Driver Marcus Miller was a particularly excited first-time Crown winner after piloting his father Erv's trainee Someomensomewhere to victory in the two-year-old filly pace.

Ranking the top five moments from Saturday's Breeders Crown events for two- and three-year-olds at the Meadowlands:

5. Takter Thrice Crowned

Breeders Crown king Jimmy Takter opened the Crown portion of the card with a victory with Ariana G in the rookie trotting fillies' division and then added another later in the card when Bar Hopping won the sophomore trotting colt test. Add that to the Breeders Crown the trainer earned on Friday night with Always B Miki and the three Crowns for the weekend puts Takter at 30 Breeders Crown victories lifetime.

4. Katz and Libfeld homebreds 1-2

Despite having to miss being at the Meadowlands after having hip replacement surgery, Toronto breeder Al Libfeld had a hell of a night with his fellow Torontonian and partner Marvin Katz. The pair not only finished first and second with Takter-trained homebreds Ariana G and Princess Aurora,

Friday's Crown card was chilly and windy, but it was beautiful weather for Saturday's Breeders Crown races.

respectively, in the two-year-old trotting filly division, they are also part of Bar Hopping's ownership, giving them two Crowns on the night.

3. First Timers

Is there anything quite like seeing first-time Breeders Crown winners? Marcus Miller (Someomensomewhere, two-year-old filly pacers) and Scott Zeron (Call Me Queen Be, three-year-old filly pacers) were refreshingly-excited first-time Crown champs. The pair of 27-year-old rising stars loved every minute of it, with Miller particularly thrilled to team up with his father, trainer Erv Miller, for the win with Someomensomewhere. As for Zeron, it's been a year of firsts. He won his first Hambletonian in August with Marion Marauder and then the Trotting Triple Crown with the same horse. Though Marion Marauder had an off night in his Crown test, Zeron still got his Crown.

2. Walner

The prohibitive 2017 Hambletonian favorite was ultra-dominant and ultra-impressive for trainer Linda Toscano and owner Ken Jacobs, winning by four-and-a-half lengths. The son of Toscano's champ Chapter Seven out of Random Destiny sure looks like the real deal.

1. Tetrick's natural hat trick

Driver Tim Tetrick not only recorded a natural hat trick by winning the two-year-old colt trot (Walner), two-year-old colt pace (Huntsville) and three-year-old colt trot (Bar Hopping) in succession, two of them were stakes records — Walner in 1:53 and Bar Hopping in a record-tying 1:54.1. Tetrick now has 18 Breeders Crown victories in his career.

Final note:

In all, the weekend's 12 Breeders Crown events attracted a total of \$3,954,042 in wagering, with total all-sources handle for Friday and Saturday cards coming in at \$6,409,792.







There is nothing like the Breeders Crown

Newsflash – Harness racing has issues. We speak about them here at HRU often, and this past week, with detention barn chatter, it was certainly evident that not everything is well in standardbredville. But, every once in a while we're allowed to forget about the problems. The Breeders Crown on Saturday was excellent tonic.

As I often do on Crown night, I smiled quite a bit and cheered a lot. There's nothing like the bang-bang action of the Breeders Crown along with the celebration of the trainers, drivers, owners, grooms and everyone involved. It's a fabulous event.

I watched the Marvin Katz interview after Ariana G won the two-year-old filly trot. I think Marvin has probably won every big trotting race a dozen times over, so you'd think things would be pretty low-key in the winners' circle. No, not exactly. Marvin was as giddy as a 12-year-old that he finished one-two, and he was completely beaming. It's great to see joy on someone's face who truly loves this sport. Way to go Marvin.

After the trot, the two-year-old filly pacers took center stage, and if you didn't smile at that winner's circle, I am not sure you are cursed with a permanent frown. Marcus Miller and Nick Surick have never won a Crown race and they were so ridiculously happy it was infectious.

At the same time, the Crown always makes us remember for every winner there's a loser. For Frank Chick and Kevin Lare, their filly – Roaring to Go — didn't fire, and I felt for them. Gentlemen, you have a great filly, and you'll certainly get yours.

Sometimes the Crown identifies horses with blue-sky potential that gives us pause. Walner is one of those horses. He looks sound, happy, relaxed and he can flat out fly. Have we seen as talented a colt at two since Muscle Hill?

As if that wasn't enough, Huntsville was absolutely incredible in the two-year-old colt pace. I am not sure we've seen a more dominant performance at two, in a fast time, in a big race since Huntsville's sire won the Metro Pace in earth shattering time eight years ago. I, for one, thought Downbytheseaside was the better horse going into the race. Whoops, I guess it all does come down to the Breeders Crown.

Sometimes the Breeders Crown pays homage to the durability of the standardbred. It did that with Broadway Donna. It's difficult for filly trotters to be dominant at age two and come back a year later in the Crown and win like she did. It's a credit to her, the horsemanship of her team, and it's nice this year-end event puts a cherry on top of wonderful fillies like her.

The three-year-old filly trotting final also reminded us what we as owners and trainers and drivers go through sometimes – bad racing luck. In the last month or so, Caprice Hill has had enough bad trip luck for a lifetime.

Sometimes the Breeders Crown recognizes horses who did not have the racing luck early in the year, which would allow the horse to show what he or she can do. That probably describes Bar Hopping. He's been great, and showed how good he was tonight.

In the same race, we get to see what's great about the sport when a horse doesn't win, too. Ms. Wellwood had a terrible night when the Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder raced very poorly. Although she was obviously disappointed, she took time out to congratulate the winners. That's class.

The Breeders Crown is a coronation for horses, sure, but sometimes for drivers, too. Scott Zeron won his first Crown race with Call Me Queen Be, and it was so deserved. Scott is one of the classiest drivers at the Meadowlands, and has a unique ability to drive to take care of the horse, while simultaneously giving the bettors a good shake. Well done.

The final event of the evening was always this sport's marquee Crown race, but this year (and in some others) it's lost a little sizzle. This year's three-year-old crop doesn't feel deep, and with the injury to Betting Line, it felt like even less of an event. Just when you think you shouldn't get excited, well, we see a barnburner of a horse race. That sure was some old-school hardball. Racing Hill has been great all year, but had some real question marks heading into tonight. It was nice to see that it was him who benefitted from the action to take all the chocolates.

