any energy to get up, but she got better. I actually thought I would get up in the morning and find her passed away, but there she was, running around in her paddock."

When the great mare recently went down again, Miller said she was unable to muster another comeback.

"I was kind of expecting her to get up again, but she just couldn't, so we had the vet come out and euthanize her," he said.

Eternal Camnation is the top mare and seventh overall on the all-time list of North American pacers by earnings. Her 47 wins from 101 lifetime starts led to her induction to the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame (2011) and Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame (2013). The daughter of Cool World out of the very last crop of just 19 foals produced by the legendary Cam Fella. She was all the richest of all 1,002 of Cam Fella's foals.

Eternal Camnation was bred by Lew Amo and Fred Hertrich III of All American Harnessbreds fame, purchased as a yearling by Jim Hardesty of Fort Wayne, IN and later raced for the Eternal Camnation Stable, of Ohio. Eternal Camnation was owned by the Jeff Miller Stable of Haviland, OH at the time of her death. Miller trained her throughout her stellar career.

Through the Woodbine Mohawk Park stakes race of the same name, Eternal Camnation's memory still shines. Since 2005, the best 2-year-old pacing fillies have competed in the Eternal Camnation stakes (formerly the Harvest Stake).

Miller said Eternal Camnation had so many memorable career highlights that it was impossible to single out just one best.

"The Jugette, the Breeders Crowns, and of course, she loved Canada," he told HRU. "Some of those races, it looks like them

horses were going to devour her, and she would come back and win... She wasn't very big, but she had a desire to win."

The former \$35,000 Harrisburg yearling, originally named Allamerican Coin, began her career on June 16, 1999, winning a Hoosier Park qualifier by 11 and a half lengths in 2:00.4. She broke her maiden there in her second start, winning for regular driver Eric Ledford on July 4. Eternal Camnation went undefeated the rest of her 2-year-old season, capturing Champlain and Harvest victories that September at Mohawk before winning her Breeders Crown elimination and final at the Campbellville, ON track.

Eternal Camnation was voted Dan Patch, O'Brien, and Nova 2-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year, exceeding Miller's hopes.

"You know, she always behaved well," Miller said. "She kind of wanted things her own way, but that's typical for a filly anyway. Until we got down to around 2:05, she didn't excel any more than anybody else. It's just that wasn't her bottom, she just kept going and going and going. Once we got her to the races, she just had a competitive nature about her. She knew what it meant to win... She liked that."

Long retired from racing, Miller said he cherished memories of quiet one-on-one moments with Eternal Camnation on the Mohawk backstretch, where he would take her out to graze for dandelions.

"When she was a 2-year-old, she was up in Canada because the [Breeders Crown] final was at Mohawk that year, and she won," Miller said. "Of course, everybody was back at the barn, and I had spent a lot of time with her in Canada at that time. It was just her and I, and we'd go out for walks... When the race was over, I

got changed and walked back into the barn. One of the security guards stopped me on the other side of the barn and was talking to me, and you could hear her over there, whinnying for me!"

At age 3, it took Eternal Camnation three qualifiers and four consecutive pari-mutuel losses to return to winning form, which she did in the 2000 Fan Hanover Stake at Woodbine Racetrack on Aug. 19. In September, she won her Jugette heat and final for Ledford.

The best was yet to come. Eternal Camnation's first pari-mutuel win at age 4 was May 5, 2001 at Mohawk, sweeping down the stretch to a 1:52.4 Classic Distaff victory for catch driver Randy Waples. After beating mares in a 1:49.4 Meadowlands distaff free-for-all June 23, she improbably faced male M1 free-for-allers seven days later, finishing sixth. It proved an ideal tightener for her Breeders Crown Mare Pace elimination and final at The Meadowlands, which she swept that July en route to Dan Patch and O'Brien divisional honors.

Eternal Camnation had a fighting spirit rarely matched by rivals, said Miller, who did much of the mare's care throughout her six years on the track.

"She was a one-man horse," he said, adding with a laugh, "I'm not saying that to pat myself on the back, but she loved me and she just put up with everybody else. My wife would tell you that. It was a special bond."

Returning at age 5, the New Jersey-bred champion made 21 starts against some of the all-time toughest female pacers. On the road with stablemate Cinder Best, "Cammie" recorded her first 2002 win on June 14 at The Meadowlands, holding off Cathedra Dot Com in a distaff free-for-all. She went undefeated that August, including her Roses Are Red elimination and final at Woodbine, plus an Aug. 31 filly and mare open. She ended the season by capturing the Milton Stake at Mohawk over Cathedra Dot Com and Bunny Lake, and repeating as Dan Patch and O'Brien Older Pacing Mare of the Year.

Eternal Camnation distinguished herself with a Canadian Horse of the Year campaign in 2003, repeating as Dan Patch, O'Brien, and Nova divisional champ. Her remarkable nine-race win streak kicked off with the Aug. 30 Breeders Crown final at Woodbine and concluded with the mile-and-a-quarter Classic Distaff at Dover Downs on Nov. 24.

"Usually when horses get headed, they just don't fight back like that, but that was just her," said Miller. "That last 30 yards to the wire, that belonged to her and she wanted everybody to know that. When she was at the top of her game, she was pretty much unbeatable."

At age 7, Eternal Camnation won her May 2004 Classic Distaff elimination and final at Mohawk, followed by a July 9 Woodbine filly and mare open. Her last victory came in another distaff open pace, Aug. 20 at Woodbine. She retired after an Oct. 9 place finish behind Carolina Sunshine in the Allerage Distaff Pace at Red Mile.

While a financial controversy and the premature death of Eric Ledford made unfortunate headlines in the past, they never overshadowed the champion mare's achievements. "The business changed for us a few years back," said Miller, adding that he began cancer treatment the day he lost Eternal Camnation. "I became a pastor, and she's the only horse we had. This farm was her farm, and she had the best of both worlds. Sometimes she'd get a little lonely, so we had some riding horses that would stop in and stay for a while."

