

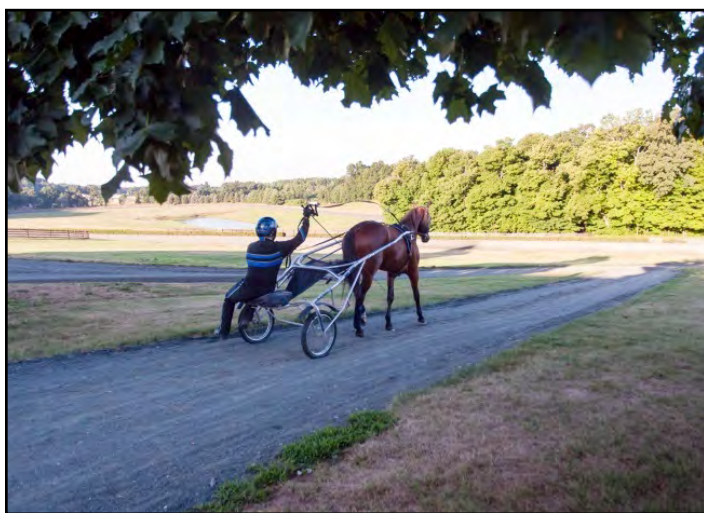

The Lindy Way

From global thinking on training and breeding to its own equine spa complete with generator, Lindy Farms is interested in big picture change, not repeating what others have done.

From the beginning, the Antonacci family was casting its gaze beyond New England to foreign lands to help make Lindy Farms of Connecticut a success.

"If you look back from when we first started our private stable, we looked overseas and brought a Swedish guy over. We had an American guy here and that's how we started our stable," said Lindy owner Frank "the elder" Antonacci, father of Lindy Farms president Frank M. Antonacci and son of farm founder Guy "Sonny" Antonacci. "And we had early success with Probe and Harmonious and that's how we had it."

Frank "the elder" is referring to the back-to-back

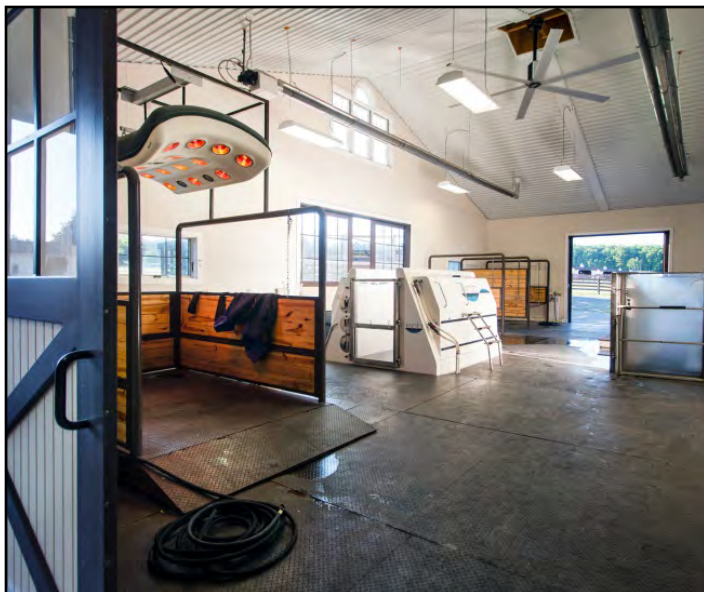

Hambletonian victories (1989 and 1990, respectively), two of the family's record five Hambletonian champions. Osvaldo Formia, who hails from one of Argentina's great racing families, and was once Lindy Farms' head trainer, conditioned both Probe and Harmonious.

That international spirit continues today with Italian Domenico Cecere heading the racing stable, but it extends far beyond the horses Lindy trains to the breeding itself. Frank "the elder" has long had a passion for introducing French blood into American pedigrees. In 1999, he bred Dream Vacation's dam, Dream On Victory, to Cocktail Jet. Today the process is much easier thanks to frozen semen.

