Azur Steals The Show at Meadowlands Sale

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ—Fran Azur came, saw and conquered at yesterday's Tattersalls Select Mixed Sale at the Meadowlands. The owner took home the \$170,000 sale topper, **Mystical Diva** (Western Ideal), plus three other horses that topped the \$100,000 barrier.

Mystical Diva, a 4-year-old mare, had been racing at Woodbine for trainer Tony Alagna and was coming off a solid 2011 in which she won seven times and earned \$150,738. She was second in the Tender Loving Care Series final and won an elimination the Lynch Memorial.

"I wanted her as a race horse, but the backup plan is a broodmare," Azur said. "I like the number of races she had (30) in 2011 and her times are good. She's a good strong raceway horse and, hopefully, she'll show that again this year. I expected to pay no more than \$125,000 for her. I wasn't get-

ting gun shy, but the problem is that the higher you go the more you have to recover racing. When you pay that much you need a little luck when they race."

Mystical Diva was consigned by Preferred Equine.

Azur said his new acquisitions would be trained by Kevin McDermott.

The owner also paid \$155,000 for **Flipper J** (Art Major), \$135,000 for **Sonic Dancer** (Mach Three) and \$120,000 for **Village Beat** (Rocknroll Hanover). Flipper J was a New York sire's takes winner last year and has career earnings of \$250,590. Sonic Dancer is a lightly raced horse who held his own in Ontario sire's stakes races in 2011, and Village Beat is a solid 5-year-old with \$151,916 in career earnings.

"The prices for the raceway horses are higher," Azur noted. "That is the trend, for a good raceway horse you're going to pay a little more than you used to. I am always looking for the right horses and trying to balance our stable. Since we sent 'Hypnotic' to stud, we wanted to add a little bit to the stable. At the last Harrisburg sale, I bought a yearling for \$110,000. That's the first yearling I ever bought in my life. I like raceway horses. With these we'll need a little luck to recover the extra we had to pay."

Second-place honors went to **Divulge** (Tell All), a 3-year-old purchased for \$160,000 by Daryl Bier. Though he has

earned just \$50,132 in his career he showed promise last year, finishing second in the New Jersey Futurity at Freehold and holding his own with a fourth place finish in the Matron at Dover. He was bred by Brittany Farms and was trained in 2011 by Jimmy Takter.

"I got to \$150,000 and figured what's another \$10,000?" Bier said. "But that would have been my last bid. Unlike with the babies, when you buy a horse like this it's not a guessing game. This horse has already proven himself as a race horse. I don't have any dreams of winning the North America Cup with him. I was looking for a horse that can make anywhere from \$150,000 to \$300,000 over the course of the year. It looks like he can do that, and he has a lot of promise."

Bier achieved a rarity when acquiring the colt, outbidding John Cancelliere, who doesn't say no too often when he wants a horse. But the Cancelliere Brothers did not go home empty handed as they added **Rollwithitharry** (Rocknroll Hanover) to their stable, paying \$120,000 for the 4-year-old.

Nine horses topped the \$100,000 mark as opposed to seven at last year's sale.

Total US Purses Off 2 Percent in 2011

There was good news and bad news for North American harness racing in 2011 when it comes to purses.



A total of \$422 million in purse money was paid out in 2011 at the US tracks, a slight decrease from 2010 when \$431 million was paid out.

However, the decline is largely attributable to the fact that fewer races were contested. There were 48,346 races in the US in 2011,

down from 49,998 a year earlier. With the decline in the number of races, the figure for the average purse per race was actually up. The average purse in the U.S. in 2011 was \$8,746 versus \$8,628 a year earlier.

Purses at the Canadian tracks were up in 2011 in every category. Canadian races went for a total of \$186 million in 2011, an increase of \$4.3 million over 2010 numbers.

There were 20,575 races held in Canada in 2011 versus 22,194 in 2010. That resulted in a healthy increase in the average purse per race figure, which was \$9,063 in 2011 versus \$8,208 in 2010. That represents a 10.4 percent increase.

Combining the numbers from the two countries, purses in 2011 were \$609 million, down from the 2010 figure of \$613 million. The decline was less than 1 percent.

Sorry, But Jug Doesn't Belong In Crown

I would like to address the topic of revamping the Triple Crown to make it relevant and turn it back into a milestone worth pursuing. The two key components missing today are:

- 1) Selecting races that today draw the best of the three year old class to the most prestigious races
- 2) That there is an economic incentive to insure that it becomes the goal of everyone.

I agree the first two logical choices are The North America Cup and The Meadowlands Pace. These are both first class races at first class facilities with big purses and they are run on large tracks with two turns. My third choice would be the Breeders Crown instead of the Little Brown Jug. The Jug is a great race to watch but a terrible race to crown a champion. More times than not, the winner of the Jug is determined at draw time than post time.

Delaware's half mile track is so biased to the inside that it is not the right venue as the deciding leg. Whereas the Breeders Crown already attracts all the eyes of our industry and is normally run on a large track, this would just be the icing on the cake.

Finally, we must economically incentivize this accomplishment to not only build the excitement but to insure it becomes the goal of all the connections of the top three year olds.

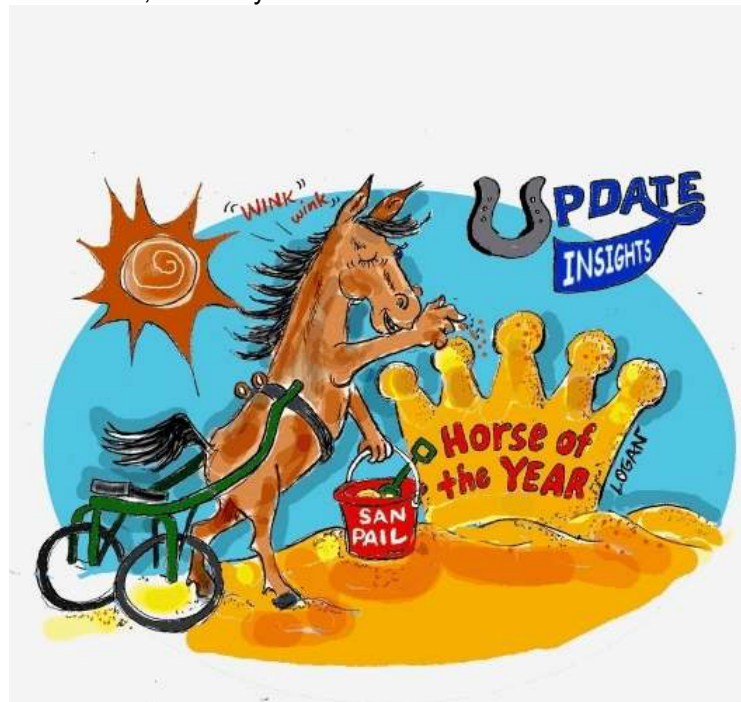
