



# Hambletonian OCICIO preparing now for the day HISA may be adopted by harness racing

The contentious body now governing thoroughbred racing in the United States may one day be adopted by harness racing and John Campbell wants the Society to be well prepared if that happens.

John Campbell knows the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority has been contentious. So, he stressed off the top that *should* it be adopted by the harness racing industry it likely won't happen for at least two years — and likely longer.

Still, the CEO of the Hambletonian Society said work is underway now at the Society to prepare for HISA *if* it comes to the standardbred industry.

"I think as long as HISA continues and is not struck down, I think eventually the other breeds – quarter horse and standardbreds will be incorporated under HISA," Campbell said. "If you look at the track and safety regs for the thoroughbreds now, it just does not make any sense... It's strictly for thoroughbreds and it would not have any place in standardbred racing.

"So, what the Society is doing, we've put together five committees: one of veterinarians, a track, a shoeing, a drivers' committee and a trainers' committee. A couple of them have met already and started the dialogue and discussing how to move forward,



and what we want to do is to come up with a document that is standardbred-centric that HISA could look at and say, 'Yes, this would work for standardbreds' and it would work for our industry moving forward."

Campbell said it's all about being prepared if HISA does get adopted in harness racing.

"If it doesn't come, we'll have wasted some time, some good people's time, but that will be it," he said. "If it does come, then there will be a document that we'll be able to incorporate into the standardbred industry.

"I want to stress that it's not a referendum on HISA, these committees, because we have USTA directors on it and we have a number of people who are not in favor of HISA at all, but they realize that we should be prepared should HISA become the regulator and governor of standardbred racing.

Campbell said the committees were first formed last fall.

One of the most contentious parts of HISA has been the medication rules. Campbell said the Hambletonian Society committees are not looking at HISA's medication rules at this time. Their focus is on other HISA rules.

"There are two separate documents for the thoroughbreds," Campbell said. "There's the track and safety document – that's the one we're going to work on from the Society standpoint.

"I don't think the changes [for standardbreds] will be that dramatic... in the track and safety regs as part of a HISA document. Obviously, breakdowns are the focal point of the track and safety regs for thoroughbreds. It's not that we don't

have any breakdowns, but our breakdowns are a fraction of what the thoroughbreds are. So, a lot of this is really just incorporating the best policies that racetracks and commissions have in play now and incorporating them into one document."

At this point, the Hambletonian Society isn't looking at HISA fees, either.

"That's not our role at this point," he said. "I think, obviously, HISA is very expensive, there's no question about that. However, Lisa Lazarus did allude to looking into alternative funding at the symposium in Arizona this past December and hopefully there will be something that comes out of that because I know it's going to be a burden with a number of thoroughbred tracks in order to support HISA. So, hopefully they can come up with some funding that will lessen that."

While it's important to prepare and get the standardbred rules right should HISA be adopted, Campbell said HISA has made many

adjustments as it has been adopted by the thoroughbred industry. So, he doesn't expect the people that run it to be inflexible.

"If you follow HISA, they are making changes constantly, both to the track and safety regs and the medication part of it," he said. "So, hopefully, the burden will be lessened and there will be more clarity to the funding by the time they get to us."

For now, the Hambletonian Society is, "just making sure we get this document done. Time is on our side, as of right now, but, as you know, time runs down pretty quickly. Though, again, I don't see the standardbreds being under HISA inside of two years and likely closer to three."

Coach Stefanos was recognized as Pacer of the Year in the Hoosier State, while Ponda Title was named Trotter of the Year. The event was sponsored by the Indiana Standardbred

Association, Standardbred Advisory Board and Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

Coach Stefanos ranked as one of the top sophomore pacing colts in the Indiana Sires Stakes program. The Tellitlikeitis—Watch N Be Watched gelding won four legs and finished a close second in the \$250,000 Super Final for the ownership group of Ken Duffy, John Stefanos and D & M Trading II LLC. Coach Stefanos finished on the board in 15 of 17 3-year-old starts with nine wins to his credit. Conditioned by Erv Miller and steered by Trace Tetrick, the pacer also added open stakes wins, capturing the \$190,000 Monument Circle and scoring a Breeders Crown elimination. The Victory Hill Farm-bred gelding finished the season with \$565,865 in earnings.