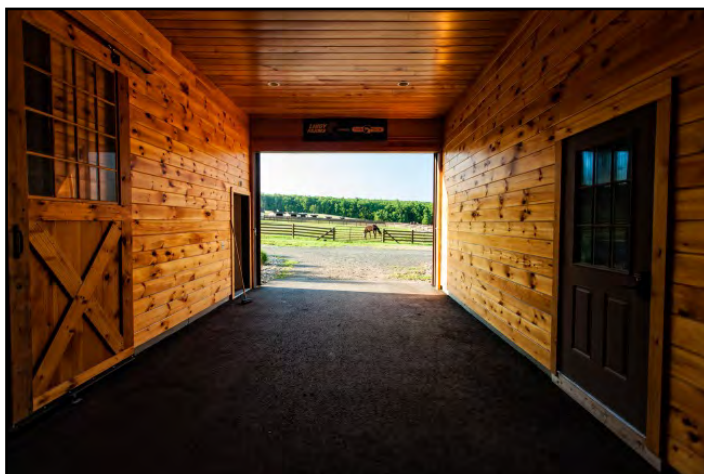
"It just makes common sense that if you can breed our horses to their horses, then possibly you could come up with a superior individual, considering they are two different

bloodlines," Frank "the elder" said. "I'm trying to add a little variety in the pedigree... I think it will produce a superior horse."

He said the breed is becoming too homogeneous and points to Rubio, a talented two-year-old trotting colt (five-for-seven, \$107,292, 1:54.2) as an example of trying to broaden pedigrees. Rubio, who was bred by the Moni Market Breeders (Lindy, several Antonaccis and David Reid), is a son of Cantab Hall out of Moni Market's French mare Italianne Girl, a mare that was produced by French master horseman Jean Pierre Dubois, a decades-old advocate of mixing French and American pedigrees.

"He looks like he's going to be a decent horse," Frank "the elder" said of Rubio, who was purchased for \$75,000 by Jimmy Takter last fall at the Lexington-Selected Yearling Sale. "He's from a mare that maybe not a lot of people understood; not a lot of people understood the pedigree. She's a sister to really good horses. We took a chance and bred her to a horse that you know is going to have the cleanest gait a modern-day trotter can have – Cantab Hall – and hopefully you get a horse, which has worked out a bit."

Though it is undeniably more of a hassle to produce horses that mix American and European blood and unconventional pedigrees require more of an educational process and risk

being less commercially viable, Frank “the elder” said it was worth the work and risk to try to produce a superstar that will change the breed.

“As an industry we make great horses, it’s just the great horses can come from every single mare out there nowadays. I’m not smart enough to know which mare that’s going to be. But I know that maybe the next great horse that I breed might come from one of these mares bred to a foreign stallion and when that horse comes he’s going to be open to breed every horse in America and the world,” he said.

It’s that kind of global thinking that is common throughout the entire Lindy Farms operation.

In 1993, when Sonny Antonacci built a five-eighths mile track and straight track through the woods at Lindy’s training facility just down the road from its main farm in Somers, CT, he opted for a Euro Track designed with a wood chip base.



“It’s supposed to have a nice cushion. I’m sure all that’s decayed already now,” said Sonny’s grandson, Frank M. Antonacci. “Now it’s kind of settled into a good spot. There’s a lot of clay down in that area. So, it was mostly a clay-sand track for a lot of years. The last six, seven years we’ve been adding local stonedust to make it more all-weather. That combination really has been fantastic. It’s a really good surface now.”

Lindy has some 30 horses in training at it farm and the horses are spoiled with the very best facilities and care — including an impressive equine therapeutic spa that features a cold water Jacuzzi, water treadmill and a vibrating floor under a gigantic heat lamp that can be lowered just above a horse’s back. Farm manager John Belskie said the spa is great for dealing with horses suffering from inflammation and soreness.

“Then, of course, the power can’t be out, so we have a huge generator. You’ve got to keep those horses going,” Belskie said with a smile, pointing out yet another area where the Antonaccis have spent significant dollars to build a first class facility for the horses that have given them so much.

Belskie said many of Lindy’s horses are retired to the farm. Frank “the elder” is fond of saying, “The horses are not like

my brother or son, but they're like a distant aunt or uncle. They've given me pleasure and been good to me."

And so it goes on, from Sonny through his sons Jerry and Frank "the elder" to their children and beyond. Perhaps even a fourth generation is

coming to one day operate Lindy Farms. Frank M. has two young sons being raised at Lindy and they already have a pony named Rocky at the training farm.

