

Pinkman Lives Up To Status In Canadian Trotting Classic

CAMPBELLVILLE, ON - The Canadian air certainly agrees with Pinkman.

The gelding by Explosive Matter won the \$700,000 Canadian Trotting Classic for three-year-old colt and gelding trotters Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack.

Pinkman has won four times in four career starts in Canada, including his elimination last week. Last year at Woodbine Racetrack, he won his elimination race for the Valley Victory and then won the \$521,000 final.

He'll be back on Canadian soil for the Breeders Crown at Woodbine in a month's time.

Driven by Yannick Gingras, Pinkman was hustled to the front after three-eighths of a mile, passing Crazy Wow, who had the lead after a quarter mile in 27 3/5. Pinkman grabbed control after three-eighths, leading at the half in 56 2/5. He stayed in front the rest of the way through three quarters in 1:25 1/5 and won in 1:53 3/5.

Crazy Wow battled and finished strongly by three quarters of a length. Uncle Lasse was third, followed by In The Bank and French Laundry.

Trainer Jimmy Takter is the conditioner of Pinkman,

Uncle Lasse, The Bank and French Laundry. He drove French Laundry.

Pinkman is owned by Takter's wife Christina, Jim and John Fielding, Joyce McClelland and Herb Liverman.

The Fieldings also have pieces of Uncle Lasse and French Laundry. Liverman is also one of the owners

of Bee A Magician, the great five-year-old mare who won the Maple Leaf Trot for aged trotters earlier in the card. Liverman, the Fieldings and Christina Takter are owners of Wild Honey, who placed second to Mission Brief in the \$404,000 Elegantimage final for three-year-old filly trotters.

Pinkman's win followed up on his huge win earlier in the year in the Hambletonian. He had some consistency problems in his next three races, but rebounded strongly in his elimination race for the CTC and continued that in the final.

He surpassed \$2.1 in career earnings with the \$350,000 winner's share.

Pinkman was the 7-10 race favorite and paid \$3.40 to win, \$2.50 to place and \$2.10 to show. Crazy Wow paid \$5.00 and \$3.30. Uncle Lasse paid \$2.50. The exacta paid \$17.10 and the trifecta \$37.60.

John Fielding said winning the CTC, which he did last year with Father Patrick, is important because he is a Canadian.

"Growing up, the Canadian Trotting Classic was huge, more so than the North America Cup or anything (in Canada)," he said. "The Canadian Trotting Classic was THE race. For me, this is actually a really good one to win."

I think this is very important. The Breeders Crowns are great. The Hambletonian was a dream, but this is a dream too. It's a great Canadian race."

Gingras publicly thanked the owners afterward for giving him the drive back on Pinkman after he elected to go with the brilliant filly Mission Brief in the Hambletonian.

"It's something I didn't expect and I'm very thankful for that," Gingras said.

Fielding spoke proudly of Pinkman, a horse who at one time was going to be put up for sale as a two-year-old and as a last resort was gelded.

"This horse is just a tough, tough horse," Fielding said. "He's a gelding and he has defied all odds. We gelded him and he became a different animal. He concentrated on his business and the rest is history. He went undefeated after we gelded him and this year he's been nothing but fantastic. He came up here last year and won the Valley Victory and then won the won the Breeders Crown (a few races later). The game is a funny game and it's made of dreams and we all get lucky. You've just got to savor the moment when it comes because there are a lot of dull moments as well."

He hugged Jimmy Takter in the winner's circle.

"You have to understand I've been with him so many years, so he's a very close friend of mine as well and I hadn't seen him since the Hambletonian," Fielding said. "If I had have lost I would have hugged him, too."

He laughed when asked what it was like to have multiple horses in the race and to finish first, third and fifth.

"It's great, it's checks," he said. "Listen, these bills will choke a horse. When you get the checks it pays the bills. I love Pinkman to bits, but I really wanted Uncle Lasse to win because he has stallion potential as a full brother to Shake It Cerry. He's from a great, great family. For greedy reasons I wanted him to win, but I'm thrilled either way."