I get that the Crown is not the Breeders' Cup. It's not movie stars and billionaires, sunshine and blue-bloods. No, the media is not out in full force for this event, and we all saw the crowd tonight wasn't overly large, and the bet, well, it is what it is.


But, ask yourself, for us as harness fans and participants, what we'd do without it. We would not get to witness these great horses, great trainers, and fabulous drivers assembled all in one place on one weekend. Breeders Crown — Two-Year-Old Filly Trot

Homebred Ariana G caps a brilliant year and continues divisional dominance by Tatker, Katz and Libfeld.



The exactor on the board paid \$36.20, but it was significantly more 'grande' for Canadian-based owner/breeders Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, who watched dominant filly Ariana G lead fellow homebred Princess Aurora across the wire in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown Final for two-year-old trotting fillies.

It was the perfect outcome, but for the fact that Katz could not share the winner's circle celebration with his friend and long-time breeding partner Libfeld, who watched from home in Ontario while recuperating from a recent fall that fractured his hip and required replacement surgery.

Taking a moment off the top of his post-race interview with Hollywood Heyden, Katz paused for a shout out, "We did it tonight, Al. Get well soon," and later underscored his point by saying that his partner was "tough as nails," just like their horses.

Ariana G, a daughter of Muscle Hill—Cantab It All, is



definitely one such example. After a long year on top of her game every step of the way, the season's elite filly came into the Crown final off a loss in last week's elimination.

Trainer Jimmy Takter, who celebrated his 29th Crown win with Ariana G, rolled the dice on several equipment changes after the filly proved too grabby last week to the point where Gingras believes she may have choked.

The adjustments, which included an ear hood and changes to open her bridle, worked a little too well according to winning driver Yannick Gingras, leaving Ariana G with three lengths to make up at the head of the stretch after following elimination winner Chezatter's cover for most of the mile.

"When I tipped off David's (Miller, with Chezatter) back, I didn't have a whole lot of trot. We got her to be quiet tonight and she responded maybe a little bit too well to it," he said.

"She was really quiet third over, but when I tipped her off his back, she got into another gear and I knew at that point that I was a winner," said Gingras, who received congratulations from Takter on the fly, as the trainer sidled up next to him on the track, warming up a finalist for a later race

The margin of victory was one-and-a-quarter lengths by the 3-5 favorite over Princess Aurora and Sunshine Delight, in a time of 1:53.4.

The victory was the filly's ninth win in 11 starts this season, where she earned just under \$750,000. She adds the Crown title to a host of other lucrative stakes wins this year, including the Jim Doherty Memorial, Peaceful Way Stake and Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stake.

It's been an impressive season for Ariana G-a filly appropriately named for a pop star — which Takter says will draw to a close with the Crown victory.

"This is her last for the year. We've decided and she's been racing since May, it's a long year. It's a great way to finish the year for her," said Takter, who saved some considerable praise for Princess Aurora (Cantab Hall—Vulcanize) as well.

"She's probably the horse that's in the best form out of my horses right now. She's going to continue racing, going to the Goldsmith Maid up in Canada."

For Katz, the equipment change on Ariana G was just another Takter masterstroke.

"It takes a lot of courage to make the changes he made on her, from last week to this week and racing in the Breeders Crown," he said.

"This is a great filly. It's been a long campaign and she's been right on the top from the beginning of the season and to dominate the way she has and to win the Breeders Crown, I'm so proud of her. And to have Aurora come second, it's a testament to the people we work with – Perry Soderberg and Jimmy Glass, Bobby Brady and Jimmy Takter," said Katz, who also won this division one year ago with Ariana G's equally amazing full-sister, All The Time.

"To have great, great fillies like Ariana and Princess Aurora, to breed them and have them come out of our system, I think it speaks to the program that we have developed over the years, the people that are directing it, and now we're really



Breeders Crown — Two-Year-Old Filly Pace

It's Miller Time in rookie filly pace with 17-1 upset

Marcus Miller had always had this scenario in the back of his mind. Not only would he win a Breeders Crown final some day, but when it happened it would happen for his father. Erv.

That wasn't supposed to happen Saturday night (Oct. 29) at the Meadowlands as the Miller-Miller horse, Someomensomewhere, was being overlooked by the bettors. Sent off at 17-1, she was expected to have her hands full with, among others, 1-2 favorite and Breeders Crown elim winner Roaring To Go. In the elims, the Miller trainee raced well, but was beaten a length as the 7-5 favorite by Tori Hanover. Even as the horses crossed the wire, Marcus Miller didn't know that his dream had come true. The finish was extremely close as Someomensomewhere and Agent Q hit the wire in tandem. It took the placing judges six or seven minutes to put up the number six, Marcus Miller's number.

"This is absolutely the best, winning the Breeders Crown with my dad," the 27-year-old driver said. "He has worked so hard to help me get to where I am. We've put in a lot of time together. We've always worked well together. I couldn't have

pictured my first Breeders Crown win any other way."

Father was just as pleased as son.

"This was special," he said. "I've won some Breeders Crowns, but to win one with Marcus is extra special."

Someomensomewhere is by Somebeachsomewhere out of the Western Hanover mare Omen Hanover. Omen Hanover raced for trainer Nick Surick and owner Howard Schneidler and was a warrior on the racetrack. She started 217 times, won 45 races and earned just over \$1 million. Surick and Schneidler bred her to Somebeachsomewhere and this is her first foal. Surick, of course, is an accomplished trainer, but he chose to keep the foal with Schneidler and give her to Miller to train.

The connection between Surick and Team MIller is a natural one as Surick dates top amateur driver Hannah Miller, Marcus' sister.

"I just don't train enough babies and you need to have a lot of babies in order to get good at training them," Surick explained. "So I just let Erv train them and it works out for me. It gets me a little vacation time in Florida (where Miller readies his babies) in the winter and I can get down there when it's cold."

If you employ Erv Miller you're likely to get Marcus Miller as your driver. He's young and hungry and has won a lot of races, but he is not considered to be in the league of a Yannick Gingras or Tim Tetrick. Entering last night's race he had never so much as driven in a Breeders Crown final.

