What The Hill (David Miller) set a 1:51.4 stakes record while winning the \$684,000 Canadian Trotting Classic at Mohawk.

Trainer Ron Burke said What The Hill's victory in Saturday's \$684,000 Canadian Trotting Classic (CTC) doesn't erase being disqualified after the colt reached the wire first in the Hambletonian, but it helps "a little bit."

"But then you start thinking if he wasn't taken down (in the Hambletonian) he's a Peter Haughton winner, a Canadian Trotting Classic winner and a Hambletonian winner. Now, the horse is starting to put together a little bit of a resume," said Burke, who also won the \$593,000 Maple Leaf Trot later in the card with Hannelore Hanover.

In the CTC, What The Hill converted off of a similar pocket trip to find redemption with a 1:51.4 stakes record victory that came in just his second start since a month-long layoff to recover from throat surgery.

"I knew that he was probably not going to be as tight as we needed him to be," Burke said of What The Hill's third-place finish in his CTC elimination a week ago. "I knew one more week would make a huge difference."

The son of Muscle Hill out of K T Cha Cha followed behind Long Tom and driver Tim Tetrick as they posted fractions of :27.1, :55.4 for the half and 1:23.3 for three-quarters. Into the stretch, driver David Miller angled What The Hill off cover



and fed the colt open racetrack where he was quick to respond. What The Hill then breezed past Long Tom to capture the rich final and also earn a new speed badge in the process. Dover Dan rallied to finish second, three lengths behind the victor. Long Tom faded to third.

"I figured I would be following Timmy (Tetrick and Long Tom) and I was only hoping that someone didn't try to remove on him," said Miller from the winner's circle. "But the trip worked out great. The horse that was first in, I believe was Bills Man. He didn't get to us so I was able to sit in right to the head of the stretch and then my horse exploded."

"It was much more stress-free than the last time," Burke said, laughing, referring to the Hambletonian which he has appealed to the New Jersey courts.

"I was flabbergasted that no one came out and let them go to three-quarters in the race they did and let David get out this time," said co-owner Jerry Silva, who won the 2009 Canadian Trotting Classic with What The Hill's sire Muscle Hill, and also is a part-owner of this year's Maple Leaf Trot winner Hannelore Hanover. "Not like in the Hambletonian when they were all alongside of him and we got disqualified for the first time in 92 years, which I still have doubts about them disqualifying us in that race."

What The Hill notched his fifth victory of the season and eighth lifetime. With the win, the trotting colt now boasts career earnings of \$630,747 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Our Horse Cents Stables, J And T Silva Stables and Deo Volente Farms.

"He's very talented, very good-gaited. He's really a complete package, just does everything very well," Burke said, adding What The Hill is expected to race in the Kentucky Futurity and Breeders Crown.

"I think he'll trot a big mile. He'll love Lexington, so I'm excited to take him down there and see what he does," Burke said, adding that heats won't be an issue for What The Hill.

"Heats don't bother me," Burke said. "He's a big, fat horse. He'll be fine."

What The Hill paid \$7.60, \$5.10, and \$3.70, combining with Dover Dan (\$8, \$4.80) for a \$ 35.70 (4-3) exactor. A 4-3-7 (Long Tom, \$4.20) triactor was worth \$292, while a \$1 superfecta [4-3-7-2 (Bills Man)] returned \$474.80.



Silva scores two big stakes wins as Hannelore Hanover cruises in Maple Leaf Trot

A year after finishing second in the Maple Leaf Trot, Hannelore Hanover turned the table on the boys with a dominant score in Saturday's \$594,000 final at Mohawk.

Owner Jerry Silva had a heck of a night at Mohawk as part of the Ron Burke team that won both the \$684,000 Canadian Trotting Classic (CTC) with What The Hill and the \$594,000 Maple Leaf Trot (MLT) with mare Hannelore Hanover.

"The mare is just so special," said Silva, who bought into the 5-year-old daughter of Swan For All—High Sobriety at the end of 2016. "She just knows what to do, likes to do it and doesn't stand in the winner's circle. She wants to run back into the paddock and around the racetrack again and she can... in control, in control.

"It couldn't be better. I hate to go off at 1-2 because it makes you worry, but with Yannick (Gingeras) and Hannelore – they ease all of your problems. She loves Mohawk. She's tough on the turns, five-eighths or a half is not for her, but

we'll keep her on the big tracks and make a lot of money."

Hannelore Hanover finished second to Resolve in the 2016 Maple Leaf Trot and got her redemption with an impressive 1:51.1 victory in Saturday's final.

Driver Gingras seized the lead heading to the half and proceeded to trot away to a 4 ½ length victory for trainer Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Frank Baldachino and J And T Silva Stables LLC.

"When she's like this, in North America anyway, I'll take on any trotter," said Gingras.

Silva said he'd like to see her take on European trotters one day.

"I've got to talk to Ronnie in Lexington, but maybe he'll think of the Elitlopp, which I've been in two or three times," Silva said. "I wanted to go there with Mission Brief, but Mission Brief didn't want to go there... I say that facetiously, but she sored up and it wasn't in her world. We sold her to Steve Stewart and his team to breed her and hopefully he will get a champion out of her. Then we can buy the baby, because we're really not breeders. We're racehorse people."

In the MLT, JL Cruze shot out to the grab the early lead and posted a snappy opening-quarter of :26.2. Hannelore

Hanover settled into third in the early going, while Gingras waited to make his move.

