Is more the merrier for the Mohawk Million?

Lower-priced slots drew record interest thanks to a \$500,000 commitment to the purse from WEG and the horsepeople, but that meant some owners – including long-time supporters of the race – were shut out.

When the \$1 million guaranteed Mohawk Million goes behind the gate Sept. 21 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, some of the 2-year-old trotters will likely have owners new to the slot game. A record 21 individuals, farms, and partnerships entered into Wednesday's (March 20) draw for the 10 spots in the 2024 Mohawk Million.

Bill McLinchey of Woodbine Entertainment told HRU that the \$50,000 cost of each slot was reduced from the previous \$100,000 to attract new participants while retaining existing supporters. In 2021, the price was lowered from \$110,000 (U.S.) to \$100,000 (Cdn) for the nine available slots; a 10th had traditionally been held in reserve for the winner of the William Wellwood Memorial.

"We knew after last year it was going to be tough to go back to the same people again, and we knew we had to make a change," said Woodbine's vice-president of standardbred racing. "We threw a couple of different format ideas out, and lowering the price was what we thought would get more interest in the slots, so that's where we landed."

Each has already paid a \$25,000 deposit to hold their slot, with the remaining \$25,000 due on June 3.

Others entered but did not end up with a slot. Al Libfeld, Bertrand and Gilhespy Stable, Bill Pollack, Courant Inc., Daniel Plouffe, Determination, Glengate Farms, Hudson Standardbred, Mark Weaver, Santo Vena, and Steve Held all missed their first chance to secure a place in the big race.

The previous-high number of applicants for slots was nine.

"It was quite a change, so the new price definitely sparked interest," said McLinchey. "A couple [of horse owners] have mentioned that, 'Well, if we have one good enough, we'll have to do some wheeling and dealing to make sure we get in the race.' I'm quite sure there were some who were disappointed they didn't get in the race."

Determination (Serge Godin) of Montreal, QC has been a loyal supporter of the Mohawk Million since its inception, purchasing slots annually since 2020. While not yet winning the race, the stable has sent out runner-up Donna Soprano and Wellwood-winning show finisher On A Streak in 2020, Star Power Hanover (ninth placed eighth) and Mischevious Rose (10th) in 2021, 42-1 place-finisher Silly Me Hanover in 2022, and Emoji Hanover (ninth) and Drawn Impression (10th) in 2023.

Luc Blais, the 2021 O'Brien Award of Horsemanship winner who trains for Determination, said he did not want to comment on this year's Mohawk Million draw, which he was unable to attend.

McLinchey acknowledged how lower-priced slots seemed to put this year's Mohawk Million on the radar of more owners, breeders and trainers, leading to some not getting in for the first time.

"I think we were more nervous going into this draw, just because you want to see everybody get in, but you knew that wasn't going to be possible, and you knew that would leave some people feeling disappointed," McLinchey said. "Everyone had to make a down payment of \$25,000, and if you were out-drawn this week, you're going to get your money back. It doesn't mean you're not going to be in the Mohawk Million. You just might have to get creative on how you get in there."

The format is still a rarity in North American harness racing, although Truro Raceway introduced a slot race in 2023, the \$50,000 Diamond Classic for Maritime-sired 2-year-old filly pacers. Slot races are gaining attention in Australia and New Zealand, with three in 2023, including the “World’s Richest Harness Race” the \$2.1-million TAB Eureka for 3- and 4-year-old Australian-bred pacers. The second edition is slated for Menangle on Sept. 7, 2024. Slots cost \$100,000 per year, and must be purchased for three-year terms.

McLinchey said the Mohawk Million’s slot format came from a thoroughbred race, yet works well for 2-year-old trotters.

“We took the idea and downsized it from the Pegasus at Gulfstream,” McLinchey said. “What makes it unique is not having to name the horse who’s using your slot until, really, the week of the race.”

While this year’s lowered slot price was intended to grow participation and help ensure a strong future for the race, McLinchey said it was not necessarily a change that would continue in 2025. He confirmed that the added money for the Mohawk Million purse is now \$500,000, up from \$100,000 in 2023, which comes from the Woodbine Mohawk Park purse account.

“We wanted to make sure we kept it going and kept the buy-in format, and we wanted to just get more people in,” he said. “Even if we had kept it at \$100,000 and didn’t change anything, we might have been able to sell it out again this year, but I would rather be a year early making a change than a year late.”

It’s more than just a race, added McLinchey. Selling slots and conducting the draw “actually create buzz two or three times throughout the year. Handle-wise, he estimated it was, “probably in our top two or three races bet last year.” (According to SC information, \$425,559 was wagered on the 2024 edition won by T C I).

“As soon as you have a million-dollar purse on a race, that garners a lot of attention for both fans and horseplayers, and horsemen,” McLinchey said. “It’s definitely an event we want to carry on. We certainly think it’s worthy of continuing... There may be tweaks along the way for future editions.”

Introduced in Sept. 2020, the inaugural Mohawk Million was won by Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year Venerate (5, 1:50.1m; \$1,119,667) and driver Andrew McCarthy. The colt’s owners (Pinske Stables and Andy Miller Stable) negotiated a private deal to use the slot originally purchased by Brad Grant.

And that’s the consolation for anyone shut out of a slot in the 2024 Mohawk Million, according to McLinchey.

“I’m pretty sure if someone has a talented 2-year-old trotter and that’s the race they want to be in, they’ll find a way to get in,” he said.

