Fortunately, the cancer was caught early and the tumor that was found and removed is very small. The Hall of Fame pacing stallion's majority owners, along with Hanover Shoe Farms where Somebeachsomewhere stands, have vowed to put the best interests of the horse ahead of all else.

Brent MacGrath told *Harness Racing Update* on Saturday that Somebeachsomewhere has begun chemotherapy to battle cancer and is being treated by Dr. Rodney Belgrave an internal medicine specialist at the Mid-Atlantic Veterinary Center in Ringoes, NJ.

MacGrath, the trainer and part-owner of the 12-year-old Hall of Fame pacer and leading stallion, said the good news in a scary diagnosis is the cancer was caught early and the tumor, which has been removed, was quite small.

An issue with colic and the decision by Hanover Shoes Farms' farm manager Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky to send Somebeachsomewhere to the equine hospital to get thoroughly checked allowed veterinary surgeons to find the cancer early, MacGrath said.

"Beach has had some stomach issues for some time," MacGrath said Saturday. "We have treated him for colic in the

past and, this last episode, Bridgette wanted him sent to the hospital and checked out. So we did and they found the intestine in a bad spot. It was making him uncomfortable and we determined that we were going to go in and move it into its proper position. Everything looked very good, but he did have a small mass in there that was half the size of a grape."

Hanover Shoe Farms president Jim Simpson said the colon surgery performed about 10 days ago, "was very successful and they did three biopsies and one came back positive (for cancer). The course is to treat him, starting today.

"All we can hope for at this point is that they got it and we'll take care of him. Otherwise, he's really the picture of health in any other way. He looks good, feels good, but we must take care of this aggressively and that's what we are doing."

Somebeachsomewhere underwent the first of six weekly chemotherapy treatments on Saturday, said MacGrath, who stressed the only thing that matters is the health of the horse and doing what is right for the horse.

The stallion is syndicated, but the six-member Schooner Stable of Bible Hill, NS — MacGrath, Garry Pye, Stu Rath, Reg Petitpas, Pamela Dean and Jamie Bagnell — still holds majority ownership in the horse.

"All of us, the original six owners, our main concern is Beach... We just want him to have as happy and healthy a life for as long as he possibly can," MacGrath said. "We'll do whatever we can. Hanover's position is the same. We are very lucky to have them as a partner. It isn't all about the money with them or with us. It's about Beach and what he's done for

us and what he's done for the farm and what he's done for the sport. We're going to do whatever we can do for him. We're staying positive. Hoping for the best is all we can do.

"I feel very comfortable knowing that the best possible (treatment) is going to be done for him, without question."

The superstar son of Mach Three out of Wheres The Beach earned more than \$3.2 million on the track in 2007 and 2008, winning 20 of 21 starts and setting an all-age world record of 1:46.4 at age three at The Red Mile. He shared the Canadian Horse of the Year award in 2007 with Tell All and was named the Horse of the Year in both Canada and the United States in 2008. Somebeachsomewhere was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2009, the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2015 and has already sired the winners of more than \$82 million with just six racing-aged crops on the ground. He led all pacing sires in progeny earnings in 2016 with nearly \$20 million earned by his offspring. He is the leading pacing stallion in 2017. His progeny have earned more than \$22 million this year.

Four separate Somebeachsomewhere stallion shares were scheduled to be sold during the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's Mixed Sale session on Nov. 9, but the shares were pulled before the sale as a precautionary measure due to the stallion's colic surgery. That decision was made before Somebeachsomewhere was found to have cancer.

MacGrath said it was something of a blessing that Somebeachsomewhere had an issue with colic that allowed veterinarians to find the small tumor.

"We believe the best thing that could have happened to us was that he got colic. All indications are that we would have found it too late (otherwise)," MacGrath said. "We're certainly positive and optimistic about our chances. He's in the best place, with the best doctors. Bridgette and Jim moved very quickly to get him to Mid-Atlantic Hospital in New Jersey.

"And the silver lining here is that Beach is an extremely strong horse. That we know from everything that he's done."





Somebeachsomewhere television documentary begins production

The production is slated for an exclusive debut on Atlantic Canadian cable channel EastLink early next spring, which will coincide with Somebeachsomewhere's legendary three-year-old season.

