The Red Mile is one step closer to playing host to the Breeders Crown after the Kentucky House of Representatives passed Kentucky state senator Damon Thayer's amendment to House Bill 8 late on Thursday night (March 28). If the bill is signed by governor Andy Beshear, it would provide a maximum of \$900,000 every three years for a Kentucky track that plays host to an international harness racing event that distributes at least \$5 million in purses and awards.

The Red Mile's president and CEO Joe Costa told HRU that there is still a long way to go before the famed Lexington track could play host to the Breeders Crown, but passage of the bill was terrific news.

"I'm very excited," Costa said. "I think the state of Kentucky should be proud. I think the breeders should be proud. I think people that race horses should be proud to put a spotlight on the state's standardbred industry and the opportunity to be national news.



"This speaks a little bit of how far the Kentucky program has come. I would think this is a great opportunity for all the standard participants and different avenues of the business in our industry to highlight what they do here in Kentucky."

Costa said this is just the first step toward the Crown coming to The Red Mile. The next is having the governor sign the bill.

"We expect the governor will support this vehicle to give an opportunity to the standardbred racetracks in Kentucky to invite the Breeders Crown to come back to Kentucky," Costa said.

"Once executed by the governor, it will provide an opportunity for Kentucky to get in the loop. At this time, I don't have the authority to speak for The Red Mile. I have to hear what [owners] George [Segal], Frank [Antonacci] and Joe [Thomson] have to say because they will have to provide some money to do it. Nonetheless, it's an opportunity for Kentucky to highlight the state and its standardbred program. So, stay tuned. But, I would think that this is something that The Red Mile would be interested in exploring. There are a lot of steps before we get to that point, but we're generally excited about the opportunity for Kentucky.

"Speaking as a civilian and a fan of standardbred racing for a moment, I can imagine what a wonderful event could be presented to the standardbred universe [at The Red Mile]."

In the meantime, Costa said Thayer deserves tremendous praise and thanks for his efforts to support standardbred racing in Kentucky.

"We need to celebrate Senator Damon Thayer," Costa said. "It was his support for the horse racing industry and his passion for the standardbred industry thanks to his roots all the way back to Michigan and being buddies with Sam McKee. That has led to his support for the standardbred industry and being a friend of the horse racing industry in Kentucky. He was the one that carried the ball across the goal line. So, he's deserving of the credit."

Thayer is a Republican who serves as the Senate Majority Floor Leader. He is completing his 22nd and final year in the Senate representing Kentucky's 17th Senate District, which includes southern Kenton County, and all of Grant and Scott counties.

"My goal is to see Kentucky part of the Breeders Crown rotation," Thayer told the USTA's Ken Weingartner. "That's the language we came up with to try to get us in the running. The licensing fee to host the Breeders Crown is \$900,000. So, I wanted to set up a perpetual fund that would give a Kentucky track the impetus to make a bid for the Breeders Crown."

Costa said the way he understands it, the funding would provide \$300,000 a year up to a maximum of \$900,000 until it is drawn upon.

Should governor Beshear sign the bill, The Red Mile's board of directors would next have to make a decision about whether

they wish to enter the rotation for the Breeders Crown. The event, which will be at The Meadowlands this October, currently rotates between The Big M, Woodbine Mohawk Park and Harrah's Hoosier Park.

The Red Mile has played host to Breeders Crown races on two occasions, including the championship's inaugural event, the 2-Year-Old Colt Trot in 1984. In 1987, the Lexington track played host to the Crown Mare Pace.

Since 2010, all 12 Breeders Crown races have been held at a single track.

In other Kentucky horse racing news, on Thursday the Kentucky House of Representatives also passed Senate Bill 299 sponsored by Thayer. If it becomes law, as expected, it will create the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation, effective July of 2024.

The new corporation would replace the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and create a standalone government agency that would oversee horse racing, sports gambling, and charitable gaming.





TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON

As a horseman and a gentleman, Benoit Cote is a Hall of Famer

How is this for a recommendation? Hall of Famers and some who perhaps should be Hall of Famers, Delvin Miller, Stanley Dancer, Joe O'Brien, Aime Choquette, and Glen Garnsey, among others, all sent horses to Benoit Cote to train and drive in Montreal, when Montreal was arguably second only to the New York tracks as the center of harness racing in North America.

Miller asked his right hand-man Choquette who he should send his champion filly Delmonica Hanover to for a stakes' engagement in Montreal. Choquette's immediate answer was that Benoit Cote was the man. So, what did Cote do? He set a world record of 2:00.1f with her cruising to a stakes win.

"It's not difficult to win big races when you are racing top horses" said Cote recently.

But Miller wasn't the only one. Garnsey sent his top filly Berna Hanover to Cote to train and drive. Dancer sent Norman Woolworth's top colt Bon Sport to Cote, who won Canada's richest trotting race at the time with him. O'Brien sent Frosted Yankee and Armbro Luann. Whenever O'Brien had a stakes engagement in Montreal which he couldn't make, Cote was always his choice.

Benoit Cote just reached his 90th birthday on Friday (March 22). He has now been retired since a career ending injury to an elbow forced an end to his driving career.

Where did it start and how did it progress?

"I first started training and driving in Quebec City when I was just a young kid. My father had raced horses and I learned from him. From Quebec City I went to Montreal where I raced at Parc Richelieu and Blue Bonnets. My first contract job was for les Ecuries Montreal. I worked for them for a couple of years. I then went to work for Gerard Veilleux's Drummond Stables. I worked for them for a few years more and then trained for

Hubert Soucie's la Ferme Richelieu. They were all wonderful people to work for. Now more than 60 years later I am still good friends with Gerard Veilleux's son Alain. After Hubert Soucie, I set up my own public stable which I operated until I retired."

It was while with the Drummond Stables and la Ferme Richelieu that you were part of two of the most noteworthy events in Canadian Harness Racing history.

