Gillis, Fishman wiretap case proves industry must act faster to protect horses

Why did it take 18 months for the sport to punish Jeff Gillis after The Meadowlands banned him for being on a list of alleged EPO purchasers?

The wiretaps are chilling for their utter disregard for equine health and safety and Jeff Gillis' blatant robbery of his fellow horsepeople, but, sadly, not surprising. The response by racing commissions and associations, while nice, is far too slow.

This week, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) handed the trainer a 10-year suspension and a \$40,000 fine. The United States Trotting Association (USTA) quickly slapped a reciprocal "indefinite" ban of Gillis.

Kudos to the AGCO for being the first to act — and deliver a stiff penalty — when many others failed. But it's troubling all this comes **18 months** after Meadowlands owner **Jeff Gural banned Gillis and 32 other people** from his track whose names appeared on records indicating they allegedly made, at the very least, questionable purchases from disgraced veterinarian Seth Fishman's performance-enhancing drug (PED) operation. Fishman is a convicted horse dope peddler that holds the dubious distinction of receiving the longest federal prison sentence (11 years) among more than 20 people sent to jail for a collective total of more than 65 years in horse doping cases brought by the FBI and the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York.

Gural makes a troubling and salient point when he wrote that not one track bothered to ask him what evidence he had to ban 33 people a year-and-a-half ago. We asked Gural on Saturday if that extended beyond tracks and he responded via email that no racing commissions or associations asked for more information, either.

"Sadly, no one asked, but we provided the info to the New Jersey Racing Commission, AGCO and Hambletonian Society," Gural said.

So, why did it take the public release of the wiretap transcripts of conversations between Fishman and Gillis before action was taken?

In the 18 months since Gural banned Gillis from the biggest track in the sport — specifically placing Gillis on a list of those said to have purchased the "untraceable" performance-enhancer BB3 (EPO), which we now know from the wiretaps Gillis did indeed purchase — horses trained by Gillis collectively earned nearly \$2 million in purses and his UTRS hovered over .300.

Gural said he believes if it wasn't for the transcripts being released, "Gillis would still be racing except at my tracks."

It's not unreasonable to think that in those 18 months, a man that had few qualms about purchasing EPO multiple times because he couldn't compete without it — it's right there on the wiretaps — continued to put the health of his horses in jeopardy and continued to steal from honest competitors.

Human athletes using PEDs to cheat is egregious enough. It's disgraceful to give potentially harmful substances to innocent horses that lack the ability to consent.

The AGCO said Gillis purchased or attempted to purchase drugs from Fishman multiple times between Oct. 14, 2018 and June 27, 2019.

In the wiretap transcripts released into evidence, Gillis said to Fishman, "I ordered some of the BB3 from you last fall" and then placed an order for 10 more doses/bottles.

A discussion of the price per bottle then led to this exchange:

Fishman: "Unfortunately building blood is not cheap friend."

Gillis: "No, I hear you."

Fishman: "It's the Holy Grail of all sports."

Gillis: "Yeah, and try and compete without it, you know, at a high level."

Fishman: "I know in the thoroughbreds what these guys are pushing but you know it's insane and... I don't mention names, I don't talk about other people, but I've seen some bloods on horses being claimed by certain trainers, and I don't know, I don't think they are getting out of competition tested let's leave it at that."

Gillis: "Right, right."

Fishman: "That's just my theory, you know?"

Gillis: "And with either of these you are confident that there's — if they pull blood six hours later you would be safe?"

Fishman: "Well, on mine I am very confident because it [was] tested... literally it was like 12 hours later. They gave it the night before and [Meadowlands investigator] Brice Cote showed up to their farm like early in the morning."

Gillis: "And then you said that [sample was sent] to Hong Kong [to be tested], I think you told me."

Fishman: "Yeah, it did go to Hong Kong. Well, that's what they told the person."

There's plenty to unpack there, but let's just stick to the fact that the wiretaps were from more than five years ago and little was done to Gillis until now.

It's important to note that Gillis does not show a positive test on his record that we could find. So, if he did use EPO, he got away with it until now. It was the wiretaps that did him in, which is why that work, partly funded by Gural, is so important.



Racing commissions and associations simply must do better to investigate cases of cheating that are right there in front of them, especially when horses are endangered. Ask him for it.

That this is the second 10-year suspension and \$40,000 fine handed down by the AGCO in less than a year for alleged EPO use — the **Richard Moreau / Sylvain Filion case is currently under appeal** — is progress. At least in that case, there was a positive test.

Yet, the sad reality is that many of us bemoan the decline of the sport and do little to improve the situation.

Racing commissions and associations simply must do better to investigate cases of cheating that are right there in front of them, especially when horses are endangered. Commissions that don't act in a timely fashion are failing to uphold their mission to protect horses and the public. Gural has long said he has more evidence that should put away more bad actors. Ask him for it.

Meanwhile, more tracks should follow Gural's lead and exercise private property rights to ban unscrupulous operators.

Finally, honest horsepeople must demand better of regulators and speak up, anonymously, when they suspect someone is giving horses PEDs. Remaining silent is akin to tossing a thief the keys to your house and letting them know when you won't be home.

At the core of all of this is protecting the very animals on which everyone in the industry makes their living - and the vast majority of us profess to love.

For their sake, all of us need to do better.



A layman's look at casino legislation in Ohio that could impact horse racing

You're welcome.

I'm sorry.

You're welcome that I did some heavy reading. I'm sorry that I don't completely understand what I read.

The future of harness racing troubles me. Therefore, the May 18, 2025, front page headline of *The Cleveland Plain Dealer* got my attention. The article was titled, Lawmakers look to go all in on iGaming. The subtitle read – State Senate Bill 197 would let websites and apps allow people 21 or older to gamble via casino-styled games. The bill was introduced by Senator Nathan Manning of North Ridgeville, OH, as state Senate Bill 197. The bill is currently under consideration in the Ohio Senate's select committee on gaming.

"The bill would allow Ohio's four casinos and seven racinos to introduce websites or apps to gamble on casino-styled games such as roulette, slots, blackjack, and poker, plus internet gambling on real and simulated horse racing."