Hannelore came with a second-quarter rush and secured the lead in time to post a half of :54.3. Odds On Amethyst came first up in the third-quarter and got up to the wheel of the leader, but Gingras got a comfortable third-quarter of :28.4 to lead at that station in 1:23.3.

In the stretch, Hannelore Hanover waved goodbye to her rivals and trotted home strongly in :27.4 for her biggest victory to date. JL Cruze finished second, while Pasithea Face, the other mare in the field, was third. The Superfecta was completed by Warrawee Roo.

"When she's like this you can race her any which you want," said Gingras about moving Hannelore Hanover to the lead. "They told me how good she trained and the great week she had and they sure were right."

The victory is extra special for Hannelore Hanover's connections after coming up just short in last year's event.

"Last year she raced her heart out and was second to Resolve in a great race," said co-owner Baldachino. "For her to comeback a year later and actually win it, it's real sweet and very special."

Hannelore Hanover is now six for 10 this season with \$634,986 earned. The talented trotting mare surpassed \$2 million in career earnings with her 32nd career win Saturday.

Hannelore Hanover's Maple Leaf Trot victory is the first win in the event for driver Gingras and trainer Burke.

Hannelore Hanover returned \$3, \$2.60, \$2.30. The \$2 Exacta with JL Cruze (\$7.50, \$3.90) paid \$15.70, while the \$1 Trifecta with Pasithea Face (\$3.40) returned \$30.15. The \$1 Superfecta with Warrawee Roo in the fourth-slot paid \$228.10.

Libfeld: Ariana G is a "once in a lifetime" horse

The wonder filly set a stakes, track and Canadian record while winning the \$385,000 Elegantimage final at Mohawk.

Al Libfeld calls Ariana G a "once in a lifetime" horse.

"She's definitely our most exciting horse ever," said Libfeld, who bred and owns the exceptional daughter of Muscle Hill—Cantab It All with his partner Marvin Katz. "She's special. We can only dream of this type of thing. It's unbelievable."

Saturday at Mohawk, Ariana G lowered the stakes, track and Canadian record with a flashy 1:51.4 score in the \$385,000 Elegantimage Final for three-year-old trotting fillies on Saturday evening at Mohawk, part of the Canadian Trotting Classic and Maple Leaf Trot undercard.

Ariana G, trained by Jimmy Takter, is the second of five foals out of Cantab It All. Her older full-sister All The Time made just shy of \$1 million. Libfeld said other promising young horses out of Cantab It all are coming.

"She has a weanling, full-sister, that's absolutely gorgeous," Libfeld said. "She has a two-year-old (Fleet Admiral) that developed colic on the Thursday before the sale, so we retained him. He got a late start, but he qualified in :56 at Lexington and we're pretty excited about him. Then we have a yearling that got kicked in the head, but he's recovering. He's a Trixton yearling. She's not in foal, but we're hoping for fillies only because we haven't had the best of luck with the colts."

The weanling is named Selena G — to add another pop star to the family. Ariana G is named for Ariana Grande. Libfeld said the plan is to keep Selena G.

"It's a great family that delivers unbelievable performance. The cross works so well with Muscle Hill. We can't get enough of him," he said.

As for Ariana G, the 1-9 heavy favourite and driver Yannick Gingras got away third as Sweet of My Heart and Dream Together took turns leading the field into the backstretch. Sweet of My Heart was the earlier leader past the :26.4 opening panel. Dream Together was then pulled from the pocket and marched to the front.

Before the mid-way point, Ariana G was on the move from third then past the :55.3 half she brushed to the lead and that is where she remained. The homebred filly breezed by the three-quarter pole in 1:23.3 as Dream Together was pulled from the pocket. The 8-1 second choice couldn't catch Ariana G as she opened up by four and one-quarter lengths before crossing the wire. Dream Together stayed for second and Magic Presto was third.

Katz told WEG's Chad Rozema that Ariana G may race next year as a four-year-old.

"Actually, I spoke with Jimmy about it last week. Our plan is to bring her back next year, which is unusual. We typically







won't do that, but she's so talented and we enjoy racing her so much. I think it's great for the sport and great for her. Perhaps, we'll think about Europe or something like that, but the plan right now is to bring her back next year," Katz said.

When it comes time for Ariana G to retire and become a broodmare, Gingras said he will always remember the Takter trainee for her versatility.

"She can do anything you want her to do and she is so smart," said her reinsman. "It also makes my job real easy. She

has high speed like the top fillies I have driven. She is so easy to drive. Every time I get on the racetrack I know I'll see how the race plays out."

Ariana G, who has finished top three in all but one of her 22 lifetime starts, notched her ninth victory of the season and 18th lifetime. With the win, Ariana G lifts her career earnings to \$1,641,772, who following the race were presented with a Breeder of the Year Award from Equestrian Canada.

Ariana G paid \$2.10 and 2.10, combining with Dream Together (\$3.40) for a \$4.40 (4-3) exacta. A 4-3-7 (Magic Presto) trifecta was worth \$7.60, while a \$1 superfecta [4-3-7-9 (Dream Baby Dream)] returned \$18.70. There was no show wagering.







Blue Moon Stride posts stakes record victory in Milton

Pacing mare posts a mild 6-1 upset while setting a 1:48.4 stakes record in the \$256,000 Milton final at Mohawk.

