The Super Bowl is the ultimate "Big Tent" but it got there by building a strong product

We hear a lot of talk in horse racing about influencers and marketing. But without a solid foundation, it's a train stuck at the station.

Super Bowl Sunday is upon us, and the business numbers we'll be looking at today are pretty astounding, especially considering Super Bowl I wasn't even a sell-out.

Here are a **few snippets**:

The game's impact on the Las Vegas economy will be over \$1.1 billion.

Ticket prices in the aftermarket are at an all-time high – averaging \$10,752.

The game is expected to draw over 115 million viewers – a record.

A 30-second ad in Super Bowl I was \$42,500, now it's \$7 million (or \$230,000 per second).

Advertising on the Las Vegas Sphere alone ranges from \$1 million to \$2 million for a 90-second spot.

About 112.2 million people plan to throw or attend a Super Bowl party.

Some \$23.1 billion is expected to be wagered on the big game today, with about 68 million people making some sort of bet, an increase of 35 per cent.

And I haven't even touched on all the other "big tent" marketing and reach, like a certain celebrity attending a game. Which, of course, will be accompanied with prop bets about how many times she will be shown on camera, or if there's a marriage proposal should the Chiefs win.

How did all this happen?

In my opinion, it took a whole lot of work on their core product – the game of football.

Back in the 1960s, revenue sharing created a parity, ensuring things were competitive. Today, there are 32 franchises competing with each other on sound, even terms. There are no 1-9 shots in the NFL.

Each year, rule changes were updated, fixing a problem that was anti-competitive. Scheduling, conference and division alignment, virtually everything to enhance the game was studied, examined, and if deemed appropriate, implemented.

If you look at the history of the National Football League for the last 60 years, it truly was (and is) all about "the product, stupid."

In our sport, it's no secret we have not worked nearly as hard on the product itself.

On-track, especially this winter at flagship tracks like The Meadowlands, the fields are pretty poor, the product not exciting or interesting; the classes, the horses, the drivers and the trainers simply aren't there.

To get people to bet the races, we've created a system where a computer-assisted wagering team can bet into super-low takeout, while the regular folk bang their heads against 20 per cent juice.

The rules, the judging, the competitiveness of racing have not been addressed in a measurable way. God bless John Campbell for trying, but it's nowhere near where it needs to be. And lowering takeout for all to make the product better that way; well, good luck with that.

In racing we often get giddy about marketing, or influencers, or people showing up with fancy hats drinking \$20 drinks. We've actually sunk lots of money over the years into these things.

But as the NFL has proven, without a core foundation of a sound product, they are probably fruitless. Taylor Swift showing up to a game, Usher performing at halftime, and boxes filled with celebrities trying to be seen aren't what drives the sport of football, it's a *result* of the sport of football being popular for decades.

Let's be clear, we all know racing will never be the NFL. That's impossible. But in my view, the sport could learn something from them: Put every dollar; every ounce of blood, sweat and tears into fixing the product.

In my view, anything else is putting the cart in front of the horse.

TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON

Hall of Famer Tom Crouch's expertise wasn't limited to standardbreds

A conversation with the founder of Kentuckiana Farms and the Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sale.

Tom Crouch was raised on a dairy farm in small town Indiana where, he said, "We were poor, but never hungry."

For as long as he can remember, he considered himself to be a livestock man, mostly relating to hogs, but also including cattle, chickens and horses.

"Above just about everything else one needs to have an eye for quality and a sense of value," Crouch said. "I always had a great eye for hogs, but speaking in generalities, if you know what you're looking at in one species of farm animal, it will generally extend to most."

At the age of 20, he was offered a chance to move to Chicago where he became a livestock analyst and a hog buyer for one of the largest companies where he was responsible for purchasing upwards of 135,000 hogs a year.

Young Crouch's reputation for quality buying and livestock breeding reached across the Atlantic to England where he was asked to consult with the leading hog breeders in the United Kingdom. That journey resulted in upwards of 60 per cent of the hog population in North America tracing to those hogs that Crouch was responsible for bringing to these shores in 1975.

By this time, the reader is probably wondering, since this is a periodical relating to harness racing, what do hogs have to do with it?

Actually, Crouch views hog breeding as his major means to becoming involved in his passion for harness racing.

