## Jug Outcome May Come Down to Wiggle It, Artspeak Elim

**DELAWARE, OH** - Scott Zeron, the driver of Artspeak, knows what's on the line in today's 13th race at Delaware, the second of two elims for the Little Brown Jug.

"It is a big advantage (having the one post)," Zeron said. "If I can beat (Wiggle It Jiggleit) in the first elim I know I can beat him in the final. The first elim is going to feel like the final to me."

On paper, the two best horses in the 70th Little Brown Jug are Artspeak and Wiggle It Jiggleit, who will face off in the second of two elims. Wiggle It Jiggleit may be the better of the two horses, but Artspeak has the coveted one hole. If he can use that to his advantage and beat Wiggle It Jiggleit in the elim, that would mean Artspeak could get the one post again in the final and Wiggle It Jiggleit definitely will not get it. At Delaware, nothing is more important than post one.

In the elim, this could turn into a Zeron-Montrell Teague chess match that may decide everything. Artspeak has speed and the one hole and Wiggle It Jiggleit, who drew post five, has tons of early

speed if driver Montrell Teague wants to call on it. Something has to give, but what, when and how?



"I have thought about that (how the race will play out)," Zeron said. "I have gone through a couple of scenarios and will have to play it by ear off the gate, but I'm going to commit to leaving out of there, for sure. The question is what will (Teague) do?

"Obviously, his horse can go 25

seconds and so can mine. It will be interesting. I'd love to have him sit that two hole and if he does I can control the whole race. He might just take the safe approach and get away where he can be first up and control his own destiny. I'll know about five steps off the gate what is going to happen."

Montrell Teague didn't seem too worried about how the race would unfold or getting caught up in any pre-race mind games.

"I haven't had a game plan yet with him and I'm not going to start now," he said. "He's shown he doesn't have to have the lead."

Though Artspeak has the post position edge, Wiggle It Jiggleit is definitely the horse to beat. He is harness racing's reigning star and on top of the sport's Top 10 poll. In past years, some horses in that position have bypassed the Jug, their connections citing the heat format and the perceived problems of racing on a half-mile track.

Not only did Wiggle It's owner George Teague Jr. decide to race in the Jug, he had to pay \$45,000 to supplement into the field. A fan of the Jug and it's rich history, Teague said racing here was never something he had to think twice about.

It was another big day for sire Rock N Roll Heaven as his talented daughter won yesterday's \$252,250 Jugette in a world-record setting performance.

We look forward to a bright future with Rock N Roll Heaven, who will stand the 2016 breeding season at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey "It is a lot of people's most favorite race, including Montrell's," Teague said. "He kept pushing me and pushing me to go, even though I am the one who had to put up the money. I wanted to come, too. I am on the Jug board so I felt a little bit of an obligation to help them put on the best show they can.

"The prestige of the Jug is always going to be the biggest part of it. The money is a close second. But as much as anything else I'm not scared. I'm not worried about exposing this horse. If I get beat I get beat and even if that happens I'll still think he's one of the better horses to ever to race."

In addition to his post in the elim, the other worry about Wiggle It Jiggleit is that he hasn't had a race since Aug. 22. But George Teague Jr. said that could actually be to his advantage.

"That's not a worry in the least," Teague said. "He kind of needs that now because he was cranked up racing in January and was getting ready to race all the way back in November. He's been going for a long, long time. He went in 50 and 2 at Chester (in a qualifier) and couldn't have gone any easier. It was a good tightener."

If the winner of the Jug Final doesn't come out of the second elim it will come as a surprise as Wiggle It Jiggleit and Artspeak look like the two best horses in the overall field-- with no one else coming close.

Long before anyone outside of Team Teague had ever heard of Wiggle It Jiggleit, Artspeak was considered the top

member of his class. But he has yet to land a huge win this year, while Wiggle It Jiggleit has stolen all the headlines. That could be about to change. Artspeak has had a good month, winning a qualifier at Mohawk by 23 1/4 lengths and then winning the Simcoe by 2 1/4 lengths.

"Yes, I feel good about things," his trainer, Tony Alagna said. "With the way he qualified and the way he raced in Canada, I have to be happy. I knew the first part of the year would be tough on him with him racing so many weeks in a row. He's getting better and bouncing back."

The likely favorite in the first of two elims is Lost For Words. He's lost six straight, but has been racing well throughout the streak and drew post one in what is undoubtedly the weaker of the two elims.

