

Young People Aren't Betting. Can Harness Racing Do Anything About It?

You are probably saying, oh boy, here comes another column about young people and racing.

'They have short attention spans, so we need to give them action, like slot machines do.'

'They like concerts and bands, so we have to change the on-track experience to meet these needs.'

'Once we get them in the building, they will get the "bug" just like we did when we were their age.'

I promise you won't read anything like the above in the following as a solution. Scout's honor.

"Millennials" is a term we often read or hear, without really knowing what it means. Generally, a millennial is simply someone born between 1980 and 2000. In the US alone, there are 87 million of them, and they make over 1/3rd of all retail purchases in the country. Appealing to this demographic means big dollars and it is more important than ever before.

Like WalMart or any other retailer, casino gambling (and horse racing for that matter) has been trying their best to attack the market. Getting these kids (I call anyone under 35 a kid, forgive me) to gamble is paramount. But, a funny thing has been happening. They aren't gambling like they



explores the reasons why Las Vegas Strip gambling revenue only makes up 37% of total strip revenue, despite Vegas doing a lot of the right things. Las Vegas, as many of you well know, has delivered young people into the building - with night clubs, concerts, and all the rest - but these folks are going for night clubs, concerts and all the rest. They are not gambling.


Hwang speaks about the hand-wringing that goes on in casino executive offices, and frankly a lot of it reads like exactly the discussions racing has about the same topic. Everyone seems to be looking for a solution to a problem in the abstract, without looking at the real, fundamental issue: The declining economics of being a gambler.

In a recently released report, "Slot Market Assessment: Analysis of Industry Data" the eroded value of the gambling dollar for slots was examined. As the following graph shows, industry holds for slot machines have been creeping upwards.



In addition, new technologies have allowed for quicker slot game play, from around 10 spins a minute to 17 spins a minute. As Hwang notes, "in short, the slot player is losing more money faster than ever before."

What happens when you feel you are not getting a fair shake, and losing too much money at a game? You play less, of course, and that's exactly what's been happening. Again, from the same report, below is a graph showing the rise in income, versus slot machine handle in the US.




Although the above is true for all gamblers, when it comes to millennials it's even more pronounced, because they're different than baby boomers and Gen X'ers in one big way.

Hwang: "Millennials who have come of age during and after the poker boom of the 2000s, have the benefit of the Internet and all of the gambling knowledge that wasn't available to previous generations - are more knowledgeable and generally less stupid about gambling than any generation to come before us. Millennials (and the rest of America) are doing what you would expect people to do when they become more knowledgeable about gambling -- gamble less in larger amounts for profit, and more in smaller amounts to hang out."

The thing is, millennials and those like them, are not stopping gambling, they are just not gambling on games the casinos want them to gamble on.

Skill based games - those games where there is a perceived edge - have grown in popularity. "Daily Fantasy Sports" was virtually non-existent in 2010, but is pegged to handle more than \$31 billion by 2020. Per capita spending on Fantasy sports in 2014 was \$465, up from only \$95 a



year in 2012, and it's sure to be higher this year. In a recent survey, over half of players fall in the 25 to 35 age range, with 60% with an average household income of \$75,000 or more. Takeout in "DFS" averages about 8%.

Why do younger people gamble on "DFS" but not nearly as much on blackjack, table games or slots? There's a strong case that "DFS" is something they think - with knowledge and extreme skill - they can beat, and they are probably right. We see winners advertised all the time. Let's look at harness racing from this perspective. Is there value? Can they, with hard work and skill, become a winner?

Your average race on say a half-mile track, is an affair which will yield favorites that win almost one in two races; that's like a coin flip. For the pleasure of wagering on that event, patrons will lose upwards of 20 cents on every dollar bet. Let's pose a question: If you went into a casino and played a game of coin flip with the house, where for a dollar wager the house keeps the dollar when you lose, but gives you 80 cents when you win, how long would you play that game? Not long, I imagine. We should not expect a smart, knowledgeable-about-gambling millennial to either,

but that's the proposition harness racing is offering them at most racetracks.

