Joe and Jeff have more in common than we think

No, that headline is not a misprint.

I understand perfectly; the sometimes interesting, often acrimonious chatter between New York SOA head Joe Faraldo and Meadowlands chief executive Jeff Gural (as seen again in Harness Racing Update yesterday) tends to make readers cringe. Most wish they would just get along, and stop the sniping. Most believe if one says the sky is blue the other would argue the point, and it's unhealthy for the sport.

While I agree it is ideal if the communication was more respectful, I think it's healthy for the sport of harness racing that this back and forth exists between the two. Passionate discussion opens up more passionate discussion. The resulting debate moves the sport forward 10 times out of 10.

And, if you look at the arguments closely, there is much more common ground than we think. I believe yesterday's letters to the editor from each man illustrates my point.

Joe Faraldo took exception to the Meadowlands' Jason Settlemoir's comment that a percentage of purse money should be used to market the sport of harness racing. This idea is nothing new, and, in fact, it's been going on in a micro-way for some time. Mr. Faraldo himself spoke of what

the SOA has been doing with marketing in his letter to the editor – increasing reach of the Yonkers product by exporting races to France, the work done on the International Trot, etc.

Mr. Faraldo seems to believe the horsemen should be rowing the 'marketing' boat.
But he doesn't

think they should be the only ones rowing the boat.

"That being said, the SOA will not permit pilfering of the purse account by someone with one hand, while their other hand is lodged firmly in a locked grip in their own pocket; especially when that pocket is three times as flush. Pilfering a purse account as the sole funding source is just an expansion of the OPM theory of economics; wherever possible, always utilize other people's money," he wrote.

Does Jeff Gural disagree with this? I can't speak for him, but from what I see he is probably the largest track operator of any breed who actively promotes the sport, with slots or without slots; often with his own money.

In fact, Jeff Gural in black and white has said how important he believes this is.

"The law I helped write in New York requires that the racino owners spend a minimum of 10 per cent of their VLT revenue on marketing," he wrote in HRU yesterday.

Where there is major disagreement, it is about how to spend the money. Joe Faraldo believes pure marketing lacks efficacy, whereas Jeff Gural believes it can help. This type of disagreement is common in marketing departments and in business, so it's nothing new. That's what you hire experts for, and this disagreement is eminently fixable.

Interestingly enough, yesterday the discussion between the two pivoted to drug testing and enforcement.

Joe Faraldo: "Think about some famous cyclists and how they were caught. It wasn't through drug testing. While drug


testing is useful as a tool, just throwing money at this problem does not solve it. The real, honest answer is that thoughtful drug testing needs to be paired with a complimentary investigative arm to create a truly comprehensive approach."

I think we all agree with Joe's words. And, doesn't Jeff agree, too?

Jeff Gural hired an in-house investigator when he took over the Meadowlands, and has said how important it's been to




identifying some of the bad apples. He's said so in interviews at the *Paulick Report*, *Thoroughbred Daily News* and elsewhere, where thoroughbred racing has been calling for similar for their sport. He also said he spends money on a three-pronged approach – better testing, more out of competition testing and investigation – at his tracks.

Again, there are real disagreements about how to go about creating a department to handle this harness racing-wide. Some who say they're for this policy may be saying so for optics and will stand in the way of reform. There are legal issues bigger than the sport itself, and the whole exercise is like herding cats covered in canola oil. But on the surface, aren't both men agreeing?

Vermont congressman Peter Welch said, "there's a tendency in politics to attribute bad motivation much too quickly, and the sooner you attribute bad motivation to someone you disagree with, the harder it is to find common ground to make some progress."

It's clear Jeff and Joe do not get along well, and have their own questions in regards to the other's motivation. That's fine; they have a past and they are men with strong opinions. But on the outside looking in, the rest of us can ably see that they are both spending money on marketing (although in different ways), and both have similar ideas about moving forward with a 21st century drug testing, investigative and enforcement regime. That should mean something, and just discussing it – even in the ways in which Jeff and Joe do – does the sport a service, not a disservice.

