## American-bred Double Deceiver wins Sweden Cup on Elitloppet eve

The gelding, bred by Steve Stewart and Oakwood Farms was a winner for trainer Daniel Redén and driver Örjan Kihlström. Meanwhile, France continued its dominance of the Harper Hanovers.

The mood at Solvalla was electric when Saturday's (May 24) card offered really great performances throughout the whole day.

Today (May 25), the Elitloppet will be contested. A program for today's races is **here**. The post parade for the first Elitloppet heat will be at 9:19 a.m. ET.

Saturday's card started with the three elimination heats for the \$120,000 Sweden Cup and Daniel Redén could hardly dream of a better beginning of his Elitloppet weekend.

**Mister Hercules** (Trixton) impressed after a first over trip in heat 1 as he bested leader Click Bait and held quick finisher Guerrier Castelets behind by a head. Heat 1 replay **here**.

Örjan Kihlström sat in the bike and Redén/Kihlström continued winning in heat 2, where **Double Deceiver** (Cantab Hall) showed that he most likely enjoys racing with cover best. A second over trip and a three-wide attack throughout the last turn ended with a very comfortable win for the American-bred gelding. Heat 2 replay **here**.



Johan Untersteiner's **Dancer Brodde** (Bold Eagle) finished quickly from fourth over in the last elimination and claimed the victory in nice style. Heat 3 replay **here**.

Nine horses qualified for the final, three from Redén's stable (Gamin Jaba finished third in heat 3) and it looked good for Redén when the Sweden Cup was scheduled as race 7 on the card.

Double Deceiver drew post 1 behind the gate in the final and Kihlström acted as he was supposed to, aiming for the lead, keeping the opponents on his outside and Double Deceiver was answering to Kihlström's commands. Double Deceiver kept the lead and was allowed to keep the pace at a moderate level, which meant that the 6-year-old gelding, bred by Steve Stewart and Oakwood Farms, had everything under complete control all the way to the wire. Double Deceiver flew in the stretch, leaving challengers several lengths behind to win in 1:51.3.

Final replay here.

First over trotter Ideal San Leandro and pocket runner Dancer Brodde finished in a dead heat for the silver medal.

Kihlström has won the biggest races in the world, some of them several times, but he was still very happy after Double Deceiver's two wins at Solvalla.


"This is big, it's always pleasant winning races this weekend and it was very nice to feel Double Deceiver like this today," Kihlström said after the win. "He raced one week ago and we hoped for a better performance, a ticket to Elitloppet, but this turned out well. He has never felt better before in his European starts."

#### INMAROSA WINS HARPER HANOVERS

The race day concluded with the \$200,000 Harper Hanovers race over 3.140 meters.

French trotters have dominated this event many times and the 2025 edition ended with another big win for a strong horse born in the country of tricolor.

**Inmarosa** (Amiral Sacha) has battled against the very best trotters in Europe, in the Prix d'Amérique this year among other big events, but the really important, prestigious win was missing, until Saturday's race at Solvalla.

Driver Leo Abrivard solved his debut in Swedish start method without a problem and Inmarosa found a great position early into the race.

Napoleon Cash got fired up on the lead, but being eager in front over 3,140 meters is rarely a good thing if you want to win. This fact made the journey more pleasant for the well-merited trotters who started with a 40 meter disadvantage and Inmarosa was the horse that liked it best. She left her position in third over with 1,150 meters to go, attacked three wide, flew to the lead on the backstretch and kept her pace all the way towards the finish line. Chaser Kentucky River couldn't follow but held to second place ahead of Immortal Doc.

Winner Inmarosa did not just win the Harper Hanovers race, she claimed her first Group 1 victory and did it in a world-record mile rate of 1:55 over 3,180 meters!

France was on top in the biggest race at Solvalla on Saturday. Will it be the same today, in Elitloppet?

#### OLLY HÅLERYD TAKES JOVIALITY

The \$100,000 Joviality race for mares over 1,640 meters became a speed story as leader Channel Trio got way too fired up in front, which meant that favorite **Olly Håleryd** (Trixton) could sprint to a safe win far outside of the track. Olly Håleryd and Kihlström sat far back in the field when they headed into the last turn, but in the stretch Olly Håleryd was unstoppable and she claimed the win in a mile rate of 1:52.1. 

## AGCO issues 10-year suspension to trainer Jeff Gillis

The Ontario commission alleges Gillis bought illegal performance-enhancing drugs from convicted U.S. veterinarian Seth Fishman.

The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) has issued a 10-year suspension and \$40,000 penalty to standardbred trainer Jeffrey Gillis following an investigation by its equine drug unit.

The AGCO has been actively investigating potential violations of Ontario's horseracing anti-doping rules stemming from an international criminal investigation led by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The FBI investigation resulted in 27 horseracing trainers, veterinarians, and others being charged in the United States with offenses relating to the systematic shipment and administration of illegal performance enhancing drugs (PEDs) to racehorses competing across multiple jurisdictions.

Records recently obtained by the AGCO include evidence that Gillis purchased illegal PEDs — including a substance held out to be an illegal, blood-boosting synthetic erythropoietin (EPO) — from Seth Fishman. Fishman was a U.S.-based veterinarian who was among the 27 individuals charged by U.S. federal prosecutors for his role in the manufacture and distribution of PEDs designed specifically to evade equine anti-doping controls.

The AGCO's rules of racing explicitly state that no individual will possess or attempt to possess banned, non-therapeutic substances or medications. The AGCO has quickly moved to issue this ruling in order to protect the integrity of the sport and to safeguard horse welfare.


The AGCO's equine drug unit is staffed through a partnership between the AGCO and the Ontario Provincial Police Investigations and Enforcement Bureau. The unit routinely collaborates with local, national and international authorities to detect the use of illegal, and performance-enhancing drugs in Ontario.

A licensed horse racing participant issued a ruling under the rules of racing has the right to appeal the AGCO's action to the **Horse Racing Appeal Panel** (HRAP), an independent



adjudicative body mandated to hear appeals of the registrar's decisions made under the rules of racing.

"The AGCO will not tolerate doping in Ontario's horse racing industry," Dr. Karin Schnarr said. "This case underscores our unwavering commitment to protecting the integrity of the sport and the welfare of horses. Any attempt to cheat the system and use performance-enhancing drugs is a serious breach of trust and the AGCO will hold offenders accountable."

### Jimmy reflects on four Takter-tonians

From Malabar Man in 1997 through Pinkman in 2015, the three-time Hall of Famer reflects on triumphs in "the toughest race to win."

"The Hambletonian is the toughest race to win," said Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter.

The talented trainer knows of what he speaks, having won "America's Trotting Classic" four times, as a favorite, second choice, fourth choice, and even from the driver's seat.

After watching his first Hambletonian in 1978 when he was 17, it took less than 20 years for Takter to win his first at the age of 36.

"Well, you know, the first one was Mal Burroughs' horse, Malabar Man," Takter said of the 1997 race. "It was a great story. Mal Burroughs is the first amateur in modern times to win the Hambletonian, and it was my first Hambletonian. It's always very special, the first one. You know, it was great.

"And he was just the best horse. He was the best 2-year-old, best 3-year-old. He was just the perfect horse, really."

Even with Burroughs driving, Takter was confident they would get the job done.

Takter's first Hambletonian victory came with Mal Burroughs and Malabar Man in 1997.

"I did, you know, I really did," Takter said. "I drove him just once myself and I won with him in Kentucky. He was a really, really, really perfect horse. [Burroughs] almost screwed up because he stayed in, he sat up behind Trond [Smedshammer, driving Bowlin For Dollars], and, fortunately, Trond drifted out in the stretch and he came up inside him. You know, I was second in the race, as well."

Takter's Take Chances, driven by Wally Hennessey, closed to finish a length behind the winner.

"Take Chances was second in that race, so I had a backup horse behind [Malabar Man]," Takter said with a laugh. "But the right horse won the race. He was a way better horse than Take Chances was, even though Take Chances won the Futurity, which Malabar Man was never staked to."

Takter said Burroughs was actually a very good driver.

"He had good hands," Takter said. "He won the [Hambletonian] Oaks with Gleam [in 1994]. Everybody's so hung up on the drivers here and there, and, of course, there are very good drivers out there, but by the same token, if they don't have the horse, it doesn't matter."

Takter went on to say that people should show more love to the Hambletonian Oaks.

