Much still to be settled as Borgata series approaches final two legs

There have been plenty of plot twists, so far, in the multi-leg stakes series at Yonkers.

The first three legs of this year's MGM Borgata Pacing Series have come with plot twists to kick off this year's free-for-all stakes action, and suddenly with just two legs left before the finals are determined, much remains in flux for the higher-regarded horses.

Before getting into those on the "bubble," Verdun is one of a few series contenders that looks to have his name squarely stamped for a date into the finals. He also might be the feel-good story of the series thus far.

Owned by Thomas Ceraso and trained and driven by Pat Lachance, Verdun is one of the rarer free-for-all pacers that was acquired via claim. After racing in Delaware into last summer as a 4-year-old where he was trained by Jason Johnson, Verdun made two starts at Yonkers as a \$50,000 claimer for Travis Alexander. After winning his first two races in the class upon arrival, he was claimed out of that third one — a race he won by four lengths in 1:51.4 — and the rest is history. He's since won eight different 3-5YO opens at Yonkers and has taken two out of his three Borgata legs. In the last three weeks alone, racing in

the Borgata series, he's earned the exact amount of his \$62,500 (\$50,000 plus allowances) claim price.

Following late-race heroics to win his opening leg three weeks ago over a notable Huntinthelastdolar, Verdun picked up another series win last week when he popped from the pocket around the final turn to capitalize off a perfect trip against heavily favored Desperate Man to win by a couple of lengths going away. Monday's (April 21) seventh race could be telling, as it pits Verdun, with the post advantage in the field of six, against both Desperate Man and Huntinthelastdolar.

Huntinthelastdolar goes for Yonkers leading trainer Per Engblom and is another that, aside from that head defeat to Verdun in the opening leg, has been nearly perfect in the series thus far. The New York Sire Stake champion from 2023 was battle tested against many of the sports best older pacers last year and his win in last week's second preliminary leg was monstrous. In

that race, he was used extremely hard having left into a :26.1 opening quarter and had to wait for Charlie May to clear before he could then make his move to the front, and in the end, he not only lived to tell about it but won quite comfortably.

Another major player, who will have a say before the series is said and done, has been Mossdale Ben N. Prior to last week, he had been a perfect six-for-six since coming to North America and that includes winning his first two legs of the Borgata series – both from well off the pace which is something you don't see often at Yonkers let alone two weeks in a row. Last week, he did all he could to be a game second to Coaches Corner after ceding the tactical advantage to that rival who is also a top series contender and who is making his presence felt in this series for the second straight year. As for Mossdale Ben N, he looks favorably situated in his upcoming race Monday to do no worse than second in a race he'll be odds-on favored to win.

Another notable performer in a series that's exceeded my initial expectations for star power has been For Once Inmy Life who returns Monday after taking last week off. Unbeaten thus far in the series through his first two races, he amazingly hasn't been worse than second in a race since November of last year. Over the course of 12 races, most of which came at The Meadowlands, two were races he nearly took it to Mad Max Hanover. He races Monday where his main threats will come from Coaches Corner and perhaps Humble A.

On the topic of Humble A, he's one of a few that's in need of a top finish in Monday's fourth leg. A (presumably high dollar) private purchase following his runner-up finish in the series first leg – a race where he was beaten for the first time since shooting up the Yonkers ranks last year on entering North America, he's run into somewhat of a new reality the last two weeks. In leg 2 he took

a good first-over try against For Once Inmy Life but flattened at the end – similar to what he did in leg 1. Last week he wasn't involved from an outside post. Now, it looks like he'd need to finish ahead of at least Coaches Corner or For Once Inmy Life on Monday to keep his Borgata final hopes alive.

Veterans Desperate Man and Charlie May find themselves in similar situations. Desperate Man tore through the preliminary legs last year before dueling into defeat in the final, but this year has been tougher. He didn't have an easy trip in the first leg when he was third, but then he didn't last on the lead in his next two races either. With one second place finish and two thirds to his credit thus far, he is in against two tough ones on Monday and is another that needs a strong showing.

Nearly the same can be said for Charlie May. He looked a little short to me in his first leg but came back with two strong races since then where he's been involved in early uncharacteristically Yonkers fast fractions. He cut the mile two back when parked through a :26.4 opening quarter, and last week dueled to the front past a :26.1 opening split and did quite well to stay up close until the end. He lands a relatively comfortable position Monday in a race that I'd say is a must-win if he were to keep on track to the final.

With two weeks to go until a week off and then the finals, the Borgata series is still anybody's to win.

Can brilliant Ponda Jewel become Wrenn's next headliner?

In 2009 and 2010, Peter Wrenn and his wife, Melanie, took the Indiana racing program by storm with trotting filly Msnaughtybynature. Purchased two starts into her freshman campaign, she would dominate her division over the next two seasons, winning 22 of 26 starts and accumulating \$642,000. Today, the Wrenns have another trotting filly in Ponda Jewel whose early season exploits are reminiscent of the former champion and stable headliner.

"She would win her sires stakes about as easy as that, you know," said Peter, recalling the former champion and comparing with his up-and-coming trotter. "And it's changed a little bit now, as far as speed, that's for sure."

During her two seasons on the track, Msnaughtybynature was never asked to go any faster than 1:56. Ponda Jewel, by contrast, has already dipped below that standard, circling the Harrah's Hoosier Park oval in 1:54.4 in late March. But what has captured the imagination is not only the time on the tote board, but the distance between Ponda Jewel and her competition at the wire. In a trio of starts this year, the filly has sparkled for her connections, claiming victory by margins of $7\frac{1}{2}$ lengths, $10\frac{3}{4}$ lengths, and $8\frac{3}{4}$ lengths.