"In the 11 starts she's had, Marcus has never given her anything but a very good drive," Surick said.

For Marcus Miller, the goal remains to become the type of driver that regularly picks up top mounts in events like the Breeders Crown. This win can't hurt.

"I think this is kind of what it takes," Marcus said. "Scott (Zeron) proved that with a couple big wins like the Jug a few years ago and he's about the same age as me. So, yes, I am hoping something like this can help break me loose. I feel comfortable out there with those guys now. I feel like I can drive with them. I don't feel intimidated against them anymore. I'm not sure I could have said that a few years ago. I'm happy with the way things are progressing.

The original plan was for Surick to eventually to take over the training duties with Someomensomewhere, either as a three-year-old or four-year-old. Surick, who picked up his first Breeders Crown win in any capacity, said that may no longer be the case.

"The plan was always for Erv to train this horse at two and at some point I was going to take over," he said. "It's going to be hard to change things off this. It's not broke, why fix it?"

For Agent Q, driver Dave Miller and trainer Aaron Lambert, this was a tough beat. She's finished second in four straight races and in six of her last seven. She came very close to breaking her case of second-itis in a Breeders Crown race. It just didn't work out.

"I was back there next-to-last, I think," Dave Miller said. "I went three deep earlier than I wanted to, and I just missed. It's tough. The draw (she had post 10) got us, that was all. She overcame a rough trip. If I had any kind of trip I think she would have won. I thought the last step I got there, to be honest with you. I thought she got up in time, but she didn't. She couldn't have been too far off."

Roarin To Go faded in deep stretch and finished fourth.

Breeders Crown - Two-Year-Old Colt Trot

Walner confirms he's the class of the freshman trotting colts

Coming into the Breeders Crown, six of his 10 rivals had earned more money than Walner, but when the bettors invested their money, Walner got almost all of it. He was sent off at odds of 1-9 despite coming into the race with only a half-dozen starts.


But he had made the most of those starts, flashing speed far superior to any freshman trotting colt of this season — or of any season. His 1:51.2 jogburger win at Red Mile lowered the world record for juvenile trotting males by two full seconds.

It was much the same in the Breeders Crown: Walner in front, the rest nowhere.

His Breeders Crown wasn't so much a race as it was an exhibition of this extraordinary trotter's talents.

He was given a confident steer by Tim Tetrick and assumed command as they headed down the backside. In deep stretch, Walner boldly stepped away from his hapless pursuers to trip the timer in 1:53, a track and stakes record.





Moonshiner Hanover and Sortie were next across the wire.

Walner is by Chapter Seven from Random Destiny by Ken Warkentin. He was purchased last fall at the Lexington Selected Sale by Ken Jacobs for \$90,000.

Looking at Walner's pedigree, you realize that he is about as complete an outcross as we find today in trotting. Weaving together the blood of Speedy Crown, Super Bowl, Garland Lobell, and Valley Victory — often with some tight inbreeding — has resulted in astonishing increases in trotting speed in recent decades.

Yet the first four generations of Walner's pedigree doesn't have a single male ancestor more than once. You pick up Valley Victory once in the fourth and again in the fifth generation. Then you get Speedy Crown, the great-grandsire of Valley Victory, three times in the fifth generation.

Chapter Seven's first crop consisted of 84 foals (48 colts and 36 fillies) and they included the colts Seven And Seven and Big Man Ev and the good fillies Mamora Bay and Amber Ella.

But that quartet pales in comparison to Walner, who is assured of being the champion juvenile trotter of the season and the pick for the 2017 Hambletonian.

Walner's success is particularly rewarding to trainer Linda Toscano, who managed his sire Chapter Seven through his trio of seasons at the racing wars, culminating with his Horse of the Year campaign in 2012. In 28 career starts, Chapter Seven found the winner's circle 20 times and was runner-up four times. That's class and consistency and his 1:50.1 win at the Meadowlands as a four-year-old tells you he had speed aplenty.

When Linda Toscano spotted Walner as a yearling, she was drawn to him by his handsome head and the fact that his neck and shoulder evoked memories of Chapter Seven.

"He was the one who reminded me most of Chapter Seven," she said. "He was a larger and leggier version of Chapter Seven. That's what drew me to him."

Walner is the second foal of the mare Random Destiny, a top Ontario Sires Stakes trotter in her two seasons in stakes competition. Trained and driven by the superb Finnish horsewoman Riina Rikila, Random Destiny compiled a 11-5-2 slate in 18 starts and banked \$658,314 along the way.

Most of that money came in sires stakes competition. As a sophomore, she tried her luck without great success in open completion. She was ninth in the Casual Breeze behind Ultimate Cameron, and then fifth in the elimination and seventh in the final of the Elegant Image, again trailing Ultimate Cameron.

Random Destiny was owned by the Overseas Farm, a partnership between trainer Rikila and industry veteran Esa Lahtinen, both natives of Finland. They bred her first to Andover Hall and got a colt that fetched \$50,000 as a yearling. Then she was bred to Chapter Seven once on April 24, 2013 and delivered Walner on April 12, 2014.

Toscano has been around long enough not to allow herself to get too high on young horse.

"I'm the worst one to say that a horse was good from the start, but Walner really was," she said. "He broke easily, trotted most of the time, and he did everything effortlessly. Timmy (Tetrick) matineed him for me at Pinehurst. I told him I liked the colt, and after the race he came back nodding and smiling. And that was when Walner had only been in 2:20.

"Chapter Seven was not like that. He had an attention span problem. He would see a bird flying by and make a break. He was just immature all around."

The son proved to be more precocious than his sire.

"You never know if they're really special until they go behind the gate," Toscano said. "Walner is a complete overachiever. I was just hoping for a really nice horse."

What Toscano and owner Ken Jacobs got in Walner is a world champion and Breeders Crown winner.


Breeders' Crown - Two-Year-Old Colt Pace

Huntsville sets track record, defeats chief rival Downbytheseaside

The \$600,000 Breeders Crown two-year old colt pace was seen as a showdown between dominant elimination winners Huntsville and Downbytheseaside, and the pair didn't disappoint on the track, as the favored Huntsville got the upper hand on his rival once again with a track record performance for two-year old colt pacers at Meadowlands on Saturday night.

