At age 7, Charlie May set to make Borgata series debut

With a new trainer and a solid record on half-mile tracks, the double millionaire is poised to tackle the multi-leg series at Yonkers.

Fresh off a 1:49.1 win in just his third start of the year, Charlie May is set to make his debut in the MGM Borgata Pacing series when the first preliminary legs start on Monday (March 31) at Yonkers.

Suddenly now a 7-year-old with close to \$2.3 million in career earnings, form and timing have aligned as Charlie May will enter the series as one of the top horses to beat.

"He's never made it until now, but it's one of the races I wanted to be in at ages 4,5, and 6," said Charlie May's owner Don Tiger. "All three years he was sort of wobbly at the end of the prior year and I couldn't get him ready for the series. It's one of those things where he needed a couple of months off and by the time it took to get him back, it never worked out right. But we began targeting this race last year and did some different things with him over the past six to nine months and he's really sound now and doing well.

"That 1:49.1 win last week at Pocono was with the trainer driving him, too. The first call I got after that race was David Miller. He had to drive one at The Meadowlands that day



which was his own horse – otherwise he would have been there for [Charlie May's] race. It's all good stuff and he should be a major factor in the series, I predict that."

Yonkers isn't a track that Charlie May has frequented too often over the years, but he has been here before. That includes the Aria Invitational Pace most recently from 2022, along with the Messenger elimination and final from 2021; the latter of which he was a closing second to American Courage during a hard rainstorm in the \$500,000 race.

Though Charlie May is 0-for-3 in the win column historically at Yonkers (with two seconds), his overall record on half-mile tracks is notably impressive. From 21 starts on a half-mile track, he's won nine of those, and been second in eight, and third another two times. For that matter, the only time he's ever been off the board from those races was the 2021 Charles Juravinski Cup at Flamboro Downs when he had an outside post against the likes of Linedrive Hanover, Desperate Man and Bulldog Hanover, and the 2022 Aria when he never got involved from a poor position in a 10-horse field.

As to what sized track suits him best, Tiger said, "Well, it's interesting. Me and Chris Page have sat around and have had some interesting conversations about Charlie May. Chris thinks he's better on a mile track and I think he's better on a half-mile. Because he's so slick gaited and he has the speed to get into play, but he can also follow, or he can take air. Like at Northfield, you look at all the bad posts he's drawn there, 6, 7, 8, 9-hole and he's never been worse than second in any race there, ever. He just finds a way around half-mile tracks."

After being trained throughout his career by Steve Carter, Charlie May is in a new barn this year with Ron and Heidi Cushing.

"I just wasn't happy," said Tiger. "You can put it this way – the last time Charlie May raced before the change he was last or second to last, and the same with my other horse Shane Falco. It's not a big deal; it was just time for a change, and I've been very happy with it. I think Ron and Heidi have been doing great things. They have a smaller stable which I think is important and they stay on top of things. And even Shane Falco – he raced last Monday in an amateur race and won in his first start of the year, so both horses I'm really happy with."

Tiger also mentioned another sibling to Charlie May that he has in the works.

"I have a 2-year-old PA-bred named Miki May out of the same dam [Stipple Hanover], making him obviously Charlie and Shane's younger brother and he's doing phenomenal. He's training down better than Charlie and there's a lot still to be seen, but he's built like Charlie. How fast he is, who knows?"

Like any half-mile track, but even more so perhaps at Yonkers, the draw will play a factor throughout the series and especially into the series final. For his first leg, which goes as race number 5, Charlie May has drawn post 4, but will be looking inwards

to a couple of tough, well-positioned rivals. Immediately to his inside is Chase H Hanover and those two are well acquainted having raced throughout their careers from the same racing crop. Huntinthelastdolar should be one of the bigger players throughout the series and he'll be tough from the rail in Monday's first division to kick things off. Tiger noted that even though it could work against him should Charlie May progress to the Borgata final, he prefers the open draw system for the series final rather than a system based on points accumulation, on the basis that drawing by points and thus stacking the inside posts could make the race lacking from a wagering perspective.

One of the changes made to the Borgata series for this year was to provide a week off in between the fifth and final preliminary leg and the final. Even with that scheduled week in between, Tiger said that Charlie May will sit out one of the preliminary legs due to a robust 2025 stakes schedule.

"There are a lot of stakes and races out there," Tiger said. "So, there's no need to race six weeks in a row and for that matter there's no need to race five weeks in a row. I don't know what we're going to do exactly, but we're going to be smart and manage the horse properly, that's for sure."



Unprecedented demand for 2025 Mohawk Million slots

Owner Brad Grant looking for luck beyond the draw.


