




Frank "The Elder" Antonacci (left) is a part of the Walner group through his Lindy Farms. The syndicate will be managed by Preferred's David Reid (right).

Hakan Walner was one of the most wonderful horseman I have had the pleasure of knowing. His namesake (Walner) may be the most fabulous horse I have ever seen.

It all started on a warm morning at the Meadowlands on the 18th of June in 2016 in the 7th baby race. A beautiful light bay son of Chapter Seven made his way out of the paddock onto the track in the more than capable hands of Tim Tetrick. What happened in that race was, to me, beyond belief. Tim took the colt off the gate and was seventh through less than pedestrian fractions. Not only did he win the qualifier, but to do so he had to trot the final half in 55 seconds and the final quarter in :26.3. This was the first start of a two-year-old. Simply amazing.

Walner tortured his competition for the entire two-year-old season, ending the year winning the Breeders Crown and the Kindergarten final. To say the harness world anxiously awaited his three-year-old campaign would be a ridiculous understatement.

Unfortunately, the sophomore jinx took hold. His return to the track in May resulted in a fine qualifier but he was soon sidelined by a minor problem that has since been rectified. He only had two overnight starts and a 1:50.2 performance



in the Stanley Dancer that was breathtaking.

Sadly, that was to be his last start. When the announcement was made that he would not start in the Hambletonian the horse world was shaken. We are all thankful to a very special owner and trainer combination of Kenneth Jacobs and Linda Toscano for putting their horse before the money to avoid the risk of hurting him severely. I am sure that was a hard decision to make as I understand that the injury was not severe.

"When Linda announced that he was not going to race in the Hambletonian I thought it was a similar situation to Valley Victory and we should buy him," said George Segal. "I spoke to Myron (Bell) and had him call Steve Stewart, Marvin Katz and Al Libfield and they all loved it," said George.


Segal then contacted Toscano and she said they would entertain offers. However, at this point, there was no certainty that the horse was retired and Segal was afraid that if they bought the colt, tried to race him and there was still a soreness issue, it could present a serious problem.

Later, when the decision was made to retire the colt, the process evolved. Segal said, "my first offer was turned down and we finally settled at a number that we all could live with. Lindy Farms, Brittany farms, Hunterton and their clients, Libfield and Katz and Deo Volente are the basis of the syndicate. There are a tremendous amount of European interests that want to get involved at a later date. Preferred Equine will be the syndicate manager and the horse will stand at Southwind Farm in New Jersey."

Southwind Farm's manager Mike Klau said he was contacted by Preferred's David Reid, "because they wanted the horse to stand in an area with a mile track and he wanted to go for dual eligibility (New Jersey and Kentucky). In 2017, Muscle Hill returned to New Jersey. I think that state eligibility is a non factor in a top stallion."

Myron Bell said he saw Walner for the first time in a baby race at the Meadowlands.

"He was super impressive, he was outside the whole mile. He looked like a special horse," Bell said. "After a few starts, I

spoke to Mr Jacobs and expressed an interest in the horse. After seeing Walner, Brittany bought three shares in Chapter Seven. Walner was a knockout from the word go in 2017. He was center stage. He is such a great outcross — out of a Ken Warkentin mare he is good to breed to mares by Muscle Hill, Cantab Hall, Father Patrick and Trixton."

Katz said he is very excited about Walner's future.

"I think he will bring a new dimension to North American breeding. He was very charismatic on the racetrack," Katz said.

It is quite normal for a trainer to favor horses he has trained. In his time, Self Possessed's performance in the Hambletonian was overpowering. Yet, I truly expected Walner to be far more impressive to the point of maybe equating it to Secretariat's 32-length win in the Belmont Stake.

I sincerely wish the best to all the investors in this great colt and hope all their dreams become reality.

Hoping for super results on Indiana Super Night

Tonight trainer Bill Crone and owner John Barnard will send out three trotters with shots at glory on Hoosier Park's nearly \$2 million Super Night card of Indiana Sires Stakes.

Indiana's top trotters and pacers are set to slug it out tonight (Oct. 13) at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Divisional honors in the state will be on the line, and the trainer/owner partnership of Bill Crone and John Barnard enter the lucrative night with three shots at Super Finals glory. Crone will send out a trio of trotters on the championship card, including sophomores Swan Chase and Intothelight and freshman colt Fiftydallarbill. Two of the entries are morning line favorites.

The partnership between these two horsemen has previously produced results in Indiana. Crone first came to the Hoosier State in 2011 with older pacer St Elmo Hero. Incidentally, it was the first horse he had trained for Barnard, and it led to an association that continues today.

"A good friend of ours picked out St Elmo Hero," Crone said



of the now six-year partnership. "John and I just hit it off."

That season, the trainer made two starts at Hoosier Park with St Elmo Hero, finishing second one week in an Indiana Sires Stakes elimination for older male pacers. The next week, the son of Western Hero—Crystal Crickett captured the \$100,000 final as the favorite, pacing to a 1:50.1 victory. That season, the five-year-old went on to bank a little over \$300,000 in his second season of racing and the two were off and running in the Indiana program.

In 2013 and 2014, Crone and Barnard returned to Indiana Sires Stakes with trotter Hudson Jesse. The Jailhouse Jesse filly won five of seven starts as a freshman, claiming a \$40,000 Silver Final. In the Super Final, an interference break after the quarter cost her a chance to compete for victory. The filly returned at three, however, to win eight of 19 starts. Hudson Jesse's biggest win came in the \$216,000 Super Final, where Peter Wrenn steered her to a 1:56.3 triumph, hitting the wire nearly three lengths ahead of the field.

Three years removed from that big Indiana win, Crone and Barnard enter tonight's huge card with legitimate chances to add to their collection of Indiana Sires Stakes scores. Three-year-old Swan Chase will start the evening, lining up in post eight in the night's sixth race. The trotter enters the contest with 12 wins from 18 starts and \$177,327 in seasonal earnings. Swan Chase finished second in last year's Super Final racing as a colt. Earlier this season, he was gelded.

