The 36-year-old driver is already half-way to John Campbell's record of six victories.

"After the first Hambo win, it's all downhill from there," driver Scott Zeron said with a laugh.

Thankfully for him, that really wasn't the case, as just two years after notching his first victory in America's Trotting Classic with

Marion Marauder in 2016, he was back in the Hambletonian winner's circle with Atlanta, and five years after that, with Tactical Approach.

On the list of drivers with the most Hambletonian victories, Zeron is tied with five other drivers — Howard Beissinger, Del Cameron, Ron Pierce, Brian Sears, and Henry Thomas — with three. Four drivers — Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton, Mike Lachance and Ben White, each have four wins, while John Campbell sits at the top of the list with six.



Zeron is currently in the unique position of being the only driver on that list still active.

Sitting with half as many Hambletonian victories as Campbell, Zeron said he could comprehend how difficult it must have been to win a half-dozen.

"I kind of let things flow a little bit anyway," Zeron said. "I never make it about me, either, you know, because I could win it any given year... sometimes the trainer and definitely, sometimes the owner, that could be their only chance ever, and it's definitely that horse's only chance. And if you're campaigning a horse that you believe will be a stallion, it is a huge deal to get that win. So, you individualize it that way, but, I never really, ever thought of it as about me."

Zeron did acknowledge that succeeding in a high-profile race like the Hambletonian does come with its perks, especially for a young driver.

"The advantage to winning them is people have more confidence that you can handle yourself in pressure situations," Zeron said. "So, you know, that always helps, because this is one of the few businesses, they don't want young and eager, they want seasoned and experienced. So, yeah, youth is tough in this game. You want John Campbell, who's won it six times. You don't want the guy that you know hasn't won it."

According to Zeron, youth may have been beneficial for his first Hambletonian win.

"The first one I won with 'Marauder' was the first final I'd ever been in," said Zeron, who was 27 at the time. "So, you're a little naive to the significance, which always helps. Youth is the greatest thing, because you don't know how global and significant the Hambletonian really is, at least I didn't. So, I went in with an open mind. I was driving for [trainers] Mike [Keeling] and Paula [Wellwood], who every step of the way were, 'Just keep the horse happy,' and 'hope he races well.' It was never, 'This is his one chance, this is our one chance.' It was always about there's so much more for this horse, so much more. And that was the mentality they installed in me, which helped me be patient and let races come to me with Marauder. He wasn't a run and gun horse; he was a trip horse. And then when I went first-up with him, that was exciting, because I didn't know, crossing the wire, if I had won."

Zeron's next Hambletonian success, with the filly Atlanta, had a family connection since his dad, Rick, was both the trainer and co-owner.

"Atlanta, I didn't think could lose it," Scott said. "I went in so confident with her to the point where I told my father, 'Whatever you want to do, if you want to put her in the Oaks or the Hambo, I think I'm going to win either. I think she's just an unbeatable horse.' And obviously I raced her way too hard in the elimination, and she got beat. And that was devastating, because, like I said, I just never sat behind a horse as talented as she was, and her five races leading up to that was just like not even breaking a sweat. So, it was really exciting to see that there are horses that are just complete freaks, and to me, she was that.

"And then in the elimination, even at the three-quarter pole, I was like, 'She's going to go [1]:48.' I was just, you know, thinking crazy things. That's how good she was and how good she felt."

According to Scott, Atlanta unfortunately went from feeling good to spitting the bit.

"And I'm sure she looked down that long quarter-of-a-mile, and said, 'No, no, no, this is too much." Scott said with a laugh. "So, I thought in the elimination, I basically lost the final. That was it to me, you know, I can't expect her to come back and be great in the final."

In the drivers' room before the Hambletonian final, Scott said he was looking at the program trying to figure out who was going to cut the mile.

"I ended up leaving again, having to cut it, the poor girl," he said with a laugh. "And I got a soft half, but I didn't get a soft quarter; I went too fast to the quarter pole. Nonetheless, when I asked her in the middle of the last turn to get separation off of Tactical Landing, she responded, and that was obviously a breath of fresh air. And she went both heats in [1]:50.4, both of them. So that was exciting. I don't know how thrilling it was, it was more of a little bit of relief, because I told my dad she'd win."

Scott said he was well aware at the time that it had been 22 years since the last filly, Continentalvictory (1996), had won the Hambletonian.

"So now you look dumb trying to attempt it, and I didn't want that to be the case, so, it was a relief," he said. "It was excitement for my family, and, you know, for my dad, a career of 50 years in the business, to have a horse like her, and he didn't have a colt, so, you know, the Hambo wasn't ever on the table, so he had to do it with a filly."

Harness racing tends to be a generational pursuit, which made this victory more important to Scott. "If you were to ask any gentlemen that started driving, what would be your No.1 goal it would be, 'I'd love to win the biggest race there is with my father," Scott said. "My dad was a trainer/driver, but he'd handed the lines over to me. It's something I don't even know if I could have put on a bucket list, because it just seemed like a million-to-one chance, and that was pretty


cool. I don't know if anything could actually top doing something of that importance with your own family."

Scott's Hambletonian hat trick came in 2023, with Tactical Approach, who had everything going for him except for his odds (12-1) and post position (10).

"As talented of a horse as he was, I didn't think strategically he had a chance in hell," Scott said. "So, that was just a matter of under-driving him. And, obviously, the cards that were dealt, Brian [Sears] left out of the 9-hole, so I couldn't really leave out of the 10-hole. Then everybody was protecting the two-wide path to get Brian to keep taking back, so, then I just started up [along the rail] early. I was on the inside of everybody before the quarter pole. And then, you know, everything that transpired, everyone kept pulling, kept pulling, kept pulling, and then [Tactical Approach] was as fresh as anybody turning for home."

Down the stretch, Scott said his attention was fully on the rail.

"I'm more focused on the inside and not going over pylons and not hooking a wheel, and I get through there, he's trotting a 1,000 and I kind of look over to my right and nobody was over to my right," Scott said. "And I was like, 'Oh my God, he's winning.' That one was pretty cool... That one was really exciting crossing the finish line, because I knew without a doubt, I won the race, obviously, by a couple lengths. And if you're a driver, winning on the front is more nerve-wracking, like you're just hoping the wire comes up quickly. So, you're just fending off people, versus tactically, just going through, moving, juking, jiving, and sprinting past horses; to me, it's much more thrilling to pass horses late. Like I said, as talented as he was, and as good as

he finished off the rest of the year, I didn't know how I could put him in a position to win.

"All my Hambos were so different... With Atlanta, I didn't think I could lose, with Tactical Approach, I didn't know how I could win, and Marion Marauder, it was one of many races that [the connections] were just hoping the horse raced well. So, you know, I went in with an open mind."

Scott is hopeful for another opportunity to get back to the Hambletonian winner's circle again this year with one of the nice colts he drove last year at 2, which are both in Ken Warkentin's Road to the Hambletonian Top 10.


"[Maximus Mearas S] had a sneaky good campaign last year," Scott said of the Lucas Wallin-trained Breeders Crown runner-up. "I want to say he was top two almost every time.

"He ended the year off sensationally flying up in 26 seconds to kind of get close to Maryland's bridle. So, yeah, I'm most excited about him. And I guess he's training back great, too, so that's good.

"And then [Marcus] Melander has me on Meshuggah. He's also a nice horse. And you never know. You never know what will make it that day, or if I'll pick up a drive."

When asked what advice Scott would give to somebody making their Hambletonian debut, he said, "I think it was [Todd McCarthy's] advice that I heard him say on the Cool Papa Bell [winning Hambletonian] Day. He just wanted to enjoy the day.

"I wouldn't let strategy consume you prior to it, because guys are going to drive differently than they did in the elimination. So, just enjoy the day. It's one of the greatest days in harness racing, the whole entire Hambo card. So, yeah, if you have a

drive in it, enjoy the day, and if you can go in with an open mind, sometimes the race can come to you."

It sounds like Scott will use that same advice himself.

"I read an article last year that Yannick [Gingras] was doing prior to [last year's Hambletonian], and he said, 'Yeah, it's one of the hardest races to win, unless you're Scott Zeron," Scott said with a laugh.

Campbell won his first Hambletonian in 1987 when he was 32 and his sixth and final in 2006 at 51. Scott won his first two before he hit 30 and his third when he was 34. At the ripe old age of 36, he may be able to make Gingras' comment a reality.

# The first 10 editions of Canada's most prestigious race

Here's a thumbnail look at the first 10 editions of the North America Cup, also known as the "Greenwood Years."

1984: The Queen City Pace ends a 20-year run. Greenwood, around since 1874, is about to close out its last decade in style. Legal Notice and Dr. John Hayes score in the \$596,500 test for the best sophomores in the land. Sonny Dancer sat second to the winner pretty much every step with Walton Hanover and narrowed in late but fell a couple of bucks short. 3YOPC On The Road Again was not present in the inaugural.

1985: Dave Wall and Staff Director follow the 1984 blueprint and lead every step. Pepsi climbs aboard as a sponsor. Red Colt was a good second. Some 'brand' names failed to seriously threaten: Forrest Skipper (1986 HOY), Chairmanoftheboard, Anxious Robby, and Pinocchio.

1986: Trevor Ritchie follows John Campbell and Amity Chef and just does get the measure of that Blair Burgess trainee scoring with Quite A Sensation. This is the first June NA Cup. Campbell would have to wait until 1991 for his Cup breakthrough. It was a healthy \$63.50-win mutuel a year before the million dollar era began.

1987: Fittingly, Jate Lobell, 21-for-22 lifetime coming in, held on a nose over Frugal Gourmet in the first seven-figure race ever contested in Canada, harness or thoroughbred. It was the 26th overall million-dollar race in the industry and it cost a robust \$16,000 — payments of \$1G,\$2G,\$2G,\$3G, and \$8G to start — to get your nose on the starting gate. Jate Lobell actually broke the track record with a 1:54.1 elimination score, and then again by nearly 2 seconds with his 1:52.3 win for Mark O'Mara, who was the first U.S.-born driver to win it. The win price was \$2.70 and it was 30-1 on the runner-up. The second feature was named the Kick Off Pace with a \$75,000 purse. Quietly a veteran named Perfect Out appeared in there. He didn't win, but did become the first and only horse to beat Cam Fella and later race on a card with Jate Lobell.

1988: Yves Filion and Runnymede Lobell rewarded those who backed the Bayama Farms' colt to 4-5 (\$3.70) as he won the richest of the first 17 editions (\$1,043,500). Second choice

Camtastic (8-5), the defending Pacer of the Year, never got underway and was last in the eight-horse field, but just 2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths back in the tightly packed group. Exclusive Cam (125-1) for Lyle MacArthur was the longest shot to hit the board.

1989: Goalie Jeff posts the biggest upset in North America Cup history with a \$93.60 reward for those who believed, then, in the eventual 3YOPC of the Year for Tom Artandi. Kentucky Spur was oh-so-close to hanging on for the lone U.S.-born driver Richard Stillings. Campbell was fourth with Totally Ruthless for Steve Elliott. Both would have better days ahead in this event.

