Resolve Rules Yonkers International

Resolve's octogenarian owner Hans Enggren was positively delighted with his trotter's victory Saturday afternoon in the Yonkers International Trot.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt piloted Resolve to a 2:23.4 mile-and-a-quarter world record in the \$1 million Yonkers Invitational Trot Saturday afternoon.

Hans Enggren, 87, is relying on his second pacemaker after the first sustained him for 13 years. The second device, in its fourth year, was severely tested on Saturday (Oct. 15).

The octogenarian owner watched Resolve take command early and rule the \$1 million Yonkers Invitational Trot in a scorching world-record time of 2:23.4 for the mile-and-a-quarter over Yonkers Raceway's half-mile track.

Italian-bred Oasis Bi was a non-threatening runner-up. Flanagan Memory of Canada rallied to be third followed by On Track Piraten and Explosive de Vie, both from Sweden, in fourth and fifth, respectively.

If Enggren's pulse rate soared as he watched Resolve's pulsating effort, he was the picture of contentment when he was interviewed in the winner's circle on a perfect autumn afternoon.

He said of gaining the triumph long after many owners would have slipped quietly from the game, "means that I am extremely grateful for the trotting horse. I've been associated



with this since 1939 in one form or another."

Enggren recalled his rise from humble beginnings in his native Sweden, noting that he used to ride his bicycle to the track to sell tip sheets and programs. He said he has owned horses for the last 70 years and has bred them for almost half a century.

"I've had a wonderful ride with the horse," he said.

He first arrived in the United States in 1952 to work for the Swedish government. He came to stay in 1957 and now lives in Abbottstown, PA.

Enggren has long possessed a great mind for the racing business. He bred and owned Prakas, the 1985 Hambletonian champion. He spotted Resolve when he walked by the barn of trainer Roman Lopez while the horse was being bathed at the South Florida Training Center in November, 2013.

He could not take his eyes off the son of Muscle Hill out of the mare Anikawiesahalee. The two-year-old captivated him in every way. His eye — and his gut — told him he had to have him.

Negotiations dragged on for months. Enggren was relentless, unwilling to accept 'no' for an answer. Finally, he got the response he wanted.

"I ran like a son of a gun to the bank," he said.

The International marked Resolve's 15th victory in 50 career starts and pushed him beyond \$2 million in lifetime earnings. And he made it look easy as the even-money favorite, paying \$4.20 to win.

"He did everything himself. I was just a passenger," said Ake Svanstedt, his trainer and driver. "Once he got the lead, he was very comfortable."

Then Svanstedt, self-effacing and soft-spoken, made a big statement. "I think he can go faster if I drive faster. He was not tired and he came home fast. He's an amazing horse."

Oasis Bi had the early lead snatched from him by Resolve, who was unrelenting through fractions of :57.1, 1:26 and 1:54.4. Erik Adielsson, driving Oasis Bi, waited in vain for the leader to weaken.

"It felt good to be second," Adielsson said. "I was happy with the horse's performance."

Resolve, starting from post two in a field of 10, had his task made easier when Hannelore Hanover, bidding to become the ninth mare to win the International, broke stride shortly after the start. She had drawn the rail.

Hannelore Hanover was racing for the first time on a half-mile configuration. It showed.

"She didn't handle the turn as well as we had hoped," said Yannick Gingras, her driver. "She was good warming up."

Gingras saluted the winner in saying, "He's a great horse. He's much the best. Even if I had stayed trotting, he was the best horse on the racetrack."

With this eye-popping result, Enggren's phone is likely to ring even more. He said he has received numerous inquiries, including one extremely persistent caller, about the horse's availability for sale.

"I started to recognize the phone number. I say, 'If you're calling about Resolve, we can talk, but he's not for sale."

Enggren looks forward to seeing what Resolve can do for an encore in the Breeders Crown at the Meadowlands. He said future plans call for a return trip to compete in the Elitlopp after a second-place finish to the great Nuncio this year, a move being urged by Svanstedt.

"He does so many good things for me, I can't very well say no," said Enggren.

He praised Svanstedt for his role in continuing Resolve's development. "They work together so fantastic," he said. "I don't think I ever have another pair like that."

The International was first run in 1959 at now defunct Roosevelt Raceway. Tim Rooney, president and CEO of Yonkers Raceway, revived it last season after a 20-year absence.

Enggren expressed the hope that the International will grow until it can be compared to the most prestigious trotting races in the world. He reiterated his determination to reject any offers for Resolve that might be forthcoming, no matter how grand they might be.

"If I'm that lucky at my age," he said, "you can't sell something like that."

Bee A Magician (Brian Sears) returned to action - and form - with a victory over the boys in the \$250,000 Invitational Trot that kept her perfect on the year in four starts.

Bee A Magician, Wiggle It star on International undercard

Bee A Magician (Brian Sears, \$3.30), in her first purse try since late May at Yonkers, didn't disappoint Saturday, winning Yonkers Raceway's \$250,000 Invitational Trot.

Away third from post position two in the mile-and-a-quarter event, Bee a Magician saw a couple of ladies, polester Barn Doll (Jeff Gregory) and Allerage Star (Andy Miller), plus Homicide Hunter (Eric Goodell) all offer early foot.

After a :27.4 opening quarter-mile, and with Homicide Hunter finding a seat behind her, the fave was pointed forward. Bee a Magician made the lead before a :57.4 half, with second-tier Melady's Monet (Jason Bartlett) first-up from sixth.

That one engaged the leader through a soft 1:28 three-quarters (mile in 1:57), with Bee a Magician owned a length-and-a-half lead in and out of the final turn.

She held sway from there, repelling a stubborn "Melady" by three-quarters of a length in 2:25.1. Barn Doll was a pocket third, with Windofthenorth (Corey Callahan) and Lookslikeachipndale (Dan Dube) settling for the smaller envelopes.

For Bee a Magician, a six-year-old daughter of Kadabra—Beehive trained by Nifty Norman for co-owners

David McDuffee, Mel Hartman and Herb Liverman, she's now a perfect four-for-four this season and 45-for-69 in her brilliant career (just shy of \$4 million).