"He started out a little slow and we ended up castrating him. That made a big difference. I think he's won seven of his last eight since we castrated him," explained the Illinois-based trainer. "It just really turned him around. It was kind of a touchy thing to do, but he was getting sulky and just wasn't racing well."

Swan Chase sports a 1:53.2 mark over the Hoosier Park surface. Tabbed the 2-1 morning line favorite, John DeLong will drive the son of Swan For All—Precisionist. Crone is hoping for a good result, but admits there are three or four other good colts that could also reach the winner's circle.

One race later, Crone will send out freshman trotter Fiftydallarbill in the \$220,000 Super Final for two-year-old trotting colts. The 9-5 morning line selection has drawn post 10 and will line up in the second tier for driver Trace Tetrick. The Swan For All-CR Dixie Chick colt has won six of 14 starts, including a pair of ISS finals that secured entry into the Super Final. A \$16,000 yearling purchase last fall, Fiftydallarbill has had his share of issues this season.

"When we first started out with him, he would halfway try

to run and stop," Crone said. "We changed some of his shoeing and it helped a little."

Still, through his first eight starts, Fiftydallarbill only produced one win. It was during a start at the Indiana State Fair on Grand Circuit day that Tetrick made a suggestion. That day, the colt made a break and finished last in the Ralph Wilfong Memorial. In the post-race analysis, the driver offered his opinion.

"After the race Trace said, 'You know, maybe if you widen him out just a little behind," Crone said. "We decided to put some brace bandages on him. Since we did that he's been real good. He was just touching himself lightly. He was real green then, and when he touched himself he would go to running every once in a while."

Fiftydallarbill has reeled off five wins in six starts since the adjustment. His lone blemish was a ninth-place finish in an Indiana Sires Stakes final held September 16. In that start, the colt made a break before the start. His last time out, the freshman romped by more than five lengths in the \$80,000 ISS final, stopping the clock in a lifetime best 1:55.

Tonight, the colt looks to add to his \$137,950 in seasonal earnings. Crone knows that it will be a tough feat to win one, let alone get to the winner's circle with two horses on Super Night.

"It's a good program," said the trainer. "This competition is as tough as there is anywhere."

And that is why the conditioner recognizes he has a longshot in sophomore filly Intothelight in the night's 11th race. The Swan For All filly has won twice in 2017, and has drawn post two in the \$220,000 Super Final. The division has been dominated this season by Satin Dancer, a winner in 11 of 15 starts. Slotted as 25-1 on the morning line, a victory over the favorite Friday would make for a big headline.

"She's a nice three-year-old filly, but there's three or four in there that are really good, especially one," he said. "Hopefully she'll get a check."

Dreammoko chasing Yonkers International and father's glory

The Richard Westerlink trainee has some distance to go to live up to his heralded father Timoko, the richest French trotter of all time.

Like father, like son? Not exactly.

Handicappers preparing for the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot on Saturday will note that Dreammoko is a 4-year-old son of Timoko, the hard-luck runner-up when the International was revived in 2015 after a 20-year hiatus. Beyond the name and the bloodlines, in many respects that is where the similarity ends.

Timoko was recently retired as a 15-time Group 1 winner. Dreammoko is still chasing his first Group 1 victory. Timoko was expected to be a force in the International for trainer Richard Westerlink and lived up to that billing. Dreammoko is rated 6-1 for Westerlink as part of a 10-horse field.

"No horse compares with his father. I think Timoko was unbelievable," Westerlink said of the French champion.



a million."

One in a million sounds about right. Timoko was still effective earlier this season as a 10-year-old before issues with his legs and joints led to this retirement as the richest trotter in France's harness racing history with \$5,949,190 in earnings. He won 36 of 101 starts with 15 second-place finishes. He was third on 13 other occasions.

Timoko remained an unyielding competitor to the end. He won his final start, in Cagnes-sur-Mer in August, in a time of 1:51.1 for driver Bjorn Goop.

Jerry Riordan, who trains Twister Bi, a top contender in Saturday's International, grew to become a great admirer of Timoko through the years, even as he worked to defeat him.

"The horse was just unbelievable. He was one of those smart, old, indestructible horses," Riordan said. "He was a horse with real character. You had to do what he wanted to do."

Riordan's blunt assessment of Dreammoko?

"Honestly, he's a nice horse," he said. "But he ain't Timoko, that's for sure."

Although few trotters will ever approach Timoko in their accomplishments and demeanor, Dreammoko has established unmistakable quality in capturing five of 29 lifetime starts to go with four runner-up finishes. He came in third another six times. His career earnings stand at \$348,007.

Bred by Paul Vanklaveren in France, Dreammoko faltered last season before making dramatic progress this year. He won just once in 10 starts in 2016 and earned a relatively meager \$22,804. This year? Thirteen starts have brought three victories, three second-place finishes and four thirds while he banked \$293,802.

The difference?

Gotta be the shoes, right? Wrong. The correct answer: no shoes.

Goop suggested to Westerlink that he try racing the chestnut horse barefoot. That resulted in a significant uptick in performance.

"This year we take the shoes off and he's much better without shoes," the trainer said. "He's won a lot of money without shoes."

Westerlink admits he is somewhat puzzled why the removal of shoes should make such a radical difference. "There are a lot of horses in France like that. It's more natural, I think," he said. "I can't explain it. I don't know."

According to Westerlink, he decided Dreammoko was worthy of a place in the mile-and-a-quarter International only after he crossed the wire third in the Kymi Grand Prix at Kouvola on June 17. He was just two-and-a-half lengths

behind his famed sire, who placed second.

"It was, for me, a stimulation to come over here," Westerlink said.

Dreammoko drew favorably and will leave from post three. He will be driven by Gabriele Gelormini and is expected to trot around the half-mile oval barefoot. Westerlink can only hope for a better trip than the one Timoko endured when he lost considerable ground before a determined rally left him half a length behind Papagayo E of Norway two years ago.

"To me, Timoko was the emotional winner of the race," Westerlink said.


He has relatively modest hopes for Dreammoko on Saturday. "He has a chance maybe not for win but for a place, I think," he said.

He noted that Timoko passed on one trait he could do without.

