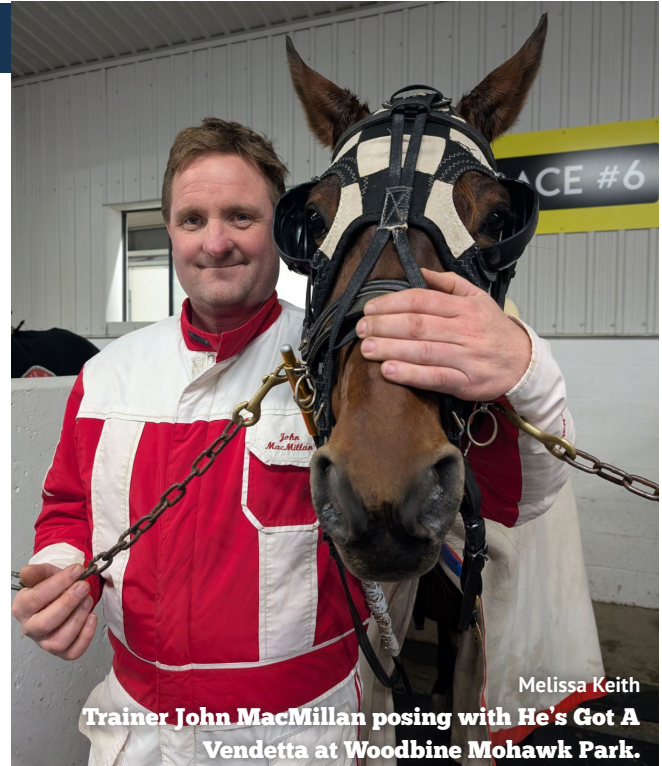

When JJ Xavier and driver James MacDonald handily held off nine other conditioned pacers on Saturday (Dec. 27) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, it might not have seemed like the night's standout race. It was the ninth seasonal victory for the now 7-year-old Tobago Cays—JJ Mistress gelding, who was claimed at Georgian Downs on June 15 by current owner/trainer John MacMillan. But Mohawk race 4 was also more than that. JJ Xavier's 1:53 mile was MacMillan's 40th training win of 2025, the Odessa, ON resident's third year of battling glioblastoma, an aggressive form of brain cancer.

On Tuesday (Dec. 30), MacMillan confirmed that JJ Xavier (p, 6, 1:52.1f; \$168,346) is the best among his active roster of 10 racehorses. Approaching his 10,000th race as a trainer, the 55-year-old horseman said a simple fact keeps him involved in the sport: "It's all I have ever done. I love it."

Rather than downsizing and stepping away from harness racing, the former Rideau Carleton Raceway announcer, race secretary,

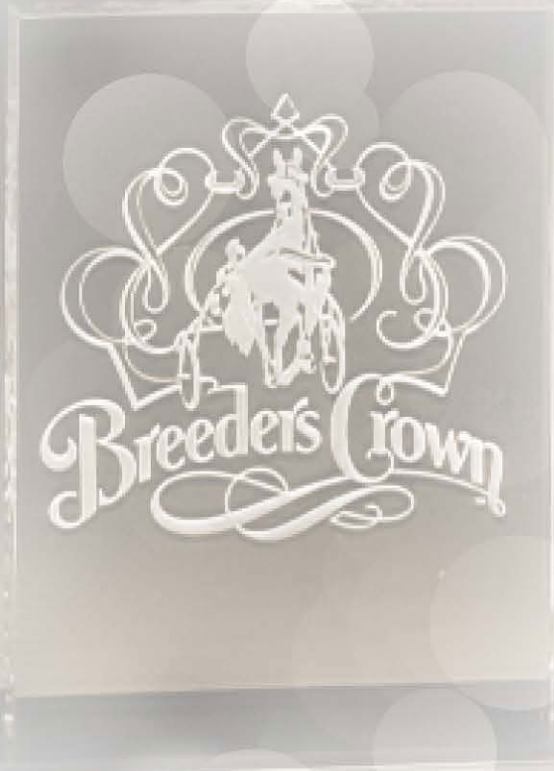

and general manager has doubled down, acquiring new horses throughout 2025 and finding renewed strength.

“[It’s] the love of the game and I have been doing it since I was 15 years old,” said MacMillan, who began training professionally in 2000. “I can’t imagine a life not waking up and going to the barn every day and training them.”

Although voted a top-three finalist for the 2025 USHWA Dan Patch Unsung Hero Award, MacMillan said he is no one-man show.

“I am truly honored,” he told HRU. “I try to work hard every day. I’ve been lucky and am still very lucky to have great people [around]. Owners like Glenn Bechtel, Percy Elkins, Glenn Pearson, Rob Watson, and Mike Bartram, as well as Jeff Murphy.”

Pearson celebrated his 400th win as co-owner in partnership with “Johnny Mac” when Tie Game won on Nov. 19 at Rideau Carleton for driver Guy Gagnon. Their 4-year-old trotter, currently trained by Joe Pereira, was unfortunately scratched lame Monday (Jan. 5) at Mohawk.

Racing mainly at Rideau Carleton and Kawartha Downs until the end of both meets last year, MacMillan’s 10-horse stable can now be found at Flamboro Downs and Mohawk.

“It can be difficult because of the bigger track [at Mohawk] and it is much further to travel for the horse,” he said.

MacMillan began his training career 25 years ago at Quinte Exhibition Raceway in Belleville, ON and Hippodrome Aylmer in Gatineau, QC. At press time, he had 1,842 wins from 9,951 starts as a trainer, with purse earnings of \$9,150,581.

Not being based at a training center near Mohawk, it takes extra effort to travel and compete there.

“I have a great assistant named Mike Adam who helps me every day,” MacMillan said. “Honestly, [I] couldn’t do it without him.”

The trainer’s favorite current horse, 8-year-old Montysgonemarle (p, 6, 1:53.2f; \$153,879) is winless in eight career starts at the Campbellville track, the latest result an off-the-board finish on Dec. 20. But MacMillan often punches above his weight when he ventures to Mohawk: On Nov. 3, Fancy Lettering (p, 3, 1:51.2s; \$96,039), his only entrant, came out a 9-2 winner. The downside: the 5-year-old mare was also claimed that night.

Long influential as a director of the National Capital Region Harness Horse Owners Association (NCRHHA), representing the horsepeople of Rideau Carleton, MacMillan’s accomplishments on the track have sometimes been overshadowed by his talent for advocacy.

He began driving in amateur races at Hippodrome de Montreal in early 1999, recording his first win with Kenneth Backer-trained Dawns Revenge on Feb. 1 that year at Aylmer, in a mile-and-a-sixteenth added-distance trot. On June 7, 1999, he won the CKG Billings Amateur Driving Championship at Woodbine Racetrack, driving trotter Natural Balance (6, 1:57.1s; \$291,537).

“Rick Zeron owned [him]; he was perfect.” MacMillan said.

After driving 2-year-old pacer Speedy Dancer to a maiden victory at Rideau Carleton on Sept. 14, 2025, MacMillan quietly made a decision.

“Yes, that was my last drive,” he said on Dec. 30, looking back on the year.

At the time of the victory, he had texted: “Interestingly enough, that was exactly seven years after my previous win,” driving Music Note on Sept. 14, 2019 at Kawartha Downs. Speedy Dancer is now racing at Mohawk, in search of his next win; MacMillan is content with 68 from 736 career drives.

An accomplished trainer of overnight horses, MacMillan helped develop the 2006 O'Brien Older Male Trotter of the Year, Stiletto (5, 1:53.1s; \$1,006,527), a Mr Vic—Armbro Natural gelding who did not race at age 2.

On Nov. 18, 2003, MacMillan first qualified the 3-year-old Stiletto at Woodbine Racetrack. The gelding had won his first three career starts at Pocono in June-July 2003, racing for trainer Gene Daisey and Hall of Fame drivers Wally Hennesey and Hervé Filion. Unsuccessful in two Sept. 2003 starts at The Red Mile for Ross Croghan, Stiletto moved to MacMillan's stable in Nov. 2003. Although he broke stride for driver Gilles Gendron in his Mohawk debut on Nov. 27, 2003, finishing fifth as the beaten favorite, Stiletto was sharp in a Dec. 2, 2003 qualifier at Woodbine Racetrack, winning with MacMillan in the sulky.