Hugh Mitchell's 10,000-Foot View

The CEO of The Western Fair District shares his thoughts on industry consultations designed to revitalize horse racing in Ontario with a multi-year funding plan and all tracks working together under the direction of the Woodbine Entertainment Group.

Hugh Mitchell is well aware there are critics of the early details behind the reshaping of Ontario's horse racing industry. Still, the chief executive officer of The Western Fair District in London, ON that operates one of the province's oldest racetracks, said this week there is a lot to like about a plan that, to start, could deliver 22 years of government funding amounting to over \$2 billion in total.

"The good news is that the government is thinking about a long-term funding solution, long-term being out as far as 2038, which matches up with some of the slot licenses and lease agreements, for Woodbine, particularly," Mitchell said. "I can't remember any jurisdictions in my time where government had committed funding for as many years, some 22 (years) when you look at our (current deal) expiring in 2021, plus an additional 17 years. So, that's really good news."

Mitchell said the fact the funding arrangement is partly designed to align with the Ontario Lottery and Gaming (OLG) corporation's lease arrangements for slot halls at tracks in the province is an indication the OLG — a former adversary of horse racing — "is taking some responsibility for racing and supporting racing on behalf of the government."

On Oct. 31, Ontario Racing (OR), the industry collective tasked with overseeing racing's revival, began a province-wide, three-week, seven-stop tour to consult members of the industry in an effort to devise the best strategy for growing the business.


Stable, long-term funding is welcome news in an industry on the rebound after the devastation caused by the province's cancellation of the Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP) in 2012.

At the core of the plan is to expand the existing Standardbred Alliance concept to all interested tracks in the province across all three racing breeds — standardbreds, thoroughbreds and quarter horses. Currently, there are 13 tracks operating in Ontario and those that buy in will get a cut of the nearly \$100 million in annual government funding. The Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) that currently coordinates the eight-track Standardbred Alliance is also

expected to manage an expanded, Ontario-wide alliance.

"The genesis of that model the government is touting is WEG overseeing a broader alliance came out of the successes of the Standardbred Alliance," Mitchell said. "It's just an expansion. It's tremendously successful — one race office, one tote company. We never would have gotten there. That's one of the pluses that has come out of the cancellation of SARP because we had no other choice. This would not have happened, if we still had 10 per cent of the slot revenue for (tracks) and 10 per cent for the horsepeople. I'm convinced it would never have happened. There wouldn't have been the need, but it was either do it or sink.

"I really think we'll be forced to become more customer-driven than ever before. So that's a good story. I think we're going to be forced to drive some efficiencies in

our operation that I think that otherwise, given the false economies created by slots, we wouldn't have driven ourselves. We're now forced to be more accountable to each other, not just with government but with ourselves... We're an industry where tracks never wanted to share financial information with horsemen and vice versa, so now we're going to be forced to put everything on the table."

There have been just two public consultation sessions so far, but already there has been the predictable grumbling on three major points: 1. There's not enough purse money to sustain ownership at the medium-sized tracks and smaller. 2. Some don't like that WEG, which once competed against Ontario's other tracks, will likely will be given the authority to coordinate racing for all tracks in the province and 3. There's a lack of new blood and leadership among those in charge of this revitalization. Namely, the board of Ontario Racing is just a carryover from the defunct Ontario Horse Racing Industry Association (OHRIA) that had its critics.

Mitchell, who is on the steering committee of OR, is fond of espousing a "10,000 foot view," which just means he has a

particular gift for a province-wide perspective. Rather than wait for a perfect solution that may never come, he prefers the industry, "get rolling. I'm more concerned about any more lag, just because we've already lost a fair bit of capital in the



horse ownership side and the breeding side. So, let's just start... and the cards we've been given by the government, let's start to play them and take it where we might think it needs to go. We'll be in a better position to argue for more money and more support once we are into it, rather than now when we don't know what that right number is.

"It's not perfect, by any means, but at least it's, to me, two meals a day is better than no meals a day so let's get going."