Eternal Camnation never produced a successor from six foals. Her fastest and richest is her only son, Rocken Camnation (p, 6, 1:50f; \$537,517). Her final foal died at birth.

"She wasn't a good mom, I'll admit that," said Miller. "It wasn't in her DNA. After a while, you just kind of throw your hands up and say, 'She don't owe us anything.' Gosh, the thrills that she allowed us to have, Doc and Dorothy [Miller of the Eternal Camnation Stable] and Jim and my family."

Her production record perhaps underscores her singularity: Eternal Camnation was more than a mare.

"She was a partner," said Jeff, fighting back fresh tears. "We spent a lot of time together. I said this a long time ago: She took a guy from the cornfields of Ohio and allowed me to experience the best of our business. That was all God, all talent. She was just a wonderful athlete, a wonderful horse, and memories you'll never forget."

The stage was set and **Leap To Fame** seized it in the most glorious and dominant style.

Champions defy logic and history and that's exactly what Leap To Fame did winning the \$1 million Miracle Mile at Menangle on Saturday night (March 9).

There is a strong argument to say he is the best pacer in the world right now.

The 5-year-old son of Bettors Delight became the first horse in Miracle Mile history to win from wider than post position 6. He started second from the outside (post 7).

Leap To Fame also became just the second horse in history to complete Australia's Triple Crown — the Inter Dominion pacing final, Hunter Cup and Miracle Mile — in the one campaign. The only previous was the mighty Preux Chevalier 39 years ago.

And he did all this after enduring, by far, the hardest trip in the race, sitting in the 'death seat' (outside the leader) for the entire race.

Such was the enormity of the challenge, it was the first time in almost 20 months — and only the third time in his 45-start career — Leap To Fame did not start as the favorite. Remarkably, he paid \$4 (for a \$1 bet).

The win was universally considered one of the greatest in the 57-year history of the Miracle Mile.

It moved owner Kevin Seymour, one of the greatest contributors to Australian harness racing on every level and a notoriously tough marker on horses, to call Leap To Fame a champion.

"I've reserved my judgement until now, tonight he proved he's a champion by sitting in the 'death [seat]' in such quick time and winning," he said.

Trainer/driver Grant Dixon, who handled the pacer masterfully, oozed as much pride as he did excitement after the win.

"I'm so rapt for the horse, he really deserved that," Dixon said. "That other horse [Sooner The Bettor] had a much softer run and really came at him, but he put his head down and wanted to get to the line.


"This horse has given me the best part of my career and Trista [Dixon, wife] is the best part of my life, so to have her and the kids here is just so special."

There were some magical scenes and Trista and their children greeted Dixon on the track moments after the win.

Seymour and Dixon have been very giving of Leap To Fame, especially with recent races at regional tracks like Cranbourne in Victoria and Newcastle in New South Wales.

It was somewhat deliberate and Seymour especially has put a premium on Leap To Fame being a vehicle to promote harness racing and draw new fans.

"Harness racing needs another champion to follow and get excited about, even to fall in love with," Seymour said. "We love the fact he's become a people's horse and hopefully that continues to grow. It's why when I asked for tenders for which slot we would partner with for his next big race in NZ, I told them I would put a premium on how they would promote the horse, the race and the sport as a whole."

That race is the \$1 million Race By Grins at Cambridge in New Zealand's North Island on April 12.

It will be Leap To Fame's first race outside of Australia and showcase him to a new, very passionate harness racing country.


Dixon said the massive following Leap To Fame has grown added to the jot of his success.

"So many people love the horse and come up asking to get photos of him or with him," Dixon said. "It's great to be part of it."

Leap To Fame's win took his record to an amazing 45 starts with 35 wins, six seconds, two thirds and earnings of \$2,765,957.

Just over two months into his 5-year-old season, Leap To Fame is already eighth on the Australasian prize money list for pacers.

Still to come this year, he has races like the \$1mil Race By



Grins, \$350,000 Blacks A Fake, the \$500,000 Inter Dominion and possibly even the \$750,000 NZ Cup in there somewhere, too.

If he stays sound, and races on for a couple more years as planned, Leap To Fame will get his chance to overtake his remarkable fellow Queenslander, Blacks A Fake, who is the richest Down Under pacer of all-time with \$4,575,438.

CALLMETHEBREEZE STRONG IN GROUP 1 HAMMERHEAD TROTTERS' MILE

Former European trotter **Callmethebreeze** continues to make waves Down Under.

The French-bred entire thrashed his rivals in last night's \$100,000 Group 1 Hammerhead Trotters' Mile at Menangle.

It was his third win from just five starts since being bought by leviathan Aussie owner/breeder Pat Driscoll through his Haras de Trotteurs and Yabby Dams operations.

Callmethebreeze has already done what no other Down Under trotter has done in the past six months, beating champion Just Believe, which he did in the Group 1 Great Southern Star final at Melton last month.

He suffered a shocking defeat after leading, pulling hard and cutting off his wind in the Group 1 Grand Prix at Melton in between the Great Southern Star and last night.

"We're all still learning about him, but the master [trainer Anton Golino] knows what to do," driver Nathan Jack said. "We changed a few things and he was great tonight, so relaxed in front. He actually waited a bit for them at the top of the [home] straight, so he might need a pair of pull-ups or something at some stage, but I'm happy when he's relaxed.

"I've fallen in love with him. Look at him, he's easy to fall in love with."

Jack is counting down the days until he heads to New Zealand for the next major target, the inaugural \$575,000 TAB Trot at Cambridge in NZ's North Island on April 12.

"Can't wait," he said. "What a race it's shaping to be. I'm sure he'll be very hard to beat again if he gets a good draw."

Jack knows that means taking on Just Believe again.

"As I've said, I'm not scared of Just Believe, but I certainly respect him," he said. "We've beaten him once before and can do it again if this horse is at his top and gets a good draw.

"I'm really excited about this horse and that [NZ] race."

Callmethebreeze trotted a 1:53.1 mile last night, but it was his closing splits which really turned heads.

