After more than 50 years working as an auctioneer at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling and mixed sales in Harrisburg, PA, and at least a quarter century as the head auctioneer, Vernon Martin, 75, has done the equivalent of passing the torch by passing the red chair to Joseph Mast.

"A famous auctioneer passed the red chair onto Tom Caldwell long ago, who passed it on to Vernon Martin. It's one of those pride things with the auctioneers, and now it's been passed on to Joe Mast," said Preferred Equine Marketing's David Reid, who photographed the passing of the chair that not only marked Martin's departure as head auctioneer, but also Martin's retirement from the sale.

"This was Vernon's last one for us," said sale president and CEO Pete Spears. "I had said to Vernon some years ago that we really valued his leadership and expertise and the way he's continued this tradition. I wanted him to decide when it was time to step down. I had no arbitrary year to make a change or anything like that and he said to me two years ago that this would be the year. We're going to miss Vernon and we have appointed Joseph Mast as the head auctioneer for next year, going forward. Hopefully Vernon will be back to be part of this, but not on the auction stand next year.

"He has been connected with the sale, in one capacity or another, since the 1960s. Isn't that something?"

A Vietnam veteran who served with the Marine Corps, Martin, who lives in Lititz, PA, followed his father and grandfather into the auction business.

Spears said he and sale vice-president Russell Williams believe, "Vernon has few peers in being able to direct and control the flow of the auction from the stand, and to engage the buyers in a way that creates a sense of building

excitement during the auction. I'm sure the younger auctioneers have probably learned a lot from him and will carry that forward.







Can half-mile tracks create a better product?

In Part I we analyzed the disadvantage half-mile tracks possess in terms of field depth and handle generation. In Part II we offer a couple solutions.

Part I here

"I wouldn't bet that place with Monopoly money," said one bettor to me a few weeks ago. He was speaking of a half-mile racetrack where the racing has little movement; races that resemble a merry-go-round that all-too-often end with a \$9 exacta and \$21 trifecta. Some of racing's seasoned customers like this man have that feeling, so one wonders what other bettors the sport needs to attract might think.

In Part I we examined why post bias is such a threat on the smaller ovals, and by way of a quick summary, we noticed that on half-mile tracks early speed increasingly comes from the best posts, and this shortens "field depth" dramatically. This presents the gambler (and fan) with fewer potential race outcomes, and consequently lowers handles, resulting in smaller revenues to harness racing.

In Part II we'll have a look at a couple of tactics that may help increase real field size, and provide bettors and fans with a more interesting product to watch and wager on.

Let's head to Pennsylvania

When we analyzed the data in Part I we noticed that the outside post positions at smaller tracks yield so few (fewer than 5 per cent) horses making the lead, and a meagre number of horses landing in the top three slots at the half. When compared to the mile or 7/8's mile tracks, well, there simply was no comparison.

However, when we look at another smaller track – in this case the 5/8's oval at The Meadows – the data is pretty

astounding. Here's data from The Meadows, along with comparison data from the Meadowlands, Mohawk, Yonkers and Northfield.

Incredibly, the Pennsylvania racetrack —even though only a 5/8's — has a completely different post bias in terms of early speed.

- More horses reach the lead at the half from the outside two posts than at the Big M or Mohawk (and they score nine wide).
- More horses reach the lead at the half from the nine post than they do from the rail (this could be partially due to the poor inside at The Meadows on off tracks).

It is obvious that the driving colony at The Meadows has little trouble taking a shot at the lead from the outside posts.

Meanwhile, when we look at horses that are 1st through 3rd at the half, the numbers are equally interesting.

Yes there's a bias to the middle of the gate, but again, at The Meadows, the two outside posts provide a driver with a chance to use his horse's speed at greater frequency than

even the rail.

What's different at The Meadows compared to some other racetracks? Something not new, but not as frequently talked about in the sport in this day and age: The Meadows has a slanted starting gate. The outside post has a 15-foot advantage.

Can half-mile track issues be fixed with something so simple and often bandied about in this sport like a staggered gate? Probably not, but as The Meadows illustrates, experimenting with it at different staggers and running the numbers over a season might not be a bad idea.

Pay the Man (or Woman)

The lack of movement on smaller tracks, as well as so many horses from the outside going straight to the back of the bus was a discussion on social media recently, and one response caught my eye. It was from Paul Matties. Paul is (primarily) a thoroughbred player who took down the \$800,000 first prize in the National Handicapping Championship last year.



