Karl was stellar in Big M qualifiers

An early favorite for the Hambletonian, the trotter breezed to an impressive victory among a group of other stars that qualified Saturday.

Saturday morning's (April 27) 18-race qualifying card on the final Saturday in April from The Meadowlands could have easily passed as a late-season Breeders Crown card. Led by 2-year-old champion **Karl**, there were a host of other divisional and Grand Circuit-winning horses making their first appearance on the track since last year.

Here were some performances of interest by division:

3-YEAR-OLD COLT TROTTERS

In what doesn't bode well for the competition in the division for the coming months, the sky truly looks like the limit this year for Karl following his triumphant return qualifier. Worked to the lead early from the outside post 7 for Gingras, he turned it on with a third-quarter in :27.3 to open up at will on the field and then followed that with a :26.3 final quarter, good enough to win by a ton in a time of 1:52.1, all accomplished with seemingly next to zero effort. With respect to others including T C I who hasn't yet qualified back, it seems unlikely to envision anyone being able to catch up and challenge Karl for the Hambletonian.

Elsewhere in the division, **Wild Ticket** returned a winner to kick off the morning's qualifiers in a time of 1:54.4, including a final quarter in :26.4. That winning time established a new

lifetime mark for him, besting his time of 1:55.1 taken last year in a New York Sires Stakes win at Tioga. In the race, he led mostly throughout while cutting reasonable fractions as was the case for most races and kept together well while winning by about a measured length. In that same race, \$325,000 Lexington Selected buy Mars Hill closed fastest of all in :26.2. A Bluegrass winner last year in 1:54.2 and near \$200,000 earner, he tipped off the cones from third in the stretch and closed steadily when given his cue.

In one of the qualifiers grouped by newcomers, **Memorial Fashion** took to trotting hopples for the first time, put it all together and came out with an impressive 1:54.2. The wellbred Walner—Broadway Schooner gelding couldn't stay flat last year but that was a nice-looking mile and there could be some potential here. In that same race, a colt by the name of Bella's Musclehill trained by Nifty Norman made her racetrack debut and kicked home fastest of anyone in :27.2.


3-YEAR-OLD FILLY TROTTERS

Racing far back throughout much of her return qualifier, last year's KYSS Final champion Date Night Hanover finished off her mile with a :26.1 final quarter, easily the fastest final split of any others in her race. Dunn didn't move her off the inside until right by three-quarters, but once he did, she found a couple different seams and was visually impressive. That race was won by **Volcanic Blue Chip**, but most of the action came from Glamourous Hanover who looked to be opening up by daylight at the top of the stretch before she broke. She did gather herself back together and was somehow able to re-rally to the outside of Date Night Hanover; last year's near-90-1 upset winner in the Kindergarten final could be a player this year.

She Shaq closed out her season last year with a couple of smaller stakes wins in the Liberty Bell and Simpson in Pennsylvania, and won her return qualifier by three-quarters of a length coming off a perfect pocket trip. Even better perhaps from that race was The Moment, a 1:55.4 winner last year at 2, who was third for most of that mile but made a late move and was getting to She Shaq to her inside.


3-YEAR-OLD COLT PACERS

In the premier qualifier of the morning for the pacing glamour boy division, a couple of the best ones from last year didn't disappoint. The defending upset Breeders Crown champion **Gem Quality** intently tracked every move by 2-hole sitting Mirage Hanover as those two threw down late in deep stretch and nearly dead-heated, with Gem Quality getting the decision. The winning time of 1:52.1 included a final quarter sprint time of :25.1. It was the second qualifier for Mirage Hanover who qualified last week and made a name for himself early in the 2-year-old season last year in Canada; he did well for himself once again. Booming Economy had things his own way for most of the race but was a tad short when push came to shove with the top pair.

Harness Racing Update

Sir John B who won last year's Kentucky Commonwealth final in a time of 1:51.4 at The Red Mile faced a host of pursuers throughout the stretch in his qualifier but was able to outlast them all and won in a time of 1:53.2. Hungry To Win who at times showed potential last year at 2 despite having never hit the board in five races, closed well while racing widest in the stretch posting the fastest final quarter in :26 flat. In a separate qualifier, **Rock The Captain N** and Total Stranger slugged it out through the stretch and came home with identical :25.4 final quarters off slow fractional times; both look decent.

3-YEAR-OLD FILLY PACERS

In another superb morning performance from the connections of Takter and Gingras, **Caviart Belle** stamped herself early to once again vie for top spot in her division. She closed out last year with a win in the Three Diamonds and garnered attention for divisional honors that eventually went to Geocentric, but following that powerful qualifier she'll be in position to even better her sub-1:50 mark from last year. In her qualifier, Gingras waited patiently before moving three-wide from third around the final turn as the pocket sitter also pulled, and she sprinted home powerfully with a remarkable final quarter of :25.2 to win under wraps. A 1:51.4 winner from last year, Pressure Cooker, set the pace in that race and tried to fight on through the stretch but was eventually no match for the winner. Rocket Deo rallied belatedly to just miss for second; encouraging effort.