Upon reading the lede (yes, the word is lede and not lead), my harness racing survival thoughts and Spidey sense engaged. What does this mean for the thriving Ohio harness racing program? Is this good news or bad? I dove deeper into the question by searching the internet for a copy of the proposed legislation. Here is where you can thank me and why my head almost exploded.

With a can of Red Bull and two naps, your friendly correspondent read the entire legislation. Well, full disclosure: there was skimming. Page after page, about vendors, initial licenses, tax rates, lotteries, bingo, funding, charitable, fingerprinting, the Ohio constitution, blah, blah blah.

As I read the legislation, I wondered about the genesis of this proposal. I asked if Nathan Manning rose from bed one morning and decided to wade into these waters. Did some powerful lobbyists slip into the Buckeye State and suggest that this proposal was an excellent idea for the citizens of Ohio? Did Nathan write the proposal, or did he have friends assist in the plan? Is this an altruistic citizen-driven action without a hint of ulterior motivation? Is or was the Ohio horse racing community deeply involved and actively participating in Senate Bill 197? Who are the winners and losers?

As a horse racing enthusiast, most of the information glazed over my eyes. However, one detail alarmed me. Starting on page 188, line 5713 (the document has both pages and line numbers) and on lines 5774, 5848, 6135, 6344 – etc., I noticed the term "Racing Commission" has a deletion line through the word "Racing," leaving only the word Commission." If my interpretation of the legislation is correct, the Ohio Casino Control Commission would oversee gambling, including horse racing. The new legislation would abolish The Ohio State Racing Commission (RAC) if passed.

Let us take a few moments to speculate.

For proponents of harness horse racing, the concept of an Ohio Casino Control Commission calling the shots for horse racing should bring knots to your stomach. The other players in this gambling stew (bingo, land-based casinos, online sports gambling, online casino gambling, the Ohio lottery, and who knows who else) are powerful and predatory and do not wake each morning looking to bolster harness horse racing.

More troubling is that several articles popped up while searching for an analysis of the legislation. However, none addressed the effect on horse racing, while several reported, "The legislation may move fast."

The gambling floodgates are open. The public's resistance to gambling, both online and in person, is fading. We are well over a decade from being the only legal gamble in the state. With the passage of legislation such as this, irresponsible gamblers and gambling addicts can finish off a few wine coolers, stroll out to their kids' backyard swing set, open their phones, and gamble away every dime they have and dimes they do not have.

This report on pending legislation is very depressing. Who has our harness racing backs is an unknown question. I sense that the long knives are out in every horse racing state. The parties wielding the long knives are powerful.

That's all I got on this topic: a report, a few fears, no answers, and eyestrain.

After reading this legislation, War and Peace, another Tolstoy tome, does not look as daunting. If harness racing gets cut out of the pie, I will order a copy of War and Peace, pop a wine cooler, and read it. If casinos call the tune for harness horse racing in Ohio, I will have plenty of time for reading.

Doug McNair on Mohawk star Logan Park's Elitloppet experience

On Sunday (May 25) at Stockholm's Solvalla Racetrack, there was only one North American-based trotter in the eliminations for Elitloppet 2025. It was Logan Park, the reigning O'Brien Older Trotting Horse of the Year and undefeated king of the Woodbine Mohawk Park preferred trot this season. His 1:50.4 victory over Gaines Hanover on May 5 at Mohawk is currently the fastest winning mile by a trotter this year in Canada.Logan Park (6, 1:49.2m; \$1,566,469) went to Europe after his connections accepted a coveted 2025 Elitloppet invitation. Trainer Robert Kyle Fellows and members of the horse's ownership group joined the gelding on his European adventure. Logan Park is

owned by Arpad Szabo of Bradford, ON, the Outofthepark Stable of Rockwood, ON, and breeder Reg Higgs of Blenheim, ON. The fastest-ever Canadian-sired trotter went behind the starting gate in the first of the two Elitloppet eliminations, in line to his regular driver, Doug McNair. When Logan Park ventured to Stockholm for one of the world's top trotting races, his regular Woodbine Mohawk Park pilot joined him at Solvalla.

Friday (May 30), McNair told HRU about the Elitloppet experience. While he arrived at the Swedish track that Sunday to drive, Logan Park had been living at Bernie Noren's Swedish farm "for a couple weeks," after some serious travel for the horse to get there from Canada.

"It took about a total time, in a truck, trailers, planes, and stuff, of around 40, 45 hours for him to get there," McNair said of Logan Park's arduous arrangements. "It was long ship for him, but as far as me, like, I went over on Thursday [May 22] and came back Monday morning [May 26]. So, it was a great trip. A good experience."

The Mohawk reinsman said the huge crowd at Solvalla impressed him. The amount of people that they get, you know what I mean? he said. Over here, we've got huge crowds out east from the Gold Cup and Saucer or even a night like this



McNair has driven in Europe before, but the 2025 Elitloppet was his first.

"I raced at the World Driving Championship in 2019," he said. Logan Park was not himself in his Elitloppet elimination, finishing eighth and failing to advance to the final. He was undefeated in three 2025 starts at the WMP preferred level and the last two were without Lasix, in preparation for his Swedish debut. The medication is not permitted in racehorses there.

McNair said he was unsure why Logan Park, the only North American horse invited this year, failed to show his best form in the elimination.



"Yeah, I don't know," McNair said. "It's just probably factoring in a few things. You know, it was a tough ship for him. I even talked to Dagfin [Henriksen, who took Perfetto to Elitloppet]. He wasn't in the truck nearly as long as [Logan Park] was."

Transportation was not the only element that may have worked against Logan Park. "His trip didn't work out perfect," McNair said. "He obviously didn't like the track. It's got a real bank on it. It's different than Mohawk and the North American tracks... It's quite a bit deeper." He wanted to clarify that the rare disappointing result took nothing away from Logan Park. "He's still a great horse, and I'd love to see him face off against those European horses in North America, because I think he can go with any of those horses, in North America," McNair said.

He added that he didn't think the trip hurt his chances in the elimination. The way it was in the stretch, I don't think it would have mattered if I was on the front end or not," he said. "You know, we lost quite a bit of ground in the stretch... We followed the horse who actually won the final [Go On Boy]. "McNair said the European style of racing, training, and driving remains quite different from North America.

