The fat cigar of course was icing on the cake. I feared that the cigar might catch either or both he and Heather on fire. Thankfully, shortly after the interview began, its flame expired.

I thought to myself, I haven't spoken with Sylvester for quite some time. It's time to remedy that situation.

It's been awhile since we have spoken. You look great. Far better than most near 86-year-olds or those who have been fighting cancer should look.

“I feel pretty good as well. I weigh in at about 190, the lowest of my adult life. I feel good. My energy level is strong. I ride behind my horses most days. If the weather isn't good, I leave it to the younger guys. I've always been adverse to the cold and bad weather in general. So, if the weather isn't to my liking, I sit in my chair and watch them go or hear about how they were from the guys who are doing the heavy lifting.”

The last time we spoke in person, you were still living in Boca Raton and training at Sunshine Meadows. Quite a bit has changed since then.

“Yes. As you know, my wife Sharon was suffering from dementia. It was getting worse, to the point where she could not be left alone. It became necessary to move to Northern Florida where my two daughters live, so that they could help in looking after Sharon when I had to be at work.

“We moved and I returned to training at Spring Garden Ranch [SGR] where I had previously had my stable. There were both pluses and minuses involved with the move. The track at SGR is better than that at Sunshine Meadows, so that was a plus for the horses. The lifestyle, restaurants and such, were better, and more varied in Boca Raton than in sedate Deland. I did love living in Boca Raton. The bottom line was that it became necessary to move, so that is what we did. It's hard to stand in the way of life's ongoing events.”

How is life for you these days?

“Considering my age, and the health challenges I've gone through, I suppose it's been pretty darn good. I still get up early and I'm at the stable every day. If the weather is to my liking, I will still sit behind them. If not, I turn the job over to younger and perhaps more able bodies.”

What can you tell us about those health challenges?

“I've had two forms of cancer. The first one was in my throat. I believe I've beaten it. Although with that deadly, insidious disease you never know for sure. As for the second one, colon cancer, we are still fighting it, but I believe we have it on the run. We, because I believe I have a great team of doctors on my side. I still go for regular infusion treatments to treat the colon cancer.

“As for how I feel. I generally feel great. Certainly, as good as, or better than any near 86-year-old should feel.

“Things are certainly different though. The size of my stable is smaller, much smaller than it was in the glory years. Back then, I had a stable numbering 50 or even more. Now, this winter, I trained just five. That number pleases me. I feel that I can handle that many adequately and do justice to the horses and their owners.

“In the past, of course, when the horses went north for the summer, I’d go with them. Now I stay here in Florida and ship them to trainers in the various jurisdictions in which they are eligible to race.”

Would you please tell us about your present-day stable?

“I trained five head this winter, one 3-year-old and four 2-year-olds. Of course, they all are trotters. They are all still going. I suppose that’s a good sign. One New York eligible, one New Jersey, and two in Pennsylvania among the 2-year-olds.

“If I were asked which of the 2-year-olds I liked best, I would point to two fillies I bought from Steve Jones’ Cameo Hills consignment at Lexington last fall.

“The Captain Corey is named Stir The Pot. She brought \$100,000. That price is a little out of my comfort zone. But that is what the market thought she was worth.

“The Chapter Seven, The Money Chapter brought \$60,000, less than the going price for First Day Lexington Chapter Seven fillies. I like to think that I got myself a bargain.

“If any, or all of the four I bought become good enough, I’m still dreaming, they will be bargains at any price.”

Let’s talk about a different topic. You are one of those quoted as not being a fan of embryo transfer yearlings. Do you still feel negatively disposed towards them?

“I suppose I still do, but probably not near as much as I previously was. I think that the human tendency is to like what you’ve been successful with and to not like the opposite. When ET [embryo transfer] yearlings first hit the pipeline, I had a couple which were not any good. So, I decided I didn’t like them. I guess if I had a champion, I likely would love them. My friend Steve Jones says it’s nonsense. It’s all in my head. It may be. But I only buy a very small number each year, so I try to stay away from areas with which I haven’t been successful.”

On another topic. We are seeing a whole lot of success nowadays with pacing blood being infused into trotting pedigrees, mostly being manifested by the very successful stallion Googoo Gaagaa and his great young son Captain Corey and more recently, with last year’s Hambletonian winner Nordic Catcher S. How do you account for that great success?

“I look upon it as being two pronged.

“The first is our breed seems to come up with solutions when faced with problems. The trotting breed was facing a problem

with fertility problems because it was thought of having too much inbreeding. The need for some hybrid vigor was there and the infusion of pacing blood was nature’s solution. If you asked me why this happened? I’d answer that is for wiser minds than mine to answer.

“The second is that pacers have always been faster than trotters. It’s my thought that the modern-day trotter is a far better species on many counts than its predecessors. They are more natural, faster, and a whole lot smarter than they used to be. I believe that the breed was in effect ready for the infusion of speed that pacing blood has added.”

