Following the thoroughbred tradition may just spur much needed ownership growth and investment the sport desperately needs.


With horse ownership down and more owners partnering up to buy horses, Phil Antonacci believes one way to drive more single ownership — and ownership interest in general — is to follow the thoroughbred tradition and have drivers wear owner colors.

Put aside the logistics for a second of each owner/stable having to have multiple sets of colors for all seasons — and in drivers' case they'd have to be a variety of sizes, too. Let's just process what Antonacci is suggesting.

He thinks ego alone may spur owners on to want to see their colors and logos on the track and more owners would have to own horses solo in order to earn that right. That would mean more owners bidding against each other, rather than teaming up. That, in turn, would drive up prices for yearlings and allow more breeders to make a profit, which may, ultimately, increase the horse population, leading to fuller fields and more attractive betting options for the customers.

"Some people say it doesn't matter, but I think it actually matters," Phil said recently.

His brother, Frank M. Antonacci, agreed.

"There's been enough fights in the business about who gets the trophy and who stands where in the picture. You would think if you put owner colors in the mix that it might make a difference," Frank M. said.

Yes, I get it, drivers wearing their own colors makes them more recognizable. But it also tends to make them more important in the equation than they may be given their role in the process. Many, including the Antonacci brothers, argue making drivers the stars has not been a winning strategy.

"The drivers, really, have way too much leverage on the whole sport. I don't see how creating drivers to be the superstars has helped us one bit," Frank M. said.

In fact, the concept of drivers having their own colors really stems from a bygone era when the trainer/driver model dominated and stables — think Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton, Delvin Miller, etc. — truly were the stars.

Now in an era when owners not only feel marginalized — as well as being squeezed financially by rising training bills, vet bills and more — making an owner's brand more recognizable may spur much-needed ownership growth.


"You go to Saratoga (for the thoroughbred meet) and you're

not even looking at the form," Phil said. "You see the horses in the paddock and if you see WinStar has a horse in the race you're going to look at that horse and you see WinStar colors. It builds a brand around the farm that you can recognize."

Drivers wearing owner colors also might signal a much-needed course correction where the investors become the most important part of the equation.

"I've got a buddy named TJ that I grew up with. He's a self-made guy. A guy like him, the value that it would add for him to have his own colors and have his horse go out on the racetrack and race in his colors would be huge for him. There's more than just one guy," Frank M. said.

Yes, it's convenient to look out and easily spot John Campbell, Yannick Gingras, Tim Tetrick, David Miller, etc. Yes, it is easier to find your favorite driver than it is to spot your favorite thoroughbred jockey. But, in the end, especially in top markets where there's a number of talented drivers, there's not usually a huge disparity in talent from one driver to the next, rendering that less of a handicapping factor. Most of the Meadowlands drivers, for example, are talented enough to make the bettors happy.



Yes, there would be logistic hurdles to overcome, but one possible solution would be a high-class bib or cover-all of owner colors that drivers could put over generic driving suits and switch out easily from race to race.

The point is not that drivers are unimportant. Of course they're important. Rather, having drivers wear owners colors would give the investors some added ego value for their hefty investment.


As Frank M. correctly points out: "More times than not (owners) are going to lose. How you can make that experience as enjoyable as possible is the challenge."

The benefits of horse ownership are frequently touted as the equivalent of owning one's own sports franchise. If true, why then do we allow the employees to pick the uniform?

How to pick out a Hambletonian winner

Hall of Fame trainer and three-time Hambletonian winner Ron Gurfein with his tips for picking out a winning trotter at the yearling sales.

Hall of Fame trainer Ron Gurfein has won three Hambletonians.

It's sale time in our industry, once again. The beginning of hopes and dreams, that often vanish into thin air all too quickly. I can't necessarily make the dream of Hambletonian come true, but, for certain, I can make it closer to a reality while considerably limiting your down side.

There are three essential ingredients to being successful picking yearlings:


1. Know what a classic winning trotter should look like in the field and on the floor, and understand the pedigree to go along with it — or know someone that can do it for you.