"A lot of them are like her, they're late horses," Peter said of his filly, a one-time starter in 2024 that fits the early closer criteria. "She hasn't met the competition that will be more prepared in another couple months, I know that."

That competition is the crop of last season's top freshman Indiana Sires Stakes fillies that will begin to show up in qualifiers soon in anticipation of the opening leg next month. Peter wants to see how his charge compares with the group, and her trio of efforts in the Mya Tri series has left him optimistic.

"I really like this filly," he said. "Her starts here really showed me a lot of stuff I like. And, you know, I know with being that confident, sometimes it comes with a little disappointment. We'll see. I mean, it's hard to take talent away, and she's got smarts and talent, so those are two things you like."

Ponda Jewel is the first foal from Muscle Hill mare Aperfectcrystal. Stakes placed in PASS and Kentucky Commonwealth action at 2 and 3, the mare is a half-sister to Haughton Memorial

winner Aperfectyankee. Bred and consigned by Pond-A-Acres, the Swan For All lass brought \$130,000 at the 2023 Hoosier Classic sale, purchased by Peter for owners David McDuffee and L&L DeVisser LLC.

Peter brought the filly along last season and made it to the races, but immaturity issues led to an abbreviated campaign. In her lone attempt behind the starter's gate last September, Ponda Jewel made a break early and was relegated to racing well back of the field.

"She just had a lot of immaturity issues," Peter said. "And luckily, I thought she was a gifted filly. She showed me pieces, and there were days when she wasn't so gifted. We gave her a little time in the summer, then I brought her back in the fall, and I tinkered with her in the fall, and I qualified her. I kind of liked her, knowing that there were some things that needed to be taken care of as far as maturity."

In March, Peter said that Ponda Jewel began to put it all together, and today, despite only four starts, the green filly looks much different than the trotter that made her debut seven months ago.

"That's when she really, really made the trot, right around the first of March," he said. "It finally clicked for her and I, and we all got together. And, you know, she's just a beautiful filly. I love her. She's fun to sit behind. She's one of the nicest green trotters."

After qualifying in 1:58.2 at Sunshine Meadows in mid-March, Ponda Jewel made her sophomore debut on March 29 in the opening round of the Mya Tri series, named after another dominant Indiana-sired trotting filly. Starting from post 7, Peter sent her to the lead and the pair never relinquished, winning handily in 1:54.4. In the second \$10,000 leg, she followed the same template, this time from post 2. Receiving every call as the heavy favorite, the trotter once again stepped away from

the field, this time by double-digit lengths. In the \$20,000 series final, held April 17, Peter employed different tactics with Ponda Jewel, sitting early before brushing to the top after the half and sprinting to the wire uncontested in 1:55.2.

"She's just so fun to drive," the veteran driver said. "The other night she was two fingers. When I moved her, she was all business. In fact, in that last turn, she was cruising around. I was like, 'Whoa, where are you going?' That's just a fun ride. Real fun ride."

Ponda Jewel is eligible to the Msnaughtybynature, a series named in honor of the former champion, but Peter says he will skip it, focusing more on the upcoming sires stakes campaign and the bigger picture.

"I just feel like it's a long season, and a big future ahead of her," he said. "If she is that good, then it's an easy decision to make. Naturally, I'm excited about her. I run a big barn with a lot of good help, so we do need good horses. We need headliners, and hopefully she can take us that way, and maybe we can have a headliner. I know in April we had a headliner, but we'll see what happens in October."

Elitloppet contenders upset in Paris by 31-1 shot Iguski Sautonne

Saturday's (April 19) \$200,000 Prix de l'Atlantique at Enghien racetrack in Paris included some of the best horses in France. Go On Boy, Hussard du Landret, Hohneck, Hooker Berry and Etonnant are all winners of big events in Europe. When Etonnant eventually hit the lead in the 2,150-meter race, the most merited trotters all were in the front of the field. Etonnant was on the lead with favorite Go On Boy on the outside in a pace that well suited the front trotters and Go On Boy could easily disarm Etonnant in the home stretch. Etonnant showed that he needs more races in his big body before he peaks. Go On Boy seemed to meet the wire as a winner in the Prix de l'Atlantique, but the home stretch at Enghien is a long journey, a never-ending story

it seemed like, and Matthieu Abrivard's **Iguski Sautonne** (Village Mystic) produced a very strong finish on the far outside and it was clear 50 meters from the wire that he was going to post the upset. Abrivard's 31-1 shot impressed a lot with his strong ending of the race and he came home in a mile rate of 1:54.3 over 1.3 miles.

Go On Boy held on to second place and Ampia Mede Sm was given the bronze medal since Hooker Berry, who was third, was disqualified for racing outside of the track in the last turn.

Racing room appeared at the top of the stretch after a perfect pocket trip for **Learn To Fly** (Uriel Speed) and Eric Raffin in the \$120,000 Prix de Tonnac-Villeneuve and by then, the race was over. Learn To Fly cruised to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:58.1 over 1.7 miles.

BORUPS VICTORY DEFENDS TITLE

Daniel Wäjersten's **Borups Victory** (Googoo Gaagaa) performed on top when the \$130,000 Seinäjoki Race was held in Seinäjoki, Finland on Saturday (April 19) afternoon.

As predicted, Stens Rubin kept the lead from his inside post while Borups Victory had to make it hard for the leader from his first over position. Wäjersten made an early move, targeting Stens Rubin and the pace increased dramatically after 500 meters. Both Stens Rubin and Borups Victory kept calm after

the speed attack and the two favorites had acquired big chances of fighting for the win.

