'What if' questions loom in Horse of Year decision

Not a lot separates the top seven horses in the Hambletonian Society's weekly poll.

The battle to determine the best harness racing horse in 2017 is a highly contentious one as evidenced by the fact that in the final Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, five horses are garnering at least one first-place vote.

Any number of the top horses are deserving of the top honor despite none being unbeatably heads and shoulders better than anyone else. For some, it's been literally a matter of inches in their races throughout the year and it makes you wonder if Horse of the Year may have been in their fortunes if not for the slightest of different outcomes.

At least some amount of reasonable consideration for Horse of the Year can be given to the first seven horses listed

in the standardbred final poll. Working backwards to #1, we begin with the 7th rated horse.

Youaremycandygirl crushed (pun intended) her competition almost the entire season, ending her year with seven straight wins highlighted by the She's A Great Lady, the Three Diamonds and the Breeders Crown. Most noteworthy of all is her 1:50 clocking in her International Stallion Stakes in Lexington, which was the fastest mile paced by a 2-year-old filly EVER.

A winner of nine for 11 on the year, her only two defeats came in her first lifetime start at Vernon when she broke after being interfered with, and then a NYSS race at Yonkers when she faded late at 35 cents on the dollar. The debut race can't be held against her, but if not for that fluky fifth-place finish at YR she'd be on the outside part of the discussion; she's dominated her division in style.

Next comes **What The Hill**, and how big right now is that Hambletonian disqualification? He's been an up and down horse this year for sure throwing in disappointing races at times including falters in the Matron, Erskine, Bluegrass and Futurity, but he's nailed all the big ones.

There can't be too many horses (if any) that have won the

Hambletonian and Breeders Crown in the same season and have not won Horse of the Year. He obviously didn't win the Hambletonian as an official record, but he did cross the line first and was obviously best that day. In addition, he won the Canadian Trotting Classic and capped off the year with the rare feat of defeating older horses in the TVG. It's not crazy to say that had he been kept up in the Hambletonian, that he

would be tough to deny for top honors.

At #5 is **Fear The Dragon** who did notch one first place vote in the final poll. Had this award been decided a couple of months ago he may have won, and today he likely won't

even hang on for his own division. In many sports, it's not how you start but how you finish and this is no exception. After impressive PASS wins that was followed up with a North America Cup win, he then went on to win both the Hempt and the Adios.

But after he finished second in the Milstein (no disgrace there) he didn't fire his best in the Little Brown Jug final and was empty in his Breeders Crown elimination, failing to even make the final. Fear The Dragon still may have been able to salvage a larger say in the award had he been able to beat his nemesis in Progress Pace to close out the year, but he could only manage second best. A Jug win or even a better showing in any number of races to close out the year would have aided his cause.

Next to Fear The Dragon in the poll is **Downbytheseaside**, and we had the pleasure of watching these two slug it out going back to early in the year. If grit and toughness played into HOY, Downbytheseaside (three first place votes) would have a real chance. His 22 starts this year are far more than anyone else under consideration and despite all his ups and downs through the year, he finished out November a perfect four for four.

His race at Northfield in the Milstein when he went first



over through a back half of about :52 to beat Fear The Dragon might be the race of the year in my opinion. He came up a nose short against Huntsville in the Meadowlands Pace and had that race been credited to him to go along with wins in the Rooney, Messenger, Jug Preview, Matron, Progress, Monument Circle, that resume may have been good enough for him to be voted #1. He was also second in the Breeders Crown final in an upset, and that race too would have been a big boost. He'll end up as 3YO champion.

The top 3 spots are all held by female trotters, beginning with **Manchego** (four first place votes) in the third spot. With a perfect 12-for-12 record where she was simply too good for her group, it's not like you can knock her or say what she could have done differently. What she has going for her is that she's never lost, but that might not be enough as it's nearly impossible for a 2YO filly trotter to be voted as HOY; it just doesn't happen. Her mark this year of 1:52.4 is solid, but by comparison the great Mission Brief trotted in a world record 1:50.3 three years ago and even she could do more than win her own division. She'll get her chances next year.

In the poll's runner up spot is **Ariana G** with 13 first-place votes. With a record of 15 12-2-1 things would seem to be in her favor, but I think she's a victim of how much we've come to expect her to dominate her peers over the last two years.