- 2. Understand that it makes a big difference in where a horse was raised.
- 3. Have a trainer that will create a plan for your purchase, that will maximize his chance on the first Saturday in August of his sophomore season.

There is no way to say all great trotters look the same, but I can safely say that most of them have certain things in common. The most important being long legs. Rarely do you find a good, short-legged trotter. We see more lately, because the excessive use of trotting hopples has enabled some of those squat little fellows to stay on gait.

How a colt stands is way less important than how he moves. However, please don't buy a horse that is severely toed out. Chuck Sylvester, one of the best that ever drew a line over a horse, loves toed out horses and has had success with them. I can't go that route. I remember when Valley Victory fillies were at a tremendous premium and Chuck bought a great bred one for over \$200,000 that was severely toed out. I called him in January to see how she was progressing and find out if he could keep her off her knees. He said, "Ronnie, are you kidding? She hits them going to the feed tub."

However, I find nothing wrong with toed in horses. Both Continental victory and Self Possessed were toed in. What



concerns me more is horses having excessive foot movement winging to a knee or paddling. Whether or not this causes interference is unimportant, just the motion itself will slow a horse down enough to negate greatness. Ideally, there should be no crooked legged colts in a select sale as the company is supposed to eliminate them from the catalogue, but to play it safe, when you look at a horse standing on the floor, everything should be facing you and straight (i.e.: knees, pasterns and feet all facing you the same way and equal in size).

I like colts with long necks, it gives them more balance and they will get air more easily. If you watch a short-necked horse in the field, when they trot off, they duck their chin causing a distinct bend in the airflow. A long-necked colt can go with his head low creating a straight air path. You want a colt with a big girth, bigger lungs, more oxygen.

Size matters, there have been many good little trotters. But, you want a good-sized one. They are not as easy to keep sound and need more maintenance, but they are faster. They take fewer steps in the mile. It works, believe me.

Buying a trotter is the exact opposite to buying a pacing horse. You want a big wide chest on a pacer and a more narrow front end on a trotter to prevent him from hitting his shins. His hind legs must be fairly wide apart also. Europeans are fussy about the length of a colt. Short coupled doesn't bother me at all as long as they have enough air under them and trot cleanly in the field. There are many faults that I haven't discussed because it would be a book, but when you select the proper trainer you will know.

As far as pedigree is concerned, right now it's easier than it has been in recent years because it is quite obvious that Muscle Hill is in a class by himself. Since he has been standing (only three three-year-old crops), he has two Hambletonian winners and two very close seconds. I really look forward to the first crop of Father Patrick as a likely challenger to Muscle Hill.

Personally, I don't care what foal of the mare the yearling is unless it's past the 10th foal, but since I decided to write this article I did a quick study of the winners in the last 30 years and I found you should look for foals from third to seventh. The best of the best were right in the middle.


As far as help outside the training colony is concerned, there are two more than capable horseman, that do nothing but look at every yearling with a Hambletonian pedigree. They are Perry Soderberg and Pat Waldo. They both have an excellent opinion and have selected many classic winners in the past.

Believe it or not, I think the water and the soil in certain areas creates a stronger horse and I think if you look into this you will find I am not that crazy. I am not going to mention any farms because it's just my opinion and I don't want to leave anyone out. Instead I would prefer that you do your own study and come up with the farms that have raised and foaled the majority of classic winners.

Lastly, and very, very important is your selection of a trainer. You are not going to find him or her on a list of trainers with the most wins because you are looking for a specialist and lots of wins means too many horses to attend to your needs. I would start with trainers who have been there, and had great success. This is very important as Muscle Hill, as great a stallion as he is, does not produce a yearling that is easy to train. So now you think you know the answer: just send the colt to Jimmy Takter. I am not saying you would be wrong. He is, without a doubt, the best trainer of our era, but unfortunately he can't train all the yearlings. So now we must look elsewhere.