But as it turned out, Borups Victory played on another level compared to his opponents this day. In the end of the last turn, the advantage was his and the Googoo Gaagaa son had strength and moral enough to keep follower Massimo Hoist a safe distance behind him in the end.

A mile rate of 1:54 over 1.3 miles after a first over trip is just splendid and Borups Victory will most certainly grab more trophies during the season.

ZET-HORSES WERE TOPS ON GOOD FRIDAY

Daniel Redén presented two top performers on Good Friday (April 18) and the question whether **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin), now 9 years old, is a horse ready for Elitloppet is close to ridiculous. Don Fanucci Zet made his comeback after throat surgery in super style in the Eskilstuna. It was a race with moderate opponents, by all means, but the form Don Fanucci Zet showed was impressive as he danced to an outstanding 1:52.1 win.

The will-he-or-won't-he Elitloppet question is more about his trainer.

Redén has a number of horses racing in the elite races in Europe and his Francesco Zet is already invited to Elitloppet. But the fans might be "tired" of seeing an old trotter that won the big race in 2021. That's the unfair part of the Don Fanucci Zet story. In my opinion, he is the winner of Elitloppet 2025, but there is a risk that he never gets an invitation.

Further east in Sweden, in Karlstad, another Zet-trotter showed that he had developed some levels during the winter. **Holcombe Zet** (Daley Lovin) sprinted to the lead in the \$60,000 Prins Carl Philips Jubileumspokal for 5-year-olds, meaning that heavy favorite Devilish Hill had to settle for parked first over. Holcombe Zet, third in the Breeders Crown final in November 2024, won the race in 1:51.4, the fastest mile in Europe so far in 2025. Impressive, and normally, a performance that opens the eyes of Elitloppet manager Anders Malmrot, but Holcombe Zet is just one out of many trotters from Redén's stable good enough for all the big races in Europe and Holcombe Zet will probably have to wait for his turn regarding Elitloppet.

Norwegian trained **Daim Brodda** (Readly Express) took commando in the 4-year-old mares crop 2024 and in her debut this year, in the \$30,000 Folke Hjalmarssons Minneslopp, she just looked splendid in an impressive wire-to-wire win in a mile rate of 1:54.3 over 1.3 miles.







THE VIEW FROM WOODBINE MOHAWK PARK

Looking back at the Cam Fella Farewell Tour and remembering the late Pat Crowe

Pat Crowe will forever be associated with Woodbine Mohawk Park. The 87-year-old horseman died on March 28 in Windsor, ON, marking the end of an era for harness racing. Crowe was a standardbred owner, trainer, and driver who was inducted to the Springwater Sports Hall of Fame just last year, although his career in the sport spanned more than six decades. On April 26, 1963, he drove the first-ever winner at a newly-opened

five-eighths-mile track in Campbellville, ON called Mohawk Racetrack. The horse, a 3-year-old pacing gelding named David Hal B (p, 7, 2:05.4f; \$32,364), was a homebred longshot trained by Carman Brown of Meaford, ON. He won in front of 4,338 spectators.

But it's another pacer who truly made history with trainer/driver Crowe.

Initially purchased by Doug Arthur, a finalist on the 2025 ballot for the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, Cam Fella was a \$19,000 Tattersalls (Lexington) yearling. At age 2, the Most Happy Fella—Nan Cam colt won three of 11 races, breaking stride in three others. Cam Fella (p, 4, 1:53.1m; \$2,041,367) was purchased by Norm Clements of Uxbridge, ON and Norm Faulkner of Stouffville, ON in 1981 for \$140,000; later, JEF's Standardbred Country Club of Sacramento, CA, joined the partnership.

Cam Fella was syndicated in 1984 and leased to stand stud at Stonegate Standardbred Farms in Glen Gardner, NJ, following an impressive 61 victories in 80 starts. In a rare setback at age 4, he narrowly defeated Perfect Out at Mohawk on May 6, 1983, only to be disqualified and set back to second. As Crowe told interviewer Harold Howe in 1997, "The judges ruled I waved my whip in the face of Perfect Out, causing interference. I don't



with cancer and the plan was to geld him to save his life. It was the year after the Niatross [retirement] tour and I was approached by Norm Clements about a farewell tour for charity and to raise the awareness for harness racing. I made all the arrangements and contacted different tracks, and some heard about the tour and wanted to have Cam there.

think it was a fair judgement, but I imagine that Doug Brown, who drove Perfect Out, still disagrees with me."

On Dec. 10, 1983 at Greenwood Raceway, 12,878 fans showed up to cheer Cam Fella to his 28th straight win, in the last race of his career. At the time of his retirement, the ridgling held records for the most sub-1:55 victories (16) and most sub-1:55 victories in a given year (14, in his 4-year-old season), and the most wins in races with purses of \$100,000 or higher (13). He was also the first older harness horse to exceed \$1-million in annual purse winnings, which he accomplished in his 4-year-old campaign.

"The Pacing Machine" was voted the USHWA Dan Patch 3-Year-Old Male Pacer, Pacer of the Year, and Horse of the Year for 1982, then repeated as Older Pacing Horse, Pacer of the Year, and Horse of the Year in 1983. He was also voted Canadian Horse of the Year at ages 3 and 4. Inducted to the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame (1986) and the Goshen, NY, Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame (1998) for his legacy as a racehorse and sire, Cam Fella retired from breeding due to testicular cancer.

What could have been the end of the road for the celebrated pacer was instead a new beginning, thanks to a plan developed and put into play by Clements and Callie Davies-Gooch, who was then working as the Canadian Trotting Association's media relations director.