Bee A Magician Beats The Boys In Maple Leaf Trot

The lady is still a champ.

Bee A Magician, the lone mare in a field of older male horses, showed her mettle winning the \$680,000 Maple Leaf for aged trotters with a perfectly-timed drive by Brian Sears Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack.

out midway in the stretch to win by half a length. Natural Herbie placed third, five lengths in arrears.

J L Cruze, who was supplemented into the Maple Leaf along with Resolve, was gunned hard to the lead by John Campbell, who led through an opening quarter in 26 4/5 and a half in 55 3/5. Resolve, the 7-5 favorite, cleared en route to three quarters of a mile in 1:24 1/5.

"We got a really good trip, I thought," Sears said. "I had to stay to close to Resolve. You didn't want either (Resolve or J L Cruze) to be too far away. You didn't want any traffic in between you and them, and you also had to worry about Natural Herbie. She showed her grit. She wears an open bridle. She knows how to race other horses. She knows what's going on out there, what we're trying to do."

Bee A Magician won all of her 17 races two years ago and was voted Horse of the Year in Canada and the U.S. She struggled in her four-year-old season facing open company, but rebounded to win the Breeders Crown in her own division in her second-last start of 2014. Sears said trainer Nifty Norman had a practical approach to the mare's four-year-old season.

"Nifty took it in stride last year. He didn't want to put a lot of pressure on her," Sears said.

"Going from three to four, it's a lot to ask sometimes. We tried to be realistic about it. Once we saw she wasn't as sharp as we'd like her to be, we weren't overly disappointed and didn't put undue pressure on her. We raced her, but we weren't going to go to extremes. She did get sharp at the end of the year for the Breeders Crown."

Bee A Magician, second choice in the field at just over 2-1, paid \$6.20, \$3.20 and \$2.40. Resolve paid \$2.80, \$2.20. Natural Herbie paid \$3.60. The exacta paid \$15.70 and the trifecta \$56.00.

Bee A Magician, owned by Mel Hartman, Herb Liverman and David McDuffee, surpassed \$3 million in career earnings with the win, her 40th in 60 career starts.

"This is historic beating the colts, it's a great race to win," Norman said. "She's been terrific. She's bigger and stronger. Everyone comments on how much stronger she looks – plus she got a magic trip. You couldn't have drawn it up more perfect. Brian seems to be capable of doing that."

Norman told Harness Racing Update that the mare will be pointed to the Breeders Crown, October 24 at Woodbine Racetrack and may race in the Prix d'Amerique in Paris next January.

"You wouldn't have to lay her off, you could just keep going through, maybe give her a week off here and there," Norman said. "It's a better timing. To get a horse ready for the Elitlopp, you've got to give them a rest and bring them back. I think the timing might work better this way. If she did well, you might leave her there."

Southwind Frank Continues Solid Win Streak

It maybe a little early to compare Southwind Frank to Pinkman at this stage of his career, but he's certainly showing positive signs – at least that's the impression of

driver Yannick Gingras, who steers both of them.

Southwind Frank increased his record to eight wins in nine career starts with a victory in the \$373,000 William Wellwood Final for two-year-old colt and gelding trotters Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack. It was his fifth consecutive win and followed major victories in the Peter Haughton Memorial and Champlain.

Gingras made a move up the backstretch to claim the lead from Brooklyn Hill, who set the early pace with a quarter mile in 28. Southwind Frank had the lead after half in 57 1/5 and opened up after three quarters in 1:25 4/5 and stopped the clock in 1:55 4/5, finishing 1 1/4 lengths in front. He went postward at 1-10.

Marion Marauder finished second, followed by Deep Impact.

Southwind Frank paid \$2.20, \$2.10, \$2.10. Marion Marauder paid \$8.00, \$4.30. Deep Impact paid \$3.00 to show. The exacta paid \$12.80, the trifecta \$42.20.