Blue Moon Stride converted off a perfect second-over trip to win Saturday's \$256,000 Milton Stakes at Mohawk Racetrack in a stakes record 1:48.4.

The Mark Harder trained four-year-old pacing mare and driver David Miller followed up their 7-1 upset victory in last week's elimination with a mild 6-1 upset in Saturday's final.

Post-10 starter Witch Dali blasted out from the outside to grab the early lead and post a :26.1 opening-quarter. Wrangler Magic and Pure Country, the 6-5 favourite, were both seeking the lead early and parked around the first turn. Pure Country cleared to the lead nearing the half, but paid a big price by pacing a :53.3 opening-half.

Lady Shadow came out from fourth and committed first up at the half, providing cover for Blue Moon Stride, who was pacing sixth. Pure Country and Lady Shadow dueled by three-quarters in 1:21.1, while Miller was just waiting for the stretch in a perfect second-over spot.

Blue Moon Stride rocketed off cover in the lane and surged to the lead. The mare stormed home in :27.2 to win by

three-quarters of a length over a charging L A Delight. Frost Damage Blues finished third, while Darlinonthebeach was fourth.

A daughter of Rocknroll Hanover—Classic Star, Blue Moon Stride appears to have found her best stride with Miller in the sulky. The duo have now won three races in a row when working together and the four-year-old is arguably at her best right now.

"She's very sharp right now," said Miller. "I talked to Mark (Harder) last night and he assured me that she was coming into the race in great shape and he was absolutely right.

"She's beaten the best ones the last three weeks pretty handily, so yes I'm pretty high on her."

Owned by Emilio and Maria Rosati, Blue Moon Stride is now four for 13 this season with \$243,119 earned. The pacer earned her 14th victory Saturday and pushes her career earnings over \$950,000.

The clocking of 1:48.4 lowered the Milton Stakes record by a full-second. The previous mark of 1:49.4 was set twice by Rocklamation in 2012 and 2013.

A \$2 win ticket on Blue Moon Stride returned \$14.30. The \$2 exacta with runner up L A Delight (\$8.50, \$4.60) paid \$100.50, while the \$1 Trifecta including Frost Damage Blues (\$3.80) paid \$323.20.

Stay Hungry quickest in Metro Pace eliminations

Stay Hungry stalked a contested tempo, swooping to victory in one of three \$40,000 Metro Pace eliminations Saturday at Mohawk Racetrack, going a lifetime-best mile of 1:50.2.

Lost In Time launched to the lead, setting a :27.3 quarter before yielding to Summer Travel into the backstretch. Shadow Moon, on his back, then brushed to the lead passing three-eighths as Lost In Time, anxious behind the pair, tipped wide to reclaim command following a :55.2 half while wide of Shadow Moon.

Past three-quarters in 1:22.4, Shadow Moon retook a narrow lead from Lost In Time turning into the stretch, soon losing it as Lost In Time and Hayden Hanover, moving off cover, overpowered the leader. Stay Hungry, wide of Hayden Hanover, drew alongside the pair into the eighth pole, getting a neck in front of Lost In Time, who took second, and Hayden Hanover in third.

Undefeated in three starts, Stay Hungry, by Somebeachsomewhere from the Dragon Again mare My





Little Dragon, has earned \$75,940 for owners Brad Grant and Irwin Samelman. Trained by Tony Alagna and driven by Doug McNair, he paid \$4.60 to win.

This is kind of where you aim for to start a season," McNair said. "He's coming into the Metro final in good shape — dropped two more seconds off his previous mark and he did it pretty handily. He felt pretty good [while] they were battling up front. He's green once he clears — he hesitates a bit, but he's real smart; he knows what he's doing."

Sent off the 1-5 favourite, Pedro Hanover launched off

cover to take the first elimination of the Metro Pace in 1:51.2.

Floating into fourth approaching the first turn, Pedro Hanover tipped wide to pursue pacesetter Phil The Thrill following a :27 opening quarter, picking up cover from Declan Seelster before the half timed in :56. Phil The Thrill held control around the final turn while undergoing pressure from Declan Seelster, passing three-quarters in 1:24.2.

Both Phil The Thrill and Declan Seelster stalled in their duel through the stretch. Pedro Hanover edged towards the center of the track and grabbed the lead into the eighth pole, kicking clear of Springsteen, who weaved his way into second, and closers Odds On Lauderdale and St Lads Neptune, who finished third in a dead heat.

Owned by Brad Gray and Denise Guerriero, Pedro Hanover, by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Pro Bono Best mare Paulas Best, won for the fifth time in seven starts this season, earning \$260,656. Trained by Andrew Harris and driven by Andrew McCarthy, he paid \$2.60 to win.

"I got very lucky [when] Tim Tetrick couldn't make it up here for the Nassagaweya, and he mentioned my name, so I got to come up and race him up here," McCarthy said. "They went [fast] enough in the first quarter, so I knew that'd take a bit of the sting out of them. As long as I was handy enough at the head of the stretch, I know he's going to kick home in 26-and-change; he can really fly."

Twin B Tuffenuff pulled off a minor upset in the final Metro elimination, winning in 1:51.1 at odds of 7-1.