The son of Trixton blasted home in :54.4 and :26.8.





The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines unique as:


- 1. Being the only one.

Whereas many announcers search for the right thing to say when a particular horse wins — and sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn't — knowing what to say was part of Lederman's DNA. It's what made him a good stand-up comic and an even better race caller.

He wanted his calls to be fun because he wanted people to be entertained and have a good time, and, who knows, maybe come back to the track again. But with all his comical shtick, the listener always knew what was going on in the race because that was the most important thing.

When talking about some of his best calls, he almost sounded surprised at what he came up with and how well it landed. He didn't plan, he didn't study and that's what made him so good. He was spontaneous and had a gift for what he did.

In 2011, Lederman faced an obstacle that he never saw coming, an inoperable brain tumor. He faced it as he did everything else in his life, with humor and appreciation for whatever time he had left.

On Thursday (Dec. 6, 2018) Lederman was a guest announcer at The Meadowlands. Even though he had been living with this tumor that had prevented him from flying or even travelling too far in a car, Lederman was everything you could have asked for.

He was famous for giving baseball scores during his race calls and even though there was no baseball in December, in true Lederman fashion, in the middle of the eighth race, he said: "And this race brings the question: Do the Mets really need Robinson Cano?"

Needless to say, he was a big hit with The Big M faithful and since it's believed to have been his last time calling at the track, as any master showman, he left them wanting more.

The Meadowlands paid tribute to Lederman this weekend following his passing on Tuesday (March 5). On both Friday and Saturday night, there was a moment of silence followed by a tribute from co-hosts Dave Little and Jessica Otten (on Friday) and track announcer Ken Warkentin (on Saturday).

On a personal note, I had the privilege of knowing Lederman for over 30 years. My husband and I made many trips to Garden State Park and they always included a trip to the announcer's booth.

The first time I met Lederman, he asked me if I wanted to blow his bugle. I told him that was a very personal question. Apparently, visitors to his booth enjoyed hitting the button that blew the bugle. When I first started in this business, I was told by many people that announcers protect their booth because they're scared that if they let someone else call a race that person will steal their job. That was not who Lederman was. He practically had a revolving door on that booth for people who wanted to call a race. He even asked me if I wanted to call a small field and I declined.


I also remember when he told my husband and I about doing the race call in the movie A Bronx Tale. He said that Robert DeNiro knew he could do impressions and wanted him to do an impression of NYRA track announcer Fred Capossela.

Lederman explained to us that he told DeNiro that he could do what he wanted but that Capossela would never have said what was in the script. He said he told DeNiro he'd do it as Capossela but then he'd also do it the way he thought it should be done and DeNiro liked Lederman's way best.

He once said he preferred to be known as a good guy more than a good announcer, but he was most certainly both. He was the complete package and he was consistently unique.









Harness racing's M&A growth paradox

More than 50 years ago, the NFL and AFL came together to create a stronger NFL, but the same merger and acquisition strategy is, strangely, unavailable in harness racing. The least we could do is race the best horses where the handle is the highest.

Competition in business can elicit a lot of chain reactions and subsequent responses. One tool in the business toolkit for excess competition is using mergers and acquisitions.

In the 1960s, the National Football League was competing with the American Football League. Players had two leagues to sign with, marketing, promotion and television deals were split, and the infrastructure of the entire sport of football was with two entities, not one. It was a classic de-growth dilemma.

The two leagues finally merged in 1970 and it wasn't easy. Entire books have been written on finding common ground when there was none, and working through the myriad rules and regulations to make it happen was akin to finding the lost city of Atlantis. In the end, the partnership and the sport of football thrived. In today's business world many of the mergers we see lean on the lessons learned from the NFL-AFL partnership.

Flipping over to our sport, we often hear wants and wishes about pooling resources when it comes to slot money. We hear questions about slush funds and rainy-day funds for the good of the overall sport. Some of us gaze into a crystal ball of hope for better cooperation to increase the sport's reach, growth, and innovation not unlike the NFL and AFL did 50 years ago.

But that hasn't happened, and probably won't. Officials from New York see no reason (or are contractually bound) to share resources with New Jersey; Pennsylvania with Illinois, or Ohio with Florida, where the "Pomp" is a distant memory. The Giants and Jets might share a stadium for the good of each team, but The Meadowlands and Yonkers doing similar seems downright laughable.

However — and I think this makes most in the sport apoplectic — no one seems to even try to find an alternative.

A few weeks ago, Yonkers ran an open pace on a weekday night. The purse was \$35,000 and it attracted a good field of horses with top trainers and drivers at the controls. **The total handle on the race was \$19,207**.

Meanwhile, this past Friday (March 8) at The Meadowlands, we will saw a number of TrackMaster races featuring horses between the levels of 71 and 74, driven at times by amateur drivers, with unreadable form, and they attracted hundreds of thousands of dollars in handle on a card where the total handle again exceeded \$3 million.

This doesn't make sense to anyone.

If we started with what most would think is a worthwhile goal — race the best horses where the handle is the highest — it'd be reasonable to think something could get done without some technocratic, government-led decree.

Yes, the sport has talked about — or given lip service to — solutions. Scheduling changes in the winter months (the summer less so with New York Sires Stakes and The Meadowlands stakes racing calendar); splitting up the types of races so there's only one class at each racetrack; bringing Harrah's Philadelphia and Pocono on-board with similar. Working together, as a team for the better of the sport.

But for whatever reason nothing seems to change. Stasis is all that remains.

In harness racing we're often told there are no workable solutions, it is what it is. When it comes to M&A activity they're right because it's a tool that cannot be used. However, the reasons businesses uses M&A is to get more efficient, to innovate, to grow, just like the NFL has. Those, in my view, are attainable to harness racing if they're creative, and there's a will to get the job done.





Bill McLinchey was born to be a standardbred racing executive

Bill McLinchey was likely born to be what he has become: vice president, standardbred racing for Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG). If not that, certainly something closely associated with harness racing.

