



# How John Campbell's most devastating career defeat led to Meadowlands Pace glory

The Hall of Fame driver's first Meadowlands Pace victory with Hilarion came just after he experienced a crushingly-poor performance by his own colt, Merger.

John Campbell's most devastating career defeat quickly turned into one of his most memorable victories.

In 1982, Campbell was still training and driving horses. Going into that year's Meadowlands Pace, Campbell's student, Merger, was primed for success.

"We had pointed [Merger] for the Meadowlands Pace and he was as good as he could possibly be going into the race," Campbell said.

"He just raced terribly in the eliminations. To tell you the truth, it was about as bad as I felt after any race, any time, in my career.

"I was confident that he would race well and that he had enough ability to compete in there. I thought he was as good as anybody and he had no excuse, he just raced poorly. I was absolutely devastated."


But devastation quickly turned to elation when Campbell received a call from trainer Jerry Silverman. That call led to Campbell driving **Hilarion** and winning his first Meadowlands Pace (replay **here**).

But it was no easy trip. Hilarion had the 10-hole.

"A lot of it was just good fortune," Campbell said. "I had no intentions of leaving the gate with him when I looked at the

program. I just thought there would be so much early speed. I was really just trying to race for a check. I looked over and before we got to the wire, nobody was on the gate and so I just spoke to him and he crossed right over and got covered right up. Then, he was lucky to get out. No Nukes came three-wide down the backstretch and got up to be first over and the horse following him couldn't keep up, which allowed me to get out on his back. So, it was really a very, very fortunate trip.

#### **Harness Racing Update**

"When I crossed the wire I was pretty sure I won, but it was close. When they put the number up, I kind of forgot about Merger."

Campbell laughed when he said this. After all, later that year Merger became the first of his three Little Brown Jug winners.

But let's go back to the Meadowlands Pace, which goes Saturday (July 13) at The Big M. Campbell said the track was "electric, just electric" on Pace Night in the 1980s and '90s.

"We had the front paddock [at the old grandstand], the apron was full of people," he said. "About that time, we were averaging between 15,000 and 16,000 a night, so it would be 25,000 and 30,000 people there, for sure. It was a major sporting event in the New York-New Jersey area at that time.

Seven years after he retired from driving and 22 years after he won his last Meadowlands Pace, Campbell still holds the record for the most Pace victories. He won the race seven times between Hilarion's triumph in 1982 and 2002.

Campbell's second Pace victory came in 1989 with **Dexter Nukes** (replay here).

"Well, again, there was luck involved," Campbell said. "My uncle George Gilmour trained him and Bruce Ranger was driving him and he started in the Jersey Sires Stakes. I had a horse for Johnny Edmunds — I can't even remember his name — that I thought was going to be a pretty good 3-year-old colt. Bruce didn't get along that well [with Dexter Nukes] in the first few legs of the Sires Stakes and Tom Dexter, who owned Dexter Nukes, told George he had to make a change. George called me and he said, 'Will you go with him?' I said, 'Well, I've got that other colt and I think he's a pretty good colt, but as long as they don't get in the same division I'll go with Dexter Nukes.'

"Fortunately, they split. Dexter Nukes won and the other colt was never heard from again. He didn't race well that night and didn't do much else. I got the drive on Dexter Nukes for the rest of the year.

"It was really a special thing with my uncle and my aunt, Pat, involved. It was a family deal. [Dexter Nukes] had such a great run during that summer meet at The Meadowlands. He was just hard to beat.

"Going into Meadowlands Pace, I was really confident. He won the Jersey Classic over a bad track. There were some really good horses in there. I was really confident in him, I just knew I needed a breather down the backstretch and that would be enough for him and he won rather easily."

Campbell won the Pace back-to-back in 1994 with Cam's Card **Shark** (replay here) and 1995 with **David's Pass** (replay here).

"Cam's Card Shark wasn't quite as good in his elimination for the North America Cup, so I was a little concerned going into the final, but he bounced back and got a good trip [and won]," Campbell said. "In the Meadowlands Pace, he got even stronger and I thought, 'As long as I keep him out of trouble, he's going to be almost impossible to beat. He got to the front in reasonable fractions and he was so sharp... I just had so much confidence that I didn't think there was anybody in there that could beat him at that time."

As for David's Pass, he was a horse that needed a good trip, Campbell said.

"I got fortunate, second-over right into the stretch," he said. "He had to work for it, but the whole key to that horse was that he had to have a perfect trip, but he would take advantage of it and it worked out great in the Meadowlands Pace."

In 1999, Campbell won the Pace with **The Panderosa** (replay here).

"He was a huge favorite and he was so good [winning] the North America Cup," Campbell said. "Again, the only thing I thought could get him beat was if I got into a speed duel. There was a lot of action up front and I didn't want to be involved in it, so I just rode out and parked with him the whole mile, without using him. I got up alongside the leaders around the turn and he still felt strong, even though he'd been parked with no cover, and then when I asked him in the lane he just drew off. He was just so sharp. That was his last really good race. He was never the same again."

Two years later, Campbell won the 2001 Meadowland Pace with **Real Desire** in an epic battle with Bettors Delight (replay here).

"Real Desire had come down and [trainer] Blair [Burgess] asked me to qualify him," Campbell said. "He had qualified really well and I wasn't really sure what I was going to have for the Meadowlands Pace. I kind of kept my options open a little bit. He raced really well in the elimination.

"He was a horse that raced much better off cover than if you used him and went to the front. So, he got back away in the middle of the pack and Mike [Lachance] had gone back to the front with Bettors Delight. I caught dead cover around the last turn and had to go three-wide. Then, the horse in the 2-hole couldn't keep up and I ducked back in just for a second, but, when I did, [Real Desire] swelled right up and took a hold of me. Then, we had a pretty great stretch duel — Real Desire and Bettors Delight. Fortunately, [Real Desire] was able to win, but he was just a horse, especially at that time, you had to race him off cover. You couldn't use him that much the first half, but if you didn't, he'd give you a real good run for a half.

"I think whether he would've won or not if he didn't duck back in, I don't know, but it certainly didn't hurt him."

The next year, Campbell won the Meadowlands Pace again, this time with **Mach Three** (replay **here**).

"He was really sharp right then," Campbell said. "There were some really good horses – Red River Hanover won the NA Cup. What was really fun as a driver — and if you watch the replays it's pretty impressive — when I moved [Mach Three] to the front, they were still pacing decent, but he just accelerated so quickly that even though they were going fast, it looks like they weren't. When he crossed over and got back to the front and I could give him a breather, he swelled right up and he won rather handily.