We often give advice to newbie gamblers that they should bet the good drivers, and really it's not terrible advice to catch a few winners. At Yonkers, since 2014, the top two drivers with favorites are Jason Bartlett and Brian Sears with 45% win rates. There's that coin flip again. Well, maybe you'd instead tell a new racing bettor to just play these drivers when they're longer shots. That's even worse. At 5-1 odds and higher, Brian and Jason bring home about 5 out of every

100 of these horses, returning about 70 cents of each dollar bet.

It's not dissimilar with two-horse exotics. The takeout is high and the outcome is not very difficult to come up with (many exactas pay under \$10). You can give away hats, stage concerts, or just about everything else and not get people with a predisposition to gamble, to gamble on that kind of a game.


So, if harness racing is delivering a lot of low-paying chalk, and young people are avoiding gambling games with little value, what can harness racing do? Maybe a few

1) Fixed odds and Exchanges need to be at the very least examined. In Australian racing, fixed odds wagering (low takeout bets without late odds drops) has been growing rapidly. In 2014, this form of wagering at Australian service provider TabCorp was up 26.5% to \$511 million, with over 60% of it occurring on horse racing, not

sports. Why does this work? It's lower takeout, it's perceived to be beatable and it's modern. In addition, for the same reasons, exchange wagering has been embraced by these younger bettors. I remember presenting at the Hambletonian Society conference many years ago now about a betting exchange test in the UK. In a ten horse field harness race - the first time a harness race was offered on the exchange - almost \$200,000 was traded. If you have anywhere near 50% hit rates for favorites, you will never grow handle at any multiple in the current high rake, static system. Never.

2) Lower minimums sound good and attract money, but for harness racing they are breaking customers, and in the long run are a net industry loss. This is a tough part of an overhaul to get passed, I know, because this is a long-term view and will result in short term handle losses, but the fact is, 10 cent or 20 cent pick 3's, doubles, etc, suck the value out of the pools where no one wins. Again, it's simply a function of the nature of the sport, with high favorite hit rates. This is why the super high fives seem, at times, to do very well. They are harder to hit, and when something is hard to hit, there are many who will put in the time, money and effort to try and make a perceived positive expectation bet. Add a carryover for this pool (a carryover is lower takeout and more value) and then you're really onto something. Harness racing needs more bets that reward smarts and skill, not fewer.

Too much chalk makes harness racing a tough

rates. Why does the sport card a six-horse field with a 1-5 shot? Why is any race carded that's not deep, complex and hard to decipher? Why in heavens name are the best posts given to elimination winners when potential long-term customer eyeballs are watching stakes races? Remember, the easier a race to handicap the harder it is to win long term at, at current sell to modern gamblers takeout rates. Harness racing has been carding about the

exact same races that they carded in 1915, expecting to have the old days come back. It's simply not going to happen. The new crowd is, as Mr. Hwang notes, too smart.

Horse racing has never been particularly cutting edge. I

remember many years ago, Mark Davies, then a director at Betfair, travelled UK racetracks for a discussion about "What Will Racing Look Like in 2020." In one segment, Mark spoke about new smartphones and how racing having a betting, information and

technological presence on them would be wise, especially since it was forecast that younger people were going to be using them more and more as a part of their daily lives.

The response he got from one racing executive was, "Not everyone has an iPhone."

Ten years or so later we've moved well beyond that. It's not just about technology, showing races or handing out past performances on a smartphone or tablet. Attracting millennials to wager is not about bands, or action, or time between races. It's not about them getting the horse racing "bug." It's not about taking them for a ride in the starting car. Las Vegas is noticing, although it's important, it's not just about getting young people into the casino, it's about getting them to bet while they're in the casino.

Today's gambling world is about delivering increasingly smarter, sophisticated gamblers a modern betting outlet they believe they have a chance to beat. Harness racing is a skill game with built-in advantages with a lot going for it. To engage these younger users, it has to be presented in their way, not yours and mine.

In Jug, No Kicking, No Slashing, No Problem By Bill Finley

What would happen if drivers, locked in a fierce stretch battle, relied only on their own skill and finesse and the heart, ability and desire of their horses? What would happen if they didn't kick or nudge or boot, or whatever you care to call it, and if they didn't beat their horses with their whips?

To some, that might just mean the end of the world as we know it, a calamity for bettors, drivers and owners whose horses would be so unfairly handicapped by rules that all but placed a pair of handcuffs on the drivers before they got into the sulky.