"Our horses can't race two-by-two, but their horses are used to it," McNair said. "Ours aren't, so I wasn't taking a shot to get parked. I didn't want to go that type of trip. I just figured I'd race mine as soon as the gate pulled, and I made my choice to race him from the middle, and hopefully get to the final and maybe have a shot in the final. I was sitting seventh on the outside in the first turn, so that wasn't a great spot either."

McNair said Logan Park had stayed in Sweden after the race.

"I think he was 13 or 14 hours from Frankfurt, Germany, at Bernie's farm," he said.

The gelding had flown to and from North America via New York's JFK Airport, a flight of 8 or 9 hours. Being based at Mohawk with Logan Park stabled nearby is preferable to regularly traveling long distances to race. The gelding was expected to arrive back at the Fellows' training center on Friday (May 30), according to his regular driver.

"On Monday night, we've got a horse that's 1-9 or 3-5, and I'm going for \$38,000," said McNair, referring to Logan Park's typical odds in the top class at Mohawk. He added that he was unsure of when or where Logan Park will race next, and would know better how the trotter came out of the race and trip when he sat behind him again. The 2025 Elitloppet experience was one McNair said he enjoyed immensely, and he would love another chance to drive in the race. "The hotels were great," he said. "The food was great. The people were great. The weather ended up turning out really good. That was a great time, and I think people appreciated the show."



The longtime collector/fan created Harness Racing History for the betterment or our sport.



John Polvinale is nearing the age of 88. He has been a harness racing fan and a collector of harness racing memorabilia for the vast majority of that time. Recently, he donated the overwhelming majority of his collection to the Harness Racing Museum. His involvement in the sport began in the formative years of the New York racetracks Roosevelt Raceway and Yonkers in the late 1940s, when as an underaged teenager he accompanied his father to the original home of the Messenger Stakes in Westbury, NY. Then as now, he was in love with the sport, its characters and most importantly its great equine performers.



Most people look upon you, among other areas, as a preserver of the sport's history through you starting the internet site Harness Racing History. How did that come to pass?

"In 2016, the internet contained a hodgepodge of harness racing posts and information. I thought it might be a good idea to somewhat formalize this talk and give those folks, especially younger people, a place to come to and discuss just about anything and everything relating to our great sport. Prior to its establishment, many of the discussions began with, or often

led to, anger, animosity and sometimes even outright rage. I believed that these were nothing but wasted emotions and totally unnecessary for what I wanted. I wanted a happy place where people could express their views and become educated by those of others, through decent, and civilized discourse. Thus, I began Harness Racing History.

"Anybody could join. The only rules were that the discussions were limited to all areas of harness racing and that they had to conduct themselves in an orderly fashion. There also had to be no advertising or any other signs of commercialism. There was to be no bad language, no threats and nothing that related to negativity. Within a few months, the site had a membership in excess of 2,000. Now, slightly less than a decade later our membership is almost 50,000 and includes people from over a hundred countries. Only a small percentage of these folks post on the site, but I'd like to think that a good many of them read what is transmitted and have an interest in the sport."

Almost 50,000 subscribers? That is a huge number. How do you administer such a large group?

"Actually, I have help. As the site grew, I thought it became too big for me. One of our early members was Pete Lawrence. I asked him to become our moderator. In addition to Pete, there are others who help including Dean Hoffman, Dom Robelo, Nina Bell Mariani, and Daniel Allor, without whose aid we couldn't function as we do. It's a somewhat informal group with no ensconced hierarchy. The main goal of its being is to generate interest and conversation in and of harness racing. In 2019, I was surprised and deeply honored to receive the USHWA [U.S. Harness Writers Association] President's Award from Shawn Wiles in appreciation for my founding of the site."

You were a great friend and fan of Herve Filion. How did that association come about?

"I lived in New Jersey and spent many a day at Freehold Raceway. As many fans of the sport do, I greatly mourn the fact that it no longer exists. I would hang out in the drivers' room at Freehold and would occasionally speak with Herve. Those conversations grew and led to a long and enduring friendship. I moved to Wilkes Barre when Herve was racing at Pocono Downs. Our friendship continued and grew.

In addition to harness racing, we shared other interests. We both enjoyed playing cards and shooting pool. Herve's prowess at both, much as with harness racing was exceptional. I couldn't come close to him. He would almost always clean my clock. Herve would visit often at my place while he was racing at Pocono Downs. that the museum took about 90 per cent of what I had put together. I made arrangements with my good friend Rick Kane, the director of racing at Pocono Downs, to take what he found useful pertaining to Pocono Downs of what remained and to put it on display in a suitable area of the racetrack, which he has done."

Through your many years of being involved in the sport, in addition to being a fan and a collector, haven't you also owned quite a few horses?

"Yes indeed. I really have no idea of the number of horses I've owned through the years. Its more than a hundred and less than 200. It began with a horse named Steady New Yorker that I bought into at the suggestion of a Freehold trainer named 'Big Mike' Petitto. In his first start, with a young Jackie Moiseyev driving, he won for us pacing away easily at 25-1 odds. In addition to getting the purse, we also bet on him. 'This is an easy game.' I thought to myself. As many have found out, I couldn't have been more mistaken. It certainly isn't easy. There have been many mountains to climb and some heartaches to endure, but when the stars are in alignment and you are lucky enough to visit the winner's circle, there is nothing else quite as gratifying."

You recently made an interesting suggestion in a post on Harness Racing History following up on a suggestion you made a few years ago, about a "Wall of Achievements." What can you tell us about that?

"I **thought it was a good idea**, but apparently the folks at Goshen did not agree. I took my suggestion to Janet Terhune at the Museum. She said that she would bring it up before the board. They said they were not interested.

"There is a feeling among some that there is much, for lack of a better word 'politics' involved in choosing members of the Living Hall of Fame, as well as to, perhaps a lesser degree, members of the Immortals section. I'd like to make it clear that my suggestion is not for the living HOF members or Immortals to be replaced by those that fit my criteria.

"This is not a substitution for the formula currently used for choosing people for the Hall of Fame.

"My suggested criteria might include drivers who have won more than 10,000 pari-mutuel races and/or Grade 1 wins, trainers and the number of Grade 1 races they have won, breeders and owners the same, getting their names on a wall in the Museum. These criteria are only some that come to mind. Others could be added. But they would in some fashion allow for significant achievements by some heretofore unacknowledged horsemen to be recognized, such as Billy Parker, Jr., and others who meet these standards and if not, they wouldn't."