When we last spoke here in HRU you mentioned that your last Hambletonian winner, Chip Chip Hooray, was pensioned at a small farm near Spring Garden Ranch in Florida. Is he still with us?

“Indeed, he is. He is now 27 and still living the good life as befits a horse of his accomplishments.”

The memory of Greg Sugars will forever be tattooed on everyone's heart and Jess Tubbs' forearm

Down Under harness racing was catapulted into shock and disbelief 12 months ago.

One of its brightest stars and most loved and admired figures, Greg Sugars, died suddenly and seemingly without reason.

It's been a confronting year for the sport, but unthinkable hard for Sugars' wife, Jess Tubbs.

To the sport Sugars, who was just 40, was a freakish talent with over 4,000 wins, including 70 at Group 1 level. He was at the height of his powers, and well on the way to Hall of Fame greatness.

But to Tubbs he was her other half, the man she finished all the long, hard, and sometimes relentlessly tough days in the stables with.

The person who made it all worthwhile.

He remains a part of her, albeit just in memory and ink now.

Tubbs recently got a tattoo on the inside of her forearm. That stunned most because she's never been a fan of ink.

"I don't like tattoos, Greg had them, but I said I never would," she said. "It says 'tu me manques' which is French for 'you are missing from me.' Greg would think that's pretty cool, I think."

It was April 26 last year when police arrived at the Myrning property of Tubbs and Sugars, an hour north-west of Melbourne, to break the devastating news that Sugars was dead.

A friend and fellow horseman had found Sugars dead in a hotel room near Sydney while preparing to race their horses at Menangle that night.

How?

Why?

Everyone wanted to know, but there were no immediate answers, just questions, and hurtful and unfounded speculation.

It was several months before Tubbs finally learned Sugars had Long QT syndrome (LQTS) and died in his sleep because the electrical currents stopped driving his heart.

He went to sleep and never woke up.

“It certainly helps to have an answer,” Tubbs said. “It’s a comfort knowing he was asleep when he died and had no idea, but had we known [about LQTS] we could’ve done something about it.

“I’m now working with the Sydney Heart Institute on genetic testing to give Greg’s family some more precise answers, so they know which side of the family needs to get tested and prevent any further tragedies.”

Already, Sugars’ sister, Kylie, has been diagnosed with LQTS as well.

Tubbs said the past year has felt long and drawn out.

“It’s been a real battle to get through,” Tubbs said. “I miss everything about him given we worked together 24/7. I miss him with the horses, his knowledge and knack was unmatched, but when you go inside at night and there’s nobody there is when I miss him most. He was away a lot, but was always coming home.”

The doubters muttered behind Tubbs’ back, and even some directly to her, that the stable would struggle without Sugars.

“It was not unexpected, but hurtful from people you have respect for and that obviously they don’t carry for you,” Tubbs said.

“Greg and I both knew how hard we both worked and I’ve never pretended I ran this on my own, it’s been very much a team and difficult picking up the slack.

“It’s also been nice to continue on some of the success and put a few people back in their place.”

The greatest moment for Tubbs since Sugars’ passing came at last November’s iconic New Zealand Cup Week in Christchurch when star trotting filly Tracy The Jet won the \$500,000 The Ascent slot race.

A year earlier, Tubbs and Sugars had won the Group 1 Dominion Trot together at the same carnival with their greatest horse, trotter Just Believe.

“It was really intimidating to go back without Greg because he was so loved over there,” Tubbs said. “We had so many friends over there and Greg had so much respect from the industry.

“Being able to go and be amongst those friends and great people and then to get the win was so special and it validated going back.

“To be there with some of my best friends in the world and watch her win, the emotions were pretty strong, and to have ‘Herbie’ [James Herbertson] driving her, I felt really proud that day. It was a really, really important day to me.”

Proud is an important word to Tubbs.

“I know how proud Greg would be looking down,” she said. “He knew how hard I worked and I think we’re all a bit surprised how much I’ve been able to achieve in the past

Injustice is another swirling emotion.

“It feels incredibly unfair because we’d sacrificed a huge amount in the time we’d been together,” Tubbs said. “This was our dream and we’d put everything into it. We were finally in a position to start to enjoy life and that was meant to be our plan for the past 12 months.

“It’s a really strange feeling to wake up and the future you’d set yourself up for is gone... I find myself starting again at 38 and it’s lonely. It was a team sport and now it’s not.”

Tubbs, who always took the back seat publicly in their business, has been uncharacteristically open on social media for a reason.

“I want people to know and remember more than just Greg Sugars the driver... his smile, how cheeky he was, the fun-loving person he was,” she said. “He made such an effort to make people feel important and special.

“At the races he sometimes came across with a bit of arrogance, but that wasn’t him at all. He was quite shy and we lived a pretty simple life here on the hill, not being particularly social, but having a lot of fun.”

Now it’s just Tubbs on the hill with 30 horses in work.