"It was something that I think I was good at," he said. "It allowed me to earn enough to become involved in harness racing, initially as an owner and then as a breeder. I had a great passion for breeding quality, especially quality racehorses. Without passion in this life of ours you are doomed to mediocrity at best and the likelihood of failure."

How did your life in harness racing evolve?

"It goes back to my roots in rural Indiana. We'd go to all of the state fairs where we showed and sold our livestock. Almost all the fairs had harness racing. I watched it and became hooked. My wife Betty and I bought our first horse, Boutoniere, back in 1967. We raced her at the fairs. She won her last start at the Indiana State Fair in Indianapolis and we sold her to Normand Dauplaise at a good profit. I thought to myself, 'This is an easy business.' Little did I know.

"When we moved to Chicago, there were numerous people on the Mercantile Exchange who owned horses among them were Brian Monieson, Lloyd Arnold, Don Stevens, Craig Mahlstedt, Steve Newcom and George Segal. I've known a lot of wonderful people in my journey through life. Brian Monieson was one of the very best. He possessed just about all of the positive attributes that a man could have. He was brilliant, kind and was a whiz with numbers. He began as a tout sheet operator at Sportsman's Park. We became habitues of the Chicago tracks. I met Gene Riegle and Jim Dennis, two of the greatest horsemen I have been privileged to have known.

"The first top horse I was associated with was Try Scotch. I, together with Steve Newcom and Craig Mahlstedt, bought him

[thrill] would probably have been when Naughty But Nice won the Jugette driven by Tommy Haughton. from Jerry Snyder who was looking to cash him in to buy a new house. He was with Mike Zeller and doing very well. Mike had a deathly fear of flying and told me that Try Scotch was too good to stay where we were racing. He said that he wouldn't fly and we wouldn't do the horse justice by staying where he was. He suggested that we give him to Jim Dennis to train and drive.

"Jim, the great gentleman that he was, wouldn't take the horse unless it was cleared with Mike. Mike called Jim and told him that it was okay with him and wished him the best of luck with him. Try Scotch went on and won 47 races and \$956,770. With all the hundreds of horses I've been associated with I've never enjoyed one more than Try Scotch. Of course, we had many other pretty good ones after him."

Among your claims to fame is that you together with Bill Shehan started the Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sale. How did that evolve?

"Bill and I were selling our consignments at Tattersalls. I'm not about to say that all was rosy while we were there, but I will say that we were not terribly unhappy until we were blindsided by the powers that owned the sale. We were promised spots in the sale and then without any consultation, they were taken away from us. Not only that, but our commission was structured at a rate where we were paying almost double the going rate in commission to be treated as second class citizens. Bill called me and said that we should start our own sales company. I agreed and we held our first sale in 1978 selling around 120 high-quality yearlings. It went great and we were flooded with interest and entries for the next year's sale. Soon after, Armstrong Brothers came in both as a major consignor and part owner of the sales company. Dr. Glen Brown represented Armstrong on our board. I've never had a better partner than Dr. Brown proved to be.

"The powers that be at Tattersalls were upset. They were losing consignors. Fred Van Lennep said that he would tell consignors and buyers that if they did business with us, they wouldn't get stalls at Pompano Park. Our attorney responded, that if he did that, we would soon own Pompano Park and Castleton Farm. We didn't hear anything further."

What are some of the most monumental achievements or thrills in your life in harness racing?

"In terms of racing, the greatest would probably have been when Naughty But Nice won the Jugette driven by Tommy Haughton. In breeding, among a host of thrills would have been, together with Betty, building one of the great broodmare bands in

You've known many outstanding people in your long career in the sport. Tell us about a few.

"There have been so many. Gene Riegle, Carter Duer, Bill Haughton, George Sholty, Glen Garnsey, Jim Dennis, Delvin Miller and so many more. Of those, Gene was among the very best to ever look at and evaluate a yearling. He didn't need to look at one for long either. Another one that could really pick a yearling was Dr. Peter Boyce. Carter Duer has to be one of the greatest horsemen that ever lived. When he first left Castleton Farms, he came to work for me and helped me establish Kentuckiana Farms. The fact that he is not in the Hall of Fame does nothing, but in my opinion, cast shame on that institution."

What keeps you occupied these days?

