John Campbell reveals his power super power

This and other probing questions in our jumbo-sized Q & A of the harness racing legend.

For many years, back in my days at *The Canadian Sportsman*, we ran a light Q & A feature called Post Parade where we asked industry luminaries a series of horse racing and general life questions.

Hall of Famer John Campbell was featured in Post Parade in 2005. A few days ago, Campbell agreed to another round of Post Parade-style questions. Afterward, I looked back at the initial Q & A to see what, if anything, had changed over nearly 20 years. Naturally, Campbell was remarkably consistent.

But one question and answer stuck out from 2005 considering the mission Campbell has been on in his current role as CEO of the Hambletonian Society:

If you were the commissioner of all of harness racing, what would be the first thing you would do?

"Universalize our rules on racing, medication, everything. We should have universal rules, especially between Canada and the United States. The whipping rule is one of the biggest things and the pylon rule. To me, it is ludicrous when a guy is sitting in a simulcast parlour and the two biggest simulcasting outlets, Woodbine and The Meadowlands, have different rules on whipping and pylons violations."

Before we pick out a few more gems from that old Q & A, here's the most recent one:

What one horse do you wish you had driven that you never did?

"Somebeachsomewhere. He was just an amazing horse."



What sticks with you the most from the glory days of The Meadowlands, beyond the great purses?

"Just how the management side of it was set up and how everything ran so smoothly. And how everybody, from top to bottom, whether it was management or horsemen, had to be accountable for what they did. I really think that played into a lot of success at The Meadowlands at that time. You had Bob Quigley, who was the general manager and he was so visible. He was on the backside four or five times a week. You had Joe DeFrank and he was completely in charge of the racing side of it. He had his finger on everything that was going on in the backstretch and in the paddock and putting the races together. That's one thing that stands out to me.

"If you weren't rowing in that direction, it didn't take long until you were. Again, that went for horsemen and staff, too. There were very few times when there was dissention, but when there was, it was addressed quickly.

"It was the big leagues, there was no question about that. 'This is the way we do things here' was expected from everyone on both sides of the aisle.

"[I also remember] the first time I came up to the front paddock in 1978, I couldn't believe the noise. Just that whole drum sound [of the crowd], a buzzing sound, almost. I couldn't believe how loud it was. You got used to it quickly, but the first time when I hit the top of those stairs, I couldn't believe how loud the people around that front paddock were.

"Also, just how popular The Meadowlands was during that period when you were out, away from the track in Bergen County. Everybody in Bergen County was aware of The Meadowlands at that time and would go, not regularly, but periodically. People away from the track were so aware of The Meadowlands and that's not the case anymore in Bergen County.

"My oldest daughter, Lisa, when she started high school, pretty much everybody knew who I was. [My youngest daughter] Brittany is 11 years younger and when she started high school very few people knew who I was.

Beyond your own (white and maroon), who has the best racing colors?

"I've got to go back to when I was a kid. I always liked Ronnie Feagan's colors. I was a big fan of Ronnie Feagan growing up. He was older than me and our families were friends and I just thought his colors were cool... They were red and white and he had stars across the back."

If you could go back in time and see any horse race in history, where would you go and why did you pick that one?

"I've always been fascinated with Dan Patch. A horse going :55 at the turn of the century? If you could just go back knowing now what our horses look like and how they travel and then take a look at him and just his conformation, his gait and everything to see how it compared and how he could go in :55 back then... I don't care if he followed a windscreen or not, he still paced that, or close to it, and no one else was doing it. I think just comparing how he travelled and his conformation would be really interesting."

Beyond full crowds and the sport being popular, is there something else that was better about the sport in the past?

"Yes. The judging was stricter."

Name one thing today that's better than the past?

"No hub rails, for one thing. Also, the horses are a totally different, more athletic, better gaited, more gifted than ever. That's changed so much since I was a kid."

What is the most challenging track you've ever driven on?

"Well, I do have a funny story about the first time I raced at Woodbine when they put the 7/8th mile track inside the [thoroughbred] track there. The first turn at Woodbine took a little bit of getting used to and the first race I drove there, I forget who I was driving, but I let somebody go and went to come back right in the point of that turn and I just moved them over and they just about went on their head, just because that turn was so sharp. I knew I couldn't do that again. So, that was one of the things I learned about Woodbine quite quickly was that first turn. If you were taking out, you better do it gradually because I just did it like I would do it at The Meadowlands and they totally lost their qait."

What is the most difficult/challenging horse you've ever driven?

"Queens Over, but only because she kicked. She was the worse kicker I've ever driven. I raced her a little in the fall of her 3-year-old year and she would kick and then she got a break and she came back in the Overbid Series at The Meadowlands. In the post parade, I couldn't get her to stop kicking. She kicked and kicked. They had a bar up and she hit that and loosened it right up off the bolts. Joe Holloway and David Rovine had her. I said to myself, 'If I ever get off, I'm never getting back on.' So, I raced her and she won a leg of the Overbid and I thought to myself going back to the paddock from the winner's circle, 'How do I tell these guys — I'm driving 30 horses for them — that I'm not going to drive the best mare on the grounds right now?' So, I ended up driving her more. I kept that to myself."

Did you ever splurge on anything crazy after winning a major race?

"No, I really haven't."

What is your perfect day?