Of her three losses, only one has come against females, which occurred on a day when she wasn't at her best in the Kentucky Filly Futurity for fillies. The other two came in races against males in the Beal final and in the Zweig; both races of which should still be towards her credit. She did beat the boys in her Beal elimination, but after two losses against male counterparts her connections had seen enough and

elected to race her in the Hambletonian Oaks instead of the open Hambletonian. She romped in that race as expected, but a win in the Hambletonian against the boys – something that hasn't been done since 1996 – would have all but cinched her spot for Horse of the Year. For that matter, a win in either the Zweig or Beal may have done the same.

Hannelore Hanover leads the final USTA poll with 14 first-place votes and is the favorite to win Horse of the Year, largely aided by her world record 1:49:2 mile in the Allerage at Red Mile. She's racked up many big wins including wins against the boys, but she's only won 10 of her 17 starts (five-for-five in Canada but just five-for-12 in the U.S.). If there's anything that could have gone a different way that would have gave her more breathing room in the top spot, it would have been from any of her 5 races where she was runner up.

The race that comes to mind where she was deserving to win but didn't, was the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts at Plainridge when she was unofficially interfered with multiple times and had to settle for second. But in the end it shouldn't matter. Her race against males in the Maple Leaf Trot was one of the most impressive races of the year and she's done enough to earn the top honors.

My picks for Horse of the Year would be: Hannelore Hanover, Downbytheseaside and Ariana G in that order.

Dates set for What The Hill's appeal of Hambletonian DQ

Mike Gulotta said Thursday the New Jersey Office of Administrative Law (OAL) has set dates to hear the appeal of What The Hill's disqualification from the \$1 million Hambletonian held Aug. 5, 2017 at the Meadowlands.

January 23, 24 and 25, 2018 have been set aside in Newark, NJ to hear the appeal of the race judges' decision to disqualify What The Hill for interference in the stretch and place him from first to ninth (full story here). Second-place finisher Perfect Spirit was declared the winner.

Gulotta's Deo Volente Farms owns What The Hill, along with the colt's trainer, Ron Burke (Burke Racing Stable LLC), the Our Horse Cents Stable and J&T Silva Stables LLC. The group has long contested that judges erred in disqualifying

What The Hill.

Jersey harness tracks cautiously optimistic about sports betting

With several signs pointing toward the Supreme Court of the United States ruling in favor of the state of New Jersey in its efforts to legalize sports betting at racetracks and casinos, management at both the Meadowlands and Freehold said they're looking forward to the day when they can accept bets on sporting events.

The Supreme Court heard oral arguments in the case known as Christie v. National Collegiate Athletic Association Monday and, based on questions asked by the justices, virtually every legal expert who has weighed in on the subject expects that New Jersey will prevail. A decision is expected to be announced in the first half of 2018.

"We invested heavily in this with Monmouth Park sharing the legal fees and it looks like it's going to pay off," Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural said. "It's good news. It's great news, actually."

But neither Gural nor Chris McErlean, the vice president of racing with Penn National Gaming, which co-owns Freehold with Greenwood Racing Inc., were willing to predict that sports betting would produce a large influx of revenue and neither would commit to using any of the extra money for purse increases.

"From what I've been told it doesn't make a lot of revenue, but it would put people in the building and that would certainly help pay the bills," Gural said. "There's still a lot of uncertainty surrounding the possible outcomes of the case. One thing that is certain is it will help. The question is will the people coming here to bet on a football or baseball game also bet on horse racing? I suspect there are probably people who bet on horse racing and sports who might come and our live handle would go up."

McErlean said that sports betting would likely be something that would help Freehold stay in business.

"Certainly, given the state of the industry in New Jersey, any opportunities for increasing potential revenue and foot traffic within the building is a good thing," he said. "It remains to be seen what actually will be permitted, whether it will be in New Jersey only, all over the country, on-line or just at bricks and mortar. This is an opportunity we've been restricted from up to this point and we would certainly welcome this opportunity that will help keep Freehold viable going into the future."

Single game sports bets are illegal in the U.S. in all states but Nevada due to a federal law known as the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act of 1992 (PASPA). The Supreme Court could rule against New Jersey and keep the sports betting ban in effect. If the court rules in favor of New Jersey then it could go in two directions. One would be that only New Jersey's partial repeal of PASPA, which allows for sports betting only at casinos and racetracks and does not call for it to be regulated, is legal. The other is that it could declare PASPA unconstitutional. If that turns out to be the court's decision it could easily open the doors for sports betting to be legalized rapidly in a number of states and,

perhaps, go online.

