In Her Blood

Jessica Buckley, the new president of Mohawk Racetrack, grew up on a thoroughbred breeding farm and developed a passion for racehorses of both breeds that resulted in more than two decades worth of experience in racing boardrooms.

On a sweltering
August Saturday 10
summers ago, Jessica
Buckley was determined
not to let her brother
and father have all the
fun racing Pampered
Princess against the
boys in the
Hambletonian. At the
last minute, Buckley and
her mother cooked up a
plan to jump on a plane
from Ontario to New
Jersey.

"We didn't tell my brother or my dad that we were coming," Buckley said, laughing at the memory. "We spent the whole day sneaking around The Meadowlands, having the best time. We saw them a few times and were sort of jumping behind pillars and laughing hysterically that we were there and they didn't know it. The plan was that we were going to meet them in the winner's circle after she won.

Unfortunately, she didn't have a great race that day. Donato Hanover was the big winner that day, but it was just a really exciting day to be down there and take in the Hambletonian."

Pampered Princess — owned then by Buckley's brother, David Anderson, and her father, Bob Anderson — was sitting third at the top of the stretch when she made a break and finished seventh-placed-sixth a week after winning her

Hambletonian elimination.

"I remember there were a bunch of young girls at the rail that were holding up signs saying, 'Princess Power' and 'Girl Power," Buckley said.

She shares the story not only to illustrate her lifelong passion for horse racing, but as something of an introduction to the standardbred community she will be working with as the new president of Mohawk Racetrack.

Girl power, indeed.

Buckley grew up at Anderson Farms, a thoroughbred nursery in St. Thomas, ON, but wants the harness racing industry to know she has respect and appreciation for standardbreds, a breed that also became her brother and father's passion for a time.

"We want to make Woodbine at Mohawk Park, which it will soon be called, the number one harness track in North America," she said. "That's our goal and we've got tremendous opportunity there because our racing is so strong and we have such committed horsepeople."

David Anderson may be biased, but he is certain his sister is up to the challenge.

"The horses are in her pedigree and she's more than capable of doing the work and I think she's a much-needed addition to that racetrack," Anderson said. "She's very bright and she's tough... she will be very tough, and take a tough stance on integrity, which is much-needed in the game. I think her leadership skills are second to none and she's going to do a great job."

Buckley began working in the horse racing industry fresh out of university 23 years ago. In 1994, she was hired at the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) — which was still called the Ontario Jockey Club in those days.

"I was here at a time when there were a lot of new things happening, there was technology coming into play and I was part of the team that launched Horseplayer Interactive," Buckley said, adding that she was also involved with the launch of the complimentary racing television service. "That was an exciting time, the first account wagering service to be launched (in Canada).

"I then had an opportunity to go to the U.S. with Magna Entertainment and help launch account wagering in California, which they were legalizing account wagering in the 2001 and 2002 timeframe. I was there for the launching of Xpressbet... I was also involved with Horse Racing Television, which was Magna Entertainment's cable TV


channel. I was part of the launch of that service and the development of that cable network to over 20 million subscribers and then it was bought out by TVG."

She remained with Magna for nine years before returning to WEG. The last two years, prior to taking on the role as president of Mohawk beginning Sept. 5, Buckley was WEG's vice-president of community relations and corporate affairs.

"Having an understanding of the game, whether it's thoroughbred or standardbred, she's going to be able to talk at the same level as the horsemen and I think that's really needed in our sport," Anderson said. "I think we've gotten away from that a bit with some executives and she's got both – the horse background and she's got the boardroom skills."

The president of Mohawk position is a new one created after WEG opted to move toward year-round standardbred racing at the Milton, ON plant, leaving Woodbine Racetrack to the thoroughbreds.

"I think with having Mohawk be a 12-month-a-year operation, we wanted to have some leadership in Milton and that was really the genesis of the change," Buckley said. "We've got an amazing opportunity to be out there 12 months a year and grow the fan base and get more people interested in horse ownership and all the rest."



She said her first priority is to work with a new gaming operator expected to be announced this month and then prepare the Mohawk plant for year-round racing.

"I think the priority is going to be the winterization initiatives to get the facility ready for year-round racing and ready to re-open in the spring of 2018. So, I'll be focused on that," she said. "I'll also be focused on pulling the team together and getting everyone ready. Working with the gaming partner, most definitely, will be a big piece of what's happening. We expect in the next couple of weeks to know who that gaming partner is and they'll be doing some likely interim expansion in the building and then leading to something larger.