Settling into fourth through a :26.3 quarter, Twin B Tuffenuff moved first over towards Babes Dig Me, who circled by Trump That to take the lead into the backstretch. Following a :55.3 half, Twin B Tuffenuff crept closer into contention, matching strides with the pacesetter after a

1:23.3 third quarter and soon sweeping to the lead in the stretch. Taste Of History rallied up the rail to take second, while Nutcracker Sweet tipped off cover from second over to finish third.

Owned by Marvin Rounick, Twin B Tuffenuff, by Rock N Roll Heaven out of the Dragon Again mare In The Pink, won his first race in eight starts, earning \$35,830. Trained by Steve Elliot and driven by Brett Miller, he paid \$16.30 to win.

"This is a very nice colt," Brett Miller said. "As you can see on his lines, at the quarter, at the half, he's been 15 lengths off - 15 lengths off at the half and pacing unreal back halves. He has troubles steering, so I knew, if I could ever get him close from the half on, he'd be tough to beat.

"[Elliot] did change his equipment tonight and it helped a little bit. But still, from the last turn to the wire, I was pulling on the right line pretty hard. If I could ever let him go straight, he'd be even faster. He's going to have to show his 'A'-game [next week]; I know he can go with those colts, but it's just a matter of getting the right trip and how he's steering."

The draw for the \$816,000 Metro Pace final took place following the eliminations.





Like Clockwork wins sixth straight, takes Keystone Classic

Wes Delight won the other division Saturday afternoon at The Meadows.

Like Clockwork accelerated out of the final turn and blazed through the lane to extend his career unbeaten streak to six in Saturday's \$83,300 Keystone Classic at The Meadows. Wes Delight captured the other division in the stake for freshman colt and gelding pacers.

Like Clockwork took the Pennsylvania Stallion Series championship on the front end, but winning driver Mike Wilder indicated he was hoping to chase a helmet with the Ponder—Macharoundtheclock gelding in the Keystone Classic.

"I wanted to race him out of a hole," Wilder said. "I've been putting him on the lead because it's just worked out that way. He stepped up to the plate every time. But he's tremendous out of a hole. He just loves a target."

Like Clockwork and Wilder dropped in fourth, followed live cover and poured it on late to triumph in a career-best 1:52.2. Early leader Ideal Flip was second, 1-1/4 lengths back,

with Iluvtomakemoney third. Angela Porfilio sent out Like Clockwork for owner/breeder Birnam Wood Farms.

Wilder noted that Like Clockwork has several stakes remaining, including the Breeders Crown.

"I'm not saying he's that kind of horse, but he sure hasn't shown me he's not, either," Wilder said. "It might sound crazy, but if they would go a 1:21 (three-quarters), they would never get away from him. Who knows what he could do?

Wes Delight was hammered down to 1-9 off his third-place finish in the PA Sires Stake championship, and, abetted by a :29.3 second-quarter breather, he lived up to the billing, downing Go West Go Fast by a measured length in 1:53.1, with Yupper third.

"I hadn't driven him before, but on paper, he looked the best, so I wanted to be on the front," said winning driver Tony Hall. "That second quarter definitely helped." Mark Harder trains the son of Bettor's Delight-Maid West and owns with Rick Phillips and Deena Frost.

The Meadows will take a week's break from live racing to allow the track to prepare facilities and the racing surface for the fall/winter schedule. Live racing resumes Saturday, Sept. 23, first post 1:05 p.m.

Janet Terhune would love to increase membership numbers at the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY, but, more importantly, she wants more people to visit the museum to appreciate what a treasure it is for the industry.

"I welcome, encourage and embrace anyone that wants to join the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame. It's a dime a day, or more, if they are willing. But, really, the biggest thing is that they've got to come and visit us," said Terhune, the museum's executive director. "People who don't even know anything about harness racing go through it and say, 'This is fantastic. I can't believe this has been in this town for the last 66 years and I've never been here.'

"Although the museum is located in Goshen, New York, we never lose sight that it represents the interests of everyone that is connected with harness racing everywhere. It's the

sport's permanent showcase and we are a nationally-recognized, professionally-run museum that houses 70,000 artifacts and we do it very, very well. Each exhibits probably takes two years to come to fruition. It's not just a throw-it-up-on-the-wall-and-hope-it-stays thing. It's a well thought out and deliberate effort.

"The museum strives to be the primary harness racing resource for historical information and artifacts."

Though the museum houses the Hall of Fame and plays host to the annual induction ceremony, Terhune is quick to stress the museum does not elect the Hall of Famers. That's done by the United States Harness Writers' Association (USHWA).

Terhune said the museum had just over 16,000 visitors in 2016. There were 751 museum members at the end of its last fiscal year, a number which is just 4.5 per cent of the 16,582 people who are U.S. Trotting Association members.

Membership, which starts at \$35, "shows industry engagement, which is helpful to us when we are writing grants," Terhune said. "We write a lot of grants, looking for money from corporate or state and federal funding

institutions. The money is there and we try to get it. When your membership is engaged, you stand a better chance of getting those grants, quite honestly. Stand up and get counted as a member. Be proud to be a member of it, because it really is a cool place."

Terhune said Goshen is also in close proximity to a number of major racetracks — some 50 miles north of the Meadowlands, 60 miles north of Yonkers, and 90 miles east of Pocono Downs.

"If you're already there to race, make the trip and spend a couple of hours," Terhune said.

There's always tons to see, including Greyhound's stall which opened to the public on July 2. Terhune said the acquisition of the stall from Doc Flanery's farm — where the great trotter lived in Maple Park, IL from 1950 until his death in 1965 — is an interesting tale of preserving one of harness racing's greatest artifacts.

