



# John Campbell rates his legendary driving contemporaries

Though there was little separating the very best reinsmen in terms of talent, many names stand out for other reasons.

Asking Hall of Fame driver and Hambletonian CEO John Campbell to assess his legendary driving contemporaries in multiple categories was, admittedly, a little challenging because of one over-riding reality: There truly was little separating the very top drivers from his era.

"So, saying, 'who had the **best hands**?' it is almost impossible to differentiate," Campbell said. "Who had better hands than Billy O'Donnell? Or Mike Lachance? Or Buddy Gilmour or Herve

[Filion]? Once you get to that level, that's what made those guys so successful for so long and able to reach that height. It takes that package to be exceptional at it."

But asked who among them was the **best tactician** on the track, Campbell did say Filion was, perhaps, at the top of the list.

"Again, once you get to that level, they all have to be great tacticians," he said. "But, I will say, Herve was a master if he thought it was a two-horse race between your horse and his... He was a master of at least trying to get you in a disadvantaged situation... He put a lot of thought into that and did everything he could to get you into a spot where you didn't want to be."

Though, there is a qualifier.

"It was a little different back then, because horses could come from farther back," Campbell said. "But, if you used your horse too much on the front they wouldn't finish. It was a chess match among all of us, trying to get your horse in a spot close enough so you could win without using her too hard and then trying to get the guy that had the horse you thought you had to beat in a bad spot."

As for the **single greatest move** Campbell said he ever witnessed from another driver, it was George Sholty's move with Sonsam in the 1979 Meadowlands Pace in a then-world record of 1:53.2 from post 10. As **Bob Heyden recently recalled**, "It was the biggest purse, \$750,000, at that time. [Sonsam] was three-, four-, and five-wide from past the half. Maybe the greatest effort ever!" Campbell agreed.

"I just remember when [Sholty] moved [Sonsam], I thought, 'Holy s---, look at this,' Campbell said. "Then, the acceleration he had on the turn was absolutely incredible. To make a move is one thing, but for the horse to deliver for him is another... but it's certainly one of the boldest moves I've ever seen and he just had so much confidence in the horse that it worked.

"I wasn't in the race. I was watching and just from an entertainment value, I went, 'Holy crap, I've never seen that before."

As for all-world **trash talkers**, Campbell said he and his peers didn't trash talk all that much. However, in terms of **arguments after races**, he said he, "likely had more with Cat Manzi than with anybody else."

He said both of them were just as guilty for post-race arguments fueled by competition on the track.

"It wasn't for a long, long time," Campbell said. "It was for a very short period of time, like early-'80s, and Cat was doing very well and winning lots of races — both of us were — and we

just seemed to be digging into each other and had some back and forth... Some guys don't engage and some guys do. Well, Cat and I engaged."

Yet, in terms of pure **intensity**, it was another driver that topped them both — Mike Lachance.

"I don't know if intense is the right word, but he was certainly focused," Campbell said. "He totally lost his whole sense of humor when he was in that moment. It didn't matter, you could come up with something really funny and he'd just look at you.

"He was just totally focused and intense, especially with big races coming up or on that night. Not that everybody else wasn't intense, it was just that he focused more ahead of time than some people."

As for the driver most likely to pick up the tab, Campbell said that was, likely, Gilmour.

But, times were a little different among the driving colony then compared to today, Campbell said.

"Today, they travel together on planes to go to races," Campbell said. "When we started out, we all trained so we were all in the same barn area and ate in the same track kitchen, so you had to get along."

As for the notion that **today's drivers are more aggressive** than those of his era, Campbell said there is truth to that, but only because, "the horses can stand it... but it doesn't matter which era you're in, drivers in any era only do what works. That's what makes them great.

"The strategies and how I raced from the time I started at The Meadowlands until when I quit at The Meadowlands, that changed dramatically. It's not the drivers that changed, it's the horses that changed.

"When I led the post parade at the Jug last fall, I did think, 'Boy, it would be nice to have the rail in the final of the Jug and just go into that first turn as hard as the horse could go.' I was a little nostalgic for that, just scoring down there. The horses have changed a little since I quit [driving in 2017], but not that much. I really did get in on both eras."

#### REMEMBERING STAN BERGSTEIN

Campbell said there is no wonder why the late-and-legendary Stan Bergstein is the only person enshrined in both the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame (immortals) and the U.S. Communicators Hall of Fame.

"There's really been nobody else in history that's done, across the board, everything that Stan did, at the level that Stan did, and had the visibility that he did," Campbell said.

"He was an owner and then he was an announcer, a publicist, he worked for [Harness Tracks of America]... Just the breadth of what he brought to the table across the board was tremendous and the respect he had, not only inside the industry, but outside the industry from the thoroughbred folks. I had so much respect for him and got along so well with him on a personal note."

