In support of a new USTA

The race for a new president is the perfect time to reshape the association for the betterment of the sport.



Not long after a contentious U.S. presidential election, an election for presidency of the United States Trotting Association (USTA) is close on the horizon. Based on some social media chatter and talk among industry insiders, it may also ruffle more than a few feathers.


And with good reason.

Despite the strong efforts of Phil Langley and, from what I've seen firsthand, a very dedicated and hardworking team, the USTA has become the convenient scapegoat for many of the ills of the sport. Despite a nominal budget compared to horseman groups, and certainly casino-funded tracks, the USTA, as the only quasi-national organization in the sport, steps into an ongoing onslaught of issues that it gamely tries to address despite the fact that most of the issues are outside its core charter as the sport's registry. Rule making, government legislation, publishing and even being the core impetus for first ever national social marketing, have all fallen under its domain due in large part to the lack of leadership from other parts of the industry and an "every man for himself" mentality between tracks and other groups (and some directors). Many in the sport simply don't understand the role of the USTA and that the tracks and racing commissions are the ones with much of the power. It's

simply easy for those disgruntled with aspects of the sport to point that dissatisfaction to the USTA, when in many cases it has neither the responsibility nor authority to act on those issues.

In the midst of this malaise, some are calling for the organization to be torn down to focus only on its core charge. I disagree strongly. The USTA, for better or worse, is the only national organization that can bring disparate groups together and serve as the closest analogy to an NFL or NHL league office, something the sport desperately needs.

But in my view, change needs to indeed happen — serious change and not necessarily because of any failures at the organization. Instead a "new" USTA needs to be transformed to be better positioned to more firmly address the failures and opportunities of the industry at large. In fact, as we approach this election, the debate should not be just about the new leadership of the organization, but about a new business model for the industry. What to do?

Streamline: According to the Corporate Library's study, the average board size is 9.2 members. No organization can operate effectively with 60 directors. That structure is reminiscent of the old Soviet Politburo (and we know how that turned out).

Diversify: Tracks and horsemen dominate the board. Yes, of course, their voices need to be heard and they're key constituents but they're also often myopic in their viewpoints, looking out for their niche interests instead of what's good for the sport at large. We need more diversity of perspectives, especially with the owners and breeders who are key investors into the sport, have a long-term perspective, but are often ignored. We also need a youth movement among the directors with fresh ideas, enthusiasm and determination to work through traditional hurdles. In most organizations, outside directors are also valuable to help overcome political factions.

Go Outside: We have some talented and ambitious people within the sport, but the next president should, in my view, come from outside the industry and have deep experience in the very core issues that are required to grow this sport. There is already a clear roadmap towards growth and innovation already out there if one looks to the NHL, MLB, FIFA and even rugby.

The CEO of MLB.com, for example, was a former client of mine, a Harvard grad, treasurer of Michigan and then CEO of

a dot-com start up before his current role. The sport has been reinvented through digital and social and MLB Advanced Media has "new" revenue of \$1.1 billion in 2016. We'll obviously not see that type of success in harness racing, but there is a lesson here: there are new business models we need to look at including owning our distribution. monetization, streaming rights, sponsor packaging and more. The current casino-subsidized model isn't sustainable. It provides us false comfort for the interim. Instead, we need to design a new business model. Right now between third party streaming partners who own exclusivity, ADWs, fractured sponsorship activities and more, we're leaving a lot of potential revenue on the table. No successful industry can allow its fate to be in the hands of third parties who don't share the same financial interest or passion for the product as us. The roadmap is out there and it resides in other sports that have been through this transformation, initiated OTT channels, created and owned new digital assets (such as Fantasy Leagues), and more. We have to break out of our insular thinking. This would require tracks and other horseman groups to empower the USTA to negotiate collectively for the sport on some key issues while retaining their right to approve or disapprove final terms. Not any easy task, clearly, but common sense dictates that by working collectively we will have more impact and leverage than working individually, and at times, against each other.