"Get up in the morning, have my coffee and read. Have breakfast with [my wife] Paula. Get a quick workout in. Go to the golf course and play. Then meet my family for dinner after playing qolf."

Beside family, who was your hero growing up.

"Ronnie Feagan."

Who is the greatest hockey player of all time and why?

"Wayne Gretzky, because of everything he was able to accomplish. Scoring goals is the way you win games and nobody did it better.

Greatest golfer of all time?

"The guy with the most majors – Jack Nicklaus. I've marvelled at what Tiger [Woods] has done and I think Tiger did what he did against a deeper pool of more talented golfers than Jack did, but Jack's got the most majors."

What's the best lesson your three daughters ever taught you?

"That is a good question... Just a funny story and it's actually a lesson. I had my oldest two daughters — this was before Brittany was born — at a hockey game. My middle daughter Michelle, she would be maybe 7 or 8, and Lisa was 2 years older. We were watching the game. Lisa really liked hockey and watched it. Michelle was looking around and she just said to



What expression did your mom always say to you that you swore you would never say to your kids — but you ended up saying it to your kids anyway?

"Nothing really that nags in your mind. I think something both my mom and dad did say to us when we were kids when my sister and I would fight was, 'One day you'll look back and you'll be best friends and you'll never even think of fighting with your sister again.' That is something I would say to my daughters when they would argue and they thought it was totally ridiculous at the time. The three generations of us laugh about it now."

What's your best "brush with a celebrity" story?

"I play a lot of golf with [former NFL player and NBA broadcaster] Ahmad Rashad, who's a really good friend of mine. I played with him and Michael Jordan one day. We were playing a par 3 over water. I hit my first shot in the water. I put my next shot in the hole. I was bitter about putting my first one in the water. I was kind of excited about going in the hole. Ahmad couldn't believe it. He said, 'It's in the hole.' Jordan hardly batted an eye, looked up and said, 'Nice par.' Ahmad and I still laugh about that. It didn't faze him one iota."

What skill or trait do people underestimate most about what makes a great driver?

"Lack of fear."

"It was great. Bill and I had a great time, we just really enjoyed it so much. It's really something to see. It's a sports spectacle. To sum it up briefly, it was just an amazing experience."

He said he and McLinchey took notes.

"Big events is something we are both involved in and we kind of compared notes after each day, but there are some things that just don't apply to us because the scale is so large and they are dealing with just massive numbers of people and massive numbers of dollars," Campbell said. "We just can't do that – it's just not feasible for us, but we came out of there with some things that we are going to bring back to our teams and discuss.

"We actually had a Meadowlands-Breeders Crown meeting this past week and, yeah, I brought some of the things up that we'd like to incorporate or at least discuss it.

"One thing, we want to get the drivers for the Hambletonian presented to the public in front of the grandstand in the winner's circle.

"The jocks... when they come out of the jock's room, they have to walk right by this new paddock expansion [at Churchill Downs]. The crowd just loved it. They were lined up in post-position order and walked out. The big cheer came up when they went out and people really liked that. I think we need to


get our horses and drivers closer to the people. Obviously, we don't have a front paddock at The Meadowlands, so we can't get them any closer with the horses, but we'd like to get the drivers presented some time prior to Hambletonian in front of the grandstand. They do that at the Elitlopp.

Campbell said he was also impressed that there were free programs and free food in many areas at the Derby.

"It's a high quality, free program and they are just sitting on a table and you just walk by and grab one. Again, that goes back to the massive amounts of dollars that we're talking about. So, they can do that. Even the alcohol and food is free in almost every area. You just walk by and they are giving away beers. You've got to tip, but other than that, that was something that I found remarkable as "well."

"That was throughout the whole grandstand. Now, there are difference foods that you have to buy, but there were certainly plenty of food and snacks included with the ticket price for everybody."



Craig Henderson is no dummy when it comes to bridge or harness racing

"Of all the people I've known in life, Richard Young is the most honest, ethical partner that I've ever had. But that's only part of the story. I'm saving the other part for a certain best seller that I'm never going to write. It would be called 'Richard is Richard."

That quote comes from prominent horse owner Craig Henderson. Although Henderson had been first exposed to horse racing by his grandfather when he was about 12 years old, it was through his association with Young that he started on the road to becoming a prominent owner.

Let's start with your grandfather.

"My grandfather was the kind of person that just about any kid would love to have been able to spend time with. He lived in Rochester, NY. I would spend time there each summer with my grandparents. He would take me fishing one day on the Finger Lakes and then the next day we would go to the Finger Lakes thoroughbred track. There was a hitch though. The age for admittance to the track was 18. I was a long way from that age. He'd go to the guard at the gate and tell him that I was small for my age. The guard would look skeptically and say that I didn't look old enough. My grandfather would put a couple of bucks down and ask the guard if I was aging. He'd raise the ante if necessary to the point where I was okay to enter. In the evening, we would go to Batavia Downs. My grandmother, who liked harness racing and didn't care for the runners, would come with us to Batavia. So, when I seriously started in harness racing, it wasn't totally unknown to me."

There was a long period of time between going to the races with your grandparents and when you became an owner.

