

Inaugural Goshen Sale Looks Like a Winner

Give sellers a good deal, give buyers a catalogue with plenty of horses with solid looks and pedigrees and bring everyone together in a venue that is on the beaten path. That's the idea behind today's inaugural Goshen Sale, where some 121 yearlings will go on sale.



The Goshen Yearling sale might be new but it is being backed by some of the biggest names in the industry as Blue Chip Farms, Cameo Hills Farm, Concord Stud and Winbak Farm are among the consignors. Their mind-set was that the Mid-Atlantic states, and particularly New York, needed a sale that was easy to get to for

area horsemen and one where they could auction off some of their horses that may have gotten lost in the crowd at the sport's two premier sales, Lexington and Harrisburg.

The sale will begin today at noon and will be held at Mark Ford's training center in Middletown, New York. Ford's training center is just 65 miles from Yonkers. The other yearling sale held annually in New York takes place at Morrisville, not exactly an easy place to get to.

"We feel that the location is ideal," sales manager Chris Tully said. "We're already at a training center where there are a lot of power stables. We are centrally located, 90 miles or less from all the all major tracks and training centers in the tri-state area.

"For the breeders, it is costing more and more money to raise a yearling and so you have to provide yourself with the very best opportunities when it comes time to sell them. The date has to be at a good time when people will be in the area and you want it to be geographically sound so the majority of buyers are close by your sale so they don't have

to go out of their way to visit your sale. They really felt that date could be improved, location could be improved and the cataloging process and the way sale was presented could be improved, so they decided to take a shot at it."

One enticement to consignors is a reduced commission rate. Tully said the commission will be 4 percent on most horses and 3 percent on horses that sell for \$50,000 or more. He said the industry standard is 6 percent.

Many of the sport's top sires will be represented. The list includes American Ideal, Art Major, Rock N Roll Heaven, Muscle Hill, Crazy, Credit Winner, Lucky Chucky and Bettor's Delight. Most, but not all, of the horses are New York bred. The sale also includes four horses from the first crop of Chapter Seven.

"The location is ideal," said Steve Jones of Cameo Hills Farm. "Our farm is less than 10 miles away from the sales grounds and it is also close for most people who are racing in New York, especially the downstate people and even people located New Jersey. It's just easier for them to travel to this sale as opposed to the other New York sale that is further upstate."

Jones will sell five horse of his own and will act as the consignor on 12 others. He understands that Lexington and Harrisburg will always get the premier yearlings, but he said it would be a mistake to underestimate the horses that will be available today in Goshen.

"The horses that I own that I put in are all New York bred and I put some nice ones in there," he said. "I don't think there's any way you can expect people to show up at the sale unless you have nice looking horses to sell. The ones I put in here are nice looking New York bred horses and I think they will sell well. In this sale, I think they will stick out, where they might not have at Lexington and Harrisburg."

Harness racing is notoriously slow to change or adopt new ideas, so Tully and his bosses believe what they have accomplished for the first year of the Goshen sale is something to celebrate. Likely, Goshen will get bigger and better.

"We know horsepeople by nature are not early adopters, so it's going to take a year, maybe two years, to have people realize that we put on a good show, we have a good venue, that we are a trustworthy, reliable sales company," he said. "We feel in producing this sale people will be given firsthand experience of how we operate, that we run a professional operation. We really feel we could at some point sell 200 yearlings. It's not always easy to attract horses to a new sale but I think we did a pretty good job."

L A Delight in a league of her own in the Champlain

It's not often you see a horse 1/5 in the morning line, but the oddsmaker got it right when assessing L A Delight's chances in the \$241,000 Champlain Stakes at Mohawk Racetrack last night.

There were no anxious moments for this sensational Bettors Delight filly as she easily ran her win streak to nine straight with a facile 5-length win in 1:52 1/5. Driver Randy Waples steered L A Delight to the lead

taking over from unbeaten Good Will Hanover before the 1/2 in 55 2/5 which was pretty quick on this cool night.

From there it was a cakewalk as L A Delight and Waples seemed to open up their lead with little effort on their overmatched foes. Together, they stopped the teletimer in 1:52 1/5 as wrapped up winners, their time only 1/5 of a second slower than the rookie colts went in their Champlain dash.

Winning trainer Bob McIntosh was obviously pleased with his filly's effort. "She's just getting more professional every week," the Hall of Famer observed. "I just feel lucky to have her. When you breed her and she turns out like this it's just

extra special. She seems to be better every week."

But McIntosh wasn't this high on L A Delight at the start as she didn't really stand out until she really got down to business. "All year long she never did a thing wrong but she was just one of the pack. Then all of a sudden we got her qualified and got her going and she was extra special. It's a nice surprise."

Early leader Good Will Hanover stuck around for second – 4 1/2 lengths behind the winner – in a good showing in her stakes debut. Ivy League was a further length back in third. The winner returned \$2.30 to win and topped a \$5.90 exacta.

L A Delight would likely be considered the early favorite for the Breeders Crown – had she been kept eligible. "In all my wisdom I didn't put her in it," McIntosh fretted. "I thought she was just an ordinary filly back in the winter." This super filly is anything but ordinary in her trainer's eyes – or anyone else that watches her race – when she does her thing on the racetrack now.