"We have to consider the Oaks like the Hambletonian as well because we can't discriminate against the ladies," Takter said. "[Driver] Yannick [Gingras] winning the Oaks five times in a row [2014-18 driving Takter's horses], I think that's never going to be broken.

"My six Breeders Crowns [wins as a trainer in a single year], who knows, that can be broken by somebody, but not five years in a row, same trainer and driver in the Hambletonian Oaks, that's unheard of."

It took 13 years for Takter to land in the Hambletonian winner's circle for the second time, this time with Muscle Massive in 2010.

In 2015, Takter won his last Hambletonian with Pinkman and joined owner John Fielding and driver Brian Sears in the winner's circle.

"That was a big gap for me, but, you know, it was early in my career and I started to get better horses in the 2000s," Takter said.

Sold at the Standardbred Horse Sale for \$425,000, Muscle Massive was the highest priced yearling of 2008. It was the fifth highest price ever for a yearling colt trotter.

"He was the most beautiful colt," Takter said. "He was, to me, probably the least good of my Hambletonian winners abilitywise. [Driver] Ron Pierce and me, we did a hell of a job with that horse. He got hurt as a 2-year-old [with a suspensory issue].

"So, he lost the whole 2-year-old season and coming back from scratch, unraced, to win the Hambletonian, of course it was a great accomplishment, but I give Ron Pierce a lot of credit for that one."

Four years later, 2014, was a good year for Takter.

"I was very fortunate that year because I had the three best colts," Takter said. "Father Patrick was by far the best out of the three, and you can say Trixton and Nuncio were kind of tied ability-wise."

Father Patrick, driven by Gingras, was the overwhelming Hambletonian favorite at 2-5, while the Takter-driven Trixton was the 4-1 second choice, followed closely by 9-2 third-choice Nuncio, driven by John Campbell.

"Trixton always had big issues with his hind ankles and he wasn't a sound horse and then when I drove the race, I almost lost him on the backside; he took a couple steps there," Takter said. "He wasn't comfortable and I just raced him, I think, once or twice after that and we retired him because his ankle was not [perfect]; I didn't want to disgrace the horse, because I love that horse. He was a really, really nice horse.

"But Father Patrick was outstanding. He should have won the race. He would have won the race if he didn't run at the gate."

Takter did not find out what happened to Father Patrick until after the race.



I got pissed at Yannick after [he picked Mission Brief over Pinkman], and I said, 'Yannick, well now you know you're going to get f -- ked, because now I'm going to beat your ass here.'
I could have driven the horse myself because I won the Hambletonian the year before, but Pinkman was so smart and he was a lazy horse and he knew me way too well... "I assumed that something must have happened because he wasn't around, but you have to focus on your own horse, you cannot concentrate on what's going on behind that, but, you know, that's horse racing," Takter said.

Training three horses in the Hambletonian could split your attention according to Takter, but if you're driving one, then you have to stay focused.

"I remember my wife said, 'Remember, you're driving our horse," Takter said with a laugh. "You know, I liked all three of those horses. In hindsight, it didn't matter for Father Patrick as much because he ended up being 3-Year-Old Colt [Trotter] of the Year and had a stallion career, and Trixton needed to win the Hambletonian to become commercial, and Nuncio, he won the Futurity, but he ended up going to Europe and winning Elitloppet (in 2016), so he ended up to be a top stallion over there, too.

"So, it's not easy when you have three horses as good at that. Trixton made a little shy of a million and the rest of them made way over a million, so we basically won everything that year with our 3-year-olds."

The next year, Takter again had a favorite heading into the Hambletonian.

Pinkman was driven by Gingras, who also drove the fantastic filly Mission Brief.

When both Pinkman and Mission Brief won their Hambletonian eliminations, a decision needed to be made by Gingras, and it did not go in Takter's favor.

"I got pissed at Yannick after that, and I said, 'Yannick, well now you know you're going to get f - - ked, because now I'm going to beat your ass here," Takter said.


Two-time Hambletonian champ Brian Sears was available, so Takter asked him to take the lines on Pinkman.

"I could have driven the horse myself because I won the Hambletonian the year before, but Pinkman was so smart and he was a lazy horse and he knew me way too well," Takter said. "I trained the horse so many times and he had no respect for me, and actually that horse was so smart that it almost was a plus to change drivers a little frequently.

"So, I said there is no way I'm going to jump up on him and Brian Sears is standing there. And, you know, Brian, he's a top, top driver and he won the race. It just worked out."

With four Hambletonian training victories, Takter is tied for second on the all-time list with Chuck Sylvester, behind Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton and Ben White, who all have five.

Had he not retired from training in 2018, it would be easy to assume that, over time, Takter could have tied or even passed the current record holders, but he said he has no regrets.

#### Christina and Jimmy Takter have an incredible Hambletonian legacy.

"No, I'm so tickled to death, my daughter [Nancy] won the last two years," Takter said. "I mean, when she won with Tactical Approach, for the first time, and I didn't own anything in Tactical Approach, I had a feeling, and it was the same with Karl, it was like me winning and maybe better.

"When your children do well, you're very proud of that... and she didn't train that many trotters [at that time].

"One race for sure you can never predict is the Hambletonian." Although not training, Takter still owns, jogs and occasionally drives horses.

"I think to be a top trainer you really have to love the horse first, and I love the horses, I just love to be around them," Takter said, adding with a laugh. "I like horses more than I like a lot of people."

## Super Sunday is Showdown Sunday at Harrah's Philadelphia

Ask and you shall receive. Just one week after an HRU column clamored for a matchup between Swedish imports Aetos Kronos S and Antognoni S that didn't come to fruition in the Cutler, those two horses will square off side by side in a stake today (May 25) at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Dubbed promotionally as Super Sunday, the day might as well be called Showdown Sunday because the Euro matchup is just the start of it. Also featured head-to-head in major stakes are last year's Dan Patch Horse of the Year Twin B Joe Fresh going against fresh rival and divisional champion herself, My Girl EJ. Those two will start right next to each other also, as will Louprint and Fallout in one of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) races on the card. Captain Optimistic makes his seasonal debut too in what should easily go down as the track's best card of the year. Here's how I see the key races shaping up:

## RACE 11,\$100,000 JOSEPH AUGER MEMORIAL INVITATIONAL PACE

Since its inception in 2023, Ruthless Hanover is the only winner this race has ever known. It was in that inaugural edition won in 1:46.3 that Ruthless Hanover went the fastest mile in racing history on a five-eighths-mile track and repeated the trick last year in a time of "only" 1:47.2. This time around he's racing in the Auger while making just his first start of the year and has post 8 to contend with also. Though, with his early speed it may not be too much of a problem. Those two qualifiers over this track — a place he has an affinity for — signal he's ready and I'd certainly be including him on Pick 4 tickets in which the Auger is included as the third leg.

Borgata champion Mossdale Ben N goes from post 7 and makes his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season but it will be his first one outside of Yonkers. He went some huge miles at Yonkers throughout that series — from off the pace no less — and he'll likely have to take that same route here with the speed around him. I do think he could be the real deal in the free-for-all ranks but this may be a tough spot to prove it. Bythemissal never got involved in this race last year but is sure to be better positioned this time

around. He was much better last out when crushing in 1:48.3 at Scioto than he was first out when he rode the cover of Little Rocket Man in his season debut but could only finish third. It will be interesting to see what approach Gingras takes with him from the mid-pack post. Last year's division champion, Abuckabett Hanover, returns today on the heels of two qualifiers at The Meadowlands, and that second one was a vast improvement from the first one when he tired in that small field of three. He lost last week only to Sabonis, a new addition to the Pelling barn who, by the looks of things, will be another one to watch this year. Coaches Corner and Dunkin' are ones I associate more with the half-mile success but could play roles for smaller shares.

## RACE 12, \$100,000 MAXIE LEE MEMORIAL INVITATIONAL TROT

As alluded to at the top, Antognoni S and Aetos Kronos S will begin from posts 1 and 2 respectively, and one would think that these two should be controlling the race throughout. The only prior time they raced each other was two weeks ago in a high-level conditioned race at The Meadowlands, where Antognoni S broke stride when he was about to get into a live cover flow. He came back last week in the Cutler to finish third in a race where he was put on the point and had every chance before being caught late, but perhaps the move to Chester will help and judging by his performance throughout the Brennan series at Yonkers, it just might.