Ponda Title enjoyed an exceptional freshman campaign for her connections. The Muscle Massive—Elin filly never missed the board in 2023, registering seven wins in 11 attempts for owners Connie Hochstetler, Robert Buddig and Allen Schwartz. The 2-year-old scored four Indiana Sires Stakes legs for trainer Jay Hochstetler before adding the \$250,000 Super Final. Kyle Wilfong served as Ponda Title's regular pilot, also guiding her to runner-up finishes in the Jim Doherty and Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stake. Bred by Pond-A-Acres, Ponda Title banked \$483,420 in her first season. She is the first freshman to be named Trotter of the Year in Indiana since Fiftydallarbill earned the award following the 2017 campaign.

The success of Coach Stefanos trickled down through some of the night's other awards. Victory Hill Farm was recognized as Large Breeder of the Year for the ninth consecutive year. The LaGrange, Indiana-based nursery has received the award in 13 of the last 16 years. Coach Stefanos, Super Final winner Tell's On A Roll and Little Rocket Man were just some of the horses bred by Victory Hill that produced notable seasons. A group of 44 Indiana-sired starters earned nearly \$2.3 million racing on the fair circuit and at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Nationally, they accumulated just under \$2.9 million in purse earnings.

Stallions standing at Victory Hill swept the awards for the state's top sires. Tellitlikeitis was tabbed as Pacing Sire of the Year and stalwart Swan For All was again recognized as Trotting Sire of the Year. Tellitlikeitis was represented by 179 starters in 2023, with 121 reaching the winner's circle. His top offspring included Coach Stefanos, Tell's On A Roll and freshman Super Final winner Tellmeitmatters. The progeny of Tellitlikeitis combined to earn more than \$5 million last year, securing the sire's first award.

Swan For All, by contrast, collected his seventh-straight award as the state's leading trotting sires. Of his 198 starters, 142 combined to collect more than 400 wins in 2023 while raking in over \$6.2 million in earnings, His top offspring included millionaire and Hambletonian Maturity winner M-M's Dream, and sires stakes stars Swanya, Talent Scout and Skyway Paige, a filly that earned over \$200,000 in her first season.

The father-son team of Bo and Pat DeLong were named Small Breeder of the Year for 2023. Their pair of freshmen Indianasired homebreds were among the best in the 2-year-old pacing divisions. Filly Teelatini scored five sires stakes leg wins and

banked over \$270,000. Colt Tellmeitmatters picked up an Indiana Sires Stakes leg and triumphed in the \$250,000 Super Final at Harrah's Hoosier Park as the third choice in the contest.

Trace Tetrick was awarded Pari-Mutuel Driver of the Year after another successful title defense at Harrah's Hoosier Park. On the strength of 368 victories and more than \$4.8 million in earnings at the Anderson oval, he earned the award for the  $10^{th}$ -consecutive season. He was the regular pilot of Coach Stefanos, Rollin Rosie and freshman All Jk among others.

Tyler George secured his fourth consecutive Harrah's Hoosier Park training title, earning him a fourth-straight Pari-Mutuel Trainer of the Year award. George led all conditioners with 108 victories. He also finished the season with \$1.6 million in purses. Super Final winner Tell's On A Roll is a filly he trains and also partially owns.

Doug Rideout swept top honors for Fair Circuit Driver of the Year and Trainer of the Year for the third straight season. In 2023 he guided 54 winners over the course of the summer and conditioned 53 winners, enjoying double-digit margins in both categories. He sent out two Governor's Cup Championship winners in Fly Delta and Woodside Hank, the first he also steered to victory at the Indiana State Fairgrounds.

