Immediate returns at Yonkers

Just a few weeks after Cammie Haughton took over as the director of racing at Yonkers, handle is up significantly thanks to the elimination of the passing lane, an earlier evening post time and management's insistence that drivers mix it up more.

Cammie Haughton has encouraged the Yonkers drivers' colony to mix it up more to help drive handle.

The elimination of the passing lane, an earlier evening post time, and the introduction of guarantees that will accompany Pick 5 carryovers are among changes that appear to be breathing new life into a Yonkers Raceway product accused of being stale.

"It's a whole new different level of racing," said Cammie Haughton, in his first year as director of racing at Yonkers. "I call it back to basics."

Initial returns may have owner Tim Rooney wondering why he did not move sooner to hire the son of late Hall of Famer Billy Haughton.

The first two Sunday cards of the new year, bolstered by trotting races simulcast in France, produced total handles in

excess of \$2 million, a gaudy total for the tradition-rich half-mile oval. According to Haughton, the first five cards generated a 73 per cent increase in handle compared to 2017.

There is widespread agreement that the decision to drop the passing lane is resulting in far more entertaining competition. With the lane, drivers were criticized for being rather passive in the early stages of some races that tended to offer little beyond a late flurry of activity.

“For the money we’re going for, these drivers have an obligation to get the most out of their horses for the owner, for the trainer, with expending the least amount of energy,” said Joe Faraldo, president of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York. “So they haven’t been pulling on the right line with that passing lane because they can get third money, fourth money, or even win the race by just sitting. But it made the racing very boring.”

No one would make that accusation any longer. There is widespread approval of an adjustment that some would argue was long overdue.

“I don’t think there is any argument from anybody. It’s definitely changed racing and made it more exciting,” said Jordan Stratton, who drives regularly at Yonkers. “There might be one or two cases where the favorite gets buried on the inside and has no place to go, but for the most part there is a lot more movement.

“You have to do something. I’m just glad my home track was the one to step up and take the initiative and try to be better for the future.”

According to Haughton, there is more pressure on drivers to engage their horses early without the comfort level that the passing lane provided.

“They know two things,” he said. “Either they’ve got to pull or they get trapped in.”

More pressure up front will likely be more taxing on favorites that were sometimes afforded a comfortable lead in the past as drivers bided their time, confident the passing lane would provide an opening for a late bid. Haughton said there were 14 winning favorites in 58 races during the first week of racing. In comparison, the top choice delivered 24 times in 53 races in the first week last year.

“That’s good,” Haughton said of the increased unpredictability. “That means people who are betting on these races are getting prices.”

The decision to advance the evening post time 20 minutes to 6:50 p.m. ET is helping Yonkers to avoid having races run at the same time as other simulcast tracks. In addition, Haughton is insisting that drivers and horses be on track for at least seven minutes before they go to the starting gate to give fans a longer look at horses before they wager.

“Our guys were just going out there and going right to the gate. There is no way a gambler wants to see that,” Haughton said. “How can they even look at their horse and bet on it? It was terrible.”

Clearly, Haughton is not afraid to speak his mind. During a mandatory meeting for drivers before the season began, the new director of racing said he told them, “The party’s over. We are dangerously low with our handle. We have to get the handle up.”

Faraldo hailed the earlier first post for night racing.

“You have to stagger your starts,” he said. “You need at least five to seven minutes between the conclusion of the last race, wherever that last race is, and your race because gamblers say, ‘Our best race is the next race coming up.’ You can’t go head to head with other tracks.”

In another twist designed to spur handle, Yonkers announced on Friday that guarantees will accompany Pick 5 carryovers, effective immediately. Guarantees will range from

\$10,000 for Pick 5 carryovers less than \$3,500 to \$35,000 when the Pick 5 carryover is between \$12,001 and \$15,000.


Haughton expressed gratitude for the widespread cooperation he is receiving. He emphasized that more changes are ahead.

“I’m just getting started,” he said.

Overhaul in Ontario aims to create one group controlling all racing in the province

Ontario Racing chair Hugh Mitchell wants to create a more inclusive, transparent group that oversees all 15 tracks, all three racing breeds and includes horsepeople, breeders and horse retirement groups.

Hugh Mitchell can envision a day when all horse racing in Ontario is controlled by one body and all tracks work together to fill fields, coordinate schedules and rules and increase efficiencies to create one branded product to maximize profits for all.

“That’s the dream, the vision, and I think it’s real and achievable,” said Mitchell, the chair of Ontario Racing (OR), an industry association that represents much, but not all, of the province’s horse racing industry.

Mitchell would like that to change.

On Dec. 14, OR announced it was undergoing a transformation to attempt to bring all horse racing parties in Ontario into the fold of an independent, not-for-profit industry organization – including horsepeople and horse retirement groups.

Mitchell said an all-encompassing organization would mean, “tracks aren’t competing with each other for horses or customers. We’re coordinating our efforts and driving down our costs of administering and producing this product. We’re being more efficient and we’re being more effective because we are talking to one another in an informed way.”