L A Delight has now won 9 of 10 starts and more than \$520,000 for owners McIntosh, S X Stables and Al McIntosh Holdings.

Artspeak takes the Simcoe in a new life's mark

Scott Zeron said that Artspeak "felt like his old self" in the post parade last night and he sure looked like it in mowing down the tough Reverend Hanover in the \$224K Simcoe Stakes in a new life's mark of 1:48 2/5.

"I knew he was ready to rock tonight," Zeron said in the winners' circle. "Tony did a great job prepping him for this race giving him a couple of weeks off then qualifying him in 50. Doing it off a first-up trip like that tonight and finishing the way he did;

that was crazy".

Neither Artspeak nor Reverend Hanover left particularly hard as Go Daddy Go and Lyons Again fought for the lead early through a 26 1/5 opening quarter, but soon Reverend Hanover was on the move as expected and he took the lead at the 1/2 in 53 2/5. Zeron moved Artspeak first-over past the 1/2 and the expected battle was on. Reverend Hanover – a winner last week here in a new life's mark of 1:48 3/5 -marched on past the 3/4 mark in a swift 1:21 1/5 with last year's Metro Pace winner in hot pursuit.

Reverend Hanover was game and entered the stretch with a short lead, but in the final 1/8th of a mile, last year's Metro Pace winner had too much pace and drew away while pacing his last 1/4 in 27 1/5 to finish 2 1/4 lengths in front of Reverend Hanover. Split The House was another length back in 3rd.

Zeron clearly was impressed with Artspeak, "I have a lot of respect for Reverend," he said. "To mow him down like that was big." The winning driver also said that part of the reason that Artspeak hasn't been as dominant this year may be that things stack up a bit different for him from a

competition standpoint. "Last year he had bullet quick speed when other horses weren't ready to do what he was capable of," he remarked. "Last year it felt like a cakewalk...ya know; it was a matter of just keeping him well-behaved and he was much the best. This year we hit some top-caliber horses. Wiggelt seems like he's an absolute machine. It seems like there's no end to him."

Artspeak served notice to his foes in the Simcoe that he's still around and he's a tough out as the Little Brown Jug fast approaches. He won for the 4th time in twelve 2015 starts and boosted his season's earnings past the \$500,000 mark for owners Brittany Farms, Marvin Katz, Joe Sbrocco and The Gym Partners.

The winner returned \$4.80 as the second choice and the exacta with Reverend Hanover second paid \$8.10.

Betting Line takes advantage of favorites scratching in Champlain

When unbeaten 2/5 morning line favorite Control The Moment was announced as a vet scratch sick partway through the card last night that opened the door for second choice Betting Line to record a Grand Circuit stakes win. Despite a few anxious moments on the final turn when the Bettors Delight colt appeared to be gapping his cover, he didn't disappoint, getting up late to convert as the 1/2 favorite.

Victorious trainer Casie Coleman noted her colt's issues after his 1:52 flat score. "No he wasn't quite right tonight," she mentioned. "He was on the right line pretty good and we think we know what it is. It's a sesamoid and we're going to get it

cryoad on Monday morning and get it fixed up and ready for the rest of the season."

Coleman expressed disappointment at Control The Moment's scratching. "A win's a win but it sucks to have to win that way," she said. I guess he's a bit sick tonight that colt; I didn't want to win this way."

Chalk bettors had to be worried as Betting Line seemingly couldn't keep up on the final turn as Nocturnal Blue Chip led the field past a 55 2/5 half and through a 1:23 3/5 three-quarters, but when they straightened out, Steve Condren angled the eventual winner three-wide and he chased down the leader to get the job done by 1 1/4 lengths.

Betting Line won for the fifth time in eight lifetime starts and boosted his earnings close to the \$340,000 mark for owners West Win Stable, Christine Calhoun and Mac Nichol. He returned \$3 to his faithful and the 9-4 exacta returned a \$26.20.

Nvestment Bluechip atones for Metro Stakes miscue in Champlain

Nvestment Bluechip picked the worst time to break stride for the first time last week in the rich Metro Stakes Final. But last night he was poetry in motion in winning the

\$115,000 Champlain Stakes under expert handling by veteran reinsman Jody Jamieson.

After blasting to the front early in a 27 flat first 1/4, the Shadow Play colt released heavy favorite Voracity to the front past a 56 flat 1/2 but was kept right on his helmet throughout by Jamieson. As the leader passed the 3/4 pole in 1:23 4/5 it was obvious

that Nvestment Bluechip wasn't going away. As they straightened for home and Jamieson began to ease his charge off the rail, it became apparent that the Dave Menary-trained (and part-owned) colt had the most pace left.

Nvestment Bluechip easily drove past Voracity – who had finished third in the Metro – and had plenty left to hold any closers at bay while registering a new life's mark of 1:52 1/5. New Talent drove up late for 2nd just ahead of Sassy's King Kong while Voracity faded to 4th late.

Menary said he liked his colt right from the start. "He was my favorite all along right from November," he said. He's smart, he takes care of himself and he shows up when the lights are on. Menary wasn't surprised by the result, either. "It kind of went like I thought it was going to go (tonight),"

he said, "The colt had a really good week and I've always been pretty high on him and tonight we got paid for it."