"His father was a lazy horse in the morning. He's a little bit more lazy than his father," Westerlink said. "He cannot beat claimers in the work. In the race, he's always fighting. I can't explain it."

Resolve continues to enrich the life of veteran owner Hans Enggren

The Ake Svanstedt trainee will carry the U.S. flag into Saturday Yonkers International Trot hoping to be the first repeat winner of the race since 1973-74.

Defending Yonkers International Trot champion Resolve provides what owner Hans Enggren needs most these days – good medicine.

Enggren, 88, remains mentally sharp but life has been somewhat of a struggle physically. He has relied on a pacemaker for the last 18 years. He continues to treasure every day, each immeasurably brightened by the addition of Resolve, the horse of a lifetime.

Enggren spotted Resolve in November of 2013 when the horse was being bathed outside the barn of his then trainer Roman Lopez at the South Florida Training Center. Enggren was able to purchase him privately after months of determined pursuit.

"He makes life exciting for you," said Enggren. "I never get bored because people call, and that's nice."

Family members and friends all want to know how Resolve is doing and whether he can give the United States its first repeat winner in the International since Delmonica Hanover in 1973-74. The son of Muscle Hill—Anikawiesahalee provided an extraordinary performance last year when he led at every call and tore through the mile-and-a-quarter contest in a world record 2:23.4.

Enggren was thrilled to be part of the crowd at Yonkers Raceway last year. "It was something that would be very hard to forget," he said of the exhilarating experience that came after more than 50 years as an owner and breeder. He also bred and owned Prakas, the 1985 Hambletonian champion.

Recent health issues will make it wiser for him to watch the International with loved ones at his home in Abbottstown, PA. He and his wife, Christina, have five children. Resolve will start from post six as part of a 10-horse field. The 3-1 favorite is trained and driven by Ake Svanstedt.

Svanstedt had hoped to draw one of the five inside positions. "The post is okay, but I'm not satisfied with having the horses to beat on the inside," he said. "We'll see what happens."

Oasis Bi of Italy, who finished a length and a half behind in second last year, drew post two. Twister Bi, another highly-regarded opponent from Italy, has post four. Marion Marauder of Canada, trotting's Triple Crown champion in 2016, enjoys the benefit of the rail.

Resolve continues to compete at a high level. The 6-year-old was third behind Timoko and Propulsion in the Elitloppet earlier this year. He counts wins in the Cashman Memorial, Crawford Farms Open Trot and Cutler Memorial among his four victories in 10 starts this year with earnings of \$485,149.

There may be some question about his readiness for the stiff test the International represents. He comes off an uncharacteristically poor effort when he struggled home seventh in an elimination of the Maple Leaf Trot at Mohawk Racetrack on Sept. 8 and spiked a high fever after the race.

A veterinarian discovered evidence of either a snake or tick bite, leading Resolve to be treated with strong antibiotics. He remained in Canada for five days before he was well enough to return to Svanstedt's farm in Wrightstown, NJ.

"We started jogging him already the first day he came home, so he just missed one week," Svanstedt said. "He is good now."

Svanstedt is confident recent circumstances will not adversely affect Resolve. "I think it is better for him to have the time off," he said. "When he races too often, he is a little bit lazy. When it is a longer time between races, he is more excited when he comes to the race and really wants to race."

Enggren is not sure what the future holds for Resolve beyond the International and the Breeders Crown on Oct. 27 and 28 at Hoosier Park. He is considering having Resolve continue to race while beginning his breeding career.

"All options are open," he said.

Although Enggren sold his farm five years ago, he retained four mares and intends to breed all of them to Resolve. When asked if he hopes to see Resolve's progeny race, he noted how long a process that is.

"That would be a dream," he said.

Twister Bi and Jerry Riordan

U.S.-born Riordan hoping to score with Italy's Twister Bi

Swedish-based American ex-pat trainer Jerry Riordan is hoping Twister Bi can be the first International Trot winner for Italy since 1977.

Italy has not fared well in the International Trot, producing one winner in the race's 38-year history when Delfo, driven by Sergio Breghenti, prevailed in 1977.

Trainer Jerry Riordan is rather outspoken in his optimism that Twister Bi (Varenne—Lorraine Bi) can end Italy's drought on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

Riordan said of the chances of toppling defending champion Resolve of the United States, "He's got home-field advantage, that's for sure. It's a big home-field advantage. He's in his paddock every day. His routine is the same as always. He's an exceptional horse. But I think on our best day we can beat him."

According to Riordan, Twister Bi is accustomed to shipping and handled the journey well.

"He's traveled, he knows his work," said Riordan, an expatriate from Rhode Island. "He's going to be really good, I think."

Although Resolve set the world record in last year's event, he is rated only slightly ahead in the morning line as the 3-1

favorite from post six. Twister Bi, from post four, is the second choice at 4-1. He is followed by another Italian starter, Oasis Bi, and Marion Marauder of Canada, both at 5-1.

Oasis Bi, from post two, placed second to Resolve last year. Marion Marauder, the rail horse, swept trotting's Triple Crown last year and showed the ability to handle the testing turns on Yonkers's half-mile oval in winning the Yonkers Trot.

Twister Bi has been extremely consistent this season, cracking the top three in 9 of 11 races with four victories in banking \$528,768 for owner Pasquale Ciccarelli. His wins include the Ulf Thoresen Grand International, the Oslo Grand Prix and the Prix De La Mayenne. He comes into the Yonkers International off a third-place finish on Sept. 9 in the UET Trotting Masters championship.

Although the 5-year-old was aggressive to a fault earlier in his career and still has some temperament issues, he boasts 20 victories in 49 lifetime starts and has earnings of \$708,328.

Riordan is confident his horse will adapt well to Yonkers. "I raced him one time on a half and he just flew around the turns," he said. "He's a lefty."

Christoffer Eriksson will drive.

Edge goes to Italy in International Trot

Saturday marks the third edition of the \$1,000,000 International Trot at Yonkers since returning from a 20-year hiatus, and the event is being lauded for attracting the deep caliber of horses that will be competing in the race.

Ten entrants are representing seven different countries, and the strongest contenders appear to be coming from Italy, Sweden and the United States.

