Owner Sam Bowie on his two great loves, hoops and harness racing

It was on Dec. 20, 2020 when I first wrote a **column with Sam Bowie**. It seems like so much longer. The world then was in the midst of a terrible pandemic through which its residents had never before seen. It is now going on five years later and although the worst days of COVID-19 are well past, things in this world of ours are far from settled - now mostly from a political and trade standpoint.

Nevertheless, two of the most influential areas in Bowie's life, harness racing and basketball, still occupy prominent places.

It's on the eve of the NCAA's Final Four and the time when most stables are preparing for the stakes season to come that we got together for this conversation.

When I last wrote about you, you had just finished a terrific 2-year-old season with your great filly Hot Mess Express. After a racing career where she earned \$949,284, she is now a broodmare, having given birth to her first foal a colt by Captaintreacherous a few weeks ago.

but I decided it's not for me. I much prefer the action of racing. I don't have the patience required to wait the years involved in waiting to see what the future might bring."

at the horse. A couple of nights previous, the owner called me to say that he wanted \$40,000 more than what we had agreed upon. I told him thank you, but no thanks."

Which leads to my next question. How is your racing stable presently constituted?

"Right now, I have three head in training. Six-year-old Energetic Hanover (\$428,421) is the backbone of the operation. He is a solid open pacer who is just getting ready to qualify. He is with Tony Alagna with who he has been since I first bought him.

"Tony and his late mom Donna Lee have guided him successfully all the time that I've owned him.

"I also own a lightly raced Catch The Fire 3-year-old Catch The Express that I bought late last season and a Catch The Fire 2-year-old My Boy Pank.

"Both those two are with Ronny Gillespie. They are in Ohio and hopefully will be factors in the Ohio Sires Stakes this coming season.

"I'm always on the lookout for something new. I watch racing from all over on a daily basis.

"When I see a horse that catches my eye, I'm not hesitant to contact its owner to see if it's for sale. I thought I had one bought a week ago. We agreed on a price. I was going to New York to look

I don't know many people who have a greater interest in harness racing and a greater love for the sport than you do.

"I just love the game; everything about it. But especially the part of it that most people do not see.

"Here in Florida, I'm often at Sunshine Meadows six mornings a week. I love learning as much as I can absorb. I love being the proverbial fly on the wall overhearing the conversations about the history and breeding of our great horses between people like Myron, Tom Merriman and you. I cherish the many great friends I have made through my involvement in the sport. We generally stay in Florida until early May when we move to Lexington where we will stay until after the sales in October.

"In Kentucky, it's more of the same, except that my base of operations has switched from Sunshine Meadows to The Red Mile.



"Those that I learn from there have switched to Bobby Stewart, Steve Waller and the recently passed Mike Zeller. Later on, when Grand Circuit racing starts, I like to spend as much time as I can possibly find with all the stars of the game.

"When I think back, I've transitioned from being friends with the Campbells, O'Donnells and Pierces to the Dexter Dunns, the McCarthy brothers and Jason Bartletts.

"Of course, being in Lexington I also spend a good deal of time following basketball, specifically University of Kentucky basketball."

Let's pick up there. UK has had a significant change in its basketball fortunes this season.

"It certainly has been rewarding and a great deal of fun to be a UK fan this season. I cannot stress how much of a great job that Mark Pope has done as our coach. Nobody, I stress nobody, could have done better. It's no secret that he wasn't our first choice. He was probably our third or maybe even our fourth pick.

"I have no doubt that if he had even been our twentieth choice, he still would have come here and done great things for the program. Such is that guy's love for UK and its basketball traditions. This guy was born to lead UK. Nobody bleeds Kentucky Blue more than he does.

"He played here, being captain of the champion 1995-96 team. The team he inherited this season was non-existent. There was not a single returning member of last year's Calipari team.

"What did Mark do? He built his own team made up of players he brought in through the portal and a couple of freshmen.

"What did the team do? They acquitted themselves extraordinarily well in college basketball's toughest conference the SEC and made it to the Sweet Sixteen, something that the previous Calipari teams loaded with blue chippers had failed to do.

"In the first game I like Florida to defeat Auburn. Of course, a lot will depend on the physical readiness of Auburn's star Johni Broome. If Broome is alright, it should be one heck of a game.

"In the second game I like your Duke Blue Devils over the University of Houston. I just believe they are bigger, faster, deeper and yes, better.

"In the final, I like Duke to win it all.

"When I watched our UK team defeat Duke early this season, I thought to myself 'This team barely resembles the team we will see by the time the tournament comes along. They start three freshmen who have barely played a dozen games in the totality of their careers. Those freshmen, plus two others are now battle proven stars."

It Takes Two, Western Fair's reigning HOY, is back for more

Horseman Scott McNiven has his fourth-generation trainee It Takes Two continuing the winning tradition that his ancestors set some 40 years ago with a hardware-filled 4-year-old campaign at The Raceway at Western Fair District.

After collecting nine wins and north of \$55,000 across 21 starts (9-3-3) at the London, ON, oval in 2024, It Takes Two doubled

down at Western Fair's annual awards night on Feb. 22, capturing Horse of the Year and Older Pacing Horse honors.

All the credit, his trainer said, belongs to his homebred pacer.

"It's always nice getting recognized and receiving an award like that, but it wasn't about us; it was about him," McNiven said. "He won the most money in that division. There were four or five horses that were in the running for it, and he's the one that qot it.


"He's a nice horse to be around, and being a homebred is an extra bonus. It's nice that we were there when he was born, and he's still in the barn."

McNiven has become an expert on the bay's bloodline over the years, having trained and broken It Takes Two's great grandmother Keystone Heron, her daughter Island Hussy, and his dam Shellace, who made nearly \$370,000 for her career.

That familiarity was an asset when the time came to break It Takes Two, who was a tad lukewarm to racing as a youngster.

"He's a big, strong, and good-gaited horse but he somewhat lacked the desire when he was younger; he went through the motions," McNiven said. "He'd follow along."

A helping hand from another familiar face, veteran reinsman Lorne House, also paid dividends for an unseasoned young horse trying to put it all together.

House stables at the same track as McNiven (Dorchester Fairgrounds) and has known It Takes Two from the beginning.

"He watched him train down as a young horse," said McNiven, who enlisted House's talents after conducting a few training sessions of his own from the race bike.

"I had been around 2:12 with him and I asked Lorne if he could go with him in the bike, which he did. He went around in 2:05. He even looked great out there by himself."

The pair have since proven to be the perfect match, as House and It Takes Two have teamed up for 81 of the geldings 99 career starts – a partnership McNiven is certainly grateful for.

"Lorne sees him every day, and he knows him well," McNiven said. "He's obviously a good driver himself, but he gives him a chance every time."

While even the Putnam, ON-based conditioner acknowledged that a path to Horse of the Year honors seemed unlikely at first, It Takes Two possessed too much natural talent for it to be squandered.

As the son of Artspeak—Shellace furthered in his progression, he became more versatile on the racecourse.

"He really clicked around his late 2-year-old, early 3-year-old year," McNiven said. "He got more 'racier' and once you put him in position off the gate, he did the rest.

