2015 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale Shows Solid Increase From A Year Ago By Perry Lefko

**LEXINGTON, KY** - The 2015 Lexington Selected Sale did well, despite concerns going into it that Canadian and European buyers would not be as bullish about spending this year due to their struggling economies and the cost of doing business in American currency.

"We're very pleased, our sales were very good," Randy Manges, co-manager of Lexington Select, told Harness Racing Update following the conclusion of the five-day sale on Friday night.

"Every day we were close to being even or up. Tonight we were up about 15% over last year, averaging \$16,022 while a year ago it was \$13,926. I was surprised (the sale) did as well as it did with the Canadian buyers being as strong as they were. In Canada, the Ontario-breds supply is way down in light of what has happened in recent years (with the cancellation of the lucrative Slots At Racetrack Program in 2013). The number of Ontario-breds is way down, so there's much more of a demand for them. We had some very good Ontario-breds. Not that we had a lot of Ontario-breds, but we had some very good ones."

Manges added the struggling European market and the financial impact it had on buyers spending in U.S. dollars also represented a significant concern.

"The past few years the (U.S.) dollar was not as strong against the Euro and we had been doing well with the European market," Manges added. "I wasn't quite as optimistic this year as I was in the past with how well we've doing with the European market. But it turned out well for us."

Overall, 642 horses sold for \$29,031,000, averaging \$45,220. A year ago, 687 horses sold for \$39,857, which represents a 13.46% increase on average. A year ago, the average had a 10.6% boost from 2013.

Friday's sale saw 91 horses sold for \$1,458,000, averaging \$16,022.

The \$75,000 sales topper on Friday night was Father Dave, a bay pacing colt by Always A Virgin-My Best Girl, purchased by Joe Holloway of New Jersey and consigned by Preferred Equine Inc. Agent for Copper Cat Farm.

The second-highest purchased horse was Best

Trick Ever, a \$55,000 bay pacing colt by Cambest-Best Trick Ever, purchased by John Como, Jr., of New Jersey and consigned by Preferred Equine Inc. Agent for Denim Stable.

The final sales day included 24 pacing colts sold for a total of \$504,000, averaging \$21,000. 25 pacing fillies sold \$358,000, averaging \$14,320. 18 trotting colts sold for \$237,000, averaging \$13,167. 24 trotting fillies sold for \$359,000, averaging \$14,950.

Overall, 146 pacing colts sold for \$7,313,000, averaging \$50,089. 154 pacing fillies sold for \$5,823,000, averaging \$37,812. 182 trotting colts sold for \$9,040,000, averaging \$49,670. 160 trotting fillies sold for \$6,855,000, averaging \$42,844.


Tony Alagna, agent, led all buyers in total spending with \$1,487,000 on 13 horses. Robert Lindstrom, agent, placed second overall with \$1,340,000 on 10 horses. Jimmy Takter followed with \$1,017,000 on 13 horses. Burke Racing Stable led all buyers in total purchases with 14 totaling \$864,000.

Preferred Equine, Inc., led all consignors with \$6,278,000 in total sales and the most horses sold, 132. Hunterton Sales Agency, Inc., placed second with \$3,964,000 on 75 horses sold. Winbak Farm followed with \$2,252,000 from 56 horses sold.

Muscle Hill led all sires with 49 offspring totaling \$4,229,000 and averaging \$86,300.

Somebeachsomewhere placed second with 44 offspring selling for \$3,779,000, averaging \$85,886.

The 2015 sale showed promise right from the start when two trotting colts sold for \$350,000 each. One was Federal Hill, a son of Muscle Hill, who was purchased by Mario Zuanetti's Atlantic Trot, acting as the agent for Finnish owner Reima Kuisla. The colt is a half-brother to Father Patrick and Pastor Stephen and was sold by Brittany Farms. The other \$350,000 purchase was Live For Greatness, a son of Cantab Hall out of Forever Graceful, purchased by agent Robert Lindstrom on behalf of Lennart Agren's SRF Stable. Agren also owns Elitloppet winner Magic Tonight and the top mare D'One.

R Gauwitz Hanover Won't Get Claimed - At Least Not This Week

R Gauwitz Hanover, who has been claimed 12 consecutive times, won't be racing this weekend because his immediate future will all come down to the Breeders Crown.

No, the six-year-old gelded pacer, who has been solid at the \$25,000 claiming level in Pennsylvania, will not be stepping up in class to race in the Breeders Crown. He's good, but not that good. But Rene Allard, who has claimed the gritty gelding twice this year, wants to see if any of the horses that may potentially race in Open company at Pocono Downs will be entered in the Breeders Crown eliminations Oct. 17. That would present an opportunity for the \$25,000 claimer to step up in company.

"We're thinking about racing him in there once and going from there," Allard told Harness Racing Update.

The highest level for claimers at Pocono is \$25,000, and because of the horse's solid form horsemen are submitting claim slips to halter him. If Allard races the gelding in a claimer in his next race, the horse will be claimed and tie the record for consecutive claims. Champagnesupernova holds the record for consecutive claims with 13, which happened during the 2003 racing at The Meadows.