"Cam Fella had been diagnosed with cancer and the plan was to geld him to save his life," Davies-Gooch told HRU on Sunday (April 13). "It was the year after the Niatross [retirement] tour and I was approached by Norm Clements about a farewell tour for charity and to raise the awareness for harness racing. I made all the arrangements and contacted different tracks, and some heard about the tour and wanted to have Cam there."

Currently living in California, Davies-Gooch had fond memories of going on the road across North America with Cam Fella and his trainer/driver.

"Pat Crowe appeared at all the stops to jog Cam and sign autographs, and for the last three legs of the tour, he actually took over the travel duties for Cam, driving the truck and trailer," she said. "I was still working at the Canadian Trotting Association in between tour stops, which were normally on the weekends."

The Cam Fella farewell tour began at The Meadowlands on June 5,1997, next moving to Toronto's Nathan Phillips Square for the June 12 North America Cup draw. On June 13, the superstar pacer and his entourage visited Western Fair Raceway in London, ON, before returning to the Toronto area for a June 14 Woodbine Racetrack appearance. The tour continued with stops at Buffalo Raceway, Flamboro Downs, Woodstock Raceway, Sportsman's Park, Hoosier Park, Showplace Farms in Englishtown, NJ, Hiawatha Horse Park, Windsor Raceway, and Barrie Raceway in June and July.

Regardless of where he appeared, Cam Fella regularly drew audiences Davies-Gooch described as "large crowds of harness racing fans and horse lovers."

The former ridgling handled his tour schedule like a professional, rarely showing signs of impatience. "Cam was for the most part very good with the crowds, but on occasion, if he was tired of standing around, he might take a little nip," Davies-Gooch said. "His caretaker, Peter Houck, and I were well aware of this tendency and we called it the 'Million Dollar Nip."

Costs for the wide-ranging Cam Fella tour were offset by supporters.

"The [souvenir] brochure was sponsored by *The Canadian Sportsman* [magazine], and we had wonderful sponsors in Arthur, Ontario Chrysler Plymouth for the truck, and Belore Trailer," she said.

Funds raised by raffles and souvenir sales were divided equally among the Jennifer Ashleigh Foundation, the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation [of Canada], and the Harness Horse Youth Foundation.

Clements established the Jennifer Ashleigh Foundation (now known as the Jennifer Ashleigh Children's Charity) in 1990

after losing two young granddaughters, Jennifer and Danica, to the same hereditary muscular illness. The Uxbridge, ON charity continues to raise funds in accordance with its mission statement: "To provide timely financial support to families caring for children in medical crisis, when they need it most."

Cam Fella's travels took him to Ontario's Hanover Raceway, Clinton Raceway, Elmira Raceway, Kawartha Downs, Quinte Raceway, and Rideau Carleton Raceway in August 1997, before he traveled to Charlottetown Driving Park, on Prince Edward Island, for two appearances during Old Home Week. After stops at New Brunswick's Exhibition Park Raceway and Fredericton Raceway, the superstar pacer was bound for Mohawk, where he received a warm welcome on Sept. 13.

"He was loved by everyone there," Davies-Gooch said. "Fans, owners, horsemen and horsewomen."

Perhaps the most popular stop on the Cam Fella tour was Ohio's Delaware County Fairgrounds, where the gelding made appearances on Sept. 17 and 18.

"The Little Brown Jug stop, where he paced a half in :57.3," Davies-Gooch said.

After visits to The Red Mile in Kentucky, Harrington Raceway in Delaware, Pompano Park in Florida, and Maryland's Rosecroft Raceway, the final legs of the tour returned to Canada. Cam Fella and friends went to Edmonton's Northlands Park on Nov. 1, then Fraser Downs in Surrey, BC on Nov. 9.

"We also had a stop at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto after Fraser Downs," Davies-Gooch said. "In BC at Fraser Downs, we went into a TV studio where [Cam Fella] was on camera and he was so incredibly calm for the whole time. Walking on concrete

floors and turning down narrow halls. Back at the racetrack for the appearance, he led the post parade and the track had arranged for 15 of his offspring to appear in the parade."

When interviewed at Cam Fella's Fraser Downs stop, Clements expressed his amazement with the gelding's return to fitness.

"It's our pleasure to come here and it's a great reception," he told Tommy Wolski. "I think he's getting better every day. We started jogging him in April. He hadn't been jogged for 15 years. At Delaware, at the Little Brown Jug, he went a half-mile in 57 seconds. That would beat a lot of horses today."

Davies-Gooch said that when the farewell tour concluded, Cam Fella "went directly to the Kentucky Horse Park" in Lexington on Dec. 5, 1997. He continued to meet the public at the Hall of Champions until cancer returned and spread to his kidneys. He was humanely euthanized on May 9, 2001, but his name remains a part of the Cam Fella Award, established in 1997 and presented for the kind of "extreme meritorious service to the Canadian harness racing industry" exemplified by the horse himself.

The former Canadian Trotting Association media relations director added that she thought "Foiled Again [p, 9, 1:48f; \$7,635,588] would [still] draw crowds" at public appearances today, but out of the 27 North American racetracks visited by Cam Fella's farewell tour, "there might be about 15 still active."

SUPERSTAR HARNESS RACING

After 46 years at Freehold Raceway, Karen Fagliarone is still going strong

When Freehold Raceway closed its doors in December 2024, Karen Fagliarone was among the many people to say goodbye to yet another harness racetrack.

Fagliarone was a tenured employee who had worked at Freehold for 46 years in various departments: publicity, accounting, clerk, program director and race secretary.