Some say the sport will never attract a talent like that, but the truth is there are many ambitious executives within some of the leagues with the experience and track records of working in other sports going through transformation that might make a lateral move with proper incentives for a chance to burnish their resume by helping to transform a nice sport.

However, and this is the rub, they will not do so unless the sport shows commitment, empowerment and resources to do what is necessary. Begging, cajoling, arm-twisting and hoping can only go so far.

Focus and Empower: Finally, the USTA tries to do too much for too many and, as the saying goes, too often "no good deed goes unpunished." When I first got into advertising at Young & Rubicam, I was advised never to accept the responsibility for a project without the authority. This is exactly where the USTA is now. It exists in a hybrid world between what it was chartered to do and all the activities it has been caught up trying to do in good faith and now is expected to do by an industry that would prefer to avoid having to do the heavy lifting themselves. While empowering it, I would narrow other activities by putting things like publishing, marketing (and associated analytics) in a separate, but related, entity that is also funded by other industry constituents to allow focus requires others to put

some skin in the game (and take some responsibilities for the outcomes), somewhat like the Jockey Club's America's Best Racing. A shared service model can be effective to bring cohesion and partnership among various factions. The USTA should not be responsible for being the default publicity engine for tracks and other groups who have been far too long on the sidelines yet make no investment in these activities.

The USTA leadership, in my view, deserves far more credit than it receives for trying to be the default guiding force in the sport. With this election however, it's clear the status quo is no longer sustainable. It is incumbent on all of us to take a pause to have the critically important existential conversation necessary about how we move forward – not just with new leadership – but with a new vision, structure and mission. A "new" USTA, for all its imperfections, is the only horse in the race who can get us there.

For the good of the sport, judges need to do their jobs

Calling up drivers for questionable drives should not be considered adversarial; it's simply common sense for a gambling game in the modern, connected world.

The HRU Twitter feed received a comment last week regarding the 2nd race at Cal Expo on Saturday. The tweet, in no uncertain terms, let loose, alluding that "the fix was in."

The race, a low conditioned event, saw the favorite from the wood grab an early three hole, sitting behind a 16-1 and 25-1 shot. The driver of the horse then chose to follow the two longshots through even fractions, and at the head of the lane was hopelessly boxed, loaded with pace. After the driver bobbed, weaved, and probably yelled at everyone to get out of the way, the horse stormed home to a bang up third.

I could see that commenter (and others) being very upset at the drive. But I watched the race replay about a half dozen times, and although I don't expect people who bet the horse to be happy, I sincerely doubt "the fix was in." This horse was clearly struggling on the sloppy racetrack. He was not on the bit at the quarter (even announcer Gary Siebel noted the driver was using the whip to keep pace before the half) and looked very uncomfortable. It was only at the head of the lane that the horse's class showed and he looked like a likely winner if he found room. The driver tried to find a clear path, pulling out every trick in the book to shake free. There is no doubt in my mind he wanted to win that race, and was doing everything possible to give his horse the best chance to win.

But we will never know, will we? And that's a big problem.

Races like the above happen with some regularity in harness racing, and instead of educating customers about a trip, or giving them some peace of mind by having the driver explain his or her reasons for the effort, we leave the betting public with nothing. They walk away thinking no one is minding the store, no one is taking care of their money, and that harness racing judges are in cahoots with the people they are paid to judge.

I know what some are saying reading this, because I have heard it a hundred times before: "so what, why bother with these whiners." Well, these 'whiners' bet \$2 billion a year and generate hundreds of millions of dollars in revenue for harness racing. They put food on everyone's table. I think we'd be wise to listen to Henry Ford, who once said about customer complaints, "don't find fault, find a remedy."

And in some parts of the harness racing world, a remedy is what's found

In Australia and New Zealand when these drives occur, drivers are called up by the stewards. They must explain why they employed the strategy they chose, and this discussion is released to the betting public. When they truly were at fault — i.e. they didn't try the horse when they should've — sometimes they get days. No, I am not naïve, many customers will not accept an explanation, or two days off, but at the very least they'll know someone was, i) watching the same race they were (customer empathy) and ii) actually cared enough to look into it (customer service).

