

one of the filly's breeders, gave the pacer her moniker after the traumatic birth of his daughter, Lindsey. The first child of Miller and his wife, Marijane, Lindsey's June 2022 delivery was met with serious complications.

"When our daughter was born, she didn't breathe for 11 minutes," Eric said. "Our doctor, Dr. Jana [Schenkel], she was amazing. Obviously, it was a pretty traumatic experience for us at first."

The Millers chose to use a birthing tub at Blessed Beginnings Care Center in Nappanee, IN, under the guidance of Schenkel, a midwife and care provider. After 11 excruciating minutes, Lindsey took her first breath. Immediately color began to return to the newborn's body, radiating out from her chest. Afterwards, she was transferred to the NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) in nearby Mishawaka for further observation.

"It's an unbelievable blessing to our family that there's nothing wrong with our daughter," Eric said. "I mean, the doctor said she'd never seen where a baby went that long without breathing and nothing was wrong. That's pretty incredible to go without oxygen that long, and yet they say that there's no side effects. It's just a total blessing for us through and through.

"It was traumatic at first and kind of surreal now that our daughter is 2 and she's doing well. She's kind of getting into the terrible 2s a little bit."

When it came time to name the filly that had foaled on March 31 of that year, the choice was simple. She was christened Blessed Beginning after the care center.

Bred by Eric, his father, Doyle, and brother, Kevin, the pacer was entered in the 2023 Hoosier Classic Sale. She was cataloged to sell on the first day as Hip #39. Part of the In-Law Stable's consignment, Blessed Beginning was hammered down for \$25,000, purchased by trainer Zach Miller and his wife, Dessa, (no relation to the breeders), along with partners Marvin Schwartz and Jesse Bilbrey. For Bilbrey, a resident of Crossville, TN, the filly represented his entry into the ownership game.

"I'd actually been a fan of the sport ever since I was little," Bilbrey said. "You know, my fascination actually started with dogs down in Panama City Beach, FL, where we used to vacation. As I grew up, my grandpa and I would go out to Hoosier Park."

Working as a finance manager at East Tennessee Dodge Chrysler Jeep RAM, Bilbrey was ready to enter the business, but struggled to connect with a trainer until he found Zach and Dessa, messaging them through Facebook.

"It was really hard to find connections or contacts even," Bilbrey said. "You know, I couldn't really find too many phone numbers. I felt like nobody really wanted to respond, but Zach did. I basically started sending out messages to a few different trainers. Zach was the one person that really took an ample amount of time to respond to me. I'd ask one question and I felt like I got a book back every time. And I was like, this is my kind of quy."

Attending the Hoosier Classic Sale that year, Bilbrey said that Blessed Beginning was one of the top horses on their list.

"Her video stood out to us; the pedigree stood out to us," he said. "When it came time, she was in budget. She did expand that budget just a little bit. But sometimes you have to do that with a horse that you really like."

Without knowing the origins of the filly's name, Bilbrey liked it due to the tie-in to his entry into harness racing with his wife and children.

"I think when Zach pulled the trigger on getting her, he told us that it was #39 and her name," Bilbrey said. "I was like, 'Wow, that's kind of fitting.' You know, one of the only horses that has something to do with a start or beginning of something. And this is literally what this is for us. It kind of gave you some goosebumps when you read the name and you kind of put the whole picture together. It'll shake out in the end how it's supposed to, and I truly feel that way. The name definitely stood out to me and I thought it was a little ironic."

Once he learned of the events leading to the name, Bilbrey added, "The connection that the name means for each one of us comes from a different place. It's an emotional experience for them as it is for us."

The way the season shook out in 2024 was filled with disappointment. Before Blessed Beginning was able to make it to the races, she sustained an injury in May and was shelved for the remainder of the year.

"She had a slight injury to a hind sesamoid last year," Zach said. "Didn't actually break, but just had her puffed up a little bit, and I think I'd been in like [2:]15 with her or something around there. I thought she was a really nice horse. The vet told us we could have given her 30 days off and start her back, but that was mid-May. So, by the time we would have given her 30 days off it would have been mid-June, which means it would have been October before she was ready. So, we just decided to give her a year and let everything heal up."

With the extra time to heal and grow, Blessed Beginning is off to a promising start in 2025. Steered by Marcus Miller, the

sophomore won her pari-mutuel debut in a time of 1:54.3, then followed it with a 1:55.3 score in the opening leg of the Miss Windfall series. In her latest effort she finished second in the latest Miss Windfall round Thursday (April 10). She was timed in 1:53.2.

"The long-term goal is sire stakes, but we're still not sure if she's really good enough for that yet," Zach said. "We're hoping she's a sire stakes mare yet, but she's got to show us that she is. Right now, she's just doing good in a non-winners of one. Everything she's shown us so far says that she has a really good chance to be."

While Bilbrey bought into two other horses that raced last season, he was excited to see his first purchase reach the track this spring. He was not disappointed as Blessed Beginning paced home in :26.1 to capture her debut and close in :27.1 over a sloppy surface April 3.

"She had a terrible draw and drew outside in her first two starts, but she found a way to win," Bilbrey said. "And Marcus gave her a good drive both times. But the closing speed so far is really what's kind of shocked me the most. And it gave me the most optimism, I think, for her moving forward."

Eric and his family also follow the filly's progress. They are thrilled with her early success at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

"It's been pretty special to watch this filly start her career," he said. "Hopefully, she continues to do good things for them. We wish them nothing but the best in the future."

She's Glorious delivered another JK Endofanera filly a few weeks ago. The newborn pacer arrived three years to the day after her older sister, foaled by The Panderosa mare on March 31.

Concerns as handle continues to decline

Digging deeper into downward industry economic measures.

In a column written at the start of this year that analyzed the 2024 handle and purses statistics, I concluded essentially that while those numbers were off compared to the prior year, it wasn't necessarily a sign of any imminent danger. Perhaps I was wrong.