Dec. 7 and 18, 2003, Stiletto wired going away at Woodbine Racetrack for trainer/driver MacMillan, who subsequently listed catch drivers (mostly Tony Kerwood) but continued to

condition the trotter. On Nov. 23, 2004, Stiletto was claimed for \$62,500 at Woodbine. Five of his seven seasonal wins had been for MacMillan, who said he counts the gelding as one of his favorite trainees, alongside Montysgonemarble and Vanilla Malted (p. 6, 1:50.4h; \$269,164). The latter broke his maiden May 18, 2019 at Kawartha in his debut for MacMillan and driver Ryan Guy. Vanilla Malted won 34 of 112 races in their three years together, five times at the Rideau preferred level.

Former marathon runner MacMillan has remained active throughout his cancer treatment, thanks to the people and horses in his life, and his dedication to the racing game. On Sunday (Jan. 5) at Flamboro, JJ Xavier and driver Paul MacKenzie provided him with his first training win of the new year. Asked about goals for 2026, MacMillan indicated that he did not have a specific milestone he wanted to reach; it was rather the reaching for never-ending milestones that motivated him.

“I have been blessed to work my entire life in harness racing, in one form or another, in the business that I cherish, and I was lucky enough to do very well,” he said. “So, for now, I will continue to live my dream, one day at a time.”

# Hawthorne meeting restarts with Illinois Racing Board's blessing

Hawthorne Race Course's Suburban Downs meeting that began on Nov. 7 will resume on Saturday and Sunday (Jan. 10 and 11) after the **first two scheduled programs of the year were canceled** last weekend because of the track's failure to meet the requirements stipulated for 2026 licensing by the Illinois Racing Board at its September dates hearings.

"They were able to correct the deficiencies on Jan. 5 and are now in compliance," the Racing Board's executive director, Domenic DiCera, announced in a Jan. 6 press release.

The issuance of 2026 organization licenses for Hawthorne and Suburban Downs applies to betting at the track, advance deposit wagering, intertrack wagering, and betting at Illinois off-track locations in Joliet, Lansing, Prospect Heights, Crestwood, Oakbrook Terrace, Evergreen Park, Hoffman Estates, McHenry, North Aurora, and Villa Park.

DiCera didn't specify what the requirements mandated at the dates hearing were.

Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association (IHHA) president Jeff Davis was briefed by the Racing Board on Jan. 6.

"They are confident Hawthorne has its house in order and the necessary items are in place to be able to race," Davis said. "Hawthorne and Suburban Downs are in good standing for the rest of 2026. The bond requirements [for the track and its entities] are nothing unusual. In years past this has been settled by the last couple weeks in December."

The meeting will continue with Saturday and Sunday racing through Feb. 15. Following a spring/summer/fall thoroughbred meeting the harness horses will return to the Chicago metropolitan area's only remaining racetrack on Nov. 6 for 20 programs during the calendar year at a meeting that is expected to extend into the first two months of 2027.

Davis discussed with the Racing Board staff the possibility of making up last weekend's two lost programs "sometime in the 2026 racing year" and is optimistic the IHHA's request will be granted.

In a major problem unrelated to the cancellations by the Racing Board, Davis discussed the bounced checks issued by Hawthorne in December and early this year to owners, trainers, and drivers.

"One member [of the IHHA] had a \$40,000 check bounce; another a \$25,000 check; a trainer and his owners claim to have more than \$100,000 in bounced checks; and another member has a check for \$90,000 that hasn't cleared," he said. "If you want me to estimate we're talking about hundreds of thousands of dollars.

"Some new checks have been issued; some have not cleared."

Hawthorne is claiming a technical glitch with its financial institution was the culprit but the family-owned track's president and general manager, Tim Carey, has not elaborated.

Davis scheduled a membership meeting for Jan. 8 "asking anyone who has a bounced check to submit proof and information about fees that are associated"

He said this information will be relayed to the Illinois Racing Board.

Hawthorne's financial woes go beyond the bounced checks:

- Dating back to the 2024 fall/winter harness meeting Churchill Downs, Inc. has blacked out its simulcast signal to Hawthorne and its network because of non-payment of fees;
- Liens asserting that the track owes as much as \$5 million in unpaid bills for the 2020 demolition of significant portions of the grandstand and clubhouse to facilitate the construction of a casino addition made possible by passage of a major gambling expansion bill;
- Carey initially said a \$400 million state-of-the-art casino would open in the spring of 2021 but the project has been in limbo because of his inability to secure financing;
- President Donald Trump's tariffs have increased prices for steel and building materials and the ante for what originally was a \$400 million project is now estimated to be in the neighborhood of \$500 million.

The IHHA members are hoping and praying that help will be on the way when the Illinois House of Representatives begins its spring session on Jan. 20.

Rep. Anthony DeLuca (D-Chicago Heights) is calling on his colleagues to immediately pass Bill 2724 that he is sponsoring and send it to Democratic Gov.J.B. Pritzker to sign upon receipt.

The bill passed the State Senate on Oct. 30 at the fall veto session by a 49-8 vote.

Senator Patrick Joyce (D-Essex), the bill's sponsor in the Senate, at the time emphasized the urgency of its enactment because of Hawthorne's inability to construct a casino addition.

“They have yet to build a casino at their racetrack in Stickney and yet they still have veto power over a racino in the south suburbs,” Joyce said of Hawthorne. “This bill is intended to move the needle.”

The bill would take away Hawthorne's right to veto construction of a racetrack/casino within 35 miles of its Stickney location and also allow construction of a harness track/casino in downstate Decatur.

“We believe we have the votes if it's called [in the House],” DeLuca has been quoted as saying. “We need it to be called immediately so we can get this industry fixed and on the path to prosperity.”

# Well-traveled Braxten Boyd reaps Rising Star honors

Braxten Boyd did the most traveling of his young career during 2025 and it paid off with plenty of trips to the winner's circle and a Rising Star Award.

Boyd, 25, remembers getting the call from U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA) president Michael Carter to inform him that he was chosen for the acclaimed accolade, which will be presented at the Dan Patch Awards banquet on Feb. 22.

"It was just an exhilarating feeling; it's definitely an honor," Boyd said. "A lot of prestigious people in our business have won that award. Being a young person and being in our business and being there in Florida on that night, with all those prestigious people getting awards, it'll be an honor just to be a part of it."

Logging a lot of driving miles in his car, as well as on the track, is nothing new to Boyd, who competes on the New York Sire Stakes circuit, but calls Pennsylvania home.

"In New York, it's a great circuit, and we're very blessed as drivers to get asked to drive on the circuit and get to drive horses in those races that go for great money," Boyd said. "It's a great place to make some money and have a little fun, but those places are all very far drives."

Boyd, a native of Michigan, currently lives a half-hour away from Pocono Downs and 2½ hours from The Meadowlands.

"I race 180 days a year at Pocono, so it helps just because it's a 30-minute drive to start your day, whether you've got to go somewhere else

or not at night," Boyd said. "And then, usually, I'm working about 60 days a year at Tioga Downs, and Tioga is an hour and 15 minutes.

"I work a ton of days at The Meadowlands, too, but those are usually only two days a week, and like in the summer, when I'm really working the bulk of my days, four at Pocono and three at Tioga, those drives make it a lot easier when you're working seven days a week and racing two tracks four days out of the week."

Boyd has shown himself to be an uber-consistent driver, as he notched 337 wins in both 2024 and 2025.

But his association with trainer Cameron Capone, 26, and a colt named Madden Oaks, helped take Boyd's career to the next level.

Boyd drove the 3-year-old pacing son of Huntsville—Hard Eight in 12 of the colt's 18 starts in 2025, including a victory in the Grade 1 Meadowlands Pace and a second-place finish in the Grade 1 North America Cup.

Madden Oaks was given little respect in the NA Cup final, having been sent off at 53-1 from post 10, but Boyd believed they could get the job done.

Boyd wore a [helmet cam in the race](#) that captured his emotions from the time he left the paddock through the exciting duel down the stretch with Louprint, where Madden Oaks came up a head shy.

“More or less in the last turn, I thought [we could win],” Boyd said. “Once I got room [in the stretch], it was kind of a blur, but up until then, before I got room, I thought I was going to win.

“My poor horse was the second fastest horse ever in that race, and was second.”

A month later, Boyd again found himself leaving from the outermost post, 9, at odds of 6-1 in the Meadowlands Pace.

Although Boyd and Madden Oaks crossed the line second in the Pace, a length behind Prince Hal Hanover, after a lengthy judges’ inquiry, it was determined that Prince Hal Hanover had interfered with Madden Oaks nearing the finish line.

“In my heart of hearts, as it happened, I knew I won, but it’s a decision that you have no part of making,” Boyd said. “It definitely was a little different.”

A week later, Boyd piloted Binge On Yankee from the rail to victory in the \$250,000 Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial Pace at Saratoga at odds of 43-1 for trainer Todd Luther and owner Greg Luther Racing.