The transformation aims to merge OR with the eight-track Standardbred Alliance to, in effect, expand the work of the Alliance to the entire horse racing industry in Ontario – all 15 tracks and all three breeds: standardbred, thoroughbred and quarter horse.

The newly merged organization is committed to having a three-year business plan in place by April 1, 2018. The plan will include guarantees of purse payments for all member tracks, staking programs and race schedules, as well as establishing and administering common racetrack rules and policies.

“One of the reasons (the Standardbred Alliance) works so well is because Woodbine is the administrator of the Alliance and because we’re all pretty well aligned on the objectives of the Alliance and supporting live racing. It’s working. We

want to take that business model and expand it to the industry,” Mitchell said. “One of the shortcomings of the Standardbred Alliance is that it’s only standardbred racetracks and it’s not all racetracks. As well, it doesn’t include horsepeople or breeders. It’s a great first step, but I don’t see it as the final step.

“The thing about OR is that OR includes all breeds and it includes breeders, horsepeople and racetracks, but it has its own shortcomings. It doesn’t include all racetracks and it doesn’t include all horsepeople. And it doesn’t include some industry organizations that I think are important in the future of racing. Two, in particular, come to mind: Long Run and the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society. I think the racing industry has a real obligation to ensure that the equine athletes have a respectful home and are treated with dignity once they leave the racetrack... I think we can do a better job as an industry on finding homes for retired racehorses of all breeds.”

Beyond inclusiveness, the goal of an enhanced Ontario Racing – or whatever it may be called if it undergoes a name change – is transparency.

“You’re going to have a situation where horsepeople and tracks are talking about purse structure. Right now, the Standardbred Alliance has a discussion about purse structure, but in all fairness to horsepeople they are not in the room when the discussion is going on. That’s really not by design, it’s just evolved and so I’m of the view that we should take it to another level with respect to accountability and transparency amongst ourselves,” Mitchell said, adding membership will be voluntary, but, “I think that all will be welcomed and those that elect not to participate, so be it. That’s their prerogative, but I hope a good many of the racetracks and the industry organizations are able to support it and participate in it.”

Mitchell said a better, more inclusive, more transparent Ontario Racing should also help the industry secure

long-term funding with the government through the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation (OLG).

“Honestly, we really need to develop a new OR that can receive the funding and then be accountable and responsible to government to make sure it’s good value for the money spent in supporting racing. They tie together very nicely and it’s very important that they do tie together,” he said.

In the latter half of 2016, it was announced government funding was being proposed that would amount to some \$94 million annually to cover a term as long as 23 years (through 2038). Yet, that funding has not, yet, materialized despite Mitchell’s hope that it would be in place before the end of 2017. With a provincial election looming in June of 2018 and the ruling Liberal Party low in the polls, there has been some concern in the industry that funding may not come through before the election. But Mitchell said the long-promised long-term funding is moving closer to reality.

“I would say that it’s moving forward very quickly. There’s some momentum. I’m hesitant to put a timeline on it, but I would say that it’s very near. It’s very near because the three key pillars in all of the funding discussions – (Ministry of) Finance, OLG and Woodbine – are more aligned today than they ever have been. So I’m really optimistic. It’s going to happen, I’m pretty sure of that, I would bet a lot that it will. Exactly when I can’t say, but I’ve got to give credit to the Minister of Finance and his staff, who have been very supportive and have worked really hard to try to find solutions,” Mitchell said.

Even with long-term funding, Mitchell said \$94 million a year is going to be stretched pretty thin divided up between the province’s 15 racetracks.

“Not this year, but at some point in time, there will have to be tough decisions about how we divvy up a set number of dollars,” Mitchell said. “I think we can get through it if we focus on what’s right for the industry. If that’s the objective, to the betterment of horse racing – all breeds – we’ll find

the solutions... but we need the mechanism to be able to arrive at those solutions and the mechanism is a new OR.”

In the past, groups that failed to gain a seat at the table of Ontario Racing or its predecessor, the Ontario Horse Racing Industry Association (OHRIA), were critical of the one-industry group concept controlled by the most powerful players. Mitchell said those skeptical about the attempt to create a more inclusive, transparent group need to leave those grievances in the past.

“We sail together or we sink apart. It’s that simple. Those are words, but we have to start acting that way. If you’re not prepared to act that way and be sincere and committed to one cause to the betterment of the industry, then, frankly, my view is that you’re not welcome... Everyone has to be prepared to be a part of something bigger and to come with an open mind and be willing to compromise, share and work together,” Mitchell said. “I say to them, ‘Get involved’, but come with the right attitude, because if you’re coming to be disruptive and distracting and divisive, my view is that you’re not welcome if that’s your attitude. But if you’re coming to help and support and work together, then ‘Welcome.’”

Similarly, some – particularly those connected to Fort Erie and Ajax Downs – have been critical of giving their

long-term adversary, the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG), the power to coordinate racing for all. But Mitchell stressed both the OR and Standardbred Alliance boards were unanimous in the decision that WEG be in charge of coordinating the racing product for the province.