"You can lead with him every time off the gate, and he never gets hot. That's a real bonus. A lot of horses, if you keep marching them off the gate, they'll get to a point where that's all they want to do. You can race him any way you want to, depending on the class you're in or whatever the circumstance.

"He's been a nice horse. The last 16 months or so, he's really developed into what he is."

The Western Fair faithful witnessed exactly who It Takes Two is in a preferred handicap tilt on March 18, 2024.

Locked into a tightly contested battle with heavy 1-5 favorite Wilcat Rocky, It Takes Two and House, at 7-1, showed incredible poise and resolve to slide ahead in the late goings to win by a nose.

That gritty performance punctuated what McNiven already knew.

"He's tough," he said. "If you look at all the wins he's had in London, or even down at Mohawk, most of them are all way less than a length. He has a nose for the wire. He doesn't over exert himself; he goes where he has to go. Even his last win was by a nose [March 25 at Western Fair]. That's who he is."

Off to a strong start in 2025 (2-2-3 across 10 starts, all at Western Fair), McNiven said the tentative plan is to keep It Takes Two at the preferred tier or the class below for the remainder of Western Fair's winter meet.

Once the half-mile track's season concludes, it's most likely off to Grand River and possibly Mohawk, where It Takes Two was victorious twice in 2024 with driver Jody Jamieson at the helm.

"He got along great with him, and he liked a big track, too," McNiven said. "He wasn't the kind you could race in front down there. You had to bury him a bit and get him a trip and he responded well."

Before any changes of scenery, It Takes Two will embark on his next start — number 100 of his career — currently scheduled for Tuesday (April 8) at his hometown track.

When he makes the milestone start, It Takes Two will get one step closer to joining a trio of McNiven greats in Bridge Street (361 starts, 58 wins, \$676,317 earned), two-time Western Fair awards recipient Kendal Gustav, and Rackum Red, another former Western Fair awards winner, all of whom enjoyed long and fruitful careers.

With It Takes Two, McNiven is optimistic that the second act will be just as auspicious as the first.

Just when the doubters were emerging, champion Aussie pacer **Leap To Fame** delivered his most stunning win yet.

On a rain sodden track, Leap To Fame crushed his Miracle Mile conqueror Don Hugo and left New Zealand's best in his wake in the \$1 million race by betcha at Cambridge in New Zealand's North Island.

Despite the conditions and never seeing the marker pegs, Leap To Fame obliterated the New Zealand national 2,200 meters, taking 1.6 seconds off the previous mark.

Even his conservative and modest trainer/driver Grant Dixon was moved to say it was Leap To Fame's "greatest performance yet."

Champion Kiwi trainers Barry and Mark Purdon, along with Cran Dalgety, all watched in awe and remarked they had seen genuine greatness.

As he walked Leap To Fame back to the trailer to leave the track, Dixon said he was as much relieved as excited.

"It's a bit that way in all the big races with him, but it's especially so with this one... coming all the way to New Zealand the first time," he said. "When you factor it all in, the travel, the wide draw and the work he did getting around the field, I think it's his greatest performance yet."

Dixon drove like a man on a mission after some felt he didn't put enough pressure on Don Hugo in the Miracle Mile when they last met on March 8.

"I got lots of instructions to get right up and into Don Hugo's face and it worked," Dixon said. "I had him beaten coming to the last bend, but I did worry what we'd have left after doing so much work.

"I didn't look back. I just focused on Larry [Leap To Fame's nickname] and hoped he would keep going. He's just an amazing horse, a life changing horse for Trista [Dixon's wife] and I."

Owner Kevin Seymour talked of the extra layer after the disappointment of two aborted New Zealand trips last year, most notably last November's New Zealand Cup.

"There was unfinished business and we wanted to get the horse over here to show a passionate harness country how good he is," Seymour said. "I've said before, he's the horse Kay [Seymour's wife] and I have been dreaming of getting after more than 50 years in the game.

"Grant and Trista have done such a remarkable job with him, it's a real team effort. It adds so much to share a win like this with them, too.

"It's hard to compare wins, but this has to be up in the very top echelon."

Dixon confirmed Leap To Fame would now return home for a break with the Brisbane Inter Dominion at Albion Park in July the next major target.

He won the Inter Dominion the last time it was run at Albion Park in December, 2023.

Seymour said a trip back to New Zealand for the iconic NZ Cup in November could be in the cards.

"Now that would be the pinnacle and we'd love to do it, but it's something we won't talk about until after the Inter Dominion," Seymour said.

Don Hugo, who was heavily backed to beat Leap To Fame again, succumbed to the immense pressure and weakened to finish fourth.

Mark Purdon's emerging 4-year-old ran a booming race for second, while defending champion Merlin kept rallying after being under pressure with a lap to run and finished third.

Earlier, emerging trotting star **Arcee Phoenix** set the scene for the Aussie dominance of the night by leading throughout to win the \$600,000 TAB Trot.

Aussie raiders, all of them trained in Victoria, filled the first four spots in last year's inaugural TAB Trot with champion Just Believe leading the way from Callmethebreeze, Queen Elida and Arcee Phoenix.

A year later, and with Just Believe retired, and Callmethebreeze recovering from hoof issues, it was Arcee Phoenix's turn to shine with Queen Elida running another booming race for second.

It was an Aussie trifecta again with Inter Dominion winner, the Swedish-bound The Locomotive, running third after doing the work outside the leader on a rain-soaked track.

But this was a wonderful story of family, patience and passion with Arcee Phoenix.

The family and patience part came through winning trainer/driver Chris Svanosio's father-in-law, renowned equine vet Dr. Alistair MacLean, who passed away in September, last year.

"Alistair played such a big role in shaping this horse the path he's gone on to get here," Svanosio said. The horse was here as a 2-year-old and didn't race because Alistair looked at him and said, give him time. We've followed the pathway Alistair set for him. We all miss him, it's such a shame he's not here to enjoy this tonight."

The passion element came from Svanosio and global trotting identity, Duncan McPherson, who bought the slot in the race through his Aldebaran Park brand, and banked on Arcee Phoenix for the second year in a row.

"You know how much I love trotting and what I've put into it to make it better Down Under, this just means the world to me, especially doing it with great people and mates," McPherson said. "We knew he was probably a year early last year, but coming across was part of what built him for the win tonight.

"This is a serious trotter. With all of my international connections, I hope we get the chance to see him race on the international stage. I just love trotting. It's everything, which is why I'm so emotional. It just means the world, especially sharing it with these great people."

Svanosio will skip three other major races in New Zealand to return home to, like Leap To Fame, focus on the Brisbane Inter Dominion.

The series consists of two heats and a \$500,000 final and runs from July 5 to 19 at Albion Park.

By running second, Queen Elida became the richest Down Under trotting mare of all-time. She moved to \$1,063,920, compared to One Over Kenny's \$1,060,394.

And The Locomotive didn't lose any fans finishing third after doing the work outside the leader.

What's clear is he will need the draw to lead to be a serious factor in Sweden.

The Locomotive has won 23 times in 25 races when he's led, but only won once from 14 tries when he hasn't been able to find the front.

Remembering colorful standout Im A Standardbred

As The Meadowlands celebrated the arrival of Irish pinto pacer Always B Colour IR on Saturday (April 5) night, the news evoked memories of perhaps the most colorful horse to compete at Mohawk Raceway/Woodbine Mohawk Park.