On the very positive side, for customers with an open mind, this is a chance to win them over, maybe forever. Perhaps if this driver was called up at Cal Expo, explained the horse was not grabbing the track, was gapped in the three hole so he could not move at the quarter pole, and that he was as annoyed as bettors when he could not find room to win the race, people will watch the replay – and harness racing in general — in a new light.

This accomplishes much more than placation, in my view. It humanizes the sports' participants, and being human is one of the strongest bonds the sport (or any business) can make with its customer base.

As for drivers who get upset when they are being questioned, well, I understand because it's human nature. But, no one is calling them a crook, so there's no need to get their backs up. The sport is simply asking participants to be a part of the customer service team; not unlike a football player giving an interview after a tough loss.

There is a real bias from the betting public towards the sport of harness racing. It's a bias that drivers cheat and it's been going on since Hoover was president. We know with high purses cheating happens with little regularity; so little it's not even worth talking about. But for those out there betting \$5 or \$10, it's a very real concern.

Judges in the sport of harness racing, in my view, need to change their tune. They need to start calling up drivers for questionable drives. It's time they stop worrying about how the drivers feel, and focusing on what the customers have felt for decades. If this occurs, I believe – brick by brick – the relationship between the customer base and the sport can be rebuilt, and over time — on social media or grandstands — we'll see fewer and fewer complaints, and happier customers.









From Disaster to Progress

More than 10 months after his stable was destroyed by fire, Ontario trainer Ben Wallace won the \$314,600 Hap Hansen Progress Pace at Dover Downs with Easy Lover Hanover, a horse Brad Grant purchased to help Wallace rebuild.

Easy Lover Hanover completed a harness racing Cinderella story by winning the \$314,600 Hap Hansen Progress Pace at Dover Downs on Monday (Nov. 28) in 1:49.

Purchased for \$70,000 at the January Mixed Sale at the Meadowlands by Brad Grant of Milton, ON, Easy Lover Hanover was one of three horses Grant purchased at the sale to give to trainer Ben Wallace who lost all 17 horses he had in barn one at Classy Lane Stables that was destroyed by a Jan. 4 fire that claimed all 43 horses in it.

Easy Lover Hanover, a three-year-old gelded son of Somebeachsomewhere out of Easy Go Go, went on to post a record of 15-4-2 in 31 starts and earn \$314,124 for Grant, with the biggest win coming Monday when the pacer set a career best mark when driver Doug McNair orchestrated a half-length victory over favorite Check Six. Boston Red Rocks was three-quarters-of-a-length back in third.

McNair made good use of starting from post 1 by trailing Check Six (Yannick Gingras) through fast early fractions before finding room along the passing lane to finally pass the leader late in the stretch for the victory.

Grant and Wallace were elated in the winner's circle.

"He was a great horse to buy," said Wallace. "He won the first five races we had. While giving the horse some time off, we gelded him, which we had planned when we got him. After wins at Mohawk and Woodbine, we decided to put up \$25,000 to supplement him to this race. Doug McNair had driven him all season for us and he did another good job tonight."

Grant not only grabbed Easy Lover Hanover out of the January Mixed Sale, he topped the sale by purchasing six-year-old trotting horse Lindy's Tru Grit for \$125,000 and also bought four-year-old pacing mare A Plus for \$80,000. Collectively, that \$275,000 investment has earned Grant \$402,667 this year. Lindy's Tru Grit earned \$30,577 in 2016 in 10 starts. A Plus earned \$57,966 in 31 starts.

"It's to get Ben back and going," Grant told *HRU* at the sale. "We've known each other for 40 years. He's probably trained my horses for 20 or 25. So, it's to get him back up and

running right away, get him some racehorses... I'm excited about it. I want top-end horses and I think all three of them will be."

