If one were doing a genealogy assessment of Brett Beckwith, one would say he was linebred four by three to harness racing; four through his sire Mark who is a third-generation horseman through his father Bert and three through his mom Melissa who is a daughter of Hall of Famer Jerry Silverman. Certainly, one would believe, the horsemanship flowing through Brett's blood is responsible for a great deal of the success young Brett has achieved thus far at the age of just 21. I spoke with Brett the day after he had, in effect, swept the card at Saratoga visiting the winner's circle five times including two New York Sires Stakes events.

Saratoga is headquarters for you at present, but it is far from the only place where you ply your trade.

"I go wherever I can get the most competitive drives. In a given week, I will drive at as many as a half dozen racetracks. I suppose that, in addition to Saratoga, I might be considered a regular at The Meadowlands, Plainridge and Freehold. I hope to broaden that experience this coming season by picking up drives at all of the New York tracks. I now occasionally drive at Yonkers, but if the drives become available, I hope to go anywhere and everywhere I can get good horses and maybe sometimes not so good horses to drive. If destiny smiles on me, maybe I'll get to the point where I'll pick up some Grand Circuit drives. If that should happen, I hope to be ready and able."

What is your favorite track at which to race?


"The Meadowlands. That is our sport's Yankee Stadium or Madison Square Garden. It's the place where so many of our top races take place and where all of the top stables come to compete. All of the great drivers race there. At least in my opinion, if you cannot do well there, then you may be an excellent driver, but you are not among the sport's elite few."

Speaking of drivers are there those which you admire more than others?


"Two that immediately come to mind are David Miller and Wally Hennessey. It wouldn't be fair to call them old, but they amazingly have been around at the very top of their profession for a long time. Not only are they still very competitive, but in racing against them it seems that they haven't lost a beat. They are both ultra prepared and are true professionals. I have great admiration for Dexter Dunn as well as the McCarthy brothers. I find that a young guy like me can learn a lot by watching guys like this both in races and outside of them."

How about when you were just a kid, just watching racing, was there one driver that caught your eye?

"If you were speaking of just one, that one would probably be John Campbell. What impressed me most about him

was what I thought he didn't do. He didn't make too many mistakes out on the racetrack. I think that the absence of mistakes is what separates the good drivers from the great ones. All drivers make mistakes. The better ones make fewer."

What one word would best describe you and your status in harness racing today?

"Just one word? That's not an easy question. I suppose if it came down to just one word, that word would be 'learning.' I'd like to think that I know more about the sport than I knew just a short while ago and less, hopefully far less, than I will know in the not-too-distant future. I look at the great drivers in the game, especially the old timers like David and Wally. From the outside looking in, it seems to me that they are never satisfied with their achievements. They are always looking ahead to the next good horse and to the next big race. I would hope that I learn from watching guys like them never to be satisfied with the status quo, to be always looking ahead. One thing I've learned in my young life is that you don't stand still. If you don't move forward, you fall behind."

I have heard more than one of the better drivers describe you as the sport's next superstar. Would you agree with that?

"I don't know. I doubt it; not yet anyway. There are several very good young drivers out there. Look at Braxten Boyd for example. On Sunday, he swept the card at Tioga winning five races. Just yesterday [Tuesday, May 28] at Pocono he won four. That wasn't just driving against guys named Al either. He races against some of the better drivers in North America."

In the last three days, you've won five races (Saratoga), five races (Plainridge) and two races (Plainridge). That certainly cannot be a coincidence.

"Ultimately it has to do with the horses. You've got to have a horse that is competitive in order to win a race. That's not necessarily the best horse in the race, because it's horse racing and the best horse doesn't always win. I've been fortunate in that I've mostly been put down behind horses that are competitive. Another element to my success is that I often drive horses from my dad's stable. My father is an exceptional horseman. His horses are almost always fit and ready to do battle. That certainly gives me an edge, as slight

as it sometimes might be, over the competition. That's not to even mention his great guidance which continues to influence my career."

In a conversation with John Campbell some time ago, he mentioned how the terrain when speaking of top drivers has changed over time. It used to be, he said, that most of them tended to congregate at a few of the top tracks. The lesser tracks and the fairs were mostly inhabited by older guys who trained and drove their own horses. Obviously, that did not hold true for all, but it was stereotypical of how the ground was laid out. Today, he said, anywhere you go, you are going to come across talent, perhaps unhoned, young talent just waiting for the opportunity that will raise them up a level. Would you agree with that?

"Most definitely. In my case I've been fortunate in that the opportunity was at hand and I was able to seize upon it."

What is it about your ability to drive a horse that allows you to rise above the ordinary?

"If in fact that is the case, probably several factors, one of which is adaptability. An example is that I feel I can drive most types of horses on all sized tracks. I consider myself to be relatively patient and a good strategist, especially with a young horse, which, just like I am, is still learning. I don't view myself as being cocky. I think there is more that I need to learn than what I already know."

Do you look upon 2024 as being a breakthrough year?

"Probably not. If there was one in my career, it was probably last year. I look upon this year and hopefully all years in the future as giving me the chance to get better and improve my numbers. We are just getting into stakes season. I hope to pick up some drives in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and New York Sires Stakes races. If I do well, maybe catch a few Grand Circuit drives. Then hopefully onward and upward."

Mohawk baby races make a triumphant return

Canada's first 2-year-old qualifiers held Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Saturday (June 1) marked the first baby races of the year at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The 2-year-old qualifiers are a precursor to the Campbellville, ON track's first 2-year-old stakes events of the season, the Tomkins-Geers Stakes. Divisions for fillies and males of both gaits are scheduled for Mohawk on Thursday (June 27) and Friday (June 28).

The inaugural baby races always make for a special day at the track, complete with race calls from Mark McKelvie. The senior manager of communications for Woodbine Entertainment announced Canada's first 2024 baby races, and said he will be on the mic for upcoming 2-year-old qualifiers.


"I also chart the qualifiers at the same time, so a little bit of multi-tasking, but this is the fun time of year," McKelvie said. "We're also looking at some enhanced coverage of baby races, and still ironing out some details, but we know how much owners and fans are wanting to see the future stars."

The entry box for Saturday's qualifiers closed May 31 at 10:30 a.m., a rare Mohawk Friday with no scheduled qualifiers. Two qualifiers for 2-year-old trotters and one for freshman pacers filled, along with one qualifier apiece for 3-year-old trotters and pacers.

Six 2-year-old trotters lined up in the first baby race.

Southwind Grenade was eager behind the gate, off-stride for a few moments before settling down for owner/trainer/driver Gino Toscani. The Walner—Southwind Gilly colt led through early fractions of :31.4, 1:03, and a 30-second third quarter, reaching three-quarters in 1:33 flat.