"I was really happy to see he drew the rail and that he didn't draw in against Wiggle It Jiggleit," Miller said. "We're in a good spot."

The card also includes the Old Oaken Bucket and the Ms. Versatility. As it is a race for 3-year-old trotters, it should come as no surprise that Jimmy Takter appears to have the upper hand in the Old Oaken Bucket. He has the first and second choice in the morning line in French Laundry and Walter White. | share this story |



# Get it Write

Winning Jug No Longer Guarantees Championship Honors

Time was that when a 3-year-old pacer won the Little

Brown Jug, he was almost automatically voted the champion of his class. That was then; this is now.

Of the first 30 sophomore pacers voted champion, 24 were Jug winners. Of the most recent 30 sophomore pacers voted champion, only 13 were Jug winners.

(In fact, the last four Jug winners---Big Bad John, Michael's Power, Vegas Vacation, and Limelight Beach---were not named champion of their class.)

That's largely because the Jug was the paramount pacing event for sophomores in the 1950s and 60s. Along with the Messenger and Cane Pace, the Jug comprised the pacing Triple Crown and the Jug had the lure of Americana and tradition that made it a target for everyone with a talented 3-year-old pacer.

Then other races came along to challenge the Jug's role as the must-win event for owners, trainers, and drivers. The Meadowland Pace was first contested in 1977 for a purse of \$425,000. The same year the Jug offered a bounty of only \$150,000.

By 1980, when Niatross won the Meadowlands Pace, the purse exceeded \$1 million. When Niatross won the Jug two months later, its purse was \$207,361.

Still, there was the tradition and prestige attached to winning the Jug. It was unique in American harness racing. But owners and those associated with a top horse know that tradition and prestige don't pay the bills.

That was brought home to me in the 1980s when I was meandering through a shed row at Pompano Park in late winter. I stopped in front of the stall of a 3-year-old-pacer that was raising some hell and some headline with his victories in Florida.

I engaged the colt's groom in a conversation by asking what the plans were for the colt later in the year.

"We'll race him a couple more times here at Pompano, ship him north and freshen him up, and then get him ready for the big one," he told me.

"The Jug?" I replied.

"No, no, no," he shot back, looking at me as if I'd just fallen off a turnip truck. "The Meadowlands Pace."

The Jug's tradition and prestige didn't mean much to him. It was strictly a case of "show me the money."

In 1984, the Breeders Crown, harness racing's year-end championship, made its debut and the sophomore pacers

fought it out that fall for a purse of \$670,000. That year the Jug's purse was about half as much.

It was, of course, difficult for a small county fair in Ohio to compete with the Meadowlands and Breeders Crown in terms of purses. The Jug's purse increased in the 1980s and 90s, but trainers soon expressed reservations about heat racing and half-mile tracks.

The 1980s were a pivotal decade for harness racing in many ways and certainly for the Jug.

In 1981, the Jug was won by Fan Hanover, the only filly ever to take top honors, but that race was marred by accidents that wiped out several pacers, including the unbeaten pre-race favorite Landslide.

Over the next seven years (1982-1988), the Jug winner was named champion of the class only twice.


In 1982, Cam Fella was the best horse in harness racing and certainly the dominant sophomore, but he was not eligible to the Jug. Merger won in 1982.

In 1984, On The Road Again dominated the sophomore classics, but he, too, was not eligible to the Jug. Colt Forty-Six won.

In 1987, Jate Lobell was voted champion of his talent-laden class, but he was also not eligible to the Jug. Jaguar Spur won that year.

In 1988, Matt's Scooter became the fastest horse in history with a stunning 1:48.2 time trial and dominated his sophomore class, but he was not eligible to the Jug. BJ Scoot won.

Since 1990, sophomore champions such as Western Hanover, Presidential Ball, Cam's Card Shark, Jenna's Beach Boy, Hot Lead, Artiscape, Gallo Blue Chip, Art Major, Rocknroll Hanover and Total Truth were named champions despite not winning the Jug.

In 2008, Brent McGrath, the trainer and co-owner of Somebeachsomewhere, the megastar of that season, made a controversial decision to skip the Jug. He took considerable heat from the traditionalists, who viewed his defection as sacrireligiuos, but McGrath weighed the risks of racing in the Jug against the best interest of the horse. To win the Jug, Somebeachsomewhere would have to race at least two and possibly three heats. He stood out over his rivals, but what if he drew the dreaded post eight, and then got hung out to dry by a pacer setting torrid fractions?