Huntsville and Downbytheseaside haven't been separated by much when they've been on the racetrack together this season. In their previous meeting in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes back in September, the pair raced within two lengths of each other over the mile, with Huntsville going on to win by a half-length. They also matched the two-year old colt





pacing world record at Red Mile on Oct. 8 in separate divisions of the International Stallion Stakes. Finally, on Saturday, the pair were once again closely matched in the Breeders Crown, with Huntsville on the lead and Downbytheseaside right behind him in the pocket.

Downbytheseaside tipped out at the top of the stretch and tried to pace down Huntsville in the final strides, but he couldn't get there, as Huntsville crossed the line in 1:49.1, missing the Breeders Crown record of 1:49 set by Sweet Lou in 2011 by a fifth of a second. Huntsville broke the Meadowlands track record for two-year-old colt pacers of 1:49.3 set by Captaintreacherous in 2012.

Huntsville found himself fifth early on as the field raced through the first turn, but aggressively made his way to the front along the backstretch. Trainer Ray Schnittker said the quick early pace had him worried for the stretch run.

"I got a little concerned at the half with a :54.1 around the last turn. I said, 'Well, let's separate the men from the boys' and he was the man," he said.

Huntsville won his sixth consecutive race and seventh race overall in his 10th career start for Schnittker, who co-owns the colt with Charles lannazzo, Ted Gewertz, and Steve Arnold. Schnittker and lannazzo also co-bred the son of Somebeachsomewhere, who is out of the Western Hanover mare Wild West Show. Huntsville earned \$300,000 in the victory to bring his career earnings to \$603,234.

It was Schnittker's third career Breeders Crown victory as trainer. He had previously won the 2007 two-year old colt trot with Deweycheatumnhowe and the 2011 two-year old filly trot with Check Me Out.

Driver Tim Tetrick recorded his 17th Breeders' Crown victory in the two-year old colt pace, but added to that total before the end of the night. Tetrick also recorded wins with Walner in the two-year old colt trot and Bar Hopping in the three-year old colt trot, but said he was impressed with Huntsville's effort in the two-year old colt pace.

"He showed how good he is," Tetrick said. "He made a really bold move down the backside. I didn't know if (Downbytheseaside driver) Dave (Miller) was going to let me go, or how far he was going to string me out, but he showed how tough he is. At the top of the lane he fought hard and opened up down by the wire."

he had no complaints Downbytheseaside's effort in the Breeders' Crown.

"I feel pretty good," Brown said. "I'm disappointed we didn't win, but my horse raced great, Ray's was just better.

Everything was perfect, we were right where we wanted to be, we just couldn't catch him. I thought my horse sat well tonight, he's been a little tough to handle at times, and the fractions were right. At the top of the stretch I thought we were pulling up to him and I thought we were in good shape, but Ray's horse paced away from us."

Miller agreed that Downbytheseaside had a good trip.

"My horse felt really good," he said. "I was waiting for room and when he got it, I moved him over, he took right off and went after him. Halfway through the stretch, he let up. He did what he could do. The other horse was just better tonight and congratulations to those guys."

Schnittker said Huntsville would be pointed towards the \$565,000 Governor's Cup at Woodbine to close out the year, but the pacer is now drawing comparisons to Schnittker's 2010 Meadowlands Pace winner, One More Laugh.

"He's probably better than One More Laugh and One More Laugh was a real good two-year-old," Schnittker said.

Breeders Crown - Three-Year-Old Colt Trot

Bar Hopping grabs the spotlight

The bettors apparently knew something the experts didn't.

While on paper, the \$500,000 Breeders Crown final for sophomore trotting colts looked like a final, epic duel between Trotting Triple Crown champion, Marion Marauder (Muscle Hill – Spellbound Hanover) and his arch-rival, Southwind Frank (Muscle Hill – Flawless Lindy), it was Jimmy Takter trainee Bar Hopping who was getting all the action going postward.

Sent off as the 4-5 favorite, Bar Hopping (Muscle Hill – Cocktail Hour) made good on those bets, equalling the 1:51.4 stakes record set by fellow Takter student, Father Patrick, in 2014 as he won by a length and a half over Southwind Frank (Yannick Gingras) and longshot Double L Lindy (Ake Svanstedt). In doing so, he surpassed \$1 million in lifetime earnings, and handed Takter his 30th Breeders Crown victory – the most of any trainer to date.


"That's a great feeling," Takter said of his 30-win tally. "I came into this with, I think, 27, so it's not a huge surprise, but

still, that's pretty good."

Tim Tetrick, who drove Bar Hopping, said, "I felt really good (going into the race). Last week he raced really well. We opened him up a little bit and he trotted a big mile. Today, off cover, he really responded well.

"My horse has raced against (Southwind Frank and Marion Marauder) all year, and a couple of times he drew bad and could never get into the race when they raced hard, but we still got checks. Those are great horses, and (Bar Hopping) was right there with him."

As the horses came to the gate, Andrew Harris trainee



Waitlifter K made a break in post position one, causing Scott Zeron to hang back a bit with Marion Marauder in post two. Both he and Tetrick got away sluggishly at the start, while Andy Miller hustled Breeders Crown elimination winner, Sutton, to the lead with Southwind Frank stalking in second from post nine.

The second of three Takter entries, Lagerfeld (David Miller), came first over to challenge Sutton as the field neared the three-quarter pole, leaving Southwind Frank little racing room and providing perfect cover for a late rush from Bar Hopping on the outside. When Southwind Frank finally found a bit of racing room, it was too late.

To the surprise of many, Marion Marauder, who had a record of 10 wins in 14 starts this season, was never a factor in this contest, remaining well back of the pack and fading to 10th.

"Bar Hopping has been up against Marion Marauder and Southwind Frank all season and has not had it easy," Takter said. "They're three great horses. To be honest I didn't see what happened with Marion Marauder tonight – I had three horses in this race (Bar Hopping, Lagerfeld, and longshot Love Matters) so I wasn't really watching him."