"As a driver, that move down the backstretch, as soon as I tipped him I knew he was getting back to the front. You just don't get that that often, but it's a good feeling when you get it."

Beyond Mach Three winning the Meadowlands Pace his other claim to fame was siring the great Somebeachsomewhere.

"Mach Three was just okay as a sire, but when you factor in Somebeachsomewhere it's a major impact on the industry," Campbell said.

Just as the Meadowlands Pace has had a major impact on the industry.

"Back in the '80s and '90s with that front paddock it was a special, special night."

#### **GREAT WEEKEND IN GOSHEN**

Speaking of special nights, they don't come much bigger than watching your brother be inducted into the Harness Racing Living Hall of Fame.

Trainer Jim Campbell was officially inducted last Sunday (July 7) in Goshen, NY.

"That was a great weekend, obviously for Jim, but for our whole family," John said. "We had a contingent, including my mom and sister and nieces and nephews of Jim's that came down. All my daughters and the grandkids were there, as well as [my wife] Paula, obviously. We just had a great weekend. We had a really nice family dinner on Saturday night and then the event on Sunday – it just couldn't have been better."

John said their mom, Florence, was beaming the entire weekend.

"And we had grandkids there that are one years old, up to my oldest granddaughter who is 20," John said. "Everybody enjoyed going through the Hall of Fame and taking a look at myself and Jim's statue. They got a kick out of that. That was a lot of fun."

#### THOUGHTS ON LEGENDS DAY

Finally this week, some thoughts on the most recent edition of Legends Day at Clinton Raceway on June 30 back in John and Jim's native Ontario.

"Legends Day never fails to impress," John said "It's really a good event and you really see a lot of people that you only see at Clinton, but each year you see somebody new that you haven't seen in a long time that comes there.

"Certainly, the weather didn't cooperate, but that didn't dampen anybody's spirits around there at all. It was really a good event and I was really happy to see that they included the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, because there were people there that normally didn't come to Clinton, per se, so I got to see a number of people and chat with them. I really enjoyed that."

## Connections of Captain's Quarters are looking for smooth sailing in the Meadowlands Pace final

Captain's Quarters had to navigate through some rough seas leading up to last Saturday's (July 6) Meadowlands Pace eliminations, but his connections hope for smooth sailing in tomorrow night's (July 13) \$650,000 final at The Meadowlands.

Trained by Herb Holland and driven by Jody Jamieson, Captain's Quarters finished fourth in his Pace elimination, two lengths behind winner Legendary Hanover. Legendary Hanover came home in an impressive :24.4, just one tick off the fastest final quarter in Meadowlands history.

Despite not hitting the board, Captain's Quarters also came home in :24.4, which looks even more impressive once you know his backstory.

"The colt didn't have a good week [leading up to the Pace elims]," Holland said. "He actually kicked through the bars of the stall and when we came in and fed, the bar was down and his leg was caught in it. So, I wasn't even sure he was going to make it to The Meadowlands.

"His week was very light and a lot of hosing. I mean, he went into the race, I would say about 70 per cent of what I would like to have been and for him to race the way he did, coming a half in :52 and [a final quarter in] :24.4, I think it was phenomenal."

The situation with Captain's Quarters was serious enough that Holland considered scratching him from the Meadowlands Pace elims.

"It was Tuesday morning [July 2]. I already had him entered [in the Pace elims], and I went to [Woodbine Mohawk Park] at 6 a.m. and had my vet watch him," Holland said. "We ultra-sounded him because if there were any issues that came up at all, I was scratching him, and that was Tuesday morning."

With a thumbs up from his vet and a good ultra-sound, Holland had a conversation with Captain's Quarters' owner Rich Stiles and they decided to ship down to The Meadowlands on Wednesday (July 3) for the Pace elims.

Before the elims, Holland made sure that his horse's bad week was front and center in his driver's mind.

"I reminded Jody of that when he went out on the track," Holland said. "'Remember, he didn't have a good week.' I said, 'I don't want him first up and I don't want him on the front.'

"And, so I know some guy gave Jody a little critiquing for not moving when the fractions were slow, but that was my call, not his."

In the simplest of terms, the current Meadowlands Post Position Formula, which went into effect for the Pace in 2022, rewards horses based on where they finish in the eliminations, allowing them to draw for better posts. As a fourth-place finisher, Captain's Quarters got the worst post possible available, since he drew for post 9 and down eliminating positions already selected.

"I mean, we'll see what he's made of, I guess," Jamieson said after finding out Captain's Quarters drew post 9 for the final. "It's disappointing that you draw bad, but I mean, you take your lumps with your results in the elim. If you win your elim you get a good post and you have to race a little harder. But maybe we'll have a little extra in the tank if we go a half in :52 or :53 or something like that. I guess it remains to be seen, but definitely strategy will change."

Neither Holland or Jamieson were aware of the Meadowlands Post Position Formula until someone told them after the Pace eliminations, but considering the week that Captain's Quarters had, and how Jamieson was asked to drive him, it seems unlikely the outcome would have been much different.

When you look at the fact that prior to his Pace elimination, Captain's Quarters hadn't raced since his second-place finish in the Pepsi North America Cup to Nijinsky on June 15, it's understandable why Holland thinks of him the way he does.

"After three weeks off, for him to go race like he did [in the Pace elims], because I wasn't able to train him, that's why I'm still very confident," Holland said. "I think before the end of the

year shows up, I think he'll just step up and people will see that he is the best colt. I really believe that."

When asked if he was surprised to see so many Canadian horses and drivers in this this year's Pace final, Jamieson said, "No, I mean, obviously, I think the best of the best are Canadians with hockey and horse racing, so, no, I'm not surprised at all.

"I mean, He's Watching [sire of Funtime Bayama] and Bettors Delight [sire of Nijinsky], they're both past Meadowlands Pace winners. My horse is a Captaintreacherous trained by a Canadian and driven by a Canadian. I'm not surprised at all. With all due respect, I think it's a silly question."

When it was explained to Jamieson that statistics would show that having four horses — Captain's Quarters, Funtime Bayama, Legendary Hanover and Nijinsky — in the 10-horse Pace final that raced the majority of their careers in Canada is a rarity, he said, "I think you're right. I'm not sure what the reasoning is, but lots of times Canadian people aren't paying their horses into the Meadowlands Pace.

"But I think Doc [Ian] Moore kind of started doing that a little more and you saw that you could go down there and make money and I think that helped people or changed people's minds. Two Ontario Sires Stakes horses eligible [to the Pace], it's a rarity. I get what you're saying."

Jamieson did stand by his quote about hockey and horse racing.

