



Googoo Gaagaa Sensational in Beal Win By Bill Finley

WILKES-BARRE, Pa.—He’s for real. Is he ever.

Facing the best field he has met so far and racing in his first major stakes race, **Googoo Gaagaa** (Cam’s Rocket) won last night’s \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial at Pocono Downs and set another world record in the process. The time of 1:50.4 eclipse the record he set a week earlier when winning a Beal elim in 1:51.3. It was the fastest mile ever by a trotter of any age on a five-eighths track.

The track was lightning fast last night as records seemed to fall in just about every race.

He won by 1 1/4 lengths over **Stormin Normand** (Broadway Hall). **Little Brown Fox** (Muscles Yankee) was third. Considered the strongest part of the three-horse Jimmy Takter-trained entry, **Uncle Peter** (Cantab Hall) broke stride and finished eighth. The winner paid \$3.

Afterward, driver Corey Callahan said Googoo Gaagaa had, for he first time in his career, a fight on his hands.

“Tonight was definitely a test,” he said. “That’s the first time I ever really asked him fora little bit of trot and he gave it to me in world record fashion. I think he can do a little bit more. We’ll have to see if we ever get to that point.”

The story of Googoo Gaagaa is about as fascinating as they get. Richard Hans, his owner, trainer and breeder paid \$1,200 for a trotting mare named Kora’s Trotter and tried to breed her to a trotting stallion. When she did not get in foal, Hans decided to breed her at the last minute to his family’s nondescript pacing stallion, Cam’s Rocket. This billion-1 shot turned out to be one of the fastest trotters ever.

“He trots very good and square,” Callahan said. “If you watch him on TV his front legs move like a pacer almost. He’s got tremendous reach. If you look at some of his win

pictures, his arm is out even with his nose. It’s unbelievable. I think that’s why he can go so fast, because he covers so much ground. It is so effortless with him.”

Largely because Hans staked his horse to only a handful of races, Googoo Gaagaa’s biggest win to date had come in the \$54,866 Simpson at the Meadowlands. Last night, he was facing the type of horses that figured to give him a serious test.

Callahan sat third early before pulling and making the lead approaching the half. Stormin Normand, the other elim winner, sat in second with Dave Palone driving but was unable to cut into Googoo’s lead.

“This horse can absolutely fly,” Hans said. “I said that a long time ago and no one believed me.”

The Yonkers Trot will be next for Googoo Gaagaa, who is not eligible to the Hambletonian.

“I don’t want to be in (the Hambletonian),” Hans said. “This is enough for me. There’s too much pressure in that race.”

It’s easy to understand why Hans wants to stay out of the spotlight. He’s spent his entire career in obscurity on the Maryland circuit and has never had a horse anywhere near this caliber.

"This is out of my league," he said after he Beal, somewhat exasperated by the attention.

"It's a great story," Callahan said. "No offense to the Takter connections, but this is what these people came out here tonight to see. Takter and Fielding and Ron Pierce, those guys win all the big races. This is about the little guy, Richard Hans. He bred the horse, he owns the horse, he trains the horse. It's just all him. That makes it extra special."

Hans has yet to decide whether he will cash in and sell the horse. Before the 3-year-old campaign began, he turned down a \$500,000 offer from trainer Staffan Lind.

"The guy was going to buy him last year and I was ready to sell him, Hans said. "I couldn't look at the horse. The guy was coming the next day. It was feeding time and he was licking me in the neck. I panicked. I felt bad. Couldn't do it."

The offers have now eclipsed the seven-figure mark.

Hans hasn't said yes and he hasn't said no. He'll take his freak to Yonkers next and likely cash another big check. Half pacer, half trotter, Googoo Gaagaa's story is far from complete.

Woodbine's Future a Cause for Concern in Canada

What would the horse racing industry be without Woodbine Entertainment Group, the largest racetrack operator in Canada and one of the biggest in the world?

That's a question that many in the business must be wondering after WEG's president/chief executive officer suggested on Thursday his company may not have a long-term future beyond next season because the province of Ontario plans to end its slots at racetracks program in March, 2013.

Nick Eaves made his dramatic statement at the draw for this year's Queen's Plate, which is to Canada what the Kentucky Derby is to the U.S. and takes place Sunday at Woodbine. Woodbine sent out a media release on Thursday suggesting this may be the last year for the Plate, which this year will celebrate its 153rd edition, but Eaves went one step further in addressing horsemen and the media by talking about Woodbine's long-term financial sustainability. Eaves was quoted as saying 50% of its operating budget comes from casino revenues, which generate \$345 million for the horse racing industry. The racetracks and the horsemen each collect 10% of the annual revenues, while the government's take is \$1.1 billion.

So when the head of WEG made such a bold statement, the sobering news clearly created concern among horsemen, knowing their futures may be in peril.

"I'm just kind of shell-shocked by it all and so are a lot of people," trainer Arthur Silvera told Harness Racing Update. "I wouldn't have ever expected this to get to this point. I'm kind of flabbergasted by it all. It was all a big shock to us. Nobody was privy to that. It was all new to us."