Paying more, or adding a bonus for outside post wins has been talked about before (and tried at The Meadows at one point, as far as I know), so it's not new. But it sure is logical, isn't it? In theory, adding such a bonus should encourage drivers to take a shot more often with live horses from the outside because money is a perfect incentive in a sport that races for it.

Further, if the policy was tweaked to bonus outside horses that are in the top three at the half (that go on to win) this could encourage even more movement. For example, if a driver leaves from the seven and tucks his horse in the five hole but feels he has a lapful of horse, he's more likely to move on the first turn to challenge the leader. This not only injects pace into the race, it creates a vibrant early flow with a live horse first over.

I think the driving colony at Yonkers is fantastic, and I'd love to see the result of the Bartletts and MacDonalds and others devising a strategy from the outside posts. I bet we'd see some entertaining racing, and at the very least we'd not have to take out the red pen and cross off a horse from the

seven post so quickly.

Don't stop experimenting

Bob Pandolfo **referenced some interesting statistics** he gleaned from his keen eye on the Yonkers distance races recently. He believes the slower pace over the longer distances brings more back markers into the race. He also professes that the trailers encourage more early movement, and it can result in some bigger prices.

It's early, and the jury is still out but there could be something happening that's positive for handles in these races (aside from the bigger pools due to export).

Longer distances and races of this nature are something seasoned players are not used to, and many dislike the format. But when we think back to when the Meadowlands opened – with horses coming from everywhere – seasoned players complained, too. Years later, of course, bigger prices through more field depth drew customers demanding betting value to the Big M pools and they never looked back.

Summing up

We've spoken before about the need for more movement, and more pace in harness racing (see the passing lane article here). This is buttressed in a 1998 study by Piron & Smith which said it's racing's job to "bring together horses and purse money in a way to encourage people to bet on those horses," and to maximize this purse money, there should be a goal to create competitive races that, "in a perfectly handicapped race, all horses would finish in a dead heat."

That is not going to happen in even an ideal world, but I hope you read both part I and II and digested some of the statistics regarding outside posts on smaller tracks with this in mind.

I am sure there are many ideas on how to inject pace and movement into races on half-mile tracks; to incentivize drivers from outside posts to be more aggressive; to make not only watching, but betting harness racing on small tracks more worthwhile. Does a driver colony impact handle?

Whenever the topic of handle is discussed, the most common things heard as contributing factors to changes in handle are changes in takeout rates and field sizes. Statistical analysis has shown change in handle to be more responsive to these two factors more so than lesser ones that include caliber of horses racing and size of the purse.

This brings us to comments made by Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural in his letter published in HRU last week. In the letter, Mr. Gural says that the quality of his driver colony is important to the Meadowlands product. He also says that without slots, his income is derived entirely from his Meadowlands product. Putting the two statements next to each other, there's an inference being made that a quality driver colony is important in generating revenue.

Of all factors that can have an impact on handle, the quality of drivers is one that's seldom heard but is something worth exploring. Forget for a moment the debate of Gural even having a right to dictate the conditions in which drivers drive (which as you may expect I don't agree with), but this is rather about strictly the notion that drivers can impact revenue.

Thinking about it common sense-wise, I could see the rationale as to how a higher quality set of drivers would be better for the product, and better for handle. Those wagering on the product have a higher degree of confidence in placing their hard-earned cash on drivers who are professionals and know what they're doing and will drive the races to form, as opposed to lesser quality drivers that are more unpredictable and can throw races into chaos, as often is the case in some of these amateur races.

For an analogy, the logic probably goes along the lines of a serious gambler in a casino playing blackjack. Would that person be more likely to play at a table of seasoned bettors who play the game by the book, or play with a bunch of amateurs who are splitting ten's and playing reckless. Of course it would be the former, which would be my reason for

being able to get behind the thought that a higher quality set of drivers inspires more confidence and thus more money from the betting public.

This all sounds nice in theory but in my estimation, it doesn't play out this way in reality.

One only has to go back a few days to illustrate this. Last Saturday, the Meadowlands had everything it wanted as far as a November driver colony. In addition to major stakes eliminations and predominantly full fields, drivers from that card included Tetrick, Gingras, a rare appearance from Sears, Miller (all four of them), Zeron, and so forth. With seemingly favorable conditions including an A-list set of drivers, handle for the 13-race card just made it past the \$2 million mark. It's still an industry-leading handle, but one that isn't particularly high for the Big M.