Bergstein died in 2011, but is fondly remembered by many, including Campbell.

"I remember a lot of interactions with him," Campbell said. "He just did so much and brought such a broad scope of knowledge to the whole industry because he worked in almost every area, other than training and driving."

In 2012, Campbell was awarded the very first Proximity Award renamed in Bergstein's honor as the Stan Bergstein Proximity Award.

Short of induction into the Hall of Fame, the Stan Bergstein Proximity Award is the highest annual honor the United States Harness Writers Association bestows on recipients.

Campbell said he was deeply honored to receive that award, especially with Bergstein's name attached. He also fondly remembers receiving the Stanley F. Bergstein Messenger Award in 1999. Campbell said he vividly remembers how special it was to physically receive that award from the man himself.

Recently, Campbell even stumbled upon the speech he gave at that time.

"I talked about how we don't pay our race secretaries and judges enough," Campbell said of his speech. "We have to attract more and better people for those positions – and that was 1999 and certainly nothing has changed since then.

"I also said we had two different issues as far as harness racing. If someone went to the Breeders Crown or the Meadowlands Pace or North America Cup or Hambletonian they would say there's nothing wrong – they would see people around there having fun, a big crowd, great racing and all that, but if they came back on a Tuesday night in January at The Meadowlands then it would be a totally different story. I think at the time I was promoting making sure our big events were as big as they could be at that time... So, I think reading that and knowing I said that in 1999 kind of makes me feel pretty good, to tell you the truth."

# Burgess on a Special Mission with trotter

The Hall of Fame trainer has crafted a different program for a different kind of horse.

Blair Burgess is probably best known for training two Dan Patch Horses of the Year, one on each gait: Glidemaster (2006) and Real Desire (2002), respectively. He told HRU that he doesn't want to jinx himself by being overconfident, but current trainee Special Mission (5, 1:52.3s; \$52,660) is rapidly raising his hopes.

The 5-year-old son of Walner—Special Hill is riding the crest of a four-race win streak at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Special Mission is also the co-fastest trotter in North America at the moment. He shares a 1:52.3s seasonal mark with five other horses, including WMP preferred regular Amigo Volo.

Burgess said Special Mission's co-owner Dan Roland of Sandstone, MN "got him ready" before sending the horse to race in Ontario. Bred Winr Stables, of Colona, IL shares ownership of the full brother to 2022 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year Special Way (3, 1:51.2m; \$1,160,575).

Special Mission skipped racing this week, in preparation for the upcoming New Holland Trotting Series, which kicks off March 11 at Mohawk.

"I like the opportunity to manage a good horse, and hopefully this horse will fit into that role," Burgess said. "He's pretty stoic, but he wants to get out there."

With just 12 lifetime starts, Special Mission's WMP win margins have been eye-catching at conservative classifications so far. Burgess is carefully bringing the stallion along, not wanting to push too hard, too soon.

"The idea is to keep him relatively fit, and bring him back for some summer and fall stakes," said the trainer, mentioning Special Mission's nominations to the 2024 Maple Leaf Trot and Breeders Crown.

Owner Dan Roland said he was fortunate to find the blue-blooded trotter for just \$20,000 last year.

"Part of what was intriguing about him is he only had three races; he only had \$7,500 on his card," Roland said. "We had been trying to find a Walner mare for a couple of years, probably, and obviously they are all quite expensive. We couldn't find any that we could afford... A year ago September was when we bought him on OnGait.com. He had been injured. The people who had him prior to us had bought him as a yearling, trained him at 2, and brought him back at 3, and he raced just three times I think, and then he got hurt."

Special Mission's sister Special Way hadn't yet raised the family profile.

"At the time we bought him, she had only raced maybe two or three times," Roland said. "It was a good family, but it wasn't a great family without her in there."

The Minnesota horseman said he sought out help to get Special Mission ready to race.

"I've got a vet I trust that used to run Iowa State University, named Scott McClure," Roland said. "We took [Special Mission] to him and he said the suspensory had been injured pretty bad, and he thought he needed at least a year off to heal up. We've had luck in the past using a shaker plate and BEMER stuff on suspensory injuries. So, we took that time with him and put him on the plate everyday while we were doing our other stuff."

Local trainer and friend Justin Anfinson qualified Special Mission at Hawthorne Race Course in October 2023, with Todd Warren

driving. In November, the horse recorded back-to-back wins there with multi-length margins.

"They basically never really pushed him more than a quarter of a mile, you know," said Roland.

He was a Hawthorne vet scratch Nov. 27 due to illness, but made his Dec. 21 Mohawk debut a winning one for Burgess and driver Tyler Borth.

Special Mission bled that race.

"Since he's been on Lasix, it's been under control and no big deal," Roland said.