“That’s the only time I drove for those connections and that horse,” Boyd said. “Scotty Zeron’s a very busy person, and he was the one that was listed on the horse, and I think he kind of just threw my name out there at the connections because I was going to be there for New York Sire Stakes races.”

With many Grand Circuit drivers, including Zeron, at The Meadowlands for divisions of the Tompkins-Geers, recommending Boyd to drive Binge On Yankee was easy for Zeron to do.

“I personally think Braxten is just a good person, and he’s also an extremely talented driver,” Zeron said. “He called me and asked me what I would do driving [Binge On Yankee], and he did a hell of a job. And obviously the race worked out in his favor.”

Although currently 35, with three Hambletonian victories under his belt, Zeron said he remembers what it was like to be that young, up-and-coming driver.

“Being young is extremely difficult in this business, because people want age and experience and not youth and eagerness,”

Zeron said. “So, you’re always in a constant battle of trying to prove yourself. And any opportunity you’re given is usually because a lot of the guys can’t participate in that race, and that’s your one chance to shine. So, it’s a very high-pressure situation for any young driver, because they don’t get those opportunities very often. And if they could just capitalize on them, it could propel their career to new heights.

“And obviously, Braxten hooked up with a really good horse [Madden Oaks] and it just made his whole year great, having that talented horse, and then spiraling into winning the Gerrity, that’s what you need.

“To me, Braxten feels like one of the more veteran young guys, so I really trust him as a driver. And like I said, he’s a great person. He deserved that opportunity.”

As with all things, Zeron said timing is everything, and Boyd made the most of what he was given.

“His placing in the Pace was before [the Gerrity], which brought him the global eyes, and the Luthers, obviously, may not have known much about him, and then they see him win on the Grand Circuit, and that makes him an easy sell as well,” Zeron said. “It might be a referral by me, but if they’ve never heard of Braxten Boyd, they might not go that direction. So, he earned it and... he was not favored by any means in that race, so it wasn’t a layup win. It was a great race and just a great outcome.

“I think Braxten makes very good decisions out there. I believe that drivers who can make horses go fast are a dime a dozen, but if you can weigh on the side of trying to make the best decision at that time, more often than not, you’ll end up winning more races, and people will trust you... If you aren’t making calculated decisions more often than not, then it just won’t end up working out, and I feel like he’s a pretty good decision-maker on the track.”

Although Zeron was too busy driving at The Meadowlands to watch the Gerrity as it happened, he was able to experience the victory on TikTok through [Boyd’s helmet cam](#).

“So, when I watched his helmet cam of that horse it was super exciting to watch,” Zeron said. “Because as a driver, he’s loaded

in the last turn, and then you’ve got to time the passing lane really accurately. He times it, and his horse just zips on by. And, like I said, he didn’t have the best horse in that race and he won that race.”

Boyd said his favorite race/memory of the year wasn’t a win.

“Without a doubt, which is weird, even though I didn’t get to touch the trophy, the North America Cup,” Boyd said. “The show they put on up there at Mohawk, it just was so professional, and the crowd was just absolutely packed to the gills. I’ve never seen anything like it, other than when I was younger. Since COVID, at a horse race, I haven’t seen anything like it.

“And then kind of having the expectations that I had a chance, and getting the 10-hole, and kind of just going into it with a whatever happens mindset, and then it coming out the way

it did, the way it played out. It was just something I’ll never forget.”

Boyd said he thanks all of his family, especially his fiancée, Brandy Wine, and all of the trainers that supported him in his career year.

“I just couldn’t thank them enough for the opportunities, and, hopefully, I can keep doing the best I can for them,” he said. “It’s really hard for me to single anybody out, because I drive for so many people.”

To illustrate Boyd’s point, in 2025 he competed in 31 races worth \$100,000 or more for 17 different trainers, driving 22 different horses.

When Boyd started driving on a full-time basis in 2021, he said he could not have seen a year like 2025 playing out for him as soon or as well as it did.

“As a kid, just dreaming of doing this as a job, you just hoped that you could make a good, solid living doing it and just be able to enjoy it, and race horses doing what you love,” Boyd said. “It’s been a whirlwind of a couple of years, and I couldn’t be more blessed and thankful for it. It’s definitely had its highs and definitely had its lows, but it’s been a business that I’m very grateful to be a part of.

“I’ve gotten to drive for some people at The Meadowlands, I would think I wouldn’t have ever gotten to drive for when I was first starting out in the business, and I’ve tried to make the most of those opportunities. And, for the most part, I feel like I’ve held my own with those chances, and hopefully more of them are to come. Hopefully, people have seen what I’ve done in the races that had major money on the line last year, and maybe it can just catapult into more chances, and, hopefully, I can do well with those ones.”

# Over 50 years in, Bryan Lawrence is still not the retiring type

Bryan Lawrence has made countless memories across five-plus decades in the standardbred business, but when he looks back, it isn't any single moment that stands tallest – instead, it's the people and horses he made them with.

“There have been so many people who have been good to me,” he said. “I could go on with a list as long as your arm.”

The list, like it has for many, began with Keith and Gordon Waples of the renowned Waples racing family.

“Gordy and I used to play hockey together, and then I got to helping him a wee bit with horses,” said Lawrence, who worked in construction at the time. “I was never around horses in my lifetime, but Gord and his dad, Mr. Waples [Keith], became very good friends of mine, and they helped me a lot with different advice and tips with the horses. They were great to me over the years... I'm still good friends with Gord.”

After graduating from the Waples school of horsemanship, Lawrence moved from Durham, ON, to Hanover some 30-odd-years ago to pursue racing full time.

In the years that followed, the committed conditioner enjoyed steady success around the Ontario circuit, leaving his mark as a respected trainer and owner.

Then, in 2012, came a change of scenery, or as Lawrence put it, a “first retirement.”

This next chapter took Lawrence south to Florida, where he spent eight years racing at the now defunct Pompano Park.

“I had a big trailer for four or five horses, and we had good luck down there,” he said. “It was a nice way for an old guy to spend the winter. Pompano was a beautiful place, I loved it... Met a lot of nice people down there.”

Being the same friendly face over 1,500 miles from home was working well for Lawrence, who won just shy of 70 races in limited action at the Pompano Beach oval.

With everything running smoothly at home and at the track, Lawrence had no plans to cut his early retirement short – unfortunately, COVID-19 did.

“It's been a great year with everyone. A lot of pleasure, a lot of nice wins, and a lot of nice moments that come with it. I tell the guys some nights, ‘When you win, you drive home from the racetrack... and you almost think you know something until you go back next time and finish last.’”

As the pandemic emerged, Lawrence promptly packed his bags, loaded up his horses and set course for home.

“I just thought if I got COVID and ended up in the hospital, I'd have all these horses in Florida, so I better get out of here,” he said.

While it was difficult saying goodbye to the sunshine and Pompano, what awaited Lawrence upon his return home was a second chapter filled with fresh and familiar faces, human and equine.

American Hustle, a bay American Ideal pacer who collected north of \$302,000 across 100 starts, was one of the friendly faces who routinely delivered for Lawrence both in Florida and back home.

“He was a good one for me a few years back,” Lawrence said. “He was close to a top horse at Mohawk.”

Lawrence's already rewarding experience with American Hustle was uplifted further by the presence of drivers Doug McNair, Scott Zeron, and Bob McClure, each of whom go back a ways with the horseman out of Hanover.

“Bobby [McClure] drove a lot for me when he was starting out,” Lawrence said. “Doug also drove a lot for me his first year or two driving – I've known his dad Gregg for a long time, and I've known Doug since he was a kid.”

“When Doug and Scott started, they'd come to Hanover for a drive, I'd sometimes have three, four horses in there or somewhere else and get them driving them. It was good for them and good for me.”

After hanging up the horseshoes in March of 2021, American Hustle was succeeded by a then 3-year-old trotter, Stonebridge Zeus.

Lawrence purchased the son of Resolve—Stonebridge Epic in the fall of 2022 from fellow trainer Blake MacIntosh via onGait for a price tag in the ballpark of \$27,000 USD.

The deal was sealed with help from another trainer and mutual friend, Rick Deacon.

“I was looking for a trotter we could afford,” Lawrence said. “Some of them are pretty pricey, and he was for sale.

“The guy that warms up a bit for me, Rick Deacon, he works for Blake MacIntosh and knew a bit about Zeus. He told me more and I bought him.”

Figuring out the enigmatic gelding took time, continued Lawrence, but the process was smoothed with help from a pair of seasoned Ontario reinsmen in Travis Henry and Scott Wray.

“He’s gotten a lot more dependable,” said Lawrence of Stonebridge Zeus. “He had a big problem of getting away, now Travis seemed to figure it out. They get along really well, and Travis has done an outstanding job with him.”