"I still do some day-to-day trading, but only for my own account. I need to keep my mind occupied. I'm not in the best of health, but fortunately I'm still upright. I've had five back surgeries and two on my hips. We live year-round here in New Smyrna Beach, FL. I try to get to Spring Garden Ranch and the Pinske Training Center to watch the youngsters in training as often as this old body allows me to. I still have a strong interest in the sport and its people. That won't go until I do."

Is there anything else that you would care to speak of?

"We, and by we, I mean my wife Betty and me; Betty is an excellent horse person in her own right. We built Kentuckiana

Farms broodmare band into one of the greatest in all of harness racing. Bill Shehan had hit a bump in the road financially. He had opened a nightclub in Lexington that really strapped him for cash. He was over extended and had to sell his broodmares and his farm. We and George Segal bought the mares and George bought the farm. Those mares are the genesis of many of the great broodmares that were the foundation of the great broodmare bands at both Kentuckiana and Brittany Farms."

2024 Breeders Crown Foreign Stallion Nomination Form





Up to 15 North American Foals of 2025 by Foreign Stallions may be made eligible to the Breeders Crown with a payment by March 15, 2024 of a Foreign Stallion Nomination Fee equal to the amount of the North American advertised service fee for a 2024 breeding. (\$500 U.S. funds minimum)





Additionally, any foals that are foaled & registered in North America which are produced from mares bred outside of North America may also be made eligible by a payment of the advertised stud fee in the country where the stallion stands. This payment provides Breeders Crown eligibility for a North American crop of up to 15 foals.



If the Foreign Stallion's North American Crop is 15 foals or less, that payment is the total amount due for these North American foals to be eligible to make the 2026 Yearling payment and maintain eligibility by the future payments to the Breeders Crown. Any additional amount ("surcharge") or refund of this nomination fee will be determined by the number of 2025 foals ("North American Crop") by these stallions standing outside North America ("Foreign Stallions") and foaled and registered in North America (either with the U.S. Trotting Assoc. or Standardbred Canada) as of August 15, 2025. All foals which are nominated as yearlings must be registered in North America at the time of nomination.

A few facts about past Horse of the Year champs and some 2023 Dan Patch honorees

In early February, the talk is usually all about Horse of the Year and Dan Patch award winners, so let's join the discussion.

SOMEBEACHSOMEWHERE'S BEGINNINGS

Jean Louis Arsenault had the best vantage point in 2007 taking care of Somebeachsomewhere when he got started. He remembers those days quite well.

"He only had six starts at 2 and the decision was made to stop with him," Arsenault said. "It was the right decision. He had really nothing left to race for at 2... He needed time to grow. We knew we had a special horse on our hands. Plus, I knew he was coming back into my barn. I was still the groom and second trainer of him."

SBSW was the 2008 HOY but a decade later we lost him. He never did have that HOY son/daughter.

"After his first start at 2 he was great and Paul [MacDonell] never got him to stop until the top of the turn," Arsenault said. "Bill Robinson's people were trying to buy him and went all the way to \$750,000 but we kept telling them he was not for sale. He was a great training colt; always wanted to go forward; always full of life; never tired and enjoyed his work. Size-wise he was medium size but needed some filling to age 3."

IS SAN PELLEGRINO A FORGOTTEN HOY SIRE?

His son San Pail is the 2011 HOY, yet few seem to remember and few mention his name. Maybe because he was in a crop of early standouts like Enjoy Lavec, Self Possessed, Angus Hall and CR Commando in 1998 as a freshman. Maybe it's because he is probably more known for a few comebacks than his numbers.

Everyone wanted to see the towering presence of the 24-for-24 HOY with his caretaker Avery Fisher and trainer/driver Frank Ervin. Both Bulldog and Bret loved a camera.

POP QUIZ

Who was the youngest trainer and/or driver to have back-to-back HOY titles with the same horse? The answer is Paige West in 1960-61 with Adios Butler. West was 28 and then 29 for the two-year ride.

GOLDSMITH MAID

There was no HOY award in the 19th century, but no matter, Goldsmith Maid was more like the Horse of the Century anyway. Goldsmith Maid banked \$364,200 racing until age 20, her 13th and final year on the track in 1877. Her career slate was 123 97-16-7.