"The farm was becoming more and more rundown and two women in Illinois were watching it and they received notice



that they were going to raze the building in the spring. So, they went over in November and they took down his entire stall, which was 12 by 21 of oak ceiling, oak walls," Terhune said. "It was a beautiful stall. Took it down, board by board and numbered every single board and drew diagrams and kept great records. They packed it all up and stored it for the winter and then drove it out to the museum in May of 2014.

"We weren't sure where we were going to put it, but we were sure we wanted it. I think it has ended up in the absolute best place that it could possibly be and that's directly off the old stable and directly off the hallway to Haughton Hall. So there's easy accessibility. The sitting room was also dismantled and numbered... It really is a terrific exhibit of his living quarters."

As an indication of the high esteem in which Greyhound was held by his connections, Terhune said, "his stall was air conditioned, but the sitting room was not."

Apart from adding Greyhound's stall to the museum, Terhune and her team have also been busy launching a new website, which can be found at: https://harnessmuseum.com.

"The website project ended up being far longer than it should've been, but it's a vast improvement over the previous site," she said. "You can access much of the collection. You can read about Hall of Famers and their bios. We are continually adding photographs of both horses and humans to their specific entries. That information is now available online for the first time ever."

Terhune is now trying to launch some projects to better preserve important harness racing history. She would like to have past performance microfiche transferred to a digital format.

"This is a really deteriorating medium. Microfiche are stable in a controlled environment, but they are not forever. It's always good to get them to a digital format," Terhune



said.

Though she has wanted to digitize the information for many years, the quotes to perform the work were too high until just recently, she said.

"On a whim last year, I called a company and gave them the details, number of fiche, images. He sent a quote of about \$15,000. Now, we're talking. Now, it's do-able" with help funding the project.

"We are really talking about fleshing out a lot of past performance histories that have never been available before in (the USTA's) Pathway (system) and that's the ultimate goal."

The next step would be to digitize the museum's collection of film, periodicals and books.


"We have an enormous number, probably 8,000 in the library, that are just screaming for help. They are in a controlled environment so they are pretty stable, but none of that is stable for life or forever," Terhune said.

She said the museum's historic collection provides a comprehensive archive tracing the origins of the American Standardbred horse and harness racing from their beginnings among the breeding farms and racetracks of New York State to today's international stage.

"Stamina, speed and an even temperament made the standardbred the perfect road horse. The new trotting bred was also exciting to drive and watch giving rise to a new competitive sport that has left a legacy of beautiful art and complex artifacts" including the nation's preeminent collection of harness drivers' jackets and caps, representing drivers from the late 1800s through today, and more than 570 Currier & Ives lithographs, believed to be the largest compilation of the company's trotting horse prints in the world.

All of it is housed in a 1913 Tudor style horse stable in a pretty little New York town.

Jug draws eight; Brown trainees favored

Trainer Brian Brown will send out Downbytheseaside and Fear The Dragon in Thursday's Little Brown Jug.

It is expected to be a battle between a pair of Brian Brown trainees as Downbytheseaside and Fear The Dragon have been installed as the morning line favorites in the \$590,400 Little Brown Jug, presented by the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, to be held Thursday, Sept. 21 at the Delaware County Fair.

Downbytheseaside was tapped as the 2-1 choice and will leave from post 5 and will be piloted by Brian Sears in the first heat field of eight.

Downbytheseaside comes into the Jug on a four-race win streak, and has won nine-of-13 seasonal starts, including the \$500,000 Art Rooney Pace, the \$500,000 Messenger Stakes, the \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial and the \$125,000 Jug Preview. He owns a lifetime mark of 1:49.2 and has earned just short of \$1.6 million.

The Somebeachsomewhere—Sprig Hanover colt is owned by Country Club Acres, Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and Diamond Creek Racing.

Fear The Dragon drew post 3 and has been made the 7-2 second choice.

The Dragon Again—Armbro Cinnamon colt is owned by Bruce Trogdon's Emerald Highlands Farm and has earned

\$1.2 million during his career.

Fear The Dragon will receive the services of Delaware's all-time winningest driver, David Miller. They teamed up to win the \$730,000 North America Cup, the \$500,000 Max Hempt Memorial and the \$400,000 Adios Pace. He was scratched sick from the \$252,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Final on Sept. 3. He won a qualifying race at Hoosier Park on Sept. 13 in 1:54 over a sloppy track.

The eight entries are the smallest number since eight entered the 1980 Little Brown Jug won by Niatross. Only seven horses entered the 1948 (won by Knight Dream) and 1965 (won by Bret Hanover) Little Brown Jugs.

The post positions for the final heat will be determined by the official results of the \$188,928 first heat. The winner of the \$401,472 final heat will be declared the 72nd Jug champion.

Uncle Peter filly brings \$150,000 at Ohio Selected Jug Sale

A change in venue and an alteration in format did not dissuade those in attendance at the Ohio Selected Jug Sale on Friday (Sept. 15) from investing in the sport's future. Trotters, most notably the first yearlings from world champion and Breeders Crown winner **Uncle Peter**, took center stage at the Brave Horse Show Park in Johnstown, OH, as his daughter Tu Eres Mi Corazon went through the ring for \$150,000, equaling the highest-price ever paid for an Ohio-bred standardbred.