Summer starts early in Ontario as Grand River opens Wednesday

The Elora track is pulling out all the stops to keep their healthy handle momentum.

The first day of summer in the Northern Hemisphere, astronomically speaking, is Friday, June 20.

The first day of summer in Elora, Ontario, culturally speaking, is Wednesday, June 4 – otherwise known as opening day at Grand River Raceway.

"When Grand River opens that means summertime's coming," said Jenna MacDonell ahead of her second season as raceway manager. "Everybody is looking forward to opening day and getting out of that cold, winter grind. We do so much prep getting ready for the season.

"At this point, I'm ready for it... let's go."

While the eager MacDonell, with the support of her racing team, is still ironing out some of the final details, she added the ship is sailing much steadier in the leadup to the 2025 season than it was in 2024.

At this time last year, the western Ontario oval was gearing up for its first campaign as a five-eighths mile track, following the successful extension of its racing surface.

Prior to the redesign, Grand River had operated as a half-mile track for the entirety of its 20-plus-year existence.

The revamped racing surface received rave reviews from horse people and horseplayers in its inaugural showing, resulting in a new overall handle record of \$13,933,212, and a much more soothing prelude to the 2025 renewal.

"The key was seeing how it would hold over the winter, but so far it looks good," told MacDonell. "We've had horses out training since the beginning of May, and it's a lot more seamless this year now that everything was about up and rolling compared to last year.

In the [Grand River] NEIGHbourhood tent, kids can learn about racehorses, for example, what they eat and what a day in the life of a racehorse looks like, as well as enjoy a variety of fun activities. We're really trying to give the younger crowd and families a nice night out and make them want to come back.

"Hopefully, we can glide into opening day with no major issues and set the tone for another memorable season."

Achieving a "healthy handle," as MacDonell put it, was especially meaningful given the emerging challenges surrounding handle health at tracks around the province.

"I was happy because it was a tough year where we saw a bit of a decline in handle everywhere, but we maintained. That was really my goal for last year and I think that will be my goal continuing into this year.

"It's tough out there. There's a lot of competition but we have an excellent product, and I think that shines through."

Alongside gunning for another strong wagering output in 2025, MacDonell and co. remain intent on delivering a premium experience for track-goers.

Grand River, in pursuit of that overarching goal, has planned several new and returning events tailored for fans of all ages and backgrounds.

One of the fresh additions to the track's summer schedule is an activities and racehorse education center for kids, known as the NEIGHbourhood.

Running on Friday nights in June and September (eight total, four nights each month), the dedicated kid-friendly space is an extension of the track's successful NEIGHbourhood program.

In the Tarmac Tent, guests will be treated to a virtual reality horse racing experience courtesy of the Bill Galvin Racing Alliance, arts and crafts, coloring books, interactive educational stations to learn more about horses and Standardbred racing, and a visit from Grandy, the mascot at Grand River Raceway.

"In the NEIGHbourhood tent, kids can learn about racehorses, for example, what they eat and what a day in the life of a racehorse looks like, as well as enjoy a variety of fun activities.

"We're really trying to give the younger crowd and families a nice night out and make them want to come back."

In July and August, the tent space will remain open on all three race nights during the week (Monday, Wednesday, and Friday).

Also coming to Grand River across its four-month, 48-race date season, is the return of the fan-favorite wiener dog races on July 4.

MacDonell, who said over 30 dogs have already registered for the event, noted that tickets for VIP seating in the Captain's Quarters restaurant overlooking the racetrack are also on sale.

Spicing up the return of the dachshunds is a shift in that particular race night's menu from picnic boxes to a buffet.

The Captain's Quarters buffet will be available once more in 2025, returning August 4 for Grand River's hallmark race day, Industry Day (12:30 p.m. post time).

The Harness the Hope breast cancer research, support, and awareness fundraiser will also make its way back to Grand River on August 15.

During last year's event, the Raceway raised \$25,000.

"We'll have our big pink patio party that we had last year. Harness the Hope is very popular and it's near and dear to our hearts."

One last can't-miss addition landing at Grand River in 2025 is a brand-new wood fire pizza oven.

The timeline for its debut is still working itself out, but MacDonell added it is coming soon.

The early returns, she said, have been promising.

"I've been very involved in the whole menu taste testing," laughed MacDonell. "Our chef, he's a pizza guy, I'm a pizza girl, and we are very excited to roll this out."

Between the new culinary lineup, NEIGHbourhood tent, and return of perennial favorites like Industry Day, Harness the Hope, and Wiener Dog night, Grand River is pulling out all the stops in 2025.

That versatility complements the track's three-night-a-week schedule, which yields a different crowd every night.

Mondays and Wednesdays, MacDonell said, belong to the regulars. Fridays are made for families.

Each race night brings something unique to the table.

"I'm a big fan of our schedule. Friday night, we have a lot of families that will come out, and it's very busy on track. Usually, it's hard to find a spot to sit because it's poppin', especially when you get a beautiful night.

"Wednesday night, we don't have to compete with Mohawk – that's typically our best night when it comes to the handle. Most importantly, though, we have a great card of racing every night."

Something she has seen through different lenses throughout the years, from fan to supporter, and now, manager.

"Year after year, it's about building on what's already been here, and it's been a pleasure. It's going to be a fun summer."

Will Vel Cinderella go from Illinois fairs to the Grand Circuit?

Indiana Sires Stakes competition for sophomore pacers and trotters kicked off on Memorial Day (May 26) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Chalk horses carried the day, with favorites or second choices capturing seven of the eight divisions in the program's top tier. The lone exception? Pacing filly Vel Cinderella. Sent off at 86-1 odds, the Keystone Velocity—The Filly Princess

sophomore and driver Marcus Miller turned heads with a 1:53.2 upset for trainer Rob Rittof, returning \$174 in victory.

"She just goes out there and tries, you know, she gives you a hundred and ten percent, gives you her all," Rittof said of Vel Cinderella. "We had the 8-hole. I told Marcus when we were going out just figure out how to make us some money. If it's a check, it's great and if it's a win, it's even better."