The exacta paid \$26.20, with the triple returned \$109.50.

"To have a horse ready to go the mile-and-a-quarter against a very good field after nearly five months is a credit to Nifty (Norman) and a credit to her," Sears said.

"I qualified her this past Tuesday (Meadowlands), and she was impressive. Today, she was back to her ornery self and it was good to see."

Wiggle It Jiggleit (Montrell Teague) made it look easy in the \$250,000 Invitational Pace.

In the \$250,000 Invitational Pace, the post position gods made it difficult for Wiggle It Jiggleit (Montrell Teague, \$2.80). The opposition did not.

Harness racing's richest horse of 2016 had it easier than expected Saturday afternoon. Everything, save for the draw, worked out splendidly.

First, there was an inside scratch, moving WIJI in one notch from behind the eight-ball.

Second, in a race packed with early foot, everyone else deferred. Wiggle It Jiggleit snapped off the wings, made an immediate lead and rendered the result a given.

WIJI found his way around pole-sitting Bit of a Legend N (Jordan Stratton), then negotiated his work day (:27.3, :55.4, 1:23.1, 1:50.2) with no issues whatsoever. So much for a shot at the Raceway's first ever sub-1:50 mile.

It was Keystone Velocity (Brian Sears), who figured to be in the early fray, trying it first-up, from fifth. That one never mounted a challenge as Wiggle It Jiggleit took a length-and-a-half lead into the lane.

The final margin over a chasing Bit of a Legend N was a length-and-three quarters, with Mel Mara (Corey Callahan) — another non-leaver — All Bets Off (Matt Kakaley) and Melmerby Beach (Dan Dube) settling for the minors.

For WIJI, a four-year-old Mr. Wiggles—Mozzi Hanover

gelding trained by Clyde Francis for co-owners George Teague Jr. and Teague Racing Partnership, it was his 15th win in 23 seasonal starts (\$1,624,337, career 38-for-50, over \$3.8 million).

The exacta paid \$8.20, the triple returned \$33.60 and the superfecta paid \$54.50.

"I was surprised as anyone to no one left out of there," Montrell Teague said. "He was on the bit and ready, so I let him go. It was a better trip than I could have ever imagined.

"Someone asked me going in what my strategy was, and I said I had idea, just see how the race unfolded."

It unfolded right in his lap.

As far as buying into the Breeders Crown, "Dad and I have talked about it, but we're not going to tip our hand, yet," Montrell said.



International Importance

Despite financial and logistical obstacles — mostly centered around attracting top-flight horses from France — Yonkers president and CEO Tim Rooney said the revival of the International Trot is important in promoting the track worldwide.

The \$1 million Yonkers International Trot is expected to be awash in red ink when the accounting for the race is completed, just as it was last year when it was restored after a 20-year absence. Tim Rooney, president and chief executive officer of Yonkers Raceway, acknowledged that, but he views those losses as the price to be paid to increase the track's global footprint.

"The big thing we're hoping for by having a race of this quality and the recognition it has world-wide, is it really gets harness racing, and Yonkers Raceway in particular, attention we wouldn't have if we didn't have this," Rooney said.

Rooney said the days of his youth, when fans poured into the half-mile track for major races, are long gone. He believes a powerful alternative is to tap into the far greater popularity of trotting overseas through simulcasting, and that a race such as the International can be a powerful tool toward accomplishing that.

"It opens up potentially a new market for us with simulcasting, which is working out very well in France and in the future I think is going to be in other places also," Rooney said.

France has developed into a good simulcasting partner for Yonkers. But the French were conspicuous in their absence when seven nations – Canada, Denmark, Finland, Italy, Norway, Sweden and the United States – were represented in the International on Saturday.

Although Timoko thrilled his large following by rallying for second last year, his connections opted to target other races for him after he returned from stallion duty. Steve Starr, the racing secretary at Yonkers, said attempts were made to attract at least half a dozen other trotters from France to no avail. The International would lack some of its luster if that were to continue.

Jamin of France, who created a great deal of publicity with his love of artichokes, won the inaugural running of the International in 1959 at old Roosevelt Raceway. The French have long played a major role in the event by winning 13 of the first 37 editions. That included a stretch of five in a row from 1981-85, with Ideal du Gazeau sweeping the first three before Lutin d'Isigny went back to back.

Rooney recognizes the importance of having France annually be part of the mix.

"France is very, very important and their participation in this has always been big," he said. "One of the big aspects of us bringing back the International in the first place was conversations and relationships we built with the French." Rooney noted that finding a slot that fits well in the United States and European schedules is complex.

"They want to participate in this very much. Sometimes it doesn't fit into their schedule," he said. "Somehow, we have to try to work that out better."

He is wary of scheduling the International beyond mid-October.

"Winter is coming and there is a dramatic difference between early October, mid-October and late October," he said. "It doesn't always happen, but we could have snow in November. It's hard enough promoting things without having to take on bad weather."

In addition to the absence of France, this year's field could not be said to comprise the best of the best. Nuncio of Sweden, a brilliant trotter known as the "dark dream," stayed home. Some of those who came arrived with suspect credentials compared to starters of yesteryear.

"It's a totally different world than it was back then," said John Campbell, the Hall of Fame driver. "There weren't nearly as many opportunities for money in Europe or here, so horses traveled more than they do now, so that is going to be an issue."

Campbell praised Yonkers Raceway officials for their willingness to do what was necessary to restore the International when it could have easily been forgotten for good.

"I think the fact that we're bringing horses together from different parts of the world is a positive thing," he said. "There is always an unknown, and from a betting standpoint, with the unknowns you have, it makes it more attractive for the bettor."

Starr emphasized that the effort to attract top European talent will be ongoing.

"We're working very closely with the Europeans. If we have to make adjustments, we definitely will," Starr said. "We can't do it without them. They are very important to this race."

Campbell warned against judging the International too harshly in the early stages of its revival.


"I think everything kind of runs in cycles," he said. "It didn't work out as well this year as maybe they would have liked."