"I spent my entire career in the municipal bond money management business. My biggest love in life other than my family is in playing competitive bridge. That is how I met Richard Young. In 2005, we played together as partners in a random online game. We also became friendly. We were both big golfers. Richard invited me to play with him at his club in Florida. I thought 'Why not?' I booked a flight to Fort Lauderdale and met Richard at his club in Boca Raton.

"Richard had a friend of his join us in our threesome. This guy was a serious golfer. I think his handicap was either a two or three. I asked him his name. He was Steve Condren. I asked him what he did for a living. He drove harness horses, specializing with young horses who were just beginning their racing careers. I became interested. I asked Richard why he hadn't told me about Steve and what he did. I really don't remember his answer.

"Richard and I continued to play bridge and became friends. For a few years, Richard would ask me to join him in his annual yearling purchases, with the stern warning that if I became his partner, I could own no more than 49 per cent of any horse we owned. For two or three years, I resisted his invitation. In 2008, the year of the financial collapse, he told me his luck had been so bad, I needed to come in with him on a yearling to help change it. I thought it over and told him I would come in for as much of a percentage as \$25,000 would buy. He bought a filly for \$75,000. That filly was Put On A Show. She of course went on to earn \$2,406,628 and become a world champion. What a way to start!

"I remained as Richard's partner for about five years. We were both doing well — in the horse business, that is. Things began to unravel between us and the situation eventually became untenable. Put On A Show and two of her foals were sold and Richard bought me out.

"Now quite a few years later, I look back and think how much I learned from Richard, who was most generous with his time and knowledge. The number one lesson I learned in this business, came from him. In essence, it is don't throw good money after bad. If they are no good, then find them another home. As of this year, I'm carrying that forward a bit to say that if they do not race at 2, then someone else needs to own them."

So, at this point, if you are to stay in the business, you are in effect on your own?

"No. Chris Ryder was still my trainer. We had established a great relationship. He was my main man then and I expect and hope that he will always be. He is honest, a hard worker and as ethical a horse trainer as I've ever been around."

of all the people I've known in life, Richard Young is the most honest, ethical partner that I've ever had. But that's only part of the story. I'm saving the other part for a certain best seller that I'm never going to write. It would be called 'Richard is Richard.'


But you also have horses with other trainers?

"I do and they are all people in who I have great trust. Nevertheless, Chris is and always will be my main man. I also have horses with Ronnie Burke, Linda Toscano and Dave Menary. To a great degree, I am with them because my partners and I have a relationship and trust with these folks. Speaking of partners, not only my partners, but other people throughout the sport, this business is loaded with wonderful people.

"My partners are all great people. I am friends with most of them both in and out of harness racing. For the most part we have complete trust in our trainers and they call the shots with our horses. I have a wonderful group of partners including Bob Mondillo, Pete Mazzella, Bill Donovan, Scott Dillon, Joe Sbrocco, Michelle Crawford and Libby Jones. I'm sure I've left out somebody, for which I apologize. Steve Stewart, Mark Mullen and Adam Bowden have also been good friends and advisors. Referencing Ronnie Burke, he has to be the eighth wonder of the world. In case he ever gets tired of training horses, he can teach a course in business management at Wharton or the Harvard Business school."

You've had a pleasurable and profitable experience in your time in the sport, but are there a few things you feel that need to be done to improve it?

"That is a huge understatement. I have two pet peeves that can, in my opinion, be easily rectified, if the people involved would only and quite easily do something about it.



"The first relates to why do the authorities, most specifically the racing commissions, make it so difficult for people to participate as owners? We are in the 21st century. Hasn't anyone there heard of Docusign? Why do they insist on actual signed signatures on paper? Its archaic! Why does every state need fingerprints? One set should do the job. Some states require new fingerprints after three years. How silly is that? Do your fingerprints ever change? I don't believe so.

"The second area that concerns me a great deal is horse aftercare. I contribute to several organizations involved in caring for our equine athletes who are no longer racing. More people need to participate. It's an obligation and I believe a necessity. The decision of the USTA board to do away with mandatory freeze branding is likely the most asinine and irresponsible act that board has ever perpetuated. The horse with the freeze brand is easy to recognize and possibly rescue when that horse ends up, as far too many do, in a kill pen. Why would they do such a horrible thing?"


How many horses do you have today?

"I have six who are 3 or older, seven 2-year-olds, four yearlings and five broodmares, two of which have already foaled. It's important to mention that I don't own all of any of the horses. That to me makes sense on a practical basis. It also, in no small part, has fostered great relationships between me and my partners. Adding up the percentages of the horses of racing age, I try to limit my total ownership of racehorses each season to four entire horses."

You mentioned that playing competitive bridge is still your greatest passion.

"It is and I suppose it always will be. Next in line is investing my personal money. I love the investment business. I've worked hard and achieved some success for myself and my clients. Third, but not that far off is the horse business, every facet of it. I love going to the sales and shopping for yearlings. I love watching these yearlings develop and become racehorses. I also love life. I enjoy fly fishing and travel. We have a home in Park City Utah where we spend seven months a year. My wife still skis, but I gave it up a while ago. We enjoy restaurants and love finding good new ones. I love golf and play regularly. Actually, I leave tonight on a seven-day golfing trip in Ireland."