In assessing the race from a handicapping perspective, we can learn from the most two recent Internationals. First is that the added distance of a quarter mile hasn't proven to be a difference maker one way or the other.

Conventional thinking might lead one to believe that the added distance plays into the hands of the foreign invaders since those horses are accustomed to racing at extended distances, but North American horses seem to hold up just as well whenever they are seldom asked to go beyond one mile. Standardbreds by their nature appear to adapt to changes in distance more easily than their thoroughbred counterparts.

As an example, In Secret (Deweycheatumnhowe—Secret Magic) won at one and a quarter miles in August in his very first start at the added distance, and did it from post 8 no less. His time of 2:26:1 was only one fifth of a second off the time of the International two years ago that included the French star Timoko.

If anything, many of the outsiders could find the American racing style and, in particular, the racing style at Yonkers, unforgiving. These horses are accustomed to large fields at long distances, but what they don't ever see is a track configuration that plays towards a combination of speed and an inside advantage as much as Yonkers does.

In France, Sweden, Norway – anywhere else around the world for that matter – racing on an outside tier isn't necessarily detrimental. Even prolonged first-over or

sweeping three and four-wide moves often result in winnable drives, but at Yonkers too much momentum and too much ground is lost while racing wide. The added distance of a quarter mile is supposed to help in these situations, but the style of racing here is still faster than it is elsewhere. You could make the race five miles and it still might not make a difference.

Just look at last year, as an example. The two horses that got away first and second ended up following each other around the track to finish that way, which isn't different from many other races we see on half-mile tracks. Two years ago, we saw brave efforts from a number of foreign horses each taking their shots from the outside. But in the end, it was the horse from Norway that sat the pocket, saved all the ground, and got up on in the inside to win.

With all of that said, how will this year's race shape up? Unlike the last two years that saw the front end do predictably well, this is a highly competitive field and the complexion of the race could take any number of unforeseen turns once the starting car lets them go.

Let's start with the defending champion, Resolve. Trained and driven by Ake Svanstedt, Resolve won this race last year in a record 2:23:4 on the front end. But recent form this time around is a bit suspect, having not raced since Sept. 8 when he never got close at 55 cents on the dollar in a Maple Leaf Trot elimination at Mohawk. He also starts further outside than he did last year (post 6 now and post 2 then), and don't forget that he couldn't reach the top in a mile and a quarter open handicap here in July. I've guessed wrong on him more than a couple times through the years and could very well be wrong again, but there are reasons to play against.

The other US entrant is the midsummer Ron Burke acquisition, In Secret. Purchased for \$140,000 from the Tattersalls Summer Mixed Sale at the Meadowlands in July, In Secret has earned \$125,000 in his first six starts for the new barn and in the process earned himself an invite into this race. Driver George Brennan has already made his

intentions clear that he'll be looking to put In Secret into play early, but it could be a long way to the top from the outside post with other expected leavers. Also, is this newly acquired gelding really this good, to go from a solid overnight horse to a literal world beater in such a short time?

The Canadian entrant Marion Marauder almost seems forgotten, having not won a race since the Hambletonian Maturity in June. The rail may force Zeron's hand early as to not get shuffled; I'd expect this one to offer a decent price should he be able to bounce back.

Sweden's On Track Piraten makes his third consecutive start in the International and seems due for some luck, although I don't know how he'll get from the second tier. This one made a big early move to the lead two years ago only to be rebuffed, and last year he had got late trot but had to come from an impossible spot. He's not out of the question if driver Johnny Takter can work out a trip.

Oasis Bi is one of two in the International from Italy and he was second in last year's edition to Resolve. He's battled some pretty good ones along the way in recent months and has the post edge on almost all of his main rivals; will offer a square price and figures to be prominent early.

Twister Bi is the second horse in here from Italy and unlike the previous one, he makes his first start stateside from Italy and should command a great deal of respect. Many will remember his Italian sire Varenne from one of the more memorable moments in Meadowlands history when he romped in the 2001 Breeders Crown. Aside from that, a look at his past performances show many of the best trotters in the world today including the legendary Bold Eagle from France.

Three races back Twister Bi was a close up third to Propulsion (who began his career in the US), in a mile that went an unheard of 1:49:2 at Jagersro in Sweden. He won the rich Group 1 Oslo Grand Prix in Norway over the summer and oozes of class; the one to beat in my opinion.



The new London Selected Yearling Sale will debut Saturday at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex at the Western Fair District in London, ON.

New London sale following Lexington's lead

The London Selected Yearling Sale, to be held Saturday and Sunday at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex at the Western Fair District in London, ON, is the result of the Forest City Yearling Sale and Standardbred Canada's Canadian Yearling Sale joining forces.

This weekend's inaugural London Selected Yearling Sale was born with some inspiration from the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Now the co-manager of the London sale is hoping to replicate the gangbuster results of the Lexington auction, as well.

"It was a phenomenal sale in Lexington and beyond expectations, as far as being able to top last year's statistics. It's exciting that there's such a strong market," said Ann Straatman, reached Wednesday at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex facility at the Western Fair District in London, ON while setting up for the London Selected Yearling Sale that will be held Saturday and Sunday (Oct. 14-15). Both sessions begin at noon.

The Lexington sale, which was formed in 2002 when the Kentucky Standardbred Sale and Tattersalls Yearling Sale came together, concluded last week with records for gross (\$36,410,000), average (\$58,537), median (\$42,000) and number of yearlings that sold for \$100,000 or more (103).

The London sale is the result of a similar partnership — this one between the Forest City Yearling Sale and Standardbred Canada's Canadian Yearling Sale.

Due to the end of the Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP) in 2013 and declining Ontario foal numbers in recent years because of it — numbers that are on the rise starting with

this year's yearling crop thanks, in part, to an annual government investment in the industry of nearly \$100 million — Straatman and others have been lobbying for years to have one major Ontario sale. She credits Standardbred Canada CEO Dan Gall, who took that position mid-way through 2016, for bringing the two sales companies together.