Rooney doubts the International will ever generate a profit, given the considerable expenses associated with it.

"It's always been a question from a financial standpoint," he said. "The way we have to look at this, the race can never directly pay for itself."

When asked if Yonkers is committed to continuing the International, Rooney said, "Unless the costs get insurmountable, we surely are."







Report card on Yonkers International Trot

I wrote an article a few weeks ago for the *Thoroughbred Daily News* (click here to read). The tome focused on the sport of thoroughbred racing's continual wish for great horses that capture the imagination and interest of the public; horses such as American Pharoah, California Chrome and Zenyatta. The problem, of course, is the sport of thoroughbred racing doesn't have these horses to promote very often. Horses race infrequently, are retired early; the Zenyattas and Chromes are diamonds in the rough.

To combat the dearth of star power, the sport has tended to focus on big days and big events. I believe that's the only path forward for them, and it makes a lot of sense. Despite the fact harness racing has a lot of star horses, I'd submit event marketing is as important for this sport, as well.

Why? Beyond the obvious, I believe events matter for three reasons:

- 1. When your track creates and brands an event, the event can feed itself and break new ground with partnerships and new revenue streams. These experiments can be honed and expanded year after year, and the brand, and the event, can grow. Best practices are discovered, and long-term revenue rises
- 2. Politicians are watching. I have had more than one conversation with political types who saw a successful horse racing event in his or her town or city, where he/she beamed that their vote for slot money was a smart one. Slots in some states are a livelihood and harness racing depends on this money for survival. This always needs to be kept in mind.
- **3.** In the simulcast world, compelling events provide an opportunity to introduce, or reintroduce your racetrack to bettors. The "lifetime value" of a bettor who decides to play your venue again can result in thousands of dollars in revenue.

In the "big event" vein, how did Yonkers do with the

International Trot card yesterday? I'll share my opinion with a few letter grades.

Promotion - Grade "B+"

This is something harness racing is getting better at, and Yonkers is no exception. This week, I saw seeded articles and press releases that were used by local newspapers. Social media was talking about the event. Even some overseas fans had the buzz. I was pleasantly surprised.

TV Production, Race Presentation - Grade "A+"

I must admit, I have not watched Yonkers a lot the past while, so I don't have a lot to compare it to, but I thought the simulcast show was fabulous. I'm a sucker for a couple of fellas (or gals) chatting harness racing, and the Yonkers crew did not disappoint. It was fun and informative.

As for the presentation of the races, Yonkers, in my view, did the impossible. They added camera angles, a drone shot, and seamlessly made it all work. Traditional race-watchers often complain when the regular pan shot is messed with, but I don't know anyone who complained about how Yonkers spiced up the in-race coverage. In fact, most people I spoke with gave them praise. Well done, Yonkers!

The International Trot Itself - Grade "C"

There's no use sugar-coating it, the race was a dud. Half-mile track racing is difficult to make exciting oftentimes, but when Hannelore Hanover broke, the chalk made the lead, and the outside flow was stuck in a bog, the race simply couldn't deliver.


Attendance - Grade "B+"

Question: What's easier, getting people out to a harness track in the afternoon (when it's not Little Brown Jug or Hambletonian Day) or splitting an atom with a butter knife?

There is nothing more depressing as a fan of harness racing than seeing a couple million of purses on a card, great horses, great drivers, and a beautiful sunny day, where you can fire a cannonball down the tarmac and not hit a soul. Yonkers did fairly well today on the attendance front. There were people enjoying the day.

The Handle - Grade "A-"

You might look at the total handle and think I'm crazy for this grade, but hear me out. Yonkers didn't just distribute money and hope, they worked at it, and the result was a big improvement from their average daily handle.

With comingling from Europe, the win and show pools were tremendous.

\$82,000 was in the win pool for the International itself. For comparison, Woodbine Entertainment – a track(s) who generally has 400 per cent higher handle than Yonkers – did about \$50,000 in the win pool for their last big trot, the Canadian Trotting Classic. The win, place and show pools for the Trot were not that far off what (arguably) the world's greatest pacing race, the North America Cup achieved, and that race was in the evening, on national television in Canada.

Running trots during the day and attracting betting dollars is difficult. Yonkers, in my view, showed some imagination, and from a position of weakness, did well.

The Card - Grade "B"

No, this was not the quality of a Hambletonian card, but the International had a really cool field. Bee A Magician made her fall debut (a winning one), and yes, one of the most popular horses in harness racing the past 10 years – Wiggle It Jiggleit - made an appearance.

Overall, I didn't think I'd particularly enjoy wagering and watching the card. It's a lazy Saturday afternoon, I don't watch a lot of racing at Yonkers as a rule, and international racing doesn't really thrill me. I expected I might just watch

the International, and maybe Wiggle it on replay. But I tuned in early, and the more I watched, the more I liked.

Let's hope Yonkers learns something from putting on a card like this, improves it and draws more and more eyeballs and interest. Politicians are watching, and so are potential fans and bettors, both here and overseas.

Events are important for harness racing, and today's festivities, in my opinion, delivered.



Betting Line wins 14th straight; Filion Super three times

Betting Line (David Miller) overcame post 10 to win his \$250,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final Saturday at Mohawk. It was the sophomore pacing colt's 14th straight victory.

Betting Line won his 14th straight race and Sylvain Filion won three of the eight \$250,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Finals Saturday night (Oct. 15) at Mohawk Racetrack as the provincial program wrapped up its 2016 season with its year-end \$2 million championship event.

Overcoming post 10 in the Super Final for sophomore pacing colts, Betting Line was driven to victory by David Miller for trainer Casie Coleman, who owns the son of Bettor's Delight out of Heather's Western with fellow Ontarians Ross and Margaret Warriner, Christine Calhoun and Mac Nichol.

Gerries Sport was three-quarters-of-a-length behind in second, followed by Sintra.

The 1:49.3 Super Final victory improved Betting Line's seasonal record to 14-1-0 in 15 starts and upped his 2016 bankroll to the brink of \$1.5 million and his career earnings over \$1.9 million.