Customer Support delivers the fun for White-Engel partnership

Trainer Dave White will turn 79 in August, and while he may not be as spry as he once was, his interest in developing horses is as strong as ever. His current project is Customer Support, a Dover Dan—Talkin Tootsie sophomore competing in the Expression Series at Harrah's Hoosier Park. To date, the gelding has hit the board in each of his five seasonal starts, winning twice.


"He's just a fun horse to have in the barn," said White. "He just acts like one of those that wants to be a racehorse. He's just a fun horse to race."

As a 2-year-old, Customer Support picked up two wins over the course of 11 starts at Hoosier Park. While the trotter wasn't a frequent visitor to the winner's circle for White and owner Ted Engel, he returned to the paddock only twice without earning a check. On a couple of occasions untimely breaks prevented him from finishing higher in the order. Steered by Indiana Hall of Famer Jay Cross, the trotter managed to bank just shy of \$30,000 to close out the campaign.

"His brain wasn't keeping up with his ability to go forward," said White with a laugh. "A couple of those breaks were colt breaks. I changed a couple of things, and Jay has such steady hands, things just progressed from there."

Customer Support is the second foal from Cantab Hall mare Talkin Tootsie. White, who is stabled at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, watched his full-brother, Talk Show Host, train down and race for fellow fairgrounds-based conditioner Jeff Edwards. That played a factor when looking at yearlings during the 2022 Hoosier Classic sale.

"When Mr. Engel and I went to look at this colt, he was a sharp colt," White said of the \$22,000 yearling purchase. "He's turned out to be fun for everybody."

The fun isn't derived purely from his performance on the track. The veteran horseman also cites the precocious trotter's personality in and around the barn.

"This colt, he just loves having that front door open and watching the horses on the track," White said. "He's very alert. He'll get fired up in the stall on his own, and sometimes I have to put kicking chains on him. It's not as bad as last year. He's matured a little bit to that extent. I don't like putting anything on his hocks, but I didn't have a choice."

When racing at Hoosier Park, horses are required to arrive in detention several hours in advance. Those conditions can be trying for Customer Support.

"He has trouble at the track, especially with a couple of hours of detention," White said. "He'll get fired up. I usually sit with him most of the night just in case he does get fired up, then I'll put him in a cross tie, just to try to keep him calm."

This winter, Customer Support grew up, filled out, and he made great strides in maturity. With Cross in Florida early in the Hoosier Park meet, trainer and catch-driver Robert Taylor picked up the drive behind the sophomore. Steering the gelding four times, Taylor won twice to go along with a runner-up and third-place effort. In the most recent start Wednesday (May 8), one of Taylor's horses drew into the same race. Cross took the reins and piloted Customer Support to a third-place performance in the second leg of the Expression.

"I put Spence down first and Jay second," White said of choosing between the two. "You're talking about two accomplished horsemen and fine gentlemen. They don't have any attitude problems."

This season, Customer Support, bred by Black Creek Farm and Hickory Hollow Stables, has collected \$19,340 while raising his career tally to \$49,205. Through the years, White and Engel have teamed to campaign top horses in the Hoosier State, including 2009 Indiana Sires Stakes final

winner Solvent. The then-freshman trotter, owned by Engel and Frank McCurdy, went on to earn over \$350,000 for his connections.

"I've had him in the barn 35 years," White said of the partnership with Engel. "I've been so fortunate. We've had some good ones and we've had some others."

White currently has three horses in training. Besides Customer Support, the conditioner is working with a pair of freshman trotters. One, a Don't Let'em colt named Machado, was purchased last fall by Engel and Tom Kindell.

"I said I was going to go until I was 80," White said, adding with a chuckle. "Mr. Engel called me before the sale this year and said, 'I'm going on 90, want to go another year?' When Ted pulls the plug, I'm going to have a big sale."

Until then, both men are enjoying the exploits of their latest winner, Customer Support. The sophomore will compete in next week's Expression final before getting a short break and launching into Indiana Sires Stakes action, where White knows anything is possible.

"We're just letting him tell us what to do," White said. "You'd like to hit a lick and get a leg or two of it, but the main thing is soundness and being able to maintain where he is at. He's usually in the race and he gives you a shot. If we can stay together, we'll have a lot of enjoyable races this year."

BIRTHDAYS AND ANNIVERSARIES

- The oldest living Hall of Famer Bruce Nickells (96 on July 5) celebrates 60 years since he debuted in the Hambletonian with Scribe Rodney (8-6-7). That year of 1964 saw Ayres take down the third Trotting Triple Crown following Scott Frost in 1955 and Speedy Scot in 1963.
- 2024 marks the 60th year of operation for HHI (Harness Horsemen's International). David Buckson was their first president in 1965 in Montreal their birthplace welcoming "any member of any horsemen's association."
- May 8 is not only the 20th birthday of Foiled Again but the 61st anniversary of the foaling date of Fresh Yankee. The 1971

HOY, the first North American bred millionaire, was a daughter of Hickory Pride—Pert Yankee bred by NY Yankee star outfielder Charlie "King Kong" Keller. Her 31 20-11-0 \$359,002 (\$900 yearling) was her 1971 slate for Sanders Russell (first trainer) and Joe O'Brien.