“I wake at 5 a.m., have a couple of coffees in bed, anyone without a kettle next to their bed is missing out, and then I’ll head to the stables to get things ready for when the staff arrive at 7 a.m.... then I work until we’re done,” she said.

“I eat cold food; I don’t have time to heat things up. Some days we’ll have races, too, and then there’s grading the track, the accounts, the list goes on.

“I’ve got great staff and they are so important to trust, for support and the banter around the stable is really important.”

But it is Tubbs’ mother, Kate, who has been her rock.

“She’s awesome and looks after me in so many ways,” Jess said. “She also knows what it’s like to lose a partner [Jess’ father Alan died] unexpectedly, too.

“I’ve also got a terrific group of friends around Australia, in New Zealand and even a few in the U.S. as well. I’m very lucky in that regard, they seem to sense the right times to check in.”

For all top horses Jess and Sugars shared, Fighter Command is the one who continues the equine bond between the pair.

The big, raw, goofy and untapped 5-year-old boasts 13 wins and six placings from just 26 starts and started this year with a win and two fantastic seconds.

“We’ve always had a huge opinion of him and he’s got lovely patient owners who have allowed us to look after it,” Jess said. “We had a long-term plan with him and he’s come back really well, it’s very sad Greg’s not here to share this horse with me.

“He’s a huge horse and still really green, so hopefully he’ll take another step up this year and then next year we can have a bit of fun with him.”

Fighter Command is one of the horses who continues to drive Jess.

“Heaps of continuing [training] has been in his [Greg’s] honor,” she said. “This was always Greg’s dream and I gave up a corporate career I was happy in to support him.

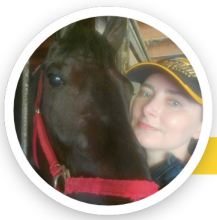
“But I love the horses and now they’re my reason for getting up and through the past 12 months.

“I have absolutely no idea where I’ll be in five years. I didn’t see the past 12 months happening, so I’ve just got to roll with the punches and see how long I can maintain it for.

“Professionally and personally, it’s hard to look too far forward, so I’ll give myself the grace of time.”

Bruno No No No said 'Yes' to early 2026 success

On Saturday (April 11), Bruno No No No paced to the fastest mile of his career and the early 2026 North American racing season. The 4-year-old son of All Bets Off–Winbak Alice was competing in his first open pace at Woodbine Mohawk Park, in his fifth start since joining trainer Dave Menary's stable. The 1:48.1 mile was an eye-catching two-move trip for driver Doug McNair. Bruno No No No worked to clear pacesetter Saulsbrook Victor past the :26.1 opening quarter and then overtook Menary stablemate Brue Hanover late in a stretch duel.

Bruno No No No (p, 4, 1:48.1s; \$160,002) is now the fastest performer sired by All Bets Off; the fastest of his dam's 10 offspring; and the fastest horse foaled and raised at Jesse and Katie Belore's Princeton Farms of Princeton, ON. The 4-year-old stallion was bred by Seelster Farms of Lucan, ON; dam Winbak Alice was sold while carrying the colt and joined the Princeton Farms broodmare band in Nov. 2021. The 21-year-old mare is owned by Connor and Sawyer Belore, the children of Jesse and Katie, for a specific reason.

"When I was a kid, a family friend bought her [Winbak Alice's] granddam, Misty Dallas, for me and my sister as young kids," Jesse said. "Her second foal was Lady Camella, [Winbak] Alice's mom. I already owned another mare from that family. When she was advertised, we bought her for our kids. As soon as I saw the ad, I called Ann [Straatman] at Seelster. What a great way to go full circle."

Winbak Alice was sold by Seelster Farms, which also stands Bruno No No No's sire All Bets Off.

Bruno No No No began his racing career on June 8, 2024 in a qualifier at Mohawk for trainer Gabriella Sasso and driver Bob McClure. Finishing fourth, he qualified again on June 14, ending up third. Bruno No No No made breaks in his first two starts, the Tompkins Geers stake and Ontario Sires Stakes Gold leg 1, both at Mohawk.

The former \$35,000 London Classic yearling started his racing days for owners Jeff Courchesne of Cambridge, ON, Martwest Racing Stable of Mississauga, ON, and Tony Aarts of Putnam,

ON. Courchesne is Sasso's husband; Martwest is an ownership partner which has often owned up to 50 per cent of their racehorses.

"It was Gabby [Sasso] who bought 'Bruno' at the sale," Jesse said. "She was tied to Lady Shadow [p, 5, 1:48.1s; \$2,029,469]."

That daughter of Lady Camella captured divisional titles as 2014 O'Brien 3-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year, 2015 O'Brien Older Pacing Mare of the Year, and 2016 Dan Patch and O'Brien Older Pacing Mare of the Year. Sasso was her caretaker.

Bruno No No No was a surprising bargain as a yearling.

"He was a hunk of a horse," Jesse said. "We loved him, right from day one. He always had this big presence."