Although he had been developed over a half-mile track in Nova Scotia and won his first couple starts over a twice-around, there was a question about how the long-striding son of Mach Three would do against the bearcats on a smaller track.

So McGrath decided to skip the Jug and still earned honors as Horse of the Year.

The star colt from the first crop by Somebeachsomehwere was Captaintreacherous. He was the overwhelming freshman champion of 2012 and came into Jug week with only a few losses in his career. Yet his connection decided to by-pass the Jug for fear that multiple heats might vitiate the Captain for later season stakes. To add insult, a few days after skipping the \$552,552 Jug,

Captaintreacherous raced in a \$52,000 invitation at Hoosier Park.

Wiggle It Jiggleit is the obvious and sentimental favorite to be named champion of the sophomore pacer this season, and he's also the favorite to win the Jug on Thursday. But we all know that there is no such thing as a sure thing in horse racing.

## Sassa Hanover Shows Her Versatility, Wins Jugette

**DELAWARE, OH** -Trainer Ron Burke admitted he wasn't sure what the best strategy was for Sassa Hanover entering yesterday's finals of the Jugette. All afternoon, speed had been coming up short at Delaware and Sassa Hanover had won her Jugette elim closing from last.

It was driver Matt Kakaley who made the final call. At Delaware, if you draw the rail in a big race you go. End of story.

"I wasn't as confident as you might think I'd be because no one really wanted to cut it," said Burke, who won both elims, the other with Bettor N Better. "I give Matt the credit

because he said, 'I'll cut it.' I think there had been ten favorites in a row beaten on the front end here, but he said 'I'll take my shot. If I can her to the half easy, I'll get her home from there.' That shows signs of maturation as a driver and a belief in himself to make horses go in big

spots."

So not only is Sassa Hanover good, she can win in a multitude of ways.

The daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven led every step of the way to win the Jugette final in a cakewalk. She won by two lengths over another Burke-trainee, Southwind Roulette, in the time of 1:51.1. Her combined time for the two heats was 3:42, a world-record for a 3-year-old pacing filly.

Burke could not have found himself in a better position coming into the final as he had three horses and they had the three inside posts.

With Yannick Gingras driving, Bettor N Better won the first of two elims over stablemate Southwind Roulette. Sassa Hanover was an upset winner of the second elim, paying \$19.20. The favorite was still another Burke-trainee, Band Of Angels. She finished fifth and did not make the

final.

The only question in the final appeared to be which filly would Burke win with?

Kakaley took care of business and went right to the front, going the first quarter in 26.4 and then slowing the pace down so that he got a 56 half and a 29.1 second quarter.

"I thought if I could give her a breather at some point she could get the job done," said Kakaley. "I figured I would just let her roll off the car and as long as there was a breather somewhere we were going to win."

Bettor N Better came after her as Gingras decided to come first over. Her challenge was short lived as she ran out of gas on the final turn. From there, it was all over as no one challenged Sassa Hanover late.

Sassa Hanover has had an up-and-down year, but Burke thinks a change in tactics has helped her turn the corner.

"We have a different mind-set now, to be more aggressive with her and make her train harder," he said. "We were so worried that she would get hot and that we had to control her we had her to point where she was almost slumbering around the racetrack. So we came here and decided to train her hard, make her aggressive, and she's either going to race good or then we'll come up with a new plan. Maybe she's just been waiting for us to do this."

It was the third Jugette win for the Burke stable. Ron Burke won the race in 2012 with Darena Hanover and his father, Mickey, won it with Western Graduate in 2007.

Nuncio is The Rage in Sweden By Joakim Lindqvist

**STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN** - Nine performances. Seven wins. Two national records and the quickest trotter in Europe this year.

Here in Sweden, 4-year old Nuncio is developing into what a political editorial page in a daily newspaper quoted as a "dark dream."

"People get in touch and want me to race with him, just for the chance to see him", says Stefan Melander, the driver, trainer as well as the owner of Nuncio. "Nuncio is a special horse. Wise. Scarlet Knight and Gigant Neo were, of course, also special, but in my eyes Nuncio is different. He is so unique. Nothing short of a miracle. What differs him in a vital way is that he's such a kind individual".