TRIPS TO WIN

Three times a horse has made over \$2 million lifetime before winning their first HOY trophy: Artsplace (1992), Real Desire (2002) and McWicked (2018).

FROM THE HEY, YA NEVER KNOW DEPT (HOY EDITION)

- Rainbow Blue slipped through the cracks in 2002 at the New Jersey Classic Yearling Sale for \$10,500. She was from the first crop of Artiscape.
- In 1963, Fresh Yankee sold for \$900. Raise your hand folks if anyone thought she would become the first million-dollar earner bred in North America and 1970 HOY.

- Green Speed sold as Hip #40 on 11/3/75 at Harrisburg. This powerhouse would wind up being the 1977 HOY for Team Haughton.
- At Harrisburg in 2004, nobody thought too much of Glidemaster before, during, or after the sale, to the same man who paid \$16,000 for Real Desire in 1999, Blair Burgess. How could they if they let Glidemaster go at \$10,000?

SWEET LOU COULD JOIN THE ELITE

In 1970, the Pacer and Trotter of the Year awards debuted. Sweet Lou could become the 11th pacer to both win that honor and sire the winner of the same, Confederate. He would join Most Happy Fella (Cam Fella, twice), Albatross (Niatross, twice and Fan Hanover), Niatross (Nihilator), Abercrombie (Artsplace), Cam Fella (Camtastic, Precious Bunny, and Cams Card Shark), Beach Towel (Jennas Beach Boy), Precious Bunny (Bunny Lake), Real Desire (Tell All), Rocknroll Hanover (Rock N Roll Heaven) and SBSW (Captaintreacherous, twice).

JIMMY AND NOW NANCY

It's a pretty good bet that Tactical Approach (19 10-3-4, \$1.6 million, the No. 1 trotting earner) is going to be named 2023 Trotter of the Year. This fact will then see Nancy Takter join her dad Jimmy as having both Trotter/Pacer winners of this award, a father-daughter first. Nancy had Tall Dark Stranger in 2020 who doubled up as HOY. Jimmy's 2016 Always B Miki joined his trotting winners Malabar Man (1997), Moni Maker the next three (1998-2000), Kadabra (2002), and Pinkman (2015).

ENDING THE YEAR IN STYLE

Ake Svanstedt has a way of doing that. He won four Breeders Crowns as a trainer and three driving. Those three driving Crowns were his three biggest purse wins of 2023: Warrawee Michelle (\$700,000) in the 2YOFT, Bond (\$600,000) in the 3YOFT, and Southwind Tyrion (\$600,000) in the Open Trot.

ZERON AGAIN

Teesha Symes – Third generation horsewoman

Born in Springhill, NS, Teesha Symes is from the same town as one of harness racing's all-time top drivers and Hall of Famer, "The Magic Man" Billy O'Donnell.

Teesha's grandfather, Cecil Symes, owned and trained horses in the Maritimes during the '70s and '80s and Teesha's father, Charles Symes owned, trained and drove standardbreds in the Maritimes and also in Maine.

"I was around 6 or 7 years old when I started jogging horses and knew right then that there wasn't anything else I wanted to do with my life," Teesha said. "Like most horsemen/horsewomen, once bitten by the racing bug the sting is there forever. No matter what age you are, if you had been born into the business or have begun your own legacy, once the love of the horse and sport gets in your blood, it will always be there.

"Although my parents were pleased that I loved the sport, they were adamant about my attending college. I took a course in Corrections and every weekend I drove to Prince Edward Island to watch the races. I did my work placement at the County Jail in Amherst, NS, and also worked at the police station after college, but always found my way back to the horses.

The first horse Teesha owned was Anybunny.

"My father bought him for me in 2002 from a horseman in Harrington," she said. "He had two ugly front suspensories, so we gave him time off. When he returned to the track, he ended up being a real nice junior invitational horse."

Anybunny would be the first of many horses for Teesha. Today, she trains 18 horses. Originally she trained in Ontario, but she has recently moved to the Buckeye State with her fiancée, Beau Brown, the son of one of Ohio's top trainers, Brian Brown.

"Presently, Beau and I stable at the fairgrounds in Delaware, OH," Teesha said. "I love training there for it has one of the nicest surfaces for the horses. Currently we are racing at Miami Valley and Northfield Park in Ohio but we will travel wherever we can get our horses in where they can compete and make money.

