Hannelore Homecoming

In her return to Indiana, Hannelore Hanover defeated the boys to win the Centaur Trotting Classic at Hoosier Park

Hannelore Hanover (Yannick Gingras) easily defeated the boys in the \$220,000 Centaur Trotting Classic Saturday at Hoosier Park.

Hannelore Hanover, with driver Yannick Gingras in the bike, returned to her home state of Indiana Saturday (Sept. 24) and turned in a dominant performance at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino in the featured event of the evening, the \$220,000 Centaur Trotting Classic. The Centaur Trotting Classic is Hoosier Park's richest trotting race and for the second consecutive year, the race was won by a mare.

Just as Bee A Magician did the previous year, Hannelore Hanover easily handled a field of nine male counterparts to add another stakes victory to her resume. With a final time of 1:52.4, the world champion mare made her game winning move down the backside and coasted on to the wire to finish two lengths in front of the competition.

Leaving from post six in the field of 10, Hannelore Hanover was eased off the gate to settle in fourth while Homicide Hunter and David Miller got the first call through the opening panel in :26.4. Muscle Up The Goal and Aaron

Merriman benefitted from a pocket trip, while Crazy Wow and John DeLong were next in line third. Gingras gave Hannelore Hanover the green light just past the half in :55 and she ranged up to reach the leader's wheel to grab command just before the three-quarter clocking in 1:24.3.

As the field turned for home, Hannelore Hanover began to put her talent on display as she found another gear and started to trot away from the field. Wind Of The North and Corey Callahan rallied gamely in the stretch, but had to settle for second-place honors while Crazy Wow and John DeLong rounded out the trifecta. As the 1-5 favorite, Hannelore Hanover returned \$2.60 at the betting window.

"She's just a great, great mare," Gingras said in the winner's circle. "I wanted to race her off the pace, but that was a nice horse on the front and I had to move when I did so he didn't get away from us. She was strong turning for home and just coasted to the wire. She was unbelievably good again tonight."

Trained by Hoosier Park's leading trainer Ron Burke, the four-year-old daughter of Swan For All—High Sobriety notched her 15th win from 17 seasonal outings. Hannelore Hanover has now amassed \$1,201,685 for her connections of

Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci, Frank Baldachino, and J&T Silva Stables.

"I always knew she was a nice mare," Burke said before the race. "I told Yannick (Gingras) last year that she was third best trotting filly in the country and she's proving it now."

"I am very fond of Mission Brief, but Hannelore Hanover is right up there with her. Hopefully Mission Brief can come back and we can see these two racing together. They are definitely the nicest trotting mares I've ever had and that's saying a lot because I also trained Buck I St. Pat. It's been a lot of fun with Hannelore Hanover this season."

The victory with Hannelore Hanover was one of four winners on the evening's 14-race card for both Burke and Gingras. Burke currently leads all trainers at Hoosier Park for the 2016 live harness racing season with 64 wins on the season through 125 days of racing.

Miki Delivers

Indiana Sired star Always B Miki gave the Hoosier Park faithful exactly what they came to see.

The majority of the members of the Hoosier Park audience were in attendance Saturday (Sept. 24) to witness a show of superb speed and unrivalled power. They received that and more as Always B Miki paced yet another tour-de-force in triumph in the \$170,000 Hoosier Park Pacing Derby at the Anderson, IN oval.

"I think he and Wiggle It Jiggleit are horses before their time," said David Miller, who steered Always B Miki to victory. "They are just not like any other horses we have seen before. We will see other horses that come along like them as time goes on with their speed and how far they can carry it, but right now they stand alone."

The overwhelming public selection at 1-9, Always B Miki and Miller left from the rail and went straight to the front. Freaky Feet Pete and Trace Tetrick were right on their heels from post position three as those two horses clicked off a first-quarter mile of :26.2. Miller and Always B Miki pulled comfortably away from Freaky Feet Pete to lead by a length at the half-mile pole in :55.

At that juncture, Dealt A Winner with Aaron Merriman at the controls and Always At My Place in rein to Ricky Macomber Jr., made their bids for the front, with Dealt A Winner passing Freaky Feet Pete to take second and locking

the four-year-old stallion in the pocket.

After three-quarters in 1:22.3, the six-horse field entered in the stretch with Always B Miki and Miller still reigning supreme. As they were set down for the final push to the wire, Freaky Feet Pete's only option for victory was the passing lane, while it appeared Dealt A Winner and Always At My Place had far too much real estate to cover to even draw even with the leader.

Tetrick and Freaky Pete punched through the inside to give chase and despite a :25.4 final quarter panel on their part, it was simply not enough to relegate Always B Miki to their rearview mirror prior to the finish line.

Miller and Always B Miki crossed the finish line in 1:48.2. Like Freaky Feet Pete, Always B Miki came home in :25.4, yet it appeared the five-year-old stallion could have went much more swiftly if Miller had truly asked for what remained in reserve.

After a valiant effort, Freaky Feet Pete was second with Always Bets Off rushing from sixth to claim the show position over the fading Dealt A Winner.