Making her second qualifying start, **Flawless** looked just that en route to brushing to the lead and going all the way from there, winning in 1:51.3 with a last quarter of :26.1, her second straight good-looking outing. Direction kept up well enough in that race to chase after the winner and finish second. One of the sports best freshmen fillies from last year, Pass Line didn't gain but didn't lose any ground either through the stretch to the winner; honestly thought her qualifier from two weeks ago may have been a touch better.

OLDER PACERS

Following up on last week's 1:52.1 qualifying win, **It's My Show** won again, this time in a time of 1:49.3 as predictably the morning's fastest qualifier and he looks primed to follow up from last year's million-dollar 3-year-old campaign. In the race, he pounced from the pocket against a fired up Save America who did pretty well for himself as the only other 4-year-old in that older qualifier. Last year's divisional and Breeders Crown champion Bythemissal was third on his return to the track. He never threatened the top two but at the same time it didn't seem like driver Gingras was particularly concerned about doing so.

If and when will Desperate Man return to Mohawk?

The 2021 Canadian Horse of the Year and Pepsi North America Cup champ is loving life and racing in the United States.

It's somewhat ironic that Desperate Man (p, 3, 1:49.3s; \$1,144,279) took his lifetime mark at the track that's proven most elusive over his four-year racing career. It's the track that defined his early career and 2021 Canadian Horse of the Year season — from his first, winning qualifier to victory in the 2021 Pepsi North America Cup. It's also the track where he has struggled to reclaim his crown as a 4- and 5-year-old pacer.

Desperate Man's only 2023 win at Woodbine Mohawk Park came in a June 13 qualifier. So, his owner, Kathy Cecchin, sought out other opportunities for him.

The 2024 MGM Borgata Series at Yonkers Raceway vindicated Cecchin's decision, despite a stunning upset in Monday's (April 22) \$457,000 final. Desperate Man and driver Matt Kakaley went undefeated in four preliminary legs, only to end up parked firstover against Linedrive Hanover through furious fractions (:26.4, :53.1, 1:21.1). While Linedrive Hanover, driven by Scott Zeron, faded badly in the stretch, Desperate Man fought on. He finished third to winner Hellabalou in the 1:50.2 mile.

Kathy and husband John Cecchin watched Desperate Man's race from their home in Arthur, ON.

"I think we were all emotional," she told HRU Friday (April 26). "We were so worried about him, but absolutely proud. He had every reason to stop, but he did his best. He was a warrior. We were happy with how Matt [Kakaley] approached the race. That's racing. Sometimes things just don't work out."

Kathy trained Desperate Man during his Canadian career, and sent him to U.S. trainer Travis Alexander last September to begin his American campaign. The Shadow Play–Dreamlands Latte gelding won his Yonkers debut Oct. 5, 2023, and worked his way up to the open handicap pace, assembling a strong record of five wins, one loss by a nose (to Covered Bridge), and one show finish (when he bled) in seven starts at the New York half-mile oval.

After the grueling Borgata final, Desperate Man was scheduled for a week of rest and turnout, possibly followed by a week of

training back, depending on his readiness.

"If he needs more time, that's what he gets," said Kathy. "He's at Mark Ford's training center. He had a whole month off when Yonkers shut down before Christmas. He went to Florida for his break. He got the full-body clip and he loved the shedrows. He's such a gawker; he enjoys looking around at everything."

Because the 2021 Somebeachsomewhere O'Brien Horse of the Year had previously lived and trained with the Cecchins at their Arthur, ON farm, wintering in Florida was a new experience for him.

"He got to [regularly] train with other horses for the first time," said Kathy. "He never really had a horse who could go with him. He was training in these big sets, out with six other horses... They were sending videos of Travis, flat in the jogger. We were killing ourselves laughing. [Desperate Man] thought, 'It's go time!' He thought it was a race."

The gelding nicknamed "Slick" (because at nearly 17 hands high, with a 63.5-inch hopple, he is anything but streamlined and slick) was better off enjoying downtime in the Sunshine State than back in Arthur, ON.

"Last year at Christmas, we had a five-day storm with no hydro," said Kathy. "We would have to ship him down to Mohawk to train him back... So, it didn't make logical sense to bring him home."

She said she thinks the change of scenery also helped Desperate Man improve as a racehorse.

Kathy said: "[Caretaker] Alaina [Alexander] told me, 'You said he had all this personality, but we didn't see it for the first three months... He was quiet. Then he went to Florida, and he came out of his shell. He was a wild man. Maybe he needed to see some bigger things in life. He'd been in the same stall his whole life, so maybe he was just bored."

The rest of the 2024 season has yet to be mapped out for Desperate Man.

Half-mile tracks are naturally under consideration.

"He loves Yonkers," said Kathy. "He loved Grand River."