Why, despite all top drivers, was handle just so-so by Meadowlands standards? The reasons for this are nearly endless and speak to a far larger set of conditions, but to say that any of it is based on who is driving seems to be unfounded.

In the winter of 2016 at the Meadowlands, it seemed like every single racing card produced a \$3 million handle. The driver colony back then wasn't much different than it was early in this year as the top drivers typically take time away during those winter months, yet year over year this was an obvious decline in handle. And in some cases, handle from the winter driving colony earlier this year outpaced handle from the summer driving colony featuring top drivers.

If there were any correlation between an improved product vis-à-vis quality drivers and handle, then why did the 12-race Meadowlands Pace eliminations card this year from July 8 with all the best drivers from all over handle \$2.6 million?

Now on the opposite side, you could note that historically on a week to week basis handle drops at the Meadowlands when the entire set of drivers go to another track such as Mohawk to drive in their stakes races. This does occur, but it's clearly more a reflection of bettors redirecting their gambling dollars to where the highest level of racing action is and not abandoning the Meadowlands solely because of changes in drivers. Also, this only happens when almost the

entirely colony goes and we're left with drivers who are all fill-ins; the removal of only a Tetrick or only a Gingras doesn't have the same effect.

To its credit, the Meadowlands has been resilient when you think that it still generates far more handle than any other track considering that the lesser quality horses that fill the majority of races there. Many of the horses racing at the Meadowlands would be eligible for Freehold conditions and if the Meadowlands product were related to horses – let alone drivers – handle would be far less than the level that it has maintained.

The drivers are the least of the problem. With low purses and a racing stock in which 90 per cent of the horses wouldn't have been good enough to race at the Meadowlands 10 years ago, people still wager on the product. But knowing that the product is already diluted, drivers alone wouldn't have an impact on handle and recent numbers support that.

The larger problem of course is that because of the lesser quality of racing, some races are frankly un-playable. I understand that Mr. Gural may have a greater likelihood of landing his choice of drivers at the Meadowlands than landing his choice of top quality horses racing for greater purses at other tracks, but it remains to be seen how better drivers would lead to more revenue.

Like many, I want what is ultimately best for the industry. But I think anyone would be hard pressed to show in a tangible way that a top set of drivers can be responsible for changes to handle.

Fall Final Four stakes analysis

\$381,200 Three Diamonds Final: Just to make things interesting YOUAREMYCANDYGIRL lands post 10 following a bye, although it still may not make a difference. The Breeders Crown champion has been untouchable this fall and a win here would put her just shy of \$1 million for her freshman campaign. KISSIN IN THE SAND has impressed mightily in her recent pair of races at the Meadowlands and now gets another shot against #10; will start off with a big post edge. REIGN ON ME is one that I've started to chase the last couple of weeks; gets another new driver and will offer a good price should she be able to come through a big one. RAINBOW ROOM is an obvious short priced alternative to the favorite; went off at 5-2 when last seen in the Crown for connections of Holloway and Dave Miller.

Picks: 10-6-2-9

\$420,750 Goldsmith Maid Final: PIRANHA FURY broke last out on the driver change to Miller but still gets another shot since everyone from that elimination made the final anyway. 0 for 10 maiden has a shot and will obviously offer a very

square price. PLUNGE BLUE CHIP sprinted home with an eye-opening :26:.2 final quarter last week for Svanstedt; Matron champ will be going right to the front. HEY BLONDIE won on cruise control here three weeks ago and opted for a bye into the final tonight; her 1:53:1 win time from Lexington is the fastest mark of anyone in here. SEVIYORUM took a ton of money last out in a race where it was obvious she would be at a disadvantage; not sure she would have caught #6 anyway. SWING IT CATHY may be capable at a big price with a flat mile.

Picks: 5-6-3-2

\$411,700 Governor's Cup Final: Don't let the drama and the Simon Allard taunt from the end of last week's mile to distract from the fact regardless of who the trainer is, SPRINGSTEEN is a serious horse. He followed up his crushing win in the Matron with a confidently handled score last week and to the chagrin of some, he rates a strong chance in this race. NUTCRACKER SWEET couldn't stave off the eventual race winner last week but it was still a top effort; sets him up well for Saturday. STAY HUNGRY makes his first start since the Breeders Crown nearly one month ago and apparent closer lands post 9; will be interesting to see how McNair plays this from out here as the likely favorite. LOST IN TIME is assured to be raced more aggressively tonight than he was last week; seeking a return to that form leading up to the Crown final. AMERICAN HISTORY is another that never had a shot in his elimination last week; maybe these waters are a bit too deep.