Who can beat or compete with Sir Jimmy? There aren't a lot, but they certainly exist. I would say there are at least a half-dozen trainers that could compete if they had competitive pocketbooks. Once again, I can't name names because I may leave out a name and get shot. To start, look





at the previous Hambletonian winners and go from there. Make sure it is someone you feel comfortable with and that is a good communicator and trains a manageable size stable.

Great horses are born, they are not created by a trainer. However, a good trainer is essential because it is very easy to mess up on the way to a classic. I did it myself, so I have good reason to make this statement. Thankfully, I learned from my mistake and didn't do it again. In 1991, I had my first Hambletonian entrant. His name was MB Felty. It wasn't a stellar field, but I had the best horse and was confidant that he was ready. Concerned we were going two heats I over trained him and even warmed him up a bit faster than usual to take a little of the edge off his fractious attitude. Well, he won the first heat easily and fell short in the second at 4-5. I was devastated, and never realized what I had done wrong for many days after. The realization certainly aided my future attempts that ended on a more positive note. You may be thinking that I screwed up Cantab Hall's attempt more than a decade later as a big favorite, but I can't take the blame for that. Less than a month before the race he developed a condition called anhydrosis (the inability of the body to control it temperature). His temperature would be as high as

107 just after a two mile jog. My sincerest thanks to Dr Paul Nolan for correcting the problem, but the colt was marginalized for the entire three-year-old season by the condition. He did salvage second in the classic as a result of a excellent Michel Lachance drive and certainly went on to prove his greatness in the stud barn. How I bought him is a great story that I will save for another day. While on the subject of Cantab Hall, I love his fillies and if you are looking for an Oaks winner I think he would be competitive.

Owning a good or great racehorse is a fabulous experience. Our business has undergone many changes in the past 50 years I have been training, but one thing will never change and that is the feeling of standing in the winner's circle. Racing is not the same as it was in the earlier day, but what is? If you follow my guidelines you have a chance to enjoy the journey and what a journey it is.



Long before he became president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society, Tom Charters was the caretaker for Delvin Miller's great pacing mare Delmonica Hanover.

"Obviously, she was a great. But, I just kind of hung onto her tail," Charters said.

Instead, the horse that changed Charters' life was a simple pacing mare named Barbara Hudson owned and bred by the Hackett family of London, OH. When Barbara Hudson came along in the mid-1960s, Charters was a teenager and close friends with Rick Hackett.

"Now he's Dr. Rick Hackett from Cornell," Charters said. "We were born a few days apart. He was a friend and he was taking care of Barbara Hudson, the family horse, for his father. I remember he was bathing her and I thought this was the coolest thing I had ever seen, a job where you really got to lay hands on horses. The next summer, I went to work for the Hacketts.

"(Barbara Hudson) was just the family horse. She was by Guy Hudson, who was a three-quarter brother in blood to Greyhound, but she was a pacer, a chestnut pacer. I don't even have a picture of her, but she is the one (Rick Hackett) was taking care of. Later, I saw Bret (Hanover) and his Jug. And even Bret at Scioto Downs. When I saw Bret (Hanover) win his Jug I knew I wanted to get involved with good horses, great horses. Then Delmonica Hanover was the luck of the draw because nobody wanted to take care of her. But I always point out to people that I took care of Delmonica the two years she didn't win any big races."

Charters did, however, tour Europe with Delmonica

Hanover, though not the year she won the Prix d'Amerique.

"She won some races at some small tracks in Germany and she raced in the Elitlopp and she raced in the Lotteria. She won a heat in Berlin. Then the non-German horses had to take a 30-metre handicap," Charters said. "But, if I had to pick the one horse, (Barbara Hudson) is it. I think eventually she ended up in claimers and there was great angst in the family because Barbara probably sent a lot of (Hackett) kids to school. All the horses were by the family stud, Guy Hudson."

Streakavana, Machin A Trick top OSS Golds for freshman pacing colts

From rain, to wind, to fog, Ontario's best have not allowed the weather to deter them as they wrap up their Gold Series regular seasons at Mohawk Racetrack this weekend.