# In winter void, Swedish racing is an attractive alternative

An already light January harness racing calendar has been further trimmed over these past couple of weeks with continual cancellations related to winter weather. Going back over the last full week, there hasn't been a day without at least one track canceling. From Tuesday earlier this week as an example, with the cancellation of racing at Monticello, there wasn't a single thoroughbred or harness racetrack conducting live racing until Miami Valley went post-ward later that afternoon at 4:00 p.m.

While harness racing here in North America has had a limited number of racing days over that time, racing in Europe, and Sweden in particular, has been evidently undeterred by the wintry conditions. And in this day and age of international simulcasting, harness racing from Sweden can be viewed and wagered on from the early morning hours to well into the afternoon, during times when early afternoon U.S. tracks have been forced to cancel.

For those less familiar, there is much that racing from Sweden offers and, in many ways, I'd argue is quite superior to that of racing here. All the things such as complete fields, a competitive style of racing and large pools can be seen race in and race out throughout that country with routine. Take the action-packed racing style here in the U.S. at Northfield Park. If you were to expand that same style to a larger size track with a couple more horses and make the races a longer distance, that's how I'd describe racing in Sweden.

The most well-known track in that country is Solvalla Racetrack, home of Elitloppet. After that, the next best-known track may be Jägersro Racetrack. Jägersro had a card on Tuesday when most North American tracks canceled, and the very first race that day exemplified Swedish racing.

In that race, a field of 10 went to post at a distance of 2,140 meters, which equates to a little more than a mile and a quarter.

With the track configuration, horses were let go at where the finish line is, with the trip consisting of two full circuits. Right from the start, there was a three-wide skirmish for the lead and already with the first quarter of the race complete, there were five horses on the inside and five horses in a fully formed and moving outer flow.

One of the key differences in styles of racing internationally compared to here is how horses race first-over. Horses in Sweden and elsewhere have an amazing ability to race parked uncovered for almost an entire duration of the race and still have a chance. In that first race from Jägersro, the horse that was first-over, or in the death-seat, as it's called there, was parked the mile while racing outside the leader on the inside. Going around the final turn with 500 meters to go, the parked horse was able to further assert himself and put away his foe to the inside, and only lost in the stretch to the race favorite. In another contrast to domestic racing where racing is dominated on the frontend, it was the favorite — who was parked last and 10th on the outside — who ended up making up massive amounts of late ground to surge for the win.

Part of the competitive nature of the race comes from an actual enforcement of the rules, something that here in North America judges aren't always keen to uphold. On the topic of changing positions and giving advance, Swedishhorseracing. com states "A driver may not intentionally change position to help another horse improve its position or by any other means give an advantage to another horse and driver."

help another horse improve its position or by any other means give an advantage to another horse and driver."

All put together, it simply makes for an engaging product. In addition to how the races are run, the horsemen are top notch. Bjorn Goop, Ulf Ohlsson and Örjan Kihlström have made winning appearances in major races the U.S. through the years and are arguably just as good as any other drivers worldwide. Everything else related to the European product storylines are documented brilliantly here in Harness Racing Update by Thomas Hedlund, and it's easy to quickly discover who the leading players at each track are.

Another interesting aspect of the racing is the program. Like most other forms of international racing, past performances don't track a horse at every pole call, but it does provide all other information, including a feature that captures odds movement. For any horse, you can go back to all the recent races and see not only that horse's final odds, but what specifically was the odds trend at five different intervals that go through post-time and official time. This way, one could easily track and identify which horses in a given race took early money, took late money, took sudden action or drifted noticeably in price throughout the wagering process.