Picks: 5-9-8-3

\$464,650 Valley Victory Final: FOURTH DIMENSION absolutely jogged last out and made any attempts to play against him in that race look silly. He was the beneficiary of an early breaker that may have contended otherwise, but aside from that he proved that his underperforming Breeders Crown race was a fluke and he's clearly the one to beat once again. FASHIONWOODCHOPPER was clearly using last week to prep for this week's final; goes second start since the qualifier and could be heard from. TITO made a brief bid last week before flattening; that was a big longshot in KINDA LUCKY LINDY that beat him out for second in that race. SAMO DIFFERENT DAY won here very early in the 2-year-old season.

Analysis of Captaintreacherous

A look at how the first crop of the son of Somebeachsomewhere fared on the auction block.

In last Sunday's report on how stallions fared at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA (full story here), we inadvertently left out first-crop sire Captaintreacherous, who sold 25 colts and 19 fillies for a \$46,733 average. Six of them topped \$100,000, while a dozen beat \$50,000. Seventy-three per cent of them sold for at least \$25,000. Fifty-two from his initial offering brought a stellar \$70,481 average in Lexington.

Harness Racing Update spoke to Myron Bell this week to get a further update on Captaintreacherous. Bell represents Brittany Farms LLC in the ownership group of the son of Somebeachsomewhere out of Worldly Treasure.

"Captaintreacherous' average was good, but not as good as we thought it would be because he had so many foals selling at public auction," Bell said. "He had 44 in Harrisburg and 52 in Lexington and one in Goshen... He had 33 sell in the first day at Harrisburg out of 170 horses, which hurt his average because there's too many of them."

The upside, Bell said, is a pile of Captaintreacherous offspring will hit the track soon.

"He has many foals that are going to be two-year-olds on

January 1st and that will give him a tremendous advantage over the others because he has so many out there," Bell said. "I kept the stud fee at \$15,000 for a reason — so he would have a full crop his first four years. So far it's worked out the first three years and now we're going into the fourth year where people saw them in the flesh and they're going to be training."

Bell said Captaintreacherous — a winner of more than \$3.1 million on the track with a mark of 1:47.1 — has been given every opportunity to be successful in the stud barn.

"He was attracted to the best mares in the industry," Bell said. "We set up a tremendous syndicate. Some of the best breeders in North America bred to him and the resulting foals look tremendous and we partook, as well. I bought six Captain colts at public auction for my group Captain's Court — four in Lexington and two in Harrisburg."

Bell said the industry should benefit from a good group of first-crop stallions this year.

"They're all nice horses, whether it's Father Patrick or Trixton or Sweet Lou or Sunshine Beach. They all had very nice looking foals and I'd be shocked if any of these are duds," Bell said.



What The Hill taking on older trotters in TVG

The three-year-old is the third straight Breeders Crown winner to test older foes in the stakes final which is set for Saturday at the Meadowlands.

Ron Burke will send What The Hill to face older foes in Saturday's \$350,000 TVG Series championship for male trotters at the Meadowlands Racetrack and the trainer is interested to see how the colt responds.

What The Hill received an invitation to the TVG finale because of his win in October's Breeders Crown for 3-year-old male trotters at Hoosier Park. He is the third consecutive Breeders Crown 3-year-old champion to try the TVG, following Bar Hopping and The Bank. Bar Hopping finished fifth last year and The Bank was seventh in 2015.

Joining What The Hill in this year's race are Lookslikeachpndale, Mambo Lindy, Pinkman, Crazy Wow, and Dayson. Crazy Wow and Dayson also are trained by Burke.

According to the U.S. Trotting Association's Information and Research Department, What The Hill is trying to become the first 3-year-old male trotter in recent history to win against older foes in a series final worth at least \$100,000 since Before He Cheats captured the \$120,000 Chester Late Closing Series in 2007.

The only other instance since 1992 of a 3-year-old trotter winning a race worth at least \$100,000 against older horses came on the female side, when filly CR Kay Suzie defeated seven mares in the Breeders Crown at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

"I'm excited to try this," Burke said. "(What The Hill) loves the Meadowlands and it's a short field, which gives him options. It's something neat to try to see where he is and how much he has to improve for next year if he races."

The Meadowlands on Saturday also plays host to the TVG Series championships for female trotters, male pacers and female pacers. In addition, the 13-race card includes the "Fall Final Four" stakes for 2-year-old trotters and pacers.

Post time is 7:15 p.m. EST for the night's first race.