Pocket-sitting Macthenight (Trixton—MacKenzie Hall), driven by Tyler Jones and owned by Chad Hill and Kimberly Jensen of Hagersville, ON, stepped out to challenge Southwind Grenade





down the stretch. Filly **Exquisite Taste** (Resolve—Ghost Glider) went three-wide to overtake both colts in deep stretch for driver Louis-Philippe Roy. She won handily in 2:02.2.

Exquisite Taste is owned by Ecurie Csl of Sorel-Tracy, QC and Louis-Philippe Roy Racing of Campbellville, ON, and trained by Eric Nadeau. The former \$34,000 London Classic yearling was bred by Glengate Farms and Ariel Stables of Erin, ON.

The second 2-year-old qualifier saw five trotters go behind the gate. **Southwind Francoo** (Muscle Hill—Follow Streak) was first to the front for driver Sylvain Filion. The colt was quickly followed by Foresworn (Walner—Princess Lilly), in line to James MacDonald. Reaching the opening quarter in :33.2, Southwind Francoo then surrendered the lead to Foresworn, who hit the half in 1:05.

Another three-horse stretch duel developed when Filion's colt left the pocket and lone filly Bright Green (Green Manalishi S—Shine Bright) tipped three-wide for driver Louis-Philippe Roy. Southwind Francoo held off Bright Green to win the 2:04.2 qualifier.

Southwind Francoo is a former \$12,000 Lexington Select Sale yearling, bred by Southwind Farms Llc of Pennington, NJ. The colt is owned and trained by Gaetan Hebert of Dundas, ON.

Seven 2-year-old pacers qualified in the last of the day. Lady Gambler, a Bettors Delight—Lady Be Great filly, was scratched.

Free-legged grey colt Snowport (Huntsville—Milky Way Hanover) instantly crossed over to the front from the outside post for trainer/driver Gino Toscani. **Seas The Day** (Your Nemesis—No Time for Talkin) and driver Bob McClure circled him approaching the :31.1 first quarter.

Seas The Day maintained command through a 1:02.3 half. Snowport emerged from the pocket to chase him from first-over to three-quarters, reached in 1:33.4. The stretch drive saw fillies Love Tap Station (Captain Crunch—Hit By A Bus) and Stylish Stella (Betterthancheddar—Arabella J) closing wide. Seas The Day held off Stylish Stella, with Tyler Borth driving, in the 2:02.2 mile.



Seas The Day is a homebred owned by Stephen and Marilyn Gillard of Innerkip, ON. The colt is also trained by Stephen Gillard, who owns his 27-year-old sire, Your Nemesis (p, 5, 1:51.2m; \$425,953).

McKelvie told HRU that numbers entered in the early 2-year-old qualifiers can be unpredictable from year to year.

"It's always a bit of a toss-up with how many babies will be entered for that first week," he said after calling this Saturday's qualifiers. "I think the winter we had should mean we'll have plenty ready over the first few weeks.

"I'm not sure too many trainers are really aiming for that first week, especially when it falls right on June 1. But the group we had looked good, and now it's full steam ahead for a busy month."

Starting next week, there will be three days of Mohawk qualifiers scheduled each week. Tuesday mornings will be for 3-year-olds and older horses, with 2-year-old qualifiers set for later in the week.

The baby races return on Friday (June 7) and Saturday (June 8), with one Thursday (June 13), also allocated for 2-year-old qualifiers. The regular Friday-Saturday schedule resumes from June 14 through June 29, excluding Saturday (June 15), the date of the 2024 Pepsi North America Cup final. Qualifiers begin at 9:30 a.m. (Eastern).

"It's just the plan every year to offer up 2-year-old qualifiers on that first weekend in June," McKelvie said. "We've penciled in multiple baby race days for next weekend and throughout the month."

Depending on demand, there could be more or fewer baby races.

"The entry box will tell us if we need both Friday and Saturday next weekend," he said. "We're ready to accommodate whatever number comes forward."

Woodbine Mohawk Park will also open the track for training from 7 a.m. to noon each Wednesday during the month of June.

A complimentary "Owners' Breakfast" is scheduled for the grandstand Mohawk Harvest Kitchen on Saturday (June 8). The special event begins at 9 a.m., and does not require reservations. It's open to all racing participants attending the morning's baby races.

"The Owners' Breakfast is just a way for us to show some appreciation for the individuals and groups that support our industry," McKelvie told HRU. "Just as you'd expect, baby races draw more owners out than regular qualifiers, so it's a perfect time to host a breakfast. 

Tetrick, Jamieson likely headed Down Under for Ultimate Driver Championship

Some of the world's best drivers are eyeing-off a trip Down Under for an exciting and innovative new series early next year.

North American superstars Tim Tetrick and Jody Jamieson are among those excited about and hugely supportive of the "Ultimate Driver Championship" scheduled for Brisbane's Albion Park next February.

In a world first, 10 slot owners will choose their driver — from anywhere around the world — and horses to compete across two nights and 20 races with over \$250,000 in prize money on offer.

Global wagering giant Entain, through its Ladbrokes brand, will sponsor the series and take one slot. The other nine slots will sell for \$20,000 each and are sure to be in high demand.

The winning driver and their slot holder will earn \$100,000 with each individual race winning driver banking \$1,000.

"I absolutely love the concept of the Ladbrokes Ultimate Driver Championship," Tetrick said. "This type of innovation brings energy and excitement to reward our fans and fellow horse lovers."

Tetrick, a Hall of Famer with more than 13,000 career wins, added: "What a fantastic way to add interest to the sport of harness racing on a global level."

Canadian superstar Jamieson, a two-time World Driving Champion, was equally as excited.

"What a great idea," Jamieson said. "This concept will bring many more eyes to harness racing. The Ultimate Driver has the opportunity to become the greatest show on dirt.

"It's a very exciting event that is sure to pique the interest of drivers and racing and sporting fans, not just in Australia, but across the globe."

The joint initiative of Albion Park and Racing Queensland was launched on Wednesday night (May 29).

"The Ultimate Driver series will not only be the quest to find the world's No. 1 driver, but will also be a game of strategy and a chance to win big with over \$250,000 up for grabs," Racing Queensland CEO Jason Scott said. "We are encouraging

as many people as possible to get involved and apply for slots, with preference given to applications from syndicates and those that provide promotional value to both the event and the Queensland racing industry.

"This series will be a great way to showcase the best drivers in the world right here in our backyard at Albion Park."

Aussie expats Todd and Andy McCarthy, along with New Zealander Dexter Dunn are also sure to be in hot demand.

"Given the growing relationship between Australasia and North American harness racing, we think the Ladbrokes Ultimate Driver will appeal to both leading drivers and potentially even slot holders in the USA and Canada," Racing Queensland's senior harness manager David Brick said. "We see the exploits of our horses and participants such as the McCarthys and Dexter Dunn on a daily basis in North America, while from a breeding perspective, access to their best stallions has seen the breed here move ahead in leaps and bounds, Leap To Fame being living proof.