But my pick will be the other import Aetos Kronos S. He's only lost once in three starts since arriving here, and I'm sure that's a race that Dexter Dunn pins on himself. In that race two back, Aetos Kronos S was trapped behind the leader and surged late to make things interesting once he found room, but by that point it was too late. He since came back last out to win in 1:51.3 and the former Prix d'Amérique starter looks ready.

I'll avoid the full blown soapbox but as usual there should be a manual review of computer generated morning lines for these big races. In this race, there is no way that morning line favorite Sir Pinocchio will be favored over either #s 1 or 2. I admire his success last year, but he tired in the Cutler from the pocket as a 19-1 longshot and prior to that was sixth by 10 lengths. Secret Agent Man went a 1:51.1 qualifying mile at this track a couple weeks ago and that might be the fastest qualifier ever trotted here. I still remember a big mile he went to just miss against Karl last year in Lexington, and his very best would make him an interesting longshot. Amigo Volo is still going strong at age 8; winner of \$2.5 million was second not too long ago at Woodbine Mohawk Park to Logan Park, who is in Sweden today contesting Elitloppet.

## RACE 13, \$100,000 BETSY ROSS FILLIES AND MARES INVITATIONAL PACE

Like Mossdale Ben N who won the Borgata series, the winner of the Blue Chip Matchmaker series Aardie B Miki N gets thrown into the deepest of waters coming out of Yonkers. To her credit, she's never lost since coming to the States and laid over her Matchmaker competition every week. Her Down Under record does look impressive as well – winning half her races last year while banking \$146,000. That's a better record than you see from almost any other horse coming here. I respect her class and I'm interested to see how she stacks up against the likes of #s 5 and 6, will see how those 1:53 miles at Yonkers translate.

In another morning line atrocity, Twin B Joe Fresh, the winner of this race last year, is listed as the second choice at 7-2. She's qualified three times for this race as she makes her 2025 debut and she was in another world in that recent qualifier against overwhelmed foes. She did lose her first race of the season last year before only losing one more time the rest of the way; I do think she'll be tested in here. More of a hunch than anything but I think My Girl EJ could get the better of Twin B Joe Fresh in this race and will be my pick. Making her first start as a 4-year-old, she chased home Twin B Joe Fresh two qualifiers ago when she was making her first Q of the season and Twin B Joe Fresh was making her second. My Girl EJ came back to qualify again in a fast 1:50.2 with a confident Todd McCarthy steer.

## RACE 8, \$50,000 SEND IT IN INVITATIONAL PACE

Seven Colors will be my preference over Desperate Man, a horse who raced on this day last year in the Auger. As for Seven Colors, he went a big qualifier two back when besting Voukefalas (post 1 in this race) and Abuckabett Hanover and closed strongly last week from the back of the pack with good, crisp momentum. Desperate Man was up against it from the outside post in his Borgata final, a race that's snakebit him the last couple of seasons but came right back last out to post a career best 1:48.2 win at Pocono. Huntinthelastdolar won a couple of Borgata legs and post 2 from Engblom just makes it seem like he'll be a big factor. Maximus Miki was a 1:48 winner last year and makes his first start since the end of December, nothing wrong with either local qualifier. Expectations were high coming into this year for Humble; maybe the change in scenery from Yonkers can spur a wake up.

#### RACE 5,\$40,322 PENNSYLVANIA SIRE STAKE

Captain Optimistic makes his 3-year-old debut coming off two rousing qualifiers. The Governor's Cup champion from last year and top contender for the Pepsi North America Cup and Meadowlands Pace kicks off his season with a ton of hype. Papi's Rocket will be another top 3-year-old but amazingly is 0-for-3 to start his season. Though, last out, he was clearly best in his PASS race but probably should have pulled before getting caught in traffic and only found room once the race had been decided. Twisted Destiny gave game chase last out to Louprint and made that one sprint all the way through the wire to earn it; another nice looking one.

#### **RACE 7, \$40,722 PENNSYLVANIA SIRE STAKE**

Railroad Station finds himself in the softest of the three PASS divisions and this race seems to be his for the taking. He was second last out to the impressive Prince Hal Hanover, whose time of 1:49.3 was super to other sire stakes times that day – no excuses accepted in this spot. Wedlock Blue Chip got the trip and jump on the race favorite and delivered last out to score the minor upset. Aside from maybe #3, he's no worse than anyone else in here and will have a say. Seaworthy Hanover retains Dunn.

#### **RACE 10, \$40,722 PENNSYLVANIA SIRE STAKE**

Louprint looks to keep his perfect record this season intact and once again would be hard to go against. Enough can't be said about his 1:49.3 mile at The Meadows two back when parked, and then he dug in when he had to in winning last out at Pocono. Gets a fresh test from a familiar foe to his inside in the name of Fallout. Another top sophomore contender, Fallout, last year's Metro winner, makes his second start of the year, and was second last out in his debut to a 4-year-old who was coming off a 1:49.2 mile that he chased all the way home. Go Go Grasshopper comes off a scratch, but prior to that was a sharp winner over Papi's Rocket.

# John Duer is building on his strong family foundation with new Kentucky training center

"It's been a very challenging year to have to build a racetrack," said fourth generation standardbred horseman John Duer of the Versailles Standardbred Group LLC, a venture of which he is one of the four chief officers. He is the one with the greatest background and experience in the standardbred industry. The project, based on 165 acres in Versailles' Woodford County, about a 15-minute ship from the historic Red Mile in Lexington is set for completion in the next month. It will begin operations by playing host to the second leg of the fair portion of the Kentucky eligible races this season. The first series of these races was set to be competed at the Marion County Fairgrounds in Lebanon.

"They will have 27 races with 158 horses competing on Saturday (May 24)," Duer said. "I'm guessing that we will have at least that many and quite probably a few more.

"It's been a real horse race to get the stables ready for their first occupants. The weather this winter and spring here in Central Kentucky hasn't helped us any. We originally had an April date for completion of the project. Due to the horrible weather we've had to endure, we are now looking at a completion date in June in time for our first series of Kentucky races."

## What can you tell us about the Versailles Standardbred Group LLC?

"It is the brainchild of businessman Alex Riddle. Alex's equine background relates almost entirely to the thoroughbreds. A few years ago, he went to his first standardbred race. As good fortune would have it, it was the Little Brown Jug. It was love at first sight. Alex is someone who thinks big. He began by owning pieces of a few overnight horses. Initially he had thoughts of building a racetrack. Then that desire became the training center which we are about to open. We thought the stars were in perfect alignment for such a venture. As everyone can see, the Kentucky program has grown exponentially. The number of races, new farms and horses in the Commonwealth has grown beyond just about everyone's expectations. With it has grown

the need to house the large number of horses establishing roots here in Kentucky.

"Initially we have built stables capable of housing 320 horses. There is the likelihood of us having another 200 or so more if there is the need for it. We have a state of the art five-eighthsmile track built by the Coon brothers. A restaurant on site will be coming, as will be all the requirements for a successful state of the art training center."

## Doesn't your background in the sport relate mostly to breeding and racing?

"Yes, it does. You could say that I was born into harness racing. My dad, Carter Duer, is considered by most to be one of the sport's greatest farm managers. He also is an accomplished trainer. I like to think that I have followed in his footsteps and learned from his great font of knowledge. While training, I was fortunate enough to spend many a year at some of the finest training centers in the sport. I believe that I've learned both the positives and the negatives associated with them. I'm the standardbred representative on the management group of this enterprise and the one who will oversee it on a daily basis. I think we've built this training center so that we emphasize all the positives and hopefully eliminate the negatives. I'll be there administrating the center and working with the horsemen who have set up shop here."

You mentioned that the first leg of Kentucky fair races will have 27 races scheduled. That is more than the number of last year. Your legs will probably exceed that number. Each succeeding year will bring more. At what point, if at all, do you think that saturation will set in?

"It's very obvious that the program is growing significantly, probably a whole lot quicker than anybody envisioned. I can see the need developing to make the requirements for entry somewhat more stringent than they are now. Perhaps it might develop into a sires stakes series where entry to some, or maybe even all, of the events might be limited to the produce of stallions standing in Kentucky. There are no Kentucky Sires stakes per se right now. Perhaps that is something for the future. Right now, as Carter Pinske said here last week, I'm going to enjoy it as it is."