On May 18, 1992, an unusually marked mare owned by Sydney Norris of Brantford, ON gave birth to an extraordinarily

flashy colt. The mare, simply named T (5, 2:03f; \$30,166), was a Florida-bred by solid bay stallion Star Shot out of the unraced mare Stonegate Worthy, a bay mare with a star, snip and strip on her face, and one white sock. Star Shot (3,TT1:58.1m; \$132,010), owned by John J. Walker of Delray Beach, FL, sired 13 chestnut foals among his 98 registered offspring, passing along the distinctive color of his own sire, 1959 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Trotter of the Year Blaze Hanover (3, 1:59.4m; \$239,069).

T raced from 1984 through 1987, winning 16 of 64 starts and taking her 2:03 lifetime mark at Mohawk. The bay mare's more remarkable marks were her blaze and the spot on her lower lip, her left hind white ankle, and her completely white front and hind right legs.

T was not a registered pinto, but she almost certainly was a sabino. The University of California Davis Veterinary Genetics Laboratory website described sabino as an "autosomal incompletely dominant trait" which shows up as "irregular spotting, usually on the legs, belly, and face, often with extensive roaning." The website noted that if sire or dam passes along the sabino 1 allele, the result can be "horses with two or more white legs or feet, often with white running up the anterior

part of the leg, an extensive blaze, spotting on the midsection, with jagged or roaned margins to the pattern." If both parents pass along the sabino 1 allele, the offspring will typically be "at least 90 per cent white."

When Sydney Norris bred T to Armbro Bullet (8,2:00.3f; \$302,477), he was likely aware of the stallion's famously chrome-sporting sire, Dream Of Glory (3,1:57.2m; \$473,316), if not the genetics of sabino. While Armbro Bullet was bay with little white on his coat, three-time Dan Patch Award winner Dream Of Glory was a dark bay with a star with connecting strip and long snip on his face, plus white on his outer left front coronet, right front ankle, and both hind half-legs. When combined, the genetics of Armbro Bullet and T resulted in a colt so unique that his looks belied his breeding.

The colt was fittingly named Im A Standardbred.

As Dave Little reported in his Meadowlands media release about Always B Colour IR, horses of a different color are seldom high achievers on the racetrack in harness racing. He quoted the stallion's trainer, Shane Tritton, about the reason why skewbald (i.e., brown, bay or chestnut with large white patches) pinto standardbreds even exist today.

"They have skewbalds racing in Australia and Europe, but they've always had a notorious history of not producing the best horses," Tritton said. "People want these things and try to breed them because they love the coloring but not many of them have turned out to be high-quality racehorses."

Unusually-colored harness horses have sometimes inherited this trait from non-standard bloodlines originating outside of the standardbred breed. Not so for Im A Standardbred (8, 1:57s; \$388,906), who was all trot when he won his first schooling race at Quebec's Connaught Park by 16 open lengths in 2:17 flat on June 18, 1994. He finished second as the beaten favorite in his pari-mutuel debut, an Ontario Sires Stakes 2-year-old colt trot at Kawartha Downs on July 30, 1994, for owner/trainer/driver Erwin Stewart. He made seven more OSS starts that season, finishing fourth behind winner Armbro Norbert in the \$98,280 finale at Windsor Raceway on Nov. 26, 1994. With four wins

from 17 starts and a mark of 2:04.3 taken at Rideau Carleton Raceway for Stewart, Im A Standardbred was establishing himself as a dependable trotter who would race every season until his final start on Nov. 8, 2002 at Mohawk.

Canadian Hall of Fame driver Dave Wall first picked up the catch drive on Im A Standardbred in OSS action at Windsor Raceway. The gelding was interfered with early in a \$101,720 event on Oct. 2, 1994, but reset for a show finish behind Larry Walker's Going Smartly. Wall teamed up with Im A Standardbred for 69 of the striking chestnut's 239 starts, mainly driving him at Mohawk and Woodbine Racetrack later in the trotter's career.

Dave Wall's son, Dean Wall, told HRU that while his father had some memory issues that (understandably) prevented him from recalling details from his 48,541 lifetime drives, Im A Standardbred stood out for everyone who watched him on the track. Dave Wall's memory was affected by "a few bad accidents over the years, so he watches the races and he knows all the horses and that, but he forgets that he talked about it a couple of minutes ago," said Dean.

"Dad and Kevin Davidson had a lot of success over the years," said Dean, referring to the now-retired trainer who campaigned Im A Standardbred intermittently for a total of 116 starts together. "Kevin went out on his own, I think in the '90s."

Davidson's first race with Im A Standardbred was a place finish for Dave Wall at Mohawk on Oct. 22, 1996-the gelding's second-ever start at the Campbellville, ON showplace. Im A Standardbred previously finished sixth there with owner/trainer Stewart in the sulky for a May 21, 1995 OSS Gold elimination for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings.

"He was a chestnut, I remember," said Dean, speaking of Im A Standardbred. "He had all these funny markings on him. The thing I remember about him racing is that he didn't leave very good. He didn't get off the gate very good, so he was first-over almost all the time, and when they hit the head of the stretch, coming down the homestretch, he was always the one on the outside, and he just stood out like a sore thumb... He'd be out in the center of the track, and he just stood out with all that chestnut and then the white markings on him."

Dean said he remembered the effect that Dream Of Glory had on Ontario trotters during the late stallion's heyday.

"Dream Of Glorys had a lot of white on them," Dean said. "A lot of them had three or four white feet. That's probably part of where [Im A Standardbred's] color came from."

While he didn't have personal memories of working hands-on with the flashy chestnut-and-white trotter, Dean said he saw a lot of him.

"I traveled with my dad pretty well every night in my teen years," Dean said. "After I left school, we'd be off to Greenwood and I'd Dream Of Glorys had a lot of white on them. A lot of them had three or four white feet. That's probably part of where [Im A Standardbred's] color came from.

do my homework in the van, and I saw a lot of these horses race a lot. I would work on the weekends and that, until I was done with school, and then I started full-time once I graduated high school. I was working for dad and now I have my own stable."

In his own racing career, Dean said he had never seen another standardbred like Im A Standardbred, but he knew of some deliberate efforts to produce white standardbreds in Ontario.

"There's a couple of pure white horses at the Durbridges' [Norman and Bill Durbridge of Dutton, ON], not a mixture or anything like that... They went out of their way to breed to get these white horses, and they ended up getting a couple. One [Maximum White (p, 5, 2:03.3h; \$17,605)] did make the races."

Looking back at the career of Im A Standardbred, Dean said he was somewhat surprised by the trotter's earnings.

"He made more money than I even thought... that's a tough grind, especially without a lot of stake earnings," he said.

The gelding made 58 lifetime starts at the preferred level, primarily at Rideau Carleton, where he won 15. He took his 1:57 flat mark at age 8, racing in non-winners of \$40K company at Woodbine for Dave Wall and Davidson. His one appearance in the Mohawk preferred was when he finished seventh of 10 trotters on Nov. 26, 1999, in an edition won by Turnpike Token.

Dean said Always B Colour IR's North American debut naturally raised questions about the scarcity of other colorful standardbreds today.

