### Free Walter Case Jr.

It's true that Walter Case Jr. has done a lot of terrible things in his life, mostly to himself, and in one case, to an ex-wife. Case was convicted of felonious assault in 2004 after hitting and stabbing Nadine Case in the back with a steak knife. That got him a five-year sentence in prison and lifetime in the Human Race Hall of Shame.

On the surface, Case, who has also had numerous problems with substance abuse, is not exactly a nice guy. And I am not interested in scratching beneath the surface or examining whatever demons might have made him so troubled. I just don't see what any of that has to do with his right to drive a standardbred race horse and the right of an owner or trainer to hire him to do so.

The only thing that should matter to racing officials and regulators, fans, owners, trainers and his fellow drivers is how Case performed on the racetrack before his latest exile. He did kick horses and needs to never do that again if allowed to drive. But, when it comes to his driving, there's never been a hint of a scandal. Case's biggest problem may have been that he tried too hard, which is why he would kick a horse. On the track, when it comes to this particular driver, integrity has never been an issue.

The USTA and the state racing commissions have a duty to keep cheaters out of the sport. Had Case's crime had anything to do with racing a lifetime ban would be justified. I do not believe that what happens away from the race-track falls under the authority of racetrack officials or those who have the power to deny someone a license.

Imagine if Case played professional football for a living. Like Michael Vick or Plaxico Burress, after serving his time, he would have been allowed to go back to work and, as long as his skills merited it, someone would have signed him. That's basically how things work in this country. You pay your debt to society and are then given the opportunity to rehabilitate yourself and get on with your life.

The exceptions are when someone's presence and character poses a threat. A bank robber cannot be hired as a bank guard. Vick can play quarterback, but no one would hire him to dog sit. A convicted race-fixer should not ever be allowed to participate in racing.

In Case's case, it is the owners and trainers who are cast in the role of an NFL team. Case is a private contractor and the owners decide whether or not they want to pay for

his services, just like the Philadelphia Eagles decided they wanted Vick, baggage and all. The race horse owner can decline to hire Case for reasons that may or may not have something to do with his past or they can hire them. It should be up to them.

Case's detractors will argue that because of his crime and his past he should be disqualified under the notion that his presence on the racetrack is not in the "best interests of the sport." Granted, Case isn't exactly the type of character you want winning your races or gracing the cover of your program, but I would be a lot more sympathetic to that argument if the sport weren't so lenient with its cheaters.

There are numerous people participating in the sport who have been caught and punished for drugging, race fixing and all sorts of other nefarious on-track acts. They go a way for a little while and then are welcomed back as if nothing ever happened. These are the people that need to be booted and booted forever, and not Walter Case Jr. Anyone who won't take him back but has done nothing to keep the cheaters out is a hypocrite of the highest order.

Case's wife, Luanne, says her husband is a changed

Case has yet to take the necessary steps to get back in the bike. He will need to plead his case to the USTA in order to get a license from them and he'll have to do the same with various racing commissions. He plans to do so and hopes to be driving again soon.

He has hurdles to clear, but no one should stand in his way. To the best of anyone's knowledge, Case has never drugged a horse, stiffed a horse, bet against himself or done anything on the racetrack

other than try his very best to win.

It's a shame what he has done with his life away from the track, but when it comes to whether or not he should be allowed to participate in this sport none of that should matter.

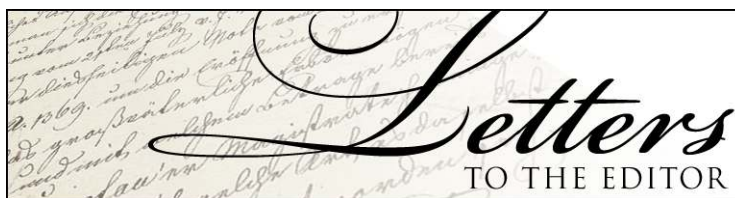

However, knowing they could be facing a sixty day suspension and fine, they may not have taken the chance to violate the rules.

But the problem is not just training violations but driving violations as well. There are two problems with rule books. First, some fines haven't been looked at for so long and secondly, there is a need to index fines, perhaps indexing them to a licensee's earnings the prior year. Let's say whipping before the 3/4s is a \$100 fine. Driver John Doe last year earned \$50,000 in purse earnings meaning he made \$2,500 driving. Then we have Joe Superstar who earned \$1,000,000 in purses meaning he made \$50,000 driving. To John Doe, a \$100 fine will be a real deterrent, but for Joe Superstar, that \$100 fine is a cost of doing business. When you are in a race with a \$100,000 purse is the risk of a \$100 fine going to keep Joe Superstar from whipping before the 3/4s? Now, if that fine was \$1,000, it may be a different story.

If fines and suspensions are to be a deterrent, racing commissions and the USTA need to review their rule books and go over all violations to bring fines and suspensions up to line with 2011 as well as index fines and suspensions so they are punitive, not just a cost of doing business.

Shooebie's Place (George Brennan).

Lucky Man found three-quarters in 1:24.2, taking a length-and-a-half lead into the lane. He hit the mile marker in 1:52, with Rojette's Best his only threat. That one came up a half-length short, as Lucky Man negotiated the mile-and-one-sixteenth in 1:59.

B J's Bequia (Jason Bartlett), Foreign Officer (Jim Pantaleano) and Code Word (Yannick Gingras) rounded out the payees.

For Lucky Man, a 6-year-old Camluck gelding owned by Thomas Hill and trained by Casie Coleman, he returned \$4.10 for his fourth win in 23 seasonal starts. The exacta (two wagering favorites) paid \$10.80, with the triple returning \$36.

While the horses were slowing down in the first turn after the race, Rojette's Best and Foreign Officer appeared to collide, with both Holland--who was unseated--and Pantaleano getting injured. Both were taken to a local hospital and no other information is available at this time. Rojette's Best was down on the track for several minutes, but did get up.