"He's a cool little horse. It's funny," Frank M. said, laughing, as his brother Phil tells him that Rocky made a bold escape recently when he jumped his stall bungee chord when becoming scared by a leaf blower.

"No way. He jumped?" Frank M. asked incredulously. "Wow. Good for him."

While the family would love nothing more than to have a fourth generation one day continue on with Lindy Farms, Frank M. said he's troubled with the direction of the industry on many fronts.

"It goes back to people being professional about their trades, whatever they do," Frank M. said. "The frustrating part that we have is I think we continually try to elevate the industry and so many people around us don't treat it with the same kind of business professionalism or personal professionalism. It's a major negative in our entire industry. People need to start recognizing that people have choices where they invest their money whether it's for fun or for business... It doesn't cost you any money to run a clean operation. You don't need to have all the opulence, but just run a clean operation and wear a pair of pants every once in awhile to the races and treat your trade and yourself with some respect. That would be a nice thing for people to start doing in our industry."

Frank M. also is critical of tracks that don't provide a great experience for owners and fans and trainers that don't take on the role of creating a top-notch experience for their investors.



"More times than not you're going to lose. How you can make that experience as enjoyable as possible is the challenge," he said, pointing out that he has taken it upon himself to entertain partners at Lindy Farms, rather than take people to the racetrack.

"I didn't want the people to necessarily go to the races. We had a family day at our farm and had everybody come to us because I can control that experience. I know I can do a good job at it. I don't trust the racetracks to do it. They don't do it the right way and most trainers don't do it the right way," Frank M. said. "I make sure that we have a box for Hambletonian Day and invite them and their family and we put out a little bit extra for them and make sure they get a hotel. You're a concierge, but that's the business you're in. In any business, that's what you have to do for your customers. I don't think many trainers do that."

Frank M. said he lives "in today and tomorrow" and his focus is firmly on moving Lindy Farms forward.

Though, clearly, he knows more about the past than he first admits. In the 1989, when Frank M. was six, his family's trotter Probe – trained by Formia – dead-heated with Park Avenue Joe in the famed "too close to call" Hambletonian. Twenty-seven years later, Frank M. has the evidence that proves Probe – sent postward by Lindy's Argentinean trainer Osvaldo Formia – won that Hambletonian outright.

Grace in defeat

Recounting some incredible moments when giant upsets were handled with class by those on the losing end.

Eddie Lohmeyer had every reason to be optimistic when he dropped his prize pacing colt Landslide into the box for the Little Brown Jug in 1981.

After all, Landslide was unbeaten in nine starts that season. In his last five starts, no horse got within a length of him at the wire. Although Landslide had never started on a half-mile track, many horses that have problems with turns just glide around the soup bowl oval at Delaware.

Lohmeyer was even happier when he drew the rail in his 10-horse elimination heat. That's a huge advantage at Delaware as the horses are into the first turn in a flash.

But the world came crashing down for Landslide and Lohmeyer soon after the start of his heat. Herve Filion sent second-choice Eastern Skipper to the front and showed the way.

As the field turned down the backstretch the second time, Eastern Skipper suddenly jumped over a scalper lying on the track and then over a footprint. Armbro Wolf, driven by John Campbell, slammed into him and then Lohmeyer and Landslide and Phil Lobell couldn't avoid the pile-up.

Horses and drivers went down in a heap and Landslide, Armbro Wolf, and Phil Lobell did not finish.

Fan Hanover, driven by Glen Garnsey, went on to win the Jug after dodging yet another accident in the final heat.

I was working for the USTA then as we always provided on-site publicity assistance to member tracks for major races. I recall a television reporter in the press box after the race that was pleading for a driver to interview. All that she got were printed quotes distributed to the media. She needed a talking head for the camera.

I told her I would see what I could do, then walked to the backstretch to see if I could find Eddie Lohmeyer. He'd changed into his street clothes, but I spotted him easily

enough. I was admittedly uneasy when I approached him and told him a TV reporter wanted an interview. After what he'd been through, he'd have every right to tell me to go to hell. Still, I posed the question to him.

Lohmeyer merely said, "Would it be better for the camera if I put on my colors?"

I almost fell over with shock and gratitude.

Eddie had no hesitation about doing the interview. He simply wanted to present the best possible image. We walked across the track and to the infield where we met the reporter.

