Pennsylvania to suspend horses with positive tests

In a rule aimed at improving integrity in the state, horses with Class 1, 2, or 3 positives or high TCO2 readings will be banned from racing in Pennsylvania for as much as 90 days.

Beginning Oct. 1, Pennsylvania will be able to ban horses with high-level positive tests from competing.

A new rule suspending horses with Class 1, 2 or 3 positive tests from racing in Pennsylvania is the latest in the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission's (PHRC) efforts to improve integrity. The new rule, approved Friday, goes into effect Oct. 1.

Horses with positive tests for Class 1 or 2 drugs will be "ineligible to race for a period of 90 days from the date of confirmation of the positive split sample," the rule states. Horses with a Class 3 positive or a high TCO2 reading will be banned from racing in the state "for a period of 30 days from the date of confirmation of the positive split sample."

The rule is also reciprocal, meaning Pennsylvania can ban horses from racing that received Class 1, 2 or 3 positives or high TCO2 readings in other jurisdictions.

"Any horse which receives a positive test or is declared positive for prohibited substances from a jurisdiction outside

Harness Racing Update

of Pennsylvania for a Class 1, 2, 3 medication/drug or high blood gas reading shall be placed on the judges/stewards list," the rule states.

Brett Revington, the bureau director of standardbred racing for the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, told HRU on Friday the new rule, "adds another level of accountability to the trainers and owners. We thought it was important to address our integrity issues."

Revington said the rule is also intended to have horse owners be, "a little more mindful, diligent and selective about who they are choosing to train their horses."

He said the rule was modelled after one in effect in Ontario.

"I was familiar with the rule from Ontario. They've had it in place for a number of years," Revington said.

In Pennsylvania, revenue from slots at racetracks greatly enhance purses and politicians frequently are looking to cut the industry's share. Taking a harder stance on integrity helps protect the industry's share of slot revenue, Revington said.

"(The politicians) are happy that we are being proactive on a number of new initiatives," said Revington, adding that all industry partners in Pennsylvania supported the initiative to suspend horses from racing.

"We've had 100 per cent support from our commission, our stakeholders and horsemen's groups. They are all 100 per cent behind it," Revington said. "It definitely helps and hopefully we've got a few new pieces in place and we are moving in the right direction.

"It's been a really pleasant surprise to get the cooperation internally from the Department of Agriculture... We are all pulling the same way right now and that's very good to see."

Revington said the rule can't take effect until Oct. 1 because it has to be publicized first.

"We can't start until we publicize it in the Pennsylvania bulletin, so it will begin October 1," he said.

Au D Lox Bluegrass is a "brute" with "no quit in her"

The Indiana-bred filly is the daughter of Ag-N-Au Bluegrass, a talented mare John Merkel initially thought had little interest in racing.

When trainer John Merkel watches pacing mare Au D Lox Bluegrass line up behind the starting gate at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino, he's never surprised by the results. The four-year-old started the year in his barn before being sold to Jeff Cullipher and Tom Pollack. Merkel also conditioned the pacer's dam, Indiana champion Ag-N-Au Bluegrass, so he has strong connections to both.

As Merkel trained down Ag-N-Au Bluegrass (pronounced Silver-N-Gold Bluegrass) in the spring of 2008, he wasn't sure the filly would make it to the races. When it came to the work needed to build a foundation, the Whitefish Falls lass seemed to lack the motivation.

"She was so laid back," the trainer said. "You would try to train her and she didn't really act like she had much interest."

He was hesitant to load Ag-N-Au Bluegrass on the trailer and take her to Indiana Downs to qualify. But Merkel had other freshmen ready to go, so he brought her along. That day she circled the oval for Dan Shetler in 2:04.2, six seconds off the pace set by Merkel's other charge, Ey-Wilwe Bluegrass. Two weeks later she won a qualifier in 2:00.2 with Trent Stohler at the helm. Despite the win, the trainer was still reluctant with the filly.

"I didn't want to put her in. I told Doc (owner Dr. Luel Overstreet), 'She hasn't even gone a mile in (1):59.' He said, 'Go on and put her in.' I went on and stuck her in," Merkel said. "She won in 1:55 that first start."