The final result turned out to be a whole lot better. The Doug Overhiser-owned pacer picked up the lion's share of the \$49,500 purse in a race where favored Tarshish was pulled up racing into the last turn. Vel Cinderella capitalized on the opportunity, sprinting home in 26 seconds flat to overtake second choice Odds On Alexandria and win by a length. While the victory was a pleasant surprise for the owner, the shock came in learning the filly's long-shot status afterward.

"It's weird how life works, right?" Overhiser said. "I was on the phone with somebody, I'm watching the race on TV, so I'm half paying attention and half having a conversation. And, you know, the race goes off, and of course, in the middle of the conversation, I start yelling and screaming because I can see that it's going to be close, she might win. And then as the race



is over, they go 86-1, and I was like, 'What?' I looked at my wife, my wife looked at me and was like, 'How did you not bet her?' And I'm like, 'I didn't know.' I absolutely just didn't know, or she would not have been 86-1."

Hindsight being what it is, there may be some scratching their heads that Vel Cinderella was the next to longest shot on the board in Monday's contest. Overhiser and Rittof were quick to note that the filly is small in stature. That didn't deter the owner from spending \$19,000 to purchase her out of the Hoosier Classic sale in 2023, admitting he paid more than he anticipated for the pacer bred by Mo Coo Inc. of New York.

"I really thought we'd get her very, very cheap, like \$8,000 was what I assumed," Overhiser said. "And so, I kind of locked in on her, really, really liking her, talking myself more and more into it. And I just kept going. The other thing that got me was there was a Keystone Velocity that won the Jugette that year [Ucandoit Blue Chip], and I said, 'Why not?'"

When digging into her past performance lines, Vel Cinderella's freshman campaign reveals a filly that finished on the board in six of seven contests. She began last season racing in Illinois on the fair circuit in the Topline series. Making her second seasonal start at the Effingham County Fair, Vel Cinderella broke the 80-year-old track record for 2-year-olds with a 1:58.3 performance. In all, the filly won four Topline events before moving to Indiana Sires Stakes, making two starts and finishing second each time out.

"I give a lot of kudos to Doug," the conditioner said. "He let me kind of take it easy with her because she's not that big of a horse and, you know, I don't think too many horses start at the Illinois Topline and race at Springfield and DuQuoin in the Topline and then sneak over to Hoosier for sires stakes. But it worked out really good for her. We were hoping to make the consolation and then she was second twice and we made the final."

Despite drawing post 9 and never seeing the rail in the \$250,000 Super Final, Vel Cinderella managed a fifth-place finish under the guidance of Yannick Gingras, pacing the mile in 1:52.3.

"When he came back after the race, he kind of had a big old grin and said, 'She raced huge, you know, parked the mile and he couldn't find any hole; I just didn't want him to come back and put the lines up and say she's no good," Rittof said of Gingras' reaction. "He was very pleased with her. But everybody has liked her. She had five different guys drive her last year and everyone came back and liked her."

Long before Vel Cinderella's Memorial Day triumph, Overhiser set his sights on one of the sport's coveted stakes, a prize fit for a princess in the making. Give him credit for dreaming big and taking major swings.

"Rob and I have been talking about this since her first fair win in Illinois last year," Overhiser said. "We're going to take her to the Jugette. Anybody who's ever listened to me, I've said it since this little filly raced her first race. That's where we're going unless she tells us differently."

A lot of details must fall into place over the next four months, but the owner and trainer are set on managing Vel Cinderella's schedule so that she qualifies for October's Super Final, while also competing on Delaware's banked oval. A shot at the Jugette would serve as the ultimate glass slipper.

"The look on his face winning that sire stake the other night was incredible," Overhiser said of his trainer. "Can you imagine the look on that guy's face if he won the Jugette?"





Remembering Terry Morgan

Terry Morgan passed away this week, three months shy of his 82nd birthday. The native from the hills of Tennessee had been a steady presence in harness racing for over six decades. In the late 1960s, he was stabled in between Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton at Pompano Park.

"You could learn a lot from those two," said Morgan, who had spent considerable time through the years in Ohio, Michigan occasionally, and, of course, The Meadowlands. "I'd get a horse from them they didn't want or couldn't get to go."

As a matter of fact, the answer to this pair of Meadowlands trivia questions, is Morgan.

- 1. Who is the only driver/trainer to participate in East Rutherford in both 1976 and 2025?
- 2. The first Hambletonian in New Jersey was held in 1981, and on that day, who trained Searights, the horse that paid \$60, the highest price to win?

Bill O'Donnell remembers that Morgan did his best work with horses who needed special attention.

"He could do it all," O'Donnell said. "Especially with a horse who had missed time. You name it he did it. I remember going to see him one day and he was working on a horse's teeth. Very good horseman."

John Campbell remembers Terry from way back.

"I knew Terry before I got my license over 50 years ago, around Windsor," Campbell said. "He never wanted a big stable. He owned all or part of every horse in his stable. Really a high percentage guy. A professional. He was universally respected anywhere he went to race, as much for his training as well as his driving. Paula and I were very good friends with Terry and Jeannie years ago."

Mark Jordan, who trained Supergrit and Manfred Hanover during his career, is a decade younger than Morgan, but raced with him often on the Michigan circuit.

"Terry was a very good horseman, he liked training and driving his own and was a good blacksmith," Jordan said. "But most of all he was a real man and never hesitated to help anyone he could." **Note:** Personally, I was friends with Morgan since the early 1980s. He was four parts horseman, three parts 'character,' and two parts old school gentleman. He loved the business and was, well, part horse in the estimation of some. His current reclamation project was indeed Lionhead.

"I got him off the back of the Amish truck for \$7,000 four years ago," Morgan said.

Right to the end a wheeler-dealer and a very, very good guy.

HAMBLETONIAN DAY SHORTS

As the first Saturday in August, and the 100th Hambletonian, gets ever closer, it's a good time to share more facts from past Hambletonian Days.

FATHERS AND SONS

It has never happened at The Meadowlands, but it did happen four times in the last six editions at DuQuoin, where the winning driver had a son in the very same race who also got money. In 1976, Billy Haughton won with Steve Lobell and his son Peter finished fifth with Quick Pay. In 1977, they did it again, with Billy taking it all with Green Speed and Peter again fifth, this time with Cold Comfort. Then in 1980, Billy and Burgomeister took down the first prize with his son Tommy and Final Score finishing second.