Dennis Drazin, who heads the management team at Monmouth Park, seems far more optimist than Gural is about the windfall to come from sports betting, estimating that Monmouth's take on sports bets placed there will be \$75 million. He said \$25 million will go towards overhead and that the remaining \$50 million would be split evenly among the racetrack and William Hill, the bookmaking firm that has been hired to run sports wagering at the Jersey Shore track.

Gural notes that the Meadowlands racetrack is largely inaccessible when either the Giants or Jets are playing at nearby Met Life Stadium on Sundays, which would limit his ability to take bets on the NFL, and also wonders if people will be willing to travel somewhere to make a legal bet when there are still many ways to bet illegally on line through foreign websites.

"It's clear you'd have huge days like the Super Bowl, the football playoffs, maybe the college bowl games and the NCAA tournament," Gural said. "But on other days are people going to drive 30 miles to the Meadowlands just so they can make their bet legally?"

It also remains unclear how the Supreme Court decision will impact online wagering in the state and whether **4njbets.com**, which is run by TVG, and is the only ADW Jersey residents are allowed to use, could take sports bets. If they do take sports bets on-line, all the Jersey tracks would share in the profits.

None of the New Jersey tracks have any obligation to take any of the profits from sports bets and put them into purses. Gural admitted he won't immediately be looking to fatten up the purse account.

"At the Meadowlands we've overpaid purses by \$4 million right now and (paying more into the purse account) is not an issue for me," he said. "The horsemen are lucky I fund the losses that keep the Meadowlands open so I doubt if this would have a dramatic effect on purses. All it's going to do is help pay the bills. Obviously, if I am wrong and there is some bonanza from sports betting that I am not anticipating I would look into sharing it with the horsemen. But all I've ever head from people is you don't make a lot of money from sports betting."


McErlean was not clear about what Freehold would do with any extra profits made for sports bets.

"We haven't had any real discussions on that," he said. "A lot will depend on what we are actually permitted to do and

what type of investment it takes and what is the potential return. We really have not addressed that matter.

Gural said if the court rules in New Jersey's favor he would hope to have a sports book up and running by the beginning of the 2018 NFL season.

Bo is Jayden's world

The Children's Wish Foundation's gift of a 13-year-old standardbred named Bo has been life changing for 12-year-old Jayden Trueman of Nova Scotia.

This is the story of a girl and her horse — but not just any girl, and not just any horse.

When Jayden Trueman of Nova Scotia was four years old, one of her knees swelled to three times its normal size even though she had not done anything to injure the area. Her life changed dramatically when she was diagnosed with a severe form of juvenile arthritis.

Eight years later, prescribed medications are working well for Jayden. And her spirits have never been better thanks to Bo, a 13-year-old standardbred that was recently presented to her by the Children's Wish Foundation.

"What does Bo mean to Jayden?" her mother, Jackie Snow, asked rhetorically. "Oh, my goodness, the world."

After Jayden conveyed her wish for a horse to the Foundation, her family undertook the expense of preparing for its arrival. Jayden had been taking riding lessons with Bo and caring for him at a nearby farm. But she understood that his owner, Kim Sellars, was equally attracted to his good-natured demeanor and did not want to part with him.

The more Sellars watched Jayden interact with Bo,

however, the more she recognized the need to play her part in granting the child's wish by selling the horse for a modest sum to the Foundation.

"As much as she didn't want to give up Bo, she knew that connection was something you don't see very often, that instant connection between a horse and a caregiver," said Jacob Rafuse, a wish coordinator. "That's when she knew that Bo was going where he needed to go."

Jayden thought she was attending a surprise birthday party for one of her uncles the day Bo arrived. She was seated at a table when the brown gelding announced his presence by gently nudging her in the back. She turned and instantly understood that her wish was granted beyond her wildest dreams. Tears flowed.

"I cried a little bit more than a little bit," Jayden said.

She no longer thought of herself as a 12-year-old with a worrisome illness. She was a 12-year-old with a horse that needed her as much as she needed him.

"He's not like other horses," she said. "He's a big baby."

Nothing seems to frighten or faze Bo. He is nothing but loving and trusting.

"He is as calm as can be. He's very gentle," Snow said. "I have a granddaughter. (Lilah) is almost 17 months old and she can walk that horse around. Jayden is holding on, too, but as soon as the baby stops, that horse stops."

Jayden describes Bo as being "goofy," a quality that delights her. "He can be calm and sweet," she said, "and then he likes to play and stuff."