Southwind Frank is trained by Ron Burke, who owns the colt with Weaver Brussemi, Our Horse Cents Stable and Jerry and Theresa Silva, was purchased for \$100,000 at the Lexington Select Sale. He collected \$186,500 with the win, increasing his bankroll to more than \$400,000.

Pinkman was voted the champion two-year-old colt and gelding trotter last year in the U.S. with six wins in eight starts and earnings of almost \$600,000.

Southwind Frank looks to be in the same class. His only loss was the result of breaking stride.

"He's won in 1:53 a few times already, I think he's in the

same class (as Pinkman), for sure," Gingras said.

"Pinkman is a little bit more laid back, this horse likes to do the work. Pinkman at this time as a two-year-old liked to follow, but he's a winner. They're both winners. They both get the job done, but in different ways."

Silva, who has been a partner in many great horses, described the son of Muscle Hill as a sleeper.

"I didn't think he was this good," Silva said. "He's a New Jersey Sires stakes, he's a Muscle Hill (colt) and he reminds me a lot of Muscle Hill in terms of always doing the right thing. He just goes and he seems to be very relaxed. It was a measured win by Yannick. He could have won by three or four, but he didn't have to."

The horse is scheduled to race in his next two starts in Lexington, followed by the Breeders Crown eliminations at Woodbine Racetrack.

"It's Ronnie's talent and Yannick's talent now to make it happen in the race," Silva said. "We've had a lot of disappointments in life. I was at Yonkers last week with Crazy Wow, who broke stride at the start. I'm always nervous about races, but especially trotters. Trotters make me crazy."

Caprice Hill Is a Pro in \$410,000 Peaceful Way

CAMPBELLVILLE, ON - Two-year-old trotting fillies can be a capricious group, but there was nothing flighty about Tom Hill's Caprice Hill on the night of Saturday, September 19th. She was totally professional as she cruised to a one-and-a-quarter length victory in the \$410,000 (Cdn) Peaceful Way Stakes at Mohawk racetrack, living up to her even-money price and her easy win in last week's elimination.

With #6, Ultimate Shopper, scratched sick, nine fillies went to the gate in the Peaceful Way, four of which, including Caprice Hill, were daughters of the stalwart Ontario sire, Kadabra. Leaving from post four, Tim Tetrick eased Caprice Hill comfortably into fourth off the start, with Celebrity Eventsy and Brett Miller firing to the front. Could It Be Magic (Wayne Henry) picked up the early pocket spot, but by a first quarter in a respectable :27.1, Sylvain Filion had Emoticon Hanover on the move to overtake. Celebrity Eventsy stayed stuck on Filion's helmet, while Could It Be Magic applied pressure coming up to the three-quarter pole in 1:27.0.

Tetrick had to swing Caprice Hill four wide as they turned for home, but the strapping filly, having benefited from an energy-saving trip, had more than enough step to smoothly take command down the stretch. She stopped the timers in 1:56.1, with Celebrity Eventsy grabbing the place spot, and #9, Dewdle All Day (Chris Christoforou) stepping up for third some five lengths back.

"It worked out great," said Tetrick. "It was a second-over trip following a couple of nice fillies there. I got led up right where I needed to be, there was a little racing when Brett (Miller) shook loose, and she showed how good she is and how she wants to do it. She just gets the job done."

Tetrick had yielded the drive on this filly to Yannick Gingras earlier this year, and was grateful to be back in the bike for this trip. "Good things happen when everything works out right," he said. "Lucky for me I got a chance to get back on ... that was one of my biggest mistakes, picking off her early in the season."

Caprice Hill now has a record of six wins and a second in seven lifetime starts, and has more than doubled her bankroll with this win. Owner Tom Hill celebrated his 65th birthday by hoisting the Peaceful Way trophy. "It's great to win a big race, especially on your birthday," he said.

"When Yannick (Gingras) drove this filly, he said she was 'Mission Brief with brains'. She's proven it tonight. She's a

gift from God. Kadabra has proven to be as good a sire as any trotting sire in the world. I don't know a whole lot about trotters - I just asked Tony (Alagna) to get us a nice filly. He went and picked her out, and he deserves all the credit and all the praise." Hill then amended that statement, saying, "His mother (Donna Alagna) deserves a lot of the credit as well!"