Turns out it's complete nonsense, and nothing proved that better than this year's Little Brown Jug.

It was a race for the ages, one that pitted a superstar with a heart bigger than the state of Ohio and a spunky underdog who would not go away. It was as great a race as any of us have ever seen among two horses who clearly delivered everything they had. And it was accomplished with Wiggle It Jiggleit's driver Montrell Teague playing by the rules.

Teague kept his feet in the stirrups the entire time and Teague never once hit the Jug winner Wiggle It Jiggleit at any point in the race. Dave Miller, driving runner-up Lost For Words, dropped his left foot at the top of the stretch, presumably to pull the plugs, but Miller never hit his horse in the stretch and kept his feet in the stirrups when it mattered.

"That has to be in the back of your mind now because everyone is changing to hands in the hand-holds and as minimal whipping as possible," Teague said. "I'm trying to make it a habit. You can still do it one handed, but I try to do it as little as possible."

Though Teague is just 24, he had some old school in him. He was fined \$300 for excessive use of the whip on Wiggle It Jiggleit in the Cane Pace and was fined in August by Delaware authorities for excessive or indiscriminate use of whip and causing a visible injury to a horse at Harrington.

Teague said he never hit Wiggle It Jiggleit in the Jug final because of what he learned in the elimination on a day when Wiggle It was on the steppy side.

"In the first heat, I was tap, tap, tapping," he said. "He stutter stepped a little bit. We got around the turn, I had a little bit of room to maneuver and flipped his tail up. That seemed to work the best. It worked out better than just hitting. He just needed little bit of encouragement, he didn't need the whip."

Maybe Teague has learned his lesson or maybe he knew he was not going to get away with anything in Ohio. More so than any other state, Ohio has cracked down on drivers



In a heated stretch drive in the Little Brown Jug, the drivers didn't find the need to kick or excessively whip their horses

kicking or excessively whipping their horses. Ohio Racing Commission Chairman Bob Schmitz said any driver coming into the state to drive for the first time is handed a set of rules and, basically, told the state has will not tolerate anyone beating up on a

horse in any way.

"What the commission did was simply a matter of our doing the right thing," Schmitz said. "We had very few violations all that week at Delaware. People understood the rules and we were delighted that they put on a great race in the Jug."

Schmitz had heard all the reasons why drivers need to be freed to do whatever it takes to get the horse to the winner's circle.

"Some of the things people have said over time are they won't go as fast, the bettors won't bet, so and so," he said. "None of it has come to fruition. It's business as usual and the horses are going as fast as ever. We were delighted with the way the whole week at Delaware went."

Teague and the connections of Wiggle t Jiggleit and Lost For Words got the only thing they could have asked for--a fair playing field. With neither driver breaking the rules neither horse had an advantage.

Great, thrilling race? Check. Did the best horse win? Check. Did the bettors get their money's worth? Check. Is the sport better off without excessive whipping and kicking? Check.

Dupree Impresses in Blue Grass Series at The Red Mile

When Åke Svanstedt plunked down \$200,000 for an Andover Hall colt at last year's Lexington sale he was probably hoping his newest acquisition would have more than one win and \$77,531 on his card a year later. That said, it's starting to look like this might have been an expensive purchase that will pay off.

Now named Dupree, that same Andover Hall colt was arguably the most impressive winner among the four who made their way to the winner's circle last night at The Red Mile in the Blue Grass series.

On a night when the track was slow and speed definitely wasn't holding up, Dupree cut the mile with Svanstedt driving to upset the Jimmy Takter trained Bar Hopping. The latter was made the 1-2 favorite.

Dupree had not won since his first pari-mutuel race, a July 7 PASS race at The Meadows. But he had shown some improvement in his last start, the PASS finals when closing for third. Last night, Svanstedt tried a new tactic and sent Dupree right to the front. Driver-trainer Takter sat second

with Bar Hopping and had dead aim on him at the top of the stretch, but Dupree pulled away for an easy win. His final time was 1:57.3.

"This is a really nice horse and we always had high thoughts about him," assistant trainer Bernie Noren said. "He showed up

tonight; he was the horse we always thought he would be. He raced really well last time and was a little sick before that. Åke babied him some and now he's getting back to his real self."