"In 1959, I had one of my greatest horses ever. Her name was Chief Maid. There were hardly any races for just females back then, so I raced her almost exclusively against stallions and geldings. That year she won 11 of 18 starts racing only against boys. Georges Giguere the racing secretary at Richelieu Park began a racing series called the Canada Pace. On July 19 of that year, she raced in one of the races of the series. She could leave the gate as well as any horse ever. She cut the mile. But I got beat at the finish by Keith Waples driving Mighty Dudley in 1:59.3. That was the first 2:00 mile in Canadian harness history. A few years later, I was driving Monsieur Richelieu, one of Mr. Soucie's homebred horses and we won over that same Richelieu Park track in 2:00h. That was the first 2:00 mile by a Canadian-bred horse."

You mentioned Keith Waples. Back then you raced against him and a teenager named Herve Filion often.

"They were both great. Keith didn't say a whole lot. He was pretty quiet. He let his horses do the talking for him on the racetrack. He was excellent. He took good care of a horse. Rarely did he win a race by more than what he had to. Herve was maybe the greatest driver that ever lived. He patterned himself on the style of Keith Waples. Even when he was just a teenager you knew that you were watching someone who was exceptional."

In 1981, you were enshrined in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. What do you remember of the night?

"Firstly, I was surprised. I was young. My career had been good, but I didn't think that great. Roger White had been installed a few years previous. Roger had trained and driven great horses. I had some good ones, but none as good as Silent Majority, although arguably my best horse, Semalu D'Amour, was yet to come. I was extremely proud of that honor as I still am today."

Before I saw Stanley Dancer's Stable, the three that impressed me the most were yours, Roger White's and that of Marcel Dostie. Everything was clean and neat; nothing out of place. They looked like museums. White and you of course are in the Hall of Fame. I suppose that because Dostie had such a great career himself and had such a great influence on my career, it upsets me that he isn't yet in.

"There is no doubt that he belongs. He was an outstanding horseman. Perhaps, he is among some of those that has been overlooked and maybe forgotten by time."

You mentioned Semalu D'Amour. I'll introduce another Semalu mare that you also trained and brought along named Midi A Semalu.

"They were both very good fillies but Semalu D'Amour was the better of the two. She was one of the best fillies of her generation. She earned over \$880,000. Midi A Semalu was no slouch though. She earned over \$500,000. But pedigree buffs would say that she was the better bred of the two, being by Most Happy Fella and out of a full sister to Silent Majority.

"In addition to being a superior broodmare herself, her daughters and granddaughters are responsible for some of the greatest pacers of this era including the Hall of Fame broodmare Precious Beauty and Tall Dark Stranger, Sportswriter and Downbytheseaside. Perhaps the greatest performer from the family is yet to be heard from. In your article last week, Jody Jamieson said that Captains Quarters might become the greatest horse he has ever sat behind. Considering that he drove Bulldog Hanover more than anybody else, that is a huge statement."

You've trained for many wonderful people in addition to the top American trainers that sent horses to you.

"Yes. I've been very fortunate to have trained for some wonderful people. In addition to the Veilleux family and Hubert Soucie, I trained the Semalu horses for Dr. Lucien Paiement. I also had some horses for the great Canadiens' hockey player John Ferguson. I believe that you might have been partners on some of the fillies I raced for Fergie."

Tell us about Delmonica Hanover.

"Aime Choquette called me. He asked me if I would train and race Delmonica up here for Delvin Miller. Delvin had to be at a golf tournament and asked if Aime could get me to take her. Of course I did. She was great. I had no idea that she had set a world record. She did it so easy. She only went as fast as she needed to. There is no doubt in my mind that she could have gone faster if that had been needed."

Thinking back to that first 2:00 mile, did you ever think that horses would or could go as fast as they go today?

"The short answer would be no. I certainly thought that they would go faster but I never thought that they would go as fast as they now go. What is amazing is that they do it just about every day at all tracks. I think that the biggest reason is in the breeding. We are breeding a stronger, faster and I think most importantly a sounder horse. If you go to a yearling sale today, the number of poor individuals is smaller than it's ever been.

"I think the way we race them is another factor. Back then we might leave with a horse, then give it a breather trying to save something for the end of the mile. That doesn't happen too much today. They are on their toes from beginning to end. Another factor is probably the absence of the hub rail. In addition to making racing safer, taking it out has made the mile shorter."

Montreal, where you still live used to be a major hub of harness racing. Great horses and great stables raced there regularly. Now there is no racing at all in the entire province of Quebec except for a small seasonal meet at Trois Rivieres.

"It is indeed a great tragedy. It makes me quite sad whenever I think of it. If you were asking for reasons, I suppose that the major reason would be the Casino de Montreal on the island. But there are other reasons, most of them are political. The horsemen and the horsemen's association are also to blame. Their efforts to preserve racing were minimal and relatively inconsequential. Since the track shut down there has been no activity on the grounds. Some of the most prime real estate on the island of Montreal has gone unused for 16 years. The land is owned by the city and they haven't done anything with it.

"Quebecers, more specifically French Canadians, love harness racing. Just look at the racing at Mohawk. I wouldn't say that it is dominated by Quebecers, but there is no doubt that they are quite active there. The leading trainer just about every year is Richard Moreau. Then look at some of the names in the trainers' colony: Tourigny, Baillargeon, Blais, Dupont, Bourassa, Dumouchel, Guillemette, Chretien, Jones, Simard and Zeron. There are numerous Quebec based owners. Two of the best of a great drivers' colony are Louis-Philippe Roy and Sylvain Filion."



Howard Taylor is wrong on two counts and his ire is misdirected

Hambletonian Society CEO John Campbell said the owner's battle is with The Meadowlands, not the Society.

Hambletonian Society CEO John Campbell wants to set the record straight.