"We're also working closely with the town of Milton because the town has been a great supporter of Mohawk and standardbred racing. They are extremely excited about having more of an entertainment destination on our site.

"Also, I'm looking forward to working with the horsepeople. I certainly need to make it a priority to get to know them and earn their trust and I look forward to that."

Buckley said plans for potential development of the 440-acre Mohawk property into an entertainment district are in the early stages.

"We plan to have other uses on the site, which will help drive more people and we would like to get those people interested in racing," she said.

Asked to project what Mohawk could look like in 10 years, Buckley dreamed big.

"If things go well, I would love to see a full-blown entertainment destination for the region, which includes great attendance at our live racing, five nights a week. A very vibrant site that offers amenities for families and something for everyone. I think we've got that potential there for sure,"

she said.

Growing up watching young horses romp through the paddocks, as the daughter of a man who is enshrined in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame as a builder, Buckley is familiar with dreams without limits — some that turn to fruition. Just this week, her brother David sold a thoroughbred yearling in Kentucky for \$1.1 million.

"My parents bought the farm in St. Thomas and I moved there when I was two years old, so I was lucky enough to grow up on a breeding farm. Certainly, that experience influenced my life greatly. I fell in love with horses," she said. "I really enjoyed being out with the mares and foals and just the excitement in the spring when the foals would come along. It was a wonderful, wonderful life as a child, to be around that all the time."

Rockin Serena carrying Indiana's flag into Jugette

The Rockin Image filly will be testing Grand Circuit competition for the first time for the trainer/driver duo of Melanie and Peter Wrenn.

Next week's Jugette at the Delaware County Fair will offer an Indiana flavor as Rockin Serena is slated to compete. Trained by Melanie Wrenn, the sophomore pacing filly has won three of 11 starts in 2017, and looks to mix it up on the Grand Circuit for the first time this season. The Rockin Image—Day Lily Hanover lass will enter the Jugette after a 1:52.2 victory in an Indiana Sires Stakes consolation and subsequent qualifier Sept. 13 at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

Purchased out of the Hoosier Classic sale for \$82,000 in 2015, Rockin Serena has put together a solid campaign in 2017 for her connections. She has finished worse than fourth only twice, hitting the board seven times for the partnership of The Kales Company LLC, Dolne Farm Services LLC, S&R Racing Stables and Wrenn Racing LLC. That's a significant



accomplishment when competing against a very competitive group of Indiana-sired fillies.

"I don't think anybody has totally dominated the group. I think anybody, in a good week, can pick up some pieces," said Rockin Serena's driver Peter Wrenn. "There is a lot of depth. I give any one of them a lot of credit. I think it's going to be an exciting final."

Through four rounds of eliminations and \$75,000 finals there has proven to be no clear leader. A different filly has reached the winner's circle each time, with Rockin Serena getting her chance on Aug. 2. In that event, Wrenn and his filly were sent off at 11-1 odds, but they managed to make it to the wire first in a lifetime best 1:52.1. That night, a full second was all that separated the winner from the last place horse. The victory, paired with a third-place effort in another final, gives the three-year-old enough points for the \$220,000 Super Final next month at Hoosier Park.

"I think she's a real usable filly. I don't know how in-depth she is," the driver said. "She's not going to overpower any of them on her own, but she has enough ability to follow and pick up some pieces if things go wrong."

Rockin Serena's progression this season is what Wrenn hoped to see after a 2016 season that showed glimpses of brilliance. As a freshman, the pacer made five starts for her connections, finishing on the board four times and banking \$56,525. She registered victories in an Indiana Sires Stakes elimination and final, but the filly also missed most of August and September.

"She had some immaturity issues. Her bone density just wasn't filled in completely in her hind cannon bones, so we didn't push her," Wrenn said. "We never did anything exotic with her, but we did the right thing. Coming back this year she's been good so far, and she's matured up."

Racing exclusively at Hoosier Park this season, Rockin Serena has developed into a filly that can contend for the division in Indiana. Before she takes on her in-state rivals, however, Wrenn will test her at Delaware next week. It won't be her first time over the famed oval, as she's had several training opportunities in anticipation of entering the Jugette.

"We've had her on a different training program prepping her for her stake next week in Delaware," Wrenn said. "She has trained over that track many times, and she seems to be pretty good on the track."

Rockin Serena, now a winner of just over \$130,000, will carry the hopes of the partnership into Delaware off a 1:56.2 qualifier Wednesday morning. In that race, the filly controlled the pace through fractions of 27.2, 58.1 and 1:28.2 before crossing the wire six lengths in front.

