HARNESS RACING UPDATE

Take us through time from when you arrived in this country to where you are now.

"For all intents and purposes, dad was born a horseman. He probably had no other choice, nor certainly did he aspire to become anything else. Dad and mom were part of the great Swedish migration to America of the 1980s. Although they were born and raised in Sweden, they have lived and prospered as Americans from the beginning. Dad was born into the game. His father, Bo William, was considered one of the great trotting trainers in Sweden. Dad started working for the great Swedish horse trainer Soren Nordin when he arrived on these shores. He quickly outperformed the role of apprentice and decided to go out on his own shortly thereafter. It wasn't quite 'instant' success, but it didn't take too long before he became known as one of North America's best conditioners. Hard work and great talent quickly propelled the Taktors up the totem pole.

"I was 'Dad's Shadow.' It seemed like wherever and whenever he went, I was along with him. I consider myself to be a great observer. I watched him all the time. I quickly adapted a good many of the habits and the philosophy that led him to become the Jimmy Takter that he became. I was with him from the beginning, first as a tagalong, then as a groom in his stable and then as a groom with some second trainer responsibilities in his operation. I was usually there picking up on all the knowledge that was available."

Your dad had decided to retire and you decided to branch out on your own.

"When my dad retired, I already had over 30 horses in training and was established as a trainer on my own. At that point, I had already trained JK Shesalady, Kissin In The Sand and Captain Crunch. With my dad's retirement, came the opportunity to grow my stable and to also take over

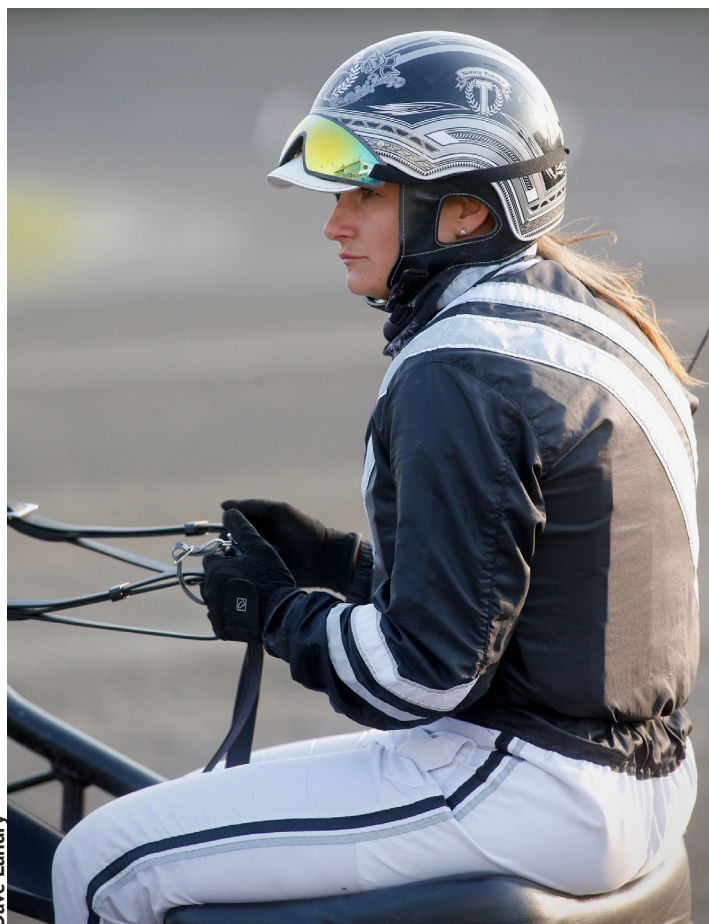

When he was running his own stable, yes, he wanted me to do well... [But] no he didn't want to lose even to me.

"I originally went on my own in 2013 feeling that life had more to offer me than to be a caretaker for the rest of my life. Perry Soderberg gave me my first yearling to train, a \$7,000 yearling named Western Vintage. Western Vintage ended up being one of the best 2-year-olds of his year. Around the same time, the 3 Brothers Stables were looking for a trainer. They reached out to me. Alan, Steven and Ronnie Katz sent me their homebreds that year. Among them was JK Shesalady. She ended up being undefeated and winning Horse of the Year honors in both Canada and the United States.

"I'd be disingenuous if I didn't say that I found myself in a situation where I didn't have a whole lot going for me. I was coming out of an 'apprenticeship' with the foremost Grand Circuit racing stable in America and probably the world. In addition to all the experience I had garnered from working at Jimmy Takter's side, I also had access to some of his great help, his great owners and perhaps even a few horses that I 'inherited' from my father. Not only all of that, but also the knowledge that I could call upon dad for advice in virtually any horse related situation. I would also be setting up headquarters at what I believe to be the finest horse training facility in North America."

What is it about your dad that contributed to his becoming not only great, but one of the very few all-time greats in the history of our sport?

"There are undoubtedly numerous factors and positives. However, in my opinion, the greatest one is that he genuinely loves horses. He loves them all to probably varying degrees. He can transport himself into their very essence. It's not only the big things, but also a great deal of the minutia. All of those little things eventually add up to a great whole. He looks upon himself as being an artist tasked with creating masterpieces."

the family training center which has been a huge advantage for me. I also 'inherited' some nice horses like Manchego, Don't Let'em and The Ice Duchess. With his retirement also came support from some of his biggest owners like Black Horse Racing, Katz/Libfeld, John Fielding and my mom Christina Takter. Josert Fonseca and Conny Svensson were part of my dad's staff that made the move over to my stable along with some outstanding caretakers. My dad being in retirement and no long competing opened up the door for him to be there to give me advice when I needed it. Dad and I are very competitive.

You are now in the 10th year of being out on your own. How do you view your stable at present?

“We are training 55 head of which 30 are 2-year-olds. There is about a three to one ratio of pacers to trotters. At this point I’m very pleased with what we have. However, it’s not quite May yet and we’ve only gone between 2:07 and 2:11 with them. I would say that we would be in a pretty sad state if I were not pleased with where we are at this point.”

Do you have any favorites right now?

“Not really. But I think they are a pretty substantial group. There’s a Father Patrick filly out of Shake It Cerry, Cheval Rapide, that appears to be quite talented. The full brother to Tall Dark Stranger, Total Stranger, seems to have a good deal of go. We have seven 2-year-olds from the first crop by Captain Crunch. I like them as a group. At this point there are none that I look upon as laggards.”

Of all the horses that you have trained, do you look upon any of them as favorites?

