

Lexington Sale Holds Its Own By Bill Finley

**LEXINGTON, KY -** Night two couldn't match the opening round of the Lexington Selected yearling sale, but no one seemed to be complaining. They sold 154 horses last night for a gross of \$8,621,000 and an average of \$55,981.

That amounted to a decline of just less than 1 percent over last year, or to be precise, 0.99 percent.

"I certainly wasn't unhappy with the results tonight," cosales manager Randy Manges said. "The very small decline is no big deal. I think we are in good shape the rest of the way through. We have a strong consignment (Wednesday). With any sale, when you get to this point there will be some strong spots and some soft spots.

"I always like to be up, but if we are even the rest of the way I would be satisfied. When you consider everything that is going on with the Canadian dollar and the Euro there are concerns. But the participation by the Europeans has been fantastic. Even the Canadian buyers have been great and that's been a pleasant surprise."

After two sessions, \$19.3 million has been spent for an average of \$76,805 per yearling. That is a three percent increase over last year, not too shabby considering last year's sale was so strong.

The night two sales topper was Hip 140, a Cantab Hall filly named Thats All Moni. After a quiet first night, Jimmy Takter stepped it up and bought this one from consignor Preferred Equine.

Takter was shopping at both ends of the spectrum last night as he also bought a horse for \$20,000. His bargain basement buy was Hip 141, UFA Nephew Hanover, who is by Explosive Matter. Explosive Matter is the sire of Takter's Hambletonian winner, Pinkman,

Coming in a close second in terms of session topper was Hip 129, Seven Stars. He is a Chapter Seven colt who was purchased by Myron Bell, agent. The consignor was Spring Haven Farm.

The Cancelliere Brothers made their most expensive purchase thus far at at this sale, taking home a Somebeachsomewhere colt named Rum Punch.

Super sire Muscle Hill had another strong night and remains the leading sire in the sale in terms of average price per yearling. His yearlings have sold for an average of \$99,833. Somebeachsomewhere leads all pacing sires with an average of \$89,219. | share this story |

# Mare Bee A Magician Favored in Return of **International Trot**

**NEW YORK** – Fans with long memories and perhaps an eye for the ladies will remember that mares traditionally fared well in the International Trot. Bee A Magician is a 3-1 favorite to add to that history when the once-popular race is revived on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway after a 20-year absence.

recently as Aug. 1 and broke her own record for aged mares by blazing one mile in 1:54.3.

She drew adequately when she received post five as part of a field of 10 for the International when positions were drawn on Tuesday as part of a luncheon at Tavern on the Green. The mile-and-one-quarter contest will carry a \$1 million purse, making it the richest trotting event in New York State history.

Richard "Nifty" Norman, who trains Bee A Magician, believes her experience at Yonkers will be invaluable.

"It has to be an advantage because she's been there before and the foreign horses haven't," he said. "Yonkers is a tricky place to race if you haven't been there before."

Norman admitted it is difficult to assess his prospects because he lacks familiarity with many of the starters from overseas. Canada, France, Italy, Norway, Sweden and the United States will be represented when the race goes off at approximately 3:10 p.m. ET as part of a matinee geared to attract foreign markets through simulcasting.

"I don't really know the other horses very well," Norman said, "but she couldn't do much better than she's been doing."

Bee A Magician, bidding to give Canada only its third International victory, owns 10 victories and has never been worse than second through 14 starts this year. She boasts 41 wins in 61 lifetime starts with \$3,623,815 in earnings. She failed to crack the top three only six times. She was the Horse of the Year and the Trotter of the Year in 2013.

The fact that she is a mare? "I think it's a non-factor because she's been going against the best stallions and geldings in this country," he said. She will have her regular driver, Brian Sears.

"I'm happy with the spot we drew," Sears said. "I'm not familiar with all the competition, but she's earned the right to be there and I'm sure the other trotters have, too,"

The inaugural International Trot was held at old Roosevelt Raceway in Westbury, L.I., in 1959 and continued to be a marquee event there until Roosevelt closed in 1988. It moved to Yonkers for the next seven years before financial constraints forced the event to be dropped. Tim Rooney, the owner of Yonkers, has been interested in reviving the International since the long-suffering track turned into a bustling racino in 2006.