“I have experienced and I have witnessed Woodbine’s leadership and willingness to work with others for the greater good of the industry... so I’m a big supporter of them administering the industry, as others are, because their commitment to racing is real. They have the expertise, they have the infrastructure, they have the resources and I think it’s appropriate that they play a leadership role in driving the future of this industry.”

Mitchell added that WEG would be accountable to the OR board.

He said the governance structure of the new group is yet to be finalized, but the challenge is to create a manageable number of board members.

“It doesn’t make sense to me to have a board of 28 members,” Mitchell said. “I see a more robust committee structure.”

A key goal of the new body would be to create a strategic planning committee, he said.

“That’s something that our industry doesn’t do enough of. That’s not to be critical, but now is the time to strategically plan the next 3 to 5 years or longer out for ourselves, before somebody else does,” Mitchell said.

He acknowledged himself and others have made mistakes in the post-Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP) era, which is exactly the reason he wants to get it right now.

“We’re not perfect. And the structure we have today is not the best structure, so we’re recognizing that and saying, ‘Okay, let’s find another structure that takes us to another level that is appropriate for the times we live in and let’s run with it,’” Mitchell said.

In the end, he challenged the industry to come together before it was too late.

“This is clichéd, but we’re long past fighting, surely to God,” Mitchell said. “We’ve got to start working together. We’ve got to start making compromises amongst ourselves for the greater good of the industry. And this will be a test to see if the industry can do this. I think they can, with the right leadership.”

The colt finished his freshman campaign with a victory at The Red Mile in the International Stallion Stake.

As a sophomore, Odds On Equuleus finished second five times in some of the sport's biggest races. He was second in a North America Cup elimination, runner-up in the Meadowlands Pace, and second in a Little Brown Jug heat, clocking a 1:50.3 mile before pacing in 1:51.2 later that afternoon in the Jug final. Odds On Equuleus finished in the money in the Empire Breeders Classic, Messenger Stake and American National.

Competing in the open ranks for four seasons, Odds On Equuleus continued to reach the winner's circle and log fast miles. He took his 1:47.3 mark at age five and paced in 1:48.4 as a seven year old in 2017, turning in miles in 1:51 or lower six times in his final season of racing. Is harness racing an insider's game? The perception is reality

One of the most common replies you and I hear when we mention we patronize harness racing is that it's a game is for insiders. Whether it's through a conversation with a newbie, a thoroughbred bettor, or in popular culture (as rare as that is these days), harness racing takes its lumps. Everyone reading this likely agrees that, no, the game is not as insider as people may think it is. But, when we look at the complaints introspectively, we can't deny that the game's detractors make some strong points.

A couple of weeks ago I opened the program for the first 2018 card at Woodbine. Because of the holiday break I noticed a lot of stale dates, and anyone who handicaps or owns horses knows what a difference time off means for a standardbred. When you crunch the numbers (thanks Ray Schell), you find out that win percentages fall 25 per cent for a horse who is off more than 20 days, versus those who are off seven days or less. Return on investment falls appreciably as well for these horses, from about \$0.74 to \$0.60.

Despite almost the entire card with horses off more than two weeks, I decided I'd handicap the early Pick 5.

In one leg of the Pick 5, there was a horse coming from another track (who looked good enough, for a good trainer) off over a month. In the next leg, I saw a strong favorite; he too off extended time for another good trainer. I emailed a friend to see what he thought about these two horses and he wrote, "it sure looks like a good card for insiders to make money.

He was probably correct. The shipper horse off a month took money and won gate to wire. The horse off similar time in the next leg took boatloads too – bet down to a 2-1 chalk – but was 9th by 18 lengths at the half, missing the board. Someone knew what was going to happen with those two horses, but it certainly wasn't an outsider.

This is especially difficult in a sport that increasingly relies on serial bets for its betting survival. If insiders are on a horse in leg three of a Pick 5 because they know he's a good

thing, they're in the driver's seat, because fans can't even lean on an odds board for guidance.

A couple nights later, there was an even more striking example of this, again at Woodbine, in race 8; the second leg of the Pick 4.

A mare – Call it Courage – was coming off a 35-day break with no charted line. The last two times in this class she was 29-1 and 31-1, where she finished 9th and 7th respectively (from good posts). None of the lines on her card showed an on the board finish, and she was 3-for-35 last year. In one set of tools I look at to handicap, she was slated at 20-1 fair odds, and Compubet had her finishing 6th of 8. The only major change was the trainer, so that could certainly improve her chances some, as we all know.

The horse won and paid \$4.70. "The state of modern harness racing," was how one person described it on social media.

This race and others like them occur in harness racing with some regularity. They often make fans and bettors instantly think "they knew," and if the insiders knew, their money is cannon fodder. Can you blame them for feeling the way they do?

What can be done? Well, something sure can, because this issue and those like it have been tackled in other jurisdictions already.

In Hong Kong, you can reference their website and pretty much learn what a horse had for breakfast that day. You learn why a rider made a move he or she did, what vet work was completed on a horse, and what the trainer intent is for today's race. Even in North America, thoroughbreds off time have works, and there are plenty of widely available statistics regarding layoffs (short or long), or first time starters. For harness racing, as [Brett Sturman noted here in HRU](#) a few weeks ago, in New Zealand and Australia, steward's reports include notes on driver and trainer intent. If a horse is off 40 days, you bet you're going to have information about it. If a horse bleeds, or goes to the back at short odds, or races poorly for no apparent reason, it's reported to customers.