Whether it be Jägersro, Solvalla, or any other trotting track that ran this week such as Axevalla, Aby and a slew of others, they all offer multi-leg wagers that offer the potential to win tens or hundreds of thousands of dollars, and in rare cases even millions of dollars. For those who may only watch racing from Sweden once or twice a year for Elitloppet and maybe a couple of other major races, there's certainly plenty of reasons to pay attention throughout the year. Especially from here in North America when race days are harder to come by.

#### A couple of questions, including who's the early **2024 HOY fave**




Karl has to be the early 2024 Horse of the Year choice. Any way you slice it, the now 3-year-old son of Tactical Landing not only won his division and was a scant nose from being unblemished, he did it so easily. Yes, memories of Muscle Hill have come to mind, and remember that the 2008 2YOTC of the Year had one blemish also, a photo (by a neck in his debut), and he ran the table in 12 amazing efforts in 2009 to easily take down HOY honors. Oh, and he's the grandsire of Karl.

Seven times the 2YOTC of his year then followed up with a 3YO HOY season. Scott Frost in 1954-55 did it first, then Speedy Scot in 1962-63 and Nevele Pride in 1967-68. All three won the Triple Crown. There was a gap then of a couple of decades until Mack Lobell in 1986-87 who dominated at 2, 3, and 4 and was a two-time HOY, much like Scott Frost and Nevele Pride had a HOY hat trick. Then there was another gap to Malabar Man in 1996-97, then another decade to Donato Hanover in 2006 taking his momentum into 2007 with 19 straight and a Hambletonian blowout. Muscle Hill is the last to do both, so it'll be a 15-year gap if Karl can go out and make it eight in 2024.

Karl would also take us back to the 1950s if he does capture the Hambletonian. It would mean Tactical Landing would have Hambletonian credits in his first two crops, not done since 1957-58 when Stars Pride won it back-to-back with Emily's Pride and then Diller Hanover. Maybe Tactical Landing can dream big, and be another Stars Pride who was the only sire to go back-to-back-to-back.

T C I is from the 16th crop of the late Cantab Hall, the 2004 Hambletonian runner up. He has not yet won the Hambletonian as a stud, but three times hit the board. Mets Hall was second in 2018 for Team Miller, My MVP was third in 2012 and 2009 saw Explosive Matter second best to Muscle Hill's record 1:50.1.

#### WHO REMEMBERS THE PRESIDENTIAL SERIES?

A January staple at The Meadowlands. It had a 1978 official start-up as a series, although the year prior, Tarport Hap beat the boys in a race named The Presidential. It was the free-for-all go-to event of the winter. Tune Town, Red Bow Tie, Falcon Seelster, all had great moments in the series.

That first year saw Buddy Gilmour and Senor Skipper take it. As a matter of fact, Gilmour and Lew Williams split the first four editions. Genghis Khan set the record for wins in a single Meadowlands' meet in 1982 at 16, but the Presidential was not one of them, because he finished second to the stubborn Rusty Abbot. John Campbell got his first for 1984 leading trainer Fred Grant with Boomer Drummond.

#### **NUMBERS/QUESTIONS**

Brett Pelling or is that Brett "Hanover" Pelling? Maybe it should be after his success with both Papi Rob Hanover and HOY/HOY sire Rocknroll Hanover.

Trace Tetrick had 530 wins and big brother Tim had 529 wins to end the 2023 season. The slight second choice for Trace with

Coach Stefanos (sixth) in the Breeders Crown won by Confederate made for the brothers to be 1-2 in the same Breeders Crown race in the wagering. Remember too that Trace started Confederate's career with a third at Hoosier Park in July 2022 and Tim took it from there. The last time that a HOY started and ended their career with the same last name of a driver but two different ones? Don and Clint Galbraith with Niatross in 1979 and 1980. Don is Clint's godson.

Do you still not want post 10 in the Hambletonian or Oaks? It won both in 2023 as well as the Oaks in 2022.

Raging Glory for his was 20 4-3-3 \$54,963. Head-scratcher time. How did this son of Big Towner sire a winner of \$2,673,920; Red Bow Tie?

