Harrisburg principals hoping to follow Lexington's trend

Standardbred Horse Sales Company president Pete Spears said historically the Harrisburg sale has followed the lead of Lexington, which was up nearly 25 per cent this year.

Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale kicks off Monday in Harrisburg, PA with a select session of the very best 175 yearlings.


Was the exceptional Lexington Selected Yearling Sale a bellwether of what to expect from this week's Standardbred Horse Sales Company sale (http://theblackbook.com) starting Monday (Nov. 7) and running through Friday (Nov. 11) at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, PA? Sale president, CEO and treasurer Pete Spears certainly is hoping that proves to be the case.


"Historically Harrisburg and Lexington have gone in the same direction economically," Spears said. "There have been two exceptions to that — last year when the Pennsylvania governor decided to threaten to shut down racing and in 2008 when the tech bubble burst and the sale and the market went down. So, historically, if Lexington does well and the other sales do well, we do well. I'm optimistic we'll do well, but time will tell."

The Lexington sale, held Oct. 4-8, was up 24.5 per cent

over 2015 and the gross of \$32.3 million that was the second highest in its history

"I'd be disappointed if we weren't up, at least to some degree (at Harrisburg)," said Hanover Shoe Farms' Hall of Fame publicity man Murray Brown. "I would hope we could be up as much as they were (in Lexington), but I doubt it. It would be a welcome gift, but a few days at Lexington this year were magic and I just don't know... they had a great book and great individuals and they sold accordingly. They sold more than accordingly."

Northwood Bloodstock's Bob Boni said, "all of our sales take on personalities and the Lexington sale and the Harrisburg sale are two distinctly different ones. In the Harrisburg book, there's plenty to pick from and if people are willing to take their time and look at a lot of horses they are going to find nice horses that they can buy... and they will occasionally find horses that they will consider a good value."

The sale will begin at noon on Monday with a select session of 175 yearlings designed to start the sale with fireworks.

"They were selected based on excellent pedigrees and the individuality to go with it. We're starting an hour later (than in previous years), so people who come in Sunday night or Monday morning will have plenty of time to evaluate their choices," Brown said.

Spears said the opening session would be followed by the reinstatement of a buffet dinner thanks to a grant from the Pennsylvania State Racing Commission. The event will begin at 6:15 with an open bar and appetizers followed by the dinner at 7 pm.

"Also, as part of that grant, we reinstituted an international buyer incentive program, whereby people who are either new or haven't bought in at least three years, who are coming from overseas, can apply for a \$1,500 incentive grant that will basically pay for their plane ticket and hopefully most of their lodging to come to the sale," Spears said.

"We are also going to auction four individual artworks at the end of the sale on Monday to benefit the Harness Horse Youth Foundation," Spears said.

Neither Spears, Brown nor Boni said they thought Tuesday's Presidential election would have much impact on the sale, though some attention of the buyers will likely be elsewhere on Tuesday evening.

"I look forward to going to Harrisburg every year," Boni said. "I think it's a great place to sell horses. People are there to sell horses. With the exception of this year because of the election, normally what goes on outside of that building nobody even knows. It's as if you don't even know what's going on."

Brown said he not only expects Harrisburg to be up this

year, he expects Hanover Shoe Farms will follow the trend, "because we've got a pretty darn good book and a lot of outstanding individuals. We've got a lot of what people want, the Beaches, the Muscle Hills. We've got Cantabs, Donatos, Bettors Delights and we've got geographical diversification. I would be very disappointed if we did not have a good sale."

Hanover Shoe Farms owns the Standardbred Horse Sales Company and helping Hanover's bottom line is the fact that it did not sell at Lexington in part to sell all of its very best yearlings at Harrisburg to support the sale.

"I think we're very, very strong. I think we have top horses in every category, especially deep in pacing colts and trotting fillies. If I had to pick just one in either category, I just couldn't do it," Brown said. "With the Beaches, we've probably got a dozen or more colts that just jump out at you, as well as other yearlings. Overall, in pacing colts, we've got 25 to 30 that any one of them could be a top, top horse. It wouldn't surprise me, and that's pretty much the same with trotting fillies and, to a lesser degree, the other two categories.

"I don't think we had as good a group of yearlings, period, last year as we do this year."

Brown predicted Hanover's top trotting colt would be hip #21, Story Time Hanover, a Muscle Hill colt out of Shared Past.