Another daughter, Majestic Lexi, was the third most expensive horse sold at this event when she fetched the sum of \$95,000, while the recently deceased **Dragon Again** led pacing stallions when his son, Dragon Ruler, changed hands for \$100,000.

The buzz prior to the sale was about the first progeny of Uncle Peter, who stands at Hickory Lane Farm for a stud fee of \$6,000 and his pacing counterpart Rockin Amadeus, a full brother to top Indiana stallion **Rockin Image**. Rockin Amadeus provides his services from Cool Winds Farm for \$3,500 and owns the distinction of defeating Pacer of the Year **Captaintreacherous** in the 2012 edition of the Breeders Crown.

One of 40 yearlings by her sire originally consigned to the sale of 237 head prior to withdrawals, Tu Eres Mi Corazon was selected by Ron Burke Racing Stables as Hip No. 71 and placed in the sale by her breeders, Spring Haven Farm and Doug Millard Holdings USA Inc.

The striking brown filly is the second foal out of the Muscle Hill mare Corazon Blue Chip and is a half-sibling to 2-year-old Fourth Dimension (Chapter Seven, \$81,750). That colt brought \$200,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and is now owned by Courant Inc. He is a perfect four-for-four in his young career and has established a new track record at Monticello Raceway as well as equaling the track standard at Yonkers Raceway.

"We bought her dam in foal (with Fourth Dimension) at the Harrisburg Sale in 2014," said Senena Esty, the proprietor of Spring Haven Farm. "She is just a gorgeous mare and she has passed on her looks to Fourth Dimension and this filly.

"This filly's name means 'a piece of my heart' and she really is like that to me. She is just so classy and cool, calm and collected. It is so rewarding to see a horse like this go on to top the sale, but there is always a part of you with them

when they go on. Maybe it's a woman thing becoming emotional about it, but we follow all our horses and we have been cheering for Fourth Dimension all year long, just like we will always watch her."

The second horse to equal or exceed the \$100,000 mark was the Dragon Again-Canary Island colt, Dragon Ruler. Presented as Hip No. 52 with Hunterton Sales Agency Inc. on behalf of Willow Oak Ranch, the bay colt is the first foal out of his dam who won \$155,327 during her racing career and is a half-sister to Elusive Prey (Western Hanover, \$802,706) Aba Daba Doo (Cam's Card Shark, \$541,037) and Duneside Perch (Cam's Card Shark, \$160,325).

When asked to discuss the legacy of Dragon Again as a stallion and his immediate impact in the Buckeye State, Joe McLead, the co-owner and manager of Sugar Valley Farm, was succinct.

"Ed Mullinax's (Dragon Again's owner) heart always belonged to his home state and he is the only one responsible for the success of this horse," he said. "His contributions to the sport have simply been immense."

Purchased by M.K. Bencic as the agent, Dragon Ruler's granddam, Duck Duck Goose has foaled 12 horses and every one of them is a winner. His third dam Misty Bretta, by Bret Hanover, gave birth to 20 offspring with 13 of them collecting at least one victory. Four of her foals amassed more than \$250,000 in purse money.

The third highest priced horse to leave the grounds under new ownership was Majestic Lexi. The daughter of Uncle Peter-Majestic Taglet was purchased by Black Magic Racing for \$95,000 from the LMN Bred Stables Inc., who also bred her.

"Breeding is the hardest part of this business," said Mitchell Nault, the co-owner of LMN Stables with his wife Laura. "I've trained horses, I've driven them and I'm the tattooer for Michigan and Ohio. (Breeders) are like a bunch of riverboat gamblers every time we come down the pike.

"It is incredibly rewarding to be able to come into a sale like this where people are looking for pedigree, not only to race in the Ohio Sire Stakes, but in Grand Circuit events. To be able to satisfy what people want to buy when you begin planning for something like this more than two years in advance is a great feeling. We also have a full brother to this filly that we are hoping to bring to next year's sale, but you just never know what is going to happen. We are just very, very happy with what this filly brought today, but we felt she did have the pedigree and a lot to offer."

Majestic Lexi's dam banked \$200,116 during her days of

competition and is a half-sibling to world champion Muscle Up The Goal (Muscle Mass, \$348,858) and Kahoku (SJ's Caviar, \$236,965).

This filly also possesses the distinction of being the first foal delivered from Uncle Peter and her arrival was heralded by Hoof Beats magazine when the image shortly after her birth was published.

"She was born on Jan. 19 and was the first one of his to hit the ground," Nault said. "We believe in breeding to foal as early as possible in the year because we think it helps in the long run when they race."

Although the three horses that accrued the largest bids nearly always receive the most attention, the entire sale was a tremendous success as other yearlings by the stallions Rockin Amadeus, McArdle, Manofmanymissions, Pet Rock, Dejarmbro, Triumphant Caviar and Yankee Cruiser were all well received.

I would love to see The Meadowlands regain its former status. So would just about everyone involved in our great sport.

Its time to look forward, not to constantly dwell on the past and do everything possible to get expanded gaming at what is still harness racing's number one track.

I am extremely grateful for your perseverance, but I fail to see where the constant bickering does anybody any good.

We hosted over 2,000 people this weekend for various social events besides our normal customers, so someone must think it looks nice. As far as my remarks about Sears and Brennan I was being facetious. I just wanted to make the point that

when I decided to commit all of my time and financial resources I assumed the top drivers would stay. I agree the bettors don't seem to care, but as a horse owner I am sure the owners would like a level playing field when they enter and having as many equally talented drivers helps.