"I went to Hanover (Shoe Farms) to look at their consignment (prior to the Harrisburg sale, where Caprice Hill sold for \$55,000)," said Alagna. "I actually went to look at the colts. She was the only trotting filly I turned out that day. She just had a presence about her, and a natural balance in the paddock."

"My mother trains all of Tom Hill's yearlings back in Illinois. Mid-winter, she said to me, 'this is some kinda filly'. Around April, she said, 'she's too good for me to keep here at Balmoral Park. I'm sending her to you.' The first time I sat behind her in the bike, I thought, 'this filly's something special'."

Caprice Hill returned a modest \$3.90, \$2.40, and \$2.20 for the win.

San Pail Retires in Style

Prior to the Peaceful Way, Mohawk's fans were treated to a farewell visit from the retiring San Pail, three-time winner of the Maple Leaf Trot in 2009, 2010, and 2011. Canada's Horse of the Year in 2011 and a multiple O'Brien Award winner, with earnings of over \$3 million, the 11-year-old San Pellegrino gelding is a fan favourite who was locally owned and trained, and driven throughout his career by

Randy Waples. San Pail later led the post parade for the Maple Leaf Trot.

"It was a tough night to have him here looking so fit and feeling so good, and not be racing him," said trainer Rod Hughes. "Everywhere we go, people ask about the Pail. I wish they'd ask about my other horses! He put me in the spotlight for sure. We still jog him from time to time and he gets ridden a little too. He's just going to enjoy life from here on out."

Mission Brief Makes Short Work of Elegatimage Stakes

Even with a Hambletonian Oaks winner in the field, there wasn't much question who was likely to dominate in the \$404,000 Elegatimage Final, for sophomore trotting fillies, this evening at Mohawk. The overwhelming bettor's choice was the ebony miss, Mission Brief - and she didn't disappoint, sailing home five and a half lengths to the good in a smart, but not stakes-shattering, 1:52.4.

Second choice, Muscle Baby Doll (Doug McNair) and Wild Honey (John Campbell) surged off the gate to lead the early proceedings, while Yannick Gingras tucked Mission Brief into the fourth spot and played a waiting game. Wild Honey quickly got tangled in traffic, but Gingras managed to keep Mission Brief clear, and she was on top before the half in a brisk :55.2 and sailing away from the pack. From there it was plain sailing for the fleet-footed filly who delivered on her 1-9 odds, though Wild Honey surprised by fighting gamely back to capture second.

Elegant Serenity, trained and driven by Roger Mayotte and owned by Doug Millard of Woodstock, Ontario, crossed the line third; she is a daughter of Elegatimage herself, by Kadabra.

Ron Burke trains Mission Brief, who has earned more than \$1.1 million but struggled with breaks in her freshman season (including a costly one in the 2014 edition of the Peaceful Way). At three, she is coming into her own, with seven wins in nine starts this year, including a 15-length romp in last week's Elegatimage elimination. The filly is owned by the Burke Racing Stable, the Our Horse Cents Stable, Weaver Brussemi, and J and T Silva Stables. The same connections own Southwind Frank, another Muscle Hill offspring, who captured the William Wellwood Memorial Stakes for two-year-old trotting colts earlier in the evening.

Gingras remarked, "She was amazing tonight. I didn't even start her up. The (ear) plugs were still in. She's toying with them; she's just in a different class.

"Tonight she was really relaxed. She drove two fingers. I was able to put Jody (Jamieson, driving Danielle Hall) in the hole around the first turn and I took control of the race after that.

"She makes the game plan," Gingras added. "Last week she decided she was going to go all the way, and tonight she was a little more easy to handle, so we just let the dust settle and moved on up. I can't make plans on her. She makes the plans."