"He is as well-bred and good looking as any trotting colt

that I've seen this year," Brown said. "He's a real mouth-waterer. I think he's just a lovely horse... He's probably been out in the paddock every day for the last two weeks (when potential buyers came to look at yearlings at the Hanover Fairgrounds.

"Another positive we have in our consignment, we've got a lot of geographical divergence. We have a far better group of Ontario-breds than we've had in many years. We've got a brother to Reverend Hanover, who is, in my opinion, a lovely colt. We've got a Kadabra filly that I think is probably as nice a filly as we have period."

Brown said Hanover stallion Somebeachsomewhere is putting up "scary" numbers at stud.

"Just the statistics that his two and three-year-olds have earned more than double that of the next leading sire, which, in both cases is Bettors Delight, who is a great, great sire. The Beaches have earned twice as much and, to me, that's astonishing," Brown said. "I haven't seen the likes of this since maybe the days of Adios and this is even more domination."

Preferred Equine Marketing will offer a huge number of horses during both the yearling sessions (Nov. 7-9) and the two mixed sessions (Nov. 10-11). Preferred's David Reid said he is "looking forward to the sale. We have a lot of nice

horses, we have a good blend of trotters and pacers and we have something for everybody from the major jurisdictions. We're just looking forward to having a good week and, hopefully, the sales continue on the trend they've been on and I look forward to getting the show on the road."

Boni said there is no magic formula for which horses will sell well.

"The ones that are okay are always going to take care of themselves," Boni said. "On a given day, they'll bring more. I was at Hanover the other day and looked at some of their yearlings... They've always got good yearlings, but their pacing colts are exceptionally good... I like some of the colts and fillies that I'm selling, but in the yearling market the public can be picky. But, if you've got the right stuff, the right sire, they will pay enough for them."

Spears said there are no large dispersals at this year's mixed sale, but "Peninsula Farms is offering a very select, high-quality group of broodmares from the William Weaver estate and I think they will prove to be very attractive to buyers."



Extraordinary numbers in this Breeders Crown recap

Ron Burke, after winning with Hannelore Hanover, finished with a 17 1-3-2 slate. That may not seem like two big nights, but look at the odds of his competitors after Hannelore: 125-1 (5th), 54-1 (6th), 169-1 (5th), 36-1 (2nd), 28-1 (5th), 158-1 (7th), 10-1 (4th), 92-1 (7th), 43-1 (3rd) 33-1 (4th), 29-1 (8th), 9-2 (2nd), 60-1 (2nd), 3-1 (3rd), 28-1 (4th) 72-1 (8th). No second choices, a pair of third choices, and the average odds of his last 16 starters was 58-1.

Always B Miki, if he is voted Horse Of The Year, will be the third different horse for Jimmy Takter and the fourth time he's won it. All three will have slayed a Triple Crown winner in being so named: 1997 Malabar Man over Western Dreamer; 1999 Moni Maker over Blissfull Hall (Moni Maker also was 1998 HOY) and 2016 Always B Miki over Marion Marauder???

Rail fails

Like the rail do ya? Not this past Breeders Crown weekend. Post one not only didn't win a Breeders Crown event, it did not hit the board either: 7-4-10-8-8-7-8-5-9-6-10-8.

Odds on was good

Eight of the 12 Breeders Crown favorites won. All eight were odds on — the highest price \$3.80. Three of the favorites that got beat were also odds on, meaning that only Lyons Snyder at 2.20-1 in the sophomore colt pace (10th) was higher than even money.

The average win price for the night was \$8.90. The average odds of the runnerup was 14-1.

Hot in Hoosier

Next year is not a bad year to be heading to Hoosier Park for the Breeders Crown — it will be the 31st site the Crown has visited — especially considering we are looking at the strong likelihood of a 1-2-3 finish in the HOY balloting among Always B Miki, Wiggle It Jiggleit and Hannelore Hanover — all Hoosiers.

Six bombs nearly landed

 $57-1\ 60-1$, $132-1\ 31-1\ 43-1$ and 36-1 all hit the board this past weekend. But get this. Of the 117 horses competing -60-or 51.3 per cent - were higher than 30-1 odds.

You might not believe this one

Seven different drivers won a Breeders Crown race in 2016. But only one of those did not also drive at least one 100-1 shot (David Miller). The other six did and that doesn't include John Campbell, who was an ultra-competitive third with a 132-1 shot.