A decade after his retirement to stud, Somebeachsomewhere is making a triumphant return — to television screens, in 2018.

Producer Dale Stevens and director Amanda Gallagher are making the as-yet untitled documentary for Clerisy Entertainment, a Dartmouth, NS-based media company founded in 2009, the year Somebeachsomewhere (p, 2,1:49.3s; 3,1:46.4m; \$ 3,221,299) retired to stud. Specializing in documentaries and lifestyle programming, they were previously uninvolved with the racing industry. Yet Gallagher and Stevens recognized ongoing, crowd-pleasing appeal in how the Schooner Stable's \$40,000 yearling became one of the greatest pacers ever to look through a bridle, and are bringing that story to Atlantic Canadian TV (and beyond) in spring 2018.

The project began months ago, before it was announced Saturday that Somebeachsomewhere undergoing chemotherapy to battle cancer (see story pg 1).

Stevens said encountering a 2017 *National Post* story about Somebeachsomewhere's breeding career and viewing an older EastLink television show on his success ("Some Horse") provided motivation to revisit the achievements of the star pacer trained and owned, in part, by Truro, NS horseman Brent MacGrath.

"Honestly, I hadn't really known about 'Beach' before starting the project," Stevens admitted. "We like to do stories that we can shoot locally with Nova Scotians, and tell stories that relate to the broader international population. Normally, we have to struggle really hard to find stories that have interest for people outside of Canada or even outside of our own area; this one was checking all the boxes, right away."

World champion Somebeachsomewhere's impact on the sport began with his undefeated two-year-old campaign for owner/trainer MacGrath and regular driver Paul MacDonell; entered the realm of legend with his Dan Patch and O'Brien Award Horse of the Year season at age three; and lives on via his sons and daughters, led by two-time Dan Patch Pacer of the Year Captaintreacherous (p, 3, 1:47.1m; \$3,148,697) and

double Breeders Crown distaff pacing champion Pure Country (p, 4, Q1:48.0m; \$1,793, 648). Among the Mach Three son's best performers this year are recent Matron Stake winner Downbytheseaside (p, 3, 1:48.3s; \$ 2,008,028); Meadowlands Pace winner Huntsville (p, 3, 1:47.4m; \$1,704,242); Breeders Crown Two-Year-Old Colt Pace victor Stay Hungry (p, 2, 1:50.2s; \$437,964); and Pennsylvania Sire Stake freshman filly champ Rainbow Room (p, 2, 1:51.2f; \$424,424).

Stevens said Somebeachsomewhere's dizzying rise to the top as a racehorse and sire makes the pacer's career trajectory an engrossing one, even to viewers with no pre-existing knowledge of the sport: "It's a Canadian story and it's got this fantastic, do-it-yourself feel about it, where

Brent went down south, bought the horse and trained it at Truro [Raceway]."

Gallagher also admitted to starting from scratch in learning about harness racing, after Stevens approached her to direct. The first track she ever set foot on was Red Mile, site of Beach's 1:46.4 world record victory in his 2008 Bluegrass Stake division, which she visited in the early stages of making the new documentary. "I read about 300 articles about Beach and I started getting really into this story, as an animal story, but also as an athletic story," she says. "His athleticism was exceptional. I think there's a small-town hero story there, too, training out of Truro in the dead of winter." The director adds that the mainstream media attention the Ontario-bred pacer drew on both sides of the border captured her attention.

While many Nova Scotians have a background or family connection to harness racing, this is not the case for the 48-year-old Stevens or 32-year-old Gallagher. Their interest in making the film originates from the unique improbability of Somebeachsomewhere's career, which still resonates outside harness racing circles. "We're still in production right now, planning people we need to interview," advised Gallagher, who has been consulting with MacGrath and Truro Raceway staff about the project. The timing of the film was in conjunction with a specific event in Somebeachsomewhere's life: "It all started at the Lexington sale—we did go down there for this year's sale" to begin shooting footage for the documentary.

Next in the film's production schedule is visiting the Ontario tracks where Beach gained early prominence, and his current base of Hanover Shoe Farms in Pennsylvania.