Both his father and grandfather had small stables and trained

horses. He has been around horses, specifically harness horses, all his life. He is related to three Hall of Famers — uncles John and Jim Campbell and great grandfather Dunc Campbell. McLinchey initially worked in the race office at Woodbine and Mohawk under Scott McKelvie where he learned a great deal. From the race office he moved onto nighttime manager of racing at WEG. He served in that capacity for several years before becoming the director, standardbred racing. This past year he was promoted to his present position. April of this year will be his 20th year working for Woodbine.

You've been at WEG for all your adult life. You've seen virtually all of the horses that have raced at Mohawk and previously at Woodbine. Do you have a favorite?

"That would have to be Somebeachsomewhere. He was a horse that the people loved and wanted to see. There was buzz around the racetrack as soon as an overnight sheet with his name on it was printed. He drew a huge crowd from all over Canada every time he raced. In recent years, Bulldog Hanover had a similar following. There was a real sense of Canadian pride every time both of those horses raced."



[Woodbine Mohawk Park aims] to be the racetrack where you can race your stakes caliber 2- and 3-yearolds from the beginning of summer through, until the end of September, as the Grand Circuit makes its way to Lexington and on to the Breeders Crown. We are proud to offer the only million-dollar events for 2-yearolds in North America; for pacers in the Metro and the Mohawk Million for trotters. Money is certainly very important, but there is also something to be said for the prestige that comes from winning a grand circuit event.

You race 222 days a year at Mohawk, more than any other major track. How do you keep your product fresh and your customers coming back?

"It is something we are constantly aware of. Our goal is to present a quality product. I believe that for all intents and purposes we succeed in that goal. We strive to present a well-balanced match between quality overnight racing and high-level stakes racing. We are presently in what we refer to as our down time, meaning that we only race four times a week, rather than our peak of the season five nights. This time of year, our racing consists almost entirely of overnights. Beginning this month, we are adding a series of late closers featuring both younger and older horses, a few of which hopefully will become the stars of our summer racing. We gradually evolve from entirely overnight racing to where a significant portion of our race cards will be made up of younger horses and stakes events, a good many of which include Ontario Sires Stakes."

It seems, looking from the outside that you, perhaps, more than most other racing jurisdictions, have a great relationship with your horseman's association.

"I believe that to be very much the case. The main reason for that, in my view, is that our goals, especially our main goal is almost identical. In just a few words we strive to present a quality product featuring the best horses available for the betterment of the entire sport. I look upon COSA and Bill O'Donnell as being great partners. If you have a problem getting along with Bill O'Donnell, chances are that it is you that is the problem."

Is it just a coincidence that two of the major cogs in the WEG harness structure race secretary Tony O'Sullivan and manager, racing surfaces Brad Maxwell are former successful horsemen?

"Far from it. That is a huge asset in performing their duties. Not only are they extremely knowledgeable in knowing what is required to do their jobs well, they also have a great relationship with the horsemen they serve. It has certainly been a smooth transition for both gentlemen from running successful stables to being successful in their current roles with Woodbine."



WEG likely has the best stakes program of any racetrack in North America, perhaps the world.

"It is something that has grown and evolved over time. I like to think that we possess a perfect mix of stakes events beginning with our late closers, then to the Ontario Sires Stakes and stretching to our major Grand Circuit events including, but far from limited, to the three million-dollar races, the Pepsi North America Cup, the Metro and the Mohawk Million."

Let's speak specifically about the Mohawk Million. It has undergone a rather significant transformation this year.

"After presenting the race successfully for four years, we thought that it needed some tweaking in order to be able to continue. The chief change we instituted was in lowering the buy in price from \$100,000 to \$50,000. The new slot price certainly sparked interest, and instead of struggling to sell all the slots at \$100,000 we had 21 people put their name forward wishing to purchase a slot this year. We received nominations from owners in the U.S., Europe, and Canada including the provinces of Ontario, Quebec and Alberta."

Has the resurgence of the Kentucky breeding and residency program had an adverse effect on your stakes program?

"Undoubtedly it has. Traditionally, after Hambletonian Day at The Meadowlands many of the Grand Circuit stables migrated north with their 2- and 3-year-old stars. Now some of them have decided to head southwest to Kentucky to participate in the lucrative sire stake program offered at the Red Mile. We have made tweaks and adjustments to our summer and Grand Circuit stakes with the hope our races continue to be a priority to all the major stables both locally and from the U.S.

"We aim to be the racetrack where you can race your stakes caliber 2- and 3-year-olds from the beginning of summer through, until the end of September, as the Grand Circuit makes its way to Lexington and on to the Breeders Crown. We are proud to offer the only million-dollar events for 2-year-olds in North America; for pacers in the Metro and the Mohawk Million for trotters. Money is certainly very important, but there is also something to be said for the prestige that comes from winning a grand circuit event."

MONDAY

At the NA meeting tonight, a big topic was loneliness. The leader asked us to raise our hands if we felt lonely. All 11 people in our small group raised their hands, opening the floodgates. A woman who I did not recognize tearfully said that every drug she took, every drink she swallowed, was because she felt lonely and isolated. A lady named Zola told us that unless she was using, she always felt ugly, awkward, and like a freak. Another guy said that in his mind, he never fit in with other people unless high, and being high made him feel like he was a freewheeling adventurer who was now among friends. We all agree our brains are wired differently, wired in a way that makes us lonely and afraid of life.

These feelings run through my brain all the time. When I am high, for a while, I fit in. Suddenly, I'm lovely and intelligent. Of course, this is BS. Drugs are messy, and addictions are false friends, but they are something, something, that makes fear and isolation disappear. For me, it feels like other people, ordinary people, have this magic connection where they relax and get along, and they have some level of trust. Happy, ordinary people annoy me. I envy them. Except for being with my mom, I'm always an outsider.