The first quarter numbers of 2025 are in for U.S. races, and the downward figures from last year have accelerated sharply through the first three months of this year. Whereas total handle last year was down over 7 per cent from 2023, handle in the first quarter of this year is down a whopping 14.41 per cent compared to the first quarter from last year, as per statistics provided in a press release this week from the USTA. Part of that number is due to fewer race days by 7.88 per cent, but even looking at a more honest per-race average shows a decline of 8.35 per cent. Purses too, are down 3.62 per cent from this time last year.

The press release said that of the 15 U.S. tracks that have raced so far this year as well as the same period last year, six of those show handle increases and nine show decreases. It didn't state specifically which tracks showed increases or decreases, but if you want to assess what's driving the overall numbers, as is usually the case, you don't have to look any farther than The Meadowlands.

As was noted in that last column on handle, The Meadowlands accounted last year for 18 per cent of the entire industry handle and the performance of that track serves as a clear barometer for the collective performance of all tracks. In 2025, the track's figures are what one would expect based on the overall handle decline.

Referencing data from The Meadowlands chart archive online, looking at just data from March as a sample provides the answer. In March 2024, The Meadowlands had 10 cards and averaged \$3.279 million. In March 2025, The Meadowlands raced nine cards and averaged \$2.972 million – a difference

of being down 9.36 per cent which closely mirrors as expected the industry per race average of minus 8.35 per cent.

The numbers are even more dramatic when switching to Canadian races. Whereas the U.S. was down 14.41 per cent in total wagering, Canada was down 20.65 per cent in figures taken from the Standardbred Canada website March 31. Same as the U.S., that number is in part a function of fewer race days, but even the per-race average shows a double-digit drop of 11 per cent.

Doing the same exercise I did with The Meadowlands, the Canadian story can be explained by looking directly at Woodbine Mohawk Park for the month of March. According to figures obtained from the historical charts in race programs, in March of last year, Mohawk raced 12 times and averaged \$2.404 million in handle. This March, they raced 12 times as well, but only averaged \$1.860 million. One of those cards however was a Saturday card that got canceled after six races, and if you toss that out of the equation then you're looking at 11 cards with an average of \$1.959 million. But even that reflects a sharp decline in card average handle of minus 18.5 per cent.

The USTA press release notes the closure of Northville Downs and Freehold Raceway, but that doesn't explain the noteworthy drop in average handle at the two premier harness racetracks in North America. Though, that tracks continue to close — as

well as the fact that race days are declining in part due to self-inflicted poor track upkeep — are a major part of the problem as well when it comes to total race days.

If there's one bright spot, it's that purses are down but are holding steadier. And part of the reduction can be explained. Last year, the Borgata and Blue Chip Matchmaker series began earlier than this year, and there were two preliminary legs with those high purses offered in March of last year, whereas this year only the first preliminary legs with corresponding purses were included in the March numbers. Indeed, when looking at the industry purse numbers as of April 11, the minus 3.62 per cent deficit has already been reduced to minus 2.11 per cent – this despite total race days still being down over 7 per cent.

The question will become, at what point will purses be adversely impacted by handle? It may be more gradual at most tracks where there isn't a real correlation between the two, but it's a little different at The Meadowlands where handle is more of a consideration in track operations.

That topic segues into the actions announced by The Meadowlands to reduce and eliminate post-time drag. For as noble an effort as it is, can it really be sustained through the summer's Championship Meet if handle tanks as a result?

There was some confusion as The Meadowlands announced the updated drag schedule would begin on Friday (April 11) with a seven-minute drag that would be reduced every race card thereafter. I took that announcement as saying Friday was the first night of the drag reduction as did DRF's Greg Reinhart who commented on X about it, but The Meadowlands' Jessica Otten responded that there was no reduction on Friday, as I guess seven minutes past post was always the standard.

Purely coincidentally then, The Meadowlands handle from Friday was just \$2.456 million. I went back and looked, and that handle is the lowest of 2025 for The Meadowlands, and the lowest for the track since Dec. 20. With that number on top of all current trends, one would think there is going to be some pain once the drag reductions actually kick in and handle is lost from the lesser time the track will show 0 minutes at the top of the list in all the online wagering platforms.

The entire industry will be watching to see how the drag elimination works out because in whichever direction it goes, it's going to impact the overall health of the sport.

After a recalibration, Ladies From Hell found her rhythm

Heart is what kept Ladies From Hell in rhythm, even when hers wasn't.

The 11-year-old mare with an indomitable spirit has taken her owners, Michael and Shae Sumner, on the most rewarding and improbable of journeys since being claimed by the father-and-daughter duo in the fall of 2021.

While not without its fair share of obstacles, none of which too daunting for the stouthearted trio to overcome, the winding path to prosperity has all been worthwhile.

On Feb. 22, following a remarkable 10-year-old campaign that saw her collect 11 wins and well north of \$60,000 in earnings across 28 starts at The Raceway at Western Fair in 2024 (11-6-3), Ladies From Hell was recognized with the distinction of top Older Pacing Mare at the half-mile oval's annual Awards Night.

A feat, Michael said, wouldn't have been possible without Shae.

"It's cool to be recognized, but the credit goes to my daughter," Michael said. "I hadn't been to the awards ceremonies in quite a few years, but I was begged to go with her, and she was really looking forward to it because she loves this game and this horse.

"'Lady' [Ladies From Hell] turned it on in the fall to win that award because it wasn't easy. There were a bunch of mares with some good money made. It shows a lot about the effort that Shae put into her. She brought this mare from a claimer to an open horse. Shae's a good trainer herself. I can't take any credit for anything."

Shae's steadfast belief in the daughter of Classic Card Shark— Jennys Place was at first a mystery to her father, who didn't understand what she saw in the war horse from Western Canada.

"I didn't like her," Michael said with a laugh. "My daughter picked her out. She said, 'Dad, have a look at her. I think she's a better horse than you think. She's got some back class."

