Betting Line scratched from Breeders Crown

Trainer Casie Coleman said a vet suspects the sophomore pacing colt was bitten by a spider that caused an infection and puss pocket.

Betting Line (David Miller) was expected to be the favorite in his Breeders Crown division until being forced to scratch Saturday night due to a suspected spider bite.

Trainer Casie Coleman believes a spider bite — perhaps from a Brown Recluse Spider — is what led Betting Line to be scratched from the Breeders Crown due to injury.

The three-year-old pacing colt, who has won 14 straight races, was completely normal when fed early Saturday





morning in detention at the Meadowlands. A few hours later, the colt had trouble walking and a puss pocket had formed.

Coleman originally thought Betting Line injured himself in his stall, but Saturday night, after scratching out of the Crown, her vet discovered what looked like a serious bug bite on Betting Line's left front shoulder. A test confirmed a poisonous bite of some kind and a serious infection, which is believed to have caused the puss pocket that led to the lameness.

"The vet had a similar one last week in Jersey and in 48 hours the horse was okay," Coleman said via text message, adding friends in the business have been telling her about horses that have been bitten by Brown Recluse Spiders in the region. "This sucks like hell, but the horse should be okay. There is nothing broken."

Betting Line is being treated for the infection and Coleman said an ultrasound will be performed today to find the puss pocket to treat that, too, in hopes of being able to race the horse at Dover Downs in a few weeks before the pacer goes off to stud duty at Hanover Shoe Farms.

The son of Bettor's Delight out of Heather's Western has won 14 of 15 races this year and \$1.46 million in 2016. He

has earned \$1.879 million lifetime for Coleman and Ross and Margaret Warriner's West Wins Stable, Christine Calhoun and Mac Nichol.

Breeders Crown (3yocp)

Check Six and Western Fame resolute in victory

Pace made the race in the first \$25,000 Breeders Crow elimination event for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings, as Check Six (\$12.40) had plenty left after rating a :56.2 first half-mile to parry a trio of late challengers Saturday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands.

It was the ninth win in 19 starts this year for the son of Somebeachsomewhere out of Southwind Vanna trained by Ron Burke for the Burke Racing Stable, the Weaver Bruscemi partnership, William Switala, and James Martin. Check Six, a \$30,000 yearling from the 2014 Harrisburg sale, eclipsed \$800,000 this year with the victory and is now over \$915,000 lifetime.

Check Six (Yannick Gingras) won the early duel with Dr J Hanover (Scott Zeron), but was relatively untaxed through a :28.1 first quarter-mile and under no pressure at all through a :56.2 half. The pressure came with just over a quarter-mile remaining, as Lyons Snyder (Brian Sears) offered a sustained yet mild challenge after he was flushed first-over.

Despite that threat and the presence of Adios and Messenger winner Racing Hill (Brett Miller) fanning off cover as well as Dr J Hanover chasing at the pegs from a cozy pocket trip, Check Six was determined to hold sway, prevailing by one-and-a-quarter lengths in 1:50.3 for his 13th career win.

Lyons Snyder was the runner-up over Dr J Hanover, while Racing Hill could only stay even with the top flight to take fourth. Fine Diamond (Matt Kakaley), while four-and-a-half lengths detached from the top quartet, rounded out the top five finishers.

"I don't know if he's an overachiever, but he did make a lot of money this year," said Gingras. "There's a couple of tough horses (in the division), and he's right below the top ones, but he puts in a performance like this. Yeah, I think he can go with most of them."

Western Fame goes gate-to-wire

Taking the lead early and cutting all of the fractions, Western Fame, with Mark MacDonald steering, continued his late season productivity with a win in the second elimination.

Trained by Jimmy Takter and owned and bred by Brittany Farms, the colt led through fractions of :27.2, :56, 1:25 and won in 1:52. Fernando Hanover, who came first-over on the second turn to challenge Western Fame, took second, while Manhattan Beach nabbed the show spot.

Also qualifying for the final were Katies Rocker, fourth, and JJ Flynn, fifth.