On Saturday (Oct. 1) it was the two-year-old pacing colts' turn to shine through the fog, competing in a pair of \$105,000 Gold divisions.

Streakavana landed his third Gold trophy in the first split.

Sent off as the fan favourite, Streakavana left smartly from post five and landed fourth on the rail as Big Bad Bill rolled out to a :26.2 opening quarter. Heading for the :55.2 half driver Sylvain Filion tipped Streakavana out behind Classic Pro and followed that colt into the final turn before swinging out three-wide. A head in front by the 1:25.2 three-quarters, Streakavana accelerated down the stretch to a one-length victory in 1:53.1. Mc Mach closed hard to be second, leaving mid-race pacesetter Southwind General to settle for third.

"He was good tonight, but he's not as good as he was when he qualified," said trainer Scott McEneny, referring to

Streakavana's 1:52.4 clocking in a Sept. 9 qualifier. "I thought when he qualified he was just a monster, and Sylvain thought that too, but he's better than what he was and hopefully we can get him better for the Super Final."

Streakavana made his debut in the July 7 Grassroots season opener at Mohawk, finishing second, and then won three straight at the Campbellville oval, capturing two Gold events (July 16 and Aug. 11) and one overnight event (Aug. 5). After his impressive qualifier, the son of Big Jim and Stonebridge Madona made the trip to Grand River Raceway



for the Sept. 19 Gold event and finished a disappointing fifth. McEneny says a number of factors played into the gelding's first off the board result, starting with a tough trip to the Elora, ON oval.

"It was just weird the way he trucked over. I had to stop the trailer three or four times, and he was just all wound up," said McEneny, who conditions the gelding for Brad Grant and Teresa Davidson of Milton, ON. "He's just a little bit of a nervous horse and I think he just got too wound up that day."

Streakavana's caretaker Stacey Currie ensured the gelding arrived at Mohawk in a calmer frame of mind on Saturday, riding in the trailer with her nervous charge.

"He rode over well, came off the trailer well," said McEneny, who is stabled at Classy Lane Training Centre. "Stacey's been a big help for me this year. She can do everything, she's not afraid to work, and she loves her horses."

McEneny and Currie will spend the next two weeks ensuring Streakavana is in peak form for the Oct. 15 Super Final — the gelding leads the division with 155 points — and then start looking forward to his sophomore campaign.

"That's all he was paid in was the Sires Stakes, so he'll only have seven or eight starts," said Waterdown, ON resident McEneny. "I think we'll pay him up in a little more next year, because I think he'll get to be a better horse next year, he's got a big motor in him. Like that day he qualified, he was in with three-year-olds and he went by them with the plugs in and a bow in his neck, so I think he's got a big motor in him for next year, hopefully."

In the second division, Mohawk fans sent Classic Pro off as the favorite, but it was second choice Machin A Trick who sprinted down the stretch to a one-half length victory in 1:53.2.

Starting from post seven, Machin A Trick got away at the back of the field of eight, 13 lengths behind early leader Bet On Brett at the :26.3 quarter, and was still eighth when Happy Trio reached the half in :55.3. Moving up the outer lane, driver James MacDonald had moved Machin A Trick into sixth by the 1:25.1 three-quarters and sent him out three-wide. The son of Mach Three and Tricky kicked home in :27.1 to claim the victory, leaving Bet On Brett and Classic Pro to settle for second and third.

"I didn't want to be too far out of it, but sometimes you can't really help what you're dealt with, so when the trip worked out like it did I moved him and he was gone," said MacDonald from the winner's circle. "When you come off a helmet he's going; he's going to go by whoever he's

following."

MacDonald engineered Machin A Trick's first Gold Series win for trainer Jeff Gillis of Everett, ON and his partners Mac Nichol of Burlington, ON and Gerald Stay of Buffalo, NY. The victory, added to one second, one third and one sixth in his first three Gold outings, gives Machin A Trick 90 points and puts him sixth in the division standings. While Saturday's win was Machin A Trick's first in Gold competition, he has posted two wins in overnight action, both coming at Mohawk.