"It is a thrill (to be involved with this filly), confirmed co-owner Jerry Silva, "but what Yannick said is important. When you have a special lady, she dictates how she's going to go and what she wants to do. Yannick

understands her. We're just there to keep her happy, and we don't have last year's problems with breaking, thank God. I can't wait for Lexington, to try to break 1:50!

"With Mission Brief, our plans are to race her at four, if everybody still agrees, and to bring her to the Elitlopp at five."

Ohio Selected Jug Sale Up 6.5 Percent

SUNBURY, OH - Picking up where it left off last year, the Ohio Selected Jug Sale proved to be a winner again yesterday as it showed a 6.5 percent increase off of the big numbers it posted in 2014.



Thanks to the advent of casino gaming at the Ohio tracks, the sale was brought back last year after a four-year hiatus and it exceeded all expectations, with horses selling for six figures and the average topping \$16,000. With a bigger supply (there were 262 horses in the catalogue) and with some feeling it would be almost impossible to top last year's sale, some were mildly pessimistic entering Jug Sale 2015. But it turns out that there was nothing to be worried about as the average price rose 6.5 percent to \$17,347.

"We ended up selling two for over \$100,000 and sold a lot of horses in the 25 to 50 price range, so I was really pleased," sales manager Randy Manges said. "The middle was real strong. I am relieved, but not surprised. I thought and hoped we'd be up a little bit. I knew we weren't going to be up a lot and we weren't, but I was real pleased with the sale. I am always pleased with a sale when the middle is strong and the middle here was strong."

The sale topper was Hip 219, a Big Bad John colt named Dancin Rebel. A half-brother to millionaire Dancin Yankee, he brought \$112,000 and was purchased by Melanie Wrenn. The colt was sold by Walnut Hall Limited, Agent.

Placing second was the Dejarmbro colt Stormy Kromer, who sold for \$100,000. The buyer was Peter Wrenn and the consignor was Winterwood Farm, Agent.

"I had a couple of people, partners from Michigan, and we decided to jump in and buy some nice babies," Wrenn said. "This was one of our better picks, so we decided to go in on it. Honestly, I was hoping I would get the colt for 65-75, but I knew also that some other people were looking at the horse. I was hesitating toward the end. I almost didn't make the last bid."

Among sires, the stars were the pride of Hickory Lane Farm, Dejarmbro and McArdle. McArdle led all pacing sires in terms of average price per yearling and Dejarmbro led all trotting sires in that category among horses that were represented by at least five horses in the sale.

"I thought the sale held up real good, especially toward the end," said Hickory Lane's Kevin Greenfield. "I was very happy with my sale. The McArdles were outstanding. We've all worked hard, including my staff, to get to this point and I am pleased with the results. It's been a work in progress, but I am very pleased with what happened today."

"With McArdle, people knew this stallion is the real deal. He's been a great value to people in Ohio and it might be time to me to raise his stud fee. He's been one of those unsung heroes for a long time. He's had 20, 25 foals a year (before he arrived in Ohio) and was going up against Somebeachsomewhere, Well Said, Art Major and he has had colts and fillies that have beaten them. I think everybody realizes what he can do."

DELAWARE, OH - Wiggle It Jiggleit, the No. 1-ranked horse in harness racing's weekly Top 10 poll, leads a field of 15 horses entered in Thursday's (Sept. 24) 70th Little Brown Jug for 3-year-old male pacers at the Delaware County Fairgrounds in central Ohio. The event, presented by Fazoli's, carries a record total purse of \$677,000.

The draw for the Little Brown Jug was conducted

Saturday at the fairgrounds. Wiggle It Jiggleit drew post five in the second first-heat elimination and was installed as the 4-5 favorite. The gelding is owned by George Teague Jr., driven by Montrell Teague, and trained by Clyde Francis.

Wiggle It Jiggleit has won 16 of 18

races this year and earned \$1.43 million. His victories include the Meadowlands Pace, Hempt Memorial, Battle of the Brandywine, and Milstein Memorial. He was not staked to the Little Brown Jug, but his victory in the Meadowlands Pace permitted his connections to pay \$45,000 to supplement to the event.