While training, I was fortunate enough to spend many a year at some of the finest training centers in the sport. I believe that I've learned both the positives and the negatives associated with them. Let's switch topics a bit. Your background is mostly in training and racing horses with an entire lifetime in breeding and raising horses solidly behind it. Do you miss specifically working with the horses?

"The answer to that question is somewhat. The reality is that those two segments although not as all-inclusive in my life are still presently there. Our family still lives on the farm. I still see and I am around horses each and every day. If I'm needed to help at the farm, whether it might be to help with a mare foaling or to show some yearlings in the fall, I am still available to do so. I look upon my training experience as a great asset for the job as administrator at the training center. I've been there. I've worked at several training centers. I like to think I know what is best and perhaps what doesn't work. I consider myself first to be a horseman. I think that because of that, I am well suited to working with horsemen."

## Your father, Carter Duer, is now 86 years old. How is he doing?

"Exceptionally well. He is as active as he ever was. He still oversees all aspects of activity on the farm. He still recognizes every horse on sight. If you want to know about any racehorse from a cheap claimer to a top free for aller, just ask him. Chances are he knows the horse and can tell you something about it. He watches just about every race at just about any track that he is able to access. At yearling time, he is still as active as ever. He is a wonder."

## Your webpage on Facebook surprisingly features a hockey theme. Can you please explain that?

"That is because of my two boys. They are both consumed by the sport and have got me interested in it as well. The oldest, Mason, just graduated from high school and will be going to the University of Delaware where he will be playing on that school's team. The younger one, Colton, will likely follow in his footsteps. They come by it quite naturally. Their mother is Swedish and has a lot of hockey in her background. The boys began playing when we were in Connecticut and I was working at Lindy Farms. I became a hockey dad and started going to all their games. I loved the sport. In addition to playing the game, the boys are avid fans of the sport. They can probably tell you as much about every NHL player as my dad can tell you about most horses racing. Trust me, that is a whole lot."

## The divided road ahead for Chantilly

Will Canada's Horse of the Year take on the boys in the Pepsi North America Cup?

Chantilly, Canada's 2024 Somebeachsomewhere O'Brien Horse of the Year, has been a big story in Ontario in the leadup to the Pepsi North America Cup.

After back-to-back qualifying wins at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the latest by a widening seven lengths on May 2, the daughter of Big Jim—Shiraz Seelster won her sophomore pari-mutuel debut on May 17 in the Standardbred Breeders Of Ontario (SBOA) 3-year-old filly pace final at Mohawk.

Last night (May 24), Chantilly set a lifetime best 1:49.4 mile in the lone \$140,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series division for 3-year-old pacing fillies at the same track to remain undefeated through all 11 career starts.

The filly is owned by her breeder, Millar Farms of Stouffville, ON, trained by Nick Gallucci, and driven by James MacDonald, all 2024 O'Brien Award winners.

Speaking before her OSS start, Gallucci, the 2024 O'Brien Trainer of the Year, said that he had hoped for another week of preparation before the filly's 2025 debut.

"I was going to qualify her a third time before she raced," Gallucci said. "She had a little bit of mucus, so I'm hoping for better in the next couple weeks."

Gallucci said the filly "wasn't really in tip-top Chantilly form" on May 17, but added that he's "taking everything one step at a time" with the returning star. That includes plans about aiming for the Pepsi North America Cup or Fan Hanover next month.

"Yeah, we can't really rule anything out at this point," Gallucci said. "We can't make that call until we see how she races on the weekend."

He added that George Millar will make the ultimate decision. Chantilly is eligible to both stakes, with the final sustaining fees paid by the May 15 deadline.

The question of participation in the 2025 Pepsi North America Cup has drawn attention to Chantilly ever since the notion was **first mentioned by Millar Last year.** No filly has ever been nominated to the race, which annually attracts top 3-year-old male pacers to Mohawk. In an interview at the 2024 O'Brien Awards, Millar said that he had nominated Chantilly to both the \$1 million North America Cup and its companion stake for 3-year-old distaff pacers, the Fan Hanover. Ironically, the filly stake's namesake famously beat colts in the 1981 Little Brown Jug. Jug heats had previously been won by His Lady (1946), Phantom Lady (1954), and Dotties Pick (1955), but no other filly has ever won the final.

In 1982, Fan Hanover would also become the lone mare to capture the Mohawk Gold Cup.

Other major races associated with Ontario Jockey Club (now Woodbine Entertainment) tracks have had occasional female pacing participants.

Miss Vera Bars won the sixth edition of the Canadian Pacing Derby, for 3-year-olds and up, in 1941 and finished third the following year. The race was contested at Fountain Park Racetrack in New Hamburg, ON in its first years, later relocating to Greenwood, Woodbine, and finally Mohawk, where it has been based since 2005. Canada's 3-Year-Old Pacer of the Year in 1965, filly Woodlawn Drummond, finished third in the 1966 Canadian Pacing Derby.

The concept of a top pacing filly taking on Grand Circuit colts and geldings remains an oddity. A filly, Iosola's Worthy, won the second edition of the Hambletonian back in 1927; there have been 14 since then, four of them after the introduction of the Hambletonian Oaks in 1971. On the pacing side, however, there has been recent reticence to even try a 3-year-old filly against

males, although some have fared well in the past: Countess Adios captured the first two legs of the 1960 Pacing Triple Crown, winning the Cane Pace and Messenger Stake. She was ineligible to the Little Brown Jug.

Miss Easy, Drop The Ball, and Pure Country all faced top males at age 3.

Miss Easy won the 1991 Meadowlands Pace consolation over Cambest, despite breaking early in her elimination and missing the final.

Drop The Ball went first-over to challenge leader Westwardho Hanover in a 2011 Meadowlands Pace elimination, breaking late in the mile and finishing last. The Ross Croghan trainee led to the top of the stretch in the Meadowlands Pace consolation, jumping it off late once again, a problem which also plagued her when taking on fillies in her subsequent start.

After winning the 2016 Fan Hanover Stake at Mohawk, Pure Country was competitive against males in the Cane Pace at The Meadowlands and Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park. The Jimmy Takter trainee overcame post 11 to finish fourth to Control The Moment in the Cane, and closed for place behind Betting Line in the Milstein.

None of them attempted the North America Cup, a race established in 1984 at Greenwood Raceway. But examine the North America Cup's background, and fillies did take part in its precursor, the Queen City Pace, which began in 1964.



The inaugural Queen City Pace went for a purse of \$9,750, at a mile-and-one-sixteenth distance, on Aug. 24, 1964. Three fillies raced in the event, which was won by eventual 1964 Canadian Horse of the Year Timely Knight and trainer/driver Roger White. Highland Girl (p, 4, 2:03.4f; \$44,790) was best among the fillies, finishing third behind Eagle Armbro, Canada's top 2-year-old pacer of 1963.

Owned, trained, and driven by Hugh McLean of Port Elgin, ON, Highland Girl was a daughter of Highland Express—Willmots Girl. Before venturing to Greenwood, she captured the \$1,200 top class at The Raceway at Western Fair in London, ON, on Aug. 3, 1964. McLean and his brother Ray were inducted to the track's Wall of Fame in 1989.

Late in the season, *The St. Catharines Standard* newspaper noted that Highland Girl would be taking on males in the inaugural \$3,930 Valedictory Series Pace at Garden City Park, in St. Catherines, ON: "The lone filly in the Valedictory is Highland Girl. This lass has been impressive all season racing with the colts and free for all talent. Owner Hugh McLean of Port Elgin will guide his ace side-wheeler when starter Ernie Brown gives the word."

Eagle Armbro won the five-horse race at a distance of oneand-five-sixteenth miles. It later moved to Mohawk, at a mile distance.

On Dec. 26, 1964, Highland Girl and McLean finished second to 6-year-old Rendezvous Boy in the \$1,530 Western Fair invitational, defeating four other top-class London pacers in her final 3-year-old start.

The Fan Hanover Stake was introduced at Greenwood on July 1,1983, and now provides an attractive \$425,000 purse for 3-year-old filly pacers at Mohawk. Fan Hanover herself became the first 3-year-old filly pacer to be voted USHWA Dan Patch Horse of the Year, back in 1981.

In the four decades since, Test Of Faith (2021), Rainbow Blue (2004), and Bunny Lake (2001) have been named Dan Patch Horse of the Year, all without having faced colts and geldings at age 3. Canada's 2023 O'Brien Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year Sylvia Hanover never raced the boys either, suggesting that the abundance of Grand Circuit filly races today is successfully convincing the connections of top distaff pacing talents from testing them in the so-called "glamour division" of harness racing.