Nvestment Bluechip won for the third time in seven starts and pushed his earnings to more than \$165,000 for Menary and partners Michael Guerriero and Denis Breton. He paid \$8.20 to win and combined with 41/1 shot New Talent for a \$134.60 exacta.

Resolve solid in Maple Leaf Trot elimination win

Is Resolve the "now" horse in the aged trotting ranks? It certainly appears so.

The four-year-old Muscle Hill stallion has amassed a nice bankroll by mostly picking up checks in some big races this season, but by recording his 2nd win of the season in his Maple Leaf Trot elimination last night, he is looking like a horse that is peaking at the right time heading for the rich final of that race next week.

Resolve – second choice in the wagering behind the mare D One - was immediately sent for the front when the gate pulled away by trainer/driver Ake Svandstedt who was obviously intent on controlling things. He led through a moderate

27 4/5 opening frame with last year's Breeders Crown winner Intimidate lurking in the pocket and the favorite sitting a comfortable fourth.

Resolve's fortunes took a turn for the better when D One broke just after pulling off the rail to head for the front before the 1/2. Svandstedt used that miscue to his advantage by stealing a 29 flat second 1/4 which in effect meant sure doom for the rest of his foes that were still trotting.

Local hope Daylon Magician was sent first-up heading to the 3/4 pole by driver Jack Moiseyev but Resolve was unfazed and unbothered and drove away from Daylon Magician after hitting the 3/4 in 1:25 1/5 by trotting the final frame in 27 3/5.

Resolve was an easy winner by 3 1/4 lengths in 1:52 4/5 on a track that had been dampened by some mid-evening rain. Intimidate hung around to finish 2nd and Obrigado, who briefly went rough in the final turn finished third. The powerful victory – albeit aided by some soft early fractions – likely stamps Resolve as the early favorite for the Maple Leaf Trot final next week.

In winning for the 2nd time in nine 2015 starts, Resolve pushed his season's earnings to more than \$263,000 for owner Hans Enggren. He paid \$6.60 to win and combined with Intimidate for an \$80.60 exacta.

Natural Herbie upsets in his Maple Leaf Trot elimination

Seemingly destined to finish 2nd to Bee A Magician in mid-stretch, 12/1 longshot Natural Herbie showed the grit he has become known for and just kept coming to mow the 2013 Horse of the Year down right on the line in the first Maple Leaf Trot elimination.

up, looking every bit the winner at the 1/8th pole.

As Bee A Magician easily passed the faltering J L Cruze, Natural Herbie kept coming, forcing Brian Sears to urge the leader on as they neared the wire. Natural Herbie was able to reach up by a head right on the wire in 1:52 4/5 on a track that had been moistened by some mid-card rain.

Yoder said he wasn't surprised by the lack of speed in the race. "I figured there would be no speed on the front end," he remarked. "I was hoping I could be first up or second up and it worked out pretty good. When I called on him he was ready."

Bee A Magician finished a clear 2nd with longshot Lindy's Tru Grit closing late for third. Whiskey Tax held on for 4th ahead of J L Cruze who faded badly late. The only horse that didn't make the final was Ellitlopp winner Magic Tonight who finished 6th and last and has not thrived since returning to North America this summer.

Pinkman rebounds in Canadian Trotting Classic elimination

Pinkman served notice to his Canadian Trotting Classic foes that he's still the horse to beat with a workmanlike 1:52 2/5 victory over stablemate The Bank last night.

Pinkman, as is his custom, left hard for the front but The Bank also had designs on the top and was pushed to the lead by trainer/driver Jimmy Takter in a reasonable first 1/4 of 27.4. But The Bank wouldn't enjoy his lead for very long as Yannick

Gingras sent Pinkman back out for command and the public's 4/5 favorite would not relinquish the lead from there, trotting past the 3/4 in 1:24 4/5 en route to a 1:52 2/5 two-length score over his stablemate.

"He sure was really good tonight." Gingras beamed after the race. "I kicked the plugs out halfway down the stretch and he got into another gear and trotted really strong to the wire."

Pinkman came off an adventurous trip in the Yonkers

Trot final which his driver said had more to do with the track configuration than Pinkman. "He didn't like the half (mile track)," he said matter-of-factly. "He struggled on it and was running in real hard. He was pretty bumpy gaited. It was pretty amazing that he stayed at it both weeks. He's a really game horse but the half-mile track isn't what he likes."

The race was marred by several breakers, including Takter's third entrant, Canepa Hanover, who broke just past the 1/2 while racing along in 4th, Lookslikeeachpndale, who broke while sitting a good third at the 3/4 and Centurion ATM, who broke at the start. The latter managed to recover to finish 4th and make the final.

Pinkman won for the first time since his Hambletonian victory, taking his ninth win in 13 starts this year. He has now earned \$1.225 million for owners Christine Takter, Jim and John Fielding Joyce McLelland and Herb Liverman.

He returned \$3.70 as the choice and the Takter exactor with The Bank 2nd paid \$15.70.