Zeron later said, "I think (Marion Marauder) was a little sick; off his game. He has definitely always given me his all. In every start he has been out here, and today he didn't have it early on in the race. It's unfortunate, but hopefully he goes on to bigger and better things at stud."

Trainer Paula Wellwood had already announced that the Breeders Crown was to be Marion Marauder's final race.

Tim Tetrick claimed his third Breeders Crown trophy of the evening with the victory behind Bar Hopping. "Any time you win one of those big trophies, they are very, very hard to get; that's why we (start) qualifying in May and we work so hard to get to those big races. It's very, very special," he said.

Bar Hopping was a \$190,000 yearling at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's 2014 sale in Harrisburg. He is owned by Christina Takter of East Windsor, New Jersey, Hatfield Stables of Columbus, Ohio, and Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, both Ontario-based. The Breeders Crown victory pushes his lifetime earnings to \$1,163,033.

Breeders Crown - Three-Year-Old Filly Trot

Broadway Donna earns her Crown


Broadway Donna flashed the form that earned her the Dan Patch Award last season as the Fashion Farms homebred scored a decisive victory in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown final for sophomore trotting fillies Saturday, October 29 at the Meadowlands. Driven by David Miller for trainer Jim Campbell, the filly drew away from leader All The Time to capture her fourth straight in a time of 1:53.1. The victory also minted her as the sport's newest millionaire.

"I feel very blessed and I thank God for (me) being able to be in a position to train a filly like her," Campbell said from the winner's circle. "She's just a super filly."

This royally-bred filly was the toast of her division as a two-year-old. Sired by Hambletonian champion Donato Hanover, out of the Hambletonian Oaks winner Broadway Schooner, Broadway Donna won nine of 10 seasonal starts for Jules Siegel's New Hope, PA breeding operation. Victorious in the Kentucky Filly Futurity and Pennsylvania

Sire Stakes final, the filly had notched six wins in 11 starts entering Saturday's contest. Broadway Donna has finished off the board only twice in 2016, racing fourth to All The Time in the Hambletonian Oaks, while a break relegated her to sixth in the Bluegrass at Lexington.

Despite those miscues, Broadway Donna entered the Breeders Crown final riding an impressive streak. She was the fastest of the field of 10, thanks to her speedy 1:51.1 elimination and 1:51.2 Futurity final efforts, showing she could handle heats with ease. In her Crown elimination, Miller kept her covered up before she unleashed a :27.1 last quarter to move from fifth to first in the stretch, winning by



half a length for her connections.

"She really has (gotten better through the season). She's way sharper now than she was halfway through the summer, and that's always a good thing," said Miller.

With her hot hand as of late, it was easy to understand why she was sent off as the favorite Saturday from post five. Second choice All The Time and Yannick Gingras drew to her inside in post two, but when the gate folded, it was Emoticon Hanover (Sylvain Fillion) and Fad Finance (Brian Sears) that pushed to the front from posts seven and eight. Leading the field through a :28 first panel, Emoticon Hanover would be shuffled to second by All The Time as Miller sat patiently mid-pack with Broadway Donna. He wouldn't sit long, though, pulling on the backstretch and sending his filly first-up on the way to a :56.3 half.

"I was hoping to get away somewhere in the middle and come with cover, but, right off the gate, nobody from the inside was even pushing off, so I had to do something," Miller said of his race strategy. "I got around, and when Yannick (Gingras on All The Time) was moving back, I knew I was going to be first over. She has been sharp, she's strong. She got the job done."

Steadily advancing on the outside, Broadway Donna pulled even with All The Time racing out of the turn (1:25.3) and the battle was on between the two fillies. The Fashion Farms homebred was up to the challenge, powering on with a :27.2 last quarter and putting away the field by two lengths at the wire to secure her seventh seasonal score and 16th win in 22 career starts. Emoticon Hanover finished second followed by All The Time and Earn Your Wings.

"When I saw Dave coming first over, I just thought if she's got her game on tonight, going first over didn't bother me. She just proved tonight that she's a top-notch filly," said Campbell.

The victory was sweet redemption for the filly and her connections on the Breeders Crown stage. As a freshman, Broadway Donna made a break in her elimination and finished a distant seventh, preventing her from advancing to the final. Now, she has a Crown championship to her credit, and as a result, a second Dan Patch Award could be in her future. The victory raised the filly's seasonal earnings to \$664,708, and her career bankroll now stand at \$1,195,994.

"[Jules Siegel and I] are both very happy. From Mr. Siegel's point of view, he bred her, and to have a filly like this and put her over one-million dollars lifetime (is incredible),"

Breeders Crown - Three-Year-Old Filly Pace

Call Me Queen Be rules the sophomore fillies

She was ignored on the tote board at odds of 12-1, but Call Me Queen Be, who had the undivided attention of trainer Ross Croghan and her dedicated groom Justin MacEachern, prevailed Saturday (Oct. 29) at the Meadowlands in a stirring stretch duel over O'Brien Award winner L A Delight in the \$500,000 three-year-old filly pace.


The feisty filly had come up short on a few occasions this year against division darlings Pure Country and Darlinonthebeach, but Call Me Queen Be fired a warning shot at her rivals on Sept. 10 after besting both in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Final when similarly overlooked at odds of 14-1.

The pacer took her talents to the Delaware Country Fairgrounds in Ohio and won the opening heat of the Jugette but had to play second fiddle to L A Delight in the Jugette final. After a trio of trips which saw the filly fail to have her photo snapped, Croghan went to work on readying Call Me Queen Be for the division's biggest night.

"She's run some great miles this year, but the horse has had some liver enzyme problems over the last month," explained Croghan. "We tried to do some oxygen therapy on her this week to try and give Mother Nature a little push and her liver enzyme count did drop nearly 30 points. She stepped out tonight and performed."

The victory provided driver Scott Zeron, who completed a Trotting Triple Crown earlier this month with Marion Marauder, with a first Breeders Crown score. Zeron regularly puts the high-flying daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Preppy Party Girl on the point, but he worked a first-over trip from post nine to secure the Breeders Crown score.