“If I were looking to pick just one, that one would be Kissin In The Sand. From the outset she was an extremely difficult filly with which to work. She had issues all along. She wasn’t the easiest filly both physically and in temperament. With the former, she was constantly bothered by allergies. She wanted to do things as she pleased. I wanted her to do them my way. After a good deal of trial and error we reached an accommodation. From that point forward she became a sweetheart. I remember a conversation I had with Marvin Katz, one of her owners, early in the game. I told Marvin, ‘This filly is either going to become a champion or a discard.’ Thankfully, the former transpired.

“Of course, there are others, fortunately quite a few others. One of them is Tall Dark Stranger whose first crop of yearlings we are anxiously awaiting. If they are anything like he was, they will be great. He had it all. He was perhaps the most beautiful yearling that I’ve ever seen. From the onset, he trained like a good horse. He not only trained like one, more importantly he raced like one both at 2 and 3. The only regret I have about him is that his 3-year-old season coincided with the worst of COVID. Probably not as many people as could have got to see him race.”

How about your life away from the horses? Do either of your two kids show any interest?

"Away from the horses I like to eat good food. Fortunately, I also enjoy exercising. I enjoy fashion and shopping and try to stay current on what's going on in the 'real world.' My oldest, Ella, will be attending college this year at WPI. She is interested in pursuing a career in aerospace engineering and computer science. My son, Marcus, is still in high school. His two greatest pursuits at the moment are in playing hockey and golf... I could maybe see him having some interest in the sport as he gets older."

How does your training operation work?

"I like to say that I don't train like everybody else. But the truth of the matter is that we do not train much differently than my dad did. If you were going to classify it, you might say that we emphasize conditioning far more than we do speed. My experience is that speed will come as a natural sequence of conditioning. I think that our 2-year-olds have just reached the stage where they are becoming more competitive. The competitive spirit leads to speed. It will come when it does."

Do you have any favorite tracks where you like to race?

"The three top ones in order would be The Meadowlands, Lexington and Mohawk. The Meadowlands because its home for us. This is the track where we probably spend most of our time. Its where I grew up and learned most everything that I know. We start our season racing and often end it racing here. The Red Mile in Lexington is great, especially so for the owners and maybe the horses, but probably not so much for the trainers. There is so much to do and often nowhere near enough time in which to do it. We've got to train our horses, manage them, go out to the farms and look at yearlings, race in the afternoons, socialize with owners and often go to the sales in the evenings. Two weeks of doing this just about every day can be very draining. I love racing at Mohawk mostly because of the hospitality of management up there. When you race there, you feel like you are truly welcome and appreciated. Another factor is the fans. It remains one of the very few places where the customers come out to cheer for and appreciate good horses."

Are the horses of today any different than those you grew up with?

"For the most part I would say yes. They are faster, better gaited and come to their speed a whole lot quicker. I would say that they are generally better individuals as well. I guess that is a tribute to the breeders and to the evolution of our breed. There are far fewer yearlings at the major sales that you can eliminate due to obvious conformation defects. That is undoubtedly true, but there are lameness and breathing issues that continue to affect us."

Talk a little about your owners.

"I'm very privileged to have a great group of them. Mom and dad have backed me from the onset. There are others such as Black Horse Racing, Marvin Katz, Al Libfeld, the Chafees, the folks from Crawford Farms, the Katz Brothers, John Fielding, Howard Taylor, Joe Sbrocco, John Fodera and others that do not come immediately to mind. I like to think that I have good relationships with all of them."

Insofar as owners are concerned, do you speak with them often?

"It varies from client to client. I speak with Alan Katz almost every day. I do try to keep communication open with all of them and try to keep them apprised with the progress of their horses. I make it a point to sit behind every horse in the stable at least once a week. I believe that most of our stable members have pretty much the same philosophy as I do with regard to the horses. We place a high priority on quality over quantity."

Track expansion to unlock further potential at Grand River

Two years after it was first announced and then later deferred, news came this week that Grand River Raceway will indeed be moving forward with plans to construct a five-eighths mile track from its current half-mile configuration.

With plans for the project – in which both of the track’s turns will be expanded – set to begin in August, the new track configuration will be in place and ready to go for the 2024 summer meet. With it, will bring a number of inherent benefits to all race participants involved with racing at Grand River; all of which comes down to being able to offer a better racing product.

The idea for the project was a long time coming and was something that Grand River’s recently retired director of operations Jamie Martin had long advocated. Now, others will share in those benefits, including the new Grand River racing manager, Chad Rozema.

Recently profiled here in HRU, Rozema’s excitement for the opportunity has been further bolstered now by news of the track expansion.

“I grew up here as a kid in Elmira, ON, which is about 15 minutes from Grand River’s racetrack,” Rozema said. “And having that half-mile track – that’s the grassroots of racing – it’s fun to watch and be around, but I just feel that a five-eighths being a bigger oval, opens things up. The five-eighths track can certainly

“It’s going to make things more enjoyable. It’s a strong product that I think has gotten so much more to offer up and that’s what we’re looking towards with the transition to the five-eighths. You get better horses, better racing and it’ll improve what to me is already a strong product.”

With the aspect of giving more opportunities, especially with the emphasis on horses that draw outside posts, the track expansion will be a game changer. Last year’s results at Grand River show how it’s nearly impossible for horses to overcome the outside post; numbers which are even worse than the already low number of winners produced from outside posts at comparable half-mile tracks.

From 123 races conducted last year at Grand River on the pace in which there was a starter from post 8, just two horses won, equating to a percentage of 1.6 per cent. It was near identical results on the trotting side too. In 57 races with a starter from post 8, there was just one winner, coming out to a percentage of 1.8 per cent. These numbers alone show the need for a change, which the track will now receive.

The outside posts became even more difficult to overcome in races where a post nine trailer was included in the race, but nine horse fields on the new track configuration will be completely different. The winning percentage by post position will be far more evenly distributed than it has been and there will be more plentiful opportunities and chances for all horses in the race. Provided that the track continues with nine horses in a race, that will be a healthy field size number for driving handle.

“I fully expect an increase in handle,” Rozema said. “I intend to do my part to help promote that with a pumped-up wagering menu, something we’ll see if we can do that for this season, too. And anytime you can add some fuller fields and attract some better horses, now suddenly that makes the product more interesting to more people from all over that are going to play and then it grows from there.

“We’ve got a great driving colony and a lot of young up and comers that someday are likely to crack their way onto the WEG circuit. And if we can keep those, maybe even get some WEG circuit guys here on occasion, that’s going to make for excitement. All of which will attract more bettors. So, I fully expect and intend to have the wagering increase rather significantly once we go to the five-eighths.”