Uncle Lasse converts a perfect trip to win his Canadian Trotting Classic elimination

There was very little movement throughout the race as Crazy Wow was allowed to set the pace as he pleased carving out a reasonable opening half of 56 2/5. When no

one moved at the 1/2 and Crazy Wow's teamster Tim Tetrick stole a 29-second third ¼ breather, it appeared as though the heavy favorite held a big advantage. But Uncle Lasse – who finished third in the Hambletonian Final last

month to Pinkman – clearly had other ideas and turned on the afterburners to outsprint the leader in a 27 1/5 final 1/4 to reach up late. That final frame was the fastest fraction of the race.

Winning driver Sears praised the son of Donato Hanover in the winner's circle. "The trip worked out perfect and I was really happy with that and the horse really responded off the trip," he said. "He's been knocking on the door all year and hopefully he has a good one next week."

Uncle Lasse won for the fifth time in eleven 2015 starts and raised his season's earnings above the \$500,000 level for owners Solveigs Racing Partners and Goran Falk. He returned \$7.80 as the second choice in the wagering. Crazy Wow finished 2nd ahead of Muscle Up The Goal who closed for third late.

driver Ronnie Wrenn Jr. and held off late bids from All Bets Off and State Treasurer to win.

He won by a head over All Bets Off. State Treasurer was third, beaten a half-length. The final time was 1:49.2.

Ironically, Wrenn said afterward that he was convinced the track was favoring closers last night.

"He's a nice horse, probably one of nicest horses I've ever driven," he said. "He overcame the fact that speed was not holding up at all tonight. He just went a wicked mile."

It was a return to form for Doo Wop Hanover, who had lost four straight coming in for trainer Steve Elliott. He was at his best earlier this summer when winning four straight legs of the Graduate Series, including the final. This was his first career win in a race that included horses older than four.

State Treasurer had no obvious excuse last night. Dave Miller pulled the pocket on the second turn, got cover behind Limelight Beach and wheeled out for the drive turning for home. He just didn't have his usual kick.

Doo Wop Hanover paid \$12.80.

The first of the two Grand Circuit races on the night, the Sam Chip Noble Memorial, went to Wind Of the North. Driven by Dave Palone for trainer Daryl Bier, he went to the front and was clinging to a narrow lead turning for home. Gural Hanover, the favorite, took a crack at him from the outside and Southwind Pepino challenged along the pylons, but the son of Cantab Hall gamely held on to win by a head in 1:53.2.

"I really went into the race thinking it was between him and Gural Hanover," Palone said. "I really hadn't made up my mind whether I should be on the lead; I was just going to see how crisp my horse was off the wings. When he crossed right over and Matt (Kakaley) was content to follow me (with Gural Hanover) I thought I'd get the numbers I wanted. It was a great horse race. I thought he had me beat but my horse fought back like I thought he would off those fractions."

From the winner's circle, Palone took the time to remember Noble, an Ohio racing legend.

"I remember when I was young Chip would send horses to The Meadows and I would get to drive them. It was an honor to be 25, 26 and get to drive for Chip Noble, one of the best horsemen who ever lived. I don't think anyone in Ohio can say his name without getting real choked up."

The Scioto card also included eight \$225,000 Ohio sire stakes championship races and, among them, the highlight was clearly a win by MJB Got Faith in the race for

2-year-old male trotters. Not only did the son of Trainforthefuture stay undefeated in five career starts, but he is owned by a 10-year-old. The owner is Breana Carsey, who watched her horse beat the previously undefeated Kanthaka.

When asked if she was nervous about facing Kanthaka young Miss Caresy said, "No because I believe in God and I know that he always has faith in him."

And what is she going to do with the \$112,500 she just made? "I'm going to give it to the people who need it."

Kanthaka was part of a pair of undefeated 2-year-olds sent out by trainer Christopher Beaver and the other one, the filly Kestrel, was also beaten. She finished second, a nose behind Count On Kami. Count On Kami was 0 for 7 lifetime with six seconds.

"She had four seconds in all the legs of the sire stakes," Driver Kurt Sugg noted. "Actually, after the first leg of the sire stakes races I told (Kestrel's driver) Aaron Merriman that I thought I had the best one. She raced really good that time. Since then she's kind of flattened out a little bit but she was back on her game today."

Yonkers Trot Champion Habitat Provides Fitting Encore

YONKERS, NY - On the first of two evenings highlighting New York champions, Habitat showed how bright a star he is.

After dominating the Yonkers Trot in his previous start, Habitat added a commanding victory in the \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes final for 3-year-old colts and geldings on Saturday night at Yonkers Raceway.

"He's maybe rounding into career form," said trainer Ron Burke. "Right now, he seems to be getting around great."

The son of Conway Hall notched his fourth consecutive victory in the most eye-catching performance of the four New York Sire Stakes finals. Jewels In Hock upset Barn Doll in the 3-year-old trotting fillies division. Band of Angels, another Burke trainee, nosed out Devil Child in the final for 3-year-old filly pacers. Betting Exchange bested Americanprimetime by three-quarters of a length in a pacing final for 3-year-old colts and geldings. All of the NYSS races carried hefty \$225,000 purses.

A track turned slopping by a pelting rain may have been more challenging for Habitatat than any of the six competitors he faced. Driver Jim Morrill Jr. focused on keeping him at a trot, knowing that would be enough to get

the job done.