With its unusual format and recent vintage (first raced in 2020), the Mohawk Million slot race was always a gamble for Woodbine Mohawk Park. Fortunately, the 2-year-old trotting event has quickly become a highlight of the racing calendar for the Campbellville, ON track. The 2025 draw for Mohawk Million slots took place on March 19, with unprecedented demand; 37 individuals, partnerships, stables, and farms put their names into contention for the 10 positions behind the gate on Sept. 20.

Finding the specific horses doesn't come into play until much later. Slot holders must pay two installments of \$25,000 (Can.), one paid after winning their Mohawk Million slot, the other due by June 2 to remain eligible, but the deadline for declaring their 2-year-old trotter is Sept. 15. Slot holders can sell, lease, or trade their slot.

This year's edition has a different look to the owners involved, with some familiar names absent from the list of 10 slot holders, and others more closely associated with pacers now in the mix.

The 37 applicants for this year's Mohawk Million slots included the following: Allister Stable, Bill Pollock, Blair Corbeil, Brad Grant, Bruce Areman, Bruce Northover, Bud Hatfield, Casie Coleman, Courant Inc., Coyote Wynd Farms, Daniel Sarafian, David Heffering, Determination, Diane Bertrand, Dustin Jones, Gino Toscani, Hunterton Farm, Jake Higgs, Karen Irwin, Kempii Stable Inc., Kozen Farms, Kyle Northover, Mark Prentice, Mark Weaver, Mary Clark, Michel Blais, Michael Veneri, Mike McCallister, Paul Van Camp, Robert and Yolanda Fellows, Terry Hudson, The Stable. ca, Tom Pollack, Tom Rankin, Tony Infilise, and Will Fleming.

The 10 slot holders drawn were: Allister Stable of Monroe Township, NJ; Bill Pollock of Freehold, NJ; Brad Grant of Milton, ON; Bruce Northover of Sunderland, ON; Bud Hatfield of Columbus, OH; Casie Coleman of Wellington, FL; Diane Bertrand of Lake County, BC; Hunterton Farm of Paris, KY; Kempii Stable Inc. of Delray Beach, FL; and Kyle Northover of Sunderland, ON.



Former \$90,000 Lexington yearling Venerate (6, 1:50.1f; \$1,217,706) captured the inaugural Mohawk Million (2020) and was voted 2020 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Male Trotter of the Year. Now standing his first season at stud, the Love You—Peaceful Kemp stallion is based in Sweden at Broline International AB. He was bred by Steve Stewart of Paris, KY and Kempii Stable, both of whom landed slots for the 2025 Mohawk Million. Stewart owns and operates Hunterton Farm with his wife Cindy.

Venerate won the Mohawk Million despite landing trailing post position 10, taking an overland route for driver Andrew McCarthy and outdueling favored 4-5 filly Donna Soprano in the stretch of the 1:53.2 mile. It was Canada's fastest win by any 2-year-old trotter in 2020.

After winning a slot in the latest Mohawk Million draw, Brad Grant said he was hopeful that the luck he had in the first two editions might carry on to one of his own trotters this season. Grant sold his 2020 slot to the connections of Venerate, and his 2021 slot to those of Venerable, the winner of the second Mohawk Million. In the 2022 edition, Grant's slot went to John Bax trainee Proud To Be Lindy, who ended up third, at odds of 96-1, behind winner Oh Well.

"You know what? I didn't even watch the draw," said Grant. "I was lucky enough to get a slot."

The fourth-generation standardbred owner said that he has been in and out of the industry, but is currently enjoying it, even though he attends the live races at Woodbine Mohawk

Park less than in the past. Still, he would love to stand in the Mohawk Million winner's circle.

"It's a home race, obviously a signature event, so it would be great to win," Grant told HRU Saturday (March 29). "But if they said, 'Stay away and you'll win it,' I would!"

He said that trainer Ben Wallace used to tease that it was Grant's absence from Mohawk that kept the winning streak of his former WMP preferred pacer Apprentice Hanover intact from Nov. 30, 2013 through March 15, 2014.

"It became a running joke," said Grant.

Grant said he is no longer as superstitious as he once was.

"You just put your faith in the horse and the people who look after them," he said.

The Milton, ON owner is spreading out his chances for the 2025 Mohawk Million in a strategic, not superstitious manner.

"We're still trying to figure out how to win it," he said. "Actually, I've got a colt and three fillies, really nice ones, so we're keeping our fingers crossed."

Grant and Al Libfeld of Pickering, ON share ownership of Upgrade, a Green Manalishi S—Uptown Classic filly trained by John Bax.

"Al is just a great person," said Grant.

The black filly was a \$300,000 purchase last fall at Harrisburg.