Her first job was with the New Jersey Racing Commission assigning horsemen passes and seats to the grandstand. Years later, Fagliarone was moved to the publicity department where she assisted in writing articles and held events to promote the industry.

Sometime later, Fagliarone began working as the assistant race secretary for Frank Ferone. Ferone eventually retired and was replaced with Peter Koch. Both of these mentors had a huge impact on Fagliarone, teaching her about the business.

But these are only some of the important jobs Fagliarone would do for harness racing, the sport that her family loved so much.

Fagliarone was born in Staten Island, NY. Her late father, Jim McGovern and her brother Jamie McGovern, were both drivers and trainers, as was her late uncle Donald McGovern who drove and trained standardbreds part-time. So, it would come as no surprise when Fagliarone would choose to make harness racing her enduring profession.

"My father was very protective and didn't think the backside of the racetrack was a place for young girls," she said. "Therefore, I never even experienced getting up and personal with horses until I was around 12 or 13 years old. At that time, my family moved from Staten Island, NY, to Cream Ridge, NJ, where my dad purchased and built a 120-acre horse farm [currently named Dreamland Farm] located on Schoolhouse Rd in Cream Ridge, NJ. I started working on the farm and quickly developed a deep passion for horses.

"In 1990 I met and married my husband, Michael Fagliarone, who at that time was also a driver/trainer. A short time later Mike left his driving career and began working at the Meadowlands Racetrack as a track supervisor. In 2009, Mike left The Meadowlands and took the same position at Freehold

Although [as director of racing] I was working with trainers and drivers, mostly male and much younger than me, I found that if you treat people with respect and remained fair, most of the time, you would get respect back. I also found it extremely important to be accessible. People have the right to ask questions and deserve honest answers. ??

Luckily for Fagliarone, she received some good advice.

"My good friend, trainer/driver Jackie Ingrassia, has always been a huge influence in my life, and she convinced me that I could handle the challenge, and I'm so glad I did," Fagliarone said. "Although I was working with trainers and drivers, mostly male and much younger than me, I found that if you treat people with respect and remained fair, most of the time, you would get respect back. I also found it extremely important to be accessible. People have the right to ask questions and deserve honest answers."

Fagliarone's job as a race secretary is an important one requiring a lot of attention to detail.

"My day consists of printing up eligibility papers on each horse that was entered for the day, classifying them, checking that they were both qualified and fit the conditions of the race and then dating them by preference date. From there, I put together the most competitive field of horses and number my race numbers before sending the program to the judges. The judges proof my work, check for any entries or errors and then I complete the draw."

Fagliarone mentioned how things have changed drastically since the days when the race draw was performed by one person who pulled a horse's name from the box while another person rolled the dice to see what number that horse would be assigned.

"They sure have," Fagliarone said. "We now have the pleasure of electronic eligibilities and an automated draw, which are helpful tools provided by the USTA. Years ago, you had an actual blue or yellow eligibility card, and we would hand write the lines of a horse. Technology has come a long way and our jobs as officials have benefited."

Over her decades in the business, Fagliarone has observed changes to an industry that was once thriving, and offered a thought on what could help to reverse that trend in the future.

"I've watched a steady decline in the harness industry, and it saddens me," she said. "I remember the days when we would handle over a million dollars on a Saturday afternoon. In 2024 we were lucky to handle \$250,000 on average. Before the Atlantic City casinos opened in the late '70s, horse racing was the only place to wager. Today, it takes a click of the phone to wager on just about any sporting event imaginable.

"At Freehold we conducted an event called "The Open Space Pace," which was sponsored by Eugene and Sam Landy. The father and son team are two amazing supporters of our sport and have given so much back. Sam's son, Harry Landy, began his career driving at Freehold Raceway. Events such as these bring awareness and attract newcomers, which is what the business needs."

Although Freehold is no longer open, Fagliarone is still involved the business.

"I'm happy to say that I have taken two remote jobs, working at Bangor in Maine, and Shanandoah Downs in Virginia as race secretary," she said. "Although I will miss the social aspect of my job, I will still get to watch these incredible horses race around in circles two laps at both of my new tracks.

"I truly enjoy my job and I am most proud of the young, ambitious interns that I have mentored. Just to name a few, PJ Iovino, who is currently the race secretary at Saratoga Raceway, Rich Mattei and John Piassek, who are both employed at Yonkers Raceway, and Rob Pennington, who is race secretary at both Cumberland in Maine and Harrah's in Chester, PA.

"My most recent intern is a young man named Joseph Romanelli. Joe's grandfather and my dad owned horses together back in the '70s and throughout the years. I've watched Joe stand under the TV's during a race and call races to himself. I knew he had the passion, talent, and work ethic to become an announcer one day, and so I hired him at Freehold. He is now working for The Meadowlands conducting interviews and broadcasting. These individuals have all become family to me and to this day, I keep in touch with all of them."





Peter Blood came a long way on self-confidence and BS

In a conversation the other day, Peter Blood brought up the fact that the motto of the USTA used to be "Harness racing, America's fastest growing sport." Not only was that the motto of our governing body, but it was undoubtedly true at the time. One might be entitled to ask what has happened to us since those halcyon days?

Blood was primarily addressing the fact that harness racing in his home state of Florida is no more.

So, you ended up in Florida. What happened next?