"The greatest hockey player ever was Wayne Gretzky or Mario Lemieux or Bobby Orr, whoever you want to argue about," Jamieson said. "The greatest driver ever was John Campbell. Two of the best drivers in the world right now are Yanick Gingras and Scott Zeron. Mark MacDonald has won the Meadowlands Pace; he's Canadian.

"Now we have four drivers invading The Meadowlands on Saturday night for their biggest night. Obviously, we're used to seeing The Meadowlands drivers invade Woodbine [Mohawk Park], but, for whatever reason, maybe there's a changing of the tide. Who knows?

"And I think there's an unspoken bias about the people who race in the U.S. full-time. And that's why people like Mark MacDonald, Yannick, Scott Zeron, even John Campbell went to the U.S.; in lots of ways for opportunity, but also to prove themselves, because that's where you go to prove yourself. So, I think, you know, it's a bit of a changing of the tide there where maybe you don't have to go there now to prove yourself. You can just go down there and win those biggest races."

Captain's Quarters has raced against the other Canadian horses on more than one occasion but Jamieson didn't think that was what might give him an edge.

"I'll tell you what, I think I have an advantage because I'm driving Captain's Quarters and I think he's all world," Jamieson said. "Whether he'll prove it on Saturday will remain to be seen. But my advantage lies in the horse that I'm driving and I'll be honest, I know it sucks to have the 9-hole but, I don't think I would trade him."

Holland is optimistic for Captain's Quarters chances in the Pace final since on Tuesday, he said the colt was probably up to about 85 per cent.

"I think we've got a few more things we've got to do to him," Holland said. "He's got a few muscles that are a little sore, so we're going to do some massage and acupuncture and I think come race time, I don't know if he'll be 100, but he'll be 90 per cent for sure.

"I can tell you this, even though we got the 9-hole, they'll know he's in the race."







# A toast to the Meadowlands Pace, seven and seven anyone?

John Campbell has seven wins in the Meadowlands Pace. Tim Tetrick is trying for his seventh Pace victory on Saturday (July 13) to equal what once seemed completely unapproachable.

Here are seven fun facts that compare the No. 1 and No. 3 moneywinning drivers of all time in The Meadowlands signature race.

1. Campbell's seven came with: Hilarion (1982) for Jerry Silverman, Dexter Nukes (1989) for George Gilmour, Cam's Card Shark (1994) for Bill Robinson, David's Pass (1995) for Brett Pelling, The Panderosa (1999) also for Pelling, and finally No. 7 came in 2002 with Mach Three for Monte Gelrod. Tetrick's half dozen started in his 2007 debut try with Southwind Lynx for George Teague. His second came three years later in 2010, edging by John Campbell and Rock N Roll Heaven with One More Laugh for Ray Schnittker. His third came in 2013 when Captaintreacherous dominated. The very next year, and still the fastest Pace ever, he won with He's Watching in 1:46.4. In 2017 he won again for Schnittker with the outstanding Huntsville, and he scored comfortably in 2023 with HOY Confederate.

Campbell also won the Pace with a HOY, Cams Card Shark (1994). Both Campbell and Tetrick won for Pelling, their only common trainer.

- 2. When Campbell won his last Pace in 2002, he also won his final money title (No. 16). At that point Campbell owned the top six money-winning seasons ever. Currently, Tim Tetrick owns six of the top eight money-winning seasons.
- 3. Both drivers won the Pace before and after going into the Hall of Fame.
- 4. Campbell was history's first driver to reach \$100 million, \$200 million and \$250 million. Tetrick is the youngest driver to \$100 million, \$200 million and \$250 million.
- 5. Both won the Meadowlands Pace back-to-back, both times with favorites. Campbell did it in 1994-95 with Cams Card

Shark and David's Pass and Tetrick did it in 2013-14 with Captaintreacherous and He's Watching.

6. When Campbell won his seventh Pace (2002) he owned the two fastest Pace wins ever to that point, 1:49.3 with both The Panderosa and Mach Three. Tetrick currently owns the two fastest Pace wins ever with Confederate last year in 1:47 only a fifth-of-a-second off He's Watching from 2014 (1:46 4).

7. Campbell holds the all-time record for consecutive Pace final drives at 30 (1981-2010). This year, Tetrick will go in his 18th straight, the second longest streak.

#### MEADOWLANDS PACE BY THE NUMBERS

Here are some Pace stats that could change depending on who wins this year's 48<sup>th</sup> edition.

#### SIX BY SIX

Six Meadowlands Pace winners have been sired by a Meadowlands Pace winner: Nihilator (1985) by 1980 winner Niatross, Mach Three (2002) by 1988 winner Matt's Scooter, Holborn Hanover (2004) by 1994 winner Cams Card Shark, Roll With Joe (2011) by 1994 winner Cams Card Shark, A Rocknroll Hanover (2013) by 2005 winner Rocknroll Hanover, and Control The Moment (2016) by 2009 winner Well Said.

#### **SWEET 16**

Sixteen of the 47 editions of the Meadowlands Pace had a Horse of the Year in there, including twice with two. In 1985, Nihilator was first and Forrest Skipper 10<sup>th</sup> and in 1991 Precious Bunny was first with Artsplace second (1992). Nihilator and Precious Bunny were HOY the same year they won the Pace, while Forrest Skipper and Artsplace did it the following year.

#### **MORE FOR 24?**

Nijinsky will be the 24th winner of the North America Cup who will attempt to double up in the Meadowlands Pace. The combined slate reads 23 10-3-1.

#### A PERFECT THREE?

Nijinsky will attempt to be just the third undefeated 3YO to capture the Meadowlands Pace. He's 6-6 in 2024. Captaintreacherous was 5-5 in 2013 and Tall Dark Stranger was 2-2 in 2020.

#### **18 STRAIGHT**

In 2024, Tim Tetrick will drive in his 18th consecutive Pace final. Yannick Gingras is in his 17th. The last Pace not with both was

2007, Tetrick's debut. John Campbell holds the all-time record for consecutive Pace drives with 30 (1981-2010).

#### **ONE NOT DONE**

Nijinsky was 1-for-10 as a 2-year-old. He's not the first to enter the Pace with a less than stellar 2YO tally. In 1977 Escort won the first Pace despite an 0-15 freshman slate, Art Official was also 0-15 at 2 before turning the tables on Somebeachsomewhere in 2008, and Precious Bunny was just 1-14 in 1990 before posting the first sub 1:50 Pace (1:49.4) defeating Artsplace in 1991.