Michael slowly started to come around.

"That night, I was running back replays in my room," he said. "I pulled up her lines, and this mare was in a \$4,500 claimer at

Fraser Downs [in British Columbia] when she was young. She was in six claimers, but she also worked her way into the open before she left Fraser. Then she came to Ontario, and performed alright, but petered back down into an eight or 10.

"Still, I thought, 'You know what? She's right, this mare does have some back class. We'll claim her to have a horse fill a stall."

On the day he claimed Ladies From Hell, Michael also purchased another horse. He advised Shae, who wanted to buy a stake in half of one, to look in the other direction.

But Shae stood by her evaluation and took 50 per cent ownership of the well-traveled mare.

Michael had never been happier to be proven wrong.

"I made about \$2,000 with the other horse and sold at a loss," he said. "Lady's made about \$150,000 for us."

That already impressive figure would almost certainly be even larger had Ladies From Hell not missed nearly all of 2023.

The culprit? Atrial fibrillation, or in layman's terms, an irregular heartbeat, caused by an electrolyte imbalance.

The root of the ailment, as Michael described, traced back to the way in which the electrolytes were administered.

Instead of "jugging" or "sticking" her with intravenous [IV] treatments after each race, Michael supplied oral electrolytes to lessen the burden on Ladies From Hell.

"She's a fantastic eater but you can't regulate how much water they'll take in," he said. "Basically, she was getting too many electrolytes in her stomach, and it was pulling the fluids out of her other organs and dehydrated her.

"It was my fault, trying to be easier and not poking needles in her. She doesn't have a heart issue. She doesn't have a bad heart. If she did, I never would have raced her again. It just was a situation where it put her heart out of rhythm, and she wouldn't reset."

Thus began the process, or "debacle" as Michael recounted, of recalibrating her heart.

Following the initial incident, which occurred on Boxing Day in 2023, the Sumners took Ladies From Hell to a clinic to receive doses of quinidine.

The Class IA antiarrhythmic agent is used to treat heart rhythm disturbances.

At the time, however, the clinic did not have enough quinidine to supply the proper dosage, and finding more at the height of the holiday season was simply not feasible.

What should have been the debacle's denouement, was instead its prolonged opening act.

"We brought her back home, and I decided to call Guelph to put her on the box and it became a debacle," Michael said. "I called them 70 times. They didn't have the guy in. The technicians weren't there. Then they said the machine was broken. Then they said it was fixed. Then they said bring her down Friday.

Then they said, don't, the box is still broken.

"Two weeks after that, I called them and then they said bring her down. I brought her down. They shaved her up, got her on the operating table, and the box wouldn't work to electrically get her heart back in rhythm."

December turned to January, January to February, and February to March.

Desperately in search of answers, Michael took the onus upon himself. He offered to pay the \$2,000 for a new box but that didn't move the needle, either.

As their faith began to wane, Michael and Shae were ready to accept what felt like the inevitable – Ladies From Hell's racing days were over. They very well believed it, too, having engaged in conversations with several prospective breeders.

Then came a glimmer of hope.

During an April conversation with one of his vets, Dr. Stan Henderson, Michael found the answers that had been so elusive to him and his daughter for almost five months.

It was here that Henderson, the owner of Henderson Equine Services and 2008 Ontario Veterinary Medical Association's Veterinarian of the Year, offered to conduct the procedure for half the price.

After months of waffling and uncertainty, Ladies From Hell's heart was back in rhythm.

That, however, was only half the battle. Next up: a return to racing.

"By then it was summer, so we took it nice and easy in the heat," he said. "We qualified her in October, and I said to Shae, 'She'll never be the same, open type of horse again."

Once again, Michael was overjoyed to be proven wrong.

"She's just gotten better and better," he said. "When she put it all together, man, we're shocked, we're absolutely amazed. She makes me shake my head with some of the miles she's gone against the quality of horses that have been on her back.

"We expected nothing. We didn't expect her to ever come back, and then when she did, we're stunned that she's the best she's ever been in her life, by far, at 11."

Since the procedure, Ladies From Hell has collected almost \$100,000 in prize money for the Sumners.

As it would be, her finest outing came almost one year to the day after the AFib ordeal began.

Slotted into post 4 on Monday (Dec. 23) at Western Fair, Ladies From Hell, against the backdrop of heavy snowfall, sped off to a dazzling 12-length triumph.

"She beat good horses that night," Michael said. "They canceled the races one race after. That's how bad the track was. She went in :57.1 that night; it was an absolute snowstorm, and the track ate it, no one could get over it, and she just paced away from good horses.

"The paddock was buzzing over that one pretty good."

The resilient racer has shown no signs of slowing down in 2025.

With five wins, one second, and two thirds from 10 starts, Ladies From Hell has already reeled in more than \$37,000.

For her career, the venerable bay sports a 51-43-34 line through 211 starts and has banked over \$332,000.

Not too shabby for an 11-year-old, \$8,500 claimer (\$10,625 with mares allowance) whose career was supposed to be over 15 months ago.

Ladies From Hell's vibrant, youthful spirit continues to light up the Sumner's stable.

"She loves to go out to the field every day," Michael said. "She loves to jump. She sits there driving you nuts. She paws holes in her rubber mats in front of her stall, with her tongue all out the side, waiting to get treats or waiting to eat.

"I'd love to have four or five of her."

Finding another Ladies From Hell, let alone four or five, could take a lifetime. So, for now, Michael and Shae will focus on cherishing the one they have.

"This mare has carried us," he said. "I couldn't have imagined she'd be this kind of horse. Even before she had her heart issue, she was not as good as she is right now. It's unbelievable.

"She makes you look good, and we're incredibly grateful."

Hall of Famer Stefan Hultman dies at 61

Swedish Hall of Famer Stefan Hultman died Saturday (April 12). Hultman's career ended in 2016, after developing the muscular disease **myasthenia gravis** one year earlier.