"I got a job with Charlie Connors, the father of well-known New York horseman Chuck Connors. Charlie was the first who allowed me to jog a horse for him. I then got a job with the Bruce Nickells Stable. Lupe Morales was Bruce's number one man. I distinctly remember him telling me, 'You don't know s ---: At that time, he was probably right. I went to work for Fred Bradbury. Fred didn't have many in his stable, but they were all decent to very good. I took care of a good Spectator filly named Sweet Freight who was owned by Arthur Brown's ABC Freight Forwarding Stable. She was the third highest earning 3-year-old trotting filly that year.

"In the interim, I went back to Maine, but not for long. I came back to Florida where I went to work for Billy Haughton. I worked there for two years. Billy Haughton is, in my opinion, the greatest horseman ever. It isn't even close. What he didn't know about a horse isn't worth knowing. After two years with Haughton, I thought it was time that I went out on my own. I started a small stable composed mostly of claimers.

"It was at about this time where I became involved in the Florida Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association (FSBOA), a

You began racing at Pompano from its inception. What was the path that led you there?

"I was born in Brooklyn. At the age of 5, my dad picked up and moved our family to the great state of Maine, then as it is now, a place that has been a breeding place for numerous exceptional horsemen. While there, I would describe myself as being mostly a musician. I played quitar and bass mostly at clubs. I suppose my claim to fame was being part of a small band that once opened for a quy named Jimi Hendrix in Lewiston. My dad was a devoted horse player. It was no surprise that he began taking me along when he visited the racetrack. My part in actively being involved in the sport came about when two friends and myself bought a cheap claimer for \$750. We did alright with it, but just alright. I decided to go to Florida and try to get involved in harness racing full time. I had no experience, but I didn't lack in selfconfidence or bulls - - -."

Looking back at my time as a [FSBOA] director, I must confess that I probably did a poor job. group of which I am still a member. Looking back at my time as a director, I must confess that I probably did a poor job. "I suppose it was both my good and not so good fortune to meet a man named Bob Rosenheim. The good was that Mr. Rosenheim had almost unlimited resources and was willing to spend whatever it took to achieve his goals. The bad, and there was lots of bad, was that he was almost completely devoid of class. When you were with him, there were lots of unexpected things he could unleash, almost always resulting in embarrassing behavior. Through the three years I was with him, we did pretty well, but only on the racetrack. One day, he accused me of lying to him. I don't lie to anyone. I told him to take his job and shove it where the sun doesn't shine."

Would you say your relationship with Rick Berks has been diametrically opposed to what you experienced with Rosenheim?

"Yes, indeed. We have been together for 33 years. He has been a client, a partner, and most important of all, a dear friend for all of that time. I'm now not much more than a dollar a year man, going around the track for Bill Deters at Sunshine Meadows with regard to actually working with the horses. I still help Rick in determining the bookings for his broodmare band that now numbers around a dozen. I have my computer hooked up to the stalls of his mares as they go through the next stage of their lives at his farm in Kentucky. It has been an association on which I place great value."

The three Alans, Part 2

I was wandering around the Del Mar clubhouse between races during a thoroughbred program. The next race looked like a good one for me to drop a win bet, so I kept my eyes on the tote board while pacing the trackside area. I noticed broadcasting celebrity Larry King sitting on a small lawn chair. I approached him.

"Mr. King, excuse me," I said.

"Yeah, what?"

"We met on your CNN show when you interviewed Wolfman Jack. Remember? It was earlier this year."

"Oh, sure. Wolfman. He's quite a fella. That was fun. He's looking good these days. So, who do you like in this race?"

I said, "Right now I'm interested in the 2 horse."

"What? Right now? What's that mean? I don't see anyone beating the 6. He's a strong and deserving favorite."

"But I don't think he's worthy of a 1-2 bet."

"So, what do you do? You bet longshots? Like the 2 at 12-1?"

"I wish he'd be 12-1. But think he will come in around 6- or 7-1. I'll bet him at 6- or 7-1."

King folded his *Racing Form* and he stood facing the betting windows. He said, "Well good luck with that longshot. I'm getting on the favorite."

"The 2 might beat the favorite at 6-1."

"Good luck with however you bet," he said and as he walked away, he added, "And say hello to the Wolf fella."

He was not rude, but he made it obvious he was not interested in my betting opinions. I looked at the tote board and then I turned towards King and shouted, "Bet the 2, Mr. King. He's almost 7-1."

I didn't see him as I walked to a betting window and wagered \$20 to win on the 2. Then I found a monitor to watch the race. In late stretch the favorite led in a wire-to-wire attempt and was challenged by the second favorite deep down the stretch. But the 2 horse came thundering three wide and caught them both by a nose at the wire. At \$6.70 to the dollar the 2 paid \$15.40 to win.

I went to cash my winning ticket at the farthest window in the area. Mr. King could not see me but I could see him. He was standing still and looking to the left and right and in front and

back of himself. I was willing to bet Larry King never read any works by Alan Watts.

The third Alan in my trio was Alan Watts. He had nothing to do with horse racing or gambling. He is called a "philosophical entertainer," and is known for introducing Buddhist Zen philosophy to a Western audience. I was introduced to his work seven years after his death and it came at a perfect time.

I was working at breakneck speed as a writer with a supplementary job: serious pari-mutuel wagering. My bankroll was a solid five digits. Money went out and came in with a modicum of success (thanks to strict handicapping practices and a professional money-management system). With what little time in a day was left, I ate and slept and read and listened to Alan Watts.

In all the handicapping literature I read and the first-hand professional advice I was given there was not one author's work addressing how to cope with the psychological beating pari-mutuel player experiences. Even successful professionals likened the job to flailing through a gauntlet.

"Even after a big win," a professional horseplayer told me, "you're left healing from the pains it took to get it. And losing leaves you clobbered all together."