- May 20 marks the 27th anniversary of the passing of Harry Burright of Macomb, IL. The 1948 North American dash-leader with 129 wins and career totals of 2,671 and \$5,069,986 in earnings, was Illinois Hall of Fame bound in 1979.
- Scotty Zeron turns 35 on May 23. He's coming off his first \$10 million season, surpassed \$100 million for his career as well as earning his first "Driver of the Year" title given by USHWA.
- Jet Laag turned 31 years old recently getting the jump on his 25th anniversary of his epic 1:49 effort in 1999 on the half at Delaware, OH. Linda Toscano looking to defend her Jug/Jugette titles in 2024 was the trainer of Jet Laag.
- It's been 98 years since Hal Dale was foaled in Indiana. He later sired Adios in 1940 and Dale Frost in 1951. Dale then sired Meadow Skipper. Remember him? For eight straight years now the USHWA Driver of the Year has not yet been over 40 years old. David Miller was the last to win it at an age past 40. Miller did it in his 50s in back-to-back (2015-16) years.

A VERY GOOD YEAR

How successful was Hanover Shoe Farms as of December 1965? Well,, the following nine stallions had their books already closed for 1966: Tar Heel (\$3,500), Bullet Hanover (\$5,000), Stars Pride (\$5,000), Caleb (\$1,000), Ayres (\$2,000), Hickory Smoke (\$2,000), Gamecock (\$500), Lehigh Hanover (\$1,500) and Dancer Hanover (\$750).

:55 IN 55

Luther Lyons was the driver who broke the existing world record with a 1:55 mile at Vernon Downs in 1955 with Adios Harry. Then another son of Adios, Adios Butler, would break that and then another son of Adios, Bret Hanover, would take it down to 1:53.3 in the fall of 1966 at the The Red Mile.

Canadian Mike's love of Down Under racing

Canadian Mike Tanev's growing love affair with Down Under harness racing means his alarm goes off at some weird and wonderful times through the night.

Throw in the fact he's got two sons playing NHL hockey — Christopher (for the Dallas Stars) and Brandon (Seattle Kraken) — and Mike admits to burning the midnight oil to feed his two passions and hobbies in life.

But the 64-year-old Toronto-based car broker wouldn't change a thing.

"I don't drink, I don't smoke and I don't gamble anymore, either," Mike said. "If I'm up late watching games or the alarm wakes me at 3:30 a.m. to watch a race at Albion Park [in Brisbane, Australia], then there's worse things to do. I'll just watch it and go back to sleep.

"You can call me crazy and maybe I am, but I love it."

Mike races "about 10 horses" in North America, but is now up to "about 15, including mares and foals" across Australia and New Zealand.

"I've said it before, I like the horsepeople more down there, than I do here," he said. "That might upset some people, but it's a fact."

Down Under, Mike has quickly become known as "that Aardie man" through the deeds of his best horses, headed by star 5-year-old mare Aardies Express, who recently beat local champion Ladies In Red in Australia's biggest mares' race, the Group 1 Queen Elizabeth II Mile at Menangle in Sydney.

So, where does the "Aardie" moniker, which Mike attaches to every horse he possibly can, actually come from.

"It's my nickname," he said. "It's what everybody calls me. It goes back to when I was 18 and playing baseball. I've got a big nose and the guys called me 'Aardie, the Aardvark.


"So, when I really started getting into the horses, I wanted to build a brand and Aardie it was. Any horses I buy, I change their names if I possibly can."

Two of those making waves in Australia now are Aardies Express and Aardiebytheseaside.

Remarkably, despite Mike's growing investment and passion for Down Under, he's yet to visit to see any of his horses or trainers.

"That might change late next year," he said. "My son is getting married in Manila and I'm planning to go from there to New Zealand, then across to Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne and even Perth before I go home.

"I've got to do it once in my life. I dread long flights. I've been in four car crashes and have all sorts of problems with my back,





so the long flights are my enemy, but I've met so many great people down there, I have to see them, and some of my horses, in person."

Mike admits Aardies Express' Queen Elizabeth win was up with any for thrill and satisfaction.

"For so many reasons, the main one being what she overcame to do it," he said. "She's had so many injuries along the way and then she comes out and runs down a champion in Ladies In Red. It was a privilege racing Ladies In Red, let alone beating her.

"I hear she will race on to Brisbane [for the Golden Girl] and that's great. I can't wait for Aardies Express to race her again."

Let's go back to the start with Aardies Express, who was called Glenledi Express when Mike bought her online through Gavelhouse.

"She'd just been broken in and had her first session [preparation] with Mark Smolenski," Mike said. "I gave her to Steve Dolan to train, but she ran off the track, through a fence and almost killed herself and Steve. He rang and said she was too dangerous to keep training, so I called Steve Telfer and he said he'd take her.

"She missed her 2-year-old career because she was too big, but they could see the ability there. She won eight of her first nine starts, but then fractured a cannon bone and missed all the 3-year-old stakes [feature] races. Instead of putting a screw in, we just gave her time to recover.

"She'd also had a micro fracture in a knee, which ultimately led to the decision to move her to Australia. The vet, Tim Montgomery, said she'd need a specific training plan and a water walker." in my life. I dread long flights. Enter young former NZ horseman, Jack Trainor, who is based at the fantastic on-course training centre at Menangle.

