Eli, Foiled Again, The "Captain" Highlight Big Night at Pocono

With so many big races and so many good horses on last night's card at Pocono Downs the list of those horses who had big nights is a long one. But three horses stood out from the crowd. Smilin Eli (Muscles Yankee) turned in a huge mile in the elims for the Beal and Captaintreacherous (Somebeachsomewhere) did it again, showing talent and tenacity as he won a Hempt elim. And just when you thought it couldn't get any better, golden oldie Foiled Again (Dragon Again) set a track record in the elims for the Ben Franklin.

Holloway in what turned out to be a two-horse race. Ms Caila J Fra figures to be up against it next week as the second elim went to I Luv The Nitelife (Rocknroll Hanover), who paid \$2.20. A winner of three straight, she's earned the right to be called the best 3-year-old pacing filly in the game, especially after she thrashed 2012 Dan Patch Award winner Somwhorvarainbow last night. The latter finished fourth. Nikki Beach woke up last night to finish second at 35-1.

Ms Caila J Fra (Western Ideal) got the night going when posting a mild upset in the first elim, winning by a head at 2-1. She defeated 4-5 favorite Shebestingin, crossing the wire in 1:49.3 Simon Allard drove the winner for Joe

Beal elims:

The Jimmy Takter-trainee Dontyouforgetit (Cantab Hall) won for the third straight time, getting to the wire a neck in front of Possessed Fashion in the first elim. Celebrity Maserati was sent off as the

7-5 favorite and finished third. The other big name in the race, Aperfectyankee, broke and finished last.

Takter came right back with another Beal winner as Corky (Muscles Yankee) took the second elim with Dave Miller in the bike. He won by a length and was the recipient of a perfect and lucky trip. He got to the front and was ready to be challenged by Royalty For Life when that one broke stride. That allowed him to get an unchallenged trip on the lead and coast home. After breaking, Royalty For Life dropped back to last, regrouped and made a courageous late rally to finish second. It was a terrific performance from the Breeders Crown 2012 runner-up.

But can anyone beat Smilin Eli? That will be the question next week when these trotters square off in the finals. The Deshawn Minor-trainee had a tough assignment last night. Not only did he draw the eight hole, but he landed in the toughest of the three elims, one that included the red hot Jurgen Hanover and Takter's tough 3-year-old High Bridge.

Driven by Tim Tetrick, he took control on the first turn, completed the half in 55.1, the three-quarters in 1:23.2 and won by a length in 1:52.3. The final margin did not do him justice as he was a very comfortable winner.

Jurgen Hanover finished fifth.

over Johnny Rock. With someone plunging on Lonewolf Currier to show, Emeritus Maximus paid \$19.20 to win and \$62.60 in the show spot.

Another favorite went down as Wake Up Peter finished fourth at 3-5 in the second elim for Ron Pierce and trainer Tony Alagna. That gave Takter another winner as he took the top spot with Sunfire Blue Chip (American Ideal), who was the third choice in the wagering.

But Captaintreacherous did not disappoint. Coming off a win in the North America Cup, he won by a neck over the upset-minded Vegas Vacation. The final time was 1:48.4.

Driven by Tetrick, the Captain took over on the first turn and led by 1 1/4 lengths heading for home. Vegas Vacation and Brian Sears took dead aim on him and it looked for a second like they had the race won, but Captaintreacherous dug in and held him off.

This seems to be an on-going pattern for the 2012 Pacer of the Year. Each week there is a scare of some sort. Each week he wins.

"It's called class, C-L-A-S-S," racing manager Myron Bell said.

Razzle Dazzle (Real Desire) took the next elim, winning by a head over Our Lucky Chip as the two longshots completed the exacta. Sweet Lou, the 9-5 favorite, broke shortly after the start and finished sixth.

Hempt elims: The Hempt got off to a surprising start as 2-5 favorite Lonewolf Currier was flat in the opener, finishing fifth at 2-5. That was good news for Emeritus Maximus (Rockroll Hanover), who won by a nose

Ben Franklin elims: Dynamic Youth (Bettor's Delight) won the first elim, getting a perfect pylon-skimming trip with Andrew McCarthy driving to win by a head over Clear Vision. Betterthatched

But they were all overshadowed by the venerable Foiled Again. Winless in his last five starts, the 9-year-old scooted up the inside to win by a neck over Modern Legend. Pet Rock, sent off at 4-5, was third. It was Foiled Again's 69th career win and moved his earnings to \$4,920,444. Even more incredible, at the age of nine he established a new lifetime mark, stopping the teletimer in 1:48, which also set a Pocono Downs track record.