Machin A Trick, Streakavana and the other colts among the top 10 point earners will return to the Campbellville oval for the season ending Super Final on Oct. 15.

The two-year-old trotting colts and two-year-old pacing fillies wrap up their Gold Series regular season at Mohawk Racetrack on Monday and their connections will be hoping the forecast for clear skies is an accurate one. The trotting colts will wage their last Gold Series battles in races two and three, while the pacing fillies square off in races six and nine. The evening's first race goes postward at 7:30 pm.



Freshman pacers star in Saturday's Bluegrass divisions

Roaring To Go yielded the pocket as Idyllic Beach, sent off the 1-9 favorite, commandeered control into the far turn, sitting before pulling outside into the stretch and pacing to a 1:50.4 victory in the first of four divisions for the \$294,000 Bluegrass for two-year-old pacing fillies on Saturday, (Oct. 1) at Red Mile.

Sprinting to the top heading into the first turn, Roaring To Go led through a :27.2 opening quarter, with Miss Jones sitting second and Idyllic Beach in third. Midway through the backstretch, Idyllic Beach moved first over and sprung to the lead through a :55.3 half. Jayes A Lady tipped off the pylons around the far turn, but could not reach Idyllic Beach's wheel through a 1:24.1 third quarter.

Roaring To Go began to tip off the rail into the stretch. Slightly rough in stride, driver Brett Miller held a firm grip of her as she coasted by Idyllic Beach to win in a lifetime-best performance.

Winning her fifth race in 11 starts this year, Roaring To Go, by Art Major from the Western Ideal mare Lioness Hanover, has now earned \$209,886 for owner Frank Chick. The Kevin Lare trainee returned \$14.00 to win.

"Luck of the draw really wasn't in my favor. I was hoping to miss (Idyllic Beach)," Lare said. "She had been racing in New York Sire Stakes and she is not a half-mile track specialist at all. I knew the big track would really help her.

"I keep swearing she needs a little bit more hopple. It's hard to tell when you're basing off quarters in :26-and-a-piece on a half and :25-and-a-piece on the mile tracks. We're just trying to get through the year and we'll play with it more next year."

Taking the lead belatedly around the first turn, **Loreenas Ruffian** held off all challengers as she progressed to a 1:52 win in her Bluegrass division over a track downgraded to 'good.'

Ella Christina cleared the lead before the first turn, forcing Loreenas Ruffian, having started from post one, to pull to the outside and take the lead before the quarter. Passing the quarter in :29.1, Loreenas Ruffian maintained control as Jennys Terror, pulling outside from third, rushed first over heading to the half before losing stride after a :56.3 half-mile. She remained in front through a 1:24.4 third quarter, holding command as Someomensomewhere took second and Ella Christina raced in third.

It was a muddy night at Red Mile Saturday (as Tim Tetrick can attest).

Sent off the 2-1 second choice, Loreenas Ruffian, by McArdle out of the Ruffstuff Baker mare Shes A Ruff One, paid \$6.60 to win. She won her fourth race in nine starts this year, pushing her earnings to \$92,667 for trainer/driver Charlie Norris, who also co-owns along with partners Leonard Buckner and Rebecca Ewing.

Awash flew down the center of a sloppy track to win the third division of Bluegrass in 1:53.3 at 3-2.

Lady Juno led through a :29.1 opening quarter, losing the lead to Happy Hannah midway down the backstretch. Emily R Hanover, sitting restlessly in third, edged first over after a :57.2. Around the far turn, Thats The Ticket grabbed her cover as well as Awash, who was positioned third over through a 1:26 third guarter.

Emily R Hanover stalled through the stretch while Happy Hannah held onto command. That's The Ticket moved three-wide and Awash began a rush towards the center track, soon surpassing Thats The Ticket heading to the wire. Thats The Ticket finished second, while Happy Hannah, the 4-5 favorite, finished third.