According to Roland, he originally decided to send his horse to Woodbine Mohawk Park due to the track size and conditions that suited Special Mission. Although he only knew Burgess through Facebook interactions, the trainer's background seemed perfect for the lightly-raced trotter.

"I looked him up and tried to research him a little bit, and for the reputation and history that he has, he really keeps a pretty small stable..." Roland said. "We didn't really want [Special Mission] to go to somebody where he was the 40th or 50th horse in line. We wanted him to get some personal attention."

Roland said he also wanted Burgess' opinion on Special Mission's potential.

"We wanted him to go to somebody who had really good horses before and knew how to take care of good horses," Roland said. "Obviously with that past injury, you never know what's going to happen, but that's part of what I've been most happy about; that Blair's been very conservative with him."

That approach is one that Burgess defends.

"There's only so many times they can go that fast, so it might as well be when it counts," said the U.S. and Canadian Hall of Fame. "We've only been racing him two weeks out of three, to not

overuse him. He's been very sound and very good. I would have liked to have one more start [before the New Holland Series]." Special Mission is currently based at Tomiko Training Centre,

"He showed moderate talent at 3, but since he came back, he hasn't really put any bad efforts in," said Burgess, who thinks that having access to regular turnout at Tomiko has helped Special Mission remain content. "He never misses time outside. He's one of the best-behaved stallions I've ever had."

The former \$100,000 yearling has a soft spot for Yes I'm Hungry, "a big fat pacing mare in the paddock adjacent to him," said Burgess. "He's just happy that she's there every day."

Hopes are high for Special Mission to continue improving on the racetrack while being part of a small renaissance in Minnesota breeding. He was bred to four of his owners' mares and eight outside mares in 2023, and is expected to return to Minnesota this breeding season.

"It's a growing program," Rolands said. "I think our foal numbers are up maybe 30 to 40 per cent, while a lot of states are going backwards."

This year, Special Mission will be standing commercially in Minnesota for the second consecutive year, then returning to race at Mohawk.

"Bad for me, but good for Special Mission," said Burgess, with a laugh. "He has a different program set out for him."

A different program that suits a different kind of horse, agreed Roland.

"He's just one of those unique horses that has just got a personality that draws people in," Roland said. "He's a big, athletic horse, but for a stud horse, he's nice to be around, nice to work with. He's got kind of a quirky personality, but everybody that's done anything with him really seems to like him."

The 2024 New Holland Trotting Series concludes with the March 30 final.



# Idao de Tillard closed the meeting in Paris

Thierry Duvaldestin's super trotter **Idao de Tillard** (Severino) was the big favorite when the \$250,000 Prix de Selection for 4-, 5- and 6-year-old horses was held at Vincennes on the closing day of the 2023-24 winter meeting, Saturday (March 2).

The Prix d'Amerique and Prix de France winner Idao de Tillard started with a 25-meter disadvantage to his 4-year-old opponents, but he still solved the task, even if the race became more spectacular than most of the fans expected.

Strong 4-year-old mare Kana de Beylev was in front while Idao de Tillard had to chase for a position second over. But second over became first over, even first three wide in the end of the uphill part of Vincennes' track and when leader Kana de Beylev tried to leave the rest of the field, it suddenly seemed like Idao de Tillard would have problems capturing the horse in front.

But Idao de Tillard is just a superstar in harness racing right now and his speed in the stretch was enough to claim the prestigious trophy in the Prix de Selection.

A time of 1:52 over 2,200 meters is just a phenomenal mile rate and the spring will be very interesting for European harness racing fans. Idao de Tillard is invited to Elitloppet at Solvalla in the end of May and the plan is that he will make one more start before he travels to Sweden.

Kana de Beylev held strongly as the runner up and Kyrielle was third in Saturday's race.

The race card at Vincennes also included a Group 1-race for horses racing under saddle. The \$250,000 Prix des Centaures over 2,175 meters became a three-horse battle where Julien Le Mer trained **Ideale du Chene** (Bird Parker) proved strongest at the finish. First choice Jean Balthazar used all his power trying to come back on the winner's inside in the stretch, but the 6-year-old Bird Parker mare held the opponents behind her as she won in a strong mile rate of 1:54 on a sloppy Vincennes track.

# 2024 Breeders Crown Foreign Stallion Nomination Form





Up to 15 North American Foals of 2025 by Foreign Stallions may be made eligible to the Breeders Crown with a payment by **March 15, 2024** of a Foreign Stallion Nomination Fee equal to the amount of the North American advertised service fee for a 2024 breeding. (\$500 U.S. funds minimum)





Additionally, any foals that are **foaled & registered in North America which are produced from mares bred outside of North America** may also be made eligible by a payment of the advertised stud fee in the country where the stallion stands. This payment provides Breeders Crown eligibility for a North American crop of up to 15 foals.