The one-hour documentary was recently approved for \$97,058 in funding from the Nova Scotia Film and Television Production Incentive Fund. Gallagher said it will be much more than a retelling of Somebeachsomewhere's on-track exploits: "We've been at Truro Raceway, doing some tests to shoot racing from many different angles, really getting in the mix, mounting cameras on the sulkies and trying out cool, re-enactment-type things to show racing from a different perspective... Capturing his essence and the mood he would create around him — that's important to me."

Slated for an exclusive debut on Atlantic Canadian cable channel EastLink early next spring, there are plans for later distribution in the U.S. and Europe, plus online availability in future. The exact release dates will be announced once the project nears completion, said Stevens.

Learning about race strategy and Somebeachsomewhere's uncanny ability from MacGrath was eye-opening, said

Stevens. "Hearing Brent talk about the horse and racing in general gave me a whole different appreciation for it. The things that he looks for... I never thought of it in that regard before." The producer says that there was no specific plan to use the upcoming film as a promotional tool for harness racing or Somebeachsomewhere himself, although bringing the stallion and the sport back into the spotlight, adding fresh angles to archival footage, may indirectly serve that function: "I do hope we are that bridge to bringing some new people in, that this might pique their interest."

Gulotta bullish on racing's future in New Jersey under governor Phil Murphy

The CEO of Deo Volente Farms has close ties to governor-elect Phil Murphy and said Murphy's election victory is great for the sport.

Mike Gulotta, the CEO Deo Volente Farms in Flemington, NJ, is confident horse racing scored a major victory on Nov. 7 when Phil Murphy was elected governor of New Jersey.

"It's not a good thing, it's a great thing," Gulotta said of Murphy's election. "Number one, he said that the industry's future is ahead of it. The best days for racing in New Jersey are ahead of us, not behind us. Number two, he said that the industry was very important to him. Number three, he said the Meadowlands was a gem and he also wanted to make sure that thoroughbred racing was well-supported... He said all those things. He visited our farm and he came to the Meadowlands to present the trophy for the Meadowlands Pace. We haven't had that type of representation for a very long time and I think that is a great show of support for harness racing and for racing in general."

Gulotta has close ties to the governor-elect, something Mark Ford, the president of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ), said Gulotta worked hard to achieve.

"We're very fortunate that we have a relationship with the governor," Ford said. "There's a lot of us in the industry, headed by Mike Gulotta and Deo Volente, that really went far and above to establish that relationship. We're very fortunate to have Mike on our team and fortunate he has a

relationship with the governor. Maybe we've got a shot at relaying to the governor how important this industry is, how influential it is in New Jersey with all the open spaces, how many people are involved and what infrastructure there is in the racing industry in New Jersey. Hopefully, we've got a bit of an 'in."

Gulotta said people shouldn't judge Murphy based on recent New Jersey governors.

"No one knows better than I... that we've gone through eight years of, at best, a stagnant situation," Gulotta said. "I've seen the breeding industry and the racing industry bear great burdens. I tend to be somewhat optimistic, but I'm a realist. I'm a businessman and I think that we are in the best position that we could possibly be in."

Gulotta said Murphy is a sincere person from a modest background and is anything but a career politician.

"He was born middle class at best. He started working when he was 13 years old, washing dishes. He comes from a modest background. I can tell you from my own personal interaction with him, it's been nothing but positive. I find him to be a humble and very sincere person, so when he says that he is going to do something I believe it," Gulotta said.

"The huge difference is he's not beholden to anybody... He's never been a politician so it's not like he's got a balance sheet with a lot of personal liability."

Ford said he was more optimistic that he was about racing's political fortunes.

"I'm very optimistic. We've been downtrodden for the last three or four years and now we have the right guy in and hopefully we can go forward," Ford said.







A deep dive into the half-mile track blues

In part one of a two-part series we will examine why half-mile tracks are at a serious disadvantage in today's racing world.

I watched and wagered on a few races at Yonkers over the last few weeks. Although the New York oval has some of the best purses, drivers, trainers and horses in the sport, I was pretty surprised at the product itself.

It seemed that time after time the drivers from inside posts moved to the front, the second quarter was a stroll, and then – perhaps, but not always – near the 5/8's pole someone would challenge the leader. At the head of the lane it was very likely the winner would come from the engine, the first over horse, or the pocket sitter. The back markers, oftentimes, were completely eliminated.