In North American harness racing we often hear this is too difficult to address in a similar fashion; like somehow it's easy to do in Hong Kong or Australia. We hear statements like, "no one in the grandstand is asking us to fix a problem like this"; tone deaf to the fact that the people who wanted you to address these concerns are no longer in the grandstand to complain about it anymore.

I suggest track executives open a program and put themselves in a patron's shoes. Study the cards they are asking them to wager on and ask themselves if they feel a bettor's money is being respected; if they feel they're getting a fair shake. If not, think of ways to rectify this problem and put them into practice. If enough of them do it, for long enough, perhaps harness racing's stigma of being a game for insiders will start to change.

Brandon Maxwell, son of Brad Maxwell of Control The Moment fame, is one of the U.S. team's three goalies.

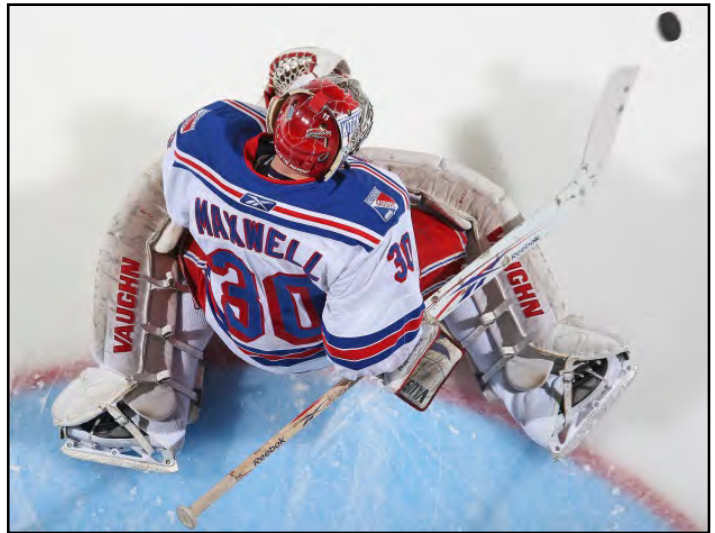
Brandon Maxwell, the son of Ontario-based trainer Brad Maxwell, has been named to the U.S. Olympic hockey team as one of the squad's three goalies.

Brandon, 26, is currently playing hockey professionally for Mlada Boleslav BK northeast of Prague in the Czech Republic. He has both U.S. and Canadian citizenship and is a former sixth-round pick of the Colorado Avalanche in 2009. Brandon played for the U.S. at two world championships and was one of three goalies – along with Olympic teammates Ryan Zapolski and David Leggio – that the U.S. brought with them to the Deutschland Cup in Germany in November.

"Brandon Maxwell, he's an elite puck-handling goaltender," U.S. general manager Jim Johansson told *USA Today*. "It potentially gives you another weapon on your breakout or alleviating pressure from your defense with his abilities with the puck."

Johansson said Brandon's experience playing on the larger ice surface in Europe was important to his selection to the team.

Brandon was born in Florida and is a former Ontario Hockey League (OHL) veteran who played for the Kitchener Rangers, Sarnia Sting and Mississauga St. Michael's Majors. He played for the U.S. under-17 and under-18 team, and joined U.S.A. Hockey's under-18 National Team Development

Further Reflections on Somebeachsomewhere

The owners of the late, great pacing stallion – plus one competitor – reflect on what Somebeachsomewhere brought to their lives.

Rhonda MacGrath: Everyone feels the loss

It's funny about Beach, I think everyone felt a connection. His story was so "feel good" there was no competitiveness or envy, everyone felt a sense of pride and joy with his accomplishments. So, I think everyone also feels the loss.

Stu Rath: If you were from Atlantic Canada it was your right to go to the winner's circle

In May of 2006, I just lost my wife of 40 years to cancer. A friend of mine that was in the harness racing business... said, 'Why don't you come to Lexington to the sale with us? We're looking at buying a horse. So, I thought, 'That's a pretty good idea! They had six people that were going to each put the \$10,000 in. One had dropped out, so they asked me if I wanted to come along and put in the \$10,000. So, it was a good decision that I agreed.

I had a good time. I'm from Truro, so I followed as Brent brought him home and trained The Beach. From there it was

quite a ride for us. We followed him around and watched how he did.

At that time, they called them the Beach Parties. That really got things going. Even now, harness racing in Canada is tough. I'm involved (at Truro Raceway) now to try to save the place because of the lotteries and the gambling machines that have really hurt harness racing. On account of what we did with The Beach, I think something is going to happen there. I will help out myself, if necessary.

As for The Beach, it was really interesting the way he became such a hero, not only in Truro, but especially at Mohawk. In the winner's circle, if you were from Atlantic Canada at all it was your right to go out there to the winner's circle. They always used to talk that Beach used to show off.