Driver Andy Miller kicked off the stakes portion of the card by winning the first two Bluegrass races. He won the first with Milligan's School for his wife, trainer Julie Miller. The son of Yankee Glide won by 1 3/4 lengths over Metatron.

Driving for trainer Frank Antonacci, Miller came right back to win with 12-1 shot Taco Tuesday. The horse came into the race with an 0-for-5 record and a bad history of breaking stride. But on this night he stayed flat, closed well in the stretch and won by a neck over 4-5 favorite Hollywood Highway.

"This guy, we had staked to the Peter Haughton, and that's because we thought a lot of him all winter," Antonacci said. "He fell into some bad grooves and made some baby mistakes. It doesn't take long for you to get into October and have only \$7,000 on your card. He just got in a couple of bad spots where he got a little too aggressive and when you try to race horses and get them back mentally it can get a little challenging sometimes."

Jimmy Takter picked up a win with Lagerfield, the slight favorite over Sutton in the third of the four races. He got a perfect two-hole trip with Yannick Gingras at the lines and benefitted from two contenders, Sutton and Mavens Way, breaking stride.

"He got the perfect trip," said Takter. "He got a little lucky with a couple of horses breaking in the first turn, but it's a tricky track tonight and last night was the same. It's maybe slightly better today, but it's very sticky at the rail and a lot of horses have a problem to find some legs there.

"It's normally like that when it's a very windy day with two-year-olds," Takter also said in regards to the benefit of coming off the pace. "It's always tough to cut the mile, and on the backside there's a very tough wind. We got a perfect trip, but I don't want to take anything away from this horse. He almost made \$300,000 and he's a great potential colt."

High Costs and Low Ratings Led to

Cancellation of PA Harness Week

Ron Battoni, the executive director of the Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association, the primary sponsor of Pa Harness Week, said the decision to cancel the show was made because the costs did not justify the small audience the program attracted.

Battoni said there were only 3,500 viewers on average in the areas surrounding the two tracks that were the focus of the show, Pocono Downs and Harrah's Chester. Battoni said it costs \$140,000 annually to air Pa Harness Week. The PHHA picked up 75 percent of the costs and Pocono Downs paid 25 percent. Harrah's Chester was not a contributor.

"I liked the show and I think a lot of people did," Battoni said. "But there were some concerns that we weren't getting a good bang for our buck. The ratings just weren't moving up and in November and December they were terrible. I wish we had more time to work on finding a different time slot because the one we had (Saturday mornings) wasn't the best. We had the show going for eight years, but our Board decided it was time to try other things to promote the sport."

Mohawk Meet Overall, Per Race Handle Increase

CAMPBELLVILLE, ON (September 30) - Woodbine



Entertainment Group (WEG) today announced wagering numbers were up for the 2015 Mohawk Standardbred meet, which concluded on Tuesday, September 29.

The 2015 Mohawk meet, which began on April 9, featured 118 race cards and an "all-sources" betting total of \$181,432,431, an 18.9 per

cent increase over 2014.

The average per race handle of \$138,603 showed a 4.2 per cent increase over the 2014 average of \$132,958.

The 2015 meet, which featured 16 more race dates than 2014, was highlighted by wagering increases on several of Mohawk's signature race dates.

The Pepsi North America Cup card on Saturday, June 20 generated the highest-handle in North America Cup history, as \$4,292,777 was wagered on the 15-race card. Wagering on the 2015 Pepsi North America Cup card was up 24.9 per cent in comparison to the 2014 edition. A crowd of over 11,000 helped raise the on track handle for the event 20.6 per cent.

Canadian Trotting Classic night on Saturday, September 19 also saw an increase in wagering in 2015. A total of \$2,664,628 was wagered on the Canadian Trotting Classic card, a 12.3 per cent increase in comparison to the 2014 total of \$2,372,215.

"We had another successful Mohawk meet," said Jamie Martin, Executive Vice-President of Racing. "We were pleased with our big race nights, which featured strong attendance and wagering numbers. Beginning the meet in April went well and we offered a high quality product to our customers and racing opportunities to our horsepeople over the course of the six-month meet."

Sylvain Filion led all drivers in wins with 160 victories during the meet. Carmen Auciello, last year's leading trainer on the WEG Circuit, sent out 55 winners to lead all trainers.