What The Hill has won six times in his career at the Meadowlands. In his most recent appearance at the track, in August, he finished first in the Hambletonian but was disqualified for interfering with another horse in the stretch. On Saturday, the colt starts from post five with driver David Miller.

"The best part is that he's very similar to me to Crazy Wow," Burke said. "That's who I most would compare him to; just how they move and their ability levels. I think right at this time they're very similar."

What The Hill has won eight of 17 races this year and earned \$774,928 for owners Burke Racing, Our Horse Cents Stables, J&T Silva Stables, and Deo Volente Farms. For his

career, the son of Muscle Hill out of K T Cha Cha has won 11 of 31 races and \$1.09 million.

Two other of this year's Breeders Crown champions will meet in the \$175,000 TVG Series final for trotting mares:

What The Hill (David Miller) in the Hambletonian. The 3-year-old colt will take on older trotters Saturday in the TVG final at the Meadowlands.

Hannelore Hanover, who defeated male rivals in the Breeders Crown Open Trot, and Emoticon Hanover, who won the Breeders Crown Mare Trot. Completing the four-horse TVG field are Barn Doll and Caprice Hill.

Hannelore Hanover, a 5-year-old mare who also beat the boys in the Maple Leaf Trot, has won nine of 16 races this season and earned \$952,879. Emoticon Hanover, a 4-year-old, has won five of 12 starts this year and earned \$385,666. Both hold world records, with Hannelore Hanover's mark of 1:49.2 the fastest in history for a female trotter and Emoticon Hanover's 1:50.2 the fastest in history for a female trotter on a five-eighths-mile track.

"It's a short field but it's good horses," Burke said.
"(Hannelore Hanover) will have to be sharp. She trained great last week, so hopefully she will be good."

Burke stakes-winners All Bets Off and Check Six are among the seven horses in the \$350,000 TVG Series championship for male pacers. Mach It So, who won this year's William R. Haughton Memorial at the Meadowlands, and stakes-winners McWicked and Dealt A Winner also are in the field.

"All Bets Off, to me, needs to win this," Burke said. "If he wins it I think he's aged pacer of the year, so it's a big priority to try to win this race."

The \$175,000 TVG Series championship for female pacers includes 2016 winner Lady Shadow, this year's Breeders Crown Mare Pace winner Pure Country and stakes-winners Nike Franco N, Blue Moon Stride, Darlinonthebeach, and Bedroomconfessions.

Burke's night is not limited to TVG action. Among the remaining horses from his stable in action is Breeders Crown 2-year-old pacing filly champion Youaremycandygirl in the \$381,200 Three Diamonds. She will start from post 10 with Yannick Gingras in the sulky.

"I hate the draw, but she's a great horse," Burke said. "She will put herself in the right position. Yannick will figure something out from out there."

Fourth Dimension trying to further rebound in Valley Victory

The freshman trotting colt is one of a host of interesting stories Saturday during the Fall Final Four at the Meadowlands.

After rebounding from a disappointing outcome in the Breeders Crown with a win in last week's Valley Victory Stakes elimination, 2-year-old trotter Fourth Dimension will try to wrap up his season with one more victory in Saturday's \$464,650 final at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

The Valley Victory is one of the "Fall Final Four" stakes for 2-year-old trotters and pacers Saturday at the Big M. The Valley Victory, for male trotters, is joined by the \$420,750 Goldsmith Maid for female trotters, \$411,700 Governor's Cup for male pacers, and \$381,200 Three Diamonds for female pacers.

In addition, the card includes TVG Series championships for trotters and pacers.

Fourth Dimension, trained by Marcus Melander, starts the Valley Victory final from post five after beating Kinda Lucky Lindy by 2-1/2 lengths in 1:55 last weekend. Brian Sears will drive the colt, who has won seven of 10 races and earned \$176,700 for owner Courant Inc.

In his start prior to the Valley Victory elimination, Fourth Dimension finished fifth in the Breeders Crown on Oct. 28 at Hoosier Park. He was the 1-2 favorite after winning his Breeders Crown elimination in a track-record 1:54, but was unable to find his footing in the final.

"We were disappointed after the Breeders Crown," Melander said. "He had a lot of problems with the surface that day. It was the same for everyone, but my horse just had a lot of problems with it. He's a horse that really needs some grip

and it was just slippery for him. It was too bad it was that day, but there is nothing we can do about it now.