"In more recent times, broadcasting has helped stimulate wagering on each other's product, to the point where Sky Racing's [Australia] Brittany Graham will attend this year's North America Cup to cover it for back home.

"We have specifically targeted the series early in the year to align with the 'off-season' in North America and we'd love to see a slot holder or two bring one of the leading drivers Down Under to compete for the large pot."

Excitingly, the February time slot is not only quiet in the northern hemisphere but absolute peak feature race time Down Under.

The huge Hunter Cup Carnival at Melton is late January/ early February and then we roll into the Carnival of Miracles, headlined by the \$1-million Miracle Mile in late February/ early March.

So, any international driver who heads down for the Ultimate Driver Championship could easily come early for the Victorian feature racing and/or stay later to be part of the Carnival of Miracles.

"We will definitely look to bring down one of the top U.S. drivers if we can," Ladbrokes Australia CEO Dean Shannon said about their slot. "It's a terrific concept, nothing like we've seen before, and we'd love to add to the international flavor of it.

"It would be great to see some of the best drivers from around the world going at it across 20 races at Albion Park."

Some of the top Aussie drivers sure to be considered include established superstars Gary Hall, Jr., Chris Alford, Luke McCarthy, Pete McMullen, Kate Gath, Greg Sugars, Kerryn Manning and Nathan Dawson, along with younger stars like Cam Hart, Jack Callaghan, Deni Roberts, James Herbertson and Angus Garrard.

Sabonis surprises his trainer and the competition

When the first round of Indiana Sires Stakes was contested Monday (May 27) at Harrah's Hoosier Park, an unexpected contender emerged in the sophomore pacing colt division. Sabonis began the season as a relative unknown. Lightly raced at 2, the Tellitlikeitis—Gypsy Bellevue colt secured a 1:51.3 victory in the second of two \$49,500 opening leg divisions. His quick ascension to the top of the division has come as a surprise to many, including trainer Aaron Stutzman.

"It's been a surprise," the conditioner said of the 2024 campaign. "From his first start out, it's been a surprise. And it's a nice surprise."

Why the surprise? Stutzman admits that Sabonis was a 'nice' horse last year that showed signs of being a racehorse, but didn't display exceedingly great potential. The pacer made only two starts, racing third and then winning for Kentucky-based owners John and Pat Miller. But the colt came out of his second start, a 1:55.1 score over the Anderson oval, with an injury.

"He had a hairline fracture in his right knee after his second start," Stutzman said. "He was a laid back, immature 2-year-old. He was a nice colt, but he didn't show anything special as a 2-year-old. We just kept him over because the owner wanted to, and he was a 'Tell' colt."

In the months leading up to his late March qualifier, Sabonis still acted like a horse that was more ordinary than extraordinary.

"He was good training down," Stutzman said. "He showed that he would make a nice racehorse, but he didn't show anything with stakes colt potential. Usually once you're training them down and getting them close you can tell if they are going to go on or not. He did what he had to and that was it."

In his qualifier, Sabonis and the trainer sat fourth before sprinting home in :26.4, stopping the clock in 1:57 and winning by a length and a quarter. Nine days later Stutzman sat behind the colt in his sophomore debut, the opening leg of the Mark Fransen Memorial. Like in the qualifier, Sabonis raced near the



front in third through most of the circuit before rocketing home. This time, he stormed to the wire with a :25.4 last panel, winning by 4 lengths in a time of 1:52.1. The green colt had transformed into a horse the trainer did not recognize.

"Something switched on him because he does everything handy," Stutzman said. "He's two fingers. I mean, he's one of the nicest horses I've ever driven. I don't know what was going on the first night I raced him. He just kind of said, 'Okay, it's time to roll.' And he did."

And roll he has, more often than not steamrolling the competition. After the successful debut, Joey Putnam picked up the lines and has steered Sabonis over the last six starts. Putnam drove the colt in his two freshman starts, and had familiarity with the horse. After back-to-back wins in the second leg of the Fransen Memorial and subsequent \$20,000 final, the young driver believed Sabonis had the skills for the next level of competition.

"Joey climbed off and said, I think we've got another sires stakes horse," Stutzman said. "That's just the way it worked out."

To close out the Fransen Memorial, Sabonis won by 3¼ lengths (1:53.1) and nearly 6 lengths (1:50). Moving into the Hal Dale, the sophomore tasted his first defeat of the season, finishing a length off leader Shooting In Place with a 1:49.3 effort.

"He got beat in that :49 mile because I told Joey how I wanted him driven, and that's the way it went," the trainer said.

Sabonis bounced back in the second Hal Dale leg, winning by nearly 3 lengths in 1:51.2. He captured the \$25,000 final by

more than 4 lengths, tripping the timer in 1:50. In Monday's sires stakes win, Sabonis and Putnam controlled the tempo as the heavy favorite, clicking off fractions of :27.1,:56.3 and 1:25. They led by 5½ lengths at the top of the stretch before cruising home to a 1¼-length advantage at the wire, closing out the mile with a :26.3 last quarter.

"He was just sitting on him that night," the conditioner said of Putnam's latest drive. "I told him to go what you have to. I was surprised he got away with a :56 half. After that I figured those boys were going to be moving and coming for him, but nobody did."

Bred by Karl Dean Miller of Ligonier, IN, the sophomore is the second foal from a Roll With Joe mare that has yet to produce another starter. The pacer was consigned to the Midwest Mixed Sale, bringing \$9,000. To date, Sabonis has won six of seven seasonal starts, earning \$68,750 for his connections.

While the colt is not staked outside the Indiana Sires Stakes program, he could become another notable Stutzman-trained superstar. The Goshen, IN native also developed Soaring Now, a son of JK Endofanera that earned Indiana Sires Stakes divisional honors and was named Indiana Pacer of the Year as a sophomore. During that 2022 campaign, Soaring Now earned just under \$375,000 for owner James Miller while being piloted by Andy Shetler and Putnam. Sabonis is owned by Miller's father and step-mother.

"We've gone through a lot of bad horses for them too," Stutzman said of the relationship with the family, which spans seven or eight years.

Sabonis looks to be one of the unexpected stars of the 2024 Indiana's Sires Stakes program. Stutzman's challenge will be to keep him in peak form throughout the season.

"He's got a calm demeanor, he's relaxed, and he knows what he's supposed to do," he said of his pupil. "He doesn't stress himself out. I've got to try to stay on top of him and keep him fresh. That's the hardest part of racing eight legs stretched from May to October is keeping him fresh."