Owned by Bluewood Stable, Roll The Dice Stable and Christina Takter, world and Indiana champion Always B Miki, is conditioned by Christina's husband Jimmy. The son of Always A Virgin—Artstopper, paid a paltry \$2.10 for a trip around the Anderson oval that truly demonstrated his hooves step in rarefied air, with the exacta paying \$4.20 and the trifecta \$18.00.

After the winner's circle festivities were complete, Miller confirmed what has become very obvious over recent months.

"I have driven a lot of very good horses over the years," he said. "I've been doing this for a long time, but this horse has to rank up there with the best of them and he may be the best."

Chalk Prevails

Idyllic Beach, Fear The Dragon and JK Will Power were all big Grand Circuit winners at Hoosier Park.

On an absolutely perfect evening in Anderson, IN the teeming crowd packing the apron was anxiously awaiting the return of their beloved equine superstars in the co-featured \$170,000 Hoosier Park Pacing Derby and the \$220,000 Centaur Trot. In the end, the faithful were rewarded with powerful performances in the \$246,000 Kentucky Stallion Management Stake, the \$140,000 Elevation Stake and the \$100,000 Jenna's Beach Boy from Idyllic Beach, Fear The Dragon and JK Will Power.

Idyllic Beach commenced the action in the eighth race, the Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stake. The two-year-old daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Idyllic, was hustled out to the lead by pilot Yannick Gingras immediately after leaving the gate ahead of Always Giggling and established an initial first quarter-mile split of :27.2.

The filly, conditioned by Jimmy Takter and owned by his wife Christina, John Fielding and Brixton Medical Inc. and Marvin Katz, effortlessly glided around the Hoosier Park oval in quarter-mile times of :56.4, 1:25.2 and stopped the clock in 1:52.2.

While her rivals attempted to collar her, their efforts were in vain and Glassine Hanover despite a valiant pursuit had to settle for second, with Awash, who also made a strong move in the stretch, in third.

“(Idyllic Beach) does everything you want her to do,” said Gingras, who scored four wins on the evening.

With her latest victory, Idyllic Beach's record improves to 8 6-2-0 and her bank account increased to \$449,132. The filly, the overwhelming public select at post time, paid \$2.50 to her supporters, while the exacta was \$4.20 and the trifecta \$10.20.

Fear The Dragon certainly served notice he is a colt that bears some serious watching, as the two-year-old son of Dragon Again—Armbr Cinnamon collected his sixth career triumph in the \$140,000 Elevation Stake, which was the ninth race on the card.

With David Miller in the bike, the Brian Brown pupil and even money favorite was placed on the lead in the beginning of the contest from post six, but was passed after the first quarter-mile, which went in a stiff :25.2, by Every Way Out and Corey Callahan. Miller and Fear The Dragon were content to sit in the pocket seat, as Every Way Out set fractions of :55.1 and 1:23.4 before he was overhauled by Rock N Tony and Trace Tetrack heading into the stretch.

That is when Miller took action and pulled Fear The Dragon to pace for home. Although Ocean Colony and

Yannick Gingras made a strong move of their own from third, the duo simply did not have enough punch to overtake the Bruce Trogdon-owned colt, who hit the wire in 1:50.4. John De Long and Odds On Delray also closed strongly through the lane, but came home third.

“I usually sell my colts,” Trogdon said. “But I loved this colt right from the time he was a baby. His dam foaled Cinnamony (\$501,394) who is an Art Official, and she has a yearling by McArdle, but she is back in foal to Dragon Again, because of this colt. We love this cross with Dragon Again and this colt has just been perfect all along. We also had high hopes for him and we are hoping we will back in the winner's circle here at Hoosier Park again with him.”

Fear The Dragon's resume now stands at 9 5-2-2 and he has amassed \$212,016 in purse money. The colt offered \$4.20 to win, with the exacta providing \$15.20 for those with the correct wager and the trifecta paid \$132.60.

Not to be outdone by the youngsters' wins prior to his stakes engagement, JK Will Power made a statement of his own in the \$100,000 Jenna's Beach Boy pace. With David Miller holding the lines, the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Whats New Pussycat, trained by Ron Burke, was in fifth place in the first quarter-mile behind leader Don'tcallmefrancis who set the opening fraction of :26.2. Don'tcallmefrancis led the field through the half-mile in :55.1 until he was overtaken by JK Will Power shortly

before the three-quarter pole with the tote board flashing a time of 1:24.

From there, it was all JK Will Power who hit the wire in 1:51.2. Granite made a bid from last to finish second, with Mystical Rock pacing from second to last to be third.

Owned by 3 Brothers Stables, the three-year-old colt paid \$5.20 to win as the even money favorite. He collected his sixth lifetime victory from 26 trips to the post.

"He has not won a lot of races and usually finishes second or third," said Miller, who captured three races in his trip to

Anderson. "But at the top of the stretch I knew I had plenty of horse and he would come home a winner tonight."

The exacta paid \$134.60 and the trifecta \$3,710.40 to their respective supporters.