We've all seen it, and we're not telling tales out of school. At half-mile tracks, especially those with high purses, this seems to be the new normal. And perhaps the saddest part of it all is it's the result of perfectly rational behavior. Why even try from an outside post when next week you have a 50 per cent chance of drawing posts one through four? As an added bonus, your horse can drop a possible earning line off the card and be in a lower class next week as well. There's virtually a double incentive to not leave the gate.

Why this is such a problem in harness racing has become more and more apparent over the years: Harness racing is a speed game like never before, and if your horse is not "in the race" you're at a serious disadvantage.

Is this anecdotal, or does the data concur?

Let's examine the numbers, by post position, by placement at the half-mile pole at Yonkers and Northfield. Who is mixing it up and showing speed, giving their horses a chance to win in the new speed game?

About one in four horses from the rail had the lead at the

half, while fewer than five in one hundred had the lead, on average, from the outer two posts.

When we look at the top three at the half-mile pole by post, these numbers grow even more polarized.

Almost unbelievably, there is such little action off the gate that the rail horse – regardless of odds or early speed – at Yonkers is in the top three at the half about eight in 10 times.

Why should we care?

Periodically we'll hear that this is simply the way it is, and why, really, should anyone care if outside posts are at such a disadvantage. But that, in my view, misses the big picture.

The number of outcomes in a race with a strong betting menu is based directly on the size of the field. If we box every horse in the exacta in a five-horse field there are only 20 outcomes, generating \$20 of handle for a one dollar bet; in a nine-horse field this number grows to 72. It's like that all the way through the exotics.

Most importantly, as outcomes grow, the penal nature of high takeout is lessened. The surest way to break a sports bookie is to make him charge 20 per cent takeout on a game with two outcomes, rather than the 4.54 per cent he's charged since the beginning of time. Parlay cards, or sports lotteries can be higher takeout and still draw dollars without breaking customers, because there are more outcomes.

The combination of high takeout and short fields results in skill game gamblers looking for the nearest sports book or DFS game. It simply can't generate big handles.

Study after study bears this out. In fact, in one of the more comprehensive studies from the University of Louisville, field size was deemed to be as important as the number of races in terms of its effect on aggregate betting handle.

This is one reason why half-mile tracks have such trouble generating turnover. The field size might be eight, but with the two outside posts being almost filler, the field size is closer to five or six. If we add a hopeless longshot to the field, it grows even smaller.

Do bigger tracks – through depth of field - draw more handle regardless of purses?

Here are the same grids for the Meadowlands and Mohawk – tracks with a circumference of mile and seven-eighths mile, respectively.

First, here are the horses that made the lead at the half, by post:

These numbers are starkly different from their smaller competitors. Instead of fewer than five of 100 horses making the lead from the outside on the half milers, that number has about doubled at the big tracks.

You can see the low variance between post positions, which lessens the "Impact Value". A low impact value means a fairer array of post positions, and this signifies a more efficient use of field size.

Second, let's look at the top three at the half mile pole:

For drivers being aggressive and taking a shot to put their charge in the race from the outside, the smaller tracks can't hold a candle to the bigger ones. I was shocked to learn, for example, that about one in four horses from post nine and ten at the Meadowlands are in the top three at the half.

At Mohawk, only 37 per cent of rail horses are in the top three at the half, which is in contrast to that number at Yonkers, which was 79 per cent.

As we all know, the Meadowlands' purses have been weak, and the races have been filled with lesser stock than their cross-state rival. But handle continues to be solid. Similarly, Mohawk has catapulted to possess nightly handles stronger than anywhere but the Meadowlands. This has occurred within the last several years, when purses north of the border were cut due to the loss of slots.

The University of Louisville study concluded that, "wagering would increase by only 6 per cent if purses were doubled. This is a surprising finding considering the importance that is attached to the purse variable in all major policy decisions to increase the wagering in this industry."

The Mohawk and Big M post arrays, as above, is some evidence of that. A deep field with more outcomes increases wagering. Bigger tracks have them, smaller ones don't, even if their purses are much higher.

What can be done, if anything?

I firmly believe Yonkers, Northfield and other half-mile tracks are certainly doing their best. Yonkers has experimented with distances and has done a world of good exporting their signal overseas. Northfield possesses some great handles when compared to many other half-mile tracks because they are aggressive in selling their signal and have a great spot on the bettor's radar.