Desperate Man set the Elora, ON half-mile track's overall record of 1:50.1 on Aug. 28, 2023, for driver Garrett Rooney.

"Which made us so happy, because we adore Garrett," Kathy said.

Big horse, big track is a stereotype thoroughly dispelled by Desperate Man.

"You'd think that, physically, he wouldn't like a half, but Matt [Kakaley] has said in an interview that he's flawlessly gaited so he can handle the turns and doesn't interfere with himself," said the gelding's Canadian trainer.

What about a return to Mohawk, where Desperate Man recorded three Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold victories for Trevor Henry in 2020, then followed up with the North America Cup final and the OSS Gold Super Final for 3-year-old male pacers a year later?

Kathy said that as an older pacer, Desperate Man struggled to find the late speed of his earlier campaigns, and the stretch at Mohawk was where it hurt him the most.

"For us, it's a rock and a hard place. He was absolutely no good at Mohawk," she said. "He was not happy. We had scoped him multiple times and it never showed he was bleeding, but he just didn't have the kick that he used to have."

As a 4-year-old, Desperate Man outperformed expectations in the 2022 Charles Juravinski Memorial at Flamboro Downs, winning his May 15 elimination in 1:50.2 and finishing second to Linedrive Hanover in the June 18 final, both races at doubledigit odds. Linedrive Hanover's 1:49 win in the final remains the fastest-ever mile on a Canadian half-mile track. Desperate Man was individually timed in 1:49.1.

"But then we had to scratch when [Desperate Man] was invited to the Mohawk Gold Cup, because he came up very, very ill after the Juravinski," said Kathy. "He was off for months."

With Desperate Man now a "rock star" in New York, Kathy said it was unlikely that Travis would opt to race him at Mohawk.

"He's going to stay with Travis and Alaina for the foreseeable future," said Kathy. "We're hoping he will receive some invites. I'm not backseat driving; what Travis says is best for him is what will happen. He's not eligible for anything right now. I doubt there would be invites for him at Mohawk [this year], so I don't know if that's something we would have to consider... It's out of your hands."

Kathy added that she would like Desperate Man to be invited to the Battle of Lake Erie at Northfield Park on June 8, because it's a race that her husband has always wanted to win. The Gold Cup and Saucer, with Aug. 10 and 12 eliminations culminating in the Aug. 17 final, would be Kathy's own "bucket list" race for Desperate Man.

The 2021 Pepsi North America Cup will always be a race to remember for the Cecchins. It was an exhausting night for them, recalled Kathy.

"We weren't going to leave [Desperate Man] in the paddock," she said. "I stayed in retention with him. He'd never been alone in his whole life."

After the win, Slick was a local hero.

"People brought flowers," said Kathy. "You wouldn't believe what it was like. All these people came from Arthur, the people who our son used to play hockey and lacrosse with. They brought carrots and apples for Slick. It's so crazy and overwhelming."

While disappointing, Desperate Man's show finish in the Borgata was also evidence of his grit.

"We weren't upset about how Scotty [Zeron] drove [Linedrive Hanover] or Matt [Kakaley] drove [Desperate Man]," said Kathy. "We were just sad for the horse. He tried his heart out. Everybody did what they thought they should do."

With the 2024 North America Cup around the corner, thoughts naturally turn to whether Desperate Man might make an appearance at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Kathy said that his upcoming season will be based on invitationals, and everything is on the table, provided it's what's best for the horse. And a return to his Ontario home will happen, eventually.

"I packed a bag for him when he went away," she told HRU. "I told John, 'I just want him to have his own stuff.' It was hard to send him away. He's a character. We miss him. You would love him if he was a \$7,000 claimer."

Swingforthefences returns to winner's circle after struggles with lameness

A familiar name in Indiana harness racing has resurfaced this year at Harrah's Hoosier Park. After an extended time away, former Indiana Trotter of the Year Swingforthefences is back in action and back in the winner's circle. The 6-year-old son of Swan For All-Sunday Yankee finished on the board in each of his first three starts for co-owners Jeff Cullipher and Tom Pollack.

"I'm very happy, and he seems happy," said Cullipher, who trains the gelding. "Things are going great right now. A horse like that, you don't make any big plans. You just go week to week if you will, and hope for the best."

The partners purchased Swingforthefences in late 2021 at public auction. That season the trotter missed the board only once in 20 outings for trainer Melanie Wrenn, collecting 12 wins and just over \$550,000. Some of his biggest scores came in the Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final, Carl Erskine Memorial and Matron Stakes. He was recognized as divisional champion in the Hoosier State and the top trotter. Cullipher and Pollack hoped that he would transition into the open ranks and contend, but the gelding has battled lameness issues over the last two seasons.

The 4-year-old campaign started well enough. After finishing first and second in consecutive weeks at Hoosier Park, Cullipher shipped him east to compete at The Meadowlands, Yonkers and Harrah's Philadelphia. He consistently earned checks, raking in \$50,000 over 14 starts, but his season was over before August.