Betting Line paid \$2.40 to win.

Filion won his three Super Finals in succession when he won the two-year-old filly pace with **Yaris Bayama**, the three-year-old colt trot with **Warrawee Roo** and the sophomore filly trot with **Emoticon Hanover**, who upset heavy favorite Caprice Hill and Tim Tetrick.

One race after Filion's heavy favorite On A Sunny Day broke stride in the two-year-old filly trot won by Winter Sweet Frost and driver Doug McNair for trainer Paul Reid, Filion made up On A Sunny Day's miscue by scoring with Yaris Bayama in 1:53 at 9-1.

It was the fifth win in 10 rookies starts for the homebred

daughter of Sportswriter out of Lucky Josie owned by Filion's father's Bayama Farms of Saint-Andre-D'Argent, QC. The Stephane Larocque trainee now sports earnings of more than \$200,000.

Filion drove Warrawee Roo to a 1:53.4 victory for trainer Luc Blais and Serge Godin's Determination Stable of Montreal. It was the fifth victory in 14 starts this year for the son of Majestic Son—Karoon, who pushed his earnings over \$200,000.

Filion completed the natural Super Final hat trick when he drove Emoticon Hanover to victory for Blais and Determination. The daughter of Kadabra out of Emmylou Who defeated Caprice Hill by one-and-a-quarter lengths in 1:53.1 to improve to 7-2-2 in 13 starts this year and push her seasonal bankroll over \$400,000 and her career earnings past \$570,000.

Trainer, driver and part-owner Rick Zeron orchestrated the eight-and-three-quarter length whooping on behalf of his co-owners: James Walker of Port Perry, ON, Bruno Dipoce of Wasaga Beach, ON and Rene Allarge of Matamoras, PA.

The son of Muscle Mass out of All Time Favorite now sports a record of 5-1-1 in nine career starts, good for nearly \$250,000 in earnings.

L A Delight (Randy Waples) held off Bad As Leader at the wire to win the sophomore pacing filly Super Final and remain undefeated lifetime in Ontario Sires Stakes competition over two years.

L A Delight capped off her Ontario Sires Stakes career by remaining perfect in the provincial program over two years. The homebred daughter of Bettor's Delight out of West Of L A and driver Randy Waples held off a large surge by Bad As Leader to win the sophomore pacing filly test by a head in 1:50.3.

The victory improved L A Delight's record to 9-2-1 in 15 starts this year and was her 20th career victory in 27 starts. L A Delight is now over \$1 million lifetime and at nearly \$565,000 this year for trainer and co-owner Bob McIntosh of LaSalle, ON and his partners, Al McIntosh of Leamington, ON and the C S X Stable of Liberty Center, OH.

In the Super Final for rookie trotting fillies, **Winter Sweet** Frost defeated 72-1 longshot Gravitator and Rick Zeron by one-and-a-half lengths in 1:55.4 for owner/breeder Bob Key of Leechburg, PA. The daughter of Kadabra out of American Frost is now 3-3-1 in nine starts for trainer Paul Reid and has earned more than \$250.000 to date.

Indiana Sires Stakes champs crowned

The 2016 Indiana Sires Stakes season culminated Saturday night with eight \$220,000 Super Finals at Hoosier Park.

The top two and three-year-old trotters and pacers in the state of Indiana descended upon Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Saturday (Oct. 15) to battle it out in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Finals in front of a packed house on a beautiful, October evening.

As expected, the Super Finals delivered some spectacular harness racing battles and hard-earned divisional championships. With purses topping the \$2 million dollar mark, the 14-race card featured the top 10 competitors from each division and provided a fitting conclusion to the 2016 stakes season.

Two-Year-Old Trotting Fillies

The evening opened with the first \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for three-year-old trotting fillies and it was Fawn De Savage who turned in a dominant performance to score in 1:54.4.

Trainer, driver Dan Shetler sent Fawn De Savage away from the gate firing from post five and she grabbed command through the opening panel in :28.1. Fawn De Savage dictated middle fractions of :56.3 and 1:25.3 while Naughty III and John DeLong were content to sit in the pocket. Tyler Smith gave Ooh La La La the green light approaching the final turn and the filly ranged up to match strides with the leader. Just as the field turned for home it appeared that the stage was set for an epic stretch battle to the wire, however Ooh La La La made a costly break and took herself out of contention. Fawn De Savage took full advantage and coasted on to the wire to win by open lengths over Nothing But Nice and Sam Widger. You Me and Rosie and Darrell Wright rallied gamely in the stretch but had to settle for third place honors. Fawn De Savage returned \$6.00 to her backers at the betting windows.

"She had plenty of ability at two," Shetler said in the winner's circle. "But like most fillies, just needed to grow up and mature. I always knew she would be a nice filly we just had to take our time with her.

"I wanted to leave with her tonight without using her too hard. I knew if I could get her out of there and they left her alone, she would be strong. I had a lot of horse at the top of

the stretch but that other filly (Ooh La La La) is a nice filly too, when she made a break I knew we were home free."

With the win, Fawn De Savage recorded her eighth win of the season from 19 starts and 11th lifetime victory. Owned by Fawn De Mon Farms, the daughter of Keystone Savage—Ms Mastercraft has now amassed \$320,396 in lifetime purse earnings.

Two-Year-Old Pacing Fillies

The two-year-old pacing fillies were up next and it was Goose's Weedie and Sam Widger who pulled the first of many upsets on the evening in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final. Sent of at odds of 8-1, Goose's Weedie used the long Hoosier Park stretch to her advantage to get up in the final strides of the mile and stop the timer in 1:54.4.

John DeLong had Amazing Arya firing from the gate and she was the first to get a call through the opening panel in :27.2 before yielding the lead to Rockin Serena and Ronnie Wrenn Jr. Rockin Serena led the field through middle fractions of :56.1 and 1:25.1, but was soon joined on the outside by the heavy post-time favorite, Hah ChaCha and Trace Tetrick. While the damage was being done on the front, the rest of the field was winding up to take aim at the leaders. Brandon Bates had Rock Me Gorgeous well placed second-over but the biggest threat was still behind him.