Brian Sears (Flanagan Memory) was 183-1 with Bettor Be Steppin (8th). Yannick Gingras (three wins) was 132-1 with Melmerby Beach (8th) and 176-1 Lindwood Beach Girl (9th). Brett Miller (Racing Hill) was 102-1 with Luck Be Withyou (7th) and 126-1 Winter Harbor (7th). Scott Zeron (Call Me Queen Be) was 187-1 with I'm So Fancy (8th) and 177-1 with Broadway Idole (9th). Tim Tetrick (3 wins) was 120-1 with Mach It So (5th) and Marcus Miller (Someomensomewhere) was 125-1 with JJ Flynn (9th).

The Beach's Crown

For the second straight year, Somebeachsomewhere was the leading money-winning sire in the Breeders Crown with his progeny earning \$1,479,520 this year. That total

represents 51.6 per cent of all the pacing money he could possibly have won — and he didn't have a horse in the mare pace. Somebeachsomewhere was the only sire to win three Crown races (Muscle Hill won a pair).

Nice night for Millers

David Miller followed up his five-Crown record night in 2015 with two winners and 10 checks. It was a nice Breeders Crown for other "Millers" with Erv getting on the board, Marcus debuting with Someomensomewhere at 17-1 and holding on and Brett winning for the second straight year — this time in a three-year-old Breeders Crown record 1:48 (Racing Hill). Andy Miller was fifth with Sutton, the elimination winner among the three-year-old trotting colt set.

Campbell's quality drives

John Campbell had four Crown drives, but he got the most from them. He was second with L A Delight at 7-2, third with 132-1 shot Sunshine Delight in the freshman female trot and third with defending older trotter champion J L Cruze at 20-1. Campbell only missed a check with Celebrity Eventsy, who was eighth.

Takter v. Burke

Jimmy Takter's slate — three wins, a second and three thirds Ron Burke's slate — one win, three seconds and two thirds.

Sears, say what!?!

The average odds for Crown drives by 2017 Hall of Fame inductee Brian Sears was 46-1.

Feast or famine for Tetrick

Tim Tetrick had a natural hat trick with Wallner \$2.40, Huntsville \$3.60 and Bar Hopping \$3.80 — all three odds on winners. Oddly, Tetrick did not hit the board in his other nine assignments: 4-5-5-6-6-6-5-9-7.

Kakaley bargains

Matt Kakaley is my new value shopper. He did not have a single drive that was less than 36-1, yet he managed quite well considering. Miso Fast at 43-1 was 3rd; Manhattan Beach at 60-1 was 2nd, Skinny Dipper at 62-1 was 10th, Waitlifter K at 35-1 was 8th, Classical Annie at 125-1 was 5th, Sassa Hanover at 36-1 was 2nd, All Bets Off at 54-1 was 6th, Rockette at 158-1 was 7th and Snowstorm Hanover at 92-1 was 7th.

Walner and Tim Tetrick were dominant winners in their Kindergarten final Saturday at The Meadowlands.

Breeders Crown champs repeat in Kindergarten finals

Fresh off their Breeders Crown triumphs last week, Walner (\$2.10) and Someomensomewhere (\$2.80) came back to capture their Kindergarten Classic series finals with flair on Saturday (Nov. 5) evening at The Meadowlands.

In the \$200,600 Kindergarten final for two-year-old trotting colts and geldings (race 2), the impressive Walner

used the first seven-sixteenths of the mile to work clear, striding clear of Limerence (Åke Svanstedt) just before completing a :55.4 half mile. The son of Chapter Seven and Random Destiny would go on to parry a first-over challenge from his stablemate Eastern Promise (John Campbell) on the far turn before accelerating away from the field at Tim Tetrick's first asking. Walner amassed seven lengths of clearance over Simply Volo (Corey Callahan), who rallied off third-over cover to take second. Fly On (Andy Miller) hooked wide from around a wall of horses to save third.

Walner's 1:53.2 mile earned him a seventh career win in eight starts for owner Kenneth Jacobs and trainer Linda Toscano.

Someomensomewhere narrowly prevailed in the \$149,100 Kindergarten final for two-year-old pacing fillies (race 8), just reaching up to collar Caviart Ally at the end of a 1:51.2 mile. Marcus Miller settled the daughter of Somebeachsomewhere and Omen Hanover just off the top trio on the first turn before angling out to stalk the live cover of Caviart Ally (Andy McCarthy) through the far turn. As Cavairt Ally wore down pacesetter Gurl Band K (Joe Bongiorno), Someomensomewhere mounted her late bid after losing cover, chasing down the filly she stalked through the far turn for the narrow win. No Chaser (Andy Miller) checked in third,

Meanwhile, there was a dead heat between Air Strike and Chip Walther in the Kindergarten final for two-year-old pacing colts.

some five-and-three-quarter lengths detached.