Sasso said Courchesne shared his regard for the colt.

"She saw Bruno for what he was at the sale... They came out to the farm two or three times to see him as a yearling," Sasso said.

The reason for Bruno No No No's disappointing pari-mutuel debut appeared to be physical.

"I believe he fractured a bone, a hairline crack at age 2, just after qualifying," Jesse said. "Lots of credit to Dave [Menary], but Gabby and Jeff really took their time with him. After his 2-year-old year he actually came back to us, between his 2- and 3-year-old year [to heal and mature]."

The whole family welcomed back the colt with the distinctive name and personality.

"Connor, our son, loved the Disney movie 'Encanto,'" Jesse told HRU on Saturday (April 25).

The song "We Don't Talk About Bruno" was featured in the popular 2021 film; its chorus includes the phrase "Bruno no no no." Naming Winbak Alice's colt for the song made sense to her young co-owner.

"It was a snapshot in time of what movie [Connor] liked at the time," Jesse said.

Bruno No No No did not qualify again until Oct. 10, 2024, but he returned as an off-the-pace maiden winner on Oct. 24 in the

first leg of the 2024 Harvest Series for Ontario-sired 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings. Two starts later, he and McClure prevailed by a head in the Nov. 7 Harvest Series final.

“We've been following Bruno very closely since he was sold,” Jesse said. “He wasn't dirty, but just really full of himself. Obviously, they've kept him a stud. He's a great big loveable goofball.”

Bruno No No No showed promise, but had not shown signs of reaching his peak until this season.

“I think he had a lot of bad luck at 3, and just couldn't find his footing until the end of the season,” Jesse said. “He's showcasing his talent now. In other hands at 2 and 3, he might not be the horse he is today.”

Bruno started his sophomore season in May 2025, qualifying twice at Mohawk before making his comeback in OSS Gold leg 1 on May 24, finishing sixth. After a May 31 victory in non-stakes company, the colt dropped into OSS Grassroots and went winless until Oct. 16.

“He's quite a looker on the track,” so even in the absence of high-profile stakes wins, Bruno No No No was attracting fans.

One of them was Dave Menary, who trained 2025 O'Brien Older Pacing Horse of the Year, Ervin Hanover. “I know for a fact that Bruno is the only horse that he's ever asked [William] Pollack to buy,” Jesse said.

Bruno No No No changed hands for an undisclosed sum that Jesse called “an offer too good to refuse.” As of Jan. 12, 2026, the stallion began racing for Pollack Racing LLC of Venetia, PA, currently the top owner at Woodbine Mohawk Park by wins and earnings this year.

After being scratched sick on Jan. 10, 2026 at Mohawk, Bruno No No No has put together a stellar season worthy of the star on his forehead. He is four-for-five this season, winning the first leg and April 4 final of the New Holland Pacing Series in the lead-up to his best-yet performance in the April 11 Mohawk

open. This weekend, Bruno is taking a rare Saturday night off. He is sustained to the upcoming Grade 2 Charles Juravinski Memorial, with eliminations at Flamboro Downs on May 10, and the Grade 1 Canadian Pacing Derby, slated for Sept. 5 at Mohawk.

Bruno No No No is the “now” horse that everybody is talking about, but Jesse has learned that every overnight success is actually the product of generations. For him, it's all about family, both human and equine.

“It all started with a Dallas Almahurst mare as the granddam,” he said with a smile. “I've always been partial to the family. Bruno's granddam was the first horse I ever owned.”

Borups Victory back in the winner's circle

Daniel Wäjersten's **Borups Victory** (Googoo Gaagaa) was one of the more intriguing contenders heading into the Prix d'Amérique at Vincennes this past winter. However, in the final weeks leading up to the race it became clear that something wasn't quite right, and he never made it to the big stage in Paris.

After three appearances at Vincennes, Borups Victory returned to Sweden, and on Saturday (April 25) it was time for his seasonal debut – fittingly in a race that holds special significance for both horse and trainer.

The \$120,000 Seinäjoki Race over 2,100 meters had been won by Borups Victory two years in a row prior to this edition, but a second-row draw and a race-fit Finnish Elitloppet contender in Massimo Hoist stood in the way of a third straight victory.

Settled fourth-over, Wäjersten followed cover three-wide down the backstretch as Dancer Brodde folded from the lead with 600 meters to go. At that point, stablemate Kuiper took over in front, with Massimo Hoist looming in pursuit.

Massimo Hoist flattened out early in the stretch, and then it played out the way it so often does in the Seinäjoki. Borups Victory fanned five-wide off the final turn and unleashed a superior late kick, drawing clear to score his third consecutive win in the race – this time in a 1:57.1 mile rate over a slushy track. Combat Fighter and Need'em completed the trifecta.

PARALYMPIATRAVET PICTURE TAKING SHAPE

Borups Victory is also the defending champion of the \$300,000 Paralympiatravet at Åby on May 9, and being already qualified allowed Wäjersten to prep in Finland rather than go through the Swedish eliminations.