But, the handle-killing situation described above is very hard to address; it's impossible for Northfield or Yonkers to blow up the racing surface and put in a mile or seven-eighths mile track, for example. The choices they have to increase eyeballs and handle are limited.

But, perhaps, there are a few ideas that have merit to increase betting depth, and in turn raise handles at these important racetracks. I'll share a couple of mine in Part II next week.

Yannick's trifecta a HOY vote-splitter?

Yannick Gingras drives the top three horses in the Hambletonian Society / Breeders Crown poll — all trotting females. Could this set up a scenario where the Horse of the Year gets a much lower percentage of the vote? In 1975, Savoir was the HOY with just 27 per cent of the first place votes, which was good enough for the HOY decision over Silk Stockings. Machego, Ariana G and Hannelore Hanover may be in the position where they are divvying up the ballots amongst themselves.

1950 - Proximity \$87,175 2:00.1

1954 – Stenographer \$65,137 TT 1:59.1

1958 - Emilys Pride \$118,830 TT 1:58.1

1970 - Fresh Yankee \$359,002 1:58.4

Twelve wins is the most common number for a horse to be crowned Horse of the Year. Eight times the winners of the award has done it with 12 wins, in 70 editions, including last year Always B Miki 12-for-18 and three years back with J K She's A Lady 12-for-12.

An all-timer

Who was the last horse to enter a season as the all-time leading money winner and then win his/her first HOY title? Su Mac Lad in 1962. He was 13 7-3-0 \$112,350 that season, but came into that season at \$455,499 lifetime, just ahead of Darn Safe at \$450,427.

Nothing average about these two

The two richest single-season performers all time among pacers — Gallo Blue Chip and Somebeachsomewhere —varied greatly in starts and money averaged during their award-winning sophomore seasons. In 2000, Gallo Blue Chip earned \$2,428,116, averaging \$83,959 per start. In 2008, SBSW earned \$2,448,003 and averaged \$163,200 per start, the high water mark for any pacer ever for a single season.

Speaking of above average

Muscle Hill and Somebeachsomewhere, the two dominant sires on the trot and pace, respectively, gave us a big clue how they would do as stallions based on their success on the track. A look at the North American-bred horses who averaged over \$100,000 start and you have not only a very short list, but you also have a wide gap back from this pair to the rest.

He correctly nailed the following — #1 Muscle Hill, #2 Explosive Matter, #3 Federal Flex and #4 Swan For All.

Millers time

Last Saturday at the Meadowlands, 47 of the 109 horses on the card were driven by a "Miller". The final tally was five wins and 29 checks, this coming the same night that Andy Miller left Freehold with a 7-winner day, just one off the October 1986 high water mark for the half-miler set by John Campbell.



Harrisburg sire analysis

A look at how the sires fared during the yearling portion of the recently-completed Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction at Harrisburg.

A Rocknroll Dance, the first-crop sire of Metro winner Lost In Time, sold nine from his second crop at Harrisburg for an average of \$32,556, which is up 32 per cent over his performance at that sale last year. Two of the nine brought at least \$50,000. This didn't come close to what he did at Lexington Selected, however. Down there, 17 averaged \$57,706 and two topped \$100,000.

American Ideal averaged \$46,394 for 33 sold in Pennsylvania. That's off five per cent from last year. A quarter of them topped \$50,000, with three of those eclipsing \$100,000, and 82 per cent brought at least \$25,000. He averaged \$50,300 for 20 sold in Lexington.

Art Major averaged \$39,300 for 45 sold, which is a little higher than last year. None of them topped \$100,000, but a dozen brought at least \$50,000. This is 11 per cent higher than his Lexington average.

Betterthancheddar, who raced his first crop in New York this year, sold seven Ontario breds for a weak \$14,857 average. Only one beat \$25,000. This was down 25 per cent from a soft first-crop average of \$19,722 in Pennsylvania last year. Nineteen-year-old Bettor's Delight is still searching for an extender. Apparently the buyers don't think it's Cheddar.

Somebeachsomewhere sold 46 yearlings at Harrisburg for a \$74,717 average. That was \$317 higher than his 2016 average, when he sold 60. A quarter of them topped \$100,000 and 72 per cent beat \$50,000. A smaller offering of 29 averaged \$103,448 at Lexington Selected.