I found another exception to my loneliness chasm, alone in the barn with the horses. It was a small sample that gave me hope. In the barn, I could feel myself relax. It was a sort of cocoon, and the horses were comforting. Those big, bug-eyed beasts broke down my lonely feelings. They uncoiled my springs. Horses don't judge and don't ask. The horse nonsense Paul is promising has me hoping and praying that they can be an antidote to loneliness.

TUESDAY

Every day, I wonder what Paul has up his sleeve that involves horses. I'm ready for a big letdown. It's probably a scam. He'll ask my mother to buy a couple of racehorses and assign the horse to a licensed trainer. By the way, I learned that a sham trainer for an ineligible trainer is called a beard, like hiding behind a beard. Asking my mother for money is a non-starter. Thanks to my drug habits, lawyer fees, and rehab, my mother sold her house, and we had to move into an apartment. Plus, what does this do for me? I don't give a fig about horse racing. I want to be around horses to see if it helps, not watch them race from afar.

WEDNESDAY

Yesterday was a bad day for me. I was very jittery and felt like bees were buzzing under my skin. I almost bailed on Burger King. It was a coin toss for me to call Paul or my dealer. Paul answered on the first ring and said he would pick me up after my shift and stay with me until the meeting. After work, I hopped into his truck. He drove to a park with a playground. We sat on a bench and watched the kids play.

Today was the second time I called Paul for help. Both times, he was available, which is odd. Since we were not at a meeting and he was in mentor mode, I asked him what he did and how he made a living.

Yikes. Paul said there were four horrible years after he got kicked out of horse racing. He went from a semi-functioning addict to a bottom-of-the-barrel addict, living in his car, stealing, dealing, shelters, and rehab programs. His grandfather paid for lawyers to keep him out of jail twice, and he slept in parks. His life was a blur and constant hustle, the usual grinding netherworld where severe addicts live, a world where every thought is drugs and money for drugs.

The fact he had come so far annoyed me. I snapped at him and said, from there, you are five years sober? How? Spill it, please.

He said that on April 12, 2019, the stars aligned. He was in the NA program for maybe the sixth time, 40 years old, a person with an addiction for half his life. He had nothing. His grandfather died that day. He said his grandfather was a great guy. He was the one who raced trotting horses and raised Paul when his father ran off shortly after he was born. He said his Gramps was kind and thoughtful and believed in second chances. He did not believe in third chances, so he kicked Paul out after his second relapse when he stole from him and would not let him back. He

called the police on his grandson, and Paul didn't blame him. When his grandfather died, his grandmother and mother were alone at the family farm in a big old farmhouse. His granny is in her 80s, and his mother has Parkinson's and needs a wheelchair. They needed him. He needed them, and this was his tipping point. He's five years without slipping and counting.

I said, so you're a farmer.

He chuckled and said, 'Not really. The family leases the farmland.' He said he spends most of his time caring for his mom and Gran, running them to doctors, taking care of the paperwork, meals, laundry, etc. In his spare time, he renovates the house, barns, and a half-mile racetrack his grandpa carved over fifty years ago. Then, he rarely misses NA meetings after supper.

THURSDAY

Now I have some clues. Paul has access to a private track and barns. But he didn't mention any horses. Paul has a place to live and money, although the farm is probably in his grandmother's name. The family farm can't be far away because he attends every night's meeting, and he has a life, a life after addiction. For some strange reason, thinking about his journey and where he is now makes me smile while I'm crying.







Maggie and Marianne Audley – Gold Star Farm

After 58 years of fun, entertainment and live harness racing, Pompano Park sadly closed its doors. Known as the Taj Mahal, and The Winter Capital of Harness Racing, Pompano put the sport on the map with the help of many superstar trainer/drivers, such as Delvin Miller, Billy Haughton, Archie McNeil, Bill Popfinger, Dick Macomber, Stanley Dancer, and many more.

Many track and world records were set at Pompano Park by the four-legged stars, Central Park West, Red Bow Tie, Artsplace,

Peace Corps and Mack Lobell, among others.

At one time, Pompano played host to a stakes series for Floridasired and bred horses and as far back as I can remember several stables dominated every year. The three that stand out in my mind were Laurie Poulin (the Prairie horses), Jay Sears, and Tom and Marianne Audley (Gold Star Farm).

Every year, one or more of their horses would take home the title and purse. Back then, the final leg could go for as much as \$100,000 or more; remember this was 40 years ago.

The mother and daughter team of Marianne and Maggie Audley, who were a permanent fixture at Pompano Park for decades, are my subjects this week.

Although patriarch Tom Audley has passed away, his legacy and the name "Gold Star Farm" continues with his wife and daughter; truly two of the nicest people I've met in the business.

Maggie Audley was born in Waukesha, WI.

"Growing up, my father always preached, 'knowledge is power, and if you ever thought you were the smartest person in the room, you failed," Maggie said. "Dad was always reading training books, equine exercise science publications, and talking to other horsemen, for if something was new or different he wanted to learn about it. My father was an avid believer in interval training. His good friend, Tom Ivers, and dad would spend hours talking about exercise and training skills.

"I was blessed to grow up surrounded by many great men and talented trainers like Tom Simmons and Erv Miller while we were stabled in Illinois; Jim Perry and Tom Brinkerhoff when we wintered at Hawkinsville, and Dr. Melvyn Aylor, Bobby Williams, Jr., and Verlin Yoder, during the 25 years we were at the Gil Crest Training Center."

Stabled at Pompano, Maggie said she was able to watch and learn from some of the best like Wally Hennessey, Jay Sears, Walter Ross, Sr. and Jr., Nick Coblentz, John Hallett, Jeff Schaefer, and Dr. Paul Caputo, trainers, farriers, and veterinarians who were always gracious to answer the questions she asked.

"As a trainer, my dad had 781 pari-mutuel starts and earned a little over \$1.1 million," Maggie said. "He did a little driving, but stuck mainly to training. In 2014, he was inducted into the Florida USHWA Hall of Fame; something he was very proud of.

"When my father died in 2015, I took over the stable continuing dad's legacy and the Gold Star name for that was important to mom and I."