Henry, a winner of over 3,000 races lifetime, has piloted Stonebridge Zeus to several meaningful wins over their three-and-a-half seasons together.

When competing for MacIntosh in August 2022, the pair won in 1:56.4 at Grand River, marking the first of four times Stonebridge Zeus would reach that watermark in his career.

The duo has been equally effectual for Lawrence throughout their tenure, highlighted by a standout summer at his home track.

“Travis won with Zeus twice for us at Hanover this summer,” Lawrence said. “The track had a memorial race for Randy Rier, which Travis drove him in and won. Both of those wins were very special for us.”

Lawrence also lauded the contributions of Wray, who reached the 1,000-career win plateau in 2025.

“Scott did a great job with him too,” Lawrence said. “I remember he liked Zeus and drove him well.”

One of those banner moments with Wray in tow came in their fourth start together on April 4, 2023, at The Raceway at Western Fair District.

Sent off at 10-1, the pair dug in late to complete the comeback and reach the winner’s circle.

The stellar effort, as Lawrence recalled, was both exhilarating and a perfect embodiment of Stonebridge Zeus’ composition.

“He was 10-1 because sometimes he didn’t get away very well,” Lawrence said with a laugh. “That’s been a challenge most of his life, but he’s worked out nicely through time. He’s not real speedy, but he’s pretty tough when he gets away near the front.”

The dependable trotter is joined in Lawrence’s two-horse stable by JGs Pal, a 5-year-old trotter he acquired in the summer of 2024.

“We’ve made some money and he’s racing pretty well,” Lawrence said. “We didn’t steal him or anything, he cost around \$70,000 Canadian, but we’ve lucked out. We’ve got about \$140,000 made with him, so it’s the pleasure of it all.”

Lawrence co-owns JGs Pal with his cousin Stuart Lawrence and Chane Ballantyne (Smurk Racing), whom he also shares Stonebridge Zeus with.

While his two partners are at very different points in their venture with horse ownership, Bryan has found common ground in the enthusiasm and support each brings to the table.

“Chane’s very nice and a very good partner; he wants to win every week, most owners are like that, but he’s started to learn it doesn’t work that way,” Bryan said with a laugh. “Stuart and I have owned a lot of horses over the years together – JGs Pal is the best one. He’s been buying horses for years. He’s in his 80s now, and he’s pretty happy we have a nice horse like that to watch race.

“Both of these guys are great partners. I’ve been lucky to have a lot of good partners on horses.”

For Bryan, now 75, slowing down isn’t in the cards.

If the opportunity to add presents itself, he’ll consider it. If not, he’s content to celebrate all he has earned today alongside the people he built it with.

“It’s been a great year with everyone,” Bryan said. “A lot of pleasure, a lot of nice wins, and a lot of nice moments that come with it. I tell the guys some nights, ‘When you win, you drive home from the racetrack... and you almost think you know something until you go back next time and finish last.’

“I’m not trying to be smart but it’s still true. I couldn’t ask for a much better year than just having the two horses and this success.”

### More ideas to fall on deaf ears

Over the past year, the Mane Attraction has presented several ideas to help our grand sport get around the track for yet a few more miles, meaning years and decades.

Examples included the genius strategy of [Damola Adamolekun](#) and, also, learning from other sports that have flourished in recent years such as [golf](#) and [bowling](#).

Suggested, also, was a novel way to [speed things up](#), a [change of landscape](#), [creating a “July Madness”](#) similar to college basketball’s March Madness, and the dire necessity of [finding a commissioner](#) to lead us into the future, just as in the NFL, NBA, MLB, and other vastly successful major sports.

We have pointed out the “easy fixes” such as solving the whipping situation and fairness when a re-draw of a race becomes necessary.

Suggestions to alleviate the agonizing 20-25-minute gap between races have been put forth, as well.

We came up with the “fill-it-or-kill-it” proposal to make things a bit more amiable for the guys and gals that still plunk \$2 through the pari-mutuel window or do so on their smart phones.

The more difficult fixes, concerning a 24-hour television network exclusive to harness racing or a recently suggestion of a Mega-8 wager, have not taken one single stride forward out of the starting gate.

The Mane Attraction has put a spotlight on the necessity for universal rules regarding medication regulations and equal due diligence for all, instead of every state having their own set of laws and rules –and rulings – with some granted stays of great time length while others get slapped with unreasonable, severe punishment, which causes owners to become disenchanting with our sport.

We have even pointed out the views of many of our most important factions – the bettors, who have gone, pretty much, ignored beginning with the racetrack meltdowns beginning a half century ago.

Us purists cringe when, instead of creating new history with exciting new stakes events, we throw our grand history in the trash by changing the names of important events – the Nat Ray, for example.

If we don’t care about our history, why would, or should, anyone else care?

We have even pointed out solutions to problems that have, and still do, plague our beloved sport, leading us to that medieval European idiom “You can lead a horse to water, but you can’t make it drink.”

We have even suggested the return of time-trials to keep the interest up between races with the multiple prop bets that could be available for action.

As longtime BDHC member and former owner R. Phil disclosed, “At least it would give us something to bet on, and it sure beats the dickens out of the useless information of having the horse’s best time at a particular size track.

We are still searching for the next Harry O. Reno of a century past or a Joe Neville, a slightly more modern version of Reno.

Reno was the gent that kicked off the idea of the Hambletonian and Neville didn’t the same for the Little Brown Jug.

We are in desperate need of new blood all the way around, from owners and caretakers and drivers to fans, most of whom – though not Harvard grads – give a keen insight into why they are leaving the pari-mutuel part of the industry in favor of the many, many, many, many other forms of gam(bl)ing.

We also are in search of futuristic thinkers to lead the way, not those that are set-in-their-old-fashioned ways happy at the way things are going, oblivious to change.

As Gary A. lamented from his simulcasting perch, “Look here, it’s not even real late yet and the place is thinning out.

“There are few of us here under the age of, say, 60 or 65 here, and I know a lot of our players are spending their hard-earned dough or Social Security payments playing other forms [of gambling] where they don’t have to wait a half hour for action.

“Horseplayers don’t need that much time to figure out who they are going to bet on. They get their programs the day before or early in the day and have their picks all mapped out when they come here.

“In the old days, we had to stand in line at the windows at the track but, today, no. That aspect of racing hasn’t kept up with the times, so to speak, and the later it gets, the thinner it gets here.

“Another reason we lose people is, *they die*.”

Gary A. is correct. Membership in the BDHC (Broken Down Horseplayers Club) is getting smaller and smaller and we have not been able to replace them with new blood (money).

Most recently, a noticeable change has come from Major League Baseball, as many of their games are held at night.

As we all know, time is of the essence and that includes all aspects of sport.

Roger Bannister’s first 4:00 mile is obsolete, Ray Harroun’s win in the first Indy 500 is long-forgotten with an average speed of 74.602 MPH and the time of 6 hours, 42 minutes and 8 seconds.

In the not-too-distant future, owners are going to wonder why their 1:50 performer, for which they paid big bucks, doesn’t have the earning power to keep their financial heads above water.

That’s an easy answer, it’s because the 1:50 mile will be as useful as a 2:05 mile was 40 years ago.

Pro basketball has sped up things with their 24 second shot clock.

There is even a shot clock in many other sports, including tennis and poker.

Even major league baseball is joining the time-saving frat with the pitch clock timer.

As our attendees age, baseball that addressed that situation as the number of games that last three hours or longer has sharply diminished since that pitch clock was introduced in 2023.

Just in the past five seasons, the number of games lasting three hours or longer has been sliced from a high of 67 per cent in 2021 to just 15 per cent in 2025.

Yes, things are getting faster and faster in sports by design.

But, in our sport, the faster the mile, the more difficult it is for the equine to earn a living for its owner.

Now, we must start paying more attention to our fans and lure new ones with innovation.



We're just getting started this year and, already, we're seeing tracks with 15 races that get done when the clock is ready to strike midnight.

As Gary A. reminds us, "Who cares?"

Harness racing's road map, fearfully, may never change as long as racing is supported by legislatures and gaming interests.

The bond between the three interests – politics, gambling, and harness racing – has, already, suffered from weak links with de-coupling and legislative interests finding ways to break away from their promises.

When it becomes more apparent that racing, for the most part, is doing little to maintain their fan base and attract new ones, casinos will complain that their public company bottom line performance is being hurt and their political contributions – from which tracks no longer benefit – will play a significant role in future dealings that most certainly will not benefit the track.

Legislators will then find other uses for the funds they deem more important than racing.

Amateur racing helps bringing in fans and their charitable contributions are noteworthy, but they cannot do it alone.