Bettor's Delight sold 48 for a \$39,510 average. That's eight per cent better than 2016. He sold a \$200,000 filly and three more above \$100,000, but only a quarter topped \$50,000 after having more than half in that range last year. Twenty averaged \$40,000 in Lexington. These yearlings are eligible to the Ontario Sire Stakes.

Cantab Hall saw 43 yearlings average \$45,372. That's 25 per cent lower than last year in Harrisburg when 41 sold. He sold one in the \$200,000 range and three more above \$100,000. A quarter topped \$50,000. Cantab averaged \$67,680 for 42 sold at Lexington Selected this year.

Cantab's son **Father Patrick**, who was reduced to half-crop status his first year at stud due to the Gural Rule, sold only a half dozen for a healthy \$54,857 average. Two topped

\$100,000. Patrick averaged \$82,048 for 22 sold in Lexington. He was well received.

Cantab's other first crop son, **Uncle Peter**, sold only three for a \$33,333 average.

Kadabra sold 13 for a \$50,538 average, down 11 per cent from last year when he sold 19 at Harrisburg, and down 37 per cent from 2015 when he sold 20. Thirty-eight percent beat \$50,000, with two of them topping \$100,000. This year 19 averaged \$56,789 in Lexington for the sire of Breeders Crown winner Emoticon Hanover.

Muscle Hill averaged \$138,304 for 23 sold. That was actually down eight per cent from last year. Between Harrisburg and Lexington, he sold 26 that eclipsed the \$100,000 mark. At Harrisburg three quarters of them topped \$50,000 last year and this. The sire of Manchego and Ariana G sells the bulk of his crop in Kentucky where he averaged \$115,857 for 49 sold.

Muscle Mass sold 10 New York breds for a \$56,900 average, up 46 per cent from last year. And he was up by 55 per cent at Lexington Selected. Six of the 10 sold in Pennsylvania topped \$50,000. He's up 63 per cent since the 2015 sale.

Muscle Massive, Mass's Hambletonian-winning little brother, didn't fare as well. He averaged \$21,194 for 36 sold. That's down 19 per cent from 2016. Forty-six percent failed to beat \$25,000. Massive sold 11 in Lexington for a soft \$18,364 average. He's being relocated to Indiana for the 2018 season.

Credit Winner averaged \$41,438 for 32 sold—13 colts and 19 fillies. That's down nine per cent from last year when 23 sold. A dozen topped \$50,000, with one in the \$100,000 range. The 20-year-old son of American Winner averaged \$47,926 for 27 sold in Lexington.

Rock N Roll Heaven sold 10 for a \$36,900 average. Two of the 10 beat \$50,000, and one of those, a colt out of My Little Dragon, sold for \$135,000. Heaven is up 25 per cent from 2016. He averaged \$18,400 for five sold in Lexington.

Roll With Joe sold his fourth crop this year. The 17 sold in Pennsylvania averaged \$30,294, down 24 per cent from last year. Only two of the 17 topped \$50,000. Five averaged \$26,600 in Lexington, down 44 per cent since 2015.

Sweet Lou sold 32 from his first crop for a \$47,188 average. Half of them beat \$50,000 and three of those brought at least \$100,000. Eighty per cent sold for at least \$25,000. Lou's average was 38 per cent higher in Lexington for 27 sold.

Sunshine Beach, another first crop stallion, sold 10 colts and five fillies for a \$36,067 average. Four of them topped \$50,000 while 11 beat \$25,000. Sunshine Beach averaged \$84,667 for three sold in Lexington.

Trixton averaged \$50,550 for 20 from his initial offering. A pair topped \$200,000 and two more eclipsed \$100,000. More than 31 per cent of them beat \$50,000. Thirty-eight averaged \$54,395 at Lexington Selected.

Well Said sold a large contingent of 42 yearlings in Harrisburg. They averaged \$24,429. Only one topped \$100,000 and three, or seven per cent, beat \$50,000. Two-thirds of them failed to crack \$25,000. Well Said averaged \$29,333 for nine sold in Lexington.

Western Ideal averaged \$27,440 for 25 sold at Harrisburg after averaging \$53,000 for eight sold in Lexington. He was down slightly from 2016 in Pennsylvania and off 17 per cent since 2015 at that sale. Three topped \$50,000; 13 brought at least \$25,000; and 11 failed to reach that threshold.