Last week, Melander raced with Nuncio on Gävle racetrack, two hours from Stockholm. This racetrack is widely known as suitable for fast performances, perhaps because it was set up on a morass. For the first time racing in Sweden, Nuncio had no shoes at all. The task was easy, but he finished on 1.52,0, a national record, and the quickest time in Europe, this year.

Melander then said he could have gone faster, remarking the low temperature, and then pointing out Sebastian K.'s world record, as something to rub out next year.

But an adventure always begins where your feet are. Speaking to Melander he says that tomorrow is always a new day. You can't know what will happen.

"We'll see, if Nuncio will race or if he goes into breeding. Most likely he'll race," he said. "I have not decided if Nuncio will be seen in the U.S. again. But since I'm curious by nature and if there would be a strong interest, I'm into trying new things. Of course, it would be a dream to have Nuncio at a stud farm there, and then go to an auction and find yearlings of Nuncio. Such U.S. auctions are the best in the world of trotting. But I wouldn't call it impossible to find a new Nuncio in Sweden as well, since bloodlines have improved here."

While Melander is not sure what he will do in the future with Nuncio he is enticed by racing him over the super-fast track at Pocono, where Sebastian K went the fastest trotting mile in the sport's history, and finding out what he can do.

"Transmitting the fast running-times he's accomplished in Sweden, it would of course be exciting to try him on the ground at Pocono," he said.

So, Nuncio has been closely defeated twice in 2015. That was in The Elitlopp at Solvalla racetrack in May. There, Nuncio was the youngest contender in the race. And his performance in the final was breath-taking, going three-wide without cover all the way, with three turns over the mile. Just a head from winning. His former trainer Jimmy Takter was on hand with Maven, and acknowledged: "the show was by Nuncio."

"You know, dispositions and tactics are so different in Sweden, so yet, I haven't made a bold try with Nuncio behind the gate. He was so calm and nice that day in May and I didn't want to quarrel with him, so I just kept our position. It was a pity that John Campbell couldn't make it to drive him that day. If there will be a new try for The Elitlopp, I hope Campbell can make it," Melander says today.

"The successes in the U.S. were unbelievable. I think I was a good owner during that time. I never interfered in the plans for him, but what I said was: 'I want Campbell to drive.' Due to lack of time I only saw him live twice in the U.S. The two years he was there, Nuncio got in a hurry,

but, as most living creatures do, he's matured. When he came here I had never driven him. Starting up anew on my farm, I wanted no knowledge of earlier methods. I want to train him the way I do it, starting from well-leveled scratch, so to speak", says Melander.

If the Elitlopp a major task this year, so was The Sprintermästaren at Halmstad racetrack in the beginning of July. It took place on the west-coast, and that race is Sweden's most important for exclusively 4-year-olds, over the mile. Nuncio won the final on 1.52,6, showing his instinct by putting his head first just passing the wire.

Prices up an Average 43% at the Morrisville Yearling Sale

LATHAM, NY - 62 well-bred yearlings, including 58 eligible to the lucrative New York Sire Stakes, went up for auction Sunday (Sept. 20) at the annual Morrisville College Yearling Sale at the Nancy Sears Stowell Equine Arena located on the college campus.

A large and enthusiastic crowd gathered well in advance of the 1:00 p.m. start time for breakfast Morrisville sale topper and to get a good look at the next generation of stars from 17 top sires in the sport before finalizing their short lists and heading into the sales arena.

When everything was said and done, 48 trotters and 14 pacers produced a sales total of just under \$1 million with an average price per horse of \$15.540. That number is up a substantial 43% from last year's average bid of \$10,715 and a 60% increase over the average price of the last five years combined. Speculation at the sale was the smaller group of higher caliber yearlings drove the prices up.

The sale topper (as well as highest priced trotter) was hip number 24, Royal Pinot (RC Royalty-Graduation Party) who was consigned by Crawford Farms. The filly was purchased for \$55,000 by Burke Racing.

The second highest bid of \$40,000 was realized for hip number 68, Texican (Cash Hall-Hot Chili Girl) who was consigned by Lakeview Equine. The trotting colt was purchased by Wanda Polisseni of Fairport, NY.

On the pacing side, hip number 42, Planet Rock (Rock N Roll Heaven-Villa Hanover), who was also consigned by Lakeview Equine, drew a final bid of \$24,000 from Ken Jacobs of Baldwinsville, NY.