"Everybody kind of wants to pick your brain about it," said Gallucci, remarking on the prospect of Chantilly in the North America Cup eliminations slated for Saturday (June 7) at Mohawk. "It would be huge for the sport, but it's also really early in the year to ask her to do something like that."

He said the Ontario Sires Stakes and James M. Lynch Memorial at Pocono were on Chantilly's schedule this season, with the 2025

Breeders Crown at Mohawk a main goal, because "there's a lot [of top fillies] she didn't even get to race last year."

Chantilly began racing with Lasix on Sept. 14.

"She did show some EIPH [exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage] last year, and I made the decision to put her on Lasix," Gallucci said. "She's benefited internally and physically."

The trainer said he was surprised to learn that there were fillies in the Queen City Pace, remarking that it was likely due to smaller numbers of competitive young horses in those years.

"Did they even separate boys and girls back then?" he said with a laugh.

He summed up the feelings of Team Chantilly as her sophomore season gets rolling: "I think even to have a horse that's in contention for the North America Cup would be a dream."

Millar's sense of sportsmanship cannot be underestimated, nor can Chantilly. Whichever road she takes on Saturday (June 14) at Mohawk, the Canadian champion will continue to fascinate fans and bettors across North America.

## On To Norway takes big step up in Indiana Sires Stakes for new owner Frank Baldachino

The opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes competition for sophomore trotters and pacers kicks off Memorial Day (May 26) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Frank Baldachino, a long-time program supporter, will be busy following his racing interests that day. One of the entries, On To Norway is a newer acquisition making his sires stakes debut for the connections Monday afternoon.

Baldachino has been very active in the Indiana program over the last two decades, always observing the races and looking for the next good horse to buy. And he's had success with finding budding stars that have gone on to greatness. In 2006, he purchased freshman pacer Go On BB privately for a moderate five-figure sum early in her career. She would go on to become one of the Indiana program's most decorated horses while winning over \$1.4 million in purses.

"I pretty much watch mostly all the Hoosier races whether it's replays or watching them live," he said. "If I like something, what is great about Hoosier, you can watch them on YouTube. So I can watch them three, four, five times and look for certain things and slow them up and just study them."

Scouring races of the early 3-year-olds racing at Hoosier this spring, Baldachino noticed trotter On To Norway. The Muscle Massive—One Class Act gelding raced second in his debut for trainer Leander Schwartz on April 3, then followed that with a victory one week later, both starts coming in the Chad E. Carlton Trotting Series for Michael Detweiler's Black And White Stable.

"I noticed him when he went in :56.2, and I said, 'That's a nice little start for that horse," Baldachino said. "I checked what he had done previously, and I saw that he had a pretty solid year on the fairs and racing a little bit in Michigan. As a freshman, On To Norway made nine starts, racing primarily on the Michigan fair circuit. He finished the year with three consecutive wins, the first coming at Hoosier Park in November. In that event, Marvin Luna steered him to a more than three-length victory in a time of 1:58.2. The fact that he handled the Hoosier configuration well and returned strong in his first two starts immediately made him a target for Baldachino and his partners.

"He was second in his first start, but he was coming, and that's what I look for in horses, that coming off the pace and finishing strong through the wire," Baldachino said. "I watched his next start, and he ran off in [1]:55. I was like, 'I've got to reach out to Leander."

When the trotters lined up behind the gate in the \$20,000 Carlton Trotting Series final, On To Norway did so with new owners. Ron Burke's team assumed the training duties and shares ownership with Baldachino, Michael Rosenthal and Black And White Stable, which stayed in on the gelding. Since the ownership change,

On To Norway has reeled off four straight, winning the Carlton Trotting Series crown before sweeping two legs of the Expresson Series and scoring the \$25,000 final last week, a 1:54.4 clocking. He now takes a big step up into the Indiana Sires Stakes, drawing post 6 in a seven-horse field Monday at Hoosier Park, one of two \$49,500 splits for sophomore trotting colts. John De Long will steer the five-time winner.

"Ronnie and Adam [Rucker] have done a great job now, continuing with him to keep moving forward," said Baldachino. "On Monday, he steps into the fire a little bit with the sire stakes horses, but I think he can go with those horses. I think he can be right there with them, but it will be a little bit of a step up now, so we'll have to see what he has in him. I've got 100 per cent confidence in him that he can race with the glamour boys out there this year. Hopefully he stays healthy and sound, and can last until October or November for us, and can be a real competitive 3-year-old trotter out there."

Baldachino now has two racing interests in the division. He also owns Starlitfranknstein, already a two-time winner in three 2025 starts for the partnership that includes Burke Racing, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and Beasty LLC. Last season the Swan For All—A Southern Lily colt won three of nine starts and raced second to divisional champion Eugene The Genius in the \$250,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final. He finished the season with \$191,827 on his card.

Having two horses in the division makes it advantageous when each sires stakes leg is drawn this season.

"I knew we wouldn't have to race against each other in the sire stakes until hopefully they both make the final," Baldachino said. "He's staked up very similar to 'Starlight,' so they both have some Grand Circuit stakes at Hoosier as well. So they might have to battle somewhere down the road, but a majority of their starts would be avoiding each other. So that was a real appeal to me also."

Starlitfranknstein has drawn post 4 in Monday's eighth race, the second of the two divisions that includes six others. Trace Tetrick is slated to drive.

In total, Baldachino will have eight horses to follow on Hoosier Park's Memorial Day program. Joining On To Norway and Starlitfranknstein are trotting fillies Miracle Maven and Classical Jane and pacers Freaky Feet Beast, CC Rockin Rosie, Angelatyourfeet and Big Al Derosa. He has had a solid track record of acquiring horses that have gone on to achieve success in the Hoosier State. He is hoping to repeat that in 2025.

## The pari-mutuel public responded in gaggles, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

Aristotle said, "The purpose of knowledge is action; not knowledge." This becomes evident as I peruse the results of the 1990s *American Turf Monthly* (ATM) active handicappers/bettors' survey.

This section deals with handicapping, and the first five questions appeared in Part 1.

## 6. Are you opposed to or in favor of writing a personal odds line (POL)?

"I think it is advisable," said Betty from Texas, though she did not say she used one. Otto from Vermont, "favored" the process. "They are useful," said David from Texas. "However, I look only at my contenders and decide if the odds justify a bet," meaning he does not use it. Blaine from New York was blunt, "I think it is a waste of time." Then there was FJ's incomprehensible statement: "I try not to let odds influence my handicapping decisions." Other responses like, "I see no merit in 2-year-old races," and "POLs are out of whack," and "Don't care," share misunderstandings of handicapping and refuse to acknowledge writing POLs as valid.

A lone wolf on the question came from Jim from Washington. He said, "I create a personal odds line for each race. Without one, I wouldn't know the values I expect from them winning."

## 7. How much research do you do when handicapping?

The answers for this proved no responders measured the time invested in the handicapping processes. All answers related to sources reviewed — public handicappers and personal notebooks and trip notes — all of which made the question moot.

## 8. Do you concentrate on playing particular tracks?

The greater number of answers for this focused upon responders' local tracks except for the simulcast of national stakes events.

## 9. What aspect of handicapping bothers you the most?

Suspicions arose across the board here. Amos from Arkansas said, "Is the owner and trainer and jockey well-meant [today] or is this race just a tightener?" Others said, "How does a horse feel [today]?" and "Is the horse feeling well enough to even run a good race?" Brett from Maine also struggled with "a lack of understanding of conditions in a race," which is why he said he was "not fond of allowance-type races."

## 10. Do you read the opinions of public handicappers?

Julius from Illinois said, "I put little importance on someone else's opinion." Harriet from California "enjoys discussing aspects of a race with other handicappers," and Willis from Indiana said, "Yes, but unless something is pointed out that I overlooked in my selection process I will invariably go with my selection."

Not one respondent mentioned a specific public handicapper whose opinions influenced them. Here and there the Andy Beyer speed ratings were mentioned as casual factors but no other national names came up; not even popular authors on handicapping like Cramer or Quinn or Mitchell. The attitude of those surveyed more than insinuated average pari-mutuel handicappers are equals to those being paid to share opinions.