"We've had these discussions for years now and it was Dan Gall and his insight into bringing Ontario together at this time that we were able to put it all together this year. I give him a lot of credit in being instrumental in taking that leap forward," said Straatman, who will co-manage the new sale with Standardbred Canada's Heather Reid.

Though the two sales were competitors, of sorts, Straatman said that, so far, the two operations have found a way to work well with each other.

"Logistically, we separated our responsibilities into site management and sales management. Standardbred Canada and Forest City Yearling Sale managed the administration portion of the sales very similarly, so it was an easy transition to allow Standardbred Canada to be responsible for that portion and they allowed Forest City Yearling Sale to be responsible for the site preparation. That's been an easy, cooperative relationship," said Straatman, who is also the reproduction manager of Seelster Farms in Lucan ON, which will sell 49 yearlings at the sale and is one of the province's largest breeding operations, standing eight stallions.

Straatman said she thinks consignors and buyers will see a huge benefit from having just one major yearling sale in Ontario.

"I think it's one-stop shopping. The convenience is one big step forward," she said. "Being able to compare the horses all together under one roof, I think will give an advantage to the buyers. They won't be waiting to see what's coming at the next sale. They will see everything all together and be able to make their selections immediately that day."

Percy Bluechip, last year's sale topper at the Forest City Yearling Sale with a bid of \$110,000 from Dr. Ian Moore, has already returned \$261,989 in her freshman season.

The primary attraction at the London sale is Ontario-sired horses eligible to the lucrative Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program that will feature some \$13.25 million in purses in 2018.

Ontario-sired yearlings sold very well in Lexington where 97 went through the ring grossing \$4,544,000 total for an average of \$46,845. Progeny of Kadabra, who stands at Tara Hills Stud in Port Perry, ON, grossed the most of the Ontario sires with \$1,079,000 total for 19 sold, an average of \$56,789. First-crop sire Sunshine Beach from Seelster Farms had the highest average of \$84,667 for three yearlings sold.

"We are excited for the Sunshine Beaches," said Straatman, wearing her Seelster hat for a second. "They showed athleticism during their videos. I'm really impressed. They have a talent for rhythm, they are graceful. They really do look the part. We're hoping the next step forward for him is to be able to show it on the track next year with his two-year-old crop."

Straatman said she hopes that trend of Ontario-sired yearlings being popular in Lexington — particularly with Canadian buyers, of course — will continue in London.

"People are looking for Ontario-sired horses and recognizing the strength of the program here in Ontario and paying for those type of horses in order to be able to play in the Sires Stakes. It's very exciting for us," she said.

This year's crop of provincially-sired horses is not only up in numbers from last year, it's more diverse thanks to the introduction of some first-crop sires besides Sunshine Beach — E L Titan (\$79,833 average in Lexington for six sold), Royalty For Life (\$51,167, six sold) and Sunfire Blue Chip (none sold in Lexington).

That lineup is buoyed by offspring by veteran Ontario stallions such as Kadabra, Shadow Play, Sportswriter and

Mach Three.

"I think we have a great offering this year," Straatman said. "I think the strength of our catalogue has increased. We have a lot of the popular perennial sires this year, plus we've got some new crop sires that I'm very excited about as well."

Straatman said the only fair way to compare the results of the London sale with previous years is to combine the results of previous years, making this year's results harder to predict.

Last year, the Forest City Yearling Sale sold 132 yearlings for a total of \$3,480,000, an average of \$26,364. The average was the highest in at least 16 years and the gross was the highest since 2011, the year before the announcement was made that the government was cancelling the slots program. The Canadian Yearling Sale sold 144 horses in 2016 and recorded a gross of \$2,972,200 which was also its highest total since 2011 when double the number of horses were sold. The 2016 Canadian Yearling Sale average of \$20,640 was down some three per cent from the average of \$21,350 fetched in 2015.

Combining the results of last year's two sales shows 276 yearlings were sold for a total gross of \$6,452,200. The average was \$23,378.

Saturday's opening session of the London sale comes the same day as that evening's \$1.8 million OSS Super Finals at Mohawk. That was no accident. The sale and the Super Finals, which feature eight championship races going for \$225,000 apiece, are designed to showcase the Ontario breed, which has long been among the industry's best.

"We have equal quality (selling) on both days," Straatman said. "Our horses were alphabetized using their dams' names. The first 120 will sell on Saturday and the remainder will sell on Sunday. We chose a shorter day on Saturday to accommodate Super Final night at Mohawk. We want to make sure that everybody is able to get away by 4:00 or 4:30 in the afternoon to be able to attend that event that night."

Straatman said the Metroland Media Agri-Plex is a great facility to buy and sell horses.

"It has recently undergone a huge renovation and is state-of-the-art as far as selling horses and hosting events," Straatman said. "Regardless of the weather on the weekend, we'll be dry and toasty inside."

Stallions rising or falling?

An analysis of how the stallions fared at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

The numbers at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale just keep heading skyward: The sale was up 12.5 per cent in 2013, 10.6 per cent in 2014, 13.46 per cent in 2015, 11 per cent last year, and 12.9 per cent this year. Muscle Hill and Somebeachsomewhere continued to rule, but new players Father Patrick, Sweet Lou and Captaintreacherous also excelled. Did all that top-end attention hurt the other stallions? Let's see.

Muscle Hill and SBSW have been taking turns leading the sale over the last four years. It was the trotter's turn in 2017 with a \$115,857 average for 49 sold, up two per cent over last year when he sold 52 yearlings. His average is up 40 per cent since 2014. The sire of Ariana G and Manchego sold one each in the \$400,000 and \$300,000 range and 10, or 20 per cent, for at least \$100,000. Half of them topped \$50,000, while all but one beat \$25,000. A smaller offering of 12 colts and 11 fillies will sell at Harrisburg.

Somebeachsomewhere, who was front and center this year with sophomore standouts Downbytheseaside and Huntsville, actually saw his average drop 16 per cent while selling 10 fewer yearlings. Still, the 29 sold averaged \$103,448. He's up 17 per cent since 2015. Did the drop have anything to do with the introduction of his son Captaintreacherous and Sweet Lou? There will be 24 colts and 23 fillies by SBSW to choose from at Harrisburg.