Shadow Play sold a dozen for a \$26,333 average. A filly out of Michelles Song brought \$150,000, but none of the others topped \$50,000. Shadow Play was down 28 per cent from last year when he sold twice as many, but he's up 30 per cent since 2015. Six averaged \$30,833 in Lexington.

Sportswriter sold 30 for a \$29,250 average, down 19 per cent from 2016, when 28 were purchased. Five, or 17 per cent, topped \$50,000, with one in the \$100,000 range. Seventeen averaged \$36,706 at Lexington Selected.

Yankee Glide, who now stands in Kentucky, averaged a weak \$13,267 for 15 sold. That's down by more than half from last year. Only one beat \$25,000. He fared much better than that at Lexington Selected, where he averaged \$29,500 for 20 sold. Yankee Glide has been shunned by the buyers in Harrisburg since 2013, when he was well received at both sales.

Donato Hanover sold 33 for a \$31,455 average, up four per cent from last year. He's down 19 per cent since 2015, and at that time he was down 16 per cent from 2014. Donato sold two colts and a filly for at least \$100,000. He averaged \$37,263 for 19 sold at Lexington Selected.

Explosive Matter, who generated a false report of a sale to Swedish interests a few weeks ago, sold a large group of 42 for a soft \$21,821 average. That's down slightly from last year when he averaged \$22,385 for 39 sold. The son of Cantab Hall fared much better in Lexington, where a dozen averaged \$51,167.

Conway Hall averaged \$21,667 for a dozen sold. That's down 28 per cent from last year when 13 sold. Three-quarters of them failed to reach \$25,000. He did better in Lexington, averaging \$41,889 for nine sold. For the most part, stallions from the bottom to the top fared much better at Lexington Selected.

Mach Three, who passed in January, sold 13 for a \$30,385 average, down 32 per cent from 2016. Seven averaged \$33,857 in Kentucky.

First crop stallion **Royalty For Life** averaged \$26,333 for a dozen sold. Half that many averaged \$51,167 in Lexington.

Horses feed people at The Stable's Christmas Open House

There's a fierce rivalry brewing between the 110 racehorses and their 362 owners at The Stable in Guelph, ON. But it's not about which horses can trot or pace the quickest race.

It's about which horses will feed the most people.

During The Stable's annual Christmas Open House on Nov. 26, each horse will be represented by an empty 25 kg feed bag — all displayed with bows and the horses' nametags, adorning the front lawn at Tomiko Training Centre (near Puslinch, ON). The goal is to fill all 110 bags (three tons — the weight equivalent of three racehorses) with much-needed items for the Guelph Food Bank, which services between 85-110 people every day.

The Open House is free to attend and all ages are welcome. An RSVP is requested. Complimentary hot drinks and snacks will be available.

The Stable urges guests to bring items listed on the Guelph Food Bank's most wanted list.

For those unable to attend the Open House, but wishing to participate in the effort, a GoFundMe page has been established. Funds will be used for the purchase of food items and any remaining monies will be donated directly to the Guelph Food Bank.

The event runs 10 a.m.-3 p.m. and features 57 of The Stable's horses training in 12 sets on the racetrack. The races will be captured by drone camera and streamed on The Stable's website. The broadcast will include interviews, feature stories about the horses, and commentary from show hosts and drivers on the racetrack.

Throughout the day, guests can meet the horses, plus clients and staff of The Stable. Shares are available for 12 of the horses, and purchases can be made on-site. Clients can purchase as little as one share, which currently run as low as \$95 (plus tax). A fixed monthly fee of \$23.85 (plus tax) covers the horse's daily care and training.

There are currently 110 horses and 362 active racehorse owners from 10 countries in The Stable. Trainers Anthony and Amy MacDonald launched the venture in 2015 as a fractional ownership stable — a model that welcomes newcomers to standardbred racehorse ownership with a very modest and low-risk investment, and completely accessible and transparent operations.

A catalogue will be available on TheStable.ca website on Nov. 24, detailing all horses for which shares are available for purchase. The catalogue will include a schedule of when each horse will be showcased on the broadcast during the Open House.