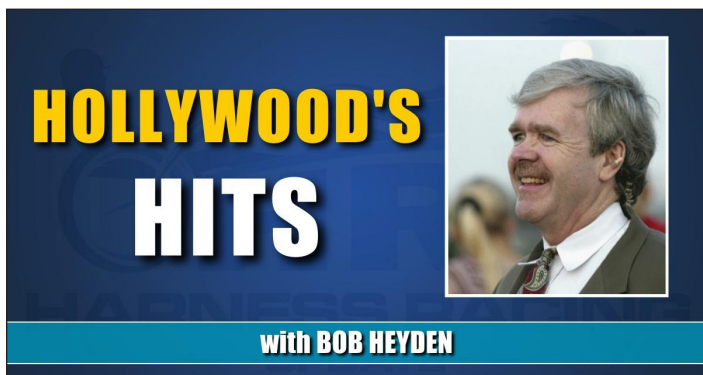

From tragedy to triumph exactly 40 years on

Four decades to the day after his horrific accident at The Meadowlands, Jack Parker, Jr. scored a remarkable triumph.

The best day of the year so far? Easy. It's March 19, 2024, and it's not even close.

Jack Parker, Jr. with just one entered on the card — he trains three, all trotters — at Dover on Tuesday (March 19) won with 9-2 shot Last Glow by a half-length, returning \$11.80. Wife Carol Jamieson-Parker trained the winner.

So, what's so notable about that?

Forty years ago, to the day in 1984, Jack was involved in the single worst accident in The Meadowlands' history. His horse Hope Valley A went down in a five-horse spill. The other drivers — Jim Dolbee, Pat Crowe, Jim Tirone — walked away a little worse for wear but not Jack. Bill O'Donnell was in the race with Wildwood Jeb, and immediately rushed to the scene.

"Jack was bleeding from the eyes, the ears, everywhere, and in convulsions," O'Donnell said. "The rule back then was that you took whoever needed attention to the nearest hospital, but I remember telling the EMS crew that Jack needed Hackensack Medical Trauma Center immediately, and I told them I would take responsibility."

I was there at The Meadowlands that night. I'll never forget the concern/curiosity among the near 13,000 that turned quickly to a respectful hushed silence. Nobody knew. Did we just witness one of our own get killed right before our eyes?

Steve Katz worked then in The Meadowlands publicity/TV department.

"I remember the hospital vigil," Katz said.

Jackie Wing, widow of The Meadowlands' one-time leading driver and Hall of Famer Ted Wing, remembers that night well.

"Cathy [Jack's wife at that time] and Jack bought a house in Paramus about a mile from me two months before the accident," Jackie said. "I was sleeping when Paula Campbell called and said Jack had a bad accident and Cathy needed someone to watch the twins while she went to Hackensack hospital. I went right over and answered calls all night. Friends kept calling to ask if I had any information about how Jack was doing. Cathy had called her 'two moms,' her mother and step-mother, and they both arrived to take care of Chet and Jason. Jack was unconscious for 21 days [officially 19]. Paula Campbell took a deck of cards to Cathy in the hospital every day. I kept checking on Cathy's moms and went food shopping for them. The twins were only 2 years old."

So, everyone was on hold basically. Nobody knew if Jack would make it and if so, what condition he'd be in. The focus for the industry was on helmet legislation.

"Jack's helmet had cracked and rolled completely across the track," O'Donnell said.

Remember, this was just 19 months after Shelly Goudreau's fatal accident in California in 1982 and 28 months before Billy Haughton's fatal accident at Yonkers the first week of July in 1986.

O'Donnell and John Campbell, already the faces of the industry, were soon seen with motorcycle-type helmets as the industry wrestled with the best way to deal with the issue.

Nineteen days later the *New York Times* reported, “Jack Parker, Jr. is off the respirator. He suffered a fractured skull in a five-horse spill at The Meadowlands on March 19. He's out of a coma.”

Now with a plate in his head, Jack said, “I have no memory of the accident. Never did. I do know my parents sat with me the entire time while my sister Lynne took their 15-20 horses to Florida to care for them.”

Before I take you through the rehab, and to today, a little refresher/Google moment on who Jack Parker, Jr. is.

He was born on 7/19/55 and is a third-generation horseman.

His first win was in 1973 and he had his first 100-win season in 1979.

His brother is Howard Parker.

His first million-dollar season, of which there were four, was in 1980.

He also handled such notables as Elitist, Dangarvon, who was on the board to Nihilator in the HOY's last race in the 1985 Breeders Crown at Garden State Park. Hall Of Famer Joe Holloway worked for Jack back then.

He also drove Vereen, Presidential winner Whiteys Fella, Computer, Boone And Crockett and even a spin with former employee Joe Holloway's fabulous filly She's A Great Lady.

His good friend Dave Palone said, “Love Jackie. Sad [about] the accident. I shared a barn with him at Garden State. We had a dead heat for win together, Jackie drove Village Jackpot and I had my own T D Escort.”

JoAnn Looney King said, “[My husband, Jim King, Jr. and I] were there that night. I knew Jackie since we were kids. It was awful that night; especially all the confusion. Was he dead or alive?”

Ron Pierce was in California early in 1984 and so was Jack's brother Howard.

“I sure remember that night and after,” Pierce said. “Howard was very concerned.”

Now, about the rehab, the progress, anything.

O'Donnell said, “Jack was in rehab right after he left the hospital. He was in there two maybe three days and checked himself out. He was one tough guy. He willed himself back. He did it.”

Bonnie Butler drove at The Meadowlands then and is currently a retired professor from Rutgers. She also noticed Jack's desire to get back.

“This shows Jack's tenacity to come back from a devastating injury and his devotion to a sport that doesn't wear thin with time,” she said.

Four and a half months after the accident, Jack drove again. Aug. 2, 1984, two days before the Hambletonian, he handled I'm A Wanderer to victory in his very first drive back and received a well-deserved standing ovation from the entire paddock. He was moving gingerly, but the desire never waned.

“I didn't feel any different when I came back,” Jack said. “Actually, I felt the same.”

Jack and Carol live in Delaware, about 15 minutes from Harrington Raceway. Jack is not only not an attention seeker, he's an attention avoider. Never one for the spotlight and a man of few words. He concentrates mostly on trotters these days, “with the occasional pacer here and there.”