According to Maggie, when Pompano closed in 2022 it was like another death in the family.

"It was life changing, as it was for many horsemen, but as time passes, it hurts a little less," she said. "At Pompano Park I loved, laughed and made lifelong friends from all corners of the globe. It will be forever a place that helped shape me into the person I am today."

Gold Star Rosie sticks out as one of Maggie's best horses.

"When Pompano offered a bonus to trainers whose horse won all of the stakes finals, she went undefeated," Maggie said. "Gold

Star Rockette was the richest and fastest horse. Gold Star Spike was a ridgling, but didn't know it, and Gold Star Mysti was a mess at 2, but finally got it together and in her 4- year-old season she took a track record, which holds today.

"We owned and stood the 2016 Florida USHWA Hall of Fame stallion Rock On, who threw many good offspring, and we also stood the stallion, Mysticism."

Today, Maggie is in Indiana where she is racing program director and charter at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

"I still co-own several broodmares with my mother that stable at the James and Cheyenne Yoder farm in Upland, IN," she said. "Unfortunately, the Indiana Racing Commission rules state that a racing official cannot own horses who race in Indiana, so when I took the job, I had to sell the two horses I co-owned, but I kept Gold Star Aurora, who was my first win as a trainer and my first pari-mutuel win."

Marianne Audley grew up in Philadelphia, PA, and was a novice to the sport of harness racing when she met her late husband Tom.

"He would tell me stories about his grandfather and great uncle who were veterinarians and farmers," Marianne said. "They conditioned racehorses for the trainers at the then Milwaukee Mile and Elkhorn, so Tom was hooked at an early age.

"At the time Tom worked at the sheriff's department. When he met Rick Schroeder in Waukesha, WI, my husband was thrilled to jog horses in his off time. We started racing in Wisconsin at the county fairs with the Schroeders, and the name Gold Star Farm came to be from Tom's job [because he wore a gold star]."

Not long thereafter, Marianne and Tom purchased a farm in Eagle, WI, where they put a half-mile track around the barn and bought a few cheap babies to learn with.

"I primarily worked in the barn and doing the books," Marianne said. "Tom would let me jog the well-behaved ones, but with a young daughter and my five brothers constantly stopping in to volunteer, I rarely got out of the barn. The thing I always loved the most and still do is studying the catalogs and being involved in the breeding end."

Marianne still owns some standardbreds.

"I have Gold Star Igotdis with trainer Stacey Mclenaghan and Corey Braden, and Goldstar Buniholly with Dave Ingraham and Kelly Case.

"I also have two 2-year-olds in training — one is with Nick Coblentz, and one with James Yoder. I get to spend time in South Florida, as well as Indiana, to visit my daughter and the Yoders, who house our broodmares and babies."

Before Tom passed away, Marianne said they had 60 acres and 40 head of horses, ranging from newborns to retirees and today, they own 10 acres, that house, seven retirees and one broodmare.


Marianne said she is continually amazed at her daughter, Maggie.



"Maggie was involved in a scary accident there with one of our 2-year-olds, and when I saw my daughter in braces and casts, I gave her the option to shut everything down. She laughed at me and said there was a zero chance of that happening. After six months of bed rest, physical therapy, and two knee surgeries, she was back in the bike training for the Florida stakes season. Maggie also started a new job and is now the charter at Hoosier Park. I know my husband Tom is very proud of his daughter, as I am."

Neal reflects on special season

Eric Neal enjoyed a season to remember in 2023. The 32-year-old driver was named the Pennsylvania Fair Horseman of the Year after leading the circuit with 68 wins and his .416 driver's rating was fifth best in North America among drivers with fewer than 300 starts.

In addition, Neal and his dad, Randal, campaigned 2-year-old male pacer Always Bet On Me, a \$3,000 yearling purchase who hit the board in all 10 of his races, winning four and finishing second in four. His second-place finishes included the Pennsylvania Fair final.

"It was a real good year," Eric said. "I didn't really plan it or expect it; you just have to let whatever happens happen. I don't know if any one thing stood out last year. It was pretty good all around, and every race you win is special."

Eric, a native of western Pennsylvania who still resides there, never considered doing anything but working with horses while growing up.

"I've been working with the horses for as long as I can remember," Eric said. "I've always wanted to do this. There wasn't any question. I was probably 5 or 6 the first time I jogged a horse with my dad. I'm pretty sure the horse's name was Summer Lad. I was hooked."

Eric got his first driving win in 2008 and has added 439 since then. He has finished in the top 10 for wins on the Pennsylvania fairs circuit nine times, including the past seven years in a row. He has been in the top five on four occasions.

Among his top triumphs were fair finals with Champ Charbel in 2019 and Crumcake in 2015.

"I think driving beats any other job," Eric said. "It's exciting, and if you do well for a trainer, it makes you feel good. They spend all week with their horses putting in the work for you to drive them on race day, and if it's a good day, that's the best feeling to see the work paid off."

If things don't go as planned, Eric has learned not to dwell on it.

"That's helped me as a driver," he said. "Horses have off days; drivers have off days. Some days don't go how you hoped, or the race doesn't go as you hoped, and you've just got to move on to the next one. You can't let something that's happened carry over to your next drive, you have to start every race like it's your first of the day."

Eric and his dad have 12 horses right now. They usually buy two yearlings each fall and found an unexpected gem with Always Bet On Me at the 2022 Standardbred Horse Sale. The son of Betting Line—Sweet Toujours earned nearly \$26,000 last season.

"We didn't even look at him, but for the price, we tried him," Eric said. "He was a surprise. Our other horses were OK last year, but he was our best one. He's a big good-looking colt. He seems OK coming back this year and hopefully he'll be like he was last year.

"I enjoy working with the horses. Every horse has a different personality, and you get to watch them develop from yearlings to racehorses. When we get one like him, it's special. It always is."

In recent years, Eric has not started driving until April or May, but already has 30 starts under his belt at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows this season.