Owner Howard Taylor was recently quoted in *HarnessLink* as saying the Hambletonian Society had excluded Taylor from its events at The Meadowlands and that Campbell had "threatened to take the Hambletonian away from me."

Campbell said neither are true.

"It is incorrect that [the Hambletonian Society] has banned Howard Taylor or anybody else from any of our events," Campbell said. "And, if you check the list of eligibles on our website and our stakes, all horses that Howard has paid in either solely or in partnership are listed as eligible."

The issue involves Taylor being on **The Meadowlands' list of people banned** from participating at the track. Taylor is one of 32 people currently banned at The Meadowlands. Jeff Gural, the owner of The Meadowlands, has said the people are banned because they appear on the list of individuals named for purchasing specific performance-enhancing drugs (PEDs) from former veterinary medication saleswoman Lisa Gianelli.

Taylor denies he purchased PEDs.

The point is that since Taylor is currently banned by The Meadowlands, it means the track is saying he cannot participate in any events. Currently that includes all Hambletonian Society events except the Hambletonian, Hambletonian Oaks

and Hambletonian Maturity. Taylor's prime concern is the Hambletonian Society's Breeders Crown event, which will be held at The Meadowlands in October. But he did mention the Hambletonian, as well.

"I never threatened to take the Hambletonian races away from Howard or anybody else," Campbell said. "I simply stated that The Meadowlands made overtures [to the Hambletonian Society] about possibly including the Hambletonian in their banned protocol."

All this is Campbell's way of saying Taylor's ire is misdirected. The Hambletonian Society isn't banning Taylor, the ban is coming from The Meadowlands, which has the legal right under private property laws to exclude people it deems undesirable.

"The track rules' clause that's in the Breeders Crown conditions, and many of our stakes, has been in for a number of years," Campbell said. "And the track rules have also come up in a similar situation at a different host track in the past."

In the end, Campbell said he just wants Taylor to get his facts straight.

"Our position is that we have not banned anybody," Campbell said of the Hambletonian Society. "It's a Meadowlands decision. We're going to gather information and monitor it and see if anything changes between now and entry time.

For the record, Campbell said the Hambletonian Society is still working on the issue.

"We have had talks and discussions about this matter on numerous occasions with Jeff Gural," Campbell said.

THRILLED MOHAWK MILLION WILL CONTINUE

Though the Hambletonian Society has no direct connection to the Mohawk Million to be held on Sept. 21 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Campbell said he's "tickled" the slots for the race were oversold and the race will continue. The price of the slots dropped from \$100,000 (Cdn) apiece in 2023 to \$50,000 (Cdn) each for 2024.

"I know they struggled to sell that race out the last couple of years at \$100,000, but they still managed to," Campbell said.

"You have to commend Woodbine for making the commitment to keeping it at a million and lowering the buy-in. Obviously, that's been reflected in the number of entries and the people that recognized the value in that. I think you're going to see a lot of haggling prior to entry time. With \$50,000 in there, it gives owners a lot more wiggle room to make deals with potential starters in the race, so I think it's going to be more interesting leading up to draw time than it has been in the past as well."

Campbell gave further kudos to Woodbine for supporting the race with \$500,000 of the \$1 million purse.

"[Woodbine's] commitment to standardbred racing as a whole, but certainly the high-end stakes, is to be commended," Campbell said. "They are certainly proponents of our industry at all ends of it."

Camille Brundle talks Woodmere Stealdeal's absence and return

Woodmere Stealdeal's last appearance at Woodbine Mohawk Park was a fourth-place finish behind Powertrain in a Sept. 15, 2023 qualifier. He paced a personal 1:54.1s mile, with a :26.4 last panel, but never resurfaced in the winter WMP races where he reached preferred status in 2022 and 2023. With no charted mile since his last qualifier, the absence of the popular pacer was raising questions on social media: Where was Woodmere Stealdeal (p, 5, 1:48.4s; \$284,188)? When, if ever, would he be back at Mohawk?

Camille Brundle provided an update this week. Her father, Frank Brundle of East Garafaxa, ON, shares ownership of Woodmere Stealdeal with the gelding's original owner, Robert Sumarah of Halifax. NS.

"Back in August, [Woodmere Stealdeal] couldn't go to the Gold Cup and Saucer [at Red Shores Charlottetown]," she told HRU. "He actually ended up having a fracture in a sesamoid bone in his back leg, that he ended up needing surgery on. He was going good, and then all of a sudden, he was kind of 'off' and then super-sore. It just kept getting worse and worse."

X-rays revealed a fracture.

"They showed that it was there for quite a while," said Camille. "Longer than the vet would have liked obviously, but he's the kind of horse that's very hardy and pushes through a lot of things, so when he started to show that he was in pain, we noticed right away."

After a September surgery at Ontario Equine Hospital, in Mississauga, ON, the gelding nicknamed "Woody," returned home to East Garafaxa, ON for a gradual recovery. At the end of January, he moved to the nearby farm where his regular driver, Jonathan Drury, is based.

On March 13, there was positive news from McKee-Pownall Equine Services.



"He's got the green light now, and he's started back training coming up on three weeks ago," said Camille.

Camille is a hands-on horsewoman who works with the six broodmares living on her family's farm, as well as other horses residing there. Woodmere Stealdeal's recovery timeline briefly paralleled her own: When she broke her own ankle, she kept hand-walking him despite the cast on her foot.

"I live right above the barn at my dad's farm, so when [Woodmere Stealdeal] came here the next day after surgery, he was on stall rest for six weeks," said Camille. "At first, it was very difficult for him, because he went from training and racing and jogging all the time, to being stuck in a square, not able to go out.

"We slowly increased him, and we would go for five-minute walks for a week straight, and then 10-minute walks, 15-, 20-minute walks. When he started getting up to 30-minute walks twice a day, his muscles were going and he was doing good. He got some shockwave treatment, which was really awesome and benefited him a lot."