Swingforthefences wouldn't turn up in entries until a qualifying attempt in April 2023 at Hoosier Park, where he led in gateto-wire fashion, winning in 1:55.3 for driver Tyler Smith. A week later he made his 5-year-old debut in the open class. He would finish sixth in a field of eight, clocking a 1:53.1 mile. It would turn out to be his first and only start of the year. He was shelved a second time, plaqued by the same lameness that cost him half of the previous year.

"That's part of the game," said Cullipher. "We love the horse. He's a great horse to be around. I rehabbed him right here at my farm. My 9-year-old daughter can walk him back and forth through the fields. He's been a fun horse to have; real enjoyable."

The conditioner brings a realistic approach to campaigning Swingforthefences. With two extended layoffs, the gelding could suffer the same fate again this season. The goal is to manage him in such a way that he can stay sound and healthy all year. Through the first month of the Hoosier meet, Swingforthefences is holding his own.

"Obviously, he had the time off for lameness issues, and hopefully with giving him the extended time this go around, we can keep him going for a while longer," said Cullipher. "Will he ever be the horse that he was? Probably not. But he's got a lot of class to him. If I can keep him going, he still has the ability to earn. I would love to be able to race him through the Hoosier meet."

Pollack and Cullipher did not stake Swingforthefences. He will not ship this season, remaining at Hoosier Park to compete in the top trotting classes. After two qualifying efforts, both runner-up finishes, the gelding raced second in his seasonal debut, trotting home in :26.4 in a 1:55.1 effort. The following week (April 6) he held off the late charge of Land Of Freedom to win by a neck, clocked in 1:54.4 as the favorite. It was the first victory for Swingforthefences in just over two years. The winning time fell more than two full second off his sophomore mark of 1:52.1. He bounced back to trot third in his next start.

"First and foremost, we want to do right by the horse," said Cullipher. "We'll see how he goes. If he shows any signs, we'll back off. He's just a professional through and through. He's going to go out there and try his best. He's not one that you feel like he's not giving 100 per cent."

With \$12,670 earned in 2024, the Concord Stud Farm-bred trotter is closing in on three-quarters of a million on his card, with \$745,214 to date. Cullipher is pleased with what he is seeing from Swingforthefences in the early going.

"He's trotting the whole mile and he's finishing the mile," he said. "Two or three more starts and you can really see where he's going to be."

Some owners might be tempted to cut their losses after the struggles of the last two years. A majority of the trotter's past success came at Hoosier Park, and Cullipher had a front row seat. Although Swingforthefences has battled lameness, his presence in the stable is a highlight.

"He's great to be around," Cullipher said. "Great to train, great to be on the track with. In the barn he's great. Other than his lameness issues, there's not a fault to him."

Archie McNeil talks about his long journey in harness racing

"There are two things that life has granted me, without which I am certain that my journey through it would have been far more difficult; the first, only because it began earlier was harness racing and the other is meeting my wife, Kathy," said Archie McNeil recently.

McNeil grew up in the small Nova Scotia town of Sackville, less than a 10-minute walk from Sackville Downs, then known as the "Harness Centre of the Maritimes."

"It was there that I first met Bill O'Donnell, beginning a friendship that has lasted for more than 60 years," McNeil said. "We are still the best of friends, speaking on an almost daily basis. I wasn't the slightest bit interested in school. All I cared about was horses and harness racing. When I was 17, I left home for the promised land of California to work for Joe O'Brien in Shafter. I stayed with Joe for about a year. I guess I might have become homesick and came back home. A year later, I suppose California beckoned me back and I went to work for Jim Dennis in 1966. That was probably the number one break of my career in the sport.

"If ever there was a person who I would describe as a consummate horseman, that person was Jim Dennis. He did it all and did it all extremely well. He drove. He trained. He ran a great stable and perhaps most importantly he was a great person. I think that perhaps history has short changed him from receiving the recognition that such a person is due.

"I worked for Jim for two years and then got the itch that many young people involved in the sport sometimes get. I wanted to go out on my own and drive my own stable of horses. What did Jim do? Instead of being upset with me for leaving him, He was completely supportive of my decision. As a bridge, to my hopefully budding career, he sent me to Chicago with eight of his best horses with which he put me down to drive. Looking back, I think of the enormity of what he did for me. Here I was a young relatively inexperienced kid being entrusted with driving the horses of one of the country's leading stables. The horses were good and they performed well. Because of them, I started to get more work and some catch drives. I began to get some owners. I received an offer to go to work as the contract trainer/ driver of Ohio owner Jerome Osborne."

Let's start there. What can you tell us about that job?

"Mr. Osborne's horses were stabled at Northfield Park and his horses raced there as well as throughout the then, as it now is once again, thriving Ohio Fair Circuit. It was there that I had my first really good horse. His name was Osbornes Creed. He was by far the top 2- and 3-year-old pacer on the circuit. It was through him that I got to go to Lexington and The Red Mile for the first time. While there I met Glen Garnsey. Glen had been working for K. D. Owen, but had just been hired as the contract trainer/ driver for Castleton Farms. Glen mentioned that Mr. Owen was looking for someone to take his place and arranged for me to meet him."