1990: Apache Fame (\$5.90) became the first Ontario-bred and sired colt to win the Cup, holding off the furious challenge of Mark Johnathan (28-1), with Road Machine (51-1) third. Jake And Elwood was fourth and the defending Breeders Crown winner Till We Meet Again was eighth. Trainer Larry Rathbone would later atone for that eighth-place finish in 2004 with Mantacular. HOY Beach Towel broke early and lost all chance.

1991: Precious Bunny becomes the first NA Cup winner to be named HOY, the first to also win the Meadowlands Pace, and the first to do so with different drivers. Campbell in the Cup and Jack Moiseyev come Pace time as Campbell reunited with Artsplace who finished second. Start The Fire, at 15-1, finished second. This was the first of six North America Cups in the 1990s alone for Campbell!

1992: The 4-5 favorite, Carlsbad Cam finished fourth, second choice Western Hanover the pacesetter at 9-5 finished second,



and Direct Flight was scratched. Mike Lachance was a late addition to team Safely Kept, a son from the very first crop of 1987 winner Jate Lobell. Joe Holloway trained and celebrated a pocket-sitting 1¾-length score returning \$63.70. It would not be the last time Iron Mike Lachance would win this race having never driven the colt before (1998 Straight Path). The three aforementioned colts were heard from three weeks later as Carlsbad Cam won the Meadowlands Pace for father-and-son Carl-and-Rod Allen. Direct Flight was third as the slight favorite over Western Hanover who wound up seventh, impeded in the first turn.

1993: Ron Waples ably filled in on Presidential Ball for Jack Moiseyev who hurt his back hours prior at Freehold, returning \$2.70 on the eventual 3YOPC of 1993. Another Cam Fella winner. Nineteen years later, Ron Waples' son Randy would win the Cup with Thinking Out Loud. The winning margin was just a half-length over a 13-1 shot by the name The Starting Gate.

The first decade, the first million-dollar race, the first win for Campbell, the first Pepsi NA Cup, and the highest priced winner. Yep, there was a lot going on during that initial decade at Greenwood Raceway the host of Canada's signature event.

**Note:** The next installment looks at the next batch of NA Cups, which feature sub 1:50 winners and the biggest pots ever offered north of the border.

## If it wasn't illegal, Marcus Melander would have worked in harness racing before he was 16

One could say that it was inevitable that Marcus Melander would become a horseman, and not only a horseman, but an exceptional one!

Based on pedigree and environment, it hardly could have been eclipsed. In terms of pedigree, Melander is the nephew of one of the most renowned and accomplished European horsemen, Stefan Melander. Regarding environment, he grew up in a horse racing family and figuratively "went to school" in two of the most renowned harness racing academies - that of his aforementioned uncle Stefan and of triple Harness Hall of Fame member Jimmy Takter.

Marcus said that he never had any doubt that his vocation would involve training horses.

"I went to school in Sweden until I was 16, because that is the law in Sweden," Marcus said. "As soon as I was free to leave and begin an apprenticeship with my uncle, I did so."


You have worked with two of the greatest horsemen of modern times, in two of the leading countries in which harness racing takes place. What are the main differences in the methods employed in Sweden and North America and more specifically by Stefan Melander and Jimmy Takter?


"Relative to Sweden and America, the major difference is in the prevalence and emphasis on 2-year-old racing in America. Two-year-olds are raced in Sweden and throughout Europe, but not as early, nor as often as they are here.

"The training methods are adjusted to the schedules of the horses involved. As an example, we will be starting a good number of our babies here this week. That would be somewhat

Marcus Melander at Woodbine Mohawk Park.






unheard of in Sweden. The reason, of course is because of racing opportunities. Both the New York and Pennsylvania Sires Stakes will be taking place in a matter of a few weeks. If we want to take advantage of them, we need to have our horses ready. I really don't believe that it is all that difficult on the horses themselves. Today's American breed of trotters are so natural and so athletic. They come to their speed when asked for it. The major requirement for trainers is to keep them fit and sound - to build a foundation.

"In discussing Melander and Takter, there is more that these two have in common than what differentiates them. They are both natural horsemen. They have lived around horses all of their lives. The major attribute that they both possess is that they are focused on the horse as an individual. The horse tells them how it should be trained, rather than the reverse. I've tried my best to emulate this philosophy."

When I spoke with you earlier this week, you were in Kentucky setting up shop for a farm and training center which you had purchased. Is it your goal to move your operation from New Jersey to Kentucky?

"No. At least not in the immediate future. But the possibility exists if by some unfortunate circumstances racing on the



farm mostly because so many of our horses are dual eligibles and are likely to race there. To emphasize that point, we had 53 2-year-olds in our stable this year, 46 of them have Kentucky eligibility... east coast and most specifically in New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania should dry up. We have bought the Kentucky farm mostly because so many of our horses are dual eligibles and are likely to race there. To emphasize that point, we had 53 2-year-olds in our stable this year, 46 of them have Kentucky eligibility. Doubtless, some of the others have some Grand Circuit events at The Red Mile where they could race. I felt that it made perfect sense to have an outpost where we could house our horses in proximity to where they are going to race."

## You mentioned 53 2-year-olds in training. How many horses in total do you have?

"We have a total number of 80, the vast majority being 2- and 3-year-olds, with a scattering of some excellent older trotters."

# You have only trotters in the stable. Is there any reason why there are no pacers?

"I suppose the main reason would be found in the ownership makeup of the stable. Most of the owners are European. Of

## Why did you choose to go out on your own in 2015?

"I had worked with Jimmy [Takter] for a year. Between what I was able to assemble in my family and from a few outside owners,

we had put together a stable of a dozen head. We went to the sales and bought five or six moderately priced yearlings. We did okay — not great, but not bad. I suppose that if you were looking for a breakout year, there would likely be two of them — the years 2016 and 2017. In 2015, we bought the yearlings Long Tom and Enterprise. Both turned out to be pretty good trotters. Both are standing stud in Ohio. In 2016 we bought Fourth Dimension. He was the Dan Patch winning 2-year-old trotter of 2017. He was Swedish owned and is now standing stud in Sweden."

"We are fortunate to have Anders Strom and his Courant Stable, Lennart Agren's S R F Stable and Jeff and Michael Snyder among our owners. Between those three entities, I would guess that they are probably involved with two thirds of the horses in the stable. Somewhat notable is that Courant and SRF are Swedish stables racing in America. Our Melander family, my dad Mikael, my mom Madelene, myself, my brother Mattias and my sister Mikaela own all or part of another 10 or more head. Our family horses race under the stable name Holly Lane Stud East."

You mentioned that your favorite stallion and the one with which you have enjoyed the most success is Chapter Seven. What about him differentiates his foals from those of other horses?

"If I were looking for one single trait, it would be that most of them have great attitudes. Some of them might not have the best gait, some might not be that big, but the vast majority want to do right. That is an intangible quality that few stallions possess. That is what often separates a good stallion from a great one."

Speaking of Chapter Seven, let's discuss his son Maryland. He is just about everyone's pick as the favorite for this year's Classic races. Why do you consider him to be the very best that you have trained?

"He is truly a great colt. Perhaps he has not started his season as some may have expected, but I'm not in the slightest concerned or disappointed. In his first qualifier, Dexter [Dunn] raced him just as instructed, and as one would use a qualifying event. We just wanted to give him a race.

"Last Saturday in his second qualifier he made a break. Both Dexter and I believe he saw something which may have frightened him. Dexter said he felt great both before and after the break. He felt perfect to me as well. I'm guessing it was just one of those things. We are still on schedule with the first Saturday in August circled on our calendar."





In the May 17 preferred handicap at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Ervin Hanover made one of the most hotly-anticipated returns in this year's older pacing ranks. The 5-year-old son of Captaintreacherous—Eloquent Grace wired in back-to-back Mohawk qualifiers on May 2 and 9 for Louis-Philippe Roy, then



stepped up for his first 2025 start, with Doug McNair taking the lines. They got away fifth behind the front-end winner, Dave Menary stablemate Brue Hanover, who easily held off place-finisher Nijinsky in that rival's 4-year-old comeback. Ervin Hanover charged home for show, sixth lengths behind 2025 New Holland Series champ Brue Hanover.

On May 30 at The Raceway at Western Fair District, the two Menary trainees faced each other again, but over a smaller track.

Brue Hanover (p, 5, 1:49s; \$418,633) began his career at Mohawk in 2022, and made his half-mile track debut on Dec. 12, 2023 at Yonkers, where he finished second as the beaten even-money favorite in a conditioned event. The 5-year-old Stay Hungry—Blind Ambition gelding had his first Yonkers victory on March 27, 2024, and would win just once more over that track in 10 tries last year, taking his half-mile track record of 1:52.1 on Sept. 16. He had never gone a faster trip, win or lose, on a half. The pacer, owned by Burke Racing Stable Llc of Fredericktown, PA and Weaver Bruscemi Llc of Canonsburg, PA, was on a seven-race win streak at Mohawk leading up to the \$150,000 Camluck Classic.

Ervin Hanover (p, 4, 1:47.3s; \$519,427), owned by Pollack Racing Llc of Venetia, PA, began his racing career over Pennsylvania's



five-eighths-mile tracks. The stallion broke his maiden in his 2-year-old debut, on July 2, 2022 at The Meadows. His half-mile track debut came on Sept. 12, 2023, when he defeated six other pacers in a front-end trip from post 5 at Yonkers. Ervin Hanover's victory did not translate into success at the Little Brown Jug: he finished fourth behind Ken Hanover in his elimination and did not make the final. At age 4, the stallion won again at Yonkers in an April 2 conditioned race, and finished a strong second from post 7 in his Charles Juravinski Memorial elim at Flamboro. Although a compact horse with a good record on small tracks, Ervin Hanover found his best results last November over the big track at Mohawk, as chronicled here in HRU, ending his season with a three-race win streak in the preferred.

James MacDonald sent Brue Hanover straight to the front in the Camluck Classic, under early pressure from Chase H Hanover into the first turn. Ervin Hanover scrambled around the opening turn three-wide from seventh, brushing to third along the backstretch, and clearing Brue Hanover coming off the second turn. McNair kept Ervin Hanover ahead of first-over Lous World approaching three-quarters, and maintained the lead at the top of the stretch. That's when Brue Hanover made his move up the inside path, and leaped over the finish, ending up first-placed-third.

Ervin Hanover paced his fastest-ever winning mile on a half in the Camluck Classic, a 1:52 individual performance. He had been individually timed in 1:49.4 in his Little Brown Jug elimination, his best beaten time on the smaller-sized track.

Was one of the Menary stablemates better suited to the dimensions of the London, ON track, or was it sheer racing luck that led to Ervin Hanover being elevated to his first 2025 win? Was Brue Hanover's leap at the wire caused by his desperate effort to catch Ervin Hanover down the short stretch, the roar of the crowd, or something else? Given all the variables, it's impossible to pin down one reason.

After the placing, interviewer Greg Blanchard spoke with Ervin Hanover's driver on the walk back to the London winner's circle.