"It's getting choppy and with these trotters, it doesn't take a lot," said Morrill, referring to the increased risk of going off stride. "All they have to do is step in a bit of a hole."

Heavily-favored Habitat, in providing a fitting encore to his 3 1/2-length score in the Yonkers Trot, avoided such mishaps. "He's such a nice horse to drive. He's straight. He trots nice," said Morrill. "He makes my job easy, for sure."

Burke blames bad luck and worse strategy for Habitat's dismal seventh-place showing in the Hambletonian final after the brown colt advanced by finishing fourth in his elimination. The 3-year-old had the misfortune of leaving from post 10.


"We drew a horrible spot," Burke said. "If I had to do it over, I would have sent him out of there. But we took him back and you're not going to pass those kinds of horses from back there."

Habitat kicked off his winning streak by trotting a lifetime best-tying time of 1:53 in the Tompkins Memorial at Tioga Downs. He wired the field in his Yonkers Trot elimination and again showed the way throughout in the Yonkers Trot final. His latest success, achieved in the comfortable time of 1:56.3, represents his eighth victory in 15 starts this year with a pair of runner-up efforts.

Burke noted that Habitat is exceeding expectations. "We thought he'd be solid. He's a bit more than solid lately," he said.

Burke, who is also part of the ownership group, said he expects Habitat to race as a 4-year-old. "It will create more

interest in him as a stallion and that's what we do, we race horses," he said.

In an intriguing twist, Burke said he may point Habitat toward some races in Europe in 2016. "We might look to head over there at some point," the trainer said. "They don't race over mile tracks there. They have smaller tracks and they go a distance, which won't hurt him a bit."

A sizzling start was the key when Jewels In Hock, also driven by Morrill, surprised Barn Doll to hand her only her fifth defeat in 22 career starts. "My filly is as honest as the day is long," said winning trainer Linda Toscano. "The only advantage she has against Barn Doll is she can get off the gate really well."

Morrill gunned Jewels In Hock to the front while Barn Doll endured her typical slow start. That forced her driver, Jeff Gregory, to make some difficult decisions. "I had to tip her out three wide in the middle of the last turn," he noted.

Although Barn Doll raced extremely wide, she closed sharply during the stretch run. "She really likes to pass horses," Gregory said. "We just ran out of real estate."

Jewels In Hock gained her ninth victory in 17 starts this year. She also owns two second-place finishes and two third-place showings. "She's been a filly that has been really consistent all year," Toscano said. "She really hasn't made a mistake."

An aggressive drive from Jason Bartlett with Band of Angels had much to do with Burke's other New York Sire Stakes win. Bartlett sent his 9-1 longshot to the lead from farthest outside in post eight. His go-for-the-gusto approach could not have worked out any better.

"We had pretty easy fractions through three-quarters," he said, "and she sprinted home." She covered the mile in 1:54.

Betting Exchange appeared to benefit from his rail position and an equipment change by part-owner and trainer Tom Fanning. "We changed his bridle and kind of closed him up," Fanning said. "We thought he was waiting on horses a bit. He was much more aggressive tonight."

Betting Exchange recorded a winning time of 1:52.4 in giving Bartlett his second NYSS win on the evening. Betting Exchange won for only the sixth time in 22 career starts. He has failed to crack the top three only seven times, however.

Two-year-old pacers and trotters will be featured on the second New York Night of Champions at Yonkers Raceway on Sept. 26. Burke surely spoke for most owners and trainers when he called the NYSS program "one of the best in the world."

Making New History at Saratoga Casino and Raceway

For just the second time in track history, there was a triple dead heat for win on Saturday night at Saratoga Casino and Raceway.



The three-way tie came in the evening's \$18,000 featured Open Pace and was the result of a scramble in the stretch. Longshot Spinarama (Austin Siegelman) was parked to the half in 53.2 over a sloppy track and despite racing overland throughout lap one dug in and drew clear midway through the stretch. The 12-1 shot Spinarama was then met with challenges of rivals Panocchio (Gerry Mattison) and Burkentine Hanover (Stephane Bouchard).

The three top flight pacers hit the wire at the same time in 1:52.2 and the race was declared a three-way dead heat. Spinarama, undaunted by his tough journey in the feature, earned his fourth win of the season in the Open.

For Panocchio it was victory number five in the Saturday feature this year while Burkentine Hanover got his picture taken for the second straight week after scoring in the local Open for the first time last Saturday night. The only other three-way dead heat to occur at Saratoga came on a President's Day matinee card in 2008 when three trotters hit the line at the same time in the afternoon's finale.

Super Night Championships Produce Star Studded Efforts

Super Night XXVII at Balmoral Park is in the books as Saturday's eight championship events showcased the Prairie States top pacers and trotters. Despite heavy rains early in the day and fall temperatures in the air the track was lightning fast as the fans enjoyed the fast paced action on and off the track with a variety bands and party packages keeping the festivities flowing.

The championship action kicked off in race three with a full field of 10 sophomore trotting fillies squaring off in the \$79,000 Lady Ann Reed Stake.

Despite the fact that four of the starters wound up making early breaks it still turned into a thrilling finish as Bi Polar Rose held off the late bid of Fox Valley Yoko to prevail by a head in 1:57.1, giving Matt Krueger his first Super Night championship. Patient ID (Robert Smolin) was third.