The three horses, and others, helped 67-year-old Wallace post better results in 2016 than he did in 2015, despite having to start over from scratch after the fire. Wallace's stable has earned \$584,607 this year and his 45 victories is the most he's had since 2013. Even more remarkable, his UTRS of .352 is the highest of his career since trainer records were first kept in 1992.

In April, Wallace told *HRU* he didn't want the fire to end a career in which his horses have earned well north of the \$35 million to which he's credited.

"I didn't want to quit. I didn't want to retire. I didn't want to call it. I didn't want a fire to define my career. I wanted horses to define my career," said 67-year-old Wallace who lost all 17 horses he had at Classy Lane when a fire gutted Barn 1, killing all 43 horses in it.

"There wasn't one 'Why me?' moment or 'What am I going to do now?' It was, 'How are we going to pick the pieces up and start back again?""

Ten months later, Wallace's victory in the Progress Pace with Easy Lover Hanover is an indication he's rebounded nicely.

Go 4th, young man

If Always B Miki is named the Horse of the Year, he will have finished fourth in his only off-the-board finish this year. That fourth-place finish came at the Meadowlands on Hambletonian Day, which is the exact same day, location and finish position as the 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit's lone off-the-board result of the year.

Others who were HOY with a fourth on their yearly bio were 2010 winner Rock N Roll Heaven who was fourth in the North America Cup, and No Pan Intended, who missed the board only once all season with a fourth in the 2003 Meadowlands Pace.

The rich go broke on Hambletonian Day

Even the richest trotters of all time occasionally went "broke" on Hambletonian Day.

Great, or almost great horses, that made a costly break on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands Include:

— Super Juan, who still managed to make the Hambletonian raceoff as the favorite and just missed taking the whole enchilada.

1982 — Both favorites broke while on or making the lead in their elims — Arndon, 10-for-13 coming in and Mystic Park 11-for-13 coming in. So did another horse, 72-1 longshot Diamond Exchange, who 11 months later would be the first ever 1:55 trotter in Meadowlands history.

— Gentle Stroke broke and finished ninth in the second heat.

1985 — Master Willie broke, but he atoned by winning the Yonkers Trot. Another Miracle broke also, but, a year earlier, he won the first ever \$1 million two-year-old trotting event when he was victorious in the Peter Haughton.

— Waikiki Beach broke and finished last. Hardly anyone was thinking that he would be the sire of Varenne, the richest trotter of all time.

– Jimmy Takter's first Hambletonian starter, Sir Taurus, was off stride and finished sixth and didn't make the final with Benny Webster driving.

— Some people forget that Probe made a break in his second heat, but fought back to dead heat Park Avenue Joe for the win in the raceoff.

— Magic Lobell broke and wound up last, but he dead heated in the Yonkers Trot with McCluckey.

– Jimmy Takter's Whiteland Image broke stride, but he came in off an upset score in the Beacon Course.

— Act Of Grace was second in the first hear to Continentalvictory's 1:52.1 world record — making it an all-girls finish. But, Act Of Grace made a break in the final.

— Yankee Glide broke and finished last the year Malabar Man won. Yankee Glide won the Peter Haughton the year prior, later sired Triple Crown winning Glidemaster and is the last sire to go one-two in the Horse of the Year ballot (2006 with Glidemaster and Passionate Glide).

— Master Lavec broke a year after wiring his field in the Breeders Crown.

— Andover Hall made a costly break early at 3-5 and lost all chance. As a stallion, his progeny's Hambletonian Day was one for the record books. He finished first and second in the Hambletonian with Donato Hanover and Adrian Chip and he also was the sire of Hambletonian Oaks winner Danae.

— Sand Vic, a career winner of \$2.1 million, made a break.

— Ken Warkentin (2-5) made a break and was placed sixth not advancing.

— R C Royalty broke, but made up for it big time siring the 2013 Hambletonian winner Royalty For Life.

2007 — Pampered Princess shunned the girls and took on Donato Hanover and wasn't up to the task on this day. She broke and finished sixth.