In 2018 he made the Breeders Crown final with the best horse he's ever owned N F Happenstance, 33 years after racing at Garden State Park in the Breeders Crown 3YOCP with Dangarvon.

Now, here we are 40 years later. He was 28 then, 68 now and still at it. Jack never knew time off, study halls or slacking. He's that same guy amazingly today. And quietly he won a race on March 19 this year, and against the best drivers too; Corey Callahan was second (Speed Away), Tim Tetrack fourth (Crystal Fashion) and Tony Morgan eighth (The Fast Lane). I'm not at all sure how long Jack and Carol will be doing this. I am positive though that he won't be doing anything else, no matter what stands in the way.

A conversation with Jody Jamieson

“There was a time when I felt that harness racing is all about winning races” said driver Jody Jamieson. “Don’t get me wrong. It is still probably the most important thing. But there are other areas of near as much importance. There is nothing like developing a young horse that goes on to win great races. I haven’t done it yet myself, but I’m certain that breeders find great pride in breeding and raising one that goes on to great accomplishments on the race track. I’m now 47 years old; I’ve been very fortunate in this game. I’ve been the recipient of great opportunity, firstly from my dad and then from numerous horsemen who allowed me to drive for them. In doing so, I’ve been fortunate enough to sit behind some of the greatest horses our sport has ever seen.”

Let’s start at the beginning. You were in effect born in a feed bucket. You’ve known and been around horses all of your life. Your dad Carl is a well-known and well-accomplished Hall of Famer. His dad, although more of a horse trader, also trained horses that passed through his hands.

“I’ve been extremely fortunate in having the father that I have. He is first and foremost a great father and now a great grandfather. He is also a great horseman. He not only imparted his great knowledge to me, but he also created great opportunity to my career. He started using me to

drive his horses and also encouraged others to take a chance on me as well. As those who know him know that he is an extremely direct person. There is nothing wishy washy about him. What you see is exactly what he is. He can do anything, from fixing a car that won’t start to getting a horse that others may not be able to get going, to becoming a star on the racetrack. I like to think that he has imparted some of his great knowledge and talent to me.”

You’ve been at it for some time. What have been your greatest thrills in the business?

“I suppose you might think that winning great races like the Maple Leaf Trot, the Metro and the Breeders Crown would probably be the answer. Don’t get me wrong, they certainly rank up there. But both my number one and number two thrills of my career in harness racing relate to my dad. Number one was when he won the Gold Cup and Saucer, the number one race in the Maritimes and to me the top race in Canada with

Banner Yankee. That's a race that has thus far escaped me and is number one on my bucket list. I was unable to be there, but John Campbell, Brian Sears, Ronnie Pierce, George Brennan and me were listening to it on my flip top phone. The thrill of his victory was indescribable. I still shed a tear of joy when I think of it.

"Number two was dad's installation in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. I was so very proud. I thought that all the hard work, blood, sweat and tears were finally being justly rewarded."

Among your many virtues you are known as being a fan favorite at Mohawk. When you win a major race, you often parade your horse alongside the fence and share high fives with the fans on your way to the winner's circle.

"That is something that I really enjoy doing. I would like to think that the fans really enjoy it as well. Like most good things in life, I didn't develop it myself. I learned from someone else. I'm an avid Toronto Maple Leafs' fan. When I started going to their games they had a player by the name of Ken Klee. After one game as the players were coming off the ice I reached out to Klee. He fist bumped me in return. I thought to myself, 'That was great. If I ever have the chance to do something similar in harness racing I will.' That is how the process evolved.

"At last year's Gold Cup and Saucer Jordan Stratton paraded his winning horse Covered Bridge before just about every fan in the place. It was something that you really had to see to appreciate how great it was."

You are now training a stable of horses as well as driving regularly at Mohawk.

"Wayne Smith and I have six horses that we will be racing this spring and summer. We have one colt that I think a whole lot about. Dad and Brian Paquet saw this Muscle Mass colt named Dion Seelster at the London Classic yearling sale in 2022. They bought him for \$70,000. The truth of the matter is that I didn't particularly like him. I guess that was mostly because he has four white legs. I hadn't had much luck previously with horses marked that way, so I decided that I didn't like him. He trained extremely well down to 2:25 at 2. He then developed a small bump on a tendon. We had him ultra sounded and it was found that he had a three-inch tear on the tendon. Of course he couldn't race at 2. The diagnosis was that he needed a year off. Dad left him with me this winter and he has now qualified and is in to race. So far, so good, fingers crossed.

"Sadly, his co-owner and our great friend Brian Paquet passed away this year. We changed his name. He is now named Paquet. If he turns out to become as great a horse as his namesake was a man, there is no telling how good he will become."

"I'm not sure I would use the term 'one of' [the best] in describing [the Mohawk drivers' colony]. Night in and night out it might be the very best one. I know I'll probably get flak for this. Sure, the colony at The Meadowlands is great, probably the very best from April through November. But it's seasonal. You have been fortunate enough to have driven numerous very good horses and some great ones. What about some?

"If I were categorizing the best ones, the best pacer would undoubtedly be Bulldog Hanover. He was very, very special. A horse that is the fastest ever would have to be, of course. One thing among the many special things about him is that he never got tired.

"The best trotter would be Mister Herbie with whom I won the Maple Leaf Trot. The best pacing mare would be Put On A Show. She was extraordinary. The best trotting mare was probably Frenchfrysnvinegar. We won the Breeders Crown together."

"I truly believe that Captains Quarters can become the best I've ever sat behind. That's saying something as I've driven Warrawee Needy to 1:46:4 life mark and got to sit behind Lather Up in a couple races at Mohawk and drive Bulldog for most of his younger career."

Let's talk about the drivers' colony at Mohawk. It has gradually developed into one of the best ones out there.