"I subscribe to a handicapping service," said Barry from New York, "more for scratches, trainer and track information and weekly news than for its daily picks... I have a mini-library of racing books."

Another respondent used the question to complement ATM. "The only outside opinion I consider," said William from Illinois, "is ATM's Fit and Ready List." He was the only surveyed to mention the publication.

If anything was proven by the handicapping half of the survey it was the side-to-side extent of self-reliance and personal independence when it comes to measuring the ingredients of handicapping and how it depends upon the fixed beliefs of the individual. I know of no such survey for standardbred racing. Still my experiences knowing handicappers of all racing breeds (including greyhounds), and as a paid public handicapper, it is safe to assume there is plenty of information to make a wise decision about a race but how the information is processed rarely results in profitable wagering.

Over five decades of knowing handicappers offered more and more valuable information to measure any class of race by any breed it was a scant few able to be skillful enough with their betting dollars to accomplish more than a break-even long-term result. Even before the creation of single- and multirace exotics and their huge payoffs attracting lottery-minded bettors to inflate pools, it was the sensitive practice of money management rewarding the few successful players.

This inarguable fact is why the second half of the ATM survey asked handicappers about their wagering practices. Pari-mutuel bettors were asked to reveal how they invested in races. The questions begged for specifics and hoped for patterns that indicated the importance of not betting as well as what expectation demanded how much to wager.

The histories of financially successful people in any risky investment are indications of turning knowledge into action. Careful choices concerning when to act and when to pass. Strong knowledge of handicapping demands emotional strength to be loyal about a money-management plan.

Aristotle's advice is demonstrated in the next review of the ATM survey.

### The things we do for love

Listening to enthusiastic people talk about their exotic hobbies and interests is enjoyable. This morning, I set down my "Stuff Happens After My Third Cup" coffee mug, grabbed a pen, and composed a list of people I know and the things they do that make them happy. They were not obvious activities like watching sports, television, and movies, but listed pastimes a bit more esoteric and interactive.

Here is a quick list of 20 people and their special interests:

- Serious birdwatching
- Music composing and recording
- International island travel
- Playing a round of golf in every American state (now on to foreign lands)
- Rare book collecting
- RV travel
- Competitive chess
- Competitive bridge
- Jigsaw puzzles
- Restoring vintage cars
- Playwriting
- Archaeology
- Assembling a massive music library of pre-1970 recordings
- Local theater
- Fossil collecting
- Antique collecting
- Poetry writing
- Wood carving
- Operating fantasy sports leagues
- Model train collecting
- Flyfishing
- Metal detecting

People on this list spend considerable time and money satisfying their itches to participate in their niches. Listening to them talk about their passions fires me up. I pepper them with questions of who, what, where, how, and why they do what they do. I never ask how much money they spend on their passions, but I suspect many spend more on their passions than we do on harness racing.

For example, a person on this list was a competitive bridge player. There is no purse money or income for this passion. There are many expenses, such as entry fees, travel (sometimes international), lodging, cruises for bridge players, club memberships, etc.

Or a few months ago, a friend rhapsodically talked about his annual two-week expedition to Utah to "break rocks," a slang terminology for fossil searching. He did not mention the costs for permits, travel, food, lodging, destroying his vehicle on rutty roads, and countless other expenses – he was over the moon about what fossils he found ("my biggest find ever"), the people he met, and the fun he had. He and some of his fellow fossil enthusiasts travel internationally to pursue their interests.

Our sport offers the same inner satisfaction, but the questioning from strangers is annoyingly different. To a metal detector, you might ask what treasures they have unearthed, what equipment they use, what exactly they are looking for, where they search, and how they plan a day of searching. In horse racing, the person you are trying to reach often skips over the inner satisfaction and mystery of racing horses and quickly gets to deflating questions, "How much does it cost? Is it cruel? Is their doping? Is it fixed?"

In horse racing, it feels like we start on the wrong foot. We are on the defensive. Look back to my list. Those 20 people representing other sports and hobbies do not carry this baggage as they spread the good word about their passion.

We all know that a sprinkle of magic is attached to the majestic horses carrying our dreams. We know our horse affliction or addiction is more than dollars and cents. We know that jogging a horse as the sun rises is a wonderful place to be. We know the thrill of your horse competing in a race. But it isn't very easy to push new prospects to that point.

Perhaps an approach to our sport where money was less critical, an introduction that puts the horse before the costs, the magic before the money, is the best path. I think fractional ownership stables follow this model and are very valuable assets. Let me suggest a slight tweak: set up a group of new owners geographically, less than an hour from the training track, to physically get people to watch those training laps, touch the horses, smell the smells, hear the hoof beats, feel, and see the magic.

In the future, circumstances beyond our control may force us to reconfigure to more hobby and less business. In our hearts, we feel the clock ticking for the harness racing model as we know it. The next series of columns in this space are canaries in the coal mine. They will be radical, sometimes painful suggestions for when funding dries up, yet the hobby remains.

Perhaps an approach to our sport where money was less critical, an introduction that puts the horse before the costs, the magic before the money, is the best path. I think fractional ownership stables follow this model and are very valuable assets. Let me suggest a slight tweak: set up a group of new owners geographically, less than an hour from the training track, to physically get people to watch those training laps, touch the horses, smell the smells, hear the hoof beats, feel, and see the magic.

The money for racing may decline, but the list above illustrates that people who gladly pay for their thrills often pay a steep price and do not expect to earn money. Money will no longer be our master in the new racing world. In the old world, a powerful motivator was that we all harbored the unrealistic dream that we would find a racing gem and make a million dollars. Participating in our sport with the mindset of not making money racing and raising racing trotters and pacers will be a massive mental hurdle for many.

None of us are Nostradamus. We do not know how the sport will evolve — perhaps a new method of competing, possibly people who love the sport who play in a new world will need to find motivation in jogging their horse in the morning sun, maybe time trials of 2:22, cleaning a stall, feeding carrots over a stall gate, meeting new people, enjoying our history, sharing new ideas, breathing fresh air, meeting new friends, and staying connected with old friends. Could you, would you, remain in a world of harness horses without the carrot of a payday?

The people on my list do it every day.







### One cool 'Amigo'

Amigo Volo might not be the same horse who set at least one world record at ages 2, 3, and 4 in addition to capturing two Breeders Crown titles and a Dan Patch Award, but the now 8-year-old trotter is still producing winning performances and big miles.

In 35 races since the start of 2024, the son of Father Patrick—Margarita Momma has 13 victories among 26 top-three finishes, and his 1:50.4 win this past October at Ontario's Woodbine Mohawk Park equaled the second-fastest mile by a trotter in Canada last season. He was an O'Brien Award finalist for the top older male trotter in Canada in 2024, an honor that ultimately went to Elitlopp-bound Logan Park.

Furthermore, Amigo Volo's earnings of \$282,522 during the past 17 months have pushed his career bankroll to \$2.48 million, putting him within \$74,000 of the Top 25 money-winning trotters in North American history as he prepares for today's \$100,000 Grade 3 Maxie Lee Memorial invitational for older trotters at Harrah's Philadelphia.

"It's pretty cool," said Carter Pinske, who along with Nifty Norman and Meg Crone, has trained Amigo Volo for owners Pinske Stables and David J. Miller. "He's a special horse for my family and David Miller. Nifty has had a lot of great horses, but I think he would rank right up there with every horse that all of us combined have worked with."

For his career, Amigo Volo has won 45 of 119 races and hit the board an additional 45 times. He has earned a paycheck in all but 15 starts. In addition to his Breeders Crown scores at ages 2 and 3 in 2019 and 2020, his victories include the 2020 Kentucky Futurity, two Matron Stakes, and a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship.

So, what has contributed to Amigo Volo's success and longevity?

"That's the million-dollar question," Pinske said. "I think everybody goes to the sale looking for a horse like him, and I don't think there is one certain thing that you can pick out. The main thing is just his attitude. He loves to race, and he loves to win races. He knows when he wins.

"One thing I'll say about the horse, and most people that work with him will agree with me, is that he's the smartest horse I've ever been around. He just has brains. I always joke that he's more like a dog than a horse. When we had him down in Florida, you could turn him out in the yard, and he would free graze and just hang out with you. He's halfway human in that sense."

Amigo Volo has participated in the past four editions of the Maxie Lee Memorial, with a best finish of third on two occasions.