It's unfortunate the way things happened, but I think we did everything possible that we could.

It was quite a ride.

Pye: Much more than a “once in a lifetime” horse

Brent MacGrath is my business partner, in a number of businesses, mostly automobile dealerships. He is also my best friend. We have worked together now for 27 years. During most of that time, we have owned horses together. It was really a lifelong hobby of Brent's.

There were always a number of partners, usually six or less. Brent brought an expertise to the barn that showed he had a firm understanding of the sport and an uncanny expertise about the qualities of these animals. I was an owner with Brent on 10 horses before he went to Lexington and bought Beach.

I had the opportunity to visit daily with each of our horses. Brent not only trained them early every morning, he fed them at noon and in the evening. This wasn't an investment, where someone else did all the work. Brent was working two jobs, and one of his job trainees was Somebeachsomewhere.

It's easy to look back and marvel at how healthy, and how friendly, and how frisky, and how handsome Beach was. He looked good, he trained well and never seemed to get sick.

Then there were the races.

Somebeachsomewhere was much more than a once in a lifetime horse. Once in a lifetime might mean winning one of the many world class races that he won. This unbelievable horse, as a two and three-year-old, showed us all he was going to win and do it with conviction every time. This – in the judgement of those more expert than me – perhaps best of all time horse, won 21 of 22, a near mathematical impossibility.

He was still more like a friend, perhaps like a favorite family dog, when he interacted with you in the barn. He loved to eat carrots and apples out of your hand, more like a pet than a world class athlete. Brent's wife Rhonda spent

hours and days as a groom and friend to Beach. How much did the personal relationship that Beach had with both Brent and his wife Rhonda affect his career? We'll never know, but in my mind it was a significant factor.

It is difficult for us, as both owners of, and friends to the horse, to comprehend that his time is now over. A hell of a story, much more than once in a lifetime.

were able to stay so close. But that's not what I remember most about the race. It's not what I remember most about that marvelous horse, who brought together two nations and bridged the eternal divide that exists in our industry between the big hitters and the little guys.

What I remember most was the shuttle ride from the track to the paddock immediately afterward. We were there, alone on the shuttle going back to see Linda (Toscano) and our colt, and the only other person on the bus was Paul MacDonell, who of course drove Somebeachsomewhere that night, drove him every night. Poor Paul. He looked as though he had just come from a funeral. Despondent, almost in shock about that memorable drive, no doubt kicking himself on the inside for the way it unfolded, he nonetheless was polite and courteous when I offered my condolences and praised his horse.

I think about that all the time, whenever the sport we all love gets me down. Whenever it feels like the bad guys are winning and the good guys are losing. It was probably the first time in a countless succession of similar encounters from July 2008 onward where that poor man had to accept condolences on that race and congratulations on that horse. Where he had to smile when his heart was breaking. But in that moment the man mirrored the horse; no excuses, all heart, all grace. A class act. An honor to his craft and the sport.

Paul knows that he will never sit behind another horse like Somebeachsomewhere and that their lives are forever linked. And now that the great horse is gone, gone too soon, gone in a way none of us should ever go, it falls to Paul, and to the other connections, to keep the horse's legacy alive, much in the way that Penny Chenery kept alive the legacy of Secretariat, the way Ronnie Turcotte still does. BREAKING STRIDE

The King and I

A possible solution for tackling the beards.

Our neighbors on Redbud Street were a family named Tuttle. Five weeks after I popped out of my mother's womb, Mr. and Mrs. Tuttle welcomed their first son. For some bizarre reason, they named him Kingston. Thus, beginning in junior high school, my boyhood pal was stuck with the nickname, King Tut. Adding to this farce, Tut grew to be short, fleshy and male-pattern baldness arrived with puberty. These circumstances may have contributed to his somewhat belligerent nature.

After college, Tut moved to New York City, happily married and had a son named Ricky (there would be no King Tut II). My pal made a pot of money trading in derivatives, gravitated to the cult of Fox News where he sees conspiracy theories around every corner, and lives a responsible life. In every instance, he is my polar opposite – except for our affliction with harness horse racing.

Even in harness racing, we remained opposites. He races out east, owns several horses, prefers aged pacers and races on a bigger stage. Despite our differences, we keep in touch with monthly phone calls, mostly about harness racing. Our conversation last night was a rant. I will remove the profanity in order to condense the report by approximately eighty per cent.

*"I'm telling ya Trey, the end is near because the...
a rap sheet one place, a star in another...
107 dings on a record, oh never mind...
lawyers, money, intimidation...
more beards than a ZZ Top concert...
the takeout is so high you could bet **after** the race is finished
and lose money..."*

Usually, I can talk Tut off the ledge with political humor, trivia, or reminiscing about our days of Dungeons and Dragons. Maybe I am wrong, but this time Tut's rant felt different, this time he seemed serious.

In Tut's harness racing world, racehorses change hands frequently. He may appear to be a difficult owner, but he is a fair owner. He refuses to go to trainers who he believes are tainted. This has cost him money, how much is hard to say,



but it rankles. He had a few horses he raced in Sires Stakes purchased by questionable connections that instantly improved. Those magic few seconds of improvement really irritate Tut.