"In the end," another pro player told me, "only a limited few make money and are winners."

In his book, The Wisdom of Insecurity, Watts addressed the player's emotional conundrum in general terms. He wrote: "There is a stage in man's development when [fixed beliefs must] be left behind... We make bets [take risks] in the light of which we can make practical arrangements to the course of events."

Watts convinced me to apply that simple Zen discipline to coping with the enormous stress of being a handicapper for pari-mutuel wagering. It began to work instantly. My encounter with Larry King was the perfect example. His typical horseplayer mentality was stained by fixed beliefs most likely acquired early in his betting education.

Most pari-mutuel bettors spend years or their entire betting career losing money without realizing the practice of "picking winners" (and not "playing winners") is affected by their personal preferences fueled by fixed beliefs and not the mathematics of the moment. Preconceived notions become traps; they are steeped in misrepresentative truths handed down by losers.

Do you believe that a human can best Al at chess, or a human harness horse race handicapper can best Al at wagering?

Next week, I will post the almost deleted column that led me to this dark cave. The column is not perfect. The topic may be inane. There will be mistakes, inherent prejudices, bad jokes, puns, and heaven knows what.

But the words will be mine, all of them.

For now.





Seaside Diva breaks through, Pelling stable doubles in Matchmaker

Seaside Diva, driven by Yannick Gingras, put herself in the running for a spot in the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series final by capturing the first of three \$50,000 divisions in the fourth round of the event for pacing mares at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (April 18). The 4-year-old by Downbytheseaside went to the front and never looked back, stopping the teletimer in 1:53.2 for her first win in five seasonal starts.

Seaside Diva took over from Dougs Babe into the first turn and cut the opening fraction in :27.4 without a fight. Gingras had Seaside Diva marching strongly to the half in :56.1 with the field of seven in straight alignment going past that call. The classy Grace Hill and Matt Kakaley moved first coming off the third turn and were followed by favorite Promiseland A with Jason Bartlett. Seaside Diva accelerated during the third quarter, pacing a solid 28 second fraction, making it difficult for the outer flow to contend, with Dougs Babe A struggling to keep the pocket closed.

Gingras let out a notch on the final turn, and the Ron Burketrained Seaside Diva shifted gears, drawing away from the field. Grace Hill kept charging to the wire and was clear for second with Lloyds Loves finishing in overdrive for Brent Holland and getting the show spot.

Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Knox Services and Let It Ride Stables, Seaside Diva was a winner for the 18th time in her career and returned \$9.90 to win as the second choice. With Grace Hill second, the exacta returned \$44.60 and longshot Lloyds Loves helped complete a \$602 triple payoff.

Opening round winner **Walkin On Sunshine** found her way back into the winner's circle in the second \$50,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division as driver Scott Zeron steered the 2-5 favorite on a long coverless jaunt before eventually wearing down pace-setter Tarapasta in the stretch to win in 1:53.

Tarapasta left the gate sharply for Matt Kakaley. The second choice in the field put Lit De Rose into a hole on the first turn and also forced Talk Curdy To Me to retreat on the opening bend, with the favorite Walkin On Sunshine getting away third. After an opening quarter in :27.3, Kakaley was able to rate the half nicely, with Tarapasta hitting that pole in :56.3. Zeron had waited comfortably in third with Walkin On Sunshine, but Turn The Page N, with Ron Cushing, advanced sharply from off the second bend

and flushed the favorite before the half was reached.

Walkin On Sunshine attacked under some rating, with Zeron inching her in next to Tarapasta through an accelerated three-quarters reached in 1:24.4. The business got serious for the favorite from there, and Walkin On Sunshine, a 5-year-old daughter of Always A Virgin, wore down the pace-setter in early stretch, then easily held off a solid bid late by Turn The Page N, while Tarapasta settled for third.

Owned by Maynard Miller, Daniel Lehman and Michael Yoder, Walkin On Sunshine was a winner for the fifth time in seven starts this year for trainer Brett Pelling. As the favorite she returned \$2.90 to win and keyed a \$31.20 exacta and \$75.50 triple.

Rocket Deo gave Pelling a pair of Blue Chip Matchmaker divisions on the card when she converted on a 1-5 promise in the third \$50,000 division for driver Jason Bartlett in a solid 1:53.1 mile. The 4-year-old daughter of Captaintreacherous also won for the second time in the series like her stablemate Walkin On Sunshine.

Silk Cloud A and Coachellabound N both left with high speed from the outside of the gate. Matt Kakaley was able to squeeze into a hole on the first turn with Coachellabound N, with Silk Cloud A and Jordan Stratton taking the lead briefly from the favorite before Bartlett re-moved Rocket Deo for control well before the :27.3 opening quarter had been completed. Rocket Deo controlled the half in :56.1 and then began feeling some pressure when High Flyin' Filly and Gingras moved late on the third turn to go up without cover.

Rocket Deo was in command at three-quarters in 1:24.3, and Bartlett appeared confident as he opened ground in the stretch, eventually allowing Silk Cloud A a path to be clear for second. High Flyin' Filly held ground late to hold on to the show spot.

Morrison Racing Stable and John Fielding share ownership in Rocket Deo, a winner of 13 races in 26 lifetime starts. Rocket Deo paid \$2.50 to win and keyed a \$5.70 exacta and \$27.20 triple.

The preliminary rounds of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series will wrap up Friday (April 25) with the leading point earners advancing to the final on Friday (May 9). A major change in 2025 revolves around the added money for the final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, which gets a boost from \$125,000 to \$200,000, equaling the MGM Borgata Pacing Series total. With that increase the Blue Chip Matchmaker final will certainly offer the richest purse in recent history and far eclipse the \$276,200 purse from 2024.