Hultman dominated the business in Sweden — and Europe — from the early 2000s forward with countless victories in the biggest, and most prestigious races in Europe.

Hultman's biggest win as a trainer came in 2014, when Maharajah won the Prix d'Amérique in Paris. Maharajah is probably the horse that most people associate Hultman with.

From Above, Orecchietti, Panne de Moteur, Lie Detector, Naglo and Triton Sund are all horses that took Hultman and his driver Örjan Kihlström to the finest winner's podiums and after his professional career as a trainer at Solvalla, he became one of the most popular experts in harness racing live TV.

Hultman will always be remembered as the skillful trainer that always showed his emotions at the tracks, and racing fans will miss him deeply.

STRONG PERFORMANCES FROM K-TROTTERS

French bred 5-year-olds battled at Vincennes on Saturday (April 12) afternoon and the mares were first out in the \$120,000 Prix Henri Levesque over 2,700 meters. The race favorite, the winter dominant in the crop, Kokote, went off-stride early into the event and that opened things up for another mare with great merits, **Kana de Beylev** (Express Jet).

Benjamin Rochard sat behind the William Bigeon trained mare and the three-wide attack from second over started in the uphill part of the track. In the middle of the last turn Kana de Beylev had the advantage and she looked strong all the way to the wire in a mile rate of 1:57.2 over 1.6 miles.

Rochard was on fire in Paris this day. When the 5-year-old colts met in the \$120,000 Prix Robert Auvray, Rochard's drive was **Kanto Avis** (Ready Cash). Kanto Avis has been below the radar as a great horse in the shadow of the very best in the K-crop and in Saturday's race Kanto Avis showed that he belongs in the top himself. Rochard opted for a first over trip behind Marc

Sassier's trotter and as the field turned for home, Rochard had plenty of power to use in his horse. Kanto Avis cruised to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:55.2 over 1.6 miles.

A FAIR DAY SET FOR PARALYMPIATRAVET

The second elimination race ahead of the Paralympiatravet was held at Jägersro racetrack in Malmö, Sweden on Saturday (April 12) afternoon. Only seven trotters gathered behind the gate, but there were some really strong contenders among them. Top trotters Önas Prince, Barack Face and A Fair Day chased the ticket to Åby in May — Önas Prince is the title defender and has a wild card to the final — and it ended with an impressive win by **A Fair Day** (Maharajah).

A Fair Day, contender in Elitloppet 2024, was the event's first choice and driver Oscar Ginman could push his horse to the lead when the field reached the backstretch for the first time. On the front, A Fair Day is hard to beat and when Barack Face went off-stride and Önas Prince had to run outside of A Fair Day, the result was pretty obvious to predict. A mile rate of 1:53.1 over 1.3 miles is just splendid and the amateur trained trotter from the south of Sweden will certainly be a factor even in the final of the \$300,000 Paralympiatravet at Åby on May 3.





James Herbertson going to U.S. on fact-finding mission

Australia's leading driver will spend five weeks working with Ron Burke.

James Herbertson wants more.

And that's what is inspiring Australia's leading driver to step out of his comfort zone at the peak of his powers to spend almost two months seeing how the rest of the world does it.

Herbertson's adventure started today (April 12) when he flew out of Melbourne to New York.

The 25-year-old, who boasts over 1,500 career wins and six at Group 1 level, will spend five weeks working with Hall of Famer trainer Ron Burke.

Then it's over the Stockholm, Sweden for 10 days at a perfect time while the iconic Elitlopp is on.

"I've been counting down the days. I can't wait to get there," Herbertson said.

Many think it will be a forerunner to last season's premier Australian driver following the likes of Andy and Todd McCarthy and making the U.S. home.

"If you mean, will I be tempted and just stay there, no that won't be happening," he said. "Let's call it a fact-finding mission. I've never been to the U.S., not even on a holiday, so the first part is to see what it's like over there and learn as much as I can.

"So many people rave about it and I've had so many telling me for years now that I've simply got to get over there. There's no such thing as a good time to go, I'll be giving up some nice drives here and I've probably got the best set of young horses to drive that I've ever had, but the opportunity is here and I don't want to miss out."

The opportunity arose when Herbertson won Harness Racing Victoria's "Young Guns" series for junior drivers on New Year's Eve last year, which carried with it the opportunity to spend time with top Swedish trainer Jorgen Westholm.

"I'd been thinking about it before then, but that was the clincher, so to speak," Herbertson said. "I've been planning when to go since then."

The U.S. part of the trip built strongly when Herbertson met leviathan U.S. owner Mark Weaver through Summit Bloodstock's Jamie Durnberger-Smith at the hugely successful Ladbrokes Ultimate Driver Challenge in Brisbane during February.

"That certainly got me even more excited," Herbertson said. "Mark and Jamie, who also own horses with Ron, said they would both back me over there and give me drives when their regular

drivers aren't available. You can't ask for any more than that. I hope to be driving at Pocono [this] week.

"I know I'll have to earn my stripes over there; in fact, I want to. I'll be very happy to drive at those second-tier meetings."

Herbertson will reunite with former Aussie Brad Chisholm and stay with him for his first week in the U.S.

"Brad's been over there working and driving for a while now and he's been great in offering me somewhere to stay until I settle in and get my own place," he said. "I can't wait to get stuck into it, see how different it is and how it all works."

You can almost hear in Herbertson's voice, his want to see future opportunities emerge.

"I've got no real plans as I've said," he said. "There's no hiding the fact the racing here [in Victoria] is a real battle at the moment, prize money is down and it doesn't look like turning around anytime soon.

"There's an effort versus reward thing to consider. I'm driving at so many meetings and doing so much travel; I'll burn out at some stage if I keep going.