Mark MacDonald said after the race that Western Fame is "extremely lazy" but when he leads he is "tough to get by."

Western Fame, a son of Western Ideal—Shyaway, has won

six of 21 races this year and has seasonal earnings of more than \$375,000. He paid \$3.20 to win.

Betting Line, tapped to be the rail horse in the field, was scratched due to a spider's bite. Also scratched was Stolen Glimpse, who was sick.

Pure Country, Newborn Sassy score victories

Pacing off the gate into fourth, Diamond Creek homebred Pure Country, driven by Brett Miller, was flushed first over heading to the half and sustained her uncovered bid to win the first of two \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown three-year-old filly pace on Saturday (Oct. 22) at the Meadowlands in 1:51.

It was the ninth win in 19 starts this year for the Jimmy Takter trainee, who inched to the brink of \$1 million in seasonal earnings. Pure Country is well over \$1.65 million lifetime.

Darlinonthebeach took the lead through a :27.4 first quarter while Call Me Queen Be settled for the pocket. L A Delight, getting away last, moved two wide and managed to flush Pure Country heading to the half.

Pure Country narrowed in on Darlinonthebeach through a half in :55.3 and three-quarters in 1:23.2 before sticking her head in front in the stretch. L A Delight fanned off cover and closed down the center of the track to take second, while Call Me Queen Be sprinted up the rail for third. Darlinonthebeach and Kiss Me Onthebeach also advanced.

By Somebeachsomewhere of the Western Hanover mare Western Montana, Pure Country won her 19th race in 29 career starts. She paid \$5.20 to win.

"I always felt like she was better when she has a target," Miller said. "Obviously, she can do it any way, but she was very tough tonight."

Newborn Sassy gets up

Newborn Sassy (Tim Tetrick) sliced through traffic in the final strides to win her \$25,000 elimination for in 1:53 by three quarters of a length. Newborn Sassy is trained and co-owned by Jo Ann Looney-King along with owners CC Racing. Blue Moon Stride (Andrew McCarthy) was second and Penpal (Pat Lachance) was third.

"I thought she was going to be really good in this field," said Looney-King. "We got in late and I thought she was a winner from the time we got here tonight. That's going to be a tough (final), we're up against Pure Country. There are just so many, they're just such good fillies. She's up for it and

we're going to have her as good as we can get her and I hope we can be real competitive and maybe beat those horses next week. There's no reason at all why I can't win a Breeders Crown and that's what I want to do."

Lindwood Beachgirl (Yannick Gingras) had the lead early at the :29 first quarter, only to be overtaken by Penpal and then Blue Moon Stride by the :56.4 half. Blue Moon Stride held the lead to the 1:25.2 three quarters, Wishy Washy Girl (Brian Sears) was moving to challenge for the lead at that point. In the final turn, Newborn Sassy edged three wide to make a try for the lead, pacing down the middle of the track to pass the leaders a few strides from the wire.

Newborn Sassy, a daughter of Western Ideal out of Sass Newton, is now 7-5-2 in 18 starts this year for earnings of more than \$340,000. It was her 15th career win in 28 starts for earnings of more than \$550,000. The filly was a \$38,000 purchase at the 2014 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Breeders Crown (2yocp)

Huntsville wins fifth straight; Downbytheseaside dazzles

After settling in the mid-division from his outside post, Huntsville (\$2.40) sustained first-over gains to wear down pacesetter Odds On Delray and draw clear by two-and-a-quarter lengths in his \$20,000 Breeders Crown elimination for two-year-old pacing colts and geldings on Saturday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands.

Trainer Ray Schnittker, who shares ownership of Huntsville with Ted Gewertz, Charles Iannazzo, and Steven Arnold, has high hopes for Huntsville's future beyond next week's \$600,000 final.

"He's been getting stronger every week and racing from behind and he seems like he's getting stronger every time he races," Schnittker said. "He's a great big horse, 16 hands. If he stays sound, I think he could have a great year next year."

The victory pushed the homebred son of Somebeachsomewhere—Wild West Show over \$300,000 in earnings and improved his record to 6-3-0 in nine starts.