If the Foreign Stallion's **North American Crop is 15 foals or less**, that payment is the total amount due for these North American foals to be eligible to make the 2026 Yearling payment and maintain eligibility by the future payments to the Breeders Crown. Any additional amount ("surcharge") or refund of this nomination fee will be determined by the number of 2025 foals ("North American Crop") by these stallions standing outside North America ("Foreign Stallions") and foaled and registered in North America (either with the U.S. Trotting Assoc. or Standardbred Canada) as of August 15, 2025. All foals which are nominated as yearlings must be registered in North America at the time of nomination.

Six consecutive wins since the meeting started in November 2023, are the strong results that Matthieu Abrivard-trained **Face Time** (Coktail Jet) can brag about when the Paris meeting is summarized.

In the \$100,000 Prix du Plateau de Gravelle, Face Time overtook the front position from leader Gaspar d'Angis with three quarters of a mile remaining in the 2,700-meter long race. In front, Face Time had no problem winning the race in a mile rate of 1:55.4 over 1.6 miles and last year's Prix d'Amérique favorite Horsy Dream followed as second.

The last Group 1-race for the meeting was the \$250,000 Prix Henri Desmontil, for horses racing under saddle and 10-year-old **Edition Gema** (Prince Gede) had the best power in the race's final part. # McIntosh trotter Convoy Hall catches the eye at Woodbine Mohawk Park

In the span of two races over the past 10 days, a 3-year-old gelded trotter named Convoy Hall (Muscle Mass—Constance Hall) has burst onto the racing scene in a big-time way at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trained and co-owned by Hall of Fame conditioner Bob McIntosh, it took just his debut race for Convoy Hall to become Canada's fastest 3-year-old trotter this winter and is co-fastest in the division across all North America in pari-mutuel racing.

In sweeping through the bottom non-winners 1 or \$7,000 (Ontario-sired \$10,500) condition at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Convoy Hall has been untested and more impressively, apparently un-asked for anything yet close to his best.

Following an easy 2:01.3 win in his lone qualifier, Convoy Hall debuted six days later on Feb. 22. He was well supported in that race as an even-money proposition and the early word out on him proved correct. After getting away second from post 3, driven by Sylvain Filion, Convoy Hall was put on the point in between calls to the half-mile and never looked back from there. In an amazingly professional performance, considering it being just his first race, he was trotting on his own through fractions of :57.4 and 1:27.4 and was entirely under wraps when coming home in :27.4 to post the national best time of 1:55.3.

On Thursday (Feb. 29), Convoy Hall followed up that debut with another sparkler. This time sent off at can't lose odds of 1-9, Filion put Convoy Hall on the front immediately and scorched similar rivals as the week prior, winning by a half-dozen lengths. After opening up daylight nearing the three-quarter marker and over seven lengths into the stretch, the Muscle Mass gelding raced through the lane with no Filion urging whatsoever and still trotted a final quarter of :27.2 while geared down to win as he pleased in 1:56.2.

A \$52,000 yearling from the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, Convoy Hall carries a pedigree that McIntosh has great familiarity with. McIntosh trained Convoy Hall's dam, Constance Hall, during her racing career of 2006-07; a formidable player in the Ontario Sire Stakes Gold circuit at that time and winner of over \$250,000. Out of the Canland Hall, Constance Hall is a half-sister to the great race trotter and even more prolific sire, the recently passed Cantab Hall. The same family includes \$838,335 winner Chin Chin Hall.

Interestingly, for her own success on the track and shared bloodlines with Cantab Hall, Constance Hall had yet to produce anything truly exceptional. From 12 previous foals to Convoy Hall, including eight winners, only a single one of those (Criquette Hall) was able to best the 1:55 mark. Convoy Hall on the other hand, looks poised to go well faster than that at any future time that he pleases.

As Convoy Hall moves up in class and some of the better sophomore trotters begin to re-emerge it's inevitable that whatever win streak he has at those times will be tested. But Convoy Hall certainly has the look of a trotter with serious staying power.

For all the attention to Convoy Hall, he's not the only new McIntosh pupil to keep tabs on. Tracking a near identical path from the same barn, the 3-year-old pacing filly named Catch My Breath (Thinking Out Load—Breathtacular) qualified the same morning as did Convoy Hall.

Like Convoy Hall, Catch My Breath has a right to be decent from her pedigree. A homebred out of the mare Breathtacular, she's a half-sister to last year's Ontario Sire Stakes 3-year-old champion, Moment Is Here.

And like her stablemate, she too won her lone prep. But while Convoy Hall trotted that morning in 2:01.3, Catch My Breath paced in just 2:03. It's easy to say now in retrospect but it's hard to believe considering the connections, pedigree and starting from rail at Flamboro Downs, Catch My Breath was dismissed as an overlooked 12-1 longshot. In that race, she raced along in fourth, came first over shortly after the half-mile and sustained a powerful first-over push to breeze past the race leader on the backstretch and ended up winning by over seven lengths in a time of 1:58.3, relatively fast for the track.