Mitchell counters the three chief criticisms to the plan.

He said he doesn't "know what the right number is (for purses), but let's get into this, let's get going and get our governance right and start to work with government and see if we can drive up additional revenue through other products or other integration strategies... working with the OLG."

On the issue of the OR board being the same people that were on the board of OHRIA, Mitchell said the current OR board is an interim one.

"I don't see it as being permanent at all. That's no disrespect to those people and some of them may stay... but it was never intended to be for the long-term, so I think the right step is what they've done. I give OHRIA some credit and the OLG for pushing it in that direction too, is putting OHRIA in that role as the interim board of OR. That, I agree with, to the critics I say, 'Be patient'. Rome wasn't built in a day. It took a long time for this industry to get to where we are and we're not going to get out of this hole overnight."

As for WEG potentially being put in charge of racing for the province, Mitchell, a former WEG executive, said it is the correct move.

"I'm a big supporter of WEG. I've witnessed for many years their willingness to support the industry, their genuine benevolence," Mitchell said. "I've also witnessed, as a member of the alliance, the value they bring to the table, the efficiencies they've been able to drive into our collective operations. I can honestly say, we'd be sunk without Woodbine, we really would. They've driven some efficiencies. In terms of management skills, they are one of the premier racetracks in North America. So, why wouldn't you take advantage of that, if they are willing to do so and they've been willing to do so? I push back hard on those who criticize the WEG piece, but I don't think we'll ever be rid of that. I remember paddocking horses at Greenwood when I was 13 years old and people complaining about them then when they were the OJC (Ontario Jockey Club). So, it's not new to me."

Mitchell was also quick to point out there wasn't a viable option other than WEG.

"It's not like you can go to public tender and get 50 different responses. Does anyone really thing that a bunch of industry participants can get their heads together and go run a consortium like what we have? It's delirious. There's no other model like it in North America, so my thought is let's give it a try," he said.

Mitchell said there is a lot of work to be done, "but we're certainly in a better position today than we were in 2012. That's the good news."

Now everyone — himself included — needs to be open-minded about the consultation process.

"It took me a long time to learn that piece, but I think we need to listen carefully to the common themes that are surfacing when they do the consultation and pay attention to it... Ultimately we have to find a model that works for everybody."

The sad reality, Mitchell said, is the sport is, currently, not growing.

"We are becoming generations removed from racing and agriculture. My kids are not involved in racing. Me and my brother are because our dad was involved in racing. He was involved because his dad was... but that link is gone. The Mitchell family is not the only one experiencing that."

Helene Engblom and Shake It Cerry have traveled together to the races 60 times in the past four years, but their next trip is likely to be the most difficult. Shake It Cerry, the 2014

Trotter of the Year, is expected to make the final start of her illustrious career Saturday (Nov. 12) at the TVG Series Championships at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Engblom has been by Shake It Cerry's side for nearly her entire career. As a yearling, Shake It Cerry connected immediately with Engblom and in the ensuing years the two forged a relationship that extends beyond racehorse and caretaker into the realm of friendship and family.

"We have a very special bond and always have," Engblom said. "She's more than a horse. I can ABAPT ABAPTS

communicate with her. We can 'talk' and there's not so many horses like that. I know what she wants, I know what she means. She knows what I want, she knows what I mean.

"It's very easy to work with her. I can feel her mood. (The communication) is more like eye contact. I can see in her eyes and in her face what she wants. She knows the same

with me, if she can play or if it's serious and she has to behave. She's very special like that. I can trust her a hundred percent and she can trust me. The bond I have with Cerry, I've never had that with another horse in my whole life."

Shake It Cerry's connection with Engblom revealed itself

the moment they met.

"I started with the yearling group right away," said Engblom, who began working for the Jimmy Takter Stable, where her husband Per is second trainer, in November 2012. "One day, I got to jog her and in the afternoon I put her away. The next morning when I came to the barn she started nickering to me when she saw me. So I said to Per and the guys 'I want her. I think she likes me.' It was love at first sight. That's never happened before. We found a bond right away."