Erv Miller trains four-time winner Someomensomewhere for the Nick Surick Stable and Howard Schneidler's KDM Stables.

The \$147,200 Kindergarten final for two-year-old pacing colts and geldings (race 4) wasn't lacking for the dramatic, as not only did a scant head separate the top four finishers, but the favored pair of Air Strike and Chip Walther finished in a dead heat for the win in 1:52.1. Air Strike (David Miller), the Joe Holloway-trained Indiana star, used a middle move to take charge from Erv Miller trainee Chip Walther (Marcus Miller) through a :55.4 half mile before working to withstand first-over pressure from Mac's Jackpot (Tim Tetrick) through the late stages of the race. But while Air Strike was able to keep Mac's Jackpot at bay, Chip Walther found room to hook three-wide at the eighth pole and surge late for a share of the win. Deo de Janiero (Scott Zero) mounted late gains up the pegs for third, missing the joint winners by a mere nose.

Val D'Or Farms and Ted Gewertz own Air Strike, while the partnership of the Erv Miller Stable, Paymaq Racing, the Nick Surick Stable, and Louis Willinger share ownership of Chip Walther.

While favorites lived up to their billing in three of the Kindergarten events, Overdraft Volo (\$34.80) sprung a major upset in the \$190,200 two-year-old filly trot. As favorites Feed Your Head (Yannick Gingras) and Hillarmbro (Trond Smedshammer) dueled on approach to the far turn, David Miller angled the daughter of Yankee Glide and Bank of Newport fourth-over. Overdraft Volo circled three-wide off the far turn and took aim on the top pair, chasing them down and striking the front a sixteenth from home before

accelerating away to a 1:55 victory by one-and-a-quarter lengths. Hillarmbro and Feed Your Head finished second and third, respectively.

Julie Miller trains Overdraft Volo for the Pinske Stables and the Kentuckiana Racing Stable.

In a non-wagering Racing Under Saddle (RUS) event, presented by Back on Track and Knutsson trotting, Richard Gutnick's Modest Prince and Helene Gregory held a clear lead over five others en route to a decisive 1:56.3 victory that was a North American RUS race record. Linda Toscano trains the six-year-old RC Royalty gelding.

Total handle for the 13-race card was \$2,425,766.

Live racing returns to The Meadowlands on Friday (Nov. 11). Post time is slated for 7:15 p.m. EST.

Bar Hopping sets Hoosier track record

The sophomore trotting colt highlighted a stakes-filled card Friday at the Anderson, IN track.

Fresh off a win in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown Final for three-year-old trotting colts, Bar Hopping was back in the spotlight as he ventured to Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Friday (Nov. 4) to turn in a dominant performance and take home top honors in the featured event of the evening on a stakes filled card, the \$220,000 Carl Erskine Trot for three-year-old trotting colts.

With Tim Tetrick in the bike, Bar Hopping staged a big rally late in the lane to hold off all rivals in 1:53.4 and establish a new track record in the process. The previous track record for three-year-old trotting colts was a 1:54.3 mark established by Creatine and David Miller in the 2013 edition of the Carl Erskine Trot.

Leaving from post two in a talented field of 10, Bar Hopping left alertly, but Andy Miller had Sutton firing off the gate from post three to grab the early lead through the opening panel in :27.1. Bar Hopping was content to sit in the

pocket while Bridge To Jesse's and John DeLong were next in line third. Dayson and Yannick Gingras were unable to find a spot along the rail and pressed on to the lead to reach the front just before the half in :56.2.

Dayson continued to call the shots at three-quarter clocking in 1:26.2, but Tetrick had Bar Hopping on the attack first-over. As the field turned for home, the stage was set for a battle to the wire. Tetrick asked his mount for more and Bar Hopping utilized a :27 final quarter to get the win by a quarter of a length over a game Dayson. Sutton held on for third place honors. As the 1-5 heavy betting favorite, Bar Hopping returned \$2.60 at the betting windows.

"I wanted to be a lot closer than I was but my colt almost ran in the first turn so I had to be careful," Tetrick, who won last year's edition of the Carl Erskine behind Crazy Wow, said after the victory. "He fought it out and went a great trip. He has been close all year racing the best colts in the country and he deserves the big wins that he's got. I'm just happy to be a part of it."