The secret was out from there, and when she came over to race the big track at Woodbine Mohawk Park just two days ago, she was sent off at odds of 1-5. Catch My Breath won that race coming first-over from fifth in a time of 1:54.2 in a closer than expected stretch drive against her longshot stablemate, Think Ahead. The winning race time was the fourth-fastest mile by a 3-year-old pacer in Canada this year.

# Will the Pomona goddess bring fruitful abundance to Fairplex Park?

I was given a similar response when I told anyone in Hollywood, I would not attend a specific media event because I was going to Pomona, CA.

"Why?" said everyone.

They speculated: "Visiting family?" "Got a new girlfriend?" "Is this some secret real estate investment opportunity I should know about?" and the most obvious, "You doing a personal appearance with the Wolfman at the fairgrounds?"

And so on. All wrong. No one fathomed my intentions for going to the "Queen of the Citrus Belt" were to bet on horse racing; no less on harness horse racing.

Mr. Bruce and I headed for the new harness racing meet's opening night at Fairplex Park with an extra incentive — I was covering the event for a news article in the next *Hoof Beats* magazine. (When published the article included a photo of Mr. Bruce walking into the main entrance among a swath of people responding to much extensive promotion).

There were great expectations for harness racing in the county. Fair-association president Jim Henwood said the Pomona Valley was experiencing a population boom and boasted one of the highest per-capita income rates in the Golden State; the stuff that could only benefit a robust harness racing meet.

And the track itself?

Fairplex Park was a five-eighths-mile track best known to horseplayers for its L.A. County Fair's brief thoroughbred meet

each September. The smaller track was considered a better theater for standardbreds. Thoroughbred fans called any racetrack with more than two turns a "bullring" because the extra curve impeded speedy galloping. Pacing and trotting racehorses differed; three-turn and four-turn tracks were common across the continent for standardbred racing. That made things look good for the modern debut of harness racing in Pomona.

Then Mr. Bruce added to the positive speculation. I knew nothing about Pomona origins but he did his homework and on the long drive to Pomona for opening night he held class in the passenger seat of my Honda.

He said that inherent in the outland county were historic and mystical elements also leaning in favor of the sport's success.

Pomona was named after a Roman myth, a goddess of fruitful abundance. Her name originates from "pomum," Latin for fruit grown on trees and in gardens and orchards. Pomona protects and cares for their health so they may flourish against all natural enemies. The Native-American Tongva tribe lived under her protection until Spanish settlements turned it into a larger agricultural center and it became commercialized throughout the west coast fruit market.

"That's where Hollywood got a lot of its wine during the early days of the film industry," he said.

"Smart stuff," I said, "but what does it mean to for us veteran harness bettors?"

"You taught me most people bet on horse racing based on feelings and superstitions," he said. "I'm telling you this new crowd we're betting against will wager like goddess Pomona insures Fairplex is on sacred ground and she protects their fruit. That is, their money."

"You mean they expect winning?" I said.

"Oh yeah," Mr. Bruce said. "For a while at least. Making bets based on feelings and superstitions will run amok with these folks. Add that to the Pomona bettors' total lack of experience playing the sport and..."

"We have an edge."

"Among ourselves."

Mr. Bruce's usual deep dive into the human condition was not as ludicrous as one would think. Remember Jim Henwood's spin on the success of harness racing in Pomona? How it could be possible due to a population boom and high per-capita income? Where is there data to support either condition would have a minor influence on the sport's success? The fruit goddess would have as much to do with its success. Bingo.

The few of us following harness racing on the west coast had an edge. We could only hope to be greatly outnumbered by neophytes with high per-capita incomes and faith in the goddess.

On opening night, it appeared Fairplex Park attracted a majority of the population. This was good for the sport and the article I was writing and the handle and most of all for the few of us armed with harness racing wagering experience. The Fairplex administration hired professional-gambler Barry Meadow to give handicapping lessons in the grandstands. A smart move. Meadow made a living betting on the sport. (More about him in future AO columns).

The concession stands offered food and drink and each level of the facility was festooned with colorful drapes and the seating areas were clean. The track looked to be maintained at the greatest level for safely presenting horsemen and their trotters and pacers to compete. Here too us veterans were steps ahead. We were well acquainted with the cast of characters: Stein, Kuebler, Aubin, Sleeth, Parker, Anderson, Desomer, Longo, Croghan, Bayless, Lackey, Lighthill, Plano and so on.

#### **FRIDAY**



We talked until 9. I blocked Susie on my phone; another day in my book.

#### **MONDAY**

When Paul met me at McDonald's, we did not talk about drugs. We did not talk about addiction. We talked about politics, which I do not care about, and horses, which I do not know much about.