"I decided to qualify because we don't race for a while," said Wrenn. "I wanted to make sure she had some sort of workout a week prior."

The veteran driver has tasted victory in the Jugette before. In 1996, he steered the Chuck Sylvester-trained Paige Nicole Q to a 1:53.1 elimination win before following with a 1:55.3 triumph in the \$164,592 final. That day the Beach Towel—Turn To Stone filly received every call on the way to a nearly two-length victory as the second choice.

The Jugette will provide Rockin Serena the chance to compete against some top-caliber fillies. She has shown she can produce speed, now it's a matter of seeing how that translates over Delaware's speedy half-mile configuration. Wrenn said that the Jugette may determine whether the sophomore competes in other stakes in the next two months.

"I thought she deserved a chance. She's been healthy and sound and feeling well. She gets over a small track well," he said. "She'll be in against quality fillies in a prestigious race, possibly going two heats. She's a big filly that carries a lot of depth to her. I don't think that (heats) will hinder her."

Blazin Britches favored in 47th Jugette

Eleven fillies will vie for \$273,250 Wednesday at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

Blazin Britches, winner of nine of 10 races this season, has been installed as the 6-5 morning line favorite in the \$273,250 Jugette three-year-old filly pace on Wednesday, Sept. 20 at the Delaware County Fair.

The daughter of the 2010 Little Brown Jug champion, Rock N Roll Heaven, owns a lifetime mark of 1:48.4 and has earned \$203,392. The Brian Brown trainee will leave from post three in the first of two eliminations and will be piloted by Trace Tetrick for Emerald Highlands Farm. Her current five-race winning streak includes wins in the \$63,475 Adioo Volo, the \$113,950 Shady Daisy and the \$160,000 Nadia Lobell.

Emerald Highlands and Brian Brown are also expected to challenge in the 72nd Little Brown Jug with Fear The Dragon.

Obvious Blue Chip (Scott Zeron) is the second choice at 4-1 from post four. Mark Steacy trains the daughter of Roll For Joe for NLG Racing and Stephen Klunowski. Obvious Blue Chip has earned \$264,073 during her career.

Caviart Alley is the favorite in the six-horse second

\$54,650 elimination. Andrew McCarthy was named to pilot the daughter of Bettor's Delight for Caviart Farm. The Noel Daley trainee has been first or second in her last five starts. She owns a 1:50.2 mark and has earned \$475,700 during her career.

The second and third choices in the second elimination are Tequila Monday (Brett Miller) and Idyllic Beach (Yannick Gingras).

The top four elimination finishers will advance to the \$163,950 second heat. The winner of the second heat will be declared the Jugette champion.

Morrisville's lasting legacy

Sunday's Morrisville Equine College Yearling Sale is key in helping provide a future for the sport's next generation.

Dave Hanson of Lakeview Equine of West Eaton, NY, said Sunday's Morrisville Equine College Yearling Sale at Morrisville State College in Morrisville, NY is much more than a yearling sale.

"It's a big thing for the (Morrisville) students," Hanson said.
"It's the same in that aspect as it was when I ran the sale. It
is the one event that all the disciplines work together to pull
off. The hunt seat students are here. The western riding
students are here. The draft horse, the thoroughbred and,
obviously, the standardbred students are here. They all get
together and pull off what is really a pretty significant
fundraiser here for the equine program."

Yearling sale administrator Mary Taylor said, "the money from the sale goes back into the equine program. The students in the program are involved in one way or another with the sale — either as grooms, first leaders, second leaders, office, parking... it's all different phases of the sale."

Preferred Equine's David Reid is also a big fan of the Morrisville sale, which will sell some 80 yearlings beginning Sunday at noon.

"I always love going back to Morrisville College to attend the sale," Reid said. "This year we have a large consignment, as we are representing yearlings from leading breeders like Crawford Farm, Brittany Farms, White Birch Farm, Lindy Farms. We have a cross section of trotters and pacers that I believe are going to have a lot of appeal for the buyers."

Reid said he also appreciates the greater impact the sale has on the equine community.

"It's an established venue. It supports the equine division of not only the college, but also New York state," he said. "It continuously turns out graduates that participate in the industry today, in key roles at farms and operations."

Taylor said the sale is key in helping the students to make contacts and get jobs.