Since supplements were first allowed in 1999, four horses have used that route to enter the Little Brown Jug: Four Starzzz Shark in 2001, Art Official in 2008, Betterthancheddar in 2011, and Lyonssomewhere in 2014. Four Starzzz Shark, Art Official, and Betterthancheddar all finished third. Lyonssomewhere failed to advance to the second heat.

Wiggle It Jiggleit is a son of Mr Wiggles, who finished sixth in the 2009 Little Brown Jug, out of the mare Mozzi Hanover. He prepped for the Jug by winning a qualifier in 1:50.2 last Tuesday at Harrah's Philadelphia.

"He was good," Montrell Teague said. "He was definitely himself. I pretty much just let him do what he wanted to do. I let him float out and we were planning on going a (1):52 mile, but when I tapped him in the last quarter he took off, so I just let him do what he wanted. That (time) is not a bad thing at all."

The Little Brown Jug is contested on a half-mile track at the Delaware County Fairgrounds, located 30 miles north of Columbus. Wiggle It Jiggleit is history's fastest 3-year-old pacer on a half-mile oval, having won in 1:49 earlier this season at Harrington Raceway.

"I'm looking forward to it the most of any race I've been in so far," Teague said about the Little Brown Jug.

Among the other top Jug contenders are Artspeak and My Hero Ron in the second elimination and Lost For Words and Dude's The Man in the opening elimination.

Artspeak, this year's New Jersey Sire Stakes champion, heads to the Little Brown Jug off a career-best 1:48.2 win in the Simcoe Stakes last Saturday (Sept. 12) at Mohawk

Racetrack. The time established the stakes record, shaving one-fifth of a second off the previous mark set by 2013 Little Brown Jug champion Vegas Vacation.

Trained by Tony Alagna for owners Brittany Farms, Marvin Katz, Joe Sbrocco, and In The Gym Partners, Artspeak has won four of 12 races this year and earned \$483,325. The son of Western Ideal-The Art Museum was the 2014 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male pacer and will try to become the first divisional champion since Bettor's Delight in 2001 to return and win the Jug.

Brittany Farms won the 1993 Little Brown Jug as the owner of Life Sign. Brittany Farms owner George Segal also was part of Jug-winning partnerships with Mr Feelgood in 2006 and Tell All in 2007. His three victories are tied with Jeff Snyder and Stanley Dancer for the most by an owner in history.

Artspeak will be driven by Scott Zeron, who in 2012 at the age of 23 became the youngest driver to win the Jug when he piloted Michael's Power to victory.

Artspeak has drawn the rail in the second elimination and is the 5-2 second choice behind Wiggle It Jiggleit.

Ron Burke will try for his second consecutive Jug triumph when he sends out My Hero Ron, who was the runner-up in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship and has won four of 13 races this season. The gelded son of Well Said-Erma La Em is owned by Burke Racing, the partnership of Mark Weaver and Mike Brussemi, Larry Karr, and Frank Baldachino.

He has drawn post four in the second elimination with Yannick Gingras listed to drive. My Hero Ron is 4-1 on the morning line. Burke and Gingras teamed to win last year's Little Brown Jug with Limelight Beach.

The 2-1 morning line favorite in the opening elimination is Lost For Words, who drew the coveted rail. Lost For Words has also been a consistent performer, with 10 on-the-board finishes in 11 starts this year and earnings of \$336,974. The colt has won four races, three on the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes circuit, and finished second to Wiggle It Jiggleit in the Milstein.

A son of 2009 Little Brown Jug winner Well Said out of the mare Thou Shalt Not, Lost For Words is trained by Brian Brown and driven by David Miller. He is owned by Country Club Acres, William Robinson, Richard Lombardo, and Strollin Stable.

Miller has won the Jug three times, with No Pan Intended in 2003, Shadow Play in 2008, and Big Bad John in 2011. He is the winningest driver in the history of the Delaware County Fair, with 204 victories. Brown won last year's Jugette for 3-year-old female pacers with Color's A Virgin.