One of the more interesting aspects of the Grand River meet are the young, talented horses that debut throughout the summer. For those that don’t remember, it was Grand River that kicked off the career of the immortal Somebeachsomehow, when he made his first two pari-mutuel starts at the Elora oval, sweeping through the Battle of Waterloo to kick off his illustrious career in what was just the track’s fifth season since inception.

"That's the thing, my favorite horses are 2-year-olds," Rozema said. "It's always fun to try and see, just like you do in any sport, when a young phenom comes onto the scene and that's exactly what we get at Grand River. You don't know what you've got coming into the Battle of Waterloo or the Battle of the Belles for that matter. You can have an inkling, you can look at some lineage or you can maybe see a couple of lines, but you really don't know. We couldn't say for sure that Somebeachsomewhere was going to be a superstar but man oh man, that's a great story to know that it started here. And many other greats have been around Grand River as well."

The 2023 season at Grand River kicks off in just over a month on June 2, and the 48-date meet will run through Sep. 27. With the track playing host to a lot of provincial racing in Ontario Sires Stakes and highlighted by its signature Industry Day program on Monday (Aug. 7) with the best Ontario-sired horses in the sport, as well as the expansion project ahead, there is much promise ahead for the track.

"I'm so excited of course for my first year here and now with the news of the five-eighths transition next season makes me even more excited," Rozema said. "And I don't want to look too far ahead but it's tough not to get pumped already for all that is upcoming."

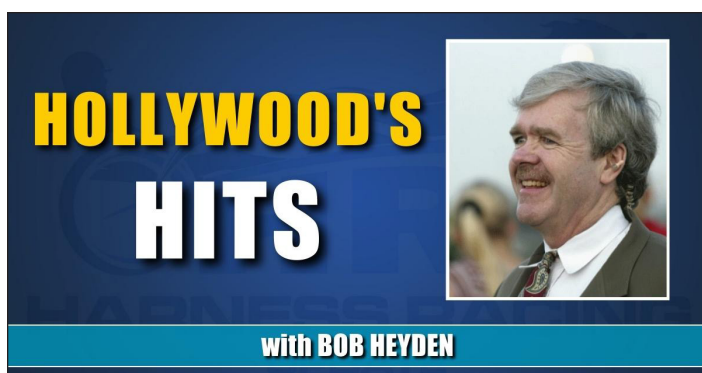

Celebrating 20 years since Brian Sears arrived at The Meadowlands

On April 30, 2003, Brian Sears — a winner of \$19.5 million with 4,180 wins — entered The Meadowlands paddock in New Jersey for the first time. He was certainly known, but not necessarily by that betting public. That was soon to change. The sport was, too. Think of the following half dozen comments, toss them into a blender and you will get very close to what was about to happen.

- 1 — “A new sheriff in town.”
- 2 — “Shifting winds.”
- 3 — “A seismic change.”
- 4 — “Babe Ruth was just sold by the Red Sox to the Yankees.”
- 5 — “A great driver colony just got that much better.”
- 6 — “Finding a Mickey Mantle baseball card in your attic.”

This was his very first night at The Meadowlands. In 27 prior Meadowlands racing seasons, he had never ventured to East Rutherford, NJ. You know, the place that has tasted and spit out drivers all over the lot through the years. Even Dexter Dunn and Dave Miller had to try it a second time before hitting paydirt.

Now, the big question. At 35 years and 3 months old, why then? Before we get to Sears and his response, consider the following numbers:

- Wayne Gretzky was already the greatest NHL goal scorer of all time by 35.
- Michael Jordan won his sixth NBA title the year he turned 35.
- Bill Russell won his 11th NBA title the year he turned 35.
- Michael Phelps was the most decorated Olympian ever at 31.
- John Campbell entered the Hall of Fame at 35.

“A lot of guys had told me that I should come over to The Meadowlands,” Sears said. “But remember, the lifestyle I had driving at The Meadows was good. In those days nobody was flying in to drive in the sire stakes. Dave [Palone] and I had pretty much the best choices.

“Jim Campbell was instrumental in my coming. I was driving for Jim and Jules [Siegel] and I would get their horses, as a matter of fact some good ones like Whatanartist and Gordons Jin Ms [Sears’ first world record setter]. But I remember thinking about all the talent at The Meadowlands. Everyone had 5,000 or 10,000 wins. You get up on the gate and no matter where you looked you saw a top driver. George [Brennan], Howard Parker, [Daniel] Dube, [John] Campbell, [Mike] Lachance, [Cat] Manzi, Jimmy Morrill Jr. So much talent. And remember the racing there was different than you see today. Everyone was on the move. No :59 halves. No matter what odds they were. Today it’s more like half mile racing even on the bigger tracks.”



You went to Pompano the winter of 2003 and you dominated. Was that a deciding factor?

“Yes, that was part of it. I got on a good roll.”

Sears’ UDRS that winter in Florida was an incredible .484.

His bio has him as the 1991 Rising Star Award winner. He won the 2001 Adios with Pine Valley and the 2002 Matron with Cheyenne Rei so you can see he was not an overnight sensation. When he went to The Meadowlands he was 98th all-time in earnings and 70th all-time in wins.

"When I first got to The Meadowlands, you were lucky to be in the race. That's how I felt. You had to sit in the back and hide and then close up the pylons. Starting out anywhere is different. But I started to do well with some longshots too and it worked out pretty well and just built up from there."

Sears had the unusual occurrence of having the Meadowlands Pace and Hambletonian favorite in his debut in each. Neither did well, but that was not a sign of things to come.

DEEPER DIVE INTO THAT DECADE

- In 2003, Stroke Play was the first of three straight 3YOFT Breeders Crown winners for Sears/Trond Smedshammer. In Smedshammer's career, every one of his Breeders Crown scores was with Sears driving. Sears was 5 1-0-1, \$346G in his first Crown year.

- In 2004, Sears scores history's first sub 1:50 mile with a Metro score of 1:49.4 with Rocknroll Hanover. It was the first time he drove him and he was 30-1.

- In 2005, Sears begins a Breeders Crown run for the ages. He would be the leading money winner for each of the next five years in the Crown and was the fastest driver ever to 20 Crown wins. Rocknroll Hanover was his first Horse of the Year in 2005, winning Sears' first NA Cup/Pace along the way.

"A beautiful specimen," Sears said of the dominating son from the first crop of Western ideal.