We need, in a hurry, to strengthen race pools to give bettors a better bang for their buck.

We need less races per card to get our remaining fan base finished at an amiable hour, and, by the way, with a 15 to 20 to

25 per cent rake (compared to other gaming forms) a bettor's bankroll cannot survive a 15-race card.

Remember, a six-horse field has a mean odds of 7-2 or 4-1, while a nine-horse field has a mean value of 6-1, and a 10-horse field has a mean value of 7-1 on the tote board.

We need full fields to further enhance winning payoffs.

We also need fewer wagering options so pools can be more substantial for enhanced value.

One suggestion would be for the racetracks to limit the number of races per program to 10 and apply for an extra race day to accommodate those with 15, instead of two 15 race programs, have three 10 race programs so bettors can replenish their funds, and freshen up for an extra racing day per week.

For those that have full racing schedules, continue with 10-race programs with enhanced purses with "AEs" when necessary and go back to what has been done in the form of preference dates.

If we take our time in innovation, there will be nobody left like us faithful old-timers to carry things forward.

Time marches on – both on and off the track, but we don't have much time off the track to make things happen.

Until then...

## Austin Hanners aims to keep improving as 2026 season begins

Austin Hanners can look back on his 2025 season and enjoy the fact he won the three biggest races of his career so far, including a Breeders Crown, but that will not change his focus going forward.

The 26-year-old Hanners captured his first Breeders Crown with Always B Naughty in the \$400,000 Grade 1 Breeders Crown Mare Pace on Oct. 25 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, garnered his first Ohio Sire Stakes championship with Jailhouse Pearl in the \$300,000 final for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Sept. 27 at Hollywood Dayton Raceway, and won the \$250,000 Charlie Hill Memorial Trot (G2) with Hillexotic on Sept. 6 at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

Overall, Hanners won 205 races and earned \$4.31 million in purses, which fell just \$44,645 shy of his career high in 2024 despite making 401 fewer starts.

“It was a good year,” said Hanners, who resides in southcentral Ohio. “I’m grateful for all the opportunities I had. The Breeders Crown and Charlie Hill were definitely highlights, along with winning my first sire stakes final. I’d won one other big race [in 2024], the Pacey Mindlin Memorial at Miami Valley, but to win the Hill at Scioto was a lot of fun. That’s at home and it was my first big, big win. The Breeders Crown just topped it all off.”

Hanners began driving in 2016, making 17 starts, and saw his workload gradually increase from there. He drove in more than 1,000 races for the first time in 2022, racing 1,618 times, and had his first million-dollar season that same year, collecting \$1.42 million in purses. He has topped 200 wins and earned more than \$3.2 million in purses each of the past three seasons. His back-to-back \$4 million campaigns put him among the top 30 drivers in purses nationally both years.

“I hope I just keep getting better,” Hanners said. “I know a lot of people say that, but I really do. Looking at how far I’ve come in such a short period of time – I remember having my first million-dollar season just a few years ago – and

now I’ve had three straight years where I’ve done triple that. To say that I thought I would be there that quickly would be a lie, but I was definitely hoping that I could get there. It has come a lot quicker and I’m hoping I can stay in that category and just keep improving.”

As for what he would like to improve, Hanners said, “I just want to get better at driving horses in general.

“Our colony is so tough that you’ve got to be on your game at all times. I just want to learn more, be a student of the game, and get better every day. I feel like if you’re not getting better, then what’s the point of being there. If you feel like you’ve learned everything, you’re way off.

"I watch a lot of races from everywhere. If I'm not in a race, I never miss one. I'm always watching, trying to learn, trying to pick something else up."

Hanners' victory in the Breeders Crown with Always B Naughty came in only his second start in a Breeders Crown final. Always B Naughty won by 5¼ lengths in a stakes-record 1:48.1.

"She just peaked at the right time," Hanners said. "She was so powerful that night, as she was the week before [winning an open for fillies and mares at Mohawk in 1:48.2]. It was a great way for her to get sharp for the right race."

"In the stretch, I could see myself on the [infield] TV and I didn't hear anybody else behind me; I knew she was a good ways ahead. The feeling was unbelievable. But it didn't really sink in until after the race and everything was over. People work for that all year long. To win a race like that was just awesome."

Always B Naughty's triumph also gave trainer Todd Luther and owner Greg Luther their first Breeders Crown trophy.

"They were as much on Cloud Nine as I was," Hanners said.

Hanners enjoyed numerous other successes with the Luthers, such as winning the Hill Memorial with Hillextotic and an Ohio Breeders Championship with 3-year-old pacing filly Prolific Fire, as well as finishing third in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown for sophomore pacing fillies with Skywalker Sea.

"It's worked out good," Hanners said. "I drive the majority of the stakes horses; all of them in Ohio and whatever we can fit in out of state. It doesn't always work out early in the year, but when we start slowing down [in Ohio], I start traveling with the older horses on the Grand Circuit, which is a lot of fun. It's somewhere I never thought I would reach. It's been one of those amazing rides."

Where that ride goes in 2026 will be determined as this season unfolds. Hanners got his year under way Wednesday with seven drives at Miami Valley Raceway.

"I'll focus mainly on Ohio, and if other things happen, then that's how it happens," Hanners said. "If not, we're just going to try to keep going one day at a time and see where we go. I try to take it one day at a time because it all happens so fast."

## Billy Herman elected to the Ohio Hall of Fame

Billy Herman, noted Grand Circuit driver/trainer, has been elected as the 52nd member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame by a vote of the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

Herman was born on Feb. 21, 1940, in Frankfort, OH, and grew up in Good Hope. He developed a love for horses at a young age while riding his pony to school and cleaning stalls at the Washington Court House fairgrounds. His passion for harness racing led him to compete at Ohio fairs and raceways, where he honed his skills and gained valuable experience.

In the 1970s, Herman made a bold move to leave his hometown and moved to Roosevelt/Yonkers to pursue his career. In 1972, he relocated to South Florida to work as the second trainer for renowned horseman George Sholty. When Sholty was injured in 1976, Herman took over as the primary driver for the stable and continued to achieve success.

He moved to Ben White Raceway to train for Hanover Shoe Farms before branching out with his own stable.

During his career, Herman trained and drove numerous champion horses, winning the Kentucky Futurity with Noble Rogue and Texas. He won the Kentucky Filly Futurity three times and the Hambletonian Oaks with Cora T. He also claimed victories in the Woodrow Wilson, the Juliette, and he won top races with Scarlet Skipper and Franz Hanover.

He is probably best remembered for the great filly Toy Poodle, a multiple Dan Patch Award winner. As this year's Proximity Award winner Bill O'Donnell recalled, "He had some really great horses, but the first that comes to mind is Toy Poodle. She had to race against the boys a lot of the time – and she beat them."

Records for at least the first two decades of his career were not documented, but as a driver, Herman amassed well over 1400 career wins and earned exponentially more than the \$10 million in purse that is reflected in his USTA statistics.

Throughout his career, Herman was known as an all-around horseman, respected trainer, and skilled driver who left a lasting impact on the harness racing community. As Chuck Sylvester summed up, "We all wanted him to drive our horses. He was a very good driver – very easy on a horse, and incredibly patient. That really stood out."

Herman will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association's annual banquet on Saturday (Jan. 10) at the Renaissance Westerville.

## Shaws to be enshrined into the Ohio Hall of Fame as Immortals

John "Red" and Betty Shaw, recognized by industry peers throughout the Midwest for their over 40 years of involvement in racing, have been elected as the Hall of Fame Immortals, by the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

Red was raised on a farm in Newcomerstown, was a member of 4-H, and worked showing cattle in New Philadelphia, Sunbury, and finally Mt. Vernon, where he met and married Betty, a partnership that lasted 50 years, coinciding with Red's new business, John Red Shaw Auctioneer, which he operated for 52 years.

It was in Knox County where Red and Betty formed a liking for harness racing, that started at the local county fairs, which led to attending and purchasing at horse sales throughout the region. It is said that Betty had a good eye at the sales and enjoyed spending time at the family farm with those that she had picked, many of whom went on to successful racing careers.

While the family was growing with a daughter, Brenda, and sons, Tim and Andy, so was the size of their racing stable. While their great trotter, Victory Is Coming, was their most successful and popular horse, over the course of 35 years the Shaws' stable owned or bred over 325 horses. They raced all over the Midwest and were recognized by their peers not only for their talent in and around racetracks, but equally as some of the nicest, hardworking people in our industry.

Red passed away in October of 2020 at the age of 81 and Betty passed away in April of 2023 at the age of 84. At the time of their passing, the family had grown to include three grandchildren and one great granddaughter. Their contributions to harness racing were significant and everlasting.