"I'm not tied down at all and I'm open to explore what opportunities the U.S. might have. It's a case of dipping my toe in and doing a temperature check. A 'win' from the trip would be coming home with plenty of thinking to do about my future." Herbertson is buzzing about being in Sweden for the Elitlopp.

"That's something I have been to before, when I was younger," he said. "I don't have to tell you what an amazing experience it is, not just the races, Stockholm itself when it's Elitlopp time."

This trip will be different with Herbertson spending time at Westholm's stable and hoping to do some driving, albeit he will only be in Sweden for 10 days.

"Ryan Sanderson, another young driver from here [in Victoria] went across and did the same with Jorgen last year and spoke so highly of him," Herbertson said. "They all say he's a great supporter of young people in the game. Jorgen gave Ryan a few drives once he'd settled in and I'd love the same opportunity."

Herbertson's timing couldn't be better with star Aussie trotter, The Locomotive, winner of last December's Inter Dominion final in Sydney, already in Sweden and preparing to tackle the Elitlopp.

He will be just the fourth Aussie-trained trotter to contest the famed event.

"What a bonus," Herbertson said. "It'll be great to have a few more Aussies there."

Top Kiwi trainer Cran Dalgety and his son, young gun driver Carter, who spent time in the U.S. driving last year, will also be part of the Down Under contingent at the Elitlopp.

The axe may fall

Upheaval in the marketplace and workforce is in the headlines these days. Tariffs, undocumented workers, slashed government programs, stock market chaos, and defunding grants will likely send many people into the employment woodchipper.

Losing a job is upsetting, especially if you enjoy that job. Many of us have experienced this pain in our working lives. Dreams get shattered when business doors shut. The end of a job leaves people without money, purpose, and relationships. Each business, including sports, must answer the fiscal bell or face a knockout.

For many workers, trouble in an industry or business often feels like a distant rumor, but the rumors can quickly become a shocking reality. It barely crossed my mind that the print magazine industry would decline with such speed.

At one time, my job was writing on multiple topics for at least a dozen magazines. Work was plentiful, and regular clients ranged from a magnificent, glossy history magazine published for over a century to a humor magazine based in Chicago that lasted only a few months. The print business devolved from powerhouse to near oblivion in what seemed like the twinkle of an eye. Only two of those print magazines survive. Ironically, they are harness racing magazines, partially subsidized by industry assistance for the membership.

Stuff ravaged the magazine industry, including the internet, reading habits, postal rates, market reach, printing costs, and advertising effectiveness. The businesses became unprofitable. Quality did not affect the bottom line. The carnage from the folding of these magazines touched the investors, the editors, the staff, the freelancers, the printers, and the readers. We all grieved the passing of a glorious industry in our ways. Nobody did anything wrong. Everybody was hurt. One day, it was here; the next day, it was gone.

The reaper can strike in sports. My family were Jai Alai fans. Three or four times a week, we would visit a fronton, often an hour's drive, to enjoy the mesmerizing sport. My mom and dad would be thrilled at wagering a few dollars and hollering at players to catch or drop the ball. We did not consider the sport could disappear. Yet it disappeared, as did dog racing and Florida harness horse racing.

These dynamics happen every day in countless fields and marketplaces. The lifelong employer and forever business are relics. In our sport, we watch this happen in racetracks near and far, in Michigan, Illinois, and Florida. You know the list. We all

wince at the news of a lost racetrack. We reminisce about the good old days and quickly return to our part of the field, hoping for the best, hoping the reaper misses us.

As my friends in the magazine industry, the Jai Alai business, the dog racing business, and at Pompano Park can attest, when a company you enjoy disappears, the emotions are many: shock, disbelief, anger, bitterness, anxiety, fear, frustration, and powerlessness. The loss feels unfair, and you look for others to blame. These feelings are human nature.

It is also human nature to avoid long-range planning. We are more apt to keep our heads down, hope for the best, react, and adapt. The simple fact is that only a handful of people in the harness racing universe have the power to do anything. Among these, an organization of breeding farm owners seems to be the most likely transition team. My ignorance of what goes on behind the scenes is extreme, but making preliminary plans and some funding for transition may be wise.

Before the axe fell, when the writing was on the wall at Pompano Park, would it not have been comforting for the Florida people who loved that track to make some contingency plans - perhaps privatization of the sport, maybe a robust, fair racing circuit, or possibly combining the training centers in the state for a new type of program? These may not be solid enough jobs for many people; however, these shadow programs, even without the revenue from gambling, would be something to cling to.

The future of harness horse racing could be a hundred wealthy people racing for their money or hobbyists racing for blankets. A smaller footprint might not be the future we want, but it would be better than oblivion. If it is our future, let's get behind it.

Before becoming Jai Alai, our little sport must have some doomsday plans.

Western Ideal, 30, dies

Hall of Fame stallion Western Ideal (p, 5, 1:48), a son of Western Hanover out of the stakes winning mare Leah Almahurst, passed away peacefully Friday (April 11) at the age of 30.

Bred by Brittany Farms, world champion pacer Western Ideal was foaled on May 23, 1995 in Versailles, KY, and raced in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

As a 5-year-old in 2000, trained by Brett Pelling and driven by Mike Lachance, Western Ideal won the Breeders Crown, William R. Haughton Memorial, Canadian Pacing Derby and the Graduate Series. In his Breeders Crown victory, Western Ideal set a world record 1:48 for 5-year-old and older standardbreds on a mile track. He was voted the 2000 Dan Patch Older Pacing Horse of the Year.

As a stallion, Western Ideal sired winners of over \$154 million and 16 millionaires. They include 2005 Horse of the Year and Hall of Fame Immortal Rocknroll Hanover (p, 3, 1:48.3, \$2,754,038), 2009 Adios winner and world champion Vintage Master (p, 4, 1:48.1f, \$2,160,953), 2010 Matron Stakes winner and world champion Krispy Apple (p, 6, 1:48.4f, \$1,905,676), 2005 Woodrow Wilson winner Western Ace (p, 4, 1:48.4, \$1,891,133), New Jersey Sire Stakes star Dial Or Nodial (p, 5, 1:48.3f, \$1,774,600), 2014 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year Artspeak (p, 3, 1:47.4, \$1,628,762), 2010 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year and world champion Big Jim (p, 2, 1:49.1s, \$1,541,924), and top Indiana stallion Always A Virgin (p, 3, 1:48.4, \$1,135,559).