Takter Has Big Morning at the Meadowlands

Hall of fame trainer Jimmy Takter sent out five "baby race" winners yesterday morning, and got a win with a potential star in Trixton (Muscle Hill). That colt cost \$360,000, making him the most expensive trotter sold at the yearling auctions last year.

Derby won the third after an up close trip for Ray Schnittker in 1:59-. This Deweycheatumnhowe colt is owned by Schnittker with Kelk's Inc, Ted Gewertz and the breeder, Jeff Gural's Little E LLC.

Trixton won this morning in 1:59.2. Gingras held him third behind a gapper and closed up nicely to get the win. He is from the Takter barn and is owned by Brixton Medical and Christina Takter.

Shake It Cerry won for the third time in these morning sessions and she looks like something special. Today's romp was a front end tour for Ron Pierce in 1:56.4 / 27.4 with the greatest of ease. Another Takter pupil, she is owned by her breeder, Solveig's Racing Partners.

Pacers began in race 10 and Avalanche Hanover was an impressive 1:57.1 / 27.2 winner in his first outing for Tim Tetrick and Linda Toscano. He is a Somebeachsomewhere colt that required only one bid by Myron Bell to secure him for Brittany Farms, Katz, Libfeld & Goldband, Sbrocco and Little E LLC; granted the amount of that single bid was \$200,000.

Tetrick and Toscano came right back with the filly JK Molly, an Art Major filly who finished her 1:56- mile in 27.3. She's owned by the 3 Brothers Stables.

Put On A Display charged home from well back for Tetrick to win in 1:58.3 for the Put On A Show connections of trainer Chris Ryder and owners Richard and Joanne Young. She's a \$175,000 Somebeach filly from the Lexington Select Yearling Sale.

Ideal Magic zipped to an effortless 1:53.3 win for Tetrick and Tony Alagna. He's an impressive American Ideal colt owned by Cheap Speed Stable, Joe Sbrocco, Eagles Soar Partners and Louis Willinger.

Tellitlikeitis is the Well Said from Kikikatie, who has thrown nothing but fast horses, and this colt is no exception. He was a geared down 1:53.3 winner for Gingras, never asked for speed. Takter trains for Lothlorien.

West Matters romped in the finale for Andy Miller in 1:53.4. He's owned by Andy and Omer Miller and Julie Miller is the trainer.

Stakes Finals Miss the Mark

We've seen it for quite some time. We have an elimination winner picking his or her post position for a stakes final, or a stakes elimination with the four or five best horses in it with only three spots moving on where a good horse or two goes home. It's the way it is. It's the way things have been structured.

On the surface, elimination winners picking posts makes sense for a couple of reasons. Namely, in elimination races some got tired of seeing a driver and trainer not try, when only having to make the top four or five placings to make a final, and also to ensure a race like the Little Brown Jug has a winner in the second dash, so horses are not racing a third.

Having an open draw in eliminations also makes sense to someone...I guess... who I don't know...and, apparently having some of the best horses not make a final is a-okay with somebody in harness racing.

Frankly, I think both are bonkers.

The Super Bowl is the big enchilada. It's the game everyone tunes in to; it's the draw, the show. I wonder what it would be like to watch if a 13 point Vegas favorite was given a 13 point lead to start a game. I wonder what it would be like if the playoffs were structured in a way where the best teams lose early on and never even make it to the big game.

The Kentucky Derby draws \$120 million in betting handle each year. The points system, from one to twenty, ensures a full field of the best horses. What they don't do is give the best horses the best posts as overkill, and they certainly don't make a qualifying system where some accomplished horse doesn't make the Derby field. What you end up with is the best against the best, and a pretty interesting betting event.

For the big game - the big draw - any sport does what it's supposed to do: Put on a compelling event.

In harness racing the same ideals should be in play, because it is even more important. Our sport chugs on branding and betting dollars and more betting dollars and branding comes when people enjoy and want to bet a big event. It has to be bettable and watchable, or it's dead on arrival.

To help achieve that, I believe two things can be done: Elimination races should be seeded, and stakes finals should be an open draw.

Seeding eliminations seems like the ultimate no-brainer. Structuring them so elimination one has the highest

earning or best horse in it, the second best draws into the second elimination, the third best in the third, and likewise with other seeds accomplishes a couple of tasks. It makes the elimination races more fun to watch and bet and it ensures our best horses have the fairest shot to make a big money final. It makes the final field as deep as possible.

As well, for let's say a Breeders Crown, the seedings - like Churchill does with their points system - can help keep that event in the news during the year. It adds some buzz. Second, enough is enough giving the best horses a leg up with the best posts. "All stakes pick 4's" in Thoroughbred racing are a draw and a sell, with some reaching millions of dollars in a pool. If you try and run an "all stakes harness pick 4" as a promotion, you're likely looking at a \$33 payoff, because all the best horses have the best posts giving you a boring chalkfest. Seriously, who wants to bet and watch that? Why in heavens name in a sport that is plagued by heavy chalk do we want to make the heavy chalk even heavier in our most watched races?