"It's been a little bit more frequent than the last couple years, but otherwise, I'm probably going to keep the same schedule as last year," Eric said. "I don't really set goals, but hopefully I can have another good year this year."

Fourever Boy on course for Borgata at Yonkers

Fourever Boy has raced on a half-mile track only four times in his career but shown he can flourish on the smaller oval. In 2022, he won an elimination of the Little Brown Jug before finishing second to Bythemissal in the final at the Delaware County Fairgrounds, and last year he captured the Charles Juravinski Memorial Cup at Flamboro Downs.

This year, Fourever Boy will give the half-mile circuit at MGM Yonkers Raceway a try. The 5-year-old stallion was among **30 older male pacers nominated** to the track's MGM Borgata Pacing Series, which begins March 18.

"We want to give him a chance in the Borgata," said trainer Tim Twaddle, who co-owns Fourever Boy with Micki Rae Stables. "We'll test the waters and see if he can handle himself. A lot of

it at Yonkers is the draw, so if we can get lucky and he does OK, we'll stick it out. If not, he can always come home."

Twaddle, who is based at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows, has sent Fourever Boy to trainer Linda Toscano for his East Coast stay. He made his seasonal debut Saturday (March 9) at The Meadowlands.

Fourever Boy entered that race with one qualifier under his belt, a 1:55 win at The Meadows on Feb. 27, following several weeks of R&R at Chris Coyle's Olive Branch Farm.

"He had a good break at Chris' place," Twaddle said. "[Horses] always come back looking great from there, and he did. He keeps his weight well anyway, so he looked good when he went, and he looked fantastic when he came back. He's not a big horse by any means, he's average, but he's very nice and thick and fleshy."

Fourever Boy has won 10 of 60 career races, hit the board an additional 19 times, and earned \$937,892. In addition to winning the Juravinski, his triumphs include the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship and a division of the Simcoe Stakes, both in 2022.

Last year, Fourever Boy won the Juravinski, which is restricted to 4-year-olds, in his second start of the season. The son of Sweet Lou—Macharoundtheclock ended the campaign with five victories in 23 races and \$193,239 in purses.

"It was just a so-so year," Twaddle said. "I'm glad we had that big hit right off the bat, that kind of got us through. I put him in for a lot of Grand Circuit events that he probably should have stayed away from and let him mature for another year. It's very tough for 4-year-olds to go against open horses in those big events. Chasing the top guys around wasn't ideal.

"I probably should have managed him a little more conservatively. It didn't hurt him by any means, but he didn't make a lot of money. But it still was fun."

Twaddle is looking forward to seeing what an older Fourever Boy can do this season as the Grand Circuit kicks off with the Borgata, and its companion event for pacing mares, the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series.

"I'm really anxious to see how things go for him at Yonkers," Twaddle said. "I'd just like to get a little lucky with the draw and really give him a good test and see if he belongs or not. We've enjoyed so much being part of the Grand Circuit and traveling

around, I would hate for it to end. So, I hope he can make a good account of himself, and we can keep the ride going."

In addition to having Fourever Boy for the Borgata, Twaddle will send Treacherous Penny to the Matchmaker. Treacherous Penny, a 4-year-old daughter of Captaintreacherous—Penpal, has won nine of 29 career starts and earned \$179,546. She made her seasonal debut Friday (March 8) at Yonkers for Toscano and Zeron in a \$22,000 conditioned pace where she finished seventh from post 7.

"She's really good on a half-mile track; I think that's her forte," said Twaddle, who bought Treacherous Penny in November. "I know it's going to be tough, but she really acts like a nice horse, and with her gate speed I think she can probably overcome bad posts and she's certainly going to take advantage of the good ones.

"I know she's got a tough road ahead of her, but she's coming in nice and fresh. I'm really excited to see what happens with her."

Friday's card started on a rough note after a two-horse accident occurred in the evening's first race.

With the field of eight pacing mares approaching the half, the group got jammed up, which led to Stay Special and driver Jonathan Drury (racing seventh) falling in front of Yes Im Hungry and driver Phil Hudon. Fortunately, both horses and drivers were able to walk off the track under their own power following the incident.

Hudon and Drury both drove in their next schedule race. Drury did eventually book off the remainder of his drives later in the evening.

Harrah's Hoosier Park prepares for 2024 racing season

With the return of live harness racing at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino just two-weeks away, final preparations are well underway throughout the property. The 160-day race meet is set to kick-off on Friday (March 22) as part of Harrah's Hoosier Park's annual fan-appreciation weekend which will consist of a host of giveaways, racing contests and additional on-track promotions.

Live racing at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino will begin with a Friday and Saturday schedule for the first two weeks of the season, before racing a Wednesday through Saturday schedule for the months of April and May. First post for the weekday cards will once again be 6:15 p.m., with the Saturday cards getting underway at 7 p.m.

For those who have not stabled at Harrah's Hoosier Park during the winter months, the barn area opened on Friday (March 1) to horsemen allotted stalls to begin moving in horses and equipment. The main track remains open for training on Monday through Saturday from the hours of 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. for the remainder of the 2024 season. All days of training will be subject to weather permitting. The paddock and ship-in area will also be open for those horsemen wishing to ship in and train. All horses entering the grounds must have all valid paperwork required before being allowed entry to the grounds.

Harrah's Hoosier Park hosted its first qualifier of the season on Saturday (March 9) with 13 qualifying races. Qualifiers will continue to follow a Wednesday and Saturday schedule throughout the entirety of the season at that 10:00 a.m. post time, with the exception of Wednesday (March 20) where qualifiers will begin at 5:00 p.m. and serve as the track's "Dress Rehearsal" prior to opening night. The entry box closes for qualifiers one day prior at noon. Condition sheets and stakes schedules are posted on the Harrah's Hoosier Park website.

In a joint effort between Harrah's Hoosier Park and the Indiana Standardbred Association, horsemen will return to the racetrack to a host of facility enhancements meant to benefit the horsemen's experience at the track. Horsemen moving in were greeted to new LED lighting above every individual stall in the barn area to allow for better visibility while working in the stall. Boosters have been added to the water heaters in each barn as well.