"It's got a dramatic impact on us," added long-time Ontario-based jockey Jim McAleney. "On a day-to-day basis, it sure makes you feel uncomfortable not knowing what lies in your future. This has been my livelihood for my entire adult-

hood. I've been doing it for 26 years. For Woodbine to close its doors really is kind of scary. What do I do? I had no inclination that anything like this was in the works. It put a huge, somber feeling in the atmosphere. We knew things were up in arms, but to officially hear it was somewhat like a bombshell."

Woodbine has been a regular staple for the Breeders Crown, either at Woodbine or its harness track at Mohawk Raceway, site of the annual North America Cup for three-year-old colt pacers.

That race has a purse of \$1.5 million, the most of any race in Canada, and is Mohawk's signature race. It was won last week by Thinking Out Loud, driven by Randy Waples for trainer Bob McIntosh, who is also one of the breeder/owners of the colt.

Woodbine has races that attract international thoroughbred horses, some of whom are targeted to go on to the annual Breeders' Cup world championships. Woodbine played host to the Breeders' Cup in 1996.

There had been hints that WEG would need to drastically alter its purse structure going into 2013 because of the Ontario government's plan to end the slots program. The Plate has a purse of \$1 million.

The province has already stopped slots operations at two harness tracks--Windsor Raceway and Hiawatha Park in Sarnia--and the Fort Erie thoroughbred oval. Fort Erie annually plays host to the Prince of Wales Stakes, the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown. It has been in financial trouble for several years competing against casinos on both sides of the Niagara Falls border. Windsor benefitted greatly from the start of the slots programs because it was being crushed by a nearby local casino. Then issues with security following 9/11 made it difficult from Americans to cross the border, which further impacted tracks such as Windsor and Fort Erie.

But WEG seemed bulletproof, and it very well might be. There are thoughts that Eaves may have been firing a shot across the government's bow because he had such a large media audience. Prior to Eaves's comments, WEG hadn't gone public with its concerns.

"It does seem like a threat, but I'm thinking positively, thinking there will be some kind of resolution," Silvera added. "I'm trying not to think about it, to tell you the truth. What do you do? I'd say for 85%-90% of the people in the horse racing industry...this is what they know, this is what they love, so what do you do if it becomes a reality?"

Chapter Seven Sets World Record In Titan Cup Prep

East Rutherford, NJ [June 23, 2012] -- Chapter Seven easily overpowered the pacesetter Winning Mister to take the \$40,000 Titan Cup Prep in world record fashion on Saturday night at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Chapter Seven's 1:50.4 clocking, which included a final panel of :26 seconds, was an all-time best for a 4-year-old trotting horse over any size track. (Lucky Jim holds the 1:50.1 record for 4-year-old geldings set in 2009). Chapter Seven was steered to victory in his 2012 debut by Tim Tetrick. Winning Mister was a length behind in second, while Arch Madness finished third in his first appearance since being the runner-up in Sweden's Elitlopp on May 27. The Titan Cup prep contenders will return for the \$201,700 final on Friday, June 29.

Chapter Seven, trained by Linda Toscano, won five of 10 starts last season, including a commanding victory in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine. The son of Windsong's Legacy was fourth in the 2011 Hambletonian. Owned by Richard Gutnick of Blue Bell, PA, Gary Cocco of Newtown Square, PA, Southwind Farm of Pennington, NJ, and Jerry and Theresa Silva of Long Beach, NY, Chapter Seven now sports 13 wins in 19 career starts, and earnings of \$951,941.

"I believe in this horse," Toscano noted. "He's incredibly talented. He's healthy and we have to keep in mind he'll be facing some seasoned veterans. Horses don't do what he's done to come back as strong he has."

Alan Leavitt on His 6 Months at RCI

My first six months as Chairman of the RCI Standbred Committee have been enlightening, to say the least. Immediately after being appointed, I struck gold when I learned that the national racing compact, which operates under the auspices of the RCI, offers a terrific licensing program that is easy to enroll in, and your licensing hassles are over. All you have to do is call 859-224-0584, ask for Sandy at ext 4004, and she'll get you signed up.

Unfortunately not everything else was quite so easy. The only printed model rules and penalties originated with the racing medication and testing consortium, and then adopted by the RCI. It was a great idea, but just as I made the discovery that the model penalties were pretty much a joke, so did a lot of other people. Those penalties are now being reviewed by the RCI, along with knowledgeable researchers and vets, with the expressed goal of having penalties that will fit the crime, which they now don't.

Another aspect of the regulatory process concerns the status of a trainer's stable when he receives a lengthy suspension. As we all have seen, the suspension of a trainer usually just means that the stable remains intact under the nominal authority of a second trainer or close relative. One state Kentucky, has addressed the problem by making part of the suspension a requirement that the suspended trainer's stable must be totally dissolved, meaning the horses cannot remain together; they have to have new trainers and grooms, and the switches must be supported by written checks and bills, etc., submitted to the commission on a regular basis. But so far Kentucky is the only state that does require stable dissolution.