"Jack wanted her," Mike said. "I knew him because I'd bought some horses from him and he stayed at my place for a few days a couple of years back. He was convinced he had access to everything at Menangle to follow Tim's plan and he desperately wanted the mare. She thrived in the routine, but it didn't start well in her first qualifier [trial] when the hopples were too long

and she broke stride a few times. Jack [Trainor] fixed that and then she went super time winning a trial and [came] home in :25.2.

"Then came her first race and she sat parked and went 1:48.9 at her first race for four months. I'd always hoped she was special and that showed she was. When Jack told me the [barrier] draw for the Queen Elizabeth, with Ladies In Red in 2 and us in 9, I thought we were right up against it, but she came out and won again. It was amazing."

Mike watched on his phone in Dallas where he was watching son Chris in the NHL playoffs.

"I've watched it 100 times again since and I'm still amazed," he said. "I thanked Tim [Montgomery] and Steve [Telfer]; they've been such a big part of getting her to here and Jack's done his part, too.

"All going well, she'll head to Queensland now for their big races in your winter [July at Albion Park]."

At the same time, on the other side of Australia in Perth, Mike's other star mare Aardiebytheseaside is creating headlines with her new trainer Greg Bond.

She made it two wins from as many starts with Bond at Gloucester Park last Friday week and driver Deni Roberts said she's so good she will be able to match it with the boys in big races going ahead.

"She was good in NZ, but kept running into Millwood Nike, who was incredible and better than us," Mike said. "I sold a half share of the racing rights of her to Greg Bond at the end of last season because she would've had to race Aardies Express if she'd stayed in NZ. I knew Greg bought a lot of horses from NZ, so I just called him. I'll take her back to breed when she's finished racing.

"Greg's been amazing. What a gentleman to deal with from that first call to every chat since. It's great to see she's started well over there and that they have a big opinion of her. She's a big mare, although not as big as Aardies Express. I'd never even thought of racing a horse in Perth before because of that small track [Gloucester Park], but I'm glad I have with her and it's given me the chance to meet Greg [Bond].

"Aardiebytheseaside has been a real success story. I bought her as a weanling for just \$1,500. As far as her racing goes, Greg's in charge. I've told him he's the captain and to just drive the boat. Having a horse in Perth adds to how far I've got them spread Down Under. Across New Zealand, as well as Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne and now Perth. All the more reason why I'm going to have to make that trip down your way that I'm talking about next year."

SATURDAY

We are in scramble mode at the farm. Horses always need to be taken care of. You can't just decide one morning to hop on a plane to Bali for a few weeks, or fracture a hip like Paul did yesterday and forget about the horses. Paul told me that people in the harness racing community are usually very kind about helping each other, and even a pariah like him could make a few calls, but he did not want to ask for help.

I was on fire this morning with good suggestions. They just kept popping into my head.

My first idea, which Paul and Bart gave a big thumbs up, is that I need to renew my driver's license. My license expired three years ago. As a member of the severe drug user's society, I never renewed it. Why should I? I did not have a car, was afraid I could be a menace under the influence, and could not afford a car, insurance, gas, or even the money to take the test. I needed every dime for you know what.

My mom will take me to the DMV on Monday morning before she takes me to the horse farm. Paul is arraigning insurance so that I can drive his truck. The guys seemed astonished that I have a clean driving record and have no problems driving a large pickup truck. Paul asked if I would check on his grandmother a few times daily. He will have limited movement when he returns to the farm today. In the meantime, we will both keep our phones handy.

Another idea came from a chat my mom and I had. Alice Riggins, one of her pinochle friends, volunteers for an organization that brings daily meals to families in need, and while Paul's family is not in need, the meals are delicious and homemade. Plus, now that his sister is in a nursing home, the person who delivers the meals can offer some socialization for Grandmother Edith. I told my mom they might want to make the delivery person a saint because Edith is prickly.

More ideas were that Paul rent or buy a golf cart to get around, and Bart could use the boards and plywood from the old barn to build a temporary ramp to the house's front door. All this chaos takes my mind off using drugs. I can't help but remember that Paul got clean when all hell broke loose after his grandfather died, so maybe, just maybe.

MONDAY

Today was good. I passed the written driver's exam but needed a live driver test. I lucked out because things were slow at the DMV, and I took a guy for a spin around the block in my mom's car with a tester who had an opening in his schedule. No problem. I am ready to roll. I will drive Paul's pickup. It feels good to have "wheels" and not be dependent. Paul stayed in the house today, but Bart and I took the fillies out for a brisk two-mile drive. When I finished tidying up the barn and filling their feed bucks, I felt accomplishment and satisfaction wash over me as I walked to the truck to drive to the NA meeting.

TUESDAY

It is official. I will train two of the 2-year-old fillies, Annie and Lady M, the two most sensible horses. Bart will train the other fillies. Paul hopes to train or call a friend as they progress towards qualifying speed. Until then, I have been confident and anxious about being an instant horse trainer with Paul as my full-time mentor.

A new problem popped up. There seem to be problems every day in horse racing and horse training. I went one lap with Annie in tandem with Paul jogging "Miss N Tooth" (isn't that the worst name ever?) Paul waved me to come off the track. I did not know what was wrong. After all, I did not know what I was doing, but he did not like how Annie was trotting. He looked closely at her knee and asked me to feel the right and the left ankles and see if one was warmer. The right one was warmer, no doubt. Paul muttered to himself. I picked up words like: ice, blister, pin, fire, wrap, and x-ray. These words do not sound good.