How was it working for Owen?

"At the beginning it was wonderful. Mr. Owen was a brilliant man. He was charming and generous. He had a well-deserved reputation of being difficult with his trainers. Very few of them lasted any length of time before they were fired. Glen was perhaps the exception. He was one of the few who left Mr. Owen's stable before being dismissed. I wasn't near as lucky. I lasted a little more than a year. Looking back at it objectively, I think that Mr. Owen's expectations for his horses were often unrealistic. He truly loved his horses. He referred to them as his 'old friends'. When shopping for yearlings, finding one of his 'friends' on a pedigree page would often be the hook that ensnared him. When his horses didn't perform to his expectations, he didn't blame the horse. He would blame the trainer or the driver. Occasionally he might have even been right."

Where did you go from there?

"I set up my own public stable. I did reasonably well for some time. I had some good horses. I trained and owned part of Armbro Dallas, one of the very few horses to ever beat Nihilator. I got an interesting phone call that evening. Ronnie Waples and I owned him together and Ronnie told this reporter to call me. The man wanted to know why Armbro Dallas was a gelding. Didn't I know that he would have been more valuable as a stallion as one of the few horses that had beat Nihilator? I told him that at the time I had him gelded, he was just a nice horse that I thought would be better as a gelding. Somehow, I don't think my message got through. We eventually sold him to Sue Grange's Lothlorien Stables.

"Another very good horse I had and I suppose my all-time favorite was Champagne Lobell. He was a real warrior. He was a perfect horse in just about every way. As a driver, all I had to do with him was sit until around the three quarters. Than he would take off quickly passing horses. Rare was the time where he didn't go by horses in the stretch, often winning."

Eventually things began to not go your way. What happened?

"The stable wasn't going well as sometimes happens and it was starting to shrink. It became difficult to make ends meet. Even though the sport had been directly and indirectly responsible for just about everything good in my life I was having a tough go of it. I decided that maybe a change in life might be due. But what could I do? I had very little formal education and no work experience other than with horses. I spoke with a friend of mine, Randy Burrows, who was working for a pharmaceutical company. He arranged an interview for me. I was hired by Vetrepharm, a company that provides medications for equine veterinarians. I stayed with them for 30 years until they were sold to Bimeda. I stayed on with the new company and now at the age of 78, I am still with them."

Are you still involved with harness racing?

"Oh yes. To a very large extent. All of my clients are equine veterinarians. Most of them take care of harness horses. I deal not only with them, but with their clients, the horse trainers as well.

"On a personal basis I'm still quite involved in the sport. I own horses that are trained by Nifty Norman and Mark Beckwith. O'Donnell has been my partner on some of them. I suppose the best horse I own is a French import named Echo de Meautis. We had a chance to buy him and I told Mark I was in. I called Billy O and asked him if he wanted a piece. In O'Donnell's inimitable manner he said, 'I don't want any part of a F@#\$& French trotter.' He made over \$100,000 for us last year. Nifty has a Captaintreacherous Down Under horse named Jilliby Dynamite for us that won in 1:48.2 at Chester and nobody even knows his name. Can you believe that?"

On that theme, why are they going that fast?

"Kathy, who I consider to be the rock of my life, and I have been married for 33 years. We live in Westboro, MA, about 23 miles from Boston. We are about a 10-minute drive from Plainridge Raceway. I'll occasionally get in the cart and sit behind one. I like to think I awake each day with a smile on my face looking forward to what the future will bring."

Let's close out on that kid that my old eyes remember as a budding juvenile delinquent, your son Donald.

"There were times in his youth when Donald was to put it kindly, rambunctious. He was going to a junior college and was kind of ungrounded, when one day he called me to say 'Dad I'm thinking of joining the navy. What do you think?' I told him it was his life and I would be supportive, of anything he chose to do. The sailor at the enlistment center told him that if he enlisted for two years as he intended doing, he would end up doing grunt work like swabbing floors. However, if he chose to go for four years, he would be making a career for himself. That is what he did. At first, he became a medical corpsman. He then went to flight school and flew for 20 years rising through the ranks. He is now a Commander and second in command at the huge United States Naval base in San Diego. To say that I am proud of his success is indeed an understatement."

Reflections on the Ontario Sires Stakes program on its 50th anniversary

John Campbell jokes that it is a little scary that he can remember 50 years ago, but he was, indeed, racing horses in his home province of Ontario at the dawn of the Ontario Sires Stakes program in 1974. Asked to reflect on the impact of the OSS in conjunction with its 50th anniversary, Campbell said the program has been a game-changer.