FOURTH ROUND OF BORGATA SERIES ON MONDAY, BRENNAN SERIES WRAPS UP WEDNESDAY: Four \$50,000 MGM Borgata Pacing Series tests will go behind the gate on Monday (April 21) as that event has reached its next-to-last leg. Mossdale Ben N (post 5, race 3) goes for his third win in the event, as do Verdun (post 2, race 7), Huntinthelastdolar (post 6, race 7), For Once Inmy Life (post 3, race 8) and Coaches Corner (post 6, race 8).

The first final of 2025 at Yonkers will then occur on Wednesday (April 23) as the \$123,000 championship of the John Brennan Trotting Series is set. Antognoni S is after a series sweep, but will have to overcome post 7 in the mile and a quarter tilt, which is race 7 on the program. There is also a \$50,000 series consolation in race 4.

PICK 5 GUARANTEED POOL BOOSTED ON MONDAYS AND FRIDAYS: Continuing for every Monday and Friday card during the legs of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series and Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, MGM Yonkers Raceway, in conjunction with the SOA of NY, will offer a \$20,000 guaranteed Pick 5 pool in race 5.

The guaranteed Pick 5 pool on Mondays is also a part of the United States Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering Program.

John Brennan Trotting Series final and consolation drawn

The 2025 edition of the John Brennan Trotting Series will conclude on Wednesday (April 23) at MGM Yonkers Raceway, and the fields for both the \$132,000 final and \$50,000 consolation are now set.

Trainers Ron Burke and Per Engblom had seven of the eight top point-earners in the event but were limited to two finalists each as part of the stakes conditions. Burke-trained Antognoni S is the only horse in the series with a chance at a sweep, but he'll have to overcome post 7 with co-owner Yannick Gingras at the lines. Burke's other entrant, dual-round winner Busy Making Moni, landed post 5.

As for Engblom, he has Bellissimo Face S from post 1 with Jason Bartlett set to drive and Green Pastures from post 4 with Scott Zeron on the entry sheet. Zeron is also the listed driver for Busy Making Moni.

'Fire' burns bright in Big M feature

Outside The Fire worked out a perfect pocket trip on the way to taking down Lexus Kody in the Friday night (April 18) feature at The Meadowlands, a \$25,000 high-end conditioned trot.

The race shaped up as a great matchup between the two talented trotters. Outside The Fire, a winner of two of his last four for the Jeff Cullipher barn who was sent to the gate as the 3-5 favorite, taking on 2-1 second choice Lexus Kody, the ultratalented speedball from Ron Burke, who is awfully good when flat, but has a nasty breaking habit, having gone off-stride in half of his last six tries, with the other three resulting in walks down victory lane.

The race panned out predictably, with Outside The Fire leaving for position from post 5 in the seven-horse field. He actually had the top at the quarter in :27.4 before Lexus Kody, driven by 25-year-old Aussie James Herbertson, who will be at The Big M for the next five weeks to get a taste of American racing, took over and took the field past the half in :57.2 and three-quarters in 1:26.4. The track record holder for an older gelding by virtue of a 1:49.4 clocking last Hambletonian Day, Lexus Kody would be tough to beat after a middle half in :59.

But Outside The Fire was up to the challenge, because for Lexus Kody, it wasn't his breaking problem that cost him the win, but instead, it was facing a horse who was simply better.

"He's been in razor-sharp form," said winning driver Johnathan Ahle. "So, I just figured, let's see where we land and come when we have to."

When we have to was approaching three-quarters, when Ahle, driving Outside The Fire for the first time, vacated the pocket to go after the leader.

"I wouldn't say I was nervous," said Ahle. "But the slow half didn't please me at all."

Outside The Fire collared Lexus Kody with about a sixteenth to go, and went on to win by one length in 1:53.1. On Higher Ground was third.

"The way mine felt around that last turn, he felt loaded with trot and I was confident," said Ahle.

A 6-year-old gelded son of Cantab Hall—Light The Flame, Outside The Fire upped his lifetime stats to 25 wins from 84 starts, good for earnings of \$374,068 for owners Pollack Racing LLC. He paid \$3.40 to win.

A LITTLE MORE: A carryover of \$5,569 led to a total pool of just over \$22,000 in the 20-cent Pick 6, and after a sequence that saw winner's odds of 9-5,2-1,7-2,4-5,5-1 and 3-1, winning tickets were exchanged for \$2,181.64... Veteran amateur driver David Glasser recorded his first career win racing against non-amateur pilots when he guided Urban Renewal (\$12.20) to the winner's circle in the second race... All-source handle totaled \$2,272,242 on the 14-race card.

Emphasis on Pick 5s is hurting handle

Brett Sturman wrote the normal piece mentioning decline in handle over recent years. What he failed to mention is why this is happening. What he doesn't consider in his article is the long-term impact that Pick 5s are having on handle. Let's take a look at the average bettor at a racetrack. He goes to the track with \$50 in his pocket. He wins a few and loses a few during the day. By the end of the day, he has wagered around \$100. He either wins or loses \$20. This bettor will definitely bet almost every week. Now we come to the last 10 years. All we hear about is the quest to make a killing on the Pick 5 at any track. Forget about placing a \$10 wager on a horse to win. 'Bet \$48 on the early Pick 5,' the announcers say. Too many people have lost their wad after the first five races. Can the average guy sustain such a loss? Or does he get disgusted and never return. Does a few people hitting a Pick 5 lead to a higher handle in the long run? I think not. Churn only happens when a good number of bettors are cashing tickets.