Fanning three-wide into the stretch off a second-over trip, World Apart stormed down the center of the track to win the final Bluegrass division in 1:53.4 over Caviart Ally and Sky Fulla Star.

Caviart Ally left for the lead into the first turn, settling for

Gallic Sea moved first over into the final turn, providing cover to World Apart heading to three-quarters. Kiss Kiss held control narrowly at three-quarters in 1:26 as Gallic Sea took a short lead. Caviart Ally and Sky Fulla Star found room at the rail to pace into contention while **World Apart** swung off cover to take the lead. Caviart Ally attempted to sprint by her at the inside, but ended up finishing second.

World Apart, by Art Major out of the Rocknroll Hanover mare Polar Opposition, won her fourth race in nine starts this year, pushing her earnings to \$100,272 this year for owners South Mountain Stables, Bay's Stable, Little E LLC, and Radio Racing Stable. Trained by Linda Toscano and driven by Tim Tetrick, she paid \$8.00 to win.

Rock The Boat rocks the board

Rock The Boat sprung out of the pocket to pull off an 18-1 upset in one of the five divisions of the \$330,000 Bluegrass

for two-year-old pacing colts and geldings on Saturday (Oct. 1) at Red Mile.

Sent off as the 3-5 favorite, Miso Fast pulled in front the Rock The Boat to take the lead off a :29 opening quarter. After a :57.3 half, Oh K Man edged first over, carrying Tuxedo Bay on his back, in pursuit of Miso Fast entering the far turn. He moved up into third off a 1:25.4 third quarter before faltering.

Miso Fast held control until midway through the stretch, when Rock The Boat fanned off the pylons and charged down the center of the track. Mcthriller had room at the inside, and attempted to fly to the top, but Rock The Boat held him off to win in 1:53.3.

Owned by Let It Ride Stables Inc. and Dana Parham, trained by Ross Croghan, and driven by Andy Miller, Rock The Boat, by Rock N Roll Heaven out of the Badlands Hanover mare Tug River Princess, won his second race in five starts this season, pushing his earnings to \$70,551. He paid \$38.20 to win.

Huntsville won his third race in a row as he was victorious in his division of the Bluegrass in 1:53 over Boogie Shuffle and Ocean Colony.

World Apart (Tim Tetrick) won one of four Bluegrass divisions for two-year-old pacing fillies Saturday at Red Mile for trainer Linda Toscano and owners South Mountain Stables, Bay's Stable, Little E LLC, and Radio Racing Stable.

Boogie Shuffle flew to the lead, setting a :28.4 first quarter while Bettors Western paced into second, Huntsville into third, and Ocean Colony into fourth. Midway through the backstretch, Huntsville tipped first over and cleared the lead before a :58 half.

Ocean Colony was flushed first over into the far turn by Point Somewherelse and progressed up to Huntsville's wheel by three-quarters in 1:26.2. He drifted into the stretch as Huntsville extended his lead while Boogie Shuffle chased from the pocket, angling off the cones but failing to advance on Huntsville.

Earning \$260,484 for owner/trainer Ray Schnittker along with partners Ted Gewertz, Charles Iannazzo and Steven Arnold, Huntsville, by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Western Hanover mare Wild West Show, won his fourth race in seven starts this season. He was driven by Tim Tetrick and paid \$3.80.

Sweeping towards the top, **R J P** obtained the lead at the top of the stretch and advanced to a lifetime-best of 1:51.2, winning his division of the Bluegrass at 2-1.

Windsong Napoleon circled by Odds On Delray to take the lead through a :27.4 opening quarter, soon resigning to Papiamento as he brushed to the lead before the half, timed in :55.2. Papiamento led into the far turn as R J P began his first-over rush towards the top.

Matching strides with Papiamento through a 1:24 third quarter, R J P took the lead and drew clear as Odds On Delray angled off the pylons and towards the center of the track to take second, while John Dally, having followed R J Ps cover, closed to finish third.

