Rock Me Baby wins Courageous Lady

Two weeks after Thomas Dillon bought the filly for \$82,000 from the Harrisburg Mixed Sale, she set a 1:52 stakes record while winning the \$120,000 event at Northfield Park.

Rock Me Baby and Tim Tetrick set a 1:52 stakes record in the Courageous Lady two weeks after the sophomore pacing filly was purchased by Thomas Dillon for \$82,000 at the Harrisburg Mixed Sale.

Saturday's festive and well-attended evening at Northfield Park was made even better for Thomas Dillon of Anson, ME, when his horse, Rock Me Baby, won the \$120,000 Courageous Lady at Northfield Park.

The Courageous Lady was a series of firsts for Rock Me Baby. It was the first time she had raced for Dillon. He purchased her just two weeks ago for \$82,000 at the Harrisburg Sale. It was also Rock Me Baby's first start for trainer Heidi Rohr and the first time Tim Tetrick has driven the filly.

Rock Me Baby left the gate and initially sat in third, but was sent to the outside approaching the quarter. Once she made the lead about the quarter-pole, Rock Me Baby never experienced an anxious moment the remainder of the mile. She posted fractions of: 26.4, 54.4, 1:23 and 1:52.



"We had to go a pretty big first half," said Tetrick, "but I was able to give her a breather around the turn and she was really strong to the finish."

The clocking was a stakes record for the Courageous Lady and equaled Northfield Park's track record for sophomore filly pacers.

"I was happy to get to drive her," said Tetrick. "When they called me to ask if I would come here (Northfield), I was like, 'Absolutely!' I love traveling around to these big races offered at places like Northfield and being able to compete with nice horses. I'm just glad to be a part of all this."

Completing the field were Mother Of Art, LA Delight, Yankee Moonshine, Dime A Dance, Bellatricks, Free Show and Time On My Hands.

Rock Me Baby (Rock N Roll Heaven—Lover Of Art) now has four wins in 21 lifetime starts. Saturday's victory increased her career bankroll to \$164,228. She returned \$5.40 to win.

The filly was bred by Brittany Farms of Versailles, KY and the Brian P Monieson Revtrust of Northbrook, IL.

My cross-country harness racing adventure with Hal 9000

Did I ever tell you about the summer of 2004 when I drove from New York to Los Angeles with an acquaintance who not only sounded like Hal 9000 from the movie "2001: A Space Odyssey" but he also kept calling me "Dave" while asking endless questions about harness racing?

Think about it — nearly 3,000 miles of open road and rolling hills and amber waves of grain and the annoyingly polite company of a strange someone who was actually

interested in harness racing. Sounds like a yarn-spinning and tale-telling harness horseman's dream come true, right?

Wrong! It was a nightmare. It was the opposite of fun and adventure. If my car had an ejector seat, I would have pushed the button in St. Louis. And speaking of St. Louis, if you drive cross-country and you think you're making real good progress just because you got to St. Louis, think again. In the grand scheme of this trip, you've only just backed out of your driveway.

Anyway, people who actually know me, all three of them, also know that I have an insane need to be understood when I explain something. I refuse to walk away from answering a question that falls within my sphere of knowledge until I am certain that I have made myself perfectly clear. It's the only aspect of my personality that points to any sense of order or discipline in my life whatsoever. If you ask me a question, and I know the answer, I will answer in great detail — even if it takes me the entire length of America to do so.

"I'm happy to hear that about you, Dave. It's 90 miles to our next fuel stop. Can you explain the difference between a trotter and a pacer to me by then, Dave?"

Now, after what I just told you — my sick need to



over-explain stuff — how on earth could I ever hope to explain this very fundamental and very basic harness racing question to my cross-country passenger when I was continually being squeezed between 18 rumbling wheels of Piggly Wiggly sausage patties on one side of me and a Hess gasoline tanker on the other? I couldn't possibly demonstrate the whole trotter and pacer thing properly without taking my hands off the wheel and risk having us all go up into a swirling fireball which, as sick as it sounds, would probably have smelled really delicious from 20 miles away.

It's always best to start at the beginning, so let's start my travelogue of endless harness racing questions as we cross over the Delaware River in New Jersey, and head out onto the unnecessarily long state of Pennsylvania. As soon as you cross over the state line, these curious little orange traffic cones and barriers start popping up every 20 miles or so. They gradually narrow your lane until you're only inches away from driving beneath the oncoming tractor trailers. It's as though they want you to die. You can hear the cones whisper, "Come with us, frightened driver. Move over just a little bit more and all your troubles will be gone. There will be no more pain or worries or cares if you'd only drift...."