"They are not all standardbred students, but through working with the consignors, especially as grooms, they get exposure... they make contacts with Preferred or other consignors and might go to another sale and work for those consignors," she said. "The breeding kids and those in the standardbred program – we do stand stallions – the kids make contacts to get internships. The breeding students, the

last semester of their fourth year they have to go out on a 15-week internship, so they make contacts in the industry."

In 2016, 81 yearlings grossed \$1,106,136 at Morrisville for an average of \$13,656 that was down 12.1 per cent from the 2015 sale average of \$15,540 when 19 fewer horses were sold. Last year's average was up 27.5 per cent from the 2014 average of \$10,714 and up 33.3 per cent from the 2013 average of \$10,246.

Last year, Morrisville was impacted by direct competition from the Goshen Yearling Sale that had its sale the same weekend. This year, the sales are separated by a week. Goshen's sale was last Sunday.

"I know they talk about the sale down state and how it attracts the guys out of Jersey and Pennsylvania, but this sale has always attracted those people, too," Hanson said. "If you've got a horse worth buying, I don't care where you're selling. You could sell it in a field in the middle of Minnesota and somebody is going to show up and buy it."

Hanson is selling 10 yearlings this year, about the same as he sold at last year's sale.

"It's a nice group overall," Hanson said of his consignment.
"It's nice to have a So Surreal filly in here. The So Surreals seem to be very well accepted and they sold well at Goshen, so it's kind of nice to have her in the consignment."

Last year, Hanson consigned the sale topper, Thunderman, a son of Conway Hall out of Ann's Promise that sold to Chris Oakes for \$55,000.

"(This year), I also have the full brother to Thunderman, Charlieman... He's a nice colt, a very nice colt," Hanson said.

The fact Morrisville is a local sale is a huge positive for Hanson and other consignors in the region.

"This is a nice sale because it is closer to down state for a number of people, including myself. I live eight miles from (Morrisville) and it's a lot easier to run over here and sell horses and go home every night than it is to go away for three or four days," Hanson said. "A lot of local trainers sell here and that's really what it's all about. The people that sell here are usually within a couple of hours of Morrisville and it fits their bill. There's some pretty nice horses in this sale. They are good breeders, too. Just because they may only breed four or five doesn't mean they don't have horses worth looking at."

Hanson added that the weather for Sunday is predicted to deliver summer conditions.

"It looks gorgeous," Hanson said.

Meadowlands' new Survivor wager generating chatter

There's a new bet coming at The Meadowlands Racetrack, and it generated a lot of chatter on social media this week as bettors debated whether it's a good bet for the average player.

The new bet, The Pick 10 Survivor wager, requires the selection of the winner in the first 10 races on the program and it works as the name suggests. If you survive race 1 by picking the winner, you move on with other bettors that tabbed the winning horse and so on for each race. This continues until there is only one correct ticket ("The Survivor") or all 10 races have been completed. This first-of-its-kind wager will debut when the New Jersey harness track opens its Fall/Winter Meet on Saturday, Nov. 4.


The lone surviving ticket will win the entire pool minus the wager's 15-per cent takeout. If there are multiple tickets that survive through all 10 legs, or are the last surviving tickets eliminated at the same time, they will split the net pool. The wager will carry a 20-cent minimum and begin each night on the first race. There is no carryover associated with the wager. The Meadowlands is partnering with the USTA's Strategic Wagering Program to guarantee the wagering pool at \$10,000.

"We think it is imperative for our industry to innovate and create new ways to wager on our product for our core customers," said Jason Settlemoir, Meadowlands GM/COO. "We believe the horseplayers will love the fact that the winner takes down the entire pool each night. The Pick 10 Survivor is the result of lots of hard work and dedication from both our staff at the Meadowlands and our partners at Spartech and I would like to thank everyone who has helped get us to this position."

There were differing opinions being tossed around on whether this wager offers a good opportunity for the average bettor, or if they become fodder for the "whales" by placing a Survivor bet.

Driver Yannick Gingras started the ball rolling last night on Twitter with this tweet: "Love the new survivor bet @TheMeadowlands Hope it takes off because I can see this becoming V75 like." His tweet was met with varying opinions on the bet's chance to succeed with some tweeters – like @InsideThePylons – stating that the bet was essentially a "David vs. Goliath" situation for the smaller bettors, who are almost guaranteed to cash \$0 virtually every time due to being disadvantaged from a coverage standpoint.