NYSS stars crowned on Night of Champions

Eight \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes finals were contested Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

The Empire's best of the best converged upon Yonkers Raceway Saturday night (Sept. 24) for the \$1.8 million New York Night of Champions.

Eight, \$225,000 sire stakes finals, each sponsored by a prominent breeding farm, featured the best two- and three-year-olds of both sexes and gaits in the 27th edition of the Night of Champions.

The freshmen played out as follows:

(Winbak Farm 2-Year-Old Filly Pace) – Roaring To Go (Jason Bartlett), pocketed and a bit wobbly-gaited late, crossed the line first in 1:55. The wobbles didn't do her in, but the cutting the cones did. She was set down to second for leaving the course in the final turn, promoting 6-5 favorite Tequila Monday (Brian Sears, \$4.50) to the win. The latter, last after an early, eight-hole break, was relentless, closing from a dozen lengths back at the half to miss by a head before eventually being put up. Robin J (John Campbell) sat and was a best-of-the-rest third.

Tequila Monday, a daughter of American Ideal—Margarita Monday trained by Chris Oakes for co-owners Susan Oakes and Chuck Pompey, has won four of her five seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$12.40, with the triple (three wagering

choices returning \$41).

(Genesee Valley Farm 2-Year-Old Colt/Gelding Pace) – Odds-on Funknwaffles (Jim Morrill Jr., \$2.70) won this "match race" with second choice Miso Fast (Matt Kakaley) by three-quarters of a length in 1:52.3, a track record for two-year-old pacing geldings. It was 10 lengths back to Twin B Cowboy (Tim Tetrick), with 140-1 shot What's Goin' On (Mark MacDonald) fourth.

Funknwaffles, a son of American Ideal—Hatsoff Hanover co-owned by Susan Oakes and Crawford Farms Racing and trained by John Butenschoen, has been just about perfect (nine starts, eight wins, one second) this season (\$257,284). The exacta paid \$4, the triple returned \$29.60 and the superfecta paid \$266.

"He's an overachiever," Morrill Jr. said. "May not by much to look at, but this was a tremendous mile on a cool evening." (Majestic View Farms International 2-Year-Old Colt/Gelding Trot) – He was the best in the division coming in, and Devious Man (Andy Miller, \$3.20) remained as such going out. Working his way to the lead just before the half, he finished his rounds in 1:58. Stick with Me Kid (Sears) chased after yielding, beaten a length-and-three quarters, with Such an Angel (Campbell) a first-up third.

For Devious Man, a son of Credit Winner—Miss Garland owned (as part of Stroy Inc.) by trainer Julie Miller, he's won six of his 10 '16 tries. The exacta (two wagering choices) paid \$11.20, with the triple returning \$23.40.

"He just zips around these small tracks," Andy Miller said.

Smalltownthrowdown (Dan Daley) won the three-year-old male trot in 1:56.1

“He was getting a little tired around the last turn, but he’s figured out how to win.”

(Crawford Farms 2-Year-Old Filly Trot) – Despite 22 days off and a scratched-sick in between, odds-on Barn Bella (Jeff Gregory, \$3.20) held sway. She defeated an out-a-long-way Mamora Bay (Sam Schillaci) by a length in a division track-record 1:57.2. Heels on Wheels (Kakaley) was third.

Barn Bella, a Conway Hall–Bravissima miss co-owned by (trainer) Steve and Nancy Pratt and Purple Haze Stables, has won six of her nine first-season starts. The exacta (two wagering choices) paid \$7.70, with the triple returning \$22.

“She was sick before her last scheduled start (here),” Gregory said. “Steve (Pratt) didn’t want to qualify her because she’s been racing regularly before that. He and Claude Huckabone Jr., who drove her earlier in the season, did a very good job with her, because she was a project when she first started.”

The sophomore winners were:

(Allerage Farm 3-Year-Old Filly Trot) – Last season’s division champ Non Stick (Ake Svanstedt, \$4.80), defended her title in wire-to-wire, 1:56.4 fashion. Swinging Royalty (Brian Sears) was a pocket second, beaten a length, with 111-1 proposition Straight A Student (Mark MacDonald) closing for third.

Non Stick, a daughter of Lucky Chucky–Meucci Madness trained by her co-owner (with Little E LLC) and driver, has won six of her 10 seasonal starts (\$345,907) and is 12-for-16 in her career. The exacta paid \$42.20, with the triple returning \$841.

Fad Finance (Jim Morrill Jr.), as the 3-4 choice, had a brutal strip, trying to leave, only getting a (three-hole) seat when a rival broke and eventually finishing an empty fifth.

(Cameo Hills Farm 3-Year-Old Filly Pace) – Wishy Washy Girl (Morrill Jr., \$6) finished what she started, two lengths better than frosh champ Dime a Dance (Matt Kakaley) in a life-best

1:53.3. American Ivy (Andy Miller) was a loose pocket third.

No Clouds Bluechip (Sears), the 11-10 fave, was a weak first-over and backpedaled to last.