Anyway, by the time I got to Ohio, my passenger was starting to think I was holding out on him because I couldn't answer his questions well enough while I was driving in a death match with a bunch of good old boys who got themselves a convoy. Let's see you try to explain the meaning of the word "paddock" to someone who knows absolutely nothing about harness racing while you have to watch the road. It's a noun, a verb, and an adjective and it manages to be all of those things and more in about a thousand various ways.

"What's a paddock, Dave?" Well, a paddock is a patch of land with a fence around it where you can let your horse run around in the open air. "Why, do you do that, Dave?" Because horses like to kick up their heels and run and jump just like little kids playing in the backyard. "Don't they hurt themselves, Dave?" Yes, but only if they're really good horses. "But, Dave, why do you sometimes say that your horses have to be in the paddock by a certain time?" That's another kind of paddock. That's like an assembly hall for horses. "Oh, I get it, Dave, but why do trainers on Facebook say that they need someone to do a paddock for them? What's that mean, Dave?" It means....

Hey! Look! We just crossed over the border into Indiana. "No, Dave, that was hours and hours ago. We're in Illinois now. Do they have harness racing in Illinois, Dave, or do they

just have trotters?"

Yes, I know I'm a jerk, but we're talking about 2,791.3 miles in a Mitsubishi. It started to get real old, real quick, and it's scientifically impossible to explain all the stuff you need to explain to even half-explain the answers to whatever the original question might have been. By this time you'd settle for an economy seat directly in front of a screaming baby on a Southwest 737 with more metal fatigue than Mr. T's neck.

And, by the way, tumbleweeds are real things. They blow across the highway and scare the crap out of you. "What goes faster, Dave, a tumbleweed or Wiggle it Jiggleit?" I don't know. I guess it would depend on the wind speed. "Oh, yes, I didn't think of that, but what about the tumbleweed itself? Would Always B Miki be afraid of a tumbleweed or would he play with it?" I don't know about horses and tumbleweeds. "Why don't you know, Dave?" Because I don't, dammit!

Then, after the millionth question about bridles and buxtons, you come upon a thousand mile stretch of absolute nothingness where all you hear on the radio are angry preachers and twister alerts. How do you explain stud fees and artificial mares to an ordinary human being under those circumstances? You can't, so you gulp down your burger from Runza's (don't ask), and bam! You're in another state.



Gradually, the only thing that's getting thinner than the air is your patience.

"I think we're not in Kansas anymore, Dave." I know. We're in Colorado now. Time to stop for the night. "But, Dave, you never finished explaining about the hobbles. I bet if they'd put hobbles on Secretariat he would have been really fast. Why didn't anybody ever think of doing that, Dave?" They did put hobbles on Secretariat, but he didn't like them. That's when they decided that harness racing and thoroughbred racing should be two different sports. "I think you're lying to me now, Dave. I think you just made that up. Are you lying, Dave?"

By noon the next day I was traveling through New Mexico, and I was all out of my version of never-ending answers. The questions just kept coming, but now I was answering them like a normal human being. I was being very basic and pithy.

"How do you put on a leg wrap, Dave?" You don't just put on a leg wrap. It's very hard to learn to do it right, and you need to practice and practice and practice. "How do I practice that, Dave?" You need to go to a stable, clean stalls and water buckets for free, and gradually learn about all the things we talked about on this road trip. Got it?

"Yes, Dave, and now I think that I'm ready to take my USTA training test." No, you're not. "Will you sign for my license anyway, Dave?" No, I won't. "Look, Dave. I can see that you're really upset about this. I honestly think you ought to sit down calmly, take a stress pill, and think things over." No! I will not sign for your license just because we drove cross country together and I answered all of your questions about harness racing. You don't really "know" anything. You need to pay your dues. "Thank you for the ride, Dave. Our conversation about harness racing no longer serves any purpose. Goodbye."

So I dropped my passenger off at a hotel on Sunset Boulevard and continued on to my friend Matt's house in West Hollywood. I wonder how many horses my passenger has in his stable this year. Last year he had almost 30.

Down The Stretch is official horse of "Down the Stretch" show

The Down the Stretch show on Sirius XM radio has an official horse, and his name will be Down The Stretch.