Trained by Jimmy Takter, the millionaire trotter has now won nine of 18 seasonal starts while bankrolling \$1,171,795 in purse earnings. The son of Muscle Hill—Cocktail Hour recorded his third consecutive victory and 10th lifetime win for his connections of Christina Takter, Hatfield Stables,

Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

The Grand Circuit stakes action continued in the very next race of the program and it was Check Six who went gate to wire in the \$200,000 Monument Circle Pace for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings. With Yannick Gingras in the bike, Check Six stopped the timer in 1:51 to win by nearly two lengths over stablemate Manhattan Beach and Matt Kakaley. With the win, Check Six recorded his 10th win of the season and became the sport's newest millionaire.

As one of five Ron Burke-trained horses in the field, Check Six left alertly from post two to grab the early lead in :26.4. Manhattan Beach also left aggressively but was content to sit in the pocket for much of the mile. Gingras was able to slow the tempo a touch to dictate middle fractions of :56 and 1:24.2 before ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field.

Stablemate Downthehighwy and Ricky Macomber Jr. were the first to commit to the outer flow and had reached the leader's wheel as the field turned for home. Manhattan Beach looked poised to strike from the pocket, but Check Six was strong on the front. Check Six used a :26.3 final quarter en route to a near two length victory over Manhattan Beach and a hard charging Mystical Rock and Andy Shetler. As the 3-5 favorite, Check Six returned \$3.20 at the betting windows.

"I definitely expected some speed from the outside but when the gate opened, there were only two of us leaving out of there so I was happy about that," said Gingras, who has two previous victories in the Monument Circle. "I had control of the race and I was able to rate the mile so when we turned for home I didn't think they were going to beat me from there. My horse went a brutal trip in his last start but he was very game again tonight, he is super sharp right now."

Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, W. Switala, and J. Martin, Check Six recorded his 14th win from 30 lifetime outings. Now sporting a bankroll of \$1,070,304, the Somebeachsomewhere—Southwind Vanna colt has won 10 of 21 seasonal starts.

Not to be outdone by their male counterparts, the three-year-old trotting fillies and pacers kicked off the Grand Circuit Stakes action earlier in the card in impressive fashion. Gingras found the winner's circle for the first time of the evening behind Flowers N Songs in the \$115,000 Crossroads of America stakes for three-year-old trotting fillies. Overcoming a tough, first-over trip, the Rich Gillock trained filly dug in gamely in the stretch to get the win by a head in 1:54.3.

"Hats off to her connections for her keeping her on the top

of her game all year," Gingras said. "Rich Gillock has the filly this week, but Paul Reid has done a great job with her. She's raced week in and week out and traveled all over the country, and she proved again tonight that she is a very nice filly."

Unraced at two, Flowers N Songs recorded her 11th win from 31 seasonal outings. Owned by Robert Key, the daughter of Deweycheatumnhowe—Pleasure's Song pushed her seasonal bankroll to \$499,314.

Indiana Sires Stakes champion Seventimesavirgin found herself back in a familiar place, the winner's circle, in the \$112,500 USS Indianapolis Memorial for three-year-old pacing fillies. After going undefeated in Indiana Sires stakes action this season, Seventimesavirgin was handed her first loss in nine starts in Grand Circuit stakes action last week at Hoosier Park but rebounded gamely to score in 1:52.1.

Leaving from the rail, Seventimesavirgin left just enough to secure a pocket trip behind the pacesetting Yankee Moonshine and Yannick Gingras. DeLong was content to sit in the pocket through fractions of :27.2, :56.3 and 1:25.2 before making his move in deep stretch.

While the rest of the field was fanning out across the track, DeLong moved his filly to the passing lane and she exploded passed her rivals to get the win by three and quarter lengths. Can't Touch This, also an Indiana Sires Stakes winner, rallied gamely for Todd Warren to get up for second place honors. Time On My Hands and Trace Tetrick rounded out the trifecta. As the 3-5 favorite, Seventimesavirgin returned \$3.20 to win.

"We've just been doing what we've done all season and stuck to our plan," said DeLong, who also handles the training duties of the filly. "She raced really good last week too, they can't win every week and we were not disappointed at all but I am glad she's going out a winner, she deserves it.

"This was her last start of the year, she's pretty easy on herself and those breaks in between stake races really helped us out. She's going to get some well deserved R&R and hopefully be back for more next year."

The homebred daughter of Always A Virgin—Mrs Grant Seven ended her sophomore campaign winning 13 of 15 starts while amassing \$411,100 this season. Owned by Jesse J. DeLong, Seventimesavirgin has now won 18 of 27 lifetime.