Wishy Washy Girl, a daughter of Roll with Joe–Wish All You Want trained by Tracy Brainard for co-owners Steven Demeter and Michael Cimaglio, is now four-for-14 this season. The exacta paid \$24.20, with the triple returning \$129.

(Blue Chip Farms, 3-Year-Old Colt/Gelding Pace) – Slight favorite Roll Away Joe (Jason Bartlett, \$4.90) never had an anxious moment, whipping second choice Bottom Deals (Tim Tetrick) by two-and-a-half lengths in 1:52.3. Craftship (Scott Zeron) picked of the rest for third. Art Rooney Pace winner Missile J (Sears) tried it uncovered, gave way readily and finished last.

Roll Away Joe, a Roll With Joe–Chatelaine gelding trained by Brainard for co-owners Demeter, Howard Taylor and Tom Lazzaro, has won six of his 17 seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$14.80, with the triple returning \$57.

(Morrisville College Equine Institute 3-Year-Old Colt/Gelding Trot) – Small-priced Smalltownthrowdown (Dan Daley, \$2.80) needed some coaxing, but finished it off in 1:56.1. Dayson (Sears) was a good, two-move, eight-hole second – beaten a length, with Dante (Svanstedt) a pocket third and The Royal Harry (MacDonald) fourth.

For ‘Smalltown,’ a Cash Hall–Ann’s Promise gelding trained by his driver for co-owners Ann-Mari Daley, James Crawford IV, Donald Brenner and Richard Lombardo, it was his seventh win in 15 seasonal starts (\$446,263). The exacta paid \$13.80, the triple returned \$33.20 and the superfecta (four wagering choices in order) paid \$110.

“He had issues with a pus pocket the last time he raced (Yonkers),” Dan Daley said. “I know it had to be stinging him a bit, so that’s why I had to keep after him.”

Daley said Smalltownthrowdown would be in the Harrisburg sale. “He’s going to make someone some money, but I have partners and we need the money to buy more babies.”

Lady Shadow wins Milton

The older pacing mare is the first in nine years to win both the Milton and the Roses Are Red.

Lady Shadow continued her outstanding season with a powerful 1:50 victory in the \$311,000 Milton Stakes Saturday night (Sept. 24) at Mohawk Racetrack.

A strong group of 10 older pacing mares, with more than \$8.3 million in combined career earnings, battled it out for the Milton Stakes crown.

Lady Shadow has been at the top of the division all season and to no surprise was wagered down to 2-5 in Saturday's rich final.

The five-year-old pacing mare showed early speed to get away near the front for driver James MacDonald. Wrangler Magic sprinted off the wings of the gate to grab command and forced a charged up Frost Damage Blues into the two-hole.

After a :26.4 opening-quarter, Wrangler Magic continued to motor along down the backstretch for driver Sylvain Filion. MacDonald gave Lady Shadow her cue to move out from third at the three-eighths and the heavy favorite sprinted up to take a slight lead at the half in :54.4.

Filion did his best to stretch out the favorite, but Lady Shadow would clear to the front entering the far turn and ripped off a :27 third-panel to reach three-quarters in 1:21.4.

In the stretch, Lady Shadow created some separation on her rivals and paced home in :28.1 for a two-and-a-quarter length victory.

"I know with Sylvain (Filion) he wanted to stretch me out a little bit, but it doesn't matter to her," said MacDonald, who also won last year's Milton Stakes with Venus Delight.

"I've seen her go some of the craziest trips you could ask a horse to go this year and she got stung pretty hard tonight and she's just such a good mare, she overcame it."

Yagonnakissmeornot was able to finish second after getting away fourth and staying inside until three-quarters. Waasmula charged home for third, while Bedroomconfessions closed well from the back for fourth.

Wrangler Magic faded back to finish ninth.

A five-year-old daughter of Shadow Play—Lady Camella, Lady Shadow has now won nine of 16 starts and earned over \$700,000 this season for trainer Ron Adams and owners David Kryway, Carl Atley, Edwin Gold and BFI Stable.

"She's definitely having a career year," said Adams. "She's just been tough and stayed tough the whole year and she's just getting better I think every start."

Lady Shadow became the first mare Saturday since Moving Pictures in 2007 to win both the Milton Stakes and Roses Are Red Stakes in the same season. She now has 25 career wins and career earnings of over \$1.5 million.

Adams said in the winner's circle that Lady Shadow will now head to Lexington, KY to race on Oct. 9 during the Grand Circuit at The Red Mile.

"Hopefully it's a nice day and we can maybe go a big mile."

A \$2 win ticket on Lady Shadow returned \$2.90, while the \$2 Exacta with the winner and Yagonnakissmeornot paid \$46.80.

When Bret ruled the world

Remembering Bret Hanover's 1:53.3 world record at The Red Mile in 1966 through the eyes of his caretaker, Dave Willoughby.

Fifty years ago, Dave Willoughby played a central role in one of harness racing's greatest dramas.

Willoughby, now 76 and living in south Florida, was the groom of Bret Hanover, the ne plus ultra harness horse that era when the sport got widespread national media coverage and thousands packed the pari-mutuel plants to see racing.