Caviart Farms of Vienna, VA and 3 Brothers Stable of New York, NY are Grant's partners on the former \$450,000 Harrisburg yearling colt now named Pommard. The son of Walner—The Ice Dutchess was originally named The Old Man, but Grant said, "My partners wanted to change it." The colt is currently training with Nancy Takter.

Swinging Loyalty is a Walner—Swinging Royalty daughter co-owned by Grant, Richard Gutnick of Blue Bell, PA, Thomas Pontone of Holmdel, NJ, and Carmen Iannacone of Lyndhurst, NJ. The filly brought a top bid of \$760,000 at Harrisburg last November, and is now training with Linda Toscano.

Grant said his remaining contender for the 2025 Mohawk Million could be The Ice Princess, on whom he shares ownership with breeders Marvin and Lynn Katz of Toronto, ON, Hatfield Stables of Columbus, OH, and Daniel Plouffe of Bromont, QC. The homebred daughter of Walner—The Ice Countess is training with Åke Svanstedt.

"At this time of year, they're all looking like champions," said Grant. "You just keep your fingers crossed."

He said that this year's 37 contenders for Mohawk Million slots reflected the lower pricing of the coveted 10 spots in the rich race.

"When Woodbine Mohawk Park reduced the price from \$100,000 to \$50,000, and stepped up and said, 'We'll put in \$500,000, it became more doable to enter for a lot of people," said Grant.

The appeal of the Mohawk Million is as obvious as its name.

"Who doesn't want to win a million-dollar race?" said Grant, who went on to answer the rhetorical question himself. "Being up here in our own backyard, I'd love to win it, just like I'd love to win the North America Cup and the Metro [Pace]."

Grant said he sees "a lot of Canadian content" among the slot holders for the latest Mohawk Million, which he added gives him hope for the future.

"If you can't win it, you love to see them win... I've had a great run, and there are so many good people in the industry," he said.

As an owner of around 105 horses, with 80 of them racing or training at present, Grant said he still finds plenty to appreciate about being involved in harness racing.

"The challenge of the race; the great partnerships on some of the horses; and yes, I still believe in the industry," he said.

And while he admits he enjoyed shaking hands with Mohawk Million winning owners and trainers who have successfully deployed his slots, "the first year with the Pinskes and then with David McDuffee and his partners," Grant said he hopes this year could be the one when his own 2-year-old champion takes home the title and purse.

"It's a big stepping stone" toward year-end awards, as well as future value as a stallion or a broodmare, noted Grant. The most recent Mohawk Million champ, Maryland, went on to win 2024 Dan Patch and O'Brien Awards for his division.

Jeff Snyder's success comes from being a wise shopper

One doubts that there has been a person who has owned as many high-quality, classic race-winning horses as Jeff Snyder, almost all of them were purchased as yearlings and raced by him throughout their careers.

They include Rocknroll Hanover (\$2,754,038), Well Said (\$2,569,342), Cam's Card Shark (\$2,498,204), Royal Flush Hanover (\$2,153,893), Michaels Power (\$1,908,226), Village Jolt (\$1,634,220), Dealt A Winner (\$1,513,258), Aetos Kronos (\$1,347,000), Michelle's Power (\$1,287,371), Mac's Jackpot (\$1,008,229), Red River Hanover (\$965,426), Million Dollar Cam (\$880,255), Beyond Delight (\$875,784), Michael's Marvel (\$831,828), Date Night Hanover (\$800,636) and Alexas Power (\$762,666).

Their stakes wins include four North America Cups, three Meadowlands Paces, three Little Brown Jugs, three Adios', two Metros and numerous Breeders Crowns.

He has owned two Horses of the Year: Cam's Card Shark and Rocknroll Hanover and Pacer of the Year. He was also the owner of Village Jolt and Michelles Jackpot who won divisional honors.

What makes Snyder's success as an owner even more significant, is that he rarely, if ever, owned as many as a handful of horses in training at any given time. His success for the most part is as a result of wise shopping.



I'm very excited and looking forward to this year's racing. We probably have one or two more in training than usual. However, I've been in the business a long time. I know better than to get too excited before the races take place.

I've been fortunate enough to win just about everything worth winning with pacers. Now I'd like to do the same with trotters. My goal would be to have a stable of top Grand Circuit trotters.

Let's start at the beginning. How did you get into the game?

"To quote Neil Diamond, 'I'm New York City born and raised.' I first started sneaking into Yonkers and Roosevelt to gamble when I was 16 years old. I met a trainer named Larry Wolfson with who I bought my first horse named Senator Finn. We started him in claimers with a tag of \$6,000. He gradually raced himself up to the point where he was a competitive \$40,000 claimer.