"Did you see the horse at The Meadowlands?" he said. "That's quite a unique-looking horse there too, eh?"

He wasn't sure that pinto or other unusually-colored standardbreds would ever become a trend in harness racing, for one reason.

"I don't know, maybe the fans like the flashy ones, but I don't think the trainers do, because I think the trainers always think there's too much attention on those horses, and it almost works out as a jinx," he said. "I think horsemen just like their horse to be plain [bay or brown], maybe a black one."

He added, with a laugh, "It's hard to hide a horse out on the racetrack or at a training center when you've got a horse with four big white feet and the thing is going terrible. Everybody notices that one."

Taking another spin with the First Turn Stable

Last season, I took the plunge and joined Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing and Casino's First Turn Stable program, documenting the season as it unfolded. As a member of the stable, I and several others experienced a form of fractional ownership at the Anderson, IN oval providing a different perspective on racing. For someone expecting to watch their horse race weekly, the endeavor turned out to be... underwhelming. Feeling unfulfilled by the first go-round, I re-upped for First Turn Stable again in 2025 hoping for better results.

To recap, the stable's racing interest, Fast Feet, fired out of the gate in 2024 with consistent efforts, delivering an early win. But the pacer eventually reached his ceiling and the decision was made to sell him. Seven-year-old Sweet Truth was claimed as

his replacement, only to make one start before being claimed. First Turn Stable attempted to claim horses multiple times only to lose out each time. Sweet Truth's Aug. 30 effort turned out to be the last start for the group.

It was frustrating to not have a horse to follow heading into the fall, but I put the events of the summer out of my mind and moved on. That is, until I received an envelope in mid-December from Harrah's Hoosier Park. Inside was a statement of account and a check for \$25.80, my share of the proceeds. Although the season had been abbreviated, First Turn Stable had made money on the track. After training and vet bills, driver's fees and race-day Lasix were deducted, \$954.59 in profit remained.

I chuckled as I looked at the statement and accompanying dividend. A \$250 investment, and I received a smidge over 10 per cent in return. The irony was not lost on me. I had forfeited a shade under \$225 for the chance to own a racehorse for part of the season. Don't get me wrong, it was a loss, but a very small one. I'm not complaining. I think of the buyers at Lexington and Harrisburg that sign checks each fall that start with \$250 and have two or three zeros added on the end. That's the initial

investment, not including training bills, stakes payments and a host of other fees that are part and parcel with the privilege of owning and campaigning racehorses. It's much higher stakes than the \$250 I chipped in to tag along with very few strings attached.

So, like many others in this business, I am giving ownership another shot. I'm optimistic that this time will be different. Hope springs eternal, right? And after the way the season fizzled last year, I feel that there is unfinished business. Fingers crossed, I want to see a horse that First Turn Stable campaigns race weekly throughout the spring, summer, and into the fall. Even if it may mean no dividend at year's end.

First Turn Stable's 2025 season began Friday night (April 4) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Trainer Patrizio Ancora claimed pacer Robertsgladerunner for a \$10,000 tag on March 21 and gave him a week off before dropping him in the box for his debut for the partnership. A 24-time winner with more than \$200,000 on his card, Robertsgladerunner is a 9-year-old gelded son of Fred And Ginger. Last season he was winless in 17 starts.

Drawing post 5 in Friday night's third race, a field of eight battling for a purse of \$7,500, Robertsgladerunner picked up the services of catch driver Mike Oosting. When the gate folded, the veteran took a seat in fifth with the pacer in the early going. As favorite Imalwaysclassy and Trace Tetrick led the field to the half, Oosting and his charge slowly advanced on the outside, moving up to third in the turn before fading in the stretch. The gelding finished seventh, closing out the mile with a :28.4 last

quarter and managing to only beat breaker Legal Liar. Sent off at 17-1 odds, Robertsgladerunner covered the mile in a time of 1:54.3. In an email sent to First Turn members, Ancora noted "Bob" and Oosting endured a challenging trip.

"Unfortunately, the trip just did not work out the way we would have hoped," the conditioner commented in the update. "With that said, Mike was forced to pull up with how aggressive Bob was on the backstretch, he had such a hold of Mike that he was cutting his air off and Mike had to move him. We will make a rigging adjustment next week for Bob to make him a little more manageable and draw a line through this start."

While not the debut the team had anticipated, there is a path forward. Ideally, the adjustments Ancora employs will help Robertsgladerunner improve his next time out, and he can perform more like the horse that took his 1:52.1 mark in 2022.

As with last season, I approach the First Turn Stable experience with no expectations. Well, that's not entirely true. I would prefer it if we do not repeat last summer's run of one start in 12 weeks. Otherwise, I just want to take in all that the opportunity presents, and hopefully make it to the winner's circle a few times with my fellow owners. The fun will be in watching it all play out from the rail.

Inexess Bleu refused to lose again at Vincennes

Laurent-Claude Abrivard-trained **Inexess Bleu** (Vittel de Brevol) cruised through the French winter meeting undefeated in five starts and followed up by winning the \$90,000 Prix du Bois de Vincennes on March 22. In Saturday's (April 5) \$120,000 Prix Kerjacques at Vincennes, the 7-year-old gelding was faced with some really tough and well-merited opponents.

Etonnant, who showed great form as the runner-up in the Criterium de Vitesse on March 9, was pushed to the front by Anthony Barrier, while first choice Inexess Bleu had to settle in first over, six-to-seven lengths behind the leader after a tough three wide opening.

Seeing Inexess Bleu on the track makes one wonder how much he wants to win races, because he doesn't look like a

champion trotter, more like a standard strong, French horse. Alexandre Abrivard also must be mentioned as a critical part of Inexess Bleu's big success. Alexandre is definitely one of the best drivers in Europe and when he sits behind Inexess Bleu, he does everything right. In the Prix Kerjacques Alexander played it quite cool on the outside throughout the last turn and he probably felt that he had the victory in his hands as he powered up Inexess Bleu's speed in the stretch.

Replay here.

Impressive, again, by a horse that very well could make a great contribution in some of the most important races in Europe later this spring and summer.

As a gelding, there is no regard for a sire season, so if the Abrivard family want to aim high, they most certainly will receive tickets to some big events.

The mile rate in Saturday's race was 1:55 over 1.6 miles.

FIRST HORSE READY FOR PARALYMPIATRAVET

The road to Åby's \$300,000 Paralympiatravet final, scheduled for May 3, started in Bollnäs, Sweden on Saturday (April 5) afternoon as a strong field of trotters gathered behind the gate in the hunt for a place in the final. Sweden's Horse of the Year 2024, Borups Victory, entered the track for the first time this season and Daniel Wäjersten's star did a great job as third after a first over trip.

The race's first choice, Jörgen Westholm trained **Castor The Star** (Maharajah), driven by Mats E Djuse, aimed for the lead and Djuse was able to overtake the front position after 600 meters whereon the pace slowed down as the field reached the first kilometer.

It looked like Castor The Star could sprint away and leave his opponents behind at the top of the stretch, but from second over, Kentucky River delivered a very strong finish, a finish that probably would have ended with a win without an unintended interference 75 meters before the wire.