My first intervention with a mentor did not go as I expected. Instead of survival theories, drug horror stories, platitudes, and slogans for people with a substance use disorder, we just talked. His politics were that everybody should bend and be nice and that nobody should use the word they. He told me that last night, he watched a clip of the Grammy Awards performance of Tracy Chapman, an aging lefty and a young righty who made music together so beautifully it made him cry.

Then, he asked me about the horse therapy program. I admitted that I only lasted a little over four weeks, but I truly believed the

program was miles better than most. He had many questions about the program, the costs, logistics, insurance, and what I would change. I answered as best as I could.

I tried to push Paul about his horse promise. He said he was working out the bugs and would explain at my two-month mark.

#### **TUESDAY**

I keep thinking about Paul meeting me on the brink of my slipping back into the arms of drugs. Why did he drop everything and help me? Why is he suggesting this reunion with horses? What is in this for him? Then I thought about a woman named Gayle from the NA meetings. She is a tough case, really struggling. Gayle has latched on to me four times now, and we chat for at least 20 minutes; she seems to be leaning on ME. The thing is, being a help instead of being helpless feels good. I think Paul is in the same boat, helping me, he helps himself.

My days are falling into a routine: breakfast with mom, a long walk listening to talk radio or music, five hours working at Burger King, meeting at 7. He will reveal the horse project soon. I have some guesses. It will probably be a nothing burger, but the mystery is fun. Ten more days until two months sober. I'm proud and nervous. Eggshells.

# Horse racing in New York brings \$3 billion to the economy

New York is one of the largest racing hubs in the United States, and the recent results of the American Horse Council (AHC) Economic Impact Study, along with those of the associated New York State 'breakout' study, document the strength and importance of the racing sector in New York's equine profile. Together, the thoroughbred and standardbred racing sectors in New York bring an economic impact of \$3 billion (inclusive of tourism impact) and employment impact of 19,785.

With 11 pari-mutuel racetracks (four thoroughbred and seven standardbred), New York played host to 1,078 live race days in 2022, with a total handle reaching \$2.7 billion and purses topping out at \$295 million. In addition to race days, New York hosts some of the top sales in North America. The thoroughbred sales venue at Saratoga's Fasig Tipton lands in the top 10 for both the Saratoga Sale and the New York Bred Yearling Sale, both of which take place in August. In Middletown, NY, the Goshen Standardbred Yearling Sale in September is among the Top 10 public standardbred yearling sales in North America.

Horse racing has a long and robust history in New York, drawing tourists to tracks, farms, towns and communities. The economic value of tourism is part of the \$3 billion total impact, as \$575 million of that \$3 billion comes from racing tourism. Saratoga, as the preeminent and oldest thoroughbred track in the country, attracts more than a million visitors a year. The Goshen Historic Track in Goshen, NY, established as a standardbred facility in 1838, is the oldest continuously operated track in North America, regardless of breed. Although horse training occurs year-round at the half-mile oval, it is a tourism hub for Orange County during its summer race meet. Because of the historic nature of both racing venues, Saratoga Springs and Goshen are home to their respective sports' Hall of Fame Museums, a further tourism draw for New York.

While most of the highlights of racing come on the track at the sport's various race meets, the behind-the-scenes work of the people that care for the horses — day and night — is what makes it all possible. That work takes place at home farms, stables and practice tracks across New York, including the rolling fields where young foals first stretch their legs, learning the basics and growing strong to one day become racing prospects. According

to Tom Grossman, owner of Blue Chip Farms in Wallkill, NY, "our standardbred nursery boasts an average population of 150 mares and their youngsters with enormous trickle-down economic benefits supporting agricultural entities like hay growers, grain and bedding suppliers, and equipment providers [tractors, trucks, hay balers etc.]."

The expanded impact of horse farms is an often-unrecognized benefit, including the impact on land preservation and associated capital improvement of the land. Based on the AHC study results, 51 per cent of New York horse owners own or lease a farm, barn or stable, with total acreage estimated at 303,000.

The New York State Economic Impact study was commissioned by SaddleUpNY! and made possible through the generous contributions of the following industry partners and friends: New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Old Field Farm, Ltd, Blue Chip Farm, John Madden Sales, Cornell University Hospital for Animals, New York Farm Bureau, New York State Horse Council, Karin Bump, Timothy Williams, Sally Lynch, Kent Nutrition and Triple Crown Nutrition. In addition, a linked GoFundMe campaign was also utilized for essential broader support from individuals across the state.

# Hot dog! Calabrese relishes Amateur Driver of the Year honor

Long before he began competing in harness racing and winning races as a trainer and driver, John Calabrese set a track record at The Meadowlands... for selling hot dogs.