- Sears' Crown history before 2003 was similar to his Meadowlands history. Just one drive: 1998, Colonial Downs, Midori Hanover finished third for trainer Dave Smith. That means no Sears victories in the first 19 years of the Breeders Crown series (1984-2002) but he's still second all-time to Campbell in wins in the series, 49-34.

- Summary of Sears in the Breeders Crown from 2005-2009:

2005 — #1, 12 4-2-2, \$1,647,026

2006 — #1, 12 3-1-1, \$1,208,200

2007 — #1, 11 2-1-1, \$934,590

2008 — #1, 10 3-2-1, \$1,289,910

2009 — #1, 11 3-1-0, \$1,102,325

HAMBLETONIAN/OAKS HIGHLIGHTS

- Six favorites.

- Three wins, including a first-time drive with Pinkman in 2015. "An honest horse. I didn't know much about him going in. Jimmy [Takter] told me 'Just win.'"

- Muscle Hill, 2009: "I never had to fully extend him until possibly his last start in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine. He was a little tired by then and the track was off. But overall, I always wanted to save something with him and was able to do so."

His Hambletonian win with Muscle Hill was the fastest (1:50.1) and the richest ever trot race and still is at \$1,520,333.

- Bee A Magician, Hambletonian Oaks, 2013 and HOY: "A big great trotting mare who was very good in her era."

Bee A Magician went undefeated in 2013, 17-for-17, the most trotting wins for an undefeated HOY. She also set the earnings record for a trotting female at over \$1.5 million, surpassing Moni Maker's record, ironically, in the Moni Maker.

- In 2009, he became the first driver to win the Hambletonian/Oaks on the same day. He then duplicated that in 2013. Nobody not named Sears has repeated this feat.

- In 2013, Sears won the Hambletonian/Oaks with both favorites, Royalty For Life and Bee A Magician, the latter besting the boys by a tick with a 1:51 mile.

- Sears has had streaks of nine straight and then 10-straight Hambletonian drives. He missed the final only in 2012 [Market Share]. He's driven fillies in two of the last three editions, just missing in 2022 with the 3YOTF of the Year, Joviality. He will not be driving Joviality overseas, where she won her first start at age 4.

- In 2019, Greenshoe was the overwhelming Hambletonian favorite: "A very high-speed horse."

- In 2022, Joviality just missed to upsetter Cool Papa Bell: "She is an outstanding filly. Twice I had the eight post at Yonkers with her and she overcame it both times. Full tilt into the first turn at Yonkers and it didn't bother her. No ill effects either. Usually, a horse coming out of efforts like that wouldn't be as sharp the next few starts. Not her."

OTHER SEARS HIGHLIGHTS

- He won 10 Meadowlands driving titles: "That's the number I am most proud of."
- Fifty-eight consecutive nights winning at least one race every day at The Meadowlands in 2008. No one is close to that.
- First driver in history to go from \$5 to \$10 to \$15 million in three straight years (2003-2004-2005).
- He's the richest single-day driver with \$1.666 million on Hambletonian Day 2009.

LET'S TALK ABOUT SOME HORSES

- Gimpanzee – Won three straight Breeders Crowns at 2, 3 and 4, the first trotter to do it since Mack Lobell (1986, 1987 and 1988): "He knew what it was all about. My job was to get him where he had to be and call on him. It didn't make a lot of difference to him where it was, he always responded."
- Lis Mara: "A serious high speed horse. He waited for me to call on him."
- Mister Big: "Loved a target. Loved to chase. He really wanted to pass horses."
- McWicked: "A smart horse. Very intelligent. He could drive himself. He knew where the winner's circle was too. After the race he'd head right over there."
- Tactical Landing: "He was just getting good at the end of his 3-year-old season. It broke my heart when I found out he wasn't returning at 4."
- Western Terror: "A lot of fun. I have a lot of respect for that horse. Underrated. When he won the Breeders Crown from post 10, that was impressive."
- My Little Dragon: A three-time Breeders Crown champ. "A sweetheart. A fun horse."

A FEW FINAL QUESTIONS

Did your dad, Jay, or your grandfather, Gene, see any of this coming?

"My grandfather always told me when I was a kid that I would be a driver. My father, not as much. He would have been surprised at how well it has worked out."

What is your schedule going forward?

"Pretty much sire stakes and big races. I have a great relationship with Marcus Melander and Anders Strom."

You had a decent season last year in limited action, 406 75-41-50 \$4,702,866 ranking you #28 in North America in money.

"I'll sign up for that for the next couple of years for sure. I want to do this for a few more years."

Will you ever consider being just a trainer?

"Never say never. But no, I don't see that happening."

Elissa Blowe: True blue standardbred person

Woodbine Mohawk Park simulcast show welcomes a familiar face.

The Woodbine Mohawk Park (WMP) 2023 International Women's Day simulcast was a harbinger of good things to come, especially for one woman with deep roots in Ontario harness racing. On March 9, Elissa Blowe co-hosted the special show alongside regular WMP racing analyst/commentator Monique Våg.

On April 17, Blowe returned to the desk alongside Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame driver Randy Waples, who officially became a regular WMP racing analyst on Dec. 12, 2022. They were joined by WMP newcomer John Rallis, who began the show reporting from the Mohawk paddock.

Blowe is a horsewoman who has been involved in harness racing since childhood, when her parents drove (dad Don Blowe) and trained (mom Beth Blowe). The family had a small farm with a quarter-mile training track.

"My dad had a full-time job and my mother trained all the horses," Elissa said. "My grandparents would come up on the weekend and my grandfather would jog the horses. We all worked with the horses, as a family. I always wanted to be in racing, but I didn't necessarily want to be in the barn."

While Elissa did end up spending considerable time in the barn — she currently shows her thoroughbred gelding Golani in hunter competition — her father encouraged her to pursue the media side of the sport. She obliged, studying broadcasting at Kitchener, ON's Conestoga College before launching her career at Mohawk.

"My dad was never the top driver," Elissa said. "Back in the day — in the '70s and '80s — he drove like all those guys back then. They drove at fairs to get their license and we were always at Kawartha Downs on Saturday night; the old Barrie Raceway all the time; old Orangeville, when that existed; and when we had a decent horse, we'd be at Greenwood or maybe even at Mohawk."

“We were primarily at Kawartha, Barrie, those ‘B’ meets, because I grew up in Greenbank, which is north of Port Perry. So, for us, the big influence was the Brethours. Murray was a catch driver back then; Lorne, his dad and Grace, his mom, they had Wil Lor Farm [of Sunderland, ON], and that was a big deal for our area. Everybody had a Will Lor horse on the ‘B’ meets. My mother worked for the Brethours, too. She’d train our horses and then she’d go work for them as well.”