"When I saw all those horses inside of me making breaks I really had no choice but to leave out of there and try to get

to the front," said a very happy Krueger. "I was able to settle in for a quick bit early but she felt really good so I let her go on she did her own thing on the front end."

After opening up a two-length lead at the top of the stretch the daughter of Polar Winner—I Still Owe appeared to be tiring in the late stages as Fox Valley Yoko (Kyle Wilfong) was suddenly finding her best stride after a second over journey.

"I stepped on the gas with her coming out of the turn because I wanted to put some distance between my filly and Kyle's filly," explained Kreuger. "I heard her coming strong as we got down by the wire but my horse just dug in and came up huge to hold her off."

The winner is trained by Ronnie Roberts who also picked up his first Super Night championship. Overlooked a bit in the wagering Bi Polar Rose returned \$13.80, \$5.20 & \$4.20 while pushing her record to 4-3-0 in 14 starts this year with career earnings of \$132,282.

Sophomore trotting colts were next on the docket as a field of eight diagonally gaited three-year-olds battled in the \$74,000 Su Mac Lad Stake.

This one took a while to decide but after a long look at the photo it was Charles Doehring and John D Finn's Captain Greedy who prevailed by the slimmest of margins, edging out 40-1 longshot Vick Valor in 1:57.3 for J D Finn.

Sent to the front from post six by his driver-trainer Captain Greedy carved out splits of 29.0, 58.3 & 1:27.3.

"He was a little bit sick last week so I kind of took it easy on him in that prep," said Finn. "Tonight I had every intention of getting him to the top and going as far as we could go."

Battling his chief rival Fox Valley Qatar (Pat Curtin), who pulled from the pocket as the field neared the top of the stretch, the gelded son of Yankee Valor—Tropical Trixie appeared to be beaten several times. Showing the grit and determination that had netted him 15 career victories coming into this race, Captain Greedy continued to battle back, putting away that rival with 50 yards to go and then doggedly keeping a nostril in front of a hard charging Vick Valor (Jeffrey Kirk) who was closing in the center of the track. Fox Valley Qatar was forced to settle for the show dough.

The never die say die attitude that Captain Greedy exhibited did not surprise Finn who recently notched his 1,000th career victory.

"He will never stop trying for you," said his proud pilot. "If you keep driving on him he will give you everything he's got. He's overcome a lot of things already and he just keeps getting better and better."

The 3-2 favorite returned \$5.00, \$3.40 & \$2.80 while running his career slate to a very impressive 15-5-4 in 31 starts with earnings of \$151,806.

The first pacing championship of the night was next as a field of nine two-year-old fillies lined up behind the gate for the \$155,000 Filly Orange & Blue Stake.

After some early excitement which saw the fillies battling three across the track through the entire first turn Quaid Racing LLC's Char N Marg wound up parlaying a pocket sitting trip into a four-length victory in 1:52.4 with Casey

Leonard at the controls.

After all the early action Lexington Lady (Brian Carpenter) finally grabbed control of things on the backstretch leading the field through splits of 28.0, 55.2 & 1:24.0.

With the leader starting to drift out while getting a leg weary in the lane. Leonard guided the Nelson Willis trained daughter of Sportsmaster—Zip Up You Pans up the inside where she exploded past the pace-setter to notch her fifth win in 10 lifetime starts. Lexington Lady held on for second while Dandy's Diva (Mike Oosting) rallied to be third.

The bay filly who was a close second choice in the wagering returned \$5.00, \$2.40 & \$2.20 while upping her career earnings to \$96,211 which did not surprise Willis who now boasts nine Super Night titles.

"I told the owners when this horse was training down over the winter that she was going to be a nice filly," said Willis. "Of course it's always great when you turn out to be right about one but she's always been ahead of the grade so to speak and she definitely shows up every week for you."

Older mare pacers were next on the program as a field of 10 stepped on to the track for the \$95,000 Lorna Propes Championship.

As she's done so often this season John Barnard's Ryleigh's Lilly overpowered her rivals in the late going as she went sailing past her rivals in the stretch to win by two-lengths in 1:52.4 for driver Casey Leonard.

Confidently handled by her red-hot pilot the five-year-old daughter of Western Hero was positioned in mid-pack while the lead changed hands several times through opening splits of 28.0, 55.4 & 1:24.2.

"It looked like there was going to plenty of speed to keep things honest up front and it certainly worked out that way tonight," Leonard explained. "I didn't want to go three-wide quite as early as I did but I wasn't about to let those front horses get away from us."

Zooming by her rivals in the lane, Ryleigh's Lilly was on cruise control through the final sixteenth of a mile as she reported home with her 19th career victory. Just By Design (Dale Hiteman) shook loose late to rally for the place money while Rev Me Up (Brian Carpenter) was third.

The overwhelming 2-5 favorite returned \$2.80, \$2.40 & \$2.10 while hiking her career bankroll up to \$173,968.

A stretch of four straight championship tilts to close out the night kicked off with a field of 10 older pacers slugging it out in the \$92,000 Tony Maurello Stake.

This race produced the fastest mile of the night as the rock-solid speedball Ice Scraper made every call a winning one in route to 1 ½ length decision in a stakes record time of 1:49.1.