"I didn't want first-over but watching the races tonight, it's late in the season, and it's been a closer's night tonight," said Croghan. "I said to the driver before he went out that I know



she can circle anything off the wings but let's go another way and just 'woah off' and see what happens. The first over I didn't like, but the end result I did."

Favored Pure Country (Brett Miller) emerged on top from a :27.2 first-quarter duel before L A Delight (John Campbell) took over down the back straight as Zeron asked Call Me Queen Be to engage on a first-over trip.

"I'm happy she was on her game tonight," Zeron said. "That's not her style (going first-over), but things really worked out to her advantage, getting a soft third quarter and then just turn it into a sprint to leave (out) some of those horses that were following behind."

Call Me Queen Be had a narrow lead on the way home and stayed off a stubborn L A Delight through a :26 closing quarter to prevail by three-quarters of a length.

Darlinonthebeach held third while Pure Country, a Dan Patch Award winner and defending Breeders Crown champion, settled for fourth as the 4-5 mutuel favorite.

"She raced good. Honestly, I should have either forced the issue more," said Miller of Pure Country. "I should have maybe taken John (L A Delight) a quicker second quarter, because when he made the front he got a really big breather and the race turned into a sprint. When it turned into a sprint, that actually hurt us pretty bad. We just got out-sprinted."

Croghan credits MacEachern, the filly's constant companion, with bringing Call Me Queen Be to the front side with her 'A' game.

"She was a very difficult, high-strung filly from the day we got her and I've not had a lot to do with getting her mannered," said Croghan. "Justin has had her for two years and broken her to the saddle. He has spent hours and hours with this filly giving her confidence and getting her mannered. Between Justin, and the brilliant job that Scotty had done with her this year, to me, is 90 per cent of her success.

"Justin has just put his heart and soul into this horse. Between Justin and the brilliant job Scotty has done keeping the filly quiet has been the key to her success."

The affable conditioner also tipped his cap to Call Me Queen Be who was game to the wire while turning the division on its head.



Breeders Crown — Three-Year-Old Colt Pace

Racing Hill finally gets lucky


At some point, Tony Alagna had to be thinking that he was never going to catch a break with his colt Racing Hill. He lost the Meadowlands Pace by a nose to Control The Moment and he and driver Brett Miller insist that what kept them from winning was Miller's inability to pull the earplugs out. He got a brutal trip in the Little Brown Jug elims and Alagna was so discouraged he scratched him from the Jug final. In the elims for the Breeders Crown, he was sick and finished a lackluster fourth.

You might say he was overdue for some good fortune, and at last it happened.

In Saturday's Breeders Crown Final for three-year-old male pacers, things could not have gone better for the son of Roll With Joe who is out of the American Ideal mare Chasing Ideals. His first break actually came a week earlier when the division's leader, Betting Line, had to be withdrawn from the elims after suffering a spider bite. With Betting Line out and with Control The Moment having been retired earlier in the year, the division was far from deep entering the Crown final.

Sill, there were some tough horses in the field, including elim winners Western Fame and Check Six and race favorite Lyons Snyder from the Jimmy Takter barn. But two, Check Six (Yannick Gingras) and Lyons Snyder (Brian Sears), virtually lost all chance when they hooked up in a brutal battle for the front. Check Six had the lead and Sears tried to brush past him on the backstretch, but Gingras was intent on holding his position. That led to fractions of :26.3, :53 and 1:20.2, too fast for them to overcome.

As they were going toe-to-toe, Miller had Racing Hill spotted perfectly in fourth, swept by the two leaders near the top of the stretch and then held off 60-1 shot Manhattan



Beach to win by three-quarters of a length.

"There's no doubt the fractions, with the way they raced, made us a winner," Miller said. "At the same time he still won in 48 flat and went a heck of a mile. He felt like his old self tonight. I knew he could race from off the pace, but when you race from off the pace at this track you better hope they go fast fractions, and they did."

Alagna said he knew Racing Hill was in big trouble when he shipped to the Meadowlands a week earlier for the elims.

"Last week when he shipped up here, he literally, when he walked off the truck that Friday night, was ringing wet," Alagna said. "He's never been like that. When he got off the truck I said 'he just left his race on the truck.' Saturday, he was all dull as a horse could be. I had to chase him warming him up and I've never had to do that before. He just hasn't had the best of goes lately, but tonight I told Brett that you've got your horse back, he's ready to rock."

Racing Hill is a homebred owned by U.K. native Tom Hill, who won his first Breeders Crown race. Hill was not in attendance but was represented by sons William and Richard. Tom is somewhat of an oddity as he resides in a country where harness racing is virtually invisible, but loves the sport and, according to his sons, has no interest in thoroughbred racing.

"My father been into sport into sport since the early '60s," William Hill said. "My grandfather loved it, too, so he was born and bred into racing. (Standardbred) racing is very small in England but very big over here. He used to race in England, but not anymore. Everything we have now is in the U.S. or Canada. It's an expensive hobby but my father loves it and I am sure he is over the moon right now."

Hill estimated that his father has 80 to 90 horses in training.

The family was disappointed they didn't walk away with two Crown wins. In the three-year-old filly trot, their Caprice Hill had a brutal trip and could not find room in the stretch. With Tim Tetrick driving, she finished fifth.

"Caprice didn't get the trip she should have had," said William Hill. "Terrible drive. We should have had two Breeders Crown wins."

As for Check Six and Lyons Snyder, Check Six somehow held on for third. Lyons Snyder was last in the field of 10.

Average up 14 per cent at Hoosier Classic

Indiana's racing product is on the upswing and that means that Indiana-sired yearlings are in demand. Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale Company LLC wrapped up its 2016 sale Saturday (Oct. 29) at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, and the results are proof positive that Indiana's breed development program is thriving. Over the course of the two-day sale, 356 yearlings passed through the sale ring, generating sales of \$5.9 million, and good for an average of \$16,630. That average is a 14 per cent improvement over 2015 results.

"I'm extremely pleased with the response. It shows the rising popularity of the Indiana program," said sale manager Steve Cross. "It shows we're heading in the right direction with the quality of stallions and mares bred."