Eddie answered all the questions politely with poise and professionalism. The reporter was thrilled over the moon.

I thought then — and still think — that it was one of the greatest displays of sportsmanship, class, and character I'd ever seen.

Lohmeyer's class and conduct in wake of his Jug Day woes always evokes Rudyard Kipling's famed poem "If" for me.

Kipling defines traits that comprise a true man, including this one:

"If you can meet with Triumph and Disaster
And treat those two imposters just the same."

I have seen that trait occasionally in racing, and three other examples stand out in my memory.

A decade earlier I had first-hand contact with another trainer/driver who tasted bitter defeat in the Jug.

Albatross was simply sensational in 1971, coming into the Jug with only one defeat all season long. He'd destroyed his opponents. His races were not competitive simply because he was so much faster than his foes.

I was working for the USTA in a summer job then and ran into September then, and I was interviewed on TV about the Jug.

"There is one horse that is so dominant in this year's Little Brown Jug that he could fall down, not once but twice, and still get up and win. His name is Albatross."

(I certainly hope that the TV station destroyed all copies of that interview.)

I wasn't alone in my confidence. Jug officials were so concerned about a minus pool costing the Delaware County Fair thousands that Albatross was barred in the betting.

But Albatross was not himself on Jug Day, the result of a grueling schedule of races coming into the Delaware dance. He won an elimination heat for his trainer/driver Stanley Dancer, but dropped the second heat and raceoff to Nansemond and driver Herve Filion.

I was stunned. Thousands others at Delaware were stunned. Surely Stanley Dancer was stunned.

I was on the backstretch during the raceoff as Dancer took Albatross off the track and headed his hobbled hero back to the barn and not the winner's circle. I was the first person to speak to Dancer.

I asked, "Would it have made any difference if you'd pulled on Nansemond sooner?"

You never know what reaction you'll get from a person who's suffered a stunning loss, but Dancer was honest but terse.

"No," Dancer told me. "Herve just got the jump on me. He beat me fair and square."

No excuses. No regrets. No bellyaching. That impressed me then, and impresses me now.

That loss bothered Dancer until his dying day. I know that because I interviewed him decades later at his home in Florida and he was still bedeviled by that Jug defeat.

The Hambletonian, too, has seen its share of heavy favorites fail. Certainly few upsets were more spectacular than the loss of the favored filly CR Kay Suzie in 1995.

Trainer Carl Allen had described her as "lightning in a bottle" during her freshman season and it was no secret he was aiming her for a Hambletonian win over colts. With Carl's son Rod handling the reins, CR Kay Suzie was nigh perfect in trail to the Hambletonian in 1995 with only one loss.

She beat colts in the Yonkers Trot and the Beacon Course (now Stanley Dancer Trot) en route to the Hambletonian. She didn't just beat them – she destroyed her male pursuers. From post eight, she won the Yonkers Trot by seven-and-a-half lengths. (She'd won her elim by 10 lengths.) The Beacon Course resulted in a three-length romp.

So the Hambletonian was virtually conceded to CR Kay Suzie and television crews shadowed her every move that day.

She wasn't the only Carl Allen entry in the big dance. In the other elimination, he had Super Wally and CR Trackmaster, an entry that went off as the 6-1 third choice. The Allens' best shot, however, clearly rested with the filly.

Those hopes died aborning when the 1-9 favorite CR Kay Suzie skipped offstride past the first quarter and failed to finish in the top five. Her day was done.

As if to add insult to injury, in the next elimination both Super Wally and CR Trackmaster took themselves out of contention with breaks. Such a calamity was almost incomprehensible. Certainly it was a crushing blow for Carl Allen, patriarch of the family, and for his sons.

Yet after all three Allen horses were eliminated, Carl and sons didn't throw up their hands in disgust and anger. Sure, they may have felt that way inside, but they patiently and politely fielded any and all questions the media tossed at them. They had every right and reason to retreat to the confines of the drivers' room and lick their wounds in private, but they bravely did the right thing.

Another Hambletonian incident that stands out in my memory dates back to 1988 when the two best colts coming into the race were Armbro Goal and Firm Tribute. You might well say that the outcome was determined when the post positions were drawn. Armbro Goal got the rail and Firm Tribute drew 13 in the second tier.