Tim Tetrick drove Huntsville to the 1:51.3 victory, which was the colt's fifth straight.

It was Odds On Delray (Scott Zeron) that rated a :56.4 first half mile. Once put into play, Huntsville made up six lengths to collar Odds On Delray with an eighth of the mile to go and subsequently draw away under the mildest of urging for a 1:51.3 score. Huntsville, also a winner in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship, the Bluegrass, and the International Stallion Stakes.

Miso Fast (Matt Kakaley) followed Huntsville's cover to take second, while Ocean Colony (Yannick Gingras) emerged out of the pocket to claim third from the fading Odds On Delray. Ozone Blue Chip (Sylvain Filion) rounded out the top five finishers.

Downbytheseaside strong

Sweeping to command before the half, Downbytheseaside held the front as he advanced to a 1:51.2 mile in the second of two \$20,000 eliminations.

Brian Brown trains Downbytheseaside. The colt by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Allamerican Native mare Sprig Hanover races for owners Country Club Acres Inc., Joe Sbrocco, and Richard Lombardo and was a \$65,000 purchase at the 2015 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"We liked him all spring when we first got to race him," Brown said. "But until you get out to Delaware and start racing against everyone else, you never know (if you have a special horse).

"Ray (Schnittker)'s horse stands out. He's a little more manageable than mine, but mine's pretty tough so we'll be competitive."

It was Downbytheseaside's seventh victory in 11 starts, compiling \$249,706 in earnings. He paid \$2.20 to win.

Driver David Miller positioned Downbytheseaside into fifth heading to the quarter. Timed in :28.1, he pulled to the outside and brushed to the lead heading down the backstretch. Leading through fractions of :56.3 and 1:24.2, he fended off a first-over challenge by Blood Line in the stretch and extended his lead, drawing clear of Normandy Beach, Boogie Shuffle, Blood Line, and Filibuster Hanover.

Sutton slides, Bar Hopping strolls to victory

Sutton sat in the pocket before edging up the pylons to win at 6-1 in 1:54.2 in the first of two \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown three-year-old colt and gelding trot on Saturday (Oct. 22) at the Meadowlands.

The Julie Miller trainee was driven to victory by Andy Miller, who owns the son of Donato Hanover—I Wanted Wings with Jason and Douglas Allen of Vincentown, NJ, who purchased the colt for \$40,000 at the 2014 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

Sutton surpassed \$300,000 this year and \$380,000 lifetime with the win.

Taking the lead in :28.1, Sutton soon took the pocket as Trotting Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder (Scott Zeron) brushed to the lead. He remained in control through fractions of :56 and 1:25.3 before bracing pressure from Southwind Frank travelling uncovered.

Marion Marauder was clinging to control in the stretch, drifting off the rail while Southwind Frank was gaining ground to his outside and Sutton was sliding alongside at the pylons. Sutton inched to the front to win by a neck over Marion Marauder, Southwind Frank, Lagerfeld, and Double L Lindy. It was the seventh win in 23 starts for Sutton.

"He has been good all year," Andy said. "(He's) just had a lack of luck I guess. In the Futurity, he had the outside in a 12-horse field; he was four deep in the first turn and three deep in the last turn and only got beat five lengths. And in the Hambletonian, he just missed. He's been knocking at the door, so next week hopefully will be his turn."

Zeron said he didn't want to give Southwind Frank a dream trip, so he pulled the trigger with Marion Marauder.

"I had to go a lot more than I wanted to on the backside and it probably took a little bit of sting out of him, but he raced great," Zeron said of Marion Marauder. "He was trying to stick his nose out there. He loves to win, I'm sure he's disappointed, I'm disappointed, but you know next week counts."

Bar Hopping dominant

Bar Hopping flew to the lead heading down the backstretch and coasted to a 1:52.4 score in the second elimination.

Driven by Tim Tetrick, Bar Hopping won his eighth race in 25 starts, earning \$913,033 for owners Christina Takter, Hatfield Stables, Marvin Katz, and Al Libfeld. He paid \$2.60.