"(Last week) I was very happy with how he looked and how he trotted. He trained well after the Breeders Crown, otherwise I wouldn't have put him in there. He came out of the race good and I'm going to train him (Wednesday) a little bit. He seems very good."

Fourth Dimension has won three of his past four starts, including a 1:52.4 victory in a division of the International Stallion Stakes at Lexington's Red Mile. That time is tied for the fastest race mile of the season by a 2-year-old trotter. In addition, the colt set or equaled track records four times this year.

In the Valley Victory, Fourth Dimension's foes include Samo Different Day, who in October won a division of the Madison County at Hoosier Park in a then-track-record 1:54.4. Samo Different Day, who finished second in the Peter Haughton Memorial and Matron Stakes and was third in the Breeders Crown, received a bye to the final.

Also in the field are Matron Stakes winner Wolfgang, Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion Fashionwoodchopper, Kentucky Sire Stakes winner Hat Trick Habit, and Kindergarten Series winner Tito.

"I'm looking forward to Saturday," Melander said. "He's beaten these horses before. It's a nice group of colts, but I know my horse is one of the best out there. He's showed a lot. He's a very nice colt."

The Goldsmith Maid features elimination winner Plunge Blue Chip, who has won eight of nine races for trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt. Plunge Blue Chip's victories this season also include the Matron Stakes for 2-year-old female trotters. Among the horses joining her in the Goldsmith Maid are stakes-winners Hey Blondie, who received a bye to the final, and Seviyorum, who finished second in the Breeders Crown.

Breeders Crown champion Stay Hungry, who received a bye, leads the group for the Governor's Cup, which also includes elimination winner Springsteen as well as stakes-winners Lost In Time, Closing Statement, and Nutcracker Sweet.

The Three Diamonds features a field that includes Breeders Crown winner Youaremycandygirl and fellow stakes-winners Kissin In The Sand, Rainbow Room, Majorsspeciallady, Strong Opinion, and Reign On Me. Youaremycandygirl, Rainbow Room and Majorsspeciallady received byes. Kissin In The Sand was the elimination winner.

Bold Eagle scratched - Guarato won anyway

The French superstar Bold Eagle was supposed to make his return on the racetrack in the \$142,000 Prix de Bretagne at Vincennes, Paris, France last Sunday, but the 6-year-old son of Ready Cash had hoof problems and was scratched from the race.

Bold Eagle's driver Franck Nivard had an accident in the bike last Friday night and the trainer Sébastien Guarato contacted Swedish driver Björn Goop, who was supposed to replace the French reinsman behind Bold Eagle.

The Prix de Bretagne was to be the first race for Bold Eagle since he was defeated by Aubrion du Gers in the Masters Final in September, but a problem with a pus pocket stopped him from participating in the first of four "B-races" in Paris this winter.

Bold Eagle will not have any problem to make his entry in Prix d'Amérique in January next year, since he already has enough money on his bank account. But for the most of the horses in Europe (and USA), there is a hunt for the ticket to Prix d'Amérique in the B-races. The first three horses in each race will start in PdA 2018.

In the Prix de Bretagne, Guarato ensured that he will have, at least, two horses beside Bold Eagle in the Prix d'Amérique. His Valko Jenilat (Kepler—Perle du Roc) was sent to the front early and driver Eric Raffin could slow down the pace during his road to the home stretch, where Valko Jenilat sprinted to a comfortable victory in a 1:57.,4 (mile rate) over the approximate distance 1.7 miles.

Guarato also had Billie de Montfort (Jasmin de Flore), who finished behind the winner while Philippe Allaire trained Charly du Noyer (Ready Cash) finished third.

On Dec. 10, the next B-race will take place and then it's time for Prix du Bourbonnais. On Dec. 24, two big races will qualify the winners for Prix d'Amérique. The Criterium Continental for the 4-year-olds and Prix Tenor de Baune for the 5-year-olds are two important races at Christmas time in the French capital city and the fans that stay over New Year's evening in Paris have the opportunity to see Prix de Bourgogne on Dec. 31.

The last B-race, Prix de Belgique, will take place on Jan. 14, two weeks before the big event at Vincennes.

Spectacular move in Sweden

Adrian Chip son Diamanten has been one of the best 4-year-old trotters in Sweden 2017 together with trainer Robert Bergh. At the end of last week, the horse moved from Bergh to former champion trainer Stig H Johansson's barn.

Diamanten will start for his new trainer this Saturday, in the \$95,000 final of Solvallaserien – Solvalla Grand Prix, and the new driver is Erik Adielsson.