Castor The Star held on to win by a nose in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.3 miles, and Westholm's trotter is now ready for the final in May.







The three Alans, Part 1

An unexpected and fortunate happenstance became a leitmotif in my life as a journalist in the standardbred racing industry. The coincidence was professional and spiritual and it concerned a trio of men whose given names were Alan.

Two of the Alans (Alan Horowitz and Alan Kirschenbaum) were seriously involved in 1970s' ebbing California harness racing scene and became high-profile figures supporting its validity and very existence. It was those credentials drawing the duo into the sport's news. They were essential voices for journalists to interview.

Though my connection to California harness dated back to the 1970s while I was a freelance comedy writer living a nomadic lifestyle peppered with wins and losses at two of the local harness racing meets — see **Among Ourselves articles** in the Harness Racing Update archives — it took a decade to establish a relationship with Horowitz and Kirschenbaum.

By the late '80s I was an editor at the industry-news-and-commentary magazine *TIMES*: in harness. I emphasized coverage of all standardbred business on the west coast from my office in Pennsylvania. It was not merely my past connection to it that compelled me. Publisher Dave Dolezal and co-editor Ron Reed agreed the business of racing and breeding on the Pacific side of America needed inside-the-industry support.

I was told by sources the foremost person to befriend on the left coast was Horowitz. It turned out to be an understatement. From our first phone conversation through my tenure at *TIMES*: Horowitz and I maintained a relationship on- and off-the-record resulting in countless media coverage. It turned out that my exposure to the California circuit at Western Harness Racing via Hollywood Park and Los Alamitos made for smooth conversations on horses and horsemen and the politics of pari-mutuel activity.

We shared allegiance to California harness since I was well versed on information and history concerning the circuit and that made it easy for Horowitz to trust me. What began was a regular spot in the magazine that addressed the sport's problems and applauded the underrated talent among horsemen.

TIMES: gave Horowitz a larger role to contribute news and entertainment issues untouched by the other industry publications. He offered scoops on the workings of the California Harness Horsemen's Association and its legislative challenges and I published lots of focused material on underrated horsemen like Robert Sleeth and Joe Anderson and editorials about the myths labeling harness racing out west as a home for wayward drivers and trainers.

Horowitz always picked up his office phone when I called and returned a call when he was not available. When we connected, he engaged in whatever topic I brought up. Sometimes we talked when I called and said, "How are you doing this week, my friend?"

When I worked in the minefields of Hollywood, I may have rubbed shoulders with Kirschenbaum without knowing it. Writers and producers of TV comedies were often found strolling the halls of production soundstages. It was not uncommon to bump into someone you recognize. But I had no idea what Kirschenbaum looked like. Nor was I aware he was a TV writer and producer.

I found out what Kirschenbaum looked like when I saw his 1987 ESPN Breeders Crown live broadcast of an **interview with Bill O'Donnell**.

It turned out Kirschenbaum and I shared the odd combination of professions: harness racing and a writing career. And we were products of New York City. Kirschenbaum thrived in Hollywood projects while becoming active as a breeder. He bred and raced Little Steven (p, 1:49.4) on the pacific circuit. The pacer went on to be the sire of \$5.2 million from 88 performers.

When I was an editor at *TIMES*: in Pennsylvania I received a letter to the editor from Kirschenbaum. It protested a piece I wrote about my enthusiastic experiences wagering on driver/trainer Brian Pelling at Western Harness at Hollywood Park. We published his counter-opinion piece.

I did not hear from him again until a few years later about the publishing of my book **Molotov Memoirs**. Kirschenbaum's review was complementary. "Laugh-out-loud funny," he wrote. After *TIMES*: tanked there were talks with Kirschenbaum and me and former Meadows' executive Tom Chaffee about creating a harness racing TV show.

Kirschenbaum died of a suicide in 2012 and five years later Horowitz died of natural causes. The Alan completing my trifecta was dead decades before the other two but his philosophy was essential in the success of my wagering career.

It's murder

About 15 years ago, an anonymous source contacted me to write about the murder of a person in the harness racing industry. Another time, an anonymous emailer demanded that I write an expose about a suspicious trainer.

The anonymous people who contacted me were under the mistaken impression that having a byline meant I was sitting around salivating about following "leads" and rooting out evil. I do not live in a movie or television script. These hot tips widened my eyes, and my heart raced like a scorpion crawling on my leg.

No matter what the venue, sports, government, religion, business, and, indeed, harness horse racing, investigative reporting is fraught with danger at every level. It takes a strange cat to be an investigative reporter; those cats should have several lives to spare. The work is dangerous, unwanted, unappreciated, and expensive; some of the work leads to dark places and dead ends.

Yet a free press with teeth remains essential. Consider a world where nobody digs deep, nobody pokes and prods. Or consider a world where no legitimate platform was available for dissemination even if the dirty work gets done. Not just in the microscopic world of harness horse racing but everywhere.

Take a few moments and stand in the shoes of a writer or publisher.

In an earlier era, investigative workers had newspapers and magazines with wide circulations. Broadcast media were titans. Juicy stories had a place. It is debatable if journalistic investigations were as rigorous or as numerous as they should have been. Still, reporting happened because someone had the backs of the fearless ferrets of wrongdoings.

However, some content was too hot to handle, and publishers shied away. This intimidation factor is not new. The Black Sox baseball scandal in 1919 found threatening mobsters looking for the leak and the reporter. Lance Armstrong and his cycling cronies used the club of litigation. Thirteen-year-old potential Olympic gymnasts have entire nations covering their medication tracks. Even your local council member may have a shady donor who can make an editor's life miserable.

At first glance, it seems the internet would make exposing wrongs easier; this may or may not be accurate. In most businesses, money is motivation. There is virtually zero money set aside for anyone in our tiny publishing world to root out harness-racing evil. Who is going to pay the investigative reporters? Who will pay the bills when a big toe gets stepped on, and lawyers start circling?

Fewer and fewer major magazines and newspapers fill our mailboxes. None are coming back. That's life. Bots and content creators can twist simple facts like a candidate's birthplace, and some recipients of the twisted facts will remain immovable. That's more than a little sad, but the wheel turns, and we adjust. The demise of traditional outlets for disseminating information leads to a troubling question: while the motivation to dig into dark corners may still live, the structures that can afford to pay for presenting these essential investigations are dying.

For most people, thoughts of self-preservation and employment are foremost. Writers and publishers are people. Brave crusaders willing to poke into these dark corners and report on them are rare gems. More than most, this publication has a tradition of doing the work. However, it is a mistake for the public to demand too much. The messenger often gets shot when others disagree with simple facts or have a different point of view. Funding for investigative reporting, whether from the internet, radio, live streaming, or print, is problematic.



Sunlight is an excellent disinfectant, but the hands that throw open the blinds cannot, or will not, work without funding or supporting structures. Some of the responsibility to help those trying to expose cheaters is in your hands; help responsible organizations with your wallet, appreciation, and advertising.

The hunger for accurate reporting and reflection will never go away. Let us hope that the ability to tread into these murky and treacherous waters responsibly remains available to those courageous enough to splash around.