"I thought this was a magnificent mile for him," said winning trainer Jimmy Takter. "You look at all the times here tonight, and everybody understands the wind is very hard in the stretch and it's freaking freezing. He's just learning how to race and has a lack of confidence, but one day he'll get it."

Bar Hopping and Time Tetrick were dominant in the second elimination.

The colt by Muscle Hill from the Credit Winner mare Cocktail Hour was a \$190,000 yearling purchase at the 2014 Harrisburg yearling sale.

Bar Hopping settled into fourth as Southern Cross trotted the first quarter in :28.1. After a :57.2 half, Bar Hopping tipped first over and rushed alongside Southern Cross and took the lead heading into the far turn. He kicked away at three-quarters in 1:25.1 and remained in front as Waitlifter K chased him home in second. Muscle Hustle, Winter Harbor, and Love Matters also qualified for the final.

Breeders Crown (2yoct)

Walner dominates; Sortie flying high

Walner and Tim Tetrick were the unchallenged winners by three lengths in 1:53.3 in the first \$20,000 elimination for the \$600,000 Breeders Crown two-year-old colt and gelding trot on Saturday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands.

It was the fifth win in six career starts for the Linda Toscano trainee owned by Ken Jacobs of Baldwinsville, NY who purchased the son of Chapter Seven—Random Destiny for \$90,000 at the 2015 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Walner has earned just a few dollars shy of his purchase price, to date.

"I'd like to be in the Hambletonian, that's my goal," he said.

Walner, driven by Tim Tetrick, took the lead away from Giveitgasandgo (Corey Callahan) after the :28 first quarter and held that lead to the :56.3 half and the 1:25 three-quarters, holding off Devious Man (Andy Miller) who pulled on the outside to make an attempt for the lead, and drawing alongside Giveitgasandgo, who held for second throughout the first three-quarters of the race.

Walner trotted away from the rest of the field with What The Hill (David Miller) rallying for second along the rail, while Giveitgasandgo (Corey Callahan) was third. Dover Dan (Scott Zeron) was fourth and Sir John F (Matt Kakaley) was fifth and got the final spot for next week's final.

"(Walner's) got tons of talent and he wants to do his job; he's got a ton of speed to go with it. Everything's there," Tetrick said.

Sortie soars

Sortie (Andrew McCarthy) came fastest of all from mid pack in the final eighth of a mile to win the second \$20,000 elimination by one-and-three-quarter lengths in 1:55. Sortie (\$22.60) is trained by Noel Daley and owned by Patricia Stable, Joe Sbrocco, Mario Mazza and the Sortie Stable.

It was the second career win in six starts for the son of Explosive Matter out of Win B. Sortie was purchased for \$65,000 at the 2015 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

The early pace was set by Moonshiner Hanover (Scott Zeron) who reached the first quarter in :28.3, with Fly On (Andy Miller) in second. That pair led the way to the :57.4 half and by the 1:26.3 three-quarters Moonshiner Hanover was still on the lead, but Fly On and Miller were off the rail and trying to take the lead.

As the field straightened in the stretch, Andrew McCarthy had Sortie trotting out of the pack in fifth place and gobbling up ground, passing the leaders a few strides from the wire for the win. Moonshiner Hanover held for second and Fly On was third. The final two spots in the Breeders Crown final went to fourth place finisher Jake (Sylvain Filion)

and fifth place finisher Snowstorm Hanover (Matt Kakaley).

"He kind of stepped on the gas there (at the five-eighths) and got to slipping a little bit, so I just had to watch him for a few steps and when he straightened up he was fine," said McCarthy. "At the head of the stretch I thought I did (have a chance to win). You know it's a long stretch. I knew I had plenty of trot, it's just a matter of making sure I stayed flat and kept going."

Roaring To Go best; Tori Hanover upsets

Brett Miller drove Roaring To Go to an aggressive final half to win the first of two \$20,000 Breeders Crown eliminations for two-year-old filly pacers on Saturday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands. The time for the mile was 1:52.4.