"I'm just trying to hold my ground, you know what I mean?" said McNair, describing the deep-stretch battle. "I mean, they're both Dave's horses. The last thing I want to do is crash his legs and screw both of us. I thought I did hold my ground. I didn't think there was enough room and I was surprised [Brue Hanover] actually did get through there. As we watched the replay, he had to go over the last pylon to do it, but my horse raced great."

McNair stressed the importance of strategy on a half-mile track.



## **Inexess Bleu is unstoppable at Vincennes**

Laurent-Claude Abrivard is the trainer, Alexandre Abrivard drives and the horse, **Inexess Bleu** (Vittel de Brevol) refuses to lose in Paris. He has now won 10 straight races.

Saturday's (June 7) \$130,000 Prix Chambon P was more proof of Inexess Bleu's fighting spirit and great morale. Alexandre had to push his horse three wide throughout the race's initial stages and the gait was not bad, but not good either and that's a significant thing about Inexess Bleu — he trots in his style and refuses to lose.

When the field passed the grandstand for the first time, Alexandre pushed for the lead and in the downhill part of the track, Inexess Bleu controlled the race in front. Vincennes' backstretch, the mount, looks to be where Inexess Bleu enjoys racing the most. His gait is cleaner and the flow is remarkably effective in that part of the track. So, while he's building power before the last turn, his opponents often struggle following.

The stretch appeared to be quite exciting when Iguski Sautonne flew on the outside, but it was just an illusion. Inexess Bleu held the challengers at least one length behind when he hit the wire in a mile rate of 1:58 over 1.7 miles.



In the \$130,000 Prix Jean le Gonidec for 5-year-olds, Benjamin Rochard hit an early front position behind favorite **Kanto Avis** (Ready Cash) and it became a very soft and comfortable win for the duo. Kanto Avis jogged to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:53.3 over 1.3 miles.

Liberte de Choisel (Captain Sparrow) won his seventh straight race when he took the \$130,000 Prix Guy le Gonidec for 4-year-old mares. Tough opponents London and Liza Josselyn both acquired positions in front of the field, but Jean-Michel Bazire (Liza Josselyn) opted to let Liberte de Choisel overtake the lead as the field turned into the backstretch.

Liberte de Choisel defended herself bravely in the stretch and claimed her fifth consecutive victory at Vincennes 2025 and her seventh in a row since October 2024. Anthony Barrier drove Sylvain Gerard Dupont's trotter, who has eight wins in nine attempts so far in her career.

Thierry Duvaldestin is one of the very best trainers in France and when the 4-year-old colts battled in the \$130,000 Prix Jules Thibault, he had the two favorites in the field. Lovino Bello is an already known trotter in Europe and he was also the bettors' first choice, just ahead of stablemate **Lancier du Goutier** (Ready Cash). Lancier du Goutier entered the race undefeated after two starts in 2025 and in the hands of Theo Duvaldestin he proved that he very well belongs among the top trotters in the French L-crop. Lancier du Goutier had to give it all to reach front position in the end of the downhill part and when favorite Lovino Bello was cleverly driven by Eric Raffin, in second over, a battle between the two stablemates was expected. But the leading Lancier du Goutier was too strong this day as he won in a mile rate of 1:55.1 over 1.6 miles. Lovino Bello could not capture his stablemate, but finished second.

## IZOD ZET STRONG ON SWEDEN'S ONLY MILE TRACK

For the first and last time\* in Sweden, the V75 was held on the country's only mile track in Tingsryd on Saturday (June 7)

afternoon. On that card was the \$80,000 Prix Readly Express for 4-year-olds. Solvalla has always been the host track for that race, but when the mile track in Tingsryd had the opportunity to arrange such a big race day, the Prix Readly Express moved south in Sweden.

The winner of the historic race impressed a lot. In a 1.5-mile race, Daniel Redén's **Izod Zet** (Propulsion) began behind horses and was safely driven by Örjan Kihlström, with many lengths behind the leader Big Ben Pellini. When the field turned into the long stretch at the mile track, Izod Zet took off from a position furthest back in the field. And he simply flew in the stretch, capturing the leader shortly before the wire in a very strong mile rate of 1:55.4 over 2,413 meters (1.5 miles).

\* ATG, the Swedish betting company for harness racing has decided to replace the V75 later this year. The V85, a new betting product, is supposed to be the fresh betting game on Saturdays. That's why Tingsryd likely will not arrange a race card similar to Saturday's again.

## It took time for Natalie Graffam to nail down her role in harness racing

There was a time when Natalie Graffam wasn't married to the idea of a horse racing career. Now, it's clear she is

fully engaged in the standardbred world.

"My grandfather has always had racehorses, but I was never really involved with him in it; I knew he had horses," Graffam said. "But my connection to the sport changed when I met Nick."

That would be Nick Graffam, a successful driver with nearly 1,400 career wins and over \$14 million in purse earnings.

When the couple first started dating, Natalie was a regular in the grandstands, cheering Nick on wherever he raced. Gradually, her role evolved from supportive spectator to active participant.

"It started as going to the races and slowly turned into, 'Can you help with this? Can you help with that?" she said. "And now I paddock most of Nick's horses with his sister Bethany."

And she couldn't be happier.

Despite the steep learning curve, Natalie — who works fulltime in a nail salon — quickly found herself enamored with the horses and the lifestyle.

"It started out with me wondering just how much I wanted to be involved, questioning that, and as soon as I realized how much I love the horses, I knew it was something I wanted to do," she said.

One horse in particular helped solidify that love: a trotter named Happy Hooligan, known for being a bit of a handful.

"Everyone told me he was a problem child," she said with a laugh. "We raced him as a baby and his owner wanted to sell him. I ended up buying half of him and we raced him for a few years together. And then my partner wanted out, so I bought the rest of him."

Now, he's a permanent fixture in her life.

"I can't ever let him go," Natalie said. "I love him so much. He stays outside because he can't stand being inside. He is probably my heart horse, but there are so many horses I take care of that I love too."

One of them is Storm Bringer, an 8-year-old son of Explosive Matter—Agenda Tom Ridge. The bay gelding boasts 14 wins, 57 top-three finishes from 117 starts, and nearly \$230,000 in career earnings.

"I have taken care of him for about the past four years and I love him for no other reason than I think he is the most handsome horse," she said. "I love any chance to be around him."

That love extends to working alongside her husband.

"It is something very special," Natalie said. "We get along so well and work well together."

Still, most of their time at the racetrack is spent apart.

"I don't actually see too much of Nick because he is on the track most of the night," she said. "So, it might be me running up to him between races and seeing if he wants to change any equipment – that sort of thing."

For Natalie, it's the car rides to and from the track that are most meaningful.

It's a chance to chat about everything from the race night ahead to their lives outside of the hustle and bustle tied to the standardbred world.

"I appreciate those moments because we are both busy and it's hard to find time to be together," Natalie said. "Car rides — which might be annoying for most people — are perfect for us. Sometimes we listen to music or an audio book. It doesn't matter whether it's one of those things or just having a conversation — we enjoy those times."

Once they arrive at the track — whether it's their home base of Plainridge or somewhere farther afield — it's all business for the couple who call Falmouth, ME, home.

Both are focused and meticulous when it comes to race prep.

"In the beginning, I would be worried that I didn't do something right," Natalie said. "Before you are truly confident in what you are doing, I think it's natural that you are nervous. When you start to understand things more and have that level of comfort, you don't think about making a mistake. You just trust yourself that you can do it the way it needs to be done."

That trust is shared by others as well.

"Our barn horses stay the same — we don't shuffle them around very often — but I paddock for others, who give me their horses on a regular basis," she said. "It's great to learn about their horses and form relationships with the ones who have never raced at Plainridge before. Some of the horses are coming from Yonkers and other tracks, so it's fun to be able to figure out their quirks, what they wear — all those different things."

Outside the racing world, Natalie and Nick enjoy the outdoors whenever they get the chance.

Although there isn't typically time to take full advantage of everything that nature offers, Natalie is grateful for the time that is always well spent.

"Nick and I enjoy hiking – we have land up north that we like to go visit," she said. "We also like working in our yard and garden, stuff like that. We're lucky that we do get the chance to do things we love, even if we are busy."

Family time is also a top priority.

"Spending time together is the most important thing in life," Natalie said. "Family is also a big thing for us, so we try to get together with everyone as much as we can too."

For Natalie, fulfillment in racing goes far beyond the winner's circle.

"We all want to be successful, but if someone told me that we had a successful year, it would mean that we, along with the horses, are happy and healthy," she said.

Natalie thinks often about the path that brought her to the races and from the grandstand to the paddock.

She often reflects on how her path led her from watching races to working behind the scenes – and she wouldn't change a thing.

"I wouldn't trade any of it," she said. "I have met so many great people – like [trainer] Aaron Hall's wife, Josie, has been my best friend for 10 years. And I have also been around so many wonderful horses. I feel so lucky and blessed to be part of it all."

## Tough setback for First Turn Stable

It's hard to believe that two months have already passed since First Turn Stable launched the 2025 campaign with Robertsgladerunner. As I documented last year when I first joined the fractional ownership group, the experience ran the gamut of both expected and unexpected outcomes. This time around it is no different, and recently the stable had to make a difficult decision. More on that later.

In my last update, Robertsgladerunner had just made his debut for the stable. Racing out of the Patrizio Ancora barn, the 9-year-old gelding finished seventh at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Following that April 4 outing, "Bob" lined up behind the gate six more times, racing every Friday night through April and halfway into May. The results were mixed. After finishing out of the money in his debut, the gelding earned checks for four straight weeks. He managed to race fifth each time out before hitting the board on May 2, pacing third in an \$8,000 claimer. It wasn't spectacular, but he was earning.

That string of consistency came to a screeching halt the next time out. I didn't observe Bob's next effort as a railbird at Hoosier Park, but instead at home on RTN. It was a particularly exciting evening as family friends from the African country of Zambia were guests in our home. They were aware of my activities within the industry. In previous visits, I had introduced the husband, Mukuka, to harness racing. We had talked in depth about the industry; the breeding, yearling sales and racing. I had even taken him to visit a farm near Fort Wayne, and together we attended a pony auction. He was thrilled to get an up-close view of equines, as he explained back home it is a rarity to see livestock of any kind. Usually, those experiences are limited to exhibitions.

Although we had talked about the various aspects of the business, they had not witnessed harness racing. On the night of May 9, we sat down to dinner and watched the opening races from Hoosier Park. Robertsgladerunner was in the fourth race that night, drawing post 3 in a field of 10. He was sent off as the second choice in the \$8,500 claiming handicap.

As the gate folded, I provided commentary. Bob had gotten away second. A great place to sit and bide his time until the stretch. But he didn't sit. Following a :26.1 opening panel, driver Mike Oosting abandoned the pocket and moved to the lead as the

field raced to the half. Looking over Robertsgladerunner 2025 lines, he was accustomed to being forwardly placed at times, but not on the engine. He had also given up more positions in the lane than he had gained. Seeing him on the lead felt awkward and I remarked that he would need to have something left for the stretch. He didn't. We watched as he backed through the field with a :29.2 last quarter — the slowest in the field — and finished ninth.