The third qualifier for the Paralympiatravet took place in Örebro on Saturday, and it went to a proven big-race performer who clearly belongs at this level. The pre-race talk centered around Get A Wish, making his debut for Robert Bergh after leaving Åke Svanstedt, along with Bicc's Tobee and **Kentucky River** (Father Patrick).

When the first two made early breaks, the path was cleared for Kentucky River, trained by Daniel Redén. He didn't even need to be fully extended, winning with plenty left in the tank in a 1:55.2 mile rate over 2,140 meters. Behind him, both Get A Wish and Bicc's Tobee rebounded with strong efforts to finish second and third.

Inside the yellow barn

Once upon a time, a fledgling teacher/coach, working in one of the largest school districts in the county, was involved in the decision to start an intramural football program for sixth graders. The response was overwhelming. More than 100 boys signed up, some dreaming of touchdowns, others just hoping to impress a girl or two. The structure of that program has stayed with me.

We divided the group into equal teams. I don't remember if there were four or six teams, but for our purposes, let's call it six. We asked the physical education teachers to identify the

top dozen athletes on the list. Those 12 promising all-stars were carefully distributed, two to each team, so no one roster started with an advantage.

The rest of the names went into a hat. That was it. No recruiting. No politics. No parents lobbying for better placement. Just a fair shake.

Each coach received a roster of about 20 players, a small mountain of well-worn football uniforms, a patch of grass to practice on, and a schedule with games on Thursdays at 4 o'clock. We practiced, we played, and we made sure everyone got a chance to participate in the game. Something interesting happened. The pressure never arrived.

The games mattered, but not too much. The coaches cared, but not too much. The kids competed, but they also laughed, learned, socialized, and improved. Some players went on to bigger things. Some coaches climbed the ladder. But let me report, none of us ever enjoyed coaching quite like we did on those fall afternoons.

Once you moved up, the noise came with you. Scholarships. Playing time. Transfers. Looking for an edge. Boosters. Parents. Money. Winning stops being part of the experience and starts becoming the point.

What does a group of 12- and 13-year-old students on dusty old football fields have to do with 1,200-pound racehorses and gambling?

I'm not sure, but that intramural experience came back to me when I began thinking and writing about redirecting some portion of our sport to building something different, private, contained, balanced, and intentional.

If you are new to these scribbles, imagine this - pools of similarly talented horses. There are no super barns. No stacking the deck. No endless veterinarian work to grab an edge or keep a horse on the track. Horses in the pools are leased and randomly assigned to 10-horse barns, each barn a different color. Inside each barn is a trainer, a driver, and a groom. The inputs are controlled – the same veterinarians, blacksmiths, feed, and environment. The horses never leave the campus.

Now pause and look at it from other angles.

From the trainer's perspective: no arms race, no chasing million-dollar owners or horses, no nonstop shipping of horses. Horse training becomes more of a daily job, doing what you love. From the owner's perspective: defined costs and defined opportunity, and an opportunity to spend more time with your horse. From the sport's perspective: a fresh, wholesome vibe. There is no crushing burden on anyone to win or go broke.

Veterans of racing horses will find a gentler environment, and recruits to the sport can ease into the game. You can follow a barn, a horse, a friend's horse, and talk to the participants. In a world like this, the pressure doesn't disappear completely; it resets.

In that intramural football league so many years ago, the best athletes still stood out. The competitive fire still burned. If we find a business model that can transfer these principles to harness racing, we could create an environment that allows people to stay in the game. Participants could discover that improvement, competition, and fairness are fun. Not to mention the most profound change of all, our magnificent horses, the hub of the wheel, our greatest asset, will be much more accessible to the public.

Maybe a better model for our future is owning a young racehorse in that yellow barn of your imagination. And if you're wondering whether grown men and women would embrace something that simple, we will never know unless someone tries and opens the barn door.

I tried to put the pieces together and be far ahead of anyone else who might report a foreign company's plans to bring pari-mutuel racing to the Volunteer State. My hopes were high for a crescendo of inside information to present the facts and figures I needed to write an award-winning story; the plan that would end one state's famine of pari-mutuel horse racing.

But my sources began to disappear. I called Conrad at the Tennessee State Racing Commission's office for an update on the Memphis mechanical-horse project.

"Nothing new, my friend," he said.

"Is the track still under construction?"

"No word on that. No word on anything."

"What about the British bookmaking company?"

"That comes under the no-word-on-anything column."

I paused. The scrambling of shuffling jobs and genres over the past month rattled my brain and I said, "Then what are you doing? What does a race commissioner do with no racing industry in the state the commissioner rules over?"

"Right now, I'm just about to get some lunch."

"Then what?"

"Then I expect I may be looking for another job."

Next, I phoned my secret source Ernie. He said, "You know how much detectives get an hour to hound legislators and multi-millionaires and probables involved in controversial projects they do not want to be quoted about?"