When they are together in a pasture, he follows her everywhere. When she runs, he runs. When she slows to a walk, he follows her lead.

Snow has observed a significant change in her daughter since the new addition to the family.

"She's more upbeat," the mother said. "She listens more, that's for sure."

Jayden understands the great responsibility she has undertaken and welcomes it. The horse, and not juvenile arthritis, occupies most of her thoughts now.

"She does everything every other kid does," said Snow.
"When she first started horseback riding (six years ago), it
wasn't fully under control and I was quite nervous because it
can be rough on the joints."

Doctors have told Snow that, for some children, symptoms associated with juvenile arthritis ease or disappear as they age. There is no telling what the future holds for Jayden. The only certainty is that her life is immeasurably better with Bo in it, thanks to one of more than 25,000 wishes granted since the Children's Wish Foundation began 33 years ago.

For children whose illness often does not allow them to be playful and carefree, the Foundation grants an average of three wishes per day.

"It's an incredible moment when you see that joy in a child's eyes," Rafuse said.







Corrective shoeing, no shoes, the best bourbon and more

Jimmy Bernstein asks: A pacer bowlegged behind crossfires. How would you shoe him behind?

Only you would come up with a question like this. You have a better chance to get hit by lightning than find a bow-legged standardbred. However, I will not dodge the question. If the colt is truly bowlegged he must toe in behind and almost has to crossfire as he is aiming at his front feet. Raise his angle to as close as you can to 58 degrees and lower him to the outside with the shortest toe possible. Use a victory plate for the shoe and if you can't get his angle high

enough there is a 3-degree victory plate available that works well. If this doesn't work than add knee spreaders that will surely solve your problem.

David Raber asks: How do I shoe a trotter off his right hock and left knee?

If you get him off the hock chances are he will no longer hit the knee. This is a very usual scenario. When a horse hits himself behind it changes the way he carries his foot forward and often will cause him to hit a knee. But I will give you a cure for both. Raise your hind angles as much as you can and take the horses head up a couple of holes. Try a wide web flat aluminum shoe. If that works, fine. If it gets him off his hock and he still hits his knee try a queens plate in front and diamond the toe of the right front foot.

Nick Salvi asks Basil Hayden or Blantons?

This one is a lot easier. Basil Hayden without question. I find it's the best go-to Bourbon, available in almost every restaurant and is more than delicious. Soft smooth deep flavor. Blantons is a bit too harsh for me as is Knob Creek they both have a very high alcohol content — 93 proof — whereas Basil Hayden is 80 proof. I have found many little known Kentucky bourbons that are great. The best of which is Hirsch. It is 92 proof but it is 21 per cent rye whiskey and seems more delicate than the other high alcohol bourbons.

Joel Kravet asks: Do you pamper, use caution or put your best grooms on 1st night purchases vs. your barn filler yearlings. What do you do to protect the investment of the owner?

I will answer the second part first as I feel it's a loaded question. If you are considering a trainer and have to ask or even think about what he does to protect the owners' investment, you have the wrong trainer. All good trainers do the best they can, as there is little money in winter training the money comes with racing, selling, etc. If you destroy the product before the start of production you hurt yourself as much as the owner. As far as best grooms on first night horses go, most of the time we break yearlings in a group. Everyone helps and when they are jogging I let the caretakers with the most experience select the ones they like and go from there. I don't pay much attention to other trainers, but I can honestly say that I have rarely had a bad caretaker in my employ. Some are a bit quirky but they all know how to take care of a horse and keep him or her happy.

As far as barn filler yearlings, in my barn there is no such thing. I rarely buy indigenous horses and could care less about their programs. In the years I was training a full barn of horses, anything I would buy to me was a potential world champion. I won the Hambletonian with two \$100,000 horses and a \$40,000 horse. I wouldn't consider Victory Dream a barn filler nor Vernon Blue chip at \$17,000. It is also important for you to know that there is no extra pampering or caution on what you call first night horses. There is pampering and caution on ALL horses.

Steve Mattox asks: A lot of Europeans are racing with no overcheck. You have raced a boatload of trotters, any with no overcheck?

I have but not that many. Basically I race 90 per cent of my horses with no overcheck because they race with a leather chin strap and a very loose check. Many of my horses when you sit behind them, all you can see are their ears. In the earlier years, I tried a few times to qualify one without a check and I found most drivers were reluctant to sit behind one without a check. Looking back at the situation, it was probably them thinking, 'What is this jerk doing, is he's trying to get me killed?'