The rest, as they say, is history. In eight freshman starts, Ag-N-Au won three times and finished second on four other occasions, including both Indiana Sires Stakes finals. She finished the year with \$69,350 in earnings, but that was a small preview of things to come. Returning at three, Ag-N-Au Bluegrass elevated her game. Racing at Hoosier Park, she reeled off six straight wins at one point and finished second to High Speed Life in the \$150,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final. The sophomore would capture the \$150,000 final at Indiana Downs, taking her mark with a 1:52.3 effort. Ag-N-Au Bluegrass finished the year with a 9-7-0 record from 19 starts and added another \$232,355 to her bankroll.

"She was just a nice mare. She was a tough race mare," Merkel said. "She was just a sweetheart to be around."

Harness Racing Update

After the 2009 season, Ag-N-Au Bluegrass was retired to broodmare duties and bred to Panspacificflight. That pairing produced a filly that Overstreet named A Loskoz Bluegrass. The pacer never made it to the races. Despite having great potential, an injury ended her racing career before it had a chance to unfold.

"She had a lot of promise. I really liked that filly," Merkel said. "I had her trained down to (2):28 or something like that and she kicked the walls and shattered a sesamoid."

The second foal from Ag-N-Au Bluegrass, also sired by Panspacificflight, showed what the mare could produce. Au D Lox Bluegrass had the misfortune to race against the speedy freshman Topville Cadillac in 2015, and the dominating Seventimesavirgin in 2016, but she held her own both seasons. The filly finished second in the \$220,000 Super Final at two and earned over \$120,000 as a three-year-old. This spring she won her first two starts stepping into the open ranks, and hit the board in five of her six races for Merkel and regular driver Trace Tetrick.

"She finally just started coming around this year," Merkel said. "When she won those first two starts in (1):51, Trace said, 'Man, this is a much different filly this year than she was last year.' She really filled out and matured."

The more mature mare grabbed the attention of Cullipher and Pollack. In previous years they had been competitive in the filly and mare invitational class at Hoosier Park with Montenegro. With that mare now out of the barn, they were looking for a suitable replacement, and when they inquired, Au D Lox Bluegrass was available.

"We thought we would have a top mare that was competitive in the invites," Cullipher said. "She's a brute. I just don't see any quit in her at the moment."

Since the acquisition, Au D Lox Bluegrass has won Hoosier Park's filly & mare invite five times, finishing second twice. The mare has accumulated a cool \$67,730 during that time for her new owners. She also lowered the track record for older pacing mares with her 1:49.2 score on July 8, romping by nearly five lengths.

Au D Lox Bluegrass, however, isn't the only horse in Cullipher's barn that traces back to Ag-N-Au Bluegrass. A Loskoz Bluegrass never raced, but she is producing as a broodmare, with her first foal going to auction last fall in the Hoosier Classic Sale. Always Curious, sired by Always A Virgin, was purchased by Cullipher and Pollack for \$37,000. With four starts under her belt, the filly has won twice, the latest coming August 23 in a \$22,000 Indiana Sires Stakes

consolation. There, Always Curious distanced herself from the field by just over four lengths in 1:54.3.

"She was my best two-year-old training down. I don't think she's shown her true potential yet," Cullipher said of the freshman. "She's well put together and she's got the speed, we've just always had bad timing."

In a division that features clear leader Dee Rocks, a winner in eight of nine starts, the trainer and co-owner believes his filly is coming around and is on par with the rest of the freshman pacers. And with two rounds of eliminations and finals left before the \$220,000 Super Finals, he is optimistic Always Curious can secure the points needed to make the grand finale. If her consolation performance is an indication, the filly is moving in the right direction.

"We're on the right track with her now, and I do think she's got a very strong chance," said Cullipher. "We're just hoping for some good post positions and some racing luck."

Merkel has no vested interest in either Au D Lox Bluegrass or Always Curious, but the trainer is keeping tabs on both. He wants to see the offspring of Ag-N-Au Bluegrass, a mare that he broke and developed, sparkle just as she did during her racing career.