It was the seventh win in 13 starts for the Kevin Lare-trained daughter of Art Major out of the Western Ideal mare Lioness Hanover owned by Frank Chick of Harrington, DE, who purchased the pacer for \$16,000 at the 2015 Goshen Yearling Sale. The victory pushed Roaring To Go over \$250,000 lifetime.

"She's just getting better every week," Lare said. "She's been very good. This week she got even better."

Roaring To Go left swiftly from post seven to get the lead but she didn't keep it for long as she was overtaken by the favorite, Idyllic Beach, just past the :28.2 first quarter.

Idyllic Beach continued on top through a slow half in :57.2, cutting a 1:25.3 three-quarters when Roaring To Go tipped out to challenge, with Agent Q catching his cover.

As the two entered the stretch the duel was brief as Roaring To Go over-powered the favorite, leaving him behind and winning in 1:52.4. Flying late was Agent Q to get second. Idyllic Beach was third, with That's The Ticket getting the fourth spot and Brazuca snatching fifth and the last berth for next week's final.

Roaring To Go paid \$8.80.

Tori Hanover scores at 12-1

Scott Zeron was aboard Tori Hanover for the 12-1 upset win in the second \$20,000 Crown elimination for freshman pacing fillies. The Tony Alagna-trained

Somebeachsomewhere filly out of Trim Hanover improved to three wins in six starts and upped her earnings over \$25,000

for Jeffrey Snyder of New York City and Brittany Farms of Versailles, KY.

Tori Hanover, who was purchased for \$135,000 at the 2015 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA, is a half-sister to \$1.8 million winner American Jewel and \$1.3 million winner Luck Be Withyou.

Tori Hanover didn't get much mention until she began to close on the bulk of the field late, storming past favorite Someomensomewhere to win in 1:54.4.

Someomensomewhere was three wide to the first quarter in :28, with Blameitonthenight first over and Rockette at the rail. Someomensomewhere then cut the half in :57.2 and at three-quarters in 1:26.3 Tori Hanover was third over and poised to swing out and charge on the group.

Someomensomewhere held for second, while Blameitonthenight got third, Jaye's A Lady paced well after saving ground to get fourth and Rockette got a berth in the

final by finishing fifth.

"She was the product of a great trip tonight," Zeron said. "She can really smoke home. I had her in a position where I loaded her three wide and she gave me everything she had and it was enough tonight. (Brittany Racing Manager) Myron (Bell) was the one that made me a believer in her and I'm happy to have her in the Breeders Crown."

Breeders Crown (3yoft)

All The Time rebounds from colic surgery; favorite Broadway Donna strong in victory

Less than three months after having colic surgery, All The Time (Yannick Gingras) rebounded to win her \$25,000 elimination race for the \$500,000 Breeders Crown three-year-old filly trot on Saturday (Oct. 22) at the Meadowlands by a half-length in 1:55.1.

The Hambletonian Oaks winner was stricken with colic and required major surgery the day after the Aug. 6 victory.

"Last time she was racing was the Hambletonian Oaks," said winning trainer Jimmy Takter. "She won it, but unfortunately, the day after she went through colic surgery and she's been out since then. This is a really sweet moment for me. I mean, to see this filly coming back, she's just a pure champion, this girl, now that she's better.

"Mid-Atlantic (Veterinary Clinic) did a heck of a job and we were very fortunate that it was not the most serious kind of colic, but you know it was enough that we had to open her up. To be here for the Breeders Crown, that is what I was waiting for and she sure looked great tonight."

The homebred daughter of Muscle Hill—Cantab It All owned by Marvin Katz of Toronto, ON and Al Libfeld of Pickering, ON, was well off the early pace set by Non Stick (Ake Svanstadt), who got to the lead just past the :28.4 quarter. Those two held the lead to the :57.4 half-mile marker. Spicedbourbongirl (Jeff Gregory) was tucked in behind in second throughout.

By the 1:26.3 three-quarters, Fad Finance (Trond Smedshammer) trotted up to challenge and was even with the leader as the two turned to the homestretch.