The program, which covers both thoroughbred and standardbred racing and airs on Sirius XM Rush (Ch. 93) every Saturday morning from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. (eastern), has partnered with one of its biggest fans, Howard (From Rochester) Ouriel. Ouriel is a frequent caller to the show and the show's producers noticed that he was active at this year's Harrisburg yearling sale. Along with his brother, Micheal, Ouriel bought three horses, one of them an \$85,000 purchase by Art Major named Swig Hanover.

When reached by the Sirius XM team, Ouriel agreed to change the name of the horse to Down The Stretch, also the signature call of famed announcer Dave Johnson, who hosts the show.

"We though this would be a really neat idea, to sort of adopt the horse for our show," said Down the Stretch's executive producer Ed Pappas. "Howard was into the idea and quickly agreed to change the name of the horse to Down The Stretch. As long as the horse is racing and as long as we are still on the air, we'll check in with Howard from time to time to get updates on the horse and root him on to the winner's circle. We hope to have a lot of fun with this and give some exposure to a really good guy in 'Howard From Rochester' and to the sport."

Johnson opened the first "Down The Stretch" Down the Stretch segment with a mock race call of the 2018 Meadowlands Pace, which was, of course, won by Down The Stretch.

"We probably paid too much for this horse but now that I know you guys are on our side it's starting to look like a bargain," Ouriel said.

Don Rothfuss will train the horse and Ouriel said the immediate goal will be to tackle the 2017 New York sire stakes races. Ouriel said he will definitely make the payments to keep the gelding eligible for the 2018 Meadowlands Pace.

"My trainer doesn't blow smoke and he thinks the horse already looks like a three-year-old," Ouriel said. "That's a good report, but you never know. It's a total crap shoot. But Dave Johnson is a guy with good karma, so we think we have a better chance now of having this horse work out."

fastest standardbred to ever look through a bridle?

Boni defends ABM

With understandably great interest I read your Always B Miki vs. Wiggle It Jiggleit analysis and while I was certainly pleased with your conclusion, I also feel compelled to respond to a number of the points you made.

The comment that ABM "picked his spots" could not be more wrong. With ABM's trainer, Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter, we mapped out a campaign for the horse that had him making his first start in late April and racing through the TVG final at the Meadowlands in November. It all worked according to plan. With the exception of a possible conflict, ABM did not miss one major open pacing event and in fact won four of the six richest open races, the \$500,000 Ben Franklin, the \$471,800 William Haughton, the \$421,000 Breeders' Crown and the \$400,000 TVG-Final; of the other two, Bit Of A Legend won the Levy Final (with that race getting underway in late March) and WIJI won the Canadian Pacing Derby.

ABM did not "pick his spots" but made every big dance and more often than not won; unlike WIJI, ABM did not benefit from four age-restricted races.

As we feel Always B Miki is the best and I am sure (Wiggle It Jiggleit's owner) George (Teague) feels the same way about WIJI, I respectfully say let any honors be decided by performance only, as it should be. Using the criteria of performance only, I do not feel there is a horse, male or female, that has comparable 2016 accomplishments to those of ABM.

Always considering level of competition, I would challenge anyone to find another horse that can list five such brilliant performances as his world records winning the Ewart first

over (to me the race of the year), his Franklin elimination and final, and the spectacular Breeders Crown stretch drive to go along with his record shattering 1:46 mile with a :26.1 last quarter.

Not only would it be impossible to find five, but I sincerely doubt one could even find one or two.

Bringing (Miki) to the historic Red Mile for the Allerage Pace was also our goal. I have long felt this to be our greatest racing showcase and the reward was not only the world record 1:46, but an appreciative cheering crowd and a day that few in attendance will ever forget.

In addition to becoming the fastest standardbred of all time, and eclipsing a record that had stood for 23 years, ABM is also the only horse to have ever paced four miles in 1:47f or faster; no other horse has more than one! Also, ABM is the fastest ever in Canada with his dominant 1:47.1 win in the Mohawk Gold Cup.

In the category of head-to-head competition, ABM also holds a 4-3 edge over WIJI, and no, credit is never given for finishing ahead — only for winning.

Accurately assessing the stats and perhaps more importantly using the "eye" test, ABM has simply done things this season that horses are not supposed to do and have never done before.

We are very proud of his incomparable ability and courage and performance and I hope that will be what he is judged on.

Huntsville won the head to head 3 to 2, but I think Seaside's world record on the half mile and the way he won the Governor's Cup even that out.

Then there is also the homebred vs. sale purchase angle and a few words thrown around by trainers, etc. that make this race something to write about.