The sale topper came in Saturday's session when a full-brother to millionaire Natural Herbie entered the ring for consignor Black Creek Farm. Au National Herbie, a black Here Comes Herbie—Ljanearl colt, was the 27th baby sold on Day 2 (Hip 218), hammered down for \$75,000. Trainer Dan

Shetler signed the ticket as agent. While no yearling fetched a six-figure price tag, Cross was not disappointed. He pointed to other areas where the sale was stronger than in previous years.

"I was very optimistic coming in with the results from other sales and the fact that they were up," he explained. "We didn't have a big six-figure ticket, but the middle more than made up for it. It was gratifying to see the horses in the middle have their day. That's the progress I like to see."

While a total of 10 yearlings brought bids of \$50,000 or more, it was the \$25,000-\$49,000 range that carried the sale. Over the two days 63 yearlings were sold in that range, 27 of which brought over \$35,000. Another 32 babies fetched final bids between \$20,000 and \$24,000.

One of the highlights of the sale was the first crop of trotting sire Guccio hitting the marketplace. The stallion stands at Victory Hill Farm, and there were 61 offspring from the Hambletonian runner-up consigned to the sale, with 23 colts, four geldings and 34 fillies cataloged. A total of 60 Guccio yearlings were sold, averaging \$23,270. Bluebird Mario, a colt that is the first foal from Indiana Sires Stakes final winner My Sweet Shiela, led all Guccio babies with a

\$62,000 final bid. He was closely followed by Rocking Destinys, a Guccio colt from the Black Creek consignment that was the top priced trotter of Hoosier Classic's Friday session, purchased for \$60,000 by Peter Wrenn.

"I was really happy with how well they were received," said Victory Hill Farm's Maria King. "With a first crop, you never know how they'll be received. There was a lot of hype and buzz, and a lot of activity at farms that had Guccios."

Several buyers were extremely active at the Hoosier Classic sale, led by the father-son duo of Bo and Pat DeLong. The younger DeLong signed 14 slips for sales totaling \$463,200. The biggest investment was Cosmic Power (Hip 103), a Rockin Image colt consigned by Victory Hill Farm, hammered down for \$60,000.

Tom Pollack was another buyer that is bullish on the Indiana program. He purchased eight yearlings totaling \$295,000, led by My Oscars Arockin. Cataloged as Hip 257, the Rockin Image colt is a half-brother to \$600,000 winner Jammin Joshua, consigned by David Wayne Yoder.

"Indiana has improved tremendously. With Always A Virgin and Rockin Image, and with the addition of Guccio to go with Jailhouse Jesse and Swan For All, it's causing more people to take notice of Indiana," Pollack said.

He likes participating in Indiana because the program has improved, but you can still get a well-bred yearling for a

reasonable price. With 65 horses in his operation, Pollack wants to expand his racing footprint, and he likes the competitive landscape.

"In Pennsylvania, if you want a Muscle Hill colt, you're going to pay \$100,000," said the Pennsylvania-based owner. "Our main focus is the Indiana Sires Stakes program. I just like the style of racing out here. The breeders have stepped up and it's nice to buy yearlings that are also eligible to races in Delaware, New Jersey, and other states."

The racing and breeding community stepped up in a big way to support one of their own during the sale. Amy Miller, daughter of Legacy Lane Farm's Duane Miller, has been diagnosed with leukemia, and a raffle was held to help defray the costs of treatment and an upcoming bone marrow transplant. \$13,500 was raised during the raffle, and Bluestone Farm stepped in to offer a 2017 breeding to Always A Virgin, which was raffled off for another \$12,000, bringing the total raised in less than 48 hours to \$25,500.

"Honestly, that was the highlight of the weekend," said Cross. "I knew the harness racing community would step up, but they hit the ball out of the park."

Former owner/breeder David Brooks dies in prison

The Associated Press reported Saturday (Oct. 29) that former standardbred owner and breeders David H. Brooks has died in prison. He was 61.

Brooks, the founder of America's leading supplier of body armor to the U.S. military, died while serving a 17-year sentence for running a massive stock fraud scheme.

The U.S. Bureau of Prisons (BOP) confirmed Brooks died Thursday (Oct. 27) at the Federal Correctional Institution in Danbury, CT. On Saturday, BOP spokesman Justin Long said, for privacy reasons, prison officials cannot release additional details.

Brooks' lawyer told Newsday that his client became ill Thursday and was taken to a hospital. He said it was unclear what led to his death.

"It was sudden and unexpected," said Richard Klugh, Brooks' federal appeals attorney in Miami.

Brooks, the founder and former chief executive of DHB Industries, was convicted in 2010 of securities fraud, conspiracy and other charges for masterminding a \$185 million stock swindle and using the proceeds to pay for personal luxuries. Prosecutors said he threw extravagant bar and bat mitzvahs for his children in which entertainers such as Tom Petty, Aerosmith and the Eagles performed. They said he also bought a diamond-encrusted belt buckle in the shape of an American flag for more than \$100,000.

During his trial in federal court in New York, prosecutors said Brooks used the company treasury for his own extravagances, with more than \$6 million in unauthorized expenditures.

Brooks and a co-defendant were accused of falsely inflating the value of the inventory of the company's top product — the Interceptor vest — to help meet profit margin projections. The vest, made for the U.S. Marine Corps and other branches of the military, was designed to withstand rifle fire and shrapnel.

Brooks' trial lawyer told the jury that all the expenditures were approved by the company's board and in agreements between Brooks and the company. He also told jurors that Brooks had put as much as \$20 million of his own money into the business and said the money he spent on personal items amounted to less than what he was owed.

Brooks resigned from DHB in 2006, at about the same time the company moved its headquarters from Westbury, NY, to Pompano Beach, FL, where it now operates as Point Blank Solutions Inc.

Brooks was appealing his conviction.

Klugh said Brooks died days after being transferred to Connecticut from a federal detention center. Brooks had asked for the transfer so he could be closer to his family, Klugh said.

Gural with a further take on Oakes situation

It is frustrating to read all of the opinions about the Chris Oakes matter. All I've ever tried to do at the Meadowlands is to give those owners and trainers who do not use illegal medication the same chance to win a race as the owners and trainers who do use performance enhancing drugs.