Calabrese, who grew up 10 minutes from The Big M, spent three summers while home from college working a hot dog cart on the track's apron. One night in 1980, with the great pacer Niatross as the star attraction, Calabrese sold 1,042.

"When I went to check out that night, the boss was stunned and said it was double the amount anybody ever sold," Calabrese said. "After I started in the horse business, I would visit my old bosses and joke with them and ask if anybody got close [to that number]. They would just shake their heads and say that record would never be broken."

He added, with a laugh, "So, for everybody that has a track record at The Meadowlands, I have one too."

Calabrese, who never saw a harness race prior to heading to The Meadowlands for its opening night in 1976, has come a long way since those days with the hot dog cart. After getting out of school, he began working with the horses, first as a groom for future Hall of Famer Ron Waples, and later opened his own stable.

Eight years ago, Hall of Famer Ray Remmen got Calabrese started as an amateur driver with a trotter named Keenan. This past December, Calabrese was named the Amateur Driver of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. The 64-year-old Calabrese picked up his trophy Sunday (Feb. 25) at USHWA's Dan Patch Awards banquet in Orlando, FL.

"It's quite an honor," Calabrese said. "It was a great year. I appreciate all the people that let me drive their horses."

Calabrese won 26 races and \$243,995 in purses, both career highs, in 2023. Among the highlights was winning the NAADA Amateur Spring Series final on May 18 at MGM Yonkers Raceway and capturing the AHDC Spring championship nine days later at Freehold Raceway. He won both races with Shoemaker Hanover, a horse he trained.

"That was pretty cool," Calabrese said.

He also won the Italian-American drivers race at Freehold in October, and notched a victory at Flamboro Downs in Canada later that month.

"A lot of things went well," Calabrese said. "The first guy I ever worked for was Ronnie Waples. I was in Canada for six months the one year and I got to know a lot of people up there. So, it was really cool to go back to Flamboro and see people."

Calabrese, who has won 138 career races as a driver and 185 as a trainer, knew he was having a good season, but wasn't focused on winning the Amateur Driver of the Year trophy.

"For a while I thought about it, but by the end of the year, I was just driving," he said. "I just train my horses, drive, and whatever happens, happens. I had some nice horses that I train myself that I was jockeying around and then I picked up some really nice catch drives. It was a lot of traveling around, but I got it done."

As for this year, Calabrese will represent the U.S. at the World Championship for amateurs in August in Finland, and he will try to repeat as Amateur Driver of the Year here at home. Hannah Miller (2015 and 2016) and Dein Spriggs (2004 and 2005) are the only drivers to accomplish the feat this century.

"I cut back on my training this year, I trained five horses last year and it got to be a lot, and I don't know if that's going to affect me driving in the amateurs," said Calabrese, who has won 64 races as a driver the past three years. "But I would like to repeat, so if that's a goal, I'm ready."

Calabrese got his first win of 2024 last month at Freehold. On Friday (March 1), he won his second with Allindotime, trained by Bill MacKenzie, in a Meadowlands Amateur Drivers Club event at The Meadowlands.

"I like that horse; he's a nice horse," Calabrese said prior to the race. "Every time I've driven him, Bill has had him ready to roll. He'll be OK in there."

Friday was Calabrese's first start at The Big M as the reigning Amateur Driver of the Year.

"The first harness race I ever saw was opening night there," Calabrese said. "That's what makes it special for me; being there from the beginning. I would have never dreamed of being Amateur Driver of the Year all these years later."

# Shults' driving debut at Big M

Michael Shults was fascinated by horses at an early age — his family had been involved in harness racing before he was born and Shults appeared in his first winner's circle photo as an infant — but it wasn't until recently that he embarked on his own career in the sport.

In 2021, Shults joined with his father, William, and business partner Scott McDarby to buy his first racehorse. Later that year, he got his first training win with the horse, Revolver N, in a race at The Meadowlands. Now, the 44-year-old New Jersey native will look to get to the winner's circle as a driver. Shults will make his career debut in the sulky Saturday in a Meadowlands Amateur Drivers Club event at The Big M.

"I always had dreams of driving, especially at The Meadowlands," Shults said. "Just to be a part of the circuit, around the drivers there, and be part of that atmosphere is definitely special. I'm looking forward to getting out there."

Shults' grandfather, Vincent Ferriero, was a driver and trainer and Shults' father got into the sport as an owner through that side of the family.

"I was captivated by the horses at a very young age," Shults said. "In my teenage years, I wanted to spend more time with my grandfather at the farm, but my mother didn't want me in the business. She wanted me to get my education and take a different path. I was pretty upset at that moment because I was captivated by the training and driving, just being around the horses.

"To satisfy that itch, my mother enrolled me in a local riding academy when I was about 14 years old. I excelled in that, riding English, doing hunter/jumpers. I ended up getting a horse at 16, and that's kind of how I learned my horsemanship."