#### 24-FOR-47

Twenty-four of the 47 editions of the Pace went to the favorite with Confederate putting that number over 50 per cent last year. Thirty seven of 47 favorites have hit the board, just a touch under 80 per cent.

#### 11 AND COUNTING

It's been 11 years since a first crop sire has won the Meadowlands Pace. Somebeachsomewhere was the last to do it in 2013 when his son Captaintreacherous won the Pace. This year Captain Crunch will try to duplicate that with a pair in Gem Quality and Number Cruncher.

#### **NEW NUMBER TWO**

Tim Tetrick passed Ron Pierce as No. 2 on the all-time earnings list in Pace history with a victory in 2023 with Confederate. Pierce was had a record of 20 4-2-1 with \$2.7 million while Tetrick now is 17 6-1-3 with \$2.9 million.

#### SIX FOR THE MONEY

All six sires in the 2024 Pace final raced in this race and got money. Always B Miki (Its Saturday Night) was second in 2014, Bettors Delight (Nijinsky, Mirage Hanover) was second in 2001, Captain Crunch (Gem Quality, Number Cruncher) was fourth in 2024, Captaintreacherous (Captain's Quarters, Captain Albano, Captain Luke) win in 2013, Huntsville (Legendary Hanover) won in 2017 and He's Watching (Funtime Bayama) won in 2014 in a stake's best 1:46.4.







## The highs and lows of the First Turn Stable experience

When I made the choice to join Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino's **First Turn Stable in June**, I did so anticipating there would be highlights and disappointments. In the span of only a few short weeks, I've experienced both.

Our horse, Fast Feet, collected his first win only days after I joined the group. The 3-year-old had been knocking at the door in previous starts, and finally broke through on June 5. He was rewarded by trainer Patrizio Ancora with a week off. When Fast Feet returned to action June 19, he drew post 9. That's right, the dreaded outside post at Hoosier Park. Despite that, Trace Tetrick

steered the pacer to a 1:54.2 clocking and fourth-place effort while adding \$480 to Fast Feet's seasonal bankroll.

Back in action June 26, Fast Feet had the good fortune of drawing the rail. He was also reunited with Jordan Ross, who had steered the sophomore earlier in the campaign. After watching the previous starts on RTN, this was the first chance I had to watch Fast Feet as a railbird. The experience didn't disappoint. Many First Turn Stable members turned out for the evening, lining up along the rail prior to the night's fifth race. Ross and Fast Feet were able to get away second and sat in the pocket throughout the mile. Buried along the pylons sixth in the stretch, the two were able to slip up the passing lane late to secure third in a time of 1:54.3. As he rallied in deep stretch, he was cheered on by many in the group. Afterward, as Ross and Fast Feet returned to the paddock, several clapped and congratulated him.

As a racing journalist, I am often focused solely on the action on the track. On this night, I stood on the apron taking in the experience as a fractional owner, observing the reactions of my fellow partners, most of whom I do not know (more on that below). The anticipation before the race, the excitement during, and the joy of a strong performance despite the loss, was fun to witness. It made me consider how much different the live racing experience could be for all if we had a few hundred railbirds that shared this kind of enthusiasm each night.

Fast Feet marked the month of June with consistent efforts, but as fate would have it, July kicked off on a sour note. Back in to race on Wednesday (July 3), the son of Freaky Feet Pete turned in his worst effort for the group. Lining up in post 7 with Ross

again in the bike, the complexion of the race changed in the first turn, and the two were relegated to finishing last in the field of eight. Fast Feet paced the mile in 1:57.1, well off the pace set by race winner Possum Holler (1:53.2).

"Entering the first turn last night, Fast Feet lost a shoe," said Ancora in a follow-up email to First Turn Stable participants. "Going that far without the shoe left Fast Feet quite sore on that foot. Additionally, we had 'Feet' scoped after the race and found quite a bit of mucus in his airway. It's unfortunate that this all happened on the same night, but we are happy to have an answer on why he just wasn't his usual self last night. We are going to give Feet a week off next week to get that foot healed back up and get him over this sickness, and hopefully we are back in business the following week!"

While it is a rough start to the month, the reality is that these things happen. It is the first time he has missed a check since being acquired by First Turn Stable. Hopefully this is just a minor bump in the road, but it is a good reminder that racing luck is great when you have it, and can make you miserable when it eludes you.

As I mentioned above, I did not know any of my fellow First Turn partners prior to attending the June 26 race. That changed when I was introduced to Matt Weyand, an entrepreneur in Muncie, IN (a short drive to Hoosier Park) that owns his own business, Matt Weyand Repairs & Renovations LLC. He is a returning member of First Turn Stable, originally joining with his wife, Laura, during the second season of the program.

"We joined the second season, and we did that just to try to meet other people that enjoyed racing and get to know them," Matt said. "We also wanted to get a better idea of what it would be

like to be horse owners and try to have a little more insight before diving in."

Prior to the First Turn experience, Matt and his wife frequented Hoosier Park with friends, betting the races and enjoying the atmosphere and camaraderie. They joked about claiming a horse, but didn't pursue it until after their involvement in First Turn Stable.

"If I'm being candid, we were on the path of buying a horse," he said. "Whether we had joined the First Turn Stable or not, we were going to buy a horse."

Joining two other partners, Matt acquired pacing mare Artini. It turned out to be a learning experience that connected them with three different trainers. Over the course of 17 starts, the J T Arturo mare hit the board three times, winning once. She is now retired and resides at his Yorktown, IN home, foaling a Palone Ranger yearling colt named Arturoranger last year.

"We knew we wanted to do the foaling process because we have a young family and wanted to have that experience," he said of the colt, nicknamed 'Pickles." "We're going to try him as a racehorse, but if he doesn't race, that's not a big deal. We're going to keep him and break him to ride. It's about having that whole experience. If he does race and does good racing, wonderful. If he doesn't end up being a racehorse, we wanted a foal on the property regardless."

Through the experience with Artini, Matt was introduced to trainer Joel Smith and his wife, Paula. He is now a partner in multiple horses with the racing veterans, including Capt Midnight freshman Vel Miss Captain, a filly that has recorded a third-place effort in a pair of starts.

"It's been horrible, if I'm being honest," said Matt with a laugh of his returns from racing. "The first time that we got a check for a race in three years was three weeks ago. None of the


horses made it for two years. This year we have a pair of 2-year-olds racing and a third hopefully."

Matt is a poker aficionado who is analytical and likes numbers. He understands racing is a gamble, and he is prepared for the ups and downs of the game, enduring the lows of his early ownership stints hoping things will soon turn around. He is also a student of the business, soaking up as much information as he can and learning at every step.