New Jersey-based **Father Patrick**, who stood and raced in 2015, bred an abbreviated book that year, so he only brought 22 yearlings to Lexington. The 12 colts and 9 fillies that made it to the ring averaged a stellar \$82,048. A colt out of the former world record holder Designed To Be fetched \$330,000; five, or 24 per cent, sold for at least \$100,000; and 17, or 81 per cent, beat \$50,000. None sold for less than \$25,000. Next year's crop will be eligible to the more stable Pennsylvania program. Only eight by Father Patrick will sell in Harrisburg this year.

Sweet Lou, the only pacer to ever win his division at two and five, sold an initial offering of 27 for a \$76,778 average. This was almost \$6,300 higher than Captain T's average, but the latter sold almost twice as many. Lou sold one, a

half-sister to Rock N Roll Heaven and Clear Vision, for \$235,000; eight, or a healthy 30 per cent, topped \$100,000; and 18, or two-thirds, beat \$50,000. All but one brought at least \$25,000. Fourteen colts and 19 fillies will be available at the Harrisburg sale.

Captaintreacherous sent a sale-topping 52 yearlings to Lexington Selected — 29 more than his daddy showed up with. His \$70,481 average for a first-crop group that size was very good. There were no \$200,000 or \$300,000 sale busters, but nine colts and five fillies (27 per cent) brought at least \$100,000. His sire sold 41 per cent in that range. Thirty-three, or 63 per cent, cracked \$50,000. Again, that was 83 per cent for SBSW. Forty-three of the 52 topped \$25,000. Forty-five more are up for grabs in Harrisburg.

Chapter Seven, the sire of star-crossed Walner, Fourth Dimension, Swell Chap and Alarm Detector, saw his average rise by 18.6 per cent to \$65,083 on a dozen sold — half as many as last year. Three fillies beat \$100,000 while seven all told, or 78 per cent, topped \$50,000. All but one brought at least \$25,000. One colt was an RNA, so only three were sold. This crop consists of 49 registered foals, down from 71 last year. Chapter Seven, who stands in New York for \$7,500, is currently number one among 3-year-olds and second among 2-year-olds in the NYSS. Twenty-three will sell at Harrisburg.

Cantab Hall, the sire of first crop stallions Father Patrick and Uncle Peter, continued to be very consistent at the Lexington sale. His average dropped 5 per cent to \$64,167. A half-sister to Peter Haughton winner You Know You Do brought \$300,000, while a sister to Barn Doll brought \$200,000. Seven, or 17 per cent, sold for at least \$100,000, while almost half beat \$50,000. Muscle Hill keeps drawing off from Cantab Hall at Lexington. In 2015, the former's average topped Cantab's by \$28,000; this year he fell more than \$51,000 behind Muscle Hill. Nineteen colts and 24 fillies are slated to sell in Pennsylvania.

A Rocknroll Dance, the sire of Metro winner Lost In Time and KYSS champ Band Stand, saw his average jump 37 per cent as he sold 17 from his second crop for an average of \$57,706. There were six colts and 11 fillies. A three-quarter sister to Boston Red Rocks brought \$100,000. In total, two of them sold for \$100,000, five, or 30 per cent brought at least \$50,000, and 10 (59 per cent) topped \$25,000. ARNRD stood for \$5,000 in Pennsylvania in 2017. Ten more will sell at Harrisburg.

Hambletonian winner **Trixton** entered the fray with 38 from his first crop and they averaged \$54,395. Five, or 13 per cent, sold for at least \$100,000; 18, or 47 per cent, cracked \$50,000; and 27 of the 38 brought at least \$25,000. The first

son of Muscle Hill to bring a large crop to market, Trixton stands for \$12,000 in New Jersey. Twenty more will be available in Harrisburg.

Kadabra averaged \$56,789 for 19 sold. That was down 31 per cent from last year when he averaged better than \$82,000 at this sale. He's had an up and down ride in Lexington: Kadabra is down 16 per cent since 2014, but up 12 per cent since 2015. Three (16 per cent) cracked \$100,000, while seven beat \$50,000 and 93 per cent topped \$25,000. The sire of Kadabra Queen and Magic Presto stands in Ontario for \$16,000 U.S. He's on top of the OSS leader board and will be rid of number two Muscle Mass for the next couple of years. On the other hand, Archangel, E L Titan and Royalty For Life will join the rotation in 2018. Kadabra will sell a baker's dozen at Harrisburg.

American Ideal, the sire of Casual Cool, Funknwaffles and Hitman Hill, saw his average rise by four per cent to \$50,300 on the sale of 20 yearlings — a dozen fewer than last year. Crawford Farms paid \$150,000 for a colt, while their trainer Chris Oakes paid \$170,000 for another. Forty per cent topped \$50,000 and 80 per cent brought at least \$25,000. The very consistent son of Western Ideal is the leader among both two and three-year-olds in the New York Sires Stakes (NYSS) and is number three on the all-age pacing sire money list. He'll sell 20 colts and 17 fillies in Harrisburg.

Credit Winner was down 20 per cent from last year on 11 fewer sold. He averaged \$47,926. A full sister to To Dream On brought \$230,000 and a colt out of No Pain No Gain sold for \$110,000. Thirty per cent cracked \$50,000 while two-thirds beat \$25,000. The sire of the leading sophomore money winner, Devious Man, is third on the NYSS 2-year-old list and fourth among 3-year-olds. There are 34 in the Harrisburg catalogue.

After being up 24 per cent last year in Lexington, **Bettor's Delight** dropped 28 per cent on nine fewer sold. He sold 20 for a \$40,000 average. Last year's group was eligible to the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS), while these are Ontario-sired. PA champ Caviart Ally won the Jugette and a split of the Bluegrass. Bettors Up won the Fan Hanover and Simcoe, but there was no Betting Line in the ranks this year. Only one Bettor's Delight offspring topped \$100,000 at Lexington; six, or 30 per cent, beat \$50,000; and 11, or 55 per cent, topped \$25,000. Last year, there were three above \$100,000, 55 per cent beat \$50,000 and 80 per cent topped \$25,000. Bettor's Delight is second behind SBSW on the all-age pacer earnings list. Fifty more sell in Pennsylvania.