Chapter Seven yearlings brought the highest average price of the sale at \$24,667, just ahead of Conway Hall who commanded \$24,200. RC Royalty, who had the highest number of yearlings in the sale (21), was third at \$18,190.

The seven-horse consignment from Crawford Farms brought the highest average price of \$21,143. Lakeview Equine who offered 15 head averaged \$17,767 and the Morrisville College Equine Institute, who had the largest consignment of 18, realized \$17,500 per horse.

## Creatine, Natural Herbie to Represent US in **International Trot**

YONKERS. NY - The field has been finalized for Yonkers



Raceway's million-dollar International Trot, set for Saturday afternoon, Oct. 10th.

Creatine and Natural Herbie have been chosen as the United States representatives.

Creatine, a 5-year-old son of

Andover Hall, has raced abroad this far in 2015 for Johnny and Jimmy Takter. This season, his wins include Hugo Abergs Memorial (Sweden) and Prix Saint Michel (Finland), as well as a second in the final of UET Masters (Belgium). His three-year-old North American resume, when he was trained by co-owner Bob Stewart, included 14 wins, nine seconds and six thirds in 40 starts (\$1,329,170).

Creatine's career North American highlight was the 2013 Kentucky Futurity at the Red Mile, when he authored a 15-1 upset in a soggy 1:53.2.

As for Natural Herbie, he already impressed the local screening committee with last season's win over a world-class field in the \$250,000 International Trot Preview.

The 5-year-old Here Comes Herbie gelding, the pride and joy of owner/trainer/driver Verlin Yoder, won his elimination of the Maple Leaf Trot before finishing third in the final. His career earnings are approaching \$900,000. His winning time of 2:24.4 for the 11/4-mile distance (same of the International) was/is a world record for the distance over a half-mile oval.

The two American reps round out the stellar 10-horse field as the International returns after a two-decade hiatus

## Keller, Carr and Connors to Hall of Fame

CORAL SPRINGS, FL - It was announced today by the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA), that Charles Keller III, whose Yankeeland Farm produced Hambletonian winners Muscles Yankee (1998) and Yankee Paco (2000), has been voted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

In addition, two veteran publicists, David Carr and Jerry Connors, were also voted as inductees into the Communicators Hall of Fame.

Keller took over the helm of Yankeeland Farm after the 1990 death of his father, Charlie Keller Jr., of New York

Yankees fame. Keller's father purchased the farm in Frederick, Md., in 1955 and assembled the mares and bred the progeny that contributed to the farm's success over several decades.

Keller has been a director of the Hambletonian Society since 2000 and is a member of the executive committee, for which he was chairman from 2013 through this spring, following the passing of John Cashman Jr. Keller was a director of the United States Trotting Association (USTA) for five terms and an active member of the Finance

Committee. He is a current trustee of the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame.

David Carr joined the USTA as a publicist and staff writer for Hoof Beats magazine in 1982. Three years later, he proposed the creation of the information and research department, developed it into a superb resource for those writing about the sport of harness racing, and is now head of that department.

Jerry Connors has had a passion for harness racing since he was a child and few in the industry can duplicate his memory of racing and events in the sport.

A "jack of all trades," Connors has worked at numerous racetracks and industry organizations throughout his career as a publicist and administrator. He has been an USHWA director for 23 years, and is a licensed judge, track announcer and race charter.

Keller, along with horseman Bruce Nickells, who was previously announced as the senior-elect to the Hall of Fame, will join Carr and Connors at the USHWA Dan Patch Awards dinner on Sunday, March 6, in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., as their first introduction as harness racing's newest members of the Hall of Fame.

The actual induction ceremony takes place on Sunday, July 3, at the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in Goshen, N.Y.

ROCKIN IN HEAVEN steps outside from the friendly confines of New York to race against open competition. Trevor Henry gets to keep the drive and he'll be stalking all the way; should be in line to make the final from here. SPLIT THE HOUSE now has Oakes listed as the trainer and comes off an arduous first over trip in the Simcoe. The post is a killer from a win standpoint but Tetrick will do what he needs to do in order to make the final. YANKEE BOUNTY popped with a big mile two back and then wasn't bad last out against WAKIZASHI HANOVER; could be heading back in the right direction at the right time for Burke.