"It's incredible," Campbell said. "I was in Ontario when it started and it was a big boon to Ontario-breds at the time. We thought the money was great and when you look at what it's turned into in 50 years, it's just incomprehensible. The horses that come out of the Ontario Sires Stakes now compared to when it started, it's incredible the quality. They are just world class, free-for-all pacers that come out of the Ontario Sires Stakes program now.

"The driving force in the evolution of the Ontario breds... was the Sires Stakes, no doubt about it."

As for having vivid memories from five decades ago, Campbell said he remembers a conversation with fellow horseman Ronnie Feagan in the first or second year of the OSS.

"He had a colt that he was racing with his grandfather, George. He was a nice colt in the Sires Stakes, but he was just racing against other Ontario Sires Stakes colts. We were talking and he said, 'You know, I told my grandfather, if this colt gets out of the Sires Stakes, he's about a 15-claimer.' His grandfather couldn't believe that he said that and didn't want to hear it, but Ronnie was absolutely right. But that was the beginning of it and he'd be a top-five Ontario-sired colt then. The top-five colts that come out of the Ontario Sires now, well, they are a long way from being 15-claimers."

Think legends such as: Somebeachsomewhere, Bulldog Hanover, San Pail, Tall Dark Stranger, Bee A Magician, Goodtimes, Apaches Fame, Elegantimage, Peaceful Way, Pure Ivory, Billyjojimbob and many, many more.

"It's just amazing the quality of horse that are racing in [the OSS] now, just how it evolved through the ages," Campbell said.

The Campbell family's beloved pacer Derbys Gent raced in the Grassroots part of the OSS program in the early days and Campbell said he won every start in Ontario that year.

"My dad actually had a 3-year-old colt race in maybe the second or third year," Campbell said. "He didn't do that well, but he was getting checks and he was going for money that he likely wouldn't have been going for — maybe even two and three times as much at the time.

"After I left [Ontario to race in New Jersey], dad had a stable and he raced through the Sires Stakes for a period of time until he quit driving as well. It was a big deal at the time and when you see what it's become, certainly the visionaries of it are to be commended for what they started."

Campbell added that the OSS has also been a farm system for young trainers and drivers "not only to learn, but to be able to make a living while they learn. That's key."

Fifty years on, despite the rise of many other jurisdictional sires stakes programs, Campbell said the OSS still holds its own.

"It's still a good program," he said. "The breeding program is doing quite well, I would say. It's an attractive program, no matter if you live in the States or in Canada. I don't think there's any question about that."

MAKING FIRST TRIP TO THE KENTUCKY DERBY

Campbell said he will make his first trip to see the Kentucky Derby next weekend.

When he retired from driving in 2017, he was gifted the trip by a group of tracks in Ontario.

Due to his busy schedule as CEO of the Hambletonian Society and some years impacted by the pandemic, Campbell never found the time to go to the Derby until now.

"I'm going this year and really looking forward to it," he said. "It was one of those things that I said I'd like to do and I'm really excited about it."

He said he plans to take in the 150th Derby both as a horse racing fan and to take some notes to see what might be applied to harness racing.

"I'm going to go Friday and it won't be quite as crowded," he said. "I will be able to walk around and take a look at things and just see how the set up works. I've made a number of contacts in the thoroughbred world and I know I'll run into some people I know. I will pick their brains a little bit, then just enjoy Saturday.

"I'm set up to go and I'm just hoping for decent weather."

The extraordinary league of gentleman handicappers, Part 1

In California during the 1980s a roster of distinct horseplayers delivered studious approaches to handicapping and parimutuel wagering. Their books on the subjects were academic and empirical; statistical and scientific. These books buried the get-rich-quick-at-the-races-mail-order-system salesmen and attenuated the on-track tout-sheet barkers.

A serious era of pari-mutuel racing handicapping and wagering academics was creating a new and sophisticated generation of horseplayers; it treated them as smart investors instead of degenerate gamblers. The impetus for making a bet was changing from a need for action to a search for positive financial possibilities.

I realized this as I met each person responsible for the education needed to put the odds of pari-mutuel racing on the side of the player. Thanks to Mark Cramer, my original source of exposure to the extraordinary league of gentleman handicappers beginning with Barry Meadow. It did not take long for me to discover Meadow wrote his first book almost two decades before we were laughing together while betting at the California underclass harness raceways.

Success At The Harness Races, (1967, Citadel Press, NJ.; George J. McLeod Limited, Canada) was not in my wheelhouse at the age of 17 when it was published. I was starting college in New York City and doing so mostly to avoid starting to kill people in Vietnam. As a freshman I embraced philosophy with Jean-Paul Sartre and English literature with Thomas Hardy while suffering through physics and calculus. I was earning good money on the side as a professional musician.

I read Barry's book in my 30s, well after I met him. By then my professional skillsets were operating in California on another level in another state of mind. I supplemented a modest amount of hard-earned career cash and leisure time at the pari-mutuel windows. That all changed when I began reading Success At The Harness Races.