"It's too bad because he'd probably be a \$40,000-\$50,000, but the highest claimer at Pocono is \$25,000 and the Open is a big step up," Allard said. "In the Open, you're racing against horses (valued at) \$100,000 or more, and the only angle I'm looking at is I'm hoping some of the better Open horses will be going to the Breeders Crown. So if we won't have to race against Grand Circuit horses, we can race against local Open horses, which is going to be tough but we can try it for one start and see what happens.

"It's a possibility we might put him in for \$25,000 again. Obviously if you put him in for \$25,000, he's going to be claimed. I like the little horse - he's good for everybody. Nobody wants to race him over his head. It's like any sport. You don't want to go up any steps too quickly. If you take him for \$25,000 and put him in the Open and he gets beat pretty good, he might not be as sharp after that. That's why

everyone who has had him has debated with the same situation. You either put him in the Open or \$25,000. You know if you're putting him in for \$25,000 you're getting a win, but unfortunately he's going to move barns. Everyone is in the same situation, it's either you're in for \$25,000 or almost \$125,000."

Because of the state rules, any horses claimed in Pennsylvania can only race there for the next 60 days.

"I've tried to claim the horse every single race in the last 12 weeks and this is the second time I've got him," Allard said.


There were seven claim slips for the horse in his last race, including one by trainer Marty Fine, who has had him twice during the streak.

"It seems like there's one every year," Allard said. "It seems like there's one in that \$20,000-\$25,000 range that gets claimed all summer because it's such a big step up from \$25,000 to Open."

BJ's Rameau was claimed 17 times last year in 39 races, almost all of them at Pocono, the highest level \$30,000.

#### **Natural Herbie Ready for YR International**

Verlin Yoder and Natural Herbie return this weekend to the site of their biggest win, hoping to come away with an even bigger score.

Last year, Natural Herbie – owned, trained and driven by Yoder – prevailed over a talented field in the \$250,000 International Trot Preview at Yonkers Raceway. On Saturday, the Indiana-based duo returns for the \$1 million International Trot at the Hilltop.

The International Trot features horses from six different countries, with Natural Herbie joining Creatine as the U.S. representatives. Canada's Bee A Magician is the 3-1 morning line favorite in the invitational event, which will be raced at 1-1/4 miles rather than the traditional one-mile distance.

Post time is 2 p.m. for Saturday's first race at Yonkers, with the International Trot set for 3:10 p.m. approximately.

"It is a big honor," Yoder said. "Two U.S. horses were picked and you are one of them, it is very humbling."

Natural Herbie drew post No. 7 and is 8-1 on the International Trot morning line, but can't be overlooked in the race after having won last year's International Trot Preview in a world-record 2:24.4 for 1-1/4 miles. He is, according to Yoder, "a horse that loves distance racing."

The 5-year-old gelding has won 27 of 63 lifetime races and earned \$899,161. In September, he won his elimination for the Maple Leaf Trot at Mohawk and finished third in the final. Following an eighth-place finish in the Centaur Trotting Classic, he prepped for the International Trot with a 1:55.1 qualifier win on Sept. 30 at Hoosier Park, trotting his last quarter-mile in :26.3 to pull away from the field by 20-1/2 lengths.

"We had a little problem after Mohawk, but we found it," Yoder said. "He had a little sickness. I was shipping from Indiana to Mohawk – that's 7-1/2 hours. But he had a good week, so I hope we're on the right track. We take him out and grass him. He likes to go out on the grass. He's feeling good and everything."

While Yoder looks upon Saturday's race as challenging, he feels he is going in with a horse that has a good attitude, especially when it comes to going extra distance.

"If he's good, he doesn't mind it," Yoder said. "He always trains two miles without stopping, and he's the only horse I ever had that liked it. It's a matter of having him healthy and sound and as far as soundness, he's been very good. We had some little health issues but he seems to be on the right page right now."

How that confidence translates into results is anybody's guess, so Yoder is keeping his predictions low key.

Actually, they are non-existent, as he will just let things play out

"You always have big expectations but you also don't want to embarrass yourself," Yoder said. "All the horses have the right to be here, so you don't know what is going to happen until the gate opens."

## If Something Looks Bad, It Needs to Be Scrapped

--- Daily Fantasy Sports is providing yet another strong lesson for Harness Racing ---


Just this past week or so, the multi-billion dollar Daily Fantasy Sports market has been rocked with some very bad press.



The daily fantasy sports twitter (too early) about business has been rocked by scandal, something harness racing should take note of twitter (too early) about ownership rates of players for the weekly NFL contests. Sure.

One of the largest companies - Draft Kings - had what most are calling a "data leak" just after the Sunday 1 o'clock NFL games a week ago. Information was inadvertently posted on twitter (too early) about ownership rates of players for the weekly NFL contests. Sure,

close approximations of ownership rates are published each week for everyone to see before games already. Sure, this might not have helped you or me. Sure, a huge number of people did not see the "leak" before it was deleted. But it was important because the episode showed cracks in the systems and it raised legitimate questions.