RE: Black Friday won't work for customers of harness racing

I will give the author credit for a headline that garnered my interest, but I take strong exception to much of the content (HRU Nov. 25). Any entertainment or service entity who considers sitting out the retail holiday 'super season' is guilty of wasting an opportunity. Offering existing clients flash sales on handicapping tools, vouchers, season admission, box seats or gift cards for the existing bettor or a person gifting a player make perfect sense. They may even cultivate new interest in a game sorely lacking in new faces... but new ideas are required to draw in the new harness racing fan.

My late grandfather was an assistant trainer of Lou Dillion and Uhlan — my destiny was set. I've painfully watched a sport I enjoy contract over the years. I root for the Gurals of the world to bring their entrepreneurial skills to a game that has a deep tradition. The sport failed to maximize TV (though Harvey Pack and Spencer Ross gave it a good try) and now seems to be failing to take advantage of an age where placing a bet simply requires a phone. Social media advertising is incredibly cheap and reaches the dynamic harness racing needs — new blood. Advertising a sale or promotion takes a click — it doesn't need to come at the expense of wowing the existing client.

I definitely agree that more can be done to maintain a client. A Black Friday sale would enhance that relationship — sales to a 'hot client' (an existing one) are much easier than a cold one. A regular who might otherwise ignore Black Friday as a race day might suddenly play a double he can make an extra 20 per cent on. The article's premise that a Black Friday sale only appeals to new clients is simply not factual.

Good marketing can draw harness racing fans

On the holiest of "shopping days" in the United States, Black Friday, Harness Racing Update's Dean Towers wrote a column that this man-made national "shopping holiday" won't work for harness racing customers.

I beg to differ with him. Just about any day of the year, holiday or not, except maybe a select few including Christmas and Easter, are ideal times to attract any customers. It just takes creative marketing.

Harness racing customers, even our "whales" of the sport can be lured to making wagers and attending the live racing to do so, if the product and "sales" are marketed properly. And this goes for both Moira Fanning's "people" and new fans as well.

Freehold Raceway stamped "Black Friday" as a major race day without a stakes race on the card throughout the 1990s, teaming with its local daily newspaper, shopping merchants and eventually with the Freehold Raceway Mall in giving away thousands of dollars (over \$12,000 plus) in shopping certificates that afternoon.

Not only did new fans come out strong, but "whales" did too, all hoping to win free shopping money. "Whales" even brought their significant others, convincing or "conning them" with the incentive of spending a holiday together in a fun and exciting atmosphere and maybe even an added bonus of winning a \$500, \$1,000 or \$5,000 shopping spree.

The dining room would be sold out well in advance, clubhouse seats gone before the first race and post time dragged to accommodate the thousands of people wanting to get a wager in. Food and beverage sales, race programs, gift shop, etc. all accounted for one of the best economic days of the year at the track.

Freehold even had the gall back then to risk flying in the top drivers in North America annually on President's Day in the middle of winter for their annual Driver's Challenge on a Monday and drew thousands of fans who wagered \$1 million on the card that had not one stakes race or discounted wagering format. Prior their President's Day card barely surpassed \$300,000 in wagering with simulcasting.

Those promotions then ceased when new ownership took over and ended all promotions like that and those glory days never came back.

The same happened at Pompano Park in the 2000s. Some track managers poo-pooed Black Friday, said it was a waste to promote. Then came the marketing efforts, sponsorships from other businesses, big giveaways throughout the race card and #wham, \$1 million handle, huge dining room sales, program sales, simulcasting, gift shop, big time revenue

pouring in.

Pompano Park was also the first track in Florida to offer a Player Reward Program Card and track their players and offer them extra entries for contests and such and sure enough they would come and wager more.

Then when the casino first came in, the same happened, only bigger with not just shopping sprees but wagering cash both for the horses and the casino.

And sure enough, the whales came out, only now they allowed their \$250 to \$1,000 per night wagering to continue and after the races added another \$250 to \$1,000 more in slot and poker player. Early on figures shows that one of every five high rollers in the top 500 slot and poker player was a horseplayer, too!

Even a known whale who used to pump it in big time at Freehold, migrated down to Pompano and increased their wagering per night averaging higher daily and yearling wagers than before and they were not the only ones.

But once again with management changes, Pompano no longer does it that way, and thus handle and attendance has plummeted.

So, Dean, if you market it right, they will come, both whales and new customers. Does not matter where or when only how well it is done.