Dude's The Man has posted top-three finishes in 12 of 13 races this season, winning three times including the Delvin Miller Adios Stakes in August, for earnings of \$643,504. He finished second to Wiggle It Jiggleit in the Meadowlands Pace and also was the runner-up in the Messenger Stakes.

Jessica Okusko trains Dude's The Man, a son of American Ideal-Art's Risk, for owners M And L of Delaware LLC and Victoria Dickinson. Corey Callahan is the colt's driver. He will score from post four and is listed at 5-2 on the morning line.

The Little Brown Jug, which requires a horse to win two heats to be declared the champion, is the third leg of this year's Pacing Triple Crown. Dealt A Winner won the first jewel, the Cane Pace, and Revenge Shark captured the second, the Messenger Stakes.

The top four horses in each of the elimination races will advance to the \$324,960 second heat. If an elimination winner scores in the second heat, he will be the Jug winner. Otherwise, the three heat-winners will return for a \$135,400 race-off.

The exact race numbers and post times for the LBJ will be announced after the balance of the Thursday program is drawn on Monday.

The Little Brown Jug brought to you by Fazoli's will air live from 5-6:30 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.

He Loves Bill O'Donnell, But...

Firstly, there is a rule in most, if not all jurisdictions that requires a driver to report any fouls committed against them. Secondly, there is a lot more at stake in a race than the drivers' feelings on the matter. There is a direct responsibility to the trainers, the owners and most importantly to the public.

Sure, that's what the judges get paid to do. But they are up in the judges stand, usually far removed from the action. They get some things right. There are other things that they might miss.

Furthermore, I'm taking some license in saying this, but I would think from a human nature perspective, that some if not most judges would feel their initial opinions reinforced and be more likely to rule if those who might have been

fouled against would go on the record. They would be far more likely(in my opinion) to proceed with a ruling with an objection having been lodged than if it had not been.

The argument is not about whose responsibility it is, because according to the rules it is also the responsibility of the drivers. But it's rather about GETTING IT RIGHT! That is what is most important.

Nothing Wrong With Drivers Claiming Foul

Whether or not Mr. O'Donnell realizes it, he has just confirmed Dean Towers belief that drivers do not lodge objections against other drivers, no matter how justified. Mr. O'Donnell argues that he "gets paid to drive races, not to be a judge, too." After a lifetime in harness racing, it appears clear that Mr. O'Donnell has not embraced the idea that part of his job as the paid driver of a horse is to protect the interests of the owner that horse. Further, he provides a difficult to compare analogy to baseball, but doesn't say a word about thoroughbred racing, where jockeys lodge objections all the time. As the owner of five standardbred race horses, my conclusion is, is it any wonder this game is failing?

Bettors Must Come First

This is effectively a debate between customers (aka, bettors) and drivers. Some drivers argue that it is best for the strategy of the race to allow horses from inside posts to allow horses from outside posts to tuck in front of them during the first quarter. Two excuses used by drivers are: the quarter is too fast for my horse or the "tuck-er" will give my horse live cover later on. For bettors the argument is more succinct. "bleep, bleep and the horse you rode in on."

Customers only see drivers helping their buddies.
Here is the solution:

- 1) Judges must take and pass a course in handicapping before they are allowed to judge races. They should be required to handicap races before the races start to get a sense of what customers are thinking and what drivers are thinking.
- 2) A driver of a potential "tuck-er" moves alongside a hole that does not exist. The driver keeping the hole closed Takes back to create a hole. This generates an automatic suspension for the driver who created a hole. The judges must understand the exceptions (e.g., the give-and-go from the driver in the 2-hole, who gives a tuck then brushes to the top -- effectively choosing which horse he wants behind him.) Even tucks where it seems that the drivers of inside posts needed to use their horses to keep the holes closed -- should be reviewed -- and drivers interviewed. Make it clear that this is a practice to be avoided.

The bottom line Should be that the customer is always right (as it is in every successful business in the world) and giving courtesy tucks is bad for the racing product -- very bad.