"I met Buddy Regan, who at the time had the top stable at the New York tracks. I raced horses with Buddy and Gary Mosher in New York for several years. We did just fine, not great, but certainly with some success.

"I met a young trainer from Saratoga named Mickey McGivern. I began going to the Lexington and Harrisburg sales with him. In the interim, I had made the acquaintance of Ed Friedberg, a lawyer from California, who owned Jef's Standardbred Country Club and an interest in Cam Fella. I had bought a horse named Cam's Magic Trick, a colt that earned almost a half-million for me as a 2- and 3-year-old from Ed.

"Friedberg had a full brother to him that he said he would sell. His name was Cam's Card Shark. I went to Heritage Hill Farms to look at him. As they say, it was love at first sight. I bought him. Of course, he went on to become a great racehorse, becoming the Horse of the Year in 1994; a great sire and the sire of the leading all-time money winning sire Bettors Delight. From that time forward, I was in the yearling game full blast."

You have had extraordinary success in the sport. What is it that you do and have done that has enabled you to secure the great horses that you have bought?

"There are several factors that go into it. Primarily, I like to think that I work at it, as hard as anyone and harder than most. I begin my shopping ventures as soon as I get the Harrisburg and Lexington catalogs. I go through them thoroughly and often. I ultimately will concentrate on those pedigrees that

appeal to me. I naturally tend to gravitate to those families with which I have had the most success. I have had a long and quite successful association with Dr. David Goodrow. Once I've made my choices based on pedigree, I have Dr. Goodrow go to the various farms to judge the individuals. He assesses them and watches them move in the paddock. I'm a firm believer in seeing the yearlings turned out in a paddock and watching them perform there. I think that videos serve a purpose, but I prefer seeing them move in the flesh over watching them in a video.

"I also try to get the feeling of various people in the sport whose opinion I trust in addition to, of course, my trainer. I then put it all together to determine which yearlings I'm going to bid on. It's no secret that I play at the top. The ones that I like are more often the ones that others do as well. I try to evaluate them prior to the beginning of the sale. I set a price in my mind and go to that price."

In recent years you've switched from owning an almost entirely pacing operation to one where the only yearlings you now buy are trotters. Why?

"There are several reasons. Probably the major one is the challenge that trotters present. I've been fortunate enough to win just about everything worth winning with pacers. Now I'd like to do the same with trotters. My goal would be to have a stable of top Grand Circuit trotters.

"Another reason would be that trotting is more of a world-wide sport. Several years ago, I met Jerry Riordan. Jerry is an American trainer who has been based in Europe for some time, first in Italy and now in Sweden. We have had horses with him and he has done quite well with them for my son Michael and me. Actually, I think that Michael might prefer racing in Europe more than he does here. We have a horse Aetos Kronos who earned \$1.347 million in Europe, who we have recently brought stateside to race here. We are hoping that he will acquit himself well in the free-for-all racing this season."

You are generally looked upon in these days of many high-priced yearlings being owned by groups as being somewhat of a lone wolf. You have generally owned all or a majority interest in the horses which you buy and race.

"More often than not that is still the case. However, in the price ranges of where I play, its sometimes wise to spread the risk somewhat. I still want to own at least 50 per cent of any horses I own. I've been very fortunate in having exceptional partners through the years. I owned Rocknroll Hanover with Audrey Campbell's Lothlorien Enterprises. I have a wonderful, partner in Arthur Pronti in Super Chapter. I own Apex, the Walner colt out of Mission Brief that we bought for \$525,000 last year as well as Spencer Hanover a Chapter Seven colt we bought for \$450,000; Apex partnering with SRF Stable's Lennart Agren and Spencer Hanover with Arthur Pronti."

How are things shaping up for your 2025 racing season?

"I'm very excited and looking forward to this year's racing. We probably have one or two more in training than usual. However, I've been in the business a long time. I know better than to get too excited before the races take place.

"In the older ranks, we have high expectations for Aetos Kronos and we will be bringing back Date Night Hanover to race at 4.

"We have three 3-year-olds of whom we think highly. I'd like to think that we might have our Hambletonian horse in Super Chapter who was the second highest money winning 2-year-old trotter last year with earnings of \$525,000. We also have the reigning New York Sires Stakes champion Royal Mission and Kadena, a stakes winning daughter of Mission Brief. I'm hoping they all stay sound and race to their potential. However, it's hard to get too excited when your competition is a colt as dominating as Maryland was last year.

"We have two 2-year-old colts in training. One is a Walner, Apex that brought \$525,000 at Harrisburg, the other is a Chapter Seven colt named Spencer Hanover that we bought for \$450,000 at Lexington. Thus far the reports on both of them are encouraging.