Still, in our sport, we cannot overlook the corner cutters, the members who are just keeping up with the Jones, the beards, or the juicers to run rampant. Policing and enforcing rules is a problem as old as time. The solutions are, and always have been, complex. Doping racehorses, the reality and the illusion have long been an albatross** for our sport.

The above column remained in a file for a decade. Sending it to an editor and presenting obvious problems without a hint of a solution is pointless. However, there is some light in the darkness of doping racehorses. If we hold on and act wisely, the doping albatross may fly away.

The solutions to the chemical problems in our sport should be obvious. Artificial intelligence and high-tech testing machines such as ion-mobility mass spectrometers should take over our pre- and post-race testing. These AI programs would be efficient and stunningly effective. These programs work tirelessly for free. They are not intimidated. Litigation and threats against a machine that backs up all the data is complicated.

Take out the human element, and the testing libraries would expand quickly and keep expanding because AI would be on the case. AI racehorse testing and policing will improve if we outsource the task. We can ask AI to "Vigilantly keep horses free from performance-enhancing methods, keep the racing competition equitable and safe for the animals."

**Note: The metaphor "albatross" refers to something that causes anxiety or hinders accomplishment. The term stems from an 18th-century poem by Samuel Taylor Coleridge called "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner." In the poem, a mariner inexplicably kills an albatross, an omen of his ship's good fortune. When the vessel later becomes stranded, the mariner's shipmates blame his harmful act for their bad luck and hang the dead albatross around his neck to punish him.

The phrase "it takes a village to raise a child," is more than just a bunch of words; it's a powerful expression that ties into deep values of community. The idiom means an entire community of people must provide for and interact positively with children in order for those children to experience and grow in a safe and healthy environment.

It's no different in the sport of harness racing. From the moment a foal is born until he/she (hopefully) makes it to the winner's circle and breaks their maiden, there are many important people with which the horse will cross paths.

First, there's the person I call "the midwife." This is the one who is there to help the mare if she encounters trouble delivering, as there are many things that can happen in foal birth, such as Dystocia (the foal is too large or not in the right position) or the foal decides to come into the world upside down.

One in 10 equine births unfortunately have Dystocia and a veterinarian is notified immediately to help the mare/foal, and if needed, surgical intervention will be required.

Second, there's the person who works with the foal on a daily basis; grooming, feeding and eventually teaching it what it was born to do, race. This person will bathe and brush the foal and teach it manners and how to interact with a human.

Just like a mischievous child, the colt may get himself in trouble by jumping a fence, getting kicked while playing with other foals or perhaps getting a belly ache that needs attention.

By the time the colt is old enough to race, he would have made many two-legged friends — many he may not have liked — along his journey.

So, yes, it certainly takes a village from the moment that tiny foal takes its first wobbly steps,

an undeniable charisma that turns heads and melts heart, to, hopefully, becoming a champion.

From the midwife, veterinarian, caretaker, blacksmith, dentist, trainer, driver — and yes, we can't forget the owner who most likely thinks "his child" will be the next Superstar — it definitely takes a tribe.

Born in Mississauga, ON, Allison de Biasi plays a crucial part in bringing along a knobby-kneed colt to one day getting behind that funny looking contraption called the starting gate.

This year de Biasi helped bring the first foal at Winbak Farms into the frigid, chaotic world. It was a filly by McWicked out of Sweet Report.

Helping a mare foal and bring a new life into the world is definitely one of the most gratifying experiences a human can encounter.

The newborn foal will begin to draw his first breaths within about 30 seconds of birth, and within two minutes, he should be breathing regularly at a rate of about 60 second breaths per minute.

From its first whinny to watching the newborn awkwardly find the "milk truck" (mom) it is truly a remarkable miracle.

After attending the University of Guelph Ridgetown for equine care and management, young de Biasi knew what she wanted to do with her life, work with the incredible animal called a horse.

"My family was not involved in the business, but I grew up riding and felt a strong connection with the animal and knew I wanted to spend my life helping and working with horses," de Biasi said. "At Winbak Farm in Canada I have had the pleasure of meeting and working with many great horse trainers. I've even paddocked for several of them at times.

"I don't own any racehorses, yet, but I own an ex-racehorse named Ellis Park, who is my child. He is an off the track standardbred from OSAS. Ellis was a great racehorse and I feel so privileged to spoil him for the rest of his life."

According to de Biasi, working as the assistant manager at Winbak Farm of Canada is never dull. Although it can be very exciting, there are times when it can be heartbreaking.

"I work in the barns with the mares and foals, handle the stallions, and work with our fantastic vet for breeding season getting mares ready to breed," she said. "I also work closely with the yearlings for sale season. The breeding shed is a busy time of year and I'm there as well, so, I guess you can say I wear many different hats."

According to de Biasi, she has worked at Winbak for six years now, alongside many of their top stallions.

"Currently there are 150 horses on the farm," she said. "There are some very nice stallions such as McWicked, Beach Glass, Betting Line, Lawless Shadow, Betterthancheddar, Tattoo Artist, Archangel, Trixton and MVP."

She said her goals for the future are to continue to expand her knowledge.

"There is something new to learn every day," de Biasi said. "It is something I think I will never tire of and every day I learn something new.

"I absolutely love [working at Winbak] and feel so blessed to be here. Working at Winbak is never boring. Every day is a new adventure. My favorite thing is working with the foals, watching them grow and enjoying each one's unique personality. To watch them grow and go to their racing career is a rewarding experience. I'm like a proud aunt watching each one grow and hopefully make it to the races."

Top Ontario Breeder Rewards recipients reinvesting heavily in the province

George Millar could produce standardbreds anywhere. But Canada's reigning Breeder of the Year said Ontario Breeder Rewards — that in 2025 will be about \$2.5 million in total — are the prime reason he produces all of his horses in province.

In 2024, Millar Farms, which bred and campaigned the nation's **Horse of the Year, Chantilly**, was second among all standardbred breeders with total Ontario Breeder Rewards of \$225,883. Of the top 10 rewards recipients, the top seven each earned more than \$75,000 in rewards.

"The rewards help take the edge off the cost of the broodmare farm," said Millar, who is based in Aurora, ON. "Everybody sees the nice horses that you come up with, but they don't see the so-so horses that still cost about the same amount of money to get [to the races]."

Millar was one of many Ontario breeders that said the reward money is used to reinvest in both their businesses and the Ontario economy. At a time when Ontarians are more conscious than ever about supporting Ontario businesses, the result is a churn that produces economic activity far in excess of the total value of the rewards.

"[The rewards] help support everything," Millar said. "And there's always something. Every couple of years we're replacing fencing on the farm. And I've got six miles of four-plank oak fencing on the farm. It can be \$100,000 a year just replacing a bunch of that fencing to keep it looking nice. So, when you get those rewards in, it helps."

SEELSTER REINVESTS WITH 'FOUND MONEY'

Ann Straatman is the reproduction manager for Seelster Farms in Lucan, ON. Seelster, one of the largest commercial breeding farms in the province, led all Ontario breeders in 2024 with total rewards of \$297,103.

"For Seelster, [rewards] are found money," Straatman said. "We don't ever count on them to pay any bills. When it comes in, and it's six figures plus, it's always something that's turned around

into new broodmares or we had a big year once where we built a new barn. It's not something that sits with us."