Eight mares produced 11 victories in 36 editions of the International. Roquepine, a mare from France, took consecutive runnings in 1967-68. Une de Mai, another French mare, reached the winner's circle in 1969 and 1971. Delmonica Hanover, a mare representing the United States, earned consecutive triumphs in 1973-74.

U.S. trotters lead the all-time standings with 15 victories, two more than France. Then there is a large gap to Sweden and Canada, with three and two wins, respectively.

Creatine (4-1 after drawing the rail) and Natural Herbie (8-1 from post seven) will be the U.S. standard bearers. Creatine has been campaigned overseas of late, though, taking the Hugo Abergs Memorial in Sweden and the Grand Prix Saint Michel in Finland to account for his wins this season. He is trained by Jimmy Takter. He will be driven by Takter's brother, Johnny.

Natural Herbie is owned, trained and driven by Verlin

Yoder, who believes his chances may depend on the pace that is set.

"We're going to need some action on the front end," he said. "We'll hope to pick up a piece of it. If we win, it would be special."

Owner Tom Andersen was exuding optimism after Norway's Papagayo E drew post 2 and was listed at 5-1 in the morning line by Frank Drucker of Yonkers Raceway.

"I think we have a good chance," Andersen said. "We have a good starting position. We have a strong and fast horse."

Papagayo E, a 5-year-old, is 11 of 24 lifetime, including three wins in nine starts this year.

Timoko, a hard-knocking 8-year-old that is so popular in France he has his own Facebook page, will leave from post four and merits consideration at 6-1. His trainer, Richard Westerlink, hopes Timoko will have a mental edge if all else is equal.

"He's thinking all the time. He's an intelligent horse," Westerlink said.



# **He's Watching Doing Well Down Under** By Perry Lefko

He's Watching will stand stud at Tara Hills in Port Perry, Ontario next season, but he's already active in New Zealand in New Zealand at Alabar Farms, the major breeding farm in the Southern Hemisphere.

The deal to stand him there was done in connection with

Tara Hills. The two farms have a similar working relationship with Mach Three.

"They've done a great job in Ontario promoting their stallion sale - they give every stallion an opportunity - and they have a good relationship

with Alabar and were good to help me get the horse fertility tested so we could get a deal done Down Under in New Zealand before we worry about North America," Menary told Harness Racing Update. "I think everything is falling into place."

He's Watching, a son of American Ideal, retired with 13 wins in 21 career starts and earnings of more than \$1.1 million. He was voted the U.S. champion two-year-old colt pacer in 2013, going undefeated in all eight starts, breaking five tracks records and setting world records on a half-mile and five-eighths mile track. In 2014, he won the Meadowlands Pace, tying the all-age world record time a time of 1:46 4/5. He followed up with a win in the Empire Breeders Classic and a close second in the Cane. He finished the season with five wins in 13 starts and earnings of \$837,493.

He was purchased as a yearling by Menary for \$3,000 at the Harrisburg Sale. Menary subsequently sold interests to Brad Gray, Michael Guerriero and Muscara Racing Trust. He's Watching's stud fee is \$6,000.

Menary said the colt has been well-received in his stallion career.

"They're very happy with what they see," Menary said. "Alabar is impressed. New Zealand breeders are impressed. I think he's in a good spot in the Southern Hemisphere and North America. I look forward to having him in Ontario and training some of his sons and daughters."

A stud fee has yet to be announced by Tara Hills. Menary said it has been somewhat of a bittersweet season for him and the horse, whom he'd hoped to race, specifically earlier in the year in the Molson Pace in London.

"I just don't think he could have been 100% all year long," Menary said. "He doesn't owe me anything. I want to see him have a good life. His was going to be standing stud, it came sooner than expected. I would have enjoyed racing

the horse this year. It would have been a great ride, but now I'm going to enjoy the next phase of his life."

The He's Watching Stallion Group will be a sponsor of the Breeders Crown finals on October 24 at Woodbine Racetrack.



# Wiggle It Jiggleit Likely to Choose Indiana over Breeders Crown

Owner George Teague Jr. Is still mulling his options with

Wiggle It Jiggleit, but reiterated yesterday that he is unlikely to supplement the Horse-of-the-Year contender for the Breeders Crown. Instead, Teague is looking at a series of races in Indiana, starting with Saturday night's \$200,0000 Indiana

Sire Stakes final. After that he has the \$75,000 Circle City on Oct. 23 and the \$275,000 Monument Circle on Oct. 30 on his schedule.