— Not everyone remembers that Lucky Jim made a break then racing for Trond Smedshammer. It was a year later that he would tie the world record of 1:50.1 and go 17-for-18.

— Holiday Road made a break on the same day that, a year earlier, he set the Peter Haughton stakes mark of 1:54.

— Manofmanymissions, a year after winning the Breeders Crown, broke in the stretch as the public choice the year Broad Bahn won.

Chuck Sylvester's best day ever?

I'll suggest Aug. 7, 1982 was trainer Chuck Sylvester's best day ever.

It was the day the relative unknown spring-boarded into national prominence.

Sylvester, then 41, raced an 0-for-5 three-year-old-a son of Arnie Almahurst that he got for a song. Diamond Exchange went off at 72-1 and broke stride. Hardly anyone noticed. Two others who did draw attention — and also broke stride — were Mystic Park at 30 cents on the dollar and 6-5 choice Arndon. Neither made the Hambletonian final in the second year the event was held at the Meadowlands.

Why would this day be of significance to Chuck Sylvester?

- **1.** Eleven months later, on July 4, 1983, Diamond Exchange would become the first ever 1:55 trotter in Meadowlands history.
- **2.** It would be five years until Sylvester broke through on Hambletonian Day— with Mack Lobell in record time. Mack clearly put Sylvester on the map to stay. Mack Lobell was from the first crop of Mystic Park, one of those who also broke in the 1982 Hambletonian.
- **3.** It would be a little more than a decade until Pine Chip would surface. He is the last horse to be named Trotter of the Year both years he raced three and four. You guessed it, Pine Chip was a son of Arndon, a son of another breaker on that fateful Hambletonian Day in 1982.

And, by the way, both Mack Lobell and Pine Chip cost \$17,000. Coincidence?











Marie Hill dead at 85

Marie Catherine Hill, a Canadian who fell in love with harness racing as a young girl and became an important author of books about participants in the sport, died Nov. 22, in Merlin, OR near the residence of her daughter, Irene, after a brief illness. She was 85.

Born Aug. 12, 1931, in Blacks Harbor, New Brunswick, Ms. Hill attended her first harness race at the half-mile track at St. Stephen, NB, when she was 11 years old. At 13, she wrote her first article for The Canadian Sportsman, a few paragraphs titled "Watchim on the Trot," which was about the trotting track record-holder at St. Stephen. The story led to other articles for the Sportsman's Christmas editions. She also wrote for The Horseman And Fair World, Hoof Beats, The Harness Horse, and Trot magazines.

Ms. Hill became one of harness racing's most prolific historians, writing six books: Single G: The Horse That Time Forgot, Adios: The Big Daddy of Harness Racing, Gentleman Joe — The Story of Harness Driver Joe O'Brien, Mr. Harness Racing — the Story of Delvin Miller, and The Horseman from Alberton.

In 1959, Ms. Hill moved to California, where she worked as an accountant and office manager for construction companies in the San Francisco Bay area. Her interest in harness racing, its horses and people, never waned. During the 1970s and early 1980s she bred, owned and raced horses in California, Kentucky and Indiana.

Ms. Hill became acquainted with Delvin Miller by mail when he responded to an advertisement she had run in The Horseman And Fair World in which she had asked for historical information about Single D. Miller responded, as was his habit, and thus began a lifelong friendship. Miller subsequently asked Ms. Hill to write his biography and she delightedly agreed to the project. In 1992, when Adios was inducted into the Indiana Standardbred Hall of Fame, Ms. Hill accepted the award at Miller's request.

In 1984, Ms. Hill nominated B.C. Count to the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. The horse's subsequent election, which came in 1998 following a 14-year campaign on her part, brought her great satisfaction.

In 2005, Ms. Hill was honored with the Harness Racing Museum's Pinnacle Award and in 2007 she was inducted into the Communicators' Hall of Fame.