First Caprice Hill (Tim Tetrick) and then All The Time (Yannick Gingras) came out of the pack in the middle of the track to challenge for the lead. All The Time won the sprint to the wire, with Caprice Hill and Fad Finance completing the trifecta. Dewdle All Day (James MacDonald) was fourth and Side Bet Hanover (Corey Callahan) was fifth, to get the final spot in the final.

All The Time has now won five of eight starts this year and 12 of 20 lifetime. She has earnings exceeding \$350,000 in 2016 and more than \$840,000 lifetime.

She paid \$5.60.

"It's the best she has been all year," Miller said. "She kicked home really well."

Broadway Donna is last year's Breeders Crown two-year-old trotting filly champ and this year she won the Kentucky Filly Futurity at Red Mile in two heats.

The Crown elimination victory was the sixth in 11 starts this year for the homebred daughter of Donato Hanover out of Broadway Schooner owned by Fashion Farms LLC of New Hope, PA.

Broadway Donna has earned nearly \$415,000 this year and almost \$950,000 lifetime.

Emoticon Hanover took the early lead with Windowshopper second and Flowers N Songs third at the :28 first quarter-mile and the field stayed in single file to the half in :57.4. Earn Your Wings was the first to pull heading for three-quarters, getting up to the leader in 1:27. As a brief duel ensued, the second tier formed with Flowers N Songs third-over and full of trot, while Broadway Donna went three-wide to make a charge.

Broadway Donna soared down the outside lane about five-wide and hit the wire first in 1:55 for trainer Jim Campbell.

Emoticon Hanover held on for second, Flowers N Songs took third, while Earn Your Wings earned a berth in the final

Hall resides in Washington and operates a four-horse stable with his wife Ashley. He indicated he doesn't expect to change his routine in the near future.

"Eventually, I'll go more towards training," he said. "For now, my wife and I will keep a small barn, and I'll keep driving the way I've been driving and see where it goes from there."

Monticello opens new simulcasting area

Monticello Raceway general manager Anthony Bruno said, "The new location will offer our loyal racing patrons the same amenities that our slot players have come to enjoy, such as easy access to the food court, beverage service and our weekend entertainment."

Potpourri of opinions

1. Last night (Friday, Oct. 20) in one of the Breeders Crown eliminations there was an inquiry and eventual DQ. One of the many things wrong with this game is the lack of objections by the trainer or driver. The last one I can remember was some years ago at Yonkers (of all places) where Trond Smedshammer lodged an objection against one of Takter's horses that stood up and was subsequently tongue lashed by Takter. These guys should be more like the flat guys. I remember seeing a race at PARX where the second-place horse lodged an objection against the winner. It was lodged by both the trainer and jockey. That's what the bettors should be accustomed to at harness tracks, but these guys just do not care about the bettors.

2. All I keep on hearing is there are not enough horses being bred. I tend to disagree. The problem is that there are way too many tracks. All of these tracks (except for the Meadowlands and Woodbine/Mohawk) have no handle and no people. If Gural says he is losing \$5 million with these large handles and terrible purses, imagine what these other tracks would lose without a racino (being just a standalone track). These tracks are just run for the benefit of the horsemen and I am shocked that politicians have not stepped in yet and wondered why all that money is going to the horsemen and not the state.


3. I, as a bettor usually only bet the Meadowlands. When they close I look at the WEG circuit and the flats. Last Saturday, though, I went to simulcasting for the Yonkers International day. With all the flat bettors around every race (except) the international had its total pool under 100K. Tracks like this, along with the PA tracks, will never attract people who bet serious money. Upon looking at the program I came upon this trainer T. MILICI who has about a 31 per cent win percentage with about 570 starters. That is unheard of. Whenever I have seen stats like that in my 50+ years of betting horses, the trainer was eventually found to be using (something). I remember this guy from many years ago and he was always a small-time trainer with a low percentage. I guess he must have mastered his craft... Bottom line is that anybody that bets Yonkers on a steady basis will be at a great disadvantage. It is no wonder the game is dying with these things going on which tracks turn a blind eye to.