What happened next, though, was pretty interesting and even the most savvy media observer likely could never have predicted it in such fervour.

Headlines went from "early lineup tweet" to "data leak", to "insider trading" to "huge scandal", at some media outlets within hours. Calls for the companies to be more transparent regarding who sees data and when they see it - reasonable asks - leapfrogged to the nebulous (and often anti-consumer), "the industry needs to be regulated" quicker than two shakes of a lamb's tail. Rational customer concerns about employees playing at other sites (some employed in DFS have and do win big money tournaments at other sites), quickly went to "those employees are stealing all my money" narratives. Rumblings that all tournaments run should be cancelled and everyone should get their money back were rampant.

It's not the least bit unreasonable to think there is a more to this story and that some of these dire narratives might be foreshadowing, but how quickly things mushroomed, a lot of it on pure conjecture, was eye-opening.

These are issues a lot of new companies or industries have - especially those that disrupt older business models. Some have not set proper controls, or do not have experienced business people in positions of power as they hockey-stick grow. Facebook went through them with privacy, google with their ad program. With gambling, though, it's infinitely worse, because so many have a strong dislike towards it. This gives them a megaphone.

Back in 2008, for example, when Betfair was moving into Australia, an anti-gaming Australian MP, right in Parliament, suggested the betting company was funneling money to Al Qaeda. Seriously, that happened. The people who wish you never existed, agenda-driven journalists, your competition looking for your customers, or tax-hungry politicians, never let a good crisis go to waste. Think horse racing and PETA for an object lesson a little closer to home.

What does the above have to do with harness racing? Quite a bit, frankly. Harness racing is a gambling game, and like Draft Kings, how it controls its optics is extremely important; I would offer even more-so.

I had a look at the proposed rule changes submitted to the USTA for 2016 this week. One of them, forwarded by trainer driver Ray Schnittker, is about changing the time between charted lines.

The current rule:

"Within 30 days of being entered, a horse that has not raced previously at the gait chosen must go a qualifying race under the supervision of a judge..."

Ray wants 30 days to be changed to 120 days. That's one month to four months. Ray reasons that it costs money

to requalify a horse, and that the "bettors know which trainer will have them ready or not."

With costs through the roof the last decade, I am all for saving money, and I am sure I can keep stats on a horse's record off 120 days off without a charted line. But we need to remember the lessons learned about optics. 120 days off between starts with no raceline opens a Pandora's box for a gambling game like horse racing, not unlike a "data leak" in Daily Fantasy Sports does.

A horse needs four months between starts for a number of reasons, but primarily because he or she was not racing well, had an injury, was sick, or had another issue. The last few starts for a nice 1:54 type mare before being laid off might look something like this: May 9th, 8th by 22, 1:57.1, 6th by 11, 156.0, 9th by 18, 157.

Then Ray, and other good horsemen like him, fix up this mare, school her in 1:54 on Tuesday August 1st, and she's in the box in a non-winners of a ham sandwich, against horses going in 1:55 - a full 11 lengths faster in the time box than her last charted line.

She is sent to the lead, takes two left turns, scores in 153.3 and wins by 7. She pays \$14.

Ray knew she'd do that, the people at the schoolers knew it, Ray's owner knew it. The only people who did not know were customers because they could not see a charted line. Remember them?

Ray, or someone like him, is not a bad person. He's not trying to cash a bet. If he wants to bury a horse in a

qualifier and cash a bet he would've done it already. But, other than the obvious (form reversals with no charted line will light up the chat boards and social media in a nano-second), further optics are degraded.

The reason given for the change to 120 days from 30 is to save owners and trainers money. This in a sport that gets money from the public purse (slots coupling) controlled by politicians - another one of racing's "customers." Saving money and inconveniencing customers (or pulling the wool over their eyes in the worst instances with stale date horses) when getting hundreds of millions for purses from slot machines does not sit well with them, and invites the inevitable questions that pop up. "This money should go to schools not to 'greedy horse owners'". You know the drill.

I completely understand where Ray is coming from. But if the optics are bad, you just can't do these sorts of things. Draft Kings and others like them have brought a lot of these issues on themselves. Despite them knowing many were waiting in the weeds to pounce, their structure, their lack of controls, their desire to grow at breakneck speed and their inexperience still made them gloss over what's most important: Transparency, the integrity of a gambling game, and how such is perceived. That's something that never gets old and they're getting a lesson in that truism.

Harness racing is not Daily Fantasy Sports, and that puts it in an even more tenuous position when it comes to optics. It is not growing at these huge rates and it doesn't have market forces speaking loud and clear with dollars, wanting to play it. It depends in large part on public money, and government support, and make no mistake, like with Fantasy Sports, there are many in the weeds waiting to pounce. That is all the more reason to be hyper-vigilant with these issues. If any rule change looks bad - no matter how well intentioned - it must be scrapped, because optics mean everything.