In addition to harness racing, Ms. Hill's hobbies included the Civil War and watching the New York Yankees. She loved

her family, friends, animals, her Catholic faith, and was a devoted mother and daughter.

In addition to her daughter Irene (Stephen), Ms. Hill is survived by her cousin, Sheila Hurley, and friend Arlene Matheson, both of whom she called sisters; the Walker family, Hill and O'Connor cousins; and many more cousins.

A memorial service will be held at St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church in Burlingame, CA, where Ms. Hill lived until she moved to Oregon to be near her daughter.

January Select Mixed Sale closes Monday

Tattersalls Sales Co. reminds horsemen that entries for the main catalog for the Meadowlands January Select Mixed Sale will close Monday (Dec. 5).

The popular winter sale will be held in the back paddock at the Meadowlands on Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Monday, Jan. 16.

Sale manager David Reid said that despite the racehorse population not being what it used to be, the numbers for the mixed sales that are held at the Meadowlands have continued to stay strong, and he expects the January sale to hold true to form.

"There are two ways to look at the shortage of racehorses," he said. "On the one hand, there are plenty of racing opportunities and purses are strong, so many find it hard to part with a good horse.

"But on the other hand, that smaller population of racehorses has sent demand through the roof when a good one does go to auction. Nearly every horse that sells these days — that's competitive and winning — brings every penny it's worth, and many times a whole lot more."

With breeding season just around the corner, the sale has also become a target for those selling race fillies, in-foal broodmares and stallion shares.

"Our 'Magnificent Mares' section has really picked again recently, and we expect that trend to continue," Reid said.

"With the yearling market like it was this last fall, there's big money to be made selling high-end fillies and mares."

Racing Hill to stand in Ohio at Hickory Lane Farm

Owner Tom Hill, Lancaster, UK and Hickory Lane Farm, Findlay, OH are pleased to announce that they have reached an agreement to syndicate and stand Racing Hill (Roll With Joe— Chasing Ideals by American Ideal) 2, 1:51.2, 3, 1:48 (\$1,727,689.00) at Hickory Lane Farm beginning in 2017.

At two, while establishing his 1:51.2 mark on a sloppy track, Racing Hill won such prestigious races as The Bluegrass Stakes, International Stallion Stakes and an elimination of The Breeders Crown.

In addition, Racing Hill has won several of the prestigious three-year-old stakes races. Besides winning the Breeder's Crown, Racing Hill recorded victories in the \$500,000 Hempt Final at Pocono, the \$500,000 Messenger Stakes at Yonkers, and the \$400,000 Adios Pace at The Meadows. He was a fast-closing second in a photo finish for win in the Meadowlands Pace and was a strong second in the \$1 million North America Cup.

JK Endofanera's first book full and closed

The first stud book for JK Endofanera p,2, 1:51.4; 3, 1:48.2 (\$2,049,580), who was retired from racing earlier this year, is full and closed.

JK Endofanera will stand his first season at stud in 2017 at Victory Hill Farm in LaGrange, IN. He was bred and campaigned by the 3 Brothers Stable of Steven, Alan and Ron Katz. They sold a significant interest to a group comprised of the same principals who brought Always A Virgin to Indiana.

"He's an exceptional horse and we're thrilled that he's received so much support from significant breeders and will have a great start at stud," said Bob Boni, a spokesperson for the stallion's ownership group.

A son of Art Major, JK Endofanera is out of the Presidential Ball mare Presidential Lady, who also has produced 2014 Horse of the Year JK She'salady.

Trained by Ron Burke at ages two and three and Jimmy Takter during his four-year-old season, JK Endofanera beat every top colt of his generation. As a two-year-old he won four of seven starts, among them the \$534,500 Governor's Cup at the Meadowlands, when he took his freshman mark of 1:51.4. At age three, he captured the \$1 million North America Cup, defeating a field that included He's Watching and McWicked. In 2015, at age four, he captured the Dan Patch free-for-al at Hoosier Park by two-and-a-half lengths in 1:48.4, exploding past his rivals with a :26.2 final quarter.