"I think this is the kind of family that will go on and keep producing," he said. "It's always nice to see them keep on producing and the family keep on going. It's a thrill to do that. It's just like kids; you see them grow up, advance, and do well. It makes you proud."





A primer on how the other breed lives

Some of our thoroughbred brethren still know very little about us. Here's how they can understand us better.

How some in thoroughbred racing view harness racing never fails to confuse me.

A couple of weeks ago, a summary of a conference topic featuring a quote from a thoroughbred participant, caused some waves on the social media machine:

"We've seen demise of the standardbred as the result of artificial insemination. Fortunate to have live cover in TB industry."

Say what?

Sure, foal crops are not as big in number (like in thoroughbred racing) as they once were, but this is a whole lot of hooey. Small time breeders, big farms, small owners, or big owners have a ton of choice. We can buy a well-bred yearling with a shot for \$25,000, or \$250,000. We can pick and choose from literally hundreds of sires. The market, considering what the sport is going through, is very strong.

I like thoroughbred people and I know many of them. I happen to believe most thoroughbred people don't buy into a lot of the nonsense and understand harness racing perfectly fine. But for gosh sakes, I think it's pretty clear that at least some simply don't get harness racing.

For them I've developed a short primer. Please allow me to share it with you.

First off, we might as well get this out of the way, because we see it so often from some on the runner side — you should know that all standardbred racehorses are not on "drugs." That story you read about trainer "X" and his string of drug positives is one person, in a sport with thousands working every single day with horses. Plus, harness horses races very frequently which ups the chances (this is simple math) of catching an overage on something.

Standardbred trainers and thoroughbred trainers have many of the same vets, who treat horses with the same problems, because, of course, they are of the same species. It's not like Todd Pletcher is training a horse and Ron Burke a parakeet. Yes, there are bad people in harness racing who

have or are doing bad things, but if it's happening in harness racing, you can bet your bottom dollar it's happening in thoroughbred racing, too.

I read in some quarters that not using Lasix on a horse is 'cruel' because they naturally bleed, and Lasix needs to be used like they do in thoroughbred racing, i.e. on almost every animal. Harness trainers, on the other hand, use Lasix as sparingly as possible and only on animals who exhibit bleeding. I find it a little hard to swallow that this is somehow cruel, but hey, if it makes you feel better, more power to you.

"Those harness racers sure like to cheat a lot in races" has been a narrative that's been heard since the Roosevelt (the first one) administration. With horses who race a lot it can look that way at times – every horse can't be on go every race – but it's frankly pretty silly. What I find most interesting about hearing this from the runner side from time to time, is that sport condones the use of "rabbits" to kill off another horse's chances. If you sent a horse out with the sole purpose of eliminating another person's chance in harness racing, there would be an investigation. Or worse, it would be settled behind barn six after the races.

I've seen in a few spots that some on the thoroughbred side are confused that stakes colt harness racing trainers "don't seem to care if they lose a race."

There's been a sea change in thoroughbred racing that's been well-documented over the years – trainers of Grade 1 horses don't seem to want to put their horse in a situation where he or she may not convert. Win percentage is a selling point — the higher the better — and some think it's a big reason why season starts have fallen, and why we see so many pick their spots. A loss is like some sort of affront to them or their horse.

In harness racing you can bet your last dollar that Jimmy Takter or Ron Burke wants to win every single stakes race they enter. They just realize that stuff happens. Their horse could get a bad post, a bad drive, have traffic trouble, spike with a high white count after the race, or simply might not be good enough. It is what it is, and I don't think it's a weakness for a sport, but strength.

I clearly have had a little fun above, needling some folks in the thoroughbred industry. But, there's a heck of a lot more in common between the participants in the two sports than there are differences. There are a great many competitive people in both sports who deal with the same issues day in and day out – the horse off his feed, the curbs, the vet work, the sleepless nights; the joys, the disappointments, or the head-scratchers when you expected a big win and finish up the track. We're the same, but different, and that's just fine.











A deeper look at the Yonkers Trot and Messenger

This year marks the 63rd edition of the Yonkers Trot. The first year in 1955 yielded the sport's first trotting Triple Crown winner — Scott Frost.

This year also marks the 25th anniversary of the dead heat Yonkers Trot of 1992 between McCluckey and Magic Lobell.