The Shaws will be inducted at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet on Saturday (Jan. 10) at the Renaissance Westerville.

## Victory Is Coming voted into Ohio Harness Horse Hall of Fame

Victory Is Coming, a three-time Ohio Sire Stakes champion, has been selected to be the latest standardbred to be enshrined into the Ohio Hall of Fame by the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United State Harness Writers Association.

The Victory Sam mare out of Norse Comer (Overcomer) was bred by Success Acres.

She was purchased as a yearling for \$13,500 by John "Red" and Betty Shaw of Mount Vernon, OH and trained for most of her career by Ammon Hershberger.

As a 2-year-old, she won half of her 10 seasonal starts and finished second in the Ohio Sire Stakes (OHSS) final.

Her sophomore season saw 16 wins in 23 starts, and another runner-up finish in the OHSS final.

Victory Is Coming would win back-to-back-to-back OHSS finals as an older trotter in 2014-2016.

A tough open trotter who often raced against the boys, Victory Is Coming won seven straight races in 2016 as a 9-year-old.

Victory Is Coming retired from racing in 2017 with 68 wins in 163 starts, earning \$711,159.

As a broodmare, she produced six foals, including Johnnyreds Victory (\$122,948).

Victory Is Coming will be inducted at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet on Saturday (Jan. 10) at the Renaissance Westerville.

## Chris Gooden named USHWA President's Award recipient

"Grief is the last act of love we can give to those we loved."

Documenting the Honor Walk for the late Hunter Myers was one of the most difficult moments of Meadows track photographer Chris Gooden's career. While the task felt deeply painful, Gooden knew it was something the Myers family wanted and deserved.

Myers, 27, tragically passed away on March 19 following an accident at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows. His death sent shockwaves throughout the harness racing industry. The loss was deeply personal for Gooden.

The Honor Walk video created by Gooden became a profoundly moving tribute, one that has earned him a President's Award

from the United States Harness Writers Association and USHWA president Michael Carter. It showed Myers laying in his bed and being pushed through the hospital as family, friends, horsepeople, and medical staff lined the hallway and room. His organs were donated and helped several people, including an 11-year-old girl who needed a heart.

"Losing Hunter is something I still can't fathom to this day," Gooden said. "We had so much fun creating memories through video and photos. When he passed, I felt like I lost a piece of my own creativity."

Gooden, a multiple-time George Smallsreed Award winner in photography, is widely known for producing compelling visual content that helps share harness racing with a broader audience.

"Chris Gooden's work is second to none in the sport of harness racing," Carter said. "His impact goes far beyond photography because through his engaging social media content, he brings new faces and new energy to the sport."

In the aftermath of Myers' passing, Gooden contemplated stepping away from content creation altogether. Ultimately, he realized that doing so would have gone against everything his friend stood for.

"Hunter would have been mad if I had just hung it up," Gooden said. "So, I kept going, and focused on making sure he was remembered through the photos and videos we created together."

For Gooden, creating content became more than a profession; it was a way to process his grief and honor his friend's legacy.

"After the Honor Walk video was released in March, I remember calling Chris and telling him to pack his bags and get ready for Florida," Carter said. "That video brought the entire industry together, provided healing during one of its darkest times, and had over 4.5 million views."

## Janet Terhune honored with USHWA President's Award

Michael Carter, president of the United States Writers Association (USHWA), has selected Janet Terhune as the recipient of a 2026 President's Award.

Currently the executive director of the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame, Terhune is being recognized for a lifetime of dedication to the sport's data accessibility and the preservation of its rich history.

Terhune's impact on the industry spans decades. During her 26-year tenure at the United States Trotting Association (USTA), she played a central role in the development of information services and Pathway, the USTA's online data service. Through continuous collaboration with industry leaders and USTA software developers, the expanded availability of accurate records fundamentally transformed the harness racing community's interaction with racing and breeding information. In 2008 her expertise and leadership led to her appointment as registrar.

In 2012, Terhune transitioned to the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame, where she has been instrumental in promoting the Museum's mission. Under her guidance, the Museum has expanded the collections' storage capacity with the opening of the Fleming Barn, and has launched landmark exhibits, including the Greyhound Gallery and the Hambletonian 100, ensuring that the sport's most iconic moments remain accessible to future generations.

Most recently, Terhune spearheaded the 2024 renovation of the Communicators Corner. This project introduced a state-of-the-art digital display designed to honor those elected to the Communicators Hall of Fame.

"It was the most collaborative and expansive exhibit update in 2024," said Terhune. "In association with a committed group of members from USHWA, the Museum designed and implemented a new look and digital framework to celebrate these accomplishments. This effort is likely to lead the way for additional digital installations that will renew and refresh the Museum's overall presentation.

"New projects on the horizon are to digitize anything that can be digitized, including magazines, microfiche, race programs and

photographs. Stabilizing the sport's history in electronic form is crucial to the information's accessibility in the future."

Beyond her professional roles, Terhune has been a steadfast advocate for USHWA. A longtime member and director, she currently serves as the secretary and director for the Monticello-Goshen chapter.

"Janet's passion for the sport of harness racing is immeasurable," said Carter. "Her lifetime of service has aided harness racing in expanding into the future while preserving the importance of its history."

## Woodbine releases 2026 standardbred stakes schedule

Woodbine Entertainment today released the schedule for its 2026 stakes season, featuring a trio of million-dollar races and 12 Grade 1 events.

The North America Cup (June 13), Mohawk Million (Sept. 26) and Metro Pace (Sept. 26) remain the crown jewels of the racing season at Woodbine Mohawk Park for 2026.

The trio of Grade 1 million-dollar events highlight a prestigious \$20 million-plus stakes program for 2026.

This year will mark the 43rd edition of the North America Cup, which showcases the finest 3-year-old pacers. The Mohawk Million for 2-year-old trotters enters its seventh year of existence, while the Metro Pace for 2-year-old pacers has been held annually since 1988.

Woodbine's standardbred racing department did a review of its stakes program following the 2025 season and has made a few changes to conditions and dates for several stakes. The marquee race days remain unchanged in their placement on the calendar.

The following changes have been implemented for 2026:

- Slot price for Mohawk Million increased from \$50,000 to \$60,000
- After lowering the price by half from \$100,000 to \$50,000 in 2024, the Mohawk Million has seen a large demand to purchase a slot.
- Each of the 10 slots for the 2026 edition will be offered at \$60,000 with Woodbine providing the remaining \$400,000 of the \$1 million purse.
- **2-Year-Old Summer Series format changed**
- The Dream Maker, Whenuwishuponastar, Millard Farms, and Pure Ivory have been changed from two preliminary legs and a final to elimination and a final.
- Nomination and sustaining payments have been added with Woodbine aiming to generate final purses in the \$125,000 to \$150,000 range, providing local trainers with a significant racing opportunity for 2-year-olds of any sires stakes jurisdiction.
- **Canadian Graduate Series removed**
- The 4-Year-Old Canadian Graduate Series will not be offered in 2026 following low nominations and entries.
- Multiple legs were cancelled in 2025 due to lack of entries.
- **Date change for Casual Breeze and Tompkins-Geers**
- The Casual Breeze for 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters has been moved from late-August to June (North America Cup weekend) as a more ideal spot on the stakes calendar across North America.
- The Tompkins-Geers for 2-Year-Olds has been moved from late-June to mid-July.

Woodbine Mohawk Park will offer 32 graded stakes in 2026, the largest number of any racetrack in North America. The Dream Maker, Whenuwishuponastar, Millard Farms, and Pure Ivory each received graded status (Grade 3) this season.

## OHHA presents Hagemeyer Significant Contribution Award to Roger Huston

The Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association has awarded the prestigious Maynard and Stella Hagemeyer Significant Contribution Award to track announcer Roger Huston for 2025.

Now in his 67th year behind the mic, Huston has announced races all over the world with 184,841 calls to date. He has served as the announcer for the Little Brown Jug at the Delaware County Fair for 58 years with his favorite being the 2015 edition when Wiggle It Jiggleit defeated Lost For Words. He also cites Falcon Seelster setting a world record at Delaware in 1985 and Dragon's Lair defeating Nihilator to win the Breeders Crown at The Meadows in 1984 as some of his most memorable calls.

"I have never worked a day in my life," Huston said. "Every race is the most important race in harness racing for that owner, driver, trainer, and caretaker. I have been criticized that I call every race like it's the Jug, but any given race may be as close to racing in the Jug that the connections have, so they deserve the best of me."