While still a student, Elissa approached Canada’s top harness track about opportunities.

“I was at Mohawk right away,” she said. “I just walked into the media office and I said, ‘I’d really like to volunteer or help.’ Bruce Murray was the boss back then. They were like, ‘Hey, great! We’ll take you.’ So, I started working there. On the weekends I’d do blanket presentations and take people from the dining room down to the winner’s circle. I did ‘Star Phone’ [recording race results for the *Toronto Star* hotline]. I helped with whatever Bruce needed. On big days, they’d call me in.”

In her final year of college, she completed an internship in Woodbine Racetrack’s thoroughbred media office, which led to an invitation to work in their race office.

“So that’s how the thoroughbred thing got started, because I didn’t understand them as well as standardbreds at that time,” Elissa said. “Most people think of me as a thoroughbred person

and my roots, just like so many thoroughbred people, are in standardbreds. Harness racing people are super-sharp and great horsepeople. If you can learn from a standardbred person, you’re learning a lot about lameness, about shoeing changes, how to keep a horse sound.”

After leaving her position at Woodbine, she returned to the barn, working directly with thoroughbreds and traveling.

“I started my own business selling racehorses for show horses, Phase2 Thoroughbreds,” Elissa said. “Everybody liked this program, because I was getting money for the horses, getting some value for them... We were moving them on responsibly, to good homes. I had everyone from pleasure riders to Grand Prix competitors coming to me to buy horses. I was selling them all over Canada and the U.S. I think I did close to 250 of them.”

Before long, the call to post again beckoned the multi-faceted horsewoman.

“I went back to Woodbine in 2004 as a commentator and then I left in 2010 to be part of the new management team at Fort Erie Racetrack,” she said. “I did six years at Fort Erie and then I did a brief stint at OLG [Ontario Lottery and Gaming] and then I was working on primarily a contract basis for Ontario Racing’s new owners program. That was my pilot project. I’ve been kind of behind the scenes.”

Now, Elissa is back in the spotlight on the WMP simulcast show, a role reflecting her extensive background covering the sport.

“I did it all,” she said with a laugh. “Back in the day, we used to have HPI [television] and back then, there were hundreds of us in broadcasting. There might have been 10 or more commentators back then. So, we did the network shows, which I’m sure were on The Score [television]. You did HPI; you did the simulcast shows for either thoroughbred or standardbred. I used to do a Sunday all-day show on The Score for thoroughbreds and then of course I did Fort Erie forever.”

“I always worked on the thoroughbred show with Chris Connor, who is a harness guy. I loved working with Chris Hickey and he was a harness guy who could do thoroughbreds. Jeff Bratt can do both. Renee Kierans can do both. A lot of us could do both breeds.”

Working alongside Waples has been a positive experience for the knowledgeable commentator, who said that since coming back on camera, she’s been getting messages like “I can’t believe you haven’t done this in 13 years.” People have also commented favorably on the chemistry they share at the desk.

“Today, as a more mature woman, I’m looking at this from a whole different perspective, right?” she said. “I am grateful to be back and to be doing it. Elissa is a believer in providing handicapping information that isn't obvious from past performance lines.

"Somebody gave me some really great advice a thousand years ago, that your job [as a racing analyst] isn't to read the program, that's what everybody does," she said. "They're all reading the program. Your job is to give them something else. Something they don't know about. That inside tip. You're not going to get that in every race, but by being active, in the morning, talking to trainers, getting that, 'Well, he had a bit of a pus pocket and we did this,' that is the stuff to pass along."

She said she enjoys talking handicapping with her parents on conference calls.

"It brings us closer together again as a family."

They now live in Paris, KY, and often go to The Red Mile together when she visits. Her parents breed thoroughbreds for the commercial U.S. market, including one that recently captured the attention of a well-known harness racing trainer.

"Chris Ryder bought one of their yearlings at the Keeneland Yearling Sale last year."

Her parents' farm is called Ascot Thoroughbreds. Don and Beth moved from harness racing to thoroughbred breeding around the time the Ontario Slots at Racetracks Program ended in 2012. It was a challenging time that saw racetracks close and participants leave the industry, many for good.

"They had this lifetime dream of moving to Kentucky and they wanted to start a boutique breeding operation down there," Elissa said. "So, they sold our family farm and bought exactly the same farm, basically, in Paris, KY. They've had a really great career in racing, in both standardbred and thoroughbred. All they did was just change the stock around."

Their farm is named for Ascot From Heaven, their first thoroughbred.

"And that story has a standardbred background, too," Elissa said. "We claimed him for cheap, nine thousand dollars and we actually took him to Terry Ruch to do the vet work, because Terry Ruch had been our vet for the standardbreds. 'Ascot' made us about \$200,000. We lost him and claimed him back a couple of times and we ended up taking him home and retiring him at that [Ontario] farm."

"He helped buy those quality broodmares," Elissa said. "He helped fix the farm. He helped get us back together, doing something as a family."

Having seasoned professional Elissa co-hosting the WMP simulcast show is a savvy move, as she is part of an important demographic that is seldom reflected in harness handicapping today. Current Statistics Canada data shows that both women's and men's incomes are highest between the ages of 45 and 54. While women like to gamble, they are less likely to be wagering on harness racing than same-aged men. In 2022, Statistics Canada reported that men were over three times more likely than women to have bet on sports, including harness racing, in the past year (12.1 per cent versus 3.9 per cent).

Elissa said she's often encouraged women who felt unsure how to handicap or bet, who felt invisible as customers and self-conscious about having to always ask men or people the age of their (grand)children for advice.

"There is no dumb question, but women will say, 'This is going to sound like it's a really silly question,' she said. "There is no silly question and maybe they feel a little less intimidated to ask me."

The personable expert is always improving her own game, and said she's delighted to be back where it all began.

"Woodbine is where it's at, 100 per cent," she said. "I really want to make sure that the standardbred people know that I'm a true blue standardbred person."

Gerald Miller balances family and the lure of developing horses

When Gerald Miller stepped away from his role with Eash Racing Stable at the end of the 2021 season, he did so with the intention of spending more time at home with his growing family. He expected to train and race a couple of horses on the side, but it wouldn't be what paid the bills. Miller has found the lure of doing what he loves hard to resist. With a barn of eight horses under his care, he is again immersed in horse racing, but he is trying to approach it differently this time around and find a suitable balance.

"Initially, I just felt like I wanted more time at home. I kind of wanted to get away from the racing a little bit more. It didn't really work out like that," Miller said with a laugh. "I kind of fell back into training. I guess old habits are hard to break."