The summary email to First Turn Stable members the next day was titled "Early speed duel gets the best of Robertsgladerunner." Within the update, Ancora and his wife, Rebecca, provided their perspective on the race.

"Unfortunately, that wasn't the ideal trip we were looking for last night," they said in the email. "We felt like it was a bit overly aggressive, the additional move to the lead up the backstretch, with as quick as they were going, was just too much. We were happy with Bob; he raced well was just put in an unfortunate position. We will draw a line through this week and move on."

Moving on, however, has proven difficult. Racing May 16 over a sloppy track, Robertsgladerunner finished well off the pace. Drawing the outside post, Oosting looked for a spot near the front and settled in second on the way to a :56 opening half.

But Friday's announcement [of the retirement of First Turn Stable's Robertsgladerunner] also leaves the stable in search of a new horse. Last year, the struggle of claiming a horse dragged on for weeks and abruptly brought the experience to an end. Hopefully, we can claim one soon and get back in the game. While I didn't expect this outcome in my second fractional ownership experience, it again highlights the many different ways that things can go wrong in racing.

Along the pylons turning for home, the gelding faded with a :31.4 last quarter to finish last in the 10-horse field.

"We were pretty disappointed in how things went on Friday night," Patrizio and Rebecca said in the next stable update, "After such a tough trip in his last start, we were hoping for something a little more conservative on Friday that would allow Bob to finish the mile with pace, and that just isn't how things worked out unfortunately. We are going to give Bob a much-needed week off and regroup before we try again."

That was the last time Robertsgladerunner will see the starting gate. After the week off, Ancora entered him in a \$5,000 claimer May 29. He would be scratched out of the contest. Below is part of the comment from the Ancoras that came with the notification of the scratch.

"He trained on Tuesday, and unfortunately came up a little sore in his left hind. We had the vet go over him and think that it is

likely just an infection that is causing it to be irritated. We are treating it with some antibiotics and expect it to be resolved within a few days. If it doesn't, we will scan him, but the vet thinks that is likely all it is. We will give him some R&R and hope to have him back on track soon!"

Despite the initial optimism, the notice sent to First Turn Stable members on Friday (June 7) painted a much different picture. Earlier in the week I had checked the entries for the weekend. Bob had not been dropped in the box Tuesday for Friday's card, and his name could not be found among Saturday's entries. I suspected perhaps another week of rest was needed. Friday's update provided the cold hard reality of the situation. Writing to the group, Jacob Rheinheimer, Hoosier Park's race marketing manager, laid out the facts.

"As many of you know, he has missed the last few weeks on the racetrack while dealing with a nagging left hind injury," Rheinheimer said. "While initially, we were hoping this was nothing more than a minor infection, it was discovered that Bob has suffered a partial tear in his tendon in the left rear. This is an injury that Robertsgladerunner could in theory return to the track from, but after discussion with Rebecca and Patrizio, we decided that we would like to retire Bob at this time, and ensure he goes to a good home where he can spend a happy and long life."

As Rheinheimer explained, First Turn Stable has done this twice before with stable horses. Robertsgladerunner will be donated to New Vocations and transition to the next chapter of his life away from the track. Great news for him, and it's good to know he will live out his days with a family that cares for him.

But Friday's announcement also leaves the stable in search of a new horse. Last year, the struggle of claiming a horse dragged on for weeks and abruptly brought the experience to an end. Hopefully, we can claim one soon and get back in the game. While I didn't expect this outcome in my second fractional ownership experience, it again highlights the many different ways that things can go wrong in racing. Right now, First Turn Stable is in need of some racing luck. Fingers crossed we get it.

"Naw," his friend says, "I'm not betting today. I'll just send 'em a check."

The joke is perfect in that it represents the loser consciousness for betting standardbreds and thoroughbreds and quarter horses and steeplechasers and greyhounds as well as jai alai. This common negative perception of a horseplayer is based on reality and countless studies about how badly bettors mismanage their betting bucks. Few adhere to Aristotle's statement asserting the existence or the truth: "The purpose of knowledge is action; not knowledge."The 1990s American Turf Monthly (ATM) active handicappers/bettors' survey results are — so to speak — as bankable in the 2020s as ever.The excuses for losing money by most players are always unacceptable. Some call betting "casual fun" and excuse losses as meaningless. Or they admit to accepting the fickle assistance of luck for the dismal outcomes of their handicapping and betting skills. Still others aggrandize excuses when those skills fail.

On the other hand, a winning wager always prompts self-praise. The act of cashing a ticket causes the Andy Beyer response: shouting "I am king of the world!"


Winning or losing bets, more than anything, relies upon money management which rules when not to bet as well as when and how much to bet. The wisdom speaks: It is not how many tickets you cash; it matters how much the tickets you cash are worth. Along with the necessary practices of maintaining a betting bankroll come the fixed ideas players admitted to in the ATM survey.

Examples of poor money management were abundant in responses to the following questions from across the USA.:

- 1. Do you have a dedicated bankroll?
- 2. Do you focus on specific wagers?

- 3. Are you following any type of betting system?
- 4. Do you feel you have to show a profit regularly?
- 5. Do you keep records of your wagers, and how do you utilize them in reference to wagers?
- 6. What do you do with profits?
- 7. Do you have a wagering threshold?

All answers incorporated many questions. Some respected using X amount of dollars for wagering.

Chet from Minnesota said, "At the start of my [betting] season I set aside a certain amount [to play only] win and exotic bets."

The majority of answers made no claims to using a set bankroll.

Charles from Ohio said he wagered "with disposable income," and making a profit "is not life and death with me [because] I'm doing something I love."

Sam from Washington said he does not have any wagering system.

"I increase bets when I have an edge," Sam said.

Ron from New York was like many who said that they broke it down to betting certain amounts with conditions.

"I bet to win," Ron said, "and make 50-per cent increases on 'standout horses' with exceptional value."

Doris from Nevada said she took \$200 per track visit to bet and, "If I had unlimited funds, I don't feel I would ever bet \$100 to win; I would increase my number of trifecta bets." A few respondents found it necessary to explain how they felt about the questions in general and with defensive commentaries.

Vera from Arkansas said, "I feel if I were willing to wager more than I do, I might win more but it would never be enough to make much of a difference in my life."

And Riley from New York said he had no betting threshold or set bankroll because, "I instantly know the way to make money is to have money to work with in the first place. All my betting friends make good bucks because they can bet more combinations and believe you me, they win!"

Lee from California said, "More money [to bet] would not change the way I bet."

Some people sent me personal letters after survey results were published. Horseplayers love to talk about their ways and means. It is the nature of the beast.

"I give all my winnings to my children," one person said while another made the statement, "Money is only a tool."

One personal letter added a unique observation. He said he always read my ATM column and also enjoyed Mark Cramer's books about horseplayers and betting. He ended the letter with a P.S. "Are you the character 'Nick' in Cramer's book Scared Money?

Yes. Nick was based upon me.

I often wondered if this guy was as good at identifying the true odds value of a racehorse in any particular field as he was recognizing the inspiration for a fictional character in a novel then he would be one of the definitive horserace handicappers in history.









# Extended viability — a larger floor

What new models could be feasible if our sport faces downsizing, decoupling, defunding, or disappointment? The answer to that question depends on the participant's point of view.

For folks in my corner of the harness racing world, nothing matters except sires stakes racing. We do not care a whit about national racing, international racing, overnight racing, older horse racing, winter racing, ostrich racing, thoroughbred racing, or claiming racing. Thoughts of buying a yearling that turns into a grand champion are fleeting. Our immediate consideration is a code red situation where we buy, stake, and pay to train a horse that does not give a penny of ROI or an ounce of FUN.

We realize ours is a risky game, and state racing programs cannot guarantee that our yearling will qualify for racing or make money. However, state racing programs can increase our chances of not having a total fiscal disaster. A state program can improve our odds of having fun with this yearling. Allow me to make up some numbers as a stalking horse for this concept.

In 2026, a state racing program has a foal crop of 3,000. In 2028, 2,000 yearlings go to market from this state crop. In 2029, 1,000 2-year-old horses from this crop qualify. In 2029, approximately 330 will be the same sex and gait of competitors as my 2-year-old. These horses will be my racing universe. At the end of the 2029 racing season, from this crop of yearlings, about one quarter earn money, one quarter pay expenses, one quarter earn little, and one quarter earn nothing.

The "earn little" and "earn nothing" categories are the focus of this proposed restructuring. Young, marginal racehorses deserve a longer run, and the owners of these horses should be in a situation where they can have some enjoyment. Here is the crux of my madness. The state programs should swap out races for older horses and write abundant races for state-eligible young horses that currently fail to make the racing grade.

In my opinion, a 7-year-old warhorse, bless his heart, with 93 starts and earnings of \$157,000, should never race if a customer in this state program owns a young state-bred horse that has never won a race, never broken two minutes, with lifetime earnings of under \$1,000. Any horse that squeezes under the wire in a qualifying time should have several competitive racing situations. The qualifying times could be adjusted to allow more horses and owners to participate.

Does this mean there will be races for young state-bred horses that are, for some minds, dreadful slowpokes? Absolutely. But relativity is always helpful. A trotting horse that could cover a mile in 2:07 was world-class 50 years ago. To my mind, this type of racehorse is still a marvel. To underline my strange theory, these slow state horses should have opportunities through age 4. Sacrifices will be necessary to make way for the younger, slower local racehorses. Older horses will be squeezed or eliminated.

If our future is to ride the state-based racing format into the sunset in harness racing, why not go all out and reward more participants fiscally and entertainment-wise? The genuinely great horses will be fine. Paint a brighter picture for possible customers where the odds of having fun and earning money are improved.

If a state racing program requires 20,000 races per year, the speed of the races is not a factor, nor is the age or talent level. States do not need warhorses racing instead of state-bred horses owned by owners who wish to play the local game.

Reallocate purse money from culled older horses. Create a fun, competitive sphere (in addition to fairs) for the tweeners, the stragglers, and the strugglers. Do we continue to bid adieu to trotters in the 2:05 to 2:09 range and pacers in the 2:01 to 2:06 range, or do we purposefully create a playing space for them?

Nobody with these slower performers will make notable money, and some people will be reluctant to drop to the fair or the new lower racing classifications. These feelings are understandable; every owner wants to play in the majors because there is little money in the low minor leagues. But today, if you do not wish to continue with this marginal racehorse, you can send a 2:07 trotter to the online marketplace for new owners willing to race these horses. Young people, hobbyists, and wannabe trainers

can pick up a horse of this type and get some experience and competition.

One of the reasons for suggesting this expanded playing field for young local horses and cycling out older horses is the future. Racing likely will contract, and we will become more of a niche sport, probably more of a local sport. When we need a restart, racing in the manner suggested above may make an easier transition. Customers will not need to purchase horses that race miles at record speeds. The sport may not be as cutthroat. Harness racing future participants may love the game and want to play. If they do, we should nurture every customer and give them every chance to defray the costs and increase enjoyment.