In 1975, Stanley and Ronnie Dancer started this streak with Bonefish (first) and Surefire Hanover (fifth), respectively.

Being the daughter of a horseman can have a lot of perks, such as traveling and living in many different states. Just ask Chris Tallman Fout who at one-time lived in Vermont, Pennsylvania, New York, Kentucky, Maryland and Florida.

Born in Scranton, PA, Fout is no stranger to our sport for she is a fourth generation horsewoman. Starting with her great-grandfather who was a horse trader, his son PJ Tallman followed as did her uncle Jim Tallman, who was killed in a plane crash flying home from The Meadowlands, and her father, Tom Tallman who was actively in harness racing until he was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis.

Luckily for us, Fout fell in love with the horses and has kept the lineage going.

"My siblings and my son unfortunately did not share in my enthusiasm and chose different paths in life," Fout said. "My sister is a dental assistant, my brother went into the Navy and today is an electrician, and my son is a Marine, but, 'It ain't over till the fat lady sings.' I'm hoping that one of my grandchildren will get involved and continue our legacy."

Fout's father is largely responsible for her lifelong trajectory.

"My dad first sat me on the back of a horse when I was 7 years old, and I never got off," she said with a laugh. "Well maybe enough time to get married and have children.

"I began training horses at 9, then I groomed, matinéed, managed a tack shop, worked in a race office and today, I keep track of all the racehorses that Winbak Farm owns, what tracks each horse is racing at in both the United State and Canada, the purse money, licensing, and whatever else needs to be done.

"Decades ago, my father trained at Spring Garden Ranch in Florida every winter beginning in 1970. That is when I fell in love for the second time, the first was with the horses and harness racing. I met my husband of 35 years at Spring Garden Ranch and today we live in Chesapeake City, Maryland."

Her husband is longtime horseman Jeff Fout, who has also been involved in harness racing for many years. Renowned in the sport, especially in his home state of Ohio, during his career Fout had 4,563 driving wins and amassed \$23,255,000 in career earnings.

"Presently, Jeff is the trainer at Winbak Farm in Chesapeake, MD," Chris said with the sound of pride in her voice. "Although we don't personally own any racehorses at this time, my husband trains about 45 and oversees another 80 horses or so that are with outside trainers in the U.S. and Canada. So much for retiring anytime soon."

According to Chris, over the years, she has owned a lot of "favorite" standardbreds.

"One of them was Gambler's Lair," she said. "Although he wasn't the greatest racehorse, he was and will always be very special to me.

"At that time a friend of mine who also owned racehorses asked to buy Gambler's Lair, and although I didn't want to sell him, my friend made me an offer I couldn't refuse, so eventually I sold Gambler's Lair to him. Although I really loved my horse, I exchanged him for something I needed much more at the time — a truck — so I exchanged Lair's registration papers for the title of the truck.

"Several other horses that have won my heart were Western Hanover, Artsplaced, who my husband drove, and the one and only Shady Daisy who paid a lot of our bills. What a great filly.

But it was a 2-year-old Appaloosa that Chris' father bought her when she was 9, that tops her list.

"The horse's name was Shawnee, and he was my best friend for 28 years until he crossed the Rainbow Bridge at 30," she said. "He was by far the most amazing equine ever and did everything from ponying colts for my dad, outriding, jumping, barrel races, etc. When I was younger, like many other children, I was grounded a lot and gave my parents many grey hairs with my sidekick Shawnee, riding in the torrential rain and in the dark.

"One time my parents couldn't find us and when they did, I got grounded, but to me, it was all worth it. He will always own a big part of my heart. Now that I'm a mother I put myself in my parents' shoes and regret having giving them worries and anxiety like that."

Having been in the sport for decades, Chris said she's certainly seen things change and there are some things she'd like to see change.

"There's been some really drastic changes," she said. "I think we need to draw in young people and let them know that harness racing still exists and is the most exciting 2-minute sport out there. Sadly, when casinos opened, they kicked us to the curb.

"The casinos do zero advertising for harness racing, thus most people that are sitting at the slots or at the tables don't have a clue that there is exciting horse racing going on outside the walls. Most racetracks don't promote our sport by advertising. It is shown to other horsemen and tracks, but we need to get on local and national television so that the non-horsepeople can see it."

Chris pointed out a couple of trainers that she admires.

"As far as a female trainer, I would say Linda Toscano," Chris said. "She's very successful in a man's world and always has her horses ready for the big dance. Linda is very kind and never fails to stop and take a minute to say 'hello.' She's a very classy lady.

"As far as personally impacting me, it would have to be my father. Not only did he pass the 'love for horses' gene to me, but he taught me so much more. Sadly, we lost him on Aug. 10th [last year], and I miss him so much."

Ten years ago, Chris said she came to understand the special relationship she has with her horses.

"In November 2015, I was diagnosed with breast cancer," she said. "2016 was very difficult with surgery and treatments and although it was one of the most difficult things I have gone through, every day I would go to the barn or just sit in the field with my riding horse whenever I could. It was the best therapy and helped get me through the scary situation. So, yes, horses are the best medicine."

Ervin Hanover declared winner of Camluck Classic after stablemate's disqualification

The \$150,000 Camluck Classic Invitational, presented by Seelster Farms, delivered a thrilling finish Friday night (May 31) at The Raceway at Western Fair District. In a dramatic turn of events, **Ervin Hanover** was declared the winner after his stablemate Brue Hanover, who crossed the wire first, was disqualified and placed third for a pylon violation in the final strides.

Brue Hanover, riding a seven-race win streak, left alertly from post 5 and seized the early lead before yielding to Chase H Hanover at the opening quarter. Not content to sit, Brue Hanover quickly retook the front, only to face an immediate challenge from stablemate Ervin Hanover, who surged to the lead before the half in a blistering :54.3.

Ervin Hanover maintained command through three-quarters in 1:22.3, with Chase H Hanover looming off cover and Brue Hanover searching for racing room. The trio thundered down the stretch in a heart-pounding three-across finish, with Brue Hanover narrowly getting his nose to the wire first, only to be placed third for a pylon infraction. The pacer went inside the last few pylons, leaping over the pylon at the wire and going on a break.