Although it is sacrilege to be critical of it (and no, I am not advocating many changes to a successful event), the Little Brown Jug is the best example of this practice in action. It's not really a racing event, it's a post position event. Last year, when Michaels Power drew the inside in his elimination, he immediately became the chalk for both heats. I heard (on Tuesday) "if he gets the rail in the Final, it's over." If he got the six post in his elimination, no one would've said that. If there was an open draw for the Final no one would've said that either. Why do we create a strong favorite on a Tuesday for a Thursday two heat event with 25 horses entered? How is that even possible? I don't know, but harness racing has made it possible, somehow.

This system is patently unfair to all horses. If a horse draws awful but races well from the outside post in his elimination - say he parks the mile and loses by a head in 1:51 - and earns a spot in the final, he gets screwed again. In a three race elimination he has no shot to draw the one, two or three, so he has a good chance to be outside, even though he deserves a fair shot. Conversely, if a horse draws a rail in an elim and gets a 50% boost from it, we give him a huge chance at drawing the rail again and giving him another 50% boost. It's like winning a horse racing lottery.

Last year A Rocknroll Dance drew outside and when the connections saw it they probably wanted to scratch. If the final was an open draw at least the owners could've had a real hope to still win the Jug if he made the final and got a decent post draw. This happens time and time again. The Confederation Cup at Flamboro Downs is an event that has not prescribed to this phenomenon. They race eliminations to make the Final, but they have an open draw. If you look at the last ten or fifteen editions, this made for a very good, exciting, bettable final.

Last year, for example, the final boasted the best horses in posts one, six and seven, and another good horse (Warrawee Needy) drew the five. We had a 26 second first quarter and they raced. The place horse - Dynamic Youth - came from the east end parking lot to get the place spot and it was a fair final, just like it usually is. If elimination winners got the one and the two, one would expect the usual boat race merry-go-round, where a 56.4 half would be considered

fast. Michael's Power, who won from the six post, was 7-2, and very bettable for those watching.

In harness racing we let the tail wag the dog so often. We're so worried about 'stiffing' in a \$20,000 elimination (that could be addressed in a number of other ways), that we let it affect the \$500,000 real race a week later. We don't even ensure to the best of one's ability that the best field is even assembled for a final. Then we complain that our stakes finals are boring and that 'no one watches and bets them'.

If we ever want to make harness racing a mainstream sport, we at least have to make sure our biggest events are the most interesting, watchable, bettable and fun events we offer. It's where the marketing money goes, it's where the big crowds are. Seeding eliminations and having an open stakes draw won't solve all the problems, but they are a step in the right direction.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Merritt Dokey

Once one of the brightest stars on the Yonkers-Roosevelt circuit Merritt "Butch" Dokey is still fooling around with the horses, only different horses.

Dokey owns a small stable of thoroughbreds, gallops the horses himself, and hopes to soon get a trainer's license in that game.

Dokey has 3,877 career winners as a driver and 146 winners as a trainer, but hasn't driven on anything close to a regular basis since 2005 when he won 12 races.

"Have you been to Michigan?" he said when asked why he got out of the harness game. "It's pathetic here as far as the standbreds are concerned and nobody's ever done anything to help them out. I thought I could get some thoroughbreds and get going. In the first place, it's a lot cheaper having them around, just

equipment wise. And like I say, it was a challenge to see if I could do it or not."

Actually, Dokey started out as a jockey.

"When I first started out with the horses, I started out with the thoroughbreds and quarter horses," he said. "I rode quarter horses. I rode the first quarter horse futurity winner ever in the state of Michigan. That was at Hazel Park. And I rode thoroughbreds around all the country fairs in Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Michigan. I don't know if you know a rider named R.J. Campbell. He was really a good rider. He and I started out together, but he could keep his weight down and I couldn't. Back then, the weight scale

was so difficult to reach, you couldn't weigh less than 112 and get any mounts and I couldn't get down that low. I started looking at the standardbreds and I went to work for Joe Marsh Sr. and got going."

Dokey likes being hands on so he does a lot of the work with thoroughbreds, which race in Ohio and Michigan and are trained by Richard Rettele. He's 74, but not too old to gallop his own horses.

"The first thoroughbred I got on, I weighed 160 pounds. That's how far I'd blown up," he said. "Christ, I couldn't breathe and my legs were like jello. I had gone to a place and I couldn't find anybody to get on the horses, and I said this will never happen again. I'll get this weight off and get in shape and I'll work these damned things. So right now, I'm about 124, and I feel great. This winter I had a little bout with rheumatism, but the doctor here put me on some stuff and, thank God, I haven't been bothered with it since."