Driver Mark O'Mara managed to thread his way through the stragglers to finish third with Firm Tribute in the first heat, then came back to grab second in the wrap-up.

After the race, I recall one reporter asking O'Mara, "Would it have made any difference if Armbro Goal had drawn 13 and you had the rail in the first heat?"

The only sensible answer to that question is, "Hell, yes, it could have made a world of difference!"

Instead Mark O'Mara quietly said, "We just finished second in a \$1.2 million race. That's like winning a \$600,000 race. And that's not a bad afternoon."

Grace after adversity is often a rare quality and when you witness it, it's something you don't forget.

Four major cobalt positives for Commander Crowe's trainer Fabrice Souloy

A Norwegian harness racing site broke the news Thursday (Sept. 9) that French trainer Fabrice Souloy, conditioner of 2014 Breeders Crown open trot winner Commander Crowe, has had four top stakes horses test positive with extremely high levels of cobalt.

Friday morning, the Swedish Trotting Association confirmed the positive tests and handed Souloy an indefinite suspension and ordered purse money earned by Your Highness, Un Mec d'Heripre, Lionel and Timone EK be returned while further penalties are being reviewed.

Test results show Your Highness had a cobalt level of 395 while defeating U.S.-bred Nuncio (cobalt level of 1.22) in the Oslo Grand Prix.

All major European trotting countries limit cobalt to 100 nanograms per milliliter in urine and 25 nanograms per milliliter in plasma/blood.

Un Mec d'Heripre had a cobalt level of 400 prior to winning his Eltilopp elimination this year, a level of 371 before he finished third in the final won by Nuncio and had a cobalt level of 521 prior to the Oslo Grand Prix.

Lionel had a cobalt level of 469 prior to the Oslo Grand Prix and Timone EK had a cobalt level of 271 prior to a stakes race on the Oslo Grand Prix undercard.

If he does with the HOY title, it would be the third time in five years that a lady has taken down that honor – Linda Toscano won in 2012 with Chapter Seven and Nancy Johansson in 2014 with J K She'salady. Remember, too, the amazing and unprecedented streak Coleman has had of a \$750,000-winning sophomore colt or gelding for an astounding five years in a row: 2010 Sportswriter, 2011 Betterthancheddar, 2012 Michaels Power, 2013 Vegas Vacation and 2014 McWicked. And don't forget back to back Little Brown Jugs in 2012 and 2013.

2. Nancy Johansson going undefeated with her prized filly JK She'salady in 2014. She edged out both Sweet Lou and Shake It Cerry for top year-end honors.

3. Linda Toscano going 1-2 on the 2012 Horse Of The Year ballot with Chapter Seven winning over Market Share. Not bad having the Hambletonian winner in your barn and the Horse of the Year, too. The last time any trainer had gone 1-2 in the HOY balloting was in 1972 when Stanley Dancer had Albatross and Super Bowl. Linda also is the only female trainer – and one of only three ever – to have a \$2 million winner follow that season up with a \$1 million season. Market Share did that in 2012 and 2013.

4. Jeff Bamond having a stranglehold over the older pacing mare division and the older mare pacer Breeders Crown, highlighted by the never-say-die Anndrovette, who is edging ever so close to Eternal Camnation's all time female earnings record of \$3.7 million plus; a record that has stood for 12

years.

5. Hannah Miller's last couple of seasons and the incredible good work she's done bringing the amateur racing program into much clearer focus. She was voted their 2015 driver of the year and just recently went to Budapest and missed by a scant point of winning the World Cup.

6. Paula Wellwood winning the first two legs of the trotting Triple Crown with Marion Marauder.

7. Mission Brief. What a fabulous filly. Her 1:50.3 freshman blitz in 2014 has to be one of the most awesome efforts of the last quarter century. At two and three, she was the fastest both years, regardless of sex, and the last filly to do that was C R Kay Suzie in 1994-1995.

8. Hannelore Hanover, who has a record of 13-1-0 in 14 starts and \$662,000 as of Sept. 7. Beating the boys, supplementing, setting world records at different distances. Can she be the one that ends the 69-year drought of four-year-old trotting mares being named Horse of the Year?