Faraldo calls Gural a punk

In the (Meadowlands) drivers' meeting (on Saturday, track owner Jeff Gural) said that any drivers that go to Yonkers when Gural's (tracks are) racing is not going to be allowed at Meadowlands for stakes races or anything else. My definition of a punk and a bully fits well here. Mr. Tim Rooney, by comparison, has too much class to get in the gutter with this punk. How about if you want to race where you want? Owners should be able to choose what is best for them. Drivers and trainers are not indentured servants to any lord or savior.

Gural says Faraldo got it wrong

What Faraldo said is not accurate. What I pointed out to the drivers was the fact that at the Meadowlands we feature stakes races. We have \$12 million in purses for stakes and \$10 million in purses for overnight races. If I wanted to compete with Yonkers in overnights, all I'd have to do is drop the stakes. I would have equal purses to Yonkers, but that wouldn't help the industry. It certainly would not help the breeders and it certainly would not help the drivers. So, I don't think it's fair that somebody decides that they're going to race for the \$12 million in stakes and not the \$10 million in overnights. I also made it clear that all I care about is that they race at the Meadowlands on Friday and Saturday and they're certainly free to race at Yonkers on the other three or four days a week that they race and they're free to race at Yonkers any time they have stakes races. When they have the

Levy Series, they're free to race at Yonkers. All I felt was that it doesn't make sense to allow people to pick and choose and just come here and race in the stakes. It should also be noted that we invested about \$120 million in this facility to help promote harness racing, while Mr. Rooney invested virtually nothing, which I don't fault him for, but facts are facts. That is why the handle at Yonkers is so low and the attendance is practically non-existent.

I don't care if drivers spend the winter in Florida. That's fine. I don't care if they spend the winter in North Carolina. I don't care if they choose to stay home, but if they're going to race in overnight races, then I felt that they should race in our overnight program in order to be eligible to race in our stakes program.

The fact is I'm going to lose \$2 million this year keeping the Meadowlands open and Mr. Rooney is doing fine. The reality is, they get \$50 million a year in subsidies from slots and my entire racing operation is paid for out of the handle from horse racing. I'm at a big disadvantage, but I could, overnight, change that and do what Yonkers does and feature overnight racing. Just think about it, if I took \$5 million out of the stakes program, I would increase my purses by 50 per cent and everybody would race in the overnights, but there would be no stakes.

The quality of my driver colony is important to my product. When you consider my income is entirely derived from my product, I think that going forward there will be a continuing horse shortage and it's going to be harder and harder for me to compete. It's no fun losing \$2 million. I would trade places with Mr. Rooney in a minute.

Clay Horner: new staking conditions needed to increase accountability

Events of the past couple of months have reinforced the need to adopt new staking conditions based on increased trainer and owner accountability. Most who follow our top-level racing are aware of the epic double failure of Lady Shadow in the Milton elimination and final and the panicked effort to restore her lustre by immediately returning her to her prior trainer. That was followed by a similar failure to perform on the part of two high-profile and accomplished horses in the Breeders Crown following a necessitated trainer change. Of course, they immediately returned to their former trainer and won their next starts, one in a track record

time. In a new twist, the trainer of a Breeders Crown winner had another stable star scratched due to a prerace test in a stakes race only a week later. That combination was a first! Last night, we saw two more trainer changes to new players to facilitate two more stakes aspirants. Lady Shadow went backward again. As Jeff Gural smartly decided, this is more than enough. It puts a sad light on too many owners and their trainer choices. Try explaining all of this to your friends or adult family and you will feel like a fool that it has taken this remarkable set of events to bring change. Fortunately, a better approach is coming.

About 50 years ago, I recall going to Roosevelt Raceway on a Saturday night when the attendance was often over 30,000. I was away from harness racing for decades and when I first

went to Pompano Park two years ago, I asked, "Where is everybody?" I know much has changed since online betting arrived and people can watch most races in the comfort of their own home. But I think something must be done to bring some people back to the track. My suggestion is to attract people from that huge pool of lottery ticket players. Install quick pick machines at the track where you can invest a dollar and get five 20-cent random combinations for the Super High Five. Clever TV ads could show how easy it is to insert a dollar and possibly win over \$100,000. Some of these new players might just watch a race or two and get more involved in the future. Some might just spend some time in the casino while they wait. Harness racing needs new blood.