Today, he will leave from post 3 with Todd McCarthy in the sulky for trainer Norman. He is 8-1 on the morning line.

"We never seem to have a whole lot of luck in it, but it would be good to win it once," Pinske said. "He deserves to be in races like that. It's a good field, but he'll be competitive.

"He's maybe not at the top of his game anymore, but when things click for him it's like he's walking. Everybody that's driven him will tell you that you have no clue how fast you're going, he's just carrying you wherever he wants to go. He's maybe not consistently the fastest, but he'll throw in a mile here or there where your jaw kind of hits the floor."

Amigo Volo earned \$1.55 million as a Grand Circuit regular at ages 2 and 3, but he has continued to shine in opens and top-level conditions since then.

"He's quietly earned the last \$750,000 without being in the limelight," Pinske said. "He's kind of grinded it out, done it the tough way. We keep him in Canada because he seems happier in kind of the cooler weather, and he likes the track up there.

"He might show up in Kentucky for a couple weeks just to change scenery. But this is definitely where he'll end up; he'll be in my backyard in Kentucky."

A fitting spot for a horse that has meant so much to those around him. Amigo Volo gave Pinske his first win as a trainer in 2019 and also gave Pinske Stables its first Breeders Crown champion that same year.


"In a way, he's been a part of the family," Pinske said. "My wife [Makenna] and I, when he was a baby, was when we started working for Nifty together. The horse has given us a lot of 'firsts' both as a family, my wife and I as a couple, and with Nifty because that was really my start with him. It was special then, and it's been special since. He's been a key component to the Pinskes and harness racing all the way around."

The 5-2 morning-line favorite in the Lee Memorial is Sir Pinocchio, a five-time Grand Circuit winner last season. Millionaire Aetos Kronos S and last week's Arthur J. Cutler Memorial third-place finisher Antognoni S are both 3-1.

Today's card at Harrah's Philadelphia also features the \$100,000 Betsy Ross for older female pacers, which marks the return of 2024 Horse of the Year Twin B Joe Fresh, and the \$100,000 Joseph Auger Memorial invitational for older male pacers. Both are also Grade 3 events.

The Auger Memorial field includes 2024 Dan Patch Award winner Abuckabett Hanover, 2023 Dan Patch Award winner Bythemissal, two-time defending race winner Ruthless Hanover, and recent Grade 1 MGM Borgata Pacing Series winner Mossdale Ben N.

## Billyjojimbob's 1992 Elitloppet victory put Ontario-sired standardbreds on the map

Mike Wade knows it sounds cliché, but the trainer from Little Britain, ON honestly can still see Billyjojimbob thundering to victory at Solvalla like it was yesterday, not 33 years ago.

In 1992, the homebred trotter became the first Ontario-sired horse to win Sweden's famed Elitloppet. Today (May 25) in Stockholm, Logan Park will attempt to become just the second, proving what an incredible accomplishment it was for Billyjojimbob all those years ago.

Wade, who is proud to be the man that bred and trained the first and only, still has Billyjojimbob's trophies on the mantel, some VHS tapes gathering dust and a huge collage of framed photos from Elitloppet given to him by famed Swedish photographer-turned-star-trainer Stefan Melander. But nothing tops the mental movie that still plays on repeat.

"My actual memories are what mean the most to me," Wade said. "It could have been two years ago. It could have been last year. Everything about what happened in Sweden is still very vivid in my mind. The memories, to me, are what it's all about.

"Somebody asked me about it the other day, as a matter of fact, and I said, Even 33 years later, sometimes it just seems surreal."

Billyjojimbob's victory in Elitloppet put Ontario standardbreds on the world map. Wade said the trotter's sire, Balanced Image, was a major key to it all.

"It was a big boost for the industry that on an international stage Ontario could produce and Balanced Image, in my mind, was the first one to show that," Wade said. "[Billyjojimbob] just happened to be one of the first Balanced Image superstars, but there was more than a handful after that were as accomplished, or maybe more so, than he was."

That Billyjojimbob did it for a trio of small-town Ontario dreamers — his then wife, Lori Ferguson, who owned and groomed the trotter, and Murray Brethour who drove Billyjojimbob to the two-heat victory that day — fueled a whole new generation of Ontario dreamers.

"Everything fell into place," Wade said. "The whole time I was over there, it almost felt like a dream... He was in great shape. He was the kind of horse you didn't mind packing your bags and going with because he was such a good shipper and really laid back. He was an ideal candidate for going over there."

Lifetime, Billyjojimbob earned nearly \$1 million – which, when accounting for inflation, amounts to nearly double that today. He also won 39 of 62 starts. But none topped that blue sky day in Stockholm.

Though Wade had some other very good horses, none were better than Billyjojimbob, who was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 1995, just three years after winning Elitloppet. Billyjojimbob died in 2002, but 23 years later his contribution remains just as powerful.

"His grave is just on the northwest corner of my track, and I acknowledge him pretty well every day when I'm out there jogging and training horses," Wade said. "There's a big red maple tree planted above his grave, and you can't miss it. Not a day goes by when I don't acknowledge what he's done for me.

"This farm that I've lived on for the last 33 years, I can't imagine having bought it and stayed here if it wasn't for him... The horse business for me prior to him, I certainly wasn't setting the world on fire. He set me up with a farm and put me in a position where I got better quality horses that I could own part of myself or train for other people. He certainly got the ball rolling for me."

To this day, the fact that Billyjojimbob proved a champion could come not just from anywhere, but Ontario specifically, still gives Wade that glimmer of hope every time a new horse comes into his life.

"It's silly not to think about it," Wade said. You've got to try to be optimistic. And you know what, 33 years ago, maybe we were naively optimistic, and that's why things worked out the way they did. So, maybe it pays to be a little bit silly.

"Going over there, did I think going we we're going to win? I didn't know, but I was hoping for the best the way the draw went and the way that he went into the race. I was feeling pretty confident that we were not going to embarrass ourselves."

Ontario-sired horses have only competed in Elitloppet sporadically in the more than three decades since Billyjojimbob put Ontario on top of the harness racing world. But today, Wade will be cheering on Logan Park, despite the slight temptation to want to remain the man that had the only Ontario-sired winner in history.

"It's kind of cool being the only one, but... I'm a team player and I'm cheering for Canada, no doubt," he said.

### Game changers: Sports Column

## Is there a human athlete you can liken Sports Column to and why?

"Somebody known for their grit and determination. Let's go with [former NHL standout] Wendel Clark. He and Sports Column shared that no-nonsense, give-it-everything-you'vegot mentality."

#### Describe his personality on and off the track?

"On the track, he was a very strong-willed horse. He wanted to do everything he could to help you, and he wanted to win. He wanted to be there every time he raced. You could feel it.

"Off the track, he was a funny horse. He was a handful at times, but he respected you. Kind of like any other coach-athlete relationship."

## When did you know Sports Column was something special?

"I would say during his first or second qualifier we realized he could be something nice for us.

"When we saw him the first time in Lexington in 2015, we were just hoping for a nice OSS [Ontario Sires Stakes] horse. He was a beautiful looking yearling. He was stunning. He did have a bit of an offset knee, but he was a spectacular animal. It really took one look for us to know that we liked him."

#### Three words to describe him?

"Grit. Determination. Personality."

#### How has he changed your life?

"Him winning the Battle of Waterloo in 2016 was something I'll never forget. That was the first big stakes race that I won, and that one always sticks in the memory bank. I know, in the grand

scheme of things, it's not as big a stakes as others on the calendar, but it was a significant race for me at the time.

"You try and win that race every year, and we were able to break through that year. It was a very special day."

## Chantilly crushes Gold Series field in lifetime best 1:49.4 to remain undefeated through 11 career starts

Chantilly, Canada's reigning Horse of the Year, set a career best 1:49.4 mark while easily besting a field of 10 in the lone \$140,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series event for 3-year-old pacing fillies on Saturday (May 24) at Woodbine Mohawk Park. It was the first OSS Gold event of 2025.

Millar Farms' homebred daughter of Big Jim out of Shiraz Seelster, who was sent off at 1-9, is now undefeated through all 11 career starts. It was her second pari-mutuel win of 2025 and pushed her career earnings to the brink of \$900,000 (\$897,756 CDN to be exact).

Starting from the rail, driver James MacDonald positioned Chantilly fourth in the early going. The pair took the lead with a strong brush before reaching the half in :55. They opened up on the field from there through the three-quarters in 1:21.4 and came home in :28 to win by 4½ lengths over Wickedpace on a cold, windy night.