9. Hannelore Hanover gets on this list twice. Is it possible that another Indiana-bred can be Horse of the Year? Her dominant year has put her in position to do what Wiggle It Jiggleit did last year for the Hoosier State? Again? Hey, it was 31 years ago that Robert Gangloff's Nihilator was named Horse Of The Year to give Indiana their first HOY in 1985.

10. Shelly Grieco, caretaker supreme, was in the winner's circle twice in the Hambletonian in the last year – first in 2012 with Market Share and this year paddocking Marion Marauder for Wellwood.

11. Lady Shadow, has gone from good to great this summer, and her blitz at a mile and an eighth – hitting the mile marker in 1:47 flat with a :26.1 quarter to get there – is the stuff of legends, or legends to be.

12. The 2014 Trotter Of The Year was Shake It Cerry. Past \$2.5 million lifetime, remember she was, and is, the only female to also be race-timed in sub 1:50 as she was narrowing in fast on JL Cruze a year back during his 1:49.4 trotting mile at the Meadowlands, the fastest trotting mile in the history of the Big M. Shake It Cerry also made things very interesting for the odds-on fave Hannelore Hanover on Hambletonian Day, finishing second best.

13. JoAnn Looney winning the richest pacing event of 2015 – the North America Cup – with Wakisashi Hanover over the HOY to be Wiggle It Jiggleit.

14. Shebestingin's 1:47 flat Red Mile world record. Dave Miller drove. The three-year-old daughter of Bettors Delight shaved three-fifths-of-a-second off Put On A Show's 2012

mark of 1:47.3 set on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands.

15. Pure Country being undefeated in 2015 and an easy choice for freshman pacing filly of the year. What has she done lately? How about a record of 13 7-2-2 and earnings of \$796,752 Diamond Creek and trainer Jimmy Takter.

16. So many other ladies have been prominent in this five years-starting with three-month-old Trysta Tetrack being placed in the 2012 Hambletonian Bowl, to the two "Heathers" (Wilder and Vitale) co-hosting the Dan Patch

Awards Dinner, to Ellen Harvey and HRC, Moira Fanning at the Hambletonian Society and Breeders Crown, to Ellen Taylor and her Harness Horse Youth Foundation. The list is too long to mention, but you get the idea, females are fabulous, most especially in racing the past five years.

Celebrity Eventsty, who got a two-hole trip, finished second, while Emoticon Hanover came first up and finished third.

In the second Elegantimage elimination, Flowers N Songs (Yannick Gingras) won in 1:53.2.

Worldclass Hanover and Dewdle All Day rounded out the top five to qualify for the final.

Caprice Hill has been on fire since returning to Ontario after a second-place finish on Aug. 6 in the Hambletonian Oaks. The daughter of Kadabra—Bramasole has won four consecutive races, including three Grand Circuit events.

“She’s been such a blessing and she comes to work every time,” said Alagna post-race. “She wasn’t at her best on Hambo Day, she was fighting some sickness before that, and since she came back up to Canada she has been vicious.”

Owned by Tom Hill and bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, Caprice Hill now has seven wins in 10 starts this season to bring her career win total to 14. She has never missed the board in 20 career starts for earnings of over \$1 million.

Caprice Hill paid \$2.60 to win.

In the second elimination, Flowers N Songs made a big move to the front in the second-quarter and never looked back for a 1:53.2 victory.

The Paul Reid trained filly got away fifth with driver Yannick Gingras, while Side Bet Hanover cut an opening-quarter of :27.3. As the tempo slowed down in the second-quarter, Gingras sent his filly to the front from fifth to grab command at the half in :57.

Flowers N Songs, a daughter of Deweycheatumnhowe—Pleasure’s Song, posted a big third quarter of :27.3, before finishing off the victory with a :28.4 last-quarter. Dream Child closed in on the winner late to finish second by three-quarters of a length.

The top five finishers were rounded out by Royal Charm, Side Bet Hanover and Tymal Tempest.

Flowers N Songs, who did not race as a two-year-old, now has nine wins from 23 starts this season. The Robert Key

homebred has earned over \$360,000 in 2016.

“It’s amazing that a filly that can have a year like this, can keep going week in and week out,” said Reid following the victory. “She takes care of herself, she rests a lot, she eats good, we get her turned out all the time and she’s just a pleasure to be around.”

Flowers N Songs paid \$5.10 to win.

The William Wellwood eliminations proved that two-year-old trotters are certainly unpredictable.