"I'm exceedingly grateful for all the good fortune we have had through the years. I know it would not have been possible without the aid of all the horsemen with which we have been associated. I'm thankful to all the trainers and grooms who have played such a vital role in any success that we have enjoyed."

DANIEL WÄJERSTEN'S SCORES A HAT TRICK AT SOLVALLA

The spring season in Swedish harness racing took off for real at Solvalla on Saturday (March 29), with four divisions of the \$60,000 Margaretas Tidiga Unghästserie, where 3- and 4-year-olds battle for early 2025 money.

Driver Örjan Kihlström opened the series by steering Eric Martinsson's 3-year-old filly **Selmina Venit** (Donato Hanover) to a safe wire-to-wire win, before he changed horse and trainer for the 4-year-old mares' event. Roger Walmann trained **S.G.Empress** (Readly Express) was one of the best fillies in the crop last season and in her first start since November, when she finished third in the \$320,000 Breeders Crown final, she showed that her sophomore year on the track will also be great. Wire-to-wire, again, was the recipe for the win.



Sweden's Trainer of the Year 2024, Daniel Wäjersten had a strong day at Solvalla as he claimed one division of the Margaretas Tidiga Unghästserie. His **Lando Mearas** (Walner) held opponents behind him in a splendid style and Lando Mearas will be one of many 4-year-olds from Wäjersten's barn that probably will enter the biggest races for 4-year-olds in 2025.

Don Fanucci Zet son **Olle Sting** showed a strong effort in the 3-year-old colts and geldings division. Claes Sjöström sat far back in the field, got cover on the back stretch and Olle Sting easily disarmed inside horses in the stretch. Don Fanucci Zet's first crop as a sire are 3-year-olds and Saturday's win by Olle Sting is his biggest success so far.

Wäjersten continued to win and claimed the \$100,000 final of the Gold division, included in the V75. From post 1 behind the gate, his **Mellby Jinx** (Ready Cash) opened quickly and in front, Mellby Jinx is tough to beat. The 7-year-old Ready Cash son was superior to his opponents this day and Mellby Jinx got an invitation to the Finlandia-ajo in Helsinki in May after the great victory.





De-lagging

A few weeks ago, the topics of lag time and the start of our races were on the table. The opinions were thoughtful, earnest, and polite. Trey would like to add his perspective on the start of our races using true anecdotes, followed by a unique solution to the issue that would make the time between races thrilling and gambling on horses more exciting for everyone.

Wagering lag time has never been a problem for Trey. Wagering promptly is one of the few proactive things I do. Stressing about submitting my wager at the last moment is not relaxing. My standard operating procedure is to do my handicapping, often referred to as my wild guesstimates on horse racing, well before the national anthem.

In days of yore, when I attended the races with other humans, as soon as entering the racetrack premises, I walked up to the first available teller, where I wagered five consecutive races in increments of \$10. In recent years, when gambling on my iPad, my method has been similar: I fire up the computer or iPad and wager five consecutive races originating from my favorite racetrack.

Pre-wagering is liberating. Who cares what time it is? Who cares about fluctuating odds that are out of our control? What is in my control are the million things I can do until the starting car turns down the far turn and the announcer begins the race call.

Friends, my takeaway, my theme, and my slant on this subject is that when you wager early, you have time to multitask.

When Trey had a stressful job, he was a pioneer in multitasking. The empty grandstands were an oasis. I would follow my prerace wagering format, make my wagers upon entry, stick the tickets in my pocket, and purchase a plate of cheese nachos and a soft drink. I did NOT watch the geese on the infield pond or take a nap. I climbed the cement steps to an isolated nook, sat down, and read a magazine, a book, or listened to my Walkman.

When the announcer got my attention that a race was imminent, I bookmarked my place, double-checked my pre-wagered ticket to see where my wagering interests lay, and watched the race. The tote board or the exact starting time were irrelevant.

Today, while wagering on horse racing at home, we can do more than read The Biography of Oscar Wilde on a wooden folding seat with metal armrests. One of my go-to multitasking activities at home is listening to music on my headphones between races, but you can do almost anything from making chicken soup to building a ship in a bottle when the horse race is not the only part of your program.

Of course, many of you are much more serious about wagering on harness horse racing. You are a professional handicapper who needs to be in the last tick-of-the-clock club, and you believe the final click of the tote board from 7-2 to 9-5 is *very* consequential. I suggest you climb out of the world and leave that intense handicapping nonsense to computers and artificial intelligence.

Enough chat. Let's get down to businesses, having fun, and fixing this lag problem.