E L Titan (Muscle Hill), who is now standing in New York for \$6,000, but is selling Ontario crops this year and next,

averaged an eye-opening \$79,833 for a half-dozen sold. Jimmy Takter paid \$145,000 for a colt out of Christiana Hanover.

McArdle, who is doing well in the Ohio Sire Stakes, sold only two, a filly for \$13,000 and a colt for \$300,000. This is only the second time the son of Falcon Seelster has cracked \$100,000 with a yearling in a North American auction. A colt sold in Lexington for \$105,000 in 2007. This tops that sale by \$195,000. Can you say outlier?

Muscle Mass continues to impress, both on the track and at the sales. The paternal brother of Muscle Hill, who is back in Canada but selling this crop for the NYSS market, saw his average rise a stunning 55 per cent from last year. Only eight were offered — half as many as in 2016 — but they averaged \$72,125. He's up 62 per cent since 2014. Ten more sell at Harrisburg.

Muscle Mass's younger brother **Muscle Massive**, who won the Hambletonian and out-earned him by about a million dollars, averaged \$18,364 for 11 sold. His son Snowstorm Hanover was a surprise winner of the Kentucky Futurity. He'll sell 39 in Harrisburg.

Sportswriter sold eight more than he did in 2016 and his average dropped 33 per cent to \$36,706. The number one pacing stallion in the OSS going into the Super Finals is down 38 per cent in Lexington since 2014. Thirty-one more will be introduced at Harrisburg.

Shadow Play the sire of Kendall Seelster and Percy Bluechip, only sold six, after selling five in 2016. His average fell 43 per cent. Fifteen will sell in Pennsylvania.

Archangel, who has no 2-year-old crop since he raced in 2014, is number two on the NYSS sophomore money list, thanks to the likes of Guardian Angel AS, Top Flight Angel and Celebrity Ruth. He sold five Ontario breds for a \$51,600 average. Another small contingent of six colts appear in the Harrisburg catalogue.

Hambletonian winner **Royalty For Life** sold six from his first crop for a promising \$51,167 average. Another dozen will sell at Harrisburg.

Conway Hall sold nine for a \$41,889 average, which was down 33 per cent. The sire of Barn Bella, who is number three on the NYSS sophomore list, will sell a dozen at Harrisburg.

Donato Hanover, who sold 19 for a \$37,263 average, was down seven per cent. He's been very consistent in Lexington the past three years, right around \$40,000. He'll be offering 33 more in Pennsylvania.

Lexington buyers also had good things to say about new Ontario sire Royalty For Life.

Betterthancheddar dropped 16 per cent from last year, when he introduced his first crop in Lexington. That crop was New York eligible, where he's number four on the NYSS 2-year-old list, but this one is Ontario eligible. He sold eight last year and six this year (one was an RNA). Eight more are up for grabs in Harrisburg.

Western Terror, the sire of Agent Q, who sold 41 yearlings at a very soft \$15,146 average in Lexington in 2014, sold one colt for \$17,000 this year.

Well Said's average rose 20 per cent to \$29,333 on nine sold. He sold twice as many in 2016. The sire of Boogie Shuffle has no Control The Moment this year. Twenty-seven colts and 15 fillies will sell in Pennsylvania.

Roll With Joe only sold five, down from nine in 2016. He's down 44 per cent since 2015. Miso Fast generated interest, but Racing Hill is missed. Nineteen sell at Harrisburg.

Sunshine Beach, who will sell 15 at Harrisburg, got \$185,000 for one of his three colts.

Yankee Glide, who is offering 15 more in Pennsylvania, held his own, selling 20 for a \$29,500 average.

McNair and Henry battling to wire for Mohawk dash title

With only three cards left in the Mohawk summer meet, drivers Doug McNair and Trevor Henry are creating a buzz with their battle for the dash title. Last night they were prominent early and often.

McNair entered the night with a two-win lead over Henry with 148 wins to his rival's 146. The fun began in race two (see video replay) when Henry blasted off from the innermost post with two-year-old Mach Three gelding Dismissal Slip and he put anyone else who had designs on the early lead in a hole. After cutting a sharp opening quarter of :26.3, Henry got Dismissal Slip to come back to him and the leading duo stole a 30-second quarter, which put them at the half in :56.3. Not content with this slowing pace, McNair pulled his charge, D M Oreilly, out of third before the half and attacked the leader. That battle continued to the wire, with Henry prevailing with Dismissal Slip by a neck to cut the lead to one.

Race 4 featured Henry and McNair racing 1-2 throughout and turning for home well clear of the rest, but this time it was McNair capitalizing off a perfect pocket trip to drive by leading favorite Nips Beach Girl with 6-1 shot Docs Sausalito.

McNair — who also leads the overall WEG standings for the year with 233 wins to Louis Phillipe Roy's 216 wins has to be considered a strong contender for the Driver of the Year O'Brien Award at this point. He said winning the Mohawk meet would be a feather in his cap. "It would be pretty cool to win it," he said. "It's always nice to be up close in the standings, but to lead is even better."

McNair says there is no rivalry with Henry and he showed him respect with his comments. "Trevor shows up every day and races tough," he said. "So to be so close to him in standings is pretty neat."

McNair said driving good horses all summer is what put him in position to win. "I've been very fortunate to drive for a lot of top trainers all year so when your winning it really helps your confidence going into any race even with a long shot," he said. "There are so many good horses I've been lucky enough to sit behind, so if I win the meet or finish second, it's still been a really good summer."



Certainly it has been a great meet for both drivers with one highlight for McNair steering Dr J Hanover to a Canadian record mile of 1:46.4 and Henry coming close to stealing the Mohawk Gold Cup — only to fall a half-length short — with Nirvana Seelster, a six-year-old gelding that he steered to five wins at the meet, including a life's best score of 1:48 in September.

With only three cards left and McNair holding that two-win lead, it is going to be fun to watch how it plays out as these two aggressive teamsters settle the dash title on the track at Mohawk.

Huntsville has been retired from racing and will stand stud in New York in 2018.