I actually agree with Howard Taylor that all of the horses should have been treated the same. However, when I requested permission from the Breeders Crown to implement that rule, I was turned down. They came back and said they would require the horses to be either in Delaware, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, which, obviously, would make it almost impossible for us to monitor all of the horses.

Even though they did say that they were planning to take out of competition testing, as has been reported, we had a very bad experience the last time we hosted the Breeders Crown and we had a public relations nightmare at the Little Brown Jug so I thought it was important to closely monitor certain horses, including Betting Line, who caused all the controversy at the Jug. (Security chief) Brice Cote actually spent the entire night and day in the detention barn monitoring the horses last weekend.

Once I knew that we couldn't require all the horses to be in New Jersey we decided that we would ask permission to selectively require certain horses to be in New Jersey since the rules allow that. When (race secretary) Pete Koch notified those trainers prior to the eliminations that if they made the final they would be required to have their horses in New Jersey, only Chris Oakes and Rene Allard rejected. Rene's horse didn't qualify, so that left Chris Oakes.

Michelle and Al Crawford are friends of mine, our largest supporters and people who have been putting a lot of money into the business. They are also considerably younger than myself and a lot of the other breeders and really good for the game so I really didn't want to aggravate them. So I took upon myself to call Chris Oakes directly. He had a tantrum and hung up on me and as a result I had to reach out to the Crawfords. After much back and forth, I was told that (Oakes) had agreed and one of the reasons he gave for not coming to New Jersey was he thought someone would sabotage him and intentionally give his horses illegal medication so they would test positive.

I really did not want to make a big issue and draw attention away from the races themselves so I agreed that we would provide 24/7 security for the horses once they came to New Jersey. I made arrangement with Steve Williams to provide two stalls and a paddock at White Birch. I thought this issue had been resolved until I got a letter Tuesday morning from Howard Taylor advising me that Chris Oakes was not planning to come to New Jersey. I told Howard Taylor that Chris had three options: One, he could bring the horses to New Jersey as agreed. Two, he could scratch the horses. Three, I would have the security people go to his farm in Pennsylvania and keep the two horses under observation there so they could be in their natural environment which seemed so important. All of those options were rejected at which point I asked the Racing Commission to allow us to scratch the two horses, which was declined.

The last thing I wanted to do was to take anything away from the great racing this weekend and I really tried to avoid that, but the Breeders Crown rules clearly provide that you can require a trainer to bring his horses to New Jersey. All I am trying to do is make the races as fair as possible. I am not looking to fight with anybody. One thing for sure, Chris Oakes will never race a horse at any of my three tracks. Why he would not allow our security people to go up to his farm and observe the horses is beyond me, assuming he has nothing to hide.

One last thing, I do not use Facebook, but saw a lot of the comments and the only thing that really offends me is the morons who say that they are not going to race at the Meadowlands because our purses are low. Do they honestly think that the purses at Yonkers, Pocono and Chester are so high because the handle is so great, or attendance is so strong? Or, is it possible that it is because 95 per cent of the money comes from the slots, which we don't have (at the Meadowlands). I could have the same purses that they do if I eliminated all of the stakes races, but I do not think that is in the best interest of the sport. So, we are where we are.

For me, this was a great weekend of racing and I am glad that we hosted the Crown this year. If we can get enough

people to sponsor our stakes races I would hope that we could host it again in the future.

Column on Gural misses point

Your article about the owner of the Meadowlands track misses the point that, despite the owner's good intentions, he is not a regulator. He is a licensee like any other licensee who, regardless of "private property rights", is not a state actor.

Whether a racing rule gives him arbitrary exclusion authority to bar patrons and licensees alike, the integrity of racing is threatened when a racetrack owner can impose an exclusion sanction on a driver, trainer, or owner licensee, capriciously.

You are mistaken to assert that a racing license, once issued, is a "privilege", as if there are no rights attached to it. An occupational license, once issued, constitutes a "property right" entitled to due process protections of the law. Applying this legal principle and the U.S. Supreme Court case opinion in Eldridge v. Mathews, any racetrack owner-licensee would be complicit in violating the constitutional rights of a racing occupational licensee, with the blessings of the state racing jurisdictional authority, under 42 U.S.C., if the racing commission failed to provide the effected barred horseman-licensee a due process hearing. In essence, it is the obligation of the regulating authority to resolve disputes between licensees and to protect the rights horsemen possess, relative to their occupational licenses. While not compelling, the implications of Ontario Harness Horse Association v. The Ontario Racing Commission, 2002 CANLII 41981 (ON CA) sets the stage for some interesting litigation prospects

What a sad, sorry mess

The latest harness racing dustup at the Meadowlands is predictable, at least, and necessary, at best.

It is also the culmination of what happens when heads have been turned, and solid reasoning and policing gave way to blind eyes.

If this scenario had taken place at the "old" Meadowlands, the one run by the State of NJ, none of this would be happening or in the news, or if it were, the appeals process that would take place would keep Chris Oakes racing until he and his horses were eligible for Social Security.

Some will say that this is merely another personal vendetta, but that makes little sense for a guy who is looking to get and operate a casino that would ultimately be one of the busiest in the United States.

The desire to get bad publicity hardly coincides with the desire to get a money machine called a casino.

Whether or not one likes or dislikes Gural, it cannot be argued that he is a fan of harness racing, even if his need to own a casino probably supersedes his love of racing.

This mess is what you get after countless years of poor, weak, or no supervision and enforcement.

It's what you get when countless millions of dollars are siphoned out of a game with suspect supervision and regulation.

It's what you get when the mentality of "The cheaters are always two steps ahead of the testing, and we are severely underfunded."

Underfunded?

How can a sport that even in decline and will handle well over a billion dollars at the windows, be "underfunded?"

Has anyone been paying attention for the last 20 years? Does anyone learn from mistakes made previously? Do they care?

Without mentioning the handful of trainers who have garnered most of the (bad) publicity in the last seven years, (we all know who they are), we find that some of these people have probably caused irreparable damage to the sport.

This disease has been diagnosed but has not been treated, hence, we are seeing the logical conclusion.