Imagine you are wagering on a race. The numbers on the tote board show the morning line. The numbers constantly change, the pool grows, and handicapping pundits give you wagering tips – business as usual. The new twist is that approximately 10 minutes before the scheduled post time, beepers and buzzers will beep and buzz in the grandstands, and lights will flicker on the tote boards and your devices.

The bells, buzzers, and flickering lights alert one and all that you are now subject to the gong.

At any time, determined by a complex method of selection controlled by the master of MYST, a loud, resounding GONG will sound. The sound of the gong immediately halts ALL wagering. The gong could sound one minute after the warning or after the scheduled post-time.

Harness racing masters of the racing universe now will use the "ticking time bomb" - a motivational tool in movies and television dramas. This effect can be subtle or cliché, but this narrative technique injects urgency and tension into any storyline, ratchets up suspense, and keeps the audience on the edge of their seats. And a ticking bomb without a clock, an ominous, unknown deadline, takes the tension up another notch.

This active wagering situation would be very engaging in our sport. You need to decide what type of wager you wish to play, and you will also need to determine WHEN to wager. Perhaps this would help lag, or perhaps not, that is to be determined. Some people may enjoy being gonged and missing the race. Some people will be apoplectic about missing a potential winning wager. I believe everyone would enjoy the ticking time bomb experience. Not boring! What fun!

Let's try making all gamblers listen, listen, listen, listen, with itchy trigger fingers, calculating, with hair triggers, hearts pounding. If racetrack management believes this could be wagering suicide, and some of the money will not make it into the wagering pool, relax and take the long view. The grouchy players will moan, but eventually, they will play, and new people may join them if the next gong is only a few exciting seconds away.

Ciavardini in his 'happy place' with horses

Bob Ciavardini was in his mid-30s when he stepped away from harness racing to focus on a new career and raise a family. Never in the ensuing years did he ever really think about returning, but upon retiring, it didn't take long for him to reconsider.

And now, more than three decades since he left, Ciavardini is relishing every opportunity to take the stage for his second act in the sport. The lifelong New Yorker has driven 20 winners since returning to the sulky in 2017 after a 27-year absence, with most of the victories coming in the past three seasons.

"I have a second chance, which I didn't really plan on, and I'm trying to make the most of it," said the 71-year-old Ciavardini,

who drives primarily on the amateur circuit. "I really enjoy the places I go and the races I'm in. As you get older, you realize you've got to take it all in. I am doing that. I'm having a great time."

It was Ciavardini's brother, Richard, who helped steer Bob back to the sport when he said the two should take a trip to watch the races at Monticello one day. Bob ran into a friend, Michael Spano, who suggested he buy a horse. Bob got a \$4,000 claimer and was back in the game.

"When I retired, I didn't have horses on my mind at that point," Bob said. "But about six months later, I thought, what do I do now? I fixed everything [around the house]. It wasn't until my brother said about taking a ride to Monticello. That was the end of that. Thank God he said that. I guess it was fate.

"All those years of horses, it doesn't go away. It's in your blood, and that's it."

Bob was in high school when he first began working around horses at a standardbred farm up the road from where he grew up in Mount Kisco, NY, about 25 miles north of Yonkers Raceway. His father eventually bought a couple horses, and after Bob graduated, he became more immersed in the sport. He got his trainer's license in 1972 and took his dad's horses on his own.



"I did have aspirations of being an architect," Bob said with a laugh. "So, I went to look at some colleges, but it wasn't for me. The horses, everybody gets the bug."

Bob had a training stable and drove occasionally over the next 17 years, racing primarily at Roosevelt and Yonkers.

"I trained some decent horses, just claimers for the most part," he said. "I got my feet wet with that and I started to drive a little bit. I didn't have a lot of success, but I drove against the best."

One of Bob's owners in the late 1980s was a union delegate in New York City and suggested he look into working union construction. In 1989, Bob decided to make the career change, and he remained with the company for 25 years. That might have been the end of the story if not for Bob's brother.

"When I got back into it, I thought I'd like to drive again," Bob said. "It keeps me young. It keeps me going. I'm just so happy I'm able to do it, and I'm able to do it now at a pretty good level. I've had some success."

Bob's highlights since returning to the sulky include notching his first comeback victory at Goshen's Historic Track in 2017 with trotter Baltimor As, winning at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 2023 with 24-1 shot Frownies Miracle, and getting his first Meadowlands triumph this past November with Caviart Skipper.

"Winning at The Meadowlands was one of the biggest checks on the bucket list," Bob said, adding with a laugh, "It took me almost 50 years to get it, but I got it.

"The Mohawk win was very exciting, that was another track I always wanted to win at, and it was very special for the people I drove for. I went to The Red Mile, I went to Delaware, OH. Those were all things on my bucket list, to race there. I did get to check off some of those things."