But this drama would play out on a much smaller stage, but one far more important to the insiders in the sport. Bret Hanover was attempting to pace the fastest mile in history in front of a crowd consisting of the most important people in harness racing.

For Willoughby it was pretty much just another day at the office. Although Bret was the greatest harness hero of this halcyon decade, Willoughby takes little credit for the horse's accomplishments.

"To be truthful, Bret pretty much took care of himself," he said.

Bret was almost too good to be true. Never sick, never lame. Willoughby recalls that Bret showed symptoms of colic once at Liberty Bell but came through that crisis.

"Lucien Fontaine once asked me what kind of pre-race we used on Bret," says Willoughby. "We didn't do any of that stuff. We never even did a blood test on Bret. He never had a needle in his neck. Bret raced on hay and oats and an occasional bran mash."

Bret had spent his entire life doing everything right. He was like the quarterback of the football team who was dating the prettiest cheerleader. He was the high-priced yearling of 1963 at \$50,000, then justified that price by going unbeaten in 24 starts as a two-year-old. He was the first juvenile ever voted Horse of the Year.

He picked up in 1965 where he left off, bowling over his foes like a freight train. A national sports publication featured Bret with a story headlined "Can't Anyone Beat This Horse?"

It sure didn't seem that anyone could, but then the inevitable occurred. At the Illinois State Fair in mid-August, pilot Jim Dennis and Adios Vic let Bret set the fractions and then unleashed a lethal homestretch kick that carried them to victory.

Two weeks later, Adios Vic defeated Bret in two of the three heats of the Horseman Futurity at Indianapolis and Bret went home without the trophy for the first time.

Bret didn't like getting beaten and he swept the rest of his 1965 starts, including world record miles

in the Little Brown Jug. He earned Horse of the Year honors again, and took a winter vacation before returning to the races as a four-year-old.

Bret dropped a decision to Cardigan Bay in the well-promoted "Pace of the Century" at Yonkers in 1966. A

rivalry developed, but Cardy never again beat Bret.

Bret was often roped off to avoid being pestered by fans before a race, but Willoughby welcomed visitors because he set up a little table to sell Bret's old shoes.

"A track official complimented me on my initiative," Willoughby recalls with a chuckle. "But they didn't want me selling Bret's shoes when the track had an open house for the public."

Dave says that rumors started that he would go to blacksmith's shops and pick up discarded shoes and sell them as being pulled off Bret.

"That's not true," he says. "I sold maybe five or six of his shoes, and they were all authentic."

(By the way, Bret was shod in front in a flat shoe with a crease in the toe. Behind he wore a half-swedge with it squared off a bit to prevent cross-firing. If you have "authentic" Bret shoes that don't match that description, perhaps they are not so authentic.)

In the summer of 1966, trainer/driver Frank Ervin thought that the three-quarter mile track at Vernon Downs would be

ideal for breaking the 1:54.3 world record of Adios Butler. They tried it in a race with a rabbit to set a fast pace, but failed. Later Bret took the world record in a 1:54 time trial at Vernon.

Still, Ervin thought Bret might go faster if given the right conditions at Lexington that fall. But conditions at Lexington are dicey at best in early October. The two previous Kentucky Futurities had been contested in overcoat weather.

Still, Ervin slated Bret for a time trial on Futurity Day in 1966. He had trained Bret in 1:56.2 earlier in the week, but was critical of the track, calling the mile oval "the red mess."

There was a lot at stake in showcasing Bret on Futurity Day because it always attracts many of the leading breeders and owners in harness racing. These are the people who could be reasonably expected to book mares to him in 1967. What if Bret flopped in his record attempt?

He was slated to stand at nearby Castleton Farm and certainly Frances Van Lennep, the owner of Castleton, and her husband Fred, didn't want that embarrassment.

Futurity Day in 1966 came up less than perfect, so Ervin

waited until late in the day when he knew from experience that the winds would calm. Governor Armbró won the Kentucky Futurity, but his best time was 2:00.2.

Still, proof positive that the track was fast enough for records came when Howard Beissinger hustled the three-year-old pacing filly Tarport Lib to victory in 1:56.2.

That mile made Tarport Lib the fastest female in harness racing history, shattering the 28-year-old standard held jointly at 1:56.3/4 by the trotter Rosalind and the pacer Her Ladyship.

(After the victory, Beissinger called Tarport Lib's absent owner to say that he now owned the fastest female in history. "What did she pay?" he was asked. The volatile Beissinger predictably exploded like Vesuvius.)

Before Bret's time trial, Ervin consulted with track manager Walter Gibbons and they even rode around the track together to make sure the surface was fit for a supreme effort.

Ervin had driven countless time trials in his career, and believed that it was to get to the half-mile marker a little than an even pace. To beat 1:54, an evenly-rated half would be in 57 seconds. Ervin felt his front half had to be faster.

As the shadows lengthened across the track in late afternoon, Ervin scored Bret down and then turned his hobbled hero for a trip into the history books.