Once again, we are opposites. We both love the game, but we live in alien worlds.

I race in the Midwest, one or two each year, and rarely in overnights. My competitors are for the most part familiar names, both owners and trainers. The only beards to my knowledge are Amish. With only three trainers in my 15 seasons, each worked hard, spoke plainly and took great care with their small stables of horses. These trainers had decades of experience and knowledge under their belts. A vet bill is a rare occurrence. They train using hay, oats and water with spotless records after thousands of tests. A horse getting a bad test result under their care never crosses my mind. Two of the three trainers are scuffling for horses to train. This does not seem right.

Tut's world seems to be crumbling. The "beard thing" that can mask the "drug thing" understandably riles the King Tuts in the sport. Controlling who ultimately controls a racehorse beneath layers of deniability would appear to be a supremely frustrating task for regulators. Some of us have had relatives who live in our attic arrested for fencing stolen goods and never had a clue (rest easy Uncle Donnie; I will not use your name).

After our troubling phone call and thinking about Tut's alarming racing report, I came up with an idea. Let me toss it out to you.

Instead of playing whack-a-shady-mole, what if we rewarded a band of solid foot soldiers. Let some struggling trainers that need work, good folks who do a completely honest job, get some extra work.

Let us suppose an owner sends a horse to a trainer who wins at a breathtakingly high percentage, but one day this

owner is shocked, absolutely shocked and gob smacked to learn the horse gets a bad test result.

There is a new rule. In addition to punishment of the miscreant trainer, the violation also goes on the poor racehorse. The tainted horse receives a scarlet letter and banishment for a year. Do not hyperventilate and speed dial legal counsel muttering “freedom of choice” and “due process.”

In this forward thinking program, with a new plan and hopefully emboldened sheriffs, the shocked owner DOES have choices. The banished horse CAN continue to race. The sport would LOVE to keep you racing, sport will HELP to keep you and your horse racing, and the sport may well cut your

expenses - under one condition; training of this horse must go to your choice of a “Approved & Licensed Probation Trainer.” This is a menu of folks who are squeaky clean, less expensive and will be happy to race your horse.

If you are lucky, a trainer like one of the trainers who have crossed my path will be on the list. You might not make as much money, but racing will be more fun, you will not need to worry about a shocking test result – and King Tut might hang around.

Snowshoe series underway at Woodbine

Winter Series action continued Friday night at Woodbine Racetrack with four divisions of the Snowshoe Series for three and four-year-old pacers.

A total of 32 pacers competed over four \$17,000 divisions for the first leg of the three-week series.

Abbeydorney and driver James MacDonald captured the first division at odds of 9-2.

Trained by Scott Friend, Abbeydorney was hustled from an outside starting spot and would settle into the early two-hole behind My Teen Idol, who posted a :27.1 opener.

Lyons William, the 4-5 favourite, made a second-quarter move from third to first and led the field through middle-half panels of :56.2 and 1:25.1. However, Lyons William would hit a wall at the head of the lane and My Teen Idol was able to pop the pocket and grab the lead.

The lead would be short-lived for My Teen Idol, as MacDonald was able to squeeze through a tight spot and provide Abbeydorney with clear room to surge by and score a four-length victory.

My Teen Idol crossed the finish line second, while Fitbid Luck crossed third and Lyons William fourth.

The final results for the opening division would see several changes following a pair of reviews by the AGCO Judges.

My Teen Idol was deemed to have broken equipment before the start and therefore was a full pari-mutuel refund. The connections of the three-year-old pacer still receive the purse money for finishing second.

Meanwhile, race-favourite Lyons William went inside several pylons in the stretch and was disqualified from

fourth to seventh.

Race-winner Abbeydorney is now one for three in 2018 to follow up a three-year-old season that saw him win three of 22 starts. The four-year-old gelded son of Rock N Roll Heaven—Lisbella has now banked \$44,272 for owners Aaron Waxman and Alan Alber.

Abbeydorney paid \$10.50 to win.

The second division featured an intriguing matchup between Jack Darling trained three-year-old Burn Out Hanover, who was seeking a fourth straight win, and Dean Nixon trained four-year-old Artofficial Flavor, who holds a mark of 1:51.4 and a victory over tougher competition.

Friday's division went to the three-year-old, as Burn Out Hanover went coast to coast at odds of 9-5.

Driven by Jody Jamieson, Burn Out Hanover left from the outside and was able to secure the lead ahead of even-money favourite Artofficial Flavor and posted an

opening-quarter of :27.2.

The top-two choices would sit one-two throughout the middle-half, where Jamieson was able to get sensible fractions of :57.4 and 1:27.4.

Burn Out Hanover began to create separation at three-quarters and never gave any rivals a chance en route to a length score in 1:56.2. Young Man Matt finished second, while Shagnwiththedragon was third.

Artofficial Flavor got poor-gaited early in the stretch and made a break, which caused him to finish fourth.