"Today we have eight 2-year-olds, five 3-year-olds and five aged horses. We currently race our horses wherever we can get them in: Ontario, Buffalo, Batavia, Northfield and Dayton. Beau and I have always been in the same barn and in more recent times, he trains his and I train mine. Regardless, we help one another and bounce ideas off of each other."

Although Teesha and Beau have separate programs for the race horses, they have combined their 2- and 3-year-olds.

"Like his father Brian, Beau is super with young horses," Teesha said, adding with a laugh, "Although I love training with Beau, I also love beating him."

According to Teesha, hands down, her all-time favorite horse is Rockin In Heaven, aka Moe.

"We have a special bond that goes beyond the racetrack and barn for his personality is more like a human than a horse," Teesha said.

It's perhaps no surprise that she thinks the highlight of her career was racing in the Gold Cup and Saucer' in 2018 with Rockin In Heaven and again in 2022 with Laugh Again Hanover.

"The Gold Cup and Saucer was a race I grew up watching and dreamt of one day competing in, so I feel so blessed to have made the finals twice," she said. "There's nothing like going back home and post parading under the spotlight with one you train."

Her fastest horse she trained is also Rockin In Heaven.

"He took his record at Mohawk Raceway in 1:49.2 and paced a few last quarters at Mohawk in :25.1 and :25.4," she said. "When you asked him, he dug in and he had a massive motor. The fastest horse I sat behind was Monte Miki. We trained him in Canada prepping him for the Metro for Mark Evers.

"Monte was scary fast. We race biked him at our farm in Canada on Rockin In Heaven's back, and even as a 2-year-old Monte kept up with the old horse like it was easy. Monte was one you just held onto and said, 'Whoa.' Monte also won his Breeders Crown elimination in 1:50.4 when he was 2 years old at The Meadowlands."

Teesha has future plans for her and Beau in the business as well as some specific goals.

"Beau and I made a huge shift this year by moving to Ohio and purchasing Ohio bred yearlings," she said. "My plans are to focus on the younger horses. I know it won't be easy for Ohio is tough and has some of the best trainers and horses, but we will give it our all.

When I started jogging horses and knew right then that there wasn't anything else I wanted to do with my life. Like most horsemen/horsewomen, once bitten by the racing bug the sting is there forever. No matter what age you are, if you had been born into the business or have begun your own legacy, once the love of the horse and sport gets in your blood, it will always be there.

"First of all, my main goal is to be healthy, happy, and helpful to others. Career goals include a Gold Cup and Saucer winner, a Little Brown Jug winner, and to get the most out of every horse I train. I know they will not all be champions, but if they reach their full potential, I'll be happy. I feel so blessed to be carrying on my family's tradition, doing what I love more than anything in the world alongside the man I love."

MONDAY

It was stormy and cold today, so we did things in the barn. I asked some questions, and Ronnie, my mentor/coworker/minder, explained stuff that I was wondering about, like what the horses did while I cleaned their stall. She told me that young horses would jog at least two miles daily and go at least a mile when they go the right way.

I was confused about the right way. She said the horses go slow and warm up clockwise and then race counterclockwise. I also learned they have different carts for jogging and racing and that the people at the training center will not drive them in actual races.

Instead of telling me the answers, Ronnie sat beside me on a bale of straw and used her iPad to show me everything she explained. She showed me several things about the animals and people in the sport. Ronnie was a great teacher, and for once in my life, I was a decent student. She said an hour was plenty for one sitting, but I should write down any questions for the next time we have some free time.

Then I began complaining about how it was wrong that the rehab took away our phones and devices. I got a tad snotty about what a raw deal I was getting, how if I had a phone, I would look up horse racing links.

Ronnie wasn't buying what I was selling. She said, slow and quiet. They know what they are doing, and one of them is keeping you from doing stupid things and seeing triggers that send you into one of your pity party funks.