Straatman said the farm maintains an informal wish list – such as new mares, higher wages or benefits for staff, a new truck or other equipment.

"It's a forever wish list... Sometimes we're lucky enough to earn some rewards that we can maybe get that wish list looked after sooner rather than later," Straatman said. "I wish we could say that we did something fancy with it, but every bit of [the rewards] that come in are turned around to make this place run more efficiently.

"It's a thrill to see [rewards] come in, but, like I said, we always treat it as found money, because you never know how your horses are going to perform. It's always an incentive for us to aggressively buy new broodmares and breed to more popular stallions and pay out more in service fees... We're always trying to create a variety [of horses for] public sale."

SMALL BREEDERS CAN REAP HUGE REWARDS

Significant breeder rewards don't just go to the large breeders. Jake Higgs and his family have only four broodmares and that only recently increased from one lone, prolific mare, Rite Outa



The Park. That mare helped the high school teacher from Strathroy, ON, earn virtually all of the \$149,270 in breeder rewards he collected in 2024. It was the fourth highest total in the province last year.

Two offspring produced by Rite Outa The Park won O'Brien Awards in 2024 – Canada's top Older Trotter of the Year, Logan Park, and his full-sister, Willys Home Run, the 3-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year. It was Willys Home Run that delivered the significant rewards to Higgs. She earned over \$430,000 on the track as a sophomore to help Higgs collect rewards exceeding a quarter-of-a-million dollars.

"It's been amazing," Higgs said. "[The rewards are] unmatched in the industry, as far as I know. It helps when you have a successful year, like Willy did. The money falls back into the business.

"We have reinvested all our money, plus some, into purchasing new mares... We never saw ourselves increasing our mares, because we don't have a farm yet. That's the problem. We're looking for our own farm so we can bring these mares home. Right now, they're kind of spread around. That's the next plan."

HOW ONTARIO BREEDER REWARDS WORK

Ontario Bred Rewards are paid to the owners (or lessees) of mares that are enrolled in the **Ontario Resident Mare Program** prior to Sept. 1 of the foaling year. Foals from enrolled mares are considered Ontario Bred.

To be eligible a mare must be physically in the province of Ontario at the time of enrolment and remain in the province for a minimum of 180 consecutive days surrounding foaling in Ontario.

Foals racing in the Ontario Sires Stakes, and finals of select open stakes races in Ontario earn Ontario Bred Rewards.

In 2025, approximately \$2.5 million will be available for Ontario Bred Rewards, broken down as follows:

- \$2 million based on earnings in Ontario Sires Stakes.
- \$130,000 based on earnings in selected open stakes.
- \$400,000 for divisional leaders based on Ontario Sires Stakes earnings.

MILLAR USING REWARDS TO CARE FOR RETIRED HORSES

Millar said the rewards have been "awesome," especially in recent years when he's had his greatest success on the track.

"I have had some rewards checks before, but there weren't a lot," Millar said. "And then in 2021, I think they told me my rewards checks were like \$380,000. I said, 'I got the checks, but there has to be a mistake. There are a few more zeros than there

probably should be. They said, 'Oh, that's for real.' We had a good year that year."

Some of the rewards money is being used by Millar to improve the lives of horses in Ontario. The province is home to some 10,000 horses connected to the racing industry. Millar said the rewards have helped him build a third farm he's mostly using to provide lifelong care for some of his retired horses.

"The farm is just about finished," Millar said. "The barns are just about finished. The house was finished a while ago. The paddocks are all done. The property is fenced off... That farm is for mostly my retired mares and horses, ones I can't find good homes for right away that are finished racing. I'll leave them over there until I find a good home for them. But, you know, the older broodmares, you can't really find a home for them, so it's just a place where they're going to live out the rest of their lives and then I'll use it for some of my mares that are barren."

Millar's horses were so successful in 2024 he would have earned even more in breeder rewards if it wasn't for a cap of 20 per cent on the amount any one enroller can earn from open stakes. He topped out at \$26,000 in that category. Had there not been a cap, he would have earned nearly \$5,000 more.

He isn't complaining in the least. Apart from the other uses already mentioned, some of the \$225,883 he received in rewards has been used to replace farm equipment.

"We bought another tractor to work the farm," he said. "You're always replacing equipment and I'm trying to get more environmentally friendly. We're switching away from electricity and going to power grids and things like that. So, it's just always trying to upgrade."

Beautiful Seaside, Aardie B Miki N repeat in Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

The second leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series saw a pair of 1-9 favorites taken down in the first two \$50,000 divisions at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (April 4). **Beautiful Seaside** and driver Tim Tetrick put an end to the four-race win streak of Walkin On Sunshine in dramatic fashion, winning at 10-1 in the second division, completing her mile in 1:53 at the expense of the heavy favorite.

Tetrick got away from post 2 and allowed three of the seven mares to duke it out in the early stages. Silk Cloud A and Jordan Stratton were first to the front on the opening bend and Lloyd's Loves and Brent Holland pursued before taking over shortly before the :27.2 first quarter was reached. Jason Bartlett made a bullet move with Walkin On Sunshine into the second turn and managed to back down the second quarter, reaching the halfway marker in :56.4. Bartlett had the favorite in gear down the backstretch, but Tetrick pulled the Scott DiDomenico-trained Beautiful Sunshine and got instant response, moving towards the leader with three-quarters clocked in 1:24.4.

Tetrick sensed the favorite was vulnerable and kept the attack heavy through the final turn with Beautiful Sunshine, a 5-year-old daughter of Downbytheseaside, gutting it out and passing the favorite in the shadow of the wire. Walkin On Sunshine settled for second with Silk Cloud A coming on late for the show spot.

Owned by Matt Rowe, Beautiful Sunshine has now won back-to-back Blue Chip Matchmaker legs, both times at decent odds, with her victory on Friday coming at a \$22.40 win mutuel. The exacta with the favorite second paid \$48.60 and triple returned \$91.

High Flyin' Filly popped out of the pocket before the threequarters to challenge 1-9 favorite Rocket Deo and then surged to the front in the homestretch in the first \$50,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division. Trained by Ron Burke and driven by Yannick Gingras, High Flyin' Filly blasted to the front into the first turn and forced Cheryls Shadow into a 2-hole. Jason Bartlett quarter-moved the heavy favorite Rocket Deo to the front off the opening bend and they were in control through a :27.1 opening fraction.

Bartlett and Rocket Deo hit the half in :56.2 but found company from the winner before the 1:24.4 three-quarters had been hit. Off the final turn High Flyin' Filly surged to the front, with Cheryls Shadow coming along the pylons late for the second spot. Rocket Deo faded to third.

Owned by Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscemi, High Flyin' Filly, a 5-year-old by Domethatagain, returned \$17.60 to win and keyed a \$140.50 exacta and \$338.50 trifecta payout. The victory was the second in eight starts this year and first in the Matchmaker for High Flyin' Filly.

The upsets continued in the third \$50,000 division as last year's champion **Lit De Rose** rallied in the homestretch for trainer/driver Pat Lachance to overtake the leaders in a 1:54 mile. The 10-year-old daughter of Leader Bayama was sent off as the 5-2 third choice in the field of seven.