Jimmy Takter is the last trainer to win this race three straight times — 2009-2010-2011 with Judge Joe, On The Tab and Leader Of The Gang.

Meanwhile, Trond Smedshammer has the unusual distinction of being the only trainer to win the Yonkers Trot back-to-back with neither victory at Yonkers! In 2004, he won at Hawthorne with Windsongs Legacy and in 2005 Strong Yankee won for Smedshammer at Freehold.

Speaking of back-to-back wins, fillies won the Yonkers Trot back-to-back in 1995-96 when favorites C R Kay Suzie and Continental victory dominated, respectively.

Driver Jacqueline Ingrassia won the 2000 Yonkers Trot with Goalfish and still stands as the only female to drive a winner in this leg of the Triple Crown.

Jan Nordin won two Triple Crown races in his career — and they were both Yonkers Trots and he did it back-to-back in 1984 and 1985 with Baltic Speed and Master Willie, respectively.

Messenger

Six different places have called the Messenger home: Roosevelt 1956-1987; Yonkers 1988 and 2006-current; Freestate 1989; Rosecroft 1990-1994; The Meadows 1995-2003 and Harrington 2004-2005.

John Campbell's eight Messenger victories are the most by any driver or jockey in any Triple Crown event.

Billy Haughton won the first ever Messenger with Belle Acton in 1956. Fifty-seven years later, his son, Tommy, was the trainer of 2013 champion Ronny Bugatti.

Horses Of The Year Keystone Ore in 1976 and Beach Towel in 1990 were both were Messenger runnerups.

From 1967-1976, Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton won nine of the 10 Messengers contested. Only Lucien Fontaine threw a monkey wrench into this decade of dominance winning the 1973 Messenger with Valiant Bret.

There will be no pacing Triple Crown winner this year with Huntsville not going to the Jug after winning the Cane. The 15-year gap from 2003 to a minimum of 2018 will be the longest ever — 15 years — without a pacing Triple Crown winner. The biggest prior gap was the 14 years from Ralph Hanover in 1983 to Western Dreamer in 1997.

Western Dreamer won the Triple Crown from the first crop of Western Hanover, who in 1992 was denied, by a nose, of the Triple Crown himself when Fake Left won the Jug.

Ariana G cruises in Mohawk Grand Circuit action

Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld had a big night at Mohawk.

Grand Circuit week continued Friday at Mohawk Racetrack with the Simcoe Stakes for sophomore trotting fillies and the Champlain Stakes for two-year-old trotters.

The Simcoe Stakes featured a field of 11 competing for \$166,872, while two \$93,880 divisions were required for the Champlain.

Ariana G added another trophy to her impressive collection with a 1:53.1 victory in the Simcoe Stakes.

The ultra-talented daughter of Muscle Hill—Cantab It All started from the second-tier in Friday's contest. Driver Yannick Gingras elected to follow a mid-pack starter off the gates and was able to drop the heavy-favorite in third at the opening-quarter.

Ariana G wouldn't sit for long and was moved to the lead approaching the half. The Jimmy Takter trained filly touched down on the lead just after trotting by the half in :56.1.

Ariana G posted a :29 third-quarter setting her up well for the stretch. Southwind Tesla came first up and confronted the favourite turning for home, but Gingras sat motionless and allowed Ariana G to turn aside all challengers with ease to win by $2\frac{3}{4}$ lengths.

"She felt really good," said Gingras following the race.
"Down the stretch I was just taking it easy on her, the plugs were still in, just measuring them off and trying to save some for the future."

Feed Your Head, who is also trained by Takter, was able to edge out Southwind Tesla for second.

Owned and bred by Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, Ariana G improved to four-for-four at Mohawk with her Simcoe Stakes victory. The Hambletonian Oaks winner is now seven-for-nine this season with over \$600,000 earned.

Ariana G, who will likely race next in the Elegantimage Stakes eliminations on Sept. 9, is now a 16-time winner with over \$1.4 million earned. She paid \$2.90 to win.

Sire Muscle Hill swept Friday's Champlain Stakes, as his sons You Know You Do and Night Rhythm were victorious. You Know You Do, out of the mare You Want Me, went to the

lead and never looked back to win the opening division in 1:55.1.