"I'm not sure I would use the term 'one of' in describing it. Night in and night out it might be the very best one. I know I'll probably get flak for this. Sure, the colony at The Meadowlands is great, probably the very best from April through November. But it's seasonal. Here we have a bunch of guys who I have no doubt would acquit themselves well just about anywhere. Most of them are fairly young and are just approaching peak form.

"At the top is James MacDonald, not far behind are Louis-Philippe Roy, Dougie McNair, Sylvain Fillion, Bob McClure and Trevor Henry. Those guys could drive and acquit themselves well just about anywhere. There are a few young bucks in the wings like Andrew Sorrie, Tyler Borth, Tyler Jones and Trevor Cullen who don't need too many lessons on how to drive a horse. I hope I haven't left anyone off. If I have, I will surely hear of it."

The other day at Sunshine Meadows I saw a little guy looking anywhere from 8 to 12 years old sitting in the bike behind one of Carl Jamieson's colts. He looked as though he had been poured into the bike, so perfect was his seat. I asked who that kid was. Ted Smith told me that he is Jett, your son.

"It's interesting that you mention how good his seat in the bike is. Last summer Mark Steacy said that he had seen Jett behind one of our horses and he said that he appeared to have a perfect seat in the bike. Up until I began driving Bulldog Hanover Jett's interest in the horses was kind of minimal. He was absorbed with hockey at which he is pretty proficient. He's a very good hockey player even though it's his dad saying so, but we do not know how good yet. He is 11 years old and might be too small to reach a higher stage. But he will grow. Time will tell.

"In the years since Bulldog came along he has become similarly interested in the horses and harness racing. Where he goes in the future is up to him. And whatever talent and desire he may possess, whatever road he pursues, I'll always try to tag along and be available for any help and support I might lend."

Other than your dad, are there any other people in the business who you think highly of and might place on a pedestal?

"There are many. This sport is loaded with top people. There are three that come immediately to mind. Blair Burgess is a great horseman. He is smart and ultra patient. He has developed numerous champions, many of them from humble beginnings. The jobs he did with Glidemaster and Western Ideal in particular, where he was faced with challenging circumstances were something that few if any other horsemen could have achieved.

"I kind of feel that Mike Lachance was a special influence on my career. I think of him as part of the reason why I won the Jug with Tell All in 2007. I had won the first heat and was as nervous as I ever had been before the final. I kept thinking I was going to screw things up and get beat. Mike walked by and sensed something was wrong. He asked what was bothering me. I told him. He said 'That's not a problem. You will drive him the best you can. If he gets beat, he gets beat. What's the worst outcome? Win or lose you will still be a good young driver with a great future ahead of you.' That little talk steadied my frayed nerves and we were able to win the race.

"Another that comes to mind is Myron Bell. Opposed to what some people might believe, Myron is a kind, highly intelligent man possessed of as much horse knowledge as anyone I have ever known. He has gone out of his way to give opportunities to young people who he believes to be talented. He possesses two qualities that I greatly admire. He is both loyal and compassionate. As his wife Stephanie is fond of saying about Myron, 'If you don't like Myron, then you don't know him.'"

It's rumored that in addition to being a better than fair harness driver that you are a much better than average cook.

"Maybe I am, because the two harshest critics I know, my kids, say that I am. The proof is in the eating because they enjoy eating what I cook for them. I first began to cook during COVID when I was looking for things to do. I watched some cooking shows on television. There were some items that interested me, so I cooked them. They usually turned out well and my enjoyment for cooking increased.

"My mom says I make a terrific risotto. I suppose the dish the kids enjoy most is my spaghetti a la carbonara. It's a rather simple dish made of only five ingredients, pasta, pancetta, eggs, cheese and pepper. I guess the trick to making it taste good is how the ingredients are utilized."

Will Leap To Fame go to the U.S.?

Owner Kevin Seymour answers that burning question in an exclusive with Harness Racing Update.

It is the burning question much of Australia and many from the world have been asking owner Kevin Seymour: Will Down Under pacing sensation Leap To Fame go and take on the world?

Speaking exclusively to Harness Racing Update, Seymour said as tempting as it was on some levels to take Leap To Fame to the U.S., it won't happen.

Seymour is a hugely successful businessman and features in Australia's richest 250 list, but he has quelled his burning competitiveness when it comes to the best horse he's been involved with across more than 50 years in harness racing.

"Don't worry, there's a deep-down feeling of 'Gee, wouldn't it be good to go to the U.S. and see if he can beat the best in the world,'" Seymour said. "But the head rules the heart on this one and the cons out-weight the pros."

It's clear Seymour has thought seriously about it, reaching out to his many contacts, including trainer Ross Croghan for a steer.

Noel Daley is another who has suggested Seymour is better off keeping Leap To Fame Down Under.

"The first thing that struck me is how much awareness there is about Leap To Fame in the U.S.," Seymour said. "Everybody I've had contact with or who has reached out to me tells me he's big news over there, too."

"Ross [Croghan] emailed after his Miracle Mile win saying he was the talk of racing in the U.S. He said horses don't perform any better than Leap To Fame did that night. He pleaded with me to leave the horse here. Ross said we're beating many of the best already and don't have anything to prove. Leap To Fame (Grant Dixon) will not be leaving Down Under to test the waters in North America.

"Even last week, Noel [Daley] was on the Brisbane radio pretty much saying what Ross did. You've got to respect and listen to guys like them, who know the industry here and over there. Noel talked about the risk of transporting him, the potential of him getting sick and the fact we are racing for such good money here [in Australasia] now, it wouldn't be for the dollars we'd go to the U.S."

"Many people, who have a broader and more learned view of world harness racing, say he's the best horse in the world right now and that's enough for us... We don't need to take him to the other side of the world to prove it."

Then there's Seymour's broader view of what Leap To Fame has and can continue to do for Australian harness racing, along with his broader motto in the game.

"It's not what the sport can do for us, but what we can do for the sport," he has often said.

Those are pretty impressive words.