Western Ideal sired five sub-1:48 pacers — world champion American Ideal (p, 3, 1:47.4, \$786,055), winner of the 2005 Confederation Cup and Tattersalls Pace, the aforementioned Artspeak, 2013 Breeders Crown winner Luck Be Withyou (p, 5, 1:47.4f, \$1,454,166), Western Joe (p, 4, 1:47.3, \$1,081,788), and the filly JK First Lady (p, 4, 1:47.4, \$879,136).

As a broodmare sire, Western Ideal has sired the dams of winners of over \$169 million to date, with 16 millionaires led by 2018 Dan Patch and O'Brien Horse of the Year, world champion McWicked (p, 7, 1:46.2, \$4,930,967), world champion This Is The Plan (p, 6, 1:47.3h, \$3,199,903), two-time Dan Patch Award winner Bettor's Wish (p, 4, 1:47.3, \$2,601,233), two-time Dan Patch Award winner Lyons Sentinel (p, 4, 1:48, \$2,139,086), Dan Patch Award winner Abuckabett Hanover (p, 5, 1:47.2s, \$2,049,901), O'Brien Horse of the Year and world champion State Treasurer (p, 6, 1:47, \$1,908,424), O'Brien Award winner Jimmy Freight (p, 7,1:48s, \$1,725,010); and Dan Patch Award winner Pebble Beach (p, 3, 1:48.1s, \$1,720,875).

Aardie B Miki N remains undefeated in Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

If there were any questions about **Aardie B Miki**'s talent following her dominant performances in the first two legs of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, they were answered in a major way on Friday night (April 11) at MGM Yonkers Raceway. The 5-year-old by Always B Miki offered a new wrinkle to her resume by racing on the front-end for the first time in North America and winning impressively in a 1:53.1 clocking with driver Jason Bartlett relaxed at the wire.

Four divisions of the Blue Chip Matchmaker were held, but Aardie Miki N, now a three-time winner in the series, clearly stamped herself as the one-to-beat, springing from the starting gate and rolling to the top over first round winner Walkin On Sunshine off the opening bend.

With a :27.3 quarter to settle the field, Bartlett had a very relaxed mare cut fractions of :56.4 and 1:25.2, with Uptown Hanover and Todd McCarthy offering a mild first-over response on the backstretch but never getting to the wheel of the heavy favorite. On the final turn Aardie B Miki N kicked in strongly, pacing home in :27.4 to better Walkin On Sunshine by three lengths. Uptown Hanover held on for the show spot.

Owned by M T Stables Ontario Inc., Aardie B Miki N is trained by Yonkers' leading conditioner Per Engblom. As the heavy favorite Aardie B Miki N paid \$2.60 to win with the exacta worth \$3.70 and triple \$12.

Tarapasta and Matt Kakaley got her first victory in the series in the opening Blue Chip Matchmaker division for trainer Travis Alexander in a 1:54.1 clocking. Facing just four rivals, Kakaley had Tarapasta, a 5-year-old mare by Downbytheseaside, energized from the outside, racing three-wide through the opening turn before securing control through a :27.1 opening quarter. Promiseland A and Jason Bartlett stretched out the 9-5 second choice while seating Intothemysticmoon on the first turn.

Kakaley would have company rather quickly as 3-5 favorite Millwood Bliss N and Dave Miller moved well before the quarter on a prolonged bid to secure control. Millwood Bliss N cleared the top off the second turn and reached the half in :56.3. Kakaley, sensing the leader was tiring, pulled Tarapasta from the pocket and went right by before three-quarters in 1:25.3. Challenged briefly on the final turn by Promiseland A, Tarapasta strode out to a :28.3 final quarter for an easy score. Promiseland A held second with Lydeo advancing for third.

Owned by Greg Luther Racing LLC., Tarapasta returned \$5.90 to win and keyed a \$22.60 exacta and \$178.00 triple payout.

Rocket Deo bounced back in a big way after failing in the second leg as the heavy favorite, as Bartlett guided the 4-year-old by Captaintreacherous from off-the-pace to victory in another \$50,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division.

The Brett Pelling-trained mare was held in reserve off the early pace as Coachellabound N and Brent Holland made a second move before the quarter after yielding to Talk Curdy To Me on the opening bend. Coachellabound N had control in a soft :28.3 opening fraction and was content to hit the half in :57.3 without dispute.

Bartlett put Rocket Deo on the move on the third turn, but she didn't gain much ground on the pace-setter as Holland and Coachellabound N sprinted a third quarter in :27.2 and hit that marker in 1:25, with Talk Curdy To Me and McCarthy briefly coming out of the pocket and forcing Rocket Deo to race threedeep into the final bend. Coachellabound N briefly got some separation on the final turn, but Bartlett called on Rocket Deo, and the 4-5 favorite responded in kind to take control and stroll home to a 1:53.4 victory, her first of 2025.

Morrison Racing and John Fielding own Rocket Deo, who paid \$3.80 to win and keyed a \$15.80 exacta and \$34.80 triple.

Silk Cloud A and driver Jordan Stratton were dominant in another Blue Chip Matchmaker division, securing control on the opening bend and going wire-to-wire in a 1:54.3 clocking. Silk Cloud A, owned by Eric Good and David Kryway, is a 7-year-old daughter of Shadow Play trained by Peter Tritton.

Stratton used the quick early burst of Silk Cloud A to clear the front into the opening bend and looped High Flyin' Filly (Yannick Gingras), forcing that one to take back. Silk Cloud A put Cheryls Shadow in the pocket and led that one through the openinghalf, with fractions of :27.1 and 57 seconds.