"It's been fun," he said. "I don't so much care about winning as long as we are progressing. Overall, it has been positive."

This season he is hedging his bets, approaching racing with multiple interests and hoping at least one - if not all - will keep moving forward.





# Harness racing lacks power at home, so why not look abroad?

While the big dogs in thoroughbred racing flex their muscles, North American harness racing drops further down the wagering food chain.

Over in thoroughbred land, the incomparable Saratoga meet began in earnest on Thursday (July 11). This year, though, initially, there was a hitch. On July 4th the New York Racing Association announced that they were eliminating all content from FanDuel (TVG) wagering platforms because of a contract impasse. That impasse was resolved before the meet began on Thursday, but had it not been resolved it would have meant people with a FanDuel account would not have been able to bet the meet.

As usual, the fight was about money.

NYRA's Saratoga signal is popular, and when you're popular, you have pull, even if against you lies FanDuel, the largest betting entity in North America. What NYRA wants, FanDuel is unwilling to pay.

In other sports this would probably be confusing. The National Football League wouldn't withhold their games from NBC, the Super Bowl from CBS, or Monday Night Football from ESPN, even if they weren't contractually obliged. These networks are partners, and they help the whole NFL ecosystem go. In horse racing however, this is fairly common.

My question: If a thoroughbred racing entity can wave goodbye to the largest betting platform on the continent what does that say about harness racing's place on the totem pole?

It probably says — despite the sport asking for mostly meager signal fees from large racing fiefdoms — it's the lowest of the low. When this sport is down that far and is that irrelevant it has absolutely no power; it's at the mercy of everyone else's whims.

In my view, when any business is in that position, growth is not only difficult, it's probably impossible.

Fortunately, the sport does not revolve around FanDuel and NYRA; Los Angeles or New York or Miami.

If our best harness signals and races could be packaged, scheduled and made workable for export, it opens up brand new markets. These markets could not only increase handle, but allow for less of a reliance on large thoroughbred betting entities; groups that seem to have little use for our sport (and pay a pittance to host its races).

I read **Joe Faraldo's Director's Chair in Hoof Beats last fall**. In the piece, Faraldo argued that harness racing's place in the landscape lies beyond this continent's borders, and detailed some of his work in expanding the sport to faraway places. Some might remember the commingled pools in the International Trot as one piece of evidence of that. The handles were formidable.

As I perused this latest signal fight, and thought about it more and more, I believe Faraldo is onto something.

If our best harness signals and races could be packaged, scheduled and made workable for export, it opens up brand new markets. These markets could not only increase handle, but allow for less of a reliance on large thoroughbred betting entities; groups that seem to have little use for our sport (and pay a pittance to host its races).

This is obviously a complex and difficult ask. Leaving aside the problems related to different betting platforms and international laws, horsepeople are not going to be trucking horses for Lasix at six in the morning to meet an obscure post time. Our evening cards have to be protected for a myriad of reasons. There are unassailable rules to live by.

But to me there has to be more to this sport than being an afterthought of the North American betting entities; there has to be more than having a world class harness stakes race double-boxed on TVG with a five claimer from Charles Town; there has to be more than being happy with Kentucky Sires Stakes money, or a New Jersey subsidy, or a slot machine.

There's a whole world out there, and maybe this sport should begin to explore what it has to offer.





## Dresden is vital to the survival of racing in southwestern Ontario

Labeling harness racing as a 'pastime' for the residents of Dresden, ON is about as big an understatement as classifying Fenway Park as a 'solid spot' to take in some baseball.

With roots tracing back to the 1800s, the standardbred game has been stitched into the fabric of this southwestern Ontario town for nearly three centuries.

Every year without fail, the quaint community of 2,500 converges on its cherished half-mile oval to admire one of the province's most celebrated grassroots racing programs.

"The small communities love to go to these tracks because No. 1, it's convenient and No. 2, they've been going there their entire lives, and it means something to them," said the voice of Dresden racing, track announcer Nathan Bain.

The story is no different in 2024.


Dresden kicked off its 11-week program with an eight-race card on Sunday (May 26).

Six more race dates, including the final for the Mark Austin Memorial Pacing Series on June 16, and most recently (July 1), three Ontario Sires Stakes events as part of the OSS 50th Anniversary celebration tour, have since passed.

The man behind the mic through it all said strong turnouts have helped fuel a successful 2024 campaign.

"It's been excellent," Bain said. "Last week [with the OSS series], we broke \$100,000 in handle, which is pretty rare for the grassroots tracks. And I think we've taken a great step forward this year; the crowds have been excellent, the weather's been good. Considering the horse population, we've been getting some good races.

"There's been some good betting races, as well as full fields in a lot of races, not all of them, but so far, it's been really good."



Dresden's dual OSS-Canada Day celebration on July 1 was particularly memorable for Bain, who noted the palpable energy emanating from an exuberant gallery of spectators.

"Oh, it was incredible, especially as an announcer, you really feed off the crowd," he said. "The betting lines were very long, which was great to see. You could hear the crowd screaming and cheering and I think it really plays a role for the drivers as well, because they can see and hear the fans. I'm sure it's a lot more exciting for them to drive in front of a full grandstand.

"It makes the atmosphere better for everybody."

Those in attendance on that beautiful Monday afternoon witnessed Garrett Rooney, Dresden's leading driver in 2023 and through seven cards in 2024, show exactly why he's worthy of such a distinction.

The Iona, ON-based reinsman collected five of his 19 Dresden scores that day. For the current season, Rooney paces Dresden's driver colony in wins, purse earnings (\$66,695), and UDRS (.566).

Rooney, however, is not the only accomplished driver who regularly tries their hand at 1244 North St.

Nick Steward, Donald Rankin, Jr., and Scott Wray are among some of the top driving talents routinely featured at Dresden.

Between them, the trio has accumulated 8,015 wins and some \$38.4 million in purse earnings.

Bain believes history, location, and a commitment to quality all contribute to the track's long-standing appeal.

"Dresden has been around for so many years and a lot of these guys have been coming here since their early days," Bain said. "Garrett Rooney's pretty close to Dresden. For some, like Donald Rankin, it's the closest track that's racing, especially after Windsor Raceway closed, a lot of these guys have to travel to London all year long. families that have contributed to the success of Dresden Raceway and the surrounding areas of the racetrack.

"The turnout is always massive on the last day. We get a huge crowd and it's nice that a lot of families will come out and celebrate the day. It's an event we always look forward to."

Fans will also have the chance to participate in the Inside Harness Handicapping contest, which Nathan said has been a big hit this year.

The challenge, which rewards winning fans with a \$300 HPI betting voucher, has received positive feedback on social media.