Topping the list of Bob's top moments, though, was his win this past November at Monticello. Bob guided Judge Ken to victory that day in front of his family, including grandson Hunter [on his birthday, no less] and granddaughter Harper.

"We enjoy it as a family," Bob said. "My kids like it, my grandkids love it. They were in the winner's circle for the first time at Monticello. That was my biggest thrill ever, to have both of my grandkids there. I've won a few races that were exciting, but to have my grandkids there to see me win a race was off the charts."

Bob will aim for more memorable moments as this year goes on, traveling the amateur circuit with his wife, Diane.

"I love to play golf, I like to go fishing, and take my grandkids fishing, but the horses are the lifeblood for me," Bob said. "I don't think I could be without horses.

"Back when I was a younger guy, there were a thousand things to worry about. Now, there is no pressure. I'm just having a lot of fun. I won't ever give it up. Someday, I'm sure, I'm going to have to stop driving, but right now I feel like I'm 100 per cent. And I've met a lot of good people over the years, and now we're going to be lifelong friends. I totally enjoy it. I'm in a happy place."

Bartlett doubles in first leg of Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

Aardie B Miki N made a successful North American debut for trainer Per Engblom and driver Jason Bartlett, capturing the first of four \$50,000 divisions in the opening round of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (March 28). A 5-year-old by Always B Miki, Aardie B Miki N vaulted off a live cover tow on the final turn and responded with a snappy final quarter, wearing down pace-setter Talk Curdy To Me. Sent off as the 3-5 choice, Aardie B Miki scored in 1:53.4.

Talk Curdy To Me made two moves to gain control of the race by the :27.1 opening quarter and settled the pace nicely for driver Todd McCarthy, hitting the half in :57.4. Bartlett had moved Aardie B Miki N behind the live cover of Coachellabound N and stayed on that cover through three-quarters in 1:26.1. On the final turn Bartlett roared three-deep, and Aardie B Miki N was too strong for the leader, powering to victory. Talk Curdy To Me held second with Factor Girl third.

Owned by M T Stables, Aardie B Miki N returned \$3.20 as the favorite, heading a \$6.90 exacta and a \$16.60 triple ticket.

The rain had no impact on **Walkin On Sunshine**, as the 5-year-old daughter of Always A Virgin remained perfect on the season, breezing to her fourth consecutive win in a dominating performance in the second \$50,000 division.

Bartlett guided the Brett Pelling-trained mare to the front and never looked back, setting fractions of :28,:57.4 and 1:25.1 before she sprinted a final quarter in 27 seconds flat to complete the mile in 1:52.1. Walkin On Sunshine took control from runner-up Turn The Page N off the first turn and was in control from there. Ron Cushing and Turn The Page N fought hard and out-dueled Millwood Bliss N for the second spot.

Owned by Maynard Miller, Daniel Lehman and Michael Yoder, Walkin On Sunshine won for the 19th time in her career and paid \$2.50 to win, topping a \$6.90 exacta and a \$15 triple.

Silk Cloud A and driver Jordan Stratton blasted out of the gate and then were strong at the wire, posting a mild upset in the third \$50,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division. The Peter Trittontrained daughter of Shadow Play rolled past 3-5 favorite Rocket Deo nearing the wire to post her first victory in five starts this year.

Silk Cloud A out-sprinted Lloyd's Loves to the lead into the first turn, with Bartlett putting the favored Rocket Deo in the 3-hole. Brent Holland and Lloyd's Loves regained control off the opening bend and were able to set down soft fractions of :28 and :58 for the opening-half.

Bartlett got Rocket Deo on the move late on the third turn to engage the pace-setter and was on even terms at three-quarters in 1:25.3. Through the final turn Stratton edged out behind Rocket Deo and was ready to pounce when that one took control in the early stretch. Silk Cloud A sprinted by to a 1:53 victory, with Rocket Deo second and Lloyd's Loves third.

Owned by Eric Good and David Kryway, Silk Cloud A returned \$13.80 to win and keyed a \$31.80 exacta and \$71 triple ticket.

The fourth and final \$50,000 division of the Blue Chip Matchmaker saw **Beautiful Seaside** and Tim Tetrick roll off second-over cover and storm to victory over the first-up Uptown Hanover, with 1-2 favorite Grace Hill getting up for third on the wire after having difficulty finding room in the stretch. Beautiful Seaside, a 5-year-old by Downbytheseaside, is trained by Scott DiDomenico.