TUESDAY

Ronnie picked up where we left off yesterday. She didn't yell or scream but stepped into the stall where I was raking, looked me right in the eyes, talked slowly, and said, "Don't talk down about yourself or anyone. Bitching is annoying and is terrible for business. I think that bad vibes rub off on the horses and other people. Try to give off good vibes. They don't cost a dime. Now, I know your attitude is part of your issues, and an instant attitude makeover is a big ask, but try. If you can't be Miss Sunshine, be neutral or mute. Bite your tongue before talking down about yourself or anyone else. I would appreciate it, the staff would appreciate it, and these horses will enjoy it."

Instead of a pity party rant about how she did not know shit and she did not know me and then throwing the rake at her, it dawned on me that this would only prove her point. I did not say a word. I have heard this lecture at least a hundred times, but her words stuck for some reason, maybe because of the horse part. The rest of the day, as I shoveled, I thought.

WEDNESDAY

This afternoon, an owner showed up at the barn. I knew he was coming because Ronnie gave me a heads-up. I imagined an owner would be wearing a suit and be all uppity, the kind of person who irritates me, or a self-important person who pretends to be regular folks, which annoys me even more. Almost everyone irritates me.

As usual, I was wrong.

The owner, I forget his name, something like Roy or Ray, was a shy guy in baggy shorts and a saggy white t-shirt, maybe in his 40s. He strolled over to the stall door where I was shoveling, stuck his head in, and gently said, "Hi, I pay the freight on this filly."

He gave off a good vibe and was good-looking in a rumpled Jeff Bridges way, so my antenna started scanning, but of course, he wore a wedding ring. The good ones always do.

Ray or Roy was super easy to talk to, almost shy. We did some jokey small talk while I leaned on my shovel. Ray or Roy was like the second person in 20 years that I liked right away; maybe it was because we were in the barn, which was very strange. After a while, I asked him if being an owner was fun.

He said it was. Despite the ups and downs, he enjoyed owning a few racehorses and learning about the horse racing business. He said he got started as a release from the pressures at his job in a big company that I had vaguely heard the name of but can't remember. He laughed and said his release turned into an addiction to the sport.

The word addiction sent off alarm bells in my head. I wondered if he knew about my situation, which is always on our minds. We always feel like everybody knows and everybody is judging us. But he asked me earlier if I had come from another horse farm, so I figured he didn't know my history.

I told him I was a complete newbie and had yet to master the shovel and wheelbarrow.

He smiled and said that five years ago, he didn't know a trotter from a pacer.

I said all I know is if the horse has junk, he's a boy.

We went on for a few minutes, bragging about who knew less.

I was beginning to hope his marriage was on the rocks when his wife showed up and ruined my buzz. She was slim and attractive and calm and friendly, exactly my opposite. I hated her immediately.

THURSDAY

Ted, the head trainer at the horse place, sat beside me on a bench in front of the barn. He asked me how I was doing.

I told him it was a day-to-day struggle, but I was hanging in there. I mentioned how much I appreciated him letting us work at the farm and that being outdoors was outstanding, even on the cold mornings.

He asked how long my stay at the facility was and my next step. I told him a few more weeks and then probation.

Do you go to a halfway house?

I told him that's up to the judge and the courts, but there are a lot more addicts than there are places to warehouse and monitor us.

Then we turned to the horses, and I asked him for the short version of how these horses got here.

He said the horses I work with were born and raised on breeding farms. All of them were born between January and June of 2022, and for the first part of their lives, they are called weanlings. He smiled and said, now it gets a little complicated. On Jan. 1, 2023, they all share the same birthday, and we call them yearlings because they are 1 year old. At the end of their yearling year, they get sold at big auctions, yearling sales. Between January and June this year, they try to go faster as they grow. Then, this summer, all the 2-year-old horses compete against each other and race for money.

Then he said, we, people who have been racing horses all our lives, don't realize how complicated we seem to new visitors.

Then I asked, trotter or pacer, how can I tell?

He smiled and said not to feel bad. It's not easy, especially at first. He said to try this, "When they are on the track, if the horse you are watching has a strap, a hopple, or a plastic band around its back legs, it is a pacer. If there are no belts around its back legs, the horse is a trotter, no back strap means trotter." His phone buzzed, and he walked away to talk. When he finished his call, he returned to the bench, shook my hand, and said, "I hope you make it."

So do I, but I'm getting jittery about a few things. I am wrestling with some demons.

Hanners' star continues to climb

In 2022, Austin Hanners was recognized as an up-and-coming star in Ohio. In 2023, the young driver continued his ascent.