A gelded son of Well Said out of Burning Point, Burn Out Hanover capped off his rookie season with a pair of victories and has now matched those victories with two more in 2018. The sophomore pacer is now seven for 16 in his career and has banked \$63,810 for owner-trainer Darling.

Burn Out Hanover paid \$5.90 to win.

Tremendous Play and Mario Baillargeon were able to split rivals in the lane to take the third division at odds of 10-1.

Leaving from post-seven, Tremendous Play was put in play and paced to the early lead, while forcing Gillys Boy, the post-eight starter, to work hard to clear for the lead after a :27 opening-quarter.

The positions at the front went unchanged by the half in :55.3, before In Spades, the 2-5 favourite, began advancing first-up from fourth to draw up near Gillys Boy at three-quarters in 1:24.2.

In the stretch, Baillargeon tipped off the back of Gillys Boy and was able to split through that rival and new leader In Spades to bust through and win by a length. In Spades settled for second, while Casimir Quasimodo was third and Gillys Boy fourth.

A four-year-old gelded son of Shadow Play out of Tremendous, Tremendous Play is now one for three to start the new season after going two for 22 in 2017. The Ben Baillargeon trainee has three wins and \$84,295 in career earnings for owner Claude Gendreau Stb Inc.

Tremendous Play paid \$22.20 to win.

JK Pridenjoy wrapped up the Snowshoe first leg with a 1:55.3 victory as the 1-2 choice.

Driven by Doug McNair, JK Pridenjoy got away third, while Hurrikane Kingkong led narrowly over a parked Montys Play at the opening-quarter in :28.2.

Montys Play cleared to command, but handed it over in the second-quarter to a moving JK Pridenjoy. The public's top choice posted fractions of :57.3 and 1:27.2 before pacing home in :28.1 to win by half a length over Gerardo. Carolina

Magic was third, while Hurrikane Kingkong was fourth.

A four-year-old son of Rock N Roll Heaven—JK Pure Pearl, JK Pridenjoy arrived at Woodbine on short-rest after racing Monday at Yonkers. The Nick Surick trainee, who raced in last month's Valedictory Series, is now two for three in 2018 to improve off a one for eight three-year-old season.

Owned by Nick Surick Stable LLC and JL Benson Stables Inc, JK Pridenjoy has career numbers of four wins and \$46,167 earned. He paid \$3 to win Friday.

Three and four-year-old pacers, who were non-winners of \$30,000 lifetime as of October 31, 2017, were eligible for nomination to the Snowshoe Series.

Round two of the Snowshoe will take place next Friday (Jan. 26) with the final scheduled for Friday, Feb. 2.

Soho Tribeca gives owner/breeder Robert Watson his biggest win

A superbly judged front-running drive from Kim Prentice saw Soho Tribeca gain some consolation for losses in last month's Inter Dominion and last week's Fremantle Cup with victory in the \$450,000 WA Pacing Cup in Australia.

The race was robbed of some interest when the Mark Purdon trained duo of Lazarus and Ultimate Machete were scratched early in the week after they failed to recover from their hard runs in last week's Fremantle Cup.

Although drawn wide on the front-line in the 12 horse field, Soho Tribeca had his main rival Chicago Bull drawn on his outside and it was an advantage that Prentice took full advantage to move early to a position outside the early leader American Boy.

When driver Gary Hall Jr. made his move with Chicago Bull, Prentice forged to the lead and kept Chicago Bull parked for the remainder of the race.

After a couple of moderate sectionals Prentice let Soho Tribeca loose with 800 metres to travel and quarters in :27.5 and :27.9 saw him 8.2 metres clear of Chicago Bull and The Bucket List at the finish.

Soho Tribeca set a race-record rate of 1:56.9 for the 2,936 metres (1 ¾ miles).

Raced by his breeder Robert Watson Soho Tribeca, like last week's Fremantle Cup winner My Hard Copy, is a son of American Ideal and Friday night's win was the stallion's 19th in 50 starts and the \$288,000 first prize took his stakes to

\$882,609.

Watson is a sponsor of Gloucester Park through his company Perth Plasterboard Centre and breeds his horses from a property in Victoria where Soho Tribeca was foaled in 2012.

Soho Tribeca is the third of four foals of racing age that Watson has bred from the Art Major mare Pixel Perfect. All four foals have won in excess of \$100,000 and Watson has a current yearling full-brother to Soho Tribeca.

Watson has bred 294 Western Australian winners since they began racing in 2006 and Soho Tribeca's Cup win was his 99th winner at Gloucester Park and clearly his biggest success although Soho Tribeca had previously won a Golden Nugget Championship and Vicbred Super Series as a 4yo.

The win was Prentice's third WA Pacing Cup victory following the successes of Baltic Eagle in 2003 and Im Themightyquinn in 2011. While he trained Baltic Eagle he drove Im Themightyquinn for Gary Hall Snr.

That win in 2011 was the first of seven consecutive WA Pacing Cup wins as a trainer for Gary Hall Snr and somewhat ironically it was Prentice who brought the streak to an end.

Gary Hall Sr. has a record that will never be equalled in that he has trained 11 winners of the race that was first run in 1913 and been run every year since its inception just three years after the commencement of the sport in this city.