Let me conclude by giving a concrete example. A few years ago, a fellow purchased a \$15,000 yearling. The purchase, the training, and the staking were a fiscal stretch for him. His excitement level building to the race season was high. Seeing the trotter barely qualify on the third attempt was thrilling. At this point,

the trotter struggled. The odds were long this trotter would ever race a mile in two minutes. No purse money came in, but the bills kept coming. This story is as old as horse racing.

The result was an unsatisfied customer. There was no blame. This horse had no future in the current racing world. Due to the lack of ability to go three or four seconds faster in a one-mile race, this person had a bad experience. Those three seconds made all the difference for this horse and dozens in the same boat. The customer did not come back.

If somehow, somewhere, someway, the chance to compete against similar young horses, earn some money to defray bills, and have some enjoyment, the owner would still be in the game.

Once a week, throughout the Mohawk racing season, Woodbine will profile a horse who has had a life-changing impact on one of their closest connections.

This week, Mohawk's leading trainer in 2024, Anthony Beaton, and the horse whose impact both on and off the track has been vital to his program's success, Better Single.

After a prosperous racing career of her own, the now retired pacer continues to open doors for the astute horseman who took a chance on her as a \$17,000 yearling eight years ago.

# You've trained plenty of standout horses over your career. What is it that makes Better Single particularly special?

"She was the first baby that I bought when I went on my own with my racing partner. She went on to win multiple [Ontario Sires Stakes] Gold races and ended up making over \$300,000 for us."



### What was your first impression of her?

"I went to the 2017 London [Selected Yearling] Sale wanting to get a Betterthancheddar filly for myself because I dealt with 'Cheddar' quite a bit over the years. This filly ended up fitting the bill and price range I had in mind.

"She stood correct, had solid size and a bit of everything that we were looking for, so we went ahead and purchased her, and I can say, things snowballed from there. We were able to buy more babies the next year... onward and upward."

## What do you recall from her most impressive win?

"That first Gold was exciting, but it was a little short-lived because a horse went down at the head of the stretch that night. Fortunately, nobody got seriously hurt. We weren't involved in it or anything, and we were happy to win, but were also hoping that the other horse was going to be alright, too.

"It was very nice to get that first Gold win with that first baby I bought when I started my own stable.

"That said, I think the most exciting race was the second Gold we won that September. I had a lot of family in the crowd at Mohawk that night — if I recall correctly, they were up for my sister's birthday — and sure enough Better Single won that night.

"She won a third Gold that year right before the Super Final. That was the first night Louis-Philippe Roy drove and she came from another time zone to get up and win. I didn't know what was up with her, she fell so far behind — maybe she fell asleep — but all of a sudden, she kicked in gear and was flying on the outside to get up to win.

"Every one of those wins were amazing. That was a fun year, and it gave us lots to look forward to the next year."

#### Three words to describe her?

"Laid-back. Driven. Loyal."

### How has she changed your life?

"She gave us some extra funds so we could go to these sales and purchase some more horses along the way. We were a little more comfortable buying other horses after the time she spent with us. The next horses that she bought, we did well with some of them, too.

"She's that one that got the ball rolling and she's still loyal to us because we kept her to be a broodmare. Our first foal last year, Wicked N Single, made close to \$200,000. She's the gift that keeps on giving."

My Debt Collector and Best Story Ever battled all the way down the stretch. My Debt Collector pulled ahead and won in 1:57.1. Best Story Ever went on a break just before the wire and was second but placed third. Pink Chou Chou (Jeff Gregory) was third but placed second.

My Debt Collector is a 3-year-old filly by Chapter Seven, trained by R. Nifty Norman for owners Little E LLC, David McDuffee, and Melvin Hartman. It was her fourth win this season and she now has seven career victories.

**Seventh Gen** (Jeff Gregory) went from last-to-first to win the \$58,000 second division of the NYSS.

Royal Mission (Braxten Boyd) led to the first quarter in :27.2. Chapvious (Frank Affrunti) came first-up to challenge as they headed to the half. Royal Mission was first to the half in :56 and Sonmar Pond (Wally Hennessey) was the next to challenge. Royal Mission had a short lead to three-quarters in 1:25, and as they reached the stretch, eventual second place finisher, Pink Bomb (Tyler Buter) took control. Seventh Gen (\$20.40) came flying down the stretch like she was shot out of cannon and won in a lifetime best of 1:55. Royal Mission had to settle for third.

Seventh Gen is a 3-year-old filly by Chapter Seven, owned by Jesmeral Stable and trainer Jeff Gregory. She won for the first time this season, and now has five career victories.

Braxten Boyd had a driving grand slam, while Jeff Cullipher had a training double.

## Good As You, Asphalt win PASS events at The Meadows

Pennsylvania Sire Stake action returned to Hollywood Casino at The Meadows Saturday (June 7) with 3-year-old fillies taking center stage. With a supporting cast of six Stallion Series divisions; two divisions of the Adios Betty stakes would each feature returning 2-year-old stars, as well as a couple of young starlets, each vying for the role of PA's 2025 leading lady.

Fresh off a win in a maiden claiming event and sent off at odds of 6-1, **Good As You** and driver Andrew McCarthy sprung a mild upset in the first quarter of the PASS Adios Betty division.

"Going out of there from the rail, I was looking for someone to follow and avoid being first over," McCarthy said.

Trainer Trent Stohler shares ownership and breeding credit with Benjamin Grabor of the Papi Rob Hanover filly. Today's victory not only was a lifetime best, but nearly tripled her lifetime earnings.

"Very powerful attitude that translates into her racing," is how Jack Pelling, fresh off his first stakes win at The Meadows, described his sophomore filly following the victory. After **Asphalt** kept her perfect season intact by taking the fastest division of the PASS Adios Betty. Driving for trainer Brett Pelling, Jack Pelling's aggressive handling early put the daughter of Papi Rob Hanover in a perfect spot. From there, the pair would follow pace setter Tie The Knot before popping out of the 2-hole at the three-quarter pole and pacing away to a two-length victory

over a fast-closing Papi Grad, making her seasonal debut. Now four-for-four this season, Asphalt's owned by Margaret Dey of New Jersey.

**Time Of The Season** and Aaron Merriman used the combination of a backside bull rush and a :27 final quarter for a three-length victory in her Stallion Series division. Tim Twaddle trains the 3-year-old filly, today's fastest Stallion Series winner by Bettor's Wish for owner/breeder Birnam Wood Farms.

The Linda Ronstadt hit song "It's so easy" summed up the performance for her sophomore namesake. **Ronstadt's**:27 last quarter made her a three-length widening winner in a 1:51.4 lifetime best. Trained by Tony Alagna, the Brittany Farm, Marvin Katz owned homebred was driven to victory by Chris Page.

**Karma** and Ronnie Wrenn, Jr secured themselves a pocket trip and from there took advantage of early and constant pressure on the leader to earn a Stallion Series win. Trained by Ron Burke for owners Thomas and Scott Dillion, Karma's mile of 1:51.4, her first of 2025, is a lifetime best for the daughter of Tall Dark Stranger.

**Sammy Jo Hanover** and Chris Page would move uncovered from third and hold off a late challenge for a 1:52 upset

victory in their division. Sent off at odds of 10-1 in her third of three seasonal starts Sammy Jo Hanover is trained by Scott Di Domenico for owners Oompa Farms and Joseph Barbere. Last season, the Captaintreacherous filly bankrolled over \$120,000 for her connections.

**Always Dawn** and Aaron Merriman took full advantage of some late afternoon hardball for a lifetime best victory in 1:52.2. Owned by Leo Fleming and trained by Anthony Beaton, it was the first victory of the year for the Always B Miki offspring.

Local trainer Sarah Andrews conditioned **Fancy Like Louuuu** to victory in her Stallion Series event. Aaron Merriman put the Sweet Lou daughter in play first up, resulting in a lifetime best 1:52 effort for Sandbur Farms and part owner/trainer Andrews.

Aaron Merriman's four wins, including two Stallion Series victories, not only made him the day's winning driver but vaulted him into a three-way tie for week honors with Dave Palone and Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.

On the training side, 13 different trainers were victorious, Dirk Simpson stood alone as the only trainer to double up on Saturday. For the week, Ron Burke's five winners were tops among local trainers.

Chris Gooden Asphalt (Jack Pelling) won the other division in 1:50.





# Virgil Morgan, Jr. sweeps Ohio Sires Stakes for 3-year-old filly pacers at MGM Northfield Park

Trainer Virgil Morgan conditioned **Odds On Chesapeake** and **Odds On Hialeah** to dominant victories in their respective \$65,000 Ohio Sires Stakes divisions and they stamped themselves at the top of the 3-year-old filly pacing ranks on Saturday (June 7) at MGM Northfield Park.

While both won impressively, it was Odds On Chesapeake who put together the fastest performance with a 1:50 victory, just two fifths off both world and track records for 3-year-old filly pacers.

In the first division, My Hare Legend (Chris Page) and Skywalker Sea (Austin Hanners) both left alertly jostling for position into the initial turn, while Odds On Chesapeake (Dan Noble) floated away in third.

Heading into the backstretch for the first time, Skywalker Sea was able to clear rivals, and opened a four-length lead through a :27 opening quarter.

Hanners tried to get a breather in the second panel, but Skywalker Sea arrived at the half in :55.3, and then heavy-favorite Odds On Chesapeake began her rally.

The pair dueled through much of the final half, arriving at three-quarters in 1:22.4 with neither filly giving way.

Turning into the stretch, Odds On Chesapeake was able to work past Skywalker Sea winning by 1¼ lengths. Skywalker Sea after a valiant effort was second, with My Hare Legend (Chris Page) finishing third.

"The track was lightning-fast tonight, she got over it really well," said an enthusiastic Noble. "The track has really come back to life."

Ohio Sires Stakes champion, Odds On Hialeah, continued her comeback to the races on Saturday night with a gate-to-wire victory in the second \$65,000 division.

Odds On Hialeah (Brett Miller) was put into play early making the front from the rail into the first turn. She got down to the opening quarter in a testing :26.4 with the field in straight alignment entering the far turn for the first time.

Miller got a big-time breather in the second quarter, getting to the half in a leisurely :55.4.

Entering the backstretch, Miller stepped on the gas with Odds On Hialeah opening up a two-length lead at threequarters in 1:24.2.

Turning for home, Odds On Hialeah faced no pressure, and cruised home to a 1¼ length win in 1:51.2. Rose Run Aimee (Dan Noble) was second, while Guard The Fire (Jordan Stratton) rallied to be third.

### JAILHOUSE PEARL, AUNT LAURA SCORE IN OHIO SIRES STAKES ACTION AT MGM NORTHFIELD PARK

The \$65,000 divisional winners of the Ohio Sires Stakes for 3-year-old filly trotters won in different fashion on Saturday (June 7) at MGM Northfield Park with Jailhouse Pearl rallying from off-the-pace and Aunt Laura scoring in gate-to-wire fashion.

In the first division, there was a wild three-wide scramble into the first turn while Mega Money (Aaron Merriman), Wild As You (Tyler Smith), and R Maggie (Chris Lems) battled for position.

The race, however, was turned on its head early as heavy-favorite Mega Money, who had left alertly from post 2, made a break, allowing Wild As You to inherit the lead.