"I get it, Ernie. Sorry to bother you. Do not go out of your way. Just promise if you hear anything..."

"Right."

Meanwhile, back at Nashville's country-western ranch there were sour notes playing for everyone involved with the Nashville Network's radio campaign. The object to reach a wider audience was in peril. The country music side of the business always came first for the family business running its media arm so it needed to be getting immediate attention. The problem? The Jack-inspired Nashville Radio Network was not pulling the numbers expected. And as with any entertainment media project the engine to keep it afloat was money. Success is measured by profits. It was nothing different with media coming from Tennessee than it was in the Hollywood business world.

There were rumors around the studios and in the corporate offices at The Opry Hotel and there was no particular buzz around the broadcast studios; a bad sign.

One thing was apparent. It was a bad time to implore the Nashville Network to enter the gaming world; no less to join forces with a foreign entity's visions of capitalizing on an area challenging the high morals of the state's history.

"What does any of this mean for us?" Natasha said.

I told her as many details as I knew. And there we sat going through the motions of being Tennessean citizens. We had a one-family rented home (with a quaint old-fashioned screened porch) and a decent car and state drivers' licenses and two dogs and southern-hand-crafted furniture and Natasha's healthy garden and some possible plans for a future together (including marriage and children). But not one of our positive advances to settle in the state made us feel like we belonged in the deep South.

My fate as a southerner and the lynchpin broadcast producer/writer for TNNR's Wolfman Jack's popular-music crossover program was already written when my Tennessee manager Joe Slevin dropped by the house on a typical southern-scorcher of a day.

"Afraid this is not a social visit," Joe said.

I knew it. The "button man" arrived to do the dirty deed. I smiled and sighed before he said a word.

"You want to share some Kentucky Bourbon with me?" I said.

In the Italian lingo of metropolitan New York Joe was what was known as "a good egg." Meant well and worked hard at what he did. And he was as loyal a manager as anyone in the entertainment world could want to stand up for a client. Good timing, too. Natasha was enjoying digging up dirt in her garden without the slightest notion I was about to be "clipped" of my TNNR life. He did not say a word for the next 30 seconds.

"Maybe you ought to have that drink," he said.

I poured a shot and poured it down my throat. "Shoot," I said.

"TNNR is dropping the whole Wolfman project."

I nodded. He told me the only good news; that he worked out a financial settlement that awarded me payment for a month or so after the lights went out. A good egg, indeed.

"Listen," he said. "I've a tip on a racetrack project. Looking for a seasoned publicity director with extra duties."

"Where?"

"Mississippi."

I missed racing but I would never miss the South. It was time to move on.

MGM Ursula McIntyre Series prelims are in the books

Coastal Babe N and driver Yannick Gingras went wire-to-wire in 1:52.2 in the first of three \$50,000 divisions in the fifth and final leg of the MGM Ursula McIntyre Series at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (April 24), assuring the \$200,000 added final on May 8 will be a matchup of two impressive New Zealand imports.

Coastal Babe N out-sprinted four rivals to the front on the first turn and never looked back, cutting rated fractions of 28 seconds and :56.2 for the first half-mile. Two-leg winner Tarapasta, with Matt Kakaley, advanced quickly on the backstretch to take up the chase and was able to move into the pocket past the

1:24.4 three-quarters as Rocket Deo could not keep with the pace-setter.

A final quarter sprint of :27.3 with just mild urging by Gingras assured a safe victory for Coastal Babe N, her third in just four series legs she was entered in. Tarapasta finished second, with Seaside Diva third and Aardie B Miki N, last year's champion, fourth.

Trained by Jared Bako and owned by Kap Singh Racing Stables, Stanley Klunowski, Earl Hill, Jr., and Archie MacRae, Coastal Babe N was a winner for the fifth time in seven starts in 2026. As the 4-5 public choice, Coastal Babe N returned \$3.90 to win and keyed a \$10.18 exacta and a \$49.44 trifecta.

Louies Girl N made it four wins in five legs of the McIntyre Series and completed the Kiwi-led final match-up with a brilliant first-over power move that catapulted her to a 1:51.4 victory, equaling her career-best effort. Louies Girl N, guided by Jason Bartlett, out-sprinted pace-setter Millwood Bliss N while pacing a :26.4 final quarter in the process.

Louies Girl N left strongly from the pole but yielded to Walkin On Sunshine and Scott Zeron late on the first turn. Millwood Bliss N, a two-leg winner with Dexter Dunn, was quick to dispute the top and took over at the :27.5 first quarter marker. Millwood Bliss N cut a rated :56.3 half and was on her way to a 1:25 three-quarters when Bartlett pulled the 1-20 favored Louies Girl N and quickly challenged for supremacy.

The two mares were eye-to-eye through the final turn, but Louies Girl N disposed of the leader and cruised to victory. Walkin On Sunshine rallied for the second spot over Millwood Bliss N, with Turn The Page N fourth across the wire.