And, in Seymour's case, they certainly aren't just words.

"That's why we've taken to places like Cranbourne and Newcastle and Redcliffe up here... to take him to the people," he said. "I think back to one of the greatest and most loved horses of all-time in Australia, Paleface Adios back in the 1970s. Colin Pike [trainer/driver] used to take him everywhere, into pubs, local events, you name it. He even took him right up to Townsville [far north Queensland] once. He helped make the horse a celebrity."

"In less than a year in the big league, Leap To Fame has already developed a huge following and become a modern-day people's horse. The number of people from interstate and overseas who have written to us about him is incredible. But it really hit home the other day when Kay [Seymour's wife] and I were at the local shopping center and several people came up to us asking us about Leap To Fame and saying how much they loved him."

"That gives you a lump in the throat, to think a horse can have that sort of cut-through. I don't think there are many people in

Queensland who wouldn't know who Leap To Fame is and it has been a long time since we've been able to say that about a horse. I think he can spark a real resurgence in harness racing, especially in Queensland."

This isn't just Seymour saying it.

Leading Queensland sports writer Ben Dorries said: "Of all the great things Leap To Fame is doing, I think the biggest is how he's transcending racing. People know Leap To Fame, who may never have watched a race."

Simply, Seymour believes Leap To Fame can do more for harness racing Down Under by staying here rather than chasing global success.

It revives memories of the debate around former champion throughout mare Winx, who last decade won 36 of her 42 starts, the last 33 in succession, including 25 at the Group 1 level. She banked over \$24 million.

Winx is regarded as one of the greatest horse's full stop Australia has produced.

Many argued both during and after her career that she should've gone to race against the world's best in Europe, Hong Kong or the U.S., but she didn't.

Instead, she introduced and engaged an enthusiastic army of fans year-after-year as she plundered Australia's biggest races.

It seems the same debate will rage during and after Leap To Fame's career.

"I don't say this lightly, but we don't need the money," Seymour said. "Leap To Fame's success is about enjoyment and doing what we can to help an industry we love.

"It's a luxury Kay and I have and we're enjoying it."

The furthest Leap To Fame will do is "across the ditch" as we call it Down Under, that's from Australia across to New Zealand.

It is growing more likely by the day that Seymour and trainer/driver Grant Dixon will tackle the iconic New Zealand Cup at Addington Raceway in Christchurch on the second Tuesday in November.

Despite the success of the slot races and iconic events like the Miracle Mile, Inter Dominion and Hunter Cup, the NZ Cup is top of the tree in this part of the world.

It’s the ultimate to Kiwis and a dream for Aussies.

Last year, the New South Wales-trained Swayzee became just the second Aussie-trained winner of the NZ Cup since 1987.

Leap To Fame can make it two in a row this year.

“The NZ Cup is a special race and it’s a very special race day,” Seymour said. “There’s nothing bigger in this part of the world than the NZ Cup.

“It’s two-fold for us. It’s another great chance to take him to the people, a new audience, a harness racing loving audience in NZ. And it’s also important with his stallion career in mind. His future and reputation in NZ would go to a whole new level if he could win their biggest race.”

Emeraude de Bais is still in great shape

Vincennes racetrack in Paris opened its gates again on Friday (March 22) for a short spring meeting. There were some nice races on the Saturday (March 23) card, in particular.

Benjamin Goetz-trained **Emeraude de Bais** (Repeat Love) had a splendid winter in Paris where she participated in both the Prix d'Amérique and Prix de France, before she finished second to Vernissage Grif in the Criterium de Vitesse two weeks ago.

In Saturday's \$100,000 Prix du Bois de Vincennes, the 10-year-old mare entered the race as the best merited trotter and after a perfect drive by Franck Nivard, Emeraude de Bais disarmed a strong Horsy Dream a few meters before the wire in a mile rate of 1:55.2 over 1.7 miles. The strong mare will later travel north to Åby in Sweden, for the final of Paralympiatriavet in early May.

Do you remember Belina Josselyn? The chestnut mare who won the Prix d'Amérique with trainer Jean-Michel Bazire in 2019 now has her offspring **Liza Josselyn** (Ready Cash) racing in France, and in the \$75,000 Prix de Chatillon, the well-bred 3-year-old filly claimed her fourth win in five attempts in a mile rate of 2:00 over 1.6 miles. We can suppose that her name will be mentioned several more times during this season.

PHOENIX PHOTO UPSETS IN GOLD FINAL

High On Pepper, the horse of the winter in Sweden, entered Saturday's (March 23) \$105,000 Gold division final with eight consecutive wins and was obviously the big favorite, but a final means that all the best horses in each division meet and Svante Ericsson's 10-year-old gelding **Phoenix Photo** (Super Photo Kosmos) proved that winter has turned to spring even in the northern European country. The month of March means that horses are allowed to race without shoes (prohibited between Dec. 1 and March 1) again. Phoenix Photo races better with no shoes on and when Björn Goop was eager in his hunt for the lead, and succeeded as the race opened up with advantage for the leader. High On Pepper advanced to a position first over, but he couldn't challenge and was a beaten horse at the top of the stretch.

Phoenix Photo cruised to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:54.2 over 1.3 miles and the Swedish V75-circuit is all about stories like this. Older horses can make ends meet even if the "big money" years, for young horses, are long gone.

The following five days, I was sick, sicker than usual. At some point, my mother took me to Urgicare, where a stout woman with a European accent suggested that I wasn't only dope sick but that I had a nasty virus that was going around. She gave me a Z-Pac (note to readers: withdrawal is like a bad case of the flu). So, it has been 10 days without writing in this journal, without working (the Burger King job is toast), without NA meetings, and with a lot of bad, boring television for anesthesia, just lying on the couch feeling like shit. Back where I started. For the second time, I screwed my chance at working with horses.

I found myself standing at the NA meeting and saying I messed up, but I am here tonight, and the room joined me in saying, I will keep coming back.