The Brundles did not have a small turnout paddock or round pen, just larger 1-to-2-acre fields, so they asked Drury about turning out Woodmere Stealdeal at his farm, which also features a swimming pool. "He's been working with him there ever since," said Camille.

The 6-year-old pacer had assessments with the nearby veterinary clinic, getting updates every six weeks of his recovery.

Camille's career trajectory coincidentally developed alongside her favorite racehorse's veterinary treatment. She worked as an animal care attendant (ACA) at the very facility where he had arthroscopic procedures performed.

"Ironically, I started working at Ontario Equine Hospital two months before Woodmere Stealdeal was going there for surgery," she said. "I was there when he had the procedure done, and I got to learn a lot of medical knowledge from working there. It was an amazing experience. Dr. Orlaith Cleary did the surgery. She's so talented and I learned so much from her. I was able to put... everything they taught me there into providing better care for him here, and 'Stealdeal' taught me a lot about relaxing a little bit more, myself, and not being so overprotective."

Caring for horses comes naturally to Camille, from broodmares and babies, to her Warmblood hunter/jumper.

"I was born into this," she said. "I breathe horses; I've been around them my entire life."

The future Equine Nutrition student said she's a believer in proactive breaks from racing, ideally before issues arise.

"Two summers ago, Stealdeal was here all summer and he came back and dominated," Camille said. "Mystifying [p, 5, 1:49.1s; \$212,685] had some time off, came back and won her first start

back [April 7, 2023 at WMP]... She [was] in again [at WMP on March 30]... We're so lucky we can give those horses the time off they need to better themselves so they can keep going."

Camille said she knew it wasn't always easy to provide racehorses with mini-vacations.

"It's difficult in this industry, because there's so many claiming horses, but I'm a firm believer that you have to give a horse time to be a horse again," she said.

From her perspective, overseeing mares, foals, and her father's retired "warhorse" Dovuto Hanover (p, 3, 1:48.4m; \$680,825), Camille said she often jokes that her life is like a popular Canadian TV show about ranch life.

"It's just me and my dog up here," she said. "I feel like I'm living my 'Heartland' dream!"

Other young horses owned by her father are in training with Woodmere Stealdeal's former conditioner at Truro Raceway, in Bible Hill, NS.

"We actually have a few horses out there right now..." she said. "Danny Romo is an amazing trainer and horseman."

Woodmere Stealdeal was expected to be qualifying at WMP in the next month or two, according to Camille.

"There's no timeline," she said. "We want to make sure he's 100 per cent before we send him on his way... We still do believe he has more potential and he's not done racing yet."





Joviality is the third horse invited to Elitloppet

Courant Stable owned and Sabine Kagebrant trained 5-yearold Chapter Seven daughter Joviality became the third trotter invited to the 2024 Elitloppet.

Joviality dominated the stakes races in Sweden during her first season outside of America and was named Horse of the Year in Sweden in 2023. After a winter in Paris, where Joviality ended up in third place in the Prix d'Amérique, she will now target the mile race in Elitloppet at Solvalla on May 26.

BREEDERS CROWN WINNER IMPRESSED IN 2024 DEBUT

The new favorite trotter in Sweden is all of a sudden an amateur-trained 5-year-old who ended the prior season with a comfortable win in the Breeders Crown.

A Fair Day (Maharajah), trained by Elisabeth Almheden and driven by Oscar Ginman, became a very popular horse at the end of 2023, not least of all because of the victory in the 4-year-old colt and gelding Breeders Crown in November. A Fair Day, and the entourage surrounding him, showed that it's still possible for basically anyone to shape and train a successful horse. It is an important milestone in the harness racing business, regardless of where it happens.

The expectations before A Fair Day's debut for 2024 were pretty high, but most of all the fans wanted to see proof that the Breeders Crown win wasn't just a lucky shot at the right time.

When Färjestad played host to Friday's (March 29) traditional Easter races, A Fair Day shared the favorite role with Alessandro Gocciadoro's Diamond Truppo in the \$60,000 Pris Carl Philips Jubileumspokal over 1,640 meters.

No one could have been disappointed with the outcome of the race. A Fair Day showed extreme quickness as the car accelerated from the field, and from post 5, he flew to the front in a very fast opening. When Diamond Truppo eventually connected on the

outside, Ginman continued in high speed and in the last turn it was clear that A Fair Day was superior to his opponents this day.

A Fair Day won in a mile rate of 1:51.3, ahead of Theresnolimit and Diamond Truppo.

BO WESTERGAARD QUITS

Danish top trainer Bo Westergaard has ended his career as a professional trainer. This was announced in a press release on Thursday (March 28).

The story behind this is that Westergaard was suspended from the sport after a positive doping test in 2015, when Westergaard was an active trainer in Norway.

He came back to the business in 2018, but in April of last year, one of Westergaard's horses showed high levels of butorphanol and Westergaard was about to face another suspension from the sport.

In a press release (translated via Google translate), Westergaard said:

"I have realized that my judgment during my time as a trainer in Norway was very doubtful and that it would have been better if I had never had a second chance in Denmark. But since we got a second chance six years ago, we have done everything we can to never end up in violation of the rules.

But we stand powerless when we are repeatedly met by conditions on the tracks that do not meet a standard that lives up to the guidelines and the standard in the rest of the Nordic countries.

"We can only be satisfied that over 500 doping tests were performed on my horses before the inevitable happened.

"Imagine if my competitors had the same number of samples taken!!!

"Because of my past, I will never be recognized as anything other than a doping sinner here in Scandinavia. But I have nothing else to apologize for than my past in Norway.

"The past year has been a hell for me and my family and therefore I have made the following decision:

I will quit as a trainer in Aalborg when I have completed the remaining work that I have started with my faithful horse owners.

"The reduction of my [training] business is already underway, and my family and I will retire and leave the trotting sport in silence. The intention is for Nicklas Korfitsen to take over after us.