Prominent owner Mark Weaver, who isn't shy to tell you he



loves to bet, doesn't seem fazed by the possibility of whales buying big tickets. "Large players will have no bigger advantage with this wager then they do with any other, in fact they might be worse off here," he theorizes. "You're not realizing how expensive it gets to just throw in all horses that have a chance. If the pot was \$50 million then I could see this being a possibility, but with the pot being anywhere from 10k-500k there is no added advantage to the bigger player. There are just too many combinations for it to be relevant. Like I've told other people, I'll gladly put my money where mouth is and I'll play 300 units and they can play up to 30,000 units, and we can do it on any track that has 10 races. We blindly give our tickets to Garnet 30 minutes to post time and see who lasts longer. It would be fun."

Darin Zoccali – former director of racing at The Meadowlands – opined that the whales had the upper hand in a wager of this type: "The problem isn't that the whale has 3,000 combinations. The problem is he will front load the combinations just to out-last you. Barring a miracle, you have no chance."

Justin Horowitz, media relations manager for The Meadowlands, said The Big M's brass is listening to feedback from customers that has been coming in steadily since the new bet was announced. "It's a totally new wager and we think there are a lot of different ideas about the wager," he said. "We have heard from many players both in the building here at The Meadowlands and on social media that are excited about the wager. They are intrigued by the possibility of a huge score and the challenge of outlasting the rest of the horseplayers. Since it is so new and never been done before, I think we will learn a lot as the bet plays out."

Time will tell if this new, unique wager can sustain long-term success, but one thing's for sure; it's already creating quite a buzz and that isn't necessarily a bad thing.

Mambo Lindy hoping to boogie all the way to the Maple Leaf Trot winner's circle

The trotter from Massachusetts is hoping to score his first major stakes victory tonight in prime time at Mohawk.

It is unusual for a horse to have his first major stakes win come in the Maple Leaf Trot, but 6-year-old Mambo Lindy will try to do it tonight. If he does, he will join impressive company.

The most recent horse to win the Maple Leaf Trot without any prior unrestricted major stakes experience was San Pail in 2009. It was the first of three consecutive victories in the Maple Leaf Trot for the "Pail," who in 2011 was named Horse of the Year in both the U.S. and Canada and finished his career with \$3 million in purses.

Mambo Lindy, who was unraced at ages 2 and 3, will attempt to join San Pail in moving from winning

predominately at the open level of competition to capturing one of harness racing's top events for older trotters. Last week, Mambo Lindy won his Maple Leaf Trot elimination at odds of 26-1 in a lifetime-best 1:52.2. He is 9-2 on the morning line for tonight's C\$593,000 final at Ontario's Mohawk Racetrack.

Hannelore Hanover, a 5-year-old mare who won the first of the two Maple Leaf Trot eliminations in 1:52, is the 5-2 favorite. Swedish-bred mare Pasithea Face, also a 5-year-old, is the 4-1 second choice. Hannelore Hanover finished second to Resolve in last year's Maple Leaf Trot. Resolve failed to advance to this year's final.

Scott Zeron will drive Mambo Lindy in the Maple Leaf Trot. Tim Tetrick drove the gelding in his elimination, but will drive Pasithea Face in the final.

"I think he's coming in as sharp as anyone in there, as far as current form," said Frank M. Antonacci, the co-owner and trainer of Mambo Lindy. "I wouldn't want him sitting on my back turning for home. He knows how to go by horses in the stretch, so if he's anywhere in striking distance I would be

surprised if he's not moving forward.

"If it's enough to get him the win, I don't know. But he's a real good honest horse. We've mainly been racing him every other week. This time he's racing in back-to-back weeks and whenever he's done that before he's put forth a razor-sharp effort. Hopefully that's the case again."

Mambo Lindy, a son of 2007 Horse of the Year Donato Hanover out of the Dan Patch Award-winning mare Rum Boogie, has spent the majority of his career competing at Plainridge Park in Massachusetts. He has won 22 of 36 career races, with 19 of the victories coming in his 30 starts at Plainridge. He has earned \$169,260 in lifetime purses.

A lack of maturity and an injury prevented Mambo Lindy, owned by the Antonacci family's GreatHorse stable, from getting to the races until he was a 4-year-old.

"He was very difficult to get going as a 2-year-old," Antonacci said. "He always had high speed, but he paid attention to everything but his business. We knew he had a lot of talent, so it was very frustrating.

"We gelded him, and that was one thing that made a big difference. But I think it's really just age. We worked him through the ranks at Plainridge and he learned how to be a nice horse and win races. Now he's the ultimate professional; you can do anything you want with him.

"He's the pride of Massachusetts. He's just a really cool horse."