The soon-to-be 41-year-old began focusing on equine dentistry and shoeing, building his clientele list in 2019 and 2020. Miller believed the two services would become his primary occupation, working from his home in Yorktown, IN, not far from Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

"My plan all along was to train two or three on the side and stay busy with the dentistry and the shoeing," Miller said. "It kind of flipped around to now where I'm almost too busy to do that, let alone keep up with my own on that end. Between all of it I have way too much. A lot of days I tell myself I should just stick to doing one thing. I enjoy all of those."

Between his long stint with Eash Racing and his prior experience with trottingbred ponies, Miller has trained horses for over 20 years. In the time that he focused on other pursuits, he found that he missed the daily activities in and around the barn that he

tried to escape.

"There are other things that I could probably make a living at, but this is something I really enjoy," he said. "Developing horses, that's something I've always enjoyed. I didn't really know how much I enjoyed that until I took a step back from it."

While in the employ of Don and Rosie Eash, Miller had tried unsuccessfully to keep and campaign an occasional horse of his own. However, the large Eash Racing Stable operation made it difficult to serve both interests. Once on his own, the trainer leased a few horses and began competing in Ohio and Indiana.

"They did okay and I made enough money to get into other horses," Miller said. "At this point, I've got all I want as far as horses to train."

The 2022 slate was the first full year that Miller operated his own stable, again focusing on Ohio and Indiana, primarily on the fair circuit in the Hoosier State. He campaigned not only horses he owned but also those he trained for other owners. He connected with trainer Terry Haimes and together they teamed to earn an Indiana Sired Divisional Championship with freshman pacing colt Lil Joe IV. Miller also picked up catch driving opportunities at the fairs, sitting behind several entries for owners Nat and Patty Hill.

"Great people and I got to become good friends with them," Miller said. "I had a blast."

The trainer finished the 2021 season with eight trips to the winner's circle to go along with 40 other on-the-board performances. His starters earned just over \$102,000 in purses. Miller feels it was a good start and a learning experience. For years he was responsible for helping manage many aspects of the Eash stable, but classifying and entering horses was not one of them.

"I felt like it was a success with what I had," Miller said. "It's a lot different when you're on the training side. All those years

you just had to show up and race, you didn't have to follow conditions and know where your horses were at. It takes a little bit to master that. Once you learn a track's conditions, you keep up on where they fit."

He admits that this winter in Ohio his stable did not fare as well as the year before, but he still managed to record one win with trotting mare Imalovelylady. Dennis Petty owns the My MVP 5-year-old, racing under the Single G Stable banner. Since Petty claimed her last August, the trotter has won three times, the latest victory a 1:56.1 score at Hoosier Park. This season she has accumulated \$15,700 in earnings.

"She's turned out to be a nice horse," Miller said. "She's a little bitty thing, but she seems like the kind of horse that can make decent money. She's off to a pretty decent start this year.

"There are other things that I could probably make a living at, but... developing horses, that's something I've always enjoyed. I didn't really know how much I enjoyed that until I took a step back from it."

Six of the eight horses Miller is training are pointed to the Indiana fair circuit, which kicks off June 1 and 2 at Converse. His roster includes a pair of freshmen and four sophomores, three of which are qualified. Fleeting Flivver, a Check Six filly, won at Hoosier Park Thursday evening (April 27). Miller conditioned and steered the 3-year-old pacer to a 1:56.1 victory. He guided Fleeting Flivver on the fair circuit last season, and owner Therl Hensley asked if he could take on training duties this year.

"I was happy to take her," he said.

Even if that meant pushing the stable a bit beyond his comfort zone. Miller would prefer to keep his numbers around five or six horses, particularly when all the responsibilities fall on his shoulders.

"I do all the work," he said. "I do all the training, shoeing, shipping, all the barn work. I like doing it all myself. I'm happier that way. I know what's going on with everything. I'm not picky, but I know the way I want to do it."

Miller has a clear vision for what he wants in a stable, the challenge lies in fulfilling that vision. He is currently racing two or three nights each week. Once fair racing begins, he hopes to pare that back to one night each week at the pari-mutuel tracks, allowing him more time at home with his still-growing brood. He and his wife, Brooke, have four boys between the ages of 11 and 3, with another son on the way.

"I'm still not 100 per cent satisfied with my schedule," he said. "I've got four kids and another one coming in about six weeks. It's always a struggle between making enough money and devoting enough time to home. I don't feel like I've found that balance most days. Priorities are kind of shifting. The biggest thing I want is financial stability and time. With a family, I don't think anybody truly has enough time. For now, this is something I want to pursue. I don't really have any aspirations on getting up to a 30 or 40-horse stable."

Fleeting Flivver's victory Thursday marked the fourth of the season for Miller as conditioner, already tallying half his total from 2022 with two-thirds of the year remaining. When presented with that information, the conditioner focuses less on the numbers and more on his pupils. It reinforces why the pull of sitting behind a young horse is so irresistible.

"It's been going a little better than I expected," he said. "The other night I was second with one horse and she raced well, but I was more excited with the way the trotter that was sixth raced. I know that doesn't pay the bills, but I tend to get excited about improvement."

In the addiction room

Could harness racing help gambling addicts get a fix but not overdose?

My first Gamblers Anonymous meeting was 15 years ago. This meeting was surprising, depressing and revealing. I attended this meeting to do research for an article about gambling addiction in horse racing. My local GA chapter was “closed,” which limits attendance to addicts, but after agreeing to respect the groups’ anonymity, they allowed me to attend. I never wrote the article, primarily because gamblers in my small sample did not have any overlap with horse racing, but I never forgot the sessions.

My preconceived notion from watching too many crime movies was that the problem gamblers would be primarily male horseplayers (remember, horse racetracks were the only legal sports gamble in my state then). As usual, I was wrong. This GA group was about a third female, all under 50 and none gambled on horse racing. Each time I nudged a private conversation toward horse racing, the answers surprised me, “Nah, horse racing is too slow,” “It doesn’t get my juices flowing,”

“Only went once,” “There wasn’t enough action” and “Sort of impersonal.”

Each person in these GA groups had their sphere of gambling addiction purgatory: bingo, poker, lottery tickets, casinos (at the time, casinos where gamblers bussed out of state) and even the stock market. The seriousness of gambling addiction quickly became apparent when after the first session, I asked a fellow in his 20s if he came to a meeting every week. He replied, “No, I find a meeting almost every night. It’s my only shot.”