Another needed penalty for serious offenses is the suspension of the horse, as well as the trainer. We are going to take a giant step forward when we penalize the owner as well as the trainer. The owners have the power to put an end to many of our drugging problems, which they will only do if it's their ox that is being gored.

That is another thing I have been campaigning for, with no success so far.

Parenthetically, a month ago the RCI held its annual full board meeting in Oklahoma City. The standard committee was given a prime spot on the agenda. There are 15 committee members, all regulators. Of that number, only four members, including me, showed up at the meeting,

even though almost all of them were in the hotel, some right outside the door. I mention this so one can gauge for him or herself the level of interest many commissioners have in the business of harness racing.

Ed Martin, the president of the RCI and a totally great guy who is both smart and totally dedicated to the welfare of horse racing, asked me the other day my thoughts about the Lou Pena caper, as we say in the detective trade. As a member of a racing commission myself, it does not behoove me to comment on anything done by another racing commission. But, as I told Ed, I am not in favor of publishing deadlines for the administration of therapeutics and making the nonobservance of those dead lines a punishable offense. This, of course, does not include raceday medications, and the like. But the acid test for therapeutics should be the race day testing. Setting these punishable deadlines is a purely subjective matter, and one in which there are many differing opinions. And I want no part of suddenly bringing the vets into the equation. It should be remembered that the subject is therapeutic medication, and there are many times that their administration greatly benefits the well being of a horse. It's not like we're talking about eye of newt or juice of frog.

That's my six month story. I intend to keep fighting the windmills that I have mentioned above, and if anyone has a particular gripe, feel free to let me know.

If you want new players, you have to cross them over from the slots and tables. Give them a reason to come and play. Get rid of the .10 wagers. I hate those wagers because they kill large payoffs which kills more money into the pools.

I told people at the Big M years ago, to promote the Pick 6 but, not make it less than a 2 dollar wager. Why? You want to attract big money when you get carryovers. What do they do? They have made it a .50 wager. Joke.

I hope you contact TVG and HRTV, ask the questions, why they have killed harness racing, yet they continue to promote racing from other countries?

They also refuse to bring in signals from Sweden, Australia, New Zealand, France, etc. - harness racing.

His Concerns About Harness Racing

I would like to make a few comments on just a few concerns I have with Harness Racing.

I watched a race from the Meadowlands Saturday night, the horse on the lead entered the stretch with a horse first over and pressing. The horse on the lead promptly moved off the rail, allowed the horse in the two hole to get through and win. The lead horse finished second.

My questions are: How do the owner and trainer feel about their horse finishing second (and earning 25% less purse money) because this driver could not keep a straight path down the stretch (changing course in the stretch is still a driving offense).

How does the bettor (customer) feel when he sees his hard handicapping go down the drain when this happens? When will the judges and track management stop this from happening? There is NO passing lane at the Meadowlands and I remember being able to use "locked in" horses as a tool to determine horses that would be competitive from a trainers and bettors standpoint.

At the same time, a race at Tioga Downs saw a bulky 9-horse field where two outside horses left hard and got parked (no complimentary holes given). One of the parked horses, the favorite, pressed on and in the end, a "live and good trip" 14 to 1 shot, springs off second over cover and wins. The outcome of the race was changed when the drivers held their established positions.

There are too many holes given in racing today, if you leave and get parked.....enjoy the fresh air.

I have been involved in Harness Racing as a trainer/driver/groom/racing official and horsemen's rep. it has been terrible to see the decline of our once glamorous and classy sport. If we keep on the path we have been traveling down, where will it lead? Off the cliff we are steadily pointed towards.

Folks like Mr. Gural, I applaud you for changing the norm, trying new things, having classy looking presentations during post parades and providing promotions and events that will attract new and old to the racetrack. Change is good; doing the same things leads to the same result

I have many other comments and concerns, but I may take up your entire publication.

If millions of people watch two men beat the crap out of each other in a cage while being sponsored by the largest corporations in the world, why can we not get people back to the track to watch these magnificent horses perform?

Chapter Seven (Tim Tetrick, \$3.80), making his 2012 debut off a pair of dazzling qualifiers turned in another stellar effort with a 1:50.4 career-best time which set a world record for a 4-year-old trotting stallion. After getting away fourth, Tetrick was content to watch the action before pulling first over heading to three quarters. Turning for home, Chapter Seven got called on for a bit of trot and he responded, motoring past the leader by a length while coming home in a dazzling 26.0 with the earplugs still in. Winning Mister (Andy Miller) fired out as expected, rated the fractions unchallenged, looked to open some separation past three quarters but was gobbled up down the stretch by the top one's vicious rally. Arch Madness (Trond Smedshammer), making his first start back after racing overseas in the Elitlopp, yielded for the pocket trip turn one, chased the whole way but had no punch come crunch time.