Huntsville retired, will stand at Cameo Hills Farm

World Champion, 2016 Dan Patch award winner Huntsville 2,1:49; 3,1:47.4 \$1,704,242 (Somebeachsomewhere—Wild West Show) sustained an injury while training for the Tattersalls Pace and has been retired.

Huntsville was the 2-year-old pacing colt of the year in 2016 and paced to a world record mile of 1:49 at Red Mile while winning the International Stallion Stake. His 2-year-old campaign also included a track record performance at the Meadowlands, winning the Breeders Crown in 1:49.1, as well as wins in the Bluegrass and the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship Huntsville retires as the fastest 3-year-old of 2017, with a mark of 1:47.4 that he earned winning the Meadowlands Pace. He earned \$1,014,428 this year at 3 and was also victorious in the Cane Pace, Jenna's Beach Boy, and was the runner up in the North America Cup. He is the second richest son of the great Somebeachsomewhere, behind only Captaintreacherous.

In 25 lifetime starts he had 15 wins and 8 seconds, finishing off the board only one time in his career.

Huntsville will be syndicated and will stand stud at Cameo Hills Farm in Montgomery, NY.

His fee for the 2018 breeding season will be \$6,000, payable upon live foal.

"We are excited and look forward to this great champion coming to New York. He is a magnificent individual with an impeccable pedigree," said Steve Jones of Cameo Hills. Wild West Show has been a prolific broodmare, already producing Huntsville, Stevensville – 3,150.1f \$493,359; Cowboy Terrier – 1:50.1f \$448,480, and the very fast 2-year-old of 2017 – Wild Bill 2,1:52.3, from just five foals of racing age.

\$120,000 Courageous Lady set for Saturday at Northfield Park

The \$120,000 Courageous Lady has drawn an impressive field of eight and goes postward this Saturday (Oct. 14) as Northfield Park's 11th race. Approximate post time for this Grant Circuit event is 9:55 p.m. The race is an open contest for North America's top three-year-old-filly pacers.

The 2017 \$120,000 Courageous Lady Field:

#1 BOURBON AND BARLEY is trained on the Northfield Park backstretch by Kent Sherman. The Charley Barley filly is all-Buckeye and finished second in the Ohio Sires Stakes Final for Independence, OH owner Kenneth Kohut. This 8-1 morning-line contender will be driven by Ryan Stahl, who won the 2012 edition of the Courageous Lady. Bourbon And Barley has only one win in 20 career starts, but has amassed earnings of \$205,605. She has a 1:55.4 record paced in July of this year over the Flying Turns in a qualifier.

#2 AL-MAR-GOT A FEVER also has owners hailing from the Buckeye State. She is trained in southern Ohio by Steve Carter for the partnership of Grubbs, Kresheck, Whitacre and Rbr Racing. She has finished in the top three in 14 of 17 career starts, earning \$148,001 and a 1:52 lifetime mark at Hoosier Park. She enters this event off two consecutive victories and is undefeated since being introduced to the breathing medication Lasix. Chris Page has been named to drive this 9-2 third-favorite.

#3 ELLA CHRISTINA is trained by Nick Surick for the owning partnership of Surrick, Benson, Daggett and Vukovic. The 3-1 second-choice enters this race off a 1:50.2 lifetime mark at Lexington's Red Mile, where she lost by a neck in the \$88,250 Bluegrass two starts back. This daughter of Western Ideal has won six of 15 races this year and boasts lifetime earnings of \$164,638. Famed driver Tim Tetrick travels to Cleveland for the driving assignment.

#4 BIG CITY BETTY has five wins to her credit. She is trained by Steve Salerno, who co-owns this filly with Bruce Potter. The daughter of Bettor's Delight has earnings of \$124,437 and a 1:53.4 mark taken last year at Pocono Downs.

Big City Betty carries a 12-1 morning line and attracts Northfield Park leading driver Aaron Merriman. Merriman is the 2015 and 2016 National Dash Driving champion and is poised to three-peat that title this year.

#5 TERRORTINA is owned by Robert Key and trained by Norm Parker. She has five career victories, winning her most recent effort in a career best 1:53 at The Meadows. The daughter of Western Terror has bankrolled \$131,904. She is one of two fillies in this Courageous Lady field that competed in the second heat of this year's Jugette at the historic Delaware County Fairgrounds last month. Pennsylvanian Tony Hall has been given the driving assignment aboard this 6-1 morning-line contender.

#6 BETTOR'S UP is one of two Bettor's Delight fillies in this year's Courageous Lady. The Scott McEneny trainee has been named the 5-2 morning-line favorite by Northfield Park executive vice president of racing and simulcasting Dave Bianconi. She has 11 wins in 24 career efforts and is hoping to extend her three-race win streak. She has a 1:49.4 mark at Mohawk's 7/8-mile track and has earned \$552,129 for Canadian owners Bradley Grant, Teresa Davidson and Michelle McEneny. Brett Miller has been named to drive.


#7 ROSEMARY ROSE is one of two Buckeye-breds in this field and is one of two fillies in this race trained by harness racing's leading trainer, Ron Burke. The daughter of Foreclosure N is owned by the partnership of Burke Racing, Melillo and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. She has 10 wins in 23 races and carries a 1:52 mark over Northfield Park's half-mile oval. Mike Wilder accepts the driving assignment and hopes to add to her \$171,292 bankroll. She has drawn an outside post and carries a 10-1 morning line.

#8 PITTSTOP DANIKA is another trainee of the Burke Brigade. She goes to post from the 8-hole for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and M1 Stables. She has seven wins in 30 starts with earnings of \$139,076. This Yankee Cruiser filly has a 1:52 mark at Pocono Downs paced earlier this year. Ronnie Wrenn Jr. has been given the driving assignment on the 15-1 longshot. Wrenn is a top reinsman and won the nation's dash title in 2013 and 2014.

The undercard is also impressive, as it contains eight \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stake consolation races and Northfield's annual Pinktober Pace for Cure race of all female drivers to race money and awareness for breast cancer research. Collectively, in excess of \$575,000 in purses will be distributed throughout the night's 15-race program.