The revised order of finish handed the victory to Ervin Hanover, trained by Dave Menary and owned by Pollack Racing LLC of Venetia, PA. It marked the 17th career win for the talented pacer, pushing his lifetime earnings just shy of the \$600,000 mark. Chase H Hanover was elevated to second, with Brue Hanover officially third.



The undercard featured another standout performance in the \$50,000 Forest City Pace for mares. **Caviar N Crackers**, Canada's hottest female pacer, dazzled in her half-mile track debut, stopping the clock in a sparkling 1:53.2. The six-race win streak continues for the mare, who is owned, trained, and driven by the husband-and-wife team of Ed and Ashleigh Hensley.

The program also featured a quartet of \$40,000 London Classic Series finals along with three \$25,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots divisions for 3-year-old pacing colts.

P L Spencer, Ritchie Rich score victories in OSS Gold for male sophomore trotters

P L Spencer won the fastest of two \$90,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series events for 3-year-old trotting colts on Thursday (May 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park. **Ritchie Rich** was the other winner.

In the first OSS event of the night, P L Spencer set a lifetime best 1:54 while winning his first career Gold Series event in his first outing in the top provincial class.

Driver Bob McClure eased the gelded son of Resolve out of P L Indyanaca into fourth out of the 8-hole in the early going as Fast Snap (Chris Christoforou) led the field to the quarter in :28.

P L Spencer (7-2) brushed to the front before the :57.1 half and then held the nine-horse field at bay through the three-quarters in 1:25.2, trotting home in :28.3 to win by 2½ lengths over favorite Wearing The Green (Doug McNair). Fast Snap was third, Cousin Halifax (Travis Cullen) fourth and LMC Wagon Wheel (Tyler Borth) picked up the final check.

"[Fast Snap] looked like he wanted to be covered up, so I let [P L Spencer] try [the front], and then from there, he was pretty green the whole way," McClure told Woodbine Mohawk Park's Chad Rozema. "Down the stretch, he didn't have the same powerful kick he had the week before, coming off a helmet. But if that's not his A plus game, and he can still win, I'm pretty happy."

P L Spencer is owned by his trainer, Steve Bossence of London, ON, along with Richard Thompson, also of London, Derek Reid of Etobicoke, ON and E C S Racing Llc of Rockford, MI. The trotter was bred by Prince Lee Acres of Uxbridge, ON and purchased as a yearling for \$40,000 at the 2023 London Classic Yearling Sale.

P L Spencer improved to 4-1-0 in nine career starts and more than doubled his lifetime earnings to \$85,150. The gelding is now 3-1-0 in five starts in 2025.

"Last year, he seemed like the real deal, and we had trouble with a foot," Bossence said. "He got a quarter crack, and then his angle got really low, and we raced him once more, and he made a break. He went to Kentucky, and we gave him some time off out there, and then brought him back, and he's come back great. He is way better going without the hobbles on, but when he made the break, I said, 'He'll go without them, before he's done, I know he will.' He's a way, way, way nicer going horse without them."

Bossence said P L Spencer's next assignment will likely be against stakes colts in the Goodtimes at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"He'll be in with some bear cats, so [McClure] will get to do what he wants," Bossence said. "He'll be on a helmet next week with him when he runs in with the bear cats, for sure."

In the second Gold test, Ritchie Rich led gate-to-wire through fractions of :28.2,:56.2 and 1:25.4 and pulled away in the stretch to win by $4\frac{3}{4}$ lengths over Gaslight Hall (Jody Jamieson) in 1:54.1.

Todd Ratchford drove Ritchie Rich (2-1) to victory on behalf of his family and was emotional in the winner's circle while speaking to Rozema. It was the family's first career victory at the Gold level.

"My family, my sister, my dad, my mom, they've all done an incredible job with him," Ratchford said. "It's everything. That's why we do this sport, and that's why we love it, just for moments like these, and to have everyone here in the winner's circle, it's pretty amazing."

The homebred son of Wheeling N Dealin out of Hola Lola bred by Cynthia Graham and William Woolfrey of Warkworth, ON is trained and owned, in part by Ratchford's sister, Mary, who shares Ritchie Rich's papers with Graham and Carolyn Jarrell of Roslin, ON.

"I have total confidence in this horse," Todd said. "He's done nothing but show me what he's able to do. So, I figured, if I can get [to the front] kind of easy I'll just keep driving... I thought someone might get close, but once I was down the stretch, I was like, 'All right, it's game over."

Modelo Gold (Dagfin Henriksen) was third, Pierre In Paris (Trevor Henry) was fourth and favorite Galen Erso (Doug McNair) picked up the final check.

The victory more than doubled Ritchie Rich's lifetime earnings to \$83,750. The trotter is now 5-2-0 in 10 career starts and 4-2-0 in seven starts in 2025. The mile was just one-fifth-of-a-second off Ritchie Rich's career best mile of 1:54 set on May 16 in an overnight at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Madden Oaks edged American Son for third.

"I was in the shower when I got the phone call, so I was glad I was able to get here in time and he was a real pleasure to drive," said McNair of the opportunity to sit behind Prince Hal Hanover. "I was going to float him, but then last minute I saw [Ayeaye Captain Deo] crossing over and I pushed on through there and he did the rest. He's a pretty handy horse."

A son of Captaintreacherous, Prince Hal Hanover is out of the Dr. Moore trained Percy Bluechip and is now a four-time winner with over \$465,000 earned.

"We've had a lot of horses by stallions we used to race like Century Farroh, State Treasure, Shadow Play," said Dr. Moore. "This is the first one we've had out of a mare we used to race... so that's a real thrill for us."





Prince Hal Hanover, who is two-for-three this season, is now pointed to the Pepsi North America Cup eliminations next Saturday for owners Prince Hal Hanover Stable.

A \$2 win ticket on Prince Hal Hanover returned \$5.50.

Bourbon County was able to takedown heavy favorite Lite Up The World in the \$81,500 second Somebeachsomewhere division.

Driven by Trevor Henry, Bourbon County got a 3-hole trip and was able to angle out on the far turn to a second-over position behind the race favorite. Papis Pistol cut the mile, posting fractions of :27.1, :55.4 and 1:23.2, and led until halfway down the stretch.