Antonacci credited driver Greg Merton, who has driven Mambo Lindy regularly at Plainridge, for assisting with the horse's development.

"He's always taken care of him, put him in the right spots, let him learn how to be a racehorse," Antonacci said. "He's done a really good job bringing him along as well."

Although this will be Mambo Lindy's first major stakes appearance, it is not for a lack of trying. Antonacci hoped to send Mambo Lindy to the Spirit of Massachusetts and the John Cashman Memorial, but the horse was shut out because those races were filled based on earnings.

"It's a pet peeve of mine," Antonacci said. "I think too many of these races have gone to the earnings instead of eliminations. A horse like this guy, he hasn't had a chance to race anybody because those open races are based on lifetime earnings. I understand the reason some races are like that, but I'm glad the Maple Leaf Trot is not one of them."

In addition to the Maple Leaf Trot, Antonacci will have his eyes on the C\$684,000 Canadian Trotting Classic for 3-year-old trotters. Antonacci's International Moni is the 3-1 morning-line favorite from post five and his Lindy The Great is 15-1 from the outside post 10.

"I think International Moni is in a great spot," Antonacci said. "He shows up every week. He's just a tough, consistent horse. I think he'll be right there. He's had a good week and he seems good and healthy right now. I expect him to be good. I would have liked a better draw with Lindy The Great, but he's a pretty fresh horse. If he can somehow find a trip and work it out, he's a big strong powerful fresh horse that can unleash some big miles the rest of the year."

Beckhams Z Tam much the best in ISS action

Beckhams Z Tam and driver Ricky Macomber Jr. turned in a dominant performance to make a clean sweep of the final round of Indiana Sires Stakes action after they captured Friday's featured event, the \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings, at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. With a final time of 1:50.1, Beckhams Z Tam notched his second consecutive victory at Hoosier Park and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Unhurried from the gate, Beckhams Z Tam settled along the rail in sixth while Rock N Tony and Trace Tetrick were on a mission to the front from post four. Air Strike and Peter Wrenn protected their rail position to grab a pocket seat while Southern Flight and Dale Hiteman were following intently in third.

Rock N Tony clicked off fractions of :26.1 and :54.3 while the field remained in single file line down the backside. Macomber Jr. gave Beckhams Z Tam the green light just past the half and he began his mission to the front with authority.

Reaching the third station in 1:23.1, Rock N Tony continued to call the shots but Beckhams Z Tam was closing in with every stride. Macomber Jr. asked his mount for more and Beckhams Z Tam responded with a :26.4 final quarter to power on to the wire under a hand drive finishing four lengths to the good. Southern Flight utilized a ground saving trip to get up for second while Rock N Tony held on for third. As the 2-5 betting favorite, Beckhams Z Tam returned \$2.80 to his backers at the betting windows.

"I didn't want to be on the front this week," Macomber Jr. noted after the win. "I didn't really want to be first-up either but that's the way it worked out. I didn't have to pull the plugs until we got to Trace's horse (Rock N Tony) and once I did, he found another gear. He did everything I asked of him."

Trained by Hoosier Park's second leading trainer, Jamie Macomber, Beckhams Z Tam recorded his 10th victory from 15 seasonal starts and 10th lifetime win from 21 outings. The three-year-old son of Always A Virgin—Sara's Lucky Charm is owned by the Z Tam Stables LLC and pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$212,044 with the victory. The victory was also one of three wins on the evening for driver Ricky Macomber Jr.

Finally, I especially want to thank my predecessor, Bill Farish, for his outstanding dedication, leadership and expertise in serving the Breeders' Cup as chairman."

Hertrich, born in Detroit, graduated from Bucknell University with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration in 1968. In 1975, Hertrich became the youngest Ford dealer in the United States, forming Frederick Ford Mercury in Seaford, DE. Today, he is the president of the Hertrich Family of Automobile Dealerships, comprising 18 new vehicle dealerships representing 19 different franchises in Delaware, Maryland, Colorado and New Jersey, ranking them in the top 50 privately owned retail automobile groups in North America.

Over the years, Hertrich has been actively involved in both the standardbred and thoroughbred industries in Maryland, Delaware and Kentucky. Under Hertrich's proprietorship at Watercress Farm, 14 graded stakes winners and over 60 graded stakes placed or listed winners have been bred, raised and sold commercially from Watercress, including Grader 1 winner and champion Shamardal and Grade 1 winners, Boys of Tosconova and Street Boss. This year's 2-year-old crop is represented by undefeated Grade 3 winner Catholic Boy.