Owned by Dave and John Prushnok, David J. Miller and Lawrence Means, trained by Erv Miller, and driven by Marcus Miller, R J P, by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Dragons Lair mare Vysoke Tatry, won his second of nine races this year, pushing his earnings to \$91,280. He paid \$6.80.

Blood Line won his division of the Bluegrass going wire-to-wire as the 6-5 favorite in 1:52.1.

Blood Line led Manattack, Normandy Beach, and Western Hill through fractions of :28.3 and :56.3 before he began to extend his lead. By three-quarters in 1:25.2, he was three lengths clear of Manattack pacing in second and Normandy Beach to his outside in third. Through the stretch, Blood Line gradually drew away as Normandy Beach took second and Western Hill grabbed third.

Winning his second race in eight starts this year, Blood Line, by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Western Ideal mare Blood Diamond, has earned \$102,687 for owner Diamond Creek Racing. Trained by Jimmy Takter and driven by David Miller, he paid \$4.40.

Downbytheseaside took the lead midway around the first turn and remained in front to pace a 1:52 mile in his division of the Bluegrass over Eddard Hanover and Macs Jackpot.

Leading through fractions of :27.1 and :55.1, Downbytheseaside was unchallenged. Lindythefourteenth was flushed first over from sixth, having advanced towards second at three-quarters in 1:24.1. He faltered and Downbytheseaside drew off at the top of the stretch. Macs Jackpot fanned off the pylons and towards the center of the track while Eddard Hanover sprinted up the pylons to claim second.

Sent off as the 1-5 favorite, Downbytheseaside, by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Allamerican Native mare Sprig Hanover, won his fifth race in nine starts this year, lifting his earnings to \$206,956 for owners Country Club Acres Inc., Joe Sbrocco and Richard Lombardo. Trained by Brian Brown and driven by David Miller, he paid \$2.60.

Live racing resumes at Red Mile today (Oct. 2) with three divisions of the \$188,200 Bluegrass for trotting fillies, two divisions of the \$163,500 Bluegrass for trotting colts, two divisions of the \$147,000 Bluegrass for pacing fillies, and three divisions of the \$173,900 Bluegrass for pacing colts. First race post is 1 p.m.

Sandbetweenurtoes repeats in Ellamony

Sandbetweenurtoes and driver Alfie Carroll teamed up to win the \$100,000 Ellamony Stakes for the second consecutive year on Saturday night (October 1) at Flamboro Downs.

Carroll earned his third win on the card and boosted his Canadian-leading win total to 417 in steering the five-year-old Somebeachsomewhere—Als Girl mare to victory for Canada's top trainer Richard Moreau and owner Brad Grant of Milton, Ont.

Sandbetweenurtoes' stablemate Witch Dali (James MacDonald) fired off the gate from post four for the early lead, but 7-5 favorite Solar Sister (Doug McNair) took over on the way to the first quarter mark in :26.3. Coming off the turn in front of the grandstand, trailing tier starter Waasmula (Bob McClure) charged first over from fourth with the eventual winner tracking her cover. Solar Sister continued to lead past the half in :55.4, but Waasmula easily gained the upper hand approaching the third quarter mark in 1:24.2 with Sandbetweenurtoes in hot pursuit. Down the stretch, Sandbetweenurtoes swept by Waasmula to defend her title in the Ellamony, winning by two and a quarter lengths in 1:53.1. Solar Sister held on for third over Witch Dali while Delightful Hill (Travis Henry) rounded out the top five finishers.

"I wasn't really expecting to get a second-over trip, you know with the six-hole and that, but a couple of them made breaks and it worked out that we did get it and she raced awesome," said Carroll after the victory, referring to early breaks made by Bedroomconfessions and Yagonnakissmeornot. "The track's as good as it can be, but it's cool and windy so it's a big mile."

Sandbetweenurtoes won the 2015 Ellamony in 1:53.2 over a 'good' track and with the repeat victory she is now perfect in her only two races at Flamboro Downs from 52 career starts.