The 24-year-old Hanners set career highs with 218 wins and \$3.23 million in purses last year, more than doubling his previous best totals in those categories, which were established in 2022. Among his highlights was winning an Ohio Breeders Championship with 2-year-old male pacer Rose Run Zane with a world-record-equaling performance on Little Brown Jug Day at the Delaware County Fair.

Overall, Hanners appeared at 30 different tracks in 2023, piling up 2,397 drives.

He was eighth in wins at both Eldorado Scioto Downs and Miami Valley Raceway, with 78 and 50, respectively. He was ninth at Hollywood Dayton, with 38 victories, and also ninth on the Ohio fairs circuit, with 39. His .452 driver's rating at the fairs was third among drivers with at least 100 starts.

"I got very lucky; I had a very good year," Hanners said. "I got a lot of seat time, that's for sure. I didn't really have a plan [to drive more] but if I can fill up my schedule, I usually do. I don't turn down drives if I can fit them into my schedule. So, that was never a goal, I guess, but it's my goal to do the best I can.

"I enjoy it," he added about the travel. "Especially going somewhere new for the first time or two. It's definitely fun. There are always different styles of driving, and you can learn something every time you go somewhere different. Something new that you can take to your home track, or maybe somebody new that you can learn from. You can definitely learn a lot, I think."

Hanners won 98 races and \$1.42 million in purses in 2022 and was named the recipient of the Peter Haughton Memorial Award, presented by the Ohio chapter of the U.S. Harness Writers Association, for being the young Ohioan who is a rising star in the sport.

"It's always a good thing to get some recognition, no matter what level it is," Hanners said. "It's good for your self-confidence. I definitely think it helped me."

Hanners picked up his most lucrative career victory last season with Rose Run Zane in the \$75,000 OBC at Delaware. The Dan Venier-trained freshman stopped the clock in 1:51.1, equaling the world mark for a 2-year-old gelding.

"He was definitely my home run horse for the year," Hanners said. "[Equaling the world record] was something I never thought I would be able to accomplish. That was a blast. I was extremely fortunate to get the opportunities to drive horses like that last year, getting to step up and drive some stakes horses."

Rose Run Zane and Hanners won two preliminary divisions of the Ohio Sire Stakes series. Hanners won an Ohio Fairs Championship with Steve Carter-trained 2-year-old female pacer Legend N Cress and a Buckeye Stallion Series consolation final with Carter's 2-year-old male pacer Bronx Drifter. Overall, Hanners won 14 state-bred stakes in 2023 and hit the board in an additional 38.

A change in driving style has helped Hanners, who has \$6 million in career purses and nearly 500 wins, continue his development.

"I've learned to be more aggressive," Hanners said. "I started off very passive, I think. The way the sport has changed, I'm still not overly aggressive, but you have to be more aggressive than years ago. I think that's a big thing. If you're not aggressive here [in Ohio], I don't think you do very good. It's just the style of

driving. There are no big, long stretches, so you have to be up close when you turn for home."

Hanners is the son of trainer Alicia Hanners. His father, Brad, accumulated nearly 5,000 wins as a driver before passing away at the age of 43 in 2015 following a battle with cancer. Austin's younger brother Luke also is a driver and trainer. Luke raced more in the east in recent years but has returned to Ohio.

"He just moved back a couple months ago," Austin said. "It's fun getting to drive against him a lot now. It's definitely different. When I'm not in the race, I want to see him do good, but I definitely don't like to see him beat me.

"Hopefully, [the move] serves him well. It has so far. He's added to a colony that's already tough. He's going to make it even tougher, that's for sure. You definitely have to be on your toes and sharp every night. There are no nights off. There is always somebody that's very capable behind you."

Austin has started this year with 18 wins and 72 top-three finishes, which he hopes is a sign of more good things to come. Last year, he had 13 victories and 41 top-three finishes at the same point of the season.

"I'm having a better start to the year than I've ever had, so I'm hoping I can keep it up all the way through the year and have a better summer than last year," Austin said. "I don't usually look at my stats until the end of the year, but as long as they're better at that time, I feel like that's a good accomplishment. If I can do better than I did last year, I'll feel like I'm on the right track. That's how I look at it."