Equally ironic for Prentice is the fact that up until a month ago he trained Soho Tribeca however the horse was transferred to the stables of Bryan Cousins to avoid complications with Racing and Wagering WA Stewards who have opened an inquiry into a cobalt positive returned by another of Prentice's horses.

The stewards granted Prentice a stay of proceedings to drive pending completion of the inquiry.

A former star Australian Rules footballer, Cousins began training in 1991 after retiring from football had a winning double on Friday night lifted his tally of wins to 111 of which 47 have been at Gloucester Park.

His previous biggest win as a trainer came with Global Force in the 2004 WA Pacing Derby which was driven for him by WA Racing Industry Hall of Famer Fred Kersley.

Western Australia's all-time leading driver Chris Lewis had his 35th drive in a WA Cup on Friday night and while he didn't add to his tally of five wins in the race he did drive a winning double at the meeting to list his career tally to 5212 and Gloucester Park wins tally to 2694.

Soho Tribeca will join Lazarus and Ultimate Machete on a plane headed to Melbourne on Tuesday with Victorian

trainer Michael Stanley to take over the training for an Eastern States campaign.

Stanley's stable played host when Prentice took Soho Tribeca to Victoria for last season's Group One Vicbred Super Series races.

Integrity rule sews the seeds of sport's self-destruction

(Editor's note: The WEG/Big M integrity rule is currently being tweaked to address some of the concerns expressed in the following letter ([full story here](#)), but the opinion was still worth sharing. The new version of the rule was not available as of press time)

In a misguided effort to foster the integrity of harness racing, the promulgators of the WEG/Big M Rule ("Rule") have unwittingly, or otherwise, sown the seeds of the sport's self-destruction. No one should take issue with the goals pursued, but, rather, with the means proposed. While the Rule, presently, applies only to horses entered in stakes races, some are already advocating, in Harness Racing Update and elsewhere, that it should become applicable to "overnight racing." Such an expansion of the Rule would have dreadful consequences.

The Rule, which was seemingly advanced by track owners rather than by any racing commission, essentially abandons and replaces years of carefully crafted rules, procedures, and penalties imposed and enforced by the various racing commissions within their respective jurisdictions. In so doing, the track owners have ignored fundamental principles of fairness and due process, relying, in part, on the argument that they, unlike the racing commissions, are not subject to such hindrances. In their place, the track owners have advanced concepts akin to "zero tolerance" and "mandatory sentencing" — all without any appellate recourse available to the persons charged. Indeed, the Rule, on its face, is designed so as to punish innocent owners and trainers who have done absolutely nothing wrong — other than being subject to a classic case of guilt by association. Consider that owners and trainers can be severely affected by one positive against another owner or trainer as to which they had no role, forewarning, or notice. Owners would be barred from racing horses they own, and trainers would be barred from racing horses they train - even though they, themselves, are without culpability. Such draconian sanctions would likely result in innocent owners abandoning the business and innocent trainers searching for horses to train. The financial risks attendant to strict enforcement of the Rule would undoubtedly affect every aspect of our industry from breeders to grooms. Sale prices would drop and many jobs would be lost.

As a lawyer for almost 50 years, I have a deep appreciation that laws and regulations are generally adopted in a good faith

effort to foster the common good and effect justice. But there is no justice in a Rule that can effectively banish an entire stable from racing, or even being able to sell its racehorses for reasonable value, because one horse, from one trainer, on one occasion, had one positive that ran afoul of the Rule. How was the stable owner supposed to protect himself if the offending trainer had no prior positives? Why should the non-offending trainers no longer be able to race that owner's horses?

My son Josh and I presently own and race approximately 20 horses, employing the services of five different trainers. This allows us to race our horses at most of the Northeast tracks. We have also employed the services of many other trainers during the past 25 years. While the vast majority of our horses race in overnights, hope springs eternal that stakes races remain a possibility, and without a doubt, if the Rule were ever to be applied to overnights, we would inevitably — through no fault of our own — be put out of business! Likewise, our innocent trainers would suffer the loss of our horses to race. Again, the Rule requires mandatory sentencing combined with "zero tolerance" in situations where the owners and trainers did nothing wrong. This resembles application of Sharia Law and is violative of any semblance of fairness or due process.

Let us not throw out "the baby with the bathwater." Progress is being made in enforcement by both tracks and racing commissions. However, it is vital that violators and positives be penalized on an individual basis, taking into account any prior wrongdoing and all the attendant circumstances. Only then will "the punishment fit the crime." Let not our zeal to clean up our industry divert our attention from the many owners and trainers who play by the rules. Finally, let us not unintentionally or otherwise destroy the sport that we all love.

Because of these reasons, I propose that a large monetary fine instead of suspension is the best way to slow down the fraud. In fact, don't suspend them at all, providing they pay their fine. First offense should cost the trainer and owner 25K each. Until BOTH fines are paid, neither can race. Each additional infraction is doubled. And since horses didn't volunteer for this type of abuse, a major portion of collected fines should be put into an account that helps with the cost of life after racing for these great animals.