Addiction to gambling on horses is a serious issue; every addiction is severe and complex. But compared to the heroin of internet sports gambling, wagering on horse races feels like smoking a joint outside the dorm room. State legislation has opened a massive new Pandora’s box of gambling that may make the problems of the racetrack problem gambler a quaint relic. With nonstop wagers in your pocket, we read, hear and witness troubling reports of new gamblers facing addiction almost daily.

Again, nobody should ever minimize the heartbreak and seriousness of any addiction, but in 2023, the retro sport of horse racing may, in some cases, be beneficial. Thinking back to those meetings, the basics of kicking a severe gambling addiction were:

- Regularly attend meetings or counseling and keep fighting even if you relapse. Communicate with mentors or organizations to avoid the isolation that leads to additional problems.
- Addicts should consider what gambling activities are most dangerous and destructive. When you identify your most problematic area, say, online professional sports, they will suggest you attempt to avoid that particular landmine.
- Wager only using cash.
- Hand over your checkbook and credit cards.
- Bet in person.
- Block gambling sights to help eliminate temptation.

When we reflect on these strategies to treat gambling addiction, our sport checks several treatment boxes. - Only gamble on sports or events at specific, set times, such as horse races, rather than continuous and repetitive activities, such as gambling machines and computers with built-in analytic strategies that compound compulsions.

When we reflect on these strategies to treat gambling addiction, our sport checks several treatment boxes. Perhaps, just perhaps, attending the races at a local horse racetrack, in person, with a friend or two at your side, using only cash handed through a teller window, with twenty minutes between each play, could be therapeutic for some categories of struggling addicts. We might be a stepping stone in combating gambling disorders.

Of course, our sport cannot get on our high horse. While it seems that gambling on horses is relatively less dangerous, the world of addiction is tricky. Sometimes marijuana can lead to fentanyl. A scratch-off card you receive for your birthday gift can lead to a thousand-dollar-a-month lottery addiction. And a win on a horse racing wager “can” be the beginning of a plunge into an obsession that destroys lives.

Addictions lurk everywhere and in a world where online betting is at everyone’s fingertips, problem gambling grows like wildfire.

The digital gambling options of today were unborn infants when I attended those GA meetings, but they are growing into monsters. The grooming of young gamblers, especially with gambling businesses using artificial intelligence, makes one shudder at the future of problem gambling.

Where does horse racing gambling fit? Is horse racing a gateway, or is the racetrack a potentially valuable offramp for serious gambling problems? Hard to say.

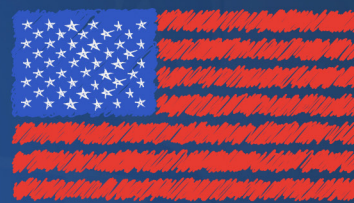

MGM Yonkers International Trot moves to Sept. 9

Fans and industry participants will want to mark their calendars with a number of schedule changes coming to MGM Yonkers Raceway throughout the rest of 2023.

The most notable calendar alteration involves the \$1,000,000 MGM Yonkers International Trot moving from Sept. 23 to Sept. 9. Along with that change comes a post time switch, as the races on Sept. 9 will commence at 12 p.m. (Eastern Time), while the card on the 23rd will revert to the normal 7 p.m. time slot.

In addition to the MGM Yonkers International Trot, the Sept. 9 program will include a six-figure invitational race for older pacers, one for older trotters and eight \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes championship finals. Total purses on the card will be well over \$3 million.

As a result of the date switch, there will be no live racing on Friday, Sept. 8.

Starting with the week of May 1, MGM Yonkers Raceway will drop Wednesdays from its weekly schedule and replace it with Saturday racing, thus creating a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday schedule through Sept. 30. At that point live racing will revert back to a Monday to Friday schedule until Dec. 20. The lone exceptions are the addition of Wednesday, July 26 to the calendar and a Monday/Tuesday only schedule during the week of Thanksgiving.

The first Saturday card (May 6) will be drawn along with Friday (May 5) on Monday, May 1. The entry box closes at 3:00 p.m.

The final change to report is actually the first to occur. On Kentucky Derby Day (May 6), MGM Yonkers Raceway will offer a first race post time of 4:00 p.m.

All of the above changes are pending New York Gaming Commission approval.

Takter's 'Tactical' has the right approach at Big M

Trainer Nancy Takter has been on fire since the first of her students hit the mile oval at The Meadowlands on March 31, with nine winners from just 21 starts at the start of racing Friday night (April 28).

After the second race on the card, the blaze continued to burn out of control.

Tactical Approach, a son of Tactical Landing—Sarcy, took a non-winners of two exclusively for 3-year-old colt and gelding trotters where all seven starters were making their first starts of the year, going wire-to-wire in a lifetime-best 1:52.3 to up his lifetime stats to three wins from five outings.

"He's very nice to handle," said winning driver Scott Zeron. "I was very confident. We got a nice tailwind down the lane and when you have that, they give you everything and more."

With a pair of winning qualifiers under his belt, Tactical Approach cut out fractions of :28.1, :56.4 and 1:25.3 before finishing the job with a :27 kicker to reach the finish 3 lengths in front of Ari Ferrari J. Squared Away was third.

"I am very happy with the maturity and development of Tactical Approach," Takter said. "This versatile horse has shown so much potential and I am confident he will continue to excel in the future. Tonight's effort was outstanding and I am eagerly looking forward to the New Jersey Sire Stakes [which get underway May 13]."

As the 7-5 favorite, Tactical Approach returned \$4.80 to win.

PELLING PROTÉGÉ PROVES 'QUICK'-EST: The Brett Pelling-trained **Quick E** (Sweet Lou—Southwind Tempo) closed well through the stretch to take a non-winners of two for filly and mare pacers in her first start of the season in 1:52.2. It was just the third career outing for the 3-year-old.

"She's come a long way," said winning driver Todd McCarthy. "The last of the [three] qualifiers [before racing tonight] was really good [a 1:52.2 win]. She got out of there good tonight. It ended up we got live cover off the turn and she went pretty well from there. She's still a little green, but I was very happy with her."

Quick E won it by a neck over another Pelling student, Southwind Bella and returned \$7.80 to win as the 5-2 second choice in the wagering.

31 AND COUNTING: Despite rainy conditions and four fields that had only seven starters, The Big M's streak of \$3-million handles on nighttime programs stayed alive.

Not counting last Saturday's (April 22) card that was canceled after only seven races due to bad weather, there have been

31 Friday and Saturday night programs conducted at The Meadowlands during 2023 and each one has seen betting bust the \$3-million barrier.