Trained by Per Engblom, who is hoping to go back-to-back in this series following Aardie B Miki N's standout effort in the 2025 edition of the race then known as the Blue Chip Matchmaker, Louies Girl N is owned by Peaceful Acres Farm. As the prohibitive favorite, Louies Girl N returned \$2.10 to win and keyed a \$2.90 exacta and a \$8.76 trifecta.

Tick A Loch A and Jordan Stratton surprised in the final \$50,000 division, and in doing so the Australian-bred locked up a spot in the final. Tick A Loch A came overland off a quick pace and collared pace-setter Bath Bomb in the final strides in a 1:52 clocking.

Silk Cloud A, the 3-5 choice with Lauren Tritton, left alertly for the lead with Bath Bomb and Andrew McCarthy to her outer flank. Silk Cloud A took over off the first turn and parked Bath Bomb to the sizzling opening fraction of :26.4. McCarthy tried to rate Bath Bomb as best he could, but the daughter of Lather Up set hot fractions of :54.4 and 1:23.2 on her own.

Stratton had Tick A Loch A on the move off the third turn, and she advanced slowly through the third quarter and then got close to Bath Bomb on the final turn. Dougs Babe A and Dexter Dunn slipped out behind the winner and tried to rally, but Tick A Loch A was determined and drove by Bath Bomb for the victory. Dougs Babe A settled for third with Silk Cloud A fourth.

Tick A Loch A had bookend victories in the series, winning in round one and now the final for trainer Chris Height and owner Michael Casalino, Jr. As a 7-1 offering Tick A Loch A returned \$16.56 to win, leading an exacta worth \$63.18 and trifecta payout of \$356. A 6-year-old by Always B Miki, Tick A Loch A has four wins in 10 starts in 2026.

With the MGM Ursula McIntyre Pacing Series prelims now complete, the mares that have unofficially advanced to the May 8 final are:

MGM Yonkers Raceway is now operating on a Monday/Tuesday and Thursday through Saturday live racing schedule with post time at 6:45 p.m. (EDT) except on Saturdays when it is 3:30 p.m. (EDT).

John 'Sonny' Patterson, 81, dies

John F. "Sonny" Patterson, Jr., 81, whose success in the sulky included winning two Breeders Crowns and the Hambletonian Oaks with filly trotter Lookout Victory in the mid-1990s, passed away April 16, 2026, in Dalton, GA.

The son of Hall of Fame trainer/driver John Patterson, Sr., Patterson, Jr. was class president in high school and graduated from McKenzie Business School in Chattanooga, TN, but always was involved with the horses while in school. After completing his education, he turned to the sport on a full-time basis.

Patterson, Jr. drove in his first races in 1963, at the Darke County Fair, in Greenville, OH. His competition included his father, driving 3-year-old pacer Overtrick, who won that day while setting the track record of 2:01 in the process. Overtrick's victories later that season included the Little Brown Jug as he went on to capture divisional honors for the second consecutive year.

In 1964, Patterson, Jr. got his first win, with Black Heath at Du Quoin, IL, and two years later found himself driving in the Messenger Stakes behind Overcall – a race remembered for Romeo Hanover completing a sweep of the Pacing Triple Crown at Roosevelt Raceway.

In the ensuing years, Patterson, Jr. drove regularly at Monticello, Yonkers, and Roosevelt and in the 1980s had five seasons in which he ranked among the sport's top 15 drivers in purses, including three times in the Top 10. Among his biggest wins during the '80s were the 1985 Peter Haughton Memorial Pace with Sherman Almahurst and the 1987 American Trotting Championship with Whip It Wood, both at Roosevelt. He ended the decade with \$22.3 million in career purses, which at the time ranked 20th in history.

The 1990s saw Patterson, Jr.'s greatest success on the Grand Circuit.

In addition to winning the 1995 Hambletonian Oaks and Breeders Crowns in 1994 and 1995 with Lookout Victory, Patterson, Jr. guided 2-year-old trotter Giant Chill to wins in the Breeders Crown and Peter Haughton Memorial in 1992, captured the Yonkers International Trot and Nat Ray with Giant Force in 1993, won the Kentucky Filly Futurity with Delphi's Daughter in 1994, and won the 1991 Canadian Trotting Classic with Giant Victory.

Patterson, Jr. also won Hambletonian heats in 1991 and 1992, with MB Felty and King Conch, respectively, and finished second in both finals.

Interestingly, Patterson, Jr. drove an average of fewer than 208 races per year during that span from 1991-95.

Patterson, Jr.'s final drive came in 2005. He completed his career with 2,989 wins and \$32.8 million in purses.

Oliveira, Tetrick ready for another round at Yonkers

There are two horses who won two prelims: Dilly Hanover from post 1 (Braxten Boyd, Emily Bost) and Captain Vodka from post 7 (Ridge Warren, Robert Baggitt, Jr.), the latter's coming in the last two prelims.