Lite Up The World would overtake Papis Pistol to strike the lead, but Bourbon County kept roaring up on the outside to nail the new leader late for a 1:50.1 score.

A son of Always B Miki, Bourbon County was making his second start of the season after a six-for-13 rookie season

Bourbon County now sits at just under \$200,000 earned for owners Elliott, William Salmeri, Rick Berks and Jerry Glantz.

Reid confirmed Bourbon County will be entered in the Pepsi North America Cup eliminations.

Bourbon County paid \$12 to win.

The entry box for the Pepsi North America Cup eliminations closes this Tuesday (June 3) at 10:30 a.m. The eliminations are scheduled for next Saturday (June 7) and the final will be held on Saturday (June 14).

Captain Luke, Nijinsky, Private Access deliver in Graduate opener

The Graduate Series for 4-year-olds kicked-off for 2025 with three divisions on Saturday night (May 31) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The pacing side needed two splits for round 1, while the trotting side featured a field of nine in one dash.

Despite posting sizzling fractions, **Captain Luke** dug in tough to hold off several rivals narrowly in 1:49.2 to win the first \$68,000 pacing division.

With multiple U.S. based drivers unable to drive due to travel issues, Jody Jamieson was able to take advantage of the last-minute call behind Captain Luke.

Vandiemen Bluechip rushed out to the lead to hang up a :26.1 opener and kept on rolling up the backstretch. Captain Luke pulled from third to attack the lead through a :53.4 half.

After clearing entering the final turn, Captain Luke took the field by three-quarters in an eye-popping 1:20.2. The pacers had to battle through a stretch headwind, with Captain Luke holding a short lead over a trio of outside rivals, while Vandiemen Bluechip had no room behind the leader.

At the wire, Captain Luke made one final push to win by a neck over Arbitrage Hanover. Chain Gang was third by a half-length, while Howlenthehills was fourth by three-quarters-of-a-length.

Captain Luke is trained by Andrew Harris and is now one-for-three to start his 4-year-old season. The son of Captaintreacherous made over \$450,000 at age 3, despite just three wins from 20 starts.

A \$2 win ticket on Captain Luke returned \$3.50.

Nijinsky picked up his first win of the season with a strong 1:48.3 score in the \$68,000 second Graduate Pace division.

Teaming with regular driver Louis-Philippe Roy, Nijinsky dropped in third before making a second-quarter rush to the lead, overtaking a moving Sweet Beach Life. The second-split was spicy as he took the field by the half in :54 off a :27.2 opener.

Nijinsky led the field to three-quarters in 1:21 and would get away on his rivals in the stretch. Several rivals made a late bid, but it was all over as Nijinsky secured the victory.

Calicojack Hanover was second, while Timeisonmyside and Storm Shadow completed the top four.

Trained by Anthony Beaton, Nijinsky will now bypass the next Graduate Series leg on June 13 and aim for the Mohawk Gold Cup Invitational on June 14. The Gold Cup is part of the Pepsi North America Cup card, which last year saw Nijinsky prevail in Canada's most prestigious harness race.

Nijinsky is now a 13-time winner with over \$1.8 million earned

for owners West Wins Stable, John Fielding, Mark Dumain and Winbak Farm. He paid \$2.30 to win.

Private Access continued the trend of battle back winners on Saturday by edging Warrawee Michelle in the \$102,000 Graduate Trot.

Louis-Philippe Roy used a little bit of early speed from Private Access to go forward, ultimately marching up to the lead at a :27.2 opening quarter. The duo would get things their own way through middle-half clips of :56.2 and 1:24.2.

Warrawee Michelle came first-up on the far turn and got onto even terms with Private Access with an-eighth-of-a-mile remaining. The Ake Svanstedt trained and driven mare got a short lead late, but Private Access fought his way back to regain the top and win by a neck in 1:52.3.

Replay here.

Security Protected finished third, while Mars Hill was fourth.

Owned by Determination, Private Access was making his first start of the season on Saturday after three qualifiers. The Luc Blais trainee had just one win in 14 starts last season, but made over \$400,000 in the process.

Private Access paid \$15.30 to win.

The next leg of the Graduate Series is scheduled for Friday (June 13) at The Meadowlands.



Even at the age of 7, the talented **Lexus Kody** continues to evolve, and the Ron Burke trainee kept the good times going Friday night (May 30) at The Meadowlands in the \$27,500 featured open handicap for trotters, taking a second straight weekly marquee event.

"He's actually behaving right now," said winning driver Yannick Gingras of the horse who has a bit of a breaking problem. "Right now, he's two fingers to drive. He's a beauty to drive when he's like this."

For a six-horse field, there was plenty of talent to go around, and \$1-million lifetime earner Ari Ferrari J was on the go early from post 5, moving four-wide into the first turn before securing the top and hitting the quarter in :26.4.

Shortly thereafter, Lexus Kody marched up to the top and led at the half in :55.3. Outside The Fire, a late-closing second to "Kody" last week, was now on the outside making up ground and challenged the leader at three-quarters, which was timed in 1:24.1.

But, as usual, Lexus Kody would prove tough to pass when on the point.

The gelded son of Archangel – Lexus Helios would hold sway to



the wire, as a determined Outside The Fire kept up alongside preventing Ari Ferrari J from getting enough room while loaded with trot to reach the eventual winner, coming up three-quarters-of-a-length short after finally finding space. Outside The Fire was third.

"He had plenty more [nearing the wire]," said Gingras. "Down the stretch I knew Brett [Beckwith, driving Ari Ferrari J] had some trot behind me. I didn't want to let him out.

"Early last year, [Lexus Kody] was misbehaving. Then, he was good for a long time but then maybe got a little tired at the end of the year. Now, he's not doing anything wrong. He has big lungs and can go fast a long, long time."

After completing the mile in 1:50.3, Lexus Kody's numbers stood at 29 wins from 77 career starts, good for earnings of \$679,422 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi and Phillip Collura. He paid \$3 to win as the 1-2 favorite.

A LITTLE MORE: All Too Well took the fifth race at odds of 12-1, giving big smiles to those who cashed in for \$12,194 with winning 20-cent Pick-5 tickets. Winner's odds for the first four legs of the sequence were 3-5, 9-1, 5-1 and 4-5... All-source handle totaled \$2,828,948 on the 14-race program.