Friday's 14-race card saw all-source wagering total \$3,007,798.

During 2022, there were a total of 85 programs conducted at the mile oval, with 23 going past the \$3-million plateau.

A LITTLE MORE: Dexter Dunn led the driver colony with five winners on the card. Kelvin Harrison was the top trainer with three walks down victory lane. Always tough on the handicappers are the Meadowlands Amateur Drivers Club events and the betting backed that up Friday as divisions one and three on the program saw three horses go to the gate at odds of 5-2. Division two had a 2-1 favorite, followed by a 7-2 shot and a pair at 5-1.

On a perfectly dreadful morning with temperatures in the high 40s with rain but little wind, the qualifiers got a 9 a.m. early start at The Meadowlands. The track was listed as "sloppy."

Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night shall stay **Bella Bellini** from the swift completion of her appointed rounds. Despite the horrible conditions, the champion mare did as she does and sat patiently near the back for regular accomplice Dexter Dunn as the lead dawdled, then burst through a small seam to win in 1:56.2 with her individual final split :26.1. Nifty Norman has trained the mare throughout her career for owner Dave McDuffee, who has his sights set on the upcoming Miss Versatility (May 6) and Arthur Cutler Memorial on May 20 as possible targets to open her 2023 campaign.

Following Bella Bellini across the wire were Venerate (Brian Sears) who raced well for new connections and recent import Immanuel KS (Ake Svanstedt), who looks remarkably like his sire, the great Sebastian K, was also willing.

Soph filly trotter **Special Way** returned in grand style this morning for trainer Ake Svanstedt who put her on the lead through a minute half then trotted away from a formidable group with the greatest of ease in an effortless :55 second final half, home in :27 flat. Very, very impressive. Secret Volo (Sears), Heart On Fire (Todd McCarthy) and Mambacita (Yannick Gingras) were all okay, left in the winner's wake.

Several of last season's top freshman colt trotters lined up for race nine and **Oh Well** (Tim Tetrick) swept past accomplished rivals willingly through the :27 last quarter to win in 1:55. Celebrity Bambino (Gingras) set slow fractions and held off the pocket pull of Kimmeridgian (Svanstedt) but could not stall

the winner.

Sam Bowie dropped \$350,000 to get **Energetic Hanover** bought at last fall's Harrisburg mixed sale and thus far it appears the big fella may have spent wisely. Scott Zeron steered Energetic through his second qualifier with a pillar to post 1:52 win, home in :26.3 well within himself. Tony Alagna trains the now 4-year-old son of "The Captain." Night Hawk (Joe Bongiorno) closed sharply to be second with a :26.1 stretch kick.

Alagna's Stay Hungry sophomore pacing colts were 1-2-3 with **Dupree Hanover** (Andy McCarthy) taking over past the :58.3 half then holding stablemates Stormalong (Jordan Stratton) and Hungry Angel Boy (Todd McCarthy) at bay through the :26.4 end to the 1:54.1 mile.

Ervin Hanover won back in 1:52.4 from off the pace, closing into a :26.4 final quarter for the Burke/Gingras combo, setting him up nicely for next Saturday's beginning to the PA Sires Stakes. Kopi Luwak closed between horses for Dave Miller for second while Taste Of Honey was unable to last on the lead for Dunn.

Pacing fillies saw **Hungry For Love** (Dave Miller) rally strong in the stretch for a clear 1:53.3 / :26.2 win over Burke stablemate Late For Dinner (Gingras) and mile cutter (4-year-old) Wickedly Innocent (Tetrick).

Treacherous Penny scored out of the pocket for Alagna and Andy McCarthy, wearing down a game Super Girl (Jordan Stratton) through a :26.1 end to a 1:55 mile. Falana Hanover (Dave Miller) impressed with good late energy, used twice from a bad post.

Other 3-year-old trotting fillies saw **If The Shoe Fits** (Andrew McCarthy), another winner from the Alagna barn, leading all the way and winning comfortably in 1:55.4, home in :28.3 unasked. On The House (Svanstedt) followed nicely for second while Wal Street Lady (Gingras) got a flat line using a pocket ride to be third.

Then **Life Itself** (Svanstedt) launched a sustained, uncovered move after the half to wear down the leader then held off the close of In Italian (Gingras) for a 1:58 / :28 victory.

Sophomore trotting colts continued with **Point Of Perfect** (Gingras), on good behavior for the Burke barn today, cut the mile for an easy 1:56.1 / :27.2 win off a half in a minute. EL Lincoln (Svanstedt) followed but proved no match for the winner today. Dire Straits (Dave Miller) had sneaky good energy late though well back of the winner.

Cypress Hanover (Josert Fonseca) flashed a little of the potential that his \$475,000 yearling purchase price promised today as he made up significant ground on then roared past fellow \$400,000 yearling Cadillac Moon (Mattias Melander) to get the 1:57 win for trainer Nancy Takter.

Purses up at Tioga – First draw on Monday

The 2023 live racing season at Tioga Downs starts on Saturday (May 6) with purses up considerably over last year. A quick scan of the [condition sheet](#) reveals that the lowest purse offered is for the NW \$1,501 last 4 / optional \$5,000 claimer at \$6,000, the NW 1PM purse is \$7,000 and the top is \$15,000 for a full field of open types, all comparing favorably for the region.

Rob Pennington has moved into the race secretary's chair and has instituted a new draw schedule; the box close for the Saturday (May 6) card will be Monday (May 1) at 9:00 a.m.

There will be ample opportunity to get raced at Tioga, where the 2022 overnight field size averaged just over seven while over \$4.5 million was paid out in overnight purses during the 52-day meet. The Southern Tier Harness Horseman's Association (STHHA) pays the NYS starting fee for their members.

Tioga has historically opened on KY Derby day with an early post time of 5:15 p.m. scheduling the first four races before the Derby (estimated to be 7:00 p.m.) then continuing with the balance of the card around 7:30 p.m. The normal [racing schedule](#) will be Friday and Saturday at 6:15 p.m. and the Sunday matinee at 1:00 p.m. each week.

A brand new rotating [claiming series](#) with enticing final purses is scheduled for the Friday cards beginning on May 12. All competing horsepersons must complete the [racing application](#) before they race a horse. Call the racing office at (607) 699-7688 for [more information](#). 2023 Buckeye Stallion Series kicks off today

The 2023 Buckeye Stallion Series begins today (April 30) with the first leg for 3-year-old filly trotters at Miami Valley Raceway. Five divisions will go to the gate with each race carrying a purse of \$20,000.