Paul London asks: Have you ever raced one of your trotters with no shoes? I have been following Swedish and French racing and they put a major emphasis on the horses racing shoeless or not. They even have lines in the program showing what shoes were worn in a previous race. It seems in the big races trainers prefer no shoes. I saw Yannick's interview after Hannelore Hanover's win at the Meadowlands and he mentioned she might go to Sweden and race shoeless.

This question was so multifaceted that I left half for another day because I could probably write a book on this subject. In answer to the first part, yes I have raced horses with no shoes and was arguably the first to do it on a grand scale. As a matter of fact, I had a few very good horses that were useless with shoes on. Gallantly, a son of the famous European stallion Varenne — who also raced barefoot — set the track record at Maywood in the Galt with no shoes. Honkin Hanover won many big races barefoot for my barn. I would say that there were many fillies I trained that lowered their record as much as four seconds time trialing barefoot at the Red Mile. There is a caveat here. The tracks in Europe are much more barefoot friendly than the surfaces we race on in the United States and Canada. The Red Mile and the Meadowlands would be the best to try. Most of the tracks are too hard and you can do serious permanent damage to the horses. The European horses that race every race barefoot have had their feet treated with a toughening agent over long periods of time that, in a sense, protects them. Both Hannelore Hanover and What the Hill raced barefoot for Ronnie Burke. But I really don't feel that racing shoeless is wide spread enough to put it on the program. I do remember an instance at Sportsman's Park when I was warming up Imperfection for the three-year-old filly American National and she lost a hind shoe. I took her to the blacksmith and he was fumbling and fumbling and she was getting antsy so I said to just leave it off and take the other one off. About five minutes later, I hear a page: Mike Lachance to the paddock judge. Mike came out laughing and said the judge told him that I had pulled the shoes, was that okay with me. He said it was fine. She won the race and the next night we had Baltic Striker in the colt division and I pulled his hind shoes also. I went in and told the judge myself and the colt won and the judge and I became good friends. He lives in Pompano now.

New Calling

Meadowlands race caller Ken Warkentin is having a blast as a first-year hockey referee.

Ken Warkentin gets up early Sunday morning and hops into the car to head to a hockey rink. Although he spent the better part of Saturday calling harness races at Freehold and the Meadowlands, finishing work around midnight, he is energized. When he arrives at the rink, he will not be playing in a game, though. He puts on black pants, a striped shirt, and Ken Weingartner qets ready to have a new kind

The 58-year-old Warkentin is

in his first year as a USA Hockey official.

Warkentin is no stranger to hockey. He grew up in Toronto and was starting to skate at the same age he was learning to walk. He played organized hockey in youth leagues, high school and college, and for several winters was on as many as four teams at the same time. As an adult, he continues to play hockey in recreational leagues.

But now Warkentin is enjoying another side of the sport. Earlier this year, at the urging of his wife, Warkentin completed an officiating class and is now a certified Level 1 USA Hockey official. He has worked 10 games so far, for ages 10-and-under (Squirt) and 8-and-under (Mite).

"It's quite challenging and intense," Warkentin said. "But being out there with the kids, and the game, it's just a lot of fun. It's high-octane fun.

"I've had nothing but pleasant experience so far. No parents have thrown rotten tomatoes at me yet."

Warkentin is paired with a more experienced official in each game as he gets more comfortable in his role. Unlike the NHL, which has two linesmen and two referees, these games are worked by only two officials.

"You've got to skate your tail off and know the rulebook inside and out." Warkentin said. "It's a team effort between two guys and you have to work together. It's really all about positioning, but you need to hustle.

"The games I've watched experienced officials do, it looks like they're doing nothing. It looks like they're standing in one spot the whole game. It just comes with experience to

be in the right position; to see what is going on and being in position to make the right calls. It's a real challenge, but it's a lot of fun."

Warkentin officiates mostly on Sundays because of his schedule. He drives up to an hour to get to the various rinks and has worked primarily travel league games.

"These kids are fast and they've got skill," Warkentin said. "You've got to be on your toes and laser focus for three 15-minute periods. It's a fast game and split-second decisions. You can't stop the game and ask to think about it. You have to see what you see and call it right away. It's kind of like the races, in a way. When I call races, I don't think, I react.