"Dresden is about an hour away from a lot of them, so it's close, and they love racing in the afternoon with beautiful weather and a strong crowd in the grandstand. The track crew's done an excellent job this year of keeping the surface in great shape and that's something the drivers really value when racing out here."

Rankin, who's in the midst of his 49th professional campaign, has been a Bain family favorite for years.

Nathan's father, David Bain, is a trainer/owner who's heavily relied on Rankin's services since signing on as a full-time conditioner in 2020.

Competitors under the Bain family domain include 9-year-old mare Marilyn, 8-year-old bay gelding Better Than Cash, and a 3-year-old filly by the name of Premier Elsa.

According to the younger Bain, who assumed his role at Dresden in 2023 as a 20-year-old, there's plenty to look forward to over the track's final four-week stretch.

This upcoming Sunday (July 14) will see Dresden play host to the fourth annual Harness The Hope event in support of breast cancer research, followed by Hawaiian Day on July 21 and Kid's Day on July 28.

"We typically get a lot of young fans at the track which is nice to see and that's why we keep doing events like Kid's Day," Nathan said. "It helps us connect with the youth in our industry and make it enjoyable for them as well. It's of vital importance that we build the next generation of fans because that helps make sure the sport is sustainable.

"We try our best to create a family atmosphere at Dresden."

Dresden's summer program rounds out on Aug. 5 with Black Heritage Day – an event that carries significant historical importance within the community.

The Chatham-Kent region of Ontario is closely tied to the Underground Railroad and is home to the Josiah Henson Museum of African-Canadian History.

"Black Heritage Day has always been a special one at Dresden," Nathan said. "The track will be honoring the individuals and

Nathan added that horseplayers in the United States can also participate for a chance at a voucher worth \$200 USD.

Upon the conclusion of Dresden's 2024 term, Nathan, much like horsepeople in the area, will take his talents about one-hour southwest to Leamington Raceway.

The 124-year-old racing venue will begin its latest campaign on Aug. 11.

Together, Dresden and Leamington have kept the light shining on horse racing in this corner of Ontario, especially following the closure of Windsor Raceway in 2012 after 47 years in operation.

"Having Leamington is important because it's really the only track in that area in southwestern Ontario and it gives somewhere close for the horsepeople to travel to," Nathan said. "In the offseason, a lot of horsepeople are traveling an hour and a half or two hours to London, and Leamington keeps people in the business."

For Nathan, Leamington is where his passion for the game first blossomed as an 11-year-old in the crowd.

At age 22, the now veteran race caller returns to where it all started with the hopes of inspiring the next generation of harness racing fans.

"For Dresden and Leamington, the on-track atmospheres are based a lot on family," Nathan said. "We need a lot of young people and that's the reason I got into the business. When Leamington opened, we went to go cheer on my grandfather's horses and I just loved the atmosphere, and I kept going every week.

"Having grassroots racing is incredibly important for the future of our game."

# Stablemates get nod as Pace favorites

Nijinsky will have the opportunity on Saturday (July 13) to become the 11th horse in history to win both the North America Cup and Meadowlands Pace. His stablemate, Legendary Hanover, will be among the horses with the opportunity to stop him.

Undefeated in six races this year, Nijinsky will head to the \$650,000 Meadowlands Pace for 3-year-olds at The Meadowlands as the 2-1 morning-line favorite. Nijinsky won his Pace elimination this past Saturday (July 6) by three-quarters-of-a-length over Funtime Bayama in 1:47.3, equaling the fastest time for an elim in Pace history.

Legendary Hanover, who finished fifth in the North America Cup, is the 3-1 second choice on the morning line after capturing his Pace elim by 1¼ lengths over Mirage Hanover in 1:48. The colt, who received the 2023 O'Brien Award for best 2-year-old male pacer in Canada, has three victories and two seconds in six races this season.

Nijinsky and driver Louis-Philippe Roy will start Saturday from post 3. Legendary Hanover and driver James MacDonald will leave from post 6. Both horses are trained by Anthony Beaton, who is making his Meadowlands Pace debut.

"It's extremely special," Beaton said. "Like I said going into the NA Cup, we're going in with two legitimate shots. Some people are lucky to get one shot in their life, and I've got two great

shots. I'm very fortunate. I really appreciate the ownership group trusting me to take care of these horses."

Nijinsky won the North America Cup in June by 1½ lengths over Captain's Quarters, who also is a Meadowlands Pace finalist. Of the five horses to accomplish the Cup-Pace double this century, three were named Horse of the Year in Dan Patch Awards voting — Gallo Blue Chip, Rocknroll Hanover, and Tall Dark Stranger — while the other two, Well Said and Captaintreacherous, were named Pacer of the Year.

Last year, Nijinsky hit the board in six of 10 races, but found his way to the winner's circle only once.

"We always had some issues leaving the gate," Beaton said. "He's always showed the high speed for home, but when we were never in the races, he just couldn't get there in the end. He was just too far out of it a lot of times.

"[I'm impressed with] how he matured from 2 to 3, and his handiness now. Now, Louis can leave a little bit with him and there doesn't seem to be an issue. Being in the races, he can show off his stuff and get the accolades that he deserves."

In his elimination, Nijinsky took the lead heading into the last turn, then fended off a challenge from Funtime Bayama to remain unbeaten this season.

"What makes my horse so easy to drive, you just need to be alert on the track and he's going to allow you to do whatever you want in the race with him," driver Roy said.

He added about the Pace final, "It's not going to be a one-horse race. Funtime Bayama went a crazy trip. Legendary Hanover, we always know he's a really fast horse and he was given the right trip [in his elim]. It's going to all come down to the draw and whatever happens on the track."

Nijinsky, a son of Bettor's Delight—Pirouette Hanover who has earned \$554,890 in his career, is owned by West Wins Stable, John Fielding, and Mark Dumain.

West Wins Stable and Dumain also own Legendary Hanover, along with Eric Good. The son of Huntsville—Lillian Hanover has hit the board in 13 of 15 career races, winning nine and earning \$402,209.

"He finally got a half-decent trip [in his elimination], which is something he's needed for a while," Beaton said. "He's been doing a lot of the heavy lifting. He deserves the accolades he's getting [after the elim] because he has done a lot of work and he's raced very well each start. It almost seems like some people were losing faith in him because he wasn't winning those races, but I never lost faith in this horse.

"I've said it in the past, he may be one of the best horses that I've ever trained myself. He's a big, strong, powerful horse. He's so professional. He's almost too smart for his own good. You could have a baby almost jog him, he's so relaxed. It's nice to go to the barn and jog a horse like that, it kind of sets you up for a good day. It's nice to have that nice horse, mild mannered, just a sweetheart to jog. He brightens your day."