Perfectly Chic was third, Wicked N Single finished fourth and Outtathisworld Deo picked up the final check.

"[Chantilly's] high gear is just something else," MacDonald told Woodbine Mohawk Park's Chad Rozema. "I was able to clear the lead pretty, pretty easily. And then she's just one of those horses — and I've only driven a few of them in my life — where you feel like you're absolutely crawling... You've got to be careful with her, because she's just got unbelievable speed.

"She's just a special horse. She's passed every test with flying colors. I would have liked to go :52 with the brakes on, but she's got other plans. Sometimes when you put her in top gear she's just relentless with her speed. Hopefully, she keeps carrying on to bigger and better things."

Whether that means Chantilly will be entered against the boys in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup or the Fan Hanover for sophomore fillies (both have their finals on June 14 at Woodbine Mohawk Park) will be up to her owner George Millar, said Chantilly's trainer Nick Gallucci.

"It's going to be George Millar's call," Gallucci said. "We'll just see what happens, and I'm good with whatever decision he makes." Chantilly will get next week off, Gallucci said.

### Sterling Choice, Control Rocks record lifetime best miles while scoring OSS Gold

**Sterling Choice** and **Control Rocks** won the two \$90,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series events for 3-year-old pacing colts on Saturday (May 24) at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Both winners set career-best miles and had first-time drivers.

In the first division (race 6), roan pacer Sterling Choice, bred by Winbak Farm, led most of the way, scoring a 1:50.4 victory for owner/trainer Blake MacIntosh and his ownership partners Ozzie and Tammy Lynn MacKay, who purchased Sterling Choice for \$15,000 at the 2023 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling auction in Harrisburg, PA.

Billy Davis, Jr. drove the son of Betterthancheddar out of Platinum Choice for the first time, leading the field through fractions of :27.1, :56.3 and 1:24.1. Sterling Choice scored a 2½ length win over Set Shot. Favorite Aquinas Hanover was third and Fubar Bunday and Blue Bar picked up the final two checks, respectively.

Bettors sent Sterling Choice off at 5-2.

"He's just so handy off the gate," Davis, Jr. said to Woodbine Mohawk Park's Chad Rozema. "He can get away so quickly and then he's got great manners and you just can relax and get a nice breather in the middle of the mile."

It was the first win of 2025 for Sterling Choice in three starts. He now sports a lifetime record of 3-4-4 in 14 starts and earnings of \$362,380.

MacIntosh said Sterling would likely contest the Somebeachsomewhere Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park next Saturday (May 31) before deciding whether to enter the pacer in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup.

"He's matured a lot, filled out a lot and he looks great," MacIntosh said. "He's a horse sort of like Rodney Dangerfield. He doesn't get any respect. Every driver picks off him every week, so hopefully Billy sticks with him."





In the second division, Control Rocks and first-time driver Tyler Borth scored a 17-1 upset in a division featuring 1-9 favorite Crack Shot, who finished fourth.

Control Rocks, a gelded son of Control The Moment out of Katie Rocks that was bred by Ben Mudry of Toronto and is owned and trained by Jack Darling, posted a 1:50.1 lifetime best in just his fifth lifetime start.

The pacer battled early with Stonebridge Wizard, with Control Rocks taking control up the backstretch and holding off the field from there to record a  $1\frac{3}{4}$  length victory.

"I didn't really know much about [Control Rocks] at all," Borth told Woodbine Mohawk Park's Chad Rozema. "I thought he raced pretty good last week... I didn't think there was a ton of inside speed, and he felt like a big, strong

horse in the post parade, so I elected to get him out of there.

"I didn't know he was that kind of horse, but he was amazing."

Tip Of Time was second, Fifth And Five was third and Mood Control finished just behind Crack Shot in fifth.

It was Control Rocks' second win in four 2025 starts. He is now 2-1-1 lifetime. He made just one start in 2024.

"It was kind of a mystery," Darling said of Control Rocks' 2-yearold season. "He qualified decently, and then his next start, he was terrible. Something went wrong. He got a little bit sick, and I just quit with him."

Darling, who purchased Control Rocks for \$33,000 at the 2023 London Classic Yearling Sale, said the gelding will mostly race in the Ontario Sires Stakes program this year.

# Noel Daley trainees sweep NJSS finals at Big M

Saturday (May 24) was a good night at The Meadowlands for 2024 Dan Patch Trainer of the Year Noel Daley as his trainees swept the New Jersey Sire Stakes finals for 3-year-old male and female pacers.

**Smooth Dream** won the \$225,000 NJSS final for sophomore males in 1:50.3.

After contently sitting third at the rail from post 8, through early fractions of :27.4 and :56.2, driver Todd McCarthy moved Smooth Dream (1-5 favorite) first over with three-eighths to go.

Smooth Dream continued to eat into the lead of race leader Manolete (driven by Scott Zeron) as they passed three-quarters in 1:24 setting up for an epic battle down the stretch.

The horses were head-to-head, nose-to-nose for the lead, but at the wire it was Smooth Dream getting up by a neck over a gutsy Manolete (4-1). Making History finished third.

"I was glad Todd did what he did, I didn't want him in front," Daley said. "I was happy for him to come first over. Manolete was better than I thought he would be in front... he fought on well. They were clocking a pretty good [final] quarter there into the wind."

Smooth Dream, now five-for-five on the season, only had three starts as a 2-year-old before being sidelined with an injury.

The gelded son of Cattlewash—Dreamlands Latte bred by Winbak Farm and sold for \$60,000 at the 2023 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, was moved into Daley's barn earlier this year.

"You're learning about him as much as I'm learning about him," Daley said. "He was ready to go; I got him a couple of weeks before he qualified [in April]. We never do a lot with him at home. He's such a sharp little fella, he's easy to put up with."

Owned by Bay Pond Racing Stable, CTC Stable and KDP Stable LLC, Smooth Dream paid \$2.60 to win.

In the \$225,000 final for sophomore fillies, Daley's **Worklifebalance** wired the field.

After fractions of :27.3, :57, and 1:24.2, Worklifebalance (Andrew McCarthy) hung on by a nose to win in 1:51.4 over Beach Babe, with Reckless Abandon in third.

The daughter of Cattlewash—Ubettergo Go, bred by WJ Donovan and sold at the Standardbred Horse Sale in 2023 for \$65,000, is owned by CTC Stable, KDP Stable LLC, and Manklin Creek LLC.

Worklifebalance paid \$5.80 to win.

**WINNING U.S. DEBUT FOR DIAL SQUARE S:** In the \$40,000 first leg of the Miss Versatility for older female trotters, **Dial Square S** held off a late charge from Elista Hanover to win by a nose in 1:51.3.

Ake Svanstedt trains and drives the 5-year-old black daughter of Ready Cash—Eileen Boko for owner Stall Arsenal AB. Making her U.S. debut a winning one, Dial Square S returned \$9.40 to her backers.



After all, last week, the Ron Burke trainee went first up and missed a neck to Periculum in the \$158,000 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial.

So, Lexus Kody was sent to the gate as the 3-5 favorite. And he delivered.

"His consistency has been the problem," said winning driver Yannick Gingras. "But there is no reason he can't go with the best trotters out there. He's got the talent."

Up Your Deo, the 5-2 second choice, was away quickly from post 7 and had the lead out of turn one. Soon thereafter, Lexus Kody,

leaving from post 9 in the nine-horse field, was up to challenge the leader and took the point while parked at the first call in a snappy :27 over a track rated 'sloppy'.

"He doesn't mind a fast [first] quarter," said Gingras.

Once 'Kody' had the front, he reached the half in :55.4. S I P, the 9-2 third choice, was now in motion first-over on the rim, but could not get close to the leader as three-quarters went in 1:24.

Proving once again tough to beat with the lead, Lexus Kody trotted home in :27.2 to record a safe two-length win in 1:51.2. Outside The Fire was airborne late, closing a ton of ground to grab second, while Up Your Deo held third closing willingly along the cones.

"He felt good," said Gingras. "He's a nice horse. I just had to keep him out of trouble."

A 7-year-old gelded son of Archangel—Lexus Helios, Lexus Kody improved his lifetime stats to 28 wins from 76 starts, good for earnings of \$665,672 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi and Phillip Collura. He paid \$3.40 to win.
