'Foiled', Burke Reign Again at Yonkers

YONKERS, N.Y. - Foiled Again (\$2.10) withstood a sustained first-over charge from Dancin Yankee and a challenge in the passing lane from P H Supercam to pick up a fourth straight victory and remain unbeaten in his 10-year-old campaign with a narrow triumph in the third division of the fourth leg of the George Morton Levy Challenge series on Saturday night at Yonkers Raceway.

A winner of the Levy final in 2009 and 2010, Foiled Again was parked momentarily on the first turn by P H Supercam before taking the lead and crossing over to the inside. He paced the opening quarter-mile in 27 4/5 seconds and led comfortably passing the grandstand the first time before Dancin Yankee began to move up in the two path approaching a half in 56 3/5.

With Dancin Yankee to his outside in second and P H Supercam bidding his time behind the top two in third, Foiled Again led by less than a length through three quarters in 1:24 and was never asked for his best in the stretch by Yannick Gingras as Dancin Yankee bore down on the outside and P H Supercam moved up along the rail.

Foiled Again, owned by Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscelli, completed the mile in 1:51 and came home in 27 seconds.

"He just does the talking," said Gingras. "He's an unbelievable racehorse, and he did it again tonight. As long as he comes into the stretch fairly fresh, I know he'll fight them off."

It marked the 12th win for trainer Ron Burke in 15 Levy races since the series began March 22. Foiled Again, harness racing's richest pacer in history with more than \$6.1 million in earnings, won a division of the first leg by 2 3/4 lengths on March 22, a division of the second leg by 3 1/4

lengths on March 29, and a division of the third leg by a head over P H Supercam one week ago.

"Yannick had a good hold of him," said Burke of Foiled Again. "We seem to be in a good spot [going into the next two races in the series]."

Burke had nothing but praise for Dancin Yankee and expressed concern that the runner-up is peaking at the right time going into next Saturday's \$50,000 guaranteed fifth leg and the \$300,000 added final on April 26.

"Dancin Yankee had a ridiculous mile," said Burke. "I'm worried that down the road that he'll be tough. He was awful good tonight and appears to be rounding into top form."

Foiled Again's entry-mate Bettor's Edge broke stride in the stretch and finished last in the field of seven.

Earlier on the card, 8-year-old Clear Vision (\$2.10) became Burke's fifth horse to win a Levy series race when he captured the first division by 1 3/4 lengths over stablemate Itrustyou, who had won on March 22 and March 29.

After finishing third from post one week ago, Clear Vision drew post 2 for tonight's race and found himself three lengths behind the leader Itrustyou in third through a quarter in 27 3/5. He made a quick move to grab the lead

on the turn and never looked back, setting fractions of 56 2/5 and 1:24 4/5 and being driven home by George Brennan while being chased by Itrustyou. The final time for one mile was 1:52 1/5.

"He just was in a good spot," said Brennan. "I was able to get him back to the lead, and he won pretty easily." Previously, Clear Vision finished second in his first two Levy starts before missing by a half-length behind Apprentice Hanover and Mach It So last week.

Special Forces, coupled with Clear Vision and Itrustyou, finished fourth.

There was a brief reprieve to Burke's run of dominance in the second division as Mach It So (\$4) rolled home to a 4 1/2-length victory with Tim Tetrick in the bike for trainer P.J. Fraley.

Mach It So, a 4-year-old who won divisions of the first and second legs of the Levy series before coming up a neck short last week, left well from the inside, briefly racing in second behind Sapphire City before tipping outside and moving to lead through an opening quarter in 26 4/5. Tetrick backed down the pace and Mach It So paced the half in 55 4/5 and three quarters in 1:25 before opening on his seven rivals in the stretch, completing the trip in 1:52 1/5. Sapphire City was well clear of third-place finisher Rock On Me.

"I had the rail, and I used it to my advantage," said Tetrick. "It was a pretty good first quarter, 26 4/5. I moved him and he rated really well, got a nice middle half. He turned on the afterburners and paced on strong."

With Mach It So's three wins in four Levy series starts, Fraley already was looking ahead to the final.

"He was super," said Fraley. "The main thing with him, we just have to keep him quiet because he's a grabby horse. Tonight he did 26 and change out of the gate, 55 [4/5] to the half, three quarters in 1:24 4/5, and that was perfect. He'll make the final off of that. Hopefully, he'll draw inside. If he draws inside, he definitely will be a force because he's fast enough to go with any of them, but he's a bit of a spooky horse, so have to keep his head on."