Inducted into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2001, Huston is arguably the sport's foremost race caller and has long been known as the voice of The Meadows. In September, he notified Little Brown Jug officials that he wanted to step back and call fewer races during Jug week beginning in 2025. Previously, he had called all 54 Jugettes and 57 straight Little Brown Jug races. Since 1967, more than 4,200 races have been conducted at the Delaware County Fair, almost all of them with Huston behind the mic.

"I just want to make it clear, I am not retiring," the 83-year-old Huston said at the time of his announcement. "I just felt it was the right thing to do, to give another young man the opportunity to live out his dream."

As 2025 came to a close, Huston said he was honored to be named the recipient of the Maynard and Stella Hagemeyer Significant Contribution Award.

"When I began announcing in 1960, I worked many county fairs with Stella Hagemeyer," Huston said. "It seemed like everywhere I went, Stella was working as clerk of course. Those were the days when we had eligibility papers for horses that had to be filled out by hand, and entries were taken over the phone since there were no computers for entries. To understand the process, I always arrived early to work with Stella, recording payments, driver changes, and scratches. Stella was the best at her job and as a person as well, and to earn the award named in her honor means as much to me as any other award."

The Maynard and Stella Hagemeyer Significant Contribution Award is given to an individual for significant lifelong contributions to Ohio harness racing. The recipient must possess a passion and advocacy for Ohio harness racing. The award is based on the importance of educating and involving local and state legislators in the preservation and promotion of the harness racing industry.

### **Katie Hershberger, Parker Steck to receive 2025 OHHA Outstanding Groom Award**

Katie Hershberger and Parker Steck have earned the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association's Outstanding Groom Award for 2025.

Both individuals received multiple nominations for the award.

Hershberger has worked for trainer Rosy Weaver for three years. She grooms eight horses in Weaver's stable in Beach City, Ohio, and jogs them when needed.

"Katie is an absolutely amazing girl," Weaver said. "I consider myself extremely lucky to have her working in my stable. She is always ready to do anything I ask her to help with, without hesitation, and she is great with the horses. She truly loves her job and is deserving of this award."

Another of Hershberger's nominators, Dave Jury, highlighted her dedication and work ethic.

"Katie is so involved in her grooming job that she has little time for outside activities," Jury said. "She is always willing to jump in and help a neighbor or friend when needed. She gives up a significant portion of her personal life to ensure her horses receive 24/7 care, often working long, demanding hours, including weekends and holidays."

Steck grooms for her parents, Ron and Kila, at their training facility in Delaware, OH, doing so full time for the past three years after graduating from Ashland University with a degree in nursing. Her job responsibilities include transporting horses to and from the races and paddocking them. Her commitment to the job has not gone unnoticed.

"I have trained with the Steck stable for 25-plus years and have known Parker since she was born," said Gary Condit, who was one of Steck's nominators. "I have experienced a multitude of grooms over the years taking care of my horses, and there has simply been none that are in the same league as Parker. It is noteworthy that after passing the nursing exams, she has chosen to take care of horses over an alternative career in nursing. That is a testament to her passion for her work as a groom."

Kila Steck also highlighted her daughter's passion for horses.

"Parker works in the barn every day and goes to the races pretty much every day as well," Kila said. "If she does not go to the races, she organizes who is going in her place. She sometimes

takes a lot of heat from people because she chose to ‘just do horses’ instead of becoming a nurse, but I could not be prouder of her decision because of how lucky she is to be able to do what she loves every day.”

### **Joe and Fran Darmofal to receive OHHA Dick Brandt, Sr. Extra Effort Award**

The Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association has awarded Joe and Fran Darmofal the Dick Brandt, Sr. Extra Effort Award for 2025.

Over the past few years, the Darmofals, of Sylvania, OH, have donated to various fairs throughout the state in the form of trophies, grandstand entertainment, funding for the Ladies Pace events, and other worthy causes. OHHA board member Rusty Vorhees also noted that the Darmofals bought a trotting filly for a young man to train because he showed a strong work ethic, and they liked the way he handled her on the track.

“The Dick Brandt Award is a perfect way to repay their generosity and to give thanks for helping county fairs succeed in Ohio,” Vorhees said.

The Dick Brandt, Sr. Extra Effort Award is awarded to an individual, local horsemen’s associations, and matinee clubs who have demonstrated a commitment to county fair racing. The award is based on involvement with their local fair board, local matinees, community involvement, improvements to racing and barn areas, and assistance with racing programs during the fair week. It is named for Dick Brandt, Sr., who served as president of the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association in 1984 and 1985. He was a past chairman of the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s health and retirement fund and treasurer of P.A.C.E.R. (Political Action Committee for Equine Racing). He also served as a member of the United States Trotting Association’s board of directors and treasurer.

### **OHHA to present 2025 Special Recognition Awards**

The Ohio-based connections of 2025 Breeders Crown champions Always B Naughty, Miki And Minnie, and Sippinonsearoc will be presented Special Recognition Awards at the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association Annual Awards banquet.

Always B Naughty was the Breeders Crown champion in the Open Mare Pace, scoring a victory for Ohio three times over with driver Austin Hanners (Frankfort), trainer Todd Luther (Commercial Point), and owner Greg Luther Racing (Blacklick). The 5-year-old Always B Miki mare won by five lengths in 1:48.1, setting a new stakes record while giving Hanners, Todd Luther, and Greg Luther their first-ever Breeders Crown titles. She closed 2025 with six wins while earning \$289,583 in 23 starts. She has 18 career victories and earnings of \$901,212.

Bred and owned in part by Bob Mondillo, of Delaware, OH, Miki And Minnie scored a second straight Breeders Crown title in 2025, doing so in the 3-Year-Old Filly Pace division in a dead heat with The Last Martini in 1:49.2. It was just the second time in the 41-year history of the Breeders Crown that there

was a dead heat for win. The Always B Miki filly gave Mondillo his first Breeders Crown trophy in 2024, and she became the 57th horse, and 27th pacer, to win two Breeders Crown titles. She hit the board in all 15 starts in 2025, recording 13 wins and two seconds to go with \$1,123,824 in earnings en route to being named the Dan Patch 3-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. She has hit the board in all 26 career starts with 19 wins and earnings of \$1,957,910.

Sippinonsearoc was the lone Ohio-bred to win a Breeders Crown title in 2025, taking the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace in a stakes-record 1:47.3. The Downbytheseaside colt has several connections to the Buckeye State. He was co-bred by Alesha Binkley (Lebanon) and is owned in part by RAS Racing (Powell) and Knox Services (Mt. Vernon). He hit the board in 12 of 15 starts in 2025, recording seven victories and bankrolling \$792,375. He has 13 career wins and \$1,360,375 in earnings.

### **Odds On Chesapeake named Ohio 3-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year**

Hitting the board in 16 of 18 starts and earning over \$470,000, Odds On Chesapeake is the 2025 Ohio 3-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year.

The Downbytheseaside filly out of Macaroon won nine races in 2025 to go with six second-place finishes and one third. Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., she banked \$477,800 this year and recorded a lifetime mark of 1:49.3 in the Jugette elimination at Delaware on Sept. 17. Bred by Odds On Nourrir and owned by Dana Parham, Sr., Odds On Chesapeake was victorious in four of the five legs of the Ohio Sires Stakes and won the \$100,000 Nadia Lobell and \$71,000 Ohio State Fair Stakes at Eldorado Scioto Downs. She was the runner-up in the \$280,000 Jugette final at Delaware and the \$125,000 Courageous Lady at MGM Northfield Park.

“I wasn’t expecting this, but I’m not surprised either, she had a heck of a year,” Parham, Sr. said of Odds On Chesapeake earning divisional recognition this year. “I’m really happy for Virgil Morgan and his whole team. They work so hard, and a lot of her success is because of them.”

Odds On Chesapeake has a record of 13-8-1 with \$635,500 in earnings in 28 lifetime starts.

### **Sippinonsearoc named Ohio 3-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year**

Sippinonsearoc is now a back-to-back divisional award winner after being named the 2025 Ohio 3-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year.

Named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year in 2024 with a record of 6-2-1 and \$568,000 in earnings in 11 starts, Sippinonsearoc had an even better season in 2025. The son of Downbytheseaside out of Queen Ann M recorded seven wins, two seconds, and three thirds, banking \$792,375 in 15 starts to surpass \$1 million in career earnings. He won the \$600,000 Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 25 in a stakes-record and lifetime-best 1:47.3 on top of taking the

\$400,000 Kentucky Championship Series final and the \$100,000 fifth leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes. Trainer Ron Burke believes Sippinonsearoc may have had even more success if not for some talented stablemates.

“There’s no telling what that horse would’ve done if not for other horses from my own barn,” Burke said. “Every time he got beat, it was by a horse from my barn. He’s really a top-notch horse.”