"I've only driven her twice and she's won both times and she seems to love this place," said Carroll.

Sandbetweenurtoes earned her fifth win of the season from 22 starts and 18th victory lifetime while the lion's share of the purse boosted her bankroll over the \$700,000 mark.

She paid \$11.40 to win as the 9-2 fourth choice in the wagering.

Banks on Gural

(Editor's note: This opinion was originally posted on the author's Facebook page and is reprinted here with the author's permission)

Having read (the Saturday, Oct. 1) HRU, I cannot help but comment on Jeff Gural's foreseeable, yet disappointing, perspective relating to his plans to further diminish the luster of the Meadowlands. Having saved it from extinction, he now proposes a living death. Having failed to lead the Meadowlands back to prosperity as a racetrack, he blames horsemen for that failure, plans offering a much diminished caliber of racing, and intends to let the Meadowlands limp along in dismal fashion only in the hope of obtaining future casino gaming — quite likely under a format that will not significantly help the horsemen he so often rails against for lack of support.

Mr. Gural should recognize that whoever has had his ear has long abused the privilege. The Gural business plan at the Meadowlands has been marked by a unique disregard for what made the Meadowlands special, by a disjointed lack of focus on the necessary — but narrow — objective of returning the Meadowlands to profitability, by the creation of a cult of personality that is irrelevant, if not counterproductive, to success.

The Meadowlands built its reputation on the excellence of its product, on its equine and human star power supported by stake and late closer offerings vastly superior to those on offer elsewhere. Someone must have convinced Mr. Gural that the Meadowlands needed to be in business to help local horsemen, and that perspective has ruined Mr. Gural's ability to turn around the operation. He should have, and should be, focusing on how to return the Meadowlands to greatness and, in so doing, to the profitability he reasonably seeks. Racing two nights a week, year round, with modest purses, mediocre drivers, and few stakes never held any promise of success. Mr. Gural has often bemoaned the lack of support he receives from horsemen who, he feels, ought to be more helpful in doing what he asks. He fails to appreciate that they fear they will not benefit sufficiently from eventual casino profitability, and that it is his responsibility to earn

their support through offering a competitive product rather than is it theirs to help, just because he saved the Meadowlands from the death still at the doorstep.

If Mr. Gural wishes to succeed with the racetrack he should GUARANTEE a minimum percentage of his non-racing casino profitability to the horsemen, and he should create a four to five month season of four-day-a-week racing of only high quality stakes, combined with high-priced claiming and conditioned races, thereby attracting the right horses, drivers and gambling customers to the Meadowlands. Instead of begging partners that have no certain participation in Gural casino profitability to help in the short term — quite often against their own short term interest — Gural should create a product that they want to be part of, and induce cooperation through the guarantee that to the extent he will financially benefit from slots, horsemen will receive a known percentage of his profitability! Avoid creation of loopholes connected to uncertainty of state percentages, and the unforseeability of partner's demands. Tie horsemen percentage to your own percentage, and, combined with an intelligently structured, high-end product, Mr. Gural will have all the cooperation willingly that begging cannot now deliver.

Mr. Gural must get out of his head that it is his responsibility to support all elements of New Jersey horsemen. It is his responsibility to make the Meadowlands profitable. If that means the creation of a high-end, five-month meet, so be it! It is his responsibility to make the Meadowlands the Mecca of racing it once was, and profitability can only occur in that setting. To proceed in the debased manor that he intends to is admitting to the Meadowlands' inability to become profitable without slots, an approach that one of these days will lead to the government forcing its obsolescence.

Proper use of the facility, better hospitality, offering the right product in a condensed season, better promotion of racing through local and New York City tie-ins with varied businesses, more intelligent use of simulcasting to garner international betting (as Yonkers has done) and many other ideas can give Mr. Gural financial peace. Diminishing the racing product being offered in the hope of limiting losses is akin to a restaurant owner raising prices because business has gone dowhill. The only certainty is failure!