But until somebody else steps up and beats Foiled Again, Burke's ageless wonder remains the horse to beat, Fraley said.

"[Ron Burke] is tough," said Fraley. "Foiled Again is the best in there. I'd love to be second to him."

For one race, Burke appeared to be mortal as his three starters in the second division filled out the final three spots. Hillbilly Hanover was disqualified from fourth and placed fifth, while Aracache Hanover was promoted to sixth from seventh after Easy Again was disqualified for going off stride and leaving the course in the second quarter.

Apprentice Hanover bypassed the fourth leg and is expected to return next week Saturday for the fifth leg.

So far, so good for Maven. With a start in the Elitlopp on her schedule, the outstanding trotting mare won her

second straight qualifier yesterday at the Meadowlands. With Yannick Gingras driving she won by a head over the Jimmy Takter-trained High Bridge in 1:53.2.

"I thought she looked pretty good. It was a good mile and I was very happy

with her," trainer Jonas Czernyson said.

Czernyson said Maven will likely have next week off, qualify the following week and then make her 2014 debut in the May 4 Miami Valley Distaff.

In the next race on the qualifying card golden oldie Arch Madness won by four lengths over D'Orsay in 1:54.3.

In a race with some big names, Uncle Peter beat Archangel by a nose in 1:53.3. Uncle Peter is also an Elitlopp possibility.

The most impressive performance from a pacer came from Rockin Amadeus, a three-length winner in 1:51.2

Santanna Blue Chip Gelding Wins Group I in Australia

It's been quite a week for Santanna Blue Chip.

On Monday, the veteran pacer won his first race this year and only his second since 2008, capturing an \$8,190



condition event at Woodbine.

Now 9, he's back racing because he fell out of favor as a sire, but that doesn't mean he still can't produce a good horse. Five days after his win, Santanna Blue Chip picked up a big win as a stallion as his offspring Three Blind Mice won the \$200,000 (Australian)

Group I Western Australia Derby at Gloucester Park in Perth. Three Blind Mice was bred in New Zealand out of a Holmes Hanover mare.

Allstar Legend Wins FFA At The Meadowlands

Jim Morrill Jr. made a decision early in the Free For All tonight at The Meadowlands and that was to beat Golden Receiver at his own game. Reaching the opening quarter in 26.1, Allstar Legend forced Golden Receiver into the pocket while clicking off a 54.4 half-mile and hitting three-quarters in 1:22.3. On the far turn, Corey Callahan seemed to be asking Golden Receiver to pick up the pace, but the response just wasn't there tonight. Meanwhile, the early fractions didn't seem to bother Allstar Legend at all as powered home in 26.4 while pacing on the front-end, to trip the timer in 1:49.2.

Allstar Legend won for the fourth time this year for trainer Ron Burke and owners Brittany Farms and John Cherveney.

The Ron Burke theme continued in the 5th race, Dash For The C-Notes Final as Sky McFly put forth a powerful first over effort through fractions of 26.3, 55.3 and 1:24.2, before pacing home in 26.4 despite the first over trip, while holding off favored Stallone Blue Chip at the wire. Through 5 races the tandem of Burke and Morrill Jr. had three winners on the card.

Sky McFly is owned by Burke Racing Stable L.L.C. and Weaver Brusceci L.L.C.

Tonight also marked the second round of The Whata Baron Pacing Series. The first division featured a heavy favorite in round one winner Wake Up Peter who cut the mile with Scott Zeron through fractions of 26.4, 55.1 and 1:23.1 before pacing home in 26.1 to complete the mile in 1:49.2 while holding off a hard to steer Alexa's Jackpot who rallied off cover. For Wake Up Peter it was his sixth win from eight starts this season for trainer Larry Remmen and owner Bradley Grant.

The second division of The Whata Baron was another tour-de-force by Captive Audience, who duplicated his 1:49 round 1 performance to score another victory and will go for the series sweep next Saturday night. Captive Audience made a quarter move to the lead and peeled off a 54.3 half-mile before hitting three-quarters in 1:22.2 and then

powering home for the win. He will head into The Whata Baron Final as the favorite for Andy Miller who guided the son of Art Major for Corey Johnson and owners Debbie Element and Mac Nichol.