Survivor Tessa Seelster Earns Gold Trophy at Flamboro

Trainer Ben Baillargeon says Tessa Seelster may not be the prettiest filly to watch on the racetrack, but when it comes to grit and heart the three-year-old pacing filly has no equal.



"She's a very gutsy mare, because she almost died as a two-year-old," explained Rockwood, ON resident Baillargeon. "She was on the operating table for colic surgery and the small bowel ruptured so they had to sew it

by hand, and the chance of her surviving was about slim and none."

Not only did Tessa Seelster survive the surgery, she went on to race as two-year-old, posting two victories in seven starts, and on Thursday evening she captured her first Ontario Sires Stakes trophy in Gold Series action at Flamboro Downs.

Starting from Post 3 in the first \$105,000 division, driver Mario Baillargeon of Milton, ON settled Tessa Seelster into fourth as fan favourite Solar Sister fired off the starting gate to a :27.1 opening quarter. The resinman kept Tessa Seelster in fourth through the :56.1 half and then sent the daughter of Shadow Play up the outside, reaching the 1:24.4 three-quarters with a narrow lead. Tessa Seelster stayed game down the stretch, holding off Maplelea for a three-quarter length victory in 1:53.1. Capela was well behind the leaders in third.

"The half-mile is not her best asset, and she still made it today, so I am very pleased with the result," said Baillargeon, who conditions the filly for Richard Berthiaume of Pointe-Aux-Trembles, QC. "Very pleased with the result and looking forward to next week."

Tessa Seelster and the other nine leading point earners from the five regular season Gold events will make their

next start in the \$250,000 Super Final at Woodbine Racetrack on Oct. 10.

"She will try her heart out anyway, because she's a very gutsy mare," noted Baillargeon.

Among the fillies joining Tessa Seelster on the starting gate at Woodbine will be Thursday's other division winner, Glamour Seelster.

With Guelph, ON resident Doug McNair in the race bike Glamour Seelster fired off the starting gate from Post 2 and landed third on the rail as fan favourite Wrangler Magic led the field to a :28.1 opening quarter. The pair continued to sit third as Wrangler Magic paced by the half in :57, then circled around the leaders to take command before the 1:25 three-quarters. From there Glamour Seelster cruised home a one and one-half length winner in 1:53, with Ms Mac N Cheese and Wrangler Magic crossing the finish line in her

"She's a high speed filly, she can pace as fast as any horse I've driven for a piece," said McNair. "She's getting better every week."

The driver's father, Gregg McNair of Guelph, conditions Glamour Seelster for Lindsey and Connie Rankin of Lexington, MI. The win, her first in Gold Series action, improved the Jeremes Jet daughter's record to seven wins, one second and one third in 11 starts and boosted her earnings to \$155,033.

In addition to the sophomore pacing fillies' last regular season Gold event, Flamboro Downs also hosted the regular season finale for the two-year-old pacing colts on Thursday.

Two-time Grassroots winner Continual Hanover made the move to the Gold Series level look easy, reeling in pacesetter Arsenic in the stretch to post a three-quarter length victory in 1:55.1. Fan favourite Nocturnal Bluechip was hot on Arsenic's heels in third.

"He's always been right on the cusp of the Gold, but it was a bit easier to stay with the Grassroots," said driver Jody Jamieson of Continual Hanover. "Tonight he was real good, and dodged (division leaders) Voracity, Betting Line and Nvestment Bluechip, which is always good."

Jack Darling of Cambridge, ON owns and trains Continual Hanover, who qualified for the freshman pacing colt Super Final with Thursday's victory. The Bettor's Delight colt will require a new driver for the Oct. 10 test as Jamieson is already committed to division point leader Nvestment Bluechip, but the Moffat, ON resident says the colt is a legitimate player in the season finale.

"I think he's got a good chance with the right trip," said Jamieson of Continual Hanover's prospects. "He's peaking at the right time."

In the second pacing colt division, Semi Automatic earned his second Gold trophy with an effortless six and one-half length score over New Talent and Cruise Patrol. The fan favourite and driver James MacDonald of Guelph, ON hit the wire in 1:55.

"Semi was great tonight. He has had a great year," said MacDonald of the Badlands Hanover son. "Tonight he was pacing great, drew well (Post 2), so I moved him to the front and he controlled the race and won pretty handy."