Turn The Page N and driver Ron Cushing attempted an uncovered assault on the backstretch, but Stratton and Silk Cloud A were comfortably in control, hitting three-quarters in 1:25.2 and rolling home with a :29.1 final quarter. Cheryls Shadow followed the winner home in second with Turn The Page N third.

As the favorite Silk Cloud A returned \$3.40 to win and keyed a \$17 exacta and \$43.40 triple payout. Now a two-time winner in the series, Silk Cloud A won for the 26th time in her career.

The preliminary rounds of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series will continue through Friday (April 25), with the leading point earners advancing to the final on Friday (May 9). A major change in 2025 revolves around the added money for the final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, which gets a boost from \$125,000 to \$200,000, equaling the MGM Borgata Pacing Series total. With that increase the Blue Chip Matchmaker final will certainly offer the richest purse in recent history and far eclipse the \$276,200 purse from 2024.

SERIES ACTION RETURNS ON MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY:

Monday's (April 14) third leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series has four \$50,000 splits. Two-for-two For Once Inmy Life is taking the week off, but Mossdale Ben N will try and improve to three-for-three in the event in the final section (race 8).

The prelims of the John Brennan Trotting Series then conclude on Wednesday (April 16) with a trio of \$30,000 splits of the third round. Named in honor of the longtime SOA of NY horsemen's representative who passed away from complications of COVID-19 in March 2020, the John Brennan Trotting Series will have a \$100,000 guaranteed final and \$50,000 guaranteed consolation on April 23.

PICK 5 POOL GETS A BOOST ON MONDAYS AND FRIDAYS:

Continuing for every Monday and Friday card during the legs of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series and Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, MGM Yonkers Raceway, in conjunction with the SOA of NY, will offer a \$20,000 guaranteed Pick 5 pool in race 5.

The guaranteed Pick 5 pool on Mondays is also a part of the United States Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering Program.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday through Friday live racing schedule with post time each night at 6:45 p.m. (EDT).

Aetos Kronos S excels at Big M in U.S. debut

His winning qualifier on March 29 was impressive. His lifetime bankroll of \$1.3 million was impressive. The fact that he raced with some of the best trotters in the world in the Prix d'Amérique last year was impressive.

On Friday night (April 11) at The Meadowlands, in the \$17,500 featured high-end conditioned trot, **Aetos Kronos S** did something else impressive. He took down 4-5 favorite Chapercraz in a sparkling debut on American soil in 1:53.2.

"He's a really classy trotter," said winning driver Dexter Dunn of the Swedish import racing out of the Marcus Melander barn. "The class has been there throughout his career."

The trip wasn't ideal, as driver Andy Miller fired away from the gate with 40-1 outsider Yanks Dugout from post 7 in the seven-horse field, and that one had the point at the quarter in :27.2 with Chapercraz in the pocket and Aetos Kronos S the 3-hole.

Joe Bongiorno moved Chapercraz to the top at the three-eighths before hitting the half in :56.1, but as the field made its way onto the far turn, Dunn moved Aetos Kronos S off the rail to go after the leader and still had some work to do as Chapercraz passed three-quarters in 1:25.

Chapercraz, a lifetime earner of \$1 million who earned more than half of that during 2024 alone, straightened up at the head of the stretch with a 1½-length edge, but despite a solid effort, he couldn't hold off Aetos Kronos S, who needed every bit of the final three-sixteenths to grind down the leader and record a three-quarter-length win over Chapercraz. Seven Sins was third.

"He got off the gate pretty good," said Dunn of the 9-year-old son of Bold Eagle—Will Of A Woman. "He got a good spot and dug really deep. [At the head of the stretch] I thought Chapercraz was going to get the better of me. It's a good way for my horse to start here in the States."

As the even-money second choice, Aetos Kronos S paid \$4 to win. He now has 20 wins from 63 lifetime starts for owners Jeff and Michael Snyder.

Will Aetos Kronos S be able to go with the very best horses in the older trotting division this season?

"As long as he keeps getting better, I'd think so, I would say," said Dunn.

PICK-6 REPORT: A carryover of just over \$5,000 served as the catalyst for players to pour \$25,372 of "new money" into the 20-cent Pick-6 pool. After a sequence that saw winner's odds of 1-1, 6-5, 1-1, 5-1, 60-1 and 3-1, those with winning tickets exchanged them for \$5,314.66.

A LITTLE MORE: Leading driver Brett Beckwith padded his lead in the Big M standings with three winners on the program. The 22-year-old pilot now has 54 victories on the year, nine more than runner-up Jason Bartlett... All-source betting on the 14-race program totaled \$2,456,339.

Philly opens for 2025, 'George Nap' wins six

Harrah's Philadelphia opened its 2025 racing season Friday (April 11) during a special evening card, and although the weather was not very cooperative (mid-40s temperatures and a "sloppy +2" surface), the featured trotting classes put on a good show.

The big story of the night was eight-time Philly dash-winning champion George Napolitano, Jr., currently the leader at Pocono and translating his hot form to the southeast Pennsylvania track with six wins on the night, including two of the three feature races. In the headline \$13,500 trot, "George Nap" never looked back with the You Know You Do gelding **Knowyoucando**, taking over before the quarter and having firm control in the latter stages before stopping the clock in 1:56.2. Jeff Cullipher trains the winner, now a winner in half his four seasonal starts, for Pollack Racing LLC.

The 4-year-old Bold Eagle gelding **Modigliani S** got an early spot in the \$12,000 co-featured trot, then made a break, but he recovered quickly and reslotted fifth. Andrew McCarthy (himself visiting Victory Lane three times during the first card of the season) was then able to back out Modigliani S behind the live cover of Give Me A Yankee down the backstretch, followed that one as he went to the lead, then caught him by three-quarters of a length in 1:59.1. Nifty Norman had the horse ready after over two months away for owner Lella Montgomery.