WEDNESDAY

Owners can change a horse's name. "Miss N Tooth" is now officially "Miss Chievous," I suggested changing it to one word: Mischievous. Owners who want to change names need to come up with a name that is not the same as another horse, and Mischievous was unavailable. So, we tinkered around, and Miss Chievous was the result. The name change was fun.

Not so much fun was a woman passed out in her folding chair just before we sat down for the NA meeting. She hit the floor with a clunk. Rachel, the moderator, a former nurse, checked her breathing; it was okay, but she went into spasms. An emergency room is less than a mile from the church, so two guys drove her in a car. We all had seen similar scenes, but this happening at an NA meeting rattled us.

THURSDAY

The vet visited Annie this morning. It was interesting. The vet took an x-ray right in the stall. It was also interesting that the vet, whose name I forgot, said he was unsure what the problem was with Annie's leg. When the vet said to "rest her for a few weeks," I thought, well, that won't run up your bill. But I respected his honesty.

FRIDAY

Today was a fun day. Paul's hip makes it uncomfortable to get into and out of his truck and sit. The weather was sunny and warm. He had a list of stops I needed to drive him to, such as stores, doctors, pharmacies, and the post office. I tossed a few bales of straw into the bed of the truck. He scooted his rear end into the truck bed and made a little nest to rest his leg and hip. We communicated using our cell phones as I drove and darted from place to place. We got every item on the list and were back with plenty of time to get the horses out.

"You can tell they are Coreys when you see them. They are smart, cooperative, and have great bodies overall. He gives them substance, good bone, and the majority stand correct."

Elista Hanover wins fourth straight in Meadows PASS

Elista Hanover charged through the lane and extended her winning streak to four in Friday's (May 10) Pennsylvania Sires Stake at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows. **Green Fee** and **Upallnight Hanover** captured the other divisions in the event for 3-year-old filly trotters.

Elista Hanover entered the stake, known as the Meadow Bright, as the "now" horse after her impressive win in the \$50,000 Weiss series championship at Pocono. She lived up to the billing, powering first up for David Miller to wear down She Shaq and edge her by a head in 1:53.3. Tracks Of My Tears completed the ticket.

Annie Stoebe, who trains the \$240,000 yearling acquisition and owns with R. Lynn Curry and Philomena Curry, likes to joke that the daughter of International Moni—Evermore, at times can be a "goofy" chestnut, but she was all business Friday for Miller.

"She's really been behaving well," he said. "It's always in the back of your mind that she might get a little silly, but so far, so good. She put in another great race today. She's been awesome, really."

Green Fee was a four-race maiden entering the stake, and her recent lines were pocked with breaks. But she moved powerfully first over from fourth for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. and pulled off the 23-1 shocker in 1:56.2. Ihaveadream De Vie was a half-length back in second, with Somthintobelievein third.

"She's a very fast horse," said trainer Kevin Johnson of his faith in Beentheredonethat Racing's daughter of Greenshoe—Hollywood Hill. "Last week we didn't quite have her hung up right. I figured if Ronnie could keep her flat, she'd get the job done."

Dave Palone wasn't necessarily looking for a Lightning Lane trip for Upallnight Hanover, but when the opportunity arose, he seized it.

"That's never an option until it's your last option," Palone said. "Especially with the young ones, I like to go right. But when I headed her in there, she was a total professional."

The daughter of Bar Hopping—Upfront Ob's Janet edged the rallying Sambuca Hanover by a head, with early leader Little Town Road third. Upallnight Hanover recorded a lifetime mark of 1:54.4 and boosted her career bankroll to \$110,475 for trainer Ake Svanstedt and owner Journey Horses Inc.

With the victory, Palone surpassed \$160 million in career purses.

PA Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters

PJ's Dream, Ciao Time, Wish List and **Dubai** each took a split in Friday's Pennsylvania Stallion Series.

Dubai had only a pair of qualifiers since Nov. 20, but she had little trouble rolling first over from third to triumph in a career-best 1:54.2 for Palone, trainer Noel Daley and owner Fred Hertrich III. Happy Chopper was second, beaten 1¼ lengths, while Standin Over earned show.

"I wanted to track the favorite and not move until I had to," Palone said. "And when I put her in the fight going into the last turn, I felt like she would win the battle. She had a great attitude, her ears were working, I took the plugs out, and the rest is history."

Aaron Merriman and Palone each piloted three winners on the 13-race card.

Driver Jeremy Smith didn't make it to the winner's circle until the seventh race, but drove five winners total on the 16-race card; juxtaposed with 16 different trainers who made it to the winner's circle on opening night.

The 90-day 2024 Eldorado Scioto Downs race meet runs through Saturday (Sept. 14). Races are held Tuesday-Saturday, with special holiday cards on Memorial Day and Labor Day taking place instead of the Tuesday card that week. First post is at 5:45 p.m. each day except for Thursday (July 4) with a post of 3:15 p.m. and Friday (Sept. 13) which will have a 6:15 p.m. post to help accommodate horsemen attending the Ohio Selected Yearling Sale. Fade Out proved to be highly competitive in the first two legs of the TrackMaster Series for fillies and mares on the pace with a rating of 84 or less, but came up short on both occasions.