Driven like he was the best by Brian Carpenter the six-year-old son of Yankee Skyscraper ripped through splits of 26.3, 53.2 & 1:20.4 while going along unchallenged on the front end.

"He loves the front and that was the plan going into this," said Carpenter. "Mike (Brown) said that if Unlocked came at us hard to go ahead and cut him loose but my horse felt so good there was no way I wanted to do that tonight."

Sprinting away from his rivals in the lane, the Mike Brown trainee was never seriously threatened the rest of the way

as he strolled under the wire with his 30th lifetime victory. Cole Heat (Dale Hiteman) shook loose late to rally for second while Fiveknuckleshuffle (Robert Smolin) was third.

The third choice in the wagering despite a pair of sub-1:50 wins over his last three starts Ice Scraper returned \$9.60, \$5.20 & \$4.60 while upping his career bankroll to \$380,854 for owner James Behrendt.

Sophomore pacing fillies followed as a field of nine ladies met in in the \$116,000 Grandma Ann Stake.

Parlaying a superb steer and a perfect trip into the biggest win of her career D Kay Bartlow's Fox Valley Brooke came charging through the passing lane for a two-length victory in a career best of 1:52.3 for driver Ridge Warren.

Perfectly positioned along the pylons as Lex (Kyle Wilfong) and Fox Valley Aubrey battled for control of the proceedings Warren had the daughter of Yankee Skyscraper—B R Golden Girl fit and fresh as the field turned for the money.

"She showed me last week that she was a really nice filly," said Warren. "I kind of got her boxed in and bottled up last week but she paced good and strong all the way to the wire. I knew if I could find some room for her tonight she was going to be a big threat."

Unleashing a wicked closing burst after moving into the passing lane the Nick Prather trained miss easily reeled in the pace setters and then drew clear for her eighth win in 14 career starts. Lex was forced to settle for the bridesmaid role on this night while Fox Valley Aubrey was a hard fought third. Heavy favorite Fox Valley Charm made an early break and wound up finishing last.

Fox Valley Brooke obviously caught the eye of the astute handicappers with her effort last week as she returned \$11.20, \$4.40 & \$3.40 off an 8-1 morning line. With the win the filly now has earnings of \$56,684.

Up next was the \$112,000 Pete Langley Memorial which attracted a field of 10 sophomore pacing colts.

Fresh off a win in the Dudley Hanover Stake down in DuQuoin Dinky Dune continued his "dream season" as he rolled to a one-length victory in a career best of 1:51.4 giving driver Pat Curtin and trainer Dane May their first Super Night championships.

Working out a second over trip while Earndawg (Todd Warren) carved out splits of 28.0, 56.1 & 1:24.0 Curtin had the son of Duneside Perch—Dream Hand in perfect striking position as the field turned for home.

"All night I had my mind set on wanting to get into the two-hole with this horse," said a very excited Curtin. "Then right before we went out there Dane said to me Pat please just give him a trip and try to be second over with him and that's what happened. Dane was definitely right on with that one!"

Gradually reeling in a tiring Earndawg Dinky Dune was well in hand to Curtin as he charged home in 27.2 to record his sixth win 14 starts this season. Earndawg turned in a game effort from the 10-hole to finish second while longshot Mighty Hot Shot (Ridge Warren) was third.

The winner returned \$7.80, \$4.40 & \$3.20 while upping his career earnings to \$84,852.

The richest event of the night was saved for last as a field of nine closed out the night in the \$187,000 Orange & Blue Stake.

Taking advantage of some brisk early fractions, Kay Willis's Dan D Dune came flying through the stretch to win by a half-length in a career best of 1:53.3 for driver Mike Oosting.

Pacing along third over while Royale Rose (Matt Krueger) faced constant pressure through splits of 26.4, 56.2 & 1:25.1 Oosting moved the Nelson Willis trained son of Duneside Perch—Witch Hanover three deep as the field hit the head of the stretch.

"I was a little concerned with how far back we were but I knew those horses up front were getting roughed up pretty good," said Oosting. "This horse has always finished up a mile well though and I knew if they faltered at all up there we were going to get there in time."

Picking up one rival after another the Governor's Cup winner zoomed right on a by with a well measured move from Oosting for his fifth win of his career. Wondrous Sport (Casey Leonard) was a tough luck second while BS Tyrrific (Kyle Wilfong) was third.

The ultra-consistent gelding returned \$17.20, \$6.80 & \$3.80 while running his record to 5-5-1 in 12 starts with earnings of \$119,431.

A crowd of just over 6,000 turned out and wagered more than \$1.4 million on the 13-race card.

From The Meadows Watchdog

Race 2 on Friday, 9/11, saw another lack of due diligence by the Meadows race office, starter and proofreaders. Friday races are usually drawn on Monday mornings with scratch time and driver selections needed by Tuesday at 10 a.m. This is done so the program can be submitted to the printer on Tuesday. However, with the holiday schedule being in effect, these Friday races were drawn on Tuesday, with corrections made that morning.