Improvements made as well to the main racing paddocks include the addition of tankless water heaters along with expanding the existing radiant heater system in both paddocks to help fend off the early/late season chill during racing. Horsemen will also have access to Wi-Fi throughout the barn area, including in the racing admin building, paddocks, dormitory, and driver's lounge.

"The Capital projects that we have undertaken during the off-season are projects that were jointly agreed to by the Indiana Standardbred Association and Harrah's Hoosier Park and approved by the Indiana Horse Racing Commission," said Rick Moore, vice president/general manager of racing. "We, the collective we, believe that the addition of these backside improvements will make the barn area at Harrah's Hoosier Park an even better one for horsemen and horsewomen to live, operate and race their horses out of, in what we believe is the best barn area in harness racing."

Entering 2024 off three-consecutive record-breaking seasons for handle, Harrah's Hoosier Park will once again host an extended stakes schedule worth over \$6 million. Harrah's Hoosier Park's signature event, the \$300,000 Dan Patch Stakes presented by Indiana Standardbred Breed Development, is slated for Friday (Aug. 9). The signature trotting event of the season, the \$200,000 Caesars Trotting Classic presented by Kountry Lane Standardbreds is tabbed for Friday (Sept. 20). Other highlights include the return of the Jim Doherty and Peter Haughton Memorials on Sept. 13 along with the Hoosier Champions card on Oct. 11.

Meadowlands to pay all starters in overnight races

The SBOA of NJ board have, at the suggestion of The Meadowlands, approved a pilot program to pay 3 per cent of the purse to those whose horses finish from fifth to last in all overnight races (excluding the MADC races which will continue their current format which has included this policy for years).

The purse distribution percentages will be adjusted to cover the cost and change with the number of starters.

For reference, to date in 2024 there have been 217 (non MADC) races comprised of 1965 (estimated) starters with 846 or 43 per cent of those receiving nothing for their efforts.

Over the past two years The Meadowlands' handle has been buoyed by full fields. Recognizing that the racing is ultracompetitive and that 10 horse fields have previously resulted in five connections receiving no money for their efforts, the hope is that helping to defray the cost of bringing a horse to race will keep horses racing here during the most competitive time of the year in the region.

This project begins with the races of March 15 and 16 and will continue through June 1 at which time the effect will be evaluated and a decision made on its future.

Tactical Approach named New Jersey bred Horse of the Year

Tactical Approach, recently named USTA Trotter of the Year, has been voted as New Jersey Horse of the Year. From the first crop of Tactical Landing, the 3-year-old colt from the Donato Hanover mare Sarcy, won 10 of 19 starts and \$1.5 million, including two legs of the Trotting Triple Crown, the Hambletonian at The Meadowlands and the Kentucky Futurity at Lexington's Red Mile. He topped his campaign by taking the Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park. Additional wins included a New Jersey Sire Stakes, two Kentucky Sire Stakes, the Bluegrass and the Erskine Trot.

Tactical Approach was bred by the partnership of Hunterton Farm and Oakwood Farm and was trained by Nancy Takter and driven by Scott Zeron. He raced under the ownership of Robert LeBlanc, John Fielding, Joe Sbrocco and JAF Racing (John Fodera).

Southwind Farms of Pennington, NJ, has been selected as New Jersey Breeder of the Year. With progeny earnings of \$4,371,181, Southwind was ranked eighth nationally and was led by Breeders Crown winner Southwind Tyrion 1:50.2 (\$984,623), Good Times stakes winner Southwind Coors 3,1:52 (\$247,632), New Jersey

Sire Stakes champion and NJ Classic winner Sig Sauer 2,1:53.3 (\$279,500), as well as stakes winners Southwind Bella p,3,1:50.2f (\$241,039), Southwind Cherry 3,1:52.4 (\$137,590) and seasoned campaigner Southwind Amazon p,1:48.3f (\$1,471,336), who is approaching the all-time win record.

Southwind stallions dominated the trotting ranks in 2023, led by Walner, who led the sires list as leading sire of 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, as well as total progeny earnings of \$11.6 million. Tactical Landing sired two champions in Tactical Approach and Karl, who won over \$1 million at 2, including the Breeders Crown, Valley Victory and Kindergarten final. Champion sire Muscle Hill was third on the sires list with earnings of \$9.9 million and continues to sire top class trotters around the world.

Southwind sires accounted for over 30 major stakes wins in 2023, including the Hambletonian, Kentucky Futurity, Kentucky Filly Futurity, five of six Breeders Crowns, Valley Victory, Goldsmith Maid, James Doherty, Stanley Dancer, Del Miller, Good Times, Zweig Memorial, Peaceful Way, Yonkers Trot, Graduate final, Moni Maker, etc.

Delaware (OH) March 15th payments due

Two-year-old sustaining payments for the 80th edition of the Little Brown Jug, the 55th Jugette, the 73rd Old Oaken Bucket (3-year-old open trot) and the 73rd Buckette (3-year-old filly trot) are due March 15. These payments are for foals of 2022 and will be raced in 2025.

Two-year-olds not nominated in the May 15, 2023 yearling payment, may be made eligible thru a supplemental nomination fee of \$400 due on or before the March 15, 2024 payment. This supplemental payment is in addition to the normal March 15 payment.



Sustaining payments are also due for the 85th Standardbred 2-year-old colt and filly stakes for foals of 2022 to be raced in 2024.

The \$1.2M (est.) Ohio Breeders Championships require a single \$300 (\$100 for the older events) nomination payment due March 15,2024 with no further sustaining payments required.

Also on the Delaware County Fair race schedule are \$20,000 legs of the Buckeye Stallion Series. To nominate to the BSS, a \$250 nomination fee is due with no further sustaining payments required.

The Delaware County Fair is once again pleased to be a part of the Ohio Fair Racing Conference.