The power of a horseplayer's least-common denominator, Part 2

I sat alone in Barry Meadows' box one night at Los Alamitos while he stood indoors in front of a TV monitor with a clipboard and a pen gaging the swift changing exacta prices. I realized the small sitting space in the clubhouse grandstand was the personal spot where he worked "in the field" like a broker amid the fracas of the New York Stock Exchange. I imagined his home office was lousy with books and paper files as well as a computer or two to record trip notes and trainer statistics and financial records along with paraphernalia that adorns such a successful headquarters for one's business.

My mind wandered and I looked at the personal notes I was keeping that night. There were scribbled lines for half-baked jokes on the borders and some abstract ideas for a short story due soon for publication in "Blue Horse," a popular small press magazine that did not pay a buck; just a cool amount of literary stature. But not a cent of legal tender. And there were a few notes scratched around the entries of every race offered that evening. One entry had more notes than any other in the program; it was about a horse I intended to bet to win.

Meanwhile Meadows' brain calculated his next moves for the same race. He focused on only the present; like a Zen master measuring the weight of drama versus knowledge. There was no comparison for our behaviors. Meadows endeavored to make crucial profits and thrive in his business if he participated in the pari-mutuel pools of the upcoming race or dismiss any activity in the next harness contest by interpreting his probabilities for success which were all dictated by a strict financial method of wagering.

The truth of that moment became obvious to me. I was witnessing Meadows' work habits like a writer and journalist covering the deep processes of his occupation. Our motivation to make a profit was the same but in doing so we were as different as Moses to Ramses.

I cannot recall the name of the horse so let me name it Delaney Lobell. I remember for sure the driver was Tim Maier. My selection of Maier's horse as the winner was based on past performances all the usual handicapping grist. As I sat watching the toteboard I was encouraged because the betting public was not agreeing with my selection.

Post time neared and Delaney Lobell's odds were spiking. The win price was close to 10-1 when Meadows got back to the box.

"What do you think about Delaney Lobell," I said.

"Gotta good chance," he said, "but his odds are way too high."
"Too high?"

"Why isn't he being bet? His chances are far better than 10-1."

"You mean 12-1," I said as the next flash of the tote changed all of the odds. "Isn't it just a big overlay?"

"Too big an overlay. I got him at 4-1."

I was too confused to make an argument but there was no time for that anyway. Meadows told me he had to realize why the horse was being ignored and he left the box to gather whatever information about the inflated odds would satisfy him before betting. I thought a lot of things. Was he looking for some inside information that may or may not be legitimate? Was he conferring with other big bettors about his opinion of the odds?

I decided I would bet Maier's horse to win but for some reason I also called bets on Delaney Lobell to place and to show. All in all, I spread strong support for the horse across the board; it was a tactic I was taught years back as a measure of insurance for the ifs and maybes about cashing a ticket to make up for a loss in the win pool when a horse finishes in the place or show spots.

When I returned to the box the field was lining up and Meadows was still absent. Delaney Lobell was having an easy trip with cover for two turns and then heading for the third turn Maier found a spot with plenty of horse left to go first over and command the field to finish behind him, at 13-1.

Still no Meadows. I reveled at the prices I collected across the board and sat down on the hard metal box seat anticipating a joyous shared experience with Meadows. But when he returned, he was dour and in no mood to be comical.

"What's the matter?" I said.

"I didn't bet him," he said. Then he put his clipboard down and walked away.

There is never anything one gambler can say to another in that situation without expecting a punch in the face.

I sat alone in his box for the rest of the evening.





Trainer Courtney Robson is on a roll

Although it was four years ago, trainer Courtney Robson remembers her first win like it was four hours ago.

On a rather mild night in mid-February of 2020, Robson and trusted trotter Slip Into Glide took to Rideau Carleton Raceway for what would be their fourth start as a tandem.

Robson, whose hometown of Aylmer, QC sits about 45 minutes north of the five-eighths-mile oval, had come close with the bay gelding before, but was still in search of that elusive breakthrough moment.

On Feb. 23, the fourth time was the charm for the then-rookie conditioner.

"That race was pretty unbelievable," Robson said. "He won a lot of races for me, so it was kind of fitting to get my first win with him.

"He was a very special horse for me."

Robson's deep connection with Slip Into Glide extends beyond the training side of the trade. Before earning her trainer's license in 2020, Robson owned the horse, who was trained by none other than her father Dave.

A life-long horseperson himself, the elder Robson won over 450 races before stepping back after the 2019 campaign.

Dave was in attendance that night at Rideau to witness the first of his daughter's now 74 wins.

"My dad was there, and he trained him before I got my license," Courtney said. "As an owner, we won the 2019 preferred trot at Rideau with Slip Into Glide, and he was with me for most of his wins, too. He was my dad's favorite horse for a long time, so that was a nice moment to share with him."

Courtney's phone worked overtime soon after, as she recalled receiving "quite a few messages" following the milestone achievement.

Slip Into Glide delivered 13 of his 56 career wins under Courtney's tutelage, including her first score after moving to the Guelph area from Quebec in the fall of 2020.

Even though the 16-year-old's racing days are now well behind him, Courtney still keeps in touch with the son of Yankee Glide—Balanced Breeze.

"He raced until his 14th year [2022]," she said. "When he retired, we gave him away with the help of New Start Standardbreds, who helped place him. He's got a nice little riding horse home in Hanover.

"I get pictures of him every couple of months. It's been really nice for him. He's giving little kids pony rides at day camp and enjoying retired life."

Courtney, however, is just getting started.

She hasn't missed a beat since making 11 trips to the winner's circle in her rookie campaign.

In 2021, she recorded 14 triumphs, followed by seasons of 22, 19, and now 8 through 75 starts on the young 2024 calendar.

While the current standardbred season may not have gotten off to the flying start Courtney envisioned, the Fergus, ON-based conditioner has maintained faith in the mindset that's helped drive strong results in years' past.

"I always try to get more wins than I did the year before," she said. "I've managed to do that almost every year, so the goal is to try and do more of that. I was off to a bit of a rough start [in 2024], but the last couple of weeks have been good. Hopefully, I can keep that rolling.

"Trying to be better than the year before has always been my 'compete with yourself' mentality."

The junior Robson was rewarded for her unwavering belief with a pair of winners on May 26 at Clinton Raceway.

With veteran driver Dan Clements at the helm, Courtney's protégés ABC and Lisas All In captured race's 3 and 4, respectively, on Clinton's Sunday afternoon (May 26) card.

Both horses have greatly benefitted from Courtney's tutelage.

The former, whom she purchased in Dec. 2022, has collected six of his seven career wins under Courtney's leadership.

"ABC is a nice horse. He was strong this weekend, and the week before that, as well," she said. "The last two starts he's raced

really well. It's nice to have some of the smaller tracks opening up for horses like him. We're hoping he'll have a good summer."

The latter, a 5-year-old mare, saw her win total rocket from two to 11 after joining the Courtney Robson School of Racing in March of last year.