"I have chosen to fight to prove my innocence and hope for [an] acquittal, and as a matter of principle for the security of all trotting [trainers] in Denmark, I will bring the decision to court.

"On April 30, 2023, the conditions on the Skive racetrack, in our opinion, were critical and there were clear violations of the routines to ensure that a doping test was not contaminated. We still believe that these conditions were the cause of the positive test.

"It became known to us during the complaint process that two veterinarians practice... daily work in the treatment room, a room... used as part of the doping booth on April 30, 2023. This was the only race day in 2023 that the room was included as part of the doping booth.

"We find it remarkable that the substances found in the horse's doping test are precisely the substances that are used daily by at least one of the veterinarians who conducts a clinic in the treatment room. This is also the only room that has access to sinks, etcetera. A room that is not cleaned by Skive racetrack and which was not checked in connection with an inspection conducted at Skive racetrack on April 30, 2023.

"However, the inspection report states that the door to the treatment room must be locked.

It is also remarkable that one of the veterinarians was also one of the track veterinarians on April 30, 2023.

"I would also like to emphasize that none of our horses have ever been treated with the same preparation/cocktail, and I know with 100 per cent certainty that I and my employees/ veterinarian have not administered the substance to the horse.

"The burden of proof is on me and according to the high court I have not proven that the test was contaminated. I will now work to prove my innocence regardless of the fact that my future in trotting sports is over as a trainer.


"During the final period, the stable will spend time exclusively with the stable's customers and work with the horses. I therefore hope that all the media and others respect our decision, which has not been easy.

In the future, my family and I will participate in the work on the farm and with this work we will prepare Nicklas to take over after me and my wife.

"It is no secret that I have been personally affected mentally and have not been able to fulfill my duties.

But I am ready to fight for my horse owners, my staff and my loved ones to the bitter end."

Of course, I fell in love with the yearling filly that I nicknamed Annie and dreaded the idea she would probably only be in my life for six months. This morning, a new guy arrived at the farm. Paul introduced him as Bart and said he would be part of our motley crew. I guessed Bart was in his 30s, a wiry guy with a protruding Adam's apple and a backward baseball hat with long black hair falling over his protruding ears. He was bowlegged in his tattered jeans, reminding me of a weathered young cowboy. After our introduction, Bart just nodded at me and did not say much. The men went into the tack room and came out with some equipment. Paul draped a harness over his shoulder and told us to go outside. I watched Paul slowly enter the stall from the barn door, whispering to Annie.

Outside, I asked Bart what was going on in the barn. He said one word – breaking. I gave him a "duh" look and spread my arms. Bart explained that the filly needed to get used to wearing equipment, and they were unsure if she had ever experienced wearing a bridle or a harness. At that moment, snorting, neighing, and a few solid thumps of hooves on wood echoed across the farm. Then it got quiet.

Bart listened for a minute or two, saying she didn't do too bad, and sometimes horses go ape-sh - -. He said this filly has probably had some handling. Paul will get a feel for her, and we might even put her on the line today. He asked if I ever line drove a young horse, and I said no.

Fifteen minutes later, the three of us walked Annie outside the barn. Paul was 10 feet behind the horse with the reins in his



hands while Bart and I held a long strap, a lead line, on each side of her; the idea was to get her to relax, walk straight, and enjoy things. Paul said to hold my line, and it would be fun.

IMHO, it WAS fun. Annie did okay except for one time she did a lone ranger dance on her back legs, and a minute later, she did a two-hoofed back kick, which was quite impressive. It was almost like she just wanted to get a few things out of her system, and then Annie thought, this isn't so bad.

TUESDAY

Today was much like yesterday. I was amazed at how much more relaxed I was. The only new twist was that Paul hooked an ancient wooden cart between him and Annie's rear. Then we just walked around in the grass. Annie fussed a bit, gave a few mini kicks, and came to a complete stop a few times. I think she just enjoyed her feet on the grass and the breeze in her face.

WEDNESDAY

Today was like yesterday. I am beginning to feel like a pro. This time, we went a little further, and we walked Annie out of the grass and walked a slow lap around the racetrack. Back in the barn, Bart said he had to fix a toilet in town, would see us tomorrow, and headed for his bicycle. Yes, he rides a bike with a motor.

As Bart disappeared over the ridge, I asked Paul if Bart had an addiction.

Paul said yeah, but Bart won't admit it. Even though it was none of my business, I asked if Bart did drugs. Paul answered he wasn't sure, but he didn't think drugs were part of Bart's problem. After a pause, Paul said Bart's problem was with alcohol, but the guy is not a typical alcoholic. Most of the time, there is no problem. Bart has a sly sense of humor and is polite. But then Paul's voice trailed off. I waited for him to continue. He said that around supper time, Bart will stop at a bar for a few beers every evening. No problem, he has two, maybe three, and goes home to his trailer in a park just outside town. He does this nine times out of 10, so he doesn't believe he has a problem or needs meetings or help. Nobody knows when or why the problem is the 10th time, but the 10th time is a flat-out, black-out bender for a couple of days. Paul said once he found him in a stall under the straw.

When I asked about the bicycle, Paul explained Bart had crashed his car twice and lost his license. He can't keep a job. His nickname is Bart-time because he needs to work part-time. His days at the track ended when a trainer scheduled him to drive a trailer with six horses, but Bart never showed. It was a mess; a few no-shows like that are poison to an employer. So, for us, he is strictly hourly. We are in a situation where a bender will not screw us up.


Two things flashed in my brain: addiction can come in many forms, and Paul used the words our and we.