Lastly, and most important, I am tired of being criticized for only caring about a casino. Faraldo said the same thing in a letter that Harnesslink published. Obviously a casino would be a big help and financially profitable but I would give away any big profit as I have been quite fortunate to be very successful in my real estate business.

The fact is, I began going to Yonkers and Roosevelt in high school over 57 years ago. I bought my first horse in 1973 and today I own all or part of 27 2yo and a dozen or so 3 yo and older horses racing under Little E LLC. You see my horses all the time including six racing (Saturday) including three in stakes at Mohawk. I have two breeding farms under the Allerage name about 40 broodmares shares in most trotting stallions and am selling 20 yearlings this fall. I probably watch more live harness races then anyone in the sport as I try to attend most Fridays when the Big M is open and most races over the summer at Tioga.

I tried to make the new facility something harness racing fans and owners could be proud of when they walked in, unlike many harness tracks. I put in a private club for owners so if they came with family and friends they had a nice environment to watch their horses race. To claim I am only interested in a casino is very hurtful. I work very hard. Right now my main focus is to get more groups to use the facility and more important to rid the sport of the drug trainers. I will not stop till I figure out what chemicals they are putting into these animals bodies just to win a race. So be warned I am committed to this effort. Thanks for letting me get this off my chest. I try my best.

Defending Yonkers

In last week's HRU (2017-09-10 Feedback), a reader took umbrage with many things Yonkers Raceway, from the handle to the racing and everything in between. I can certainly understand the frustrations and the easy thing would be to suggest that he no longer watch and wager on races there.

But it was clear to me that the reader likes Yonkers Raceway and cares about it; if one cares, they complain, if they don't they move on. He referenced handle, specifically, that the lower the handle, the more the odds can fluctuate. That is certainly true. On Monday, in a matter of minutes, I saw a horse go from 5-1 to 3-5. That is frustrating for sure. You think you're getting \$12 value on a \$2 bet and when the race is over it's \$3.20. Usually, the more money handled, the more stable the betting lines remain, which, is one of the reasons why bettors like the Meadowlands.

The next issue was the half-mile oval. In a perfect world, every track would be the like the Meadowlands and be one mile around. But, how many mile tracks are there? Besides the Big M, there is Red Mile, Cal Expo and Hawthorne Race Course. They are followed by the 7/8 mile tracks at Hoosier Park, Mohawk, Woodbine and Vernon Downs and then the 5/8 mile tracks, which include Harrah's Philadelphia, Pocono Downs and Plainridge Park. Many of the harness tracks are like Yonkers — half-miles. Buffalo, Batavia, Saratoga, Monticello in New York; Freehold in New Jersey; Northfield Park in Ohio. In addition, we have Western Fair in London, ON and Bangor and Scarborough in Maine. The point is Yonkers is far from the only half-mile in the land.

If you look at handle at most half-mile tracks, they are similar. Even though Yonkers offers better purses, that never has resulted in higher handles. One would think that it would, but it just isn't the case. In fact, Monticello Raceway often handles more dollars per race than Yonkers with purses that range from \$3,300 to \$6,400 per race. There is no \$500,000 Monticello Derby, yet bettors don't seem to mind.

There are many races at Yonkers where the leader blasts out in :27, then takes the 30-second breather, but I see that at other tracks, too. The moving of the finish line back 100 feet has definitely helped the racing at the Hilltop Oval, maybe not to the satisfaction of all, but it has certainly to some.

The finish line is just one improvement at Yonkers. The purses have improved and like the reader noted, the HD signal that Yonkers features is very good. To me, the key to betting at Yonkers is getting to know it by studying and looking for trends.

It's easy to pick on Yonkers, but the track has done the sport of harness racing plenty good over the years. It's been around since 1899; it races five days per week, 235 days per year while many "racinos" offer a fraction of that. Most prefer the Meadowlands, but have they done handicappers a disservice by offering just 91 days of racing per year, mostly on Friday and Saturday nights? While the Meadowlands is dark, there is Yonkers churning away night after night, 12

months a year.

Is Yonkers the best track to watch and wager on? Perhaps not, but it's far from the worst and it does deserve credit for hanging in there for 118 years.

Sturman is wrong

Brett Sturman could not be more wrong (full story here).

Cheating trainers represent a major real and reputational problem for our business. What is the evidence? In the first place, it is the absolutely dismal wagering levels at the tracks most known for a lax approach to integrity. In the second place, it is the difficulty in recruiting new owners to the business. In the third place, it works to undermine public confidence in the business and the long term confidence of governments in continuing to fund the business. Those are all very serious issues which ought to concern anyone interested in the future of our business.

In most cases, owners know the approach of the trainers they hire and far too many owners go looking for "high risk" trainers and switch to the new "hot" name or follow dutifully to the appointed string of "beards." In that context, it is not surprising that many potential owners decide they aren't interested in participating in a business with a reputational taint and severely tilted playing field. It is particularly galling in top level stakes racing where honest owners fund the great majority of the purses.