Widger tipped Goose's Weedie past tiring cover and she responded to the find the wire a length in front of Rock Me Gorgeous. Sand Madeline and Brett Miller used a late surge to round out the trifecta. With the upset, Goose's Weedie returned \$18.20 to her backers at the betting window.

"This is a very special moment for me," trainer Mike Hollenback said after the win. "Being from Anderson and growing up around harness racing, this is as good as it gets for me.

"It really was an ideal trip for her. She's a small filly and

doesn't seem to like the front-end too much so it worked out for us. She's always been a nice filly and she showed it tonight."

Goose's Weedie notched just the second win of her career from 13 lifetime outings and established a new lifetime mark in the process. The homebred daughter of Dontgetinmyway—Nonstop To The Top has now earned \$141,650 in lifetime purse earnings for owner Charles Kline.

Two-Year-Old Trotting Colts

The upset trend continued in the very next race of the program, the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for two-year-old trotting colts and geldings, as Ultimate Encore and Ronnie Wrenn Jr. found the winner's circle at odds of 9-1. The Jeff Edwards trainee was a decisive winner, winning by four lengths, in a new lifetime best of 1:58.

After a costly break by the heavy favorite Jesse V behind the gate, the race was a wide open affair. Trace Tetrick sent Bumblebzbuzz to the front to dictate first half fractions of :28 and :57.2. Herbies Wild Child was content to sit in the pocket while Swan Chase and Rick Plano were next in line third. Plano gave his mount the green light and he was matching strides with the leader at the three-quarter clocking in 1:28.1.

Swan Chase was able to put away Bumblebzbuzz but he would have his work cut out for him as Ultimate Encore was looming large in the background. Wrenn Jr. was well placed second and when he asked his mount for more, Ultimate Encore responded with a :29.2 final quarter to trot past his rivals well in hand at the wire. Swan Chase held on for second while Dream of Elegance and Dale Hiteman rallied nicely for third. With the upset, Ultimate Encore returned \$20.00 at the betting windows.

"I've never driven the horse before and didn't get a chance to talk to Jeff (Edwards) before the race," Wrenn Jr. said after the victory. "I looked at the program and knew I wanted to get a trip with him especially since the front end hasn't been holding up tonight. I was able to fall in line and come second-over and the colt responded. He really raced strong tonight, he's a very nice colt."

Owned by D L Dennis, Dolne Farm Services, and J. Johannsen, Ultimate Encore has now won two of his 14 lifetime outings. With the victory, the gelded son of Encore Encore—Southwind Ultima has now amassed \$145,400 in lifetime earnings.

Three-Year-Old Pacing Fillies

Just when it seemed an upset trend was forming, Seventimesavirgin proved her divisional dominance yet again with a 1:50.3 victory as the 2-5 favorite in the

\$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final for three-year-old pacing fillies. With the win, Seventimesavirgin notched her ninth straight Hoosier Park victory but more impressively, made a clean sweep of the stakes action to remain undefeated in Indiana Sires Stakes this season.

Leaving from post three, Seventimesavirgin powered away from the gate to reach the first quarter in :27.3 while the rest of the field sorted out early position. Todd Warren gave Can't Touch This the green light and she grabbed the lead just before the half :55.3. Can't Touch This went uncontested through three-quarter clocking in 1:23.2 while DeLong waited patiently in the pocket.

Using a :26.4 final panel, Seventimesavirgin took the passing lane and paced away from the rest of the field to win by three lengths. Rockin Rum Springa and Ricky Macomber Jr. made up substantial ground late in the lane to finish second while Can't Touch This held on for third. As the heavy betting favorite, Seventimesavirgin returned \$2.80 to her backers.

"We needed a trip this week," said DeLong, who also handles the training duties of the filly and was surrounded by family and friends in the winner's circle. "She's raced hard all year, she shows up every week and I couldn't have asked for the trip to work out any better for us tonight.

"This is a special one for us. My mom is a cancer survivor

and to have her here with us to enjoy this moment means the world to me. This is definitely a family affair."

The homebred daughter of Always A Virgin—Mrs Grant Seven notched her 12th win from 13 seasonal outings. Owned by Jesse J DeLong, Seventimesavirgin has now bankrolled \$426,140 in lifetime purse earnings for her connections while winning 17 of 25 lifetime starts.

Two-Year-Old Trotting Fillies

Satin Dancer and Ronnie Wrenn Jr. followed suit to deliver as the 6-5 post time favorite in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for two-year-old trotting fillies. Scoring in gate to wire fashion, Satin Dancer scored in 1:59.1 and extended her win streak to four in the process.

Wrenn Jr. wasted no time as he sent Satin Dancer away from the gate from post two and she quickly grabbed the lead through the opening panel in :27.4. She went unchallenged through middle fractions of :57.3 and 1:27.4 before ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field. Intothelight and Rick Plano were the first to take aim at the leader approaching the final turn but Satin Dancer was strong on the lead. Jessi Lind and Rick Farrington were closing in quickly on the outside but Satin Dancer dug in gamely to win by a neck. Jessi Lind finished second while Hoosier Wiggles and John DeLong finished third. As the heavy betting favorite, Satin Dancer returned \$4.60 for the

win.

"Anytime you have a two-year-old, you have to be nervous," trainer Byron Hooley said in the winner's circle. "She's been a nice filly all year, a fun filly to have in the barn. Ronnie (Wrenn Jr.) just started driving her a few starts ago; he's done a really great job with her. He gets along really well with her and said she's like a Cadillac to drive."

Owned by Summit Pacing Acres LLC, Satin Dancer recorded her eighth win from 15 lifetime outings. The daughter of Big Stick Lindy—Shaken Not Stirred now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$227,933.

Three-Year-Old Trotting Colts

Born To Thrive and driver, trainer Rick Plano pulled off the biggest surprise of the evening, prevailing at odds of 15-1 in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final for three-year-old trotting colts and geldings. Stopping the timer in 1:54.4, Born To Thrive staged a big rally late in the lane to get up in the final strides of the mile and establish a new lifetime mark in the process.