Bred by Trent Stohler Stable and Alesha Binkley, Sippinonsearoc has a record of 13-4-4 in 26 career starts, banking \$1,360,375. He is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi, RAS Racing, and Knox Services.

#### **Jailhouse Pearl named Ohio 3-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year**

Banking more than \$300,000 in earnings, Jailhouse Pearl has been named the 2025 Ohio 3-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year.

Owned and bred by Casey Clemens, the Long Tom filly out of Jailhouse Broad hit the board in 12 of 14 seasonal starts. She tallied five wins, five seconds, and two thirds while earning \$309,317 and recording a lifetime mark of 1:52.2 in winning the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship at Hollywood Gaming at Dayton Raceway on Sept. 27. Leading up to the Scarlet Championship, she posted victories in the second and fifth legs of the OHSS and also won the \$72,000 Ohio Stake Fair Stakes at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

In 29 lifetime starts, she has a record of 15-10-2 with earnings of \$372,694. She is trained by Eric Nesselroad.

“As a 2-year-old, we didn’t know whether we should stake her, but we continued to train her, and we found out that she really likes to pass,” Clemens said. “My son, Brady, drove her at the fairs as a 2-year-old, and he would try to let her have to pass, and she won most of the fair races she was at. And things have all worked out. She’s just a nice horse, and everybody likes her.”

#### **Lt Loverboy named Ohio 3-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year**

Repeat divisional award winner Lt Loverboy won five of 11 starts on his way to being named Ohio’s 3-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year for 2025.

Bred by Midland Acres, Lt Loverboy is owned by Wayne Mast, Jr. and Callam Racing. The Daren Harvey trainee added one second-place and two thirds to his five victories this season, earning \$314,879. He recorded six wins and earned \$304,855 in 10 starts as the Ohio 2-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year in 2024.

“Midland Acres would like to congratulate all of the connections to Lt Loverboy for the second year in a row being the 2-Year-Old and 3-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year in Ohio,” said Midland Acres corresponding officer Dr. John Mossbarger. “Lt Loverboy has a great trait that all champion horses have – it’s one who refuses to lose.”

Lt Loverboy opened his 2025 campaign with a victory in the \$75,000 James K. Hackett Memorial at Miami Valley Raceway.

The Long Tom gelding out of Fortheloveoflindy added wins in three legs of the 2025 Ohio Sires Stakes, recording a lifetime mark of 1:52.1 in the third leg at Eldorado Scioto Downs on July 5, and was victorious in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship.

“He was definitely a pleasure to work with all year,” Mast, Jr. said. “Daren Harvey did a phenomenal job of having him ready for big races. He’s really been a blessing to us, and it’s always amazing to have a Horse of the Year. It’s a very nice compliment to get at the end of the year.”

In two seasons, Lt Loverboy has a record of 11-4-3 with \$619,734 in earnings in 21 lifetime starts.

Huston, Hershberger, Steck, the Darmofals, the connections of Always B Naughty, Miki And Minnie, and Sippinonsearoc, Odds On Chesapeake, Sippinonsearoc, Jailhouse Pearl, and Lt Loverboy will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association Annual Awards banquet on Jan. 10 at the Renaissance Columbus-Westerville in Westerville, OH.

The 2025 Ohio Horse of the Year will be announced at the awards banquet.

## Pebble Beach 2024 foals may be supplemented for 2027 Pace

The 2024 foals of Pebble Beach, previously excluded from nominating to the 2027 Meadowlands Pace as yearlings by the Stallion Restriction Condition (Gural Rule), may now be supplemented to that stake by making the 2-year-old supplemental payment.

This has become possible due to the nomination of Pebble Beach to the [Stallions Eligible for Meadowlands Early Closer Participation payment for the foals of 2024](#), which is required to make the above mentioned supplement and will also permit all 2024 foals of Pebble Beach to be nominated and sustained to all [Meadowlands Early Closers](#) for 2-year-olds in 2026 and for the life of the horse, providing the Feb. 15, 2026 \$400 ECP payment is made.

Payment of the Feb. 15 [\\$400 ECP payment](#) is required of any and all foals of 2024 [nominated as yearlings to the 2027 Meadowlands Pace](#) to continue with the 2-year-old March 15 sustaining (or supplemental) payment and all subsequent payments on the stake.

The Meadowlands Pace requires a [2-year-old supplemental payment of \\$1,000](#) by March 15, 2026 along with all future sustaining payments.

**Important:** Failure to make the \$400 Early Closer Participation payment on the foals of 2024 will result in the horse being rendered ineligible for any future Meadowlands added money events for the life of the horse.

## Merriman, Kreiser run away with 2025 honors at MGM Northfield Park

Let's be honest, the driving title was decided on Day 1. Just as it has been for the past nine years. Aaron Merriman seized control immediately, and history took care of the rest. Everything that followed didn't change the outcome; it merely delayed the announcement.

Merriman capped off another sensational season with 578 victories from 2,255 starts, more than doubling his closest competitor. It was dominance, plain, and simple.

Trailing Merriman in the standings were Chris Lems (281), Justin Irvine (249), Kurt Sugg (240), and Dan Noble (225), rounding out the top five.

On the national stage, this marked Merriman's best season in terms of wins, as he eclipsed 900 victories since 2019, finishing with 922. It was also his eighth consecutive season with more than \$8 million in earnings (excluding 2020). The 47-year-old Northfield native, who began his career in 1997, now boasts over \$130 million in career earnings.

With 17,096 lifetime wins, Merriman ranks third on the all-time wins list, sitting 936 behind Tony Morgan and 4,366 behind Dave Palone, the only driver to surpass the 20,000-win milestone.

While the driving title was a runaway, the training crown traditionally unfolds as a season-long battle. That said, for the second consecutive year – and third time overall – Cory Kreiser proved dominant, leading all trainers with 199 wins, edging his own 2024 total of 197.

Following Kreiser were Sam Schillaci (151), Edward Miller (112), Ron Burke (109), and Keith Kash, Jr. (63) to complete the top five.

Nationally, Kreiser ranked sixth in total wins, compiling 228 victories across all tracks. It was the second-best season in both wins and purse earnings for the Kreiser barn. And before long, another milestone will fall: Kreiser is rapidly approaching \$10 million in career earnings, currently standing at \$9,271,597.

## Meadowlands 2026 Early Closer Participation payment

For the upcoming season, The Meadowlands will institute an Early Closer Participation (ECP) payment on foals of 2024 which will be required to be made to The Meadowlands to gain eligibility for nomination to all Meadowlands 2-year-old Early Closers in 2026.

This \$400 payment is not a stakes payment.

It is a separate one-time payment that will provide eligibility for nomination to Meadowlands administered races only, for the life of the horse.

Failure to make this \$400 ECP payment, regardless of intentions to race in the 2-year-old races or not, will result in the exclusion of any horse from Meadowlands added money events for the life of the horse.

Any horse by a sire who is **listed as eligible** MUST make the one-time \$400 ECP payment due (postmarked by) Feb. 15, 2026 to gain the option of nominating to Meadowlands 2YO Early Closers for the 2026 season and/or make the 2-year-old sustaining payment or plan to make the supplemental payment for the 2027 Meadowlands Pace.

Meadowlands races affected by the ECP payment on the foals of 2024 are:

Kindergarten (All divisions)

New Jersey Classic Series (All divisions)

Freshman Final Four (Governor’s Cup, Three Diamonds, Valley Victory, and Goldsmith Maid)

2027 Meadowlands Pace 2-year-old sustaining payment/2-year-old supplemental payment.

The entire series of nominating and sustaining payments as listed in the race conditions must then be made for the horse to be eligible for any Early Closer or stake.

Nomination payments on Meadowlands Early Closers for 2-year-olds in 2026 will be pushed back to begin on March 15 and sustaining payments have been adjusted accordingly.

Only those 2-year-olds who have made the one-time \$400 Meadowlands ECP payment will be permitted to race in the 2-year-old baby races at The Meadowlands.

All pertinent information on the above and the necessary form is available on the [Meadowlands website](#).

The ECP payment is not required on horses older than 2 in 2026. Horses 3 and older may be nominated by Feb. 15 to the 2026 Meadowlands Early Closers by making the nominating and sustaining payments for the events as normally done.

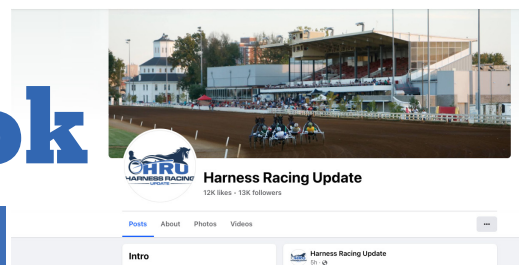