In 1984, four decades ago, there was a fire in May at Freehold, that necessitated a group of tents be placed in order to resume racing a couple of months later. It was referred to as "Joe Lynch Park."

Who were the last trotter and pacer to hold the all-time marks without competing as a freshman?

On the trotting side it was Pine Chip at 4 in 1994. He time trialed in 1:51 flat and was a repeat winner of Trotter of the Year.

The first million-dollar event? It was the 1980 Meadowlands Pace at \$1,011,000 and the runner up to Niatross was Storm Damage, who lived three more decades plus five months, passing at 33 in Dec. 2010. He also out-earned race-winner Niatross, who died on June 7, 1999, \$58-57 million as a stallion.

Their two sons wound up with history's first two sub 1:50 race miles, Nihilator (Niatross) and Call For Rain (Storm Damage).

#### FIRST HALF DOZEN SIX-FIGURE CLAIMS IN HARNESS HISTORY

All made at The Meadowlands in the period between 1979 and 1982. Ernie Spruce reached three times, Thomas Fay twice, and Charles Rocco once. All for \$100,000 exactly.

March 16, 1979 — Taurus Romeo went first. (None in 1980 and then five in the ensuing couple of seasons).

• March 14, 1981 – Sure Show (Fay)

- March 28, 1981 Rex Hanover (Rocco)
- May 23, 1981 Southern Sam (Spruce)
- Jan. 30, 1982 Meadow Norm (Spruce)
- Aug. 7, 1982 Pumping Iron (Spruce)

Later, in the 1980s, Ramblin Storm was taken twice for six figures, the first horse ever to do so.

#### **40 YEARS AGO, FAIR ENOUGH**

In 1984, 1,746 horses remained eligible for NJSS Fair Races.

The year before, the number was 1,562.

# The Diary of Bridgette M., Part 2

#### **MONDAY**

Here is more about the first and second days on the farm, or technically at the horse training center. We work on Saturday, but not Sunday. So far, it's interesting. The groom that mentors me, Rhonda, is about 45, rocks a backward ball cap, and is as wiry as a greyhound. So far, she is okay, and I have not felt the need to be a smart-assed skank yet, but give me time.

Half of the people call her Rhonda, and the other half call her Ronnie. I have not called her anything and have barely opened my mouth, which is probably good news for all concerned. She does not talk all that much, which I like. She explains things calmly and slowly, like I'm a kindergartener. Which, in horse terms, I am. The only horses I ever met were wooden ponies on a ride in the Kmart parking lot on Fairmont Road with my stepfather when I was about 8. These horses are enormous, have big bug eyes, and scare the crap out of me, and I have seen some bad shit, including a bad car crash, a knife at my throat, and two people OD and die.

I do not know anything about the racing part. So far, my education consists of picking up manure and dirty sawdust from the floor of an empty stall while a chained-up horse watches me. Next, I wheel the waste to a trailer and dump the manure. Then I roll the wheelbarrow over to another pile of clean sawdust, refill it, and then roll that back into the stall, tossing it on the floor and smoothing it out on the floor. My other specialty is filling yellow buckets with clean water and hanging the bucket inside the stall.

So far, I have yet to touch a horse, which is probably lucky for all concerned.

My mother always says, "My Bridgette doesn't like much." Well, Mom, you will be glad to hear that this work, the smells, the exercise, and the time to think are not bad. How long this will last, how much I will enjoy working with the horses, or how long I will survive without, you know, is to be determined.

#### **TUESDAY**

Alice ran away.

She was one of the four in our horse rehab group, a heavyset girl, about 20, with straw-colored hair, a nose piercing, and a permanent pout. I don't think she said 10 words to me on the van drives back and forth to the horse farm.

This morning, she was not outside waiting for the van. Somehow, in the night, she slipped out. They might have her on one of the cameras, but I doubt they will look for her. Alice may have scored already. It's weird, but my mind keeps wondering about two things.