Gural changes mind, stakes program will return to Big M in 2017

I would like to thank those of you who participated in our many stakes races this season. The battles between Wiggle it Jiggleit and Always B Miki have been quite thrilling with one more round coming up in next Saturday's TVG Championship.

In general, I thought we offered a wide array of sires stakes, small stakes and major stakes with total stakes purses for 2016 amounting to over \$17.8 million, including the Breeders Crown.

As the stakes season winds down and we face the reality that the (casino) referendum is likely to lose because of the clever approach the opposition took tying this into a vote on whether you trust the politicians in Trenton, it is clear that we have to be in this for the long haul. It is only a matter of time before we succeed in this effort, but it could take as long as six years until all seven casinos open in New York.

As I previously stated, we have overpaid the purse account by approximately \$6 million and my original plan was to drastically reduce the stakes program to

recover this money. After seeing the strong showing in Lexington at the sale, I had a change of heart and decided it was important to maintain the majority of our stakes. We have also agreed to play host to next year's Fall Final Four races for two-year olds when we open in mid-November of 2017.

We decided to reach out to the participants who benefit from our facility and our strong stakes program by trying to get sponsors for all our stakes. As Harrisburg approaches, I am pleased to say that the response from the industry has been quite positive and I am reasonably certain by the end of the stakes season next Saturday with the \$1.2 million TVG finals we will have lined up sponsors or co-sponsors for all of our stakes.


I am also very pleased to report that we have received sponsorship support from the Meadowlands drivers' colony, the veterinarians practicing in New Jersey, major breeders, owners, trainers and others who benefit from keeping our stakes program close to where it was this year, with the exception of the Breeders Crown, which is going to Hoosier.

As far as our long term future, I have reached out to my major partners and we all agree we are in this for the long haul. I am in the process of reworking our debt, so no one

should be worried that this likely defeat at the polls will affect the long-term survival of the Meadowlands.

I remain concerned about the horse shortage as fewer and fewer mares are being bred each year. The fact is that, unlike Canada, we do not work together to adjust for the horse shortage and instead hurt ourselves by racing as many races as possible and as many days as possible. We should sit down and address this problem together for the good of the sport.

The other mistake is the failure of the states that do subsidize the sport to insist that a percentage of the slots money be used for marketing. The law I helped write in New York requires that the racino owners spend a minimum of 10 per cent of their VLT revenue on marketing.

Jeff Gural said he now plans to keep the Meadowlands stakes schedule intact for 2017.

In the end, people will look back at that decision as the single biggest mistake ever made by any business and the result will be devastating to our young participants. The sad part is I bet if we took a vote the horsemen would support that concept overwhelmingly but we have no Commissioner to head us in the right direction.

In any case, for those of you looking to buy a yearling next week, rest assured that our stakes program will be strong and we are here to stay.





Court issues judgment in Pena v. NY State Gaming Commission

The State of New York Supreme Court Appellate Division has issued a memorandum and judgment in the matter of trainer Luis Pena vs. the New York State Gaming Commission.

Betting Line officially retired

Trainer Casie Coleman has informed Trot Insider that the connections of Betting Line p,3,1:47.2f (\$1,879,061) have been forced to retire the multiple stakes winning three-year-old.

"We made the final decision today (Friday, Nov. 4)," Coleman said. "We wanted to end on a winning note, but it wasn't meant to be."

Although the connections have been forced to forgo Betting Line's next three scheduled races (the Matron Stakes and the Hap Hansen Progress Pace), Betting Line still retires on a winning streak. The son of Ontario sire Bettor's Delight was carrying an impressive 14-race win streak into October's Breeders Crown eliminations, which he was forced to be scratched from due to having suffered two serious spider bites on one of his shoulders.

"We planned on supplementing him to the Matron Stakes (which will take place at Dover Downs next week) and then follow that up with the Progress Pace, which he was paid into," Coleman said.

"He had been coming back from the spider bite well. He had been jogging well and I was happy with the way he was coming along. He seemed like he was getting better.

"David Miller trained him this morning (Nov. 4) and he just wasn't himself. He was flat. David said that he wasn't right up on the iron. He also wasn't striding out with the one leg, which shows to us that he isn't over those bites on his shoulder."

The connections of Betting Line announced in mid-September that the brown colt would retire at the end of the 2016 racing campaign and stand stud at Hanover Shoes Farms in Pennsylvania for the 2017 breeding season.