R Maggie drove on past Wild As You through a :28.2 first quarter.

Lems was able to rate R Maggie in the second quarter to just :30, but then the outer flow began to come together as Jailhouse Pearl (Dan Noble) made a first-over bid for the lead.

R Maggie was able to continue to hold off rivals, but at the three-quarter pole (1:26.3), Jailhouse Pearl began to bear down on the leader entering the far turn.

As Jailhouse Pearl continued to get closer to the leader, Lems asked R Maggie for more, but through the stretch Jailhouse Pearl proved to be too good, scoring an upset in 1:54.4.

R Maggie was a game second, with Wild As You taking advantage of the miscue by Chrome Trim in the stretch to be third.

Bred by owner Casey Clemens of Malta, OH, the 3-year-old filly by Long Tom pushed her career earnings to \$104,627.

In the second division, 2024 Ohio Sires Stakes freshman champion, Aunt Laura, made short work of her foes winning in front end fashion.

Dream Something (Tyler Smith) tried to defend the pylon position when she left aggressively from the rail heading into the first turn. Aunt Laura (Brett Miller) drove up outside of Dream Something and was able to power past entering the backstretch.

At the quarter in :27.3, Aunt Laura opened a 2½-length lead on her rivals.

Aunt Laura still had a 1½-length lead at the half in :56.1 and continued to cruise on the front end, but entering the clubhouse turn for the final time the field began to catch up to her.

Midway up the backstretch, Smith gave the green light to Dream Something who confronted Aunt Laura and the pair squared off past three-quarters in 1:25.3.

Dueling into the final turn, Aunt Laura stood her ground, digging in to fight off Dream Something winning by 1¼ lengths in 1:54. Rose Run Allison (Chris Page) was second and Dream Something was third.

"This filly got really good at the end of her 2-year-old season, it took us a few times to get her qualified this year, but once we got her straightened out, she's been winning ever since," said Miller. "Once a horse gets next to her, she knows it's time for business."

The homebred 3-year-old filly by Uncle Peter, owned by JoyceA McClelland Stb LLC now has career earnings of \$301,250.



# On to the big dance: Pepsi North America Cup elims in the books



Captain Optimistic, Lite Up The World, and Louprint roll into next Saturday's (June 14) prestigious \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup (Grade 1) at Woodbine Mohawk Park in top-tier form after winning their respective \$50,000 eliminations on Saturday evening (June 7).

If tonight's performances are any indication of what's to come on June 14, the 42nd edition of the premier event for 3-year-old pacers is shaping up to be a classic.

In the opening Cup elimination, Joel And The Jets jetted to the lead heading into the first turn, followed by Fast Choice, Swingtown and Avanti, while Captain Optimistic, sent on his way as the even-money choice, was last of eight early. Arriving at the opening panel in :26.1, Joel And The Jets then yielded the lead to Swingtown, who marched on after failing to find a spot along the pylons. The latter slowed the tempo and marched his rivals through a half in :56, but Captain Optimistic and pilot Dexter Dunn were on the move and making headway on the pacesetter.

On top by  $1\frac{1}{2}$  lengths after three quarters in 1:23.4, Swingtown gave way to Captain Optimistic, who struck front early in the stretch. Joel And The Jets found a seam along the inside and attempted to reel in the leader but finished three-quarters-of-a-length back at the wire. Swingtown held for third, while Fast Choice narrowly took fourth.

The final time was 1:50.2.

"I felt pretty confident going into the race," said trainer Nancy Takter, a two-time NA Cup winner (Captain Crunch in 2019 and Tall Dark Stranger in 2020). "He's had a really good week. Obviously, the tempo was kind of slow up to the half... and he had to come from far away. I was really happy with this performance tonight."

Third in last year's Metro Pace, Captain Optimistic is now two-for-three at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The son of Captaintreacherous won seven of his 11 2-year-old starts, along with a pair of seconds and a third, including a four-length romp in the Governor's Cup in November. The bay colt was second in his first start of 2025, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes division on May 25.

"He was running in a lot in the turns, and we were losing a lot of momentum in some of the big races," said Takter. "But he did put it together in the Governor's Cup, which was the last start of the year. So, I was really happy going into his 3-year-old season, that his last 2-year-old race was so great."

Captain Optimistic paid \$4.30 for tonight's win.

Owned by 3 Brothers Stables, Marvin Katz, and Caviart Farms, he was bred by Fair Winds Farm Inc.

In the second elimination, the fast-paced festivities unfolded a few strides after the starter car sped away.

Several hopefuls tussled over early bragging rights as Crack Shot, 3-5 choice Sippinonsearoc and outsider Sterling Choice slugged it out into the first turn and through an opening panel in :26.1.

But the fireworks were only starting.

Sippinonsearoc took aim at the front after the first quarter, as Fallout picked up the chase, while Madden Oaks went three-wide and powered to the lead ahead of the half in :53.2. Lite Up The World, with James MacDonald at the controls, watched the proceedings unfold from last of eight.

Madden Oaks held a tenuous lead heading into the turn for home, but Sippinonsearoc popped the pocket and held a slim advantage through three quarters in a brisk 1:21.1, setting up a compelling dash to the wire.

Lite Up The World, still sitting eighth straightening for the stretch drive, then began to meticulously pick off his rivals one-by-one en route to a 2½-length score in 1:48.3, punctuated by a final quarter in :26. Crack Shot dug in to finish second, while a game Madden Oaks hung on for third. Fallout was fourth.

"Last week, I thought I had a great horse, and I was just trying to do too much and put him in a bad spot, and didn't get the job done," said MacDonald, of a runner-up finish in the \$81,500 second Somebeachsomewhere division. "And then tonight, it was such a competitive elim.

"I thought there were five, six or seven horses that could win it, so I was trying to just float and come with cover and hopefully they mixed it up. And I floated, but they were all leaving. There was nowhere for me to go, and I had to take back. I knew, once he got rolling, he went by one and he just took off. So, it was a good feeling."

The bay son of American Ideal, bred by Steve Stewart, Paris, John Lengacher, and Minisink Farms, and owned by Mac and

Carol Nichol, is now 5-2-0 from eight starts, including a 2-1-0 mark in four 2024 starts.

Trained by Anthony Beaton, Lite Up The World paid \$18.30 for the victory.

In the third elimination, it was Louprint for the win.

Sent off as the 1-2 choice, the Ron Burke trainee came into his latest test fashioning a perfect three-for-three mark in his sophomore season.

He had to work late to keep his unbeaten string intact.

Prince Hal Hanover fired out to the early lead, followed by Dandy Ideal, Making History and Louprint, who sat fourth through a single file opening quarter in :27.

Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. then had Louprint on the move as the son of Sweet Lou responded with a quick turn of foot to grab control before the half in :55.3 and kept the momentum going through three quarters in 1:23.

It appeared the brown colt was well on his way to a comfortable score, but Prince Hal Hanover and Dandy Ideal both came calling late.

At the wire, Louprint emerged a head in front of Prince Hal Hanover, with Dandy Ideal in third. The latter survived an inquiry after taking what appeared to be an awkward step or two nearing the half.

"It was closer than I wanted it to be, but he had the ear plugs in and he was really strong finishing, so I was happy with him tonight," said Wrenn, Jr. "This horse is the best horse I've ever driven, and he's a great horse to drive. And you know, I'm just enjoying it."

Louprint won the Dan Patch Award last season as the top 2-year-old colt pacer. He took seven of 10 starts, posting notable victories in the Breeders Crown and Kentucky Sires Stakes final.

Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Phil Collura and Larry Karr, the homebred is 11-2-1 from 14 lifetime starts.

Louprint paid \$3 for his latest success.

The top three finishers from each elimination, plus one fourthplace finisher, Fast Choice, who was drawn by lot, will contest the NA Cup final.

The post-position draw will take place on Monday (June 9) at Woodbine Mohawk Park beginning at 5 p.m.



# Chantilly charms, Miki And Minnie motors in Fan Hanover eliminations

Both star fillies, **Chantilly** and **Miki And Minnie**, excelled over the Woodbine Mohawk Park surface in their respective \$35,000 Fan Hanover eliminations on Saturday night (June 7).

Chantilly maintained her unbeaten record with a 1:50.1 stroll in the second of two Fan Hanover eliminations.

Leaving from the pylon post, driver James MacDonald settled in fourth while The Last Martini marched to lead into a :28.2 first quarter with Rodeo Drive Deo pressing outside. Rodeo Drive Deo suddenly broke stride entering the backstretch, and as she came back on-stride MacDonald launched off the pegs to brush Chantilly to the front. Chantilly took over the lead to a :56 half and cruised through the last turn, clicking past three-quarters in 1:24. MacDonald stayed poised in the sulky as the daughter of Big Jim sprinted for the finish to win handily by five lengths. The Last Martini held second while Westwinds soared from last for third, Wickedpace held fourth and Rodeo Drive Deo faded from a wide trip in fifth.

"I just tried to let her float out and feel her way into the race," MacDonald said after the race. "Dougie [McNair] made front easy, but when [Dave Miller's] horse made a break and the quarter was soft, it was a pretty easy decision to flip her to the lead and let her float along."

Undefeated from 12 starts and trained by Nick Gallucci, Chantilly has now earned \$915,256 for owner/breeder Millar Farms. The filly, who paid \$2.80 to win, deferred into the Fan Hanover after talks of tackling the boys in the Pepsi North America Cup, which was a difficult decision for owner George Millar.

"It was tough, I mean, talk to my wife – she's still calling me a chicken for not putting her in," George Millar said after the race with a laugh. "I just want to try and do what's best for the horse. I wish there were maybe one or two more races under her belt so I could've made a better decision. It's a long



season and she's got a lot of races and money to go for, and sometimes if you just race a horse a little too hard you take the heart out of them. I didn't want to see us do that to her because she's a one-in-a-lifetime type horse. I think I made the right decision; my wife will say I never did but she's got to live with it."

Chantilly will join other Fan Hanover elimination winner Miki And Minnie, last season's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace champion, in next week's final.

MacDonald after Chantilly's win in the elimination said, "She always wraps herself up pretty good, but next week will be a different story. I don't think anyone will be winning wrapped up. You got a pretty good masterclass on what makes Dexter [Dunn] so great after the trip he gave Miki And Minnie today. Just a perfect elimination going in, and I really look forward to the matchup."

In the other Fan Hanover elimination, odds-on chalk Miki And Minnie uncorked an effortless sprint down the center of the track to claim the first elimination of the Fan Hanover in 1:50.2.

Driver Dunn landed in fourth with Miki And Minnie as pylon-starter Outtathisworld Deo hustled forward for the lead and Thebeautifulthings crossed over from the outermost post for the pocket. Outtathisworld Deo clocked the first quarter in :26.2 and hit the brakes entering the backstretch, prompting Cant See Me to pull from third and brush for the lead. Cant See Me cleared control into a :56.2 half while Dunn waited to make his move.