Seaside Diva and Grace Hill exchanged the lead off the opening bend, with Yannick Gingras and Seaside Diva at the quarter in :27.3. Seaside Diva kept a lively clip, hitting the half in :56.3 before Uptown Hanover and Todd McCarthy moved without cover. Tetrick put Beautiful Seaside on her back, and the pair rushed up in the third quarter, with Seaside Diva still in control through a 1:24.3 three-quarters.

Uptown Hanover was at the throat of the leader, and that kept Grace Hill in the pocket without room at the top of the stretch. Tetrick wasn't looking inside, as he put Beautiful Seaside in three-wide position off the final turn, and the mare responded to win confidently. Uptown Hanover was clear for second, with Grace Hill and Bartlett only finding room in the late stages and barely getting up for the third spot.

Owned by Mike Rowe, Beautiful Seaside returned \$17 to win and led a \$156 exacta and \$615 triple payoff.

The preliminary rounds of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series will continue through Friday (April 25), with the leading point earners advancing to the final on Friday (May 9). A major change in 2025 revolves around the added money for the final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, which gets a boost from \$125,000 to \$200,000, equaling the MGM Borgata

Pacing Series total. With that increase the Blue Chip Matchmaker final will certainly offer the richest purse in recent history and far eclipse the \$276,200 purse from 2024.

Stakes action continues on Monday (March 31) at Yonkers with five \$50,000 splits of the first round of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for older males. Hellabalou begins his journey for three straight Borgata titles from post 7 in the first flight (race 5).

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday through Friday live schedule with post time each night at 6:45 p.m. (EDT).

'Hunt' bags fourth straight at Big M

One of the better inexpensive claimers you'll find anywhere raced in Friday's (March 28) seventh race at The Meadowlands, and the scorching-hot **I'll Hunt You Down** picked up his fourth straight win racing at the \$7,500 claiming level for pacers.

The 5-year-old gelded son of Huntsville—Crazy On You, who is trained by Michael Posner, was away third around the first turn before darting up to grab the lead at the half, then powered clear of his overmatched foes through the stretch on the way to a $4\frac{3}{4}$ -length romp in a lifetime-best equaling 1:52.1. Itzalldowntoluck N was second with Albert A' Scootin third.

"He left out of there pretty good," said winning driver Johnathan Ahle. "He can really do it either way, so I wasn't too worried about where we got away. I moved him to the front after the fast first quarter [in: 27] and from then on it was race over."

I'll Hunt You Down, who returned \$3.20 as the 3-5 favorite, now has nine wins from just 15 lifetime starts. He will seek his fifth victory in a row in his next outing, which would be the longest this year by any horse at the mile oval.

"He's been ultra-consistent and he's racing in a class he can really excel in," said Ahle. "It's all worked out very well."

A LITTLE MORE: It was a big night for Ahle, who finished atop the driver colony with four victories... Tom Fanning led the trainers with a pair of jaunts down victory lane... All-source betting on the 14-race card totaled \$2,691,345.

Campbell to concentrate on Calgary

After a red-hot start to 2025, Brandon Campbell is making a change of scenery.

A perennial leader at western Canadian racetracks, Campbell returned for the final two cards of the 2024-25 Century Mile meet in mid-February after surgery in November for a previous spinal injury. Canada's top percentage driver for 2024 then shifted his focus to Fraser Downs while racing in Alberta took a break, and it was like old times for the B.C. track's leading driver for the 2020s.

Campbell strongly sprinted away from his fellow sulkysitters, posting a 26-9-9 summary in 58 starts at Fraser Downs. Phil Giesbrecht — the 2024 dash win leader at Fraser Downs — sits second with nine wins as of Thursday (March 27) where three of those wins were recorded.

That eight-race card on Thursday was the first card of the year at Fraser without Campbell as a catch-driving option, and that's the way it's going to be for the time being. He told Trot Insider that he'd shift his focus to Century Downs as that travel back and forth to B.C. from his base of operations in Alberta isn't physically ideal.

"Too much for me; my body is still adjusting," Campbell said.

Given the 0.558 UDRS to start 2025, on the surface it would seem that Campbell's post-surgery body is adjusting pretty well. When Century Downs kicks off its 2025 standardbred meet on Saturday (March 29), he'll have six opportunities to add to his seasonal totals before making another adjustment during the second scheduled card: driving under the newly-installed lighting system. The switch will flip for those lights during the track's 10th anniversary celebration on Wednesday (April 2).

"I'm looking forward to the evening post times," Campbell said. "Hopefully they can draw in the after-work crowds as there is a lot of industrial area around the track and possibly some other fellow Calgary folk who would have not normally come out to see us in the afternoon."

The 2025 standardbred racing season at Century Downs runs from March 29 to Aug. 30, with first posts on Saturdays at 12:45 p.m. (MDT) and Wednesdays at 6:15 p.m. (MDT).