He is learning more about the thoroughbreds every day and says they will eventually run in his name.

"Whether it's a thoroughbred or a standardbred, everyone has the same goal, to have a good horse," he said.

"Thoroughbreds, they're a lot different from standardbreds, but they're still a horse."

Rooting For Walter Case to Be Reinstated

I was actually hoping that Walter Case Jr. would apply for a New York license, and request a hearing with the NYS Gaming Commission to argue the merits of re-licensing Case in New York State.

Quite honestly, these state commissions dragging their feet in this matter is ridiculous. Case committed his crime, served his time and in the years since his release from prison has been clean and sober and rehabilitated while in a life long recovery. Case briefly (25 races) returned in 2008, only for that comeback attempt to be thwarted by parole regulations in New York. A subsequent license denial by the

same racetrack (Plainridge) that had welcomed Case in 2008 and a less-than-contrite racing commissioner in Massachusetts last summer set back Case's comeback even further. Sure, Case was no angel on the racetrack, having been fined and suspended for numerous on-track violations and failed drug tests over the years, but that was then and this is now. There is no reason why a commission can't and won't grant a conditional license and test the waters with Case.

Let him prove that he is an asset to horsemen and a racetrack's handle, but keep a short leash on his behavior. There's very little risk to doing this.

It upsets me that a previously troubled person like Case is being treated like a pariah, yet the sins of the fathers are addressed at a racing commission's convenience, often ending with a veiled punishment of an assistant trainer fronting for a barn that continues to not miss a beat.

My belief is that Case can contribute to the sport again if given the chance. He's 52 years old, in good health, and knows how to win. Even if he's driving B-stock for peanuts, Case winning in bunches is both good publicity and good for the \$2 bettor that expects an honest effort each and every race. However, the only person that can get in the way of Case, is Case himself. If he experiences a moment of weakness, he needs to deal with it head on, and not medicate himself in the hope of making it go away. Tim Bullock

Driving Home His Point

Just a few comments on the last feedback. Experts will tell us, when a horse gets tired in the stretch, they have a tendency to drift out or drift to the right, which does leave room at the rail.

However, I have seen countless races where you couldn't get the horse off the rail with a fire hose, as the driver and horse maintained their strategic position to the wire.

So what is happening when this phenomenon occurs? Is it that some drivers cannot control their horses, so the horse drifts and allows room at the rail. Or could it be, "Drivers Etiquette", that says, when your horse is tired, its courteous, to gently get out of the way.

Watch a stakes race and see if a driver and his horse move away from the rail in the heat of battle. A good example of driver courtesy was at Harrah's Philly on Sunday, 16 June 2013, in the 11th race. The driver of the #4, Wynsum Magic allowed the driver of the #6, Friday at Five, to drop in the 4th position. Wynsum Magic sat in the 5th Position till the driver pulled him to the outside at the half, to make his move to the front. Wynsum Magic toughed it out on the outside and finished 4th, by 2 lengths.

Now, I don't know if Wynsum Magic could have won the race by closing that one length opening, but I do know this: Wynsum Magic has proven strategic speed, and didn't use it to close that one length hole on the rail at the beginning of the race. Maybe the trainer was teaching the horse a new strategy, unfortunately, new strategies don't have a comment line in the pp's And kudos to the Big M for trying to discourage the openings on the rail racing.

A Hall of Fame Driver made his objections known to the Meadowlands management in regards to their new concept of keep the holes closed and don't make it appear that your letting another horse into a position on the rail. His comment was, "I'm not comfortable racing like that, so I'll stay at Yonkers for now."

I'm sure he will be back to the big m for the lucrative stakes competition. A few weeks ago another Hall of Famer got a lesson in the new concept at the Meadowlands. He left the gate from the 9 hole with Waldorf Hall and couldn't get in to the rail, he sat there a moment, and then, to the back of bus he went.

Which brings up another, very interesting concept, the leader in harness racing should implement immediately: a "LIGHTNING LANE" at the Big M. This Idea has been suggested to the Meadowlands management, and their attitude was, "A LIGHTNING LANE" only benefits suck along horses and we don't want suck along races. This type of reasoning is ancient and suggestive of half mile and some 5/8ths tracks. Not the super oval.

From a fan's perspective, they are limiting a great product that screams out, no limitations. The more racing lanes provided will only promote, more opportunities.

Let's face it, not all horses can Come From Behind, and not all horses can win on the lead. But some might be able to win in the stretch after being hopelessly buried on the rail. And maybe we wouldn't have to wait till next week, to win with a horse that, "Had Some Where to Run."

Exciting possibilities, that's what racing is all about