He showed me a book as big as a bible with names and information on all the horses for sale and said I could find the catalog on my iPad or phone. Honestly, he wasted his time. I am trying to stay away from my drug friends. Drug friends are pretty much the only friends I have left, so I'm out of the loop for loopy losers. My mom had some news about Betty Feldman, one of my high school friends. She was always quiet and friendly, a year ahead of me. She died from Fentanyl. I had not seen Betty since she left for some college in Arizona after high school. I did not know she dabbled. Sad.







No reason for despair with this 'Man'

Desperate Man is tenacious when it comes to racing on halfmile racetracks.

A 6-year-old gelding, Desperate Man has opened his 2024 campaign by going two-for-two in the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for older male pacers at MGM Yonkers Raceway. Those two wins around The Hilltop's half-mile oval give him 11 victories in 16 career starts on half-mile tracks. He's missed the board just once.

In addition, Desperate Man is the all-time fastest performer (1:50.1) at half-mile Grand River Raceway and finished second in Linedrive Hanover's Canadian-record 1:49 performance at half-mile Flamboro Downs in the 2022 Charles Juravinski Memorial.

"That's pretty impressive," said Matt Kakaley, who has driven Desperate Man for trainer Travis Alexander and owner Kathy Cecchin. "He's a big horse, so you don't think he would really fit a half, but he doesn't have any trouble getting around there, that's for sure. He's a pretty flawlessly gaited horse, so I guess that has a lot to do with it."

Desperate Man opened his Borgata series experience with a 1:51.4 victory on March 18, defeating Sumomentsomwhere A by 1-1/2 lengths. In the second round this past Monday, he defeated Linedrive Hanover by three-quarters of a length in 1:51. Covered Bridge finished third. Linedrive Hanover and Covered Bridge were first-round winners.

"It's not like last week was a cake walk," Kakaley said. "It's not like we were in the easiest division. So, he's had to work for it."

Desperate Man, a son of Shadow Play—Dreamlands Latte, was Canada's Horse of the Year in 2021, when his victories included the Pepsi North America Cup and Ontario Sire Stakes Super Final. For his career, he has won 18 of 57 races and earned \$1.03 million in U.S. dollars (\$1.31 million Canadian).

On Monday (April 1), Desperate Man competes in the third of three \$50,000 divisions of the Borgata. The field also includes Rocknroll Runa A – the only other unbeaten through the series'



first two rounds — Covered Bridge and Whats Stanley Got A, who was a winner in round 2. Desperate Man will leave from post 3 and is the 8-5 morning-line favorite.

"He hasn't seemed to get tired yet," Kakaley said. "He's a powerful horse and he's high speed. He can rattle off :27 quarters like they're nothing at Yonkers. I could see him going a really big mile if I ever have to and the weather is right. He's a tough horse. If he stays healthy and remains as sharp as he's been, he's going to have a big say [in the series]."

One race prior to Desperate Man's Borgata split, Kakaley will be in the sulky behind Backstreet Shadow in the second of the three divisions. Backstreet Shadow, a 9-year-old gelding, made his seasonal debut in the Borgata's second round, finishing third behind 1:51.4 winner Dunkin' and Hemsworth N.

The son of Shadow Play—Backstreet Sweetie had prepped for his opener with a March 16 qualifier at Sunshine Meadows in Florida and March 20 qualifier at Mohegan Pennsylvania's Pocono Downs. He has won 44 of 134 career races and earned \$1.56 million.

"I thought he raced super," Kakaley said. "To do what he did in 10 days, I was super impressed. He felt good. He's only going to get better. He's a classy horse. Tough as nails.

"It's a nice little one-two punch to go through these next few weeks."

Backstreet Shadow, trained by Alexander and owned by Robert DiNozzi, leaves from post 6 on Monday and is the 5-2 second choice behind Dunkin' at 2-1.

"He's not in a great spot, but if I can get him a decent trip and give him a shot to race, I think he'll be close," Kakaley said. "The following week, he should be even sharper and better."

Linedrive Hanover is the 5-2 favorite in the first division Monday. He will leave from post 6 with Scott Zeron driving for trainer Linda Toscano.

The Borgata series features five preliminary rounds where horses receive 50 points for winning, 25 for second, 12 for third, eight for fourth, and five for fifth. In addition, all starters in each round receive 25 points. The top-eight horses at the completion of the prelims are eligible for the \$200,000-added final on April 22.

This year's final will also have a "win and you're in" feature for the \$125,000 Birthday Invitational Pace in May to celebrate 125 years of Yonkers Raceway, the Battle of Lake Erie at MGM Northfield on June 8, and the Aria Invitational at Yonkers scheduled for Sept. 7.

Matt Rheinheimer enjoyed a career-best year in purses in 2023, and two horses making their seasonal debuts this weekend in opens at Harrah's Hoosier Park — older male pacer Yourwishisgranted and older female trotter Triathlon As — were among the top contributors to the trainer's success.

Yourwishisgranted and Triathlon As joined Indiana Sire Stakes 3-year-old female trotting champion Naturdays to give Rheinheimer a trio of six-figure performers as his stable banked \$633,740 last season. His previous money high of \$366,904 came in 2015 when 3-year-old filly trotter Churita, who spent the season butting heads with future Hall of Famer Hannelore Hanover on the Indiana circuit, was the star of the barn.

"I had a super year, I cannot complain at all," said Rheinheimer, a 49-year-old resident of LaGrange, IN. "Any time you can win a sire stakes, that's just great. The owners had their whole family there, and it topped off the year. You don't get too many moments like that, so that's got to be your highlight."

Not far behind was Yourwishisgranted's campaign, which saw the then 4-year-old pacer win five times at either the open 2 or open 3 levels at Hoosier Park in addition to finishing second to Hellabalou in the Lynn Wilfong Memorial Invitational and third behind Little Rocket Man and Ponda Warrior in the Indiana Sire Stakes championship for older male pacers.

For the season, Yourwishisgranted hit the board in 16 of 28 races, winning seven and earning \$129,050.