"I'm not 100 percent sure, but I am leaning toward staying in Indiana," Teague said. "There are three races there that are somewhat the equivalent of what we could race for in the Breeders Crown purse-wise. The only difference is three races versus two."

The Breeders Crown will be held Oct. 24 at Woodbine. It would cost \$62,500 to supplement Wiggle It to the Breeders Crown, a race that goes fort \$500,000.

"For the money we have to put up to race in the Breeders Crown, that is a large chunk," he said. "You have to finish one-two to get your money back and what happens if you get a bad trip or your horse don't catch his race?"

Teague must also decided whether or not he wants to try older horses in the Nov. 21 TVG Pace at the Meadowlands, which goes for \$400,000.

"I really want to race in the TVG but the problem is it is at the same time as the Progress Pace, which goes for \$300,000 and is for 3-year-olds," he said. "It's also at my home track, Dover. That puts me in kind of a tough spot. I think he fits in the TVG and I like to do things differently. We'll see."

The finals of the Progress Pace are on Nov. 29, but if an elimination is needed that would go on the 22nd, the night after the TVG.

# Wakizashi Hanover Wins Keystone Classic Split in Sharp Breeders Crown Tune-up

Hanover turned in a sharp tune-up for the Breeders Crown when he won effortlessly in Tuesday's Keystone Classic at The Meadows. Yankee Bounty took the other division of the \$69,750 stake for

3-year-old colt and gelding pacers.

Wakizashi Hanover ranks third among all North American

Standardbreds in seasonal earnings, and he's seventh in the current Hambletonian/Breeders Crown poll. While he's used to racing for richer purses, trainer Joann Looney-King said the owners of the Dragon Again-Western Gesture gelding — the principals of Tri County Stable — deliberately picked the Keystone Classic for his final Breeders Crown prep.

"This was what we did instead of qualifying — \$34,000 is better than nothing," she said. "The owners stuck with their schedule. He's done enough traveling. He's still 3, and we want him to last a while longer."

In the Keystone Classic, Wakizashi Hanover controlled the mile for Tim Tetrick and scored in 1:51.1, 1-1/4 lengths ahead of My Hero Ron. Allbeef N Nobull earned show. With the victory, Wakizashi Hanover soared over \$1.2 million in career earnings.

"He looked good — never popped the plugs," Looney-King said. "He's been putting in steps lately, but today he looked on his game. So we're ready."

Yankee Bounty also prevailed on the front end, but he needed a late wake-up call from Yannick Gingras to complete the job.

"It wasn't so much that he was tired, but he got a little lonely on the front," Gingras said. "He was by himself a long way and wanted some company."

The pocket-sitting Badiou Hanover was second, beaten a head, while Cooperstown rallied for show.

The Yankee Cruiser-Bootleg Yankee gelding, trained by Ron Burke for Yankee Bounty Partnership and Frank Chick, is having an unusual year, with \$282,140 in earnings but only two victories. Gingras, for one, isn't disappointed.

"He's raced good against a good crop of 3-year-olds,"
Gingras said. "He's been there all along. Not many wins,
but the bottom line is the last column. That's what matters."
\$89,800 Keystone Classic — 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding
Trotters

Chef Lee and Colbert each captured a division of Tuesday's companion feature, an \$89,800 Keystone Classic for sophomore colt and gelding trotters. Chef Lee inherited the front when the leader, Mesmerized, broke stride near the quarter pole, and he made the most of it, digging in late to score in 1:54.4 — matching his lifetime best — for Mike Wilder and owner/trainer Norm Parker. Don't Mind Me was second, a head back, with Suit And Tie third.

"The lead was where I wanted to be, although Mike always likes to take it easy on the horse," Parker said. "I know he fights hard on the front end."

LEXINGTON, KY-- The Friday afternoon program at The Red Mile attracted three divisions for the \$224,100 International Stallion Stakes (ISS) for 2-year-old filly pacers and four divisions for the \$272,000 ISS for 2-year-old colt and gelding pacers.