The race was originally drawn with an entry, the 1 horse being Synonymous Hanover (post 3); the other part was Encore Gold 1A and was scratched early Tuesday before the program went to the printers. When Encore Gold was scratched, the race office run by Tom Leasure or designated proofreader should have made the correction and put all

horses by numerical order by post position in the electronic system. Which means someone had to think (do their job) and make the change. For whatever reason the correction was not made and the starter (Joe Denman) along with all drivers of the 1, 2 and 3 horses in the race did not line up properly behind the gate and the race was run. Yes, this is the same race office and starter that had the male horse programmed in a F & M race earlier this year, and the same starter that didn't realize a horse was missing from the gate in May, 2014 and that race was run. Totally unacceptable and inexcusable. Following the race, Kevin Decker (GM) ordered a full refund. When speaking with Mr. Decker by phone, I inquired as to why. He explained that it was the right thing to do for the wagering public, however the horsemen would be paid. With this being a \$60,000 stake race, I asked what would have happened had this occurred in one of the \$350,000 Pa Finals. He did state the race could possibly be rerun at a later date based on discussions with all horsemen in the race if agreed upon. I did make a suggestion to him so this programming error could not happen again, and he agreed.

Jeff Zidek, who was filling in for Mr. Huston for the broadcast, goes on to explain how entries work and when horses are coupled or uncoupled. Mr. Zidek is very knowledgeable about the game, but sometimes gives you only half the story. For those of you that don't know, many of the feature races (not stake races, pace or trot) usually contain two or three Ron Burke horses that race uncoupled. This is done so the race can be filled with a minimum of six

starters needed for the race to go with the blessing of the Pa. Race Commission. The inside posts are usually filled by horses that don't belong and are basically weekly gifts for the Burke barn. On another note, Mr. Zidek, puts out his tip sheet by "The Professor" which is fine. However when Mr. Zidek does the broadcast, his broadcast selections often differ from his tip sheet. But then again, Mr. Huston gets two sets of selections also. Mr. Huston will often state the "morning line was right on that one, or a Bingo, Bango, Boxo" for the morning line if it was correct or if his personal selection is correct, more of the same jargon is provided. When I did speak with Anthony Clark (new PJ) I explained to him that he would have his hands full, and he does, from top to bottom. Racing with entries needs to be totally revisited in Pa and addressed. When Jonathan Newman took over as Chairman for Pa racing, he promised changed. Approximately 2 years later, very little has. Takter Should Apologize to Trond

How sad was it to hear our leading trainer offer such a crude and petty response about a fellow trainer/driver when discussing the placings in the Yonkers Trot? Talk about poor sportsmanship, I think Mr. Takter should issue an apology to Trond Smedshammer.

I am surprised the results were changed due to a driver objection! Where were the judges?? Did they not see what was going on with the entry during the race? It was pretty obvious that Corey Callahan took well hold of French Laundry at the quarter pole to give Yannick Gingras and Pinkman a hole. It was further very obvious that Callahan pulled French Laundry going to the half and sat on the outside to impede the progress of Southwind Mozart until Gingras pulled Pinkman.

Section 4117.4 of the New York Gaming Commission Rules regarding driving violations states: "The following shall be deemed racing infractions: j. helping another horse improve position." Callahan twice helped Gingras improve Pinkman's position. First, sitting third on the rail is

definitely an improvement over being stuck on the outside. Second, Callahan sat on the outside making no progress (or as John Hernan said "laboring on the outside") until his entry-mate finally pulled nearing the three-quarter pole at which point he had no problem advancing until Pinkman momentarily stalled in front of him in the last turn.

Bill Finley recently bemoaned the fact the entries were coupled in wagering. Here's a perfect example as to why entries need to be treated as one for betting purposes. Too often, one horse of an entry is used to benefit the other. Takter has used this tactic before (remember his drive on Scream And Shout in the 2014 Del Miller, where he sat on the outside and blocked the favorite to benefit Shake It Cerry?).

Interesting the Judges took Takter off his drives in the Sire Stakes Championships at Pocono Saturday night as well. Although it does not appear to matter on a Takter entry whether Jimmy is one of the drivers or not! Whenever there is an entry, there is a great potential for collusion and even if there is none, the public will have the perception that one part of the entry is helping the other in some way. Perhaps no trainer should be allowed to enter more than one horse in a race, no matter what the purse or condition.

I don't think the connections of Buen Camino (or Billy Flynn for that matter) think that should be the case.

Takter, Takter, Takter

Trainer Jimmy Takter entered three in a Canadian Trotting Classic elimination Saturday. He drove one. Wife Christina owns all three. Mohawk made them separate betting interests. That means Takter drove against two horses he trains and are owned by his wife.

Imagine explaining this to a person watching races for the first time. A trainer/driver has a financial interest in three horses, but a bet is treated as though there is no

connection. Is he driving the best horse? Will one horse be used to help the others? Will drivers of the other two try to beat the person who "hired" them? A bettor hopes to figure out Takter's strategy, but it's just a guess. It's also an elimination race. No need to push any of the horses since finishing fifth or better in the seven horse field means the opportunity to go for much bigger money next Saturday.

In the end, Takter can take four into the final. Two from each elimination. Likely to be separated for betting and he'll likely drive against his horses again. Don't blame Takter (for this issue). He didn't create the eliminations or the betting setup. Ask why it makes sense to track management and Ontario regulators.