The Takter trainee found the front at the opening-quarter with driver Yannick Gingras and proceeded to post fractions of :29, :58.2 and 1:27. Alarm Detector, who came in undefeated, got away last in the field of seven and never got close to making things interesting with You Know You Do, who trotted home in :28.1 to win by $6\frac{3}{4}$ lengths over Alarm Detector, who also trotted home in :28.1. Embolden was third, while Winning American was fourth.

Owned by Howard Taylor, Order By Stable, Bud Hatfield, Katz and Libfeld, You Know You Do is now four-for-six in his rookie season. The Peter Haughton champion, who was a \$350,000 Harrisburg yearling purchase, has banked \$253,872.

"He was exceptional tonight," said co-owner Katz. "This is a really top-end colt and we are thrilled and proud of him."

You Know You Do paid \$3.60 to win.

The second division saw Frank M. Antonacci trainees finish one-two in a three-horse win photo.

Cruising In Style and driver Anthony MacDonald went to the front and tried to trot away from their rivals. The son of Muscle Mass—SOS Respect posted fractions of :29, :58.4 and 1:27.3 to lead by three-lengths turning for home.

Antonacci trainees Night Rhythm and Kinda Lucky Lindy sat third and fourth at the head of the lane and both unleashed strong stretch rallies to chase down the leader.

Night Rhythm came up the inside with driver Scott Zeron, while Kinda Lucky Lindy and driver Rick Zeron were charging on the outside. At the wire, Night Rhythm prevailed by a head over Kinda Lucky Lindy and half a length over Cruising In Style for a 1:57.2 maiden-breaking score.

Owned by Lindy Farms of Connecticut and Robert Rudolph, Night Rhythm came into the Champlain after competing in a pair of Stallion Series events in Pennsylvania.

"I think they chose to race him in The Stallion Series just to keep him brave," said Scott Zeron. "They did the right thing, it worked out today. I had to nurse him a bit in the last turn, but we turned into a sprint down the lane."

Night Rhythm is now one-for-three to start his career with \$53,540 earned. The Muscle Hill—Tail Of Night colt was a \$160,000 purchase at last October's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Katz and Libfeld, who captured the other two Grand Circuit events Friday, bred Night Rhythm to add to their big night.

Night Rhythm paid \$6.30 to win.

The William Wellwood Memorial eliminations (Monday, Sept. 11) are next on the calendar for the two-year-old trotters. You Know You Do and Night Rhythm are both eligible.

Grand Circuit week continues tonight at Mohawk Racetrack with the \$615,000 Canadian Pacing Derby headlining a stakes-packed card. The 'Pacing Derby' undercard features the Simcoe Stakes for three-year-old trotters and the Champlain Stakes for two-year-old pacers.

Post time is 7:30 p.m.

Wiggle It Jiggleit out for the year

George Teague said Friday there's not much point in trying to rush the pacer back to the races this year.

Wiggle It Jiggleit's part-owner George Teague, Jr. confirmed Friday that the 2015 Horse of the Year is unlikely to return to the races this year. Wiggle It Jiggleit has been sidelined all of 2017 with back issues.

"He's been out in the field and will probably be out there another month or so and then I'll start back with him," Teague said via text message. "The idea is (he will return) earlier next year and maybe try Yonkers in March or April.

"I feel confident he'll make it back next year. I just wasn't going to press on (this year) if he wasn't 100 per cent."

Teague said the son of Mr Wiggles—Mozzi Hanover, a career winner of more than \$3.9 million, "is just relaxing in

the field and gaining a little bit too much weight... But I'm sure it will come off and he will look like a million bucks."

Though Teague said life is "a little tougher" without the fan favorite on the track, he wasn't going to rush the horse back to the races in time just to get in a few stakes races before the end of the year.

"I would rather waste those couple races and hopefully gain a little bit next year," Teague said. "Hopefully, everything goes well and is better then this year was for him.

"No one had more fun watching him race than me and the whole stable misses him — Montrell (Teague) driving and (trainer) Clyde Francis traveling and racing him."