What The Hill held off Signal Hill to capture the first \$30,000 elimination in 1:55.3.

The Wellwood picture changed before the start of the first elimination, as Jimmy Takter trainee and heavy-favorite, Rubio, made a break and never caught back up with the field.

Signal Hill led the field by the opening-quarter in :28.4 and surrendered the lead just before the half to What The Hill, who was rushed up from fourth by driver Chris Christoforou to post a half-mile clocking of :58.3.

The new leader trotted the field by the three-quarter pole in 1:27.4 to set up a stretch sprint. In the lane, Signal Hill was brought to the outside and did his best to grind down the leader, but What The Hill fought him off with a :27.4 final-quarter to win by a neck.

Jake finished third, while International Moni and Real Luck Day were the final two rookies from the first split to qualify for the final.

David Miller was originally scheduled to drive What The Hill, but Christoforou stepped in and got the job done with the Ron Burke trainee.

“I didn’t plan on racing my horse on the front with Rubio in there,” said Christoforou, who noted his strategy changed after the favorite broke.

“I talked to Dave Miller this afternoon and he thought he might be better out of a hole... but he was good enough to win up there tonight, so it was nice to get him moved along to the final.”

A son of Muscle Hill—K T Cha Cha bred by Stan Klemencic, What The Hill now has three wins in seven starts, including a victory in the \$294,450 Peter Haughton Memorial last month. He was a \$65,000 purchase at last year’s Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

What The Hill has earned \$243,233 for owners Burke Racing LLC, Our Horse Cents Stables, J And T Silva Stables LLC and Deo Volente Farms LLC. He paid \$9.30 to win.

The second elimination wasn’t the prettiest race, but that

doesn't matter to Tom Durand.

Seven And Seven went from a four-hole trip to a two-hole trip in the blink of an eye and took full advantage of it to win in 1:56 for trainer/driver Durand.

Soho Hanover was sent to the front and led the group into the first turn. Meanwhile, Southwind Cobra and Mountain Of Love, who were sitting second and third, both made first turn miscues to give second position to Seven And Seven.

As Soho Hanover led the field to the half, Takter trainee Victor Gio IT, the 3-2 favorite, made a break while trotting along in fourth. There was little movement throughout the middle-half, as Soho Hanover posted fractions of :58.2 and 1:27.3.

In the stretch, Soho Hanover quickly created a little separation on Seven And Seven at the top of the lane, but the Durand trainee was able to grind him down and power by in deep stretch for the victory.

King On The Hill, who got a three-hole trip, finished second in a Place photo over Soho Hanover. Mountain Of Love and Victor Gio IT recovered from their miscues to grab the final two spots in next week's rich final.

A son of Chapter Seven—Ally Oop, Seven And Seven now has three wins in six starts to begin his career. He is owned and bred by June and Tom Durand and co-owned by Allan Smith.

Following Friday's victory, Durand noted that Seven And Seven almost missed Friday's race.

"I didn't get him trained in the middle of the week," said Durand. "He had a minor stall injury we think because in the middle of the week he had a little swelling in one leg.

"Fortunately it came down three days later, so he missed his training this week."

Seven And Seven, who won the Define The World series, has banked \$51,768 in six starts. He paid \$7.30 to win.

Following Friday's eliminations, the \$436,000 Elegantimage and \$350,000 William Wellwood Memorial finals were drawn. Elimination winners earned their connections the right to select their post for the final.

The finals of both events will be contested next Saturday (Sept. 17) on the Maple Leaf Trot and Canadian Trotting Classic card.

Master Class (Jordan Stratton) was third.

For second choice Smalltownthrowdown, a Cash Hall—Ann's Promise gelding trained by his driver for co-owners Ann-Mari Daley, James Crawford IV, Donald Brenner and Richard Lombardo, it was his sixth win in 15 seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$52.50, with the triple returning \$211.50.

Svanstedt, a bridesmaid in the first event, teamed with slight choice The Royal Harry (\$6.80) to win the second division in 1:57.

The post time favorite, 6-5 chance Charmed Life, reached the lead in :28 and was permitted to march on the front end through fractions of :56 and 1:23.2. Charmed Life was clear by a length and half at the head of the stretch, but My Happiness E P, who appeared to have no shot racing in fifth