The introduction to Barry's book roared with phrases such as: "Because I am going to make you a winner..." and "You'll no longer be the man whose 18-1 shot was nosed at the wire..." and turn in your tout sheets and forget your past knowledge and "Most race-goers lose. But assuming you can control your emotions at the track you can be a consistent winner."

Experiencing Barry in action and making good on his first book's promises were humbling. They made me ask myself about my pari-mutuel behavior. I was better than the average player but being just average I asked myself some questions: Perhaps my wins were not the products of precision? Perhaps some of my losses were good bets and others wasteful efforts I should not have made at all? Doubt set in and I set out to learn enough about wagering on pari-mutuel racing to beat the true competitors, the public.

Hanging with Barry at Los Alamitos I knew I could never put as much time and effort into betting as him. He was a professional bettor who devoted many hours working to make a profit; first betting on harness racing and later on thoroughbreds. I was a part-time player not about to give up a writing career for a living. But I knew watching him in action could make me smarter and enjoy profiting when I did play.

At Los Alamitos harness I watched Barry monitor everything the public did with its money. He watched the toteboard for win, place and show overlays and he scanned the exacta payoffs as the money rolled in and he flipped through his work clipboard to measure how much – if at all – he would bet into which pools; and sometimes he did all that only to find out the race developed into a pass.

"How the hell do you keep up with all of the numbers?" I said.

"I'm mathematically inclined," Barry said.

It was a big lesson for me; one to be repeated by many of California's league of gentleman handicappers (including Dick Mitchell, James Quinn, Tom Brohamer, Howard Sartin, Andy Anderson and Robert Roblin whom I will cover in other chapters). I became aware of the last thing about pari-mutuel success I wanted to accept; a need for specialized math skills. California's high caliber intellectual elite agreed math was the strongest tool for wagering success. Using it dictated the most important actions one made for any game of chance; when to play and how much to play and when not to play at all.

I was a poor arithmetic student from grade school through college but it became evident I had to face my learning challenges if I was going to continue betting with profit as the goal and I embarked upon an academic step deeper than calculating thoroughbred speed figures. I needed to be smarter and to learn handicapping was not a process of picking winners.

SATURDAY

Since late Thursday afternoon, I have been mentally in a lousy space.

Imagine walking across the street, and a speeding car loses control and barely misses running you over. This near miss scares you. Your heart races a million miles an hour, and then you get wobbly and sit in the grass thinking about the close call. Eventually, your feelings of fear, shock, and anxiety fade away, and you get back to normal. Thursday at the farm was a close call for me. Three days later, I'm not close to getting over it. That is sort of what people deep into addiction feel. My problem was not a speeding car. It was a day with a handful of what should have been minor things; two people not showing up, being alone with an injured horse, a door slammed in my face, rain on the roof, and other fears all clenched me into a trembling ball. I am not good at handling stress, but the part that scared me the most is that if I had drugs available in that barn on Thursday, I'm almost sure I would have used them.

My experience alone at the horse farm reminded me of Angela, a lady from NA, not my current NA group, but another NA group. Angela was about 30. She looked a little like the actress Kristen Wiig. Angela was sober for over a year and seemed to have her act together. She only came to NA once a week for what she called her tune-up. Then Angela relapsed. When she relapsed, her system was clean, and her usual intake damn near killed her. She told us what triggered her unraveling in an NA meeting; a flat tire! A flat tire! An event part of everyday life grew complicated with heavy traffic, her phone not working, traffic whizzing, and a sketchy guy stopping. A bad day with a bunch of small events made her so stressed and rattled she needed a few pills to chill; boom, sobriety was gone, addiction was back.

MONDAY

This diary entry is about money.

The morning at the horse barns was like a business meeting. Paul was a very open and direct CEO. Paul, Bart, and I sat on straw bales in the barn. Paul told us several things using simple sentences. Bart and I will make \$16 per hour, but we do not need to sign in. We will each receive a 10 per cent bonus from the net profit of any yearling we sell. At this moment, we do not have health insurance, but Paul is looking into coverage and hoping that our preexisting addictions will not be a problem. He said insurance is tricky since we are not members of a horseman's association. He is looking into care for his mother, but he is unsure if she can stay at the farm.

Then he told us the big picture about his family and this farm. Grandmother Edith was first in ownership, his mother second, and he was third. However, due to his mother's stroke, his grandmother's advanced age, and his five years of sobriety, he was now the family trustee. The farm consists of 646 acres in two parcels. Last year, his family sold 70 acres to a development company. That money is in an account that he uses to pay family bills, pay himself, pay taxes, pay operational expenses for the horses he bought, and pay for the renovations of the farm.

Then Paul finished his little speech with a few tidbits. He considered himself very fortunate because he OD'ed several times, and twice NARCAN brought him back. Despite massively screwing up most of his life chasing drugs, today is good. His late grandfather would be happy. He also said that he had a master plan for the farm that might involve non-profit status. And finally, he repeated, 'Call me day or night, anytime the dragons in your mind roar.'