The opening freshmen filly ISS split features the return of undefeated Pure Country, owned by Diamond Creek

Racing. The winner of seven starts and \$342.618. the Jimmy Takter-trainee won a \$81,000 division of the Bluegrass over a sloppy track in 1:56.1 as the 1-9 favorite on Oct. 2. By Somebeachsomewhere out of the Western Hanover mare Western to action Friday at The Red Mile Montana, she'll compete from post position six

against Bluegrass starters Skinny Dipper, Upside Surprise, Mother Of Art, and Hug A Dragoness.

Earning \$250,136 this season, Call Me Queen Be highlights the second split. Sired by Somebeachsomewhere, out of the Western Terror mare Preppy Party Girl, she finished third as the 1-5 favorite in a \$81,000 division of the Bluegrass on Oct. 2. Owned by Let It Ride Stables Inc. and Dana Parham, she has won four races in seven outings this season. Matching up with her once again is the Nancy Johansson-trained Jk Fannie, who finished third to the Ross Croghan-trainee in a \$127,150 division of the Kentuckiana at Hoosier Park on Sept. 26.

Bluegrass starters Kiss Me Onthebeach, Wine Snob, East Side Hanover, and Eloquent Grace also draw into this division.

The final division of the ISS filly pace gathers Bluegrass division winner Shezarealdeal and She's A Great Lady runner-up Darlinonthebeach. Shezarealdeal, sent off the 1-5 favorite in her division, she won her fourth race out of eight starts with a 1:56.4 mile over the slop.

Darlinonthebeach enters this event with one win in seven starts, and earnings of \$167,041 this season. She was recently second in a \$125,900 division of the Kentuckiana Stakes, which followed her second-place finish in the \$341,250 She's A Great Lady to L A Delight.

The first of a quartet brings back Bluegrass starters Beach Ogre, I'm Some Graduate, Mr Right Hanover, and Ideal Rocky. In the Bluegrass, I'm Some Graduate and Ideal Rocky were sent off the 4-5 and 8-5 favorites respectively, with them also finishing fourth and third respectively. I'm Some Graduate, a colt by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Western Hanover mare Western Graduate owned by John Cancelliere, has won four races in six starts, and earned \$109,927. Ideal Rocky, a Rocknroll Hanover colt out of Eternity's Delight by Bettor's Delight owned by William Wiswell, Jean Goehlen,

and Eugene Schick, has won four races in 10 starts, earning \$167,151.

Big Top Hanover and Owen Hanover, both entering off of second-place efforts in the Bluegrass on Oct. 3, compete in the second division. Big Top Hanover, conditioned by Ron Burke for the interests of Jt45 and Burke Racing Stables LLC, has won one in nine starts this year. The son of Western Ideal out of the Art Major mare Blind Ambition has earned \$121,621. Owen Hanover, by Cam's Card Shark out of On Her Way by Abercrombie, is owned by Jerry Clark and Tammy Crescenze. The winner of two races in 10 starts, earning \$69,099 in the process, is conditioned by Noel Daley.

Tony Alagna's American Passport, winner of a Bluegrass division in 1:56.1, faces world champion Spider Man Hanover in the third round of ISS. Winning a \$23,100 division of the Standardbred at Delaware, Ohio in a world-record time of 1:51.4, beating the mark of 1:52.2 set by On Golden Ponder at Delaware and set by He's Watching at Yonkers Raceway, both occurring in 2013. From the Brian Brown barn, the Western Ideal colt out of Art Major mare Stolly Up Bluechip has won four in seven starts and earned \$189,300. American Passport, an American Ideal colt out of Star Of The Show by Four Starzzz Shark, competes for the interests of Brittany Farms, Riverview Racing, Alagna Racing, and Jodi Siammis. He has won two of eight starts this year, banking \$156,246.

The last ISS split features Bluegrass-division winner Racing Hill and New York Sires Stakes champion Travel Playlist, who is undefeated in five starts. Winning going wire to wire from post 7 at Yonkers Raceway, the colt by Art Major out of the Rocknroll Hanover mare Village Madonna. He has earned \$234,695 in his campaign. Racing Hill, a winner of three in seven starts, races for owner Tom Hill and trainer Tony Alagna. The colt by Roll With Joe out of the American Ideal mare Chasing Ideals has earned \$83,576 this year.

The 10-race card has a first-race post time of 1:00pm.