The thing about NA is nobody was surprised at my screw-up. I did not need any explanations, excuses, or justifications. Everyone in the room had been there and back many, many

I know Paul called my mother at least once during my lovely 10-day excursion. I had not seen anyone since the relapse. At the meeting, we split into smaller groups, and he was not in mine, so he slipped a note into my hand during the chaos of people dragging chairs and shifting rooms. I read the note when I got settled in the basement session.

I will pick you up at noon tomorrow; dress for barn work.

TUESDAY

I was waiting on my mom's front steps when Paul's dark blue pick-up truck pulled into her driveway at 11:55. I hopped in. He

did not ask any questions, and finally, I broke the ice and asked if he fired me from my imaginary horse job. He smiled and shook his head. That was a relief because I never lost a real job and a pretend job on the same day.

We drove in comfortable silence to his grandmother's farm. He steered toward the first barn, stopped the truck, and I followed him into the barn. In the first stall was a young bay horse, beautiful, with bug eyes and a white dot on the forehead. The horse cautiously dangled its massive head over the stall gate.

Paul said I was looking at a yearling filly. Her name was Stagger LeAnn, but we could change her name. He asked if I was ready, and I nodded.

WEDNESDAY

Paul picked me up today at 10 in the morning. I told him my mother would bring me to his farm every morning. He nodded and said that was fine, but he hadn't worked out a schedule, and things would be flexible until the other horses arrived and we got into a routine.

I asked him why and how Annie ended up in the stall (it took me 10 seconds to nickname her) before the yearling sales. He explained.

He noticed a yearling was going for sale at an online auction. The owner's comments included pictures of a battered front leg, a swollen rear leg, and a sentence saying that this yearling got into mischief in the field and tangled with a fence. The advertisement said they were selling before the upcoming sales, and anyone interested should check out her pedigree. Paul said he drove two hours to inspect her before the auction, and she was okay, but her legs were a mess. Paul offered the owner \$10,000 for the horse. The owner said he thought she would bring more in the online sale scheduled for three days.

Using his mother's last name, Paul was ready when the bidding began at noon. The opening bid was \$5,000. His winning bid was \$7,400. Paul drove out to get her and pay the owner that day.

THURSDAY

My mom had a group of three from her church over to play Pinochle, but one lady got sick at the last minute, so they recruited me to play. It was fun. We played until midnight, so I am not writing much tonight. When the ladies gathered their things, I stretched and said I had to get up early tomorrow and take care of my new horse. I do not know why I said such a random thing, but somehow, saying those words felt awesome.

A conversation with third-generation horsewoman Victoria Stratton

Born in Hamilton, ON, Victoria Stratton grew up in York in Haldimand County on the family farm where her grandfather and mother both trained standardbreds.

"Although I wasn't allowed to do much with the horses when I was young, it wasn't until I was 17 that I was properly introduced to the business," Stratton said. "I learned a lot from the Whalen family – Jim, Judy and Gareth – and loved it so much that I went all in. I married my husband, trainer/driver Cory Stratton during COVID in April 2020 and we began working as a team. We train our horses together.

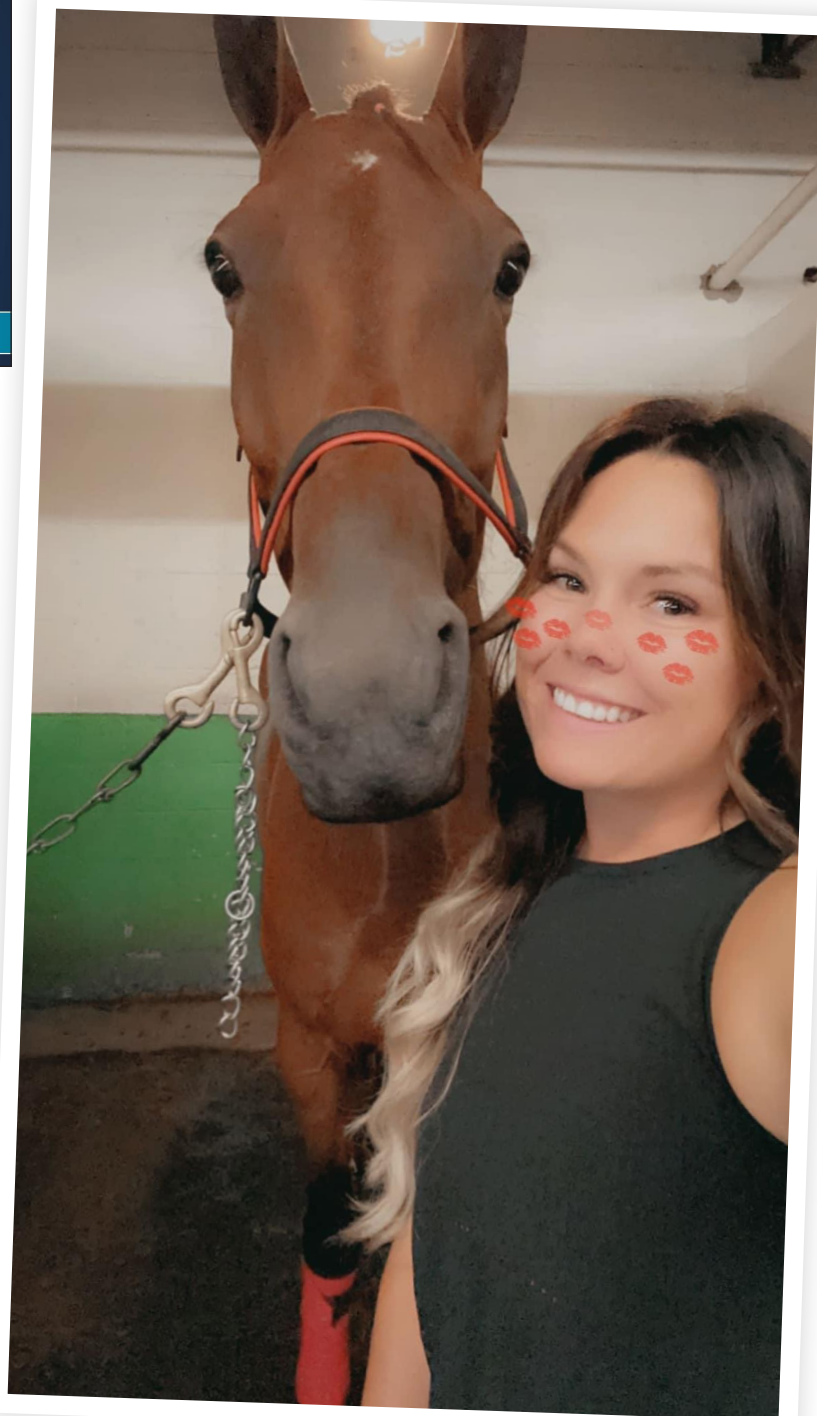
"Cory and I do a lot of track work, but I mainly run the back end of the business making sure everything is running smoothly."