"He's going to stay here at White Birch Farm until Monday (Nov. 7) and he will then ship to Hanover Shoe Farms," said Coleman. "The partners will be meeting in Harrisburg next week, at which point we will decide on a stud fee."

Betting Line retires with a career slate that reads 27 starts, 20 wins, a trio of second-place finishes and a pair of third-place finishes. He banked \$1,879,061 in purses for his connections and retires with a pair of world records under his belt. His 1:47.2 victory in the Battle of the Brandywine set a new world record for 3-year-old male pacers on a five-eighths-mile track, while his 1:49 mile in the second heat of the Little Brown Jug is the world record for 3-year-old pacing colts over a half-mile track.

After having just tasted defeat in an overnight to begin his 3-year-old campaign, Betting Line assembled a staggering season. He won his next 14 races, which included wins in the \$780,000 Pepsi North America Cup, the \$500,000 Battle of the Brandywine, \$300,000 Millstein Memorial, the \$276,960 Little Brown Jug, the \$157,111 Simcoe Stakes, and a sweep of all of his Ontario Sires Stakes races, including his \$190,000 OSS Super Final.

Northlands to continue racing into 2018

The agreement allows the industry a seamless transition into Century Mile while addressing the unique needs of all breeds. We are very pleased at the spirit of cooperation that is indicated by this licence extension," said Shirley McClellan, CEO of HRA.

"This is a win/win/win," noted Tim Reid, president and CEO of Northlands. "It is a win for the HRA in that this deal provides stability and a go forward plan for the horse racing community. It is a win for the City of Edmonton in that it allows administration time to evaluate future Area Redevelopment Plans in accordance with the Council motion and timelines and it is a win for Northlands in that it affords us the time to continue to work on our future development plans."

Faraldo v. Gural, round???

I read with interest the comment of Jason Settlemoir in Friday's Harness Racing Update (page 10) about "budgeting" a percentage of the horsemen's purse money to "...market our sport and fund enhanced drug testing."

Once again, this time through his chief operative, we have an enunciation of the Jeff Gural mantra: that the horsemen's purse fund should be the sole source of marketing and drug testing in OUR industry. The "OUR", of course, refers to track operators, as well as horsemen and breeders.

In New York, Pennsylvania and other jurisdictions where purse levels are higher, and to which Jason's comment appears to be aimed, it must be remembered that while track operators share in racing revenue, their share of the gaming revenue that helps fund purses is at or near THREE (3) times that which is allocated to the horsemen's purse account.

At Yonkers Raceway, the horsemen willingly and often offer and/or agree to fund and share 50/50 the initiatives that come from the track, as well as those from the horsemen. The Standardbred Owners Association of New York (SOA) believes that to be fair, and applauds the work being done in partnership with, and in the initiatives emanating from, Yonkers' management.

By the same token, we believe that some marketing plans praised by industry leaders, while well intended, proved to be such a wasteful use of industry assets that many horsemen's associations refused to wholeheartedly support it. In contrast, New York horsemen have partnered with Yonkers in intelligent, efficacious marketing initiatives, including simulcasting to France and throughout the French PMU's distribution network; bringing back the International Trot; starting a New York cross-breed Daily Double with the most valuable signal in all of racing – NYRA; and many more.

In short, our horsemen are committed to the judicious and partnered funding of projects deemed worthwhile, and for which they share a say in the thoughtful and planned out use of the money they allocate. That being said, the SOA will not permit pilfering of the purse account by someone with one hand, while their other hand is lodged firmly in a locked grip in their own pocket; especially when that pocket is three

times as flush. Pilfering a purse account as the sole funding source is just an expansion of the "OPM" theory of economics; wherever possible, always utilize "other people's money".

In relation to drug testing, the old adage is still true: "You are not going to find what you don't know it is you should be looking for." That hasn't changed in all the years since my college days as a chemistry major. While drug testing is heralded as a panacea, it is no more than largely a great sound bite for those waving the flag of enhanced integrity without substantive value. Think about some famous cyclists and how they were caught. It wasn't through drug testing. While drug testing is useful as a tool, just throwing money at this problem does not solve it. Doing so may play well in the media, but it solves very little.

The real, honest answer is that thoughtful drug testing needs to be paired with a complimentary investigative arm to create a truly comprehensive approach. So regardless of the location of a track – or how hard an operator may be blowing his own horn or wrongly touting the infallibility of unregulated foreign drug testing labs – the fact of the matter is that testing without an investigatory component is just a very sad fraud upon folks who are not aware and an insult to the intelligence of horsemen who darn well know better.