("I wasn't nervous," recalls Willoughby. "I might have been if I'd been driving him, but I had confidence things would be okay.")

Bret hit the quarter in :27.4. He continued to roll down the backstretch and tripped the half-mile timer at :55.2.

He was well ahead of the record pace, but could he sustain it? Horses simply didn't pace consecutive quarters under 28 seconds in that era.

Bret hit the three-quarter mark in 1:24.

Now his task was clearly defined: a final quarter faster than 30 seconds would set a new record.

But Bret was, after all, only flesh and blood. The effort took a toll. Ervin urged him through the homestretch of the famed track. Horsemen gathered on the outside of the track shouted their encouragement.

Bret hit the timer in 1:53.3

He'd done it! He'd gone where no harness horse had ever gone.

At the start of 1966, Adios Butler's mile of 1:54.3 six seasons early was the speed standard. In one season, Bret

had lowered it a full second.

Alas, Bret Hanover's racing career had an unhappy ending when he was beaten in the American Pacing Classic by True Duane, but he went to Castleton Farm as the fastest and richest harness horse in history.

How Dave met Bret

"Dave, meet Bret."

Dave Willoughby had never seen Bret Hanover until just before the 1965 Little Brown Jug. He'd rubbed horses for Frank Ervin and Howard Beissinger in the early 1960s before Uncle Sam drafted him and sent him off to Korea.

Ervin's assistant Art Hult called Willoughby just before the '65 Jug and asked Dave if he would come to Delaware to take over Bret's care.

Bret smashed all existing world records in winning one of the most memorable Jugs ever. Reporters swarmed Willoughby after the race asking about Bret's habits, his background, his training routine, and on and on. Willoughby answered all questions patiently.

One reporter asked, "How long have you been taking care of Bret Hanover?"

Willoughby looked at his watch, and said, "About six hours."

Bettor's Delight / Western Hanover combos top Jug recap

This year's Little Brown Jug and Jugette winners were both sired by Bettor's Delight and out of Western Hanover mares.

Jug winner Betting Line is out of Heather's Western and Jugette winner L A Delight is out of West Of L A.

It's an impressive feat considering Bettor's Delight hand only one offspring in each race.

David Miller – elder statesman

David Miller, for the first time while winning the Jug, was the oldest driver in the race and, at age 51, is the seventh driver 50 or older to win the Jug. He joins Ron Piece (53 in 2009), Mike Lachance (50 in 2001), Billy Haughton (50 in 1974), Joe O'Brien (55 in 1973), Frank Ervin (61 in 1965) and Clint Hodgins (52 in 1959).

Miller's Jug debut was with Ruff Hewn in 1992. He was second and then third at 40-1.

Miller is now the eighth driver to win the Little Brown Jug after having gone into the Hall Of Fame. He joins Pierce, Lachance, John Campbell, Herve Filion, Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton and Joe O'Brien on that list.

Miller's Jug history now reads 30 times on the board from 52 tries.

Third times a charm

Trainer Casie Coleman won the Jug for the third time in five editions and did it with three different drivers. Scott Zeron won the 2012 Jug with Michaels Power, Brian Sears drove Vegas Vacation to victory in 2013 and Betting Line this year was David Miller.

Coleman is the third trainer to win the Jug three times in a five-year span (2012, 2013 and 2016).

Brett Pelling did it last in 1996, 1998 and 2000. John Simpson, Sr. did it in style driving and training his trio in 1956, 1957 and 1960.

Coleman is not the first female to win the Jug. That honor

goes to Caroline Lyon, who had Nicks Fantasy in 1995. Coleman is the second woman to post a 1:49 mile at Delaware, ON. On Sept. 19, 1999, Linda Toscano's Jet Laag won with driver Luc Ouellette beating older pacers in what was then a track and world record time.

But Betting Line's 1:49 in the final is the fastest Jug heat ever. Miller also owns the fastest mile ever recorded at the track – the 1:48.1 mark set by Pet Rock in 2013.

Her lucky Nichol?

Mac Nichol, one of the owners of Betting Line, was aboard the Coleman Express when the train first left the station in 2005 and American Ideal became history's first sub-1:48 sophomore.

Great in a crowd

In 1982, John Campbell won the first Jug that had as many as 25 entrants when he drove Merger to victory. In 1995, Campbell won the first Jug that had 30 entrants when he piloted Nicks Fantasy.

Cam Fella's revenge?

Cam Fella was a supplemental winner to the Cane and Messenger in 1982, but supplements were not allowed to the Jug then for either winner. No matter, he sired four Jug winners, His son Cam's Card Shark sired three Jug winners and his grandson Bettors Delight has now sired two Jug winners.

First time in 25 years?

Betting Line is on the fast track to do something not done in a quarter century – win the North America Cup, Little Brown Jug and be named Horse Of The Year. Precious Bunny was the last to do this in 1991.

Betting Line is the fifth horse in the last 25 years to win both the NA Cup and the Jug. The others are: Precious Bunny (1991), Bettor's Delight (2001), Tell All (1997) and Well Said (2009).