Does Alice's family get a rebate when the patient runs away? Will Alice's bolting cancel the horse mentorship program?

So far, today, the van took me and the other two girls to the farm. We worked with our mentor grooms as usual. I am crossing my fingers that they don't pull the plug on the program.

My jangles are not as bad today. I have hours when the demons go to sleep.

#### WEDNESDAY

Today, Rhonda showed me how to clean the equipment they put on these horses. They call this leather and plastic, tack, like the word thumbtack. I wonder why? As we cleaned, I asked her how much she made last year. I thought she was joking when she said \$60,000, \$70,000. I figured these grooms made fast food money. Wrong.

She told me that good grooms are in high demand. She could work in plenty of places but works here because she likes her trainer, and he pays a bonus if one of the horses she is responsible for makes money on the racetrack. Is this BS? Rhonda doesn't seem like someone who blows smoke, so this is probably legit. Interesting.

#### **THURSDAY**

After I learned about Rhonda making serious money as a groom, I wondered about MY payment as her apprentice. Rhonda said she didn't know anything about that. So, when we returned to the rehab place, after my pee test, I walked into the office

around four in the afternoon and asked to see the Director. I met Richard Fleck, a tall, middle-aged guy with glasses wearing a sweater vest.

He said that the admitting staff discussed off-campus programs with my mother and me, but at the time, I was unreceptive. I did not ask him to clear up if he meant I was stoned or manic. Then he said that our outpatient programs don't require the patient to pay anything additional and that every off-site transitional work program is different. The horse farm program is new but is a good deal for the patient. Each day you work, the farm donates \$10, and Second Chance donates \$10. There is a liability waiver. Your money goes into an account. Twenty dollars is not much, but it is YOUR money, no strings. He said I could use some of the money to repay my mom.

That sounds like a good idea, but most of my ideas end up in my arm.

#### **FRIDAY**

The rules of in-patient rehab are standard. Classification means a lot. The lower the number, the fewer restrictions we have. If the druggie is level 5, you are probably in a hospital with locked doors and monitored 24/7. If you get classified as 1, you may as well be at the Beverly Hills Wilshire Hotel. I squeaked in at level 3. The five rules everybody understands are:

No leaving the rehab center without permission No visitors

No cell phones or computers

No violence or weapons

No drugs or alcohol

I could run the table before lunch, but I have toed the line for two weeks. The worst rule for many of us is no phones or computers. I swear, our device addiction is as strong as our drug addiction. When I lose my phone, I feel like I lose my right arm.

The isolation from electronic devices is intentional, so patients do not see triggers; people or events that start cravings. Even television gets monitored. The Netflix series Seaside Hotel was on a list of preapproved viewing. The series is set in the 1920s and is as triggering as Mr. Rogers taking a nap. Then I needed a staff member to boot it up; I had no control, no channel changing, and all I could do was watch. Then, a signup sheet for time. It is a hassle, so hardly anyone bothers.

So basically, in the facility, I climb the walls, bored out of my skull, which gives me time to write this stupid diary. While I have the time, I'm checking out some chapters of the *Care and Training of Trotters and Pacers* book. The fat book is not what you would classify as a bodice ripper, but some stuff makes a little more sense every day I am around the horses.

#### Woodbine releases schedule for 2024 standardbred stakes season

Woodbine Entertainment today released the schedule for its lucrative 2024 standardbred stakes season at Woodbine Mohawk Park, featuring three \$1 million races for the first-time since 2012.

The Pepsi North America Cup (June 15), Mohawk Million (Sept. 21) and Metro Pace (Sept. 21) will all be contested for a guaranteed purse of \$1 million, headlining a stakes season with more than \$12 million in Grand Circuit stakes.