Joe Bongiorno posts 3,000th career victory

Driver Joe Bongiorno scored the 3,000th win of his career by taking the seventh race on Thursday night (Feb. 8) at MGM Yonkers Raceway with **Emotions Riches**.

Emotions Riches, a 6-year-old gelding by Wheeling N Dealin, took the lead from first-over heading to the 1:26 three-quarters and drew off to win by 3 lengths in 1:56.1 for trainer Travis Alexander and owner Rags To Riches Of PA LLC.

Bongiorno, who began driving in 2010, finished fifth in the local standings a year ago. His lifetime earnings are over \$46.3 million, and his major triumphs include the Little Brown Jug in 2020 with Captain Barbossa and the 2019 Breeders Crown Open Pace with American History.

Thursday's program featured two \$35,000 invitational trots, one for horses and geldings and one for fillies and mares, and driver Yannick Gingras took both of them. He scored in the dash for the boys with **Yanks Dugout**, a 7-year-old Triumphant Caviar gelding trained by Mickey Burke, Jr. for owners Ivan and Duke Sugg, in 1:55.2 and then bagged the fillies and mares clash with Per Engblom-trained **Tipsy Moni** in 1:55.2. Gingras also co-owns that 4-year-old daughter of International Moni with partners Ben Mondello and Fac Racing LLC.

Buddy Earl wins again at Big M

Things didn't go as hoped, but as it turned out, that didn't matter, as **Buddy Earl** racked up a second-straight score Friday night (Feb. 9) at The Meadowlands, taking the \$15,000 featured midrange conditioned trot.

Dave Miller, the Hall of Famer who currently sits atop The Big M driver standings, made Plan B work to get the 4-year-old gelded son of Father Patrick—Nixie Volo his seventh lifetime score in 32 tries.

"My plan was to go ahead and leave but the whole field left inside of me," said Miller. "But the trip worked out really well for us. We had live cover."

With the field of nine leaving in a straight line, Miller and Buddy Earl had to take back to seventh around the first turn as Conrad DiPoggio IT had the lead at the quarter in :27.4 while 8-5 favorite

Outside The Fire raced alongside that one before taking the point.

The action continued to the half as King Alphonso, in search of a second straight score, took over at the half in :56.1. Mon Amour was now up and out of the 3-hole and raced on the rim while making progress first-over as Buddy Earl picked up a live tow as three-quarters was reached in 1:25.4.

Miller tipped Buddy Earl off his cover soon after the field straightened up in the stretch and gradually made his way past King Alphonso on the way to an easy 1¼-length win in 1:53.2, just a fifth-of-a-second off his lifetime best. Some Chapter, the 9-5 second choice, fired late to grab second with King Alphonso holding third.

"He's just so sharp right now I can race him anyway I want to," said Miller. "Hopefully, he can hold his form and keep it into the summer."

Buddy Earl, a Richard Johnson trainee, paid \$10.60 to win as the 4-1 third choice in the wagering.

A LITTLE MORE: Miller's three winners led the driver colony and upped his 2024 Big M total to 20. Despite a sequence that began with a 3-5 and a 2-5 shot, the 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 returned \$879.88. Five favorites emerged victorious among the seven dashes. All-source handle totaled \$3,063,392, the eighth time in 10 cards this year that saw betting bust the \$3-million barrier.

First 2024 qualifiers at Pocono set to go Monday morning

Among the most intriguing horses slotted for Monday action are a trio of 3-year-olds facing a starting gate under race conditions for the first time, all of them from the team of trainer Brett Pelling and driver/son Jack and all of them starting from the rail.

They are Beautiful Roz, a filly by Always B Miki out of Pleasant Beauty, a three-quarter sister to Precocious Beauty and a full sister to Sportswriter, who sold for \$200,000 as a yearling and who is owned by Kentuckiana Racing Stable, Melvin Segal, and Bud Hatfield; Americagreatagain, a Captain Crunch—America Rocks colt owned by Stephanie Smith-Rothaug, the breeder of Somebeachsomewhere; and Charlie's Memory, a Captaintreacherous—Darn Tootn Hanover colt owned by David McDuffee, poised to enter harness racing's Hall of Fame, along with Steven Wienick and JFoderaTRitchieCanAmerica.