Brett claims the real problem is the failure to oust the "beards". That is part of it but is an issue of both the cheaters who still race in their own name and the "beards." He conveniently fails to note that most of these "trainers" operate at tracks which have shown no interest in ousting them and perhaps that is not surprising given that wagering support is not of great interest to them at all. On many days and nights, their racing seems operated for the benefit of the players and a "beer league" audience. Outside the confines of the local ball field, no one knows or cares, but the players tote home prizes and trophies worthy of the big leagues. It can't and won't survive.

Most of the casino supported tracks aren't interested. Thankfully, the regulators in Ontario and Pennsylvania are — and hopefully New Jersey will follow. Owners are accountable in all other businesses; the results and value of their investments suffer or are completely lost due to legal

and reputational problems. Ask the shareholders of Enron or United Airlines. After troubles arise, they don't get to shift stocks before taking the hit on their troubled investment and that applies to both large and small shareholders. Owners in our business need to be accountable too. Owners who support bad trainers need to be called out, not mentioned in positive press nor invited to partner with good owners.

As many know, the Meadowlands and Tioga took responsible action in denying access to two major stakes races for Lady Shadow earlier this year. WEG required a trainer change before permitting her to race (last night) in the Milton Stakes. While her connections maintained her former performance was due to her love for her Canadian stall, it seems more likely to have been her missing friends Chris and Ron. After a long period of dominance in her category against the same horses, she failed to perform to a remotely comparable level in both the elimination and final. Both tracks did right by the responsible owners who paid to enter those races and ultimately gave our gamblers a much better and fairer product. This is an important precedent and we will build on it with additional Staking rules and vigilant observation.

Our thoroughbred colleagues have taken the right lead in adopting new rules prohibiting participation in Breeders' Cup races in the case of both recent and medium-term serious positives. We need to do likewise for our major events and we are working on that. As owners approach the yearling sales this year, they should be careful about their choices of trainers and partners. At WEG and the Gural tracks, the most significant sponsors of track based stakes, we are prepared to take the lead.

Astonished over Sturman's column

I was astonished to read Brett Sturman's article (full story here) in (Friday's) HRU (9/15), in which he opines the new suspension of horses rule in Pennsylvania is unfair to owners. Sadly, there is a widespread perception amongst the masses that harness racing is a sport rife with cheats. Without growth, harness racing is doomed and growth is impossible unless and until the sport cleans up its act.

It will not be a government agency that purges the cheats, although rules like the new one in PA definitely help. The only way to stop the cheating is for a zero-tolerance policy of

cheating be adopted, practiced and enforced by all participants of the sport, be they a trainer, a driver, a veterinarian, or an owner.

To suggest an owner is unfairly punished if one of their horses comes up with a positive test and is subsequently suspended, is ludicrous. Is it possible for a horse to test positive and the trainer be innocent? Of course it is. This could result from any number of circumstances, from an honest mix-up of medications being administered, to the vindictive act of a disgruntled stable employee.

I do believe before a suspension of horse and/or trainer is handed down, that all circumstances must be considered and a trainer's past record must weigh heavy in the decision. It is incumbent upon all trainers to take every measure to protect the integrity of their operation, whether by stringent internal controls to properly manage treatments, barn surveillance systems, etc.

Brett Revington was absolutely correct in his assessment whereby horse owners have to be diligent and selective when choosing a trainer. That has always been my practice and my trainers are well aware I will not tolerate cheating in their barns, even if it doesn't involve my horses.

In over 5,000 races in the past 20 years, I have never had a horse come up positive that I can recall. Once, I did have a trainer who was handed down a suspension after a few milk-shaking positives on horses owned by others. He immediately put a beard on his wife and all of his horses were moved to her, as trainer. In response, I immediately removed my horses from his/her barn, never to return. Unfortunately, he was a "nice guy" with a lot of natural ability, but we cannot look the other way and thereby enable the cheaters. Zero tolerance. Owner responsibility.

As for trainers to be avoided, Mr. Sturman, please get a clue! It doesn't take a Philadelphia lawyer to figure out who's crooked and who's not. Indeed, there seems to be a group of owners who have a common practice of migrating to the newest cheat. When a particular trainer all of a sudden starts winning at an abnormally high rate, or horses come under his charge and immediately drop three seconds from their records, look at the roster of owners. Frequently, you see the same names patronizing other trainers of dubious character.

Mr. Sturman, do you want to know how to deal with the beards and the shadow trainers? The best way is to start by targeting the owners. These owners know they are aiding and abetting cheats and that makes them just as quilty.

These trainers and owners are killing our sport and the rest of us honest horse people need to stand up and say enough is enough. The new PA rule is a small step in the right direction.

Sorry Brett, but it is the responsibility of the owner in selecting a trainer to try by all means possible to hire one that plays by the rules. My father and I had our stable, Leo Wolf & Son, Inc., for 30 years, racing an average of five to eight horses per year; claimers, conditional and two and three-year-old stakes horses. Over the 30 years we used eight different trainers and we NEVER had a positive test result.

Owners need to use proper business judgement as they would in selecting an accountant, a lawyer, a doctor, a veterinarian and a horse trainer too. There are many more trainers in our industry that play by the rules then not and owners must choose wisely when making their choice, or yes, they will see their horses suspended.

The USTA has Pathways that can help any owner see the past and pending fines and suspensions of every trainer in the industry. Current and new owners should be encouraged to use this service to help them in decision making.

Of course, there are extraneous circumstances that can occur, but that can also happen in any industry with the same unfair results to the client or owner. This new rule should help the vast majority of owners in our sport have some peace of mind for their investment(s).