Dunn managed to flush cover from Thebeautifulthings into the final turn and rolled forward as that tow came toe-to-toe with Cant See Me heading to three-quarters in 1:24.3. Upon straightening, Dunn fanned Miki And Minnie off a helmet and glided past the competition under no encouragement to storm home a 1½-length winner over Cant See Me. Thebeautifulthings held third from a fast-closing Perfectly Chic while Outtathisworld Deo faded to fifth.

"Last year, she just kept getting better as the season went on," Dunn said after the race. "She got turned out and she's really filled out and come back stronger this year. I'm happy with the way she's started the season. She felt great. The middle two quarters were pretty sedate, but we were close enough and she's versatile; she can grind it out the hard way or show a turn of foot. It makes my job easy with her and she knows where that finish line is, that's for sure."

A daughter of Always B Miki trained by Chris Ryder, Miki And Minnie remained unbeaten from two starts this season while collecting her eighth win from 13 starts overall, good for \$1,188,822 in earnings for owner/breeders Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo and Lawrence Minowitz. Sent off as the 1-9 favorite, Miki And Minnie paid \$2.10 to win.

Even-money favorite **Dial Square S** zipped off the pegs, waited on a helmet and lunged forward in the stretch to open the afternoon session with a win in the first Armbro Flight elimination, timed in 1:51.1.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt settled the 5-year-old daughter of Ready Cash into fourth out of post 5 as 40-1 shot Golden Rain S strutted to the top through a :26 first quarter. Svanstedt waited until just after a :55.1 half to edge off the cones, and he managed to catch cover midway around the last turn from pocket-popping M-M's Dream. Golden Rain S clung to a diminishing lead by three-quarters in 1:23.4 before caving to pressure in the lane. Dial Square S vaulted off the helmet of lateleader M-M's Dream mid-stretch to grab the lead and then held firm from a last-to-first rally by Emoji Hanover to win by three-quartersof-a-length in a lifetime-best mile. M-M's Dream settled for third with Nelsonbriteagle NO fourth and Golden Rain S well back in fifth.

#### Replay here.

"She was much better than last time," Ake Svanstedt said after the race. "Last time [in the Miss Versatility at The Meadowlands] she was pulling so hard. We made some changes and today she was nice to drive."

An import from Sweden for owners Stall Arsenal AB and Ake Svanstedt Inc., Dial Square S kept her unbeaten record in North America with her second win stateside. She's won four races from 15 starts and has now earned \$244,242. Before coming to the states, she had just two wins on her resume but around \$200,000 banked through her Swedish campaign.

"She was maybe top five in Sweden in the stakes races when she was 3 and 4," Svanstedt said. "She was a really good horse. She didn't win any races last year, but she raced good."

Dial Square S paid \$4.20 to win.

Willys Home Run hugged the pylons through most of the mile and barreled through traffic to snag a lifetime-best 1:51.1 victory at odds of 29-1 in the second Armbro Flight elimination.

Driver James MacDonald floated away sixth to a :26.2 first quarter carved by longshot Legacy Affair, who later relinquished control to pocket-popper Call Me Goo on the march to a :55.1 half. Bravo Angel S tipped first over out of third — carrying Drawn Impression and Elista Hanover on the rim — while Willys Home Run stayed steady third on the inside to three-quarters in 1:24. MacDonald angled

to the two path spinning for home and found a split mid-stretch to dart through and lay aim on weary leader Call Me Goo, as well as rallying Drawn Impression to the center of the track. Drawn Impression took the lead in the closing stages, but Willys Home Run surged with just enough momentum to put a nose in front on the beam. Call Me Goo, the defending Armbro Flight champion, finished third with Elista Hanover fourth and Bravo Angel S rounding out the finalists.

#### Replay here.

"She'd just been kind of struggling and I've given her some bad trips too," James MacDonald said after the race, "but she's always been able to sprint fast and today I was able to drive her conservatively. When she saw daylight, she just launched. I was just as surprised as you, not that she had a performance like that in her – but her form just hadn't been quite like how she'd been. Good to see her bounce back."

A 4-year-old daughter of Archangel trained by Kyle Fellows, Willys Home Run won her 11th race from 28 starts and has accrued \$980,516 for owners Dr. Sara Gatchell, Jake Higgs, Reg Higgs and N. Yolanda Fellows. She paid \$60.40 to win.

Longshot **Galen Erso** swept his peers from their feet with a pillar-to-post 1:53

lifetime-best win in the first Goodtimes elimination. Driver Doug McNair plugged out of post 3 to seize the lead to a :27.2 first quarter and cooled on the engine up the backstretch to a :57 half. As half the field tipped off the pylons to the final turn, McNair slammed the pedal to clock three-quarters in 1:24.4 and braved the swarming herd late to hold onto the win by a length. Landing On Time, the 3-5 favorite, kicked from third over for second while LMC Wagon Wheel blasted from near last for third. P L Spencer and Gap Kronos S took the remaining berths, finishing fourth and fifth, respectively.

#### Replay here.

"They kind of got away from him in a hurry, [I mean] he won the SBOA final with a tough trip," McNair said after the race. "Last week, the guys in front of us were going absolutely nowhere and he's not the type of horse you can jam up the whole way and expect him to sprint home in :26. I was expecting him to win, but I wasn't expecting him to be 30-1. I thought he did okay with these horses."

On his upset in the Goodtimes elimination, McNair said "He was a little aggressive getting out of there – this was the first time he's had the closed bridle on him this year. I figured one of the favorites, either Ake [driving Gap Kronos S] or James [driving Landing On Time], would've covered him up but they left him alone. I let him buzz the third quarter and he did the rest from there."

Gregg McNair trains Galen Erso, a sophomore colt by Green Manalishi S, for owner Brad Grant. The colt collected his fifth win from 11 starts and has now banked \$291,604 in earnings. He returned \$61.60 to win.

Heavy favorite **Emoticon Legacy** emerged victorious in his sophomore foray with a lifetime-best 1:52.1 victory in the second Goodtimes elimination. Planted into fourth by driver Louis-Philippe Roy, Emoticon Legacy sat behind a shuffle on the lead through early fractions of :28 and :56.3 before entering a first-over attack in the final turn. Roy caught brief cover from a late-pulling Fadeaway Hanover reaching three-quarters in 1:24.4 before unleashing Emoticon Legacy three wide for the stretch drive. Emoticon Legacy grabbed the lead in the lane while Roy kept him to task to win by 134 lengths over a game Eugene The Genius in second. Fadeaway Hanover held third with Blank snatching fourth and Wildturkey Hanover taking fifth.

"I didn't have much of a plan, but I was pretty confident in my horse," Roy said after the race.

"I just played it the way it was going to go and I was happy with the effort. All of Luc [Blais]'s horses — his 'A' team — have all been coming back good this year. They're all tight and ready to go, so I was confident with both this afternoon.

"Last year he actually changed so much over the summer that it was hard for me, sitting behind him, to know what kind of horse I was going to have. He started the season really hot, and then we tried managing to keep him quiet a little more and then he almost got too quiet. Right now, he seems like a nice racehorse. He's a little on the bit, but he's not stupid and he's not lazy either, so I think that's a big change for him this year. If he stays the same start after start, it's going to make our job way easier."

Blais trains Emoticon Legacy, a colt by Walner, for owner/breeder Determination. The colt won his fifth race from eight starts and has now banked \$235,637 in earnings. He paid \$2.30 to win.

Brett Miller orchestrated a perfect pocket trip with **Ken Hanover** behind hot fractions and powered past front-runner Desperate Man in the stretch to win Saturday's (June 7) \$200,000 (Grade 2) Battle of Lake Erie for older pacers at MGM Northfield Park in 1:48.3. It was the fourth Battle of Lake Erie victory for Miller, which ties Matt Kakaley for the most triumphs in race history.

Ken Hanover is the first horse trainer Roland Mallar has ever started at the Ohio track. He shares Ken Hanover's ownership with Patrick Leavitt. William Jordan and Dennis Osterholt.

Ken Hanover took the early lead and led the field to the quarter in :26.2. Shortly after, Kakaley powered Desperate Man to the lead and took the field through the half in :54.1 and the

three-quarters in 1:21 with Ken Hanover sitting pretty. In the stretch, Desperate Man tired slightly and Ken Hanover was able to sneak past to score a 1½ length victory. Dunkin' finished third. Favorite Mossdale Ben N was fourth. Helium N grabbed the final check. Ken Hanover paid 4.60.

The winner was previously driven by Miller's cousin, David Miller, who was racing in the Pepsi North America Cup eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday.

"I talked to my cousin David before the race and talked to Roland before the race and just talking to those two guys gave me a lot of confidence," Brett said. "When he got away in the 2-hole, I was feeling pretty good."

The win improved the 5-year-old son of Captaintreacherous—KJ's Justine to 3-0-1 in four starts in 2025. It was the Roland Mallar trainee's 16<sup>th</sup> lifetime win and improved his career bankroll to \$913,904. Last year, Ken Hanover had just one win in 12 starts and battled injuries.

"He's come back well and, knock on wood, hopefully the issues he had last year are behind him and we can continue on," Mallar said in the winner's circle.

Ken Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and was purchased by his current owners for \$50,000 at the 2021 Standardbred Horse Sale Company yearling auction.

# 'Ferrari' displays big speed in Big M feature

One week ago, **Ari Ferrari J** had no chance to catch Lexus Kody in the weekly feature at The Meadowlands, lacking room until very late after sitting a pocket trip.

This time around, driver Brett Beckwith left nothing to chance, putting the Tony Alagna trainee on the lead down the backstretch and lasting to the wire in the \$27,500 marquee event on the Friday night (June 6) program, a \$27,500 open handicap for trotters.

"I kind of just wanted to let him do his own thing," said Beckwith, who sits atop the driver standings at The Big M with 83 wins. "I thought that was the way the trip would go."

Southwind Coors, Sir Pinocchio, Ari Ferrari J and Outside The Fire were all in the first-turn scrum in the seven-horse field — likely favorite Periculum scratched — with Sir Pinocchio on the lead at the quarter while parked in :27.1.

Beckwith and Ari Ferrari J kept digging on the outside, and did not make the top until shortly before reaching the half in :55. Ari Ferrari J hit three-quarters in 1:23.1, and despite late rallies from Sir Pinocchio (who finished second) and Southwind Coors (third), held on to the wire for a safe 1½-length score in a lifetime-best 1:50.1.

Owned by Ken Jacobs, Ari Ferrari J, a 5-year-old son of Walner—Dream Child, returned \$3.20 to win as the 3-5 favorite. He now has 14 wins from 48 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$1,147,662.

# Sophomore colt pacers and trotters open second leg of BSS at Northfield

Five divisions featuring 41 3-year-old colt pacers will take to the MGM Northfield Park track tonight (June 8) followed by five divisions featuring 37 3-year-old colt trotters on Monday (June 9) in search of a win in the second leg of the Buckeye Stallions Series. A total of \$200,000 is on the line, with each division carrying a purse of \$20,000.

Six of the 10 divisions will feature winners from the first leg at Eldorado Scioto Downs on May 23-24.