Gural responds

I think Joe has made it his life's mission to make sure that the old guys take all the money depriving the young people who love and have decided to make careers in harness racing any long term future. Old people tend to die eventually and if a business does not replace them with young people, guess what happens?

When Joe and I were on speaking terms, I often told him to take care of his health as I wanted him to be alive when Rooney finally said, 'Enough is enough. We are losing a fortune and no one is in the grandstand watching or wagering on our mediocre product.'

Joe's marketing effort are so successful that just yesterday I noticed that the handle in N America on our first race, an amateur trot, was double the handle on the International Trot.

Rather then let Joe decide this for the industry, I challenge him to agree to put this issue to a vote of the people who are effected by this. At my expense, I propose we send out ballots to all the members of the USTA and Standardbred Canada asking if they would be willing to allocate five per cent of the money received from slots to fund a new major marketing initiative to hire top flight marketing executives

and come up with a plan to market the sport including a major TV presence every Saturday night exposing our product to the viewing audience.

This year, we had a great story to tell with Wiggle it Jiggleit vs. his arch rival Always B Miki and yet the reality is no one knows we exist. Here in New York and New Jersey, we get no media exposure. Even our 40th anniversary got no coverage. I agree \$250,000 is a waste, but maybe with \$25 million we can at least let the world know we exist. If Joe agrees to get his fellow leaders of the horsemen to abide by the decision, and if a majority don't want to do it, then I will never bring it up again. This is too important for one person to decide this for an entire industry.

As far as drug testing is concerned, I intend next year to double the money we currently spend to catch the cheats. Joe seems content to just lecture on the subject.

One last thing: When I went back and read Anthony MacDonald's story and all the comments besides Jason's, it did not appear anyone agreed with Joe.

It may be too, late but let's put it to a vote.

Casinos are not the answer

I really enjoyed watching the races over last Friday and Saturday nights. There where some great heart-pounding finishes and enjoyable racing, if you were able to find a live feed on TV or a computer. But (you knew this was coming) very, very few of the races offered any real betting interests. It was either a two-horse race, 4-5 and 8-5 or a 1-5. The average payout on all the races was just about even money. Mostly any other horse was 15-1 or greater.

I understand that in most divisions there was an absolutely dominant horse. Watching Always B Miki and Wiggle It battle in their eighth meeting of the year was fantastic and exciting, but you can't bet that race. At least I can't.

Which leads me into another thing I think is hurting the sport of harness racing. It can't be all about breeding. Over the last few weeks your "Update" has been mostly about breeding sales.

How many Somebeachsomewhere or Muscle Hills were sold is not going to create public interest in harness racing. You need to generate fans. Fans generate betting and the sport survives on betting handle.

One stallion breeds about 150 mares a season. How many will never make the races, or how many can't put one foot in front of the other? For example, looking over various two-and three-year-old races you can find five or six of 10 horse with the same sire. How many can win next years Meadowlands Pace or Hambletonian? On any given night you can see many well bred horses racing in tracks all over

for \$2,500.

Always B Miki and Wiggle It are Indiana-breds. They came from humble stock. Do you think people came out to see them race because of who their father or mother was?

The em-phasis is on the wrong sy-lable. (Hope you understand that).

Year after year, harness racing is going down in handle and attendance. Most tracks don't even post the attendance. The Meadowlands is in a life and death struggle to survive. They are trying to bring in casino gambling. Recently, the pro-forces decided to stop advertising because their polling told them it didn't have a chance.

Furthermore, harness racing cannot tie its future to casino gambling. In mostly all the places that have harness racing they have a casino. When you go to these tracks you can bring one pizza and feed all the horse players. Horse players are not casino gamblers. Actually they're not casinos they are slot machine places. There are no table games, no live dealers just machines.

These places were given their gambling license if they continued racing. How soon do you think the owners of these tracks will continue racing if they were allowed to discontinue it? The States are so dependent on the revenue generated from these casinos that when the day comes that the casino owners come and say, 'We don't make money from racing, we actually lose money, we wish to discontinue racing. By discontinuing racing we can generate more revenue to the State.' What will the States answer be?

What happened to Roosevelt Raceway? Gulf and Western sold a bill of goods to Nassau County. They bought the property with a clause that they had to continue racing for five years. They didn't spend a dime on the place. They let it rot, till you couldn't find two unbroken seats together in the grandstand. Then they sold it to real estate developers for an obscene profit, which was their intention all along.

Casinos are not the answer, it's a band aid. With band aids you have to deal with the pain when you rip them off.