Shake It Cerry's love extends beyond Engblom to her family. Engblom's nine-year-old son,

Tom, also has a special relationship with Shake It Cerry. The mare is Tom's favorite horse and it seems that Tom is the mare's favorite young man. If Tom is down, Shake It Cerry lifts him up.

"One day he had his worst day ever, when everyone is against you and the whole world hates you," Engblom said.



TWO GREAT PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO HELP YOU MAKE MONEY

ONTARIO BRED

Definition

An **ONTARIO BRED** horse is the offspring of a mare that met the requirements of the **ONTARIO RESIDENT MARE PROGRAM** (ORMP) for that foaling year. A horse must be foaled in Ontario to be registered as ONTARIO BRED. A horse can be both ONTARIO SIRED and ONTARIO BRED and be eligible for incentives attached to each status.

ONTARIO BRED Benefits

The mare must be resident in Ontario at time of enrollment and remain in Ontario for 180 days including the date of foaling. Benefits available through the Program include:

Benefits for Breeders

Ontario Bred Rewards

Ontario Bred Rewards amount to 15% of their OSS earnings plus 15% of earnings in finals of selected Open Stakes in Ontario. These rewards are paid to the owners/lessees that enrolled the mare in the Ontario Resident Mare Program.

■ Enhanced Breeders' Rewards

Under the Breeders' Enhancement Program, administered by the Standardbred Breeders of Ontario Association (SBOA), breeders will receive approximately \$3M per year from 2015 to 2018 in various breeders' incentives. Benefits for Owners

■ \$2M Owners' Bonus (Starts 2017)

2017 will mark the first time that people who purchase ONTARIO BRED horses and race them in Ontario will be rewarded through the Standardbred Improvement Program. The new \$2 Million Owners' Bonus will be paid to the owners of 2- and 3-year-olds that are ONTARIO SIRED or ONTARIO BRED. If the foal is both ONTARIO SIRED and ONTARIO BRED, they will receive double the bonus. This bonus will be calculated on a pro-rata basis according to each horse's overnight earnings in Ontario. It will be paid in early January of the following year.

Eligibility for the ONTARIO RESIDENT MARE PROGRAM

- Mare Owners (or Lessees) must enrol their mare(s) as an ONTARIO RESIDENT MARE for each foal year, for their foals to be recognized as ONTARIO BRED.
- To be eligible as an ONTARIO RESIDENT MARE, a broodmare must be located within the boundaries of the Province of Ontario at the time of enrolment, AND must remain resident in the Province of Ontario for a minimum of 180 consecutive days surrounding foaling (in Ontario).
- The fee to enroll a mare in the Program is \$50 before she foals or \$300 after the foaling date but before September 1st of the foaling year. Third party proof of residency must be provided if enrolling after foaling.
- Once the ONTARIO RESIDENT MARE has met the requirements of the Program, the resulting foal will be registered as ONTARIO BRED and will be eligible for Program benefits.

"He was so sour. He just sat on a stool with his arms crossed and head down and wouldn't talk to me. She was looking at him so I took her out and she went straight towards him and put her nose (on his shoulder) and just stood there quietly.

"After a while he started to loosen up and soon he was himself again, laughing and jumping. She was like, 'Come here little brother, I can cure you.' She knew right away that something was wrong with him. It was amazing to see.

"He's spent almost half his life with her and she's spent almost her entire life around him. He's been brushing her, riding her, driving with her. They do everything together. They play sometimes and do silly games. They have that interaction. It's fun to see. They are really good friends."

Shake It Cerry has won 29 of 61 career races and hit the board a total of 49 times, earning \$2.78 million in purses. Her earnings rank fourth among all North American female trotters in harness racing history. She was a Dan Patch Award winner at ages two and three, with her 15-for-17 campaign at three resulting not only in divisional honors but Trotter of the Year.