"Of course, you're going to make mistakes. The professionals make mistakes all the time. But everyone here knows you're not only developing the players, you're trying to develop the referees. We're all in the same boat. You just have to be honest when you mess up. You apologize and move on."

Warkentin, who has a Level 2 USA Hockey coaching certificate and has helped at clinics in the past, would like to work his way up the officiating ladder.

"I'd like to challenge myself and do higher levels," Warkentin said. "You only get out of something what you put into it. I'm taking this seriously. This means a lot to these kids and their coaches and their parents. When I get my assignment, I can't stop thinking about it all week. I want to do it right.

"Even if I'm up at 6 a.m. after a late night working, I'm not tired. I'm excited. I can't explain it. When I get on the ice, there is something magical about it."

Cullen ineligible for O'Brien Awards

OH K Man, a horse that Travis Cullen trains and drives, was issued a positive test by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) on Monday (Dec. 4) for TCO2.

Mr. Cullen made Standardbred Canada aware of the positive test result on Tuesday afternoon, and acknowledged that he shouldn't qualify for an O'Brien Award.

Following a review of O'Brien eligibility policies and criteria, Standardbred Canada has determined that Cullen is not eligible for an O'Brien Award in 2017. He will be removed from the ballot as a candidate for the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship, and is also not eligible for the Trainer or Driver of the Year Award.

Marc Campbell and Guy Gagnon will be the two finalists for the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship.

Penn National announces series

The top owner, driver and trainer based on points

accumulated in the series will receive two (2) round trip airline tickets to Las Vegas and a three (3) night stay at either the Tropicana Las Vegas or M Resort in Henderson, NV, both Penn National Gaming owned properties.

"We have had a similar successful series in place the past few years for our thoroughbred racetracks and thought with our strong presence in the harness racing industry, and having key stake events throughout the season, this would be a nice incentive for those competing in our major races," said Mark Loewe, vice-president of Ohio racing operations for Penn National Gaming.

The series will feature two events at each track, both conducted on the same day. A new stakes race on the calendar this year will be the Clara Barton Distaff for older pacing mares to be conducted at Plainridge Park Casino.

"The Clara Barton fills a needed void for this division in this time frame and is a great compliment to our Spirit of Massachusetts (older trot) which debuted last year as the richest harness race ever in the Commonwealth," said Steve O'Toole, director of racing for Plainridge Park Casino.

Complete rules and the point system for the Penn National Harness Racing Challenge will be posted shortly on the websites of the participating racetracks.

"Yankee Joe" Lee named Amateur Driver of the Year

It was unanimous. The USHWA National Amateur Driver of the Year Award Committee has named "Yankee Joe" Lee the National Amateur Driver of the Year for 2017. The ever-improving 38-year-old Bronxville, NY native is enjoying his best season in the sulky while being a member of multiple amateur organizations.

When contacted, Lee was at Yankee Stadium where he is the New York Yankee's assistant equipment manager, thus the moniker "Yankee Joe." (See HRU story from March 17)

When told of his recent accolade, Lee paused a moment and then said: "I'm greatly honored and I'm humbled by the award. This is only my third full season of amateur driving and I love it. And I'm especially grateful for the confidence that the owners and trainers have shown in my abilities."

Lee could be considered a true amateur in that he owns no racing stock nor does he have any specific trainer to drive for exclusively (save Bruce Aldrich Sr. at Monticello Raceway) and has taken the reins from at least 15 different trainers this year alone.

This National Award comes on the heels of the local Amateur Driver of the Year Award from the Monticello-Goshen Chapter USHWA, which, by the way, pioneered showcasing amateur drivers in the 1980s.

Currently Lee has a career best 15 driving victories to go along with 11 seconds and 10 thirds. Arguably the most prolific was the triumph in the 1-1/4-mile \$25,000 CKG Billings Gold Cup final at Yonkers Raceway with Dizzy Rizzy on Nov. 26.

"I love the sport and once this game gets into your blood it consumes you. And the more involved you become the more dedicated you are to the sport of harness driving," Lee said.

Says competitor and two-time National Amateur Driver of the Year, Dein Spriggs: "Joe Lee demonstrates what I feel is required to receive the 2017 National Amateur Driver of the year Award. He's a strategic driver using tactics and not losing composure during a race while readjusting strategies to overcome his competition. He's of good character and moral standing besides being the 2017 Billings Gold Cup winner."

Lee will receive his accolades at the National US Harness Writers Awards Banquet in Orlando, FL during late Feb. 2018.