Both gaits of fillies are racing Tuesday, and only trotter Concise (Tim Tetrick, Nik Drennan) has successes in all three prelims (paralleling her fellow trotter, the male Confident Volo); she has post 3 on Tuesday. Aviatrix Hanover (Jason Bartlett, Jared Bako) and Allioop Hanover (Andrew McCarthy, Noel Daley) had two prelim wins, the former the last two weeks and the latter in the first two weeks before taking last week off; they begin from posts 5 and 6, respectively.

Among the pacing fillies, Miss Jum Jabber looked to be the horse to beat after nicely winning her only two prelims, but she did not enter her Weiss race. Her absence leaves a wide-open contest among the distaff sidwheeling set; there were no other double prelim winners, but six of the eight starters did record one preliminary win, and racing fortune is sure to have a hand in the outcome for this competitive group.

Geronimo! Boyd's four wins include feature at Big M

Braxten Boyd had it going on Friday night (April 24) at The Meadowlands, as the 26-year-old driver guided the winners of the ninth, 10th, 11th and 12th races on the program, which included **Geronimo Trio IT**, who took the featured conditioned trot in a lifetime-best 1:53.3.

"Geronimo" worked out a good trip close to the action to score by 1½ lengths over Call Option. Calderone was third.

Boyd had the eventual winner sitting a 3-hole trip to the top of the stretch after 2-1 second choice Call Option had led at the half in :56.2 and three-quarters in 1:25.3. The pocket-sitting Mr Contestant, who used early speed to lead at the quarter in :28, bore out through the stretch drive, giving Geronimo Trio IT more than enough space to close along the inside and sprint past the leader nearing the wire. In the process, the 4-year-old gelded son of Manofmanymissions—Zante Trio lowered his previous lifetime-fastest effort by one-and-three-fifth seconds.

"I've been putting him on the lead quite often, so once I landed

where I did, I didn't mind following the horses I was following," said Boyd, whose 34 wins on the season are good for fifth in The Big M standings. "I just needed to find a little room. He steered incredibly well today. Once he got through that last turn, he exploded. My goodness, was he very good tonight.

"As handy of a horse as he is and the way he raced tonight, he keeps getting better every night, so why not [improve enough to beat better foes]. A win like that with the plugs in? He was very impressive tonight, so I would only assume that he'll keep getting better."

Trained by Per Engblom and owned by Tar Heel Racing, Geronimo Trio IT returned \$5.40 as the 8-5 favorite in the field of nine. He's now won seven of 23 lifetime starts.

Cheers to Gabe Prewitt for doing something

I read the [story in Harness Racing Update](#) “Prewitt clears the air in Hoosier Park mandatory drivers meeting,” and Jeff Gural and I tip our hats to Gabe Prewitt and the Hoosier Park racing team. Gabe has done an outstanding job at Hoosier Park since he got there last year and continues to impress.

The holes or “courtesy tucks” situation in our sport has continued to get worse at many tracks. This past fall and winter at The Meadowlands, we had 144 drivers apply to race. Eleven were issued warnings for the infraction, while repeat offenders paid \$250 to a charity of their choice.

We are a spectator sport with real money being bet and perception is everything, in my opinion. The most frustrating part about courtesy tucks in the first turn is that there are rules on the books that regulators don’t enforce. It doesn’t stop there, though, as not all, but some post parades are terrible (horses out of order, feet out of the stirrups) and talking on the track has increased tenfold over the last decade. No one will enforce the rules so the rules are left neglected at most tracks. It’s all just a bad look! Optics, optics, optics!

We have tried to politely ask our drivers to straighten the post parades out, put their feet in the stirrups past the grandstand while in front of the viewing public, and to stop talking on the track, close the holes, no half-in, half-out racing, no move-overs at the top of the stretch, no kicking, and follow the whipping rule. It works for a while, but eventually, things revert back into the same old habits and we as track operators (the ones that care) are left to self-police once again and the horsemen get pissed off. I understand. I get it. If the judges aren’t enforcing the rules, why should we have to do anything different?

I’m not picking on horsemen and women, but let’s look how far downhill we have gone, for not just these reasons, but a plethora of others as well, brought on by everyone inside the sport (including track operators), that just continue to snowball.

As many of you are well aware, I love horse racing, particularly harness racing, and I’m not mad at anyone, I’m just frustrated that all we ever do in this sport is point fingers at each other and nothing really gets done.

When a guy like Gabe, who also loves the game, comes along, we should all give our support to him in his initiatives. I have seen the comments on social media: “How many horses has he driven?” or “Doesn’t even know how to put a bridle on and telling drivers what to do.” It goes on and on. Many of our drivers, particularly in the winter, are good about these issues and all it

takes is a quick reminder. I applaud Gabe in his efforts and I hope his horsemen and women are receptive, as this is important to the perception of the sport and the gambling public. Thanks for listening and close the holes!