"To see your horse be Trotter of the Year, that's a dream," Engblom said. "It's beyond a dream. Especially when you're a horse girl and have been around horses your whole life. I was so proud. She was so good that year. It feels good to see a horse you love so much do so well."

Engblom has traveled with Shake It Cerry to every one of the horse's races — except Shake It Cerry's first lifetime start. Shake It Cerry won that day at Pocono while Engblom was with three-year-old pacer Source Of Pride, who also won that day, in a track-record performance at Yonkers.

But from that moment on, Shake It Cerry would be Engblom's source of pride.

Shake It Cerry's lifetime wins include two Breeders Crown finals (2013 and 2014), the 2013 Merrie Annabelle, Goldsmith Maid and Matron Stakes, 2014 Elegantimage, Kentucky Filly Futurity, Delvin Miller Memorial, Moni Maker, Matron, American-National and Zweig Memorial, and 2015 TVG Series Championship for older female trotters.

Among Engblom's favorites are the 2013 Merrie Annabelle — a win Engblom predicted to Takter six months prior to the race — and the 2013 Breeders Crown.

"The Breeders Crown was kind of between her and Cooler Schooner," Engblom said. "Everyone believed in Cooler Schooner, but Cerry was the best that day. I was crying so bad. I was crying and crying. (Winning driver) Ron Pierce went up to Per afterwards and said, 'I'm so sorry I made your

wife cry.'

"I cried at all the big races, more or less. She did so many insane races. The way she won sometimes, it was so nice to see her swish by all the horses. She'd come in full of energy and hardly breathing. Of course you want your horse to do good, but she was just the very best."

Another memorable race was the 2015 Graduate Series Championship at the Meadowlands, where a hard-charging Shake It Cerry lost by a nose to male rival JL Cruze in a world-record 1:49.4 mile.

"She's always been full of energy," Engblom said. "She's super professional, both on and off the track, and always gives you her best. But the speed she had, I could feel it so early. You can feel the power she has. That's special."

Engblom is not looking forward to saying goodbye to Shake It Cerry, but she is happy her friend will be leaving the sport on her own terms and with the admiration of many fans and followers.

"I've been around horses my whole life, had my own horses for many, many years, but this is the hardest thing I'll ever have to do," Engblom said. "When you work with them every day and then you go and the stall is empty, I don't look forward to that.

"But I'm prepared. I know it's going to end. She's always happy, but she's not the same horse anymore. It's time. So even if I'm sad, it's the best thing to do for her."

And even when Shake It Cerry is gone, she won't be out of Engblom's sight.

"Everything in my house is Cerry, Cerry, Cerry," Engblom said, smiling. "She will always be around."

Modest Prince sets RUS track and North American record

On Saturday (Nov. 5), Modest Prince, a six-year-old altered son of RC Royalty set a new track and North American Record for racing under saddle with a 1:56.3 victory in the \$6,500 RUS America Trot at Meadowlands Racing and Entertainment. In setting the new North America record, Modest Prince shaved three-fifths-of-a second of the old 1:57.1 mark that was set by Master Prince on Hambletonian Day in 2012.

On paper, the race looked to be a two-horse affair with Hyway Marcus (Maria Buchanan) being the main threat, but that matchup was eliminated when Hyway Marcus went off-stride at the start. Modest Prince took the lead quickly and reached the first station in a brisk :27.2. From that point on, it was a race for second as Rider Helene Gregory sought to reign in the eventual winner, slowing the second quarter down to reach the half in :56.4. Modest Prince then completed the mile with a three-quarter time of 1:26.3, before stopping the teletimer in 1:56.3.

Hyway Marcus recovered from his early miscue to go from last making up sufficient ground to be in a photo for the place spot with Funny Photo (Sophie Engerran) besting him by half a length. The judges disqualified Hyway Marcus from third to last for violation of the breaking rule. Bosak (Vanessa Karlewicz) was in a tight photo of his own for fourth with My Friend Charlie (Andrea Pratt) before being elevated to third.

The RUS America season concludes on Tues., Nov. 15 when racing under saddle will be contested at Rosecroft Raceway.