The first division of colt pacers features opening-leg winners South Sea and Woodrow Blue Chip leaving side-by-side from posts 4 and 5, respectively. At 2-1, Woodrow Blue Chip enters as the slight favorite over second choice South Sea (3-1). Driven by Dan Noble for trainer Ryan Miller, Woodrow Blue Chip has hit the board in four of five starts in 2025 and is seeking his second seasonal win. His lifetime best of 1:52.3 came in the opening leg of the BSS. The Lather Up gelding is owned by Miller Racing Stable, Redracer LLC, Roger Miller, Jeff Bankey, and William Rufenacht. The Beau Brown-trained South Sea will be driven by Chris Page. The gelded son of Downbytheseaside has hit the board in four of five starts this season, posting two victories. Owned by David Wills and Robert Conley, his lifetime best of 1:52.1 came in the opening leg of the BSS.

First-leg winner Accuracy By Volume is the 5-2 second choice behind 2-1 favorite Believe In Tom in the second division. Believe In Tom has two wins in three starts this season. Trained by Steve Novak, the gelded son of Long Tom will be driven by Marc St. Louis, Jr. He is owned by Gerald Mijal. After recording a lifetime-best 1:54.1 in the opening leg, Accuracy By Volume will leave from the rail tonight seeking his second win in three seasonal starts. Driven by Page for trainer Scott Betts, the Lost In Time gelding is owned by Timothy Betts.

In the third division, Fabio Hanover is leaving from the far outside as the 2-1 favorite. The Virgil Morgan, Jr. trainee has two seconds and one third in three seasonal starts and will be driven by Noble. The Downbytheseaside gelding is owned by Douglas Overhiser, FAC Racing, and John Schwarz, Jr. At 5-2, Go Accordingly and Derby Up share the same morning-line odds for second choice.

Twin B High Tide is the 7-5 favorite in the fourth division with 5-2 second choice Johnny Smash. Driven by Austin Hanners for trainer Alicia Hanners, Twin B High Tide finished third in his lone prior start this season. The Downbytheseaside colt is owned by Hanners Racing.

At 3-1, House Of Brix enters as the favorite in the fifth division seeking his second seasonal victory after winning in a lifetime-best 1:52 in the opening leg of the BSS. Driven by Trevor Smith, the Jeff Smith trainee will leave from the far outside. The gelded son of Catch The Fire is owned by James Everhart and Kathy Smith. My First Fire (7-2) is the second choice.

First-leg winners Sippinonsearoc, Harrisburg Heist, Ohohoh Im On Fire, and Swingtown are not entered in the second leg. Sippinonsearoc and Swingtown were among the 23 3-year-old pacers that competed in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup elimination races at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday (June 7). Ohohoh Im On Fire was entered in Saturday's second leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes at MGM Northfield Park.

In the first of the five divisions of colt trotters, Smoke One For Me is the even-money favorite and will leave from post 3 alongside second choice Born To Trot (5-2) in post 4. Dan Noble is driving the Christi Noble-trained Smoke One For Me. The gelded son of Long Tom is seeking his second victory in seven starts this season. He is owned by Norman Rae Racing. Born To Trot won in the opening leg of the BSS in a lifetime-best 1:56 and is seeking his second victory in six seasonal starts. Chris Lems is tabbed to drive the Uncle Peter gelding for trainer Deborah Swartz, who co-owns the horse with Thomas Michael Adams.

Along Came Tom will leave from the rail as the 9-5 favorite in the second division. Noble is scheduled to drive the Swartz trainee, who has one win and one second in nine starts this year. The Long Tom gelding is owned by Swartz and Gail Impson. Tiny Tom is the 3-1 second choice.

In the third division, first-leg winner Rose Run Ari will leave from the far outside as the 2-1 second choice to 9-5 favorite Uncle Moneybags. Aaron Merriman will drive Uncle Moneybags for trainer Chris Beaver. The gelded son of Uncle Peter is seeking his first win in seven starts this season. He is owned by Beaver, Barry Carter, VIP Internet Stable, and Tim Homan. Driven by Austin Hanners for trainer Todd Luther, Rose Run Ari has two wins in five starts this season and posted a lifetime-best 1:55.1 in the opening leg. The Triumphant Caviar gelding is owned by Greg Luther Racing.

Power Hill enters as the 2-1 favorite with second choice Tom Cruiser (5-2) in the fourth division. Merriman is tabbed to drive the Mike Sowers-trained Power Hill, who is seeking his first win in four starts in 2025. The gelded son of What The Hill is owned by Michael Sowers.

In the fifth division, 8-5 favorite Divine Will leaves from the rail next to 3-1 second choice Full Moon Howl. Hanners will drive Divine Will for trainer Daren Harvey. The Enterprise gelding has two wins in six starts this season and is owned by Michael Soehnlen. First-leg winner Tommy Count is the 7-1 fourth choice with Sugg in the sulky for the Carter trainee. His win in the opening leg in a lifetime-best 1:56 is his lone victory in four starts this season. The Long Tom gelding is owned by Jeff Fought Racing, Adam Friedland, and Brian Carsey.

First-leg winners Jet Wings, I Stand Alone AS, and Vandy Lane are not entered in the second leg.

# Leading Big M driver Beckwith hoping to make history

For the last two years, Brett Beckwith has been one of a handful of drivers under the age of 30 to perform consistently at The Meadowlands. These "Young Guns" took advantage of the opportunity created by Big M regular "A-list" pilots taking vacations for part of or all of December, January, February and March.

The 22-year-old Beckwith, the 2024 Dan Patch Rising Star Award winner who finished third in the national driver dashwin race with 608 victories during the year, has seen things go exceedingly well during 2025 at The Big M.

His 79 wins currently have him sitting atop the driver standings at the mile oval, and Beckwith has opted to stay at The Big M rather than constantly spin on the Plainridge/Saratoga wheel, the routine that brought him great success during 2023-24.

"Things were and are going really well," said Beckwith, "and I was getting a good amount of drives and I kind of realized, if there was any chance of advancing my career to the next level, which is obviously what everyone wants, the only way that would happen is staying at The Meadowlands, where all of the top guys race, because when you race against the top guys and you race for the top trainers, you get much more noticed."

Beckwith, whose biggest career win to date came in a \$160,000 Massachusetts Sire Stakes final last year with his dad Mark's trainee, O'er The Ramparts, is looking to fry some bigger fish this season with Making History.

The 3-year-old son of American History—Mystery Game is in one of three eliminations for the C\$1-million North America Cup on Saturday (June 7) night and is being pointed toward the \$700,000 (est.) Meadowlands Pace.

"If you had asked me a year ago if I was going to be flying to Canada to race in the North America Cup, I would have laughed," said Beckwith. "The main connection with Making History was the ownership group, led by Myron Bell, were at my grandfather's [Jerry Silverman] funeral and Myron told my dad and my Uncle Richie [Silverman] that he was going to give me a 2-year-old to drive."

Making History made quite a splash when he won his career debut in a New Jersey Sire Stakes leg on May 3, gunning down 2-5 favorite Manolete at the wire. Since then, the horse finished third in leg 2 of the sire stakes before another third-place finish in the \$225,000 final.

"I qualified him twice at 2 and then he was turned out," said Beckwith. "He's come back at 3 and been pretty solid. Everything's been good. The race he won, that was his first lifetime start. To do that is unbelievably impressive, passing a pretty nice horse at the end of it."

Award winner, leading driver at The Meadowlands, a live Grand Circuit horse to drive; the trajectory of Beckwith's career is clearly going in the right direction.

"It's always great to win a lot of races and make the money I was making at 20 and 21 years of age, but once you get the wins and driving titles, your next step is to make more with less starts," said Beckwith. "When you get a little bit of a taste of driving good horses, it makes you want to continue to drive the good ones."

A little old-fashioned hard work never hurts, either.

"Luckily, my career has gone the way it has at an unbelievably fast pace," said Beckwith, who still does plenty of driving at other tracks, just not on Fridays and Saturdays when The Meadowlands races. "The one thing I will give myself credit for is there are very few people who end up outworking me. You can have as much talent as you want, but you are going to get nowhere with no work ethic."

There are still 50 race cards left on the 2025 calendar at The Meadowlands, but Beckwith, with a 21-winner lead on the current runner-up in the driver standings, Jason Bartlett, is the favorite to wear the Big M crown at season's end.

"If I told you it didn't cross my mind, I'd be lying," said Beckwith. "It's crazy to think that I could be the top dog at The Meadowlands. It's so meaningful. There's probably not a single guy who has won the driving title there that hasn't gone on to be unbelievably successful."

A bit of poetic justice saw Siegel the breeder and owner of **Waldon Fashion** (Todd McCarthy) who kicked off baby season quite impressively with a 1:58.3 win.

McCarthy let his colt spring from the wings and crossed over immediately, then released Grace In Heaven (Scott Zeron/Marcus Melander) who set a 30 beat throughout. As the field turned home, Waldon Fashion shifted out a path, engaged the leader and went by late on his own through the :27.2 final panel to take the record. Grace In Fashion held grimly but could not resist the winner's close.

The Walner colt is from Breeders Crown winner Broadway Donna who earned more than \$1.4 million for Fashion Farms. The fourth foal of the great mare, first Walner, he just might be the one they've been waiting for. Jimmy Campbell trains the winner.

Race 2 was a four-filly trot with all contestants being trained in the Melander barn. The winner here was the Courant, Inc Chapter Seven homebred **Nezuko Kamada S** (Zeron) who was quietly sat last throughout then rallied sharply through the inside for Zeron, like it was the Hambletonian, then drew clear in a :27.3 end while on her own for the 1:59.4 score. Isotta Bi (Brett Beckwith) had some late trot to be second.

The third was a Melander brothers exacta as Lainey W (Mattias Melander) rode a snug pocket while **Naachtun** (Marcus Melander) reeled off 30 second splits, then fanned off the back of that one and ground by late after a spirited :28.2 stretch duel for the 1:58.2 record.

The Bar Hopping filly was a \$125,000 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale (LEX) purchase by Brittany Farms and Marvin Katz from breeders Kentuckiana Farms and Perry Soderberg.

Melander Stable also sent out the winner of the fourth, an impressive Bar Hopping colt called **Neighver Punt** (Dexter Dunn) who set all of the fractions and ended the 1:59.1 mile in :27.4 to hold stablemate Chapel (Zeron) at bay by a half-length. Both colts finished strong under minimal encouragement.

Anders Strom's Courant, Inc owns the winner, a \$25,000 (LEX) bargain buy from breeder Brittany Farms.

**Diabolic Hill** (T. McCarthy) was a powerful winner of the fifth and last of today's freshman tests for owner Mazza Racing Stables and trainer Annie Stoebe. McCarthy took the colt off the gate and settled last of the four through the early stages as Exactly (Mattias Melander) set lively fractions while on a loose lead,

taking the field by a 1:29.2 three-quarters when Diabolic Hill rolled on by and drew clear in :27.1 to win as he pleased. Exactly held the place.

Mazza paid \$300,000 (LEX) to acquire this handsome Muscle Hill colt from breeder AM Bloodstock.

"That's the beauty of this competition as we save countless horses from a tragic ending and fulfill many lives in the process."
