Tim Tetrick and his two trotters---Market Share and Check Me Out---wrote their names into the Vernon Downs record books with victories in the Zweig Memorials for both sexes on Sunday.

Hambletonian winner **Market Share** (Revenue S) got a perfect trip in the \$350,000 Zweig for males as Tetrick moved him at the half-mile marker. He picked up cover from Magic Tonight, an outsider at 46-1, who went the best race

Zweigs moved to Rockingham Park temporarily and then found a home at the new Tioga Downs in 2006.

Gym Tan Laundry (Yankee Glide) was pacing during the post parade before the \$75,000 Zweig Consolation for colts, but he was all trot once the race started. He slipped in behind pacesetter Nothing But Class before the first quarter came up in :26 on the timer. When driver Jimmy Takter took a hold of Nothing But Class, George Brennen took off with Gym Tan Laundry.

"He just gutted it out. He raced good in the Hambletonian [finishing sixth], but came up sick afterwards and was scratched from the Colonial. I think he's still not fully recovered."

Aunt Mel (Yankee Glide) showed a lot of heart in holding off a cavalry charge from four pursuers in the homestretch to win the \$40,000 Zweig consolation for sophomore fillies. Her time was 1:54.1, a new record for the Yankee Glide lass.

Blue Yonder left fastest to get the lead with Aunt Mel on her back, but then Andy Miller pulled Aunt Mel and sent her for the lead. She was unchallenged until Southwind Moni began an impressive uncovered attack on the outside.

In the stretch, Southwind Moni refused to surrender and was joined in the fray by Miss Chip K, Kristin Victory, and Blue Yonder. But the 3-5 favorite Aunt Met found enough heart to tough out a head victory over Southwind Moni with Miss Chip K a neck back in third. The first five finishers were just 1-1/2 lengths apart at the wire.

"She's just a nice filly that doesn't do anything wrong," said Matt Cox, assistant trainer for Erv Miller. "Her blood got messed up a little bit earlier, but now she's coming back. She's just not able to go with the real top fillies."

Ron Pierce won the Meadowlands -Vernon Downs Driving Championship, sealing his title with a win behind Stettin Hanover in the afternoon's final race.

He took command quickly and never relinquished it, hitting the wire in 1:52.3. It was the first win in 11 starts this season for the gelded son of Yankee Glide. He was a part of a four-horse entry with Appomatox, Jersey's Lindy Boy, and Nothing But Class. They finished 1-2-4-5 in the race. "He really wasn't at his best today," said Brennan afterwards.

Another Big Race, Another Tetrick Win

The hometown favorite, **Heston Blue Chip** (American Ideal), continued to do what he does best at Tioga Downs, and that is win races. He came into the Cane Pace elimination on Sunday night a perfect six for six at Tioga Downs and he left now seven for seven. The connections of Heston Blue Chip opted to pay the \$35,000 supplemental fee to the Cane Pace as a way to get revenge on some of the top colts in the country after a disappointing fourth place finish in the Meadowlands Pace.

After winning the filly and colt division of the Zweig earlier in the day at Vernon Downs, Tim Tetrick was in the bike for this win, as well.

Tetrick sat in fourth as Simply Business (Ron Pierce) headed the field by an opening quarter in 26.1. As Pierce hit the brakes on the front end, Tetrick quickly shuffled Heston to the front gaining control of the field by a half in 54.1. Down the backside and headed towards three quarters, Steelhead Hanover (Jim Morrill Jr.) were left first over by three quarters in 1:21.4 as Tetrick as Heston for more. Down the stretch Tetrick and Heston Blue Chip were in total control opening up on the field to win in 1:49.2. Steelhead Hanover (Jim Morrill Jr.) put in a huge effort and got second, while State Treasurer (Mark MacDonald) finished third. It was the ninth win in ten seasonal starts for Heston Blue Chip, who just posted his fourth win in a row at Tioga Downs for trainer Linda Toscano.

"He's a really nice horse who goes out every week and can pace in 48 or 49 and he'll be blown out by the time he reaches the paddock. I can't say enough good things about this horse he is such a pleasure to drive, it's like driving a Cadillac out there" said Tetrick following the victory.

Mister Herbie Comes Up Big in Frank Ryan

In his first appearance since finishing second in the Nat Ray at the Meadowlands, **Mister Herbie** (Here Comes Herbie) trounced six rivals last night at Rideau Carleton in the \$183,500 Frank Ryan Memorial Trot. Jody Jamieson was the winning driver.

He won by 2 3/4 lengths in 1:54.

In a race where both Frenchfrysnvinegar and Daylon Magician broke stride, Mister Herbie found himself on the lead through reasonable fractions of 27, 55.4 and 1:25. With no one challenging him, driver Jody Jamieson let Mister Herbie coast home uncontested through the stretch.

"He does nothing wrong," Jamieson said. "He got beat in a world record in his last start (in the Nat Ray) and before that he won the Maple Leaf Trot. He's just an amazing animal...He proved again today that he is one of the top trotters in the word...My horse is goof right now. I don't think it mattered where I sat tonight. I really believe in a classy field of horses he was the class of the field."

Mister Herbie paid \$3.40. Windsong Geant was second and Andover America finished third.

Foolish New York Entry Rule Hurting the Game

More than anything else, harness racing needs to reinvigorate interest among bettors, and yesterday's filly division of the Zweig Memorial at Vernon Downs should have been exactly the kind of race that horseplayers get excited about.

Though there was a standout in Check Me Out, there was a large field with nine horses, including a few with an upset chance. And even if the player concluded that Check Me Out couldn't lose, the battle for second, third and fourth was a puzzling one that should have made exacta, trifecta and superfecta wagering appealing.

But thanks to an archaic rule that the New York State Racing and Wagering Board stubbornly and foolishly clings to, the filly version of the Zweig was turned into a race that no one in their right mind possibly could have wagered on. The handle figure on the race was not available at this writing, but it was likely in the neighborhood of a dollar forty-five.

A decent betting race with nine horses was turned into a three-horse race for wagering purposes because NYSRWB rules required that four horses owned in part by Brittany Farms had to race as an entry as did three others with common ownership. What was left was a race where only win wagering was accepted and the Ray Schnittker-trained entry topped by winner Check Me Out paid \$2.20.

Perhaps there was a time when such a rule was necessary to protect bettors. When the betting pools were large and the purses were modest, owners and trainers had an incentive to fool around to cash a bet. Those days are long, long gone.

The purse for this race was \$150,000. A typical race at Vernon might attract \$20,000 in wagering. Thus the NYSRWB is maintaining that someone might just play games to win a few thousands bucks in a race where the winner takes home \$75,000. That is, quite obviously, asinine.

Under the leadership of John Sabini, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board has been proactive and has worked overtime to clean up thoroughbred and standard-bred racing in the state. In that respect, it has been a breath of fresh air. But its zeal to police the sport has stood in the way of basic common sense when it comes to entry rules.

With big purses and tiny betting pools at most New York tracks, the harness game has never been more honest, at least when it comes to attempted betting coups. Any and all incentive to stiff a horse or play games in order to cash a bet has been taken away by the huge disparity between purses and the betting pools.

There shouldn't be any entries in any races. With the harness game so desperate for betting customers, every effort must be made to encourage people to bet and nothing turns off the customers faster than a race with three betting interests and win wagering only.

Getting rid of all entries might be too much to wish for. OK, so how about a rule, as a first step, where there are no entries in races worth \$100,000 or more? In too many instances, the NYSRWB is standing in the way of harness racing being an attractive betting product, and that's bad for the game.