In his elimination, Legendary Hanover settled in third, where he remained heading into the stretch. He paced his last quarter in a blistering: 24.4 to earn the victory.

"It was my job to find a nice trip for him," driver MacDonald said. "Unfortunately, in the big ones, I haven't been able to map them out for him, but I'm hoping [in the final] I can get the job done.

"He's just a great horse. He can do anything. He finishes like a freight train, he's great on the front, he can rough it first-up if you've got to. Hopefully, I can work something out for him in the final. Some people maybe got down on him, but Tony and I and his ownership group have never given up on him. We think the sky is the limit still for him."



After teaming up for a memorable stakes-and-milestone win two weeks ago, Twin B Joe Fresh and driver Dexter Dunn return to action Saturday (July 13) in the \$140,000 Dorothy Haughton Memorial for older female pacers at The Meadowlands.

Last time out, Twin B Joe Fresh posted a neck victory over Sylvia Hanover in the Perfect Sting Stakes at The Big M. In addition to being Twin B Joe Fresh's sixth consecutive triumph on the Grand Circuit dating back to last November, it was Dunn's 2,000th win since arriving in the U.S. from New Zealand in the summer of 2018.

Dunn is among the co-owners of Twin B Joe Fresh, with trainer Chris Ryder, longtime Ryder assistant Peter Trebotica, and Barry Spak.

"I had no idea at all about being close to 2,000 wins," Dunn said. "I came back to the paddock after the race, and they told me. I was already pumped up for winning the race, and that was like a cherry on top. It was quite cool to get it on her."

Dunn won 2,226 races in New Zealand, where he led the Premiership in victories for 10-consecutive years before moving to the States. He has been the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Driver of the Year four times since then, from 2019-22.

He has sat behind a dozen horses to receive Dan Patch Awards, including 2022 Horse of the Year Bulldog Hanover and 2022 Trotter of the Year Bella Bellini. He has won 15 Breeders Crowns, eighth most in history.

"I've driven a lot of nice horses for a lot of good trainers," Dunn said. "I've been pretty lucky to sit behind these kinds of horses. When I came over [to the U.S.] I was just hoping to do a little bit of good. I couldn't have dreamed of winning the races I have. I still pinch myself sometimes. I'm very thankful."

Twin B Joe Fresh also keeps Dunn pinching himself. The 4-year-old daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze has hit the board in 30 of 32 career races, winning 23 and earning \$1.67 million. She finished last season by winning the Matron Stakes and FanDuel Mare Pace Championship, becoming the first 3-year-old filly to defeat her older rivals in the nine-year history of the event.

After a second-place finish against male rivals in her 2024 debut, Twin B Joe Fresh romped to a stakes- and track-record 1:48.2



victory in the Betsy Ross Invitational at Harrah's Philadelphia, then captured her elimination and the final of the Roses Are Red Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park in Ontario. Her 1:48 clocking in the final was only one-fifth of a second off the Canadian record for a female pacer.

"She's come back super," Dunn said. "Physically, she's gotten stronger. She was already a tank of a horse, but she got bigger, which is kind of hard to believe. On the track, she's pretty intelligent; she knows what she's doing. What makes her so good, too, is she's a dream to drive. You can really do whatever you want with her. When you ask her to go, she knows it's time to go and does her job."

In the Perfect Sting, Twin B Joe Fresh was fourth heading to the last turn, when Dunn moved her to the outside to follow first-over Sylvia Hanover. Twin B Joe Fresh paced her last quarter in :25.1 to overtake Sylvia Hanover, Canada's 2023 Horse of the Year, as they approached the finish line.

"Sylvia Hanover is such a good horse, it was tough to get past her," Dunn said. "It was a really good effort by 'Joe Fresh."

"Winning a big race is always cool, but it's a special feeling when you own a horse like her, especially with Chris and Pete and the team. I have about one horse a year; I don't expect to get another one like her. We're enjoying the ride with her."

In Saturday's Dorothy Haughton Memorial, Twin B Joe Fresh will see the second-through-fourth place finishers from the Perfect Sting: Sylvia Hanover, Silver Label, and Valar Dohaeris. The ninehorse field also includes Grace Hill, the pacing mare division's Dan Patch Award winner last year, and millionaire Kentucky Sire Stakes champ Strong Poison.

Twin B Joe Fresh, the 8-5 morning-line favorite, will start from post 2. Sylvia Hanover, the 5-2 second choice, will leave from post 3 with driver Bob McClure. Always B Naughty, who was third in the Roses Are Red and second in the Betsy Ross, is next at 5-1 and will go from post 5 with Andy McCarthy.

The Dorothy Haughton is part of a stakes-filled night at The Meadowlands, highlighted by the \$650,000 Meadowlands Pace for 3-year-olds. The card also includes the \$428,000 William R. Haughton Memorial for older male pacers, \$425,000 E.T. Gerry, Jr. Hambletonian Maturity for 4-year-old trotters, and divisions of the Jerry Silverman Memorial (formerly Mistletoe Shalee) for 3-year-old female pacers and Stanley Dancer Memorial and Delvin Miller Memorial for 3-year-old male and female trotters, respectively.

# Freshmen fillies shine in Indiana Sire Stakes

Two-year-old pacing fillies got their Indiana Sire Stakes season underway with three divisions of the first leg featured on the Thursday (July 10) card at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The driver/trainer combo of Ricky and Jamie Macomber secured victories in each of the first two divisions with **Loveyoucookie** and **JK's Flirty Girl** before **Kaks The Boss** and driver Kyle Wilfong stormed to victory in the final division for trainer Jeff Cullipher.

Leaving from post 3 in the \$47,000 first division, driver Ricky Macomber, Jr. grabbed the pocket spot off of the gate while Kyle

Wilfong sent Lastchanceforlove to the front at the quarter in :27.4. The order remained unchanged up front to the half in :57 before the lead duo began to separate slightly from the field at three quarters in 1:26.3.

Macomber popped the pocket turning for home, quickly grabbing command by two lengths with an eighth of a mile to go with 4-5 favorite Tarshish (Jay Cross) now in pursuit. Powering home in :27, Loveyoucookie cruised to a  $2\frac{3}{4}$ -length victory over Tarshish in a lifetime best 1:53.4, Donut Lady (John De Long) navigated rivals in the lane to finish third. Loveyoucookie returned \$10.40 for her backers at the betting windows.