John DeLong had the 1-5 post time favorite, Bridge To Jesse's on the front and he led the field through fractions of :27.1, :56.1 and 1:25.3. Fly Jesse Fly and Trace Tetrick were on the attack first-over and at the top of the stretch was matching strides with Bridge To Jesse's. Fly Jesse Fly was able to put a nose in front but the taxing mile was beginning to take its toll. Just as the top pair started to fade, Plano tipped Born To Thrive to the outside and he kicked into high gear to surge past his rivals. Fly Jesse Fly held on for second while Topville Avatar and Dale Hiteman closed well for third-place.

"It's hard to be confident with the caliber of horses we were racing against in here tonight but this is a nice colt," driver, trainer Rick Plano said. "I just bought him a few weeks ago, I made a few changes and he's really responded well to everything I've done. He's a nice colt that I think is only getting started."

With the win, Born To Thrive has now won five of 28 lifetime outings and third win of the season. Owned by J.A. Campagnuolo, V.A. Contento, and M. Plano, the gelded son of Swan For All—Soxy Kosmos has now earned \$141,933 in lifetime purse earnings.

Two-Year-Old Trotting Colts

On The Virg and Brett Miller turned in a near gate-to-wire performance to take home top honors in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final for two-year-old pacing colts and geldings. With a final time of 1:52.4, the Jim Dailey trainee dug in gamely to hold off his rivals late in the lane to score his sixth win of the season.

Dave and Dennis and Tyler Smith left with the wings of the

gate to grab the early lead through the opening panel in :28.1 before yielding the lead to On The Virg just before the half. On The Virg dictated the tempo of :57 and 1:25 before Trace Tetrick had the post time favorite Rock N Tony applying pressure to the outside first-over. As the field turned for home, Rock N Tony made a solid bid for the lead but On The Virg found another gear and drew away to win by two lengths.

"Leaving the gate I could tell not a whole lot of people were leaving," Miller said after the race. "With the soft fractions I knew I had to make my move and when I saw the half mile time pop up, I had a lot of confidence in my colt.

"The wind has died down and when we turned for home I was just hoping my colt could out sprint them. He did. He's a very nice colt and paced strong all the way to the wire."

Owned by R.M. Lombardo, H.A.Taylor, D.C. Kryway, and E.C. Goodell, On The Virg recorded his sixth win from eleven seasonal outings. With the win, the gelded son of Always A Virgin—Modern Bobbi now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$195,250.

Three-Year-Old Pacing Colts

Brett Miller would find the winner's circle once more, this time with Uncmprmising Z Tam in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings. Using the same front-running tactics, Uncmprmising Z Tam held off all charges to score in a new lifetime best of 1:50.2.

Leaving from post five, Miller wasted no time as he sent the Wilbur Eash trainee to the front. Uncmprmising Z Tam led the field through fractions of :27, :55.1, and 1:22.3 before ever feeling a threat.

Bourbon Chase and Dan Shetler were the first to commit to the outer flow but by the time the field rounded the final turn, Umcmprmising Z Tam's lead was ever-increasing. Using a :27.4 final panel, Uncmprmising Z Tam held off a late charge from Ricky Macomber Jr. and Downthehighwy to win by three lengths. Matrix of Luck and Trace Tetrick rallied from way back to round out the trifecta. As the 9-5 favorite, Uncmprmising Z Tam returned \$5.80 for the win.

With the win, Uncmprmising Z Tam notched his fourth win from 17 seasonal outings and seventh win from 26 lifetime starts. Owned by the Z Tam Stables LLC, the gelded son of Shadyshark Hanover—Cosmic Grace has now amassed \$231,288 for his connections.

From Star Pointer to Always B Miki

The progression of pacing speed

When Always B Miki thrilled the Kentucky Futurity Day crowd at Lexington with his 1:46 win last weekend, he

became only the second first pacer in over a century to set the absolute standardbred speed record in a race.

Other pacers had set speed records in time trials and some records had been equaled in races, but for the first time in 50 years a pacer became the fastest horse ever by virtue of a race, not a time trial. The only previous horse to accomplish this was Bret Hanover in 1966.

Miki's thrilling achievement wasn't the only momentous achievement on that perfect day in the Bluegrass as Marion Marauder, a horse with a nose for the finish line, wrapped up the Triple Crown for trotters.

The path from the first 2:00 mile to 1:46 took 119 years and covers some of the most famous harness horses ever to wear hobbles — and a few that didn't wear hobbles.

One of the favorite topics on the hot stove circuit in the late 1800s was whether a gaited horse was capable of covering a mile in two minutes time. Could a horse possibly pull a sulky at a speed of 30 miles per hour? (A century ago, the "hot stove circuit" was a popular term for when

horsemen would gather in chilly weather to debate the merits of horses and drivers.)

The horse that answered this question affirmatively was a rugged, fast, and unsound steed named Star Pointer. On Aug. 27, 1897, he ventured onto the now long-forgotten track at Readville, MA (suburban Boston) for the fin-de-siècle version of Mission Impossible: he was going to attempt to loop the mile track in less than two minutes time.

He paced into the history books with a 1:59-1/4 miracle to finally answer the question if a gaited horse could cover a mile in less than two minutes.

Star Pointer gave brief popularity to the old Tennessee Hal pacing line, but soon a wonder horse from the Hoosier State would soar to national prominence.

Dan Patch was foaled the year before Star Pointer paced the first 2:00 and Dan would take pacing speed into new

territory, but not without considerable controversy and criticism.

Dan Patch didn't race until he was a four-year-old in 1900 and proved to be a marvel, losing only twice in 56 heats. His best winning time was 2:03-3/4. That was fast enough in 1902 that he simply paced himself out of competition and embarked on a career as an exhibition horse.

Dan Patch toured the countryside and performed at county and state fairs simply to demonstrate his speed. His time trials were unlike those that later became so popular in the 20th century. Dan paced behind a thoroughbred whose sulky was equipped with a

canvas windscreen to allow Dan Patch to trail close and never take any air.