Betting Line's 1:47.2 mark was the fastest entering the Jug and his 1:49 Jug win is the fastest ever leaving Delaware, OH.

The pacer has now won 13 in a row. Muscle Hill won all 12 in 2009 and his final 20. Donato Hanover had 19 career wins – all consecutively. Somebeachsomewhere won his first 10 and his last 10 career. Rock N Roll Heaven won his last 10 in 2010.

All were name Horse of the Year.

Jug quiz

Q. Who was the last horse prior to Bettors Delight to win the Little Brown Jug and then sire two Jug winners?

A. Niatross, the 1980 winner, sired Jug winners from his first two crops – Nihilator in 1985 and Barberry Spur in 1986. Prior to Niatross, progeny of 1965 Jug winner Bret Hanover won the Jug back to back – Strike Out in 1972 and Melvins Woe in 1973.

Lone homebred

Western Fame, who won his heat in 1:50.1, was the only homebred in either Jug heat. It was also 10 years to the first time Mark MacDonald and Jimmy Takter won the Jug of 2006 with Mr Feelgood.

Takter vs. Burke

Who would have guessed that coming into this year's Jug that trainer Jimmy Takter would have had more Jug starters than Ron Burke? Takter led that category 20-19.

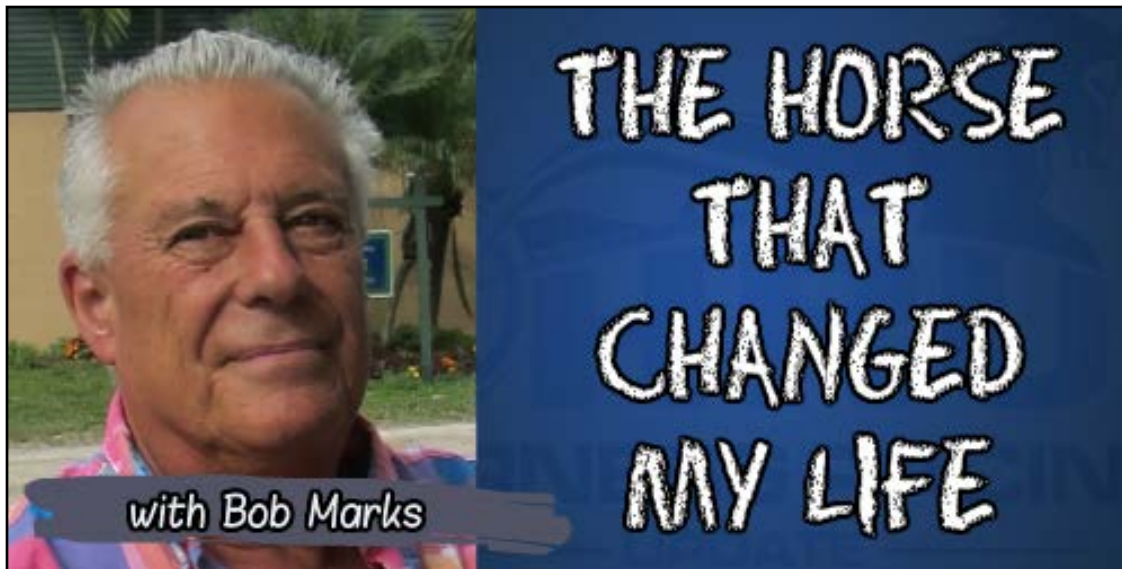

There I was in Florida — Miami Beach to be exact — writing condo ads and brochures for such lavish developments as Humidity Havens, when the back page of the New York Daily News shows a horse named Most Happy Fella winning something called the Ed Sullivan Pace at Yonkers Raceway.

The year was 1970 and I had taken the bride — with Michele in-utero — back to her place of birth as she as totally miserable in the Rego Park section of Forest Hills, Queens.

I wasn't all that happy there myself, but it was closer to Yonkers than Long Beach was and maybe just a tad more to Roosevelt.

Then it dawned on me that this lookalike son of my all time favorite horse Meadow Skipper was poised to rampage through the three-year-old pacing division much the same as his father did in 1963 and I wouldn't be there to see it.

One call to Sid Posner of Newmark Posner and Mitchell changed all that and I had a job waiting for me back in New York.

In addition, the bride was no happier in Florida than she was in Queens, so back we headed — pulling a trailer no less — this time to Long Beach Long Island.

Soon it was time for The Commodore at Roosevelt, the official coming out party for Meadow Skipper some seven years prior. This time son Most Happy Fella would be pitted against Columbia George and Truluck and it would be the first time I'd see him in the flesh.

As it was, he left — though not well but still far better than his sire could — only to tuck third down the backstretch

while Columbia George as was customary set the pace.

Most Happy Fella pulled again at the half, but couldn't dent George's two-length victory margin. Though, in time honored handicapping principles, a reversal of trips could have meant a reversal in finishes.

Thus to my eyes, he was a serious contender.