Action was fast and furious in the early stages in this division as Turn The Page N and Seaside Diva left hard from the inside and Talk Curdy To Me blasted from the outside of the starting car. Seaside Diva took control off the first bend but yielded to Talk Curdy To Me before the opening quarter clocked in :27.4. Ron Cushing had Turn The Page N making a second move shortly after the quarter and the pair held control through a :56.4 half-mile.

Lit De Rose and Lachance fished cover from Seaside Diva late on the third turn, but when Talk Curdy To Me and Todd McCarthy vacated the pocket, Seaside Diva and Yannick Gingras returned to the pylons, and Lit De Rose closed the gap behind Talk Curdy To Me in second-over position. With the leaders dueling through a 1:25.2 three-quarters, Lachance was poised and called on the now 55-time career winner for her best in the stretch, and Lit De Rose finished in style, securing the win late. Turn The Page N fought bravely with horses on both sides for the place spot, with Millwood Bliss N on the scene late for third.

Guy Corbeil owns Lit De Rose, who went over the \$1.3 million mark in career earnings with the win. Lit De Rose paid \$7.70 to win and keyed the \$26.60 exacta and \$98 trifecta payoff.

A favorite finally had her moment as **Aardie B Miki N** made a power move past Grace Hill off the final turn and rolled off to an easy score in a 1:53.2 clocking in the fourth and final Blue Chip Matchmaker division.

Grace Hill took control off the first turn from Uptown Hanover and set a reasonable pace to the quarter of :28.2 for driver David Miller. Miller was in no hurry, slowing the half to :57.3 with Bartlett sitting chilly in fourth with the prohibitive favorite Aardie B Miki N

Bartlett got instant acceleration from Aardie B Miki N down the backstretch, and she reached Grace Hill nearing the 1:25.3 three-quarters. Once on even terms Aardie B Miki N had too much power and made quick work of the leader, posting a :27.4 final quarter. Grace Hill held gamely for second ahead of Intothemysticmoon.

For Aardie B Miki N, it was her second straight Blue Chip

Matchmaker victory for owner M T Stables Ontario Inc. and trainer Per Engblom. It was Bartlett's fourth victory of the evening as well. Aardie Miki N returned \$2.30 to win while heading a \$5.60 exacta and \$31.20 trifecta payoff.

The preliminary rounds of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series will continue through Friday (April 25), with the leading point earners advancing to the final on Friday (May 9). A major change in 2025 revolves around the added money for the final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, which gets a boost from \$125,000 to \$200,000, equaling the MGM Borgata Pacing Series total. With that increase the Blue Chip Matchmaker final will certainly offer the richest purse in recent history and far eclipse the \$276,200 purse from 2024.

SERIES ACTION RESUMES ON MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY: The MGM Borgata Pacing Series will have its second preliminary round on Monday (April 7) with five \$50,000 divisions. The featured event is race 9 where round 1 winners Verdun (post 1), Mossdale Ben N (post 6) and Aardies Flash N (post 7) square off. Also looking to improve to two-for-two in the Borgata will be For Once Inmy Life (post 1, race 7) and Binge On Yankee (post 4, race 8).

The John Brennan Trotting Series then picks back up on Wednesday (April 9) with a trio of \$30,000 splits of the second leg. Named in honor of the longtime SOA of NY horsemen's representative who passed away from complications of COVID-19 in March 2020, the John Brennan Trotting Series will have a third round on April 16 before a \$100,000 guaranteed final and \$50,000 guaranteed consolation on April 23.

PICK 5 POOL GETS A BOOST ON MONDAYS AND FRIDAYS: Continuing for every Monday and Friday card during the legs of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series and Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, MGM Yonkers Raceway, in conjunction with the SOA of NY, will offer a \$20,000 guaranteed Pick 5 pool in race 5.

The guaranteed Pick 5 pool on Mondays is also a part of the United States Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering Program.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday through Friday live racing schedule with post time each night at 6:45 p.m. (EDT).

Out of this world 'Universe' wins again at Big M

After finishing an uninspiring ninth in his seasonal debut on Jan. 17, **Rock My Universe** sported a lifetime record of one win from 30 lifetime starts. Predictably, not much was expected from the 4-year-old gelded son of Walner—Youlightupmyworld in his next outing on Feb. 7, but Rock My Universe pulled off a 15-1 surprise that night.

Something in outer space had changed.

Since his inauspicious start, Rock My Universe has won four of his last six Meadowlands outings, including a victory in the Friday night (April 4) feature, a \$17,500 high-end conditioned trot.

"He loves this track," said winning trainer/driver Mike Simons of his student, who worked out the right trip to take advantage of his late-closing ways.

Flight Landing, who won two starts back on the front end in 1:54.1, set sail for the lead from the rail in the seven-horse field as 2-1 favorite Supernova Hanover set up shop in the pocket while Rock My Universe raced in the 3-hole.

The quarter went in :27.2 followed by a half in :55.2, but nearing three-quarters, Flight Landing started to slow down after he reached three-quarters in 1:25. Supernova Hanover popped out the 2-hole late on the far turn as Rock My Universe followed that one's move and swung three-wide into the stretch.

Rock My Universe then roared past the favorite and did have an anxious moment or two as Soar Higher closed quickly along the inside, but at the wire, it was Rock My Universe a neck in front of Soar Higher with Luke's Bar a fast-closing third. The final time of 1:53.1 was a lifetime best.

"We got away well, behind the horse we wanted to follow," said Simons. "He angled out there before the stretch and he did his thing. I heard somebody coming late and I got a little nervous, but my horse dug in. He's got some guts."

Rock My Universe now has five wins from 37 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$83,437 for owners A P Racing and William P. Masterson. As the 5-2 second choice, he paid \$7.80 to win.

WINNERS, WINNERS EVERYWHERE: It was a nice night for the Big M TV team. Jessica Otten led the way with seven winners, a cold Superfecta and the Early 50-cent Pick-4, while her on-set partner, Dave Little, had six on top, four Exactas, three Trifectas and a Superfecta.

Ken Warkentin selected five winners, and all four members of the team tabbed best bet winners.

Otten had **Glittering Hope** (\$4 to win) in the third race; Little picked **Paprike Blue Chip** (\$3.20) in the 14th; Warkentin gave out **The Brodster** (\$9) in the sixth; and Joe Romanelli had **Cactustotheclouds** (\$2.40) in the eighth.

A LITTLE MORE: Brett Beckwith padded his lead atop The Big M driver standings by guiding four winners on the night. The 22-year-old pilot now has 51 victories on the year... Despite some predictable outcomes, the 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 returned \$828.46. Winner's odds for the sequence were 1-1, 2-1, 3-2, 5-2, 5-1, 1-5 and 2-5... All-source betting totaled \$2,862,995 on the 14-race program.

Primo Maschio (Badlands Hanover) is owned by Forrest L. Bartlett of Shiloh, NC. Bartlett also owned former Horse of the Year, Forrest Skipper.

Primo Maschio is trained by Walter Callahan, who drove horses in the '70s and '80s at Brandywine Raceway, Liberty Bell Park and Garden State Park and turned his horseman skills to becoming a successful trainer. The winning driver was 23-year-old Trae Porter, the grandson of former catch driver Jim Porter who campaigned on the Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland circuits back in the day.