Another leg of The Legends vs. Phenoms Driver Challenge is in the books. The Legend standing tall was Jim Morrill Jr. (96), his second win in the Challenge while Scott Zeron (95) led The Phenoms for the fourth consecutive week. With one week to go, Jim Morrill Jr. (341), Andy Miller (315), Dave Miller (313), Corey Callahan (241), John Campbell (247), Scott Zeron (338) and Joe Bongiorno (162) have locked up their spots in the Final, while Steve Smith (93), Vincent Ginsburg (94), Jim Marohn Jr. (93), Mike Wilder (91) and Eric Abbatiello (68) will battle for the three remaining spots to battle for the \$15,000 First Place Prize on April 26th.

won't forget how they got the news of Pearl Harbor or JFK's assassination.

Those are truly memorable moments in American history, but memorable certainly doesn't mean tragic. Think of Neil Armstrong stepping on the moon, Lindbergh flying across the Atlantic, the Gettysburg Address, the completion of the transcontinental railroad, or even the "Miracle on Ice" when the US defeated the USSR in hockey in the 1980 Winter Olympics.

Those were memorable moments in American history, but what are the most memorable moments in harness racing history? Currently an online promotion invites harness fans to name the 100 Most Memorable Moments. There are no wrong answers---just opinions, so anyone can

participate. And you should do so. In baseball it might be Don Larsen's perfect game in the 1956 World Series, Lou Gehrig's retirement speech, or Hank Aaron topping Babe Ruth's home run total.

What about harness racing? I've jotted down some thoughts about our sport's most significant moments. I certainly didn't witness them all, but they were memorable and historic.

*The first Roosevelt International Trot in 1959 at the resplendent Roosevelt Raceway when harness racing was perhaps at its peak of popularity.

*Niatross ushering in a new era of speed with a 1:49.1 time trial at Lexington in 1980.

*Park Avenue Joe and Probe dead-heating in the race-off of the 1989 Hambletonian.

*Bret Hanover winning the first 35 races of his career in 1964-65 without a loss.

*Walter Case winning 1,076 races in a single season in 1998.

*The Steve Phillips mobile starting gate revolutionizing harness racing in 1946 at Roosevelt Raceway.

*Dancer Hanover auctioned for \$105,000 in 1958, becoming the first Standardbred or Thoroughbred yearling to sell for a six-figure sum.

*Greyhound's 1:55-1/4 mile in 1938, a record that would stand for 31 years.

*Sugarcane Hanover slipping past Ourasi and Mack Lobell to win the March of Dimes Trot at Garden State Park in 1988.

*The opening of the Meadowlands in New Jersey in the mid-1970s.

*Star Pointer pacing to the first 2:00 mile ever in Massachusetts in 1897.

*First wager placed at Off-Track Betting in New York City in 1970.

*The death of Billy Haughton after a racing accident in

1985.

*Formation of the Grand Circuit in 1873.

*Titan Hanover trotting in 2:00 in 1944, becoming the first 2-year-old of either gait in the 2:00 list.

*Moni Maker ending her career with an epic 1:54.1 under saddle performance at The Red Mile.

*Delvin Miller becoming the first driver ever to win the Hambletonian and Little Brown Jug in the same year, driving Lusty Song and Dudley Hanover to victory in 1950.

*The birth of Hambletonian---the "Big Daddy of Trotting"--- in May, 1849.

*The popularization of the bent-shaft "modified" sulky in 1976.

*Trainer Walter Cox's trotters sweeping the first four places in the 1929 Hambletonian.

*The 11-year-old Alma Sheppard driving Dean Hanover to a world record for 3-year-old trotters in a 1937 time trial.

*The epic upset of Nihlator by Dragon's Lair at The Meadows in 1984, giving instant credulity to the new Breeders Crown series.

*Dan Patch's 1:55-1/4 time trial behind a galloping Thoroughbred at Lexington in 1905.

*The trotter Scott Frost wins the first Triple Crown in 1955.

*Harrison Hoyt becomes the only amateur trainer-driver to win the Hambletonian with his horse Demon Hanover in 1948.

*Pompano Park opens in Florida in 1964, bringing

Remembering Bret Hanover

I loved Lucas Marquardt's article on the many parallels between Foiled Again and Su Mac Lad. There's another horse from that era that could also be compared to Foiled Again. That horse, of course, is Cardigan Bay. Like Su Mac Lad, he did not start out in Dancer's care, suffered great adversity in his youth that resulted in a dropped hip and a hitch in his gait for several months. He beat the best horse alive beating Bret Hanover in the "Pace of the Century," and went on to win a fortune, thus becoming the first

standardbred to win a million dollars. The Dancer family saw fit to have this last accomplishment among those engraved on Stanley Dancer's headstone in the cemetery that overlooks Freehold Raceway.