Many horsemen decried the method, but Dan Patch paced a mile in 1:55-1/4 in this fashion before the method was outlawed. That didn't bother owner Marion Savage as he continued to exhibit Dan with a thoroughbred and windshield and Dan paced a mile in 1:55 after the method was declared illegal. That didn't bother Savage and he

advertised Dan Patch as the "1:55 Pacer." That record was, however, never officially recognized.

Criticism of Dan Patch grew so loud that Savage took the bait offered by those who questioned how fast Dan could pace "in the open." Dan answered the question by pacing in 1:58 at Memphis. That 1:58 mile is perhaps the best and fairest basis on which to compare Dan Patch's speed to subsequent time trials.

When Dan Patch retired, he was heralded as the "greatest public entertainer of all light harness horses."

Harness historian John Hervey, who was familiar with every step of Dan Patch's career, called him "among the greatest of all time." But certainly not the greatest.

Dan Patch's 1:58 mile in the open lasted a decade until it was shattered by a beautiful and blazingly-fast free-legged chestnut pacer named Directum I. He looped the New York State Fair in 1916 in 1:56-3/4. (He had previously tied Dan Patch's time mark of 1:58 in a race at Columbus, OH.)

Directum I was billed as "the pacer with running-horse speed" and in 1916 he paced an official half-mile in :55-3/4, which was drag-racing speed in the World War I era.

In 1938, Billy Direct, foaled in Tennessee, was entered in a free-for-all pace at Lexington. When the small field reached the starting line, the starter yelled "Go!" and then also rang the recall bell.

Several horses paced into the first turn and raced on while others pulled up after hearing the recall bell. Confusion reigned.

Billy Direct was one of those horses that pulled up, and trainer/driver Vic Fleming asked the judges for permission to time trial his horse since he'd lost the chance to race for money.

Fleming brought Billy Direct back to the track later and the stocky horse paced a 1:55 mile, establishing a new speed standard.

(Controversy surrounded that record, however, as many people claimed that Billy Direct was "hopped" with a stimulant before the time trial. Others deny that. We will certainly never know. That isn't the only thing we'll never know about Billy Direct as I was once told that a prominent horseman said that Billy Direct raced as a two-year-old in 1936 when he was actually older. The Billy Direct saga is indeed intriguing.)

It wasn't until 1955 that a pacer could match Billy's Direct's speed and that came when the incredibly-fast Adios Harry equaled the mark at Vernon Downs. Harry's mile came at night in a race over a track smaller than one-mile. In that era, harness racing was truly wild about Harry.

Four years later, Adios Butler, another son of Adios, took standardbred speed into new territory with a 1:54.3 time trial at Lexington.

Bret Hanover completed the Adios Triumvirate of Champions when he won in 1:54 at night in the summer of 1966 over the Vernon Downs track. But his trainer Frank Ervin felt Bret had more in the gas tank and came back later in 1966 to lower the bar to 1:53.3 at Lexington.

In 1970, a blood bay sophomore colt named Steady Star startled standardbred aficionados when he stopped the timer at 1:54 in a Lexington time trial. He was certainly not the best three-year-old of that season. That honor belonged to Most Happy Fella and Columbia George, but Steady Star had gone a full second faster than Most Happy Fella's time trial and two seconds faster than Columbia George raced.

That mile spawned a plan to bring Steady Star back to The

Red Mile the following fall to see if he could do better. Indeed he did. With driver Joe O'Brien hunching down behind the horse's hind quarters to lessen wind resistance down the backstretch, Steady Star paced in an astonishing 1:52.

I was with a group of horsemen who went to the backstretch afterwards to measure Steady Star's stride and I believe that it was 22 feet and eight inches.

That mark stood inviolate until the majestic Niatross, he with the sweeping stride and speed to spare, stunned the harness racing world with a 1:49.1 time trial at Lexington in 1980. The numbers on the timer were improbable, but accurate.

It seemed certain then that this record was inviolable and would have a long stay as the ultimate in standardbred speed. But in 1988, a sophomore pacer that was ineligible to the Jug shipped to Lexington and stunned a small group of onlookers with a 1:48.2 time trial.

His name was Matt's Scooter and he had a flying, picturesque gait that perhaps derived from the numerous trotting titans in his pedigree.

Five years later, that 1:48.2 mark was matched in a race by Staying Together, a gelding trained by Bob McIntosh, one of our greatest contemporary horsemen. In June of 1993, the gelding humbled a group of free-for-allers at the Big M, winning for driver Bill O'Donnell in 1:48.2 in a pacesetting

performance.

Two months later, Cambest, the horse that finished third behind Staying Together in that 1:48.2 mile, ventured to the Illinois State Fair, long considered by horsemen as the fastest piece of dirt in the sport. In a time trial there — also with Bill O'Donnell driving — Cambest whacked out an eye-popping 1:46.1 mile.

Onlookers were stunned. The applause was long and loud.

But there was a fly in the ointment. The electric timer did not function. USTA rules stipulate that a time trial performance is invalid if not electronically timed. No exceptions (then or now).

Many people thought that the USTA would invalidate the performance. A brief controversy ensued, but the USTA approved the time based on hand timing of the mile from a videotape.

Cambest's mile stood as the pinnacle of standardbred speed until Always B Miki crossed the wire last weekend at Lexington.

He gave all the stars of the future a new target.



Gural further speaks out on casino issue

Meadowlands Racetrack owner Jeff Gural has some more interesting comments in John Brennan's recent Meadowlands Matters blog on northjersey.com.

The entire piece is well worth reading, but the highlights from Gural's comments include:

"The state (of New Jersey) correctly wanted to get out of owning racetracks," Gural said. "No state should be running racetracks. I got involved because I thought it would be important to save horse racing. But I would not have done it if I did not think we would have a casino. I still think there's going to be a casino there, eventually."

Gural said that he offered to pay 55 per cent tax on slots revenues at a Meadowlands casino, as the Pennsylvania casinos do. He projected that would raise \$500 million in casino tax revenue for the state – more than twice as much as the Atlantic City casinos pay combined. "How could you turn that down?" he asked.