The 41st Pepsi North America Cup for 3-year-old pacers will take place on Saturday (June 15). The \$2.2 million-plus all-star program will again include the \$420,000 Fan Hanover (3-year-old pacing fillies), \$305,000 Roses Are Red (pacing mares), \$210,000 Armbro Flight (trotting mares), \$250,000 Goodtimes (3-year-old trotters) and \$100,000 Mohawk Gold Cup Invitational.


The Mohawk Million for 2-year-old trotters and Metro Pace for 2-year-old pacers will be the million-dollar main events on Saturday (Sept. 21). The \$3.5 million-plus card will be Canada's richest night of racing in 2024, with the \$660,000 Canadian Trotting Classic (3-year-old trotters), \$540,000 Shes A Great Lady (2-year-old pacing fillies) and \$375,000 Elegantimage (3-year-old trotting fillies) part of the evening.

Mid-August through September remains the heart of the Grand Circuit action in 2024.

The \$620,000 William Wellwood Memorial (2-year-old trotters) and \$425,000 Peaceful Way (2-year-old trotting fillies) will be held on Saturday (Aug. 24).

The \$615,000 Canadian Pacing Derby (open pace) and \$530,000 Maple Leaf Trot (open trot) land on their usual spot on the Saturday (Aug. 31) of Labor Day weekend.

The Grand Circuit action in August and September again includes events such as the Champlain, Simcoe, Nassagaweya, Eternal Camnation, Casual Breeze and Milton.

So, you were expecting a big night?

"No," said Bartlett. "I really had no clue."

Until the races began, that is.

In addition, Bartlett's following didn't have to settle for short prices, as three of the Yonkers Raceway kingpin's winners went off at odds of 7-1 or more. During 2023, Bartlett won 500 races at the half-mile track in New York's Westchester County.

**The American Eagle** (a 5-year-old son of Trixton—D'Orsay) got things started for Bartlett by taking the third race, a low-end conditioned trot, in 1:56.2 for trainer Per Engblom at odds of 7-1 coming from last at three-quarters.

"He's kind of a weird horse," said Bartlett. "He's a little horse but doesn't get around [the half-mile track at] Yonkers too well. But he's got a lot of speed. I thought I could win from wherever, but getting away ninth wasn't ideal."

About 20 minutes later in the fourth dash, **Camlachie Chrome** (a 5-year-old gelded son of Sunshine Beach—Gotta Love Her) overcame a tough first-over journey to take a TrackMaster 74 pace in 1:55.2 for Cote Keim as the 9-5 favorite.

"I had to be a little bit careful with him," said Bartlett. "And he just kept on grinding."

Win No. 3 came in the sixth race with 11-1 chance **Got Sexy Scars** (a 5-year-old by Sportswriter—Jordan's Jewell) in a midrange conditioned pace for mares in 1:52.2 for Jared Cooper before Bartlett clicked again in the ninth with another Engblom student, **Phenom Seelster** (a 5-year-old by Sunshine Beach—Platinum Seelster), who scored at 8-1 in a low-end conditioned pace for mares in 1:53.1.

Race 11 saw Bartlett fans cash once more, as the pilot who finished 11th in The Big M standings a year ago with 30 victories, scored with 3-1 shot **Midnight Lightning** (a 12-year-old gelded son of Camluck—Twin B Intimate) in 1:54.1 in a low-end conditioned pace for Shaun Vallee.

"I've driven him and against him a million times," said Bartlett.
"The race set up well for him coming from off the pace."

Bartlett came close to rolling a lucky seven, missing a neck with Top Me Off in the eighth race and a head with Toccoa Falls in the 10th.

A LITTLE MORE: After winning four races last Friday (Jan. 12), Dave Miller won three more on the card. The Hall of Fame pilot now has eight victories over the last three programs. Engblom's two winners led the trainers. All-source handle totaled \$3,076,582 on the 14-race program, making it three \$3-million Fridays at The Big M in as many 2024 tries.