TUESDAY

Another red flag for me was the future. As I understand the yearling project, if everything goes according to plan, all the

horses will be gone in six months, so what will Bart and I do? I asked Paul about it, and he did not answer. He said we would cross that bridge when the time came. Just like sobriety, let's take one day at a time.

WEDNESDAY

My comfort level handling the fillies is outstanding. Who'da thunk it? Each of the fillies has a particular personality. I have no idea if they will be fast racehorses. These four fillies are ridiculously perfect to my rookie eyes, but Paul explained they are not. He said that the three things that buyers look for in yearlings are conformation, pedigree, and the racing performance of siblings. Paul told me that middle-tier buyers like him were like the Rolling Stones song *You Can't Always Get What You Want*.

He said buyers in the \$20,000 range needed to make sacrifices, and his wiggle room was horse conformation. While he would not bid on a little horse, he would bid on a horse that did not stand perfectly. He said that his grandfather's best horse toed in (whatever that means). Then Paul took me to each horse and noted something he was not wild about. I did not see a single problem; they all looked perfect.

THURSDAY



In 2014, he was the sport's dash leader with 847 wins. Last year, he compiled a stellar .406 UDRS in 2,458 starts. He's earned more than \$62.3 million in purses.

Wrenn, Jr. began driving in 2008 and that year captured his first purse victory in a Billings Amateur Trot at the Holland, MI fair. In two years of college pursuing a degree in criminal law, he couldn't stop thinking of harness racing.

"I never thought it would come to this," he said in 2022 on the eve of his 7,000th win. "I intended to race a few horses in amateur races and finish school. I drove for dad and my uncles, Peter and Gary.

"But I was like most young guys in this business. As soon as it gets in your blood, that's all you want to do. Now I get to drive for Ronnie Burke, Brian Brown, Sam Schillaci. It's crazy how it works out."

In 2022, Wrenn, Jr. listed one of his primary goals as landing more assignments in richer, more prestigious events.

"I really want to drive more Grand Circuit horses and fewer overnights," he said. "I'm driving for some of the connections that maybe will put me on the map a little bit."

Benjamin Hanover sets 1:51.2 track record at Philly

The track record sheet at Harrah's Philadelphia got a veryearly-in-the-season alteration on Thursday afternoon (April 25), as the 4-year-old Sebastian K S trotting gelding **Benjamin Hanover** won powerfully in 1:51.2, knocking three-fifths of a second from the local divisional standard held by Scirocco Rob since 2019.

Off a 1:52.3 impressive local bow for Hall of Famer Joe Holloway, Benjamin Hanover was elevated to the track's \$13,000 top trot and showed he could handle those horses with aplomb. Retaking the lead from Outside The Fire after a :27.3 opener for Holloway's fellow Hall of Famer David Miller, the talented gelding then went on to middle fractions of :55.2 and 1:22.4. Benjamin Hanover opened up a 2½-length lead on his pocketed rival through the far turn, then coasted home by 1¾-lengths while never threatened. Now a winner of 10 of 16 lifetime starts, Benjamin Hanover looks like a horse headed for better things for owners Sarah Andrews, Angela Correll, and Jarod Miller.

'Commander Kody' wins third straight at Big M

Lexus Kody had yet another dominant performance in the weekly featured \$27,500 winners-over trot at The Meadowlands, notching his third straight victory in much-the-best fashion Friday (April 26) night.

"He's super-sharp right now," said winning driver Yannick Gingras. "When he's like this, he can go some big miles."

Looking to lead at every call as he had in his prior two starts, Gingras had Lexus Kody on the go from post 6 in the six-horse field and found himself extremely wide into the first turn.

"It doesn't matter to him," said Gingras. "He doesn't need to be on the front. I just figured at 1-5, I wanted to stay out of trouble."

Being pushed wide provided no problem for the 6-year-old gelded son of Archangel—Lexus Helios, who made the point before completing the first turn as his Ron Burke-stablemate Chapercraz settled into the pocket.

In a race devoid of thrills, Lexus Kody cut out fractions of :27.2, :55.4 and 1:24 before sprinting home in :26.4 to safely hold off Chapercraz, who was solid late to miss by three-quarters-ofa-length. Interview Fra A, seeking a fourth-straight win while bumping up in class, grabbed the show dough. The time for the mile was 1:50.4. Throughout his career, Lexus Kody has had breaking problems from time to time, but lately he's kept his mind – as well as his stride – on point.

"He got back to his old antics at the end of last year," said Gingras. "But this horse has crazy ability. If he just minds his manners, he can go with a lot of the good ones. He never gets tired."

In winning for the 21st time from just 53 lifetime outings, Lexus Kody – who returned \$2.40 to win – upped his lifetime earnings to \$414,402 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi and P. Collura.

A LITTLE MORE: Dave Miller guided three winners on the night to up his 2024 driver dash-win total to 57, which is tops at The Big M. Andy McCarthy is a distant second with 36.