"Lisa' raced really well last year during the summer at Kawartha and then she kind of tailed off in the winter," Courtney said. "It's nice to see she's hopefully coming back around again."

One of Courtney's first students, Dance Machine, raced under her purview from June 2020 until Sept. 2022.

"We went to Harrisburg to look at a mixed sale and there were about 10 yearlings left on the day," she said. "My mom hadn't owned a racehorse in a lot of years, so we decided to take a look at the babies just for the fun of it. He [Dance Machine] was out of a really good dam [Daylon Tempo] that raced at Rideau and that's where we're from.

"He came up in the ring, and nobody was bidding on him, so my mom threw her hand up at \$3,000 and we got the horse."

This time, however, it was the pacer who taught Courtney several valuable lessons in their brief time together.

"We brought him home, and we trained him at 2 and he was fine, but he was just so lazy," she said with a laugh. "He wouldn't go.

"So, we turned him out, we brought him back, and everybody told us for the longest time 'What are you doing with that horse? You're wasting your time, he'll never race."

Dance Machine ended up making 72 starts for Courtney, crossing the finish line first seven times.

The 7-year-old pacer has since competed 84 times for seven different trainers. He notched his fifth victory post-Courtney last time out on May 24 at Kawartha Downs.

While her priorities lie elsewhere these days, Courtney still keeps tabs on the horse some said would never race.

"I saw he recently took a mark of :50 and a piece, which is pretty incredible," Courtney said in reference to a strong win in 1:50.4 at Mohawk on July 10, 2024.

"He's still racing well."

Now in her fifth full season calling the shots, Courtney is responsible for eight horses, seven of which she owns.

The only non-Robson-owned trainee in her octet is an exciting 2-year-old by the name of Dancin Idole. Although the Dancin Lou colt has yet to race, Courtney said she is very encouraged by what she's seen in his training.

The determined Courtney spends just about every waking moment working on her craft, so when a rare break in the action does come about, she's prepared to take advantage like a true horseperson.

"Everybody likes to tease me because I like to take naps. If I'm not racing, I'm usually taking a nap," she said. "That's just what us horsepeople do."

Down a racing rabbit hole, Part 1

My most recent cyberspace rabbit hole began two days ago. A cinephile friend and I were sharing a double pepperoni and onion pizza at The Slice of Life Emporium when neither of us could recall the official title of an excellent Swedish film under discussion. Since our fingers were greasy, we did not reach into our pockets for phones to solve the mystery. We just moved on to other cinematic subjects.

The elusive Swedish movie title remained a pebble in my brain. At home, a quick search removed the stone. We all do this daily — solve a question using our devices, a minor miracle that once required, at minimum, a visit to our local library.

The elusive film was easy to find: a 1971 film titled Utvandrarna (Swedish) The Emigrants (English) based on the novel by Vilhelm Moberg. Directed and screenplay by Jan Troell, starring Max Von Sydow and Liv Ullman, the movie was nominated for Best Foreign Film at the 45th Academy Awards.

A simple search like this can be treacherous. We all run the risk of getting sucked down digital passages. Sometimes, we go down purposefully. Other times, we get lured into the chasm of endless links and scrolls. Who among us has not looked for an old song on YouTube and, several hours later, find ourselves sitting near-comatose, headphones on, listening to a YouTube concert of the Go-Betweens, a rock band from Australia whose last record was in 1989?

These digital rabbit holes are a yin and yang proposition. Yin, we are all curious creatures, and our curiosity can be satisfied. Yang, we can waste a lot of time and become addicted to our devices. Even the previous two sentences led me down two little rabbit holes.

The oldest records of the yin-yang principle are found in the *Zhouyi*, also called the *I Ching* or *Book of Changes*, which King Wen wrote in the 9th century BCE during the **Western Zhou dynasty**. The term rabbit hole begins with the opening chapter of Lewis Carroll's 1865 classic, *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*,

when Alice follows the White Rabbit into his burrow, which transports her to Wonderland's strange, surreal, and nonsensical world.

A recent rabbit hole led me on a trio of odysseys that led to the sport of harness horse racing. These portals may be of interest to you. On the trail of my search for the Swedish film, I noticed a thread leading to a movie database separating films by genre. Maryann Plano is no novice to our sport. Along with her husband, Rick, she has been involved for more than a half-century. She was born and raised along with two sisters and a brother on a dairy farm in the small town of Frankfort, NY. Her parents, Jack and Bella Bono were two hard working, conservative and kind people.

"My parents were a little strict with me as I was a bit of a renegade, but they instilled good morals in me and I've tried to instill those same morals to my children, Erica and Luke," Maryann said with a smile.

Although Maryann's husband Rick may not be listed in the top drivers of the sport today, he can hold his head high for, statistically, he sits sixth all-time in training wins today, and would most likely be in the top five if his victories from the years 1972 through 1991, were included in the races he took part in while in Italy. With a combined total of more than 10,000 wins, Rick has recorded over 7,000 driving wins, 4,000 training wins, and amassed more than \$50 million in purse earnings. He's also held the leading driver and/or trainer title in California for well over 20 years. That's nothing to sneeze at.

Becoming a top driver is not easy and difficult to maintain year after year for it takes talent, luck, and the opportunity to drive the best horses in the country. But in Rick's case, the most important thing to his success was his wife Maryann who was there with him every step of the way. The saying goes, "Behind every successful man is a strong woman," and this is certainly the case with the Planos.

"Rick and I grew up in the same town and have known each other for as long as I can remember," Maryann said. "His parents owned a meat market in town and were known for their Italian sausage. People would come from miles to buy it and everyone knew the Plano family.

"We started dating on and off in high school. It was during that time Rick started in the business at Vernon Downs in New York in 1972. From there Rick raced at Green Mountain, Monticello, Dover Downs, Harrington, Pocono, Northfield and then California. Wow, I can't believe it's been over 50 years.

While Rick was racing at Pocono, Maryann told him she wanted to work in the barn so he assigned her a horse named Process to care.

"I remember showing up the first day in my daisy duke shorts and boots," Maryann said. brought in entertainment, decorated and organized get-togethers like picnics, dances, Halloween parties, etc. Everyone showed up and participated. They were the best times!"

Being married to a horseman and raising a family isn't always easy.

"We were on the circuit for many years when we were young and it was a good time going from track to track, but once I had my children it became more difficult," Maryann said. "We managed by enrolling them in school either half the year in Southern California and half in North Carolina or half of the year in New York.

"Our son Luke, who has followed in his dad's footsteps has certainly made us proud. He, like his dad, has held the driving title at Cal Expo many times and is currently leading trainer. He was also the first driver to ever win over \$1,000,000 in purses at Running Aces in Minnesota."