"He had a great year," Rheinheimer said. "I was very happy with what he did. Anytime you can be competitive with open horses in Indiana, you've got to be pretty proud of it. He had a lot of starts and there was nothing easy. He's an ordinary horse and he just loves to race. Absolutely loves it."

Yourwishisgranted was trained at ages 2 and 3 by Jay Cross before Rheinheimer took over in late October 2022, when the horse won the Circle City and a division of the Pegasus stakes. The son of JK Endofanera—Onawish Hanover has won 12 of 63 lifetime races and earned \$288,335.

"Jay always told me he thought he could be something special," Rheinheimer said. "He's just that type of horse. Any horse that loves their work, you know you're going to have a decent horse. He's just an easy-going horse. He's nice in the barn, he's nice on the track. He's one of those dream horses that you want to be around. But his biggest asset is he loves his job."

Yourwishisgranted is owned by Ruby Huggins, who took over following the passing of her husband, Bill, in January 2023 at the age of 87.

"Losing Bill, for [Yourwishisgranted] to come out and race as good as he did, it was kind of a special thing," Rheinheimer said. "Ruby was ecstatic, too, with the way he raced."

Yourwishisgranted opened this season in Friday's (March 29) \$22,000 open at Hoosier, where he finished third in a field of six. He entered the race off a second-place 1:55 qualifier on March 20.

"He's been very good," Rheinheimer said before Friday's race. "He's done everything I've wanted him to do. It's too bad we

have to throw him in the open for his first start, but that's all right. We'll get what we can get."

Triathlon As made her seasonal bow in Saturday's \$16,000 open 3 in a field of eight. Last year, the daughter of Trixton—There's A Way won six races and earned \$106,460. Four of her triumphs came in either open 2 or open 3 events.

"She's a nice and consistent mare and had a very nice year," said Rheinheimer, who trains the 7-year-old trotter for owners Faron Miller and Every Day Stable. She enters her first 2023 start off a 1:56.4 qualifier win last week.

Rheinheimer, who has a stable of 15 horses now, said Naturdays would qualify sometime around the end of April, beginning of May. She closed out her 2023 campaign by winning six of her final seven races, culminating with the sire stakes championship.

For her career, the daughter of Helpisontheway—Windsongmusclelady has won 15 of 26 starts and earned \$339,665, with \$275,820 of the money coming last season. She is owned by Alton Miller, Debra Miller, and Brackton Miller.

Lit De Rose doubles up in Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

Lit De Rose and driver Pat Lachance won for the second time in three Blue Chip Matchmaker Series legs on Friday night (March 29), kicking home strongly as the 3-5 choice to capture one of three \$40,000 divisions at MGM Yonkers Raceway.

Off quickly from post 5, Lit De Rose settled for the pocket quickly as second choice Tony's Mom and driver Yannick Gingras took advantage of the rail draw and demanded to cut the pace. Tony's Mom's first turn speed was quickly reined in by Gingras, who got the Per Engblom-trained mare to the quarter in :28.3 and half in :58.2 and appeared well in control and bound for an upset halfway through the mile.

The complexion changed radically in the third quarter when Crème Delight and George Brennan went on the offensive leaving the third turn. Crème Delight moved to even terms with the leader, and that gave Lachance the chance to make a split-second decision and seek cover, with Sale El Sol and Jason Bartlett unable to keep up with the first-over challenger.

With three-quarters in 1:26.3, the field began to bunch up on the final bend, but Lit De Rose, now a winner of 49 career races, knew exactly what to do in the stretch and overpowered the field. Crème Delight held on gamely for the place spot with AVF Claire sneaking between horses for third ahead of pace-setter Tony's Mom.

Owned and bred by Guy Corbeil, Lit De Rose is a 9-year-old by Leader Bayama that has now won three times in five starts this year and is just a shade under \$12,000 from hitting the \$1 million mark in career earnings. As the 3-5 choice Lit De Rose returned \$3.50 to win, keying the \$37.20 exacta and \$259.50 triple. The 10-cent superfecta returned \$31.85.

Delitfulcatherin N won for the first time in the series after a pair of second-place finishes, going wire-to-wire for Jordan Stratton in 1:55.4. Delitfulcatherin N, sent off at 7-2, discouraged leavers, with only Incaseyoudidntknow taking a brief surge at the start but electing to tuck in third, while 6-5 favorite Mikala elected to race from the back after starting from post 6.

Stratton flaunted his pace-setting, hitting the opening quarter in :28.1 and half in :58.4 without a challenge. Incaseyoudidntknow moved to the outside off the third turn but didn't advance quickly at all, giving Stratton and Delitfulcatherin N another breather as that pair coasted to three-quarters in 1:28 flat and then put on the accelerator.

Stratton saw his mare kick away by a few lengths as others struggled through a :27.4 final quarter. Incaseyoudidntknow and Andy McCarthy were once again brave in defeat, holding on to the place spot, with Racine Bell third and Treacherous Penny fourth as the favorite Mikala stayed on the pylons as a non-threat to the wire.

Trained by Jeff Gillis for owner Mark Ford, Delitfulcatherin N, a daughter of Bettor's Delight, won for the sixth time in 10 starts this year and returned \$9 to win. She was atop a \$30.80 exacta, \$137.50 triple and 10-cent superfecta for \$26.15.

In the first \$40,000 division **Dougs Babe A** rallied from off-the-pace to collar the leaders and score for driver Dexter Dunn in 1:53.4 for her first win in 2024. The 7-year-old by Western Terror started from the outside post 5 in the field and went to the back at the outset as Coachellabound N and Yannick Gingras assumed rapid control once the gate opened, advancing to the front on the first turn. Second choice Jive Dancing A and Matt Kakaley didn't wait very long and regained control before the :27.4 opening quarter.