Do you drive the horses in a race?

"Occasionally I drive. [I drove Dance Monkey in an amateur race at The Meadowlands on March 8] and a horse named Sports Fan, in an all-women's race for International Women's Day, but I am still learning, so right now it's just for fun. Driving in a race is so much different than training and in the past it has always been a 'man' thing. But so many women have stepped up to the plate and showed the world that women can drive, too.

"My focus is on training, but I do enjoy driving as well. I don't drive enough to pursue a career in it, nor would I want to, but it's like anything else in life, you improve with experience.

"My husband, Cory, does do some driving, as does his brother, Jordan. I wish my husband would do more driving because when Jordan has other commitments, I think Cory knows our horses better than putting a different driver up every week."

Where do you stable and race your horses?

"We train at Mark Ford Training Center and race at Yonkers, The Meadowlands and Pocono."

How many horses do you currently train?

"Presently we have approximately 34 horses total."

Who is your fastest horse?

"I have been blessed to train and sit behind some pretty fast horses, but I would say Idealsomemagic is the fastest I owned and trained. Last year in Saratoga he tied the track record in a sizzling 1:50 flat.

"Fun story, when we imported 'Magic' and began training him down, every time I went to train him something would happen; like he would lose a shoe, etc.

"I told my husband 'I think I'm a jinx sitting behind him to train,' and evidently it was Magic's way of telling us he wasn't ready to qualify. Horses are very smart and if trainers would listen to them more, they would save a lot of time and trouble."

Who is your all-time favorite racehorse?

"My favorite is What's Stanley Got A. He is a sweetheart who is always willing and obliged to do whatever I ask of him. He has been that way ever since the day when he came to us after his quarantine.

"Another was a trotter we bought as a yearling. He was a Trixton colt named Beam Me Up who was quite a looker. Unfortunately, he ended up having complications after he was castrated and we had to put him down. It was one of the hardest things I had to do in my life, so in memory of him I got a tattoo with his face markings."

Do you prefer trotters or pacers?

"Definitely trotters, for they are more challenging and rewarding. Trotters give you more gray hairs but when you have a good one there is nothing better."

What has been your most exciting time?

"My most exciting time is when we ship our babies to train and race. There is nothing more satisfying than seeing all of the time and work you put into the babies all winter and seeing them make it to the races."

Do you have any superstars in the making?

"It really is a bit early to answer that question but we do have a pretty impressive group of babies this year. I'm eager for the summer to get here and see what we got."

Your husband Cory is making a name for himself.

"Cory is a dedicated, ambitious man who, like his brother, has made a name in the sport. He was born into the sport as his father David and mother Jeanine both worked for Billy Haughton before going on their own.

"Cory has had success with the mare Easy To Please who was victorious in a leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker and finished third in the final. This was Cory's first stakes win as a trainer. Easy to Please also finished fourth in her Breeders Crown elimination."

What women do you look up to the most in harness racing?

"That would be Lauren Tritton. She proves that a woman can compete with the guys on the track and keeps amazing me."

What do you think we can do to improve our sport?

"I think harness racing needs more younger people to get involved. Sadly, there aren't many kids today following their family's tradition like they did years ago. I think we need to make it more enjoyable for families to come and watch the races. Having such late post times doesn't warrant families to bring younger kids to the races."

What are your future plans?

"My future plans are just to go with the flow and see what happens. Hopefully find a few amateur trotters this spring to buy and to give the amateur circuit a try. Other than that, hopefully our stable will have a successful year and win some big stake races; and to shift the focus more to racing stake horses and babies, and fewer claimers."

No repeaters in round two of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

Intothemysticmoon and driver Yannick Gingras blasted to the front on the opening turn and never looked back in posting a mild upset in the first of three \$40,000 divisions in the second round of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (March 22). It was the second win of the season for the 5-year-old daughter of Artspeak trained by Mickey Burke, Jr.

Gingras had post 6 with Intothemysticmoon and was assertive at the outset while Coachellabound N and Brent Holland left well from post 2 to keep outside rivals at bay. Once Gingras crossed over, Coachellabound N got steppy midway on the opening bend, giving Karma Seelster and Jordan Stratton the ability to tuck in the second position. Intothemysticmoon had the front in :28.1 at the quarter, and 1-2 favorite Incaseyoudidntknow and Andrew McCarthy came off the pylons on an expected first-over journey midway on the second turn.

Gingras was able to get a comfortable half of :56.4 with the 3-1 second choice, and Intothemysticmoon was unchallenged as she picked up the pace on the third turn as the favorite struggled to make up ground. After three-quarters in 1:25.1, Gingras called on his mare, and she responded with a solid :28.3 final quarter to win convincingly. Karma Seelster held late for second, while Incaseyoudidntknow held third ahead of Coachellabound N.

Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci and Phil Collura, Intothemysticmoon returned \$8.30 to win while keying a \$35.40 exacta, \$80.50 triple and a \$12 superfecta for a 10-cent wager.

Speed and upsets continued in the second \$40,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division as **Jive Dancing A** and Matt Kakaley dominated from start to finish, taking advantage of the pole position to win wire-to-wire as the 7-2 second choice in the field of six mares. Trained by Tahnee Camilleri, Jive Dancing A scored in 1:52.3 for her first win in two 2024 starts.

Jive Dancing A left alertly and forced 1-5 favorite Dougs Babe A to take a seat in the 3-hole on the opening bend. Kakaley got Jive Dancing A to the quarter in :27.3 and kept the pace lively, hitting the half in :56.2 with horses in straight alignment.

Jive Dancing A was still motoring towards three-quarters when Dexter Dunn, behind the heavy choice Dougs Babe A, attempted to make a coverless bid. That bid was rebuffed in short order as Jive Dancing A sprinted home in a :28.2 final quarter to complete the mile. Dougs Babe A held her ground for second, with Easy To Please and Man Dontforget Me third and fourth across the wire, respectively.

Owned by Queen Of Hearts Stables and Lav Racing Stable, Jive Dancing A, a 10-year-old by Rock N Roll Heaven, returned \$9.70 to win and led a \$20.80 exacta, \$42.60 triple and \$3.72 superfecta for 10 cents.

The favorite came to play in the final \$40,000 division of the Blue Chip Matchmaker when odds-on choice **Mikala** quarter-moved to the top for driver George Brennan and controlled the remainder of the pace, scoring in 1:53.2 for trainer Nick Drennan.

Delitfulcatherin N and driver Jordan Stratton blasted right to the front as the wings opened with Tony's Mom, the 5-2 second choice, grabbing the pocket as Brennan left patiently with Mikala. Once the field had aligned, Brennan made his move abruptly and had Mikala, a daughter of Always B Miki, moving with purpose to get control before the :27.2 opening quarter. Once on the lead, Brennan capably stalled the half to :56.3 and awaited challengers.

Gingras and Tony's Mom pulled shortly before the three quarters, with first leg winner Lit De Rose on her back, but neither posed a serious threat to the winner, who clicked three-quarters in 1:25.1 and appeared quite comfortable heading into the final turn.

Brennan asked Mikala for her best in the stretch, and she responded with a :28.1 final quarter to garner her third win in four starts this year and first victory in the series following a third-place finish in the opening leg. Stratton had ample clearance with Delitfulcatherin N, and the mare held solidly for second, with Lit De Rose advancing to third and Sale El Sol hugging the pylons in fourth over the line.

Mikala is owned by Davino, Shackman, Anthony Perretti Farm and Drennan Stable. As the even-money choice, Mikala paid \$4.20 to win with the exacta worth \$23.40, triple payoff \$49.60 and the 10-cent superfecta returning \$25.05.

The Blue Chip Matchmaker prelims continue through Friday (April 12) before the \$125,000 added final takes place on Monday (April 22).

MGM Yonkers Raceway's stakes action continues on Monday (March 25) with the second leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series. Four \$50,000 divisions will be featured on the program. Live racing takes place at Yonkers on a Monday-Friday schedule with post time each night at 7 p.m. (EDT).

Beckwith takes Big M feature by driving 'Smart'

Despite being just 21 years of age, Brett Beckwith has been distinguishing himself on the harness racing scene, and Friday night (March 22) at The Meadowlands, he gave a drive that would be the envy of any seasoned veteran to **Smart As Hill**, who pulled off an upset in the featured \$17,000 Play Meadowlands Series final for mid-range conditioned trotters.

Sent to the gate as a 24-1 outsider, Beckwith, currently No. 2 in all of North America with 143 dash wins, had Smart As Hill last in the field of seven past the quarter and the half, as another longshot, 50-1 chance Hoofbeats De Vie, was dictating the pace.

Lindys Irishcream then came calling first-over as Amador and Papa Doc got into the live flow, giving Beckwith an opportunity to get into contention by scooting up the inside along a now-vacant rail.

"The draw limited me," said Beckwith. "I didn't have many options with the 7-hole. There were quite a bit of horses who drew inside that all factored really well in there."

Beckwith opted to keep Smart As Hill at the rail as the action got more intense, and found himself in the pocket at three-quarters behind a vulnerable Hoofbeats De Vie, who had cut out fractions of :27.3, :56.4 and 1:26.4.

"It worked out really well," said Beckwith. "The rail kept opening up and when I ended up on [Troy Beyer's] back off the last turn, I was making up a lot of ground without having to use much of my horse's energy."

In deep stretch, Smart As Hill found room along the cones and surged to the lead, as Papa Doc and Amador were closing in. But the wire came just in time, as Smart As Hill won it by a neck over Amador in 1:55.1 with Papa Doc third.

"I knew I had a shot at it if something opened up," said Beckwith. "Luckily, it did."

Smart As Hill, an 8-year-old gelded son of Muscle Hill—Smarty Pants owned by It's All Good Racing, returned \$50.80 to win as the sixth choice in the wagering. The Bruce Lauer trainee now has 18 career wins from 116 starts, good for earnings of \$337,366.

A LITTLE MORE: Native Australian Madeliene Young made her first career drive at The Meadowlands a winning one, guiding Somiki to an off-the-pace score as the 2-1 second choice in the eighth race, a Meadowlands Amateur Driving Club event. Dave Miller won the track's "Driver of the Week" award and threw his hat in the ring for a second-straight trophy after leading the driver colony with four victories on the card. The 59-year-old Hall of Famer has now won at least three races on three straight programs and has a total of 12 winner's circle visits over the last four cards. He currently is far in front in The Big M standings with 45 wins. All-source handle on the 14-race program totaled \$2,756,042.