After Pompano Park, "The Winter Capital of Harness Racing," closed after some 58 years of entertaining millions of people, the Planos, like many other families, had to pick up and re-locate.

The Planos were in South Florida when harness racing was at its best; the days when the grandstands were jam-packed. Maryann shared her thoughts on how changes over the years have affected the sport and her life in it.

"Racing has changed in so many ways," she said. "Going to the races used to be a really big deal. The kids and I would get dressed up and go every weekend to cheer on their dad. Sadly, the crowds have dwindled over the years. The biggest change I've noticed is that because of the casinos, the horsemen's and the fans' best interest isn't always a priority. But in some ways, I suppose it has changed for the better as there are more resources and information available to the drivers, trainers and owners... and of course, the purses.

"Rick and I have downsized considerably as today we only have 12 horses in the barn; a far cry from the 25 to 30 that we always had. But we do have some powerhouses. We own all but two of the horses in training right now. Throughout the years we were very lucky to have had some absolute wonderful owners. There are too many to mention, but we certainly appreciate every one."

I also asked Maryann about her and Rick's future plans.

"My husband and I just celebrated our 47th anniversary and feel so blessed that we are both still here doing what we always loved, although at a much smaller scale," she said. "We are prioritizing our children now. That includes Luke and his wife Nikki, my daughter Erica who is a business woman, and a taekwondo instructor with a third degree black belt; her

husband Danny, and their child, our grandchild Coleton, who is 9 years old and the light of my life.

"My most favorite thing in the world is to be with my children, have a few cocktails, cook a delicious dinner and make a luscious dessert. I don't think I'll ever get tired of that."

Editor's note: I first met the Planos over a decade ago when I co-owned a mare named Voluminous, along with trainer Mel Turcotte, who just happens to be the dam of top pacer Taurasi. As of today, Taurasi remains undefeated racing in the preferred at Mohawk, going eight-for-eight. I will always be his biggest fan and a proud mama.

When Rick left Pompano Park for Hoosier Park, he took Voluminous where she had a very successful, but short campaign before being claimed.

Voluminous was always my special girl and I followed her even after she left me. On her way to California the trailer capsized on the icy highway and she escaped. Running and slipping on the icy asphalt she was injured.

I called the new owner and bought her back. My partner, Ron Ruggles and I shipped her to Kentucky and bred her and the rest is history. So, I guess you can say that the Planos and I will always be connected through Voluminous.

Karl, French Champagne take NJSS finals at Big M

Karl and **French Champagne** emerged victorious in their respective \$240,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes finals for 3-year-olds on the trot Friday night (May 31) at The Meadowlands.

Karl was his usual dominant self, crushing his foes by 7 widening lengths in a 1:51 lifetime-best clocking in the split for colts and geldings to complete a three-race sweep of the NJSS. He took the lead from Tony Adams S, who trotted the opening panel in :28.1, in methodical fashion just after the three-eighths.

Karl sailed past the half in :56.1, but as he neared the threequarter-mile marker, Pantoran was using a big move to go after the leader, and was right at Karl's throat as they hit the beam in 1:24.

The eventual winner — as well as his driver, Yannick Gingras — were unfazed by the challenger, shrugging off Pantoran at the top of the stretch on the way to the easy score. Benny J was second with Tony Adams S holding third.

"He's been super so far," said winning trainer Nancy Takter. "I'm really happy with him. He's been well within himself every time he's raced. So, so far, so good.

"[When Pantoran challenged], it was the first time this year that somebody was really that close to him, but I was pretty confident and it looked like Yannick had him well in hand and I knew that he was going to finish well. I knew there was plenty left in the tank and I wasn't really that worried about it."

Karl is now going to take a few weeks to rest up for what lies ahead. The Hambletonian is on Saturday (Aug. 3).

"I think that a little break is going to be good for him," said Takter. "You know, he's got a tough summer coming up and a tough schedule ahead of him. So, just a couple of weeks kind of to recoup and he's had a couple of tough races. He's gone fast times and it's important that you give the horses a little time to recover so they can race the entire season. I mean, he's going to race all the way into November, probably, so hopefully, knock on wood."

Karl, a son of Tactical Landing – Avalicious, returned \$2.10 for the third time in as many starts this season while upping his lifetime numbers to 12 wins from 13 starts, good for earnings of \$1,191,977 for owners Christina and Nancy Takter, Black Horse Racing, Crawford Farms Racing and Bender Sweden Inc.

Unlike the short price in the event for males, French Champagne used a patient drive from Tim Tetrick to pull off a mild 6-1 surprise in the division for fillies.

The trip was anything but ideal for the winner as 2-5 favorite Spy Coast led the field past the half in :55.2 and three-quarters in 1:24.2. Miss I La, a 40-1 outsider who had sprinted to the quarter on the point in :26.3, roared out of the pocket off the far turn and moved to the lead at the head of the stretch as Tetrick and French Champagne waited for an opportunity after sitting a 4-hole trip from the start.

"It opened up there late and my mare felt really good," said Tetrick. "I'd driven her one time last year and I was too wide in the last turn; I just didn't think she could respond to that, so I stayed left and, luckily, it worked out."

In deep stretch, from what looked like an impossible spot, Tetrick and French Champagne found a small seam along the inside and with a burst of speed, was able to pop a cork and record a 2½-length score. Miss I La was second with Toye Palema third. The mile time of 1:52.1 was a lifetime best for the daughter of Muscle Hill—French Café.

Trained by Ake Svanstedt and owned by Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, French Champagne, who returned \$14.20 as the second choice in the betting, raised her lifetime stats to seven wins from just 13 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$317,608.

"She's bigger and stronger [than she was a year ago]," said Tetrick. "The first turn tonight, she was kind of running in on me. So, I was like, I better save as much ground as I could and it just worked out. She responded like all Ake's horses do."

A LITTLE MORE: Gingras finished the night with five wins on the card to become the first driver at The Big M this year to do that twice. Jason Bartlett (on Jan. 19) and Andy McCarthy (Feb. 24) are the only others to record five-baggers during 2024. Gingras did it for the first time on May 3. All-source handle totaled \$3,178,707 on the 14-race program.

When trainer Ron Burke was asked what kind of trip he preferred for his millionaire trotter **T C I** in his sophomore debut, Burke replied that he wanted his star pupil to win as easily as possible.

When T C I made that debut in Friday's (May 31) Pennsylvania Sires Stake for 3-year-old colts and geldings, it was as if Burke drew up the race. T C I shrugged off a mild challenge and drew off late to triumph by 4¾ lengths in 1:52.2. **Security Protected** took the other division of the event known as the Super Bowl.

T C I cruised to the half in :56 and easily turned back a first-over bid from Coors Hanover. Ordained grabbed second while Coors Hanover had to settle for show.

"That was perfect," said winning driver David Miller, echoing Burke's thoughts. "He raced well and did it fairly easily. That was a good start for him."