The conversion of Gural's Tioga Downs racetrack in upstate New York into a full-fledged casino will produce \$50 million in taxes to the state, or more than many Atlantic City casinos pay, he noted. That's in Nichols, New York, "population 3,000," he added. Gural said "some genius" in politics decided it's better to keep a monopoly in Atlantic City. "You can't make this up," he said.

Then there is what Gural called "the biggest joke of all" – the fact that Caesars Entertainment officials have opposed construction of a Meadowlands casino 125 miles from Atlantic City on the premise that it hurts the latter, yet the same company opened a Harrah's in Pennsylvania just 70 miles away. He noted that in a recent year, the three Caesars casinos in Atlantic City paid \$85 million in taxes on \$908 million in revenue, while the Pa. property paid \$125 million in taxes on \$287 million in revenue (to be fair, AC casinos employ more people because they have so many more amenities). A new wrinkle was Gural making a link to Caesars making enough money on a low NJ tax rate to fund the building of a new casino in Pennsylvania that hurts Atlantic City's bottom line.

Gural, after predicting a Phil Murphy election as Governor in New Jersey next year, said he's sure there will be a Meadowlands casino soon enough because upon landing in office, Murphy will see a big funding shortfall and a need for a major new source of revenue.

Shares still available in fractional group LandMark 10

The 10th edition of the fractional ownership group LandMark Racing Stable still has shares available at \$2,000 apiece.

"LandMark is unique from other 'fractional' groups in that money is retained to pay all expenses for the first year — training, vet and stake payments — so no monthly bills," said LandMark principal Howard Pearce of Kingston, ON. "Two-year-old earnings are used to pay three-year-old expenses and only if there are not sufficient earnings would shareholders be asked to contribute more funds. LandMark is an excellent way to experience the thrill of race horse ownership for a modest investment with little or no risk."

The group operates within the stable of trainer Mark Steacy, the top trainer in the Ontario Sires Stakes program for 2016.

"LandMark Stable is committed to buying only Ontario sired yearlings to support Ontario breeders and to take advantage of the new \$2 million Owners Bonus Program," said Pearce who indicated LandMark 10 has already purchased 50 per cent of three Ontario Sired yearlings — two at the Canadian Yearling Sale and one at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

To date, 53 people have purchased 102 shares and Pearce said the group will continue to accept shares right up to the Harrisburg sale.

"New shareholders would instantly own those three yearlings plus any more that we purchase," he said.

Road to insanity leads to dwindling harness fan base

To say harness racing needs to get creative and break away from the same old and tired ways of doing business is an understatement. It's past the time for an effective marketing plan with an emphasis on growing a depleted fan base. Albert Einstein gets the credit for the definition of insanity, although I'm not certain he is the one who said it first. But as the story goes Einstein's accurate definition of insanity is... Doing the same thing over and over again and expecting a different result. Well in many ways that saying applies to the road harness racing has taken as generation after generation of potential fans are lost.

It shouldn't be difficult to understand when popularity wanes and the fan base shrinks different ideas are needed. In the real world, often when things go south they stay in a death spiral for a long time. In some cases there isn't a bounce or a recovery. If harness racing doesn't bounce with an injection of new fans it very well could disappear someday. Unfortunately it appears many don't see the urgency for change and a need for a new direction.

Anthony MacDonald who has been in the harness racing business in Canada for the past 25 years, wrote a great blog about an observation he made on a visit to Keeneland this past weekend. I will provide the link at the end of my article and the blog is well worth reading. MacDonald picks up on the fact there isn't a concerted effort to schedule prime racing in an effective way to attract the most attention. Harness racing is not in a position to bump heads with thoroughbred racing, college football or anything else that would stop or inhibit new, younger fans from seeing a great show. That should be obvious, but what happened last weekend in Kentucky was another missed opportunity to grow a shrinking fan base.

Harness racing in the U.S. has been around since the 1800's. That said, there is no one race that garners enough interest

to be considered a destination trip or a must see. There's nothing close to a Triple Crown race, even the Hambletonian falls way short. Maybe the only race that is steeped in tradition and would be considered sort of a destination event is the Little Brown Jug. What should be noted is the Jug happens in the afternoon on the third Thursday following Labor Day, and doesn't have to fight for attention.

McDonald correctly pointed out, scheduling Grand Circuit racing at Red Mile during the day on a Saturday of the opening weekend of Keeneland makes little sense. There is no doubt Keeneland packs fans in and the opening weekend is considered by many as a destination event. Why not take advantage of the many racing fans that traveled to Kentucky and schedule Red Mile races at night? Instead prime Grand Circuit racing was scheduled during the day and had to compete with the Keeneland card and a University of Kentucky football game.

Growing a fan base requires an effective marketing plan, which is not necessarily steeped in tradition. The plan shouldn't stay the same when it repeatedly fails to work. When 20-something adults aren't interested in harness racing, if they have children someday they too most likely won't have any interest. The lack of interest keeps snowballing generation after generation, and popularity will fade for decades. That should sound familiar to anyone who has seen the decline in the harness racing fan base over the last 30 years.

When doom and gloom abounds apathy is so thick it can be cut with a knife, then marketing programs fall by the wayside and money isn't spent on promotion. As time goes on it's just business as usual, as those who are making good money don't need to stick their nose into "fixing" the sport. They are content, and those in a position to change the direction either don't know enough, don't have enough energy, or are also content. Maybe some of the reason the bar is set so low and things don't improve is because those that could help plot a corrective course don't want to share in the blame.

The point I'm making and the issue MacDonald correctly identified is the same. The future of harness racing lies with young adults who need to be exposed to the thrills of watching, betting on and owning standardbreds. It's essential for harness racing to have an effective plan and a coordinated effort to grow the sport. In reality there's a need for a new course, and also for those who want change to criticize what is backwards and should be fixed.

When MacDonald found fault with the sport he loves, it was thought of as being sacrilegious and he was then criticized. In reality MacDonald was trying to fix harness racing because he's afraid it may not be around long enough for his kids to enjoy.