Now perfect through the first two starts of her career, Loveyoucookie is owned by Doug Overhiser. From the first crop of sire Capt Midnight, Loveyoucookie is out of the Rockin Image mare Bluebird Love and was bred by Daryl Miller.

Team Macomber came right back in the very next race to take the \$46,500 second division with JK's Flirty Girl. Starting from post six, Macomber got away fourth while 4-5 favorite Always A Card found the front from the rail to reach the quarter first in :28.3. Macomber pulled the right line on the backstretch to





steamroll to the front just prior to reaching the half in :57.3 before taking the field to three-quarters unchallenged in 1:27.

Turning for home, JK's Flirty Girl responded swiftly to a couple of Macomber whip taps, sprinting away by 2½ lengths midway down the lane. JK's Flirty Girl stopped the timer in 1:54, crossing the wire three lengths clear of Always A Card, Infatuation (John De Long) rounded out the trifecta in third. JK's Flirty Girl returned \$4.20 as the bettor's second-choice.

Also undefeated through two starts in her young career, JK's Flirty Girl is co-owned by Jamie Macomber along with James Stonecipher who bred the daughter of JK Endofanera—Mcflirty.

The \$47,000 third division saw Kaks The Boss breakthrough to earn her maiden-breaking victory in her second outing with driver Kyle Wilfong aboard. Tiffany Blue (Marvin Luna) crossed over quickly to the lead from the outside post 8 before relinquishing control to Rocky Dude (Trace Tetrick) through a quarter in :28 as Kaks The Boss stalked from fourth. Rocky Dude

had things her way to the half in :57.3 before Wilfong wheeled Kaks The Boss first-over and to the leader's wheel at three-quarters in 1:26.4.

Swinging into the stretch, Kaks The Boss continued to wear down a stubborn Rocky Dude before taking command by a half-length at the eighth pole. Once in command, Kaks The Boss sprinted away by 2¾ lengths on the wire in 1:54 over Tiffany Blue and Wunderkindbluechip (Mike Oosting). Kaks The Boss paid \$5.80 to win at the windows.

Owned by Pollack Racing LLC along with trainer Jeff Cullipher, the victory was the first for Kaks The Boss after finishing a narrow second to Loveyoucookie in her career debut. Bred by Victory Hill Farm, Kaks The Boss is a daughter of JK Endofanera out of the Captaintreacherous mare, Girl Boss.

## Two Fold Cold breaks track record in Maine Sire Stakes

Marc Tardif's **Two Fold Cold** took the overland route to win his division of the Maine Sire Stakes, breaking the track record on Wednesday (July 10) at historic Bass Park in the process.

In fact, with Andy Harrington driving for trainer Marc Tardif, the pair swept both \$16,000-plus divisions of the Pine Tree state-bred stakes for 3-year-old male pacers at Bangor.

In the first \$16,291 event, Two Fold Colt got away third from his pylon position. Hesjustadelight (7-2, Ron Cushing) and Wes's Challenge (9-2, Walter Case, Jr.) went out for the early lead, with those two matching strides into the first turn resulting in a swift :28.3 opening panel. With Cushing's Hesjustadelight on point, Harrington moved Two Fold Cold first over to challenge the pacesetter into a softer :58.4 half.

Down the backside the 1-2 favorite Two Fold Cold was still parked as the pair battled through a 1:26.3 (:27.4) third panel. Finally clearing by the top of the long, far turn Harrington hit the afterburners and the son of Deuce Seelster responded with a strong closing kick to draw away from the field and score by 4½ lengths in a benchmark smashing 1:55.2.

The mile was the fastest ever paced by a 3-year-old gelding pacer at Bangor, which eclipsed the standard set by Gordon Corey's Call Me Maverick in 2021.

Owned and trained by Marc Tardif, Two Fold Cold was bred by Gary and Kristina Hall, paying \$3 to win.

Wes's Challenge got up for second; Hesjustadelight was third.

In the second \$16,191 division of the Maine Sire Stakes Team Tardif was at it again, with **Arts Flight** and Harrington scoring a stakes race double on the late afternoon card.

The 1-5 favorite Justcallmebuck (Heath Campbell-Gary Hall) "pushed the starting gate out of the way" exclaimed track announcer Mick Sweeney, as they rolled into a :30.2 first quarter with Arts Flight (2-1, Harrington) in tow.

The pacesetting favorite had things his own way into a modest 1:00.4 half, but then pushed a little faster through the 1:30 third stanza with Arts Flight sticking to him like glue.

Harrington pulled the pocket with the son of Artistic Fella at the top of the far turn, and despite swinging wide off the turn the colt sped home in :28.2 to upset the heavy favorite in 1:58.4 by three parts of a length.

Owned and trained by Marc Tardif, and bred by Lynne-Marie Plouffe, he paid \$6.40 to win.

Justcallmebuck finished second; CBF Windy Fella (Dave Ingraham-David Crochere) was third.

The Maine Sire Stakes reconvenes this week at Cumberland with two \$15,000 divisions of the 3-year-old filly pacers today (July 12), and continues at Cumberland on Saturday (July 13) with a single \$15,000 division for 2-year-old filly pacers.

The next day, all divisions of trotters return to historic Bass Park on Sunday (July 14).

**APPROPRIATION HELPS GROWTH:** "Meadowlands Pace Night has turned into a mega event the State of New Jersey can be proud of," said Big M chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "Since Gov. [Phil] Murphy signed Racing Bill S2992 in 2019, interest in Meadowlands Pace Night has exploded."

That bill, supported by both Gov. Murphy and the N.J. State Legislature, has helped pump \$20 million a year into the racing industry — divided between the standardbreds and thoroughbreds — which has helped both the "runners" and "trotters" thrive in all facets of the business.

Since the appropriation began in 2019, handle on Meadowlands Pace Night has bustled. That year, \$4,044,303 was wagered, followed by \$5,051,261 (in 2020), \$4,403,213 (2021), \$4,733,390 (2022) and \$5,672,535 (2023).

The handle on the Meadowlands Pace itself over the last five years, beginning in 2019, was \$499,925, \$645,423, \$677,987, \$551,617 and \$821,356, respectively.

"The support we have received from Gov. Murphy and the members of the NJ. State Legislature has gone a long way toward helping to grow the harness game in the Garden State," said Settlemoir. "The money has helped us do things such as bring breeders back to the state, which has strengthened our sire stakes program. In addition, nights like this Saturday would not attract the interest — or handle — that they do unless we had that money from the state. All of us in the harness industry owe a great deal to the Governor and the Legislature."

**CALLING ALL FOODIES:** Foodies, Meadowlands Pace Night is your night, too, especially if you like a good burger.