The son of Cantab Hall—Nicole's Promise now has banked \$1,275,163 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Hatfield Stables, Knox Services Inc. and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. Burke said T C I will be pointed to the next PASS leg at Pocono.

Security Protected was no slouch at 2 himself; in fact, his check for Friday's work propelled him over \$400,000 in career earnings. The son of Father Patrick—Thatsnotmyname had to fight three wide for the early lead, but when Dave Palone popped his earplugs, he found another gear.

"You always want to make it easy on them early in the year," Palone said. "But when I took the plugs out, he was airborne. That's a very good horse. He's a driver's dream."

Blackhawk Zette, who captured six of his first seven outings this year, was 1½-lengths back in second while Luke The Spook completed the ticket. Marcus Melander conditions Security Protected for Mitchell Friesen, Brad Grant and Order By Stable Ab.

PA Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trotters

The splits in Friday's sub-feature went to **Loxahatchee**, **Usain Hanover**, **Splendid**, **I'm Out** and **Cyclone Ben**.

Usain Hanover might be ready for a step up to the next level based on his dominant performance Friday. He quarter-poled to the point for Miller and strode away to prevail by 8¾ lengths in a career-best 1:53. Attis Rock and Disgruntled Carl rounded out the ticket.

"He was coasting," Miller said. "I don't know how much the sires stake horses will go today, but it won't be much more than he went."

Nifty Norman trains the Bar Hopping—Up Front Hotsey gelding for Enzed Racing Stable Inc.

Loxahatchee's regal pedigree, Greenshoe—Hannelore Hanover, inspires dreams of championships; indeed, he brought \$435,000 as a yearling at the Lexington Selected Sale. But entering the Super Bowl, he had only one victory in seven career starts.

On Friday, he looked more like the horse everyone expected, erasing a 6-length deficit, even though his cover broke stride in front of him. He scored in 1:55.3, a new lifetime mark, 3 lengths better than Casanova Hall, with early leader International Craze third.

"Our game plan was to roll out of there, and he just didn't feel like he would get off on the right foot; he was a little pacey," said winning driver Palone. "When his cover ran, my colt took off on his own. He was well within himself."

Melander trains the winner for Courant Inc.

Miller collected three wins on the 13-race card.

Monte Gelrod suspended 18 months, fined \$12,500 for Cobalt positive with thoroughbred

We told you in March that former standardbred trainer Monte Gelrod had received a Cobalt positive on a thoroughbred he is training. Now comes word, **via Thoroughbred Daily News**, that Gelrod has been suspended for 18 months and fined \$18,500. The suspension began on April 17.

Gelrod's pupil Ratified tested positive for cobalt salts after winning at Parx Racing on Feb. 19.

TDN wrote, "The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority classifies cobalt salts as a banned substance. Cobalt has been proven to stimulate the production of red blood cells (erythropoiesis) which explains why some have turned to it as a potential performance-enhancer in both humans and animals. Greater blood cell production can help endurance and decrease muscle fatigue."

Previously, TDN's Bill Finley wrote, "Gelrod is a relative newcomer when it comes to thoroughbred racing. Gelrod was a close associate of top standardbred trainer [the late] Bill Robinson, who was banned at Woodbine Entertainment Group's tracks for more than 11 years for repeated drug violations. Gelrod trained standardbreds on his own from 1991 to 2015 and won 676 races."

Harness Racing Update

In 2002, Gelrod received a five-year suspension in New Jersey and a \$5,000 fine for what a **2003 story in the Daily Racing Form**, said was a fourth positive for milkshaking. He began training thoroughbreds in 2023."

As a thoroughbred trainer, Gelrod has a career record of 4-4-4 in 20 starts.

First 2-year-olds race at The Meadowlands

June brings with it the promise of summer and the start of 2-year-old racing. Saturday morning's (June 1) qualifiers offered the first of those as we prepare for next week's start of Breakfast of the Babies.

It was a perfect weather day with the temperature around 70 degrees, a fast track and no wind.

There were just four short fields of 2-year-olds on the bill along with six qualifiers.

Ray Schnittker dominated the opener, the result of having the only two starters in the trot. He set the fractions with the Greenshoe filly, **She's A Shoe In**, ending the 2:01.2 mile with a :29.2 quarter to hold off Karinchak (Mark MacDonald) in a photo.

The winner was bred by Steve Jones and sold at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale (LEX) for \$65,000. Schnittker owns the filly with Grozcona Racing Stable.

Trainer Bruce Saunders sent out a sharp looking son of first crop New Jersey sire Cattlewash named **Manolete** (Tim Tetrick) to win the second race. Tetrick followed his only opponent, Holt Hanover (MacDonald) around through slow fractions then brushed by when the leader drifted late through a :27.4 end to the 1:58.1 mile.

Manolete was a \$52,000 Harrisburg buy for two long-time owners of Saunders, M&L of Delaware and M&M Racing. He was bred by the OK Corral.

A pair of Bulvils, a reporter's nightmare, took on a single Schnittker entry in the third race for filly pacers. Tim Tetrick sat third throughout with Bulvilhighonmaggie as entry-mate **Bulvilsgotnopigeon** (Scott Zeron) set sensible fractions then outsprinted her two rivals to get the win in 2:00.1. On Cloud Wine (MacDonald) split the Bulvils to be second.

Steve Crevani bred, owns and trains the winner, a daughter of American Ideal.

Crevani came right back twin **Bulvillkidunotedna** who led all the way for Zeron, holding off Cervi (MacDonald) through a :28.1 end to the day's fastest 1:57.2. The winner is another daughter of top N.Y. sire American Ideal.

The older horses featured a match-up of last season's Dan Patch honoree It's Academic who led throughout for Dave Miller but could not withstand the close of 4-year-old **Winner's Bet** who charged by through the :26.3 end to the 1:51.3 mile under no urging from Dexter Dunn.

My Girl EJ was put through a public workout by Dunn, with the Breeders Crown winner sprinting home in 26 flat to close out a 1:52.3 mile off by herself.

Dunn strung three as **Stonebridge Helios** demonstrated that he can catch birds as he set the pace and sprinted home in the grips to finish the 1:51.3 mile with All About The Hunt (Patrick Ryder) sticking pretty much with him right to the wire.

Delayed Hanover's 1:52 fastest trot of Plainridge meet

Delayed Hanover strayed from The Meadowlands for a week in lieu of an afternoon at The Ridge on Thursday (May 30) and ended up leaving with a win and a new seasonal mark of 1:52 after touring the facility in the meet's fastest trotting mile of the year at Plainridge Park.