Shults worked at Watchung Stable in Mountainside, NJ, for six years as a riding instructor and trail guide in the Watchung Reservation. At the age of 23, he moved to Hawaii and got an International Business Degree from Brigham Young University in Laie. He remained active with the horses there, working at Gunstock Ranch in Kahuku, before eventually returning to New Jersey.

In 2013, Shults and McDarby started a hardwood flooring company, Selecta Flooring.

"I kind of got burned out on that a few years ago and needed to make a change, so I bought my first racehorse with my business partner and my father," Shults said. "I'm still with the company, but I'm more in a consultation role.

"My time is spent here seven days a week at the farm. It's been an adjustment for my family and myself. That's been my biggest challenge, but every time I walk in there and see the horses, I just really like that. It's very fulfilling."

Shults, who had 10 horses last year and six in training at the moment, got his first training win with Revolver N in November 2021.

"I have to give that horse all the credit in the world," said Shults, who now has 17 wins in 162 lifetime starts. "He taught me so much about training and the business. He's such a great horse; he has such a big personality. For me to click with him, to get along with him, inspired me to want to keep going.

"Eventually, I wanted to dig deeper and started doing qualifiers. I've been watching the amateur events and felt like it would be a good place for me to start and see where it goes from there."

On Saturday (March 2) at The Meadowlands, Shults drove Bionic, a 6-year-old pacer he trains and owns as a member of Blazer One Racing. The ownership group's name is a reference to the helicopter in the film "Predator," a favorite of Shults and McDarby.

Bionic, was making his first start since Jan. 20.

Revolver N also raced on The Big M's Saturday card in a conditioned pace with Jordan Stratton in the sulky.

"I almost listed myself on Revolver, but I'm trying to make smart business decisions for the stable and the horse," Shults said. "I want to get my feet wet first in the amateur ranks. I'm thankful they have these events because they give me an opportunity as a newer guy in the sport to get out there and compete and showcase my horses.

"They're very competitive races. I think it's good for the sport. It gets new people enthused. That's kind of what motivated me to want to drive now, seeing those races and thinking I could race against those guys and have a shot. It's an opportunity to get involved a little deeper without having to dive in headfirst against the top 10 drivers in the whole world. I feel good about it."



# Handle reaches Friday high; Dunn wins three at Big M

Wagering at The Meadowlands has been strong all year long, but Friday night (March 1) was an especially good night on an especially cold night (with a real-feel temperature of 35 degrees) as a 2024 Friday-night best (and second-highest overall) \$3,664,781 was put in play on the 14-race program.

Not surprisingly, the two races that offer the track's popular 50-cent Pick-4 saw vigorous wagering, as \$303,326 was bet on race 6, and \$311,547 on race 10. During the night, single-race betting topped \$300,000 five times.

There have been 16 programs contested at The Big M this year, with 14 of those seeing wagering bust the \$3-million barrier. The previous Friday-night best was established on Feb. 2 when \$3.27 million was pushed through the windows.

The top night of action this year was on Saturday (Jan. 27), when the total handle was \$3,779,096.

**GETTING IT DUNN:** It was merely another night at the salt mine for Dexter Dunn, as the 34-year-old New Zealand native recorded three wins on the card to lead the driver colony.

Dunn scored with **American Way** (\$3.00) in the second race, **ER Vegas** (\$3.60) in the ninth and **Southwind Frost** (\$3.60) in the 11th.

The four-time Dan Patch Driver of the Year (from 2019-22) has now won at least one race on each of the eight programs he's competed on since his return from vacation on Feb. 3.

**SWEET SOUNDING SWEDE:** There was no need to adjust your TV for Friday's sixth race, as the dash was called quite capably by 19-year-old Alex Persson, the track announcer at Aby Racetrack in Sweden.

Persson was in town visiting and Big M caller Ken Warkentin was happy to give up the microphone for a race.

"It was amazing [to call a race at The Meadowlands]," said Persson. "But it's different calling a race here. First of all, it's a mile track. Aby is a smaller track, and the race goes a bit differently here. It's a lot faster." Persson was exceptionally young when he got the gig at Aby. "I've been the race caller there since August of 2021, when I was 17. I did some race calling for two years before that at a small summer track in Sweden. The announcer at Aby was quitting and they wanted to go with some young, fresh blood. That's how I got the job."

One day, Persson hopes to call the biggest race in his country.

"I would love to call the Elitloppet," said Persson. "It's the biggest dream of any announcer in Sweden. Hopefully, that will come someday."

**A LITTLE MORE:** Big M TV's Dave Little was red hot with his selections on the card, tabbing eight winners, three exactas and the Late Daily Double. Little's big hit of the night came in the ninth race when he had the Early Pick-4 three times, giving his fans a \$321 score for a \$36 investment.