I didn't see Most Happy Fella again until the Cane at Yonkers in late summer and most likely inhabited the same seat section that I did for the '63 Cane in which Meadow Skipper astounded the harness world by beating the thought-to-be invincible Overtrick.

At Yonkers, I always tried to watch major races from either section six or seven.

As is history, Most Happy Fella made two moves to the lead before yielding to Columbia George's bull rush approaching the half. Those two drew away from the rest of the field, but hardly in the manner that Skip and Overtrick did back then. Those two actually opened a near 10-length lead on the rest of their field while George and Hap had maybe a length and a half.

Around the turn, I'm flashing back to Skip in front with Trick valiantly trying to overtake as Hap has pulled to challenge George in what will be his third move.

Into the stretch, Hap was going by much as Skip was holding sway and in the moment I had waited for in the cheering frenzy of well over 30,000 spectators, I almost called him Skip!

Days later in the Times Square subway shuttle, the Miriam McKeeba classic flashed through my head, though the lyrics were changed to: "I have seen me a horse like his daddy was. I have seen me a horse."

It's all history from there.

Good, Bad and Ugly

(Editor's note. This letter was received before last week's Feedback section was published and was accidentally left off the list. In light of the announcement this week about the end of the OUR Turn pro-casino campaign, a section commenting on that campaign is now moot and was edited out)

The Good: The epic duel between Miki and Wiggle (in the Jim Ewart Memorial Sept. 10 at Scioto) was fantastic. It's a rare occasion when a race causes goosebumps, but I have to admit that the Ewart was definitely one. Again, not to take anything away from Mr. Takter and Miki, but the ability of Wiggle to continue to perform at such a high level week after week is unreal. It's so rare these days to see a horse race at so many different places and so many times. Kudos again to the Teagues and Clyde Francis for the job they have done showcasing this amazing champ. Also, kudos go out to the Meadowlands for streaming the Ewart on the jumbo-tron.

The Bad: The big stables. I know it's not fair to blame the Burkes or Taktors of the world, but it just seems they have almost gotten too big. I mean, yikes, the PA Sire stakes final for three-year-old pacers featured five Burke horses (uncoupled), plus at least one of the also eligibles. Takter, I believe, had eight starters in the four finals combined. Together they had to have close to half the starters to reach the finals. It's going to be tough to get new owners in the sport if they have to face behemoths like those two (unless they feel compelled to take on newbies?)

The Ugly: First Class Horse. Although the race isn't available for replay on HRU, anyone who saw the first race at Yonkers on Saturday night (Sept. 10) should have been nauseated. I preface this by saying that I cashed on this race, thus it's not sour betting grapes. However, watching another horse transferred into the Milici barn from a competent trainer (in this case Julie Miller, certainly no slouch) run off the screen is just absurd. I understand the horse is talented and he had more class than the field he faced. However, he was parked nearly three-eighths of a mile before getting to

the lead after he was hung wide on turn one and wasn't allowed a courtesy tuck. After clearing to the front in :55 and change half, he drew off and won by a football field with Jason Bartlett not even moving in 1:50.2. There is no doubt in my mind that he would have gone under 1:50 if he was allowed. Again, this isn't rocket science. Hay and oats or a change in equipment do not explain the performance. We all like the stories of success or comebacks, in the case of Milici, but it's only time before he goes the way of Pena, Ledford, Chanskey, etc. My problem with this is simple. How long do we have to put up with this before something is done? It's amazing the same type of super trainer keeps coming along and no one can stop him before he makes a mockery of the game.

It certainly was a great couple of days in the harness world recently. Nothing says integrity like a Lou Pena sighting! The crack security team at Delaware allowed this guy, of all people, in the detention barn while he's wearing a shirt with his own name on it.

Gee whiz..... Also, it's been common knowledge for years that Pena spawned an army of "beards." Guys like Garcia Herrera and Ruiz were never prominent before Pena. My business partners and I own three pacers, racing them in Queensland and New South Wales. We are not big players.

I recall attending my first Breeders Owners Trainers & Racing Association (BOTRA) meeting, thinking this will be a great opportunity to see how my representative body was working to develop the industry we all enjoy so much. How wrong I was. In short, it appeared to be nothing more than a hotbed of cronyism. When we voiced our concerns over a number of issues, including prize money, governance, strategic planning (or lack thereof) and social media opportunities, we were met with bemused looks; looks that said "who are these blokes, don't they know how things work around here?"

As I said, we are not big owners pumping hundreds of thousands of dollars into the game. But then again, how many of those owners are being attracted to the sport?

It has been my observation that owners represent a wide range of social and economic backgrounds, qualifications and experience. As an example, our racing partnership includes a scientist, a lawyer and a drilling engineer. The skill sets of owners is a relatively untapped reservoir of skills and acumen that, if embraced by the industry, could provide some much needed insight and new ideas.

With the harness racing industry in Australia at a self-described 'cross roads', there has never been a better time for the harness racing fraternity to promote its product to a broader audience and in doing so, embrace change. In my experience, such willingness to change requires strong leadership, held to account by solid governance. I truly hope the industry finds such leaders.