Friday night (May 10) at The Meadowlands, in the series' \$23,000 final, a perfect trip for the Jeff Cullipher trainee led to a jaunt down victory lane.

"Good trips make for happiness," said winning driver Tim Tetrick.
"She's been knocking on the door and finally got it done tonight."

After finishing a close-up third and second in her attempts in the preliminaries, all went well in the final, as Fade Out sat fifth to the half while the top two choices — 5-2 shots Pattycake Mooss and Anna's Wish — were at each other's throats through a half of :55.4 over a track rated sloppy.

Around the far turn, Tetrick had Fade Out, a 5-year-old by Sportswriter—Fade, in perfect second-over striking position following last week's leg 2 upset winner Two Pistol Annie as Anna's Wish hit three-quarters in 1:23.2. From there, Fade Out was tipped off her cover as they straightened up for the stretch drive and paced right by her foes to record a safe three-quarter-length win in 1:51.1. Century Jamila, who blasted away from post 10 to lead at the quarter in :27.3, finished second, with leg 1 winner Dontkarenifido third.

"I think that's her best game, sit back and see what happens," said a mud-covered Tetrick in the post-race back paddock interview. "Luckily, turning for home, we were second-over and got the right trip. Last week, I thought she would win and hung a little [when second]. When she gets on a roll, she's a pretty nice mare."

Owned by Pollack Racing, Fade Out now has 20 wins from 69 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$367,387. As the 4-1 third choice in the wagering, she returned \$10.00 to her backers.

A LITTLE MORE: Todd McCarthy followed up his four-winner night last Saturday with a three-bagger to lead the driver colony. He has nine wins over the last three race cards. Cullipher and Cory Stratton each had training doubles. All-source handle totaled \$3,113,950 on the 14-race card, the 30th time in 2024 that wagering surpassed \$3 million from a total of 36 programs.



Thanks to Murray Brown for the Archie McNeil memories

I thoroughly enjoyed reading about my fellow horseman, Archie McNeil, from back in the day, 1970, to be exact. Archie and I were stabled at the satellite training center for Maywood Park. Archie had some nice horses; mine were mostly low-level claimers. Engare was a muscular chestnut gelding with a broached mane. I bought him for \$300 just before I shipped from Northfield Park. The training center's track finishes slightly uphill, and I trained him faster than he'd have to go in a \$2,000 claimer (purse \$2,200). Those were the halcyon days of harness racing!

Being an excited young man of 22 years old, I bragged to Archie that "Engare" would win from the 8-hole on the front end (those who raced at Maywood knew how quick it was to the first turn). So he bet me \$10. Engare won going away, and he paid \$69.00 to win. When I saw Archie the next day, he thanked me since he used the \$10 to bet, figuring he couldn't lose. We had a wonderful laugh about it.

Sadly, like Archie, I also had to give up my dreams. Although I was a very talented driver while earning my license, as told to me by the presiding judges at the Jackson (Michigan) race track – great hands, awareness of the unfolding race, keeping a horse alive, and so on. Getting catch drives was like a root canal without Novocaine. A few years later, Bob Zimmerman (Song Cycle) said the same to me after winning a race at Washington Park. After his compliment, I asked to drive any of his horses; I'd do it for free. I wanted and needed the exposure, but his reply was 'NO." Why? I asked. 'Because you don't have enough experience." Huh?" I replied. "How is a guy like me ever going to get enough expertise if a man of your caliber won't at least give me a chance to prove myself?" 'Catch 22', he said. Soon after that painful lesson, I listed the pros and cons of my "future" in harness racing. Pros: family dynasties (nepobabies), successful. Cons: Independent stables, broke and struggling.

Fortunately, my aunt's husband worked for the U.S.'s largest wire and cable distributor. I started at the bottom, a warehouse "grunt" at \$3/hr. There, I learned everything about electrical and electronic wire and cable types, moved into sales, and eventually started my own successful value-added manufacturing company. I've retired, and two of my three sons are now running the operation. Kudos to you, Archie, with your family and other happy pursuits.

As my dad used to say, if life hands you a lemon, squeeze it and make lemonade.

Retirement is great, and although I live in Chicagoland, where harness racing is all but "dead," I still can watch it and, yes, bet thanks to TVG online. I hear the call to post. Keep those articles coming, Mr. Brown.

Time to fix boring races

I am tired of watching boring races where the first quarter is quick and second quarter is slow. Every race is the same. Just once I would love to see someone from the back move early.

There is no strategy, except do the same thing every race. I think one way to stop this problem is to force drivers to drive. How do you do this? Put in a lighted pole at the three-eighths. If no one moves off the rail from the back when the lead horse hits the pole, then the last four or five drivers are fined for not getting off the rail. The money can go into purses or charity.

The rule would have to be tweaked depending on the field size. Ten-horse field - trailing six drivers fined; nine-horse field - last five drivers fined; eight-horse field - last four drivers fined etc.

The other issue that needs to be fixed is odds tanking on a horse at the last minute. I can't believe I see a horse go from even money to 1-5 at the last second. There has to be a way that you can lock in odds on a horse up to five minutes before post. Sports betting can do this. Tracks are playing a dangerous game letting syndicates run the show. If they leave, tracks will close immediately.

The only way to build up customers is to not tick them off with rapid odds drops at the last second.

Time to shake things up!