It was Jive Dancing A, on the engine from there, leading the four rivals around the track to the half in :56.4. With the pace accelerating past that point, that kept the field aligned until slightly before three-quarters when Karma Seelster and Jordan Stratton pulled from the 3-hole and put intense pressure on the pace-setter. Dunn seized the opportunity to draft behind the cover into the final bend as three-quarters was clocked in 1:24.3 and the field separated but by just three lengths.

Jive Dancing A couldn't handle the onslaught and Karma Seelster gained the top in the stretch, but the lead was short-lived as Dougs Babe A rallied sharply for the decision. Early leader Coachellabound N and Gingras found a slim opening in mid-stretch and rallied for the place, with Karma Seelster settling for third.

Trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman for owners Tom Vassiliou, Nicholas Tallarico and Enzed Racing, Dougs Babe A returned \$4.30 as the slight favorite and triggered a \$21.20 exacta and \$56.00 triple. The victory was win number 20 in 80 career starts for the import that has now finished first, second and third in her three starts in the series.

The Blue Chip Matchmaker prelims continue through Friday (April 12) before the \$125,000 added final takes place on Monday (April 22).

MGM Yonkers Raceway's stakes action continues on Monday (April 1) with the third leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series. Three \$50,000 divisions will be featured on the program. The 2024 edition of the John Brennan Trotting Series joins the stakes

slate as well next week, with four \$25,000 tilts to get that event underway on Wednesday (April 3).

Live racing takes place at Yonkers on a Monday-Friday schedule with post time each night at 7 p.m. (EDT).

'Toddy' hot, wins four at Big M

Dave Miller might be the leading driver at The Meadowlands, but Todd McCarthy was the man during March, and with Miller not racing this weekend, McCarthy locked up being the leading driver during the month after winning four times Friday night at the mile oval.

Heading into the final card of the month Saturday, McCarthy had 21 wins from 96 starts, good for a win percentage of 22. The 'Hot Toddy' scored with three favorites and one double-digit winner on the night, and had only 11 starts on the program, with three of the dashes restricted to members of the Meadowlands Amateur Driving Club.

McCarthy began his big night in the third race by guiding the Izzy Estrada-trained **The Will To Play** (a 4-year-old gelded son of Shadow Play—Lady Willpower) to an easy 1:53.4 score in a TrackMaster Series event for pacers with a rating of 74 or less. The 1-5 favorite returned \$2.40 to win.

Win No. 2 came in race 5 with 1-2 public choice **Lettuceriprita A** (a 14-year-old gelding by Aces N' Sevens – Money Bags Rita) in 1:56.2 in a TrackMaster Series dash for pacers with a rating of 71 or less. The Paul Blumenfeld student returned \$3 to his backers.

The 31-year-old pilot steered 2-1 chalk **Roma Amor** (a 4-year-old mare by Lazarus N—Full Explosion) to victory lane in the ninth race for trainer Michael Posner in a TrackMaster Series pace for fillies and mares with a rating of 73.5 or less. She returned \$6.20 after completing the mile in a lifetime-best 1:54.2.

McCarthy saved his best for last, scoring in the 14th-race finale with 4-1 third choice **Its Rockin Randy** (a 6-year-old bay gelding by Always A Virgin—Gypsys Good Girl) in a lifetime-best equaling 1:52.3 for trainer Carl Tirella in a TrackMaster Series mile for pacers with a rating of 74 or less. He returned \$10.80 to win.

A LITTLE MORE: Trainer Bryan Quevedo, 20, picked up his first career Meadowlands win with Just A Rocket Man in the second race. Outside The Fire (a 5-year-old gelded son of Cantab Hall—Light The Flame) won the \$16,000 featured conditioned trot as the even-money favorite in 1:53.3 for driver Andy Miller and trainer Anette Lorentzon. All-source handle totaled \$3,445,558 on the 14-race program, giving The Big M 20 nights where handle has exceeded the \$3-million mark from 24 cards during the year.

Free programs, playerfriendly wagers highlight 2024 Oak Grove meet

Free daily past-performance programs highlight a number of new player-friendly amenities this season at Oak Grove Racing & Gaming, which opens the 2024 Kentucky harness racing calendar with a 34-date meet beginning Monday (April 1).

The southwestern Kentucky venue, 60 miles northwest of Nashville on Interstate 24, will host live racing every Monday and Tuesday from April 1 through July 16, along with Sunday cards on July 7 and 14. Daily post time is 3 p.m. CDT (4 p.m. EDT), situated to allow for maximum visibility between the end of prime East Coast afternoon signals and evening offerings.

Daily past performances for each race day will be available via the track's website (oakgrovegaming.com/racing/), as will expanded commentary from racing analyst Ray Cotolo. On the wagering front, players will be treated to a pair of Pick-5s daily, each with a low 15-per cent takeout and a minimum 20-cent base wager. The wagering menu also includes a \$1 minimum on win, place, show, exacta, daily double, Pick-3 and Pick-4 wagers, 50-cent trifectas, 20-cent superfectas, and a 20-cent Super Hi-5 offered on each day's final race.

"Offering free programs makes our racing accessible to everyone, no matter where you are," said Cara Collins, racing and equine operations manager at Oak Grove. "Hopefully, it will

continue to grow our fan base. We've been steadily growing each year, although I think this year the buzz is greater. A lot of drivers and trainers are excited about what Oak Grove has to offer."

The sport's top stables and drivers will again converge on Oak Grove throughout the meet as it plays home to Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund races for Kentucky-bred 2-, 3- and 4-year-olds. Two series will be offered for 4-year-olds, with six-figure finals on both May 13 and June 25. Oak Grove's marquee program of the season is slated for Sunday (July 14), when 2- and 3-year-olds contest a combined \$800,000 in Kentucky Sire Stakes series finals.

The Opening Day card has its own share of firepower, with a combined \$184,000 in purses offered across 12 races, including a pair of \$30,000 open paces. Tuesday (April 2) features another 12-race card, headlined by a \$30,000 open trot.