All Wrapped Up mastered the \$11,000 fast-class field upon reuniting with Harrah's Philly, making two speed moves and handily defeating opponents with over \$3 million in lifetime earnings in a 1:56.1 mile. Joe Bongiorno conditions the Archangel gelding for Jennifer Bongiorno Stable LLC and Howard Taylor.

Harrah's Philly concludes its short inaugural opening week today with a 12:40 start; a \$13,500 handicap pace for developing horses will be the sixth race feature. Philly will race through June on a schedule of Thursday and Friday at 12:25 and Sunday at 12:40, with the exception of being dark on Easter Sunday (April 20) and adding a Saturday card at noon on Kentucky Derby Day (May 3). Live racing returns to Plainridge Park Monday

Live harness racing action returns to Massachusetts on Monday (April 14) at 4 p.m. when Plainridge Park kicks off their 2025 season with the best horses, drivers and trainers from New England who will line up for the next eight months during the meet that runs through Friday (Nov. 29).

The 110-day racing schedule starts with a Monday-Tuesday-Thursday rotation from April until May 30, when Friday is added for five weeks. The schedule then goes back to Monday-Tuesday-Thursday from June 30 through Sept. 25. Then in October, Friday is added again until the end of the year.

The two exceptions include dark days on Tuesday (July 22) due to a Sunday 2 p.m. matinee on July 20 featuring the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot and Nov. 27 when the track will be closed in observance of Thanksgiving.

Post time for all race days from April through August is 4 p.m., except for Sunday (July 20). In September and October, post time rolls back to 2 p.m. and in November, it moves back one more time to 1 p.m.

The action on the track looks to be as competitive as ever with all the top Plainridge drivers returning this year.

Last year's co-champion dash drivers Brett Beckwith and Bruce Ranger, who tied for the title with 166 wins apiece, will lead the way with other top five finishers Matty Athearn, Kevin Switzer, Jr. and Nick Graffam looking to move up the leaderboard in 2025.

Beckwith, who has become one of the top drivers in North America, was honored in February at the Dan Patch Awards in Orlando, FL, as the United States Harness Writers Association's 2024 National Rising Star as a result of a career year that saw a great number of his starts made at Plainridge. And he hasn't missed a beat this year as he already has 216 wins, that places him third in victories among all North American drivers, and earnings in excess of \$1.5 million that puts him sixth for North American driver earnings as well.

Beckwith is currently the runaway leader for dash wins at Saratoga Raceway where he has tallied 136 victories, a number totaling twice his nearest competitor.

Another notable name that will once again be part of the regular Plainridge driving colony is the legendary New England reinsman, Walter Case, Jr., who will be making his first start at The Ridge since 2008. Case was the first North American driver to ever win in excess of 1,000 races in a single year (1,076 in 1998), the first to win 10 races on one card (at Northfield Park in 1999), led all drivers in North America for total wins in 1998, 2001 and 2002 and was named Harness Tracks of America Driver of the Year three times.

For his career, "Casey" boasts a total of 11,484 lifetime wins, placing him 12th on the all-time wins list, while banking \$46,182,580 in purse money for his connections.

On the training side, Jimmy Nickerson, who has been the leading conditioner at Plainridge Park for the last four years and the first to win over \$1 million in purses at Plainridge for three consecutive years, will be looking to defend his title for a fifth straight year on the strength of a large stable of horses who just shipped north after winter training and qualifying in Pinehurst, NC.

His main rival looks to be Melissa Beckwith, who won the Plainridge training title in 2020 and is currently campaigning a large stable at Saratoga Raceway, where she is the top trainer with 61 wins. Her success there so far this year also has her ranked as the sixth leading percentage trainer in North America, boasting a gaudy .504 UTR for her efforts.

Other top trainers from last year, including Domenico Cecere, Gretchen Athearn, Jolene Andrews and Jackie Greene, will also be back to head a long list of other barns ready to go to post.

Besides horses who have raced over the winter at other tracks shipping in for this meet, Plainridge will also benefit from a lot of fresh stock as 121 horses just qualified at The Ridge this past week in preparation for making their first starts of the year during the opening days.

The 2025 meet will be rich in stakes action, including three United States Trotting Association graded stakes that will make

up a total of eight Grand Circuit races with combined purses of \$710,000 up for grabs.

First on the schedule is the \$100,000 Paul Revere Pace for 3-year-olds which will be held on Thursday (May 1). Then on Thursday (May 15), the \$100,000 Battle Of Bunker Hill Trot which is a Grade 3 stake.

On July 20, it's the Grade 2 \$250,000 Spirit Of Massachusetts and the Grade 3 \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace. Both of these races have rewritten track records several times since their inception and have enticed some of the best open class competitors from across North America to compete at Plainridge.

Then on Oct. 13, it's the Reynolds Stake for 3-year-old pacers, which will be contested by gender. The Tar Heel is the \$40,000 colt and gelding division and The Leta Long is the \$40,000 division for fillies.

Held on the same day, the \$40,000 Colonial for 3-year-old trotters is the companion stake to the Reynolds and will also be contested by gender with the filly division going as the \$40,000 Colonial Oaks.

Then the fall classic \$3.14 million (est.) Massachusetts Breeders Stakes start on Sept. 29 and features three preliminary legs before culminating on Oct. 30 when the finals will be contested.

This year's betting menu includes an early and late Daily Double, Exactas and Trifectas available in every race, Superfectas available in every race (except Wicked Hi-5 races), Wicked Hi-5 Pentafecta in the sixth and ninth race, Pick-3 in race 3 and race 6 and Pick-4 in race 5. Minimum wagers are as follows: Daily Double: \$2, Exacta: \$2, Pick-3: \$1, Pick-4: \$1, Trifecta: \$2, Superfecta: 20-cents and Wicked Hi-5: 20-cents.