Jay Randall left from post 4 with Delayed Hanover and took a quick and easy 2-length lead to the quarter in :27.2. With the field single file in chase, the pair then set a moderate tone of :56 to the half before Marquis Lafayette (Bruce Ranger) made a first-over move at five-eighths and advanced to within a length of the leader at the three-quarters. But 1 length was as close as anyone would get as Randall fed Delayed Hanover some line and allowed him to close it out. With the whip on his shoulder and his hands in his lap, Randall was just a passenger as Delayed Hanover swelled up and bolted down the lane. Delayed Hanover put space between himself and the field with every stride and ran away with a 4½-length victory in an eyepopping 1:52.

It was the first win in only seven 2024 starts for Delayed Hanover (\$3.80) who is owned by Reid Wissner and trained by Kevin Mc Dermott.

Bruce Ranger ended the day with a driving grand slam while Domenico Cecere tallied two training wins, making each the leader in their respective category for Thursday.

Racing resumes at Plainridge Park on Monday (June 3) with post time at 4 p.m. and the card will feature a \$1,519 carryover in the Wicked Hi-5 in race 6.

Drivers ready for Regional Driving Championship

This afternoon (June 2) eight harness racing drivers from Quebec and Eastern Ontario will battle it out at the Hippodrome 3R (H3R) in Trois-Rivieres, QC, to see which two drivers will head to the Canadian Driving Championship, where one driver will emerge as the champion representative to the World Driving Championship in New Zealand.

The competition is run by Standardbred Canada in four regions across the country. The top two drivers in each regional competition get to compete in the finals.

Today's Ontario/Eastern Ontario Regional Driving Championship will feature eight races, 2 through 9 at the Hippodrome 3R in Trois-Rivieres. It was two years ago that Pascal Berube and Samuel Fillion headed to the finals.

Both Berube and Fillion are back again in the competition at H3R, along with Nicholas Boyd, Stephane Brosseau, Guy Gagnon, Jimmy Gagnon, Stephane Pouliot and Robert Shepherd. They are all top drivers in their regions.

Once the morning line was completed, the point system for the competition was calculated based on the morning line (which is just an estimated indicator of betting odds for the racing fans) and came up with the following possible order of finish.

Shepherd - 64

Brosseau - 52

Berube – 51

Boyd - 45

Fillion – 45

Ji Gagnon - 42

G Gagnon - 39

Pouliot - 38

Shepherd is driving two morning line favorites, as is Brosseau, but since the odds are determined by the betting fans, it could very well change by race time.

The two top point earners today get an invitation to return to H3R on Sunday (July 7), for the Canadian Driving Championship final where the winner will represent Canada at the World Driving Champion that will be held in New Zealand.

It will be the first time that H3R has played host to the championship final.

Usually, the competition comes down to the very last race and in this case, it's the ninth race preferred handicap pace. Uncontrollable (post 2) is the 5-2 morning line favorite for driver Jimmy Gagnon. Uncontrollable is on a two-race winning streak. In his last start he scored at H3R in 1:55.4.

Another return winner in the field is Sports Bettor (post 3) with driver Pascal Berube. They are the 3-1 second choice in the race and are coming off a 1:56.2 triumph last week.

Other contenders include Thedoginthefight (Stephane Pouliot) in post 4, Greystone Watchman (Guy Gagnon) in post 5 and YS Sensationalcity (Robert Shepherd) in post 8.

When asked for comments on how they like the horses they selected and who they think are the main competitors, some of the drivers said the following:

- Stephane Pouliot: "I am feeling confident and I really like the horses I picked. For me, all of the drivers have a chance to win."
- Pascal Berube: "There is a part of choosing your horses which is interesting but not knowing their starting position when making choices makes things more complicated because if your first choices are not in a good position it makes things even more difficult. In my opinion the big winner of the tournament will be Stephane Brosseau. He has good horses and the good horses he has have a good starting position so I think that will give him better luck."
- Samuel Fillion: "I wasn't really happy when I saw my first and second picks get the 7 and 8 holes. But they are good racehorses and we never know what is going to happen. I think Pascal is probably the major danger. He gets a few good horses with good posts. He also knows those horses really well because he's been driving at H3R every week."

Usually, first race post time at H3R is noon, but today at high noon, the fans will first be introduced to the eight drivers in the competition, then the racing will begin.

With the exception of a couple of drivers, all of the 64 horses entered in the competition will have a driver that has not driven the horse before, making the contest even more exciting and harder to handicap.


Disagreeing with Sturman in Howard Taylor / Jeff Gural saga



Gural: Faraldo blocking NYRA Bets from taking night signals is a joke

As many of you are aware I have devoted substantial financial resources and personal energy in support of the sport about which I am passionate — harness racing. Beyond money, I have earnestly taken to task those who I believe have compromised the integrity and credibility of the sport we love — and I have been lambasted, sued and criticized by many who have turned a blind eye to the obvious problems facing our industry. To those folks I have a simple question, where would harness racing be if I didn't step up? And I don't ask this question to prompt anyone's applause. It's just fact.

For sure there would be no Meadowlands, there would be no Tioga, there would be no Vernon and there would be no national television exposure on NYRA Bets, without my investment and intervention in these premier venues.

To show you what a joke [harness racing] is, Joe Faraldo of USTA refuses to support change to the legislation that prevents NYRA Bets from taking any nighttime harness signals. Can anyone credibly argue that Joe advances the interests of harness racing when he refuses to support change in this New York law which currently prevents NYRA Bets from taking night signals? The joke is Joe actually thinks it would cost the SBOA money if allowed to take the signal. While I strongly disagree with him and his wrong opinion, even if he was right, isn't it important to get our major races exposed to the public? Anyone who watched the show on the night of the Cutler had to be impressed by the quality of the program.

So why am I sharing my opinion with you now? Simple: I have come to know, after all my efforts to purge our industry of those who don't share my commitment to honesty and integrity — and after all my financial and personal investment in keeping our industry alive — that it is pretty much a waste of time. So I want to give notice to the industry that I am done writing

checks as the losses at The Meadowlands from racing continue to mount. Without help from the industry it is highly unlikely that we will be able to maintain the current stakes program next year. Fortunately, I only own trotters so it will be easy just to eliminate the stakes for the pacers, but I think that would hurt the owners and breeders of pacers, so I hope the industry is prepared to step up for a change and do their part.

On a final note, if it were my choice, I would not have cast my vote to elect Joe Faraldo as USTA Chairman. Does USTA really want its Chairman criticizing me as I am a lifelong friend to harness racing, a reality well established by my efforts to financially support, preserve and clean up our industry? If so, the USTA Directors apparently, and regrettably, have bought into Mr. Faraldo's inaccurate characterizations of me as the bad quy.

Here's my bottom line: I love harness racing. It has been a part of my life since I started going to Yonkers and Roosevelt as a kid. Never in a million years did I ever think I would own The Meadowlands. I am just tired of being criticized for trying my best to clean up the sport.
